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READER'S GUIDE TO THE PENNSYLVANIA BULLETIN AND PENNSYLVANIA CODE

Pennsylvania Bulletin

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the official gazette of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. It is published every week and includes a table of contents. A cumulative subject matter index is published quarterly.

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* serves several purposes. First, it is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, which is the official codification of agency rules and regulations and other statutorily authorized documents. Changes in the codified text, whether by adoption, amendment, repeal or emergency action must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. Further, agencies proposing changes to the codified text do so in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Second, the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* also publishes: Governor's Executive Orders; State Contract Notices; Summaries of Enacted Statutes; Statewide and Local Court Rules; Attorney General Opinions; Motor Carrier Applications before the Public Utility Commission; Applications and Actions before the Department of Environmental Protection; Orders of the Independent Regulatory Review Commission; and other documents authorized by law.

The text of certain documents published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the only valid and enforceable text. Courts are required to take judicial notice of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Adoption, Amendment or Repeal of Regulations

Generally an agency wishing to adopt, amend or repeal regulations must first publish in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking. There are limited instances where the agency may omit the proposal step; they still must publish the adopted version.

The Notice of Proposed Rulemaking contains the full text of the change, the agency contact person, a fiscal note required by law and background for the action.

The agency then allows sufficient time for public comment before taking final action. An adopted proposal must be published in the *Pennsylvania*

Bulletin before it can take effect. If the agency wishes to adopt changes to the Notice of Proposed Rulemaking to enlarge the scope, they must re-propose.

Citation to the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*

Cite material in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* by volume number and page number. Example: Volume 1, *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, page 801 (short form: 1 Pa.B. 801).

Pennsylvania Code

The *Pennsylvania Code* is the official codification of rules and regulations issued by Commonwealth agencies and other statutorily authorized documents. The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, printing changes as soon as they occur. These changes are then permanently codified by the *Pennsylvania Code Reporter*, a monthly, loose-leaf supplement.

The *Pennsylvania Code* is cited by title number and section number. Example: Title 10 *Pennsylvania Code*, § 1.1 (short form: 10 Pa.Code § 1.1).

Under the *Pennsylvania Code* codification system, each regulation is assigned a unique number by title and section. Titles roughly parallel the organization of Commonwealth government. Title 1 *Pennsylvania Code* lists every agency and its corresponding *Code* title location.

How to Find Documents

Search for your area of interest in the *Pennsylvania Code*.

The *Pennsylvania Code* contains, as Finding Aids, subject indexes for the complete *Code* and for each individual title, a list of Statutes Used As Authority for Adopting Rules and a list of annotated cases. Source Notes give you the history of the documents. To see if there have been recent changes, not yet codified, check the List of *Pennsylvania Code* Chapters Affected in the most recent issue of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* also publishes a quarterly List of Pennsylvania Code Sections Affected which lists the regulations in numerical order, followed by the citation to the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* in which the change occurred.

Printing Format

Material proposed to be added to an existing rule or regulation is printed in **bold face** and material proposed to be deleted from such a rule or regulation is enclosed in brackets [] and printed in **bold face**. Asterisks indicate ellipsis of *Pennsylvania Code* text retained without change. Proposed new or additional regulations are printed in ordinary style face.

Fiscal Notes

Section 612 of The Administrative Code of 1929 (71 P. S. § 232) requires that the Office of Budget prepare a fiscal note for regulatory actions and administrative procedures of the administrative departments, boards, commissions or authorities receiving money from the State Treasury stating whether the proposed action or procedure causes a loss of revenue or an increase in the cost of programs for the Commonwealth or its political subdivisions; that the fiscal note be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* at the same time as the proposed change is advertised; and that the fiscal note shall provide the following information: (1) the designation of the fund out of which the appropriation providing for expenditures under the action or procedure shall be made; (2) the probable cost for the fiscal year the program is implemented; (3) projected cost estimate of the program for each of the five succeeding fiscal years; (4) fiscal history of the program for which expenditures are to be made; (5) probable loss of revenue for the fiscal year of its implementation; (6) projected loss of revenue from the program for each of the five succeeding fiscal years; (7) line item, if any, of the General Appropriation Act or other appropriation act out of which expenditures or losses of Commonwealth funds shall occur as a result of the action or procedures; (8) recommendation, if any, of the Secretary of the Budget and the reasons therefor.

The required information is published in the foregoing order immediately following the proposed change to which it relates; the omission of an item indicates that the agency text of the fiscal note states that there is no information available with respect thereto. In items (3) and (6) information is set forth for the first through fifth fiscal years; in that order, following the year the program is implemented, which is stated. In item (4) information is set forth for the current and two immediately preceding years, in that order. In item (8) the recommendation, if any, made by the Secretary of Budget is published with the fiscal note. See 4 Pa. Code § 7.231 *et seq.* Where “no fiscal impact” is published, the statement means no additional cost or revenue loss to the Commonwealth or its local political subdivision is intended.

Effective Dates of Statutes

The effective dates specified above for laws and appropriation acts were contained in the applicable law or appropriation act. Where no date is specified or where the effective date specified is prior to the date of enactment, the effective date is 60 days after final enactment except for statutes making appropriations or affecting budgets of political subdivisions. See 1 Pa.C.S. §§ 1701—1704 (relating to effective dates of statutes).

Advance Copies of Statutes

Section 1106 of Title 1 of the *Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes* provides that the prothonotaries of each county shall file advance copies of statutes in their offices for public inspection until the Laws of Pennsylvania are generally available. Section 2406(h) of The Administrative Code of 1929 provides that the Department of General Services shall distribute advance sheets of the Laws of Pennsylvania to each law judge of the courts, to every county and public library of this Commonwealth and to each member of the General Assembly. These copies shall be furnished without charge. The Department shall also mail one copy of each law enacted during any legislative session to any person who pays to it the sum of \$20.

PENNSYLVANIA INTEREST ON LAWYERS TRUST ACCOUNT BOARD

PART IX. ACCESS TO JUSTICE ACT REGULATIONS

[204 PA. CODE CH. 401]

Eligibility Regulations Applicable to Access to Justice Act Funding

The Pennsylvania Interest on Lawyers Trust Account Board drafted the following proposed regulations to apply to activities and representations undertaken with Access to Justice Funding. This funding is provided pursuant to the Access to Justice Act, 42 Pa.C.S.A. § 4901 et seq.

The Pennsylvania Interest on Lawyers Trust Account Board requests that interested persons submit suggestions, comments, or objections concerning the proposed regulations in writing to the Pennsylvania Interest on Lawyers Trust Account Board directed to Alfred J. Azen, Executive Director, 115 State Street, P. O. Box 1025, Harrisburg, PA 17108-1025, no later than June 23, 2003. After the comment period, the Pennsylvania Interest on Lawyers Trust Account Board will decide whether to make any revisions to the proposed regulations. Then, the Pennsylvania Interest on Lawyers Trust Account Board shall submit the proposed regulations to the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania for its consideration. The Supreme Court of Pennsylvania is responsible for the promulgation of the Access to Justice Act regulations.

CHAPTER 401. ELIGIBILITY REGULATIONS APPLICABLE TO ACCESS TO JUSTICE ACT FUNDING

§ 401.1. Definition of Terms.

“Act” means the Access to Justice Act, Title 42, Chapter 49 of the *Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes*, and as it may be amended.

“Applicant” is the person who voluntarily requests legal assistance, or on whose behalf service is requested. The

Applicant is the determining factor in defining “individual or family status” for eligibility determination purposes.

“Fee-generating case” means any case or matter which, if undertaken on behalf of a client by an attorney in private practice, reasonably may be expected to result in a fee for legal services from an award to a client, from public funds, or from the opposing party.

“Eligible Legal Services Provider” is a not-for-profit entity incorporated in this Commonwealth, tax exempt under section 501(c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (Public Law 99-514, 26 U.S.C. § 501(c)(3)), or any successor provision, which operates within this Commonwealth for the primary purpose of providing civil legal services without charge, and which operates to provide such civil legal services to eligible clients and victims of abuse under contract or subcontract with the Department of Public Welfare for the expenditure of funds appropriated by the General Assembly for the provision of legal services.

“Emancipated Minor”

(a) An emancipated minor is a person under 21 years of age (irrespective of whether he/she is receiving services designed for adults or children) who either:

(1) is married, whether he/she lives within, or away from, his/her parent’s household; or

(2) has left the parental household or has established himself/herself as a separate entity within the parental household; and

(i) is acting for himself/herself independent of control by his/her parents, or persons acting as loco parentis; and

(ii) is financially independent of his/her parents, although he/she may be receiving financial assistance or benefits to which he/she is entitled in his/her own right.

