

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# READER'S GUIDE TO THE PENNSYLVANIA BULLETIN AND THE PENNSYLVANIA CODE

### Pennsylvania Bulletin

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the official gazette of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. It is published every week and includes a table of contents. A cumulative subject matter index is published quarterly.

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* serves several purposes. First, it is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, which is the official codification of agency rules and regulations and other statutorily authorized documents. Changes in the codified text, whether by adoption, amendment, repeal or emergency action must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. Further, agencies proposing changes to the codified text do so in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Second, the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* also publishes: Governor's Executive Orders; State Contract Notices; Summaries of Enacted Statutes; Statewide and Local Court Rules; Attorney General Opinions; Motor Carrier Applications before the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission; Applications and Actions before the Department of Environmental Protection; Orders of the Independent Regulatory Review Commission; and other documents authorized by law.

The text of certain documents published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the only valid and enforceable text. Courts are required to take judicial notice of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

# Adoption, Amendment or Repeal of Regulations

Generally an agency wishing to adopt, amend or repeal regulations must first publish in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking. There are limited instances when the agency may omit the proposal step; it still must publish the adopted version.

The Notice of Proposed Rulemaking contains the full text of the change, the agency contact person, a fiscal note required by law and background for the action.

The agency then allows sufficient time for public comment before taking final action. An adopted proposal must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* before it can take effect. If the agency

wishes to adopt changes to the Notice of Proposed Rulemaking to enlarge the scope, it must repropose.

### Citation to the Pennsylvania Bulletin

Cite material in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* by volume number, a page number and date. Example: Volume 1, *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, page 801, January 9, 1971 (short form: 1 Pa.B. 801 (January 9, 1971)).

### Pennsylvania Code

The *Pennsylvania Code* is the official codification of rules and regulations issued by Commonwealth agencies and other statutorily authorized documents. The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, printing changes as soon as they occur. These changes are then permanently codified by the *Pennsylvania Code Reporter*, a monthly, loose-leaf supplement.

The *Pennsylvania Code* is cited by title number and section number. Example: Title 10 *Pennsylvania Code*, § 1.1 (short form: 10 Pa. Code § 1.1).

Under the *Pennsylvania Code* codification system, each regulation is assigned a unique number by title and section. Titles roughly parallel the organization of Commonwealth government. Title 1 *Pennsylvania Code* lists every agency and its corresponding *Code* title location.

### **How to Find Documents**

Search for your area of interest in the *Pennsylvania Code*. The *Pennsylvania Code* is available at www.pacode.com.

Source Notes give the history of regulations. To see if there have been recent changes, not yet codified, check the List of *Pennsylvania Code* Chapters Affected in the most recent issue of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

A chronological table of the history of *Pennsylva-nia Code* sections may be found at www.legis.state.pa.us/cfdocs/legis/CH/Public/pcde\_index.cfm.

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* also publishes a quarterly List of Pennsylvania Code Sections Affected which lists the regulations in numerical order, followed by the citation to the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* in which the change occurred. The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is available at www.pabulletin.com.

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### **Printing Format**

Material proposed to be added to an existing rule or regulation is printed in **bold face** and material proposed to be deleted from a rule or regulation is enclosed in brackets [ ] and printed in **bold face**. Asterisks indicate ellipsis of *Pennsylvania Code* text retained without change. Proposed new or additional regulations are printed in ordinary style face.

### **Fiscal Notes**

Section 612 of The Administrative Code of 1929 (71 P. S. § 232) requires that the Office of Budget prepare a fiscal note for regulatory actions and administrative procedures of the administrative departments, boards, commissions or authorities receiving money from the State Treasury stating whether the proposed action or procedure causes a loss of revenue or an increase in the cost of programs for the Commonwealth or its political subdivisions; that the fiscal note be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* at the same time as the proposed change is advertised. A fiscal note provides the following information: (1) the designation of the fund out of which the appropriation providing for expenditures under the action or procedure shall be made; (2) the probable cost for the fiscal year the program is implemented; (3) projected cost estimate of the program for each of the 5 succeeding fiscal years; (4) fiscal history of the program for which expenditures are to be made; (5) probable loss of revenue for the fiscal year of its implementation; (6) projected loss of revenue from the program for each of the 5 succeeding fiscal years; (7) line item, if any, of the General Appropriation Act or other appropriation act out of which expenditures or losses of Commonwealth funds shall occur as a result of the action or procedures; (8) recommendation, if any, of the Secretary of the Budget and the reasons therefor.

The required information is published in the foregoing order immediately following the proposed change to which it relates; the omission of an item indicates that the agency text of the fiscal note states that there is no information available with respect thereto. In items (3) and (6) information is set forth for the first through fifth fiscal years; in that order, following the year the program is implemented, which is stated. In item (4) information is set forth for the current and two immediately preceding years, in that order. In item (8) the recommendation, if any, made by the Secretary of Budget is published with the fiscal note. See 4 Pa. Code § 7.231 et seq. Where "no fiscal impact" is published, the statement means no additional cost or revenue loss to the Commonwealth or its local political subdivision is intended.

#### **Effective Dates of Statutes**

The effective dates specified above for laws and appropriation acts were contained in the applicable law or appropriation act. Where no date is specified or where the effective date specified is prior to the date of enactment, the effective date is 60 days after final enactment except for statutes making appropriations or affecting budgets of political subdivisions. See 1 Pa.C.S. §§ 1701—1704 (relating to effective dates of statutes).

### **Advance Copies of Statutes**

Section 1106 of Title 1 of the *Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes* provides that the prothonotaries of each county shall file advance copies of statutes in their offices for public inspection until the *Laws of Pennsylvania* are generally available. Section 2406(h) of The Administrative Code of 1929 provides that the Department of General Services shall distribute advance sheets of the *Laws of Pennsylvania* to each law judge of the courts, to every county and public library of this Commonwealth and to each member of the General Assembly. These copies shall be furnished without charge. The Department shall also mail one copy of each law enacted during any legislative session to any person who pays to it the sum of \$20.

# PROPOSED RULEMAKING

### LIQUOR CONTROL BOARD

[ 40 PA. CODE CH. 7 ]

### Posting Requirements for Extension

The Liquor Control Board (Board), under the authority of section 207(i) of the Liquor Code (47 P. S. § 2-207(i)), proposes to amend § 7.22 (relating to application).

### Summary

The Board's regulations require that an applicant for an extension of a licensed premise post a notice that the application has been filed. Section 7.22 provides that the notice must be posted for 15 days. The 15-day posting period is consistent with the former language of section 403(g) of the Liquor Code (47 P. S. § 4-403(g)).

The act of December 9, 2002 (P. L. 1653, No. 212) amended section 403(g) of the Liquor Code by increasing the time period for the posting of a notice from 15 days to 30 days. Section 403(g) of the Liquor Code now requires a longer posting period than the regulation in § 7.22.

The disparity between section 403(g) of the Liquor Code and § 7.22 sometimes results in frustration and confusion for applicants. Some applicants believe that the notice can be taken down at the expiration of the 15-day period, and that the application can then be approved. However, because of the language in section 403(g) of the Liquor Code, that is not the case.

