The Department of Conservation and Natural Resources, acting through the Bureau of Forestry, and C & S Lumber Company, Inc. of Roulette, Pennsylvania, are proposing to negotiate an exchange of lands in Cameron and Potter Counties, Pennsylvania.

#### Retention of a Professional Design Firm or Firms

#### **Project Reference No. FDC 500-910**

The Department of Conservation and Natural Resources (Department) will retain a professional design firm or firms for open-end contracts for various building and engineering designs and associated geological services, environmental services and CADD services. The contract or contracts will be for a 12-month period with four 12-month extensions possible. Projects will be assigned on an as-needed basis.

Letters of Interest for these projects will only be accepted from individuals, firms or corporations duly

authorized to engage in the practice of professional design. If an individual, firm or corporation not authorized to engage in the practice of engineering desires to submit a letter of interest, said individual, firm or corporation may do so as part of a joint venture with an individual, firm or corporation which is permitted under State law to engage in the practice of engineering and/or architecture. The professional design firm may be an engineering/architectural firm, an architectural/engineering firm, an engineering firm with an architectural subconsultant or an architectural firm with an engineering subconsultant.

The firm's area of responsibility for assigned work shall be throughout Central and Western Commonwealth. Bureau of Facility Design and Construction (Bureau) personnel will do project work in conjunction with this professional design firm on some of the projects.

The services may encompass a wide range of design and environmental efforts with the possibility of several different types of projects being designed under short completion schedules. The firm or firms may be required to design multiple projects at the same time.

The open-ended design services work will consist of building architectural, mechanical, plumbing and electrical designs, tie-ins to site utilities, major maintenance repair, renovations to existing buildings and additions to existing buildings. Many of these projects may be for buildings less than 5,000 square feet in size and small in terms of project scope.

Areas of environmental study associated with these projects may include, but are not limited to, wetlands, soil, geology, DER Chapter 105 and Corps of Engineers 404 permits. The environmental studies will be conducted in accordance with accepted analysis techniques and methodologies.

The selected firm or firms may be required to perform any or all of the projects in order to ensure a complete environmental investigation has been performed and may be required to provide all necessary environmental services, material and equipment necessary to collect, analyze and organize data, assess impacts, prepare reports and design mitigation plans. The reports and other graphic material to be prepared may include, but are not limited to, plans of study, meeting minutes, preparation of permit application documents, mitigation plans and reports and wetland and floodplain findings.

The professional design firm or firms may be required to perform any or all of the following duties: attend site visits; prepare minutes; perform necessary field surveys; plot topography and cross sections; develop erosion control details and narrative; prepare type, size and location report; prepare construction drawings, specifications, and estimates; procure core borings; provide soil and foundation engineering report; investigate utility involvement; and evaluate alternative using benefit/cost analysis, develop details and narratives; prepare reports; and also, the review of shop drawings, catalog cuts and occasional attendance at job conferences may be required.

The services shall also include, but not be limited to, a preliminary meeting in the Bureau of Facility Design and Construction, 8th floor, Rachel Carson State Office Building, 400 Market Street, Harrisburg, for each project. The contract shall be based on the hours of service and qualifying expenses not exceeding the contract amount. Work may be done on an hourly basis or a maximum cost work order for the individual design project. The design work will be reviewed by the architectural and engineering staff of the Bureau, and when acceptable, approved by same staff.

The number of open-end contracts and the dollar amount of each contract shall be at the discretion of the Department for the first year. The extent of the work for the subsequent 4-years of the contract will be dependent on the availability of additional funds and additional projects for those years, also at the discretion of the Department.

Information Concerning Socially and Economically Restricted Businesses (SERBs).

The Commonwealth of Pennsylvania strongly encourages the submission of proposals by SERBs.

To achieve the objective of enhancing SERB participation, the Commonwealth has established SERB utilization as a selection criteria in the evaluation process.

The Bureau of Contract Administration and Business Development (BCABD) will evaluate the aforementioned criteria and will assign a point value to be considered within the overall RFP total point tabulation.

Proposals submitted by individuals claiming SERB status or proposals submitted by individuals reflecting joint venture and subcontracting opportunities with SERBs must submit documentation verifying their claim.