(b) An unmarried minor who, after living outside the parental household, returns to live with his/her parents or someone acting in loco parentis, is no longer considered emancipated unless he/she remains independent of control by his/her parents or someone acting in loco parentis, and is financially independent of them although he/she may be receiving financial assistance or benefits in his/her own right.

“Family”

(a) A family is one or more adults and unemancipated minor children, if any, who are related by blood or law, and who reside in the same household.

A Family includes:

(1) one person and his/her unemancipated minor children (natural and adoptive) who reside in the same household;

(2) two persons in a marriage or common law relationship who reside in the same household;

(3) two persons in a marriage or common law relationship and their joint unemancipated minor children (natural and adoptive) who reside in the same household;

(4) two persons in a marriage or common law relationship and their joint unemancipated minor children (natural and adoptive) and the unemancipated minor children (natural and adoptive) of either/both persons who reside in the same household.

(5) two persons who are residing together with a child(ren) in common.

(b) A pregnant woman shall be counted as one person in the determination of family size.

(c) A man and woman who are legally free to marry, who agree to live together as husband and wife without benefit of a marriage license, and both publicly and privately consider themselves married are regarded as living in a common law relationship.

(d) A person defined as "Individual" is not included in a family grouping.

(e) A person may choose to count as a family member any other person(s) residing in the same household who is claimed by that person as a tax dependent.

"*Criminal proceeding*" means the adversary judicial process initiated by a formal complaint, information, or indictment charging a person with an offense denominated "criminal" by applicable law and punishable by death, imprisonment, a jail sentence, or a fine.

"*Individual*" is any of the following:

- (a) an emancipated minor;
- (b) an unemancipated minor living with persons other than his/her natural or adoptive parents;
- (c) an unemancipated minor living in a residential facility serving dependent and delinquent children;
- (d) an adult who resides alone;
- (e) an adult who resides with another related or unrelated adult, other than persons who are married including those living in a common law relationship.

"*Legal Assistance*" means the provisions of any legal services consistent with the Rules of Professional Conduct of the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania and with the purposes and provisions of the Act.

"*Lobbying Activities*" are any efforts to influence Federal, State or local legislative or administrative action, including, but not limited to, activities intended to influence the issuance, amendment or revocation of any executive or administrative order or regulation of a Federal, State or local agency, or to influence the introduction, amendment, passage or defeat of any legislation by the Congress of the United States or by any State or local legislative body.

"*Recipient*" means an eligible Legal Services Provider that receives a grant of funds derived from the Act.

"*Telephone Advice and Brief Service*" means civil legal assistance provided to eligible Applicants by Recipients through a telephone service system which provides legal advice, information and brief services at or near the time an eligible Applicant contacts the Recipient. Such telephone service systems are often referred to as "helplines" or "hotlines." Legal assistance provided through these systems is limited to advice and counsel, brief services, and referral after legal assessments when such activities are likely to address the problem without the need for in-person initial contact and within a short time from the contact by the eligible Applicant.

§ 401.2. Application for Legal Assistance.

(a) An individual eligibility determination requires completion of a dated application form containing information which enables the Recipient to determine an

Applicant's eligibility to receive the requested service.

(b) A written application is not required for general non-legal information and referral service.

(c) Application forms for extended services and in-person advice and brief services must be signed by the Applicant. The application form need not be signed by the Applicant for telephone advice and brief services.

(d) The application form must be completed by the Recipient from the information given by the Applicant, his/her authorized representative, or, by someone, including Recipient's staff, acting responsibly for the Applicant if he/she is physically incapable of completing an application form, or in an emergency situation.

(e) The Recipient shall ensure that the Applicant, or the person responsible for giving the information, receives all the help necessary to provide accurate and complete information. Arrangements must be made for an interpreter to assist non-English speaking, deaf, and visually handicapped Applicants, on an as-needed basis in those individual cases for whom no alternative methods for communication can be substituted effectively.

(f) Individual eligibility determinations are made using the declaration method. The declaration method is the acceptance of an Applicant's statements that he/she meets the applicable eligibility criteria. This does not preclude the requirement to obtain documentation when needed to comply with requirements of funding sources of the grant Recipient organization. Documentation also can be required and obtained if there is substantial reason to doubt the accuracy or completeness of the information provided by the Applicant, but such documentation must be obtained in a manner that promotes the development of trust between the attorney and client.

§ 401.3. Eligibility Criteria.

Those financially eligible for civil legal assistance are:

(a) Applicants whose family monthly gross income does not exceed 125% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines, as published annually in the *Federal Register* by the Department of Health and Human Services, adjusted according to family size.

(b) The Commonwealth of Pennsylvania authorizes the issuance of medical assistance based upon the combination of income and certain public policy circumstances. When an Applicant has a current medical access card for a category for which eligibility is based upon 125% of poverty income, no additional eligibility determination is needed for legal assistance.

(c) The Applicant must be a resident of Pennsylvania. No requirements as to citizenship or length of residence in the State may be imposed as a condition of eligibility. Temporary absences from Pennsylvania, with subsequent returns, or with a plan to return when the purpose of the absence, such as a trip or a visit, has been accomplished, do not interrupt residence. Out-of-State students and foreign students who are living in Pennsylvania while attending an education or job-training institution in Pennsylvania are considered residents of Pennsylvania. Migrant workers who are seasonally employed or seeking seasonal employment in Pennsylvania are considered residents of Pennsylvania.

(d) Legal assistance may be provided without regard to income when the Applicant is in need of protective services under the Protection from Abuse Act.

(e) *Authorized Exceptions to Income Eligibility.* The governing body of the recipient may adopt policies for the provision of legal assistance under the Act to an applicant whose family, monthly gross income, does not exceed 150 percent of the 125% of poverty eligibility income level (i.e. 187.5% of poverty income level). The determination of family, monthly gross income shall be made pursuant to the income inclusions and exclusions defined within Sections 401.4 and 401.5 except that the definition of medical expenses is modified as included below in (f)(2). When a recipient's policies provide for authorized exceptions to income eligibility, legal assistance can be provided when:

(1) The Applicant's circumstances require that eligibility should be allowed on the basis of one or more of the factors set forth in Section 401.3(f); or

(2) The person is seeking legal assistance to secure benefits provided by a governmental program for the poor.

In the event that a recipient determines to serve a person whose family, monthly gross income exceeds 125% of poverty, the factual basis for the decision shall be documented and retained by the recipient.

(f) Factors which shall be used in the determination of the eligibility of clients over the 125% of poverty income level shall include:

(1) Current income prospects, taking into account seasonal variations in income;

(2) Medical expenses, and in exceptional instances, with the prior, written approval of the Recipient's project director based on written documentation received by the recipient and available for review, if an Applicant's family, monthly gross income is primarily committed to medical or nursing home expenses, a person may be served even if that person's gross income exceeds 187.5 percent of the poverty income eligibility level;

(3) Fixed debts and obligations, including unpaid Federal, state and local taxes from prior years;

(4) Child care, transportation, and other expenses necessary for employment;

(5) Expenses associated with age or physical infirmity of resident family members; and

(6) Other significant factors related to financial inability to afford legal assistance.

(g) A Recipient may provide legal assistance to a group, non-profit corporation, association or other entity if the Recipient has determined that the group, non-profit corporation or association or other entity lacks and has not practical means of obtaining private counsel in the matter for which representation is sought and:

(1) at least a majority of the group's members are financially eligible for legal assistance; or

(2) for a non-membership group, at least a majority of the individuals who are forming or operating the group are financially eligible for legal assistance; or

(3) the group has as its principal function or activity the delivery of services to those persons in the community who would be financially eligible for legal assistance; or

(4) the group has as its principal function or activity the furtherance of the interests of those persons in the community who would be financially eligible for legal assistance and the representation sought relates to such function or activity.

In order to make a determination that a group, non-profit corporation, association or other entity is eligible for legal services as required by paragraph (a) of this section, a recipient shall collect information that reasonably demonstrates that the group, corporation, association or other entity meets the eligibility requirements set forth herein.

§ 401.4. Income Inclusions.

