On March 30, 1996, at 26 Pa.B. 1395 the Department of Community Affairs (DCA) published a Request for Proposals (RFP) for Fiscal Year 1996 for the Home Investment Partnerships Program (HOME). The RFP indicated the allocation was \$8,353,000. DCA has been notified that the amount of HOME funds allocated to the Commonwealth is \$21,769,000. Small Communities Planning Assistance Program

By this notice, the Department of Community Affairs (DCA) and/or its successor, announces the opening of the application period beginning May 25, 1996, for funding from the Small Communities Planning Assistance Program (SCPAP). Grant applications will be accepted beginning May 25, 1996, through the DCA regional offices (addresses appear at the end of this notice). All applications must be received in the regional office by close of business August 16, 1996, or if mailed, postmarked no later than this date. No applications will be accepted via FAX machine.

The SCPAP program is administered by the Department's Bureau of Community Planning. The purpose of the Program is to assist eligible municipalities to prepare

comprehensive strategies for community conservation and economic development. A total of \$250,000 has been set aside from the Commonwealth's Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program 1996 funds to provide funds for this purpose contingent upon appropriation by the General Assembly.

The Department published the Summary Notice of the Consolidated Plan for Federal Fiscal Years 1995—1999 at 40 Pa.B. 4911 (October 1, 1994). The full plan is available at all County Commissioners offices, all DCA CDBG grantees and all District Libraries.

Notice of submission to the U. S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) was published at 48 Pa.B. 5852 (November 28, 1994). Regulations for the CDBG Program may be found at 16 Pa. Code Ch. 25.

Eligible Applicants

All Pennsylvania Boroughs, incorporated towns and townships are eligible, in accordance with Act 179 of 1984, to apply for planning assistance grants with the exception of the following:

A. Municipalities eligible to receive CDBG funds directly from the Federal Government because of their destination as Federal Entitlement Communities or those eligible to receive funds through the HUD Urban County CDBG Program.

B. Boroughs, towns and townships which are identified as entitlement municipalities under the Pennsylvania CDBG Program and which have populations of 10,000 or more based on the 1990 census.

Program Contents and Eligible Activities.

The SCPAP emphasizes action-oriented planning programs with a high potential for implementation. Eligible activities include:

1. Overall community development strategies;
2. Neighborhood revitalization strategies;
3. Economic development planning projects;
4. Housing strategies; and
5. Community conservation planning projects.

SCPAP funds may also be utilized for all other planning and policy-planning-management-capacity building activities eligible under the U. S. Department of Housing and Urban Development's Community Development Block Grants (CDBG) regulations (24 CFR Part 570.205) September 6, 1988.

Applications will be competitively evaluated based upon the following criteria:

A. Quality of Work Program—The degree to which the application presents a proposed work program that ad-

dresses the problems in an effective and logical way, presents a coordinated approach with other existing planning activities and is realistic in terms of cost and time of execution.

B. Seriousness of the Problem—The comparative seriousness of the needs to be addressed by the proposed planning activity as compared with needs identified in other applications.

C. Potential for Implementation—The degree to which the application proposes an action-oriented planning program which includes as its final end product realistic and achievable short range activities with high potential for implementation.

D. Benefit to Low- and Moderate-Income Persons—The extent to which the application proposes a planning program which is designed to benefit this income category.

E. Leverage—The extent to which other funds are leveraged to undertake the proposed planning program.

F. Timeliness—The ability of the applicant to complete the proposed planning program in a timely fashion.

G. Past Performance—Applicants that have received previous SCPAP grants will be evaluated on their performance in administering those grants.

H. Community Involvement—The extent to which the public participated in the preparation of the application and the extent the public will be involved in the planning program and its implementation.

Ineligible Activities

A. General government operating and maintenance expenses including legal fees and general administrative costs other than those cited under the Financial Assistance, paragraph C.

B. Architectural (landscape-architectural)/engineering specifications and design costs.

C. The preparation of a Small Communities Planning Assistance Program application.

D. Property Acquisition.

E. Construction projects.

Financial Assistance

A. The Department in awarding grants will insure that at least 70% of the total SCPAP funds awarded will benefit low- to moderate-income persons and families.

B. The financial assistance will be for a period not to exceed 24 months and at a SCPAP maximum funding level of \$28,000 per applicant.

C. The Department will pay for application preparation costs, surveys conducted in accordance with CDBG Sur-

vey Standards and the actual advertising costs of the two required public notices for successful grantees. The total administrative allowance shall not exceed \$3,600.