In addition, those parties who wish to file a protest (protestants) to the application have 30 days from the posting of the notice to do so under § 17.13 (relating to protests/intervention procedure). There can be confusion or misunderstanding on the part of protestants when a notice is removed (erroneously) after only 15 days.

The proposed amendment would resolve these misunderstandings by § 7.22 requiring that a notice of an application for extension of the licensed premises must be posted for at least 30 days.

### Affected Parties

As of July 14, 2015, there are 15,112 active licensees that could be potentially affected by the proposed rule-making, but only if they decide to expand their premises. Since the proposed rulemaking simply aligns the posting period with that which is required under section 403(g) of the Liquor Code, licensees will not be adversely affected.

### Paperwork Requirements

This proposed rulemaking is not expected to affect legal, accounting or consulting procedures and should not require additional reporting, recordkeeping or other paperwork.

### Fiscal Impact

This proposed rulemaking is not expected to have fiscal impact on the Commonwealth, the regulated community or local governments.

### Effective Date

This proposed rulemaking will become effective upon final-form publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Public Comments

Interested persons are invited to submit written comments about the proposed rulemaking to Rodrigo Diaz, Executive Deputy Chief Counsel, or Norina Blynn, Assistant Counsel, Office of Chief Counsel, Liquor Control Board, Room 401, Northwest Office Building, Harrisburg, PA 17124-0001 within 30 days after publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. Comments submitted by facsimile will not be accepted.

Public comments will be posted on the Independent Regulatory Review Commission's (IRRC) web site. Personal information will not be redacted from the public comments received.

### Regulatory Review

Under section 5(a) of the Regulatory Review Act (71 P. S. § 745.5(a)), on September 15, 2015, the Board submitted a copy of this proposed rulemaking and a copy of a Regulatory Analysis Form to IRRC and to the Chairpersons of the House Liquor Control Committee and Senate Committee on Law and Justice. A copy of this material is available to the public upon request.

Under section 5(g) of the Regulatory Review Act, IRRC may convey any comments, recommendations or objections to the proposed rulemaking within 30 days of the close of the public comment period. The comments, recommendations or objections must specify the regulatory review criteria which have not been met. The Regulatory Review Act specifies detailed procedures for review, prior to final publication of the rulemaking, by the Board, the General Assembly and the Governor of comments, recommendations or objections raised.

### PART I. LIQUOR CONTROL BOARD

CHAPTER 7. TRANSFER, EXTENSION, SURRENDER, EXCHANGE AND SUSPENSION OF LICENSES

Subchapter B. EXTENSION OF LICENSES § 7.22. Application.

(c) An applicant for extension of premises shall post, for a period of at least [15] 30 days beginning with the day the application is filed with the Board, in a conspicuous place on the outside of the licensed premises, a notice of application in a form, and size and containing provisions the Board requires concerning the requested extension. Proof of the posting of the notice shall be filed with the Board.

# DELAWARE RIVER BASIN COMMISSION

### **Public Hearing and Business Meeting**

The Delaware River Basin Commission (Commission) will hold a public hearing on Tuesday, November 10, 2015. A business meeting will be held the following month on Wednesday, December 9, 2015. The hearing and business meeting are open to the public and will be held at the Washington Crossing Historic Park Visitor Center, 1112 River Road, Washington Crossing, PA.

Public hearing. The public hearing on November 10, 2015, will begin at 1:30 p.m. Hearing items will include: draft dockets for the withdrawals, discharges and other water-related projects subject to the Commission's review; and a resolution authorizing the Executive Director to enter into an agreement with the University of Delaware for an analysis of water quality data collected by the University on the Cape May—Lewes Ferry, which will be used by the Commission and the United States Army Corps of Engineers to refine water quality models of the Delaware Estuary and Delaware Bay.

Written comments on matters scheduled for hearing on November 10, 2015, will be accepted through 5 p.m. on November 12, 2015, the next business day following the Veterans' Day holiday. After the hearing on all scheduled matters has been completed, and as time allows, an opportunity for open public comment (formerly known as "public dialogue") will also be provided.

The public is advised to check the Commission's web site periodically prior to the hearing date, as items scheduled for hearing may be postponed if additional time is deemed necessary to complete the Commission's review, and items may be added up to 10 days prior to the hearing date. In reviewing docket descriptions, the public is also asked to be aware that project details commonly change in the course of the Commission's review, which is ongoing.

- 1. Brookhaven Borough, D-1966-096 CP-4. An application to renew the approval of the applicant's existing 0.192 million gallons per day (mgd) wastewater treatment plant (WWTP) and its discharge. The WWTP will continue to discharge to Chester Creek at River Mile 82.93—4.3 (Delaware River—Chester Creek) in Brookhaven Borough, Delaware County, PA.
- 2. Jim Thorpe Borough, D-1981-071 CP-5. An application to renew the approval of an existing surface water withdrawal of up to 13.175 million gallons per month (mgm) from an existing intake on Mauch Chunk Creek and up to 12.4 mgm of groundwater from existing Wells Nos. 1 and 4 for use in the applicant's West Side and East Side public water systems. The docket combines two previous Commission approvals with a decrease in groundwater allocation. The wells are completed in the Mauch Chunk Formation, and the wells and surface water intake are located in the Mauch Chunk Creek-Lehigh River Watershed in the Borough of Jim Thorpe, Carbon County, PA within the drainage area of the section of the main stem Delaware River known as the Lower Delaware, which the Commission has classified as Special Protection Waters.
- 3. J.G. Townsend, Jr. & Company, D-1989-048-4. An application to renew the approval of the existing importa-

tion of up to 15.5 mgm from the Chesapeake Bay Basin from existing Wells Nos. 1 and 5 to supply water to the applicant's vegetable processing facility. The applicant also seeks to renew the approval to withdraw up to 15.5 mgm of groundwater from five groundwater sources. The requested allocation is not an increase from the previous allocation. The project's existing groundwater withdrawals are approved by the Delaware Department of Natural Resources and Environmental Control (DNREC) and will continue to be regulated by DNREC in accordance with the Administrative Agreement between the Commission and the State of Delaware. The wells are located in the Savannah Ditch Watershed in the Town of Georgetown, Sussex County, DE.

