

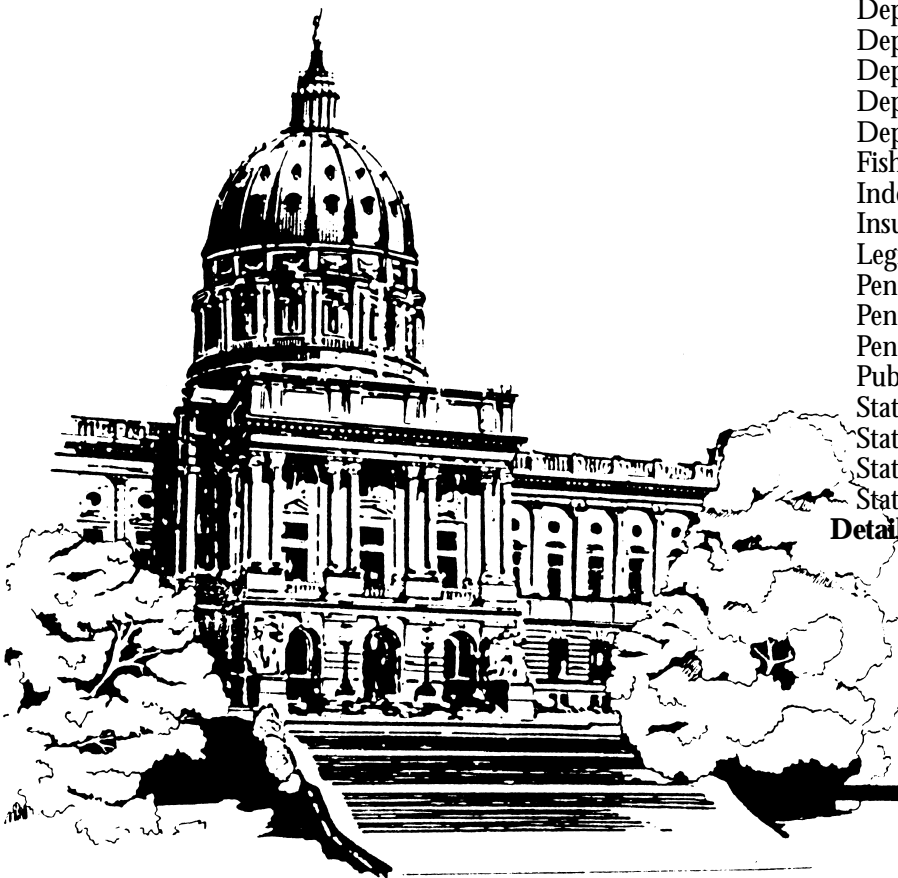

READER'S GUIDE TO THE PENNSYLVANIA BULLETIN AND PENNSYLVANIA CODE

Pennsylvania Bulletin

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the official gazette of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. It is published every week and includes a table of contents. A cumulative subject matter index is published quarterly.

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* serves several purposes. First, it is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, which is the official codification of agency rules and regulations and other statutorily authorized documents. Changes in the codified text, whether by adoption, amendment, repeal or emergency action must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. Further, agencies proposing changes to the codified text do so in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Second, the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* also publishes: Governor's Executive Orders; State Contract Notices; Summaries of Enacted Statutes; Statewide and Local Court Rules; Attorney General Opinions; Motor Carrier Applications before the Public Utility Commission; Applications and Actions before the Department of Environmental Protection; Orders of the Independent Regulatory Review Commission; and other documents authorized by law.

The text of certain documents published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the only valid and enforceable text. Courts are required to take judicial notice of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Adoption, Amendment or Repeal of Regulations

Generally an agency wishing to adopt, amend or repeal regulations must first publish in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking. There are limited instances where the agency may omit the proposal step; they still must publish the adopted version.

The Notice of Proposed Rulemaking contains the full text of the change, the agency contact person, a fiscal note required by law and background for the action.

The agency then allows sufficient time for public comment before taking final action. An adopted proposal must be published in the *Pennsylvania*

Bulletin before it can take effect. If the agency wishes to adopt changes to the Notice of Proposed Rulemaking to enlarge the scope, they must re-propose.

Citation to the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*

Cite material in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* by volume number and page number. Example: Volume 1, *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, page 801 (short form: 1 Pa.B. 801).

Pennsylvania Code

The *Pennsylvania Code* is the official codification of rules and regulations issued by Commonwealth agencies and other statutorily authorized documents. The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, printing changes as soon as they occur. These changes are then permanently codified by the *Pennsylvania Code Reporter*, a monthly, loose-leaf supplement.

The *Pennsylvania Code* is cited by title number and section number. Example: Title 10 *Pennsylvania Code*, § 1.1 (short form: 10 Pa.Code § 1.1).

Under the *Pennsylvania Code* codification system, each regulation is assigned a unique number by title and section. Titles roughly parallel the organization of Commonwealth government. Title 1 *Pennsylvania Code* lists every agency and its corresponding *Code* title location.

How to Find Documents

Search for your area of interest in the *Pennsylvania Code*.

The *Pennsylvania Code* contains, as Finding Aids, subject indexes for the complete *Code* and for each individual title, a list of Statutes Used As Authority for Adopting Rules and a list of annotated cases. Source Notes give you the history of the documents. To see if there have been recent changes, not yet codified, check the List of *Pennsylvania Code* Chapters Affected in the most recent issue of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* also publishes a quarterly List of Pennsylvania Code Sections Affected which lists the regulations in numerical order, followed by the citation to the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* in which the change occurred.

Printing Format

Material proposed to be added to an existing rule or regulation is printed in **bold face** and material proposed to be deleted from such a rule or regulation is enclosed in brackets [] and printed in **bold face**. Asterisks indicate ellipsis of *Pennsylvania Code* text retained without change. Proposed new or additional regulations are printed in ordinary style face.

Fiscal Notes

Section 612 of The Administrative Code of 1929 (71 P. S. § 232) requires that the Office of Budget prepare a fiscal note for regulatory actions and administrative procedures of the administrative departments, boards, commissions or authorities receiving money from the State Treasury stating whether the proposed action or procedure causes a loss of revenue or an increase in the cost of programs for the Commonwealth or its political subdivisions; that the fiscal note be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* at the same time as the proposed change is advertised; and that the fiscal note shall provide the following information: (1) the designation of the fund out of which the appropriation providing for expenditures under the action or procedure shall be made; (2) the probable cost for the fiscal year the program is implemented; (3) projected cost estimate of the program for each of the five succeeding fiscal years; (4) fiscal history of the program for which expenditures are to be made; (5) probable loss of revenue for the fiscal year of its implementation; (6) projected loss of revenue from the program for each of the five succeeding fiscal years; (7) line item, if any, of the General Appropriation Act or other appropriation act out of which expenditures or losses of Commonwealth funds shall occur as a result of the action or procedures; (8) recommendation, if any, of the Secretary of the Budget and the reasons therefor.

The required information is published in the foregoing order immediately following the proposed change to which it relates; the omission of an item indicates that the agency text of the fiscal note states that there is no information available with respect thereto. In items (3) and (6) information is set forth for the first through fifth fiscal years; in that order, following the year the program is implemented, which is stated. In item (4) information is set forth for the current and two immediately preceding years, in that order. In item (8) the recommendation, if any, made by the Secretary of Budget is published with the fiscal note. See 4 Pa. Code § 7.231 *et seq.* Where “no fiscal impact” is published, the statement means no additional cost or revenue loss to the Commonwealth or its local political subdivision is intended.

Reproduction, Dissemination or Publication of Information

Third parties may not take information from the *Pennsylvania Code* and *Pennsylvania Bulletin* and reproduce, disseminate or publish such information except as provided by 1 Pa. Code § 3.44. 1 Pa. Code § 3.44 reads as follows:

§ 3.44. General permission to reproduce content of Code and Bulletin.

Information published under this part, which information includes, but is not limited to, cross references, tables of cases, notes of decisions, tables of contents, indexes, source notes, authority notes, numerical lists and codification guides, other than the actual text of rules or regulations may be reproduced only with the written consent of the Bureau. The information which appears on the same leaf with the text of a rule or regulation, however, may be incidentally reproduced in connection with the reproduction of the rule or regulation, if the reproduction is for the private use of a subscriber and not for resale. There are no other restrictions on the reproduction of information published under this part, and the Commonwealth hereby consents to a reproduction.

GOVERNOR'S OFFICE

Proclamation of Disaster Emergency

December 5, 2003

Whereas, investigations made at my direction have disclosed that localized and unusually high winds and heavy rains in parts of Southwestern Pennsylvania on November 19th and 20th have resulted in extensive damage to private homes and caused other adverse impacts upon the general population of Southwestern Pennsylvania; and

Whereas, as the storm waters receded, the extent of damage to private homes was revealed; and


Whereas, the serious impact of this storm and both the immediate and long-term effect on homeowners represents a major hardship requiring a comprehensive federal, state, and local partnership for effective recovery; and

Whereas, the emergency situation has been of such magnitude and severity as to render essential the Commonwealth's supplementation of county and municipal efforts and resources and the activation of all applicable state, county, and municipal emergency response plans.

Now Therefore, pursuant to the provisions of Subsection 7301(c) of the Emergency Management Services Code (35 Pa.C.S. § 7101 et seq.), I do hereby proclaim the existence of a disaster emergency in Greene County, and in accordance with the State Emergency Operations Plans, I direct all Commonwealth departments and agencies to utilize all available resources and personnel as is deemed necessary to cope with the magnitude and severity of this emergency situation.

Further, I have directed that the emergency response and recovery aspects of all the Commonwealth departments and agencies and all applicable county, municipal, and other disaster emergency response and recovery plans be activated and that all state, county, and municipal actions taken to implement those plans be coordinated through the Pennsylvania Emergency Management Agency.

Rule 402. Confidentiality.

Except as otherwise prescribed in these rules, the actions and records of the Board shall not be open to inspection by the public. The Board may, however, publish a list of the names of applicants who successfully completed the bar examination administered by the Board, and may[,]:

(1) upon request from the dean of a law school, furnish the law school with the names of applicants from the law school who did not successfully complete the bar examination, provided the law school has agreed to only use such information internally within the law school and not to disclose the names of students who failed the bar examination to any person or organization outside of the law school, and

(2) upon written request from a state or county bar association located within this commonwealth, furnish such bar association with the names and addresses of those applicants who have successfully completed the bar examination administered by the board and who have not objected to the release of such information, provided the bar association has agreed to only use such information for purposes of

offering applicants membership in and services provided by or through the bar association.

CHAPTER 211. JUDICIAL SALARIES

Pursuant to Article V, Section 10(c) of the Pennsylvania Constitution and Section 1721 of the Judicial Code, 42 Pa.C.S. § 1721, the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania has authorized the Court Administrator to obtain and publish in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* the percentage increase in the Consumer Price Index for the most recent 12-month period and the judicial salaries effective January 1, 2004, as required by Act 51 of 1995, amending the Public Official Compensation Law, Act of September 30, 1983 (P. L. 160, No. 39), 65 P. S. § 366.1 et seq. See, No. 259 Judicial Administration Docket No. 1.

The Court Administrator of Pennsylvania reports that the percentage of increase in the Philadelphia-Wilmington-Atlantic City, PA-NJ-DE-MD, Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U), for the 12-month period ending October 2003, was 2.4 percent. (See, U. S. Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics, Series CUURA102SAO, Tuesday, November 18, 2003).

The Court Administrator of Pennsylvania also reports that the following judicial salaries are adopted to implement Act 51 of 1995:

Section 2.1. Judicial salaries effective January 1, 2004.

(a) *Supreme Court*.—The annual salary of the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court shall be \$146,813 and the annual salary of each of the other justices of the Supreme Court shall be \$142,936.

(b) *Superior Court.*—The annual salary of the President Judge of the Superior Court shall be \$140,549 and the annual salary of the other judges of the Superior Court shall be \$138,459.

(c) *Commonwealth Court.*—The annual salary of the President Judge of the Commonwealth Court shall be \$140,549. The annual salary of each of the other judges of the Commonwealth Court shall be \$138,459.

(d) *Courts of common pleas.*—

(1) The annual salary of a president judge of a court of common pleas shall be fixed in accordance with the following schedule:

(i) Allegheny County, \$126,523.

(ii) Philadelphia County, \$127,120.

(iii) Judicial districts having six or more judges, \$125,330.

(iv) Judicial districts having three to five judges, \$124,733.

(v) Judicial districts having one or two judges, \$124,135.

(vi) Administrative judges of the divisions of the Court of Common Pleas of Philadelphia County with divisions of six or more judges, \$125,330.

(vii) Administrative judges of the divisions of the Court of Common Pleas of Philadelphia County with divisions of five or less judges, \$124,733.

(viii) Administrative judges of the divisions of the Court of Common Pleas of Allegheny County with divisions of six or more judges, \$125,330.

(ix) Administrative judges of the divisions of the Court of Common Pleas of Allegheny County with divisions of five or less judges, \$124,733.

(2) The other judges of the courts of common pleas shall be paid an annual salary of \$124,135.

(e) *Philadelphia Municipal Court.*—The President Judge of the Philadelphia Municipal Court shall receive an annual salary of \$122,942. The annual salary for the other judges of the Philadelphia Municipal Court shall be \$120,854.

(f) *Philadelphia Traffic Court.*—The President Judge of the Philadelphia Traffic Court shall receive an annual salary of \$65,650. The annual salary for the other judges of the Philadelphia Traffic Court shall be \$65,054.

(g) *District justices.*—A district justice shall receive an annual salary payable by the Commonwealth of \$61,472.

(h) *Senior judges.*—The compensation of the senior judges pursuant to 42 Pa.C.S. § 4121 (relating to assignment of judges) shall be \$380 per day. In any calendar year the amount of compensation which a senior judge shall be permitted to earn as a senior judge shall not when added to retirement income paid by the Commonwealth for such senior judge exceed the compensation payable by the Commonwealth to a judge then in regular active service on the court from which said senior judge retired. A senior judge who so elects may serve without

being paid all or any portion of the compensation provided by this section.

Rule L1915.4 Prompt Disposition of Custody Cases. Mandatory Education Program for Parents in Custody Matters.

1. Upon the filing of any claim for custody, the moving party shall deposit with the Prothonotary the sum of \$300.00 unless excused by the Court.
2. All actions commenced under these rules shall be scheduled for an initial conference. The initial conference

shall be held to focus on issues of fact and law and to explore the possibility of a negotiated settlement and consent order.

