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Pennsylvania Bulletin

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the official gazette of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. It is published weekly. A cumulative subject matter index is published quarterly.

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* serves several purposes. It is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, which is the official codification of agency rules and regulations, Statewide court rules, and other statutorily authorized documents. Changes in the codified text, whether by adoption, amendment, rescission, repeal or emergency action, must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

The following documents are published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*: Governor's Executive Orders; Summaries of Enacted Statutes; Statewide and Local Court Rules; Attorney General Opinions; Motor Carrier Applications before the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission; Applications and Actions before the Department of Environmental Protection; Orders of the Independent Regulatory Review Commission; and other documents authorized by law.

The text of certain documents published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the only valid and enforceable text. Courts are required to take judicial notice of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Adoption, Amendment or Repeal of Regulations

Generally an agency wishing to adopt, amend or rescind regulations must first publish in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* a Proposed Rulemaking. There are limited instances when the agency may omit the proposal step; it still must publish the adopted version.

The Proposed Rulemaking contains the full text of the change, the agency contact person, a fiscal note required by law and background for the action.

The agency then allows sufficient time for public comment before taking final action. A Final Rulemaking must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* before the changes can take effect. If the agency wishes to adopt changes to the Proposed Rulemaking to enlarge the scope, it must repropose.

Citation to the Pennsylvania Bulletin

Cite material in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* by volume number, a page number and date. Example: Volume 1, *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, page 801, January 9, 1971 (short form: 1 Pa.B. 801 (January 9, 1971)).

Pennsylvania Code

The *Pennsylvania Code* is the official codification of rules and regulations issued by Commonwealth agencies, Statewide court rules and other statutorily authorized documents. The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, printing changes when they are adopted. These changes are then permanently codified by the *Pennsylvania Code Reporter*, a monthly, loose-leaf supplement.

The *Pennsylvania Code* is cited by title number and section number. Example: Title 10 *Pennsylvania Code* § 1.1 (short form: 10 Pa. Code § 1.1).

Under the *Pennsylvania Code* codification system, each regulation is assigned a unique number by title and section. Titles roughly parallel the organization of Commonwealth government.

How to Find Rules and Regulations

Search for your area of interest in the *Pennsylva-nia Code*. The *Pennsylvania Code* is available at www.pacode.com.

Source Notes give the history of regulations. To see if there have been recent changes not yet codified, check the List of *Pennsylvania Code* Chapters Affected in the most recent issue of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

A chronological table of the history of *Pennsylva-nia Code* sections may be found at www.legis.state.pa.us/cfdocs/legis/CH/Public/pcde_index.cfm.

A quarterly List of *Pennsylvania Code* Sections Affected lists the regulations in numerical order, followed by the citation to the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* in which the change occurred.

Court Rules in Titles 201—246 of the Pennsylvania Code

Added text in proposed and adopted court rules is printed in <u>underscored bold face</u>. Deleted text in proposed and adopted court rules is enclosed in brackets [] and printed in **bold face**.

Proposed new chapters and rules are printed in regular type to enhance readability.

Ellipses, a series of five asterisks, indicate text that is not amended.

Fiscal Notes

Section 612 of The Administrative Code of 1929 (71 P.S. § 232) requires the Governor's Budget Office to prepare a fiscal note for regulatory actions and administrative procedures of the administrative departments, boards, commissions and authorities receiving money from the State Treasury. The fiscal note states whether the action or procedure causes a loss of revenue or an increase in the cost of programs for the Commonwealth or its political subdivisions. The fiscal note is required to be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* at the same time as the change is advertised.

A fiscal note provides the following information: (1) the designation of the fund out of which the appropriation providing for expenditures under the action or procedure shall be made; (2) the probable cost for the fiscal year the program is implemented; (3) projected cost estimate of the program for each of the 5 succeeding fiscal years; (4) fiscal history of the program for which expenditures are to be made; (5) probable loss of revenue for the fiscal year of its implementation; (6) projected loss of revenue from the program for each of the 5 succeeding fiscal years; (7) line item, if any, of the General Appropriation Act or other appropriation act out of which expenditures or losses of Commonwealth funds shall occur as a result of the action or procedures; and (8) recommendation, if any, of the Secretary of the Budget and the reasons therefor.

The omission of an item indicates that the agency text of the fiscal note states that there is no information available with respect thereto. In items (3) and (6) information is set forth for the first through fifth fiscal years, following the year the program is implemented, which is stated. In item (4) information is set forth for the current and two immediately preceding years. In item (8) the recommendation, if any, made by the Secretary of the Budget is published with the fiscal note. "No fiscal impact" means no additional cost or revenue loss to the Commonwealth or its local political subdivision is intended. See 4 Pa. Code Chapter 7, Subchapter R (relating to fiscal notes).

THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY

Cost-of-Living Factor under the Public Official Compensation Law

Under Section 4(d) of the Public Official Compensation Law (Act 72 of 2005), for the 12-month period beginning December 1, 2018 through November 30, 2019, the salary of the members of the General Assembly shall be increased by a cost-of-living factor which is determined by increasing the amount of the salary by the percentage change in the Consumer Price Index for all Urban Consumers (CPI-U) for the Pennsylvania, New Jersey, Delaware and Maryland area, officially reported by the United States Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics for the period of November 1, 2017 through October 31, 2018.

The percentage increase and the new salary amount have been determined jointly by the Chief Clerk of the Senate and the Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives as follows:

The CPI-U for the period November 1, 2017 through October 31, 2018 increased by 1.6405%. Therefore, the salary for legislators for the period beginning December 1, 2018 through November 30, 2019 will be \$88,610.42.

Under section 4(d.1) of the Public Official Compensation Law (Act 72 of 2005), for the 12-month period beginning December 1, 2018 through November 30, 2019, the additional compensation of the officers and leaders of the General Assembly shall be increased by a cost-of-living factor which is determined by increasing the amount of the salary by the percentage change in the Consumer Price Index for all Urban Consumers (CPI-U) for the Pennsylvania, New Jersey, Delaware and Maryland area, officially reported by the United States Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics for the period from November 1, 2017 through October 31, 2018.

The percentage change and the new compensation amounts have been determined jointly by the Chief Clerk of the Senate and the Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives as follows:

PART II. INTERNAL OPERATING PROCDURES [210 PA. CODE CH. 65]

Amendments to the Superior Court Operating Procedures

The Superior Court of Pennsylvania has adopted amendments to its published Operating Procedures. These amendments are reflected in the Superior Court Operating Procedures with amendments to Pa. Code § 65.0 et seq.

These changes were approved on September 13, 2018, effective on that date.

Annex A

TITLE 210. APPELLATE PROCEDURE PART II. INTERNAL OPERATING PROCEDURES CHAPTER 65. OPERATING PROCEUDRES OF THE SUPERIOR COURT MOTIONS PRACTICE

§ 65.26. Notices of Bankruptcy.