The sources of income to be included in determining the total monthly gross income are:

(a) money wages or salary earned by individuals 14 years of age or older before deductions for taxes, social security, bonds, pensions, union dues, health insurance, and similar purposes for work performed as an employee including commissions, tips, piece-rate payments, and cash bonuses;

(b) Armed Forces pay which includes base pay plus cash housing and/or subsistence allowances, but does not include the value of rent-free quarters;

(c) voluntary or court-ordered spousal and/or child support received by a present or former spouse;

(d) voluntary or court-ordered child support;

(e) net income from non-farm self employment, defined as gross receipts minus expenses from one's own business, professional enterprise, or partnership. Gross receipts include the value of all goods sold and service rendered. Business expenses include costs of goods purchased, rent, heat, light, power, depreciation charges, wages and salaries paid, business taxes (no personal income taxes), and similar expenses. Inventory changes may be considered in determining net income only when they are documented by income tax returns or other official records which reflect inventory changes. The value of marketable merchandise consumed by the proprietors of retail stores is not included as part of net income;

(f) net income from farm self-employment, defined as gross receipts minus operating expenses from the operation of a farm by a person on his/her own account, as an owner, renter, or share-cropper. Gross receipts include the value of all products sold, government subsidies crop loans, money received from the rental of farm equipment to others, and incidental receipts from the sale of wood, sand gravel and similar items. Operating expenses include the cost of feed, fertilizer, seed, and other farming supplies, cash wages paid to farm hands, depreciation charges, cash rent, interest on farm mortgages, farm building repairs, farm taxes (not State and Federal income taxes), and similar expenses. The value of fuel, food, or other farm products used for family living is not included as part of net income. Inventory changes may be considered in determining net income only when they are documented by income tax returns or other official records which reflect inventory changes;

(g) net income from non-resident real property income, defined as gross receipts minus the expenses for continuing the income such as depreciation charges, business taxes (not personal income taxes), interest on mortgage, repairs, and similar expenses;

(h) Social Security pensions, survivors' benefits, permanent disability insurance payments, and special benefit payments made by the Social Security Administration before deductions of health insurance premiums;

(i) Railroad retirement, disability, and survivors' benefit payments made by the U. S. Government under the

Railroad Retirement Act before deductions of health insurance premiums;

(j) State Blind Pension payments made by the Department of Public Welfare;

(k) Public assistance or welfare payments such as General Assistance, SSI and State Supplemental payments, only when the person is not the Applicant;

(l) private pension and annuities, including retirement benefits paid to a retired person or his/her survivors by a former employer or by a union, either directly or through an insurance company;

(m) government employee pensions received from retirement pensions paid by Federal, State, County, or other governmental agencies to former employees including members of the Armed Forces or their survivors;

(n) unemployment compensation received from government unemployment agencies or private companies during periods of unemployment and any strike benefits received from union funds;

(o) worker's compensation received from private or public insurance companies for injuries incurred at work. The cost of this insurance must have been paid by the employer and not by the worker;

(p) Veterans payments, defined as money paid periodically by the Veterans Administration to disabled members of the Armed Forces or to the survivors of deceased veterans, and subsistence allowances, paid to veterans for education and on-the-job training, as well as the so-called "refunds" paid to ex-service persons as GI insurance premiums. The two basic educational programs sponsored by the Veterans Administration are the G. I. Bill Educational Training Program and the VA Vocational Rehabilitation Program. There is a different method for providing funds to veterans in these programs. The veteran in G. I. Bill Education Training Program receives a monthly sum which may be used totally for education or subsistence, or partially for education and partially for subsistence. The VA calls this monthly sum a "rate." Therefore, all the money received by the G. I. Bill veteran is counted as income. The Veteran in a VA Vocational Rehabilitation Program receives what the VA calls a "subsistence allowance" and the VA itself handles the educational costs directly. Therefore, for the disabled veteran in the Vocational Rehabilitation Program, the subsistence allowance and the veteran's disability allowance is counted as income;

(q) dividends including dividends from stockholdings or membership in association;

(r) interest on savings checking accounts and bonds;

(s) income from estates and trust funds;

(t) net income from royalties;

(u) net income from room and board payments, paid singly or in combination, and for rent from apartments, determined by deducting the sum of (1) and (2) from the total gross receipts.

(1) Deductions for minimal costs:

(i) \$10 per month for each tenant (lone person) or tenant group (two or more persons living together as a family normally would) whose rent arrangements with the landlord/landlady are independent of other persons, or

(ii) \$20 per month for each boarder, or

(iii) \$30 per month for each separate tenant-boarder (person not included in (a) or (b) above) whose rent and board arrangements with the landlord/landlady are independent of other persons.

(iv) \$30 per month for the first person and \$20 per month for each additional person in a tenant-boarder group (persons not included in (a), (b), or (c) above) whose joint rent and board arrangements with the landlord/landlady are independent of other persons, and;

(2) The following amount is deducted to recognize costs above the minimum: 50% of the remainder after the deduction in (1).

§ 401.5. Income Exclusions.

Sources of income not counted in determining monthly gross income and income exclusions are:

(a) earnings of a child under 14 years of age;

(b) any medical expense not reimbursed through medical insurance which exceeds 10% of the total family monthly gross income. The medical expense must have been incurred within 90 days from the date of the application and be expected to continue or be incurred for a period of six months after the application. Medical expenses include bills for doctors, hospital costs, dental services, and health care premiums;

(c) voluntary or court-ordered child support paid out by the Primary Recipient or a member of his/her family to a present or former spouse not residing in the same household;

(d) voluntary or court-ordered child support paid out by the Primary Recipient or a member of his/her family for his/her child who is not residing in the same household;

(e) payments made pursuant to the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act, to the extent that such payments are exempt from taxation under Section 21(a) of the Act;

(f) per capita payment to, or funds held in trust for, any individual in satisfaction or judgment of the Indian Claims Commission or the court of claims;

(g) money received from the sale of property, such as stocks bonds, a house, or a car unless the person was engaged in the business of selling such property, in which case the net proceeds would be counted as income from self-employment;

(h) withdrawals of bank deposits;

(i) money borrowed;

(j) tax refunds including tax rebate from any source;

(k) gifts;

(l) lump sum inheritances or insurance payments;

(m) lump sum lottery winnings;

(n) capital gains;

(o) the value of the coupon allotment under the Food Stamp Act of 1964, as amended, in excess of the amount paid for the coupons;

(p) the value of USDA donated foods;

(q) the value of supplemental foods assistance under the child Nutrition Act of 1966 and the special food service programs of children under the National School Lunch Act, as amended;

(r) loans and grants, such as scholarships, obtained and used under conditions that preclude their use of current living costs;

(s) any grant or loan, to an under-graduate student for education purposes, made or insured under any program administered by the Commissioner of Education under the Higher Education Act;

(t) any payment received under the Uniform Relocation Assistance and Real Property Acquisition Policies Act of 1970;

(u) any home produce used for household consumption;

(v) the value of rent-free quarters;

(w) any payment made on behalf of any individual for household expenses such as rent, food, utilities;

(x) payments to VISTA volunteers pursuant to Section 404(g) of the Domestic Assistance Act of 1973;

(y) any payments to vendors by a State agency including foster care payments;

(z) payments made to an institution by an Applicant's relative or other person for the costs of institutional care for the Applicant; and

(aa) stipends derived from the Foster Grandparents Programs under P. L. 93-113, Section 404(9).

§ 401.6. Change in Circumstances.

If an eligible client becomes financially ineligible through a change in circumstances, a Recipient shall discontinue representation if the change in circumstances is sufficiently likely to continue such that the client could afford private legal assistance, and discontinuation is not inconsistent with the attorney's professional responsibilities.

§ 401.7. Grievance Procedure.

(a) *Complaints about legal assistance.*

(1) A Recipient shall establish procedures for determining the validity of a complaint about the manner or quality of legal assistance that has been rendered.

(2) The procedures shall provide at least:

(i) Information to a client at the time of the initial visit about how to make a complaint, and

(ii) Prompt consideration of each complaint by the director of the Recipient, or the director's designee, and, if the director of the Recipient is unable to resolve the matter,

(iii) An opportunity for complainant to submit an oral and written statement to a member(s) of the Recipient's grievance committee established by the governing body, preferably a board member who is himself/herself client eligible.

(3) A file containing every complaint and a statement of its disposition shall be preserved for examination. The file shall include any written statement submitted by the complainant.

(b) *Complaints about denial of assistance.* A Recipient shall establish a simple procedure for review of a decision that a person is financially ineligible, or that assistance is prohibited by the Act or Regulations, or by priorities established by the Recipient pursuant to section 401.9. The procedure shall include information about how to make a complaint, adequate notice, an opportunity to confer with the director of the Recipient or the director's designee, and, to the extent practicable, with a represent-

ative of the governing body, preferably a board member who is himself/herself client eligible.

