

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# READER'S GUIDE TO THE PENNSYLVANIA BULLETIN AND THE PENNSYLVANIA CODE

#### Pennsylvania Bulletin

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the official gazette of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. It is published weekly. A cumulative subject matter index is published quarterly.

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* serves several purposes. It is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, which is the official codification of agency rules and regulations, Statewide court rules, and other statutorily authorized documents. Changes in the codified text, whether by adoption, amendment, rescission, repeal or emergency action, must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

The following documents are published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*: Governor's Executive Orders; Summaries of Enacted Statutes; Statewide and Local Court Rules; Attorney General Opinions; Motor Carrier Applications before the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission; Applications and Actions before the Department of Environmental Protection; Orders of the Independent Regulatory Review Commission; and other documents authorized by law.

The text of certain documents published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the only valid and enforceable text. Courts are required to take judicial notice of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

## Adoption, Amendment or Repeal of Regulations

Generally an agency wishing to adopt, amend or rescind regulations must first publish in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* a Proposed Rulemaking. There are limited instances when the agency may omit the proposal step; it still must publish the adopted version.

The Proposed Rulemaking contains the full text of the change, the agency contact person, a fiscal note required by law and background for the action.

The agency then allows sufficient time for public comment before taking final action. A Final Rule-making must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* before the changes can take effect. If the agency wishes to adopt changes to the Proposed Rulemaking to enlarge the scope, it must repropose.

#### Citation to the Pennsylvania Bulletin

Cite material in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* by volume number, a page number and date. Example: Volume 1, *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, page 801, January 9, 1971 (short form: 1 Pa.B. 801 (January 9, 1971)).

#### Pennsylvania Code

The *Pennsylvania Code* is the official codification of rules and regulations issued by Commonwealth agencies, Statewide court rules and other statutorily authorized documents. The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, printing changes when they are adopted. These changes are then permanently codified by the *Pennsylvania Code Reporter*, a monthly, loose-leaf supplement.

The *Pennsylvania Code* is cited by title number and section number. Example: Title 10 *Pennsylvania Code* § 1.1 (short form: 10 Pa. Code § 1.1).

Under the *Pennsylvania Code* codification system, each regulation is assigned a unique number by title and section. Titles roughly parallel the organization of Commonwealth government.

#### **How to Find Rules and Regulations**

Search for your area of interest in the *Pennsylva*nia Code. The *Pennsylvania Code* is available at www.pacode.com.

Source Notes give the history of regulations. To see if there have been recent changes not yet codified, check the List of *Pennsylvania Code* Chapters Affected in the most recent issue of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

A chronological table of the history of *Pennsylva-nia Code* sections may be found at www.legis.state.pa.us/cfdocs/legis/CH/Public/pcde\_index.cfm.

A quarterly List of *Pennsylvania Code* Sections Affected lists the regulations in numerical order, followed by the citation to the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* in which the change occurred.

Court Rules in Titles 201—246 of the Pennsylvania Code

Added text in proposed and adopted court rules is printed in <u>underscored bold face</u>. Deleted text in proposed and adopted court rules is enclosed in brackets [ ] and printed in **bold face**.

Proposed new chapters and rules are printed in regular type to enhance readability.

Ellipses, a series of five asterisks, indicate text that is not amended.

#### **Fiscal Notes**

Section 612 of The Administrative Code of 1929 (71 P.S. § 232) requires the Governor's Budget Office to prepare a fiscal note for regulatory actions and administrative procedures of the administrative departments, boards, commissions and authorities receiving money from the State Treasury. The fiscal note states whether the action or procedure causes a loss of revenue or an increase in the cost of programs for the Commonwealth or its political subdivisions. The fiscal note is required to be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* at the same time as the change is advertised.

A fiscal note provides the following information: (1) the designation of the fund out of which the appropriation providing for expenditures under the action or procedure shall be made; (2) the probable cost for the fiscal year the program is implemented; (3) projected cost estimate of the program for each of the 5 succeeding fiscal years; (4) fiscal history of the program for which expenditures are to be made; (5) probable loss of revenue for the fiscal year of its implementation; (6) projected loss of revenue from the program for each of the 5 succeeding fiscal years; (7) line item, if any, of the General Appropriation Act or other appropriation act out of which expenditures or losses of Commonwealth funds shall occur as a result of the action or procedures; and (8) recommendation, if any, of the Secretary of the Budget and the reasons therefor.

The omission of an item indicates that the agency text of the fiscal note states that there is no information available with respect thereto. In items (3) and (6) information is set forth for the first through fifth fiscal years, following the year the program is implemented, which is stated. In item (4) information is set forth for the current and two immediately preceding years. In item (8) the recommendation, if any, made by the Secretary of the Budget is published with the fiscal note. "No fiscal impact" means no additional cost or revenue loss to the Commonwealth or its local political subdivision is intended. See 4 Pa. Code Chapter 7, Subchapter R (relating to fiscal notes).

#### Reproduction, Dissemination or Publication of Information

Third parties may not take information from the *Pennsylvania Code* and *Pennsylvania Bulletin* and reproduce, disseminate or publish information except as provided by 1 Pa. Code § 3.44:

#### § 3.44. General permission to reproduce content of Code and Bulletin.

Information published under this part, which information includes, but is not limited to, cross references, tables of cases, notes of decisions, tables of contents, indexes, source notes, authority notes, numerical lists and codification guides, other than the actual text of rules or regulations may be reproduced only with the written consent of the [Legislative Reference] Bureau. The information which appears on the same leaf with the text of a rule or regulation, however, may be incidentally reproduced in connection with the reproduction of the rule or regulation, if the reproduction is for the private use of a subscriber and not for resale. There are no other restrictions on the reproduction of information published under this part, and the Commonwealth hereby consents to a reproduction.

#### Rule of Judicial Administration L-1901. Prompt Disposition of Matters; Termination of Inactive Cases; Magisterial District Judge Courts.

It is the policy of the Court of Common Pleas in Butler County to bring each pending matter in the Butler County Magisterial District Judge offices to a final conclusion as promptly as possible, consistent with the character of the matter and the resources of the system. Where a matter has been inactive for an unreasonable period of time, the Court, upon request of the Magisterial District Judge, shall enter an appropriate order terminating the matter.

The request for termination shall be made on a form that shall be created by the Butler County District Court Administrator and shall include such specific information as is needed to properly identify the case or cases to be terminated. Requests for termination of cases shall be submitted to the Butler County Court Administrator's Office before being submitted to the Court for the entry of an order terminating cases.

Before any order terminating a matter on the ground of unreasonable inactivity is entered, the parties shall be given at least 30 days written notice of opportunity for hearing on such proposed termination. Notice shall be made consistent with Pa.RJA Rule 1901(c). Unreasonable inactivity shall be defined as any proceeding in which no

steps or proceedings have been taken for two years or more prior to the submission of the request to terminate the matter.