A. A party that has initiated bankruptcy proceedings and has obtained an automatic stay pursuant to the United States Bankruptcy Code shall file a Notice of Bankruptcy with the Prothonotary of this Court. The Notice must include: (1) the federal court that entered the stay, including the court's district, if applicable; (2) the federal court case number; (3) the date of entry of the automatic stay; and (4) the Superior Court docket number. The party shall also include federal filings relevant to the stay including, but not limited to, the Notice of Bankruptcy Case Filing issued by the federal court. The parties shall provide written updates to the Court every six months as to the status of the bankruptcy proceedings.

DECISIONAL PROCEDURES

§ 65.35. Oral Motions.

A. [When oral motions are considered by the Court at oral argument, or when the Court issues an order sua sponte at oral argument, the presiding judge shall complete the form for the issuance of an appropriate order, which forms shall be available in all Superior Court courtrooms. The Court crier shall transmit the completed form to the Prothonotary for preparation and docketing of a written order.] Oral motions raising again an issue previously denied without prejudice must first be re-raised, in writing by refiling the original motion or preserving the issue in the written brief, before the scheduled argument date.

B. When oral motions are considered by the Court at oral argument, or when the Court issues an order sua sponte at oral argument, the presiding judge shall inform the Deputy Prothonotary and shall convey to him/her the substance of an appropriate order. The Deputy Prothonotary will then direct the preparation and docketing of the corresponding written order.

Title 255—LOCAL COURT RULES

DAUPHIN COUNTY

Promulgation of Local Rules; No. 1793 S 1989

Order

And Now, this 5th day of November, 2018, Dauphin County Local Rule of Criminal Procedure 520 is amended as follows:

Rule 520. Bail.

- 1. Magisterial District Judges, the Clerk of Courts, and certain designated officials at the Dauphin County Prison and the Dauphin County Judicial Center are hereby authorized to accept bail in accordance with the provisions and subject to the limitations of the Pennsylvania Rules of Criminal Procedure and Dauphin County Local Rules of Court. (See Pa.R.Crim.P. 117(C), 520, and 525).
- 2. The Magisterial District Judge with jurisdiction over a court case may accept bail at any time until the defendant is held for court at the conclusion of the preliminary hearing. The Clerk of Courts may accept bail after a case has been held for court.
- 3. (a) Payment of monetary bail during regular business hours shall be posted at the appropriate Magisterial District Judge's Office or at the Clerk of Court's Office in accordance with paragraph 2 above.
- (b) [Payment of monetary bail outside of regular business hours shall be posted at Night Court pursuant to Local Rule 117.] Monetary bail shall be accepted by Night Court staff during the hours of Night Court for cases heard at Night Court.
- (c) Designated Judicial Center staff shall accept monetary bail posted after the conclusion of Night Court but before the defendant is transported to Dauphin County Prison. In this situation, monetary bail shall be paid by money order payable to the appropriate Magisterial District Judge office. The Judicial Center staff shall remit a receipt to the payee. The money order shall be processed by the Magisterial District Judge office the following business day and a formal receipt shall be mailed to the defendant.
- (d) Designated Dauphin County Prison staff shall accept monetary bail after regular business hours for incarcerated individuals. In this situation, monetary bail shall be paid by money order payable to the appropriate Magisterial District Judge office or the Clerk of Courts in accordance with paragraph 2 above. The prison staff shall remit a receipt to the payee. The money order shall be processed by either the Magisterial District Judge office or the Clerk of Courts office the following business day and a formal receipt shall be mailed to the defendant.
- [3. The Magisterial District Judge with jurisdiction over a court case may accept bail at any time until the defendant is held for court at the conclusion of the preliminary hearing.]
- 4. Property bail shall be posted with the Clerk of Courts or the appropriate Magisterial District Court during regular business hours.
- 5. Other than monetary bail and property bail, all other bail may be posted outside of regularly scheduled work hours at the Dauphin County Prison for individuals already committed to the prison, or at the Dauphin County Judicial Center for individuals awaiting transport to the prison. The Warden, Deputy Warden, shift commanders and records officers at the Dauphin County Prison, as well as the Sergeant and Lieutenant at the Dauphin County Judicial Center are authorized to accept such bail and to witness a defendant's signature on the bail bond at any time. The defendant and the surety shall be given a copy of the bail bond.

These amendments shall be effective thirty (30) days from date of publication.

PROPOSED RULEMAKING

STATE BOARD OF VETERINARY MEDICINE

[49 PA. CODE CH. 31]

Certified Veterinary Technicians and Veterinary Assistants

The State Board of Veterinary Medicine (Board) proposes to amend §§ 31.1, 31.31, 31.32, 31.34—31.36, 31.38, 31.39 and 31.41 to read as set forth in Annex A.

Effective Date

This proposed rulemaking will be effective upon publication of the final-form rulemaking in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Statutory Authority

Section 5 of the Veterinary Medicine Practice Act (act) (63 P.S. § 485.5) authorizes the Board to adopt reasonable rules and regulations governing the practice of veterinary medicine as are necessary to enable it to carry out and make effective the purpose and intent of the act. Further, section 11 of the act (63 P.S. § 485.11) provides that it is the responsibility of the Board to promulgate by regulation the qualifications and requirements for the certification and regulation of veterinary technicians, including grounds for disciplinary action.

Background and Purpose

On October 24, 2017, Governor Tom Wolf signed Executive Order 2017-3, requiring the Commissioner of Professional and Occupational Affairs (Commissioner) to comprehensively review and catalog the processes, fees, training requirements, criminal history policies, portability, and continuing education requirements for occupational and professional licensure within the purview of the 29 licensing boards and commissions under the Commissioner's authority. The order further directed the Commissioner to benchmark that data against regional averages from 12 states with similar or equivalent licenses that comprise the Northeast geographic region (including Ohio, West Virginia, Maryland, Delaware, New Jersey, New York, Massachusetts, Rhode Island, Connecticut, New Hampshire, Vermont and Maine) to identify requirements or functions that presented unnecessary burdens to licensure and occupational employment within this Commonwealth.

That report, issued on June 12, 2018, revealed that this Commonwealth is one of only two states (along with Delaware) within the Northeast region, in which the Board either imposes automatic suspension of or refusal to grant licensure for convictions of drug-related offenses. Further, this Commonwealth is the only State that extends this proscription by regulation to a class (that is, certified veterinary technicians) that is not expressly required by the relevant provision of the act. The Governor therefore recommended the Board consider promulgating amendments to the regulations to repeal those provisions extending the automatic 10-year bar to certified veterinary technicians who have been convicted of a felony under The Controlled Substance, Drug, Device and Cosmetic Act (Drug Act) (35 P.S. §§ 780-101—780-144). This proposed rulemaking implements the Governor's recommendation.

