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Pennsylvania Bulletin

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the official gazette of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. It is published every week and includes a table of contents. A cumulative subject matter index is published quarterly.

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* serves several purposes. First, it is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, which is the official codification of agency rules and regulations and other statutorily authorized documents. Changes in the codified text, whether by adoption, amendment, repeal or emergency action must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. Further, agencies proposing changes to the codified text do so in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Second, the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* also publishes: Governor's Executive Orders; State Contract Notices; Summaries of Enacted Statutes; Statewide and Local Court Rules; Attorney General Opinions; Motor Carrier Applications before the Public Utility Commission; Applications and Actions before the Department of Environmental Protection; Orders of the Independent Regulatory Review Commission; and other documents authorized by law.

The text of certain documents published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the only valid and enforceable text. Courts are required to take judicial notice of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Adoption, Amendment or Repeal of Regulations

Generally an agency wishing to adopt, amend or repeal regulations must first publish in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking. There are limited instances where the agency may omit the proposal step; they still must publish the adopted version.

The Notice of Proposed Rulemaking contains the full text of the change, the agency contact person, a fiscal note required by law and background for the action.

The agency then allows sufficient time for public comment before taking final action. An adopted proposal must be published in the *Pennsylvania*

Bulletin before it can take effect. If the agency wishes to adopt changes to the Notice of Proposed Rulemaking to enlarge the scope, they must repropose.

Citation to the Pennsylvania Bulletin

Cite material in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* by volume number and page number. Example: Volume 1, *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, page 801 (short form: 1 Pa.B. 801).

Pennsylvania Code

The *Pennsylvania Code* is the official codification of rules and regulations issued by Commonwealth agencies and other statutorily authorized documents. The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, printing changes as soon as they occur. These changes are then permanently codified by the *Pennsylvania Code Reporter*, a monthly, loose-leaf supplement.

The *Pennsylvania Code* is cited by title number and section number. Example: Title 10 *Pennsylvania Code*, § 1.1 (short form: 10 Pa.Code § 1.1).

Under the *Pennsylvania Code* codification system, each regulation is assigned a unique number by title and section. Titles roughly parallel the organization of Commonwealth government. Title 1 *Pennsylvania Code* lists every agency and its corresponding *Code* title location.

How to Find Documents

Search for your area of interest in the *Pennsylva*nia Code.

The *Pennsylvania Code* contains, as Finding Aids, subject indexes for the complete *Code* and for each individual title, a list of Statutes Used As Authority for Adopting Rules and a list of annotated cases. Source Notes give you the history of the documents. To see if there have been recent changes, not yet codified, check the List of *Pennsylvania Code* Chapters Affected in the most recent issue of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* also publishes a quarterly List of Pennsylvania Code Sections Affected which lists the regulations in numerical order, followed by the citation to the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* in which the change occurred.

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Printing Format

Material proposed to be added to an existing rule or regulation is printed in **bold face** and material proposed to be deleted from such a rule or regulation is enclosed in brackets [] and printed in **bold face**. Asterisks indicate ellipsis of *Pennsylvania Code* text retained without change. Proposed new or additional regulations are printed in ordinary style face.

Fiscal Notes

Section 612 of The Administrative Code of 1929 (71 P. S. § 232) requires that the Office of Budget prepare a fiscal note for regulatory actions and administrative procedures of the administrative departments, boards, commissions or authorities receiving money from the State Treasury stating whether the proposed action or procedure causes a loss of revenue or an increase in the cost of programs for the Commonwealth or its political subdivisions; that the fiscal note be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* at the same time as the proposed change is advertised; and that the fiscal note shall provide the following information: (1) the designation of the fund out of which the appropriation providing for expenditures under the action or procedure shall be made; (2) the probable cost for the fiscal year the program is implemented; (3) projected cost estimate of the program for each of the five succeeding fiscal years; (4) fiscal history of the program for which expenditures are to be made; (5) probable loss of revenue for the fiscal year of its implementation; (6) projected loss of revenue from the program for each of the five succeeding fiscal years; (7) line item, if any, of the General Appropriation Act or other appropriation act out of which expenditures or losses of Commonwealth funds shall occur as a result of the action or procedures; (8) recommendation, if any, of the Secretary of the Budget and the reasons therefor.

The required information is published in the foregoing order immediately following the proposed change to which it relates; the omission of an item indicates that the agency text of the fiscal note states that there is no information available with respect thereto. In items (3) and (6) information is set forth for the first through fifth fiscal years; in that order, following the year the program is implemented, which is stated. In item (4) information is set forth for the current and two immediately preceding years, in that order. In item (8) the recommendation, if any, made by the Secretary of Budget is published with the fiscal note. See 4 Pa. Code § 7.231 et seq. Where "no fiscal impact" is published, the statement means no additional cost or revenue loss to the Commonwealth or its local political subdivision is intended.

Rule 113. Lodging of Transcripts.

When the Court or a party direct the court reporter to transcribe the notes of testimony taken at a hearing or trial, the Clerk, upon receiving the transcript, shall notify the parties that the transcript has been lodged with the Court. The parties shall have 30 days from the date of notification to file objections to the transcript. The parties shall serve copies of objections upon the other party. The Court may conduct a hearing on the objections. If no objections or exceptions are filed, the transcript will be approved by the Court as of course.

CHAPTER 3. INITIATION OF FORMAL CHARGES Rule 303. Board Complaints; Amendment and Consolidation.