3. A continuance of the initial conference may be granted by the Court upon good cause shown.

4. If the parties agree on a custodial arrangement, two hundred dollars shall be refunded to the depositing party and a consent order shall be entered in substantially the same form as set forth in "Form A" following Carbon County Local Rule L1915.7.

5. If the parties are unable to agree, the hearing officer shall immediately schedule a hearing.

6. At the conclusion of the pre-hearing conference, the hearing officer shall prepare a recommended Interim Order which said officer believes is in the best interest of the child(ren) and forward it to the Court within 10 days of the pre-hearing conference. The Interim Order shall require the parties to file a Pre-Trial Memorandum with the Prothonotary's Office within five (5) days prior to hearing, and shall contain the following:

- (A) A clear concise statement of the principal custody issues to be resolved by the Court;
- (B) Principles of law to be applied;
- (C) List of witnesses to be called and exhibits;
- (D) Listing of any evidentiary disputes; and Legal Argument.
- (E) Proposed Findings of Fact.
- (F) Proposed Custody Order.

7. In all custody proceedings where the interests of children under the age of eighteen (18) are involved, the parties shall attend and complete one 4-hour session entitled "Education Program for Divided Families," referred to in these local rules as "Program."

8. In all custody proceedings, each complaint or petition shall be in compliance with Local Rule L206.1 or Local Rule L205.3.

9. At the time of the filing of the Complaint/Petition, the Attorney or unrepresented party shall attach the Court Order requiring attendance at the Program as set forth in Exhibit "1," a registration form, and Program description.

10. The parties shall register BY MAIL for the Program within fifteen (15) days after he or she is served with the Court Order. NO RESERVATIONS WILL BE TAKEN OVER THE TELEPHONE.

11. Every party shall attend the Program within sixty (60) days from the date of the Order requiring attendance. Any request for an extension of time to complete the Program shall be made to the Court.

12. The fee for the Program is \$35.00 per party and must be submitted with the registration form. Certified check or money order will be accepted for payment. Checks and money orders shall be made payable to the Kathryn James. NOTE: NO PERSONAL CHECKS OR CASH WILL BE ACCEPTED. NO REFUNDS GIVEN.

13. No final hearing shall be held or final order entered until all parties have attended and completed the Program, unless the Court waives the requirement upon petition filed for good cause shown. Refusal of the non-moving party to attend the Program shall be considered good cause by the Court. Failure to comply with the

Order may result in the dismissal of the action, striking of pleadings, or other appropriate action, including sanctions for contempt.

14. Upon filing of the Certificate of Completion, the Prothonotary shall provide a copy to Court Administration.

15. Copies of this Rule, Program Registration Form, and Program Description shall be available in the Prothonotary's Office of the Court of Common Pleas of Carbon County.

Rule L1915.4-1 Alternative Hearing Procedures for Partial Custody or Visitation Cases

1. Upon the filing of any claim for partial custody or visitation, the moving party shall deposit with the Prothonotary the sum of \$300.00 unless excused by the Court.

2. All actions commenced under these rules shall be scheduled for an initial conference. The initial conference shall be held to focus on issues of fact and law and to explore the possibility of a negotiated settlement and consent order.

3. A continuance of the initial conference may be granted by the Court upon good cause shown.

4. If the parties agree on a custodial arrangement, two hundred dollars shall be refunded to the depositing party and a consent order shall be entered in substantially the same form as set forth in "Form A" following Carbon County Local Rule L1915.7.

5. If the parties are unable to agree, the hearing officer shall immediately schedule a hearing.

6. The moving party shall be responsible to secure the services/attendance of an outside court reporter for said hearing and shall be responsible for the payment of said outside court reporter unless the Court places the payment responsibility on the other party.

7. Within 10 days of the conclusion of the hearing, the hearing officer shall file and serve a copy upon all parties a report stating the reasons for the recommendation along with a proposed order including a specific schedule of partial custody or visitation.

8. If exceptions are filed, no exceptions shall be argued before the Court unless written briefs have been filed. The moving party shall file three (3) copies of a brief and exceptions with the Prothonotary's Office no later than ten (10) days after filing of the hearing officer's report, and forthwith serve one (1) copy of the brief upon each adverse party or counsel of record. Each adverse party or his counsel of record shall file in the appropriate filing office three (3) copies of a brief in answer, not later than five (5) days after receipt of moving party's brief and forthwith serve a copy thereof upon all opposing parties or their counsel of record. All briefs shall be prepared in conformity with Local Rule L210. Transcription of the proceedings shall be filed of record by the party raising the objections. The cost of transcription shall be borne by the party filing the original exceptions unless otherwise ordered by the Court.

9. Argument shall be held within 45 days of the date that the last party files exceptions.

10. In all custody proceedings where the interests of children under the age of eighteen (18) are involved, the parties shall attend and complete one 4-hour session entitled "Education Program for Divided Families," referred to in these local rules as "Program."

11. In all custody proceedings, each complaint or petition shall be in compliance with Local Rule L206.1 or Local Rule L205.3.

12. At the time of the filing of the Complaint/Petition, the attorney and/or unrepresented party shall attached to the Complaint/Petition and provide all parties with the Court Order requiring attendance at the Program as set forth in Exhibit "1," a registration form, and Program description.

13. The parties shall register BY MAIL for the Program within fifteen (15) days after he or she is served with the Court Order. NO RESERVATIONS WILL BE TAKEN OVER THE TELEPHONE.

14. Every party shall attend the Program within sixty (60) days from the date of the Order requiring attendance. Any request for an extension of time to complete the Program shall be made to the Court.

15. The fee for the Program is \$35.00 per party and must be submitted with the registration form. Certified check or money order will be accepted for payment. Checks and money orders shall be made payable to the Kathryn James. NOTE: NO PERSONAL CHECKS OR CASH WILL BE ACCEPTED. NO REFUNDS GIVEN.

16. No final hearing shall be held or final order entered until all parties have attended and completed the Program, except by leave of Court. Refusal of the non-moving party to attend the Program shall be considered good cause by the Court. Failure to comply with the Order may

result in the dismissal of the action, striking of pleadings, or other appropriate action, including sanctions for contempt.

17. Upon filing of the Certificate of Completion, the Prothonotary shall provide a copy to Court Administration.

And Now, this 4th day of December 2003, Dauphin County Local Rules of Civil Procedure 2039, 2039A, 2039B, 2206, and 2206A are promulgated as follows:

Rule 2039 Petitions for Approval of Minors' Compromises

(a)(1) Petitions for Approval of Settlement or Compromise in matters in which a minor has an interest shall be

filed in the Orphans' Court Division where the minor resides if no suit has been previously filed or in the Prothonotary's Office under the docket number of the previously filed suit.

(2) The petition shall set forth:

(a) The factual background of the claim;

(b) The identification of the parties including the age of the minor and the addresses of the biological parents of the minor;

(c) Counsel's analysis of the liability and damages issues relevant to the determination of the reasonableness of the proposed settlement;

(d) Counsel's certification that the settlement is reasonable and in the best interest of the minor;

(e) The types and amounts of insurance coverage applicable to the claim and representation as to the efforts made to identify other collateral sources;

(f) Whether there are any unpaid liens, claims or debts. Where claims or debts have been waived, Petitioner shall attach as an exhibit written proof of waiver of such lien, claim or debt;

(g) A request for authorization of parent or natural guardian to sign the proposed release;

(h) A description of the type of account into which the settlement proceeds will be deposited;

(i) A statement of the proposed distribution of the settlement funds which includes the proposed percentage of counsel fees and an itemization of costs. The petitioner shall attach appropriate documentation in support of the itemized costs;

(j) Certification of the joinder of the parents or natural guardians in the proposed settlement.

(3) The petition shall contain the following exhibits:

(a) Copies of medical reports or records evidencing the diagnosis and prognosis of the minor's injuries;

(b) Investigative or police accident reports which provide background information regarding the incident which caused the minor's injuries;

(c) The counsel fee agreement with the parents or natural guardians of the minor executed by any attorney seeking recovery of counsel fees;

(4) Any amendments or supplements to the petition required by the court shall be filed of record.

(5) The Court may approve a petition without a hearing. If the Court schedules a hearing, the court may require the personal attendance and testimony of the guardian, the treating physician, the representative of the financial institution responsible for the investment of settlement funds or any other evidence which the court deems necessary to determine whether the proposed settlement adequately protects the minors interests.

(6) The Court may require a hearing on the issue of counsel fees if counsel seeks the recovery of fees in excess of 25% of the gross settlement amount. If a hearing on counsel fees is required, the court shall require the testimony of counsel primarily responsible for the preparation of the case.

(7) Except as otherwise required by the Court, the appearance of the minor shall not be required.

(8) The Petitioner shall attach a proposed order which includes the caption to the face of the petition substan-

tially in the form found in local rule 2039A which sets forth:

- (a) The court's authorization for the petitioner to enter into a settlement and release on behalf of the minor;
- (b) Reference to the total amount of the settlement;
- (c) A complete statement of the distribution of the settlement amount as set forth in the petition;
- (d) Identification of the type of account to be utilized, which account shall comply with Pa.R.C.P. 2039, including a provision that no withdrawal shall be made from

any such account until the minor attains majority or by a prior order of court;

(e) A provision that counsel shall provide the court with an Affidavit of Deposit of Minor's Funds within ten days from the date of the order. Said affidavit shall be substantially in the form found in local rule 2039B.

(b) The Court shall, in appropriate cases, authorize the parent or natural guardian to deposit cash to be paid for the benefit of the minor into an interest bearing, restricted account, insured by the Federal government, which conforms to the provisions of Pa.R.C.P. 2039.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

Title 49—PROFESSIONAL AND VOCATIONAL STANDARDS

STATE BOARD OF NURSING

[49 PA. CODE CH. 21]

Oral Orders

The State Board of Nursing (Board) amends §§ 21.14, 21.141 and 21.145 (relating to administration of drugs; definitions; and functions of the LPN) to read as set forth in Annex A.

A. *Effective Date*

The final-form rulemaking will be effective upon publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

B. *Statutory Authority*

The Board is authorized to establish rules and regulations for the practice of professional and practical nursing under section 2.1(k) of the Professional Nursing Law (63 P. S. § 212.1(k)) and section 17.6 of the Practical Nurse Law (63 P. S. § 667.6).

C. *Background and Purpose*

Current regulations of the Board prohibit a licensed practical nurse (LPN) from accepting an oral order for the administration of medication or therapeutic treatment unless the urgency of the medical circumstances requires immediate medication and therapeutic treatment. In the final-form rulemaking, the Board removes the prohibition in § 21.145 against an LPN accepting an oral order except in urgent circumstances, which the Board now regards as unnecessary and burdensome. The Board is also updating and clarifying § 21.14, which currently appears to limit the administration of medications to professional nurses (registered nurses (RNs)) only and limits the ability of an RN to accept orders from a practitioner other than a licensed doctor of the healing arts. Finally, the Board is amending § 21.141 to define the term "oral order."

D. *Summary of Comments and Responses on Proposed Rulemaking*

Notice of proposed rulemaking was published at 31 Pa.B. 6544 (December 1, 2001). Publication was followed by a 30-day public comment period, during which the Board received comments from 76 public commentators: The Hospital and Healthsystem Association of Pennsylvania (HAP); Pennsylvania Association of Non-Profit Home for the Aging (PANPHA); Pennsylvania Association of County Affiliated Homes; Pennsylvania Health Care Association; Pennsylvania State Nurses Association (PSNA); Pennsylvania Medical Directors Association; Clearfield Hospital (Clearfield); Joanna K. Stuck, RN, BSN; Wilmac Corporation; Bonham Nursing Center (6); Martha Davis, RN; Lutheran Community at Telford (Telford); Pleasant Ridge Manor; Department of Military and Veterans Affairs, Pennsylvania Soldiers' and Sailors' Home (2); Oil City Presbyterian Home (Oil City); Erie Presbyterian Lodge; Cambridge Springs Presbyterian Home; Ridge Crest Nursing and Rehabilitation Center (Ridge Crest); University of Pittsburgh School of Nursing; University of Pittsburgh Medical Center, Division of Geriatric Medicine;

Peter Becker Community; County of Lehigh Cedarbrook Nursing Homes (Cedarbrook); Lock Haven Hospital; and numerous representatives of HCR ManorCare (47).

Following the close of the public comment period, the Board received comments from the House Professional Licensure Committee (HPLC) and the Independent Regulatory Review Commission (IRRC). The Senate Consumer Protection and Professional Licensure Committee (SCP/PLC) did not comment. Responses to these comments are organized by subject.

§ 21.14. *Administration of drugs.*

IRRC questioned why the Board is including an LPN as a person who may administer a drug in this section of Subchapter A (relating to registered nurses), instead of Subchapter B (relating to practical nurses). The Board concurs and has deleted the reference to "a licensed practical nurse who is acting in accordance with § 21.145(b)."

§ 21.145. *Functions of the LPN.*

§ 21.145(b)—*oral prescriptions or orders*

IRRC and HAP recommend that the Board define "oral prescription or order" and be consistent when using this terminology. The Board's intent was to include both a situation in which the ordering practitioner delivers the order in the presence of the LPN and a situation in which the order is received over the telephone. The Board agrees that the terminology may be vague and confusing. To eliminate any confusion over the meaning of the words "prescription" and "order," the Board therefore removes reference to the word "prescription" and defines the term "oral order" in § 21.141 as "a spoken order issued by a practitioner authorized by law and by facility policy to issue orders for medical and therapeutic measures."

§ 21.145(b)—*training and qualification of the LPN to accept oral orders*

The HPLC, IRRC, the PSNA, Clearfield and the University of Pittsburgh School of Nursing have raised concerns about the level of training and instruction LPNs receive regarding their qualifications to accept oral orders and about the Board's conclusion that LPNs receive adequate instruction in pharmacology and critical thinking skills to accept oral orders. The HPLC and IRRC requested more specific information on which this conclusion is based, including curriculum requirements for LPN education programs.

Under section 5 of the Practical Nurse Law (63 P. S. § 655) and § 21.203 (relating to specific curriculum requirements for practical nursing programs), practical nursing programs must have a minimum of 1,500 hours of combined theory and clinical practice over at least a 12-month period. Section 21.203(c) and (d)(5) requires that pharmacology content be included in practical nursing education curriculum. Furthermore, Board criteria for approval of an intravenous (IV) therapy course, whether incorporated in the LPN curriculum or in an LPN IV therapy course, require content on "review of compatibility of drugs and solutions" as well as "drug actions, interactions, adverse reactions, preventions, and recognition of unexpected outcomes." (See Criteria for an Pennsylvania Board Approved Intravenous Therapy Education Program for the Student/Graduate/Licensed Practical Nurse.)

