READER'S GUIDE TO THE PENNSYLVANIA BULLETIN AND PENNSYLVANIA CODE

Pennsylvania Bulletin

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the official gazette of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. It is published every week and includes a table of contents. A cumulative subject matter index is published quarterly.

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* serves several purposes. First, it is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, which is the official codification of agency rules and regulations and other statutorily authorized documents. Changes in the codified text, whether by adoption, amendment, repeal or emergency action must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. Further, agencies proposing changes to the codified text do so in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Second, the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* also publishes: Governor's Executive Orders; State Contract Notices; Summaries of Enacted Statutes; Statewide and Local Court Rules; Attorney General Opinions; Motor Carrier Applications before the Public Utility Commission; Applications and Actions before the Department of Environmental Protection; Orders of the Independent Regulatory Review Commission; and other documents authorized by law.

The text of certain documents published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the only valid and enforceable text. Courts are required to take judicial notice of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Adoption, Amendment or Repeal of Regulations

Generally an agency wishing to adopt, amend or repeal regulations must first publish in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking. There are limited instances where the agency may omit the proposal step; they still must publish the adopted version.

The Notice of Proposed Rulemaking contains the full text of the change, the agency contact person, a fiscal note required by law and background for the action.

The agency then allows sufficient time for public comment before taking final action. An adopted proposal must be published in the *Pennsylvania*

Bulletin before it can take effect. If the agency wishes to adopt changes to the Notice of Proposed Rulemaking to enlarge the scope, they must repropose.

Citation to the Pennsylvania Bulletin

Cite material in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* by volume number and page number. Example: Volume 1, *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, page 801 (short form: 1 Pa.B. 801).

Pennsylvania Code

The *Pennsylvania Code* is the official codification of rules and regulations issued by Commonwealth agencies and other statutorily authorized documents. The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, printing changes as soon as they occur. These changes are then permanently codified by the *Pennsylvania Code Reporter*, a monthly, loose-leaf supplement.

The *Pennsylvania Code* is cited by title number and section number. Example: Title 10 *Pennsylvania Code*, § 1.1 (short form: 10 Pa.Code § 1.1).

Under the *Pennsylvania Code* codification system, each regulation is assigned a unique number by title and section. Titles roughly parallel the organization of Commonwealth government. Title 1 *Pennsylvania Code* lists every agency and its corresponding *Code* title location.

How to Find Documents

Search for your area of interest in the *Pennsylva-nia Code*.

The *Pennsylvania Code* contains, as Finding Aids, subject indexes for the complete *Code* and for each individual title, a list of Statutes Used As Authority for Adopting Rules and a list of annotated cases. Source Notes give you the history of the documents. To see if there have been recent changes, not yet codified, check the List of *Pennsylvania Code* Chapters Affected in the most recent issue of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* also publishes a quarterly List of Pennsylvania Code Sections Affected which lists the regulations in numerical order, followed by the citation to the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* in which the change occurred.

Printing Format

Material proposed to be added to an existing rule or regulation is printed in **bold face** and material proposed to be deleted from such a rule or regulation is enclosed in brackets [] and printed in **bold face**. Asterisks indicate ellipsis of *Pennsylvania Code* text retained without change. Proposed new or additional regulations are printed in ordinary style face.

Fiscal Notes

Section 612 of The Administrative Code of 1929 (71 P. S. § 232) requires that the Office of Budget prepare a fiscal note for regulatory actions and administrative procedures of the administrative departments, boards, commissions or authorities receiving money from the State Treasury stating whether the proposed action or procedure causes a loss of revenue or an increase in the cost of programs for the Commonwealth or its political subdivisions; that the fiscal note be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* at the same time as the proposed change is advertised; and that the fiscal note shall provide the following information: (1) the designation of the fund out of which the appropriation providing for expenditures under the action or procedure shall be made; (2) the probable cost for the fiscal year the program is implemented; (3) projected cost estimate of the program for each of the five succeeding fiscal years; (4) fiscal history of the program for which expenditures are to be made; (5) probable loss of revenue for the fiscal year of its implementation; (6) projected loss of revenue from the program for each of the five succeeding fiscal years; (7) line item, if any, of the General Appropriation Act or other appropriation act out of which expenditures or losses of Commonwealth funds shall occur as a result of the action or procedures; (8) recommendation, if any, of the Secretary of the Budget and the reasons therefor.

The required information is published in the foregoing order immediately following the proposed change to which it relates; the omission of an item indicates that the agency text of the fiscal note states that there is no information available with respect thereto. In items (3) and (6) information is set forth for the first through fifth fiscal years; in that order, following the year the program is implemented, which is stated. In item (4) information is set forth for the current and two immediately preceding years, in that order. In item (8) the recommendation, if any, made by the Secretary of Budget is published with the fiscal note. See 4 Pa. Code § 7.231 et seq. Where "no fiscal impact" is published, the statement means no additional cost or revenue loss to the Commonwealth or its local political subdivision is intended.

Notice of Veto

October 27, 2006

To the Honorable, the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

I am returning House Bill 1813 without my approval.

I am vetoing this bill because, without regard for fluctuations in state revenues or growth in other, mandated obligations, the legislation establishes an annual increase in the obligation of state funds for reimbursement to mental health and mental retardation providers. Enactment of this bill will increase state expenditures by \$75 million in the first year and cumulatively by \$1.2 billion over five years. None of this funding is included in our current budget projections.

The providers impacted by House Bill 1813 have received a 2% cost of living increase in their grants in each of the last three years, resulting in an actual increase in the level of these grants of 6.1% since July 1, 2004. The annual 2% cost of living increase is entirely consistent with the annual increase level paid to these providers in the second term of the Ridge/Schweiker Administration.

Overall, between the base funding increase and increase in funds to enable the expansion of services, providers of mental health and mental retardation services have received a 19.24% increase in funding—\$338 million in new funds—since July 1, 2003. These funding increases have enabled providers to remove almost 3,000 individuals from the waiting lists. In spite of these improvements, I remain concerned that waiting lists for these critical services persist, and I believe a more substantial increase in the grants is warranted. In the coming year, if our revenues and other expenditure demands permit us to increase the reimbursement rate more than 2% next year, I will propose doing so.

I am entirely sympathetic to the plight of these providers and very much value the extraordinary work they do. But, I do find it perplexing that so many members of the legislature who advocated for the passage of legislation imposing annual caps on state spending voted for this automatic five year growth in state expenditures of more than \$1 billion in the middle of the fiscal year.

I have proven over the past four years that the commonwealth can be fiscally responsible, maintain a balanced budget, and still make steady progress toward meeting the needs of the most vulnerable Pennsylvanians. I have, in the past, and will continue, in the future, to provide additional funding for vital human services. But, I have consistently enforced a "pay as you go policy" when it comes to the state budget—expenditure increases must not be legislated on an ad-hoc basis during the fiscal year. I will not sign legislation that either significantly increases spending or reduces revenue without a specific plan to pay for it. Such legislation should be passed in the disciplined context of building our annual comprehensive balanced budget.

For these reasons I must withhold my signature for House Bill 1813. I reiterate that I remain hopeful we can achieve progress toward this goal in our next budget.

