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# READER'S GUIDE TO THE PENNSYLVANIA BULLETIN AND THE PENNSYLVANIA CODE

### Pennsylvania Bulletin

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the official gazette of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. It is published weekly. A cumulative subject matter index is published quarterly.

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* serves several purposes. It is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, which is the official codification of agency rules and regulations, Statewide court rules, and other statutorily authorized documents. Changes in the codified text, whether by adoption, amendment, rescission, repeal or emergency action, must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

The following documents are published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*: Governor's Executive Orders; Summaries of Enacted Statutes; Statewide and Local Court Rules; Attorney General Opinions; Motor Carrier Applications before the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission; Applications and Actions before the Department of Environmental Protection; Orders of the Independent Regulatory Review Commission; and other documents authorized by law.

The text of certain documents published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the only valid and enforceable text. Courts are required to take judicial notice of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

### Adoption, Amendment or Repeal of Regulations

Generally an agency wishing to adopt, amend or rescind regulations must first publish in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* a Proposed Rulemaking. There are limited instances when the agency may omit the proposal step; it still must publish the adopted version.

The Proposed Rulemaking contains the full text of the change, the agency contact person, a fiscal note required by law and background for the action.

The agency then allows sufficient time for public comment before taking final action. A Final Rulemaking must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* before the changes can take effect. If the agency wishes to adopt changes to the Proposed Rulemaking to enlarge the scope, it must repropose.

### Citation to the Pennsylvania Bulletin

Cite material in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* by volume number, a page number and date. Example: Volume 1, *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, page 801, January 9, 1971 (short form: 1 Pa.B. 801 (January 9, 1971)).

### Pennsylvania Code

The *Pennsylvania Code* is the official codification of rules and regulations issued by Commonwealth agencies, Statewide court rules and other statutorily authorized documents. The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, printing changes when they are adopted. These changes are then permanently codified by the *Pennsylvania Code Reporter*, a monthly, loose-leaf supplement.

The *Pennsylvania Code* is cited by title number and section number. Example: Title 10 *Pennsylvania Code* § 1.1 (short form: 10 Pa. Code § 1.1).

Under the *Pennsylvania Code* codification system, each regulation is assigned a unique number by title and section. Titles roughly parallel the organization of Commonwealth government.

### **How to Find Rules and Regulations**

Search for your area of interest in the *Pennsylva*nia Code. The *Pennsylvania Code* is available at www.pacodeandbulletin.gov.

Source Notes give the history of regulations. To see if there have been recent changes not yet codified, check the List of *Pennsylvania Code* Chapters Affected in the most recent issue of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

A chronological table of the history of *Pennsylva-nia Code* sections may be found at www.legis.state.pa.us/cfdocs/legis/CH/Public/pcde\_index.cfm.

A quarterly List of *Pennsylvania Code* Sections Affected lists the regulations in numerical order, followed by the citation to the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* in which the change occurred.

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### **Printing Format**

Proposed new chapters and sections are printed in regular type to enhance readability. Final rulemakings and statements of policy are printed in regular type.

Ellipses, a series of five asterisks, indicate text that is not amended.

In Proposed Rulemakings and proposed Statements of Policy, existing text corresponds to the official codified text in the *Pennsylvania Code*.

Court Rules in Titles 201—246 of the Pennsylvania Code

Added text in proposed and adopted court rules is printed in <u>underscored bold face</u>. Deleted text in proposed and adopted court rules is enclosed in brackets [ ] and printed in **bold face**.

Proposed new chapters and rules are printed in regular type to enhance readability.

Ellipses, a series of five asterisks, indicate text that is not amended.

#### **Fiscal Notes**

Section 612 of The Administrative Code of 1929 (71 P.S. § 232) requires the Governor's Budget Office to prepare a fiscal note for regulatory actions and administrative procedures of the administrative departments, boards, commissions and authorities receiving money from the State Treasury. The fiscal note states whether the action or procedure causes a loss of revenue or an increase in the cost of programs for the Commonwealth or its political subdivisions. The fiscal note is required to be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* at the same time as the change is advertised.

A fiscal note provides the following information: (1) the designation of the fund out of which the appropriation providing for expenditures under the action or procedure shall be made; (2) the probable cost for the fiscal year the program is implemented; (3) projected cost estimate of the program for each of the 5 succeeding fiscal years; (4) fiscal history of the program for which expenditures are to be made; (5) probable loss of revenue for the fiscal year of its implementation; (6) projected loss of revenue from the program for each of the 5 succeeding fiscal years; (7) line item, if any, of the General Appropriation Act or other appropriation act out of which expenditures or losses of Commonwealth funds shall occur as a result of the action or procedures; and (8) recommendation, if any, of the Secretary of the Budget and the reasons therefor.

The omission of an item indicates that the agency text of the fiscal note states that there is no information available with respect thereto. In items (3) and (6) information is set forth for the first through fifth fiscal years, following the year the program is implemented, which is stated. In item (4) information is set forth for the current and two immediately preceding years. In item (8) the recommendation, if any, made by the Secretary of the Budget is published with the fiscal note. "No fiscal impact" means no additional cost or revenue loss to the Commonwealth or its local political subdivision is intended. See 4 Pa. Code Chapter 7, Subchapter R (relating to fiscal notes).