In response to a survey conducted by the Board in October 1997 of the 49 practical nursing programs in

operation at that time, 2 of the programs indicated a distinct pharmacology course as part of the curriculum, 14 programs integrated pharmacology content and 33 programs included a distinct course as well as integrated content.

All of the LPN programs that responded to a related questionnaire in 1997 indicated pharmacotherapeutics, pharmacokinetics and pharmacodynamics are covered in the curriculum. Two programs awarded three academic credits, all others included from 20 to 120 contact hours of pharmacology content. Practical nurses are instructed how to transcribe physician orders from a chart as part of their curriculum.

Because nursing practice changes frequently, the National Council of State Boards of Nursing conducts a Nationwide job analysis study of newly licensed practical/vocational nurses at least every 3 years. Both the frequency of performance and the priority ratings provided by the respondents to the related activity statements become the basis for revision of the National Council Licensure Examination for Practical Nurses (NCLEX-PN) Test Plan. As of April 1999, 5–11% of the items on the NCLEX-PN Test Plan currently relate to pharmacological therapies. Likewise, 5–11% of the items on the NCLEX-RN Test Plan relate to pharmacological and parenteral therapies.

The administrators and representatives of several facilities, as well as the University of Pittsburgh Medical Center, Division of Geriatric Medicine, specifically commented on the ability of LPNs to accept oral orders, stating that LPNs are capable of receiving verbal orders and following the appropriate protocol in the clinical record and that practical nursing programs in this Commonwealth already give instruction in pharmacology to their students, including doses calculation, drug classification and usage (PANPHA, Oil City, Telford and Cedarbrook). Telford and Cedarbrook added that the facility would provide in-service training and supervision to the LPNs as needed.

The Board concludes that LPNs are adequately prepared to take and administer oral orders. LPNs are presently permitted to administer all written orders within their scope of practice and take and administer oral orders when the urgency of the medical circumstances requires immediate medication or therapeutic measures. The Board agrees with Ridge Crest who stated it has “always found it an enigma that LPNs were able to administer any and all medications from over the counter to controlled substances, but were not able to take an [oral] order to administer the same medications that they are qualified to administer.”

§ 21.145(b)—limitation of proposed regulation to long-term care facilities

The HPLC questioned whether the acceptance of oral orders could be limited to long-term care facilities, questioning whether the same staffing concerns exist in hospitals and ambulatory surgical facilities. The HPLC requested the Board to evaluate a “limited authority” for LPNs to accept oral orders in long-term care facilities but not in hospitals and ambulatory surgical facilities. After considering the HPLC’s comments and concerns, the Board declines consideration of an authority limited to certain types of facilities. Under the Professional Nursing Law (63 P. S. §§ 211–226) and the Practical Nurse Law (63 P. S. §§ 651–667.8), the Board establishes rules and regulations for the licensure and practice of professional and practical nursing in this Commonwealth. Under the

Health Care Facilities Act (35 P. S. §§ 448.101–448.904b), the Department of Health (Department) is charged with licensing and regulating hospitals, nursing homes and ambulatory surgical facilities. Current Department regulations specify the health care practitioners who may receive oral or telephone orders in varying circumstances at each type of facility. See 28 Pa. Code §§ 107.62, 211.3 and 555.12 (relating to oral orders; oral and telephone orders; and oral orders). The Board may not alter Department regulations or assert jurisdiction over health care facilities contrary to what is mandated by statute. In light of its authority to regulate only nurses and not facilities, the Board has taken what it feels is a balanced approach in its regulations, permitting LPNs to accept oral orders if other agency regulations recognize the practice, the organization in which the LPN is employed permits the practice, the LPN can demonstrate that he has had the appropriate education and training and the LPN only accepts and acts on orders that are within the scope of practice for the LPN. If an organization or facility, for example, has a sufficient number of RNs and does not wish to permit LPNs to accept oral orders, it need not do so. The Board does not encourage the use of oral orders in all types of health care facilities, but wishes to remove unnecessary restrictions which may delay delivery of safe health care.

§ 21.145(b)(3)—questioning the order

Section 21.145(b)(3) requires the LPN to both question any order which is perceived as unsafe or contraindicated for the patient or which is not clear and to raise the issue with the ordering practitioner or other responsible person. Both IRRC and the HPLC requested an explanation as to whom the LPN is to question regarding an unclear or perceived unsafe or contraindicated order and the manner in which the LPN is to raise the issue. If the LPN questions an order perceived as unsafe or contraindicated, the LPN shall attempt to question the ordering practitioner first. If the ordering practitioner is not available, the LPN should raise the issue with an RN at the facility in a manner consistent with the protocols or policies of the facility. The Board has made this change in final-form rulemaking.

The Board declines to mandate a single specific procedure for questioning an order. The particular situation itself may determine how an apparently unclear, unsafe or contraindicated order might be clarified. Contact with the practitioner who issued the order may be by telephone or facsimile. If that practitioner is unavailable, an RN should be consulted to assist the LPN by consulting drug manuals, textbooks or other available resources. Sometimes a pharmacist or other responsible health care practitioner might be able to resolve the situation in conjunction with the RN and the LPN. A facility may well have a protocol or policy which reflects its own structure or needs. It is the experience of the professional members of the Board that questions regarding orders can almost always be answered to the satisfaction of all parties, including the ordering practitioner and the nurse.

§ 21.145(b)(5)—transcribing the oral order

Both IRRC and the HPLC point out that § 21.145(b)(5) deletes existing language that the countersignature of the physician shall be obtained in accordance with applicable Department regulations governing the licensed facility and request an explanation “as to why this requirement has been deleted.” The elimination of the countersignature language in this paragraph would in no way eliminate the requirement for a countersignature contained in the applicable Department regulations. The Board was

attempting to eliminate what it felt was duplicative and unnecessary language referring to another agency's requirements. However, the Board will retain this reference to the Department facility regulations, modified to reflect the fact that practitioners other than physicians are authorized to issue oral orders.

E. Fiscal Impact and Paperwork Requirements

The final-form rulemaking will have no fiscal impact and will not impose additional paperwork on licensees, the private sector, the general public or the Commonwealth and its political subdivisions.

F. Sunset Date

The Board continuously monitors its regulations. Therefore, no sunset date has been assigned.

G. Regulatory Review

Under section 5(a) of the Regulatory Review Act (71 P. S. § 745.5(a)), on December 1, 2001, the Board submitted a copy of the notice of proposed rulemaking, published at 31 Pa.B. 6544, to IRRC and the Chairpersons of the SCP/PLC and the HPLC for review and comment.

Under section 5(c) of the Regulatory Review Act, IRRC and the Committees were provided with copies of the comments received during the public comment period, as well as other documents when requested. In preparing the final-form rulemaking, the Department has considered all comments from IRRC, the House and Senate Committees and the public.

Under section 5.1(j.2) of the Regulatory Review Act (71 P. S. § 745.5a(j.2)), on November 17, 2003, the final-form rulemaking was approved by the HPLC. On November 19, 2003, the final-form rulemaking was deemed approved by the SCP/PLC. Under section 5.1(e) of the Regulatory Review Act, IRRC met on November 20, 2003, and approved the final-form rulemaking.

I. Findings

The Board finds that:

(1) Public notice of proposed rulemaking was given under sections 201 and 202 of the act of July 31, 1968 (P. L. 769, No. 240) (45 P. S. §§ 1201 and 1202) and the regulations promulgated thereunder in 1 Pa. Code §§ 7.1 and 7.2.

(2) A public comment period was provided as required by law and all comments were considered.

(3) The final-form rulemaking does not enlarge the purpose of the proposed rulemaking published at 31 Pa.B. 6544.

(4) The final-form rulemaking is necessary and appropriate for administering and enforcing the authorizing acts identified in this preamble.

J. Order

The Board, acting under its authorizing statutes, orders that:

(a) The regulations of the Board, 49 Pa. Code Chapter 21, are amended by amending §§ 21.14, 21.141 and 21.145 to read as set forth in Annex A, with ellipses referring to the existing text of the regulation.

(Editor's Note: The amendment to § 21.141 was not included in the proposed rulemaking published at 31 Pa.B. 6544.)

(b) The Board shall submit this order and Annex A to the Office of General Counsel and the Office of the Attorney General as required by law.

(c) The Board shall certify this order and Annex A and deposit them with the Legislative Reference Bureau as required by law.

(d) This order shall take effect on publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

TITLE 49. PROFESSIONAL AND VOCATIONAL STANDARDS

PART I. DEPARTMENT OF STATE

Subpart A. PROFESSIONAL AND OCCUPATIONAL AFFAIRS

CHAPTER 21. STATE BOARD OF NURSING

Subchapter A. REGISTERED NURSES

RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE REGISTERED NURSE

§ 21.14. Administration of drugs.

(a) A licensed registered nurse may administer a drug ordered for a patient in the dosage and manner prescribed.

(b) A licensed registered nurse, responsible for administering a drug, may supervise a graduate nurse or a nursing student in an approved nursing education program in the administration of the drug. In this section, "supervise" means the licensed registered nurse is physically present in the area or unit where the student or unlicensed graduate is practicing. This definition is not intended to limit in any way the practice of practical nursing as defined in the Practical Nurse Law (63 P. S. §§ 651—667).

Subchapter B. PRACTICAL NURSES

GENERAL PROVISIONS

§ 21.141. Definitions.

The following words and terms, when used in this subchapter, have the following meanings, unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

Act—The Practical Nurse Law (63 P. S. §§ 651—667) which establishes standards for the education of practical nurses and the practice of practical nursing.

Approved—Approved by the Board.

Board—The State Board of Nursing of this Commonwealth.

LPN—Licensed practical nurse. A nurse licensed under this subchapter to practice in this Commonwealth.

Oral order—A spoken order issued by a practitioner authorized by law and by facility policy to issue orders for medical and therapeutic measures.

Patient (includes residents and clients)—A person, other than a spouse or immediate family member, who receives professional services from a licensed practical nurse, regardless of whether or not the nurse receives remuneration for the services.

Practice of practical nursing—The performance of selected nursing acts in the care of the ill, injured or infirm under the direction of a licensed professional nurse, a licensed physician or a licensed dentist which do not require the specialized skill, judgment and knowledge required in professional nursing.

Professional relationship—The relationship which shall be deemed to exist for a period of time beginning with the first professional contact or consultation between a licensed practical nurse and a patient and ending with the final professional contact between them. The administration of emergency medical treatment or transitory trauma care will not be deemed to establish a professional relationship.

Sexual impropriety—The term includes the following offenses:

(i) Making sexually demeaning or sexually suggestive comments about or to a patient, including comments about a patient's body or undergarments.

(ii) Unnecessarily exposing a patient's body or watching a patient dress or undress, unless for therapeutic purposes or the patient specifically requests assistance.

(iii) Examining or touching genitals without the use of gloves when performing an otherwise appropriate examination.

(iv) Discussing or commenting on a patient's potential sexual performance or requesting details of a patient's sexual history or preferences during an examination or consultation, except when the examination or consultation is pertinent to the issue of sexual function or dysfunction or reproductive health care. Discussion of a patient's sexual practices and preferences shall be fully documented in the patient's chart.

(v) Soliciting a date from a patient.

(vi) Volunteering information to a patient about one's sexual problems, preferences or fantasies.

Sexual violation—The term includes the following offenses:

(i) Sexual intercourse between a licensed practical nurse and a patient during the professional relationship.

(ii) Genital to genital contact between a nurse and a patient during the professional relationship.

(iii) Oral to genital contact between a nurse and a patient during the professional relationship.

(iv) Touching breasts, genitals or any other body part for any purpose other than appropriate examination or treatment, or using prolonged or improper examination techniques, or after the patient has refused or withdrawn consent.

(v) Encouraging a patient to masturbate in the presence of the nurse or masturbating while the patient is present.

(vi) Providing or offering to provide drugs or treatment in exchange for sexual favors.

(vii) Using or causing the use of anesthesia or any other drug affecting consciousness for the purpose of engaging in any conduct that would constitute a sexual impropriety or sexual violation.

§ 21.145. Functions of the LPN.

(a) The LPN is prepared to function as a member of the health-care team by exercising sound nursing judgment based on preparation, knowledge, skills, understandings and past experiences in nursing situations. The LPN participates in the planning, implementation and evaluation of nursing care in settings where nursing takes place.

(b) The LPN administers medication and carries out the therapeutic treatment ordered for the patient in accordance with the following:

(1) The LPN may accept a written order for medication and therapeutic treatment from a practitioner authorized by law and by facility policy to issue orders for medical and therapeutic measures.

(2) The LPN may accept an oral order if the following conditions are met:

(i) The practitioner issuing the oral order is authorized by law and by facility policy to issue oral orders for medical and therapeutic measures.

(ii) The LPN has received instruction and training in accepting an oral order in an approved nursing education program or has received instruction and training in accepting an oral order in accordance with the established policies and protocols of the facility.

(iii) The policy of the facility permits an LPN to accept an oral order.

(iv) The regulations governing the facility permit an LPN to accept an oral order.

(3) The LPN shall question any order which is perceived as unsafe or contraindicated for the patient or which is not clear and shall raise the issue with the ordering practitioner. If the ordering practitioner is not available, the LPN shall raise the issue with a registered nurse or other responsible person in a manner consistent with the protocols or policies of the facility.

(4) The LPN may not accept an oral order which is not within the scope of functions permitted by this section or which the LPN does not understand.

(5) An oral order accepted by the LPN shall be immediately transcribed by the LPN in the proper place on the medical record of the patient. The transcription shall include the prescriber's name, the date, the time of acceptance of the oral order and the full signature of the LPN accepting the oral order. The countersignature of the ordering practitioner shall be obtained in accordance with applicable regulations of the Department of Health governing the licensed facility.

Title 61—REVENUE

DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE

[61 PA. CODE CH. 32]

Corrective Amendment to 61 Pa. Code § 32.2

The Department of Revenue has discovered a discrepancy between the agency text of 61 Pa. Code § 32.2 (relating to rates) as deposited with the Legislative

Reference Bureau and the official text as published in the *Pennsylvania Code Reporter* (Master Transmittal Sheet No. 338, January 2003) and as currently appearing in the *Pennsylvania Code*. The official text omitted § 32.2(b)(2)(ii) and (iii), (c) and (d)(1) and (i)

Therefore, under 45 Pa.C.S. § 901: The Department of Revenue has deposited with the Legislative Reference Bureau a corrective amendment to 61 Pa. Code § 32.2. The corrective amendment is effective as of January 4, 2003, the date the defective official text was announced in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

The correct version of 61 Pa. Code § 32.2 appears in Annex A.