Notice of Veto

October 27, 2006

To the Honorable, the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

I am returning, without my approval, House Bill 2545, which amends certain provisions of the parking authorities' law primarily relating to the regulation of taxicabs and limousines in cities of the first class.

One of the most troubling aspects of the bill is the provision that allows the Philadelphia Parking Authority to depart from the standard administrative law practice of setting forth clear and understandable reasons why a particular decision, following a hearing to contest the Authority's action with respect to the rights or obligations of a taxicab or limousine owner, was made. The grounds upon which a taxicab or limousine owner may appeal a decision are limited, so how is the owner supposed to know if he or she has grounds for an appeal if the Authority's hearing officer doesn't have to include his or her reasons in the decision? Because such a decision could involve taking away an owner's right to make a living, this seems to be patently unfair and bordering on a violation of due process for the taxicab or limousine owner. At the very least, it will mean that everyone who receives an unfavorable decision will automatically have to file an appeal—and, most likely, spend some amount of money to hire a lawyer to do so—even before they know whether they have any chance of being successful.

Moreover, the bill is fraught with provisions that are confusing and seem not to serve the interests of the Parking Authority or the citizens it was created to serve. For example, the bill exempts limousines and taxicabs that operate in Philadelphia, but are "based outside" of the city from the oversight of the Authority. Besides the fact that the bill does not define what being "based outside" of the city means, it seems that this gives suburban taxicab and limousine services a distinct advantage over those that are located in the city for no apparent good reason. It also may induce companies that are already located in Philadelphia to move out of the city, which obviously is not good for the city's overall economy. In addition, House Bill 2545 exempts all parking authorities from compliance with the most important provisions of the Commonwealth Procurement Code—those relating to the openness with which contracts must be bid and awarded. This can only result in the loss of faith by the public in the integrity of these authorities.

Finally, the bill exempts wheelchair accessible taxicabs from the prohibition in the current statute that a taxicab cannot be more than eight years old. There does not seem to be a good reason for this exemption.

For all of these reasons, I must withhold my approval from House Bill 2545.

CHAPTER 3000. JUDGMENTS

Subchapter D. ENFORCEMENT OF MONEY JUDGMENTS FOR THE PAYMENT OF MONEY

Rule 3129.3. Postponement of sale; new notice. Failure of Plaintiff to Attend Sale.

- (a) Except as provided by subdivision (b) or special order of court, new notice shall be given as provided by Rule 3129.2 if a sale of real property is stayed, continued, postponed or adjourned.
- (b) If the sale is stayed, continued, postponed or adjourned to a date certain within one hundred one hundred thirty days of the scheduled sale, notice of which sale was given as provided by Rule 3129.2, and public announcement thereof, including the new date, is made to the bidders assembled at the time and place [originally] fixed for the sale, no new notice as provided by Rule 3129.2 shall be required, but there may be only [one such stay, continuance, postponement or adjournment] two such stays, continuances, postponements or adjournments within the one hundred thirty day period without new notice.
- (c) If the plaintiff or a representative of the plaintiff is not present at the sale, the real property shall not be sold. The sheriff shall return the writ of execution to the prothonotary and file a return pursuant to Rule 3139 indicating that the real property was not sold because the plaintiff or a representative of the plaintiff was not present at the sale. Thereafter, the writ may be reissued pursuant to Rule 3106.

Explanatory Comment

Rule 3129.3(b)—Postponement of execution sale of real property

Rule 3129.3(b) formerly provided for one postponement of a sale of real property upon execution to a date within one hundred days of the scheduled sale without giving new notice of sale required by Rule 3129.2. The rule has been amended to permit two postponements within a period of one hundred thirty days of the scheduled sale without giving new notice. The amendment provides flexibility where more than one postponement is needed, saving time and expense. New notice under Rule 3129.2 is required when additional postponements of the sale are required.

Rule 3129.3(c)—Failure of plaintiff to appear at execution sale of real property

Prior to the present amendment, the execution rules did not provide for the instance when the plaintiff, whether in person or by representative, does not attend the sale of real property. New subdivision (c) of Rule 3129.3 addresses this issue. Subdivision (c) provides that, if the plaintiff is not present at the sale, "the real property shall not be sold." In such a case, the sheriff is directed to "return the writ of execution to the prothonotary and file a return pursuant to Rule 3139." The plaintiff may again seek to have the property sold but must recommence the proceedings by having the writ of execution reissued pursuant to Rule 3106 and giving new notice under Rule 3129.2.

Please note that issuance of this permit does not eliminate the necessity to comply with all Federal, State or local requirements at the permitted facility. PLAN APPROVAL AND OPERATING PERMIT APPLICATIONS

NEW SOURCES AND MODIFICATIONS

The Department of Environmental Protection (Department) has developed an "integrated" plan approval, State operating permit and Title V operating permit program. This integrated approach is designed to make the permitting process more efficient for the Department, the regulated community and the public. This approach allows the owner or operator of a facility to complete and submit all the permitting documents relevant to its application one time, affords an opportunity for public input and provides for sequential issuance of the necessary permits.

The Department has received applications for plan approvals and/or operating permits from the following facilities.

Copies of the applications, subsequently prepared draft permits, review summaries and other support materials are available for review in the regional office identified in this notice. Persons interested in reviewing the application files should contact the appropriate regional office to schedule an appointment.

Interested persons may also request that a hearing be held concerning the proposed plan approval and operating permit. Comments or protests filed with the Department regional offices must include a concise statement of the objections to the issuance of the Plan approval or operating permit and relevant facts which serve as the basis for the objections. If the Department schedules a hearing, a

notice will be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* at least 30 days prior the date of the hearing.

In accordance with 25 Pa. Code §§ 127.44(b) and 127.424(b), the Department of Environmental Protection (Department) intends to issue Plan Approval No. 54-322-005 to Commonwealth Environmental Systems (CES), 99 Commonwealth Road, Hegins, PA 17938 for their landfill in Foster, Rielly and Frailly Townships, Schuylkill County. This plan approval will be incorporated into the Title V operating permit No. 54-00054 through an admin-

istrative amendment at a later date, and the action will be published as a notice in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

The plan approval No. 54-322-005 is to construct a landfill expansion and increase the daily waste acceptance rate at the previously approved municipal solid waste landfill with an Active Gas Collection System with landfill gas flare (incinerator) for methane gas collection and recovery. The landfill expansion includes two new areas separated by the existing permitted landfill. The expansion area totals approximately 173.5 acres. Specifically, CES is requesting to increase the waste acceptance rate from the current rate of 2,100 tons per day to a proposed rate of 4,750 tons per day, the increase would be based on a ramp up schedule over a 2 year period to transition from the existing permitted acceptance rate to the proposed acceptance rate. The VOC emissions from the landfill will be controlled by enclosed landfill gas flares and shall not exceed 50 tons per year keeping the landfill below major source threshold. The Department will place conditions to limit the emissions from the landfill. The Plan Approval and Operating Permit will contain additional recordkeeping and operating restrictions designed to keep the facility operating within all applicable air quality requirements.