## Rule 507A. Approval of Police Complaints and Arrest Warrant Affidavits by Attorney for the Commonwealth.

(A) The District Attorney of Delaware County, having filed a certificate pursuant to Pennsylvania Rule of Criminal Procedure 507, Criminal Complaints and Arrest Warrant Affidavits by police officers, as defined in the Rules of Criminal Procedure charging the following criminal offenses:

Criminal Homicide in violation of 18 Pa.C.S.A. Section 2501:

Murder in any degree in violation of 18 Pa.C.S.A. Section 2502;

Voluntary Manslaughter in violation of 18 Pa.C.S.A. Section 2503;

Involuntary Manslaughter in violation of 18 Pa.C.S.A. Section 2504;

Causing or aiding suicide in violation of 18 Pa.C.S.A. Section 2505;

Drug delivery resulting in death in violation of 18 Pa.C.S.A. Section 2506;

Criminal Homicide of unborn child in violation of 18 Pa.C.S.A. Section 2603;

Murder in any degree of unborn child in violation of 18 Pa.C.S.A. Section 2604;

Voluntary Manslaughter of unborn child in violation of 18 Pa.C.S.A. Section 2605;

Aggravated Assault of unborn child in violation of 18 Pa.C.S.A. Section 2606;

Homicide by Vehicle in violation of 75 Pa.C.S.A. Section 3732; and

Homicide by Vehicle While Driving Under the Influence in violation of 75 Pa.C.S.A. Section 3735

Aggravated Assault by vehicle While Driving Under the Influence in violation of 75 Pa.C.S.A. Section 3735.1;

Aggravated Assault by Vehicle in violation of 75 Pa.C.S.A. Section 3732.1;

Rape in violation of 18 Pa.C.S.A. Section 3121;

Statutory Sexual Assault in violation of 18 Pa.C.S.A. Section 3122.1;

Involuntary Deviate Sexual Intercourse in violation of 18 Pa.C.S.A. Section 3123;

Sexual Assault in violation of 18 Pa.C.S.A. Section 3124.1;

Institutional Sexual Assault in violation of 18 Pa.C.S.A. Section 3124.2; and

Aggravated Indecent Assault in violation of 18 Pa.C.S.A. Section 3125;

shall not hereafter be accepted by any judicial officer unless the Complaint and Affidavit have the approval of a Deputy District Attorney of the Delaware County District Attorney's Office prior to filing.

(B) Upon disapproval of a police complaint, arrest warrant affidavit, or both by an attorney for the Commonwealth, the attorney for the Commonwealth shall furnish to the police officer who prepared the complaint, affidavit, or both a written notice of the disapproval, and the attorney for the Commonwealth shall maintain a record of the written notice.

## INDIANA COUNTY Booking Center Fee; 55 MD 2018

#### **Administrative Order of Court**

And Now, this 31st day of January 2018, it is hereby Ordered and Directed that pursuant to 42 Pa.C.S.A. §§ 1725.5 and 1725.6, a booking center fee of fifty dollars (\$50) shall be imposed against defendants who are placed on Probation Without Verdict, receive Accelerated Rehabilitative Disposition for, plead guilty or nolo contendere to, or are convicted of a misdemeanor or felony offense in accordance with 42 Pa.C.S.A. § 1725.5.

The fee shall be assessed as a cost of prosecution and collected by the Indiana County Clerk of Courts. The fee shall be allocated to a Central Booking Center Fund for the implementation, start-up, operation and maintenance of the booking center.

The booking center shall be available for all law enforcement agencies having arrest powers in Indiana County. The adoption of the fee shall be effective February 12, 2018.

- a. One copy via email to the Administrative Office of Pennsylvania Courts;
- b. Two paper copies and one electronic copy in Microsoft Word format on a CD-ROM to the Legislative Reference Bureau for publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*;
- c. One copy for publication on the Courts Page of the Luzerne County website, located at www.luzernecounty.org; and,
- d. One copy each to the Luzerne County Office of Court Administration, the Luzerne County Law Library, and the Luzerne County Clerk of Judicial Records for public inspection and copying.

## LUZERNE COUNTY RULES OF CIVIL PROCEDURE CONSUMER CREDIT CARD/DEBT COLLECTION ACTIONS

## Rule 1144. Commencement of Consumer Credit Card/Debt Collection Actions.

(a) Filing. In all consumer credit card/debt collection actions, the caption of the complaint shall include the words "Consumer Credit Card/Debt Collection Action." Plaintiff/lender in all consumer credit card/debt collection actions shall, simultaneously with the filing of the complaint (whether filing was completed in person to the Clerk of Judicial Records, or electronically in accordance with Luz.Co.R.C.P. No. 205.4.), email a copy of the filed complaint to the court at consumerdebtactions@luzernecounty.org.

- (b) Service. If at least one attempt at service of the complaint is made, and service is not perfected, the plaintiff shall petition the court for alternative service within thirty (30) days after the first failed attempt at service, or the action shall be dismissed. This rule shall not apply where the plaintiff is able to perfect service within fifteen days after the first failed attempt at service. Upon completion of service, plaintiff/lender shall, simultaneously with the filing of the certificate of service (whether filing was completed in person to the Clerk of Judicial Records, or electronically in accordance with Luz.Co.R.C.P. No. 205.4), email a copy of the filed certificate of service to the court at consumerdebtactions@luzernecounty.org.
- (c) Following the filing and service of the complaint, the court shall issue a practice order in substantially the format set forth in Form 12 of the Appendix to these Rules, scheduling the matter for the next available conciliation conference list and staying any pleading deadlines in the matter pending the outcome of the conciliation conference.

#### Rule 1144.1. Conciliation Conference in Consumer Credit Card/Debt Collection Actions.

- (a) The practice order shall specify the date and place of the conciliation conference and shall be forwarded by the program administrator and/or the Judge assigned to the consumer credit card/debt collection actions via ordinary mail to the parties.
- (b) The schedule for the year shall be set by the program administrator and/or the Judge assigned to the consumer credit card/debt collection actions no later than September of the year prior and will be published in the Luzerne Legal Register and on the Luzerne County Court website at www.luzernecountycourts.com and/or www. luzernecounty.org. For the inaugural year of the case management protocol for consumer credit card/debt collection actions, the program administrator and/or the Judge assigned to the consumer credit card/debt collection actions shall set the schedule for the current calendar year at least one month prior to the start of the case management protocol and shall publish the schedule in the Luzerne Legal Register and on the Luzerne County Court website at www.luzernecountycourts.com and/or www. luzernecounty.org.
- (c) Conciliation conferences will be conducted by the program administrator and/or Judge assigned to the consumer credit card/debt collection actions. Counsel for the plaintiff/lender and the defendant/borrower, including private counsel, if any, must attend the conciliation conference in person and an authorized representative of the plaintiff/lender must be available by phone at the conciliation conference. The representative of the plaintiff lender who participates in the conciliation conference must possess the actual authority to reach a mutually acceptable resolution, and counsel for the plaintiff/lender must discuss resolution proposals with that authorized representative in advance of the conciliation conference. Counsel for the plaintiff/lender shall bring to the conciliation conference the contract signed by the defendant/ borrower, proof of damages, the last billing statement sent to the defendant/borrower, and written proof of any assignments of the contract.
- (d) If the defendant/borrower has been served and does not appear at the conciliation conference, absent good cause shown, judgment shall be entered in favor of the plaintiff/lender. If the plaintiff/lender fails to appear and/or have an authorized representative available with

the required documentation at the conciliation conference, absent good cause shown, the court shall dismiss the case with prejudice. Any request for continuance on the day of the conciliation conference by either party is strongly discouraged.