Prohibition of Sexual Harassment in the Commonwealth

Whereas, the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, Pennsylvania's largest employer, has an obligation to assertively address sexual harassment issues in the workplace; and

Whereas, sexual harassment shall not be tolerated in Commonwealth workplaces or when conducting the business of the Commonwealth under any circumstances; and

Whereas, this Administration is committed to providing a work environment where employees, applicants for employment, or individuals receiving services from the Commonwealth shall not be subjected to sexual harassment; and

Whereas, to prevent sexual harassment in the conduct of the business of the Commonwealth, all managers, supervisors, and employees must be made aware of the Commonwealth's sexual harassment policy, the steps to take when concerns arise, and our commitment to address instances of sexual harassment aggressively and equitably.

*Now, Therefore*, I, Tom Wolf, Governor of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and other laws, do hereby adopt and affirm the Commonwealth's sexual harassment policy.

# TITLE 4. ADMINISTRATION PART I. GOVERNOR'S OFFICE CHAPTER 7. MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

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§§ 7.591—7.601. (Reserved).

### Subchapter CCC. PROHIBITION OF SEXUAL HARASSMENT IN THE COMMONWEALTH

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7.888.	Oversight and resolution of complaints and appeals.
7.889.	Commonwealth policy.

7.890. Cooperation by State agencies.

7.891. Effective date. 7.892. Rescission.

### 7.881. Prohibition.

A department, board, office, commission or other agency under the Governor's jurisdiction may not tolerate sexual harassment by a Commonwealth employee against another employee, applicant for employment, contractor, intern or client or other person receiving services from or conducting business with the Commonwealth. Sexual harassment while conducting the business of the Commonwealth is strictly forbidden. Further, a department, board, office, commission or other agency under the Governor's jurisdiction may not tolerate acts of sexual harassment by individuals not employed by the Commonwealth within Commonwealth offices or upon employees of the Commonwealth in the performance of their duties. Sexual harassment is a violation of Federal and State law. Therefore, all Federal and State laws relating to sexual harassment or sex discrimination, or both, shall be enforced.

### 7.882. Prohibited actions.

- (a) Sexual harassment includes unwelcome sexual advances, requests for sexual favors, or other verbal, non-verbal, visual or physical conduct of a sexual nature, if:
- (1) Submission to or rejection of the conduct is made either explicitly or implicitly a term or condition of an individual's employment or receipt of public services; or
- (2) Submission to or rejection of the conduct by an individual is used as a basis for decisions affecting the individuals; or
- (3) The conduct has the purpose or effect of unreasonably interfering with an individual's work performance or receipt of public services, or creating an intimidating, hostile or offensive work environment.
- (b) Prohibited sexual harassment may include actions by members of the opposite sex of an employee as well as members of an employee's own sex. Prohibited sexual harassment may include actions which are overtly sexual or facially neutral if those actions constitute gender, gender identity, gender expression or sexual orientation-based discrimination. Prohibited sexual harassment may include unwanted or unwelcome discussion of an individual's sexual activity or history, sexual orientation or gender identity or gender expression.

### 7.883. Disciplinary action.

A Commonwealth employee who engages in or knowingly permits or condones sexual harassment during the course of conducting their Commonwealth duties shall be subject to disciplinary action, up to and including dismissal.

#### 7.884. Retaliation.

Retaliation in any form against an individual who exercises their right to make a good faith complaint under this policy or who cooperates in an investigation of any complaint is strictly prohibited and shall itself be cause for appropriate disciplinary action.

### 7.885. Education.

Commonwealth employees shall be educated in sexual harassment issues. Education may consist of written materials, formal training, educational videos, orientation sessions, workplace discussions or individual counseling. Commonwealth employees shall be provided with a copy of this policy and must sign an acknowledgement that they have received and reviewed the policy.

### 7.886. Workplace environment.

Agency heads shall create a respectful and safe workplace environment which encourages discussion of sexual harassment issues, where employees are educated in sexual harassment prevention and sensitized to sexual harassment and where an individual with sexual harassment questions or complaints is provided with a response which is clear, impartial and timely.

### 7.887. Complaint mechanism.

The Secretary of Administration shall require each agency to have an effective complaint mechanism which ensures that an employee does not have to complain to the alleged harasser, and which provides for prompt and effective investigation of complaints. The Secretary of Administration shall also have the authority to issue Management Directives and establish rules necessary to carry out the mandates of this subchapter.

### 7.888. Oversight and resolution of complaints and appeals.

The Office of Administration, Bureau of Equal Employment Opportunity, shall provide appropriate oversight and resolution of complaints.

### 7.889. Commonwealth policy.

This subchapter and Management Directive 505.30, Prohibition of Sexual Harassment in Commonwealth Work Settings, constitute the Commonwealth's sexual harassment policy.

### 7.890. Cooperation by State agencies.

Commonwealth departments, boards, offices, commissions and other agencies under the Governor's jurisdiction shall cooperate fully with the Secretary of Administration and provide assistance and information, as needed, in the implementation of this subchapter.

#### 7.891. Effective date.

This subchapter shall take effect immediately.

### 7.892. Rescission.

Executive Order 2002-04, Prohibition of Sexual Harassment in the Commonwealth, is rescinded.

Proposed Amendment of Pa.R.C.P. No. 1930.2

### Annex A

### TITLE 231. RULES OF CIVIL PROCEDURE PART I. GENERAL

### CHAPTER 1930. RULES RELATING TO DOMESTIC RELATIONS MATTERS GENERALLY

### Rule 1930.2. No Post-Trial Practice. Motions for Reconsideration

(a) There shall be no motions for post-trial relief in any domestic relations matter, including Protection of Victims of Sexual Violence or Intimidation matters.

### [ Official Note: See Pa.R.C.P. No. 1957.

(b) A party aggrieved by the decision of the court may file a motion for reconsideration in accordance with Pa.R.A.P. 1701(b)(3). If the court does not grant the motion for reconsideration within the time

permitted, the time for filing a notice of appeal will run as if the motion for reconsideration had never been presented to the court.