- (A) *Amendments.* Upon motion of the Board, the Conference Judge may, in his or her discretion, permit substantive amendments to a Board Complaint with the written consent of the Judicial Officer or after a hearing on the motion in open court.
 - (B) Consolidation.
- (1) The Conference Judge may, for purposes of trial, upon his or her own motion, after notice to the Board and the Judicial Officer, or [Upon]upon motion of the Board or the Judicial Officer, [the Conference Judge may, for purposes of the trial,] consolidate some or all of the charges against [a] an individual Judicial Officer contained in separate Board Complaints filed pursuant to Rule 301(A).
- (2) The Conference Judge may, on his or her own motion, and after notice to the [Judicial Officer] Board and the [Board] Judicial Officer, consolidate two or more Board Complaints against an individual Judicial Officer for purposes of imposing sanctions pursuant to Rule 504.
- (3) In matters pending before the Court which involve a common question of law or fact or which arise from the same transaction or occurrence, a Conference Judge may, for any purpose, upon his or her own motion, after notice to the Board and the Judicial Officers, or upon motion of the Board or a Judicial Officer, order the matters consolidated, and may make orders which avoid unnecessary costs or delay.

Corrective Amendment to 25 Pa. Code § 93.7(c) Table 3

The Department of Environmental Protection has discovered a discrepancy between the agency text of 25 Pa. Code § 93.7(c), Table 3 (relating to specific water quality criteria) as deposited with the Legislative Reference Bureau and as published at 24 Pa.B. 832 (February 12, 1994) and the official text as published in the *Pennsylvania Code Reporter* (Master Transmittal Sheet No. 252). When the amendments made by the Department at 24 Pa.B. 832 were codified, the formula in § 93.7(c) Table 3 contained a typographical error.

Therefore, under 45 Pa.C.S. § 901: The Department of Environmental Protection has deposited with the Legislative Reference Bureau a corrective amendment to 25 Pa. Code § 93.7(c) Table 3. The corrective amendment to 25

Pa. Code § 93.7(c) Table 3 is effective as of November 4, 1995, the date the defective official text was announced in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

The correct version of 25 Pa. Code § 93.7(c) Table 3 appears in Annex A, with ellipses referring to the existing text of the regulation.

PROPOSED RULEMAKING

ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY BOARD

[25 PA. CODE CH. 93]

Stream Redesignations; Buck Hill Creek, et al.

The Environmental Quality Board (Board) proposes to amend §§ 93.9c, 93.9f, 93.9l, 93.9p, 93.9t and 93.9v to read as set forth in Annex A.

This order was adopted by the Board at its meeting of January 20, 1998.

A. Effective Date

These proposed amendments are effective upon publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* as final rulemaking.

C. Statutory and Regulatory Authority

These proposed amendments are made under the authority of sections 5(b)(1) and 402 of The Clean Streams Law (35 P. S. §§ 691.5(b)(1) and 691.402) and section 1920-A of The Administrative Code of 1929 (71 P. S. § 510-20), which grant to the Board the authority to develop and adopt rules and regulations to implement The Clean Streams Law. In addition, the Federal regulation at 40 CFR 131.32 (relating to Pennsylvania) sets forth certain requirements for portions of the Commonwealth's antidegradation program.

D. Background of the Proposed Amendments

Pennsylvania's Water Quality Standards, which are set forth in part in Chapter 93 (relating to water quality standards), implement sections 5 and 402 of The Clean Streams Law and section 303 of the Federal Clean Water Act (33 U.S.C.A. § 1313). Water quality standards are in-stream water quality goals which are implemented by imposing specific regulatory requirements (such as treatment requirements and effluent limits) on individual sources of pollution.

The Department considers candidates for Special Protection status or redesignation, or both, in its ongoing review of water quality standards. In general, Special Protection waters (High Quality (HQ) and Exceptional Value (EV) waters) must be maintained at their existing quality, and wastewater treatment requirements must comply with § 95.1 (relating to general requirements). Candidates may be identified by the Department based on routine waterbody investigations. Requests for consideration may also be initiated by other agencies, such as

the Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission (PFBC), and by the general public through a rulemaking petition to the Board.

The Department evaluated the following streams in response to requests from Department and PFBC staff, as well as two petitions:

Roaring Run and Owl Creek: Department

Sinnemahoning Portage Creek and Cowley Run, Swamp Creek, Dunbar Creek, Cush Creek, and South Branch Oswayo Creek: PFBC

Buck Hill Creek: Buck Hill Conservation Foundation Trout Run: Blairsville Municipal Authority

The physical, chemical and biological characteristics and other information on these waterbodies were evaluated to determine the appropriateness of the current designations. Aquatic surveys of these streams were conducted by the Department's Bureau of Watershed Conservation. Based upon the data collected in these surveys and information gathered from Department records and other sources, the Board recommends the designations described in Section E of this Preamble.

Copies of the Department's aquatic survey evaluation reports referred are available from Edward Brezina whose address and telephone number are listed in Section B of this Preamble.

In reviewing whether waterbodies are subject to the Special Protection Waters Program, the Department is utilizing applicable State and Federal regulatory criteria.

E. Summary of Proposed Regulatory Revisions

Following is a brief explanation of the recommendations for each stream or segment in the proposal. The proposed recommendations are based on the Department's evaluations considering applicable regulatory definitions and Federal requirements.

Buck Hill Creek—This basin is currently designated High Quality-Cold Water Fishes (HQ-CWF). The Buck Hill Conservation Foundation petitioned the Board to redesignate the upper watershed, down to Snow Shoe Run, as Exceptional Value Waters (EV). The Department evaluated the entire basin, and recommends redesignation of the Buck Hill Creek basin from the source to Margaret's Falls to EV. This recommendation is based on the presence of outstanding ecological attributes. This EV recommendation extends further downstream than requested in the petition. The remainder of the basin will retain its HQ-CWF designation. The Migratory Fishes (MF) designation will be added from Buck Hill Falls to the mouth to recognize use of this reach by the American eel.