- 4. Hackettstown Municipal Utilities Authority, D-1991-030 CP-3. An application to renew the approval of the applicant's existing 3.39 mgd water pollution control plant and its discharge, as well as to approve the demolition of the existing equalization basin and its related appurtenances. Treated effluent will continue to be discharged to the Musconetcong River at River Mile 174.6—28.3 (Delaware River—Musconetcong River) by means of Outfall No. DSN002A, within the drainage area of the section of the main stem Delaware River known as the Lower Delaware, which the Commission has classified as Special Protection Waters, in Washington Township, Morris County, NJ.
- 5. Bucks County, Neshaminy Manor, D-1991-036 CP-3. An application to renew the approval of an existing groundwater withdrawal (GWD) of up to 6.2 mgm to supply the applicant's Neshaminy Manor Complex from existing Wells Nos. 4 and 5. Well No. 4 is completed in the Lockatong Formation and Well No. 5 is completed in the Stockton Formation. The requested allocation is not an increase from the previous allocation. The wells are located in the Commission's designated Ground Water Protected Area in the Neshaminy Creek Watershed in Doylestown Township, Bucks County, PA.
- 6. Upper Gwynedd Township, D-1991-088 CP-8. An application to renew approval of the applicant's existing 6.5 mgd WWTP and its discharge. The WWTP will continue to discharge to Wissahickon Creek, which is a tributary of the Schuylkill River, at River Mile 92.5—12.8—12.7 (Delaware River—Schuylkill River—Wissahickon Creek) in Upper Gwynedd Township, Montgomery County, PA.
- 7. Jackson Township Municipal Utilities Authority, D-1994-018 CP-3. An application to renew the approval of an existing import of up to 0.792 mgd of groundwater from the Atlantic Basin from existing Well No. 14 to supply water to the applicant's Six Flags Great Adventure Theme Park Complex. The application will also renew the approval of an existing groundwater withdrawal of up to 30 mgm to the applicant's theme park complex from existing Wells Nos. 7, 10 and ASR-12, completed in the Upper Potomac-Raritan-Magothy Formation. The requested allocation is not an increase from the previous allocation. The project is located in the Crosswicks Creek Watershed in Jackson Township, Monmouth County, NJ.
- 8. Pennsylvania American Water Company, D-1999-030 CP-5. An application to renew the approval of an existing GWD of up to 81.778 mgm to supply the applicant's public water supply distribution system from existing Wells Nos. G1, G5, G7, G8, G9, G9A, GL2A, DG3, DG4, DG6, DG11, DG12A and DG13. Wells Nos. G1, G5 and G7

- are completed in Hornblende Gneiss; Wells Nos. G8, G9 and 9A are completed in a fanglomerate aquifer and Wells Nos. GL2A, DG3, DG4, DG6, DG11, DG12A and DG13 are completed in the Brunswick Formation. The requested allocation is not an increase from the previous allocation. The project wells are located in the Trout Run, Schuylkill River and Manatawny watersheds in Amity, Exeter and Lower Alsace Townships, Berks County, PA.
- 9. Fleischmanns Village, D-2002-033 CP-2. An application to renew approval of the applicant's existing 0.16 mgd WWTP and its discharge. The WWTP will continue to discharge to Bush Kill, which is a tributary of Dry Brook, which is a tributary of the East Branch Delaware River, at River Mile 330.7—56.8—1.2—4.4 (Delaware River—East Branch Delaware River—Dry Brook—Bush Kill) and is located within the drainage area of the section of the main stem Delaware River known as the Upper Delaware, which the Commission has classified as Special Protection Waters, in the Village of Fleischmanns, Delaware County, NY.
- 10. Tuthill Corporation & Aquashicola-Little Gap, Inc., D-2008-023-4. An application to renew the approval of the applicant's existing 0.06 mgd Blue Mountain Ski Area WWTP and its discharge, as well as its expansion to 0.28 mgd. Treated effluent will continue to be discharged to Aquashicola Creek at River Mile 183.66—36.32—5.73 (Delaware River—Lehigh River—Aquashicola Creek) by means of Outfall No. 002, within the drainage area of the section of the main stem Delaware River known as the Lower Delaware, which the Commission has classified as Special Protection Waters, in Lower Towamensing Township, Carbon County, PA.
- 11. Kinsley Group Family, LP, D-2010-005-3. An application to renew the approval of the applicant's existing 0.02 mgd Kinsley Shopping Center WWTP and its discharge. The Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (PADEP) and the Commission have based effluent limitations on a discharge flow of 0.0177 mgd. Treated effluent will continue to be land-discharged to grade seepage beds in the Weir Creek Watershed near River Mile 183.66—40.88—6.30—6.51—7.40—2.40 (Delaware River—Lehigh River—Pohopoco Creek—Beltzville Reservoir—Pohopoco Creek—Weir Creek), within the drainage area of the section of the main stem Delaware River known as the Lower Delaware, which the Commission has classified as Special Protection Waters, in Chestnuthill Township, Monroe County, PA.
- 12. Reading Area Water Authority, D-2010-009 CP-2. An application to renew the approval of the applicant's existing 35 mgd Maiden Creek water filtration plant (WFP) and its discharge of up to 4.3 mgd of filter backwash, pump seal water, chlorine analyses and diesel generator cooling water. The PADEP and the Commission have based effluent limits on a discharge flow of 3.26 mgd. Treated effluent will continue to be discharged to Maiden Creek at River Mile 92.47—85.63—0.24 (Delaware River—Schuylkill River—Maiden Creek) by means of Outfall No. 001, in Ontelaunee Township, Berks County, PA.
- 13. Spring City Borough, D-1974-061 CP-5. An application to renew the approval of the applicant's existing 0.6 mgd WWTP and its discharge. The applicant has also requested approval to expand the WWTP to 0.787 mgd. Treated effluent will continue to be discharged to the Schuylkill River at River Mile 92.47—41.3 (Delaware River—Schuylkill River) by means of Outfall No. 001, in Spring City Borough, Chester County, PA.

14. Chalfont-New Britain Township Joint Sewage Authority, D-1999-063 CP-3. An application to renew the approval of the applicant's existing WWTP and its discharge, and to approve a rerate of the hydraulic capacity of the WWTP from 6.0 mgd to 7.0 mgd. No modifications to the WWTP are proposed; the applicant has performed design calculations demonstrating that the existing WWTP can treat up to 7.0 mgd. The WWTP will remain at an average annual design flow of 4.625 mgd and will continue to discharge to Neshaminy Creek at River Mile 115.63—37.4 (Delaware River—Neshaminy Creek) in Doylestown Township, Bucks County, PA.

- 15. Artesian Water Company (AWC), D-2002-034 CP-4. An application to renew the approval of an existing import project of up to 3.0 mgd from the Chesapeake Bay Basin from the Old County Road, Chesapeake City Road and Eastern States well fields, and up to 3.0 mgd from the Susquehanna River Basin from an interconnection with Chester Water Authority to augment water supply to the applicant's public water supply system. The applicant also seeks approval of new Well Broad Run PA for inclusion in the AWC public water supply system and renewal of the approval to withdraw up to 612.83 mgm of groundwater for the applicant's public water supply distribution system. AWC is not requesting an increase in groundwater withdrawal allocation. The water supply system and wellfields are located in New Castle County, DE and New Garden Township, Chester County, PA.
- 16. Union Lake Hotel, Inc., D-2012-018-2. An application to renew the approval of the applicant's existing 0.06 mgd Camp Equinunk WWTP and its discharge. The applicant has also requested approval to modify the WWTP without expanding its capacity. The WWTP will continue to discharge treated effluent to an unnamed tributary (UNT) of Little Equinunk Creek at River Mile 312.7—3.64—2.37 (Delaware River—Little Equinunk Creek—UNT) by means of Outfall No. 001, within the drainage area of the section of the main stem Delaware River known as the Upper Delaware, which the Commission has classified as Special Protection Waters, in Manchester Township, Wayne County, PA.
- 17. Pennsylvania American Water Company, D-2015-015 CP-1. An application to approve a new intermittent discharge of up to 1.93 mgd of process wastewater from the applicant's existing 18.0 mgd Norristown WFP. The project consists of constructing a new outfall to the Schuylkill River and modifying the existing WFP facilities to allow for the intermittent discharge of the clarifier supernatant. The WFP currently recycles the clarifier supernatant back to the head of the WFP treatment system. The WFP will discharge to the Schuylkill River at River Mile 92.47—24.5 (Delaware River—Schuylkill River) in the Borough of Norristown, Montgomery County, PA.
- 18. Sunoco Pipeline, LP, D-2015-018-1. An application to approve the construction of the Delaware River Basin portion of the applicant's Pennsylvania Pipeline Project, including one new 20-inch diameter natural gas liquid (NGL) pipeline and one 16-inch diameter NGL pipeline constructed parallel to one another within a single 49.8-mile long right-of-way (ROW); one 2.3 mile long, up to 20-inch diameter lateral pipeline; and nine above-ground facilities. The project, taken together with existing Sunoco Pipeline LP pipeline systems, will provide NGL transportation of up to 700,000 barrels per day total, including the existing and proposed pipelines from the Utica and Marcellus Shale formations for both domestic and foreign markets. The new 2.3-mile long lateral pipeline will be constructed within a new 75-foot wide construction (50-foot wide permanent) ROW. The docket also constitutes a special use permit in accordance with Section 6.3.4 of the Commission's *Flood Plain Regulations*. The project is located within multiple municipalities in Berks, Chester and Delaware Counties, PA.