Official Note: Pennsylvania Rule of Appellate Procedure 903 states that the Notice of Appeal shall be filed within 30 days after the entry of the order from which the appeal is taken, except as otherwise set forth in that rule.

- (c) The court shall render its reconsidered decision within 120 days of the date the motion for reconsideration is granted, except as set forth in subdivision (e). If the court's decision is not rendered within 120 days, the motion shall be deemed denied.
- (d) If the court does not enter a reconsidered decision within 120 days, the time for filing a notice of appeal will begin to run anew from the date of entry of the reconsidered decision or from the 121st day after the motion for reconsideration was granted.
- (e) If the court grants the motion for reconsideration and files its order within the 30-day appeal period, the court may issue an order during the applicable 120-day period directing that additional testimony be taken. If the court issues an order for additional testimony, the reconsidered decision need not be rendered within 120 days, and the time for filing a notice of appeal will run from the date the reconsidered decision is rendered.
- (b) Motion for Reconsideration. Within 30 days of the entry of an order, a party aggrieved by a court's order may file with the court a motion for reconsideration.
  - (1) Reconsideration Granted.
- (i) If the court expressly grants the motion for reconsideration, the court's order granting reconsideration shall state the underlying order's status pending reconsideration. The court may:
  - (A) maintain the underlying order as entered;
  - (B) stay the underlying order;
  - (C) vacate the underlying order; or
- (D) enter an interim order amending the underlying order as necessary.
- (ii) Reconsidered Decision. Except as set forth in subdivision (b)(1)(iii):
- (A) the court shall enter the reconsidered decision within 120 days from the date the court expressly granted the motion for reconsideration; or
- (B) if the court does not enter a reconsidered decision within 120 days, the underlying order shall be deemed affirmed.
- (iii) During the 120-day period provided in subdivision (b)(1)(ii), the court may order additional testimony, and as a result, the court need not render its reconsidered decision within 120 days.
- (iv) *Notice of Appeal*. The time for filing a notice of appeal will begin to run anew from:
- (A) the day the court enters the reconsidered decision; or

- (B) when the underlying order has been deemed affirmed as provided in subdivision (b)(1)(ii)(B), the 121st day after the motion for reconsideration was expressly granted.
- (2) Reconsideration Denied. When the court denies the motion for reconsideration within 30 days, the time for filing a notice of appeal will run as if a party had never presented the motion for reconsideration to the court.

### REPUBLICATION REPORT RULE PROPOSAL 182

The Domestic Relations Procedural Rules Committee (Committee) is proposing an amendment to Pa.R.C.P. No. 1930.2 as that rule relates to a motion for reconsideration. The proposed amendment would address the status of the underlying order pending the trial court's reconsideration. Currently, the Rules of Civil Procedure do not address the order's status. The Committee previously published the Rule Proposal in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, 50 Pa.B. 7008 (December 12, 2020) with a comment period ending February 12, 2021. After reviewing the comments, the Committee revised the Rule Proposal, which is being republished for comment.

As noted in the previous Publication Report, subdivisions (b) through (e) have been entirely rewritten into an outline format with the substantive changes included in subdivision (b)(1)(i). Otherwise, Pa.R.C.P. No. 1930.2 remains substantively unchanged. However, based on the comments received, the Committee proposes a few revisions.

Unlike other civil actions, post-trial motions are precluded for domestic relations actions. See Pa.R.C.P. No. 1930.2(a). A party seeking relief from a court's order may appeal, request the trial court reconsider its order, or both. And, unlike other civil actions, the parties in domestic relations actions typically have an ongoing relationship and may have a support order or a custody order in place in the action prior to requesting reconsideration, which places a special significance on the underlying order's status pending reconsideration.

The Committee received a comment suggesting that the underlying order is automatically vacated upon a court expressly granting reconsideration with the exception of a custody order. The Committee could not find case law supporting this position or the exception. Instead, the Committee opined that the court should have discretion in determining the underlying order's status pending reconsideration. As such, the republished Rule Proposal clarifies that the court shall determine the underlying orders status in its order expressly granting reconsider. Further, the Rule Proposal provides additional discretionary options for the court to consider when expressly granting reconsideration. Proposed subdivision (b)(1)(i)now proposes adding four options for the court: (1) maintain the underlying order as entered; (2) stay the underlying order; (3) vacate the underlying order; or (4) enter an interim order amending the underlying order as necessary.

The Committee is also proposing two additional revisions. From the previously published Rule Proposal, the sequence of subdivisions (b)(1)(ii) and (iii) have been reversed. The Committee believed this revised sequence is more appropriate and provided more clarity to the rule's operation.

Finally, the Committee revised the Rule Proposal by indicating that the court must "expressly" grant reconsid-

eration. This change is consistent with the case law discussing motions for reconsideration and related timing issues.

All comments, concerns, and suggestions concerning this rule proposal are welcome.

### Rule 1915.3. Filing a Claim for Custody.

- (A) To comply with 23 Pa.C.S.A. § 5329.l, a party filing an action for custody, including modification, must complete the first page and file the entirety of the Information Sharing in Custody Filing Form as an attachment to the filing party's Complaint or Petition.
- (B) In said Filing Form, Household 1 shall be considered Plaintiff's household and Household 2 shall be considered Defendant's household.
- (C) Plaintiff is required to complete the information for said Filing Form for both Plaintiff's household and Defendant's household.
- (D) The Office of the Prothonotary shall send the Complaint or Petition and the attached Information Sharing in Custody Filing Form to the Office of Children and Youth.
- (E) Except proceedings scheduled on an emergency basis, the Office of Children and Youth shall file the completed Information Sharing in Custody Form with the Court in the Office of the Prothonotary at least seventy-two (72) hours before the scheduled proceeding.