In addition, the Board recognizes that in many licensed professions, students nearing completion of their educa-

tional program may sit for all or a portion of the National licensure examination prior to graduation. National trends for the licensure of veterinary technicians embrace this practice, and the Pennsylvania Association of Veterinary Technicians requested that the Board consider allowing students of this Commonwealth to follow this practice. After examining the issue, the Board determined that students in the final half of their educational programs should be authorized, should they choose, to take the examination prior to graduation. Individuals who take the examination prior to graduation would still be required to graduate from their educational program prior to licensure. Therefore, this proposed rulemaking would authorize students in their final year of an approved program to take the Veterinary Technician National Examination prior to graduation, provided they have completed at least half of the credits required for completion of the program.

Finally, this proposed rulemaking will replace references to "noncertified employee" with the term, "veterinary assistant" throughout the regulations. This term was changed by amendments to the act in 2002, and the Board is now making the regulations consistent with that change.

Description of Proposed Amendments

The Board proposes to amend \S 31.1 (relating to definitions) to replace the definition of "noncertified employee" with a definition for "veterinary assistant" and to update the definition for "direct veterinary supervision" by replacing the outdated term "noncertified employee" and by adding to the provision a reference to "other licensed professionals." This latter amendment clarifies the supervision level already required under § 31.21 (relating to Rules of Professional Conduct for Veterinarians), Principle 6(b) regarding professional relationships, which allows veterinarians to seek the assistance of other licensed professionals to enhance the quality of veterinary medical services provided and requires other licensed professionals to be under the direct supervision of the attending veterinarian when providing services to animals. Likewise, the Board is amending the definition of "immediate veterinary supervision" to replace "noncertified employee" with "veterinary assistant." The Board is also adding definitions for AAVSB (American Association of Veterinary State Boards) to include a successor organization and VTNE (Veterinary Technician National Examination) to include a successor examination.

The proposed amendments to § 31.31 (relating to scope of practice) update the regulations to use the 2002 statutory term "veterinary assistant" instead of "noncertified employee."

The proposed amendments to § 31.32 (relating to certification) remove the requirement that the applicant submit a statement that applicant has not been convicted of a felony under the Drug Act, as previously set forth. Instead, the amendments would require an applicant to submit other relevant documents, as requested by the Board. For example, if an applicant had been disciplined in another state, or had been convicted of crimes related to the profession, the Board may request additional relevant documentation to permit a comprehensive review of the applicant's qualifications. The proposed amendments also provide the name of the VTNE in place of the current reference to the "proficiency examination."

The proposed amendments to § 31.34 (relating to qualification for examination) would provide veterinary technician students the ability to sit for the VTNE when they are enrolled in the final year of an approved program for the training and education of veterinary technicians and have completed at least half of the credits required for completion of the program.

The proposed amendments to § 31.35 (relating to examinations) add language to subsection (b) to clarify that an applicant failing to pass the examination may be re-examined, in accordance with the policies of the AAVSB. For example, the AAVSB has a policy that requires an applicant who has failed the examination five times to seek prior approval of the AAVSB for subsequent attempts. At § 31.35(c)(3), the Board proposes to add details related to waiver of the exam requirement for individuals licensed, registered or certified as an animal health technician or veterinary technician in another state (that is, reciprocity), to specify that requirements in another state which are "at least equal to those of the Commonwealth" include completion of an approved education program and passage of the VTNE or an examination equivalent to the VTNE if the examination was taken before the VTNE was offered. The Board proposes to add subsection (d) to require applicants applying by reciprocity to submit a copy of their credential from the other state and proof that it is currently in good standing.

The proposed amendment to § 31.36(c) (relating to renewal of certification, inactive status and reactivation of certification) would delete the requirement that a notarized affidavit of non-practice be submitted with an application to reactivate certification. Instead, each applicant is required to certify that all materials submitted in support of an application are true and correct, subject to the penalties for unsworn falsification under 18 Pa.C.S. § 4904 (relating to unsworn falsification to authorities) and possible disciplinary action for fraud or deceit under § 31.39 (relating to grounds for disciplinary proceedings). This is proposed to streamline and simplify the process for reactivation and to be consistent with all applications that are now being processed online through the Pennsylvania Licensing System (PALS).

In § 31.38 (relating to code of ethics for certified veterinary technicians), the Board proposes to amend subsection (c) to refer to the veterinarian-client-patient relationship, the term defined in the act instead of the current "doctor-client" relationship. At subsection (d), the Board proposes to change the requirement that a certified veterinary technician "explain" to clients that the individual is not a veterinarian with the requirement that the certified veterinary technician "notify" the client that the individual is a certified veterinary technician. The Board believes that the general public is now familiar enough with the profession that it is not necessary to explain that the individual is not a veterinarian. In subsection (g) the Board would include an amendment to provide for the possibility of a successor organization to the National Association of Veterinary Technicians in America. In addition, the Board proposes new subsections (h)-(k) in § 31.38, to set out further ethical conduct rules for certified veterinary technicians. Subsection (h) would prohibit a certified veterinary technician from engaging in conduct which a reasonable person would believe is intended to coerce, pressure or intimidate another person to file, not file or withdraw a complaint made to the Board or law enforcement officials. Subsection (i) would prohibit a certified veterinary technician from abusing, harassing or intimidating a client, former client, colleague or associate in the course of professional practice. Subsection (j) would prohibit a certified veterinary technician from abusing or neglecting any animal, as defined in § 31.1. Finally, subsection (k) would require a certified veterinary technician to report to the Board any certified veterinary technician or veterinarian who is deficient in professional competence, professional conduct or ethical conduct as described in the Board's regulations. These provisions mirror existing regulatory provisions for veterinarians in § 31.21 at Principle 1(e) and Principle 3(10), (12), (15) and (16).

In § 31.39, the Board is proposing to amend subsection (b) to replace the outdated term "noncertified employees" with the statutory term "veterinary assistants."

Finally, the Board proposes to delete outdated language related to the effective date of the Board's last biennial renewal fee regulation in § 31.41 (related to schedule of fees) for veterinarians and certified veterinary technicians and to clarify that the current biennial renewal fee is \$360 for veterinarians and \$100 for certified veterinary technicians.

Fiscal Impact

The Board does not anticipate any fiscal impact relating to these amendments to the general public or the Board. The only fiscal impact to the regulated community in these amendments is related to the elimination of the notarized affidavit requirement for applicants seeking reactivation of a license or certificate.

Paperwork Requirements

This proposed rulemaking does not create additional paperwork for the Board, the regulated community or the general public. This proposed rulemaking streamlines and simplifies the process for applying for reactivation by eliminating the need for a notarized affidavit.

Sunset Date

The Board continuously monitors the effectiveness of its regulations on a fiscal year and biennial basis. Therefore, no sunset date has been assigned.

Regulatory Review

Under section 5(a) of the Regulatory Review Act (71 P.S. § 745.5(a)), on November 7, 2018, the Board submitted a copy of this proposed regulation and a copy of the Regulatory Analysis form to the Independent Regulatory Review Commission (IRRC) and to the Chairpersons of the Senate Consumer Protection and Professional Licensure Committee and the House Professional Licensure Committee. A copy of this material is available to the public upon request.