19. Public Service Electric & Gas, D-2015-019-1. An application to approve the applicant's new temporary 0.35 mgd industrial wastewater treatment plant (IWTP) and its discharge. The IWTP will treat supernatant from a temporary sediment dewatering project utilizing a filtration treatment system consisting of dual train filter bags, Organoclay vessels, and granluar activated carbon. The treated effluent from the IWTP will discharge to Water Quality Zone 3 of the Delaware River at River Mile 98.4, in the City of Camden, Camden County, NJ.

Persons wishing to comment on NPDES applications are invited to submit statements to the contact office noted before the application within 30 days from the date of this public notice. Persons wishing to comment on WQM permit applications are invited to submit statements to the office noted before the application within 15 days from the date of this public notice. Comments received within the respective comment periods will be considered in the final determinations regarding the applications. A comment submittal should include the name, address and telephone number of the writer and a concise statement to inform the Department of the exact basis of a comment and the relevant facts upon which it is based.

Acknowledgment of Notices of Intent to Remediate Submitted under the Land Recycling and Environmental Remediation Standards Act (35 P.S. §§ **6026.101—6026.907**)

Sections 302-305 of the Land Recycling and Environmental Remediation Standards Act (act) (35 P.S. §§ 6026.302—6026.305) require the Department to publish in the Pennsylvania Bulletin an acknowledgment noting receipt of Notices of Intent to Remediate. An acknowledgment of the receipt of a Notice of Intent to Remediate is used to identify a site where a person proposes to, or has been required to, respond to a release of a regulated substance at a site. A person intending to use the background standard, Statewide health standard, the site-specific standard or intend to remediate a site as a special industrial area shall file a Notice of Intent to Remediate with the Department. A Notice of Intent to Remediate filed with the Department provides a brief description of the location of the site, a list of known or suspected contaminants at the site, the proposed remediation measures for the site and a description of the intended future use of the site. A person who demonstrates attainment of one or a combination of cleanup standards or receives approval of a special industrial area remediation identified under the act will be relieved of further liability for the remediation of the site for contamination identified in reports submitted to and approved by the Department. Furthermore, the person shall not be subject to citizen suits or other contribution actions brought by responsible persons not participating in the remediation.

Under sections 304(n)(1)(ii) and 305(c)(2) of the act, there is a 30-day public and municipal comment period for sites proposed for remediation using a site-specific standard, in whole or in part, and for sites remediated as a special industrial area. This period begins when a summary of the Notice of Intent to Remediate is published in a newspaper of general circulation in the area of the site. For the following site, proposed for remediation to a site-specific standard or as a special industrial area, the municipality, within which the site is located, may request to be involved in the development of the remediation and reuse plans for the site if the request is made within 30 days of the date specified as follows. During this comment period, the municipality may request that the person identified as the remediator of the site develop and implement a public involvement plan. Requests to be involved and comments should be directed to the remediator of the site.

# PLAN APPROVAL AND OPERATING PERMIT APPLICATIONS

The Department has developed an "integrated" plan approval, State Operating Permit and Title V Operating Permit program. This integrated approach is designed to make the permitting process more efficient for the Department, the regulated community and the general public. This approach allows the owner or operator of a facility to submit permitting documents relevant to its application for all sources related to a facility or a proposed project, affords an opportunity for public input, and provides for a decision on the issuance of the necessary permits.

The Department received applications for Plan Approvals or Operating Permits from the following facilities.

Copies of the application, the Department's analysis, all pertinent documents used in the evaluation of the appli-

cation and subsequently prepared proposed plan approvals/operating permits are available for public review during normal business hours at the appropriate Department Regional Office. Appointments for scheduling a review must be made by calling the appropriate Department Regional Office. The address and phone number of the Regional Office is listed before the application notices.

Persons wishing to file a written protest or provide comments or additional information, which they believe should be considered prior to the issuance of a permit, may submit the information to the Department's Regional Office. A 30-day comment period from the date of this publication will exist for the submission of comments, protests and information. Each submission must contain the name, address and telephone number of the person submitting the comments, identification of the proposed Plan Approval/Operating Permit including the permit number and a concise statement regarding the relevancy of the information or objections to issuance of the permit.

A person wishing to request a hearing may do so during the 30-day comment period. A public hearing may be held, if the Department, in its discretion, decides that a hearing is warranted based on the information received. Persons submitting comments or requesting a hearing will be notified of the decision to hold a hearing by publication in the newspaper, the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* or by telephone, when the Department determines this type of notification is sufficient. Requests for a public hearing and any relevant information should be directed to the appropriate Department Regional Office.

Permits issued to the owners or operators of sources subject to 25 Pa. Code Chapter 127, Subchapter D or E, or located within a Title V facility or subject to 25 Pa. Code § 129.51(a) or permits issued for sources with limitations on their potential to emit used to avoid otherwise applicable Federal requirements may be submitted to the United States Environmental Protection Agency for review and approval as a revision to the State Implementation Plan. Final Plan Approvals and Operating Permits will contain terms and conditions to ensure that the sources are constructed and operating in compliance with applicable requirements in the Air Pollution Control Act (35 P. S. §§ 4001—4015), 25 Pa. Code Chapters 121-145, the Federal Clean Air Act (42 U.S.C.A. §§ 7401—7671q) and regulations adopted under the Federal Clean Air Act.

  - CT 01—Alky Cooling Tower #2: 10.49 TPY
  - CT 02—FCC Cooling Tower: 24.81 TPY
  - CT 03—Crude Cooling Tower: 32.08 TPY
- 2. The annual average VOC concentration in the recirculating cooling water shall not exceed 31 ppmw calculated monthly and averaged on a 12-month rolling period.
- 3. The permittee shall monitor VOC concentration in the recirculating cooling water monthly using a leak action level defined as a total strippable hydrocarbon concentration (as methane) in the stripping gas of 6.2 ppmv.

