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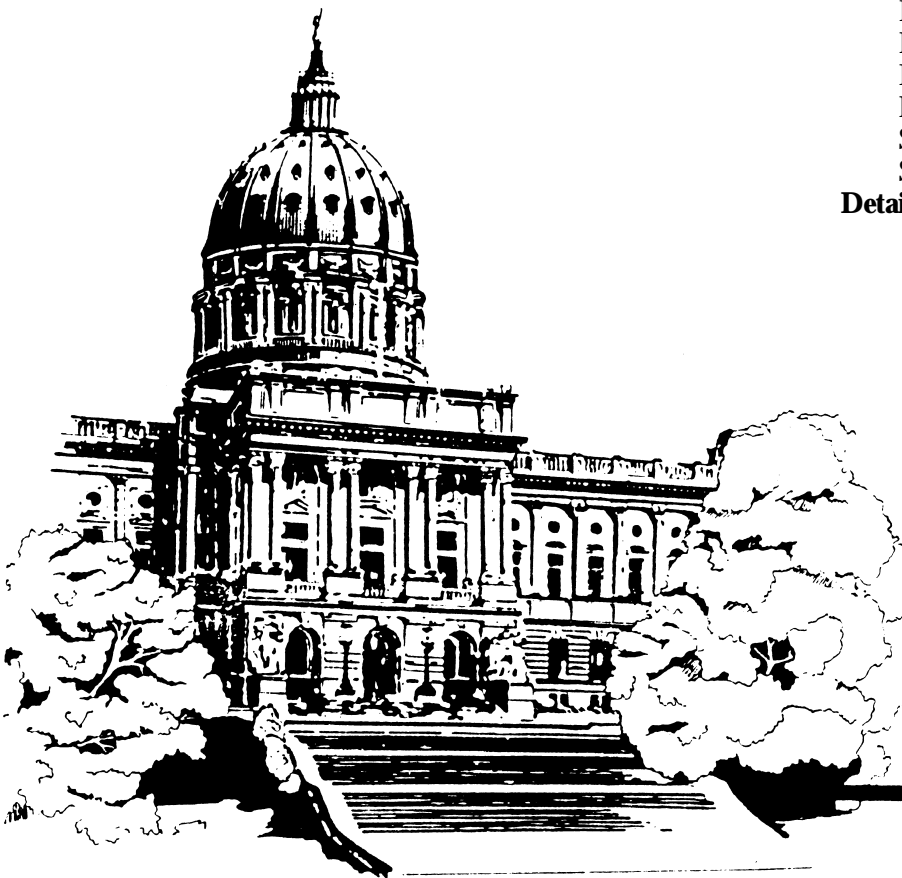

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READER'S GUIDE TO THE PENNSYLVANIA BULLETIN AND PENNSYLVANIA CODE

Pennsylvania Bulletin

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the official gazette of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. It is published every week and includes a table of contents. A cumulative subject matter index is published quarterly.

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* serves several purposes. First, it is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, which is the official codification of agency rules and regulations and other statutorily authorized documents. Changes in the codified text, whether by adoption, amendment, repeal or emergency action must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. Further, agencies proposing changes to the codified text do so in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Second, the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* also publishes: Governor's Executive Orders; State Contract Notices; Summaries of Enacted Statutes; Statewide and Local Court Rules; Attorney General Opinions; Motor Carrier Applications before the Public Utility Commission; Applications and Actions before the Department of Environmental Protection; Orders of the Independent Regulatory Review Commission; and other documents authorized by law.

The text of certain documents published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the only valid and enforceable text. Courts are required to take judicial notice of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Adoption, Amendment or Repeal of Regulations

Generally an agency wishing to adopt, amend or repeal regulations must first publish in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking. There are limited instances where the agency may omit the proposal step; they still must publish the adopted version.

The Notice of Proposed Rulemaking contains the full text of the change, the agency contact person, a fiscal note required by law and background for the action.