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- (e) At the conciliation conference, the parties shall be prepared to discuss and explore all available resolution options, including, but not limited to, a mutually agreed upon payment plan. In the event that the parties reach an agreement, the court will issue a consent judgment/order substantially in the format set forth in Form 13 of the Appendix to these Rules, setting forth the agreement.
- (f) If an agreement is not reached by the parties at the conciliation conference, the stay of pleading deadlines will be immediately lifted and the court shall issue a scheduling order substantially in the format set forth in Form 14 of the Appendix to these Rules.

#### FORM 12 PRACTICE ORDER

Counsel for Plaintiff shall bring to the conciliation conference the contract signed by Defendant, proof of damages, the last billing statement sent to defendant, and written proof of any assignments of the contract.
- 4. If DEFENDANT FAILS TO APPEAR at the conciliation conference, absent good cause shown, Plaintiff will be granted a judgment in its favor.
- 5. If PLAINTIFF FAILS TO APPEAR and/or have an authorized representative and/or counsel available with the required documentation at the conciliation conference, absent good cause shown, the case will be dismissed with prejudice.
- 6. If the parties reach an agreement at the conciliation conference, the court will issue a consent judgment/order setting forth the agreement. Plaintiff shall be responsible for filing the consent judgment/order with the Clerk of Judicial Records (Prothonotary). The filing fee for a consent judgment/order is \_\_\_\_\_, as set forth in the current Clerk of Judicial Records Fee Schedule.
- 7. If an agreement is not reached at the conciliation conference, the court shall enter a scheduling order setting forth deadlines for the timely disposition of the case.
- 8. Defendant may contact North Penn Legal Services for possible representation at the conciliation conference by calling 877-953-4250 to determine eligibility. If interested, Defendant is encouraged to do so as soon as possible.

## 2018 Referendum on Continuation of the Pennsylvania Vegetable Marketing and Research Program

- I. The Pennsylvania Vegetable Marketing and Research Program was established under the provisions of the Agricultural Commodities Marketing Act. The Act requires that the Secretary of Agriculture call a referendum of affected producers every five years to determine if a majority of those voting still desire the program. The program was last subjected to a review referendum conducted in 2013. It is now time for another review referendum to determine if a majority of the vegetable producers desire the program to continue. The current program order, which is to be considered for continuation, is published in its entirety as Appendix "A" to this document.
- II. Referendum Period: The referendum period shall be from March 5, 2018, until 4 p.m. on March 20, 2018. Completed ballots shall be mailed or hand-delivered to the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture, Bureau of Market Development, Room 310, 2301 North Cameron Street, Harrisburg, Pennsylvania 17110-9408. Hand-delivered ballots must be received by 4 p.m. on March 23, 2018. Ballots that are mailed must be postmarked no later than March 20, 2018, and received no later than March 23, 2018.
- III. Notice of Referendum: This referendum order and an official ballot shall be mailed no later than February 26, 2018, to all affected producers whose names appear on the list of Pennsylvania vegetable producers maintained in the Office of the Secretary of Agriculture. Additional copies of the same materials shall be made available at the Office of the Secretary of Agriculture.
- IV. Eligible Voters: In order for a vegetable producer to be eligible to vote, the vegetable producer must have done one or more of the following in the growing season running from January 1, 2017 through December 31, 2017: (a) The vegetable producer grew one (1) or more acres of vegetables within Pennsylvania for the purpose of selling said vegetables; and/or (b) The vegetable producer grew vegetables in one or more greenhouses located within Pennsylvania from total greenhouse space of 1,000 square feet or more, grew those vegetables for sale, and did not grow those vegetables to be transplanted outdoors; and/or (c) The vegetable producer grew vegetables within Pennsylvania and sold them for a total of \$2,000 or more.
- V. Counting of Ballots: The ballots will be canvassed and counted by a Teller Committee appointed by the Secretary of Agriculture. The counting of the ballots will begin at 10 a.m., Wednesday, March 28, 2018, at the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture, 2301 North Cameron Street, Harrisburg, Pennsylvania 17110. The Secretary will announce the results of the referendum within 30 days following the completion of the referendum period. The results will be published in the Pennsylvania Bulletin and the Harrisburg Patriot-News, and disseminated to the news media.
- VI. Reporting Irregularities: Any irregularities or disputes concerning the referendum procedures must be

reported in written form to the Secretary of Agriculture not later than seven (7) calendar days from the end of the referendum period.

- VII. *Publication*: This referendum order shall be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* and the *Harrisburg Patriot-News*.
- VIII. Effective Date: The foregoing order shall be effective immediately.

#### Appendix A

#### 2018 Referendum on Continuation of the Pennsylvania Vegetable Marketing and Research Program

#### Article I—Declaration.

In accordance with requirements of the Agricultural Commodities Marketing Act as amended, the Secretary of Agriculture finds that this program effectuates the purposes of said Act.

#### Article II—Definitions.

As used in this marketing program, the following words and terms shall have the following meaning unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

- 1. "Act" means the Act of March 24, 1998 (P.L. 217, No. 39) (3 Pa.C.S.A. §§ 4501—4513), as amended, known as the Agricultural Commodities Marketing Act.
- 2. "Commodity Marketing Board" or "Board" consists of the Secretary plus those persons who are appointed by the Secretary from among producers whose commodities are subject to this marketing program and from among certain sales agents required by regulation to collect or assist in the collection of producer charges under the authority of Section 10(b) of the Act, that person who is appointed by the Secretary from among such sales agents.
- 3. "Department" means the Department of Agriculture of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.
- 4. "Greenhouse" means any enclosed structure for growing vegetables, including both structures where the internal temperature is controlled and high tunnels where no additional heat is supplied. The term does not include low tunnels.
- 5. "Marketing Contract" Any contract or agreement between the Commodity Marketing Board and a person for the performance of services relating to advertising, marketing, promotion, or research, or other objectives in furtherance of this marketing program.
- 6. "Marketing Season" The period from October 15, 2011 through December 31, 2012, and thereafter from January 1 through December 31 of each calendar year.
- 7. "Person" means an individual, partnership, firm, corporation, association or other business unit.
- 8. "Producer" means a person who does one or more of the following during a particular marketing season:
- a. Grows one (1) or more acres of vegetables within this Commonwealth for the purpose of selling said vegetables.
- b. Grows vegetables in one or more greenhouses located within this Commonwealth if: (1) the greenhouse(s)

is/are used for growing vegetables in 1,000 square feet or more of growing space; and (2) the vegetables are grown for sale; and (3) the vegetables are not grown to be transplanted outdoors.

- c. Grows vegetables within this Commonwealth and sells \$2,000 or more of the vegetables grown in a given marketing season.
- 9. "Sales Agent" means any processor, auction, packing house, fresh market vegetable stand, cooperative, broker, wholesaler, commission merchant or any person who purchases, handles, processes, receives, sells or contracts to sell vegetables originating from a producer. A producer may be a sales agent with respect to his own production.
- 10. "Secretary" means the Secretary of Agriculture of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, or his designee.
- 11. "Vegetables" means all vegetables except Irish potatoes, including but not limited to: asparagus, beans (snap, dry and lima), beets, cabbage, cauliflower, broccoli, Brussels sprouts, collards, kale, mustard greens, kohlrabi, carrots, celery, corn (sweet, pop and ornamental), cucumbers, eggplant, garlic, horseradish, leeks, lettuce, muskmelons, watermelon, onions, parsley, parsnips, peas, peppers, pumpkins, squash (edible and decorative), gourds, radishes, rutabagas, spinach, sweet potatoes, tomatoes, and turnips, produced in Pennsylvania for the purpose of sale by a producer as herein defined.