Owl Creek—The Department found that this tributary to Tulpehocken Creek is not listed in the Chapter 93 drainage list. A field survey indicated that the Owl Creek Fishery is dominated by warm water fish species. The Department recommends that the Owl Creek Basin be included in Chapter 93 and be designated Warm Water Fishes (WWF).

Swamp Creek—The PFBC requested that the current TSF designation upstream of the Route 100 crossing be evaluated for upgrade to CWF and that the basin above the dam in Bechtelsville be evaluated for designation as HQ-CWF. The Department's recommendations conform to this request. The Swamp Creek basin upstream from the

dam in Bechtelsville is designated a Class A wild trout water and thus contains attributes which merit an HQ designation. The basin from the dam to Route 100 supports brown trout and other species indigenous to cold water habitats and is therefore recommended for redesignation to CWF. American eels are found throughout the basin, so the MF designation should be added to the entire Swamp Creek basin, source to mouth.

Sinnemahoning Portage Creek and Cowley Run—The Sinnemahoning Portage Creek basin from the source to and including Cowley Run is recommended for designation as EV (currently CWF). At all stations sampled in this portion of the basin, the ecological significance score was 92% or greater than that of the reference station, thus exhibiting outstanding ecological attributes. This proposed designation would provide more protection than the original HQ-CWF request from the PFBC.

South Branch Oswayo Creek—The South Branch Oswayo Creek basin was evaluated for redesignation from CWF to HQ-CWF at the request of the PFBC. The ecological condition score at all stations sampled in the basin exceeded 92% of that of the reference; thus exhibiting outstanding ecological attributes. The Department is recommending EV for the basin. This exceeds the original PFBC request for HQ-CWF.

Roaring Run—The Roaring Run basin is currently designated HQ-CWF, and a portion was evaluated for redesignation to EV on the basis of a request from the Department's Southwest Regional Office. Roaring Run is located primarily on public lands and demonstrates excellent water quality. The PFBC has included the Roaring Run basin upstream from the Boswell Reservoir in its Wilderness Trout Stream program. The Department is recommending EV for this portion of the basin.

Trout Run—The Blairsville Municipal Authority petitioned the Board to include the portion of Trout Run upstream from their reservoir in the Special Protection Waters program. The PFBC requested that the entire basin be evaluated. The sampling above the reservoir showed an ecological comparison of 100%, thus exhibiting outstanding ecological attributes. An upgrade from CWF to EV is proposed. The basin downstream from the reservoir will retain the existing CWF designation.

Dunbar Creek—The PFBC requested an EV evaluation for Dunbar Creek from the source to Gist Run. This section is currently designated HQ-CWF. This proposed rulemaking recommends portions of this watershed to be redesignated EV based on the presence of outstanding ecology. These portions are: Dunbar Creek basin, source to Glade Run; Dunbar Creek main stem, Glade Run to Elk Rock Run; the Tucker Run basin; and the Elk Rock Run basin. The remainder of the basin will retain the HQ-CWF designation. These proposed recommendations apply the EV designation to much less of the basin than requested by the PFBC.

Cush Creek was evaluated for inclusion in this proposed rulemaking, but was found to be correctly designated. A portion of Cush Creek, currently CWF, was evaluated for redesignation as HQ-CWF based on a PFBC request. The portion of the basin upstream from Horton Run exhibited signs of degradation due to past coal mining, and the designation is recommended to remain unchanged.

These changes allow wastewater treatment requirements for dischargers to these streams to be consistent with the water uses to be protected. These proposed

regulatory amendments do not contain any standards or requirements which exceed requirements of the companion Federal regulations.

F. Benefits, Costs and Compliance

Executive Order 1996-1 requires a cost /benefit analysis of the proposed amendments.

- 1. Benefits—Overall, the citizens of this Commonwealth will benefit from these recommended changes because they reflect the appropriate designated use and maintain the most appropriate degree of protection for each stream.
- 2. Compliance Costs—Generally, the proposed changes should have no fiscal impact on, or create additional compliance costs for the Commonwealth or its political subdivisions. Except as noted, no costs will be imposed directly upon local government by this proposed recommendation. However, indirect costs may result from newly proposed activities which result in revisions to Act 537 Sewage Facilities Plans due to consultant and other administrative fees. Political subdivisions which add a new sewage treatment plant or expand an existing plant in the basin may experience changes in cost as noted in the discussion of impacts on the private sector.

Persons proposing activities or projects which result in discharges to streams must comply with the regulatory requirements relating to current stream designations. Persons could be adversely affected by the recommended changes that increase the level of protection provided to a stream if they expand the discharge or add a new discharge point since they may need to provide a higher level of treatment for the new or expanded discharge. These increased costs take the form of higher engineering, construction or operating costs for wastewater treatment facilities. Treatment costs are site specific and may depend upon the size of the discharge in relation to the size of the stream and many other factors. It is therefore not possible to precisely predict the actual change in costs. In addition, nonpoint source controls necessary to protect High Quality and Exceptional Value Waters may add to the cost of planning and development for new or expanded nonpoint source discharges. Economic impacts would primarily involve the potential for higher treatment costs for new or expanded discharges to streams which are upgraded, and potentially lower treatment costs for discharges to streams which are downgraded.