D. The Department reserves the right to deny approval of any application and to request additional information from certain applicants without undertaking any duty to request such information from all applicants. Grants will be awarded at the discretion of the Department to those projects that are determined to be most suitable for funding.

APPLICATIONS

The following parties have applied for an NPDES permit to discharge controlled wastewaters into the surface waters of this Commonwealth. Unless otherwise indicated on the basis of preliminary review and application of lawful standards and regulations, the Department of Environmental Protection proposes to issue a permit to discharge, subject to certain effluent limitations and special conditions. These proposed determinations are tentative.

Where indicated, the EPA, Region III, Regional Administrator has waived the right to review or object to this proposed permit action under the waiver provision 40 CFR 123.6E.

Persons wishing to comment on the proposed permit are invited to submit a statement to the Field Office indicated as the office responsible, within 30 days from the date of this public notice. Comments received within this 30-day period will be considered in the formulation of the final determinations regarding this application. Responses should include the name, address and telephone number of the writer and a concise statement to inform the Field Office of the exact basis of a comment and the relevant facts upon which it is based. A public hearing may be held if the Field Office considers the public response significant.

Following the 30-day comment period, the Water Management Program Managers will make a final determination regarding the proposed permit. Notice of this determination will be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* at which time this determination may be appealed to the Environmental Hearing Board.

The application and related documents, proposed effluent limitations and special conditions, comments received and other information are on file and may be inspected and arrangements made for copying at the Field Office indicated above the application.

Code §§ 77.121—77.123 and 86.31—86.34 (relating to public notices of filing of permit applications, opportunity for comment, and informal conferences).

Where any of the mining activities listed below will have discharges of wastewater to streams, the Department will incorporate NPDES permits into the mining activity permits issued in response to these applications. Such NPDES permits will contain, at a minimum, technology-based effluent limitations (as described in the Department's regulations—25 Pa. Code §§ 77.522, 87.102, 88.92, 88.187, 88.242, 89.52 and 90.102) for iron, manganese, suspended solids, settleable solids, alkalinity and pH. In addition to the above, more restrictive effluent limitations, restrictions on discharge volume or restrictions on the extent of mining which may occur will be incorporated into a mining activity permit when necessary for compliance with water quality standards (in accordance with 25 Pa. Code Chs. 93 and 95). Persons or agencies which have requested review of the NPDES permit requirements for a particular mining activity within the above-mentioned public comment period will be provided with a 30-day period to review and submit comments on those requirements.

Written comments or objections should contain the name, address and telephone number of persons submitting comments or objections, application number and a statement of sufficient detail to inform the Department on the basis of comment or objection and relevant facts

upon which it is based. Requests for an informal conference must contain the name, address and telephone number of requestor, application number, a brief summary of the issues to be raised by the requestor at the conference and a statement whether the requestor desires to have the conference conducted in the locality of the proposed mining activities.

The Department's review has found that the Joint Plan Update is now acceptable and hereby grants planning approval. This review has also not identified and significant environmental impacts resulting from this proposal.

The Joint Plan Update calls for the construction of a new, 1.6 mgd (Average Daily Flow)/5.7 mgd (Peak Flow) regional wastewater treatment facility by the recently chartered Central Carbon Municipal Authority. This flow includes an allowance of 13,600 gpd, of the proposed facility's overall capacity, for the treatment of residential septage generated within the four municipalities previously identified. The proposed regional wastewater treatment facility will be constructed on property identified as Site No. 7 in the Joint Plan Update. Site 7 is located in Mahoning Township, south of the existing Lehighon Wastewater Treatment Facility; and is currently owned by Consolidated Rail Corporation (CONRAIL). The CCMA will acquire Site 7, through proper, legal means at the appropriate time. Treated wastewater will be discharged to the Lehigh River from the proposed regional wastewater treatment facility.

The Joint Plan Update also calls for the installation of new wastewater collection systems to serve selected areas in both Mahoning and Franklin Townships. In Mahoning Township, collection systems will be constructed in the Jamestown, Packerton, Meadowcrest, Ashtown and Graverville/SR0443 areas. In Franklin Township, collection systems will be constructed in the North Weissport, East Weissport and Union Hill areas. Each Township will assess its users for the construction and operation and maintenance of their individual wastewater collection systems.