#### Article III-Scope of Program.

The area affected by this marketing program shall be the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. The persons affected by this marketing program shall be the "producers" described herein at Article II.

#### Article IV—Commodity Marketing Board.

Section A. Establishment and Members.

The Commodity Marketing Board shall consist of fourteen (14) members, one of whom shall be the Secretary, or his designee. The Board shall have the primary decisionmaking authority in the administration of this marketing program, as provided in the Act.

For the purpose of representing the producers on the Commodity Marketing Board, the state shall be divided into three (3) production areas (West, Central, and East). Four (4) Board members representing producers shall be appointed from each production area. Such Board members shall represent fresh market vegetable producers, producers of vegetables for processing, and greenhouse vegetable producers.

As this marketing program requires certain sales agents to collect or assist in the collection of producer charges under authority of Section 10(b) of the Act, the Secretary shall appoint one (1) Board member from among such sales agents.

Section B. Term of Office.

- 1. The term of office of each appointed member shall be for three (3) years, beginning July 1 and ending June 30: Provided, that the terms of office of the initial appointed members of the Commodity Marketing Board shall be staggered as follows: Four (4) members shall serve one (1) year, four (4) members shall serve two (2) years, and four (4) members shall serve for three (3) years. All members appointed subsequent to those first appointed, and the member appointed to represent sales agents, shall serve three (3) year terms.
- 2. The Secretary, or his designee, will be a member of the Commodity Marketing Board, and the other Board

members shall be appointed by the Secretary. Twelve (12) Board members shall be appointed from among affected producers. One (1) Board member shall be appointed by the Secretary from among sales agents. In making these appointments, the Secretary shall consider nominations submitted by the affected producers or sales agents.

- 3. Successor members to fill the expired terms of members of the Commodity Marketing Board shall be appointed in the same manner as the initial members of the Commodity Marketing Board. Members shall serve in such capacities for the portion of the term of office for which they are appointed and until their respective successors are appointed and have qualified.
- 4. Any person appointed to represent producers as a member of the Commodity Marketing Board shall be and remain a producer while a member of the Board. A person appointed to represent sales agents as a member of the Board shall be and remain a sales agent while a member of the Board. Any person appointed to the Board shall qualify by filing a written acceptance with the Secretary within fifteen (15) days of being notified of appointment.
- 5. To fill any vacancy occasioned by the failure of any person appointed as a member of the Commodity Marketing Board, a successor for the unexpired term of such member shall be appointed by the Secretary from among the affected producers or sales agents.
- 6. The regular meetings of the Board will be held at least four (4) times a year.

Section C. Powers and Duties of the Board.

The Commodity Marketing Board shall have the primary decision-making authority relative to marketing contracts and other projects in furtherance of this marketing program and includes the following powers and duties:

- 1. To determine all matters pertaining to this marketing program.
- 2. To hire and employ personnel which the Board deems necessary for the proper administration of this marketing program and to fix the compensation and terms of employment of such personnel.
- 3. To adopt written procedures for acquiring and disposing of property, and subject to these procedures, to acquire, own, use, hire, lease, operate and dispose of personal property, real property and interests in real property.
- 4. To make and enter into all contracts and agreements, in accordance with the provisions of the law, which the Board deems necessary or incidental to the furtherance of the marketing program or performance of duties and powers pursuant to the Act. The Board shall adopt written procurement procedures for all marketing contracts.
- 5. To receive, account for and disburse all monies collected pursuant to this marketing program, the Act and any applicable regulations. Funds should generally be disbursed to benefit the fresh market producers in proportion to the amount received from the fresh market acreage and likewise to proportionately benefit the processing producers and greenhouse producers.
- 6. To prepare a budget for the administration, operating costs and expenses of this marketing program.
- 7. To receive and report to the Secretary complaints or violations of this marketing program and to assist and cooperate with the Secretary in the enforcement thereof.

- 8. To establish committees or subcommittees to carry out assigned duties and functions, and to designate Board members and non-board members to serve on such committees and subcommittees.
- 9. To collect and gather information and data relevant to the proper administration of this marketing program.
- 10. To charge fees and to assist the Secretary in the imposition of fees and the collection of fees and revenue pursuant to the Act.
- 11. To issue an annual report on the operation of this marketing program.
- 12. To recommend amendments to this marketing program and amendments to the Act and regulations issued pursuant thereto.

#### Section D. Expenses and Compensation.

No member of the Board shall receive a salary, but each shall be entitled to actual expenses incurred while engaged in performing duties authorized herein. In addition, a per diem payment may be made to each Board Member or subcommittee member for each day in which a Board Member or subcommittee member is performing a duty necessary to the functions of the Board. The per diem payment shall not exceed the maximum sum allowable under the Act.

#### Article V—Powers and Duties of the Secretary.

Subject to the provisions contained in the Act, the Secretary shall administer and enforce the provisions of the Act, and shall have and shall exercise all administrative powers necessary to effectuate the purposes of the Act, including the issuance of this marketing program, the appointment of members to the Commodity Marketing Board and the providing of personnel, staff, legal counsel, and office facilities required for the administration and enforcement of this marketing program.

#### Article VI—Purpose.

This marketing program is to provide funds to be used to contract with any person, organization, or state or federal agency, to prepare, issue, administer and enforce plans for promoting the sale of vegetables or vegetable products without reference to any particular firm's or individual's brand or trade name. No advertising or sales promotion program shall be approved, which shall make use of false or unwarranted claims or disparage the quality, value, sale or use of any other agricultural commodity.

This marketing program further provides funds to be contracted with any person, organization, or state or federal agency for conducting research deemed beneficial to the vegetable industry. Program funds may also be used to develop information designed to inform producers of quality standards and quality improvements. The Secretary and the Board may cooperate with any other state or Federal agency, or other organization whose activities may be deemed beneficial to the purpose of this Act.

### Article VII—Budget, Rate of Assessment, Collection of Assessment, Disbursement of Funds.

Section A. Budget and Assessment.

A budget shall be prepared and established for the administration and enforcement of this marketing program and for carrying out duly authorized programs and activities of marketing or research as herein provided.

The rate of assessment shall be the lesser of the following:

- a. a flat fee of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) per affected producer ("affected producer" is defined herein at Article III, relating to scope of program) plus \$1.50 for each acre of field vegetable production and each 1,000 square feet of greenhouse vegetable production beyond the initial five of these acreage and/or square-footage units; or
- b. an amount equal to 1.25% (.0125) of gross sales of vegetables during a particular marketing season, but no less than twenty-five dollars (\$25).

Producers shall report what part of their total acreage is utilized for fresh market production and the part utilized for processing production.

Section B. Collection of Assessment/Charge.