And Now, this 18th day of June, 2021, Dauphin County Local Rule of Criminal Procedure 117 is amended as follows:

### Rule 117. Magisterial District Judge Night Court Duty Procedures.

- (1)(a) The standard business hours for all Dauphin County Magisterial District Courts shall be Monday through Friday, 8:00 A.M. to 4:30 P.M. Any Magisterial District Judge (MDJ) who is unavailable during these times due to vacation, illness, night duty, continuing education, or any other reason, must [make arrangements to have his or her district covered] secure coverage by another MDJ.
- (b) Any [matter] preliminary arraignment presented to an MDJ between 8:00 A.M. and 4:00 P.M. Monday through Friday shall be resolved by that judge, or by the MDJ temporarily covering that district. Any [matter] preliminary arraignment presented to an MDJ after 4:00 P.M. Monday through Friday may be handled by the MDJ or may be held for Night Court.
- (2) The standard business hours for Dauphin County Night Court shall be as follows:
- (a) Monday through Thursday: 5:00 P.M. to midnight. The Night Court Duty Judge ("Duty Judge") shall be available from 9:00 P.M. to midnight, either by presence at Night Court or by video conference, to handle all relevant matters. The Duty Judge shall arraign all defendants whose paperwork is received by Night Court no later than midnight.
- (b) Friday through Sunday: 5:00 P.M. Friday until midnight Sunday night. The Duty Judge shall be available Friday, [night and Saturday night] Saturday, and Sunday nights from 9:00 P.M. until all matters are concluded, Saturday and Sunday morning at 8:00 A.M. until all matters are concluded, Saturday and Sunday afternoon at 4:00 P.M. until all matters are concluded[, and Sunday night from 9:00 P.M. until midnight]. The Duty Judge shall arraign all defendants whose paperwork is received by Night Court during those hours.

The Duty Judge may call in to Night Court one hour prior to the morning and afternoon arraignment times. If no matters are pending, the Duty Judge does not need to be present at Night Court or by video.

(c) *Holidays*: The Duty Judge shall be available at 8:00 A.M. until all matters are concluded, at 4:00 P.M. until all matters are concluded, and at 9:00 P.M. until midnight. The Duty Judge shall arraign all defendants whose paperwork is received by Night Court during those hours.

The Duty Judge may call Night Court one hour prior to the morning and afternoon arraignment times. If no matters are pending, the judge does not need to be present at Night Court or by video.

(d) [Any emergency situations requiring search warrants and arrest warrants arising] Any emergency situations necessitating the issuance of search warrants and arrest warrants between 4:00 P.M.—8:00 A.M. Monday—Thursday and from 4:00

- P.M. Friday until 8:00 A.M. Monday shall be the responsibility of the Duty Judge and the Duty Judge shall be available to immediately handle such matters. The Deputy Court Administrator for Magisterial District Judges shall provide the Duty Judge schedule to Emergency Management so that contact can be made by the police to the Duty Judge.
- (3) Morning Arraignments Monday—Friday: Each MDJ shall be responsible to handle his/her own arraignments for those defendants arrested after the close of Dauphin County Night Court the previous night. These arraignments shall be held at 8:30 A.M. each weekday morning, either by having the defendant brought to the district court in person or by video conferencing. If an MDJ is absent from his/her office, it is the responsibility of the sitting judge to make sure that another MDJ is available to perform the morning arraignments.
- (4) The schedule for Night Court duty shall be the responsibility of the Deputy Court Administrator for Magisterial District Judges.

The above amendments shall be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* and will become effective thirty (30) days from the date of publication.

In cases where the tenant in possession of real property desires to appeal from a judgment for the possession of said real estate entered by a Magisterial District Judge of the court and does not desire or is unable to file a bond with surety as required by Pa.R.C.P.D.J. 1008B, such tenant, upon application to and approval by the Court, may be permitted to deposit rental payments coming due during the proceedings in the Court of Common Pleas in an escrow account in a bank or trust company approved by the Court. ] 1. Except as may otherwise be provided in any related State rules, or elsewhere in these rules, no withdrawals shall be permitted from any such | escrow | account except pursuant to court order, or a filed written agreement signed by all parties with an accompanying praecipe. At the conclusion of the proceedings and the expiration of the applicable appeal period, such deposits as then may exist shall be applied to the payment of any final judgment against the tenant, including costs, rendered on the appeal. Any portion of the escrowed funds not used for such purpose

shall, after thirty (30) days from the date of the expiration of the any applicable appeal rights, be refunded to the tenant upon praecipe duly filed and served.

2. If a landlord files a Petition for the Release of Sums from the Escrow Account on a continuing basis as permitted by Pa.R.C.P.M.D.J. 1008B, a copy of the Petition, which shall state the reason(s) for the sums desired, shall immediately be served on the tenant and any other parties of record, with a proof of service. The court shall issue a rule to show cause why the Petition should not be granted and serve the rule on the tenant, or tenant's counsel if the tenant is represented, and any other parties of record. If no response to the rule is filed, then the Court shall, upon motion, make the rule absolute. If a response to the rule is filed, any party may file a certificate of readiness, upon receipt of which the Court shall schedule a hearing for the sole purpose of determining those sums which are appropriate solely for the purpose of compensating the landlord for the tenant's actual possession and use of the premises during the pendency of the appeal.