The agency then allows sufficient time for public comment before taking final action. An adopted proposal must be published in the *Pennsylvania*

Bulletin before it can take effect. If the agency wishes to adopt changes to the Notice of Proposed Rulemaking to enlarge the scope, they must re-propose.

Citation to the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*

Cite material in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* by volume number and page number. Example: Volume 1, *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, page 801 (short form: 1 Pa.B. 801).

Pennsylvania Code

The *Pennsylvania Code* is the official codification of rules and regulations issued by Commonwealth agencies and other statutorily authorized documents. The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, printing changes as soon as they occur. These changes are then permanently codified by the *Pennsylvania Code Reporter*, a monthly, loose-leaf supplement.

The *Pennsylvania Code* is cited by title number and section number. Example: Title 10 *Pennsylvania Code*, § 1.1 (short form: 10 Pa.Code § 1.1).

Under the *Pennsylvania Code* codification system, each regulation is assigned a unique number by title and section. Titles roughly parallel the organization of Commonwealth government. Title 1 *Pennsylvania Code* lists every agency and its corresponding *Code* title location.

How to Find Documents

Search for your area of interest in the *Pennsylvania Code*.

The *Pennsylvania Code* contains, as Finding Aids, subject indexes for the complete *Code* and for each individual title, a list of Statutes Used As Authority for Adopting Rules and a list of annotated cases. Source Notes give you the history of the documents. To see if there have been recent changes, not yet codified, check the List of *Pennsylvania Code* Chapters Affected in the most recent issue of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* also publishes a quarterly List of Pennsylvania Code Sections Affected which lists the regulations in numerical order, followed by the citation to the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* in which the change occurred.

Printing Format

Material proposed to be added to an existing rule or regulation is printed in **bold face** and material proposed to be deleted from such a rule or regulation is enclosed in brackets [] and printed in **bold face**. Asterisks indicate ellipsis of *Pennsylvania Code* text retained without change. Proposed new or additional regulations are printed in ordinary style face.

Fiscal Notes

Section 612 of The Administrative Code of 1929 (71 P. S. § 232) requires that the Office of Budget prepare a fiscal note for regulatory actions and administrative procedures of the administrative departments, boards, commissions or authorities receiving money from the State Treasury stating whether the proposed action or procedure causes a loss of revenue or an increase in the cost of programs for the Commonwealth or its political subdivisions; that the fiscal note be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* at the same time as the proposed change is advertised; and that the fiscal note shall provide the following information: (1) the designation of the fund out of which the appropriation providing for expenditures under the action or procedure shall be made; (2) the probable cost for the fiscal year the program is implemented; (3) projected cost estimate of the program for each of the five succeeding fiscal years; (4) fiscal history of the program for which expenditures are to be made; (5) probable loss of revenue for the fiscal year of its implementation; (6) projected loss of revenue from the program for each of the five succeeding fiscal years; (7) line item, if any, of the General Appropriation Act or other appropriation act out of which expenditures or losses of Commonwealth funds shall occur as a result of the action or procedures; (8) recommendation, if any, of the Secretary of the Budget and the reasons therefor.

The required information is published in the foregoing order immediately following the proposed change to which it relates; the omission of an item indicates that the agency text of the fiscal note states that there is no information available with respect thereto. In items (3) and (6) information is set forth for the first through fifth fiscal years; in that order, following the year the program is implemented, which is stated. In item (4) information is set forth for the current and two immediately preceding years, in that order. In item (8) the recommendation, if any, made by the Secretary of Budget is published with the fiscal note. See 4 Pa. Code § 7.231 *et seq.* Where “no fiscal impact” is published, the statement means no additional cost or revenue loss to the Commonwealth or its local political subdivision is intended.