TITLE 61. REVENUE

PART I. DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE

Subpart B. GENERAL FUND REVENUES

ARTICLE II. SALES AND USE TAX

CHAPTER 32. EXEMPTIONS

GENERAL PROVISIONS

§ 32.2. Exemption certificates.

(a) *When exemption certificates are required.* A person who is required by the act to collect tax upon sales or rentals of tangible personal property or taxable service shall, in every case in which he has not collected tax, have available for Departmental inspection a valid, properly executed exemption certificate which was accepted in good faith or, in lieu of the certificate, the following:

(1) Evidence that the property sold or rented is not tangible personal property or a taxable service as defined by the act.

(2) Documentary evidence that his customer is the United States or an instrumentality thereof, the Commonwealth, or a political subdivision or instrumentality of the Commonwealth.

(3) Documentary evidence that he was required to deliver the property sold, rented or serviced to a destination outside this Commonwealth for use outside this Commonwealth, and that he did, in fact, so deliver the property.

(b) *Relief from tax liability.* A seller or lessor who accepts in good faith an exemption certificate which discloses a proper basis for exemption upon its face is relieved of liability for collection or payment of tax upon transactions covered by the certificate.

(1) *Disclosure of proper exemption basis.* For a certificate to disclose a proper basis for exemption, it must meet the following requirements:

(i) The certificate must be an officially promulgated exemption certificate form, or a substantial and proper reproduction thereof.

(ii) The certificate must be dated and executed in accordance with the instructions published for use therewith, and must be complete and regular in every respect.

(iii) The certificate must state a proper exemption reason.

(2) *Acceptance in good faith.* An exemption certificate to be accepted in good faith shall also meet the following requirements:

(i) The certificate must contain no statement or entry which the seller or lessor knows, or has reason to know, is false or misleading. A certificate accepted by a seller or lessor, in the ordinary course of his business, which on its face discloses a valid basis of exemption consistent with the activity of the purchaser and character of the property or service being purchased, shall be presumed to be taken in good faith.

(ii) A seller or lessor is presumed to be familiar with the law and regulations regarding the property in which he deals. When a seller or lessor has accepted a blanket exemption certificate, each transaction between the parties is considered a separate claim for exemption thereunder, and the seller or lessor shall, therefore, exercise good faith in each transaction, in order to avoid liability for the tax.

(iii) The certificate must be in the physical possession of the seller or lessor, and available for Departmental inspection, on or before the 60th day following the date of the sale or lease to which the certificate relates. When a certificate is not made available for Departmental inspection on or before that time, the seller or lessor shall prove to the satisfaction of the Department, by means of evidence other than an exemption certificate, that the sale or lease in question is, in fact, exempt. In the absence of proof the transaction will be deemed taxable and assessed as such.

(c) *Penalties for misuse of exemption certificates.* False or fraudulent statements made upon an exemption certificate by a person, whether a seller, lessor, buyer, lessee or a representative or agent of the persons, is a misdemeanor, upon each separate conviction of which the offender may be sentenced to imprisonment not exceeding 1 year, a fine not exceeding \$1,000, or both, together with costs of prosecution. In addition, severe civil penalties are provided by law for misuse of exemption certificates by any person. Reference should be made to section 268(b) of the TRC (72 P. S. § 7268(b)).

(d) *Forms of certificates.* The following exemption certificate forms and instructions have been promulgated by the Department:

(1) *Forms for general use.* The Department form entitled Sales and Use Tax Exemption Certificate may be used for:

(i) *Unit exemption.* This exemption shall be used for all single sales or leases of tangible personal property.

(ii) *Blanket exemption.* This exemption shall be used for claims of exemption upon sales and leases of tangible personal property in a series of transactions between parties.

(2) *Forms for purchase of motor vehicles.* The following form is designed for purchase of motor vehicles, and is not valid for purposes other than that for which it is designed: *Form REV-191 Vehicles Sales and Use Tax Return*. This form shall be used for claims of exemption upon the purchase or lease of a motor vehicle, trailer, semitrailer or tractor which is required by law to be registered with the Bureau of Motor Vehicles, and shall accompany the application for title.

**[61 PA. CODE CHS. 817, 831 AND 867—869]
Obsolete Lottery Regulations**

The Secretary of Revenue, under the authority contained in section 303 of the State Lottery Law (72 P. S. § 3761-303), deletes Chapters 817, 831 and 867—869.

As the selection of on-line games available to lottery players in this Commonwealth changed over the years, regulations regarding the discontinued on-line games remained in 61 Pa. Code (relating to revenue). During normal review of its regulations, the Department of Revenue (Department) determined that deleting Chapters 817, 831 and 867—869 not only rids 61 Pa. Code of unnecessary regulations, it also alleviates any possible confusion in those who read Chapters 817, 831 and 867—869 and expect to play the nonexistent games.

Because the deleted chapters relate to on-line lottery games that were retired or discontinued with actual notice conveyed through the issuance of press releases and the termination of sales, the Department, under section 204 of the act of July 31, 1968 (P. L. 769, No. 240) (CDL) (45 P. S. § 1204) and the regulation thereunder, 1 Pa. Code § 7.4 (relating to omissions of notice of proposed rulemaking), finds that notice of proposed rulemaking is under the circumstances impracticable and, therefore, may be omitted.

Purpose of Final-Omitted Rulemaking

Play of the on-line lottery games subject to deletion were concluded in accordance with the terms of the regulations. The Lottery does not intend, now or in the near future, to offer these games in their stated configuration.

Explanation of Regulatory Requirements

The sections to be deleted are as follows:

Fiscal Impact

The Department has determined that the final-omitted rulemaking will have no fiscal impact on the Commonwealth.

Paperwork

The final-omitted rulemaking will not generate additional paperwork for the public or the Commonwealth.

Effectiveness/Sunset Date

The final-omitted rulemaking will become effective upon publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Regulatory Review

Under section 5.1(a) of the Regulatory Review Act (71 P. S. § 745.5a(a)), on September 30, 2003, the Department submitted a copy of the final-omitted rulemaking and a copy of a Regulatory Analysis Form to the Independent Regulatory Review Commission (IRRC) and to the Chairpersons of the House and Senate Committees on Finance. A copy of this material is available to the public upon request.

Under section 5.1(j.2) of the Regulatory Review Act, on November 5, 2003, the final-form rulemaking was deemed approved by the House and Senate Committees. Under section 5.1(e) of the Regulatory Review Act, IRRC met on November 6, 2003, and approved the final-omitted rulemaking.

Findings

The Department finds that the regulatory sections in Chapters 817, 831 and 867—869 are no longer necessary for administration and enforcement of the authorizing statute. Under section 204 of the CDL, the Department also finds that the proposed rulemaking procedures in sections 201 and 202 of the CDL (45 P. S. §§ 1201 and 1202) are unnecessary because the games were retired or discontinued with actual notice conveyed through the issuance of press releases and the termination of sales and are under the circumstances impracticable.

Order

The Department, acting under the authorizing statute, orders that:

DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION

[25 PA. CODE CHS. 121, 129 AND 145]

Small Sources of NO_x, Cement Kilns and Large Internal Combustion Engines

The Department of Environmental Protection (Department) is soliciting comments on changes it recommends to be made to the small sources of nitrogen oxide (NO_x), cement kilns and large internal combustion (IC) engines proposed rulemaking published at 32 Pa.B. 5178 (October 19, 2002).

The draft final rulemaking establishes in 25 Pa. Code Chapter 129 (relating to standards for sources) additional ozone season NO_x requirements for certain boilers, turbines and stationary IC units that are small sources of NO_x in Bucks, Chester, Delaware, Montgomery and Philadelphia Counties to achieve an estimated 3-ton per day reduction that the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) determined is necessary to support the ozone attainment demonstration for Philadelphia. The proposed rulemaking also establishes in 25 Pa. Code Chapter 145 (relating to interstate pollution transport reduction) ozone season NO_x emission limits for large stationary IC engines and Portland cement kilns in this Commonwealth to satisfy the Federal NO_x State Implementation Plan (SIP) call. The NO_x SIP call was issued in 1998, requiring 22 states that contribute to ozone nonattainment in the northeast to regulate NO_x sources to meet NO_x budgets set by the EPA. The large IC engine and cement kiln portion of the proposed rulemaking was initially proposed March 19, 1999, and never finalized. The current proposal was adopted by the Environmental Quality Board on September 17, 2002.

A. Summary of the Advance Notice of Final Rulemaking Changes

In response to comments received during the official public comment period on the proposed rulemaking and following the Department's review of other related information, the Department has prepared a draft final rulemaking for public comment. The draft final rulemaking contains significant changes in several areas. These changes include:

- The proposed rulemaking provided the opportunity for affected unit operators to meet the emission limits by averaging with other units; however, commentators requested that specific methodologies be provided along with the option to utilize NO_x allowances. The draft final rulemaking provides a simplified and specific compliance mechanism that incorporates both averaging and allowance surrender as compliance options.

- The new provisions set a baseline of allowable emissions for each type of unit. An operator is accountable for any emissions from the units above these baselines. An operator may average NO_x emissions among the owner's affected units, install controls for one or more units or not control at all, in which case the operator may purchase or utilize NO_x allowances to cover any excess emissions.

- Because the provisions expand the opportunity to average across different types of units and among facilities, the optional emission rate limits have been eliminated. The same overall level of emission reductions is expected.

- The emergency unit exemptions have been eliminated. Emissions from the routine maintenance testing of standby units generally do not exceed the threshold amount and will remain unaffected.

- Emission limits in 25 Pa. Code Chapter 145 for lean burn and spark ignited engines are increased from 1.5 to 3.0 grams per Bhp/hr to reflect anticipated changes to the Federal SIP call rules that were remanded and are due for publication by the EPA. For similar technical reasons, the limits in 25 Pa. Code Chapter 129 for these types of engines were also revised. The baseline for cement kilns was set at a level that, in conjunction with the current individual facility emission limits contained in the SIP, achieves the level of emission control required by the SIP call.

- A new compliance option has been added to 25 Pa. Code Chapter 129 to encourage energy production from zero emission renewable energy sources. Owners and operators of affected units may install and operate renewable energy sources to generate NO_x credits or may acquire and use credits generated by other sources. Renewable energy production reduces some NO_x emitting power generation. However, under the Department's existing NO_x Budget Trading Program (program), renewable energy production will not result in actual, surplus and creditable emission reductions unless NO_x allowances are also retired. Therefore, the draft final rulemaking provides for the retirement of a matching quantity of NO_x allowances allocated in the new source set aside provision (in 25 Pa. Code § 145.42(d) (relating to NO_x allowance allocations)) of the existing program.

- Additional emission measurement options were added to 25 Pa. Code Chapters 129 and 145 to provide additional cost-effective alternatives.

While there is no legal requirement to provide an opportunity to comment upon the Department's recommendations for final rulemaking, the Department believes further discussion would serve the public interest in this instance.

Administration of the Bureau of Liquor Control Enforcement; Age Compliance Check Program

Under 18 Pa.C.S. §§ 6308 and 6310 (relating to purchase, consumption, possession or transportation of liquor or malt or brewed beverages; and inducement of minors to buy liquor or malt or brewed beverages), this proposed rulemaking is necessary for the general administration of the age compliance program. This proposed rulemaking prescribes the manner in which compliance checks are to be performed and requires officers, employees and interns of the State Police Bureau of Liquor Control Enforcement (Bureau) to undergo approved training prior to participation in a compliance check.

Effect

The proposed rulemaking will affect the Bureau and establishments licensed to serve alcoholic beverages.

Fiscal Impact

The proposed rulemaking will impose minimal costs upon the State Police in developing and implementing the requisite training and the age compliance check program.

Paperwork Requirements

The proposed rulemaking will require the completion of additional forms, reports or other paperwork as prescribed and provided by the State Police.

Regulatory Review

CHAPTER 23. ADMINISTRATION OF THE BUREAU OF LIQUOR CONTROL ENFORCEMENT AGE COMPLIANCE CHECK PROGRAM

GENERAL PROVISIONS

GENERAL PROVISIONS

§ 23.1. Definitions.

The following words and terms, when used in this chapter, have the following meanings unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

Age compliance check—An undercover investigation of a licensed premises during which an underage buyer purchases or attempts to purchase liquor or malt or brewed beverages under the supervision of a Bureau officer.

Compliance—Refusing sale or service of liquor or malt or brewed beverages to the underage buyer.

Bureau officer—A State Police officer or liquor enforcement officer who is assigned to an age compliance check.

Enforcement Bureau (Bureau)—The Bureau of Liquor Control Enforcement of the State Police.

Licensed premises—A business licensed by the Liquor Control Board to sell liquor or malt or brewed beverages in this Commonwealth.

Liquor—Includes any alcoholic, spirituous, vinous, fermented or other alcoholic beverage, or combination of liquors and mixed liquor a part of which is spirituous, vinous, fermented or otherwise alcoholic, including all drinks and drinkable liquids, preparations or mixtures, and reused, recovered or redistilled denatured alcohol usable or taxable for beverage purposes which contain more than .5% of alcohol by volume, except pure ethyl alcohol and malt or brewed beverages.

Malt or brewed beverages—Any beer, lager beer, ale, porter or similar fermented malt beverage containing .5%

or more of alcohol by volume, by whatever name the beverage may be called.

Purchase—Obtaining food, nonalcoholic beverages, liquor, alcohol or malt or brewed beverages for consideration.

Sale or sell—The transfer of liquor, alcohol or malt or brewed beverages for consideration.

Underage buyer—An individual between 18 and 20 years of age who is an officer, employee or intern of the Enforcement Bureau and participates in an age compliance check.

COMPLIANCE CHECKS

§ 23.21. Required training.

(a) *Bureau officers.* Before participating in an age compliance check, Bureau officers shall complete training approved by the Enforcement Bureau.

(b) *Underage buyers.* Before participating in an age compliance check, an underage buyer shall complete a training course prescribed by the Enforcement Bureau, which includes instruction in at least the following areas of study:

(1) Applicable provisions of the Liquor Code (43 P. S.) and 18 Pa.C.S. (relating to the Crimes Code).