#### Rule 1008C. Indigent Tenants.

6. If a landlord files a Petition for the Release of Sums from the Escrow Account on a continuing basis as permitted by Pa.R.C.P.M.D.J. 1008B, a copy of the Petition, which shall state the reason(s) for the sums desired, shall immediately be served on the tenant and any other parties of record, with a proof of service. If no response to the rule is filed, then the Court shall, upon motion, make the rule absolute. If a response to the rule is filed, any party may file a certificate of readiness, upon receipt of which the Court shall schedule a hearing for the sole purpose of determining those sums which are appropriate solely for the purpose of compensating the landlord for the tenant's actual possession and use of the premises during the pendency of the appeal.

### Rule 1009. Praecipe for Writ of Certiorari.

- E. Within ten (10) days after filing the Praecipe for Writ of Certiorari, the party filing the writ shall file and serve on all other parties a concise statement of those specific jurisdictional and/or gross irregularities relied upon in support of the issuance of the writ and the relief sought. The opposing party(ies) may, within ten (10) days of service of the supporting statement, file and serve any responding statement deemed appropriate.
- F. When all requirements set forth above have been met or the time permitted for filing the supporting statement and any response thereto has elapsed, either party may file an original and one copy of a Certificate of Readiness with the Prothonotary.
- G. Upon assignment, the court may, at its discretion, schedule a status conference; order the filing of briefs, schedule oral argument, or schedule a hearing.

Rule 1013B. Writ of Certiorari as Supersedeas.

If a landlord files a Petition for the Release of Sums from the Escrow Account on a continuing basis as permitted by Pa.R.C.P.M.D.J. 1013B, a copy of the Petition, which shall state the reason(s) for the sums desired, shall immediately be served on the tenant and any other parties of record, with a proof of service. The court shall issue a rule to show cause why the Petition should not be granted and serve the rule on the tenant, or tenant's counsel if the tenant is represented, and any other parties of record. If no response to the rule is filed, then the Court shall, upon motion, make the rule absolute. If a response to the rule is filed, any party may file a certificate of readiness, upon receipt of which the Court shall schedule a hearing for the sole purpose of determining those sums which are appropriate solely for the purpose of compensating the landlord for the tenant's actual possession and use of the premises during the pendency of the appeal. Any portion of the escrowed funds not used for such purpose shall, after thirty (30) days from the date of the expiration of the any applicable appeal rights, be refunded to the tenant upon praecipe duly filed and served.

### Rule 1013C. Indigent Tenants.

(6) If a landlord files a Petition for the Release of Sums from the Escrow Account on a continuing basis as permitted by Pa.R.C.P.M.D.J. 1013(C)(6), a copy of the Petition, which shall state the reason(s) for the sums desired, shall immediately be served on the tenant and any other parties of record, with a proof of service. The court shall issue a rule to show cause why the Petition should not be granted and serve the rule on the tenant, or tenant's counsel if the tenant is represented, and any other parties of record. If no response to the rule is filed, then the Court shall, upon motion, make the rule absolute. If a response to the rule is filed, any party may file a certificate of readiness, upon receipt of which the Court shall schedule a hearing for the sole purpose of determining those sums which are appropriate solely for the purpose of compensating the landlord for the tenant's actual possession and use of the premises during the pendency of the appeal.

And Now, this 21st day of June, 2021, it is hereby ordered as follows:

Effective July 6, 2021, operation of the Unified Judicial System shall return to pre-pandemic status. All courtrooms, adjacent judicial facilities, chambers, and offices within the Unified Judicial System shall be fully opened and staffed by judges and other personnel.

This Court's order of May 27, 2020, terminated the statewide judicial emergency effective June 1, 2020, but authorized president judges to declare local judicial emergencies. Effective today, president judges are no longer authorized to declare local judicial emergencies. Notwithstanding, to the extent declarations of local judicial emergencies are in effect suspending the rule-based right of criminal defendants to a prompt trial, they may remain in effect until August 31, 2021.

# Agricultural Product Promotion, Education and Export Promotion Matching Grant Program; 2021-2022 Application Period

The Department of Agriculture (Department) announces the program requirements and application period for grants under the Pennsylvania Agricultural Product Promotion, Education and Export Promotion Matching Grant Program (Program). The Program is authorized under a Fiscal Year (FY) 2021-2022 budgetary appropriation to the Department for agricultural product promotion, education and exports. The Department intends to make up to \$303,000 available for grants under the Program. All funding is contingent upon 2021-2022 budget appropriations.

### 1. Program objectives.

- (a) *Purpose*. The Department will award grants to provide matching funds to nonprofit agricultural product promotion and marketing organizations to reimburse up to 50% of the cost of projects intended to:
- (1) Increase consumer awareness of agricultural products within this Commonwealth and thereby increase sales of these agricultural products.
- (2) Educate producers and consumers with respect to agricultural products within this Commonwealth.
- (3) Otherwise facilitate the growth and development of export markets for agricultural products within this Commonwealth.
- (b) Applicants. Grants will be awarded to Pennsylvania nonprofit agricultural product promotion and marketing organizations.
  - (c) FY 2021-2022 project funding priorities.
- (1) The Department will prioritize eligible projects for promotion, education and export market development of agricultural products within this Commonwealth that support the industry's recovery as it navigates and emerges from the novel coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic. Applicants with projects aligned to COVID-19 recovery are encouraged to submit proposals.
- (2) The Department will also prioritize eligible projects that improve food security in the Commonwealth, including projects that improve access to nutritious food, decrease food waste in schools and other settings, and that leverage Federal, community and State resources through public-private partnerships.
- (d) Competitive program. The Program is competitive. Grant requests and related documentation will be reviewed by the Secretary, who will approve or reject each grant request.
- (e) Funds available basis. Grants will not be awarded unless funds are available for this purpose. The Department need not expend all the funds that are available for the Program.