Reproduction, Dissemination or Publication of Information

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Information published under this part, which information includes, but is not limited to, cross references, tables of cases, notes of decisions, tables of contents, indexes, source notes, authority notes, numerical lists and codification guides, other than the actual text of rules or regulations may be reproduced only with the written consent of the Bureau. The information which appears on the same leaf with the text of a rule or regulation, however, may be incidentally reproduced in connection with the reproduction of the rule or regulation, if the reproduction is for the private use of a subscriber and not for resale. There are no other restrictions on the reproduction of information published under this part, and the Commonwealth hereby consents to a reproduction.

Effective Dates of Statutes

The effective dates specified above for laws and appropriation acts were contained in the applicable law or appropriation act. Where no date is specified or where the effective date specified is prior to the date of enactment, the effective date is 60 days after final enactment except for statutes making appropriations or affecting budgets of political subdivisions. See 1 Pa.C.S. §§ 1701—1704 (relating to effective dates of statutes).

Advance Copies of Statutes

Section 1106 of Title 1 of the *Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes* provides that the prothonotaries of each county shall file advance copies of statutes in their offices for public inspection until the Laws of Pennsylvania are generally available. Section 2406(h) of The Administrative Code of 1929 provides that the Department of General Services shall distribute advance sheets of the Laws of Pennsylvania to each law judge of the courts, to every county and public library of this Commonwealth and to each member of the General Assembly. These copies shall be furnished without charge. The Department shall also mail one copy of each law enacted during any legislative session to any person who pays to it the sum of \$20.

This General Court Regulation is issued in accordance with Pa.R.Civil.P. No. 206.1 et seq., and shall become effective July 1, 2003. As required, the original General Court Regulation shall be filed with the Prothonotary in a Docket maintained for General Court Regulations issued by the President Judge of the Court of Common Pleas of Philadelphia County, and copies shall be submitted to the Administrative Office of Pennsylvania Courts, the Legislative Reference Bureau and the Civil Procedural Rules Committee. Copies of the Order shall also be submitted to American Lawyer Media, *The Legal Intelligencer*, Jenkins Memorial Law Library, and the Law Library for the First Judicial District.

Rule *206.1 Motion Procedure.

* * * * *

(C) *Service Requirements.* The moving party shall immediately serve copies of all documents filed in the Civil Administration Unit on each attorney of record and unrepresented party, together with the transmittal letter, stating that the documents have been filed and that any response must be filed within [30] 20 days of the filing date. The specific due date and the assigned control number shall be specified in the transmittal letter. The cover sheet of each service copy shall bear the control number assigned to the filing by the Civil Administration Unit.

(D) *Response Requirements.* Any party opposing the motion, petition or preliminary objections shall file the following documents with the Civil Administration Unit no later than 4:30 p.m. on the date [30] 20 days after the date of filing:

(F) *Motion Court Argument List.*

(1) All Motion Court Argument List matters shall be accompanied by a proposed rule to show cause. Upon filing, the Civil Administration Unit shall assign a date, time and place for the return of the rule. The moving party shall then immediately serve the rule on each attorney of record and unrepresented party (including, in the case of a petition to withdraw, the party affected by the withdrawal), together with a letter stating that the

time for filing a response as stated in the original transmittal letter is superseded, and that any response shall be filed by a date not later than the date of the argument or [30] 20 days after the date the rule was signed, whichever comes first. A certificate of service evidencing such service shall be presented to court by the moving party at the time of argument.

Rule 229.1 Sanctions for Failure to Deliver Settlements Funds.