The Joint Plan Update identified the existence of infiltration/inflow (I/I) problems within the existing wastewater collection/conveyance systems of Lehighon and Weissport Boroughs. Both Boroughs propose activities which are intended to reduce I/I through rehabilitation and/or replacement of various portions of their wastewater collection systems. In addition, the proposed, regional wastewater treatment facility's peak hydraulic treatment capacity has been increased beyond normal levels to provide sufficient capacity to properly treat both Boroughs' combined, peak wet-weather wastewater flows.

Conveyance facilities, both existing and proposed, have been included in the Joint Plan Update to facilitate the transportation of wastewater between the individual, municipal wastewater collection systems and the proposed regional wastewater treatment facility. The Jamestown and Packerton areas of Mahoning Township will discharge wastewater to a proposed 165 gpm pump station to be located northeast of the intersection of Carbon and First Streets in Mahoning Township. This pump station will discharge its wastewater into manhole No. 397 located in Subarea 2 of the existing Lehighon Borough Wastewater Collection System. The costs associated with this pump station and force main will be borne by Mahoning Township.

The Ashtown section of Mahoning Township is currently served by a 174 gpm pump station which discharges to manhole No. 256D in the existing Lehighon Borough Wastewater Collection System. In conjunction with this discharge, wastewater from the Meadowcrest area of Mahoning Township will be conveyed to the existing Ashtown Pump Station for conveyance to Lehighon Borough's Wastewater Collection System and ultimately the regional wastewater treatment facility. The existing Ashtown Pump Station has adequate capacity to transport the wastewater flows which will be generated by both the Ashtown and Meadowcrest areas of Mahoning Township.

Wastewater from the Graverville/SR0443 areas of Mahoning Township will be conveyed to manhole No. 256D in the existing Lehighon Borough Wastewater Collection System by a proposed 270 gpm pump station and force main. The costs associated with the proposed, new pump station and force main will be borne by Mahoning Township.

As a result of the increased discharge to manhole No. 256D from the previously identified areas of Mahoning Township, several Lehighon Borough Wastewater Collection System lines will need to be upgraded. The Bridge Street Collection line, from manhole No. 256D to manhole No. 201, will be upgraded from an 8" to a 10" diameter line. The 15" collection line, between manhole No. 201 and manhole No. 345 will be upgraded to an 18" line. The 18" conveyance line, between manhole No. 345 and manhole No. 418, will be upgraded to a 21" line. All costs associated with these three line upgrades will be borne by the CCMA.

The existing Stanley Hoffman Boulevard Pump Station, which serves Subareas 3 and 4 of the Lehighon Wastewater Collection System and the proposed Jamestown and Packerton Wastewater Collection Systems in Mahoning Township, must be upgraded and expanded. The costs associated with this upgrade will be borne by the CCMA. As a direct result of the Stanley Hoffman Boulevard Pump Station Upgrade/Expansion an existing 15" conveyance line in the Lehighon Wastewater Collection System will need to be upgraded to an 18" conveyance line. The existing line must be upgraded between manhole No. 440 and manhole No. 444 in the Lehighon Wastewater Collection System. All costs associated with this upgrade will be borne by the CCMA.

An existing pump station, currently serving only Weissport Borough, will be upgraded to accommodate Weissport Borough's projected wet-weather flows and the proposed flows from Franklin Township. The existing 300 gpm pump station will be replaced by an 850 gpm pump station. However, the same 8" force main, between the existing Weissport Pump Station and the existing Lehighon Wastewater Treatment Facility, will still be capable of transporting the total, increased wastewater volume from Weissport Borough and Franklin Township. The costs associated with this pump station upgrade/expansion will be borne by the CCMA.

The project's final conveyance component will be the construction of a new influent pumping station to be located at the existing Lehighon Wastewater Treatment Facility Site. This pump station will be equipped with three, 50 HP variable speed drive pumps. The station will be capable of pumping all of the raw wastewater received from the four municipalities, through an 18" ductile iron force main to the proposed regional wastewater treatment facility site. All costs associated with the influent pumping station and force main will be borne by the CCMA.