§ 401.8. Prohibited Use.

Recipients of funds under this Act are prohibited from using them for the following purposes:

(a) *Political and Lobbying Activities.* Funds shall not be used to contribute to or be made available to any political party or association, or the campaign of any candidate for public or party office or similar political activities or to support or oppose candidates from public or party office or to support or oppose candidates for public or party office or to support or oppose any ballot questions or to engage in lobbying activities, except that:

(1) A Recipient of funds may engage in lobbying activities in response to a request from a governmental agency, legislative body, committee, member or staff thereof made to the recipient, consistent with the Rules of Professional Conduct.

(2) A Recipient may engage in lobbying activities in the provision of legal services to an eligible client on a particular application, claim or case, which directly involves that client's legal rights and responsibilities, however this shall not be construed to a permit a Recipient to solicit a client, in violation of the Rules of Professional Conduct, for the purpose of making such representation possible.

(b) *Fee generating case.* Funds shall not be used to provide legal assistance in a fee-generating case unless other adequate representation is unavailable. All Recipients shall establish procedures for the referral of fee-generating cases.

(1) Other adequate representative is deemed to be unavailable when the Recipient has determined that free referral is not possible because:

(i) The case has been rejected by the local lawyer referral service, or by two private attorneys, or the Recipient's experience within the previous six months with similar cases is that the current case will not be accepted by a private attorney; or

(ii) Neither the referral service nor any lawyer will consider the case without payment of a consultation fee; or

(iii) Emergency circumstances compel immediate action before referral can be made, but the client is advised that if appropriate, and consistent with professional responsibility, referral will be attempted at a later time; or

(2) Recovery of damages is not the principal object of the case and a request for damages is merely ancillary to an action for equitable or other non-pecuniary relief, or inclusion of a counterclaim requesting damages is necessary for effective defense or because of applicable rules governing joinder of counterclaims; or

(3) A court appoints a Recipient or an employee of a Recipient pursuant to a statute or a court rule or practice of equal applicability to all attorneys in the jurisdiction; or

(4) An eligible client is seeking benefits under Subchapter II of the Social Security Act, 42 U.S.C. 401, et seq., as amended, Federal Old Age, Survivors, and Disability Insurance Benefits; or Subchapter XVI of the Social Security Act, 42 U.S.C. 1381, et seq., as amended, Supplemental Security Income for Aged, Blind, and Disabled.

(5) A Recipient may seek and accept a fee awarded or approved by a court or administrative body, or included in a settlement, if the requirements of subsection 401.8(b)(1) are met.

(6) When a case or matter subject to this sub-section results in a recovery of damages, other than statutory benefits, a Recipient may accept reimbursement from the client for out-of-pocket costs and expenses incurred in connection with the case or matter, if

(i) The requirements of sub-section 401.8(b)(1) are met, and

(ii) The client has agreed in writing to reimburse the Recipient for such costs and expenses.

(7) Nothing in this part shall prevent a Recipient from:

(i) Requiring a client to pay court fees when the client does not qualify to proceed *in forma pauperis* under the rules of the jurisdiction; or

(ii) Acting as a co-counsel with a private attorney when the case meets the standards set forth in sub-section 401.8(b)(1) and accepting part of any fees that may result from a shared case.

(c) *Defense of Criminal Prosecutions.*

(1) Funds shall not be used to provide legal assistance with respect to a criminal proceeding, unless authorized by sub-section 401.8(c)(2).

(2) Legal assistance may be provided with respect to a criminal proceeding;

(i) Pursuant to a court appointment made under a statute or a court rule or practice of equal applicability to all attorneys in the jurisdiction, if authorized by the Recipient after a determination that it is consistent with the Recipient's primary responsibility to provide legal assistance to clients in civil matters; or

(ii) When professional responsibility requires representation in a criminal proceeding arising out of a transaction with respect to which the client is being, or has been, represented by a Recipient.

(3) *Actions Attacking Criminal Convictions.* Funds shall not be used to provide legal assistance in civil actions to persons who have been convicted of a criminal charge where the civil action arises out of alleged acts or failures to act and the action is brought against an official of the court or against a law enforcement official for the purpose of challenging the validity of the criminal conviction.

However, this sub-section does not prohibit legal assistance pursuant to a court appointment made under a statute or a court rule or practice of equal applicability to all attorneys in the jurisdiction, if authorized by the Recipient after a determination that it is consistent with the primary responsibility of the Recipient to provide legal assistance to eligible clients in civil matters.

(d) *Statutory Right to Counsel.* Funds shall not be used to provide legal assistance in cases in which the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania has an obligation to provide counsel to the indigent through another source identified by statute.

§ 401.9. Priorities in Allocation of Resources.

Recipients daily must make decisions concerning what cases to handle, what area of client need to pursue, what models of delivery of services to choose, what communities to serve, and related issues. A high quality Recipient program responds effectively to changing client needs and

integrates its priority setting process into its daily operations. This section is intended to assure that Recipients plan and perform services provided under the Act in a way that responds to existing and changing client and community needs, promptly and strategically.

(a) The governing body of a Recipient shall adapt procedures for establishing priorities in the allocation of its resources. The procedures adopted shall:

(1) Include an effective appraisal of the needs of eligible clients in the geographic areas served by the Recipient;

(2) Insure an opportunity for participation by representatives of all significant segments of the client community and the Recipient's employees in the setting of priorities.

(b) The following factors could be among those considered by the Recipient in establishing priorities:

(1) the appraisal described in paragraph (a)(1) of this section;

(2) the population of eligible clients in the geographic areas served by the Recipient, including all significant segments of that population with special legal problems or special difficulties of access to legal services;

(3) the resources of the Recipient;

(4) the availability of another source of free or low-cost legal assistance in a particular category of cases or matters;

(5) the availability of other sources of training, support, and outreach services;

(6) the relative importance of particular legal problems of the individual clients of the recipient;

(7) the susceptibility of particular problems to solution through legal processes;

(8) whether legal efforts by the recipient will complement other efforts to solve particular problems in the area served; and

(9) whether legal efforts will result in efficient and economic delivery of legal services.

(c) A Recipient shall allocate resources consistent with the purposes and requirements of the Act and regulations, and in a manner that assures such resources are put to their highest and best use in meeting client needs. To the extent possible efforts should be made to provide that all potentially eligible clients in the Recipients' service area have reasonably equal access to similar types of services. If the governing body of the Recipient so desires, the types of services may vary so as to take into account different priorities in different parts of the Recipient's service area, a higher incidence of a particular kind of problem, the considerably higher costs of providing services, or differences in individual client financial resources.

(d) The governing body of a Recipient shall establish policies and procedures that assure clients that cases which are accepted for representation of eligible clients substantially comply with the priorities adopted by the Recipient.

(e) *Annual Review.* Priorities shall be set periodically and shall be reviewed by the Recipient at least annually.

Title 49—PROFESSIONAL AND VOCATIONAL STANDARDS

STATE BOARD OF CERTIFIED REAL ESTATE APPRAISERS

[49 PA. CODE CH. 36]

Biennial Renewal Fees and Examination Fees

The State Board of Certified Real Estate Appraisers (Board) amends § 36.6 (relating to fees) to read as set forth in Annex A.

The final-form rulemaking raises the biennial renewal fees for certified general and residential real estate appraisers and certified Pennsylvania evaluators from \$105 to \$225; establishes a biennial renewal fee of \$225 for certified brokers/appraisers; deletes the examination fees for certified general and residential real estate appraisers and certified Pennsylvania evaluators; and makes editorial changes to the description of the fees. The new biennial renewal fees will initially apply to certificateholders who renew their certifications for the biennial renewal period that begins July 1, 2003.

Summary of Comments and Responses to Proposed Rulemaking

The Board published a notice of proposed rulemaking at 32 Pa.B. 4871 (October 5, 2002) with a 30-day public comment period. The Board received comments from the Pennsylvania Association of Realtors (PAR).

The Board also received comments from the Independent Regulatory Review Commission (IRRC) and the House Professional Licensure Committee (House Committee) as part of their review of proposed rulemaking under the Regulatory Review Act (71 P. S. §§ 745.1—745.12). The Board did not receive comments from the Senate Committee on Consumer Protection and Professional Licensure (Senate Committee) as part of its review of proposed rulemaking under the Regulatory Review Act.

IRRC asked whether the Board had considered gradual fee increases, instead of a one-time fee increase, as a solution to its growing budget deficit. PAR recommended that the Board phase in the increases over the next two biennial renewal cycles.