2. *Definitions*. The following words and terms have the following meanings:

*Applicant*—A Pennsylvania nonprofit agricultural product promotion and marketing organization which applies for grant moneys under the Program.

Bureau—The Bureau of Market Development of the Department.

Pennsylvania agricultural prducts—Any of the following agricultural commodities grown, processed or manufactured within this Commonwealth: agricultural, horticultural, aquacultural, viticulture and dairy products, including artisan cheese, livestock and the products thereof, ranch raised fur-bearing animals and the products thereof, the products of poultry and beef raising, forestry and forestry products, and all products raised or produced on farms intended for human consumption, and the processed or manufactured products thereof intended for human consumption, transported or intended to be transported in commerce.

Pennsylvania nonprofit agricultural product promotion and marketing organization—A nonprofit business organization having its principal business offices within this Commonwealth, or having 50% or more of its membership within this Commonwealth, or having 50% or more of the agricultural products which it promotes or markets produced within this Commonwealth, and having as its members groups, individuals or organizations that serve to distribute an agricultural product within this Commonwealth in commerce. These members may include wholesalers, distributors, brokers, retailers, processors, growers and producers.

Secretary—The Secretary of the Department.

- 3. Limitations on grants. The minimum amount of a matching grant is \$1,000. A matching grant is a reimbursement grant, meaning no payment of grant funds will be made by the Department until the subject project is completed and the applicant documents the completion of the project to the Department in accordance with this notice.
  - 4. Uses of matching grant moneys.
- (a) Conformity to application. Matching grant moneys awarded to an applicant shall be expended solely to reimburse up to 50% of the cost of the specific project described in the grant application.
- (b) Allowable expenditures of grant moneys. Grant moneys shall be used for one or more of the following purposes described in the grant application:
- (1) To pay the cost of the specific project described in the grant application.
- (2) To pay the cost of a portion of a Pennsylvania nonprofit agricultural product promotion and marketing organization's contribution to a National or regional agricultural product promotion and marketing project.
- (3) To pay the cost of programs conducted by an applicant to educate producers and consumers with respect to agricultural products within this Commonwealth.
- (4) To pay the cost of trade shows conducted or attended by an applicant, or other projects to facilitate the growth and development of export markets for produced agricultural products within this Commonwealth.

(c) Prohibited expenditure of grant moneys. Grant moneys may not be used to defray the costs of employing temporary or permanent personnel.

#### 5. Applications.

- (a) Application required. Interested Pennsylvania non-profit agricultural product promotion and marketing organizations shall submit grant applications to the Department. An application shall include a detailed work plan and project budget.
- (b) Project commencement and completion dates. An application shall designate July 1, 2021, or a later date, as the project start date and June 30, 2022, or earlier, as the project completion date. Program grant funds will not be awarded or paid for project activities that occur before the stated project start date or beyond the stated project completion date.
- (c) Electronic applications only. Interested applicants must submit a complete electronic project proposal and grant application using the Department's Electronic Single Application web site at https://www.esa.dced.state.pa.us/login.aspx?var=5.
- (d) Application window. Applications shall be submitted by 4:59 p.m. on Friday, August 6, 2021.
- (e) Additional documentation. The Secretary may require that an applicant submit additional documentation to complete or verify an application. The additional documentation may include a letter, affidavit or other documentation:
- (1) Verifying that an applicant is a Pennsylvania non-profit agricultural product promotion and marketing organization.
- (2) Verifying the activities and location of offices of an applicant.
- (3) Confirming that the applicant for a matching grant has secured funds in an amount at least equal to the matching grant amount sought for the project.

### 6. Review of application.

- (a) Transmittal of application to Bureau. When the Bureau receives a complete and accurate grant application, it will forward this application, together with supporting documentation submitted therewith, to the Secretary for review. The Bureau may also forward a recommendation as to whether the application should be approved or rejected, whether the grant should be in an amount less than requested and whether special restrictions or limitations should be placed on the grant.
- (b) Factors. The Secretary will review and evaluate the application and supporting documentation and may consider the following factors, among others, in deciding whether to approve or reject the grant request:
- (1) The relevance of the project to the promotion or marketing of agricultural products within this Commonwealth.
- (2) The innovativeness of the project described in the application.
- (3) The scope of the project and the number of people who will be exposed to or affected by the project described in the application.
- (4) The impact which the project will have upon the promotion and sales of the agricultural products within this Commonwealth to which the project is targeted.

- (5) The availability of full funding for the project from the applicant or from any source other than the Grant Program.
- (6) The apparent ability of the applicant to complete the project as described in the application or, in the case of a grant to fund a National or regional agricultural product promotion or marketing project, the apparent ability of the entity with primary responsibility for the project to complete it.
- (7) The overall performance of the project if the project had received funding through any other grant program administered by the Department in a previous fiscal year.
- (8) Projects that are joint efforts between two or more Pennsylvania nonprofit agricultural product promotion and marketing organizations may be given preference over projects involving only one organization.
- (9) Projects where reference to the Department as a source of funding can practicably be made in promotional materials or broadcasts, and that would make such a reference, may be given preference over projects that would not make such a reference.
- (10) Whether the project has been assigned priority for funding in FY 2021-2022, as previously described in paragraph No. 1(c).
- (c) *Decisions*. The Secretary may approve a grant in an amount less than that requested in the grant application. In addition, the Secretary may impose restrictions or special conditions upon the issuance of a grant. The Secretary will review all recommendations of the Bureau but will have final authority to accept or reject these recommendations.
  - 7. Notice of disposition of application.