Copies of the application, the Department's analysis and other documents used in the evaluation of the application are available for public review during normal business hours at Air Quality Program, 2 Public Square, Wilkes-Barre, PA 18711.

Interested persons may submit written comments, suggestions or objections which they believe should be considered prior to the issuance of this permit to the address shown in the preceding paragraph. 08-399-044C: OSRAM SYLVANIA Products, Inc. (Hawes Street, Towanda, PA 18848-0504) for installation of an American Air Filter (AAF) model 10-672-8941 fabric collector (ID C195G) and an American Air Filter BioCel model BioCel-I final filter system (ID C195H) to control particulate matter emissions from the Hot and Cold Rolling department at their facility in North Towanda Township, **Bradford County**. The proposed fabric collector and final filter will replace an existing fabric collector. The facility is a State-only facility.

The Department of Environmental Protection's (Department) review of the information contained in the applica-

tion submitted by OSRAM indicates that the source and the air-cleaning devices will comply with all applicable air quality requirements pertaining to air contamination sources and the emission of air contaminants, including the fugitive air contaminant emission requirement of 25 Pa. Code § 123.1,the PM emission limitation of 25 Pa. Code § 123.13 and the visible emission limitation of 25 Pa. Code § 123.41. The plan approval, if issued, will subsequently be incorporated in an operating permit via an administrative amendment in accordance with 25 Pa. Code § 127.450 at a later date.

Based upon this finding, the Department proposes to issue plan approval for the installation of an American Air Filter model 10-672-8941 fabric collector (ID C195G) and an American Air Filter BioCel model BioCel-I final filter system (ID C195H). The following is a summary of the conditions the Department proposes to place in the plan approval to be issued to ensure compliance with all applicable regulatory requirements:

- 1. Source ID P195 is the Hot and Cold Rolling department consisting of the following sources:
 - a. Farrel (Plate) Rolling Mill.
 - b. GTE (Plate) Furnace.
 - c. 500 Ton Wilson (Plate) Press.
 - d. Abrasive Cutting Machine (model 364 wet saw).
 - e. Waterbury-Farrel (Rod) Rolling Mill.
 - f. GTE (Rod) Furnace.
 - g. Plate Conveyor.

The PM emissions from all sources of Source ID P195 with the exception of the Abrasive Cutting Machine (model 364 wet saw) shall be controlled by the two American Air Filter model 14-480-8982 fabric collectors (IDs C195a and C195B) that operate in parallel and four final filter assemblies (IDs C195C, C195D, C195E and C195F) (2 filter assemblies per collector operating in parallel). In addition the PM emissions the GTE plate furnace, Farell plate rolling mill and the plate conveyor shall be additionally controlled by the AAF Model 10-672-8941 fabric collector (ID C195G) and an American Air Filter BioCel model BioCel-I final filter system (ID C195H).

- 2. The PM emissions contained in the exhaust of the American Air Filter BioCel model BioCel-I final filter system associated with Source ID P195 shall not exceed 0.02 grain per dry standard cubic foot.
- 3. The permittee shall continuously monitor the pressure drop across the AAF model 10-672-8941 and American Air Filter BioCel model BioCel-I final filter system using instrumentation capable of monitoring the pressure drop on a continuous basis.
- 4. The pressure drop across the AAF model 10-672-8941 and an American Air Filter BioCel model BioCel-I final filter system shall be recorded at least once per day and be retained on site for a minimum of 5 years.
- 5. The permittee shall keep on hand a sufficient quantity of spare fabric collector bags and filters for the fabric collector and filters associated with Source ID P195 in order to be able to replace any bag or filter requiring replacement immediately.
- 6. The two American Air Filter model 14-480-8982 fabric collectors (IDs C195a and C195B) that operate in parallel and four final filter assemblies (IDs C195C, C195D, C195E and C195F) (two filter assemblies per

collector operating in parallel) associated with Source ID P195 shall continue to operate as required by operating permit 08-399-044B.

41-318-045C: High Steel Structures, Inc. (1853 William Penn Way, Lancaster, PA 17605) for the modification of a structural steel surface coating operation located at 3501 West Fourth Street in the City of Williamsport, **Lycoming County**. The facility is not a major (Title V) facility for any air contaminant.

The structural steel surface coating operation is operated under Operating Permit 41-318-045, which was issued on April 4, 2001. The proposed modifications are revisions in the coating (paint) VOC content limitations currently imposed on the surface coating operation by Operating Permit 41-381-045. Although these revisions may result in an increased amount of VOCs emitted per gallon of coating used, no increase is being proposed in either the allowable annual facility-wide VOC emission limitation or the allowable annual facility-wide HAP emission limitations.

The Department of Environmental Protection's (Department) review of the information provided by High Steel Structures, Inc. indicates that the modified surface coating operation will comply with all applicable regulatory requirements pertaining to air contamination sources and the emission of air contaminants, including the best available technology requirement of 25 Pa. Code §§ 127.1 and 127.12 and the requirements of 25 Pa. Code § 129.52. Based on this finding, the Department proposes to issue plan approval for the proposed modifications.

The following is a summary of the conditions the Department proposes to place in the plan approval to be issued to assure compliance with all applicable regulatory requirements:

- 1. Conditions contained in Operating Permit 41-318-045 remain in effect unless amended or superseded by a condition contained herein. If there is a conflict between a condition contained in Operating Permit 41-318-045 and a condition contained herein, the permittee shall comply with the condition contained here rather than with the conflicting condition contained in Operating Permit 41-318-045.
- 2. The total combined VOC emissions from the entire facility shall not equal or exceed 50 tons in any 12-consecutive month period, the total combined emissions of any single HAP shall not equal or exceed 10 tons in any 12-consecutive month period, the total combined emissions of all HAPs shall not equal or exceed 25 tons in any 12-consecutive month period and the total combined emissions of acetone shall not equal or exceed 20 tons in any 12-consecutive month period.
- 3. The VOC content of any primer used shall not exceed 6.48 pounds per gallon of coating solids on an as-applied basis, the VOC content of any intermediate coating used shall not exceed 6.03 pounds per gallon of

coating solids on an as-applied basis and the VOC content of any topcoat used shall not exceed 6.08 pounds per gallon of coating solids on an as applied basis.