3. Compliance Assistance Plan—The proposed amendments will be implemented through the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permitting program since the stream use designation is a major basis for determining allowable stream discharge effluent limitations. These permit conditions are established to assure water quality criteria are achieved and designated uses are protected. New and expanded dischargers with water quality based effluent limitations are required to provide effluent treatment according to the water quality criteria associated with the proposed revised designated water uses. The Department has developed extensive guidance documents to aid permittees with the permitting process.

For those waters which are redesignated as Special Protection (HQ or EV) waters, the Department has developed a "Special Protection Waters Implementation Handbook" to guide persons conducting or proposing to conduct activities in watersheds on appropriate measures which should be taken to protect the waters.

4. Paperwork Requirements—The proposed regulatory revisions should have no direct paperwork impact on the Commonwealth, local governments and political subdivi-

sions, or the private sector. These proposed regulatory revisions are based on existing Department programs and policies. There may be some indirect paperwork requirements for new or expanding discharges to streams upgraded to Special Protection (HQ or EV). For example, NPDES general permits are not currently available for new or expanded discharges to Special Protection streams. Thus an individual permit and its associated additional paperwork would be required. Additionally, paperwork associated with demonstrating social and economic justification, and the nonfeasibility of nondischarge alternatives, may be required for new or expanded discharges to certain Special Protection waters.

G. Pollution Prevention

The antidegradation program, which applies to streams designated as HQ and EV waters, is a major pollution prevention tool because its objective is to prevent degradation by maintaining and protecting existing water quality. Although new or expanded wastewater discharges are not prohibited by the antidegradation program, nondischarge alternatives are encouraged and required, when appropriate. Nondischarge alternatives, when implemented, remove impacts to surface water and reduce the overall level of pollution to the environment by remediation of the effluent through the soil.

H. Sunset Review

These proposed amendments will be reviewed in accordance with the sunset review schedule published by the Department to determine whether the amendments effectively fulfill the goals for which they were intended.

I. Regulatory Review

Under section 5(a) of the Regulatory Review Act (71 P. S. § 745.5(a)), on March 23, 1998, the Department submitted a copy of the proposed rulemaking to the Independent Regulatory Review Commission (IRRC) and to the Chairpersons of the Senate and House Environmental Resources and Energy Committees. In addition to submitting the proposed amendments, the Department has provided IRRC and the Committees with a copy of a detailed regulatory analysis form prepared by the Department in compliance with Executive Order 1996-1, "Regulatory Review and Promulgation." A copy of this material is available to the public upon request.

Under section 5(g) of the Regulatory Review Act, if IRRC has objections to any portion of the proposed amendments, it will notify the Department within 10 days of the close of the Committees' review period. The notification shall specify the regulatory review criteria that have not been met by the portion of the proposed amendments to which an objection is made. The Regulatory Review Act specifies detailed procedures for review, prior to final publication of the amendments, by the Department, the Governor and the General Assembly of objection raised.

Written Comments-Interested persons are invited to submit comments, suggestions or objections regarding the proposed amendments to the Environmental Quality Board, P. O. Comments submitted by facsimile will not be accepted. Comments, suggestions or objections must be received by the Board by June 3, 1998 (within 60 days of publication in the Pennsylvania Bulletin). Interested persons may also submit a summary of their comments to the Board. The summary may not exceed one page in length and must also be received by June 3, 1998 (within 60 days following publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*). The one page summary will be provided to each member of the Board in the agenda packet distributed prior to the meeting at which the final-form regulations will be considered. If sufficient interest is generated as a result of this publication, a public hearing will be scheduled at an appropriate location to receive additional comments.





In addition to the above, more restrictive effluent limitations, restrictions on discharge volume, or restrictions on the extent of mining which may occur will be incorporated into a mining activity permit when necessary for compliance with water quality standards (in accordance with 25 Pa. Code Chapters 93 and 95). Persons or agencies which have requested review of the NPDES permit requirements for a particular mining activity within the above-mentioned public comment period will be provided with a 30-day period to review and submit comments on those requirements.

Written comments or objections should contain the name, address and telephone number of persons submitting comments or objections; application number; and a statement of sufficient detail to inform the Department on the basis of comment or objection and relevant facts upon which it is based. Requests for an informal conference must contain the name, address and telephone number of requestor; application number; a brief summary of the issues to be raised by the requestor at the conference; and a statement whether the requestor desires to have the conference conducted in the locality of the proposed mining activities.

HAZARDOUS SITES CLEANUP

Under the Act of October 18, 1998

Proposed Response Fair Oaks Dump Site Leet Township, Allegheny County

The Department of Environmental Protection (Department) under the authority of the Hazardous Sites Cleanup Act (35 P. S. §§ 6020.101—6020.1304) (HSCA), is proposing a response action for the Fair Oaks Dump site, located at 226—228 Hill Street, Leet Township. The Fair Oaks Dump site is approximately 3 acres in size and is situated in a heavy residential area.

Disposal at Fair Oaks Dump site occurred during the late 1940s and early 1950s. Waste materials brought to the site included asbestos felt, galbestos (asbestos felt bonded to galvanized metal), hardened the moplastic resins, bottom ash, galvanizing slag wastes, floor sweepings and construction debris.

Metal analytical results showed concentrations of arsenic, cadmium, lead, mercury and zinc exceeding Statewide cleanup standards under the 1995 Land Recycling

Act. Exposure to these metals poses a direct contact threat. An inhalation threat is posed by piles of asbestos felt and trimmings, a hazardous substance and known carcinogen. Access to the site is unrestricted and homes are located within 10 feet of the disposal area. Other threats include offsite migration of contaminants by means of surface water and potential groundwater contamination.