As noted during proposed rulemaking, the Department of State's Bureau of Finance and Operations (BFO) had advised the Board that to close the widening gap between revenues and expenses, the Board needed to establish uniform biennial renewal fees in an amount between \$200 and \$250 for all certificateholders, effective with the 2003-2005 biennial renewal period. The board had opted for the midpoint fee of \$225, which, according to BFO estimates would generate sufficient revenues to permit comfortable positive balances during the next several fiscal years, thereby obviating the need for additional fee increases in the foreseeable future.

In light of the comments submitted by PAR and IRRC, the Board asked the BFO if it would be possible to have graduated fee increases while still generating sufficient revenues. In January, the BFO reported that the Board could generate the same revenues as would be realized

under the one-time fee increase if the biennial renewal fees were increased to \$200, \$225 and \$250 for the 2003-2005, 2005-2007 and 2007-2009 biennial renewal periods, respectively.

Given the temporary and relatively modest savings to certificateholders under the graduated approach, the Board believes certificateholders would prefer a one-time fee increase now rather than fee increases over the next three biennial renewal cycles, particularly since the latter would lead to higher biennial renewal fees than what were contemplated during proposed rulemaking.

IRRC also asked whether the Board's general expenses are distributed equally among its certification classes (that is, general appraiser, residential appraiser, broker/appraiser and certified Pennsylvania evaluator) and, if not, whether the biennial renewal fees could be adjusted to reflect each certification class's share of the overall expenses.

According to the BFO, it is not possible to reliably determine what portion of the Board's general expenses can be apportioned to each certification class. As a consequence, the fairest formula is to require every certificateholder, regardless of certification class, to share equally in defraying the Board's general expenses.

The House Committee asked for a detailed breakdown of the expenses that justify the imposition of new biennial renewal fees. During proposed rulemaking, the Board stated that its annual expenses have risen steadily in the nearly 12 years since its inception as a licensing board within the Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs (BPOA). The following information, prepared by the BFO, breaks down the Board's annual expenses of \$190,577 for FY95-96 and projected annual expenses of \$505,000 for FY02-03 by "cost center":

As reflected in the previous chart, the most significant increases in the Board's expenses involve the legal and law enforcement areas. These amounts reflect substantial growth in complaint and disciplinary activity relating to the Board. From 1990—1996, the BPOA received 231 complaints alleging violations of either the Real Estate Appraisers Certification Act (REACA) (63 P. S. §§ 457.1—457.19) or the Assessors Certification Act (ACA) (63 P. S. §§ 458.1—458.16). During this period, the Board imposed seven disciplinary sanctions. From 1997—2001, the BPOA received 607 complaints regarding alleged violations of the REACA or the ACA, while the Board imposed 125 disciplinary sanctions. Whereas many of the complaints in the early years involved jurisdictional matters, a sizeable number of the more recent complaints allege violations of professional appraisal practice standards by certificateholders. These latter complaints tend to involve complex disciplinary issues, often requiring more specialized investigation or review by expert consultants.

Another significant area of increase in the Board's expenses relates to its administrative operations. This increase is attributable in large part to the higher level of training required of the Board's administrative staff as compared to administrative staff assigned to other business boards within the BPOA.

Fiscal Impact

According to BFO projections, the final-form rulemaking will generate approximately \$621,000 in additional biennial renewal fee revenues as follows:

Paperwork Requirements

The final-form rulemaking will require the Board to change its biennial renewal forms to reflect the new fees. The final-form rulemaking will not create additional paperwork requirements for certificateholders.

Effective Date

The final-form rulemaking will become effective upon publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* and will initially apply to certificateholders who renew their certifications for the 2003-2005 biennial renewal period.

Statutory Authority

Section 5(6) of the REACA (63 P. S. § 457.5(6)) authorizes the Board to establish fees for its operations.

Section 9 of the REACA (63 P. S. § 457.9) requires the Board to establish fees by regulation and to ensure that revenues derived from fees, fines and civil penalties are adequate to cover the Board's expenditures over a biennial period. Section 9 of the ACA (63 P. S. § 458.9) authorizes the Board to establish renewal and other fees relating to certified Pennsylvania evaluators by regulation.

Regulatory Review

Under section 5(a) of the Regulatory Review Act (71 P. S. § 745.5(a)), on September 25, 2002, the Board submitted a copy of the notice of proposed rulemaking, published at 32 Pa.B. 4871, to IRRC and to the Chairper-

sons of the House and Senate Committees for review and comment.

Under section 5(c) of the Regulatory Review Act, IRRC and the Committees were provided with copies of the comments received during the public comment period, as well as other documents when requested. In preparing this final-form rulemaking, the Department has considered the comments received from IRRC, the House Committees and the public. The Board did not receive comments from the Senate Committee.

On March 31, 2003, the Board submitted this final-form rulemaking to IRRC and the House and Senate Committees. Under section 5.1(j.2) of the Regulatory Review Act (71 P. S. § 745.5a(j.2)), on April 15, 2003, this final-form rulemaking was deemed approved by the House Committee. On May 7, 2003, this final-form rulemaking was deemed approved by the Senate Committee. Under section 5.1(e) of the Regulatory Review Act, IRRC met on May 8, 2003, and approved the final-form rulemaking.

Emission Inspection Program

The Department of Transportation (Department), Bureau of Motor Vehicles (Bureau), adopts amendments to Chapter 177 (relating to emission inspection program) to read as set forth in Annex A by adding provisions to include alternative final exhaust emission standards recently developed by the Federal Environmental Protection Agency (EPA).

The inspection/maintenance (I/M) program, implemented under the authority of 75 Pa.C.S. §§ 4103, 4531, 4701, 4706, 4707, 4710, 6103 and 9104, is required by the Federal Clean Air Act (Clean Air Act), as amended by Pub. L. No. 101-52, 104 Stat. 2399—2712 (42 U.S.C.A. §§ 7401—26718) and Pub. L. No. 104-59, 109 Stat. 568 (1995) (known as the National Highway System Designation Act of 1995).

Proposed rulemaking is omitted under 75 Pa.C.S. § 4706 (relating to prohibition on expenditures for emission inspection program), which exempts this final-omitted rulemaking from the proposed rulemaking provisions of the act of July 31, 1968 (P. L. 769, No. 240) (45 P. S. §§ 1201 and 1202), known as the Commonwealth Documents Law, the Regulatory Review Act (71 P. S. §§ 745.1—745.12) and 75 Pa.C.S. § 4710 (relating to Vehicle Emission System Inspection Program Advisory Committee), which provides for initial submission of final regulations relating to the Vehicle Emission Inspection Program to the Office of Attorney General for review as to form and legality and thereafter to the Independent Regulatory Review Commission (IRRC) and the designated committees of the House of Representatives and the Senate, in accordance with the Regulatory Review Act.

Purpose of this Chapter

The purpose of this chapter is to implement an emissions I/M program as required by the Clean Air Act (42 U.S.C.A. §§ 7401—7671q) and the regulations promulgated thereunder, 40 CFR Parts 51 and 85 (relating to regulations for preparation, adoption and submittal of implementation plans; and control of air pollution from mobile sources).

Purpose of the Final-Omitted Rulemaking

The purpose of the final-omitted rulemaking is to include alternative final exhaust emission standards recently developed by the EPA. By memorandum dated August 16, 2002, the EPA provided alternative final exhaust emission standards for states to consider for use in I/M programs using the Acceleration Simulation Mode (ASM) Test. The alternative exhaust emission standards were generated in response to evaluations of the original final exhaust emission standards that suggested application of the original exhaust emission standards would result in false failures. Chapter 177, Appendix A, has been amended to include the alternative final exhaust emission standards.

Significant Provisions of the Final-Omitted Rulemaking

The significant amendments to this chapter have been amended to include the alternative final exhaust emission standards.

Persons and Entities Affected

The final-omitted rulemaking will affect the owners and operators of vehicles registered in the counties in this Commonwealth in which the I/M program uses the ASM test.

Fiscal Impact

The final-omitted rulemaking may result in savings to vehicle owners in the form of a lower false failure rate of vehicles subjected to the ASM test and subsequent avoidance of possibly unnecessary repairs and retesting. The Department cannot, however, measure with any precision what costs and savings may result.

Regulatory Review

Under 75 Pa.C.S. § 4710(d), on March 28, 2003, the Department submitted a copy of this final-omitted rulemaking to the Office of Attorney General. The final-omitted rulemaking was approved as to form and legality by the Office of Attorney General on March 31, 2003. The Department submitted a copy of this final-omitted rulemaking on April 9, 2003, to IRRC and to the Chairpersons of the House and Senate Transportation Committees and to the House and Senate Environmental Resources and Energy Committees for review under the Regulatory Review Act. This final-omitted rulemaking was deemed approved by the Committees on April 29, 2003, and was approved by IRRC on May 8, 2003.