To assure compliance with the LAER and applicable Federal and state standards, the applicable requirements of 40 CFR Part 63, Subpart CC have been placed into the plan approval for these cooling towers. The requirements include testing, monitoring, recordkeeping, reporting and

work practice standards for identifying leaks of total strippable volatile organic compounds (VOC) from each heat exchange system.

#### MINING ACTIVITY NPDES DRAFT PERMITS

This notice provides information about applications for a new, amended or renewed NPDES permits associated with mining activity (coal or noncoal) permits. Discharges from noncoal mines located in some geologic settings (for example, in the coal fields) may require additional water quality based effluent limits. If additional effluent limits are needed for an NPDES permit associated with a noncoal mining permit, then the permit description specifies the parameters.

In addition to BAT or WQBEL limits, coal and noncoal NPDES permits establish effluent limitations in the form of implemented Best Management Practices (BMPs) identified in the associated Erosion and Sedimentation Plan, the Reclamation Plan and the NPDES permit application. These BMPs restrict the rates and quantities of associated pollutants from being discharged into surface waters in this Commonwealth.

More restrictive effluent limitations, restrictions on discharge volume or restrictions on the extent of mining that may occur are incorporated into an NPDES permit when necessary for compliance with water quality standards and antidegradation requirements (in accordance with 25 Pa. Code Chapters 91—96).

The procedures for determining the final effluent limits, using a mass-balance equation or model, are found in Technical Guidance Document 563-2112-115, Developing National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Permits for Mining Activities. ### Establishment of Minimum Standard Requirements for Sexual Assault Evidence Collection

Section 3 of the Sexual Assault Testing and Evidence Collection Act (act) (35 P.S. § 10172.3) establishes a Statewide sexual assault evidence collection program to be administered by the Department of Health (Department). Under this program the Department is to consult

with the Pennsylvania Coalition Against Rape (PCAR) and the State Police to develop and review on a scheduled basis the minimum standard requirements for all rape kits used in hospitals and health care facilities in this Commonwealth, to test and approve commercially available rape kits for use in this Commonwealth and establish a program to train appropriate personnel in the correct use and application of rape kits.

Under the act, the Department, in consultation with PCAR and the State Police, established a Sexual Assault Evidence Collection Committee (Committee). The Committee included representatives of the Department, PCAR, the State Police, the Hospital and Healthsystem Association of Pennsylvania, forensic nurse examiners, members of sexual assault response teams and law enforcement.

In accordance with the act, the SAEC formulated minimum standard requirements for sexual assault evidence collection in this Commonwealth. Beginning October 1, 2008, the minimum standards requirements established by the SAEC should be observed by all health care facilities and child advocacy centers in this Commonwealth, and these facilities and centers should meet or exceed those minimum standard requirements.

Under 28 Pa. Code § 117.52(a)(1) (relating to minimum requirements for sexual assault emergency services), all hospitals providing sexual assault emergency services under 28 Pa. Code §§ 117.51—117.58 (relating to sexual assault victim emergency services) "shall utilize a rape kit that complies with the minimum standard requirements developed by the Department or that is otherwise approved by the Department . . . under the [act]." Accordingly, this publication shall serve as notice to those hospitals of the minimum standard requirements developed by the Department under the act.

As of October 1, 2015, the following minimum standard requirements for sexual assault evidence collection are in effect:

On July 1, 1988, the Department of Human Services (Department) implemented a disproportionate share payment system. The Department is required to annually publish the names of each inpatient acute care general hospital, rehabilitation hospital and private psychiatric hospital qualifying for a disproportionate share payment and their respective disproportionate share payment percentage as set forth in 55 Pa. Code §§ 1151.54(i), 1163.67(k) and 1163.459(j) (relating to disproportionate share payments).

A. Disproportionate Share for Acute Care General Hospitals, Rehabilitation Hospitals and Private Psychiatric Hospitals.

The following lists identify the inpatient acute care general hospitals, psychiatric units, drug and alcohol units, and rehabilitation units of acute care general hospitals, rehabilitation hospitals, private psychiatric hospitals, and private drug and alcohol hospitals eligible for disproportionate share payments for the period of July 1, 2014, through June 30, 2015, and their respective payment percentages. C. Additional Class of Disproportionate Share Payments

Effective March 1, 1998, the Department established a new class of disproportionate share payments to hospitals which render uncompensated care and which the Department has determined are experiencing significant revenue loss as a result of MA Program revisions under the act of May 16, 1996 (P. L. 175, No. 35).

Effective January 15, 1999, the Department established a new class of disproportionate share payments to include a Charity Care component of the Community Access Fund. A disproportionate share payment will be made to qualifying hospitals based on each hospital's percentage of charity care cost to the total charity care costs of all qualifying hospitals. The Department also established a disproportionate share payment for those hospitals which the Department has determined advanced its goal of enhanced access to multiple types of medical care in economically distressed areas of this Commonwealth.

- (6) All entries shall be subject to verification by the Pennsylvania Lottery.
- (7) The Pennsylvania Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to disqualify an entrant found to be tampering with the operation of the Game or to be acting in violation of these rules or applicable law.
- (8) The Game is governed by the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Applicable laws and regulations apply.
- (9) Prizes must be claimed within 1 year of the drawing date of the drawing in which the prize was won. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$1,000,001 and not exceeding \$10,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$10,000. A Lottery retailer is entitled only to the largest bonus for which he qualifies on a winning ticket. A bonus will be initiated for payment after the instant ticket is claimed and validated. A bonus will not be awarded to a Lottery retailer that sells a nonwinning Pennsylvania Lottery instant ticket used to enter a Pennsylvania Lottery second-chance drawing or promotion that is subsequently selected to win a prize.
- 13. Unclaimed Prize Money: For a period of 1 year from the announced close of Pennsylvania \$100,000 Wish List, prize money from winning Pennsylvania \$100,000 Wish List instant lottery game tickets will be retained by the Secretary for payment to the persons entitled thereto. - (vi) All entries received after 11:59:59 p.m. November 26, 2015, through 11:59:59 p.m. December 3, 2015, will be entered into Countdown Drawing #5, held between December 4, 2015 and December 8, 2015.
- (vii) All entries received after 11:59:59 p.m. December 3, 2015, through 11:59:59 p.m. December 10, 2015, will be entered into Countdown Drawing #6, held between December 11, 2015 and December 15, 2015.

- (5) The Lottery will conduct eleven Game drawings from among all the entries received during the applicable entry period(s) as described in section 9(c). The first entry selected in each Game drawing will be the winning entry. The entrant who submitted the winning entry in each weekly Countdown Drawing shall be entitled to a prize of \$1,000. The entrant who submitted the winning entry in the Grand Prize Drawing shall be entitled to a prize of \$100,000, less required federal income tax withholding. All prizes will be paid as a lump-sum cash payment.
- (6) The number of winning entries to be selected for each Game drawing will be posted to the Pennsylvania Lottery's publicly accessible website.