- 1. Each producer shall be responsible for payment of the proper assessment upon the vegetables which he produces or causes to be produced, and sells or delivers for sale.
- 2. All producers shall make remittance and accounting of the proper assessment to the Secretary or his designated fiscal agent no later than the 31st day of January immediately following the applicable marketing season, or such other period as established by regulation.
- 3. Any delinquent producer may be assessed a penalty for late payments as established by regulation.

#### Section C. Disbursement of Funds.

- 1. Disbursement of funds shall be made in the manner described in the Act and in any rules or any regulations promulgated by the Secretary to effectuate the provisions and intent thereof, and in accordance with the provisions of this marketing program.
- 2. Funds should generally be disbursed to include support for vegetable promotion or research, approximately in proportion to the amounts provided by fresh market, processing, and greenhouse segments of the vegetable industry.

#### Article VIII—Effecting Marketing Program.

This marketing program, or any amendment thereto, shall not become effective unless and until the Secretary determines by a referendum whether or not the affected producers assent to the proposed action. The Secretary shall conduct the referendum among affected producers and the affected producers shall be deemed to have assented to the proposed program if, of those voting, not less than a majority by number and a majority by acreage and square footage assent to the proposed program.

#### Article IX—Amending Marketing Program.

The Secretary shall call for a referendum on amendments to the marketing program within a reasonable period of time, upon the request of the Board or with written request of ten percent of the producers in a commodity group of over two thousand affected producers or fifteen percent of the producers in a commodity group of less than two thousand affected producers. In voting on an amendment to the marketing program, the vote shall be only on the amendment, and shall not terminate the program.

#### Article X—Terminating Marketing Program.

Subject to approval of the Board, the Secretary shall suspend or terminate this marketing program or any provisions hereof whenever he finds that such provisions

or program does not tend to effectuate the purpose of the Act within the standards and subject to the limitations and restrictions imposed in the Act: Provided that such termination or suspension shall not be effective until the expiration of the current marketing season.

If the Secretary finds that the termination of the marketing program is requested in writing, by more than thirty-three and one-third percent of the affected producers who produce for market more than fifty percent of the volume of agricultural commodities produced within the designated production area for market, the Secretary shall terminate or suspend for a specified period, the program or provisions thereof; Provided that such termination shall be effective only if announced on or before the first day of July in any calendar year. If ten percent of the producers in a commodity group of over two thousand affected producers or fifteen percent of the producers in a commodity group of less than two thousand affected producers, request in writing, that a referendum be held on the question of terminating the program, the Secretary must announce and conduct a

referendum within a reasonable period of time. The program shall be terminated if so voted by a majority of those voting.

#### Article XI—Marketing Program Reviewed.

At intervals of no greater than five (5) years, the Secretary of Agriculture shall call a referendum to determine whether or not a majority of the vegetable producers voting still desire a Commodity Marketing Program.

#### Article XII—Interpretation.

Applicable provisions of this marketing program shall be interpreted consistent with the Act and the Act shall take precedence in the event of any conflict with this market program.

#### Article XIII—Effective Date.

The Program shall become effective 21 days from publication of the notice of issuance in accordance with Section 9 of the Act.

## DEPARTMENT OF BANKING AND SECURITIES

## Maximum Lawful Rate of Interest for Residential Mortgages for the Month of March 2018

The Department of Banking and Securities (Department), under the authority in section 301 of the act of January 30, 1974 (P.L. 13, No. 6) (41 P.S. § 301), determines that the maximum lawful rate of interest for residential mortgages for the month of March 2018, is 5 1/4%.

The interest rate limitations under the Commonwealth's usury statute were pre-empted to a great extent by Federal law, the Depository Institutions Deregulation and Monetary Control Act of 1980 (Pub.L. No. 96-221). Further pre-emption was instituted with the signing of Pub.L. No. 96-399, which overrode State interest rate limitations on any individual who finances the sale or exchange of residential real property which such individual owns and which such individual occupies or has occupied as his principal residence.

Each month the Department is required by State law to compute and announce the ceiling rate on residential mortgages this Commonwealth. This maximum rate is determined by adding 2.50 percentage points to the yield rate on long-term government bonds as published by the Federal Reserve Board or the United States Treasury, or both. The latest yield rate on long-term government securities is 2.73 to which was added 2.50 percentage points for a total of 5.23 that by law is rounded off to the nearest quarter at 5 1/4%.

The purpose of this funding is to create a partnership among the Federal government, states and localities to provide, on a voluntary basis, adult education and literacy activities to: assist adults to become literate and obtain the knowledge and skills necessary for employment and economic self-sufficiency; assist adults who are parents or family members to obtain the education and skills that are necessary to becoming full partners in the educational development of their children, and lead to sustainable improvements in the economic opportunities for their family; assist adults in attaining a secondary school diploma and in the transition to postsecondary education and training, including through career pathways; and assist immigrants and other individuals who are English language learners in improving their reading, writing, speaking and comprehension skills in English and their mathematics skills; and in acquiring an understanding of the American system of government, individual freedom and the responsibilities of citizenship.

The Department, Bureau of Postsecondary and Adult Education, Division of Adult Education will accept applications for the following grants:

- Adult Basic Education Direct Service.

Eligible Applicants

Federal: Title II of WIOA

As defined in Title II of WIOA (29 U.S.C.A. §§ 3271—3333), an eligible provider is an organization that has demonstrated effectiveness in providing adult education and literacy activities that may include:

- 1. A local education agency.
- 2. A community-based organization or faith-based organization.
  - 3. A volunteer literacy organization.
  - 4. An institution of higher education.
  - 5. A public or private nonprofit agency.
  - 6. A library.
  - 7. A public housing authority.
- 8. A nonprofit institution that is not described previously and has the ability to provide adult education and literacy activities to eligible individuals.
- 9. A consortium or coalition of the agencies, organizations, institutions, libraries or authorities described previously.

10. A partnership between an employer and an entity described previously.

For the purposes of determining demonstrated effectiveness to qualify as an eligible provider, the Department will require applicants to provide hard data for the immediate preceding 3 program years. The data must demonstrate the applicant's success in helping students achieve the following outcomes:

- 1. Improvement of skills in mathematics, reading, writing or English language proficiency, especially for individuals with low literacy.
  - 2. Earning a high school equivalency credential.
  - 3. Getting a job.
  - 4. Retaining a job.
  - 5. Enrolling in postsecondary education or training.

The data must include the numbers in the numerator, denominator and percentage. Applicants also must explain how the data were collected and outcomes determined.

State: Act 143 of 1986 Funds

As defined in the act, an eligible local education provider is an approved educational agency, institution or organization making use of either professional or voluntary personnel, which may be any of the following:

- 1. School districts.
- 2. Intermediate units.
- 3. Area vocational-technical schools.
- 4. Community colleges.
- 5. Literacy councils.
- 6. Local libraries.
- 7. Community-based organizations that are private, nonprofit organizations and are representative of communities or significant parts of communities and which provide adult or family literacy education programs.
- 8. Any other educational entity recognized by the Secretary of Education for providing appropriate and effective adult or family literacy education programs.