In addition to the final-form rulemaking, the Committees were provided with a copy of a detailed Regulatory Analysis Form prepared by the agency. A copy of this material is available to the public upon request.

In preparing this final-form rulemaking, the Department has considered the comments received from the EPA, the public and individuals in the business of vehicle inspection and repair.

Sunset Provisions

The Department is not establishing a sunset date for this final-omitted rulemaking since the regulation is necessary to comply with requirements of Federal laws relating to control of vehicle emissions.

DELAWARE RIVER BASIN COMMISSION

Public Hearing on Proposal to Revise the Fee Schedule for Review of Projects

The Delaware River Basin Commission (Commission) will hold a public hearing to solicit comments on proposed changes to the fee schedule for the review of projects under section 3.8 and Article 10 of the Delaware River Basin Compact. The Commission instituted project review fees in 1972 to allocate to applicants a portion of the cost of reviewing water resource projects. The fees, which are paid to the Commission at the time applications are filed, were increased only once, in 1991, and have not been revised since.

The substantive revisions include the following: instituting filing fees for projects sponsored by political subdivisions of the basin states; for public projects costing less than \$250,000, charging a fee of \$250; for privately sponsored projects costing \$250,000 or less, increasing the fee from \$250 to \$500; for projects costing from \$250,001 to \$10 million, increasing the fee from 0.1% to 0.2% of project cost; and for projects costing over \$10 million, increasing the fee from 0.04% to 0.06% of project cost, not to exceed \$50,000. In addition, the surcharge for any project resulting in an out-of-basin diversion is proposed to be increased from 50% to double the fee calculated in accordance with the foregoing. The method of calculating project costs is proposed to remain unchanged. New fees are proposed to be instituted for two types of actions: (1) a fee of \$5,000 is proposed for a request for an emergency certificate under section 2.3.9B of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure to waive or amend a docket condition; and (2) a fee of \$500 is proposed for the transfer of a docket upon a change of ownership as defined in Resolution No. 87-15. In all cases, if the fixed fee or fee calculated in accordance with the prescribed formulas is deemed by the executive director to be insufficient due to exceptional costs associated with Commission review, it is proposed that the Commission may charge the applicant 100% of all costs deemed by the executive director to be exceptional. The revised fee schedule is proposed to become effective on July 1, 2003, for all applications submitted on or after July 1, 2003.

The public hearing will be held on June 26, 2003, during the Commission's regular business meeting, which will begin at 1 p.m. The hearing will continue until all those present who wish to testify are afforded an opportunity to do so. Persons wishing to testify are asked to register in advance with the Commission Secretary, (609) 883-9500, Ext. 203. Written comments will be accepted through the close of the public hearing.

Dog Control Facility Bill Reimbursement Grant Program

The Department of Agriculture (Department) hereby gives notice of the guidelines and conditions under which it will award up to \$250,000 in grants under the Year 2004 Dog Control Facility Bill Reimbursement Program (Program). The Program will award bill reimbursement grants of up to \$10,000 per recipient to humane societies or associations for the prevention of cruelty to animals that meet the guidelines and conditions of this Program. The Program will be funded from the Dog Law Restricted Account from funds which are declared to be "surplus" funds for the limited purposes set forth in section 1002(b) of the Dog Law (3 P. S. § 459-1002(b)).

A proposed version of these guidelines and conditions was published at 33 Pa.B. 1724 (April 5, 2003). The Department invited public and legislative review of these proposed guidelines and conditions in accordance with 7 Pa. Code § 23.4 (relating to guidelines and conditions). No comments were received. The Department attributes this, in part, to the fact that the Program is quite similar to last year's Year 2003 Dog Control Facility Bill Reimbursement Grant Program (published at 32 Pa.B. 4372 (September 7, 2002)) and, in part, to the fact the Department consulted with affected entities in the process of drafting the proposed guidelines and conditions.

Guidelines and Conditions for the Year 2004 Dog Control Facility Bill Reimbursement Grant Program

1. Definitions.

The following words and terms, when used in these guidelines and conditions, have the following meanings:

Department—The Department of Agriculture.

Dog control—The apprehending, holding and disposing of stray or unwanted dogs, or as otherwise defined in section 102 of the Dog Law (3 P. S. § 459-102).

Eligible Bill—A document seeking payment for materials, services or utilities from a grant recipient, setting forth the following:

- i. The date the document is issued.
- ii. The name and address of the humane society or association for the prevention of cruelty to animals to which the bill is issued.
- iii. If for materials, a description of the materials and the date of delivery.
- iv. If for services, a description of the nature of the services and the dates upon which the services were rendered.
- v. If for utilities (such as electricity, water, sewer, waste disposal and similar purposes), a statement of the period for which the utility, for which payment is sought, was provided.
- vi. The name, address and telephone number of the entity issuing the document.

Humane society or association for the prevention of cruelty to animals—A nonprofit society or association duly incorporated under 15 Pa.C.S. Chapter 53, Subchapter A (relating to incorporation generally) for the purpose of prevention of cruelty to animals, or as otherwise defined in section 102 of the Dog Law.

Program—The Year 2004 Dog Control Facility Bill Reimbursement Program.

2. Eligibility.

A humane society or association for the prevention of cruelty to animals is eligible to apply to receive a grant under the Program if that humane society or association for the prevention of cruelty to animals:

- a. Has been in operation for at least 1 year immediately preceding the application date.
- b. Has performed dog control functions for at least 1 year immediately preceding the application date.
- c. Has, in the performance of its dog control functions, accepted at least 100 stray or unwanted dogs into its facility within the year immediately preceding the application date.
- d. Is not a party to a contract with the Department under which the Department pays that humane society or association for the prevention of cruelty to animals for dog control activities performed in 2004.
- e. Agrees—as a condition of receiving any grant money under the Program—to continue to perform dog control activities through 2004.
- f. Has a total operating budget of \$350,000 or less for the 2004 calendar year or, if its budget is on a basis other than calendar year, has a total operating budget of \$350,000 or less for each fiscal year comprising any portion of calendar year 2004.

3. Use of Grant Funds.

The Department will allocate a specific maximum grant amount to a successful grant applicant through a written grant agreement. This maximum grant amount will be specified in the grant agreement and will not exceed \$10,000 with respect to any application. The maximum grant amount will be retained by the Department and used to reimburse the grant recipient for eligible bills the grant recipient has paid with respect to materials, services or utilities provided to the grant recipient from January 1, 2004, through December 31, 2004. The total reimbursement the Department will pay a grant recipient will not exceed the maximum grant amount. Any money remaining in a grant allocation beyond the termination date of the grant agreement will lapse into the Dog Law

Restricted Account. If a bill covers materials, services or utilities provided, in whole or in part, before January 1, 2004, or after December 31, 2004, that bill is not an eligible bill and will not be reimbursed by the Department under the Program.

4. Application Process.

a. *Application required.* A humane society or association for the prevention of cruelty to animals seeking a grant under the Program must complete a written application form and deliver it to the Department no later than 30 days from the date this notice is published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. Applications received by the Department beyond that date will not be considered.

b. *Obtaining an application form.* The Department will provide grant application forms upon request. Requests for application forms should be directed to Rick Burd, Acting Director, Bureau of Dog Law Enforcement, Department of Agriculture, 2301 North Cameron Street, Harrisburg, PA 17110-9408, (717) 787-4833, fax: (717) 772-4352.

c. *Contents of grant application form.* A grant application form shall require the following information:

- i. The name and address of the applicant.
- ii. Information to verify that the applicant is a humane society or association for the prevention of cruelty to animals and otherwise meets the eligibility requirements in paragraph 2.
- iii. The maximum grant amount sought by the applicant—not to exceed \$10,000.
- iv. A description of the eligible bills for which the grant applicant intends to seek reimbursement, including a description (and copies, if available) of bills received by the applicant in 2002 for the same type of materials, services or utilities for which reimbursement will be sought under the grant agreement.
- v. Other information as the Department might reasonably require.