- (3) If any discrepancy exists between these rules and any material describing the Game, these rules shall govern.
- (4) Employees of the Pennsylvania Lottery, MARC Advertising, Scientific Games International Inc., MDI Entertainment, LLC, and their subcontractors, or a spouse, child, brother, sister or parent residing as a member of the same household in the principle place of residence of any such person are not eligible to participate in the Game. Offer void where prohibited or restricted.
- (5) The Pennsylvania Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to cancel or suspend the Game and change these rules if the Game cannot be conducted as planned due to errors in these rules or advertising, unauthorized intervention, tampering, fraud, technical errors, viruses, worms, bugs, or any other cause beyond the control of the Pennsylvania Lottery that, in the Pennsylvania Lottery's sole judgment, could corrupt or impair the administration, security, fairness, integrity, or proper conduct of the Game.
- (6) All entries shall be subject to verification by the Pennsylvania Lottery.
- (7) The Pennsylvania Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to disqualify an entrant found to be tampering with the operation of the Game or to be acting in violation of these rules or applicable law.
- (8) The Game is governed by the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Applicable laws and regulations apply.
- (9) Prizes must be claimed within 1 year of the drawing date of the drawing in which the prize was won. If no claim is made within 1 year of the drawing date of the drawing in which the prize was won, the right of an entrant to claim the prize won, if any, will expire and the

- prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided by statute.
- (10) Final determination of winners will be made by the Secretary, whose judgment will be final and binding.
- (11) A prize awarded in the Game to a person who dies before receiving the prize shall be paid according to 61 Pa. Code § 811.16 (relating to prizes payable after death of a prize winner).

Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$1,000,001 and not exceeding \$10,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$10,000. A Lottery retailer is entitled only to the largest bonus for which he qualifies on a winning ticket. A bonus will be initiated for payment after the instant ticket is claimed and validated. A bonus will not be awarded to a Lottery retailer that sells a nonwinning Pennsylvania Lottery instant ticket used to enter a Pennsylvania Lottery second-chance drawing or promotion that is subsequently selected to win a prize.
- 12. Unclaimed Prize Money: For a period of 1 year from the announced close of Pennsylvania Doughman Doubler instant lottery game, prize money from winning Pennsylvania Doughman Doubler instant lottery game tickets will be retained by the Secretary for payment to the persons entitled thereto. If no claim is made within 1 year of the announced close of the Pennsylvania Doughman Doubler instant lottery game, the right of a ticket holder to claim the prize represented by the ticket, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided for by statute.
- 13. Governing Law: In purchasing a ticket, the customer agrees to comply with and abide by the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314), 61 Pa. Code Part V (relating to State Lotteries) and the provisions contained in this notice.
- 14. Termination of the Game: The Secretary may announce a termination date, after which no further tickets

from this game may be sold. The announcement will be disseminated through media used to advertise or promote Pennsylvania Doughman Doubler or through normal communications methods.

The "QUICK CASH" area consists of a "QUICK \$10" area, a "QUICK \$25" area and a "QUICK \$50" area. Each "GAME" is played separately. Each "QUICK CASH" area is played separately. The play symbols and their captions, located in each of the "GAME" areas are: Bell (BELL) symbol, Stocking (STOC) symbol, Drum (DRUM) symbol, Snowflake (SNFK) symbol, Ski (SKI) symbol, Candy Cane (CNDY) symbol, Cookie (COKIE) symbol, Hat (HAT) symbol, String of Lights (LGTS) symbol, Earmuff (ERMF) symbol, Mitten (MITN) symbol, Ornament (ORNM) symbol, Star (STAR) symbol, Wreath (WRTH) symbol, Sled (SLED) symbol, Tree (TREE) symbol, Holly (HLLY) symbol, Jingle Bell (JNGL) symbol, TOYS (TOYS) symbol, and a Reindeer (DEER) symbol. The play symbols and their captions located in the "QUICK \$10" area are: Snowman (TRY AGAIN) symbol, Scarf (TRY AGAIN) symbol, Gingerbread House (TRY AGAIN) symbol, Cocoa (NO BONUS) symbol, Candle (NO BONUS) symbol, Horn (NO BONUS) symbol, and a \$10 Burst (WIN10) symbol. The play symbols and their captions located in the "QUICK \$25" area are: Angel (TRY AGAIN) symbol, Goggle (TRY AGAIN) symbol, Cup (TRY AGAIN) symbol, Icicle (NO BONUS) symbol, Ice Skate (NO BONUS) symbol, Nutcracker (NO BONUS) symbol, and a \$25 Burst (WIN25) symbol. The play symbols and their captions located in the "QUICK \$50" area are: Igloo (TRY AGAIN) symbol, Fire (TRY AGAIN) symbol, Gift (TRY AGAIN) symbol, Calendar (NO BONUS) symbol, Jacket (NO BONUS) symbol, Lantern (NO BONUS) symbol, and a \$50 Burst (WIN50) symbol.
- 4. Prize Symbols: The prize symbols and their captions, located in the play area are:  $\$3^{.00}$  (THR DOL),  $\$5^{.00}$  (FIV DOL),  $\$10^{.00}$  (TEN DOL),  $\$15^{.00}$  (FIFTN),  $\$25^{.00}$  (TWY FIV),  $\$50^{.00}$  (FIFTY), \$100 (ONE HUN), \$500 (FIV HUN), \$1,000 (ONE THO), \$5,000 (FIV THO), and \$50,000 (FTY THO).
- 5. *Prizes*: The prizes that can be won in this game are: \$3, \$5, \$10, \$15, \$25, \$50, \$100, \$500, \$1,000, \$5,000, and \$50,000. The prize that can be won in the "QUICK \$10"

- (e) Holders of tickets with three like play symbols in the same "GAME," and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in the "PRIZE" area to the right of that "GAME," on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.
- (f) Holders of tickets with three like play symbols in the same "GAME," and a prize symbol of \$50.00 (FIFTY) appears in the "PRIZE" area to the right of that "GAME," on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$50.
- (g) Holders of tickets with a \$50 Burst (WIN50) symbol in the "QUICK \$50" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$50.
- (h) Holders of tickets with three like play symbols in the same "GAME," and a prize symbol of  $\$25^{.00}$  (TWY FIV) appears in the "PRIZE" area to the right of that "GAME," on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$25.
- (i) Holders of tickets with a \$25 Burst (WIN25) symbol in the "QUICK \$25" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$25.

- (5) The Lottery will conduct eleven Game drawings from among all the entries received during the applicable entry period(s) as described in section 10(c). A bonus will not be awarded to a Lottery retailer that sells a nonwinning Pennsylvania Lottery instant ticket used to enter a Pennsylvania Lottery second-chance drawing or promotion that is subsequently selected to win a prize.

This prize shall be paid as a one-time, lump-sum cash payment.

- (z) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$40.00 (FORTY) appears in the "prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$40.
- (aa) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols is a Snowflake (FLAKE) symbol, and a prize symbol of \$40.00 (FORTY) appears in the "prize" area under the Snowflake (FLAKE) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$40.