Financing of each of the proposed municipal projects will be as follows:

- CCMA—Pennsylvania Infrastructure Investment Authority (PENNVEST)
- Lehighon Borough—Conventional
- Mahoning Township—Rural Economic Community Development Service (RECDS)
- Franklin Township—Pennsylvania Infrastructure Investment Authority (PENNVEST)
- Weissport Borough—Combination of a Grant from Carbon County and Rural Economic Community Development Service (RECDS)

Each municipality will be responsible for the financing, construction and operation and maintenance of its own wastewater collection system and appurtenances. The CCMA will be responsible for the financing, construction and operation and maintenance of the proposed regional wastewater treatment facility. It will also be responsible for the financing, construction and operation and maintenance activities associated with existing pump station expansions and those conveyance facilities (interceptors, force mains, and the like) which will transport wastewater from two or more of the municipalities within a common conveyance facility or line.

In accordance with the provisions of the Pennsylvania Sewage Facilities Act, 35 P. S. § 750.1—750.20(a) (Act 537), and Chapter 71 of the Department's Regulations (25 Pa. Code Ch. 71), the Department will hold the Borough of Lehighon, the Borough of Weissport, Mahoning Township and Franklin Township responsible for the complete

and timely implementation of each municipality's portion of the Joint Plan Update's activities, as listed in the Schedules of Implementation described in the regional and respective, municipal sections of the Joint Plan Update.

Any additional wastewater-related improvements, additions, deletions or changes outside of those explicitly described in the Joint Plan Update must be in compliance with the Department's Regulations and be submitted to and approved by the Department in writing. Since the CCMA is proposing PENNVEST financing and the total cost of the project is greater than \$10 million, Value Engineering must be performed for those issues related to the proposed regional wastewater treatment facility. Issues such as the type of wastewater treatment process, wastewater treatment facility site layout or other issues which cannot be completely resolved during the planning stage of the project, should be resolved during the Value Engineering process.

Submission Date for Public-Private Partnership Recycling Grants Under Act 101 Section 902; The Municipal Waste Planning, Recycling and Waste Reduction Act of 1988

The Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) hereby announces a request for applications from municipalities for recycling program grant assistance under section 902 of the Municipal Waste Planning, Recycling and Waste Reduction Act (53 P. S. §§ 4000.101—4000.1904).

Municipalities eligible for the grants include counties, cities, boroughs, incorporated towns, townships and home rule municipalities. Authorities are not eligible to apply for the grants, but may be sponsored by a county or municipality.

This solicitation is for projects considered to be public-private partnerships where municipalities may sponsor a recycling grant application on behalf of a private sector partner for projects benefiting both entities. Priority will be given to projects that expand processing or manufacturing capacity within Pennsylvania for source separated recyclable materials including aluminum, glass, plastic and steel containers, corrugated cardboard, high-grade office papers, magazines, newspapers and other marketable grades of paper. All grant awards will be predicated on the receipt of recycling fees required by sections 701 and 702 of Act 101, and the availability of monies in the Recycling Fund. The maximum funding available is \$300,000 per project.

Municipalities and counties are eligible for 90% funding of approved recycling project costs. Municipalities considered financially distressed by the Department of Community Affairs under the Municipalities Financial Recovery Act (53 P. S. §§ 11701.101—11701.501) are eligible to receive funding for an additional 10% of approved costs.

Eligible recycling project development costs include: recycling project design costs; recycling market investigations; development of recycling market commitments; development of recycling program ordinances; development of recycling public education programs; and the costs of developing contracts or procuring equipment and services necessary for the operation of the recycling program.

Eligible recycling project implementation costs include: vehicles used to collect or transport recyclable materials to processing or storage facilities, or in the operation of a materials recovery facility, or in the transport of recyclable materials to market; reusable containers for household recyclable materials storage and collection; the cost of acquisition and/or renovation of buildings for the processing or storage of recyclable materials; equipment used for the processing of recyclable materials; and land improvements for a recycling facility. Yard waste composting programs as defined by the Pennsylvania Municipal Waste Management Regulations, Chapter 75, will be considered as recycling programs.

Before a municipality can submit a recycling grant application to the Department for the funding of mechanical processing equipment, it must first publish a notice in a newspaper of general circulation describing in detail the kinds of processing equipment that it proposes to pur-

chase and the intended use of the equipment. The notice, in the form of a display advertisement, must appear at least once weekly for 2 consecutive weeks. The municipality must allow 30 days for responses from interested individuals. When the municipality submits the recycling grant application to the Department, it must include proof of compliance with the notification requirements, a description of any responses received to the notice, and an explanation of why the municipality has concluded the mechanical processing equipment is not available to the program from the private sector.

