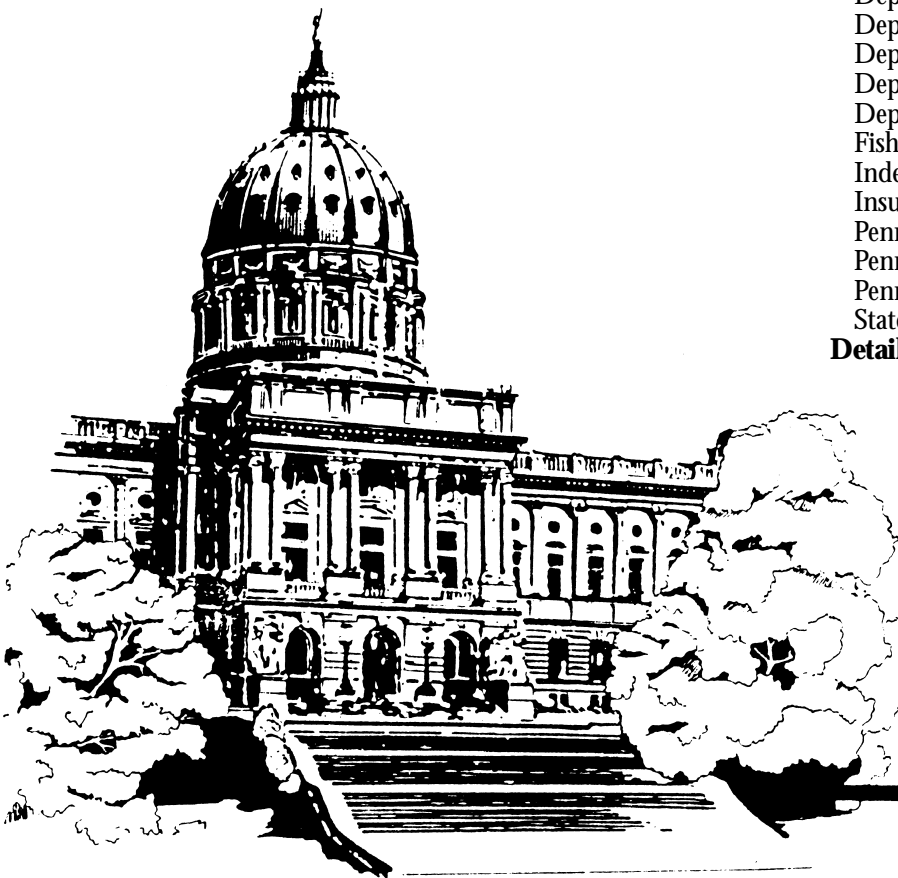

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Pennsylvania Bulletin

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the official gazette of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. It is published every week and includes a table of contents. A cumulative subject matter index is published quarterly.

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* serves several purposes. First, it is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, which is the official codification of agency rules and regulations and other statutorily authorized documents. Changes in the codified text, whether by adoption, amendment, repeal or emergency action must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. Further, agencies proposing changes to the codified text do so in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Second, the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* also publishes: Governor's Executive Orders; State Contract Notices; Summaries of Enacted Statutes; Statewide and Local Court Rules; Attorney General Opinions; Motor Carrier Applications before the Public Utility Commission; Applications and Actions before the Department of Environmental Protection; Orders of the Independent Regulatory Review Commission; and other documents authorized by law.

The text of certain documents published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the only valid and enforceable text. Courts are required to take judicial notice of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Adoption, Amendment or Repeal of Regulations

Generally an agency wishing to adopt, amend or repeal regulations must first publish in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking. There are limited instances where the agency may omit the proposal step; they still must publish the adopted version.

The Notice of Proposed Rulemaking contains the full text of the change, the agency contact person, a fiscal note required by law and background for the action.

The agency then allows sufficient time for public comment before taking final action. An adopted proposal must be published in the *Pennsylvania*

Bulletin before it can take effect. If the agency wishes to adopt changes to the Notice of Proposed Rulemaking to enlarge the scope, they must re-propose.

Citation to the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*

Cite material in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* by volume number and page number. Example: Volume 1, *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, page 801 (short form: 1 Pa.B. 801).

Pennsylvania Code

The *Pennsylvania Code* is the official codification of rules and regulations issued by Commonwealth agencies and other statutorily authorized documents. The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, printing changes as soon as they occur. These changes are then permanently codified by the *Pennsylvania Code Reporter*, a monthly, loose-leaf supplement.

The *Pennsylvania Code* is cited by title number and section number. Example: Title 10 *Pennsylvania Code*, § 1.1 (short form: 10 Pa.Code § 1.1).

Under the *Pennsylvania Code* codification system, each regulation is assigned a unique number by title and section. Titles roughly parallel the organization of Commonwealth government. Title 1 *Pennsylvania Code* lists every agency and its corresponding *Code* title location.

How to Find Documents

Search for your area of interest in the *Pennsylvania Code*.

The *Pennsylvania Code* contains, as Finding Aids, subject indexes for the complete *Code* and for each individual title, a list of Statutes Used As Authority for Adopting Rules and a list of annotated cases. Source Notes give you the history of the documents. To see if there have been recent changes, not yet codified, check the List of *Pennsylvania Code* Chapters Affected in the most recent issue of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* also publishes a quarterly List of Pennsylvania Code Sections Affected which lists the regulations in numerical order, followed by the citation to the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* in which the change occurred.

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Printing Format

Material proposed to be added to an existing rule or regulation is printed in **bold face** and material proposed to be deleted from such a rule or regulation is enclosed in brackets [] and printed in **bold face**. Asterisks indicate ellipsis of *Pennsylvania Code* text retained without change. Proposed new or additional regulations are printed in ordinary style face.

Fiscal Notes

Section 612 of The Administrative Code of 1929 (71 P. S. § 232) requires that the Office of Budget prepare a fiscal note for regulatory actions and administrative procedures of the administrative departments, boards, commissions or authorities receiving money from the State Treasury stating whether the proposed action or procedure causes a loss of revenue or an increase in the cost of programs for the Commonwealth or its political subdivisions; that the fiscal note be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* at the same time as the proposed change is advertised; and that the fiscal note shall provide the following information: (1) the designation of the fund out of which the appropriation providing for expenditures under the action or procedure shall be made; (2) the probable cost for the fiscal year the program is implemented; (3) projected cost estimate of the program for each of the five succeeding fiscal years; (4) fiscal history of the program for which expenditures are to be made; (5) probable loss of revenue for the fiscal year of its implementation; (6) projected loss of revenue from the program for each of the five succeeding fiscal years; (7) line item, if any, of the General Appropriation Act or other appropriation act out of which expenditures or losses of Commonwealth funds shall occur as a result of the action or procedures; (8) recommendation, if any, of the Secretary of the Budget and the reasons therefor.

