APPLICATIONS

The following parties have applied for an NPDES permit to discharge controlled wastewaters into the surface waters of this Commonwealth. Unless otherwise indicated, on the basis of preliminary review and applications of lawful standards and regulations, the Department of Environmental Protection proposes to issue a permit to discharge, subject to certain effluent limitations and special conditions. These proposed determinations are tentative.

Where indicated, the EPA, Region III, Regional Administrator has waived the right to review or object to this proposed permit action under the waiver provision 40 CFR 123.6E.

Persons wishing to comment on the proposed permit are invited to submit a statement to the office noted above the application within 30 days from the date of this public notice. Comments received within this 30-day period will be considered in the formulation of the final determinations regarding this application. Responses should include the name, address and telephone number of the writer and a concise statement to inform the Department of the exact basis of a comment and the relevant facts upon which it is based. A public hearing may be held if the responsible official considers the public response significant.

Following the 30-day comment period, the Water Management Program Manager will make a final determination regarding the proposed permit. Notice of this determination will be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* at which time this determination may be appealed to the Environmental Hearing Board.

The application and related documents, proposed effluent limitations and special conditions, comments received and other information are on file and may be inspected and arrangements made for copying at the office indicated above the application.

Registered and Certified Emission Reduction Credits

The following emission reduction credits (ERCs) have been approved, registered and certified by the Department of Environmental Protection (Department), Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. ERCs are surplus, permanent, quantified and Federally enforceable emission reductions used to offset emission increases of oxides of nitrogen (NO_x), volatile organic compounds (VOCs) and the following criteria pollutants: carbon monoxide (CO), lead (Pb) and oxides of sulfur (SO_x), particulate matter (PM), PM-10, particulate.

The Department has established a computerized ERC registry system, under 25 Pa. Code § 127.209, to provide for the registration, certification and tracking of ERCs. Prior to registration of the credits, ERC Registry Applications are reviewed and approved by the Department to confirm that the ERCs meet the requirements of 25 Pa. Code §§ 127.206—127.208. Registration of the credits in the ERC registry system constitutes certification that the ERCs satisfy applicable requirements and that the credits are available for use. Following certification of the ERCs, they may be used for either of the following purposes:

- (1) To satisfy new source review (NSR) offset ratio requirements;
- (2) To “net-out” of NSR at ERC-generating facilities;
- (3) To sell or trade the ERCs for use as offsets at new or modified facilities.

The certified ERCs shown below, expressed in tons per year (tpy), satisfy the applicable ERC requirements contained in 25 Pa. Code §§ 127.206—127.208. These ERCs were generated from the permanent shutdown of air contamination sources. Therefore, as specified in 25 Pa. Code § 127.206(f), the credits will expire for use as offsets 10 years after the date the sources ceased emitting NO_x emissions, if the ERCs are not included in a plan approval and used as offsets by the expiration date.

Laboratories Approved to Determine Blood Alcohol Content Under the Clinical Laboratory Act, the Vehicle Code, the Fish and Boat Code and the Game and Wildlife Code

The following laboratories are licensed by the Department of Health under the Clinical Laboratory Act (35 P.S. §§ 2151-2165) and are currently approved by the Department under 28 Pa. Code §§ 5.50 and 5.103 (relating to approval to provide special analytical services; and blood tests for blood alcohol content) to perform alcohol analyses of blood and/or serum and plasma. This approval is based on demonstrated proficiency in periodic tests conducted by the Department's Bureau of Laboratories. Since procedures for determining the alcohol content of serum and plasma are identical and results obtained from serum or plasma derived from a blood sample are the same, laboratories that demonstrate reliability in the analysis of serum proficiency testing specimens are approved to analyze both serum and plasma. These laboratories are also approved and designated under the provisions of the Vehicle Code, 75 Pa. C.S. §§ 1547 and 3755 (relating to chemical testing to determine amount of alcohol or controlled substance; and reports by emergency room person-

nel), the Fish and Boat Code, 30 Pa. C.S. § 5125 (relating to chemical testing to determine amount of alcohol or controlled substance), and the Game and Wildlife Code, 34 Pa. C.S. § 2502, (relating to hunting or furtaking under the influence of alcohol or controlled substance) as qualified to perform the types of specialized services which will reflect the presence of alcohol in blood and/or serum and plasma. Laboratories located outside the Commonwealth may not provide blood and/or serum and plasma alcohol testing services in Pennsylvania unless they are specifically licensed by the Department under the Clinical Laboratory Act.