For the purposes of the competition in this Commonwealth for both Federal and State funds, a consortium or coalition of agencies will be defined as a main grantee with one or more subgrantees. The main grantee will serve as both the fiscal agent for the grant and a provider of some of the services proposed in the grant application. The main grantee is responsible for ensuring that all activities provided are completed as proposed and is responsible for monitoring and compliance of the subgrantees. Answers in the grant application should reflect the work of the consortium/coalition as a whole rather than treat each entity separately. Applicants cannot subcontract with another applicant for a portion of the proposed services. Agencies can only be a main grantee or a subgrantee.

Successful grant applications for the Adult Basic Education Direct Service, Integrated English Literacy and Civics Education Program and the Statewide Distance Learning Project Direct Service will be approved for a 4-year grant cycle. Grant funds will be awarded through annual 1-year notifications of funding contingent upon availability of funds. Each year, grantees will be required

to submit budgets and program year specific information by the eGrants system to receive funding. Each year's renewal option and grant amounts will be based on the following criteria:

- 1. Contract compliance, including success in meeting contracted enrollment and providing the contracted services.
- 2. Evidence of sufficient progress in meeting the State imposed performance standards.
  - 3. Evidence of continuous program improvement.
- 4. Compliance with fiscal and programmatic policies and guidelines.
  - 5. The amount of the State and Federal appropriation.

The grant period for the Distance Learning Technical Assistance Project will be 1 year, July 1, 2018, through June 30, 2019, with the option to renew for up to 2 additional years. Funding for the renewal years will be negotiated annually and provided through annual contract renewals. The Department reserves the right to shorten or extend the grant cycle as the situation warrants. Each year's renewal option and grant amount will be based on the following criteria:

- 1. Contract compliance, including adherence to policy and timely submission of reports.
- 2. Compliance with fiscal and programmatic policies and guidelines.
  - 3. Amount of the Federal and State appropriation.
- 4. Results of the project's evaluation, which will include:
- a. Meeting outcomes, timelines and completion dates set with the Division of Adult Education at the beginning of each program year.
- b. Satisfactory implementation of activities required by the Division of Adult Education under this grant.
  - c. Participation in an external evaluation.

Title II of WIOA establishes requirements for the grant competition process, including items that must be addressed in the grant applications and items that the Department must take into consideration when awarding grants. This Request for Grant Applications and the questions in the grant narrative are designed to ensure that all necessary information is included. The Division of Adult Education strongly encourages applicants to refer to Programs and Activities Authorized by the Adult Education and Family Literacy Act (Title II of the Workforce Innovation and Opporunity Act), published at 81 FR 55526 (August 19, 2016), when completing the grant application. See 34 CFR 463.20 and 46.22 (relating to what is the process that the eligible agency must follow in awarding grants or contracts to eligible providers; and what must be included in the eligible provider's application for a grant or contract).

Persons wishing to comment on WQM permit applications are invited to submit statements to the office noted before the application within 15 days from the date of this public notice. A comment submittal should include the name, address and telephone number of the writer and a concise statement to inform the Department of the exact basis of a comment and the relevant facts upon which it is based.

The Department will also accept requests for public hearings on applications. A public hearing may be held if the responsible office considers the public response significant. If a hearing is scheduled, a notice of the hearing will be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* and a newspaper of general circulation within the relevant geographical area. ### MINING ACTIVITY NPDES DRAFT PERMITS

This notice provides information about applications for a new, amended or renewed NPDES permits associated with mining activity (coal or noncoal) permits. The applications concern industrial waste (mining) discharges to surface water and discharges of stormwater associated with mining activities. This notice is provided in accordance with 25 Pa. Code Chapters 91 and 92a and 40 CFR Part 122, implementing provisions of The Clean Streams Law (35 P.S. §§ 691.1—691.1001) and the Federal Clean Water Act (33 U.S.C.A. §§ 1251—1376).

The Department of Environmental Protection (Department) has prepared a draft NPDES permit and made a tentative determination to issue the NPDES permit in conjunction with the associated mining activity permit.

Effluent Limits for Coal Mining Activities

For coal mining activities, NPDES permits, when issued, will contain effluent limits that are the more stringent of technology-based (BAT) effluent limitations or Water Quality Based Effluent Limits (WQBEL).

The BAT limits for coal mining activities, as provided in 40 CFR Part 434 and 25 Pa. Code Chapters 87—90 are as follows:

A settleable solids instantaneous maximum limit of 0.5 ml/l applies to: surface runoff (resulting from a precipitation event of less than or equal to a 10-year 24-hour event) from active mining areas; active areas disturbed by coal refuse disposal activities; mined areas backfilled and revegetated; and all other discharges and drainage (resulting from a precipitation event of greater than 1-year 24-hour to less than or equal to a 10-year 24-hour event) from coal refuse disposal piles. Similarly, modified BAT limits apply to iron, manganese and suspended solids in surface runoff, discharges and drainage resulting from these precipitation events and those of greater magnitude in accordance with 25 Pa. Code §§ 87.102, 88.92, 88.187, 88.292, 89.52 and 90.102.

Exceptions to BAT effluent limits may be applicable in accordance with 25 Pa. Code §§ 87.102, 88.92, 88.187, 88.292, 89.52 and 90.102.

Effluent Limits for Noncoal Mining Activities

The limits for noncoal mining activities as provided in 25 Pa. Code Chapter 77 are pH 6 to 9 and other parameters the Department may require.

Discharges from noncoal mines located in some geologic settings (for example, in the coal fields) may require additional water quality based effluent limits. If additional effluent limits are needed for an NPDES permit associated with a noncoal mining permit, then the permit description specifies the parameters.

In addition to BAT or WQBEL limits, coal and noncoal NPDES permits establish effluent limitations in the form of implemented Best Management Practices (BMPs) identified in the associated Erosion and Sedimentation Plan, the Reclamation Plan and the NPDES permit application. These BMPs restrict the rates and quantities of associated pollutants from being discharged into surface waters in this Commonwealth.

More restrictive effluent limitations, restrictions on discharge volume or restrictions on the extent of mining that may occur are incorporated into an NPDES permit when necessary for compliance with water quality standards and antidegradation requirements (in accordance with 25 Pa. Code Chapters 91—96).

The procedures for determining the final effluent limits, using a mass-balance equation or model, are found in Technical Guidance Document 563-2112-115, Developing National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Permits for Mining Activities. Other specific factors to be considered include public comments and Total Maximum Daily Load(s). Additional discharge limitations may apply in the event that unexpected discharges occur.

Discharge rates for surface mining activities are precipitation driven. Discharge rates for proposed discharges associated with underground mining are noted in the permit description.

Comments received within the comment period will be considered in the final determinations regarding the NPDES permit applications. Comments must include the name, address and telephone number of the writer and a concise statement to inform the Department of the exact basis of a comment and the relevant facts upon which it is based.

- (q) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$200 (TWO HUN) appears in the "prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$200.
- (r) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols is a Lightbulb (BULB) symbol, and a prize symbol of \$200 (TWO HUN) appears in the "prize" area under that Lightbulb (BULB) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$200.
- (s) Holders of tickets upon which a POWER (WIN200) symbol appears in either of the "BONUS" areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$200.
- (t) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches the "5X POWER PAY" play symbol, and a prize symbol of  $\$30^{.00}$  (THIRTY)

appears in the "prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$150.