(2) Safety protocols.

(3) Undercover investigations.

(4) Testifying in court.

§ 23.22. Age compliance checks.

(a) The age compliance check shall be conducted with at least one bureau officer and one underage buyer.

(b) A Bureau officer shall be in charge of the age compliance check.

(c) A Bureau officer shall enter and remain inside the licensed premises during the age compliance check.

(d) The age compliance check shall be conducted at the licensed premises during regular business hours.

(e) While inside the licensed establishment, the Bureau officer will endeavor to maintain visual contact with the underage buyer.

(f) The Bureau officer shall observe the activity inside the licensed premises and determine if it is safe and appropriate to conduct the age compliance check.

(g) Underage buyers may purchase or attempt to purchase liquor or malt or brewed beverages only during an age compliance check and only while under the direct supervision of a Bureau officer.

(h) Underage buyers may not consume liquor or malt or brewed beverages.

(i) Upon purchase of liquor or malt or brewed beverages, the underage buyer shall deliver the liquor or malt or brewed beverages to the Bureau officer as soon as possible, consistent with safety protocols.

(j) A Bureau officer shall be responsible for insuring notification is made of the results of the age compliance check to the licensed premises.

(1) If the licensed premises is not in compliance, immediate verbal notification will be provided followed by written notification within 10 working days.

(2) If the licensed premises is found to be in compliance, written notification of compliance will be provided to the licensed premises.

Designation of Emergency Vehicles

Under 75 Pa.C.S. § 6106 (relating to designation of emergency vehicles by Pennsylvania State Police), the State Police may designate any vehicle or group of vehicles as emergency vehicles upon a finding that the designation is necessary to the preservation of life or property or to the execution of emergency governmental functions. Under existing regulations, the only vehicles eligible for emergency designation are those belonging to the Pennsylvania Emergency Management Agency, a local emergency management agency or a bona fide rescue organization. This proposed rulemaking amends § 41.5 (relating to eligibility) to allow the Department of Corrections (Department) to apply for emergency vehicle designation of Department vehicles used by its Hostage Rescue Teams, Hostage Negotiation Teams, Corrections Emergency Response Teams, Corrections Rifle Specialist Teams and Central Office Special Teams Coordinator.

Effect

The proposed rulemaking will affect the Department.

The proposed rulemaking will have a minimal fiscal impact.

Temporary Order Designating Chronic Wasting Disease a Dangerous Transmissible Disease

The Department of Agriculture (Department) designates Chronic Wasting Disease (CWD) a "dangerous transmissible disease" under the authority of 3 Pa.C.S. § 2322(d) (relating to neoplastic diseases, metabolic diseases and heritable diseases). This designation will facilitate the Department's efforts to detect and contain CWD and will assist this Commonwealth's cervid industry in developing control programs for the disease.

CWD is a disease of whitetail deer, elk and other cervids and is a member of the group of diseases known as transmissible spongiform encephalopathies (TSEs). Other more well known TSEs are scrapie and bovine spongiform encephalopathy (BSE) or "mad cow" disease. All are thought to be caused by a protein that has converted to an abnormal infectious form prion. There is some evidence, in the case of BSE, that humans may

become infected through consumption of meat products containing central nervous system tissues, thus there is a significant public health interest concerning all TSEs.

Recently, many states have instituted import regulations that require cervids entering those states be from herds that are participating in a surveillance program and that the state of origin have authority to take action in the event that CWD is diagnosed. To support our captive cervid industry and to keep these markets open, it will be necessary for the Department to assist in the development and oversight of a surveillance program and to take action in the event that a case of CWD is diagnosed. The authority to do so will depend on the designation of CWD as a "dangerous transmissible" disease.

The Department has authority under 3 Pa.C.S. §§ 2301—2389 (relating to the Domestic Animal Law) to regularly monitor the domestic animal population of this Commonwealth to determine the prevalence, incidence and location of transmissible diseases. The Department has authority under this act to declare a particular disease not contained in the original act to be a "dangerous transmissible" disease through issuance of a temporary order.

This order is a temporary order, as required under 3 Pa.C.S. § 2322(d). It is a reissuance of earlier 1-year temporary orders published at 32 Pa.B. 316 (January 19, 2002) and 33 Pa.B. 204 (January 11, 2003). This order shall take effect January 4, 2004, and shall remain in effect until no later than January 4, 2005. The Department may: (1) reissue this temporary order to extend the designation beyond January 4, 2005; (2) allow this temporary order to expire on January 4, 2005; (3) supplant this temporary order with a formal regulation designating CWD a "dangerous transmissible disease"; or (4) modify this temporary order.

LAND RECYCLING AND ENVIRONMENTAL REMEDIATION

UNDER ACT 2, 1995

PREAMBLE 1

Acknowledgment of Notices of Intent to Remediate Submitted under the Land Recycling and Environmental Remediation Standards Act (35 P. S. §§ 6026.101—6026.908).

Sections 302—305 of the Land Recycling and Environmental Remediation Standards Act (act) require the Department of Environmental Protection (Department) to publish in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* an acknowledgment noting receipt of Notices of Intent to Remediate. An acknowledgment of the receipt of a Notice of Intent to Remediate is used to identify a site where a person proposes to, or has been required to, respond to a release of a regulated substance at a site. Persons intending to use the Background Standard, Statewide Health Standard, the Site-Specific Standard or who intend to remediate a site as a special industrial area must file a Notice of Intent to Remediate with the Department. A Notice of Intent to Remediate filed with the Department provides a brief description of the location of the site, a list of known or suspected contaminants at the site, the proposed remediation measures for the site and a description of the intended future use of the site. A person who demonstrates attainment of one, a combination of the cleanup standards or who receives approval of a special industrial area remediation identified under the act will be relieved of further liability for the remediation of the site for any contamination identified in reports submitted to and approved by the Department. Furthermore, the person shall not be subject to citizen suits or other contribution actions brought by responsible persons not participating in the remediation.

Under sections 304(n)(1)(ii) and 305(c)(2) of the act, there is a 30-day public and municipal comment period for sites proposed for remediation using a Site-Specific Standard, in whole or in part, and for sites remediated as a special industrial area. This period begins when a summary of the Notice of Intent to Remediate is published in a newspaper of general circulation in the area of the site. For the sites identified, proposed for remediation to a Site-Specific Standard or as a special industrial area, the municipality, within which the site is located, may request to be involved in the development of the remediation and reuse plans for the site if the request is made within 30 days of the date specified. During this comment period, the municipality may request that the person identified, as the remediator of the site, develop and implement a public involvement plan. Requests to be involved and comments should be directed to the remediator of the site.

The modification is the proposed use of virgin no. 5 fuel oil, virgin no. 6 fuel oil and reprocessed/recycled oil as fuel in the asphalt concrete plant's drum burner in addition to the gas (natural or LP) and virgin no. 2 fuel oil which the plant is currently allowed to burn.

Fugitive particulate matter emissions from the plant's RAP crushing system are projected by the applicant to be no greater than 10.51 tons in any 12 consecutive month period but are actually expected by the Department to be much less than this. The VOC emissions from the two oil storage tanks are expected to be negligible. The asphalt concrete plant will emit no more than 16.5 pounds of NOx, 39.0 pounds of CO, 43.95 pounds of SOx and 21.6 pounds of VOCs when firing no. 5 fuel oil, no. 6 fuel oil or reprocessed/recycled oil nor will the fabric collector used

for the control of PM emissions from the plant emit more than .04 grain of particulate matter per dry standard cubic foot of collector exhaust. The total combined HAP emissions from the asphalt plant are not expected to exceed 6.75 tons in any 12 consecutive month period and the formaldehyde and toluene emissions are not expected to exceed 2.09 and 1.96 tons, respectively, in the same period.

Following the completion of the proposed construction and modification, the entire facility will not emit more than 37.84 tons of NOx, 88.35 tons of CO, 99.59 tons of SOx, 29.84 tons of VOCs and 56.85 tons of PM, respectively, in any 12 consecutive month period.

The Department has determined that the proposed construction and modification will comply with all applicable regulatory requirements pertaining to air contamination sources and the emission of air contaminants including the best available technology requirements of 25 Pa. Code §§ 127.1 and 127.12. The Department consequently intends to issue a plan approval.

The following is a summary of the conditions the Department plans to place in the plan approval to be issued to ensure compliance with all applicable regulatory requirements:

1. The asphalt plant shall only be fired on gas (natural or LP), virgin no. 2 fuel oil, virgin no. 5 fuel oil, virgin no. 6 fuel oil or reprocessed/recycled oil.

2. The sulfur content of the virgin no. 5 fuel oil, virgin no. 6 fuel oil and reprocessed/recycled oil shall not exceed .5% (by weight).

3. The reprocessed/recycled oil used as fuel in the asphalt plant shall not contain contaminants equal to or in excess of the following limitations:

Cadmium	2 parts per million
Chromium	10 parts per million
Lead	100 parts per million
Total halides	1,000 parts per million
Polychlorinated biphenyls (PCBs)	None detected (detection limit no higher than two parts per million)

Additionally, the flashpoint of the reprocessed/recycled oil shall not be less than 140°F.

4. The permittee shall not accept for use in the asphalt plant any shipment of reprocessed/recycled oil for which the arsenic, cadmium, chromium, lead, total halide and PCB content and/or flashpoint are unknown, or which fails to meet any established limitation for any of these, nor shall the permittee accept for use any shipment of any oil to be used as fuel for which the sulfur content is unknown, or which fails to meet the limitation established herein for sulfur content. Additionally, the permittee shall not accept any shipment of virgin no. 5 or virgin no. 6 fuel oil to which reprocessed/recycled oil has been added unless the shipment is treated as reprocessed/recycled oil with respect to all applicable conditions of this plan approval nor shall the permittee accept any shipment of virgin no. 5 or virgin no. 6 fuel oil to which waste oil or other waste materials have been added nor shall the permittee add any waste oil or other waste materials to any fuel storage tank.

5. A sample of each load of reprocessed/recycled oil delivered to the asphalt plant shall be taken at the time of delivery to the plant using a sampling technique

capable of achieving a representative composite sample of the entire load and shall be retained onsite for at least 2 years for random selection and analysis by the Department. The samples are to be sealed and identified as to the date of delivery, delivery invoice number, and the like.

6. A sample of each shipment of reprocessed/recycled oil delivered to the asphalt plant shall be taken at the time of delivery to the plant using a sampling technique capable of achieving a representative composite sample of the entire load and analyzed for total halide concentration using EPA Method 9077. The results of these analyses will not, however, be accepted by the Department as a demonstration of compliance with the limitation established herein for total halides should they differ from the results of analyses performed using EPA Method 9076. The permittee shall also perform a complete analysis for all contaminants and parameters for which limitations have been established herein using reference methods specified by the Department on at least 1 out of every 15 shipments of reprocessed/recycled oil received.

7. The following analytical methods are to be employed to determine compliance with the contaminant limitations and flashpoint limitations specified herein unless the Department specifies an alternate method:

8. The permittee shall submit an annual report to the Department listing the delivery date, quantity delivered, origin and delivery invoice number of each shipment of reprocessed/recycled oil delivered to the asphalt plant during the previous calendar year as well as identifying the arsenic, cadmium, chromium, lead, total halide, PCB and sulfur content and the flashpoint of each shipment. This report shall further identify the specific source of all analytical data provided and describe why this analytical data accurately represents the contaminant concentrations and flashpoint of the reprocessed/recycled oil delivered to the plant. This report shall be submitted by March 15 of each year.

9. The emission of particulate matter from the exhaust of the fabric collector controlling the emissions from the asphalt plant shall not exceed .04 grain per dry standard cubic foot of exhaust.

10. The NO_x emissions from the asphalt plant shall not exceed .055 pound per ton of asphalt concrete produced when firing no. 5 fuel oil, no. 6 fuel oil or reprocessed/recycled oil.

11. The CO emissions from the asphalt plant shall not exceed .13 pound per ton of asphalt concrete produced when firing no. 5 fuel oil, no. 6 fuel oil or reprocessed/recycled oil.

12. The SO_x emissions from the asphalt plant shall not exceed .141 pound per ton of asphalt concrete produced when firing no. 5 fuel oil, .139 pound per ton of asphalt concrete produced when firing no. 6 fuel oil or .146 pound per ton of asphalt concrete produced when firing reprocessed/recycled oil.

13. The VOC emissions (expressed as methane) from the asphalt plant shall not exceed .032 pound per ton of

asphalt concrete produced when firing no. 5 fuel oil, no. 6 fuel oil or reprocessed/recycled oil.

14. The total combined HAP emissions from the asphalt plant shall not exceed 6.75 tons in any 12 consecutive month period, the formaldehyde emissions shall not exceed 2.09 tons in any 12 consecutive month period, the toluene emissions shall not exceed 1.96 tons in any 12 consecutive month period and the emission of any other individual HAP shall not exceed 1 ton in any 12 consecutive month period.

15. The quantity of asphalt concrete produced in the asphalt plant shall not exceed 1.35 million tons in any 12 consecutive month period.

16. The asphalt concrete plant shall not process RAP at a rate in excess of 25% of the total weight of all materials charged into the drum at any time.

17. The asphalt plant shall be stack tested to determine the NO_x, CO and VOC emission rates when firing no. 5 fuel oil and processing virgin material, when firing no. 5 fuel oil and processing a combination of virgin material and RAP, when firing no. 6 fuel oil and processing virgin material, when firing no. 6 fuel oil and processing a combination of virgin material and RAP, when firing reprocessed/recycled oil and processing virgin material and when firing reprocessed/recycled oil and processing a combination of virgin material and RAP. The plant shall additionally be stack tested to determine its particulate matter emission rate while operating in one of the six operating scenarios. Should the required NO_x, CO and VOC stack testing not be performed for any of the six operating scenarios identified herein, the asphalt plant will not be authorized to operate using that operating scenario.

18. The operation of the RAP crusher, screens and associated conveyors and feeder shall not result in the emission of any visible fugitive air contaminants (other than steam or water vapor).

19. No material other than virgin no. 2, no. 5 or no. 6 fuel oil and reprocessed/recycled oil shall be stored in the oil storage tanks. Additionally, no material having a vapor pressure equal to or greater than 10.5 kilopascals (1.5 psia) shall be stored in the tanks.

20. Following the completion of the construction and modification approved herein, the NO_x, CO, SO_x, VOC and PM emissions from the entire facility shall not exceed 37.84, 88.35, 99.59, 29.84 and 56.85 tons, respectively, in any 12 consecutive month period.