The Department's blood alcohol and serum/plasma alcohol proficiency testing programs are approved by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) in accordance with the requirements contained in the Clinical Laboratory Improvement Amendments of 1988 (42 CFR 493.901 and 493.937) which are administered by the

Health Care Financing Administration (HCFA). Participation in these programs may therefore be used to demonstrate acceptable performance for approval purposes under both Federal and Commonwealth statutes.

Income Limits for the Subsidized Child Day Care Program

The Department of Public Welfare increases the income limits codified at 55 Pa. Code § 3040.62(c), § 3040.63(a)(4), (b) and (c), and § 3040 Appendix B effective July 1, 1996. Based on the increased income limits, the Department of Public Welfare has also revised Appendix C, reference companion to Appendix B and Fee Formula—Statement of Policy.

The regulation at 55 Pa. Code § 3040.62(c) establishes the Department's requirement to update the income conversion charts located at 55 Pa. Code Chapter 3040 Appendix B and the companion Fee Schedule in Appendix C. Appendices B and C are being revised to reflect the changes in the Federal Poverty Income Guidelines (FPIG) which establish the annual income guidelines for the subsidized child day care program. Effective July 1, 1996, the income guidelines will be increased due to the increase in the FPIG. The Fee Schedule is adjusted to reflect the increases in the income guidelines. Appendix B establishes the income limit of 235% of the FPIG to be used to establish a family's eligibility. Appendix B also establishes the family fee levels according to the family's computed annual income and the family's priority for service in comparing the computed family income to the percentage of the FPIG. Appendix C lists the weekly family fee based on the annual family income.

Under 55 Pa. Code § 3040.62(c), the Department of Public Welfare revised the income limits for the subsidized child day care program effective July 1, 1996. Those limits and corresponding fees are set forth in Appendices B and C which are recommended for codification in 55 Pa. Code Chapter 3040.

Increases in Allowances for a Community Spouse and Dependent Living with the Spouse when the Other Spouse is Institutionalized and is Eligible for Medical Assistance

The Department of Public Welfare announces an increase in the community maintenance need allowances for the family of an individual who is aged, blind or disabled, is eligible for Medical Assistance and is institutionalized. The allowances affected are the monthly standard community spouse maintenance need allowance, the excess monthly shelter standard for the community spouse, and the standard monthly family member maintenance allowance for a dependent living with the community spouse.

The Spousal Impoverishment Provisions of the Medicare Catastrophic Coverage Act of 1988 (Section 303(a) of P. L. 100-360) (42 U.S.C.A. § 1396r-5) require the Department to make changes to the allowances on July 1st of each year based on the Federal Poverty Income Guidelines (FPIGs) issued by the Federal Department of Health and Human Services. The current FPIGs were published at 61 FR 8286 on March 4, 1996.

The State requirements are at 55 Pa. Code § 181.452, Posteligibility Determination of Income Available from an MA Eligible Person Toward the Cost of Care. The requirements provide that revisions be published as a notice in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* and made available upon request at the county assistance offices.

ENVIRONMENTAL HEARING BOARD

Utica Mutual Insurance Company v. DEP; Doc. Nos. 95-227-MG (Tunnelton Mining Company, Marion Mine Coal Refuse Disposal Area) and 95-228-MG (Tunnelton Mining Company, Marion Deep Mine and Prep Plant)

Utica Mutual Insurance Company (Utica) and the Department of Environmental Protection (Department) have agreed to a settlement of the above matter.

The parties have agreed to a settlement, the major provisions of which include that the three reclamation bonds underwritten by Utica for the Tunnelton Mining Company Marion Mine and the facilities related to the Marion Mine are forfeited. The Department will release Utica from liability for 85% of the payment under the forfeited bonds in accordance with a schedule of work to be completed to the Department's satisfaction. This work

includes sealing the shafts, slopes and boreholes, demolition of structures, grading and capping of the Coal Refuse Disposal Area, elimination and repair of impoundments and ponds, monitoring of static water levels and water quality of the Marion Mine Pool; topsoiling and seeding of the Mine and Mine-related facilities.