- (u) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in the "prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.
- (v) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols is a Lightbulb (BULB) symbol, and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in the "prize" area under that Lightbulb (BULB) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.
- (w) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches the "5X POWER PAY" play symbol, and a prize symbol of \$20.00 (TWENTY) appears in the "prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.

- (cc) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols is a Lightbulb (BULB) symbol, and a prize symbol of \$20.00 (TWENTY) appears in the "prize" area under that Lightbulb (BULB) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$20.

Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$100,000 and not exceeding \$500,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$500. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaran-

teed minimum payout, of at least \$500,001 and not exceeding \$1,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$5,000. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$1,000,001 and not exceeding \$10,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$10,000. A Lottery retailer is entitled only to the largest bonus for which he qualifies on a winning ticket. A bonus will be initiated for payment after the instant ticket is claimed and validated. A bonus will not be awarded to a Lottery retailer that sells a non-winning Pennsylvania Lottery instant ticket used to enter a Pennsylvania Lottery second-chance drawing or promotion that is subsequently selected to win a prize.

- 11. Unclaimed Prize Money: For a period of 1 year from the announced close of \$1,000,000 Power Payday, prize money from winning \$1,000,000 Power Payday instant lottery game tickets will be retained by the Secretary for payment to the persons entitled thereto. If no claim is made within 1 year of the announced close of the \$1,000,000 Power Payday instant lottery game, the right of a ticket holder to claim the prize represented by the ticket, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided for by statute.
- 12. Governing Law: In purchasing a ticket, the customer agrees to comply with and abide by the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314), 61 Pa. Code Part V (relating to State Lotteries) and the provisions contained in this notice.
- 13. Termination of the Game: The Secretary may announce a termination date, after which no further tickets from this game may be sold. The announcement will be disseminated through media used to advertise or promote \$1,000,000 Power Payday or through normal communications methods.

## Pennsylvania Bingo Squared Instant Lottery Game 1326

Under the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314) and 61 Pa. Code § 819.203 (relating to notice of instant game rules), the Secretary of Revenue hereby provides public notice of the rules for the following instant lottery game:

- 1. Name: The name of the game is Pennsylvania Bingo Squared (hereinafter "Bingo Squared"). The game number is PA-1326.
- 2. *Price*: The price of a Bingo Squared instant lottery game ticket is \$5.
  - 3. Play Symbols:
- (a) Each Bingo Squared instant lottery game ticket will contain nine play areas designated as "CARD 1," "CARD

2," "CARD 3," "CARD 4," "CARD 5," "CARD 6," "CARD 7," "CARD 8" and "CARD 9." A player may win more than one time on a ticket, however a player may only win one prize on each "CARD." Each "CARD" will consist of 25 spaces on a 5 by 5 grid. The 76 play symbols located in the six play areas are: the numbers 1 through 75 and a "FREE" symbol. The "FREE" symbol is a free space.

- (b) Each ticket will also contain a "CALLER'S CARD" area. The "CALLER'S CARD" area will consist of 30 spaces. The play symbols that may be located in each space on the grid are: the letter B with a number 1 through 15; the letter I with a number 16 through 30; the letter N with a number 31 through 45; the letter G with a number 46 through 60; and the letter O with a number 61 through 75.
- 4. *Prizes*: The prizes that can be won in this game are: \$5, \$10, \$15, \$20, \$25, \$30, \$50, \$60, \$100, \$150, \$250, \$500, \$1,000, \$5,000, \$10,000 and \$100,000. The player can win up to 4 times on a ticket.
- 5. Approximate Number of Tickets Printed For the Game: Approximately 14,400,000 tickets will be printed for the Bingo Squared instant lottery game.
- 6. Winning Patterns: The patterns described below, when matched on any "CARD," shall determine whether a player wins a prize as further detailed in section 7 (relating to determination of prize winners).
- (a) LINE: Match the "CALLER'S CARD" numbers in a five-space horizontal or vertical line, or a four-space diagonal line through the "FREE" space. Diagonal LINE matches are exactly as follows:

(b) FOUR CORNERS: Match "CALLER'S CARD" numbers in each of the four corners of any "CARD" as follows:



(c) DIAMOND: Match four "CALLER'S CARD" numbers to form a diamond which includes the space appearing in the top horizontal row in the "N" column; the spaces appearing in the third horizontal row from the top in the "B" and "O" columns; and the space appearing in the fifth horizontal row from the top in the "N" column on any "CARD," exactly as follows:



(d) *X PATTERN*: Match eight "CALLER'S CARD" numbers to form an X Pattern extending through the "FREE" space and through to each of the four corner spaces, on any "CARD," exactly as follows:



(e) SQUARE MATCH: Match all four "CALLER'S CARD" numbers completely within the red-outlined square on any "CARD." Examples include, but are not limited to:



- 7. Determination of Prize Winners:
- (a) Holders of tickets matching the "CALLER'S CARD" play symbols in an X pattern, on "CARD 9," on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100,000.
- (b) Holders of tickets matching the "CALLER'S CARD" play symbols in an X pattern, on "CARD 8," on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$10,000.
- (c) Holders of tickets matching the "CALLER'S CARD" play symbols in a diamond pattern, on "CARD 9," on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$10,000.

- (h) Holders of tickets matching the "CALLER'S CARD" play symbols in a diamond pattern, on "CARD 7," on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1,000.
- (i) Holders of tickets matching the "CALLER'S CARD" play symbols in the four corners on "CARD 8," on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1,000.
- (j) Holders of tickets matching the "CALLER'S CARD" play symbols in a LINE on "CARD 9," on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1,000.
- (k) Holders of tickets matching the "CALLER'S CARD" play symbols with all four numbers within the redoutlined square on "CARD 9," on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$500.
- (l) Holders of tickets matching the "CALLER'S CARD" play symbols in an X pattern, on "CARD 4," on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$250.

- (m) Holders of tickets matching the "CALLER'S CARD" play symbols in a diamond pattern, on "CARD 5," on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$250.
- (n) Holders of tickets matching the "CALLER'S CARD" play symbols in the four corners on "CARD 6," on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$250.
- (o) Holders of tickets matching the "CALLER'S CARD" play symbols in a LINE on "CARD 7," on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$250.
- (p) Holders of tickets matching the "CALLER'S CARD" play symbols with all four numbers within the redoutlined square on "CARD 8," on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$250.
- (q) Holders of tickets matching the "CALLER'S CARD" play symbols with all four numbers within the redoutlined square on "CARD 7," on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$150.
- (r) Holders of tickets matching the "CALLER'S CARD" play symbols in an X pattern, on "CARD 3," on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.
- (s) Holders of tickets matching the "CALLER'S CARD" play symbols in a diamond pattern, on "CARD 4," on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.
- (t) Holders of tickets matching the "CALLER'S CARD" play symbols in the four corners on "CARD 5," on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.
- (u) Holders of tickets matching the "CALLER'S CARD" play symbols in a LINE on "CARD 6," on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.
- (v) Holders of tickets matching the "CALLER'S CARD" play symbols with all four numbers within the redoutlined square on "CARD 6," on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.
- (w) Holders of tickets matching the "CALLER'S CARD" play symbols with all four numbers within the redoutlined square on "CARD 5," on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$60.
- (x) Holders of tickets matching the "CALLER'S CARD" play symbols in an X pattern, on "CARD 2," on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$50.

Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$1,000,001 and not exceeding \$10,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$10,000. A Lottery retailer is entitled only to the largest bonus for which he qualifies on a winning ticket. A bonus will be initiated for payment after the instant ticket is claimed and validated. A bonus will not be awarded to a Lottery retailer that sells a nonwinning Pennsylvania Lottery instant ticket used to enter a Pennsylvania Lottery second-chance drawing or promotion that is subsequently selected to win a prize.
- 11. Unclaimed Prize Money: For a period of 1 year from the announced close of Bingo Squared, prize money from winning Bingo Squared instant lottery game tickets will be retained by the Secretary for payment to the persons entitled thereto. If no claim is made within 1 year of the announced close of the Bingo Squared instant lottery game, the right of a ticket holder to claim the prize represented by the ticket, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided for by statute.

9. Retailer Incentive Awards: The Lottery may conduct a separate Retailer Incentive Program for retailers who sell Loose Change instant lottery game tickets.

10. Retailer Bonus: The Lottery may offer a retailer bonus in connection with the sale of Pennsylvania instant lottery game tickets. If a retailer bonus is offered, a Lottery retailer shall be eligible for a bonus as described in this section. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$100,000 and not exceeding \$500,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$500. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$500,001 and not exceeding \$1,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$5,000. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$1,000,001 and not exceeding \$10,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$10,000. A Lottery retailer is entitled

only to the largest bonus for which he qualifies on a winning ticket. A bonus will be initiated for payment after the instant ticket is claimed and validated. A bonus will not be awarded to a Lottery retailer that sells a non-winning Pennsylvania Lottery instant ticket used to enter a Pennsylvania Lottery second-chance drawing or promotion that is subsequently selected to win a prize.

11. Unclaimed Prize Money: For a period of 1 year from the announced close of Loose Change, prize money from winning Loose Change instant lottery game tickets will be retained by the Secretary for payment to the persons entitled thereto. If no claim is made within 1 year of the announced close of the Loose Change instant lottery game, the right of a ticket holder to claim the prize represented by the ticket, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided for by statute.

12. Governing Law: In purchasing a ticket, the customer agrees to comply with and abide by the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314), 61 Pa. Code Part V (relating to State Lotteries) and the provisions contained in this notice.

13. Termination of the Game: The Secretary may announce a termination date, after which no further tickets from this game may be sold. The announcement will be disseminated through media used to advertise or promote Loose Change or through normal communications methods

Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$1,000,001 and not exceeding \$10,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$10,000. A Lottery retailer is entitled only to the largest bonus for which he qualifies on a winning ticket. A bonus will be initiated for payment after the instant ticket is claimed and validated. A bonus will not be awarded to a Lottery retailer that sells a nonwinning Pennsylvania Lottery instant ticket used to enter a Pennsylvania Lottery second-chance drawing or promotion that is subsequently selected to win a prize.
- 11. Unclaimed Prize Money: For a period of 1 year from the announced close of Silver & Gold, prize money from winning Silver & Gold instant lottery game tickets will be retained by the Secretary for payment to the persons entitled thereto. If no claim is made within 1 year of the announced close of the Silver & Gold instant lottery game, the right of a ticket holder to claim the prize represented by the ticket, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided for by statute.
- 12. Governing Law: In purchasing a ticket, the customer agrees to comply with and abide by the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314), 61 Pa. Code Part V (relating to State Lotteries) and the provisions contained in this notice.
- 13. Termination of the Game: The Secretary may announce a termination date, after which no further tickets from this game may be sold. The announcement will be disseminated through media used to advertise or promote Silver & Gold or through normal communications methods.

The Fish and Boat Commission (Commission) is considering changes to its list of Class A Wild Trout Streams. Under 58 Pa. Code § 57.8a (relating to Class A wild trout streams), it is the Commission's policy to manage self-sustaining Class A wild trout populations as a renewable natural resource to conserve that resource and the angling it provides. Class A wild trout populations represent the best of this Commonwealth's naturally reproducing trout fisheries. With rare exceptions, the Commission manages these stream sections solely for the perpetuation of the wild trout fishery with no stocking.

Criteria developed for Class A Wild Trout fisheries are species specific. Wild Trout Biomass Class Criteria include provisions for:

- (i) Wild Brook Trout Fisheries
- (A) Total brook trout biomass of at least 30 kg/ha (26.7 lbs/acre).
- (B) Total biomass of brook trout less than 15 cm (5.9 inches) in total length of at least 0.1 kg/ha (0.089 lbs/acre).
- (C) Brook trout biomass must comprise at least 75% of the total trout biomass.
  - (ii) Wild Brown Trout Fisheries
- (A) Total brown trout biomass of at least 40 kg/ha (35.6 lbs/acre).
- (B) Total biomass of brown trout less than 15 cm (5.9 inches) in total length of at least 0.1~kg/ha (0.089 lbs/acre).
- (C) Brown trout biomass must comprise at least 75% of the total trout biomass.

- (iii) Mixed Wild Brook and Brown Trout Fisheries
- (A) Combined brook and brown trout biomass of at least 40 kg/ha (35.6 lbs/acre).
- (B) Total biomass of brook trout less than 15 cm (5.9 inches) in total length of at least  $0.1~\rm kg/ha$  (0.089 lbs/acre).
- (C) Total biomass of brown trout less than 15 cm (5.9 inches) in total length of at least 0.1 kg/ha (0.089 lbs/acre).
- $\left( D\right)$  Brook trout biomass must comprise less than 75% of the total trout biomass.
- (E) Brown trout biomass must comprise less than 75% of the total trout biomass.
  - (iv) Wild Rainbow Trout Fisheries

Total biomass of rainbow trout less than 15 cm (5.9 inches) in total length of at least 2.0 kg/ha (1.78 lbs/acre).

- (v) Mixed Wild Brook and Rainbow Trout Fisheries
- (A) Combined brook and rainbow trout biomass of at least 40 kg/ha (35.6 lbs/acre).
- (B) Total biomass of brook trout less than 15 cm (5.9 inches) in total length of at least 0.1~kg/ha (0.089 lbs/acre).

- (C) Total biomass of rainbow trout less than 15 cm (5.9 inches) in total length of at least 0.1 kg/ha (0.089 lbs/acre).
- $\left(D\right)$  Brook trout biomass shall comprise less than 75% of the total trout biomass.
- (E) Rainbow trout biomass shall comprise less than 75% of the total trout biomass.
  - (vi) Mixed Wild Brown and Rainbow Trout Fisheries
- (A) Combined brown and rainbow trout biomass of at least 40 kg/ha (35.6 lbs/acre).
- (B) Total biomass of brown trout less than 15 cm (5.9 inches) in total length of at least 0.1 kg/ha (0.089 lbs/acre).
- (C) Total biomass of rainbow trout less than 15 cm (5.9 inches) in total length of at least 0.1 kg/ha (0.089 lbs/acre).
- $\left( D\right)$  Brown trout biomass shall comprise less than 75% of the total trout biomass.
- (E) Rainbow trout biomass shall comprise less than 75% of the total trout biomass.