21. Comprehensive accurate records shall be maintained of the quantity of asphalt concrete produced each month as well as the amount of each type of fuel burned each month. All records shall be retained for at least 5 years and shall be made available to the Department upon request.

These changes are being made in accordance with the application for Plan Approval and are listed in the following table (25 Pa. Code § 127.12b).

2. The emissions from the D2 area of the facility shall be limited as follows: 55 tons of VOC in any consecutive 12-month period. Compliance with this condition shall be demonstrated through source testing as required in Condition No. 12 and the recordkeeping provisions in Condition No. 11 (25 Pa. Code § 127.12b).

3. Overall destruction efficiency of VOC (as propane) in the CATOX shall not be less than 98%. For inlet concentrations less than 1,000 ppmv VOC (as propane), the outlet concentration may not exceed 20 ppmv (as propane) (25 Pa. Code § 127.12b).

4. Visible emissions from the oxidizer stack shall not exceed 10% opacity at any time. The visible emission performance standard will be met by operating the D2 CATOX in accordance with manufacturer's specifications. This stack shall also be included in the qualitative inspection procedures described in the facility's Title V Permit, Section C (Site Level Requirements), Condition No. 018 (25 Pa. Code § 127.12b).

5. Equipment to continuously monitor and record the inlet and outlet temperature of the CATOX shall be installed. A minimum acceptable outlet temperature shall be established during the most recent stack test demonstrating at least 98% VOC (as propane) destruction efficiency. Records of inlet and outlet temperatures shall be kept on file for a minimum of 5 years and shall be made available to the Department upon request. Operation of the CATOX at an outlet temperature below the established minimum acceptable temperature shall be recorded as a deviation and reported in the next compliance history update (25 Pa. Code § 127.12b).

6. Incidental VOC emissions from the D2 area shall not exceed an aggregate of 1,000 pounds in the 6-month periods, January—June and July—December of each year as allowed in Title V Permit. For purposes of this condition, incidental emissions are those emissions associated with the normal or routine operation of the D2 area in a manner consistent with good operating practices that have been approved by the Department (25 Pa. Code § 127.12b).

7. The owner/operator shall not permit the emission to the outdoor atmosphere of any malodorous air contaminants from the D2 area in a manner so that the malodors are detectable outside the property of the owner/operator (25 Pa. Code § 123.31).

8. This facility is subject to the fugitive emission requirements of 25 Pa. Code §§ 123.1 and 123.2.

9. The owner/operator shall keep monthly VOC emission estimates for the D2 area. Material balances and calculations used to estimate emissions shall be kept onsite for a period of 5 years and be made available to the Department upon request (25 Pa. Code § 127.12b).

10. Source testing shall be conducted within 90 days following completion of the Phase 2 portion of the project or no later than February 28, 2005, to demonstrate the following (25 Pa. Code Chapter 139).

a. CATOX destruction efficiency for VOC emissions.

b. Compliance with the requirements of Condition 4 shall be demonstrated through the testing of the centrifugal dryer, the surge bin exhaust and one uncontrolled PES source in the D2 area and the application of the emission calculation procedures included in the Phase 1 Request for Determination dated August 6, 2003.

11. The simultaneous stack testing of the inlet and outlet of the CATOX shall demonstrate compliance with the destruction efficiency requirement. This testing shall be performed at least once during the term of the permit.

12. The owner/operator shall submit a pretest protocol to the Department for approval at least 30 days prior to the performance of the source test (25 Pa. Code Chapter 139).

13. Stack testing shall be performed in accordance with 25 Pa. Code Chapter 139 and the Department's Source Testing Manual.

14. The Department shall be notified at least 2 weeks prior to the date of the source test so that an observer may be present (25 Pa. Code Chapter 139).

15. Two copies of the source tests results shall be supplied to the Department for review within 60 days following completion of the source test (25 Pa. Code Chapter 139).

16. The owner/operator may apply for Emission Reduction Credits once emission limitations are established through source testing in accordance with 25 Pa. Code Chapter 127, Subchapter E. Baseline emissions shall be established in accordance with 25 Pa. Code § 127.207(4).

17. This Plan Approval authorizes temporary operation of the new or modified process equipment and operation of the catalytic oxidizer covered in this Plan Approval provided the following conditions are met (25 Pa. Code § 127.12b).

a. The Department must receive written notice from the owner/operator of the completion of the installation of the CATOX and the operator's intent to commence operation of the CATOX at least 5 working days prior to the completion of construction. Once the CATOX is installed increases of production can commence while the remainder of Phase 2 construction is completed.

b. Operation is authorized only to facilitate the start-up and shake-down of sources and cleaning devices, to permit operations pending the issuance of an Operating Permit or to permit the evaluation of the sources for compliance with all applicable regulations and requirements.

c. This condition authorizes temporary operation of the sources for a period of 180 days from the commencement of increased production, provided the Department receives notice from the owner/operator under subpart (a).

d. The owner/operator may request an extension if compliance with all applicable regulations and Plan Approval requirements has not been established. The extension request shall be submitted in writing at least 15 days prior to the end of this periods of temporary operation and shall provide a description of the compliance status of the source, a detailed schedule for establishing compliance and the reasons compliance has not been established.

e. The notice submitted by the owner/operator under subpart (a), prior to the expiration of this Plan Approval, shall modify the plan approval expiration date. The new plan approval expiration date shall be 180 days from the date of the written notice.

Persons wishing to provide the Department with additional information which they believe should be considered prior to the issuance of the Plan Approval may submit the information to the Department at the following address. A 30-day comment period, from the date of this publication, will exist for the submission of comments. Written comments must contain the name, address and telephone number of the person submitting the comments, identification of the proposed Plan Approval (specify the Plan Approval number) and concise statements regarding the relevancy of the information or objections to issuance of the Plan Approval.

A public hearing may be held, if the Department, in its discretion, decides that a hearing is warranted based on the information received. All persons submitting comments or requesting a hearing will be notified of the decision to hold a hearing by publication in a newspaper or the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* or by telephone, when the Department determines notification by telephone is sufficient.

Appeals must be filed with the Board within 30 days of publication of this notice in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, unless the appropriate statute provides a different time period. The Department of Environmental Protection (Department), under the Hazardous Sites Cleanup Act (HSCA) (35 P. S. §§ 6020.102—6020.1303), is proposing an interim response at the Raymark Industries, Inc. (Raymark) Lower Mill Landfill (landfill), Manheim Borough, Lancaster County.

The former 92-acre Raymark property is in the southeast portion of Manheim Borough, Lancaster County (USGS Manheim, PA Quadrangle map: North 40° 09' 29" latitude and West 76° 24' 34" longitude). This property can be found by measuring 6 1/2 inches north and 2 1/2 inches west of the southeastern corner of the map.

The 4.7-acre landfill is at the southern and southeastern borders of the Raymark property. This former disposal area (Site) comprises approximately 1.9 acres of the landfill area. The Site consists of a former in-filled lagoon and adjacent railroad right-of-way where waste and contaminated soil were placed. The Site is bordered to the north by the Norfolk Southern Railway Company and Pennsylvania Lines LLC right-of-way, to the west by Chickies Creek, to the east by Doe Run (tributary of Chickies Creek) and to the south by the confluence of Chickies Creek and Doe Run.

Prior to 1900, the Site was farmland. Plant operations began in 1908. These operations produced dry clutch brake linings or pads and other specialized friction products. The plant has produced these products throughout its history. All manufacturing operations were phased out during the 1990s. The Site was originally used as a settling basin/lagoon. Currently, this area contains lead and asbestos contaminated soil and solid waste with lead and asbestos content.

The Department proposes an interim response at this Site to protect public health and safety or the environment. This determination is based on the actual and potential human exposure to hazardous substances via inhalation, ingestion and dermal contact.

The Department is considering three alternatives: (1) No action, which allows the hazardous substances and contaminants to remain in place without modification. (2) Excavation of contaminated soil and waste from the railroad right-of-way with onsite disposal on the existing landfill, adding a 2-foot protective soil cover to the landfill area, institutional controls to prevent intrusive activities in the landfill area and routine groundwater monitoring. (3) Excavation of contaminated soil from the railroad right-of-way, removal of 2 feet of waste from the landfill area with off-site disposal, adding a 2-foot protective soil cover to the landfill area assuming original elevations and institutional controls and routine groundwater monitoring.

The Department is providing this notice under sections 505(b) and 506(b) of the HSCA (35 P. S. §§ 6020.505(b) and 6020.506(b)) and the publication of this notice starts

the administrative record period under the HSCA. The Administrative Record, which contains information about the Site and supports the Department's decision to perform this action at the Site, is available for public review and comment. **Notice of Proposed Interim Response
Boldan-Davis Site, Penn Township,
Westmoreland County**

The Department, under the HSCA, is proposing an interim response at the Boldan-Davis Site (Site), Penn Township, Westmoreland County. The Site is adjacent to Bolen Lane, approximately 0.25 mile south of Route 130. The Site consists of an area on the Davis and Blaine properties that contains an unknown quantity of buried and partially buried drums.

The Department has recently completed an investigation of the Site and is currently conducting an interim response at the Boldan Landfill Site (landfill), which is immediately adjacent to the south of the Site. William Bolen, the original owner and operator of the landfill, also owned the Site. William Bolen began operating an unpermitted landfill in 1958 that apparently included the landfill as well as the Site. Prior to waste disposal, the Site was used for coal strip mining. It appears that waste was deposited in pits left from the mining operation. The Site is currently used for residential purposes.

During the investigation, it was determined that waste is buried in a semicircle area at the base of the large hill on the Site. The buried waste portion of the Site is approximately 0.5 acre in size and contains pockets of industrial wastes including numerous 55-gallon drums and various amounts of debris. Samples collected during

the investigation indicated the presence of hazardous substances in Site soil, groundwater and waste materials. The buried drums are in various states of deterioration. Continued deterioration of the buried drums will lead to a larger release of hazardous substances and a more extensive clean up. Several drums are also exposed at the surface presenting a direct contact threat. The current Site conditions present a substantial danger to the public health and the environment.

The Department considered several alternatives at the Site, including: no action; securing of the site; and removal and disposal of the hazardous substances at the Site. The Department determined that removal and disposal of the hazardous substances was the appropriate course of action. This alternative was selected because it complied with all applicable laws and regulations and was determined to be the most environmentally sound procedure for the Site.

Fieldwork for the prompt interim response to remove and dispose of the waste at the Site is anticipated to begin in early January 2004. All hazardous materials at the Site will be removed and properly disposed. The Department, following the public hearing and comment period, will complete a Statement of Decision and Response to Comments.

This notice is being provided under sections 505(b) and 506(b) of the HSCA. FISH AND BOAT COMMISSION

Designation of Wild Trout Streams

Under 58 Pa. Code § 57.11 (relating to listing of wild trout streams), it is the policy of the Fish and Boat Commission (Commission) to accurately identify and classify stream sections supporting naturally reproducing populations of trout as wild trout stream sections. The list of a stream section as a wild trout stream section is a biological designation that does not determine how it is managed. The Commission uses many factors in determining the appropriate management of streams. The Commission’s Fisheries Management Division maintains the list of wild trout streams. The Executive Director, with the approval of the Commission, will from time-to-time publish the list of wild trout streams in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

At the next Commission meeting on January 26 and 27, 2004, the Commission will consider the following list of wild trout streams. Persons with comments, objections or suggestions concerning the classification of the streams listed may submit them in writing to Executive Director, Fish and Boat Commission, P. O. Box 67000, Harrisburg, PA 17106-7000, within 30 days after publication of this notice in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. Comments submitted by facsimile will not be accepted.

Comments also may be submitted to ra-pfbcregs@state.pa.us. A subject heading of the proposal and a return name and address must be included in each transmission. In addition, all electronic comments must be contained in the text of the transmission, not in an attachment. Proposed Special Regulation Designations and Redesignations

Clean Water State Revolving Fund; Federal FY 2002 and 2003 Project Priority List

The Pennsylvania Infrastructure Investment Authority (PENVEST) and the Department of Environmental Protection (Department) have amended the combined Federal Fiscal Year 2002/2003 Clean Water State Revolving Fund (CWSRF) Project Priority List (List) of municipal sewage construction projects.

The FY 2002/2003 List was prepared in conformance with the requirements of Title II and Title VI of the Clean Water Act (act) and Federal guidance, and was previously approved by the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). The projects included on the List have a project priority rating established under the Department's EPA-approved Chapter 103 project priority rating system. The act stipulates that states must maintain a List of municipal sewage projects from which to develop the annual CWSRF Intended Use Plan (IUP) list of projects to be funded.

The projects added to the List will not replace any project currently on the approved FY 2002/2003 List. Projects were placed in the appropriate ranking slot in relation to other rated and ranked projects on the List. The rank order standing of projects on the List does not

dictate the order in which projects are chosen for funding in the CWSRF program. A project may be selected from any numerical rank position on the List for funding. A project's readiness to proceed and the reasonable availability of alternative sources of funds have a bearing on project selection for funding in the program.

Some projects added to the FY 2002/2003 List are expected to proceed to construction in the near future and others are being added as potential projects for future construction loan consideration. The projects expected to be ready for loan funding in the near future have submitted applications for funding and may be placed on an IUP to: (1) replace projects that have not proceeded timely toward initiation of project construction; and/or (2) fill funding gaps that have developed as a result of cost savings. Projects removed from an IUP will remain on the List and be considered for CWSRF loan funds in the future.

Projects are being removed from the FY 2002/2003 List because they have received CWSRF funding and are now either in some stage of construction or have been completed.

Interested persons are invited to express their views on the priority rating or ranking of projects on the revised FY 2002/2003 List. On October 2, 2003, Verizon Pennsylvania Inc. (Verizon or the Company) filed tariff revisions to its Services for Other Telephone Companies Tariff—Pa. PUC No. 216 to remove certain Unbundled Network Elements (UNE) and to revise terms and conditions for line sharing. The filing was said to be in compliance with the Federal Communications Commission's (FCC) *Triennial Review Order* (TRO).¹ The filing was made on 30 day's notice to become effective on November 1, 2003.

Verizon proposes to make the following revisions to its Tariff Pa. PUC No. 216:

- 1) Eliminate OC3 (Optical Carrier level-3)² and OC12 (Optical Carrier level-12) interoffice transport from the list of available UNEs.
- 2) Eliminate STS-1 (Synchronous Transport Signal-1)³ interoffice transport from the list of available UNEs.
- 3) Discontinue provisioning IOF (Inter Office Facility) Dark Fiber between a TC (Telephone Company) Collocation arrangement in a Telephone Company Central Office and the TC's central office (Dark Fiber Channel Termination).
- 4) Discontinue provisioning of new Line Sharing arrangements over copper loops or sub-loops.