SERBs are small businesses whose economic growth and development have been restricted based on social and economic bias. Such small businesses are BCABD certified minority and women owned businesses and businesses whose development has been impeded because their primary or headquarters facilities are physically located in areas designated by the Commonwealth as being designated enterprise zones. A small business will not be considered socially/economically restricted if it has gross annual revenues exceeding \$4,000,000, is dominant in its field of operation or employs more than 50 persons.

A company and its affiliates have achieved success and are graduated from this State-sponsored program when their gross revenue exceeds \$4,000,000 annually. Any other small business in which an owner of a graduated firm has a financial interest or over which an owner of a graduated firm has control, either directly or through family members, will not qualify for SERB status. Control is defined as the power, whether or not exercised, to direct or cause the direction of the management and policies of a firm, whether through the ownership of voting shares, by contract or otherwise, or through the making of day-to-day as well as major decisions in matters of policy, management and operations. A determination of control shall include, but shall not be limited to, the following factors: capital investment and all other financial, property acquisition, contract negotiation, and legal matters; officer-director-employee selection and comprehensive hiring; operating responsibility; cost-control matters; income and dividend matters; financial transactions; and rights of other shareholders or joint partners.

The comments should include the name, address and telephone number of the writer and a concise statement to inform the Department of the exact basis of a comment and the relevant facts upon which it is based. A public hearing may be held if the responsible office considers the public response significant. Following the comment period, the Department's Water Management Program Manager will make a final determination regarding these applications. Notice of this final determination will be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* at which time this determination may be appealed to the Environmental Hearing Board.

### LAND RECYCLING AND ENVIRONMENTAL REMEDIATION

**UNDER ACT 2, 1995** 

#### PREAMBLE 1

Acknowledgment of notices of intent to remediate submitted under the Land Recycling and Environmental Remediation Standards Act (35 P. S. §§ 6026.101—6026.908)

Sections 302-305 of the Land Recycling and Environmental Remediation Standards Act (Act) require the Department of Environmental Protection (Department) to publish in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* an acknowledgment noting receipt of any Notices of Intent to Remediate. An acknowledgment of the receipt of a Notice of Intent to Remediate is used to identify a site where a person proposes to, or has been required to, respond to a release of a regulated substance at a site. Persons intending to use the background standard, Statewide health standard, the site-specific standard, or who intend to remediate a site as a special industrial area, must file a Notice of Intent to Remediate with the Department. A Notice of Intent to Remediate filed with the Department provides a brief description of the location of the site, a list of known or suspected contaminants at the site, the proposed remediation measures for the site, and a description of the intended future use of the site. A person who demonstrates attainment of one, or a combination of the cleanup standards, or who receives approval of a special industrial area remediation identified under the Act, will be relieved of further liability for the remediation of the site for any contamination identified in reports submitted to and approved by the Department. Furthermore, the person shall not be subject to citizen suits or other contribution actions brought by responsible persons not participating in the remediation.

Under Sections 304(n)(1)(ii) and 305(c)(2) of the Act, there is a 30-day public and municipal comment period for sites proposed for remediation using a site-specific standard, in whole or in part, and for sites remediated as a special industrial area. This period begins when a summary of the Notice of Intent to Remediate is published in a newspaper of general circulation in the area of the site. For the sites identified, proposed for remediation to a site-specific standard or as a special industrial area, the municipality, within which the site is located, may request to be involved in the development of the remediation and reuse plans for the site if the request is made within 30 days of the date specified. During this comment period the municipality may request that the person identified, as the remediator of the site, develop and implement a public involvement plan. Requests to be involved, and comments, should be directed to the remediator of the site.