The required information is published in the foregoing order immediately following the proposed change to which it relates; the omission of an item indicates that the agency text of the fiscal note states that there is no information available with respect thereto. In items (3) and (6) information is set forth for the first through fifth fiscal years; in that order, following the year the program is implemented, which is stated. In item (4) information is set forth for the current and two immediately preceding years, in that order. In item (8) the recommendation, if any, made by the Secretary of Budget is published with the fiscal note. See 4 Pa. Code § 7.231 *et seq.* Where "no fiscal impact" is published, the statement means no additional cost or revenue loss to the Commonwealth or its local political subdivision is intended.

Effective Dates of Statutes

The effective dates specified above for laws and appropriation acts were contained in the applicable law or appropriation act. Where no date is specified or where the effective date specified is prior to the date of enactment, the effective date is 60 days after final enactment except for statutes making appropriations or affecting budgets of political subdivisions. See 1 Pa.C.S. §§ 1701—1704 (relating to effective dates of statutes).

Advance Copies of Statutes

Section 1106 of Title 1 of the *Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes* provides that the prothonotaries of each county shall file advance copies of statutes in their offices for public inspection until the *Laws of Pennsylvania* are generally available. Section 2406(h) of The Administrative Code of 1929 provides that the Department of General Services shall distribute advance sheets of the *Laws of Pennsylvania* to each law judge of the courts, to every county and public library of this Commonwealth and to each member of the General Assembly. These copies shall be furnished without charge. The Department shall also mail one copy of each law enacted during any legislative session to any person who pays to it the sum of \$20.

[231 PA. CODE CH. 100]

Annex A

TITLE 231. RULES OF CIVIL PROCEDURE

PART I. GENERAL

CHAPTER 100. RULES OF CONSTRUCTION

Rule 51. Title and Citation of Rules.

[All] These rules [adopted by the Supreme Court under the authority of Article V, Section 10(c) of the Constitution of 1968, or of any Act of Assembly,] shall be known as the Pennsylvania Rules of Civil Procedure and may be cited as "Pa.R.C.P. No. ____."

Official Note:

* * * * *

[By order dated December 31, 1968 all statutes and rules governing practice and procedure in actions and proceedings in courts of record and courts not of record were continued in force until suspended, revoked or modified pursuant to Article V of the Constitution.]

The rules of civil procedure are not applicable in the magisterial district courts. Civil actions and proceedings in magisterial district courts are governed by the Rules of Civil Procedure for Magisterial District Judges, Pa.R.C.P.M.D.J. 201 et seq.

Explanatory Comment

Rule 51 governing the title and citation of the rules of civil procedure has been amended in two respects. First, the opening language of the rule, "All rules adopted by the Supreme Court under the authority of Article V, Section 10(c) of the Constitution of 1968, or of any Act of Assembly" has been replaced by two words, "These rules." The prior opening language was appropriate when the rule was promulgated initially in 1939 as the only rules promulgated by the Supreme Court were rules of civil procedure. Sixty-six years later, the rules of civil procedure are only one of numerous types of rules promulgated by the Supreme Court. The rule as revised addresses the rules of civil procedure only.

Second, the former note to the rule concerned the continuation of the rules of civil procedure upon the adoption of the Constitution of 1968 and with the passage of time became irrelevant. The prior text of the note has been replaced by new text which contains an express statement that the rules of civil procedure do not apply to actions and proceedings in magisterial district courts. The new note is intended to refute the occasional argument that the rules of civil procedure are applicable in those courts.

Explanatory Comment

Rule 223.2 providing for note taking by jurors in civil cases was promulgated as a temporary rule for the purpose of assessing whether juror note taking in civil cases is beneficial to the system of justice in Pennsylvania. As the rule has found overwhelming favor with the bench and bar, the sunset provision of subdivision (e) has been rescinded and the rule has been made permanent.

Adoption of Philadelphia Civil Rule 229.1; President Judge General Court Regulation No. 2005-04

And Now, this 22nd day of June, 2005, the Board of Judges of Philadelphia County having voted at the Board of Judges' meeting held on May 19, 2005 to adopt Philadelphia Civil Rule 229.1, *It Is Hereby Ordered* that Philadelphia Civil Rule 229.1 is adopted as follows.

This General Court Regulation is issued in accordance with Pa.R.Civil.P. No. 239 and shall become effective [thirty (30) days after publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*]. As required by Rule 239, the original General Court Regulation shall be filed with the Prothonotary in a Docket maintained for General Court Regulations issued by the President Judge of the Court of Common Pleas of Philadelphia County, and copies shall be submitted to the Civil Procedural Rules Committee, the Administrative Office of Pennsylvania Courts, and shall be posted on the website of the Unified Judicial System at: <http://ujportal.pacourts.us>. Copies of the Order shall also be submitted to American Lawyer Media, *The Legal Intelligence*, Jenkins Memorial Law Library, and the Law Library for the First Judicial District of Pennsylvania, and posted on the website of the First Judicial District: <http://courts.phila.gov>.

Philadelphia Rule of Civil Procedure

Proposed Changes Presented to the Board of Judges on May 19, 2005

Rule 229.1 Sanctions for Failure to Deliver Settlement Funds.

(F) Upon receipt of the attorney affidavit and supporting documentation required by paragraph (E)(2) above, the Released Party shall have twenty (20) days to file a response. If the Court finds that the Released Party has violated this rule and that there is no material dispute as to the terms of the settlement or the terms of the release, the Court shall impose sanctions in the form of [**simple**] interest calculated **as set forth below together with reasonable attorneys' fees incurred in the preparation of the affidavit. Interest shall be calculated at [a]** the rate equal to the prime rate as listed in the first edition of the *Wall Street Journal* published for the calendar [**last**] year preceding the date on which the [**attorney affidavit was filed, running**] settlement funds were payable, **plus one percent, not compounded, calculated from the twenty-first day after the date of the settlement to the date of delivery of the settlement funds[, together with reasonable attorneys' fees incurred in the preparation of the affidavit]**.

Title 255—LOCAL COURT RULES

BEAVER COUNTY

Local Rules of Civil Procedure; No. 10130 of 2001

Order

Beaver County Local Rules of Civil Procedure are amended by adding L 1147, promulgated as follows. The rule is effective thirty (30) days after publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

(a) In order to comply with Pa.R.C.P. No. 1147(2), every complaint in mortgage foreclosure shall contain a full and complete description of the land subject to the mortgage.