The purpose of the proposed response is to determine: (1) the nature and extent of contamination; (2) the volume and nature of waste remaining onsite; and (3) the need for remedial action.

The Department considered the following two options: (1) no action; and (2) further investigation to characterize the site and risk posed by the site.

Option 1 would provide no site or risk characteristics.

Option 2 would characterize the nature of the risks and provide a basis for determining any remedial response action.

The Department proposes Option 2 be implemented.

This notice is being provided under section 506(b) of the HSCA. The administrative record which contains information forming the basis and documenting the selection of this response action is available for public review and comment. The administrative record is located at the Department's Southwest Regional Office, 400 Waterfront Drive, Pittsburgh, PA 15222 and is available for review between 9 a.m. and 4 p.m.

Proposed General Plan Approval and General Operating Permit; BAQ-GPA/GP-7

The Department of Environmental Protection (Department) proposes to issue general plan approvals and operating permits for sheetfed offset lithographic printing presses (Sheetfed Press General Permit). This general

plan approval and operating permit, authorized under section 6.1(f) of the Air Pollution Control Act, is limited to plants that are not major volatile organic compound (VOC) or major hazardous air pollutant (HAP) emitting facilities as defined in 25 Pa. Code § 121.1. Any facilities whose potential yearly emissions are less than the thresholds shown in the following may qualify for the general permit:

- a. 25 tons of VOC in the counties of Bucks, Chester, Delaware, Montgomery and Philadelphia.
 - b. 50 tons of VOC in all remaining counties.
- c. 10 tons of any one HAP or 25 tons of any combination of HAPs throughout the State.

The proposed general plan approval and operating permit contains conditions which prescribe applicable performance standards, emission limits, monitoring, recordkeeping and reporting requirements. The proposed general plan approval and operating permit may also be used to authorize the construction of new sheetfed offset lithographic printing presses.

The proposed Sheetfed Press General Permit has been drafted in consultation with the Graphic Arts Association and the Graphic Arts Technical Foundation. The Graphic Arts Technical Foundation has prepared guidance for the industry to determine if plants are subject to the permitting requirements, as well as, recordkeeping and reporting forms for showing compliance with the Sheetfed Press General Permit requirements.

Prior to operating under the Sheetfed Press General Permit, the owner or operator of the source must notify the Department and receive prior written approval from the Department before commencing to operate the affected facility. Notification of the facility's intent to use the general permit and plan approval must be submitted on a form provided by the Department. Sheetfed offset lithographic printing presses operating under this general permit must comply with the terms and conditions of the general plan approval and general operating permit.

Authorization to operate under the Sheetfed Press General Permit will be valid for a term of 5 years. A plan approval application fee is required each time the permittee constructs sheetfed offset lithographic printing presses in accordance with Sheetfed Press General Permit. The Department proposes to establish plan approval application, operating permit application and operating permit renewal fees as follows:

- a. \$250 during the 1995—1999 calendar years.
- b. \$300 during the 2000—2004 calendar years.
- c. \$375 beginning in the 2005 calendar year.

Within 30 days of the expiration date of the authorization to operate under the general plan approval and general operating permit, the permittee must renew the authorization if the facility intends to continue to operate under the Sheetfed Press General Permit.

The Department will also consider written requests that a public hearing be held concerning this proposed general plan approval and operating permit. Public comments must be submitted to the Department within 45 days of the date of this notice in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. Comments received by facsimile will not be accepted.

Sheetfed Offset Lithographic Printing Press

- 1. Statutory Authority and General Description—In accordance with section 6.1(f) of the Air Pollution Control Act (35 P. S. § 4006.1) and 25 Pa. Code § 127.622, the Department of Environmental Protection (Department) hereby issues this general plan approval and general operating permit for sheetfed offset lithographic printing presses (Sheetfed Press General Permit).
- 2. Applicability/Source Coverage Limitations—This Sheetfed Press General Permit is designed to serve as either a Plan Approval or as an Operating Permit for printers who exclusively use sheetfed offset lithographic printing presses or have one or more sheetfed offset lithographic presses located in a facility. The specific use will depend upon permit status and location of the facility as outlined in the following.

Approval herein granted to operate under this Sheetfed Press General Permit is limited to a facility engaged in printing on sheetfed offset lithographic printing presses as defined in Condition 16. This Sheetfed Press General Permit has been established in accordance with the provisions described in 25 Pa. Code Chapter 127 Subchapter H. If additional types of printing or manufacturing is conducted at the facility that cannot be regulated by the requirements of this general permit, an operating permit issued in accordance with 25 Pa. Code Chapter 127 Subchapter F will be required, or, if the facility is a Title V operating permit issued in accordance with Subchapter G will be required.

Operating Permit

This Sheetfed Press General Permit is not intended for use as a Title V operating permit. However, it can be used as a general plan approval to add or modify a sheetfed press at a Title V facility. A Title V facility is one that has a potential to emit (PTE) equal to or greater than those shown in the following table. Sheetfed offset lithographic printing press facilities are exempted from the permit requirements of § 127.402 if it is demonstrated that the potential to emit (PTE) and actual emissions are less than the levels listed as follows:

This Sheetfed Press General Permit can be used for all facilities engaged in sheetfed offset printing with PTE less than those identified in the table above and actual emissions exceeding those identified in the table above.