- 1. Under the best available technology provisions of 25 Pa. Code §§ 127.1 and 127.12, the air contaminant emissions from the respective sources shall be controlled by a water spray dust suppression system.
- 2. Under the best available technology provisions of 25 Pa. Code §§ 127.1 and 127.12, if at any time, it is determined that the air contaminant emissions are in excess of any applicable air contaminant emission limitation, the company shall immediately install additional spray nozzles or take other such control measures as are necessary to reduce the air contaminant emissions to within the applicable limitations.
- 3. Under the best available technology provisions of 25 Pa. Code §§ 127.1 and 127.12, the water spray dust suppression system associated with the equipment shall be connected to an on-demand water source capable of delivering an adequate supply of water at any time the plant is in operation. On-demand shall be interpreted as meaning that adequate water can be provided to all spray nozzles at any time with no more effort than turning a

valve. If at any time the water source cannot deliver an adequate supply of water to properly operate the water spray dust suppression system, the company shall immediately cease plant operation.

**47-318-009B: Aldan Acquisition, Inc.** (115 Woodbine Lane, Danville, PA 17821-9118) for construction of a festoon oven in their fabric coating and curing facility in Mahoning Township, **Montour County**.

The proposed festoon oven will be fired with natural gas, will have a maximum heat input of 4.8 million BTU per hour and will be used to cure rubber coated cloth. The air contaminant emissions potentially resulting the combustion of natural gas in the oven will be no greater than 2.1 tons of nitrogen oxides, .44 ton of carbon monoxide and .12 ton of volatile organic compounds per year. The oven will also potentially emit malodorous air contaminants from the curing process. Aldan is proposing to control the malodorous air contaminants with a thermal oxidizer currently in use at the facility for the control of volatile organic compound emissions from an existing fabric coating operation. The thermal oxidizer is expected to reduce the emission of malodorous air contaminants to a nondetectable level.

The Department has determined that the proposed festoon oven will comply with all applicable regulatory requirements pertaining to air contamination sources and the emission of air contaminants including the best available technology requirements of 25 Pa. Code §§ 127.1 and 127.12. The Department consequently intends to issue plan approval for the construction of the respective oven.

The Department intends to place conditions in the plan approval to be issued pertaining to the operation and monitoring of the festoon oven and associated thermal oxidizer. These are intended to assure proper operation of the oven and oxidizer as well as compliance with all applicable air quality regulatory requirements. The following is a summary of these conditions:

- 1. Under the best available technology provisions of 25 Pa. Code §§ 127.1 and 127.12, the festoon oven shall only be used to cure rubber coated cloth. It shall not be used to remove volatile organic compounds from coated cloth.
- 2. Under the best available technology provisions of 25 Pa. Code §§ 127.1 and 127.12, the festoon oven shall not be operated without the simultaneous operation of the thermal oxidizer.
- 3. Under the best available technology provisions of 25 Pa. Code §§ 127.1 and 127.12, the thermal oxidizer shall maintain a minimum oxidizer chamber outlet temperature of at least 1400°F at all times the festoon oven is operating.
- 4. Under the best available technology provisions of 25 Pa. Code §§ 127.1 and 127.12, the thermal oxidizer shall be equipped with a continuous oxidizer chamber outlet temperature monitoring and recording system. All records generated by this system shall be retained for at least 5 years.

**59-00005C: Dominion Transmission Corp.— Sabinsville Compressor Station** (CNG Tower, 625 Liberty Avenue, Pittsburgh, PA 15222-3199) for installation

of air cleaning devices, "screw-in prechambers" on five 1300 horsepower natural gas-fired reciprocating internal combustion compressor engines (Engines 1—5) at their facility in Clymer Township, **Tioga County**. The Department's review of the information contained in the application indicates that the proposed installations will meet all applicable air quality requirements. Based on this finding, the Department intends to approve the application and issue a plan approval to install the proposed air cleaning devices on the respective engines.

The Sabinsville Compressor Station is a major facility, which has been issued Title V Operating Permit No. 59-00005. The proposed air cleaning devices will replace existing air cleaning devices and are intended to better assure compliance with the nitrogen oxides and volatile organic compound emission limitations previously established for the respective engines under the reasonably available control technology requirements of 25 Pa. Code §§ 129.91—129.95 as well as with the carbon monoxide emission limitation to which the engines are currently subject. These installations will not result in any change in the amount of any air contaminant allowed to be emitted from the engines but may result in a reduction in the emission rate of one or more air contaminants from the levels now actually occurring.