The Department will e-mail notice of the acceptance or rejection of a grant application. This notice will be by e-mail to the address provided by the applicant in the grant application.

### 8. Grant agreement.

After the Secretary approves a grant application, and as a precondition to the Department's release of grant moneys to a successful applicant, the Department and the applicant will execute a written or electronic grant agreement which describes the terms and conditions subject to which the grant is made. The grant agreement shall contain and conform to the requirements of this notice and shall also contain special terms and conditions as required by the Secretary.

- 9. Verification of project completion.
- (a) *General*. Within 30 days of completion of the subject project, the applicant shall provide the Department with proof of the completion of the project and eligibility to receive reimbursement grant funds from the Department.
- (b) Required documentation. The proof described in subsection (a) shall consist of:
- (1) Copies of invoices for goods or services directly related to the project, confirming that the total billed amount is at least twice the amount of the grant, along with the written certification of the president or treasurer of the applicant that the goods or services that are the subject of the invoices have been delivered or provided to the applicant.

- (2) A certificate of completion, signed by its president or treasurer, verifying completion of the subject project and stating that the grant funds will reimburse the applicant for a portion of the costs incurred by the applicant in completing the subject project.
- 10. Delivery of grant funds by the Department. The Department will pay the grant amount to the applicant in a single payment within 45 days of receiving the proof of completion previously described in paragraph No. 9.

# LAND RECYCLING AND ENVIRONMENTAL REMEDIATION

UNDER ACT 2, 1995 PREAMBLE 1

Acknowledgment of Notices of Intent to Remediate Submitted Under the Land Recycling and Environmental Remediation Standards Act (35 P.S. §§ 6026.101—6026.908).

Sections 302-305 of the Land Recycling and Environmental Remediation Standards Act (Act) require the Department of Environmental Protection (Department) to publish in the Pennsylvania Bulletin an acknowledgment noting receipt of any Notices of Intent to Remediate. An acknowledgment of the receipt of a Notice of Intent (NOI) to Remediate is used to identify a site where a person proposes to, or has been required to, respond to a release of a regulated substance at a site. Persons intending to use the background standard, Statewide health standard, the site-specific standard, or who intend to remediate a site as a special industrial area, must file a (NOI) to Remediate with the Department. A NOI to Remediate filed with the Department provides a brief description of the location of the site, a list of known or suspected contaminants at the site, the proposed remediation measures for the site, and a description of the intended future use of the site. A person who demonstrates attainment of one, or a combination of the cleanup standards, or who receives approval of a special industrial area remediation identified under the Act, will be relieved of further liability for the remediation of the site for any contamination identified in reports submitted to and approved by the Department. Furthermore, the person shall not be subject to citizen suits or other contribution actions brought by responsible persons not participating in the remediation.

Under Sections 304(n)(1)(ii) and 305(c)(2) of the Act, there is a 30-day public and municipal comment period for sites proposed for remediation using a site-specific standard, in whole or in part, and for sites remediated as a special industrial area. This period begins when a summary of the NOI to Remediate is published in a newspaper of general circulation in the area of the site. For the following identified site(s), proposed for remediation to a site-specific standard or as a special industrial area, the municipality, within which the site is located, may request to be involved in the development of the remediation and reuse plans for the site if the request is made within 30-days of the following specified date. During this comment period the municipality may request that the following identified person, as the remediator of the site, develop and implement a public involvement plan. Requests to be involved, and comments, should be directed to the remediator of the site.

#### MINING ACTIVITY NPDES DRAFT PERMITS

This notice provides information about applications for a new, amended or renewed NPDES permits associated with mining activity (coal or noncoal) permits. The applications concern industrial waste (mining) discharges to surface water and discharges of stormwater associated with mining activities. This notice is provided in accordance with 25 Pa. Code Chapters 91 and 92a and 40 CFR Part 122, implementing provisions of The Clean Streams Law (35 P.S. §§ 691.1—691.1001) and the Federal Clean Water Act (33 U.S.C.A. §§ 1251—1376).

The Department of Environmental Protection (Department) has prepared a draft NPDES permit and made a tentative determination to issue the NPDES permit in conjunction with the associated mining activity permit.

Effluent Limits for Coal Mining Activities

For coal mining activities, NPDES permits, when issued, will contain effluent limits that are the more stringent of technology-based (BAT) effluent limitations or Water Quality Based Effluent Limits (WQBEL).

A settleable solids instantaneous maximum limit of 0.5 ml/l applies to: surface runoff (resulting from a precipitation event of less than or equal to a 10-year 24-hour event) from active mining areas; active areas disturbed by coal refuse disposal activities; mined areas backfilled and revegetated; and all other discharges and drainage (resulting from a precipitation event of greater than 1-year 24-hour to less than or equal to a 10-year 24-hour event) from coal refuse disposal piles. Similarly, modified BAT limits apply to iron, manganese and suspended solids in surface runoff, discharges and drainage resulting from these precipitation events and those of greater magnitude in accordance with 25 Pa. Code §§ 87.102, 88.92, 88.187, 88.292, 89.52 and 90.102.

Exceptions to BAT effluent limits may be applicable in accordance with 25 Pa. Code §§ 87.102, 88.92, 88.187, 88.292, 89.52 and 90.102.

Effluent Limits for Noncoal Mining Activities

The limits for noncoal mining activities as provided in 25 Pa. Code Chapter 77 are pH 6 to 9 and other parameters the Department may require.

Discharges from noncoal mines located in some geologic settings (for example, in the coal fields) may require additional water quality based effluent limits. If additional effluent limits are needed for an NPDES permit associated with a noncoal mining permit, then the permit description specifies the parameters.