Under section 5(g) of the Regulatory Review Act, IRRC may convey any comments, recommendations or objections to this proposed rulemaking within 30 days of the close of the public comment period. Comments, recommendations or objections shall specify the regulatory review criteria which have not been met. The Regulatory Review Act specifies detailed procedures for review, prior to final publication of the rulemaking, by the Board, the General Assembly and the Governor of comments, recommendations and objections raised.

CHAPTER 31. STATE BOARD OF VETERINARY **MEDICINE**

GENERAL PROVISIONS

§ 31.1. Definitions.

The following words and terms, when used in this chapter, have the following meanings, unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

AAVSB—The American Association of Veterinary State Boards, or its successor organization.

Act—The Veterinary Medicine Practice Act (63 P.S. §§ 485.1—485.33).

Direct veterinary supervision—A veterinarian has given either oral or written instructions to the certified veterinary technician or noncertified employee, veterinary assistant or other licensed professional, is on the premises and is easily and quickly available to assist the certified veterinary technician or the noncertified employee] veterinary assistant or other licensed professional.

Immediate veterinary supervision—A veterinarian is in visual and audible range to assist the [noncertified employee] veterinary assistant.

Neglect—To abandon an animal or deprive, either personally or through one's employees or agents, an animal over which one has a duty of care, whether belonging to himself or otherwise, of necessary sustenance, drink, shelter or veterinary care appropriate to the animal's condition or access to sanitary shelter and support for an animal's basic physical and emotional needs.

[Noncertified employee—An employee of a veterinarian who does not hold certification as a veterinary technician and whom the veterinarian deems competent to administer medication or render auxiliary or supporting assistance under direct veterinary supervision or immediate veterinary supervision.

Professional veterinary product—One which requires professional veterinary knowledge in the administration of or in the giving of instructions for safe and proper use of the product, including prescription drugs, biologicals, pharmaceuticals and prescription diets.

Solicitation—Advertising intentionally directed to specific individuals.

VTNE—The Veterinary Technician National Examination, or its successor examination—An examination owned and administered by the AAVSB used to evaluate the competency of entry-level veterinary technicians.

VTS—Veterinary technician specialist—A certified veterinary technician who holds current certification from a specialty organization recognized by the National Association of Veterinary Technicians in America (NAVTA).

Veterinarian—A licensed doctor of veterinary medicine as defined in section 3 of the act (63 P.S. § 485.3).

Veterinary assistant—An employee of a veterinarian who does not hold certification as a veterinary technician and whom the veterinarian deems competent to perform the tasks set forth in § 31.31(b) (related to scope of practice) under direct veterinary supervision or immediate veterinary supervi-

CERTIFIED VETERINARY TECHNICIANS AND VETERINARY ASSISTANTS

§ 31.31. Scope of practice.

- (b) [Noncertified employees. Noncertified employees J Veterinary assistants. Veterinary assistants may perform the duties enumerated in this subsection under direct veterinary supervision or immediate veterinary supervision, as indicated. While some of the enumerated duties may be applicable primarily to small animal practices, the intended scope of this subsection is both large and small animal practices. This subsection does not prohibit a [noncertified employee] veterinary assistant from administering medication or rendering auxiliary or other supporting assistance which is not listed in this subsection if the service is within the [noncertified employee's] veterinary assistant's skills and is requested by the supervising veterinarian. The veterinarian bears ultimate responsibility for assuring that the [noncertified employee] veterinary assistant to whom a duty is assigned is competent to perform it.
- (1) A [noncertified employee] veterinary assistant may do the following under direct veterinary super-

(2) A | noncertified employee | veterinary assistant may do the following only under immediate veteri-

nary supervision:

- (3) Emergency treatment by [noncertified employes veterinary assistants is permitted without veterinary supervision when an animal has been placed in a life-threatening condition and immediate treatment is necessary to sustain the animal's life. The [noncertified employe veterinary assistant shall immediately take steps to secure the direct supervision of a veterinarian. Emergency treatment may only consist of those duties enumerated under paragraphs (1) and (2)(i)—(iv).
- (c) Prohibited acts. Neither certified veterinary technicians nor [noncertified employees] veterinary assistants may do the following:

§ 31.32. Certification.

- (a) As a prerequisite to original certification as a veterinary technician, an applicant shall submit the following documentation to the Board:
- (1) A completed and signed application for veterinary technician certification.
- (2) Evidence of satisfactory performance on the [proficiency examination] <u>VTNE</u> as determined by the Board.
- (3) Evidence of satisfactory completion of an approved program for the training and education of veterinary technicians.
- (4) A letter of good standing from the licensure board of each state where the applicant has held a license as a veterinary technician, if any, reporting the outcome of disciplinary actions taken against the applicant in that state.
- (5) [A statement from the applicant that the applicant has not been convicted of a felony under The Controlled Substance, Drug, Device and Cosmetic Act (35 P.S. §§ 780-101—780-144), or convicted of a felony relating to a controlled substance in a court of law of the United States or any other state, territory or country within the last 10 years. An applicant convicted of such a felony more than 10 years ago shall also submit the following:
- (i) Proof that at least 10 years have elapsed from the date of conviction.
- (ii) Satisfactory documentary evidence that the applicant has made significant progress in personal rehabilitation since the conviction so that licensure of the applicant should not be expected to create a substantial risk of harm to the health and safety of patients or the public or a substantial risk of further criminal violations.
- (iii) Satisfactory documentary evidence that the applicant otherwise satisfies the qualifications contained in the Board's regulations] Other relevant documents, as requested by the Board.
- (b) The fee for application for certification is as specified in § 31.41 (relating to schedule of fees).

§ 31.34. Qualification for examination.

An applicant for examination shall be a graduate of an approved school or be a student enrolled in the final year of an approved program for the training and education of veterinary technicians provided that the student shall have completed at least half of the credit hours required for completion of the program.

§ 31.35. Examinations.

- (a) The examination required for certification as [an] <u>a</u> veterinary technician is the [Veterinary Technician National Examination (VTNE)] VTNE.
- (b) An applicant failing to pass an examination for which the applicant has previously qualified [shall] may be reexamined at the applicant's request by submitting a new application and by paying the required fee, in accordance with the policies of the AAVSB.
- (c) The Board may waive the VTNE if an applicant satisfies the following requirements:
 - (1) Has met all requirements provided for in the act.

- (2) Has filed the required application as provided in § 31.33 (relating to applications).
- (3) Has been issued a license, registration or certificate as an animal health technician or a veterinary technician in another state whose requirements [are at least equal to those of the Commonwealth; a copy of this certificate and proof of current good standing shall be submitted] include successful completion of an approved program for the training and education of veterinary technicians and successful completion of the VTNE or a comprehensive examination equivalent to the VTNE if the examination was taken before the VTNE was offered.
- (d) Applicants applying under subsection (c) shall include with their application a copy of their state credential (license, registration or certificate) and proof of current good standing.
- § 31.36. Renewal of certification, inactive status and reactivation of certification.