Plan Approval

This Sheetfed Press General Permit shall also serve as a plan approval for sheetfed offset lithographic printing presses that meet the requirements specified Conditions 17, 18, 19 and 20. The installation or modification of sheetfed offset lithographic printing presses that meet the following criteria are exempt from plan approval requirements:

- a. Emits volatile organic compounds (VOCs) at a rate less than 2.7 tons per year (tpy), and;
- b. Emits a single hazardous air pollutant (HAP) at a rate less than $1\ \text{tpy}$, and;
- c. Emits a combination of hazardous air pollutants (HAPs) rates less than 2.5 tons of all HAPs combined per year, or;
 - d. A cylinder width 17 inches or less.

Facilities claiming an exemption based on the emission based criteria (a)—(c) must provide a 15-day prior written notification to the Department committing to limit VOC/HAPs emission increases to less than the specified levels. The modification of a sheetfed offset lithographic printing press would include the addition of a printing unit, coating unit, or other changes that would increase the emission of VOCs or HAPs above the exemption levels stated in criteria (a)—(c).

- 3. Application for Use—Persons proposing to operate, install or modify a sheetfed offset lithographic press under this Sheetfed Press General Permit shall notify the Department using the Sheetfed Offset Lithographic Printing Press General Permit Application provided by the Department and shall receive prior written authorization from the Department as required under 25 Pa. Code § 127.621 (relating to application for use of general plan approvals and general operating permits).
- 4. Compliance—Sheetfed offset lithographic printing presses operating under this Sheetfed Press General Permit must comply with the terms and conditions of the general permit. The sheetfed offset lithographic printing presses shall be:
- a. Operated in such a manner as not to cause air pollution.
- b. Operated and maintained in a manner consistent with good operating and maintenance practices.
- c. Operated and maintained in accordance with the manufacturer's specifications and the applicable terms and conditions of this Sheetfed Press General Permit.
- 5. Permit Modification, Suspension and Revocation—This Sheetfed Press General Permit may be modified, suspended or revoked if the Department determines that affected sheetfed offset lithographic printing presses cannot be regulated under this general permit. Authorization to use this Sheetfed Press General Permit shall be suspended or revoked if the permittee fails to comply with applicable terms and conditions of the Sheetfed Press General Permit.

The approval herein granted to operate the sheetfed offset lithographic printing presses shall be suspended, if, at any time, the permittee causes, permits or allows any modification without Departmental approval (as defined in 25 Pa. Code § 121.1) of the sheetfed offset lithographic printing presses covered by this general permit. Upon suspension of the general permit, the permittee may not continue to operate or use said sheetfed offset lithographic printing presses. If warranted, the Department will require that the sheetfed offset lithographic printing presses be permitted under the State operating permit or Title V operating permit requirements in 25 Pa. Code Chapter 127, if applicable.

6. Notice Requirements—The applications and notifications required by 25 Pa. Code § 127.621 shall be sent to the appropriate Regional Office responsible for issuing general permit in the county in which the sheetfed offset lithographic printing press is, or will be located.

The permittee shall notify the Department within 24 hours or by 12 noon of the next business day following a weekend or holiday of any malfunction of the sheetfed offset lithographic printing presses which results in, or may possibly be resulting in, the emission of air contaminants in excess of the limitations specified in, or established under, any applicable rule or regulation contained in 25 Pa. Code, Subpart C, Article III (relating to air resources).

- 7. Sampling and Testing—The permittee shall, upon the request of the Department, provide input material analyses, or input material samples used in any sheetfed offset lithographic printing press permitted under this general permit.
- 8. Monitoring, Recordkeeping and Reporting—The permittee shall comply with applicable monitoring, recordkeeping and reporting requirements set forth in 25 Pa. Code Chapter 139 (relating to sampling and testing, the Air Pollution Control Act, the Clean Air Act or the regulations thereunder applicable to the source).
- 9. Term of Permit—The applicant will be issued a letter authorizing the applicant to operate for a fixed term of 5 years under this Sheetfed Press General Permit.
- 10. Permit and Administrative Fees—The Sheetfed Press General Permit establishes the following application and renewal fees payable every 5 years if no equipment changes occur:
 - a. \$250 during the 1995—1999 calendar years.
 - b. \$300 during the 2000-2004 calendar years.
- c. \$375 beginning in the 2005 calendar year.

An additional plan approval application fee as indicated above is required each time the permittee constructs sheetfed offset lithographic printing presses in accordance with this Sheetfed Press General Permit. Two or more sheetfed offset lithographic printing presses may be installed under a single plan approval fee.

11. Expiration and Renewal of Permit—The permittee's right to operate under this Sheetfed Press General Permit terminates on the date of expiration of this permit unless a timely and complete renewal application is submitted to the Department 30 days prior to the permit expiration date.

Upon receipt of a complete and timely application for renewal, the sheetfed offset lithographic printing presses may continue to operate subject to final action by the Department on the renewal application. This protection shall cease to exist if, subsequent to a completeness determination, the applicant fails to submit by the deadline specified in writing by the Department any additional information required by the Department to process the renewal application.

The Sheetfed Press General Permit application for renewal shall include the identity of the owner or operator, location of the sheetfed offset lithographic printing presses, current permit number, description of source category, the appropriate renewal fee listed in Condition 10 and any other information requested by the Department. At a minimum, the permit renewal fee shall be submitted to the Department at least 30 days prior to the expiration of the Sheetfed Press General Permit.