Note. A metes and bounds description of the land is preferable. The attachment as an Exhibit to the complaint of a copy of the deed which conveyed the land to the mortgagor(s) will usually constitute compliance with this rule. A reference in the complaint to a recorded deed or mortgage for a fuller description will not constitute compliance with this rule.

(b) The Prothonotary of Beaver County shall not accept for filing a complaint in mortgage foreclosure which does not contain a full and complete description of the land subject to the mortgage.

Repeal and Adoption of Rules of Orphans' Court Procedures; No. 240 of 2005; No. 2005-18

Order

And Now, June 27, 2005, it is hereby ordered and decreed that all Juniata/Perry County Rules of Orphans' Court Procedure filed prior to this date are repealed effective the date that the rules herein become effective.

The Court hereby adopts the following Perry/Juniata County Rules of Orphans' Court Procedure to be effective as follows:

(1) All of the following local rules shall be effective 30 days after publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. It is further ordered that the District Court Administrator shall file:

Local Rules of Orphans' Court Procedure

Rule 1.2.1 Certificates of Appointment of Fiduciary

The clerk of the Orphans' Court Division shall not issue a certificate of the appointment of any fiduciary until the security, if required by the court, has been entered.

Rule 1.2.2 Corporate Sureties. Approval

Surety companies duly authorized to do business in this Commonwealth may become surety on any bond or obligation required to be filed in the court; provided that a current certificate of the right to do business, issued by the Insurance Department of this Commonwealth, shall be on file with the Prothonotary; and provided, further, that no bond shall be executed by any surety company after May 1 of any year, until such certificate, issued after March 31 of that year, shall have been filed with the court.

Rule 6.1.1 Procedure under § 3102. Probate, Estates and Fiduciaries Code of 1972.

(a) *Contents of petition.* A petition under section 3102 of the Probate, Estates and Fiduciaries Code of 1972 (20 P. S. Sec. 3102), for the settlement of a small estate shall set forth

(1) the name, date of death, and residence of decedent;

(2) the name and address of the petitioner, his relationship to the decedent and whether or not he formed a part of decedent's household at the date of his death;

(3) if petitioner be the surviving spouse, the date and place of the ceremonial marriage, and the name and official capacity of the person who performed the ceremony; or, in case of a common law marriage, all averments necessary to establish the validity of such a marriage;

(4) whether the decedent died testate or intestate; where, when and to whom letters were granted, and the amount of bond given by the personal representative;

(5) the names, relationships and a brief description of the interest of all persons entitled to share in the decedent's estate under the will or intestate laws, stating which are minors, incompetents or deceased, with the names of their fiduciaries, and whether any of them has

received or retained any property of the decedent by payment of wages under section 3101 of the Probate, Estates and Fiduciaries Code (20 P. S. Section 3101), or otherwise;

(6) the person entitled to the family exemption, and the facts on which the claim is based;

(7) an itemized statement of the property of the decedent and an appraisal thereof;

(8) the disbursements made prior to the filing of the petition; the date and name of the person to whom paid; and the nature and amount of each payment;

(9) the names of all unpaid claimants of whom the petitioner has notice or knowledge, the nature and amount of each claim, and whether such claims are admitted;

(10) that a schedule of assets and deductions for inheritance tax purposes has been filed with the register; the amount of any inheritance tax assessed; and the date of payment thereof;

(11) that ten days' written notice of intention to present the petition has been given to every unpaid beneficiary, heir or claimant who has not joined in the petition, or to the Attorney General, if the decedent's heirs are unknown; and

(12) a prayer for distribution of the property, setting forth the persons entitled and their distributive shares and requesting the discharge of the personal representative and the release of his surety, if letters have been granted and advertised.

(b) *Exhibits.* The following exhibits shall be attached to the petition:

(1) a copy of the decedent's will;

(2) consents of the surety, and of unpaid beneficiaries, heirs and claimants who consent thereto;

(3) a copy of the notice given; and

(4) the inheritance tax voucher, or in lieu thereof a statement from the inheritance tax department that no tax is due.

(c) *Appraisal.* No formal appraisal is required, unless ordered by the court.

Rule 6.1.2 Procedures under § 3546. Probate, Estate and Fiduciaries Code of 1972.

(a) *Contents of petition.* A petition under section 3546 of the Probate, Estates and Fiduciaries Code of 1972 (20 PS Section 3546) for the determination of title shall set forth

(1) the name of the petitioner and his relationship to the decedent;

(2) the facts on which the claim of the petitioner is based;

(3) whether the decedent died testate or intestate, and where, when, and to whom letters were granted;

(4) a description of real property located within the Commonwealth, and the place, book, and page of recording the last deed thereto;

(5) the names and addresses of all known creditors and parties in interest; and

(6) the facts material to a determination of the title.

(b) *Exhibits.* The following exhibits shall be attached to the petition:

(1) the notice which has been given to creditors, and parties in interest; if the heirs of the decedent are unknown, a copy of the notice given to the Attorney General; and

(2) a copy of decedent's will.

Rule 8.1.1 Pre-Hearing conference

The Auditor shall schedule a pre-hearing conference at which time the accountant or his attorney shall present to the auditor all written notices of claims of creditors, legatees, devisees, next of kin and others interested in the estate given the accountant and also a list of all other creditors of which he has any information and mention the claims of creditors he recommends for allowance.

Rule 8.1.2 Notice of Hearings

Notice of the initial hearing shall be given by mailing by regular mail to the counsel of record for the Estate, counsel of record for the exceptant(s), each heir at the last known address, to each unpaid creditor and to the Department of Revenue, the Department of Welfare, Bureau of Public Assistance, or other agency of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, if such Department or agency has, according to the information of the Clerk, a claim against the estate to be audited. If a party is unrepresented, notice shall be mailed to the last known address of record.

To the extent possible, the auditor shall expedite the hearings, and any party in interest may apply to the Court for an order on the auditor to proceed and file a report or else give the reasons for the alleged delay, if there be unreasonable delay.

Rule 8.2 Filing of Report—Reserved.

Rule 8.3.1 Form of Auditor's Report

A. It shall be the duty of an auditor to keep, and file with his report, minutes setting forth the notices given, the appearances before him at the several hearings he may hold, and other proceedings had before him, including the testimony taken. At each meeting he shall note the appearance of all parties in interest and their attorneys.

B. If objection is made to a witness or to a question put to him or his answer to any question or to any documentary evidence, the offer and purpose of the evidence, the objection and reasons therefor, and the ruling of the auditor shall all be reduced to writing. If the auditor sustains the objection, he shall, nevertheless, take the testimony and reduce it to writing or receive the documentary evidence, unless the witness is clearly incompetent or the evidence is clearly inadmissible or the question or answer is impertinent, frivolous or scandalous. It must always appear who offered a witness or documentary evidence, who made the objection, and whether the examination of the witness is in chief, on cross-examination, in rebuttal, or in sur-rebuttal.