The following is a summary of the conditions the Department proposes to place in the plan approval to ensure compliance with all applicable air quality regulatory requirements:

- 1. Under the requirements of Title V Operating Permit 59-00005 and the reasonably available control technology provisions of 25 Pa. Code §§ 129.91—129.95, the nitrogen oxides emissions from each of the five engines shall not exceed an emission rate of 8.60 pounds per hour while operating at full load/full speed conditions and an emission rate of 17.16 pounds per hour while operating at any other conditions following the installation of the screw-in prechamber system on the respective engine. Additionally, the emission of volatile organic compounds and carbon monoxide shall not exceed 2.30 and 10.37 pounds per hour respectively.
- 2. Within 120 days of the completion of installation of the screw-in prechamber system on each of the respective five engines, the engine shall be stack tested for nitrogen oxides, volatile organic compounds and carbon monoxide using reference method test procedures acceptable to the Department while the engine is operating at full load and full speed.
- 3. Under the requirements of Title V Operating Permit 59-00005 and the reasonably available control technology provisions of 25 Pa. Code §§ 129.91—129.95, semi-annual nitrogen oxides portable analyzer testing shall be performed on each engine.
- 4. Under the recordkeeping requirements of 25 Pa. Code § 129.95, records shall be maintained of the number of hours per month each engine is operated as well as the amount of fuel used each month in each engine.
- 5. Under the requirements of Title V Operating Permit 59-00005 and the reasonably available control technology provisions of 25 Pa. Code §§ 129.91—129.95, the engines shall only be fired on pipeline quality natural gas.
- 6. Under the requirements of Title V Operating Permit 59-00005 and the reasonably available control technology provisions of 25 Pa. Code §§ 129.91—129.95, the engines are not required to comply with the nitrogen oxides, volatile organic compound and carbon monoxide emission

limits specified in this plan approval during engine startup and shutdown provided that the duration of startup and shutdown does not exceed one hour per occurrence.

S. §§ 6020.101—6020.1305) (HSCA), notice is hereby provided that the Department of Environmental Protection (Department) has agreed to a de minimis Consent Order and Agreement (Agreement) with Ralph Hunter, Inc. (Hunter) concerning the resolution of its liability for the Avtex Fibers, Inc. mercury release and the Avtex Adjunct Mercury Sites (Sites). The Sites are located at 33 separate locations in Hayfield, Richmond, Spring, Union, Venango, Vernon and Woodcock Townships, Crawford County.

In 1995 and 1996, Hunter transported mercury-containing wastes (wastes) from the Avtex Fibers, Inc. facility in Vernon Township, Crawford County for use as fill material to various locations. The Sites received wastes for road base in the construction of access roads used for timbering, oil and gas exploration and residential driveways. These wastes contaminated the environment at the Sites. Mercury in the wastes is defined in section 103 of HSCA (35 P. S. § 6020.103) as a "hazardous substance." To date, the Department has removed the wastes from most of the Sites for proper off-site disposal (response). These responses will continue into the construction season for the year 2001, until all remaining specific Sites are completed. The estimated cost for all the responses for the Sites is approximately \$1,318,309. Those responses mitigated the threat to human health and the environment posed by the wastes.

As a transporter and operator during the time of the release and threatened release of hazardous substances at the Sites, Hunter is a "responsible person" as defined in section 103 of HSCA (35 P. S. § 6020.103). Under the terms of the Agreement, Hunter shall pay the Department \$48,000 to resolve its liability at the Sites. The specific terms of this settlement are set forth in the Agreement between Hunter and the Department. The Department will receive and consider comments relating to the Agreement for 60 days from the date of this Public Notice. The Department has the right to withdraw its consent to the Agreement if the comments concerning the

Agreement disclose facts or considerations, which indicate that the Agreement is inappropriate, improper, or not in the public interest.

After the public comment period, the Department's settlement with Hunter shall be effective upon the date that the Department notifies Hunter, in writing, that this Agreement is final and effective in its present form, and that the Department has filed a response to significant written comments to the Agreement, or that no such comments were received.

# Watershed Redesigation

The Storm Water Management Act (act) (32 P. S. §§ 680.1—680.19), requires Commonwealth counties to prepare and adopt watershed stormwater plans for designated watersheds. The intent of the act is to address the impacts of development on existing stormwater runoff levels and recommend measures to control accelerated runoff to prevent flood damage that could occur due to those development activities.