(F) Upon receipt of the attorney affidavit and supporting documentation required by paragraph (E)(2) above, the Released Party shall have twenty (20) days to file a response. If the Court finds that the Released party has violated this rule and that there is no material dispute as to the terms of the settlement or the terms of the release, the Court shall impose sanctions in the form of simple interest [**at a rate equal to the coupon yield equivalent (as determined by the Secretary of the U. S. Department of Treasury) of the average accepted auction price for 52-week U. S. Treasury Bills at the auction**] **calculated at the rate equal to the prime rate as listed in the first edition of the Wall Street Journal published for the calendar year last preceding the date on which the attorney affidavit was filed, running from the twenty-first day to the date of delivery of the settlement funds, together with reasonable attorneys' fees incurred in the preparation of the affidavit.**

Rule 406-1**(D) Qualifications for Penalty Phase Counsel**

To be appointed penalty counsel, it is required that an attorney:

(1) Has been admitted to the bar of the Pennsylvania Supreme Court or admitted to practice pro hac vice;

(2) Is an active practitioner with at least five years litigation (trial and/or appellate) experience in the field of criminal law in this or any other jurisdiction, with at least two of those years being as an active criminal defense attorney;

(3) Has prior experience as sole or lead counsel in at least ten criminal jury trials of serious and complex cases which were tried to completion in this or any other jurisdiction;

(4) Has been sole counsel, lead counsel, in three homicide trials in this or any other jurisdiction which resulted in a verdict;

(5) Has been sole counsel, lead counsel, or penalty phase counsel, in a capital jury trial, which was tried to verdict, or has successfully completed an apprenticeship approved by the Screening Committee of the Philadelphia Bar Association which will include, but is not limited to observation of a capital homicide trial tried to penalty, or in the alternative, has participated in a mock capital trial, the content and format of which has been approved by the Screening Committee;

(6) Has completed a six hour course in mitigation advocacy, approved by Screening Committee of the Philadelphia Bar Association. Thereafter, three mitigation credits must be acquired by penalty phase counsel each calendar year; and

(7) Failure to complete CLE requirements specified in clause (6), above, failure to fulfill the requirements of the Philadelphia Mitigation Protocol, which shall be approved by the Homicide Calendar Judge, or for any other good cause shown, shall be grounds for decertification of any

attorney certified to accept appointments as penalty phase counsel.

DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE

Required Licensure of Cervidae Livestock Operations

The act of December 9, 2002 (P. L. 1495, No. 190) amended the Domestic Animal Law, 3 Pa.C.S. §§ 2303 and 2380.1—2380.9, by adding Subchapter G.1 (relating to cervidae livestock operations). Cervidae livestock operations are farm operations which: (1) contain behind fences privately owned members of the genus and species *Cervus elaphus* involved in the production, growing, breeding, using, harvesting, transporting, exporting, importing or marketing of cervidae species or cervidae products; and (2) do not allow captive bred or captive held cervidae species to be harvested through hunting anywhere on the farm operation. Animals having the genus and species *Cervus elaphus* are elk, red deer or hybrids of the two.

Subchapter G.1 requires the Department of Agriculture (Department) to license and inspect cervidae livestock

operations and to issue permits prior to importation of elk or red deer into this Commonwealth.

Subchapter G.1 requires that cervidae livestock operations maintain a current inventory that includes the sources of new herd additions and the destinations of animals leaving the herd. The subchapter also specifies that pens, shelters or enclosures used to hold elk or red deer be no less than 10 feet from the ground to the top.

The Department has sent license applications to all known cervidae operations in this Commonwealth that it believes might fit within the statutory definition of "cervidae livestock operation." Owners of elk, red deer or elk/red deer hybrid farm operations who have not received a license application from this Department should immediately contact the Department at (717) 705-2106. The deadline for licensure is June 30, 2003.

PREAMBLE 1

Acknowledgment of Notices of Intent to Remediate Submitted under the Land Recycling and Environmental Remediation Standards Act (35 P. S. §§ 6026.101—6026.908).

Sections 302—305 of the Land Recycling and Environmental Remediation Standards Act (act) require the Department of Environmental Protection (Department) to

Furthermore, the person shall not be subject to citizen suits or other contribution actions brought by responsible persons not participating in the remediation.