C. If any party desires to present suggestions for findings of fact and/or conclusions of law, he shall indicate such desire at the close of the testimony and present them to the auditor within ten days; otherwise any such suggestions shall not be considered.

D. When a claim of a creditor, legatee, devisee, next of kin or other person is disallowed by the auditor, no costs shall be allowed such claimant, and the auditor may direct such claimant to pay the witness costs of the adverse party incurred in defense against such claim and/or part or all of the costs of audit. Such order of the auditor may be enforced, on application to the Court, by a citation to show cause.

Rule 8.4.1 Form of Master's Report—Reserved

Rule 8.5.1 Transcript of Testimony

All hearings shall be transcribed. The transcript of the hearing(s) shall be filed by the stenographer with the Office of the Register of Wills and shall be made a part of the record. A transcript of the pre-hearing conference is not required.

Rule 8.6.1 Notice of Filing Report

When auditor has his report completed, he shall present it to the Court along with a proposed Decree Nisi for consideration by the Court. A copy of said report and the signed Decree Nisi shall be mailed via regular mail to all attorneys who appeared before him and all exceptants who appeared without attorneys.

Rule 8.7.1 Confirmation of Report

When an auditor's report is presented to the Court, it will be confirmed nisi and filed. Exceptions to the Report must be filed with fifteen (15) days of the date of the Decree Nisi. When no exceptions to an auditor's report are filed within the said period, the Clerk of the Court shall endorse the absolute confirmation on the report.

Rule 8.8.1 Security for Expenses and Fees

The Estate and exceptant(s) shall each provide to the Auditor an estimate of the amount of time needed to present their case. Thereafter, the Auditor shall recommend to the Court an amount to be held in escrow by the Register of Wills. Said deposit shall be applied to the Auditor's bill of cost as submitted by the Auditor and approved by the Court.

If exceptions are filed to the Report prior to confirmation absolute or if an appeal is filed after the confirmation, the party filing the same must pay in full all outstanding auditor's fees and costs as set forth on the Auditor's Bill of costs, regardless of the recommendation of the Auditor as to allocation of the payment. The Court may address the issue of auditor's fees and costs at the time of the disposition of the exceptions or appeal.

Rule 10.1.1 Certification of Record

(a) *Contents of petition.* A petition to fix a date for a hearing from a certification of record to the court from the register shall be promptly presented to the court and shall set forth:

- (1) the nature of the proceedings before the register;
- (2) the basis for the certification of record; and
- (3) the names and addresses of all parties in interest including those who have not been made parties to the record.

(b) *Certification by register.* When the record has been certified by the register, the petition required by subparagraph (a) shall be presented by the party who instituted the contest, or, in special circumstances, as the court may direct.

(c) *Citation.* Upon allowance of the petition, a citation will be issued, directed to all parties in interest, including those not represented on the record, to show cause why the matter upon which the certification is requested or based, as the case may be, should not be determined by the court on a day certain therein indicated. (See Supreme Court Orphans' Court Section 10, Rule 1.)

Rule 10.2.1 Appeals

(a) *Contents of petition.* When an appeal is taken from a judicial act of, or proceeding before, the register, the appellants shall promptly present a petition to the court, which shall set forth:

- (1) the nature of the proceeding before the register;
- (2) the basis for the appeal; and
- (3) the names and addresses of all parties in interest, including those who have not been made parties to the record.

(b) *Citation.* If the petition sets forth a prima facie case, a citation will be issued, directed to all parties in interest, including those not represented on the record, to show cause why the appeal should not be sustained and the judicial act or proceeding complained of be set aside.

Rule 11.2.1 Grant of Jury Trial

(a) On appeal from the register, or in a proceeding removed from or certified by the register, the court in its discretion may impanel a jury at any stage of the proceedings and forthwith proceed with a jury trial.

(b) On appeal from the register, or in a proceeding removed from or certified by the register, the court in its discretion may, either at the conclusion of all the evidence presented by proponents and contestants or before all such evidence has been produced, when it is satisfied that sufficient evidence has been presented so as to warrant, grant a jury trial at a future date.

(c) If a jury trial is granted, as provided in subparagraph (a) or (b) hereof, the court shall enter a decree specifying the issues to be tried, which may be in the form agreed upon by the parties, or as the court shall determine.

Maximum Lawful Rate of Interest for Residential Mortgages for the Month of August 2005

The Department of Banking (Department), under the authority contained in section 301 of the act of January 30, 1974 (P. L. 13, No. 6) (41 P. S. § 301), determines that the maximum lawful rate of interest for residential mortgages for the month of August 2005 is 6 3/4%.

The interest rate limitations under the State's usury statute were preempted to a great extent by Federal law, the Depository Institutions Deregulation and Monetary Control Act of 1980 (Pub. L. No. 96-221). Further preemption was instituted with the signing of Pub. L. No. 96-399, which overrode State interest rate limitations on any individual who finances the sale or exchange of residential real property which the individual owns and which the individual occupies or has occupied as a principal residence.

Each month the Department is required by State law to compute and announce the ceiling rate on residential mortgages in this Commonwealth. This maximum rate is determined by adding 2.50 percentage points to the yield rate on long-term government bonds as published by the Federal Reserve Board and/or the United States Treasury. The latest yield rate on long-term government securities is 4.17 to which was added 2.50 percentage points for a total of 6.67 that by law is rounded off to the nearest quarter at 6 3/4%.

Persons wishing to comment on a WQM permit application are invited to submit a statement to the regional office noted before the application within 15 days from the date of this public notice. Comments received within the respective comment periods will be considered in the final determinations regarding the applications. Comments should include the name, address and telephone number of the writer and a concise statement to inform the Department of the exact basis of a comment and the relevant facts upon which it is based.

The Department will also accept requests for a public hearing on applications. A public hearing may be held if the responsible office considers the public response significant. If a hearing is scheduled, a notice of the hearing will be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* and a newspaper of general circulation within the relevant geographical area. The Department will postpone its final determination until after a public hearing is held.

LAND RECYCLING AND ENVIRONMENTAL REMEDIATION

UNDER ACT 2, 1995

PREAMBLE 1

Acknowledgment of Notices of Intent to Remediate Submitted under the Land Recycling and Envi- ronmental Remediation Standards Act (35 P. S. §§ 6026.101—6026.908).