- 4. The VOC and volatile HAP contents of any primer used shall not exceed 3.33 and 3.33 pounds per gallon, respectively, as received from the vendor or supplier, the VOC and volatile HAP contents of any intermediate coating used shall not exceed 3.0 and 2.96 pounds per gallon, respectively, as received from the vendor or supplier and the VOC and volatile HAP contents of any topcoat used shall not exceed 3.2 and .81 pounds per gallon, respectively, as received from the vendor or supplier.
- 5. Carboline Thinner No. 225E (or alternate material containing only acetone) shall be the only thinner used for all coatings other than inorganic zinc primers unless the use of Carboline Thinner No. 225E (or alternate material containing only acetone) is demonstrated to the Department's satisfaction to be technically infeasible, in which case the permittee may use an alternate thinner recommended by the coating vendor or supplier. Carboline Thinner No. 225E shall not contain any VOCs or volatile HAPs.
- 6. Carboline Thinner No. 237 (or alternate material determined by the Department to have an equivalent, or lower, air contaminant emission potential) shall be the only thinner used for inorganic zinc primers unless the use of Carboline Thinner No. 237 is demonstrated to the Department's satisfaction to be technically infeasible, in which case the permittee may use an alternate thinner recommended by the coating vendor or supplier. Carboline Thinner No. 237 (or alternate material determined by the Department to have an equivalent, or lower, air contaminant emission potential) shall not contain VOCs in excess of 4.93 pounds per gallon nor shall it contain any volatile HAPs.
- 7. Carboline Thinner No. 225E (or alternate material containing only acetone) shall be the only cleaning solvent used unless prior authorization is obtained from the Department to use an alternate solvent.
- 8. Spray guns and lines shall be cleaned by either flushing a solid liquid stream of solvent into a container or by soaking spray guns in an enclosed container of solvent. Under no circumstances shall solvent be flushed into a container in the form of an atomized spray or flushed/sprayed into the atmosphere. Containers of cleaning solvents, coating, thinner and any other VOC-containing, volatile HAP-containing or acetone-containing materials shall be kept closed except when taking material out of the container or putting material into the container. Solvent-wet rags or cloths shall be kept in closed containers when not in actual use. Under no circumstances shall waste solvent or other VOC-containing, volatile HAP-containing or acetone-containing materials be treated in any manner which intentionally promotes evaporative loss.

Comprehensive accurate records shall be maintained of the identity, type (primer, intermediate, topcoat, and the like), amount, solids content, VOC content, content of each individual volatile HAP and acetone content of each VOC-containing, volatile HAP-containing and acetone-containing material used each month as well as the mix ratio for each batch of coating during each month to which an additive (thinner, and the like) has been added or which has been mixed from multiple components. This data shall be submitted to the Department on a quarterly basis. Additionally, all records generated as a result of

this condition shall be retained for at least 5 years and shall be made available to the Department upon request.

- 33-160B: Reynoldsville Casket Company (5th Street Extension, Reynoldsville, PA 15851) for modification of plan approval 33-160A conditions with regards to the operation of the coating lines (101) without the control device (C101B) being in operation in Reynoldsville Borough, Jefferson County. This is a State-only V facility. The public notice is required for sources required to obtain a Plan Approval in accordance with 25 Pa. Code § 127.44. This plan approval will, in accordance with 25 Pa. Code § 127.450, be incorporated into the State-only operating permit through an administrative amendment at a later date. The source shall comply with the following conditions, which will satisfy the requirements of 25 Pa. Code § 127.12b (pertaining to plan approval terms and conditions) and will demonstrate Best Available Technology for the source:
- The facility VOC emissions shall not exceed 49.4 tpy based on a consecutive 12-month period.
 - The permittee shall maintain the following records:
 - Monthly facility VOC emissions.
- Yearly facility VOC emissions based on a consecutive 12-month period.
- Persons may not permit the emission into the outdoor atmosphere of PM in a manner that the concentration of PM in the effluent gas exceeds 0.02 grain per dry standard cubic foot.
- This source is subject to 25 Pa. Code §§ 123.1, 123.31 and 123.41 for fugitive, odor and visible emissions, respectively.
- 1. During periods of primer, color and clearcoat booth operation when using coatings not in compliance with Table 1 of 25 Pa. Code § 129.52, the catalytic oxidizer inlet temperature shall be maintained at 650° F or above as defined in the Plan Approval application, or at a minimum temperature determined during compliant destruction efficiency testing. This condition replaces Condition No. 8 from plan approval 33-160A which required during periods of color and clearcoat operations to maintain oxidizer inlet temperature at 650° F or above.
- 2. The primer, color and clearcoat surface coating lines shall not be operated when the catalytic oxidizer is not operating unless the coatings used meet the requirements in 25 Pa. Code 129.52, Table 1. This condition replaces Condition No. 9 from plan approval 33-160A which required the color and clearcoat operations to cease operation immediately in the event that the oxidizer bypass is triggered.
- \bullet All other conditions from plan approval 33-160A remain in effect.
- **25-648C: NEPA Energy, LP** (10915 Ackerman Road, North East, PA 16428) to derate an existing 126 mmBtu natural gas fired boiler to 99 mmBtu and to install a Center Fired Gas gun to be used during low fire operations in the Borough of North East, **Erie County**.

Under 25 Pa. Code §§ 127.44(a) and 127.424(b), the Department of Environmental Protection (Department) intends to issue a Plan Approval to NEPA Energy for their plant in the Borough of North East, Erie County. This plan approval will authorize the applicant to de-rate an existing 126 mmBtu natural gas fired boiler to 99

mmBtu and to install a Center Fired Gas gun to be used during low fire operations. Low fire will be defined as equal to or less than 12 mmBtu. The existing Low-NOx burner with induced flue gas recirculation will remain in place for use at high fire operations. The Plan Approval will subsequently be incorporated into the company's State-only Operating Permit through an administrative amendment in accordance with 25 Pa. Code § 127.450. Normal high fire operations at high fire will be around 50 mmBtu. The boiler's hours of operation will be limited to 5,760 hours at high fire and 3,000 hours at low fire. This plan approval will also decrease the annual NOx and CO emissions to 75 TPY, based on 12 month rolling. Based on the information provided by the applicant and Department's own analysis, the natural gas fired boiler will emit 10.8 tons of NOx per year, and 30.0 tons of CO per year. Actual emissions will decrease for both pollutants with the de-rating.

- 1. A condition requiring either the performance of EPA Method 24 testing of the VOC-containing materials used at this facility or the maintenance of vendor-provided data sheets for such materials is being removed from the permit as Method 24 analyses are of no use in predicting the VOC emissions which will occur as a result of using the highest usage rate materials at this facility (gelcoat and resin) and the maintenance of accurate VOC content data for the materials being used at the facility is required by other permit conditions which are being retained.
- 2. A condition requiring either the performance of analytical tests for sulfur content on the fuel oil received at this facility or the maintenance of fuel certification reports is being removed from the permit as the amount of No. 2 fuel oil used by the facility and the likelihood of ever exceeding the allowable sulfur content (.5% by weight) are both low enough to render a requirement unnecessary.
- 3. Conditions requiring weekly "walk around" inspections of the facility and the maintenance of records of these inspections are being removed from the permit as the Department feels that the inspections are of little value in detecting the types of permit violations that could occur from this type of facility.
- 4. A condition requiring the submittal of semi-annual reports containing facility-wide VOC and HAP emission data is being modified to require the submittal of the reports on a quarterly basis.
- 5. A condition is being added to the permit prohibiting the use of No. 2 fuel oil which contains reclaimed/reprocessed oil, waste oil or other waste materials.
- 6. A number of conditions are being added to the permit which identify applicable requirements of Subpart

WWWW of the National Emission Standards for Air Pollutants, 40 CFR 63.5790—63.5935, to which the facility is now subject.

- 7. A number of conditions are being modified to specify new deadlines for the submission of quarterly reports.
- 8. Conditions prohibiting the storage of materials with a vapor pressure greater than 1.5 psia in the No. 2 fuel oil storage tanks and requiring the maintenance of records verifying compliance with this vapor pressure limitation are being modified to prohibit the use of the respective tanks to store anything other than No. 2 fuel oil and require the maintenance of records of the identity of the materials stored in the tanks.