* * * * *

- (c) Reactivation of certification. Certified veterinary technicians who desire to reactivate certification may do so by complying with the continuing education requirements in effect at the time of reactivation, paying the current renewal fee and submitting [a notarized] an affidavit to the Board setting forth the period of time in which the certificate holder did not practice in this Commonwealth. Certified veterinary technicians who seek to reactivate certification will not be assessed a late renewal fee for the preceding biennial renewal periods in which the certificate holder did not engage in practice in this Commonwealth.
- § 31.38. Code of ethics for certified veterinary technicians.

* * * * *

- (c) A certified veterinary technician may not compromise the confidentiality of the [doctor-client] veterinarian-client-patient relationship.
- (d) A certified veterinary technician who [deals or] communicates directly with a client shall [explain to] notify the client that the certificate holder is a certified veterinary technician [is not a veterinarian].

* * * * *

- (g) A certified veterinary technician may not make a false, deceptive or misleading statement or claim. A false, deceptive or misleading statement or claim includes the statements and claims defined in Principle 5(a) of § 31.21 (relating to Rules of Professional Conduct for Veterinarians) and any representation that the certified veterinary technician is a specialist, or a VTS, unless the certified veterinary technician holds current certification from a specialty organization recognized by the National Association of Veterinary Technicians in America, or its successor organization.
- (h) A certified veterinary technician shall not engage in conduct which a reasonable person would believe is intended to coerce, pressure or intimidate another person to file, not file or withdraw a complaint made to the Board or any law enforcement official regarding matters related to the certified veterinary technician's practice.

- (i) A certified veterinary technician shall not abuse, harass or intimidate a client, former client, colleague or associate in the course of professional practice.
- (j) A certified veterinary technician shall not abuse or neglect any animal, as defined in § 31.1 (relating to definitions), whether or not the animal is a patient.
- (k) A certified veterinary technician shall report to the Board any veterinary technician or veterinarian deficient in professional competence, professional conduct or ethical conduct as described in this chapter, in accordance with the rules set forth in § 31.21, Principle 1(e) (relating to Rules of Professional Conduct for Veterinarians).
- § 31.39. Grounds for disciplinary proceedings.

* * * * *

(b) Certified veterinary technicians and [noncertified employees] veterinary assistants who deviate from the permitted scope of practice as set forth in § 31.31 (relating to scope of practice) will be subject to prosecution and the levying of a civil penalty by the Board under section 28(c) of the act (63 P.S. § 485.28(c)). Veterinarians who permit, order or direct certified veterinary technicians or [noncertified employees] veterinary assistants to perform duties which are not authorized by § 31.31 will be subject to disciplinary action by the Board under section 21 of the act (63 P.S. § 485.21).

(c) Disciplinary action by the Board will be taken only after a formal hearing has been held in accordance with the act.

The Pennsylvania Wine Marketing and Research Program Board (Board) annually, or more frequently as the availability of fund permits, solicits applications for grants to conduct promotion, marketing and research projects to increase the quality, profitability, production and sale of wines, enhance the wine industry and benefit wine producers of this Commonwealth.

The Board was established by the Department of Agriculture (Department) under 3 Pa.C.S. §§ 4501—4513 (relating to Agricultural Commodities Marketing Act)

(ACMA). Its composition, funding and duties were subsequently expanded by section 488.1 of the Liquor Code (47 P.S. § 4-488.1).

The Board makes awards of grants from its own funds generated by the methods set forth in the ACMA and makes recommendations for the awarding of grants by the Liquor Control Board from funds provided through the Liquor Code (47 P.S. §§ 1-101—10-1001).

This notice establishes the procedures by which grant applications will be solicited, reviewed and grants awarded.

- 1. Grant Solicitation. The Board will be accepting grant applications for the purposes, in the form and according to the schedule set forth herein for a period of not less than 30 days beginning on the date of publication of this notice in the Pennsylvania Bulletin. Additional publication and dissemination of this notice shall be made to: (a) applicants who have previously submitted grant applications to, or received grants from, the Board; (b) State universities and State-supported universities located in this Commonwealth; (c) universities with colleges of agricultural science located in this Commonwealth; and (d) individuals or entities who have requested notification from the Department or the Board of grant availability.
- 2. Process Overview. The Board will employ the review process described as follows to select projects: (a) to fund by making a grant from its ACMA funds; or (b) to recommend to the Liquor Control Board for the making of a grant.

- c. Section 2, titled Statement of Need, explaining the need for the grant funds sought, and identifying the presence of any additional funding partners and the extent of that funding.
- d. Section 3, titled Budget, presenting a detailed budget for the proposed project or program, including an itemized breakdown of: all personnel by name devoted to the project, their professional qualifications, the amount of time calculated by hours and the tasks to be performed by each of the named personnel; each and every item of direct expense to be incurred in the project separately set forth, including all purchases of consumable or nonconsumable goods or equipment, listing the disposition of all non-consumable goods or equipment upon completion of the project; all travel by dates, purpose, destination, mode of transportation and rate; a full breakdown of other costs, if any, and the method used to calculate those costs. See also paragraph 10.
- e. Section 4, titled Criteria for Measuring Outcomes, identifying methods for measuring outcomes.
- f. Section 5, titled Industry Involvement, describing the extent of any support, participation and funding from this Commonwealth's wine industry, including any written confirmation of that support, participation or funding.
- 5. Scoring of Applications. The Board will evaluate each complete and timely-filed project proposal and grant application it receives, which shall include a 100-point scale assessing:
 - a. Up to 20 points for the project needs statement.
- b. Up to 20 points for the expected impact of project outcomes.
- c. Up to 20 points for the promotion, marketing or research methodology.
 - d. Up to 20 points for overall project evaluation.
- e. Up to 20 points for support and participation from industry.
- 6. Scores. Upon completion of evaluations, the Board will prepare a record identifying each complete and timely-filed project proposal and grant application received and the numerical score assigned to each. In the event of an ACMA-funded grant, the Board will award grants based upon its evaluation and scoring. In the event of one or more recommendations to the Liquor Control Board to make and fund a grant, the Board will

transmit to the Liquor Control Board the project proposal and grant application, along with the score assigned to it by the Board and any other information deemed relevant by the Board or requested by the Liquor Control Board. Request will be made by the Board that the Liquor Control Board respond to all recommendations for grant approval within 30 days.

- 7. Term of Grants. Applications should be submitted for projects to begin after July 1, 2019, on a date within Fiscal Year 2019-2020 (July 1, 2019—June 30, 2020). Anticipated completion dates will be dictated by the project scope and parameters and may exceed 12 months from commencement if the project so warrants. The Board may award, or recommend that the Liquor Control Board approve, grant funding for multiyear projects or extensions of an on-going project, if the Board identifies that a multiyear term or an extension advances the grant's objectives. Requests for extensions of ongoing projects shall be made, evaluated and processed in accordance with all the requirements of this notice.