Sections 302—305 of the Land Recycling and Environmental Remediation Standards Act (act) require the Department of Environmental Protection (Department) to publish in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* an acknowledgment noting receipt of Notices of Intent to Remediate. An acknowledgment of the receipt of a Notice of Intent to Remediate is used to identify a site where a person proposes to, or has been required to, respond to a release of a regulated substance at a site. Persons intending to use the Background Standard, Statewide Health Standard, the Site-Specific Standard or who intend to remediate a site as a special industrial area must file a Notice of Intent to Remediate with the Department. A Notice of Intent to Remediate filed with the Department provides a brief description of the location of the site, a list of known or suspected contaminants at the site, the proposed remediation measures for the site and a description of the intended future use of the site. A person who demonstrates attainment of one, a combination of the cleanup standards or who receives approval of a special industrial area remediation identified under the act will be relieved of further liability for the remediation of the site for any contamination identified in reports submitted to and approved by the Department. Furthermore, the person shall not be subject to citizen suits or other contribution actions brought by responsible persons not participating in the remediation.

Under sections 304(n)(1)(ii) and 305(c)(2) of the act, there is a 30-day public and municipal comment period for sites proposed for remediation using a Site-Specific Standard, in whole or in part and for sites remediated as a special industrial area. This period begins when a summary of the Notice of Intent to Remediate is published in a newspaper of general circulation in the area of the site. For the sites identified, proposed for remediation to a Site-Specific Standard or as a special industrial area, the municipality within which the site is located may request to be involved in the development of the remediation and reuse plans for the site if the request is made within 30 days of the date specified. During this comment period, the municipality may request that the person identified as the remediator of the site develop and implement a public involvement plan. Requests to be involved and comments should be directed to the remediator of the site.

S. § 7514) and 2 Pa.C.S. §§ 501—508 and 701—704 (relating to the Administrative Agency Law), to the Environmental Hearing Board, Second Floor, Rachel Carson State Office Building, 400 Market Street, P. O. Box 8457, Harrisburg, PA 17105-8457, (717) 787-3483. TDD users should contact the Environmental Hearing Board (Board) through the Pennsylvania Relay Service, (800) 654-5984. Appeals must be filed with the Board within 30 days of publication of this notice in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, unless the appropriate statute provides a different time period. Copies of the appeal form and the Board's rules of practice and procedure may be obtained from the Board. The appeal form and the Board's rules of practice and procedure are also available in Braille or on audiotape from the Secretary of the Board at (717) 787-3483. This paragraph does not, in and of itself, create any right of appeal beyond that permitted by applicable statutes and decision law.

For individuals who wish to challenge an action, appeals must reach the Board within 30 days. A lawyer is not needed to file an appeal with the Board.

Between 1962 and 1994, Neshaminy Transformer Corporation (also known as Neshaminy Electronics Corporation) manufactured transformers and other electronic components at the site. Francis Dring Wetherill (Wetherill) owned a portion of the site from 1962 until 1984. The Department's investigation of this site indicated the presence of trichloroethylene and perchloroethylene contamination. The Department has performed an environmental assessment and characterization of the site and anticipates conducting future response actions to address hazardous substances released at the site.

As a former owner of a portion of the site, Wetherill was a responsible party under section 701 of the HSCA (35 P. S. § 6018.701). Consequently, the Department had a claim against the Estate for response costs incurred at the site. It is in the public interest for the Department to resolve its claim against the Estate. The Department and the Estate have negotiated in good faith and the Estate has agreed to reimburse the Department for certain response costs in the amount of \$236,000. The Estate shall receive contribution protection from claims related to Wetherill's past ownership of a portion of the site.

This notice is provided under section 1113 of the HSCA which states that, "settlement shall become final upon the filing of the Department's response to significant written comments." The Consent Order and Agreement, which contains the specific terms of the agreement, available for public review and comment. The meeting will be held on September 19, 2005, at 7 p.m. at the Three Points Sportsman's Club, Clarence, PA. The proposed TMDL for the South Fork Beech Creek Watershed was established in accordance with the requirements of the Clean Water Act, Section 303(d). Two stream segments in the South Fork Beech Creek Watershed have been identified as impaired on the 2002 Pennsylvania Section 303(d) list due to depressed pH and/or high concentrations of metals. The primary pollutant source for the watershed is abandoned mine workings. This watershed was mined for coal in the 1900s. The effects of this are still present.

The proposed TMDL was developed using Monte Carlo Simulation to determine long-term average concentrations that each stream segment could accept and still meet water quality criteria 99% of the time. Monte Carlo Simulation allows for the expansion of a data set based on its statistical makeup. Since there was no critical flow condition where criteria were exceeded, the Department used the average flow to express the loading values in the proposed TMDL. The proposed TMDL for the South Fork Beech Creek Watershed sets allowable loading rates for metals and acidity at specified points in the watershed. Field data collected over the past 2 years was used to establish the proposed TMDL for the South Fork Beech Creek Watershed. The data and all supporting information used to develop the proposed TMDL are available from the Department.

Laboratories Approved to Perform Blood Lead and/or Erythrocyte Protoporphyrin Determinations

The following laboratories are licensed in accordance with The Clinical Laboratory Act (35 P. S. §§ 2151—2165) and/or the Federal Clinical Laboratory Improvement Act of 1967 (42 U.S.C.A. § 263a) and are currently approved under 28 Pa. Code § 5.50 (relating to approval to provide special analytical services) to perform analyses of blood for lead or erythrocyte protoporphyrin content. This approval is based on demonstrated proficiency in periodic evaluations conducted by the Bureau of Laboratories of the Department of Health (Department).

Lead poisoning is a reportable noncommunicable disease. Approved laboratories which offer blood lead testing services are required to inform the Department of actual or possible incidents of this condition in accordance with 28 Pa. Code § 27.34 (relating to reporting cases of lead poisoning). These regulations specify the following requirements for reporting by clinical laboratories.

(1) A clinical laboratory shall report all blood lead test results on both venous and capillary specimens for persons under 16 years of age to the Department's Childhood Lead Poisoning Prevention Program, Division of Maternal and Child Health, Bureau of Family Health.

(2) A clinical laboratory shall report an elevated blood lead level in a person 16 years of age or older to the Department's Division of Environmental Health Epidemiology, Bureau of Epidemiology or to other locations as designated by the Department. An elevated blood lead level is defined by the National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health (NIOSH). As of January 26, 2002, NIOSH defines an elevated blood lead level as a venous blood lead level of 25 micrograms per deciliter (µg/dL) or higher. The Department will publish in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* any NIOSH update of the definition within 30 days of NIOSH's notification to the Department.

(3) A clinical laboratory which conducts blood lead tests on 100 or more specimens per month shall submit results electronically in a format specified by the Department.

(4) A clinical laboratory which conducts blood lead tests on less than 100 blood lead specimens per month shall submit results either electronically or by hard copy in the format specified by the Department.