A watershed stormwater plan includes hydrologic and hydraulic evaluation of the drainage basin, consideration of existing drainage problems, existing and proposed flood control projects and their impacts, existing government regulatory mechanisms, and provides recommendations for the control of accelerated runoff as a result of development. The Department of Environmental Protection (Department) provides up to 75% funding assistance to counties for their watershed stormwater planning efforts.

Under section 14(a)(10) of the act (relating to powers and duties of the Department of Environmental Protection), the Department, in consultation with the counties, originally designated 353 watersheds in this entire Commonwealth. Those watersheds were approved by the Environmental Quality Board (Board) on May 31, 1980, with amendments on November 19, 1991, April 21, 1992, June 21, 1994, April 16, 1996, April 15, 1997, December 16, 1997 and most recently on March 20, 2001, bringing the current number of watersheds to 359.

Nine watersheds had previously been designated within Bucks County. The Bucks County Planning Commission requested that the Delaware River's direct drainage area located within the county boundary be redesignated into two separate watersheds as Delaware River (North) and Delaware River (South), for the purposes of stormwater planning under the act. On March 20, 2001, the Board approved this request to separate the watersheds at the Tinicum and Plumstead Township boundaries near the mouth of Tohickon Creek. This redesignation results in Bucks County having 10 watersheds for planning purposes.

Bucks County will take the lead role in preparing the watershed stormwater plans for the newly designated watersheds. The northern portion of the Delaware River (North) watershed drains to areas located in Northampton County. Northampton County has been informed that the redesignation will administratively affect the county. With the redesignations, Northampton County's ten watersheds, which previously were approved by the Board, result in 11 watersheds for planning purposes. The redesignation will enable Bucks County to undertake watershed planning separately, since each watershed has different topography, land uses and development pressures.

The Department conducted a preliminary evaluation of the hydrologic and hydraulic impacts of the redesignations on both of the redesignated watersheds and deter-

mined that there will not be any negative environmental impact from the redesignation action. Northampton County is expected to cooperate with Bucks County in undertaking watershed planning for the redesignated watershed within its jurisdiction.

The Department, subsequent to advertising in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* on June 10, 2000, held public hearings on June 27, 2000, at the office of the Bucks County Planning Commission and on June 28, 2000, at the Lehigh County Courthouse to accept public comments on the redesignations. The Bucks County Planning Commission and the Lehigh Valley Planning Commission supported Bucks County's petition at the respective public hearings. No adverse comments were received. The

public comment period following the hearings concluded on July 28, 2000, and no further comments were received.

This watershed redesignation is effective upon publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

The justification for establishing the final rates is that the regulations at 55 Pa. Code Chapter 1187 and the Commonwealth's approved Title XIX State Plan require that rates be set on a quarterly basis.

#### Appeals

Nursing facilities may appeal their final rates under 55 Pa. Code § 1187.141(a)(7). Under 55 Pa. Code § 1187.141 (c)(2), appeals must be filed within 30 days of the date of the Department's letter notifying the facility of its final rates. The filing of an appeal constitutes the exclusive way by which a nursing facility can present the Department with a demand that a final rate be modified, reversed, rescinded or otherwise altered, or with a demand that the Department increase the amount of reimbursement paid to the facility under that rate.

The estimated increase in annual aggregate expenditures for Medical Assistance nursing facility services for FY 2000-2001 based on these final rates is \$2.772 million (\$1.284 million in State funds).

The Department of Transportation plans to replace the existing Campbell's Bridge over Unami Creek on SR 4027, Allentown Road, Milford Township, Bucks County. The Project involves removal and replacement of the existing bridge, minor roadway realignment, and widening of the bridge approaches.

The proposed Project is subject to a Section 2002 Evaluation due to the use of two resources. The Project will have an "Adverse Effect" on Campbell's Bridge, listed on the National Register of Historic Places, which will be demolished and replaced with a new single or 2-span bridge traversing Unami Creek. Also, 0.29 acres of land will be used from the Milford Township Park for highway right-of-way.