- 12. Applicable Laws—Nothing in this Sheetfed Press General Permit relieves the permittee from its obligation to comply with all applicable Federal, State and local laws and regulations.
- 13. Prohibited Use—Any air contamination source that is subject to the requirements of 25 Pa. Code Chapter 127, Subchapter D (relating to prevention of significant deterioration), Subchapter E (relating to new source review), Subchapter G (relating to Title V operating permits) or 25 Pa. Code § 129.91 (relating to control of major sources of NO_x and VOCs), may not operate under this Sheetfed Press General Permit. Title V facilities may use this Sheetfed Press General Permit as a plan approval when the major new source review and prevention of significant deterioration review requirements are not applicable.
- 14. Transfer of Ownership or Operation—The permittee may not transfer the Sheetfed Press General Permit except as provided in 25 Pa. Code § 127.464 (relating to transfer of operating permits).
- 15. Plan Approval—This Sheetfed Press General Permit authorizes the construction and operation of sheetfed offset lithographic printing presses that meet the best available technology (BAT) required under 25 Pa. Code §§ 127.1 and 127.12(a)(5). For purposes of this general permit, BAT for sheetfed offset lithographic printing presses are those limits specified in Conditions 17, 18, 19 and 20.
- 16. *Definitions*—For purposes of this Sheetfed Press General Permit, the following definitions apply:
- a. *Alcohol*—Any of the following compounds, when used as a fountain solution additive for offset lithographic printing: ethanol, n-propanol, and isopropanol.
- b. *Alcohol Substitutes*—Nonalcohol additives that contain VOCs and are used in the fountain solution. Some additives are used to reduce the surface tension of water; others are added to prevent piling (ink build-up).
- c. Automatic Blanket Wash System—Equipment used to remotely clean lithographic blankets which can include, but is not limited to those utilizing a cloth and expandable bladder, brush, spray or impregnated cloth system.
- d. *Batch*—A supply of fountain solution that is prepared and used without alteration until completely used or removed from the printing process. For the purposes of this rule, this term may apply either to solutions prepared in discrete batches or solutions that are continuously blended with automix units.
- e. *Cleaning Solution*—Liquid solvents or solutions used to remove ink and debris from the operating surfaces of the printing press and its parts.

f. *Dampening System*—Equipment used to deliver the fountain solution to the lithographic plate.

- g. Fountain Solution—A mixture of water and other volatile and nonvolatile chemicals and additives that maintains the quality of the printing plate and reduces the surface tension of the water so that it spreads easily across the printing plate surface. The fountain solution wets the nonimage area so that the ink is maintained within the image areas. Nonvolatile additives include mineral salts and hydrophilic gums. Alcohol and alcohol substitutes, including isopropyl alcohol, glycol ethers and ethylene glycol, are the most common VOC additives used to reduce the surface tension of the fountain solution.
- h. Fountain Solution Recirculating Reservoir—The collection tank which accepts fountain solution recirculated from printing units. The tanks typically contain a coarse filter to remove contaminants from the fountain solution and in some cases, are equipped with cooling coils for refrigeration of the fountain solution.
- i. *Inking System*—A series of rollers used to meter the ink onto the lithographic plate. The system can include agitators, pumps and totes and other types of ink containers.
- j. *Lithography*—A planographic printing process where the image and nonimage areas are chemically differentiated; the image area is oil receptive and the nonimage area is water receptive. This method differs from other printing methods, where the image is typically printed from a raised or recessed surface.
- k. *Nonheatset*—A lithographic printing process where the printing inks are set without the use of heat. Traditional nonheatset inks set and dry by absorption and/or oxidation of the ink oils. For the purposes of this rule, ultraviolet-cured and electron beam-cured inks are considered nonheatset, although radiant energy is required to cure these inks.
- l. *Offset*—A printing process that transfers the ink film from the lithographic plate to an intermediary surface (blanket), which, in turn, transfers the ink film to the substrate.
- m. *Press*—A printing production assembly composed of one or more units used to produce a printed substrate including any associated coating, spray powder application or infra-red heating units.
- n. *Sheetfed*—A lithographic printing process where individual sheets of substrate are fed to the press sequentially.
- o. *Unit*—The smallest complete printing component, composed of inking and dampening systems, of a printing press.
- p. *VOC Composite Partial Vapor Pressure*—The sum of the partial pressure of the compounds defined as VOCs. VOC composite partial pressure is calculated as follows:

- $MW_c =$ Molecular weight of exempt compound, in g/g-mole
- $PP_c = \text{VOC}$ composite partial pressure at 20°C, in mm Hg
- VP_i = Vapor pressure of the "i"th VOC compound at 20° C, in mm Hg
- 17. Equipment Standards for Fountain Solutions—A sheetfed offset lithographic printing press subject to this Sheetfed Press General Permit shall meet one of the following requirements for the fountain solution used on that press:
- a. Maintain the as applied VOC content of the fountain solution at or below 5.0% by weight, or;
- b. Maintain the as applied VOC content of the fountain solution at or below 8.5%, by weight, and refrigerate the fountain solution to 60°F or less.
- 18. Equipment Standards for Blanket and Roller Cleaning Solutions—A blanket and roller cleaning solution used on a sheetfed offset lithographic printing press subject to this Sheetfed Press General Permit shall meet one of the following requirements:
- a. VOC content, as applied, is less than or equal to 30% by weight, or;
- b. VOC composite partial vapor pressure, as used, is less than or equal to $10\ mm$ Hg at $20^{\circ}C$ (68°F).
- c. The use of cleaning solutions not meeting Conditions 18(a) or (b) is permitted provided that the quantity used does not exceed 55 gallons over any 12 consecutive months.
- 19. Equipment Standards for Solvent Containers—An owner/operator of a sheetfed offset lithographic printing press subject to this Sheetfed Press General Permit shall keep all solvent containers closed at all times unless filling, draining or performing cleanup operations.
- 20. Equipment Standards for Solvent Laden Shop Towels—An owner/operator of a sheetfed offset lithographic printing press subject to this Sheetfed Press General Permit shall keep all solvent laden shop towels in a closed container when not being used.
- 21. Testing of Fountain Solutions—An owner/operator of a sheetfed offset lithographic printing press subject to this Sheetfed Press General Permit shall determine the VOC content of fountain solution by one of the following procedures:
- a. Analysis by USEPA Method 24 of a fountain solution sample; or
- b. Calculation which combines USEPA method 24 analytical VOC content data for the concentrated materials used to prepare the press ready fountain solution and records of the proportions in which they are mixed. The calculation shall only be performed once for each press ready fountain solution and kept in the form of a batch log, an example of which follows. The analysis of the concentrated fountain solution may be performed by the suppliers of those materials.
- 22. Testing of Blanket and Roller Cleaning Solutions—An owner/operator of a sheetfed offset lithographic printing press subject to this Sheetfed Press General