Acknowledgment of Notices of Intent to Remediate Submitted under the Land Recycling and Environmental Remediation Standards Act (35 P.S. §§ 6026.101—6026.907).

Sections 302-305 of the Land Recycling and Environmental Remediation Standards Act (act) (35 P.S. §§ 6026.302—6026.305) require the Department to publish in the Pennsylvania Bulletin an acknowledgment noting receipt of Notices of Intent to Remediate. An acknowledgment of the receipt of a Notice of Intent to Remediate is used to identify a site where a person proposes to, or has been required to, respond to a release of a regulated substance at a site. A person intending to use the background standard, Statewide health standard, the site-specific standard or intend to remediate a site as a special industrial area shall file a Notice of Intent to Remediate with the Department. A Notice of Intent to Remediate filed with the Department provides a brief description of the location of the site, a list of known or suspected contaminants at the site, the proposed remediation measures for the site and a description of the intended future use of the site. A person who demonstrates attainment of one or a combination of cleanup standards or receives approval of a special industrial area remediation identified under the act will be relieved of further liability for the remediation of the site for contamination identified in reports submitted to and approved by the Department. Furthermore, the person shall not be subject to citizen suits or other contribution actions brought by responsible persons not participating in the remediation.

Under sections 304(n)(1)(ii) and 305(c)(2) of the act, there is a 30-day public and municipal comment period for sites proposed for remediation using a site-specific standard, in whole or in part, and for sites remediated as a special industrial area. This period begins when a summary of the Notice of Intent to Remediate is published in a newspaper of general circulation in the area of the site. For the following site, proposed for remediation to a site-specific standard or as a special industrial area, the municipality, within which the site is located, may request to be involved in the development of the remediation and reuse plans for the site if the request is made within 30 days of the date specified as follows. During this comment period, the municipality may request that the person identified as the remediator of the site develop and implement a public involvement plan. Requests to be involved and comments should be directed to the remediator of the site.

For further information concerning the content of a Notice of Intent to Remediate, contact the environmental cleanup program manager in the Department regional office listed before the notice. If information concerning this acknowledgment is required in an alternative form, contact the community relations coordinator at the appropriate regional office. MINING ACTIVITY NPDES DRAFT PERMITS

This notice provides information about applications for a new, amended or renewed NPDES permits associated with mining activity (coal or noncoal) permits. The applications concern industrial waste (mining) discharges to surface water and discharges of stormwater associated with mining activities. This notice is provided in accordance with 25 Pa. Code Chapters 91 and 92a and 40 CFR Part 122, implementing provisions of The Clean Streams Law (35 P.S. §§ 691.1—691.1001) and the Federal Clean Water Act (33 U.S.C.A. §§ 1251—1376).

The Department of Environmental Protection (Department) has prepared a draft NPDES permit and made a tentative determination to issue the NPDES permit in conjunction with the associated mining activity permit.

Effluent Limits for Coal Mining Activities

For coal mining activities, NPDES permits, when issued, will contain effluent limits that are the more stringent of technology-based (BAT) effluent limitations or

Water Quality Based Effluent Limits (WQBEL).

The BAT limits for coal mining activities, as provided in 40 CFR Part 434 and 25 Pa. Code Chapters 87—90 are as follows:

A settleable solids instantaneous maximum limit of 0.5 ml/l applies to: surface runoff (resulting from a precipitation event of less than or equal to a 10-year 24-hour event) from active mining areas; active areas disturbed by coal refuse disposal activities; mined areas backfilled and revegetated; and all other discharges and drainage (resulting from a precipitation event of greater than 1-year 24-hour to less than or equal to a 10-year 24-hour event) from coal refuse disposal piles. Similarly, modified BAT limits apply to iron, manganese and suspended solids in surface runoff, discharges and drainage resulting from these precipitation events and those of greater magnitude in accordance with 25 Pa. Code §§ 87.102, 88.92, 88.187, 88.292, 89.52 and 90.102.

Exceptions to BAT effluent limits may be applicable in accordance with 25 Pa. Code §§ 87.102, 88.92, 88.187, 88.292, 89.52 and 90.102.

Effluent Limits for Noncoal Mining Activities

The limits for noncoal mining activities as provided in 25 Pa. Code Chapter 77 are pH 6 to 9 and other parameters the Department may require.

Discharges from noncoal mines located in some geologic settings (for example, in the coal fields) may require additional water quality based effluent limits. If additional effluent limits are needed for an NPDES permit associated with a noncoal mining permit, then the permit description specifies the parameters.

In addition to BAT or WQBEL limits, coal and noncoal NPDES permits establish effluent limitations in the form of implemented Best Management Practices (BMPs) identified in the associated Erosion and Sedimentation Plan, the Reclamation Plan and the NPDES permit application. These BMPs restrict the rates and quantities of associated pollutants from being discharged into surface waters in this Commonwealth.

More restrictive effluent limitations, restrictions on discharge volume or restrictions on the extent of mining that may occur are incorporated into an NPDES permit when necessary for compliance with water quality standards and antidegradation requirements (in accordance with 25 Pa. Code Chapters 91—96).

The procedures for determining the final effluent limits, using a mass-balance equation or model, are found in Technical Guidance Document 563-2112-115, Developing National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Permits for Mining Activities. Other specific factors to be considered include public comments and Total Maximum Daily Load(s). Additional discharge limitations may apply in the event that unexpected discharges occur.

Discharge rates for surface mining activities are precipitation driven. Discharge rates for proposed discharges associated with underground mining are noted in the permit description.

Persons wishing to comment on an NPDES draft permit should submit a written statement to the Department at the address of the district mining office indicated before each draft permit within 30 days of this public notice. Comments received within the comment period will be considered in the final determinations regarding the NPDES permit applications. Comments must include the name, address and telephone number of the writer and a concise statement to inform the Department of the exact basis of a comment and the relevant facts upon which it is based.

The Department will also accept requests or petitions for a public hearing on NPDES permit applications, as provided in 25 Pa. Code § 92a.82(d). The request or petition for a public hearing shall be filed within 30 days of this public notice and contain the name, address, telephone number and the interest of the party filing the request, and state the reasons why a hearing is warranted. A public hearing may be held if the Department considers the public interest significant. If a hearing is scheduled, a notice of the hearing on the NPDES permit application will be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* and a newspaper of general circulation within the relevant geographical area. The baseline remedial investigation, based on the work plan, is compiled into the baseline environmental report to establish a reference point to show existing contamination, describe proposed remediation to be done and include a description of existing or potential public benefits of the use or reuse of the property. The Department may approve or disapprove plans and reports submitted. This notice provides the Department's decision and, if relevant, the basis for disapproval.