Utica will be released from payment of the final 15% of the forfeited bonds after permanent and stabile vegetation is re-established at the Marion Mine and the Marion Mine-related facilities and after a second agreement has been entered that provides for the perpetual collection and treatment of all surface discharges from the Marion Mine and the Marion Mine-related facilities according to effluent standards acceptable to the Department.

INDEPENDENT REGULATORY REVIEW COMMISSION

The Independent Regulatory Review Commission met publicly at 11 a.m., Wednesday, July 3, 1996, and took the following actions:

Order

On January 29, 1996, the Independent Regulatory Review Commission (Commission) received this proposed regulation from the State Board of Osteopathic Medicine. This rulemaking would amend 49 Pa. Code § 25.231. The authority for this regulation is found in section 13.1(a) of the Osteopathic Medical Practice Act (63 P. S. § 271.13a(a)). The proposed regulation was published in the February 10, 1996 *Pennsylvania Bulletin* with a 30-day public comment period. The final-form regulation was submitted to the Commission on June 17, 1996.

The proposed regulation will require osteopathic physicians to pay \$140 biennially for renewal of their licenses, an increase of \$65 over the current biennial licensure fee of \$75. The regulation will affect all osteopathic physicians who are licensed to practice in Pennsylvania. Currently, there are approximately 5,600 licensees. The proposed increase will result in Pennsylvania having the twelfth lowest licensure fee in the United States.

The Senate Consumer Protection and Professional Licensure Committee voted to approve the regulation on June 25, 1996. The House Professional Licensure Committee approved the regulation on June 26, 1996.

As a result of our review of the proposed rulemaking, we expressed concern regarding the dramatic increase in some Board expenditures between the 1991-93 and the 1993-95 biennial cycles. In particular, Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs (BPOA) administration costs increased by approximately 165%, from \$25,270.11 to \$66,877.54. In addition, central support services costs increased 88%, from \$20,750 to \$39,100 and Board administration costs increased 28%, from \$120,200.58 to \$153,547.39. In our Comments, we requested that the Board provide a detailed explanation for the substantial increases in BPOA administration, central support services and Board administration costs.

In response to our inquiry concerning the increase in BPOA administration costs, the Board explained that when expenditures exceed the level of appropriations, the excess expenditure is rolled over into the next fiscal year and is recorded as that succeeding year's expenditure. Approximately \$25,000 of the increase in BPOA administration costs between the 1991-93 and the 1993-95 biennial cycles was the result of such a rollover. The \$25,000 rollover also reflects the Board's costs to reconstruct cases which were destroyed in the fire of June 16, 1994.

In addition to the \$25,000 rollover, the Board's remaining BPOA administration costs increased approximately \$16,600. The Board explained this increase was also fire related. Prior to the fire, BPOA offices were housed in a State government-owned building, and BPOA did not have to pay rent for office space. Since the fire, BPOA has incurred the additional expenses of renting office space from a private landlord and replacing office equipment which was destroyed in the fire.

The Board explained that the approximately 88% increase in central support services costs resulted from the reclassification of expenses attributable to the Office of Operations and Contract Management, which is a component of the Department of State's (Department's) central support services cost center. During the 1994-95 fiscal year, 14 positions were transferred from BPOA appropriations to the general government operations appropri-

tions. As a result, direct personnel expenses which the Department previously charged to BPOA were eliminated. The total payroll expenses for the 14 positions were prorated and charged to each of the Department program areas affected by the reclassified positions. Therefore, the increase in central support services costs reflects the Board's prorated share of the payroll expenses associated with the 14 reclassified positions.

According to the Board, three factors caused the 28% increase in Board administration costs from the 1991-93 to the 1993-95 biennial cycle. First, implementation of the legislatively mandated continuing medical education requirements for the 1994 renewal required multiple mailings to licensees to inform them of a proposed rulemaking on continuing education. The costs of preparing and mailing the notices increased Board administration costs.

Second, amendments to the Osteopathic Medical Practice Act relating to the certification and registration of respiratory care practitioners necessitated mass mailings to applicants to inform them of licensure requirements. In addition, the Board accrued overtime costs on several occasions in order to process all applications.

Finally, contractual pay and longevity increases for Board staff in the 1993-95 biennial cycle amounted to approximately 10%, or \$20,000. The combination of these three factors accounted for the increase in Board administration costs from the 1991-93 to the 1993-95 biennial cycle.