- Permit shall determine the VOC content or VOC composite partial vapor pressure of cleaning solutions by one of the following procedures.
- a. Analysis by USEPA method 24 of a cleaning solution sample for VOC content or by an appropriate method for composite partial vapor pressure; or
- b. Calculation which combines USEPA Method 24 analytical VOC content data for the concentrated materials used to prepare the press ready cleaning solution and records of the proportions in which they are mixed. The calculation shall only be performed once for each press ready cleaning solution and kept in the form of a batch log, an example of which follows. The analysis of the concentrated cleaning solution may be performed by the suppliers of those materials; or
- c. Calculation for VOC composite partial vapor pressure which combines analytical VOC vapor pressure data for the concentrated materials used to prepare the press ready cleaning solution and records of the proportions in which they are mixed. The analysis and vapor pressure determinations of the concentrated materials may be performed by the suppliers of the materials.
- 23. Monitoring Requirements for Automatic Blanket Wash Systems—An owner/operator of a sheetfed offset lithographic printing press subject to this Sheetfed Press General Permit using an automatic blanket wash system that mixes cleaning solution at the point of application must demonstrate compliance with the VOC limitation in Condition 18(a) or (b), shall document that flow meters or fixed volume spray systems result in the VOC content of the mixed solution complies with Condition 18(a) or (b).
- 24. Recordkeeping Requirements—An owner/operator of a sheetfed offset lithographic printing press subject to this Sheetfed Press General Permit shall collect and record the applicable information specified in this Condition. The information shall be maintained at the facility for a minimum of 5 years and shall be made available to an authorized Department representative at any time during normal working hours. The information required is:
- a. For each sheetfed offset lithographic ink or conventional varnish used: the monthly consumption in pounds or gallons; the percent by weight VOC and HAP content, as applied; and, an estimate of VOC and HAP emissions. Alternately, the ink with the highest VOC and HAP content may be used to represent all inks used by all sheetfed offset lithographic printing presses.
- b. For each fountain solution and additive: the monthly consumption in pounds or gallons; the percent by weight or weight to volume ratio (lbs/gal) VOC and HAP content and an estimate of VOC and HAP emissions.
- c. For each blanket and roller cleaning solution used: the monthly consumption in pounds or gallons; the percent by weight or weight to volume ratio (lbs/gal) VOC and HAP content and an estimate of VOC and HAP emissions.
- d. For each month of operation, the volume of all cleaning solution used which does not meet Condition 18(a) or (b).
- e. For each month of operation, an estimate of VOC and HAP emissions during the latest 12 months.

Temporary Changes to Special Fishing Regulations—Little Lehigh Creek, Lehigh County

On November 29, 1997, the Fish and Boat Commission (Commission) gave public notice under 58 Pa. Code §§ 65.2 and 65.6 that a 2.1 mile section of the Little Lehigh Creek, Lehigh County, was being designated as subject to "Delayed-Harvest, Artificial Lures Only" regulations effective January 1, 1998. A 1.4 mile section of this area was previously subject to "Delayed-Harvest, Fly-Fishing-Only" (58 Pa. Code § 65.2) regulations.

Subsequent meetings and correspondence with landowners whose properties border the special regulation area have revealed some opposition to the change from delayed-harvest fly-fishing-only status to delayed-harvest artificial lures only status.

Under provisions of 58 Pa. Code § 65.25, the Executive Director of the Commission is authorized to take immediate action to temporarily modify fishing regulations to conserve and preserve fishing opportunities. In light of input from landowners in the vicinity of this section of the Little Lehigh subject to special regulations, the Executive Director is taking temporary action to modify these special regulations as follows:

- (a) A 1.8 mile section of the Little Lehigh Creek (Lehigh County) from a bridge on T-508 (Wild Cherry Lane) downstream to a bridge on T-510 (Mill Race Road) will be governed by "Delayed-Harvest, Fly-Fishing Only" regulations set forth in 58 Pa. Code § 65.2 instead of "Delayed-Harvest, Artificial Lures Only" special regulations.
- (b) A 0.3 mile section of the Little Lehigh Creek (Lehigh County) from a bridge on SR 2017 (Brookside Road) downstream to a bridge on T-508 (Wild Cherry Lane) will be governed by Statewide fishing regulations (58 Pa. Code § 61.1) instead of "Delayed-Harvest, Artificial Lures Only" special regulations.

This notice is effective immediately. In accordance with 58 Pa. Code § 65.25(b), the members of the Commission will consider the special regulation status of these stream sections at their next regular meeting, which is scheduled for April 26, 1998, in Harrisburg.