5. Review and approval of grant application.

a. *Review and notification.* The Department will review each timely grant application and provide the applicant written notification of whether the Department awards the grant, denies the grant or awards a grant in some amount less than the applicant sought. This written notification will be mailed no later than 60 days from the date this notice is published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* to the address provided by the applicant on the grant application form. If an application is incomplete or the Department requires additional information or documentation in order to evaluate the grant request, it will so advise the applicant.

b. *Review criteria.* The Department will consider the following, among other factors, in determining whether to award a grant application:

- i. The number of applications received and the availability of funds for the grants sought.
- ii. The relative contribution of the applicant to dog control activities in the area it serves.
- iii. The relative contribution of the applicant to dog control as compared to the relative contribution of other applicants.
- iv. The relative importance of the grant to the continued operation of the applicant's dog control facility.

v. The expense or logistical difficulty the Department would encounter if the applicant's dog control facility was no longer in operation.

6. Grant agreement.

a. *Grant agreement required.* A successful grant applicant must execute a grant agreement with the Department, setting forth the terms and conditions under which the grant money will be used by the Department to reimburse the grant recipient for payment of eligible bills.

b. *Reimbursement requests.* The grant agreement will set forth the exact procedure by which a grant recipient shall seek reimbursement from the Department for payment of eligible bills. The basic reimbursement request procedure will be as follows:

By May 15, 2004, the grant recipient will: (1) deliver copies of the eligible bills it has paid between January 1, 2004, and April 30, 2004; (2) verify that these bills have been paid and are eligible for reimbursement; and (3) provide a detailed report of the dog control activities performed by the successful applicant during the referenced 4-month period.

Maximum Lawful Rate of Interest for Residential Mortgages for the Month of June 2003

The Department of Banking (Department), under the authority contained in section 301 of the act of January 30, 1974 (P. L. 13, No. 6) (41 P. S. § 301), hereby determines that the maximum lawful rate of interest for residential mortgages for the month of June 2003 is 7%.

The interest rate limitations under the State's usury statute were preempted to a great extent by Federal law, the Depository Institutions Deregulation and Monetary Control Act of 1980 (Pub. L. No. 96-221). Further preemption was instituted with the signing of Pub. L. No. 96-399, which overrode State interest rate limitations on any individual who finances the sale or exchange of residential real property which the individual owns and which the individual occupies or has occupied as a principal residence.

Each month the Department is required by State law to compute and announce the ceiling rate on residential mortgages in this Commonwealth. This maximum rate is determined by adding 2.50 percentage points to the yield rate on long-term government bonds as published by the Federal Reserve Board and/or the United States Treasury. The latest yield rate on long-term government securities is 4.44 to which was added 2.50 percentage points for a total of 6.94 that by law is rounded off to the nearest quarter at 7%.

LAND RECYCLING AND ENVIRONMENTAL REMEDIATION

UNDER ACT 2, 1995

PREAMBLE 1

Acknowledgment of Notices of Intent to Remediate Submitted under the Land Recycling and Environmental Remediation Standards Act (35 P.S. §§ 6026.101—6026.908).

Sections 302—305 of the Land Recycling and Environmental Remediation Standards Act (act) require the Department of Environmental Protection (Department) to publish in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* an acknowledgment noting receipt of Notices of Intent to Remediate. An acknowledgment of the receipt of a Notice of Intent to Remediate is used to identify a site where a person proposes to, or has been required to, respond to a release of a regulated substance at a site. Persons intending to use the Background Standard, Statewide Health Standard, the Site-Specific Standard or who intend to remediate a site as a special industrial area, must file a Notice of Intent to Remediate with the Department. A Notice of Intent to Remediate filed with the Department provides a brief description of the location of the site, a list of known or suspected contaminants at the site, the proposed remediation measures for the site and a description of the intended future use of the site. A person who demonstrates attainment of one, a combination of the cleanup standards or who receives approval of a special industrial area remediation identified under the act, will be relieved of further liability for the remediation of the site for any contamination identified in reports submitted to and approved by the Department. Furthermore, the person shall not be subject to citizen suits or other contribution actions brought by responsible persons not participating in the remediation.

Under sections 304(n)(1)(ii) and 305(c)(2) of the act, there is a 30-day public and municipal comment period for sites proposed for remediation using a Site-Specific Standard, in whole or in part, and for sites remediated as a special industrial area. This period begins when a summary of the Notice of Intent to Remediate is published in a newspaper of general circulation in the area of the site. For the sites identified, proposed for remediation to a site-specific standard or as a special industrial area, the municipality, within which the site is located, may request to be involved in the development of the remediation and reuse plans for the site if the request is made within 30 days of the date specified. During this comment period, the municipality may request that the person identified, as the remediator of the site, develop and implement a public involvement plan. Requests to be involved and comments should be directed to the remediator of the site.

The particulate matter emissions from the apron feeder, jaw crusher, roll crusher, transfer chute, rotary dryer and five associated conveyors are controlled by a wet scrubber. The particulate matter emissions from the additional operations are controlled by several fabric collectors. The refractories manufacturing facility could emit up to 20.2 tons of PM per year, of which 4.4 tons per year could be PM₁₀. Emissions of other air contaminants, including HAPs, are minimal.

The Department has determined that the equipment in the refractories manufacturing facility has been reactivated or constructed and is operating, in accordance with all conditions of Plan Approval 17-309-024 as well as in compliance with all applicable regulatory requirements pertaining to air contamination sources and the emission of air contaminants including the best available technology requirements of 25 Pa. Code §§ 127.1 and 127.12. The Department consequently intends to issue an operating permit for the operation of the respective refractories manufacturing facility.

The following is a summary of the conditions the Department proposes to place in the operating permit to be issued to ensure compliance with all applicable regulatory requirements:

1. The PM in the exhaust of the scrubber shall not exceed .02 grain per dry standard cubic foot.

5. The rotary dryer shall be fired on natural gas only. Additionally, the dryer shall not be operated at a process rate in excess of 25 tons per hour.

6. The scrubber shall operate at a minimum scrubbing solution recirculation rate of 60 gallons per minute and at a minimum differential pressure of 14.0 inches of water.

7. The scrubber shall be equipped with instrumentation to monitor the differential pressure across the scrubber on a continuous basis and flow monitoring equipment capable of measuring the scrubbing solution recirculating flow rate on a continuous basis. Each fabric collector shall be equipped with instrumentation to measure the differential pressure across the collector on a continuous basis.

8. Under no circumstances shall the scrubber be used to simultaneously control the air contaminant emissions from the apron feeder, jaw crusher, roll crusher, transfer chute and five associated conveyors and the air contaminant emissions from the rotary dryer.

9. The scrubber shall be drained and cleaned at the end of each 5 day workweek.

10. Each fabric collector shall be inspected at least once every 3 months for damaged or worn bags.

11. For each occurrence of rotary dryer operation, a record shall be maintained of the number of hours the dryer operated and the identity and amount of material processed.

12. A logbook shall be maintained in which all occurrences of scrubber draining/cleaning, documentation of all scrubber inspections and repairs, documentation of all fabric collector inspections and repairs and documentation of all fugitive emission and visible air contaminant emission observations are recorded.

Approval of Request for Variance

The Department of Environmental Protection (Department), Bureau of Deep Mine Safety (Bureau) has approved Black Wolf Mining Company's request for a variance from the requirements of section 224(b) of the Pennsylvania Bituminous Coal Mine Act (act) at the Quecreek Mine. This notification contains a summary of this request and the basis for the Department's approval. A complete copy of the variance request may be obtained from Allison Gaida by calling (724) 439-7469 or from the Bureau website at <http://www.dep.state.pa.us/dep/departate/minres/dms/dms.htm>.

Summary of the Request: Black Wolf Mining Company requested a variance from section 224(b) of the act to utilize horizontal longhole drilling at the Quecreek Mine to meet the drilling requirements of the act. The proposal accords protections to persons and property substantially equal to or greater than the requirements of section 224(b) of the act.

The basis for the Bureau's approval is summarized as follows:

1. The long horizontal borehole method proposed in lieu of the requirements set forth in section 224 of the act is a proven technology that has been used successfully at other underground mines in this Commonwealth.
2. The long horizontal borehole method proposed is much less labor intensive and provides much less exposure to lifting and strain type injuries by not having to handle and use hand-held drills and steels. By mining normal depth cuts, the work force will be subjected to less risk associated with equipment place changes, rather than mining the outside entry 8 feet at a time.
3. Black Wolf's proposed long horizontal borehole method provides a greater margin of safety for the protection of miners from contacting the abandoned mine over the requirements of section 224 of the act.
4. The long horizontal boreholes will provide a quicker method to close the borehole in the event of contacting

the abandoned mine by closing the valve at the end of the pipe grouted in the rib and will be more suitable for grouting, if needed.