- (4) Employees of the Pennsylvania Lottery, MARC Advertising, Scientific Games International Inc., MDI Entertainment, LLC, and their subcontractors, or a spouse, child, brother, sister or parent residing as a member of the same household in the principle place of residence of any such person are not eligible to participate in the Game. Offer void where prohibited or restricted.
- (5) The Pennsylvania Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to cancel or suspend the Game and change these rules if the Game cannot be conducted as planned

- due to errors in these rules or advertising, unauthorized intervention, tampering, fraud, technical errors, viruses, worms, bugs, or any other cause beyond the control of the Pennsylvania Lottery that, in the Pennsylvania Lottery's sole judgment, could corrupt or impair the administration, security, fairness, integrity, or proper conduct of the Game.
- (6) All entries shall be subject to verification by the Pennsylvania Lottery.
- (7) The Pennsylvania Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to disqualify an entrant found to be tampering with the operation of the Game or to be acting in violation of these rules or applicable law.
- (8) The Game is governed by the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Applicable laws and regulations apply.
- (9) Prizes must be claimed within 1 year of the drawing date of the drawing in which the prize was won. If no claim is made within 1 year of the drawing date of the drawing in which the prize was won, the right of an entrant to claim the prize won, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided by statute.

A Lottery retailer is entitled only to the largest bonus for which he qualifies on a winning ticket. A bonus will be initiated for payment after the instant ticket is claimed and validated. A bonus will not be awarded to a Lottery retailer that sells a nonwinning Pennsylvania Lottery instant ticket used to enter a Pennsylvania Lottery second-chance drawing or promotion that is subsequently selected to win a prize.
- 13. Unclaimed Prize Money: For a period of 1 year from the announced close of Pennsylvania Holiday Millionaire, prize money from winning Pennsylvania Holiday Millionaire instant lottery game tickets will be retained by the Secretary for payment to the persons entitled thereto. If no claim is made within 1 year of the announced close of the Pennsylvania Holiday Millionaire instant lottery game, the right of a ticket holder to claim the prize represented by the ticket, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided for by statute.

### Pennsylvania The Perfect Gift Instant Lottery Game

Under the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314) and 61 Pa. Code § 819.203 (relating to notice of instant game rules), the Secretary of Revenue hereby provides public notice of the rules for the following instant lottery game:

- 1. Name: The name of the game is Pennsylvania The Perfect Gift.
- 2. *Price*: The price of a Pennsylvania The Perfect Gift instant lottery game ticket is \$1.

- (e) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols is a Tree (WINALL) symbol and a prize symbol of  $$40^{.00}$  (FORTY) appears in two of the "prize" areas, and a prize symbol of  $$10^{.00}$  (TEN DOL) appears in two of the "prize" areas shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.

- (f) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches the "WINNING NUMBER" play symbol and a prize symbol of \$50.00 (FIFTY) appears in the "prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$50.

- (i) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches the "WINNING NUMBER" play symbol and a prize symbol of  $\$20^{.00}$  (TWENTY) appears in the "prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$20.

- (r) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches the "WINNING NUMBER" play symbol and a prize symbol of FREE (TICKET) appears in the "prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of one Pennsylvania The Perfect Gift instant game ticket or one Pennsylvania Lottery instant game ticket of equivalent sale price which is currently on sale.

- (4) Employees of the Pennsylvania Lottery, MARC Advertising, Scientific Games International Inc., MDI Entertainment, LLC, and their subcontractors, or a spouse, child, brother, sister or parent residing as a member of the same household in the principle place of residence of any such person are not eligible to participate in the Game. Offer void where prohibited or restricted.
- (5) The Pennsylvania Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to cancel or suspend the Game and change these rules if the Game cannot be conducted as planned due to errors in these rules or advertising, unauthorized intervention, tampering, fraud, technical errors, viruses, worms, bugs, or any other cause beyond the control of the Pennsylvania Lottery that, in the Pennsylvania Lottery's sole judgment, could corrupt or impair the administration, security, fairness, integrity, or proper conduct of the Game.
- (6) All entries shall be subject to verification by the Pennsylvania Lottery.
- (7) The Pennsylvania Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to disqualify an entrant found to be tampering with the operation of the Game or to be acting in violation of these rules or applicable law.
- (8) The Game is governed by the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Applicable laws and regulations apply.
- (9) Prizes must be claimed within 1 year of the drawing date of the drawing in which the prize was won. If no claim is made within 1 year of the drawing date of the drawing in which the prize was won, the right of an entrant to claim the prize won, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided by statute.

A Lottery retailer is entitled only to the largest bonus for which he qualifies on a winning ticket. A bonus will be initiated for payment after the instant ticket is claimed and validated. A bonus will not be awarded to a Lottery retailer that sells a nonwinning Pennsylvania Lottery instant ticket used to enter a Pennsylvania Lottery second-chance drawing or promotion that is subsequently selected to win a prize.
- 13. Unclaimed Prize Money: For a period of 1 year from the announced close of Pennsylvania The Perfect Gift, prize money from winning Pennsylvania The Perfect Gift instant lottery game tickets will be retained by the Secretary for payment to the persons entitled thereto. If no claim is made within 1 year of the announced close of the Pennsylvania The Perfect Gift instant lottery game, the right of a ticket holder to claim the prize represented by the ticket, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided for by statute.

Unclaimed Prize Money: For a period of 1 year from the announced close of Pennsylvania Season's Greetings '15, prize money from winning Pennsylvania Season's Greetings '15 instant lottery game tickets will be retained by the Secretary for payment to the persons entitled thereto. If no claim is made within 1 year of the announced close of the Pennsylvania Season's Greetings '15 instant lottery game, the right of a ticket holder to claim the prize represented by the ticket, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided for by statute.
- 14. Governing Law: In purchasing a ticket, the customer agrees to comply with and abide by the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314), 61

Pa. Code Part V (relating to State Lotteries) and the provisions contained in this notice.

15. Termination of the Game: The Secretary may announce a termination date, after which no further tickets from this game may be sold. The announcement will be disseminated through media used to advertise or promote Pennsylvania Season's Greetings '15 or through normal communications methods.

> Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board— Responsible Alcohol Management Program Regulation No. 54-79 (#3093)

On March 11, 2015, the Independent Regulatory Review Commission (Commission) received this proposed regulation from the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board (Board). This rulemaking amends 40 Pa. Code § 5.211. The proposed regulation was published in the April 11, 2015 Pennsylvania Bulletin with a 30-day public comment period. The final-form regulation was submitted to the Commission on August 20, 2015.

This final-form rulemaking allows third parties to create their own training programs for alcohol education purposes and to submit them to the Board's Bureau of Alcohol Education for approval.

We have determined this regulation is consistent with the statutory authority of the Board (47 P. S. §§ 2-207(i) and 4-471.1) and the intention of the General Assembly. Having considered all of the other criteria of the Regulatory Review Act, we find promulgation of this regulation is in the public interest.

> Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board— Right To Occupy Regulation No. 54-84 (#3098)

On May 5, 2015, the Independent Regulatory Review Commission (Commission) received this proposed regulation from the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board (Board). This rulemaking amends 40 Pa. Code (§§ 7.2, 7.4). The proposed regulation was published in the May 30, 2015 Pennsylvania Bulletin with a 30-day public comment period. The final-form regulation was submitted to the Commission on September 3, 2015.

Prior to approval of a transfer of ownership or transfer of ownership and location, the Board's regulations require an applicant to establish its right to occupy the proposed licensed premises by presenting a deed or lease for the premises, or bill of sale. The final-form regulation amends that requirement to allow for other types of written proof to reflect the fact that the right to occupy may be obtained through other means.