PennDOT shall mitigate the impacts to the replacement of Campbell's Bridge in accordance with the Stipulations contained in the Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) signed by the State Historic Preservation Office, the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation, and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers. PennDOT shall ensure that all criteria and stipulations of the MOA are completed and properly documented as per the Conditions contained therein. Additionally, the adjacent Milford Township Park impacts will be minimized by avoiding all recreation facilities, and roadway embankment will be reseeded in indigenous grasses and specimen trees. The Sholl Mill House, an adjacent historic resource that is considered eligible for the National Register of Historic Places, will be unaffected by this Project.

I have considered the environmental, economic, social, and other effects of the proposed project as enumerated in Section 2002 of the Administrative Code, and have concluded that there is no feasible and prudent alternative to

the project as designed, and all reasonable steps have been taken to minimize such effect.

No adverse environmental effect is likely to result from the replacement of this bridge.

# **Actuarial Tables and Computational Procedures**

The act of December 20, 1995 (P. L. 689, No. 77) (Act 1995-77), amended subsections 8502(h) and (j) of the Public School Employees' Retirement Code (24 Pa.C.S. §§ 8101—8535) to require the Public School Employees' Retirement Board (Board) to publish in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* the actuarial tables and computational procedures used by the Public School Employees' Retirement System (PSERS) in calculating annuities and other benefits. The Board adopted the following actuarial tables at its December 14, 2000, meeting. Accordingly, these actuarial tables and computational procedures are being published as required by Act 1995-77.

The following material provides general information, examples and actuarial tables for computing an estimated retirement benefit from PSERS.

#### **General Information**

A key component in the computation of a PSERS' retirement benefit is the final average salary PSERS' retirement code defines final average salary as the highest compensation received as an active member for any three nonoverlapping periods of 12 consecutive months. Compensation for part-time service is annualized on the basis of the fractional portion of the school year for which credit is received. This period is frequently the most recent 3 year period.

Years of credited service are the number of years of school or creditable nonschool service for which eligible contributions have been made or for which salary deductions or other payment arrangements have been made.

Accumulated deductions are the total of a member's contributions (including contributions for purchase of service) and interest.

Actuarial tables which provide the factors to compute certain retirement benefits follow. It should be noted that gender distinctions are shown on various tables because certain retirement benefits are computed differently for males and females for credited service before July 1, 1983. The factors were determined actuarially based on the life expectancies for both males and females. The portion of the benefit for credited service earned prior to July 1, 1983 is computed using gender-distinct factors for males and females. The portion of the benefit for credited service on or after July 1, 1983, is computed using gender-neutral factors (both males and females use the more favorable factor which is most often the female factor).

#### **Retirement Benefit Calculation Examples**

The following data will be used for all option calculations, unless otherwise noted.

Final Average Salary — \$30,000

Years of Credited Service — 30 years

Member Sex and Age — Female, age 60

Beneficiary Sex and Age — Male, age 60

Accumulated Deductions — 38,000

# **Maximum Option**

The Maximum Option is a single life annuity and will provide the highest monthly amount to the member. If you die and have not received in retirement benefits your accumulated deductions, the total value protected remaining will be paid in a lump sum to your designated beneficiary.

# **Vested Benefits**

If you leave service anytime after completing 10 years of credited service and before you become eligible for normal retirement benefits, and do not wish to retire at that time, it will be necessary for you to complete an application to vest. Once your application is received by the Retirement System you are then automatically covered by the death benefit provisions. Approximately one year after the receipt of your application, the Retirement System will notify you of the accumulated deductions credited to your account, the total number of years of service, and maximum single life annuity available to you when you reach retirement age. As a vestee, normal retirement age is:

- \* when you reach age 62 if you have fewer than 30 years of credited service, or
- \* when you reach age 60 if you have 30 or more years of credited service.

Approximately 90 days prior to your eligibility for a monthly benefit as a vestee, you should contact PSERS and request an estimate under all the various options available and the necessary application for you to complete. This application must be returned to the Retirement System no later than 90 days after your eligibility date. As a vestee, it will be necessary for you to keep your mailing address current.

# **Early Retirement**

## (Withdrawal Allowance)