The Public-Private Partnership Recycling Grant Program has a two-step application process. The first step involves the submission of a Letter of Intent to apply for grant funding. Enhancement to the Dealer Late Submission and Nonsubmission of Vehicle Registration Program Documents

ENVIRONMENTAL HEARING BOARD

Keystone Cement Company v. DEP; EHB Doc. No. 95-151-MG

The Department of Environmental Protection (Department) and Keystone Cement Company (Keystone) have agreed to a partial settlement of the above-captioned matter regarding its two cement kilns located in East Allen Township, Northampton County.

The Department had issued Air Quality Operating Permits (Permits) to Keystone on June 19, 1995, authorizing Keystone to operate the cement kilns in accordance with the waste fuel feed rates, emission limitations, monitoring requirements and other conditions set forth in the Permits. Keystone filed a timely appeal challenging the waste fuel feed rates, emission limitations, the requirement to perform a risk assessment and other permit conditions.

The parties have agreed to a partial settlement, the major provisions of which include:

1. Within 30 days, the Department will prepare, for publication and comment, the following draft modifications to Keystone's Permits, published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* on August 12, 1995:

a. Condition No. 6, relating to the metal concentration limits, shall be modified to read as follows:

The Permittee shall not fire any waste fuels in the cement kiln having as fired metal concentrations in excess of the following limits:

arsenic	— 100 ppm
beryllium	— 20 ppm
cadmium	— 1000 ppm
hexavalent chromium	— 1000 ppm
mercury	— 10 ppm
nickel	— 1000 ppm
lead	— 2500 ppm

The Permittee shall not accept waste fuels with metal concentrations limits in excess of the "as fired" limits, unless Permittee applies for and receives a hazardous waste treatment permit authorizing the blending of the waste fuels or the Department or Environmental Quality Board determines that such a permit is not required.

b. Condition No. 11e, relating to the automatic operation of the interlocks with visible air contaminants, shall be modified to read as follows:

Visible air contaminants from the kiln as measured by opacity is equal to or greater than 20% for any 6 minute rolling average, or equal to or greater than 60% for any 1 minute block average.

c. Condition No. 13, relating to stack sampling for metals, chlorine and particulates, shall be deleted. (See Paragraph 2.e. below.)

d. Condition No. 14, relating to stack sampling for PCDD and PCDF, shall be deleted. (See Paragraph 2.e. below.)

e. Condition No. 15, which requires stack sampling for arsenic, beryllium, cadmium, hexavalent chromium, mercury, nickel, lead, HCl, chlorine, particulates, PCDD and PCDF, at a frequency prescribed by the Department but at a minimum every 6 months for the first 18 months, then annually thereafter, shall be modified to read as follows:

The Permittee shall conduct stack sampling for the following pollutants on an annual basis: arsenic, beryllium, cadmium, hexavalent chromium, mercury, nickel, lead, HCl, chlorine, particulates, PCDD and PCDF. All stack sampling and analysis shall be conducted by an independent Department approved third party and shall be conducted while the source is operating at maximum routine operating conditions. The Department reserves the right to require the Permittee to sample the emissions in accordance with such methods and procedures and at such locations and intervals of time as the Department may reasonably prescribe and provide the Department with the results, as authorized by law.

f. Condition No. 24, relating to notification of the Department in the case of exceedances of emission limits, shall be modified to read as follows:

The Permittee shall promptly notify the Department at (610) 861-2070 of the sources or associated air cleaning devices which results in, or may possibly be resulting in, the emission of air contaminants in excess of the regula-

tion contained in Article III of the Rules and Regulations of the Department of Environmental Resources.

2. The Department and Keystone will follow the public notice provisions set forth in 25 Pa. Code § 127.424, and the Department will take final action on the modifications after consideration of any comments received.

3. Keystone will not appeal the final modifications as long as the terms and conditions thereof are not materially different from those set forth above, but reserve the right to appeal the final modifications if they are materially different.

INSURANCE DEPARTMENT

Limited Liability Companies; Notice 1996-07

Pennsylvania's Business Corporation Law prohibits "limited liability companies" from being organized to conduct the business of insurance (15 Pa.C.S. § 8911.(a)). Historically, the Insurance Department has construed this prohibition as preventing limited liability companies from conducting business as an agent or broker, in addition to prohibiting activity as an insurer.

The Insurance Commissioner has now determined that this law was not designed to prevent insurance agencies or brokers from being incorporated as limited liability companies. Accordingly, the Insurance Department will consider agent and broker applications from limited liability companies, whether resident or nonresident.