We have determined this regulation is consistent with the statutory authority of the Board (47 P. S. § 2-207(i)) and the intention of the General Assembly. Having considered all of the other criteria of the Regulatory Review Act, we find promulgation of this regulation is in the public interest.

#### State Board of Certified Real Estate Appraisers Regulation #16A-7021 (IRRC #3113)

### Appraisal Management Companies October 7, 2015

We submit for your consideration the following comments on the proposed rulemaking published in the August 8, 2015 *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. Our comments are based on criteria in Section 5.2 of the Regulatory Review Act (71 P. S. § 745.5b). Section 5.1(a) of the Regulatory Review Act (71 P. S. § 745.5a(a)) directs the State Board of Certified Real Estate Appraisers (Board) to respond to all comments received from us or any other source.

#### 1. General. Consistency with Federal rules.

The Appraisal Subcommittee of the Federal Financial Institutions Examination Council (FFIEC) submitted comments that the proposed rulemaking does not address certain requirements for registration and supervision that were recently implemented by AMC Final Rule on Minimum Requirements for Appraisal Management Companies, 80 Federal Register 32658 (June 9, 2015) (AMC Final Rule).

These requirements relate to the State's authority to: examine the books and records of an appraisal management company (AMC); require AMCs to submit information for inclusion on the National Registry of AMCs; collect and remit AMC registry fees; and report disciplinary action and violations of appraisal-related law, regulations and orders. The Board should address these areas in the final regulation or explain why it is unnecessary to do so.

### 2. Section 36.401. Definitions.—Whether the regulation is in the public interest.

In good standing—

The term's definition includes an individual who has an active unrestricted certificate or license, or a certificate or license that is on probation or subject to a restriction order by the Board. The Board explains that this phrase was not part of the temporary rulemaking and is being added at the request of stakeholders who asked for clarification and specificity regarding certification and licensure.

The phrase as used in § 36.404(b)(2) (relating to content of application) requires the compliance person to certify that the applicant has a system in place to verify that an appraiser is certified and in good standing under the Real Estate Appraisers Certification Act (63 P. S. §§ 457.1—457.19) (REACA).

We ask the Board to explain in the Preamble of the final-form regulation how allowing an appraiser who is on probation or subject to a restriction ordered by the Board to be designated as "in good standing" is in the public interest

### 3. Section 36.404. Content of Application.—Consistency with statute; and Reasonableness.

This section provides for the content of the application to register as an AMC. The Appraisal Management Company Registration Act (63 P. S. §§ 457.21—457.31) (AMCRA) requires a certification that the applicant has a system in place for the performance of appraisal reviews with respect to the work of all appraisers to determine whether the appraisals are being conducted in conformance with the minimum standards under REACA both on a periodic basis and whenever requested by a client. (§ 457.25(b)(5)(ii)) The Board has incorporated this re-

quirement into the proposed rulemaking and has added the phrase "unless otherwise limited by the terms of a contract between the client and the appraisal management company."

We understand the Board's intent is to address stake-holder concerns that "an AMC should not be obligated to perform uncompensated appraisal reviews at the whim of a client." However, our concern is that the amendment could restrict the right of a client to request an appraisal review to a specified number of times or only under certain conditions set by the AMC. The Board should explain in the Preamble of the final form regulation how this language is consistent with the AMCRA.

Also, we ask the Board to consider whether the issue relating to compensation for appraisal reviews would be more appropriately included in Standards of Practice § 36.433 (relating to appraisal review) instead of § 36.404 (relating to content of application).

### 4. Section 36.434. Broker price opinions and evaluations.—Whether the regulation is in the public interest.

The Board proposes that an AMC may not order or solicit broker price opinions (BPOs) or evaluations. Commentators submit that in many states BPOs are used in circumstances where an appraisal is not required such as default collections, loan modifications, foreclosure bidding, home equity lines of credit and refinancing. The commentators request the Board to reconsider the prohibition on BPOs in these circumstances.

The Pennsylvania Association of Realtors (PAR) questions the need for the Board to address BPOs in the proposed rulemaking based on the fact that BPOs are not within the permissible scope of practice under the Real Estate Licensing and Registration Act (RELRA). The Board should clarify the reasonableness of and need for Section 36.434 as it relates to state and federal law.

### 5. Section 36.435. Recordkeeping.—Consistency with Federal rules.

Subsection (a)(3)

The Appraisal Subcommittee expressed concern that the proposed language in this subsection may be interpreted as being narrower than the definition of an "appraiser panel" in the AMC Final Rule, which includes not only appraisers used by an AMC but also those accepted by the AMC for future appraisals. The Board should amend this section to ensure it is consistent with the AMC Final Rule or explain why it is unnecessary to do so.

### Section 36.451. Requirements for surety bond or letter of credit.—Clarity.

Subsection (d)

This subsection defines "claimant" and "faithful performance of the registrant's obligations under AMCRA." However, these terms are not used in the body of the regulation. We recommend the Board either delete the terms or revise the text of the final-form regulation to include them.

#### 7. Miscellaneous Clarity.

• We recommend the Board amend § 36.401 (relating to definitions) to include the following terms and definitions that are included in AMCRA: "Mortgage Bankers and Brokers and Consumer Equity Protection Act" and "Registrant";

- In section § 36.411(c)(3), the acronym "USPAP" should be explained and defined in the definitions section;
- We recommend the Board amend § 36.453 and § 36.454 to include lower case letter (a) at the beginning of the introductory paragraphs to be consistent with formatting and to improve readability;
- The Board's response in Regulatory Analysis Form (RAF) question #24(a) should be revised to replace "... all of these are AMCs" with "all of these are small businesses"; and
- In RAF questions #29 and #30, the Board should delete references to the Board meetings in 2014 and revise the expected date of promulgation.

#### Heads-Up Hold 'Em and High Card Flush; Table Game Rules of Play

### October 14, 2015

We submit for your consideration the following comments on the proposed rulemaking published in the August 15, 2015 *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. Our comments are based on criteria in Section 5.2 of the Regulatory Review Act (71 P. S. § 745.5b). Section 5.1(a) of the Regulatory Review Act (71 P. S. § 745.5a(a)) directs the Pennsylvania Gaming Control Board (Board) to respond to all comments received from us or any other source.

### Section 677a.1. Definitions.—Clarity.

This section defines terms for a new table game called Heads-Up Hold 'Em. We have two concerns. First, the term "fold" lacks clarity. It is defined as, "The withdrawal of a player from a round of play by not making a Raise Wager." It is our understanding that a player can only fold under the circumstance outlined in § 677a.11(f) of the rulemaking. Section 677a.11(f) pertains to the procedures for completion of each round of play after the Turn and River cards have been exposed by the dealer. When this late stage of the game occurs, a player that has not already placed a Raise Wager can either place that bet or fold. However, under §§ 677a.11(b) and (d), a player can either place a Raise Wager or check and remain in the game. We believe the definition of "fold" conflicts with Subsections (b) and (d) because these sections allow a player to not make a Raise Wager and remain in the game by checking. This could be clarified by amending the definition of "fold" to indicate that a "fold" can only occur after the Turn and River cards have been exposed.

Second, under the definition of "Bad Beat Bonus," the word "lists" should be changed to "loses."