Proposed State Implementation Plan Revision; Redesignation Request and Maintenance Plan for the Lebanon County Nonattainment Area for the 2012 Annual Fine Particulate Matter National Ambient Air Quality Standard; Public Hearing

The Department of Environmental Protection (Department) is seeking public comment on a redesignation request and a proposed revision to the State Implementation Plan (SIP) concerning a maintenance plan demonstrating that the Lebanon County Area can maintain the 2012 annual fine particulate matter National Ambient Air Quality Standard (NAAQS) for the next 10 years as required under section 175A(a) of the Clean Air Act (42 U.S.C.A. § 7505a(a)). This maintenance plan SIP revision will also establish new motor vehicle emission budgets for transportation conformity purposes in the Lebanon County Area.

Particulate matter includes both solid and liquid particles suspended in the air. Fine particle pollution describes particulate matter that is less than or equal to 2.5 micrometers in diameter (PM $_{2.5}$). PM $_{2.5}$ concentrations above the Federal health-based standard pose a serious human health threat. On January 15, 2015, the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) designated Lebanon County as a moderate nonattainment area for the 2012 annual PM $_{2.5}$ NAAQS (80 FR 2205, 2264-2265). The Lebanon County Area has since come into attainment based on 2014—2016 air quality monitoring data, which the Department submitted to the EPA on May 17, 2017. The EPA determined that Lebanon County has attained the 2012 annual PM $_{2.5}$ NAAQS based on 2014—2016 complete, quality assured and certified ambient air monitoring data that shows that the area is monitoring attainment (83 FR 9435 (March 6, 2018)).

With significant improvements in air quality in Lebanon County, this nonattainment area now meets the 2012 annual $\rm PM_{2.5}$ NAAQS. Therefore, the Department intends to submit this proposed maintenance plan SIP revision and redesignation request for the Lebanon County Area to the EPA for approval.

Consumer Price Index Adjustment of Base Amounts on Bids Effective January 1, 2019

Each year the Department of Labor and Industry (Department) is required by the following statutes to publish changes to the base amounts triggering the requirement for public bids, telephonic bids or separate bids, or both, for certain contracts. The Department is required to announce the percentage change in the Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U): All Items for the United States City Average for the 12-month period ending September 30 of each year. The Department utilizes the most current nonseasonally adjusted series, as published by the United States Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS), which at present uses 1982—1984 as the index base period (set equal to 100). The percentage change for the 12-month period ending September 30, 2018. is 2.3%.

The change to the base rate is determined as follows:

- 1) Calculate the percentage change in CPI-U (I) from September 2017 to September 2018. This is derived as I = (CPI $_{18}$ -CPI $_{17}$)/CPI $_{17}$, where the subscripts refer to September 2018 and 2017 values of CPI-U. As reported by the BLS these values are (252.439–246.819)/246.819 = +5.620/246.819 = +2.22770%, which when rounded to 1 decimal place = 2.3%. (This was also reported as 2.3% in Table A of the BLS news release on the Consumer Price Index Summary for September 2018.)
- 2) The legislation puts a floor of 0 and a cap of 3% on the percentage change to be utilized in the calculations (technically these restrictions are on the Preliminary Adjusted Base (PAB), defined in step 4, however this is mathematically equivalent). The truncated value of the percentage change to be used in the adjustment formula is denoted as PC, resulting in:

- a) PC = I, for $0 \le I \le 3\%$,
- b) PC = 0, for I < 0 and
- c) PC = 3%, for I > 3%.
- 3) The base value (either original for new legislation or the prior year's PAB) is designated as B and the product of B and PC (determined above) is P. (There are different values of the base depending on the entity and the type of bid, so technically B could be designated with two subscripts. For illustration purposes, the subscripts are omitted.) Then P = B*PC. A common value for the base
- amount in 2018 for a public bid is \$20,146.07. (The other two prior PABs, which are this year's bases for a variety of bid types, were \$10,889.77 and \$27,224.42.) For example, using B = \$20,146.07, results in P = \$20,146.07 * 2.3% = \$463.36.
- 4) Then the Preliminary Adjusted Base, PAB = P + B, which reduces to 463.36 + 20,146.07 = 20,609.43.
- 5) The Final Adjusted Base Amount, FAA (which is used as the limit for the next year that is 2019), is the PAB rounded to the nearest 100. Therefore, the FAA = \$20,600.

DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION

Bureau of Driver Licensing; School Buses, 15 or Less Passengers, May Not Be Used for Commercial Driver's License Skills Testing

The Department of Transportation, Bureau of Driver Licensing, to meet Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration requirements, is clarifying testing standards for school bus driver skills tests, as follows:

Effective immediately, any driver who wishes to obtain a Class C Commercial Driver's License (CDL) with the passenger endorsement must successfully complete a commercial skills test in a passenger vehicle designed to transport 16 or more passengers including the driver.

A person who passed a commercial skills test in a school bus designed to transport 11 to 15 passengers including the driver would previously be issued a Class C CDL with a passenger endorsement. While the Commonwealth's definition of a commercial motor vehicle (CMV) includes 11 to 15 passenger school buses, Federal regulations would not define such a vehicle as a CMV. Thus, an 11 to 15 passenger school bus would not meet the Federal requirement of testing in a representative vehicle.

Therefore, a school bus designed to transport 11 to 15 passengers including the driver cannot be used for a commercial skills test in this Commonwealth. A commercial skills test administered in an 11 to 15 passenger school bus will not be considered a valid test nor will the applicant be licensed as a Class C commercial driver.

Pennsylvania Compensation Rating Bureau; Workers' Compensation Loss Cost Filings

On November 13, 2018, the Insurance Department received from the Pennsylvania Compensation Rating Bureau (Bureau) two filings for loss cost level changes for workers' compensation insurance. The filings were made in accordance with section 705 of the Workers' Compensation Act (77 P.S. § 1035.5).

The first filing, Bureau's Filing No. C-372, proposes an overall 10.02% decrease in collectible loss costs effective January 1, 2019, for both new and renewal business. The Bureau states that this filing is being made in response to the Bureau's determination that financial data reported by a Bureau member and used in the development of Filing No. C-370 (which was approved effective April 1, 2018) were incorrect. The Bureau states that the member's reported losses were, mistakenly, materially overstated, necessitating the preparation of Bureau Filing No. C-372.

The second filing, Bureau's Filing No. C-373, proposes an overall 5.24% decrease in collectible loss costs effective January 1, 2019, for both new and renewal business. The Bureau states that the 5.24% decrease is based on the savings achieved through the enactment of HB 1840 which was signed into law as Act 111 of 2018 on October 24, 2018.

Combined, the two filings propose an overall 14.74% decrease in collectible loss costs effective January 1, 2019.

Cancellation of Certificates of Public Convenience for Common Carriers; Failure to Operate or Report Any Operating Revenue; M-2018-3003742

Final Order

By the Commission:

On August 23, 2018, the Commission entered a Tentative Order in the above-captioned proceeding to initiate the process for cancelling the Certificates of Public Convenience (CPC) of common carriers that failed to file required annual assessment reports and/or failed to establish that they have operated continuously. The Tentative Order was mailed to each carrier and was published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* on September 8, 2018. 48 Pa.B. 5683. Carriers were given 20 days from publication to challenge the cancellation of their CPCs, file a conforming Assessment Report, or, alternatively, request cancellation of their CPCs.