Under sections 304(n)(1)(ii) and 305(c)(2) of the act, there is a 30-day public and municipal comment period for sites proposed for remediation using a Site-Specific Standard, in whole or in part, and for sites remediated as a special industrial area. This period begins when a summary of the Notice of Intent to Remediate is published in a newspaper of general circulation in the area of the site. For the sites identified, proposed for remediation to a site-specific standard or as a special industrial area, the municipality, within which the site is located, may request to be involved in the development of the remediation and reuse plans for the site if the request is made within 30 days of the date specified. During this comment period, the municipality may request that the person identified, as the remediator of the site, develop and implement a public involvement plan. Requests to be involved and comments should be directed to the remediator of the site.

will be limited to 10/25 tons per year. The facility will be required to record the coating usages and calculate the VOC and HAP emissions monthly. Limits will be placed on the VOC content of the coatings used in the operation. The permit will include monitoring, work practices, recordkeeping and reporting requirements designed to keep the facility operating within all applicable air quality requirements.

The Department's review of the information contained in the application indicates that the proposed sweat furnace will comply with all applicable regulatory requirements pertaining to air contamination sources and the emission of air contaminants including the best available technology requirements of 25 Pa. Code §§ 127.1 and 127.12 and Subpart RRR of the National Emission Standards for Hazardous Air Pollutants (40 CFR 63.1500—63.1519, National Emission Standards for Hazardous Air Pollutants for Secondary Aluminum Production). Based on this finding, the Department intends to approve the application and issue plan approval.

The following is a summary of the conditions the Department proposes to place in the plan approval to ensure compliance with all applicable regulatory requirements:

1. The sweat furnace shall be used to process irony aluminum scrap only. At no time shall the furnace be used to process lead scrap nor shall it be used to recover aluminum or copper from insulated wire or cable nor shall it be used as an incinerator to dispose of wastes.
2. At no time shall fluxes be used in the sweat furnace.
3. The sweat furnace shall be fired with propane only.
4. The sweat furnace shall not be operated more than 2,080 hours in any 12 consecutive month periods.
5. The sweat furnace shall not be operated if the afterburner is inoperable.
6. The sweat furnace shall be equipped with instrumentation to monitor and record the flue gas temperature at the exit of the furnace and afterburner exhaust stack.
7. At any time scrap is being processed in the sweat furnace, a flue gas temperature of at least 1,600°F shall be maintained at the temperature sensor at the exit of the furnace and afterburner exhaust stack. No scrap shall be placed into the furnace at any time the temperature is less than 1,600°F.
8. The sweat furnace shall be attended by an operator at all times it is in operation.
9. The particulate matter emissions from the sweat furnace shall not exceed .02 grain per dry standard cubic foot. The visible air contaminant emissions shall not exceed 10% opacity at any time. The dioxin/furan emissions (on a TEQ or toxicity equivalents basis) shall not exceed .0000000035 grain per dry standard cubic foot corrected to 11% oxygen.
10. The sweat furnace shall comply with all applicable requirements of Subpart RRR of the National Emission Standards for Hazardous Air Pollutants, 40 CFR 63.1500—63.1519.
11. Records shall be maintained of the number of hours the sweat furnace is operated each month. All records and all temperature records generated by the continuous stack temperature monitoring and recording instrumentation shall be retained for at least 5 years and shall be made available to the Department upon request.

This list supercedes the list of approved drugs published at 32 Pa.B. 2817 (June 8, 2002). Changes made are: (1) addition of dilaudid for interfacility transports only; (2) deletion of "interfacility transport only" limitation on dobutamine; (3) addition of fentanyl; (4) deletion of meperidine; (5) addition of methylprednisolone; (6) addition of phenergan; (7) addition of pralidoxime CL; and (8) addition of sodium thiosulfate. Ambulance services are not authorized to stock drugs designated "for interfacility transports only." However, paramedics and health professionals may administer a drug so designated if the facility transferring a patient provides the drug, directs that it be administered to the patient during the transfer and the regional transfer and medical treatment protocols permit the administration of the drug by those personnel.