Availability of Modified Chapter 105 General Permit BWM-GP-11 and Reissuance of the 401 Water Quality Certification for the Maintenance, Testing, Repair, Rehabilitation or Replacement of Existing Water Obstructions and Encroachments

The Department of Environmental Protection (Department) announces the modification and finalization of Chapter 105 General Permit BWM-GP-11 and the reissuance of the 401 Water Quality Certification for the Maintenance, Testing, Repair, Rehabilitation, or Replacement of Existing Water Obstructions and Encroachments. The Department issues the modified General Permit, effective December 11, 2006, under the authority of section 7 of the Dam Safety and Encroachments Act (32 P. S. § 693.7) and 25 Pa. Code Chapter 105, Subchapter L (relating to general permits). The General Permit authorizes the maintenance, testing, repair, rehabilitation or replacement of any existing water obstruction or encroachment.

In accordance with 25 Pa. Code 105.446 (relating to procedure for issuance), the Department published notice of its intent to modify the General Permit at 35 Pa.B. 4368 (August 6, 2005). The Department proposed permit condition modifications including: allowing necessary appurtenant upstream and downstream works beyond the immediate 12-foot limitation for the actual bridge or culvert to restore, maintain and protect the stream and structure; limiting the use of bridges and culverts authorized under the general permit to their existing use; and clarifying language at standards Condition No. 16 Historical Resources.

During the 30-day public comment period on the proposed modifications, the Department received 24 comments from four persons/agencies. The Department has prepared a Comment and Response Document that summarizes the comments and the changes that were made, where applicable, to the General Permit.

Commentators suggested that the General Permit should not be used to put a structure to a different use. The General Permit has been clarified to indicate that structures cannot be put to a different use than for which they were originally constructed (for example, conversion and upgrade of a logging road for use as subdivision access). In addition, the General Permit condition regarding the widening of the structure to 12 feet on each side of the structure has been modified to allow for necessary appurtenant upstream and downstream works beyond the immediate 12-foot limitation for the actual bridge or culvert. Language has been added to the General Permit to ensure the appurtenant works are limited to the extent necessary to restore, maintain and protect the stream and structure as well as to ensure the protection of the public health, safety and the environment.

401 Water Quality Certification

The projects covered by General Permit BWM-GP-11 may also require a Federal license or permit. Section 401(a) of the Clean Water Act (33 U.S.C.A. § 1341(a)) requires that an applicant for a Federal license or permit to conduct any activity which may result in any discharge into the waters of the United States provide the Federal licensing or permitting agency a certification from the state in which the discharge will originate that the discharge will comply with applicable provision of the Clean Water Act as well as applicable State law related to water quality protection.

The Department issued 401 Water Quality Certification with the finalization of BWM-GP-11, which was advertised at 34 Pa.B. 3645 (July 10, 2004). The Department believes the modifications to BWM-GP-11 comply with the Commonwealth's water quality standards and is therefore reissuing the 401 Water Quality Certification for BWM-GP-11.

Freestanding Abortion Facilities—Requirement to Comply with the Medical Care Availability and Reduction of Error (MCARE) Act

On May 1, 2006, the Medical Care Availability and Reduction of Error (MCARE) Act (40 P. S. §§ 1303.101—1303.910) was amended by the act of May 1, 2006 (P. L. 103, No. 30) to require certain freestanding abortion facilities to comply with its terms, beginning no earlier than January 1, 2007.

By way of background, the MCARE Act established the Patient Safety Authority (Authority) and charged it with, among other responsibilities, the development of a reporting system for facilities subject to the MCARE Act to report "incidents," "serious events" and "infrastructure failures" as defined in the MCARE Act. The Statewide reporting system developed is known as the Pennsylvania Patient Safety Reporting System (PA-PSRS), through which facilities report "incidents" and "serious events" to the Authority and "serious events" and "infrastructure failures" to the Department of Health (Department).

Facilities subject to the MCARE Act are required to make the mandatory reports through PA-PSRS, pay a proportionate share of the Authority's annual budget into the Patient Safety Trust, develop and implement a Patient Safety Plan meeting the requirements of the MCARE Act, identify a Patient Safety Officer and establish a Patient Safety Committee to fulfill certain responsibilities set forth in the MCARE Act, provide written notification to patients upon the occurrence of a "serious event" and notify the appropriate licensing board if a health care worker fails to report a "serious event."

Freestanding abortion facilities that perform 100 or more abortions between June 30, 2006, and December 31, 2006, are subject to the MCARE Act beginning January 1, 2007, and are required to comply with its terms and begin reporting through PA-PSRS upon submission of a Patient Safety Plan to the Department no later than 60 days after January 1, 2007. Other freestanding abortion facilities that perform 100 or more abortions in any calendar year beginning 2007 and thereafter are subject to the MCARE Act on the day following the 100th

abortion. Once subject to the MCARE Act, each facility must continue to satisfy the requirements unless it provides written notice to the Department that it will not be performing and does not perform 100 or more abortions in that calendar year.

Following this notice is a summary of the MCARE Act requirements as they pertain to freestanding abortion facilities. Nothing therein is intended to supersede or modify anything set forth in the MCARE Act.

Summary of MCARE Act Responsibilities as They Pertain to Freestanding Abortion Facilities Definitions

For purposes of this summary, the following definitions apply:

A "health care worker" is an employee, independent contractor, licensee or other individual authorized to provide health care services in the freestanding abortion facility.

An "incident" is an event, occurrence or situation involving the clinical care of a patient in the freestanding abortion facility that could have injured the patient but did not either cause an unanticipated injury or require the delivery of additional health care services to the patient.

An "infrastructure failure" is an undesirable or unintended event, occurrence or situation involving the infrastructure of a freestanding abortion facility or the discontinuation or significant disruption of a service which could seriously compromise patient safety.

A "serious event" is an event, occurrence or situation involving the clinical care of a patient in the freestanding abortion facility that results in death or compromises patient safety and results in an unanticipated injury requiring the delivery of additional health services to the patient.

Freestanding Abortion Facilities That Perform 100 or More Abortions in 2006 After June 30, 2006

Effective January 1, 2007, any freestanding abortion facility that performs 100 or more abortions in the 2006 calendar year after June 30, 2006, will be subject to the requirements of Chapter 3 (relating to patient safety) of the MCARE Act (40 P. S. §§ 1303.301—1303.315), which include, but are not limited to, the following:

Assessment—It shall pay an assessment, to be deposited into the Patient Safety Trust Fund (Fund), within 30 days after the assessment is levied by the Department of Health (Department). Section 305(g) of the MCARE Act. The Department shall determine the assessment by applying the same methodology for calculating the assessment that it utilizes for ambulatory surgical facilities. Section 305(c) of the MCARE Act (40 P. S. § 1303.305(c)).