(5) A laboratory which performs blood lead tests on blood specimens collected in this Commonwealth shall be licensed as a clinical laboratory and shall be specifically approved by the Department to conduct those tests.

(6) Blood lead analyses requested for occupational health purposes on blood specimens collected in this Commonwealth shall be performed only by laboratories which are licensed and approved as specified in paragraph (5) and which are also approved by the Occupational Safety and Health Administration of the United States Department of Labor under 29 CFR 1910.1025(j)(2)(iii) (relating to lead).

(7) A clinical laboratory shall complete a blood lead test within 5 work days of the receipt of the blood specimen and shall submit the case report to the Department by the close of business of the next work day after the day on which the test was performed. The clinical laboratory shall submit a report of lead poisoning using either the hard-copy form or electronic transmission format specified by the Department.

(8) When a clinical laboratory receives a blood specimen without all of the information required for reporting purposes, the clinical laboratory shall test the specimen and shall submit the incomplete report to the Department.

Erythrocyte protoporphyrin determinations may be performed as an adjunct determination to substantiate blood lead levels of 25 micrograms per deciliter or higher. Since erythrocyte protoporphyrin concentrations may not increase as a result of low-level exposures to lead, direct blood lead analysis is the only reliable method for identifying individuals with blood lead concentrations below 25 micrograms per deciliter.

Persons seeking blood lead or erythrocyte protoporphyrin analyses should determine that the laboratory employs techniques and procedures acceptable for the purpose for which the analyses are sought. Laboratories offering blood lead analysis only are designated with the letter "L" following the name of the laboratory. Those offering erythrocyte protoporphyrin analysis only are designated with the letter "P." Laboratories offering both services are designated with the letters "LP."

The list of approved laboratories will be revised approximately semiannually and published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. The name of a laboratory is sometimes changed but the location, personnel and testing procedures of the facility remain unchanged. When changes of this type occur, the Clinical Laboratory Permit number does not change. If questions arise about the identity of a laboratory due to a name change, the Clinical Laboratory Permit number should be used as the primary identifier. To assist in identifying a laboratory that performed a test if the name of the facility changed, the Clinical Laboratory Permit numbers of the facilities are included in the lists of approved laboratories above the name of the laboratory at the time the list was prepared.

The Department's blood lead proficiency testing program is approved by the United States Department of Health and Human Services in accordance with the requirements contained in the Clinical Laboratory Improvement Amendments of 1988 (42 CFR 493.901 and 493.937 (relating to approval of proficiency testing programs; and toxicology)) which are administered by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services. Participation in these programs may therefore be used to demonstrate acceptable performance for approval purposes under both Federal and Commonwealth statutes.

Powerball

In accordance with 61 Pa. Code § 871.21 (relating to future changes to Powerball), the Secretary of Revenue (Secretary) announces the following changes to the Powerball regulations.

The Secretary, having determined that it is impractical and contrary to the public interest to defer notice to the public of changes to the Powerball Game, has given actual knowledge of the document to the persons whom the document is primarily directed in accordance with 1 Pa. Code § 13.74 (relating to effectiveness prior to publication) by press release dated June 1, 2005, of the following changes to the Powerball regulations.

These changes will affect ticket sales beginning on Sunday, August 28, 2005, for the Powerball drawing on Wednesday, August 31, 2005. The changes to the regulation will be codified in 61 Pa. Code § 871.22(2) (relating to changes to Powerball):

(2) Changes effective for Powerball tickets sold on or after August 28, 2005:

(i) Section 871.2(a) and (b); § 871.3 definition of "basic play," "first set numbers," "panel or game," "quick pick," "ticket" and "winning number"; § 871.7(c). Powerball is a five out of 55 plus one out of 42 on-line game. The first set of numbers are selected from 1 through 55.

(ii) Section 871.9(e). Annuitized prizes shall be paid in 30 graduated payments, an initial followed by 29 annual graduated payments increasing each year at a rate determined by the MUSL Powerball Product Group. This rate, once determined, will not change over the life of the payments. The 30 payments will equal 100% of the annuitized prize. Prize payments may be rounded down to the nearest \$1,000.

If the MUSL Powerball Product Group arrived at a 4% rate of increase for a \$30 million annuitized jackpot the payment schedule would be as follows:

Agreement on Community Health Reinvestment; Notice No. 2005-07

Pursuant to section 1701-A(b) of Act 1A of 2005, the Agreement on Community Health Reinvestment is hereby published below.

This Agreement on Community Health Reinvestment (the "Agreement") is made this 2nd day of February 2005, by and among the Insurance Department of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania (the "Department"), by Patricia H. Stromberg, in her capacity and pursuant to her authority as Deputy Insurance Commissioner, and Capital Blue Cross ("CBC"), Highmark Inc. ("Highmark"), Indepen-

dence Blue Cross ("IBC"), and Hospital Service Association of Northeastern Pennsylvania, d/b/a Blue Cross of Northeastern Pennsylvania ("NEPA") (collectively, the "Parties").

Recitals

A. CBC, Highmark, IBC and NEPA (collectively, the "Blue Plans"), are not-for-profit health plan corporations operating pursuant to the provisions of the Health Plan Corporations Act, 40 Pa.C.S. §§ 6101, et seq., 6301 et seq. and are subject to regulation by the Department.

B. CBC, IBC, and NEPA have traditionally and voluntarily engaged in a variety of community activities ("Community Activities").

C. Highmark has traditionally and voluntarily engaged in a variety of Community Activities. These efforts have included, but have not been limited to, full compliance with certain social and charitable health care endeavors required under a 1996 Decision and Order of the Insurance Commissioner (the "Commissioner"), Docket No. MS96-04-098.

D. The Community Activities of the Blue Plans have been designed in part to improve health care, to make health care more affordable and accessible, and to benefit the communities in the Blue Plans' respective service areas.

E. The Department and the Blue Plans wish to formalize their understanding relating to the existence, nature, and scope of the Blue Plans' Community Activities on a prospective basis.

F. This Agreement is intended to be a complete and total resolution of the issue of the Blue Plans' Community Activities (sometimes referred to, inter alia, as "social mission," "charitable and/or benevolent endeavors," or "community activities") raised in the Department's Notice dated January 17, 2004, up to and including the period of this Agreement.

Now Therefore, in consideration of the foregoing and the mutual covenants and agreements hereinafter set forth, and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, and intending to be legally bound, the Parties agree as follows:

1. Each Blue Plan agrees to an annual financial commitment to Community Activities in the form of an annual community health reinvestment (the "Annual Community Health Reinvestment") for calendar years 2005 through 2010.