Section 1005.11 permits a ground ALS ambulance service to exceed, under specified circumstances, the drugs (taken from the master list) that a region's medical treatment protocols authorize for use within the region. In addition, under 28 Pa. Code § 1001.161 (relating to research), the Department may approve an ambulance service to engage in a research project that involves use of a drug not included in a region's medical treatment protocols. Finally, under 28 Pa. Code § 1001.4 (relating to exceptions), a ground ALS ambulance service and its ALS service medical director may apply to the Department for an exception to a region's medical treatment protocols.

The list of drugs in this notice does not apply to air ambulance services. Under 28 Pa. Code § 1007.7(i)(2) (relating to licensure and general operating requirements), each air ambulance service is to develop its own medical treatment protocols which identify drugs that may be used by the air ambulance service. The air ambulance service is to then submit the protocols to the medical advisory committee of the appropriate regional emergency medical services council for the medical advisory committee's review and recommendations. Following its consideration of the recommendations, and after making further revisions if needed, the air ambulance service is to file the protocols with the Department for approval.

Prehospital Practitioners Scope of Practice

Under 28 Pa. Code §§ 1003.21(c)(13), 1003.22(e)(3), 1003.23(f), 1003.24(e) and 1003.25b(c), the Department of Health (Department) is publishing the scope of practice for ambulance attendants, first responders, emergency medical

technicians (EMTs), EMT-paramedics and prehospital registered nurses (PHRNs) under the Emergency Medical Services Act (35 P. S. §§ 6921—6938).

Skills identified may be performed by a prehospital practitioner at the practitioner's level of certification/recognition only if the practitioner has successfully completed training (cognitive, affective and psychomotor) on the specified skill, which includes training to perform the skill on adults, children and infants, as appropriate.

A PHRN with medical command authorization may perform, in addition to those services within an EMT-paramedic's scope of practice, other services authorized by The Professional Nursing Law (63 P. S. §§ 211—225.5), when authorized by a medical command physician through either online medical command or standing medical treatment protocols. To administer drugs in addition to those permitted by applicable medical treatment protocols, a PHRN must also have received approval to do so by the advanced life support service medical director of the advanced life support ambulance service under which the PHRN is functioning.

This list supersedes the list of skills in the scope of practice of prehospital personnel published at 33 Pa.B. 834 (February 8, 2003). Changes made are: (1) an addition to the legend that describes the conditions under which certain skills may be performed; (2) addition of the use of a cardiac magnet to alter the mode of an AICD or pacemaker; (3) addition of auto-injectors as a route for medication administration; and (4) addition of primary use epinephrine auto-injectors by EMTs.

Telscape USA Inc. (Telscape) has failed to return the Annual Assessment Report for Fiscal Year 2003/2004 mailed by the Fiscal Office on February 13, 2003, under section 520(b) of the Public Utility Code, 66 Pa.C.S. § 520(b). Telscape is a telecommunications interexchange reseller certificated at A-310444. Telephone calls to the last known business address of Telscape confirmed that the number is disconnected and no information is available for any new phone number. At this point, there is no reasonable means to reach the company, and it has failed in its responsibility to notify the Commission of any address or phone number changes.

The Commission puts the industry on notice that we will not hesitate to invoke our authority under the Public Utility Code to ensure timely compliance with our regulations and orders including the ordering of another remedy as the Commission may deem appropriate. 66 Pa.C.S. §§ 504, 505, 506 and 3301. Based on the findings of the Commission staff, we believe that it is appropriate to revoke Telscape's certificate of public convenience without the necessity of first filing a formal complaint. For these reasons, we tentatively conclude that revocation of Telscape's certificate of public convenience under 66 Pa.C.S. § 1102(a)(2) will not be detrimental to the public interest. Furthermore, the Commission may take other appropriate action, including the imposition of penalties under section 3301, instead of cancellation, if Telscape seeks relief from the Tentative Order; *Therefore,*

It Is Ordered That:

1. Revocation of Telscape USA Inc. certificate of public convenience is hereby tentatively approved as being in the public interest.