5. The long horizontal borehole will provide a much larger area of coverage for protecting the workers against accidentally mining into the abandoned mine.

This approval is limited to the alternate method to drill test holes as required in section 224(b) of the act. Continued authorization for operation under the approval is contingent upon compliance with the measures described in Quecreek Mine's plan. Whenever the long horizontal drillhole method is employed, the operator must tag the top and bottom of the coal seam to provide greater coverage within the coal seam.

Replacement of Star ME-1 Dry Sprinklers in Licensed Health Care Facilities

The Department of Health (Department) informs individuals who are administering licensed health care facilities, associated with health care provider organizations or involved in health care facility construction or renovation projects that a type of automatic sprinkler head is being recalled by the United States Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) and the manufacturer of these sprinkler heads. The Nationwide recall involves Star ME-1 dry sprinklers manufactured from 1977–1982 by Chemetron Corporation, an inactive subsidiary of American Household, Inc., formerly known as Sunbeam Corporation, Boca Raton, FL. Although there have been no reports of malfunction involving Star ME-1 dry sprinklers manufactured by Chemetron Corporation, the CPSC has received reports of failures involving Star ME-1 dry sprinklers manufactured by other companies. If the sprinklers fail to operate properly in a fire, persons and property may be at risk. Star ME-1 sprinklers must be replaced immediately. Health care providers are directed to determine whether any of the defective sprinkler heads are installed in their facilities and to take appropriate measures to have the recalled heads replaced.

As the State survey agency that is performing the Life Safety Code inspections for health care facilities for Federal certification and for State licensure purposes, individuals should be aware that Department inspectors will be looking for the recalled sprinkler heads during onsite inspections of facilities and for documentation indicating that good progress is being made to replace them.

10. *Unclaimed Prize Money:* For a period of 1 year from the announced close of Pennsylvania Hulk, prize money from winning Pennsylvania Hulk instant lottery game tickets will be retained by the Secretary for payment to the persons entitled thereto. If no claim is made within 1 year of the announced close of the Pennsylvania Hulk instant lottery game, the right of a ticket holder to claim the prize represented by the ticket, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided for by statute.

11. *Governing Law:* In purchasing a ticket, the customer agrees to comply with and abide by the State Lottery Law (72 P. S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314), the regulations contained in 61 Pa. Code Part V (relating to State Lotteries) and the provisions contained in this notice.

12. *Termination of the Game:* The Secretary may announce a termination date, after which no further tickets from this game may be sold. The announcement will be disseminated through media used to advertise or promote Pennsylvania Hulk or through normal communications methods.

We submit for consideration the following comments that include references to the criteria in the Regulatory Review Act (71 P. S. § 745.5b) which have not been met. The State Board of Veterinary Medicine (Board) must respond to these comments when it submits the final-form regulation. If the final-form regulation is not delivered within 2 years of the close of the public comment period, the regulation will be deemed withdrawn.

1. Sections 31.15 and 31.36. Continuing education—Consistency with statute.

Act 167 of 2002 increased the required continuing education clock hours for veterinarians from 8 clock hours to 30 clock hours and establishes a 16-clock hour requirement for certified veterinary health technicians. The House Professional Licensure Committee recommends that the Board incorporate the statutory increase in required continuing education clock hours into this proposal. We agree.

2. Section 31.40. Continuing education provider approval—Consistency with statute.

Section 31.40(a) refers to “certified animal health technicians.” Act 167 of 2002 deleted the term “animal health technician” and redefined the category as “certified veterinary technician.” The term should be updated to reflect current law. We recommend a similar revision of the heading “Animal Health Technicians and Noncertified Employees” as well.

2. If unrepresented by counsel and wishing to appear on their own behalf under 1 Pa. The PSP shall charge each investigative or law enforcement officer who enrolls in this training program a reasonable enrollment fee to offset the costs of training. Whenever necessary and possible, room and board shall be made available to attendees at a fee to be announced prior to the scheduled program.

Right-to-Know Law Request Policy

1. All requests for records must be in writing and signed by the requester. The request should identify or describe the records sought with sufficient specificity to enable the PSP to ascertain which records are being requested and shall include a name and address to which the PSP should address its response. The PSP will not accept oral or anonymous requests for records.

2. All requests for records shall be addressed to Pennsylvania State Police, Department Headquarters, Bureau of Research and Development, 1800 Elmerton Avenue, Harrisburg, PA 17110, ATTN: Supervisor, Policies and Procedures Section.

3. All requests shall be in writing and shall be sent to the PSP by mail, facsimile to (717) 772-1435 or delivered in person during the PSP's regular business hours of 8:15 a.m. to 4:15 p.m., Monday through Friday, excepting holidays and official office closings. The PSP will not accept verbal or e-mail requests for records.

4. Under the Right-to-Know Law, investigative reports are exempted from the definition of a "public record;" therefore, any request will be denied. Criminal history information is not accessible under the Right-to-Know Law but may be obtained through the submission of a Request for Criminal History, Form SP 4-164, which is available on the PSP website (www.psp.state.pa.us). The PSP does not possess or retain investigative or administrative information for other state or local agencies; therefore, such requests will be denied.

The PSP may require a requester to prepay an estimate of the fees listed if the fees required to fulfill the request are expected to exceed \$100. All costs must be paid by certified check or money order made payable to "Pennsylvania State Police."

STATE HARNESS RACING COMMISSION

Procedures for New or Amended Pari-Mutuel License Applications

1. *License required for all horse race meets.* The Race Horse Industry Reform Act (4 P. S. §§ 325.101—325.402) (act) provides that no corporation shall have the right to conduct horse race meets except on obtaining a license from the State Harness Racing Commission (Commission).

2. *Limited number of harness racing licenses.* Section 205(b) of the act (4 P. S. § 325.205(b)) provides that no more than five corporations shall be licensed by the Commission to conduct a pari-mutuel meet.

3. *More applications filed than available licenses.* The Commission has received more applications for harness licenses than are authorized by the act. The Commission does not have the power under the act to issue licenses to all applicants for harness licenses. The Commission is not obligated to issue any license despite the availability of a license. The Commission will be charged with reviewing the pending applications submitted under its respective jurisdiction as set forth in the act.

4. *Information about application procedure.* The Commission believes that it is in the public interest under section 209 of the act (4 P. S. § 325.209) and the best interests of the racing industry in this Commonwealth to establish an administrative review process to treat the applicants as a comparative group for harness horse race meeting license applications presently pending before the Commissions as well as any new applications or renewals.

In considering the present pending applications and any new applications, the Commission adopts a policy to include the following steps:

A. *Consideration group. Application closing dates.* The Commission will consider applications for pari-mutuel racing licenses made under section 209 of the act comparatively as part of a consideration group identified by an application closing date that is published by the Commission. Application closing dates will be published anytime that the Commission receives or has pending before it more than one application for a license.

B. *Applications.* To qualify to be placed into the consideration group for an available license, each new or amended application must be made using the application form available from the Commission. At a minimum, each new or amended application must contain the standards set forth in Appendix A. (See 7 Pa. Code Chapter 133 (33 Pa.B. 2172 (May 3, 2003)).

No consideration shall be given to any application, which is deemed to be untimely filed or deficient by the Commission.

C. *Application closing date.* The Commission hereby establishes a 60-day application period which will begin on May 24, 2003, and close July 22, 2003. No new applications shall be accepted after the closing date. Within that same period, previously submitted applications, which the Commission has deemed deficient by notice to the applicant, must be resubmitted to the Commission with the deficiency corrected.

D. *Resubmission after notice of deficiency.* Applicants who submit new applications the Commission deems

deficient will be given the balance of the 60-day time period or 30 days, whichever is longer, to correct the deficiency.

E. *Amendment of application form.* The Commission reserves the right to amend license application forms at any time. If the Commission amends the application forms, the Commission will establish an amended application closing date at least 30 days after the date of the amendment. Applicants with applications pending at the time of the Commission's amendment to the license application form will have until the amended application closing date to resubmit or supplement their applications; however, no new applications can be received during the amended application period.

F. *Group consideration by respective commissions.* The Commission hereby establishes a policy in which all new and/or amended applications received by the application closing date shall be placed into a single group for comparative consideration by the Commission.

G. *Process.* The Commission will consider written applications within a consideration group, and, after consideration and comparison of all written applications, may issue available licenses in numbers authorized by the act to those applicants who, in the sole judgment of the Commission, will best serve the public interest, convenience and necessity.

H. *Issuance of licenses.* No license shall be issued until all new and/or amended written applications in the respective consideration group have been considered and examined by the Commission.