Patient Safety Plan—It shall develop in consultation with the licensees providing health care services in the facility, and then implement and comply with an internal patient safety plan that it shall establish for the purpose of improving the health and safety of its patients. Section 307(a) of the MCARE Act (40 P.S. § 1303.307(a)). By March 2, 2007, it shall submit its patient safety plan to the Department for the Department's approval. Section 315(b) and (d) of the MCARE Act (40 P. S. § 1303.315(b) and (d)). It shall also begin reporting incidents, infrastructure failures, and serious events on the date it submits its patient safety plan to the Department. The Department will approve or disapprove the patient safety plan within 60 days after receiving it. Section 307(c) of the MCARE Act. Upon approval of the patient safety plan by the Department, the facility shall notify its health care workers of the plan. The facility shall require compliance with the plan by a health care worker as a condition of employment or credentialing at the facility. Section 307(d) of the MCARE Act. The patient safety plan shall do all of the following:

- 1. Designate a patient safety officer.
- 2. Establish a patient safety committee.
- 3. Establish a system for the facility's health care workers to report incidents and serious events 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.
- 4. Prohibit any retaliatory action against a health care worker for reporting an incident or serious event in accordance with the Whistleblower Law (43 P. S. §§ 1421—1428).
- 5. Provide for written notification of patients who are affected by a serious event. Section 307(b)(1)—(5) of the MCARE Act.

Patient Safety Officer—It shall have a patient safety officer, which it must designate no later than the date it submits its patient safety plan to the Department. Sections 307(b)(1) and 315(b) and (d) of the MCARE Act. The patient safety officer shall do all of the following:

- 1. Serve on the facility's patient safety committee.
- 2. Ensure the investigation of all reports of incidents and serious events.
- 3. Take action as is immediately necessary to ensure patient safety against any harm identified from the investigation of a report of an incident or serious event.
- 4. Report to the patient safety committee regarding any action taken to promote patient safety as a result of an investigation of a report of an incident or serious event. Section 309(1)—(4) of the MCARE Act (40 P. S. § 1303.309(1)—(4)).

Patient Safety Committee—It shall have a patient safety committee, which it must establish no later than the date it submits its patient safety plan to the Department. Sections 307(b)(2) and 315(b) and (d) of the MCARE Act. The patient safety committee shall meet at least quarterly and be composed of the patient safety officer, at least one health care worker at the facility, and at least one resident of the community served by the facility who is not an agent, employee or contractor of the facility. Additional membership requirements are that no more than one member of the facility's governing board may serve on the patient safety committee, and the committee shall include members of both the facility's medical and nursing staff. Section 310(a)(2) of the MCARE Act (40 P. S. § 1303.310(a)(2)). The patient safety committee shall do all of the following:

- 1. Receive reports from the patient safety officer regarding any action taken to promote patient safety as a result of an investigation of a report of an incident or serious event.
- 2. Evaluate investigations and actions of the patient safety officer on all reports of incidents and serious events.
- 3. Review and evaluate the quality of patient safety measures utilized by the facility. These reviews shall include consideration of the following:
- a. Reports to the facility from the contracted entity of the Authority of immediate changes that can be instituted for the purpose of reducing the number and severity of incidents and serious events. Section 304(a)(5)(iii) of the MCARE Act (40 P. S. § 1303.304(a)(5)(iii)).
- b. Reports to the facility from the Authority of reports of incidents or serious events filed with the Authority by health care workers. Section 304(a)(5)(iii) and (7) of the MCARE Act.
- c. Reports to the facility from its health care workers of incidents and serious events. Section 308(a) of the MCARE Act (40 P. S. \S 1303.308(a)).
- 4. Make recommendations to eliminate future incidents and serious events.
- 5. Report to the administrative officer and governing body of the facility on a quarterly basis regarding the number of incidents and serious events and its recommendations to eliminate future incidents and serious events. Section 310(b)(1)—(5) of the MCARE Act.

Duty to Notify Patient-Through an appropriate designee it shall provide written notification to a patient who has been affected by a serious event or, with the consent of the patient, to an available family member or designee. The notice shall be give within 7 days after the facility's discovery of the serious event. If the patient is unable to give consent and has not designated a person to receive the notice, the facility shall give the written notification to an adult member of the patient's immediate family and, if the facility is unable to identify or locate such a person, it shall give the written notification to the closest adult family member. If the patient is an unemancipated minor under 18 years of age, the facility shall provide the written notification to the patient's parent of guardian. Section 308(b) of the MCARE Act. Its duty to provide such written notifications begins when it submits its patient safety plan to the Department. Sections 307(b)(5), 308(b) and 1303.315(b) and (d) of the MCARE Act.

Serious Event Reports by Facility—It shall report to the Department and the Authority the occurrence of a serious event within 24 hours after it confirms the occurrence of a serious event. Section 313(a) of the MCARE Act (40 P. S. § 1303.313(a)). It shall begin reporting serious events upon submission of its patient safety plan to the Department. Section 315(e) of the MCARE Act.

Incident Reports by Facility—It shall report to the Authority the occurrence of an incident in a form and manner prescribed by the Authority. The report shall not include the name of any patient or any other identifiable individual information. Section 313(b) of the MCARE Act. It shall begin reporting incidents upon submission of its patient safety plan to the Department. Section 315(e) of the MCARE Act.

Infrastructure Failure Reports by Facility—It shall report to the Department the occurrence of an infrastructure failure within 24 hours after it confirms the occur-

rence of an infrastructure failure. Section 313(c) of the MCARE Act. It shall begin reporting infrastructure failures upon submission of its patient safety plan to the Department. Section 315(e) of the MCARE Act.

Notification to Licensure Boards—If it discovers that a health care worker regulated by a licensing board failed to report a serious event as required by the MCARE Act, it shall notify the licensing board of that health care worker's failure to report. Section 313(e) of the MCARE Act. A health care worker's responsibility to report serious events begins when the abortion facility submits its patient safety plan to the Department. Sections 307(b)(3), 308(a) and 315(b) and (d) of the MCARE Act.

Continuation of Responsibilities in Subsequent Years—It shall continue to satisfy the duties imposed upon it under Chapter 3 of the MCARE Act in subsequent calendar years unless it gives the Department written notice that it will not be performing 100 or more abortions in a calendar year and does not perform 100 or more abortions in that calendar year. Section 315(b) of the MCARE Act.

Freestanding Abortion Facilities That Do Not Perform 100 or More Abortions in 2006 After June 30, 2006, But Perform 100 or More Abortions in a Subsequent Calendar Year

A freestanding abortion facility that does not perform 100 or more abortions in the 2006 calendar year after June 30, 2006, but does perform 100 or more abortions in a subsequent calendar year, shall be subject to Chapter 3 of the MCARE Act, and the requirements with the following variations, the day following the performance of its 100th abortion in that calendar year. Section 315(c) of the MCARE Act. Within 60 days following its performance of its 100th abortion in that calendar year it shall submit its patient safety plan to the Department. Section 315(d) of the MCARE Act. It shall begin reporting incidents, infrastructure failures, and serious events on the date it submits its patient safety plan to the Department. Section 315(e) of the MCARE Act. By the date it submits its patient safety plan it shall also designate a patient safety officer, establish a patient safety committee, establish a system accessible at all times for its health care workers to report serious events and incidents, begin required patient notifications of serious events, and begin reporting to licensing boards health care workers regulated by the boards who failed to report a serious event as required by the MCARE Act. Sections 307(b) 315(c) and (d) of the MCARE Act.