2. A copy of this Tentative Order be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* giving all persons having an interest in this proceeding 30 days from the date of publication to file a written response.

3. Absent the filing of adverse public comment within 30 days after publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, this Tentative Order shall become final without further order of this Commission.

4. Upon this order becoming final and without further action by the Commission, the certificate of public convenience held by Telscape USA Inc. at A-310444 shall be cancelled and the company's name stricken from all active utility lists maintained by the Tariff and Annual Report Section of the Commission's Bureau of Fixed Utility Services and the Assessment Section of the Bureau of Administrative Services.

Whereas, Section 609(c) of the 1972 Act requires that all financial statements required to be filed under that section shall be prepared reflecting conformity with generally accepted accounting principles in the United States consistently applied (GAAP); and

Whereas, Commission Regulation 609.034(b), 64 Pa. Code § 609.034(b), requires issuers proposing to register securities for sale in Pennsylvania under Section 206 of the 1972 Act, 70 P. S. § 1-206, to file audited statements of cash flows; and

Whereas, Annually, issuers file registration statements with the Commission to register notes, bonds and other evidences of indebtedness (Debt Securities) for sale in Pennsylvania under Section 206 of the 1972 Act in reliance upon the exemptions afforded by Sections 3(a)(4) and 3(a)(11) of the federal Securities Act of 1933, 15 U.S.C. §§ 77c(a)(4) and (11); and

Whereas, These Debt Securities represent the issuer's promise to pay investors a stated rate of interest due on specified dates and frequently permit investors to elect to have interest compounded or reinvested; and

Whereas, Compounded or reinvested interest becomes a liability of the issuer incurred in connection with the issuance of Debt Securities, in that it is added to the principal amount of the Debt Securities, thereby increas-

ing the principal amount for purposes of computing the amount of the next interest payment and the amount of repayment at the end of the investment term if interest is paid at maturity; and

Whereas, Statement of Accounting Standards Number 95, "Statements of Cash Flows," defines cash flows from financing activities to include proceeds from issuing bonds, notes and other short- or long-term borrowing; and

Whereas, Generally accepted accounting principles do not prescribe how amounts of compounded or reinvested interest must be presented on statements of cash flows; and, consequently, some issuers present compounded or reinvested interest as cash flows from financing activities and some issuers present compounded or reinvested interest as cash flows from operating activities or as an adjustment to reconcile change in net assets to cash provided by operating activities in the statements of cash flows; and

Whereas, An issuer's presenting compounded or reinvested interest as cash flows from operating activities or as an adjustment to reconcile change in net assets to cash provided by operating activities results in an increase in that issuer's net cash provided by operating activities and may cause the issuer's net cash from operating activities to be positive rather than negative; and

Whereas, An issuer's presenting compounded or reinvested interest as cash flows from operating activities or as an adjustment to reconcile change in net assets to cash provided by operating activities may mislead investors as to the issuer's financial condition;

Now Therefore, the Commission, on this 25th day of March 2003, pursuant to Section 609(c) of the Pennsylvania Securities Act of 1972, 70 P. S. § 1-609(c), hereby ORDERS that a registration statement filed by an issuer to register notes, bonds or other evidences of indebtedness for sale in Pennsylvania under Section 206 of the Pennsylvania Securities Act of 1972 in reliance upon the exemptions afforded by Sections 3(a)(4) and 3(a)(11) of the federal Securities Act of 1933, 15 U.S.C. §§ 77c(a)(4) and (11), containing audited financial statements for a fiscal year ending after July 1, 2003, is required to present compounded or reinvested interest on those notes, bonds or other evidences of indebtedness in one of the following ways:

1. In a segregated schedule of noncash financing activities in the issuer's statements of cash flows; or
2. As cash flows from financing activities in the body of the issuer's statements of cash flows.