2. For purposes of this Agreement:

(a) "Health Premiums" means all Pennsylvania direct written health premiums reported by the parent and its Health Subsidiaries and Affiliates (as defined below) in their Annual Statements in proportion to any respective ownership interest. The term "Health Premiums" does not include administrative service business income or Medicare and Medicaid program premiums. "Health Premiums," as defined in this Agreement, are those premiums currently reported at Schedule T, Pennsylvania line, columns 3 and 6 of each Plan's Annual Statement.

(b) "Medicare and Medicaid Premiums" means all Pennsylvania direct written Medicare and Medicaid Premiums reported by the parent and its Health Subsidiaries and Affiliates in their Annual Statements in proportion to any respective ownership interest. "Medicare and Medicaid Premiums" are those premiums currently reported at Schedule T, Pennsylvania line, columns 4 and 5 of each Plan's Annual Statement.

(c) "Health Subsidiaries and Affiliates" means all Pennsylvania domiciled entities writing health insurance coverage.

(d) "Health Premium/State Income Tax" means all actual Commonwealth state income taxes and state premium taxes incurred on Health Premiums reported to the Pennsylvania Department of Revenue by the parent and its Health Subsidiaries and Affiliates in proportion to any respective ownership interest.

(e) "Permitted Community Health Reinvestment Endeavors" means:

(i) Health coverage programs for low income and/or uninsured persons, including, but not limited to, adultBasic, CHIP, Special Care or any similar successor programs;

(ii) Other programs or means of subsidizing or providing healthcare coverage and/or healthcare services to persons who are determined under applicable and recognized standards to be unable to pay for such coverage or services or to be without access to affordable healthcare services or coverage, including, but not limited to, rate subsidies for HIPAA and HCTC, rate subsidies for individual programs paid by any Blue Plan that have not been collected from group premiums, and operating subsidies for public health provider programs; and

(iii) Other community healthcare-related expenditures, distributions or utilizations approved by the Department, which approval shall not be unreasonably withheld.

(f) "RBC" means "risk based capital" as that term is defined at 40 P. S. §§ 221.1-B, et seq.

3. On or before December 1 of each calendar year, each Blue Plan shall submit to the Department an application (the "Application") for review by the Department setting forth the Blue Plan's proposed expenditure, distribution or other utilization of its Annual Community Health Reinvestment for the following calendar year. For calendar year 2005, the Application will be due March 1, 2005.

4. The Annual Community Health Reinvestment shall be calculated as follows:

(a) For calendar year 2005, 1.6% of Health Premiums plus 1.0% of Medicare and Medicaid Premiums as reported on each Plan's 2003 Annual Statement minus Health Premium/State Income Tax.

(b) For each succeeding calendar year in the period 2006-2010, 1.6% of Health Premiums as projected for that year by the respective Blue Plan plus 1.0% of Medicare and Medicaid Premiums as projected for that year by the respective Blue Plan minus Health Premium/State Income Tax as projected for that year by the respective Blue Plan. Beginning in calendar year 2007, and each year thereafter through 2011, on or before April 1 of each year, each Blue Plan shall submit to the Department a reconciliation of its Annual Community Health Reinvestment as provided in its Application for the prior calendar year against actual premium reported and taxes incurred for that prior calendar year. Subject to Department approval, such reconciliation shall state the manner and time within which any adjustments shall be made, and each Blue Plan shall appropriately adjust for any excess or deficiency in the actual Annual Community Health Reinvestment amount as calculated based on actual premium and taxes for the prior calendar year.

(c) Notwithstanding any other provision of this Agreement, beginning with the Application for year 2007 and for each calendar year thereafter for the term of this Agreement, the total Annual Community Health Reinvestment of any Plan shall not exceed 107.5 percent (107.5%) of the total Annual Community Health Reinvestment for that Plan in the immediately preceding calendar year.

(d) Notwithstanding any other provision in this Agreement, each Blue Plan agrees that in the event that a Blue Plan's total Annual Community Health Reinvestment amount decreases from one year to the next in excess of 5%, the percentage used to determine the Commonwealth Directed Low Income Health Insurance Portion (as defined in paragraph 5) for that Blue Plan shall be adjusted for that year such that the Commonwealth Directed Low Income Health Insurance Portion for that Blue Plan shall decrease by no more than 5% of the amount of the Commonwealth Directed Low Income Health Insurance Portion for that Blue Plan from the prior year. In no event, however, shall the adjusted percentage used to determine the Commonwealth Directed Low Income Health Insurance Portion for that Blue Plan exceed 100% of that Blue Plan's total Annual Community Health Reinvestment amount.

5. Each Blue Plan agrees that the Annual Community Health Reinvestment for each Plan shall be expended, distributed or utilized in the respective service area of that Plan and solely for Permitted Community Health Reinvestment Endeavors. Sixty percent (60%) of the Annual Community Health Reinvestment for each calendar year of this Agreement shall be dedicated to providing health insurance through state-approved programs for persons of low income, including but not limited to adultBasic (the "Commonwealth Directed Low Income Health Insurance Portion"). In the event that the Commonwealth Directed Low Income Health Insurance Portion cannot be expended, distributed or utilized in the calendar year in which it is dedicated, such amounts shall be expended, distributed or utilized in succeeding years.

6. Any Blue Plan participating in the adultBasic program or any alternative program to benefit persons of low income in any calendar year subject to this Agreement, will receive approval of rates for 2005 and thereafter for

adultBasic, and to the extent applicable for such alternative programs, as filed with the Department, or in the event such approval of rates as filed is not received, such Blue Plan will receive a credit for Actual Underwriting Losses for adultBasic, and to the extent applicable, for such alternative programs, against the sixty percent (60%) number defined in paragraph 5 above or the Blue Plan will provide a credit to the Commonwealth for adultBasic Actual Underwriting Gains. The term "Actual Underwriting Losses/Gains" means premiums earned less claims incurred, less administrative expense costs directly associated with the program as recorded on the Blue Plan's internal financials.

7. Each Blue Plan shall make available to the Department such information as the Department may reasonably require to verify the calculation, expenditure, distribution or use of a Blue Plan's Annual Community Health Reinvestment. Any such information that is proprietary or confidential, including such information that is set forth in an Application, (the "Confidential Information") shall be clearly marked prior to submission to the Department, and shall be accorded confidential treatment by the Department and not disclosed by the Department to any third party except by agreement with the Blue Plan or pursuant to Court Order. Upon receipt of any request from a third party for Confidential Information, the Department will notify the third party that the Confidential Information will not be provided. In the event that a third party institutes an action to compel the Department to disclose the Confidential Information, the Department will inform the affected Blue Plan of the Court Order in sufficient time to allow the Blue Plan to intervene or otherwise seek additional protections from having to disclose the Confidential Information. The Department may, but does not have to, assist the Blue Plan with any efforts to maintain the confidentiality of the information in any Court proceeding but in no event shall the Department oppose any such effort.