It shall be the responsibility of a freestanding abortion facility to determine when it performs 100 abortions in a calendar year and to then come into compliance with the requirements of Chapter 3 of the MCARE Act.

Sanctions Against Abortion Facilities

Late Payment of Assessment—If after 30 days' notice the facility fails to pay an assessment levied by the Department under Chapter 3 of the MCARE Act, the Department may impose an administrative penalty of \$1,000 per day against it until the assessment is paid. Section 305(g) of the MCARE Act.

Failure to Report or Notify—If the facility fails to satisfy the requirements of Chapter 3 of the MCARE Act to report an infrastructure failure or serious event; or to develop and comply with a patient safety plan; or to notify a patient of a serious event, the Department may revoke the facility's approval to perform abortions under 28 Pa. Code § 29.43 (relating to facility approval). Section 313(f) of the MCARE Act. This applies to both freestanding and hospital abortion facilities that are subject to

Chapter 3 of the MCARE Act. In addition, if the facility fails to report a serious event or an infrastructure failure, or fails to notify a licensing board of a health care worker's failure to report a serious event, as required by Chapter 3 of the MCARE Act, the Department may impose a \$1,000 per day administrative penalty on the facility until it files the required report or makes the required notification. Id.

Responsibilities of Health Care Workers

The health care worker shall report the matter immediately upon discovering it or as soon thereafter as reasonably practical, but in no event less than 24 hours after discovery. Section 308(a) of the MCARE Act.

Finding Lebanon County

Under section 2002(b) of The Administrative Code of 1929 (71 P. S. § 512(b)), the Deputy Secretary for Highway Administration makes the following written finding:

The Department of Transportation (Department) plans to improve existing SR 0501 through the Village of Schaefferstown in Heidelberg Township, Lebanon County, PA. The proposed roadway is a bypass of the Village of Schaefferstown on new alignment. The project will use property within Brendle Farms, the Old Mill Historic District and the Heidelberg Township Bike Path. Brendle Farms is listed on the National Register of Historic Places. The Old Mill Historic District has been determined eligible for the National Register of Historic Places. The Heidelberg Township Bike Path, which begins at the Heidelberg Township Park and extends east to SR 0501, is a publicly owned recreation area that is valued by the officials having jurisdiction over the land. The project requires 2.7 hectares (6.7 acres) of right-of-way from Brendle Farms and 4.1 hectares (10.2 acres) of right-of-way from the Old Mill Road Historic District. The subject project uses two contributing properties within Brendle Farms and three contributing properties within the Old Mill Road Historic District. The project will use 0.01 hectare (0.03 acre) of right-of-way from the Heidelberg Township Bike Path.

The environmental, economic, social and other effects of the proposed project as enumerated in section 2002 of The Administrative Code of 1929 have been considered. It has been concluded that there is no feasible and prudent alternative to the project as designed and all reasonable steps have been taken to minimize the effects. A Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) has been developed and signed for the proposed action. Minimization/mitigation measures in the MOA include: incorporating design features that will minimize physical and visual effects on contributing resources in each historic property while meeting current Federal and State highway design standards; incorporating historically sensitive landscaping elements; creating educational materials; and providing a historical marker for Brendle Farms. Additional specific mitigation measures may be provided that will address access needs for two property owners on Brendle Farms. The subject project will separate the western portion of the Heidelberg Township Bike Path from the eastern portion of the Heidelberg Township Bike Path at its crossing of the proposed SR 0501. To mitigate impacts to the Heidelberg Township Bike Path, advance signage will be provided on both the roadway and bike path, and pavement markings on the roadway will be provided. A stop sign will be provided on the bike path at the crossing. Pavers on the bike path in the crossing area will serve as a transition, which in combination with the stop sign will provide appropriate warning of the crossing for bike path users.

The Deputy Secretary for Highway Administration has considered the environmental, economic, social and other effects of the proposed project as enumerated in section 2002 of The Administrative Code of 1929 and has concluded that there is no feasible and prudent alternative to

the project as designed and all reasonable steps have been taken to minimize effects.

Environmental Quality Board Regulation #7-400 (IRRC #2560)

Mine Opening Blasting

November 1, 2006

We submit for your consideration the following comments on the proposed rulemaking published in the September 2, 2006 *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. Our comments are based on criteria in Section 5.2 of the Regulatory Review Act (71 P. S. § 745.5b). Section 5.1(a) of the Regulatory Review Act (71 P. S. § 745.5a(a)) directs the Environmental Quality Board to respond to all comments received from us or any other source.

1. Surface mining blasting and blaster licensing.— Consistency with statutes; Economic impact.

Surface mining blasting

In the Preamble, the EQB explains that the Mining and Reclamation Advisory Board "deadlocked on whether certain changes should be made to affirm mine opening blasting is surface mining blasting." The Pennsylvania Coal Association (PCA) submitted extensive comment in support of its belief that the EQB lacks legal authority "to apply surface blasting regulations to blasting at coal mine shaft and slope construction operations subsequent to the first two blasts." In response to these concerns, the EQB needs to fully explain its authority to regulate coal mine shaft and slope construction.

Blaster licensing

PCA also commented that "there is no legal authority for DEP to require blasters for the underground blasts to obtain licenses under 25 Pa. Code Chapter 210." The EQB needs to fully explain its authority to require coal mine blasters to be licensed.

Costs and/or savings to the regulated community

In response to Regulatory Analysis Form question #17, the EQB states that "this proposed amendment does not impose any additional costs on the regulated community." PCA takes issue with this statement. PCA states the regulations will not provide more flexibility and will result in significant cost increases. The EQB needs to respond to PCA's concerns.

2. Exception to the requirement to conduct blasting between sunrise and sunset.—Protection of the public welfare; Economic impact; Reasonableness; Clarity.

The EQB is proposing similar amendments to Sections 77.564(b), 87.127(a) and 88.135(a). Under existing regulation, blasting must be conducted between sunrise and

sunset. An exception is proposed in each of these sections to allow blasting around the clock, after the second blast. We have the following concerns with the amendment to each of these sections.

"Blasting conducted after the second blast"

The exception is limited to "blasting conducted after the second blast." However, these sections are not clear regarding what constitutes a "blast" and therefore when this exception applies. The regulations should either specify or cross-reference what constitutes a blast.

"As necessary to maintain stability of the mine opening"

It is not clear what criteria will be used to evaluate the stability of the mine opening. As written, it appears this exception could be invoked in virtually any circumstance and could supersede the blasting schedule. What stabilization measures would the blaster have to attempt before determining that stability cannot be maintained? The regulation should specify what stability criteria must be unattainable to trigger the exception.