The filing, which makes material changes to Verizon's tariff rules, terms and conditions, does not comply with

the Commission's filing requirements under 52 Pa. Code § 53.31 mandating 60 days notice for filings. Verizon's UNE Tariff 216 consists of service offerings that cannot be added, modified or withdrawn without further action by the Commission.⁴

On October 23, 2003, the Commission, by way of a Secretarial letter, extended the review period for consideration of the previous revisions until further action of the Commission to facilitate an accurate review of this filing. In addition, Verizon also filed responses to the following staff data requests:

- 1) Whether all the UNEs involved in this filing are made in accordance with FCC's TRO released on August 21, 2003, which became effective October 2, 2003.
- 2) To clarify the Pennsylvania regulation under which the Company has made this filing effective on 30 days notice, and the reason for not providing the statutorily required 60 days notice provision including documentary support.
- 3) To provide the paragraph numbers of the TRO that Verizon relies upon for each of the changes previously listed.
- 4) To provide citation to any relevant portion of Federal rule § 51.319⁵ in this regard, which requires dark fiber transport to be offered as a UNE; whether the proposed changes conflict with this rule.

In response to No. 1, Verizon claims that all of the revisions in the above filing were in accordance with the FCC's TRO.

In response to No. 2, Verizon maintains that the regulation in 52 Pa. Code § 53.59(f)(4) provides that ministerial filings for noncompetitive services may be effective on 1 day notice. Verizon considers the instant filing to be administrative in nature and argues that it could have been effective on 1 day notice, but was submitted with 30 days notice to allow sufficient time for Commission review.

In its response to No. 3, the Company indicates that paragraph 359 and paragraph 264—269 of the TRO applies for OCn (Optical Carrier-number) dedicated transport and interoffice dark fiber and line sharing respectively.

In response to No. 4, Verizon contends that the proposed changes comply with FCC rule 37 CFR 319(e), as revised by the FCC's TRO.

Regarding the filing regulations, we have always maintained that Verizon's UNE Tariff 216 consists of service offerings that cannot be added, modified or withdrawn without Commission approval. (See Commission's *Global Order* at p. 64.) We do not agree with Verizon's contention that this filing is administrative in nature and hence requires only one day's notice. Our regulation in § 53.59(f)(4) addressing ministerial changes applies only to those revisions that do not make material changes to the tariff rules, terms and conditions. In the instant filing, certain services will be removed or will no longer be available for competitive carriers, and are therefore considered material.

Our regulations in 52 Pa. Code § 53.31, requirement of notice, provides that unless the Commission otherwise orders, a company may not change an existing and duly established tariff except after notice of 60 days to the public. This general rule has been modified by 52 Pa. Code §§ 53.57—53.60 for certain telephone tariff filings related to “end-user consumers.” The intention was to revise and streamline existing filing requirements, lessen the regulatory burdens, and achieve regulatory parity as applied to CLECs and ILECs.

The competitive carriers affected by this filing and the public advocates should have the opportunity to intervene or file complaints. This filing requires a comprehensive review before a determination can be made of its compliance. As such, we require Verizon to comply with our standard filing regulation in 52 Pa. Code § 53.31 which requires 60 days notice for this type of filing.

On October 28, 2003, Covad Communications Company (Covad) filed a complaint against Verizon’s proposed tariff revisions. In its complaint, Covad alleges that the Verizon’s proposed tariff amendment to Tariff 216 is in violation of the Telecommunications Act of 1996 and the provisions of the Public Utility Code. Further, Covad alleges that Verizon incorrectly interpreted the FCC’s grandfathering rules for existing line sharing arrangements and unilaterally imposes additional limitations on CLECs beyond the FCC’s TRO. Covad claims that it raises factual issues, that Verizon’s proposed tariff will negatively impact competition for telecommunication services in Pennsylvania and that it requires a trial-type hearing.

Our review of the proposed tariff filing indicates that it may be unlawful, unjust, unreasonable and contrary to the public interest. Further, a legal determination is needed as to whether all the revisions made by Verizon in the instant filing beyond the complaint filed by Covad, fully comply with the FCC’s TRO. Accordingly, we will suspend this filing for investigation and the purposes of a Recommended Decision on the relevant factual and legal issues; *Therefore,*

It Is Ordered That:

1. The revision to Verizon Pennsylvania Inc.’s Tariff-Telephone Pa. PUC No. 216, which was filed on October 3, 2003, to become effective on November 1, 2003, the effective date of which was postponed until further action of the Commission to remove certain UNEs, is suspended for a period not to exceed 6 months, or until June 4, 2004, under 66 Pa.C.S. § 1308(b).
2. Unless specifically ordered by the Commission to file revisions on less than statutory notice, Verizon shall provide 60 days notice for this type of filing in any future revision to its Tariff-Telephone Pa. PUC No. 216.
3. Verizon shall file the appropriate tariff suspension supplements.
4. In conjunction with Covad’s complaint at R-00038871C0001, the Office of Administrative Law Judge shall assign this matter to an Administrative Law Judge for proceedings as shall be deemed necessary and the issuance of a Recommended Decision.
5. A copy of this Order be served upon Verizon, the Office of Consumer Advocate, the Office of Small Business Advocate, the Office of Trial Staff, the Office of Adminis-

trative Law Judge and published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Physical and Cyber Security Program Self Certification Requirements for Public Utilities

Background

In July 1998, the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (PUC or Commission) instituted a Year 2000 technology (Y2K) readiness formal investigation to ensure the safe and reliable delivery of utility services to citizens in this Commonwealth and to refine emergency management and response processes. Since the completion of the Y2K investigation, the PUC has been working closely with its jurisdictional utilities and the Pennsylvania Emergency Management Agency (PEMA) to ensure coordination of critical infrastructure emergency and security procedures. Following the events of September 11, 2001, and its involvement in House Resolution 361 (HR 361), the PUC began coordinating its security efforts with the State Office of Homeland Security.

As the result of recommendations made by the Commission in the September 1, 2002, HR 361 report “Protecting Critical Infrastructure: Keeping Pennsylvanians Safe,” the Bureau of Fixed Utility Services, in conjunction with the Law Bureau and the Bureau of Transportation and Safety, developed a security self certification process for all PUC jurisdictional utilities. The bureaus proposed that a Physical and Cyber Security Planning Self Certification Form (Self Certification Form) be submitted to the Commission yearly as part of each utility’s Annual Financial or Annual Assessment Report.

At the public meeting of July 17, 2003, the Commission adopted as its action the Motion sponsored by Commissioner Pizzingrilli in this proceeding. The corresponding Tentative Order was entered on August 5, 2003. The Tentative Order was published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* on August 16, 2003, with comments to the Tentative Order due by September 5, 2003.

Timely comments on the Tentative Order were filed by the Pennsylvania Telephone Association (PTA), the Energy Association of Pennsylvania (EAP), Pennsylvania-American Water Company (PA-American) and The Peoples Natural Gas Company d/b/a Dominion Peoples (Dominion Peoples). Columbia Gas of Pennsylvania, Inc. (Columbia) provided late filed comments on September 8, 2003.

Discussion

A. Confidentiality

In the Tentative Order, utilities were required to file the Self Certification Forms as an appendix to the Annual Financial or Annual Assessment Reports and any utility that desired its submitted form be kept confidential was required to file for a protective order.

The EAP, Columbia and PA-American aver that the Self Certification Forms should be automatically deemed confidential and proprietary, without the necessity of petitioning for a protective order.

Because of the potential security interests implicated by the release of a completed form, we find that the harm from release of the completed forms outweighs the public's interest in access to this information. Therefore, we deem that all completed Self Certification Forms filed with the Commission are to be treated as confidential.

B. Physical Location of the Self Certification Forms

The Tentative Order instructed utilities to append their Self Certification Form to either their Annual Financial or Annual Assessment Reports, beginning in 2004.

The EAP and PA-American believe that to the extent that submission of the Self Certification Forms is required, that the form should not reside in the utilities' Annual Financial or Annual Assessment Reports or be retained by the Secretary's Bureau. Primarily, the EAP takes the position that the Self Certification Forms should be retained at the companies' premises and an affidavit of compliance should be filed with the Commission. However, the EAP requests that security related documents filed with the Commission under this docket or any security docket should be filed with the Office of Executive Director, separately from all other documents filed with the Commission. PA-American urges the Commission to physically and/or electronically store the Self Certification Forms separately from other documents filed at the Commission.

The EAP and PA-American's request to house the Self Certification Forms in a location other than the Secretary's Bureau is based upon their assertion that the forms may be released to the public inadvertently.

To ensure the confidentiality of the Self Certification Form, we have reconsidered the filing location of the form. The Self Certification Form should be filed, beginning in 2004 at Docket No. M-00031717, and will be kept in a confidential folder by year (starting with F0004).

We have no reason to believe that the Commission's Secretary should not store these documents in the same manner that all confidential documents are handled. Additionally, we will not adopt the EAP's suggestion that an affidavit of compliance be filed with the Commission instead of the Self Certification Form.

By this Order, we are requiring each utility subject to the reporting requirements of 52 Pa. Code §§ 27.10, 61.28, 63.36, 65.19, 59.48 and 57.47¹ to submit the Self Certification Form. The form shall be submitted at the same time as the Annual Financial Reports filed on or after January 1, 2004, and each year thereafter. However, it shall be submitted under separate cover at Docket No. M-00031717.

For those utilities that are not subject to the previous annual financial reporting requirements, the Self Certification Form shall be submitted by each utility subject to the reporting requirements of 52 Pa. Code §§ 29.43, 31.10 and 33.103.² For these utilities, the form shall be submitted at the same time as the Annual Assessment Reports filed on or after January 1, 2004, and each year thereafter. However, it shall be submitted under separate cover at Docket No. M-00031717.

C. Redundant Reporting Requirements and Proposed Rulemaking

In the Tentative Order, we advised that the Law Bureau, in conjunction with the Bureau of Fixed Utility Services and the Bureau of Transportation and Safety, would initiate a rulemaking to include the security self certification reporting requirements and requirements for our jurisdictional utilities to develop and maintain appropriate physical and cyber security, emergency response and business continuity plans, as a permanent part of the Commission's regulations.

Dominion Peoples states that it is concerned that the proposed subsequent rulemaking may lead to the creation of regulations that are redundant with obligations that Pennsylvania public utilities have to Federal regulators, resulting in the inefficient and unnecessary layering of regulations. Dominion Peoples states that it is not opposed to a rulemaking that results in regulations codifying the obligation to file the security Self Certification Form. However, Dominion Peoples does not want Pennsylvania utilities to be in the position of responding to redundant or multiple requirements regarding the design or implementation of its security plans.

Columbia encourages a truly integrated and coordinated approach to avoid duplication of effort and to ensure that best practices are shared across all jurisdictions. As an example of a potential coordination concern, Columbia cites an operator statement submitted to the Commission that it has met the Federal Department of Transportation's Office of Pipeline Safety's security requirements and whether this statement will be superseded by the Self Certification Form. Likewise, Columbia inquires as to whether the Workplace Security Survey checklist attached to the HR 361 report will be necessary in light of the Self Certification Form.

Columbia suggests that enhanced coordination could be accomplished through a working group rulemaking process similar to the one employed during the gas restructuring process. The working group could then develop the regulations as well as suggest any necessary changes to the Self Certification Form.

We recognize that various Federal and State agencies have already placed requirements on many of our jurisdictional utilities to develop and maintain security and emergency response related plans and we do not wish to replicate the efforts of those authorities, nor create duplicative or undue effort for our jurisdictional utilities. The comments of Dominion Peoples and Columbia will be taken into account during the upcoming rulemaking. However, until that rulemaking is completed, each utility is required to annually file the Self Certification Form following this Order as Appendix A.

D. *Self Certification Form Content and Dates*

The EAP believes that all date related questions on the Self Certification Form should be modified to achieve the Commission's purpose of ensuring current and ongoing testing. The EAP states that testing of systems, physical security, emergency plans, cyber security and risk assessment are all ongoing and security is achieved through a sum of continuous partial testing rather than one big test undertaken over some specified time table. Additionally, the EAP avers that if the Self Certification Forms are deemed public documents and available to the public, these dates become a security threat in and of themselves.

The EAP proposes modifications to questions 3, 6, 7, 10 and 13 of the Self Certification Form to inquire if testing is done periodically, versus supplying specific testing dates.

We agree with the EAP, that in some cases, testing of physical security, cyber security, emergency response and business continuity plans are ongoing and security is achieved through a sum of continuous partial testing rather than one big test undertaken over some specified time table. Therefore, we will modify questions 3, 6, 7, 10 and 13 of the Self Certification Form to inquire if complete testing is performed annually, versus supplying specific testing dates.

Columbia submits that all parties need to understand and agree upon specific and concrete definitions for the terminology used in describing the plans and their contents. Columbia asserts that while the Tentative Order offered limited definitions, the definitions do not provide adequate guidance to ensure that all those who read them will interpret them similarly. Columbia suggests that developing more precise definitions at this point of the effort would eliminate any differences of interpretation and provide more cohesive results. Towards that end, Columbia submits that the Commission's regulations, resulting from the proposed rulemaking, should adopt standard definitions from the Disaster Recovery Institute International.

Columbia asserts that since many of the terms incorporated on the form are not yet precisely defined and the regulations have not yet been adopted, it may be impossible for a utility to compile the required plans and certify to them in a limited amount of time. Columbia is concerned with the due date for submission of the Self Certification Form. Columbia seeks clarification as to whether a Self Certification Form respondent is in compliance with the terms of the Tentative Order by answering "No" to any or all of the questions posed on the Form. Columbia submits that the timeframe for the initial submission of the Self Certification Form should provide ample time for utilities to develop, test and implement each of the various plans. Columbia suggests that a minimum of one year is required to properly design, develop, test and implement the plans.

We understand Columbia's request for additional guidance on the specifics of what the Commission expects to be included in the physical, cyber, disaster recovery, emergency response and business continuity plans. We expect these definitional issues to be dealt with in detail in the rulemaking. In the meantime, we expect each utility submitting a Self Certification Form to utilize and interpret, to the best of their ability, definitions for the various security plans provided in the Tentative Order.