We have reviewed this regulation and find it to be in the public interest. Although the Board experienced substantial increases in specific expense categories between the 1991-93 and 1993-95 biennial cycles, the Board has adequately explained the reasons for the increases. In the overall, we find the proposed biennial renewal fee to be reasonable and in-line with fees in surrounding states.

Therefore, It Is Ordered That:

1. Regulation No. 16A-536 from the State Board of Osteopathic Medicine, as submitted to the Commission on June 17, 1996, is approved; and
2. The Commission will transmit a copy of this Order to the Legislative Reference Bureau.

Old Republic Insurance Company; International Business and Mercantile Reassurance Company; Workers' Compensation Group Retrospective Rating Plan

On June 27, 1996, the Insurance Department received a filing from the Old Republic Insurance Company and International Business and Mercantile Reassurance Company which describes eligibility criteria and premium calculation rules for a workers' compensation group retrospective rating plan. The rating plan would be written through them with a proposed August 1, 1996, effective date.

Pennsylvania Compensation Rating Bureau; Workers' Compensation Manual Revision; Classification Proposals

On July 3, 1996, the Insurance Department received from the Pennsylvania Compensation Rating Bureau a filing for changes in Workers' Compensation classification procedure to be effective 12:01 a.m., September 1, 1996.

The purposes for the proposed changes include more equitable alignment of rating values with demonstrated historical potential for loss and resolution of various administrative concerns which have arisen with respect to the current classification plan.

Ten new classifications are proposed to be established. Each proposed new classification would be applicable to specific business operations presently being reported under one or more existing classifications.

Ten existing classifications (Codes 255, 257, 281, 662, 924, 928, 941, 951 and 953) are proposed to be amended by the removal of component portions of their exposures proposed to become subject to the ten new classifications. The proposed amendments of existing classifications. The proposed amendments of existing classifications do not map on a "one-for-one" basis into the proposed new classifications, with many new classifications receiving portions of exposure from more than one existing code. In all cases, the existing classification remains applicable to types of business not being removed under these proposals.

Two classifications (Codes 922 and 958) are proposed to be amended by the addition of exposures currently subject to other existing codes.

One classification (Code 808) is clarified to reduce potential for misclassification and/or misallocation of exposures under the current classification plan.

Repeal of Outdated Bulletins, Notices and Statements of Policy; Notice No. 1996-10

The Insurance Commissioner proposes to formally repeal the Bulletins, Notices and Statements of Policy listed in Annex A (collectively notices). Under Governor Tom Ridge's Executive Order 1996-1 of February 16, 1996, the Insurance Department reviewed its regulatory requirements to identify those mandates that are outdated, conflict with existing law, or are otherwise irrelevant. Those notices listed in Annex A are no longer necessary for the proper regulation of the insurance industry in the Commonwealth.

Many of the notices proposed for repeal were issued to provide guidance in advance of the promulgation of a regulation. Other notices announced a change in the law or Insurance Department practice, or announced a surcharge that was applicable in the upcoming year. Still others related to statutes that subsequently were repealed or modified.

The notices have continued in existence because they contained no formal expiration date. Insurance industry representatives who received these notices over the years have never received notification that the notices are no longer current or effective. In addition, the Department attempted to previously repeal some of these notices, yet publishers of law books and research materials continue to reproduce these notices and hold them out as statements of current and official Department policy.

For these reasons, the Insurance Department proposes to formally announce its repeal of those notices listed in Annex A.

Fiscal Impact

State Government

The adoption of the proposal will have no fiscal impact on State government.

Political Subdivisions

The proposal will have no impact on costs to political subdivisions.

General Public

The general public will benefit to the extent that the cost savings realized by the insurance industry from this proposal will be passed along to Pennsylvania consumers in the form of lower premium rates.

Private Sector

The rescission of the Bulletins, Notices and Statements of Policy will result in a cost savings for insurers and other entities regulated by the Insurance Department. The insurance industry will benefit through the elimination of time-consuming research of outdated material. By eliminating this unnecessary material, the insurance industry should realize an aggregate savings of approximately \$7 million per year. This cost savings is based on

the anticipated decrease in expenses for researching the status of the law relating to rating, marketing and underwriting issues.