"If consented to, in writing, by the affected building owner and lessee"

We have five questions. First, what information must be provided to the owner or lessee in relation to a proposal to use less stringent vibration limits than those specified in the regulation? Second, will this information be in writing? Third, if the blasting results in damage to the property, would this consent negate private insurance coverage? Fourth, will the owner or lessee be informed that the blaster takes full responsibility for any damage? Finally, who could the owner and lessee contact if they have questions on the information given to them? Given that the building owner and lessee are not likely to be experts on the effects of blasting, the regulation should indicate what information the building owner and lessee must be given before giving written consent to less stringent vibration limits, and should specify that the blaster has strict liability for damages. The EQB should also consider developing a standard consent form that includes this information.

3. Deletion of "excessive noise."—Protection of the public health.

The EQB is proposing to amend Sections 77.564(c) and 87.127(b). The Preamble states that "rather than protecting against noise, these sections will now protect against the adverse effects of the ground or air vibrations caused by the blast." We have two concerns.

First, the language added to these provisions will state "... to adequately protect the public from the adverse affects [sic] of vibration or safety hazards." We recommend that the amended language state "ground or air vibrations" consistent with the Preamble.

Second, the EQB is proposing to delete the phrase "excessive noise" from Sections 77.564(c) and 87.127(b). Excessive noise can be an "adverse affects [sic] of vibration." The EQB should explain why excessive noise no longer needs to be directly considered.

4. Surface blasting requirements.—Reasonableness.

Sections 87.127(f)(1) and 88.135(f)(1) will be amended to state:

The operator may use an alternative measure to this requirement if the operator demonstrates, to the Department's satisfaction, that the alternative measure is at least as effective at protecting persons and property from the adverse affects [sic] of a blast.

Proposed Amendment of Pa.O.C.R. 6.1 and Revised Model Accounts; Recommendation No. 3 of 2006

The Supreme Court of Pennsylvania Orphans' Court Procedural Rules Committee is publishing for comment a proposed amendment to Pa.O.C. Rule 6.1 and revised Model Accounts which may be viewed at: www.courts. state.pa.us/index/supctcmtes/orphctrules/indexorphctrules. asp.

Rule 6.1(a) has been expanded to include distributions as a category for completeness. Rule 6.1(b) has been restated to clarify the need for separate schedules within the account as illustrated in the Model Accounts. Consistent with the objective to standardize practice statewide, present Rule 6.1(e) permitting local rules regarding forms of account is stricken and the Rule is revised to require use of forms of Account consistent with the model forms except upon special order of Court.

If approved, the following Model Accounts would appear in an Appendix to the Rules:

- (1) Revised Model Estate Account;
- (2) Revised Model Trust Account; and
- $\begin{tabular}{lll} (3) New Model Charitable Remainder Unitrust Account. \end{tabular}$

The Model Estate Account and Model Trust Account currently approved under Pa.O.C. Rule 6.1(g) have been modified to correct certain mathematical and formatting errors and reflect other changes unique to practice in Pennsylvania while remaining consistent with the model accounts recommended for use by the Committee on National Fiduciary Standards. The Model Charitable Remainder Unitrust Account is new and incorporates additional schedules which permit the Orphans' Court and the parties to whom the unitrust account is furnished to verify that unitrust payments have been accurately computed and distributed. The Committee proposes to replace the present Model Estate and Trust Accounts and to add the Model Charitable Remainder Unitrust Account in the format attached to this Recommendation and to include such models in a single appendix to the Pennsylvania Orphans' Court Procedural Rules as described more fully below.

These proposed Orphans' Court Model Accounts are part of an ongoing forms project intended to promote uniformity and to standardize the content of pleadings and forms in use across the state. The Uniform Fiduciary Accounting Principles and accompanying commentaries and illustrations recommended by the Committee on National Fiduciary Standards are retained and relocated to the appendix in which the Model Accounts will also be found following the Pa.O.C. Rules.

Proposed new material is bold. Deleted material is bold and bracketed.

The Committee welcomes input from attorneys, judges and court administrators concerning the proposed revisions to Rule 6.1 and the proposed Model Accounts, and seeks suggestions as to additional forms which may be suitable for statewide use. TITLE 231. RULES OF CIVIL PROCEDURE PART II. ORPHANS' COURT RULES RULE 6: ACCOUNTS AND DISTRIBUTION

Rule 6.1. Form of Account.

Accounts shall conform to the following rules:

- (a) The dates of all receipts [and], disbursements and distributions, the sources of the receipts, and the persons to whom disbursements and distributions are made and the purpose thereof shall be stated except that where a number of payments have been received from the same source or disbursed or distributed to the same recipient for the same purpose over a period of time, such receipts [or], disbursements or distributions need not be itemized but may be stated in total amounts only with dates of beginning and ending of the period covered.
- (b) Except where otherwise provided by a special order of the local Court in a particular case, [items of administration, distribution, receipts, disbursements, principal, and income shall be separately itemized.] principal and income shall be accounted for separately within the account. As illustrated in the Model Accounts set forth in the Appendix, every account shall contain:
 - (1) cover page;
 - (2) summary and index page;
- (3) separate schedules, as needed, which set forth receipts, gains or losses on sales or other dispositions, disbursements, distributions, investments made and changes in holdings, and other schedules as appropriate; and
- (4) signature and verification pages by the accountant(s); the verification of the personal representative's account shall contain a statement that the Grant of Letters and the first complete advertisement thereof occurred more than four months before the filing of the account unless the personal representative has been directed by the court to file an account prior to that time.
- (c) Assets held by the accountant on the date of filing the account shall be separately itemized.
- (d) Testamentary assets shall be segregated from appointive assets.

- (e) [Each local Court may adopt further rules not inconsistent with the foregoing regulating the form of accounts.
- (f) Except where otherwise provided by a special order of the local Court in a particular case, Accounts [may] shall be prepared and filed in substantial conformity with [either (i) the rules prescribed or forms approved by the local Court or (ii)] any form approved by the Supreme Court of this Commonwealth [—whichever the accountant may elect].
- [(g)] (f) The Uniform Fiduciary Accounting Principles and accompanying commentaries and illustrations recommended by the Committee on National Fiduciary Accounting Standards in collaboration with the National Center for State Courts are approved as an elaboration of the requirements of this rule. Reference may be made to them for determination of the adequacy of a particular account. The model Account formats [attached thereto] set forth in the appendix to the Pa.O.C. Rules are the approved forms for purposes of paragraph

[(f)(ii)] (e) of this Rule in lieu of all forms heretofore approved.

Committee Comment: Subparagraph (a) of this Rule is expanded to include distributions as a category for completeness. Subparagraph (b) of this Rule is expanded to delineate the individual schedules required within an account and to require that each account be signed at the end and verified. Consistent with the objective to standardize statewide practice former subparagraph (e) of this Rule was stricken and present subparagraph (e) was modified to require use of forms of Account consistent with model forms except upon special order of Court. The National Fiduciary Accounting Standards Project (1983) Report of Fiduciary Accounting Standards Committee previously referenced in Pa.O.C. Rule 6.1 is now included in the appendix following the Pa.O.C. Rules. However, the Orphans' Court Procedural Rules Committee has corrected and modified the Project's Model Estate Account and Model Trust Account attached to that Report and added a Model Charitable Remainder Unitrust Account. All Model Accounts are also now included in the appendix following the Pa.O.C. Rules.