In reply to Columbia's clarification request, while certainly not preferred, a utility could provide a "No" response to any or all of the questions posed on the form and be in compliance with the terms of the Tentative Order and this Order. We believe it is important that the Commission become aware of utilities without physical, cyber, disaster recovery, emergency response or business continuity plans as soon as possible, and not wait a year or more until a utility has completed designing, developing, testing and implementing their plans. Recognition of these utilities will enable the Commission to provide education outreach assistance on security planning.

E. *Commission's Security Educational Outreach Program*

In its comments, the EAP urges the Commission to designate a person to whom the industry representatives can bring questions concerning the Self Certification Form.

Industry representatives should bring questions concerning the Self Certification Form to the Commission's Bureau of Fixed Utility Services. Furthermore, as we stated in the Tentative Order, the HR 361 report stressed the importance of communicating with smaller and mid-sized companies regarding security issues and the sharing of best practices. Therefore, we reiterate our directive that Commission Staff develop an educational outreach component so that the purpose and intent of the Self Certification Form and additional information relative to the security, emergency response and business continuity plans are communicated to all companies. This outreach component should include trade associations representing the affected industries, existing working groups, such as the small water task force and any other opportunities that Commission Staff deems appropriate.

F. *Multiple Operating Companies' Filings*

The PTA requests that, in cases of multiple companies operating together under a common ownership, those companies be permitted to file one Self Certification Form collectively.

We believe that in many cases, even companies operating under a common ownership may have separate and distinct physical, cyber, disaster recovery, emergency response or business continuity plans. Therefore, we will not grant blanket approval to filing one form for multiple companies operating together under a common ownership, however, we will review each request for this treatment on a case by case basis.

Conclusion

In addition to submittal of the Self Certification Form, each of our jurisdictional utilities should note that we intend, as necessary, to review how their security plans affect, and will in the future affect, the ability to provide service and facilities to the public.

We note that the Commission has explicit statutory authority to institute these reporting requirements and to carry out and enforce the purposes of the Public Utility Code in the public interest. 66 Pa.C.S. §§ 501 and 504. The subject matter that the Commission may examine and act on under the Public Utility Code is very broad and includes any issue, such as security, which, if left unaddressed, could pose a serious threat to the utilities' responsibility to provide safe and reliable utility service.

As a result of the foregoing and, upon full consideration of all the matters before us at this time, we determine

that a self certification process for utility security programs should be instituted to determine the current and anticipated security compliance of all jurisdictional utilities; *Therefore,*

It Is Ordered That:

1. Utilities under the reporting requirements of 52 Pa. Code §§ 27.10, 29.43, 31.10, 33.103, 61.28, 63.36, 65.19, 59.48 and 57.47 be required to complete and file the Self Certification Form following this Order as Appendix A.

2. Utilities under the reporting requirements of 52 Pa. Code §§ 27.10, 61.28, 63.36, 65.19, 59.48 and 57.47 shall file the Self Certification Form at Docket No. M-00031717, at the time each Annual Financial Report is filed, beginning on or after January 1, 2004.

3. Utilities not subject to the previous reporting requirements but subject to the reporting requirements of 52 Pa. Code §§ 29.43, 31.10 and 33.103 shall file the Self Certification Form at Docket No. M-00031717, at the time each Annual Assessment Report is filed, beginning on or after January 1, 2004.

4. Blank Self Certification Forms be available to jurisdictional utilities from the Commission's website and from the Secretary.

5. Commission Staff develop and implement an educational outreach program so that the purpose and intent of the Self Certification Form and additional information relative to the security, emergency response and business continuity plans are communicated to all companies.

6. The Law Bureau, in conjunction with the Bureau of Fixed Utility Services and the Bureau of Transportation and Safety, initiate a rulemaking in an expedited manner to include the requirement for jurisdictional utilities to develop and maintain appropriate written physical and cyber security, emergency response and business continuity plans and the requirement for jurisdictional utilities to submit the security self certification form as part of the Commission's regulations.

7. Copies of this Order be provided to PEMA, the Pennsylvania Office of Homeland Security, the Department of Environmental Protection, the EAP, the PTA, the Pennsylvania Motor Truck Association, the Pennsylvania Bus Association, the Pennsylvania Taxicab and Paratransit Association, the Pennsylvania Moving and Storage Association, the Pennsylvania Limousine Association, the Pennsylvania Chapter of the National Association of Water Companies, the Pennsylvania Section of the American Water Works Association, the Pennsylvania Rural Water Association, Pennsylvania League of Cities and Municipalities, Pennsylvania State Association of Boroughs, Pennsylvania Local Government Commission, Pennsylvania State Association of Township Supervisors and the Commission jurisdictional respondents to HR 361.

8. This Order be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* and posted on the Commission's website.

COMPLAINT

The Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (Commission) is a duly constituted agency of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania empowered to regulate public utilities within the Commonwealth. The Commission has delegated its authority to initiate proceedings which are prosecutory in nature to the Bureau of Transportation and Safety and other bureaus with enforcement responsibilities. Pursuant to that delegated authority and Section 701 of the Public Utility Code, the Bureau of Transportation and Safety Prosecutory Staff hereby represents as follows:

1. That John Chapman, t/a Chapman's Limousine Service, respondent, maintains its principal place of business at 3303 Iowa Street, Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania 15219.

2. That respondent filed for limousine authority September 6, 2001, at Application Docket No. A-00118279. Said application was dismissed on April 11, 2002, for non-compliance. On June 17, 2002, respondent filed an application for limousine emergency temporary authority at F.6000, which was approved on September 3, 2002. On October 2, 2002, respondent filed an application for permanent limousine authority in Allegheny County at Application Docket No. A-00118279, F.2. Said application was approved by Commission Order entered March 10, 2003, pursuant to compliance with requirements set forth. To date, respondent has not met all of the requirements in the compliance order.

3. On July 26, 2003, Enforcement Officer John Addison spoke with John Chapman and asked him if he was operating limousine service in Allegheny County due to a lapse in insurance on file with this Commission. Mr. Chapman stated that he let his insurance lapse because he was discontinuing service. Mr. Chapman stated that he is in the process of selling his limousine. Mr. Chapman advised Officer Addison that the last time he provided service was in December of 2002. The Respondent abandoned or discontinued limousine service without having

submitted a letter to this Commission containing a statement that the service is no longer being rendered.

4. That respondent, by failing to submit a letter to this Commission containing a statement that limousine service is no longer being rendered, violated 52 Pa. Code § 3.381(a)(5) and 66 Pa.C.S. § 1102(a)(2).

WHEREFORE, the Bureau of Transportation and Safety Prosecutory Staff hereby requests that the Commission revoke John Chapman, t/a Chapman's Limousine Service's emergency temporary authority at A-00118279, F.6000 and that the Commission dismiss respondent's application at F.2 for non-compliance.

(Order Certifying a Material Question and Staying Proceedings; Stipulation Regarding Material Question Certified to Commission)

Opinion and Order

By the Commission:

Before the Commission for consideration are: (1) an Order Certifying a Material Question and Staying Proceedings issued by Administrative Law Judge (ALJ) Michael C. Schnierle on October 23, 2003 (Order Certifying Material Question); and (2) a Stipulation Regarding Material Question Certified to Commission (Stipulation) in the previously captioned proceeding.¹ ALJ Schnierle, for reasons explained more fully, has stayed the proceeding relative to the previously captioned rate proceeding pending the Commission's Answer to the following Material Question:

Should this proceeding be terminated immediately and a new investigation begun into the combined resale rates of Verizon Pennsylvania, Inc. and Verizon North, [Inc.] or does the Commission wish to reconsider its original order regarding the scope of this proceeding, expand the scope to include Verizon North, [Inc.], and publish its reconsideration order in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* with a new deadline for petitions to intervene?

Discussion

The underlying proceeding was initiated by the Commission for the purpose of establishing new wholesale rates for the resale of telecommunications services by Verizon Pennsylvania Inc. (formerly Bell Atlantic-Pennsylvania, Inc.) (Verizon PA) to retail subscribers under 47 U.S.C. § 252(d)(3) and other applicable law.² Verizon PA's existing wholesale rates had been declared unlawful by the United States Court of Appeals for the Third Circuit.³

By Order entered October 1, 2003, ALJ Schnierle denied a Petition filed by FSN to intervene in Verizon PA's wholesale rate proceeding. ALJ Schnierle denied the Petition based on timeliness, as FSN's Petition was filed almost 2 months after the date for intervention set by the Commission. The ALJ explained in his Order Certifying a Material Question that publication of the document in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* constituted constructive notice of

the order to all persons. 45 Pa.C.S. § 904; 52 Pa. Code § 5.201. Furthermore, the ALJ indicated in his Order Certifying a Material Question that he reviewed the list attached to the Commission's Order in the Commission's document folder for the case and determined that FSN was listed as one of the carriers served. (Order Certifying Material Question at 3.)

On October 3, 2003, FSN filed a Motion for Reconsideration or Certification of a Material Question and Stay of Proceedings, or in the alternative, to certify the ALJ's denial to the Commission. FSN also sought a stay of proceedings pending consideration of the certification question. On October 7, 2003, Curry filed its Petition to intervene. Curry's Petition is currently being held in abeyance pending Commission action on the Material Question.

On October 8, 2003, Verizon PA filed its direct testimony. That testimony included resale cost studies for both Verizon PA and Verizon North. Verizon's witness, Bruce Meacham, proposed in his testimony to expand the scope of the investigation to include Verizon North and set a single discount rate for both Verizon PA and Verizon North. (Verizon St. 1.0 at 31.) Verizon witness Meacham testified that "it would be an expeditious and efficient use of party and Commission resources to set a statewide discount for both companies in the same proceeding." (Verizon St. 1.0 at 7-8.)

FSN, joined by the OTS and the OCA, are all of the opinion that FSN should not be held to the deadlines established in the Commission's June 16, 2003 Order, because FSN does not subscribe to the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* and it has no record of ever having received the Order in the mail. These Parties argue that the June 16, 2003 Order, instituting this proceeding, was not served by certified mail, and consequently, the Commission has no proof that FSN actually received the order.⁴

In addition to the previous arguments in support of FSN, the OCA individually argues that because Verizon PA has attempted to expand the scope of this proceeding by including Verizon North, as well as Verizon PA, publication of the Commission's Order, which mentioned and concerned only Verizon PA, was inadequate to serve as notice of the true scope of the proceeding. Verizon PA responded that the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* may be viewed on the Pennsylvania World Wide Web site for free and that granting the relief sought by FSN would defeat the purpose of setting a deadline for intervention and publishing said deadline in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

The ALJ agreed with the OCA's argument concerning the scope of this proceeding. The ALJ reasoned that if Verizon PA's belated attempt to expand the proceeding to include Verizon North is allowed, then the publication of the Commission's Order in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* constitutes inadequate notice. At the same time, the ALJ agrees with Verizon PA that addressing both companies' wholesale discount rates in the same proceeding would be more efficient, but that it can be done only after the public is given proper notice. Based on the foregoing, the ALJ reasoned that this case must either be terminated and a new one, begun with proper notice published in the

⁴ It is noted that, in addition to publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, the Commission mass-mailed supplemental notices to all telecommunications resellers of record. That mass mailing was not mailed as "certified mail." The ALJ opined that although the noncertified mailing of supplemental notice was not necessary, it is not prohibited (45 Pa.C.S. § 907) and the supplemental, noncertified, mailing of notice to all resellers did not undermine the effectiveness of the notice published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. (Order Certifying Material Question at 3.)

Pennsylvania Bulletin or that the Commission must reconsider its June 16, 2003 Order, modify the scope of the proceeding and publish its reconsideration order in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* with a new deadline for petitions to intervene.

Consistent with the previous reasoning, the ALJ stayed the proceeding pending the Commission's Answer to the subject Material Question. Instead of having the Commission respond to the certified Material Question posed by the ALJ, the Stipulating Parties⁵ propose that the case proceed in the following manner:

* * *

3. The Stipulating Parties consent to the entry of an order stating that the scope of this proceeding will include determining the wholesale rate for resale of telecommunications services provided by Verizon Pennsylvania Inc. and Verizon North Inc. to retail subscribers pursuant to 47 U.S.C. § 252(d)(3). The order will promptly be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* and will provide that, in light of the addition of Verizon North to this proceeding, a new intervention deadline will be established and any Petition to Intervene must be filed within 20 days after publication of such order in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. A proposed form of Order is attached.

4. The Stipulating Parties agree that the petitions to intervene of FSN and Curry should be granted.

5. Within one week after the new intervention deadline, the Stipulating Parties and any additional parties that file timely interventions will submit an agreed-upon procedural schedule to the presiding officer, or to the extent the parties are unable to agree will submit any unresolved scheduling matters to the presiding officer for resolution.

(Stipulation at 2.)

Based on our review and evaluation of the Stipulation, we conclude that the proposed resolution, as set forth in the Stipulation, is in the public interest and would result in an efficient use of the Parties' and this Commission's time and resources. Therefore, we shall grant the Stipulation Regarding Material Question Certified to Commission, consistent with the ordering paragraphs drafted by the Stipulating Parties, with minor modifications, and which are incorporated in the Ordering Paragraphs of this Opinion and Order. Finally, we note that our granting of the Stipulation will render the certified Material Question moot; *Therefore*,

It Is Ordered That:

1. The proceeding initiated by our Order entered June 16, 2003, at Docket No. R-00038516, is modified and shall include the determination of wholesale rate(s) for resale of telecommunications services provided by Verizon Pennsylvania Inc. and Verizon North Inc. to retail subscribers under 47 U.S.C. § 252(d)(3) and other applicable law.

2. The expanded proceeding shall be assigned to the Office of Administrative Law Judge (OALJ), for further proceedings before the OALJ as shall be consistent with this Opinion and Order.

3. The Petitions to Intervene filed by Full Service Computing Corporation t/a Full Service Network and Curry are granted.

⁵ Stipulating Parties comprise the following: Verizon PA, Verizon North, the OCA, the Commission's OTS, the OSBA, FSN and Curry.

4. The Secretary shall cause this Opinion and Order to be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

5. Any Petition to Intervene must be filed within 20 days after publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

6. The certified Material Question presented by ALJ Schnierle on October 22, 2003, is rendered moot.

A business is eligible for payments when the required payment is the latest of:
 The payment date specified in the contract.
 30 days after the later of the receipt of a proper invoice or receipt of goods or services.
 The net payment date stated on the business' invoice.

A 15-day grace period after the required payment date is provided to the Commonwealth by the Act.