The carriers that were served with the August 23 Tentative Order were those carriers that failed to respond to the Commission's earlier Secretarial Letter dated May 31, 2018, requesting that they either file an assessment report detailing their intrastate operating revenues, as required by Section 510 of the Public Utility Code, 66 Pa.C.S. § 510, or notify the Commission of their desire to abandon their CPCs. Moreover, the Secretarial Letter warned the carriers that failure to comply would result in the Commission taking appropriate action to cancel their CPCs.

By way of background, the Public Utility Code requires that by March 31 of each year, every public utility must file a report detailing its gross intrastate operating revenue for the preceding calendar year. 66 Pa.C.S. § 510(b). This report is essential for the Commission to fund its operations and to properly allocate assessment costs among the regulated utility community. Id. In addition, common carriers are required to operate continuously and without unreasonable interruptions of service. 66 Pa.C.S. § 1501, 52 Pa. Code §§ 29.61-62. A carrier with no intrastate operating revenues for several years indicates that it is no longer providing jurisdictional public utility service in Pennsylvania and, therefore, a CPC for that entity is no longer "necessary or proper for the service, accommodation, convenience, or safety of the public." 66 Pa.C.S. § 1103(a). In addition, Commission regulations authorize the cancellation of a common carrier's CPC for failure to comply with operating and reporting requirements, as well as other provisions of the Public Utility Code. 52 Pa. Code §§ 29.12 (Motor Carriers of Passengers) and 31.12 (Motor Carriers of Property).

In response to the August 23 Tentative Order, the common carriers listed in Table 1 filed a conforming Assessment Report with the Commission reporting their gross intrastate operating revenue for 2017; the common

carriers listed in Table 2 filed an Assessment Report with the Commission reporting no gross intrastate operating revenue for 2017; the common carriers listed in Table 3 requested cancellation of their CPCs; and the common carriers listed in Table 4 did not respond to the Tentative Order in any way. The carriers listed in Table 5 appeared on the August 23 Tentative Order. However, their CPCs have already been cancelled through Commission action taken either shortly before or since publication of the Tentative Order in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. No further action is required with respect to these carriers.

The carriers listed in Table 1 are in compliance with the reporting requirements of 66 Pa.C.S. § 510(b) and the operational requirements of 66 Pa.C.S. § 1501 and 52 Pa. Code §§ 29.61-62. Therefore, this matter is closed with respect to these carriers. The carriers listed in Table 2 are provisionally in compliance with our reporting requirements. Therefore, this matter is closed with respect to these carriers. However, since these carriers may not be operating continuously, as required by Section 1501 of the Public Utility Code, 66 Pa.C.S. § 1501, and Sections 29.61-62 of the Commission's regulations, 52 Pa. Code §§ 29.61-62, they are advised that they must operate and report revenues from their operations or appropriate action will be taken against them.

Finally, the carriers listed in Tables 3 and 4 have either requested cancellation of their CPCs or have failed to respond to the Tentative Order, remaining in noncompliance. Moreover, each of these carriers have failed to report any intrastate operating revenues for several vears. A carrier with no intrastate operating revenues for several years indicates that it is no longer providing jurisdictional public utility service in Pennsylvania and, therefore, a CPC for that entity is no longer "necessary or proper for the service, accommodation, convenience, or safety of the public." 66 Pa.C.S. § 1103(a). Each of these carriers have had ample notice and an opportunity to be heard via the May 31, 2018 Secretarial Letter and the August 23, 2018 Tentative Order. The carriers listed in Table 3 requested that their CPCs be cancelled. None of the carrier listed in Table 4 responded. The CPCs of both groups will be cancelled; *Therefore*,

It Is Ordered That:

- 1. This matter is closed for motor carriers listed in Table 1.
- 2. Motor carriers listed in Table 2 will provisionally retain their Certificates of Public Convenience and this matter is closed with respect to these carriers. These carriers are advised that they must operate and report revenues from their operations or appropriate action will be taken against them.
- 3. The Certificate of Public Convenience for each motor carrier listed in Table 3 is cancelled at the carrier's request. These carriers shall be stricken from all active utility lists maintained by the Commission's Bureau of Technical Utility Services and the Fiscal & Assessments Section of the Bureau of Administration.
- 4. The Certificate of Public Convenience for each motor carrier listed in Table 4 is cancelled for noncompliance with the reporting and operating requirements of the Public Utility Code and Commission regulations. These carriers shall be stricken from all active utility lists maintained by the Commission's Bureau of Technical Utility Services and the Fiscal & Assessments Section of the Bureau of Administration.
- 5. The Secretary serve a copy of this Final Order upon the Bureau of Investigation & Enforcement, the Bureau

of Technical Utility Services, the Bureau of Administration, Department of Revenue—Bureau of Corporation Taxes, Department of Transportation, and all motor carriers listed in Tables 1—4. The Final Order shall be filed at each carrier's docket number.

6. The Secretary shall publish a copy of this Final Order in the $Pennsylvania\ Bulletin$.

bond or other approved security in the amount directed by the Commission has been obtained.

Each EGS must file an original bond, letter of credit, continuation certificate, amendment, or other approved financial instrument with Rosemary Chiavetta, Secretary, Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission, 400 North Street, Harrisburg, PA 17120 prior to the EGS's current security expiration date. Each financial instrument must be an original document that displays a "wet" signature or digital signature, preferable in blue ink, and displays a "raised seal" or original notary stamp. The name of the principal on the original financial instrument must match exactly with the name that appears on the EGS's license issued by the Commission.

Failure to file before the financial security's expiration date may cause Commission staff to initiate a formal proceeding that may lead to the following: cancellation of each company's electric supplier license, removal of each company's information from the Commission's website and notification to all electric distribution companies, in which each company is licensed to do business, of the cancellation of the license.

As of October 30, 2018, each EGS listed in the Supplier Table below has not provided proof to the Commission that it has a bond or other approved security in the amount directed by the Commission, to replace its expired bond.

- 5. That respondent, by failing to maintain evidence of insurance on file with this Commission, violated 66 Pa.C.S. § 512, 52 Pa. Code § 32.2(c), and 52 Pa. Code § 32.11(a), § 32.12(a) or § 32.13(a).

Wherefore, unless respondent pays the penalty of \$500 or files an answer in compliance with the attached notice and/or causes its insurer to file evidence of insurance with this Commission within twenty (20) days of the date of service of this Complaint, the Bureau of Investigation and Enforcement will request that the Commission issue an Order which (1) cancels the Certificate of Public Convenience held by respondent at A-8916398 for failure to maintain evidence of current insurance on file with the Commission, (2) fines Respondent the sum of five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for the illegal activity described in this Complaint, (3) orders such other remedy as the Commission may deem to be appropriate, which may include the suspension of a vehicle registration and (4) imposes an additional fine on the respondent should cancellation occur.