8. This Agreement may be modified or waived as to an individual Blue Plan, provided notice of the application for modification or waiver is provided to each of the other Blue Plans five (5) business days in advance of when said modification or waiver is sought from the Department. The modification or waiver shall be in writing and executed by the Department and said individual Blue Plan. Relief from the Annual Community Health reinvestment obligation may be granted by the Commissioner without application for modification or waiver if a Blue Plan's RBC ratio drops 100 points within a twelve (12) month period or below the Blue Cross Blue Shield Association's early warning level which is currently at 375% RBC, or if the Commissioner determines other good cause exists for such relief, or upon written application by a Blue Plan for other good cause shown, which includes but is not limited to any circumstance which significantly impairs, diminishes, impedes or otherwise compromises a Blue Plan's ability to meet its Annual Community Health Reinvestment obligation as that obligation is defined in this Agreement, or any circumstance which suggests that the need for the Annual Community Health Reinvestment is significantly diminished, or in the event any court of competent jurisdiction issues a decision or order against any Blue Plan or legislation is enacted that substantially alters the terms or purpose of this Agreement. A decision by the Commissioner not to grant the requested modification or waiver will be in the form of a determination, as to which judicial review is available as provided by Pennsylvania law. After a Blue Plan seeks modification or waiver of the Agreement under this paragraph, the

passage of sixty (60) days or any decision by the Commissioner that does not satisfy the Blue Plan's request for modification or waiver shall constitute a determination, as to which judicial review is available as provided by Pennsylvania law.

9. In the event a Blue Plan submits a written application seeking modification of or relief from its Annual Community Health Reinvestment obligation, the Department may retain attorneys, appraisers, independent actuaries, independent certified public accountants or other professionals and examiners, the cost of which shall be borne by the Blue Plan seeking such modification or relief. The Blue Plan's obligation hereunder will not exceed \$75,000.

10. Notwithstanding any other provision to the contrary, all obligations of a respective Blue Plan shall terminate and the Agreement shall become null and void as to that Blue Plan: (i) in the event that the Blue Plan no longer is a Health Plan Corporation under 40 Pa.C.S. §§ 6101 et seq., 6301 et seq.; or (ii) in the event legislation is enacted that impacts the state tax payments or assessments of a Health Plan Corporation in a manner that is intended to or has the effect of being adverse and discriminatory to the Blue Plans in comparison to other insurers and obligates that Blue Plan to make state tax payments or assessments greater than the contributions required under this Agreement.

11. After the effective date of this Agreement, if disputes arise relating to the implementation of the Agreement or any of its terms or conditions, the Parties agree that the dispute shall be submitted to the Commissioner for resolution. Thereafter, the passage of thirty (30) days or any decision by the Commissioner that does not resolve the dispute in a manner acceptable to the Blue Plan shall constitute a determination, as to which judicial review is available as provided by Pennsylvania law.

12. This Agreement and the Annual Community Health Reinvestment hereunder shall supersede and replace Highmark's required "social or charitable health care endeavors" obligations pursuant to the 1996 Decision and Order of the Commissioner.

13. Neither the entry into this Agreement, nor the discussions in connection with its negotiation and execution, shall constitute evidence of wrongdoing or culpability or an admission by any Party of liability or obligation to any other Party for any purpose, or a waiver of any defense or position any Party could raise in any forum.

14. Unless sooner terminated as provided herein, this Agreement shall terminate and have no further force and effect after December 31, 2010, except to the extent necessary for any Blue Plan to adjust for any excess or deficiency as required by paragraphs 4 or 6 for any prior calendar year.

15. This Agreement may be executed in one or more counterparts, all or any of which shall be regarded for all purposes as one original, and constitute and be but one and the same instrument. Delivery of the executed Agreement by facsimile or other electronic means shall be equally effective as the delivery of the original Agreement.

16. Nothing in this Agreement, express or implied, is intended to, nor shall it in any way be construed to, create or convey any rights or remedies in or to any individual or entity other than the Parties, nor shall this Agreement or any provision hereof constitute a waiver or

relinquishment of any legal right of any Party to otherwise challenge or appeal any action or decision hereunder or arising from any other action of any other Party.

17. In the event any dispute arises among the Parties with regard to the interpretation of any term of this Agreement, all of the Parties shall be considered collectively to be the drafting party, and any rule of construction to the effect that ambiguities are to be resolved against the drafting party shall be inapplicable.

18. All prior discussions, agreements and understandings concerning the subject of this Agreement are completely merged and integrated into this Agreement.

19. This Agreement and all amendments, supplements, modifications, waivers and consents shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

20. No part of this Agreement shall be modified or waived in any respect except by a writing.

21. By its signature affixed hereto, each Party acknowledges that it has read this Agreement, fully understands the agreements, covenants, obligations, conditions, and terms contained herein, and has had the advice of counsel pertaining thereto, prior to the time of execution.

22. The Parties agree and acknowledge that each provision of this Agreement, including the Recitals and the terms, form the essential subject matter of this Agreement and the Recitals and the terms of this Agreement shall not be severable.

23. Each Party represents and warrants that it has the requisite power and authority to enter into this Agreement and that the signatory is duly authorized to execute this Agreement on behalf of that Party.

24. This Agreement shall be binding upon all Parties and their successors and assigns.

25. The division of this Agreement into paragraphs and subparagraphs and the use of captions and headings in connection therewith, are solely for convenience and shall have no legal effect in construing the provisions of this Agreement.



 30 days after the later of the receipt of a proper invoice or receipt of goods or services.
 The net payment date stated on the business' invoice.

A 15-day grace period after the required payment date is provided to the Commonwealth by the Act.

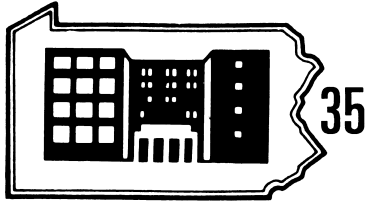

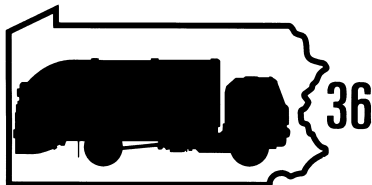

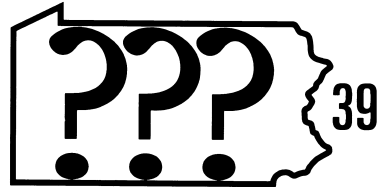