In addition to BAT or WQBEL limits, coal and noncoal NPDES permits establish effluent limitations in the form of implemented Best Management Practices (BMPs) identified in the associated Erosion and Sedimentation Plan, the Reclamation Plan and the NPDES permit application. These BMPs restrict the rates and quantities of associated pollutants from being discharged into surface waters in this Commonwealth.

More restrictive effluent limitations, restrictions on discharge volume or restrictions on the extent of mining that may occur are incorporated into an NPDES permit when necessary for compliance with water quality standards and antidegradation requirements (in accordance with 25 Pa. Code Chapters 91—96).

The procedures for determining the final effluent limits, using a mass-balance equation or model, are found in Technical Guidance Document 563-2112-115, Developing National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Permits for Mining Activities. Other specific factors to be considered include public comments and Total Maximum Daily Load(s). Additional discharge limitations may apply in the event that unexpected discharges occur.

Discharge rates for surface mining activities are precipitation driven. Discharge rates for proposed discharges associated with underground mining are noted in the permit description.

Persons wishing to comment on an NPDES draft permit should submit a written statement to the Department at the address of the district mining office indicated before each draft permit within 30-days of this public notice. Comments received within the comment period will be considered in the final determinations regarding the NPDES permit applications. Comments must include the name, address and telephone number of the writer and a concise statement to inform the Department of the exact basis of a comment and the relevant facts upon which it is based.

Federal Consistency under the Coastal Zone Management Act; Wilkins Run Stream Restoration Project

This notice is published under section 306(d)(14) of the Federal Coastal Zone Management Act of 1972 (CZMA) (16 U.S.C.A. § 1455(d)(14)), regarding public participation in consistency determinations. The Department of Environmental Protection's (Department) Coastal Resources Management Program has received notice that the Millcreek Township (applicant) is proposing the Wilkins Run Stream Restoration Project (Project) in Millcreek Township, Erie County.

The applicant is proposing to restore approximately 1,300 linear feet of the existing Wilkins Run channel and 662 linear feet of an unnamed tributary that confluences with Wilkins Run on a parcel owned by the Lake Erie Region Conservancy. The Project area is bounded by North Wayside Drive, South Wayside Drive, West Lake Road, Hartley Lane and Wolf Run Drive in Millcreek Township. The site consists of a steep, forested stream valley with residences along the surrounding ridges. A stormwater facility is located upslope on a portion of the right descending bank (north side) between the stream

and residences. Wilkins Run is beginning to erode the base of the slope at this facility and presents a structural threat. The Project is proposed to consist of the restoration of stream channels, banks and riparian buffers for Wilkins Run and the unnamed tributary in order to stabilize the eroding banks, reduce sediment transport and protect an existing stormwater management pond currently threatened by erosion associated with the streams. The proposed Project will include natural channel design intended to improve channel stability and ecological functioning along the existing channel where possible. The applicant proposes to construct wetlands and vernal pools in portions of the existing channel that are to be abandoned to provide habitat and capture upslope sediments. The applicant estimates that the sediment reduction associated with the Project will amount to approximately 1,067,456 pounds per year. Land uses following completion of the Project are proposed to remain the same as current land uses. The applicant is seeking to obtain a permit from the United States Army Corps of Engineers under section 404 of the Clean Water Act (33 U.S.C.A. § 1344).

This Project is subject to Department review for Federal consistency because it is an activity requiring a Federal license or permit and will have reasonably fore-seeable effects on this Commonwealth's coastal resources or uses.

In accordance with section 307 of the CZMA (16 U.S.C.A. § 1456) and the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) regulations at 15 CFR Part 930, Subpart D (relating to consistency for activities requiring a Federal license or permit), Millcreek Township has certified that the proposed activity will be conducted in a manner consistent with the applicable enforceable policies of the Commonwealth's NOAA-approved Coastal Resources Management Program. # Designated Exceptional Durable Medical Equipment

In accordance with the Department of Human Services' (Department) currently approved State Plan, the Department is required to publish an annual list of exceptional Durable Medical Equipment (DME) by notice in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* in July of each year for nursing facilities Statewide. Interested persons may petition the Department to consider additions to the exceptional DME list by submitting a written request to the Department. Requests received on or before December 31 will be considered in developing the list for the following July.

During calendar year 2020, the Department received no written requests to add or remove items of DME from the list of exceptional DME. Therefore, this notice makes no changes in either the acquisition cost or the list of qualifying DME.

"Exceptional DME" is defined as DME that has an acquisition cost of \$5,000 or more and is either Specially Adapted DME or other DME that is designated as

exceptional DME by the Department annually by notice in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

"Specially Adapted DME" is DME that is uniquely constructed or substantially adapted or modified in accordance with the written orders of a physician for the particular use of one resident, making its contemporaneous use by another resident unsuitable.

The list of exceptional DME that has been designated by the Department is as follows:

- (1) Air fluidized beds. The pressure relief provided by this therapy uses a high rate of airflow to fluidize fine particulate material (for example, beads or sand) to produce a support medium that has characteristics similar to liquid. It may have a Gore-Tex cover.
- (2) Powered air flotation bed (low air loss therapy). A semielectric or total electric bed with a fully integrated powered pressure-reducing mattress, which is characterized by all of the following:
- (a) An air pump or blower with a series of interconnected woven fabric air pillows which provides sequential inflation and deflation of the air cells or a low interface pressure throughout the mattress allowing some air to escape through the support surface to the resident. It may have a Gore-Tex cover.
- (b) Inflated cell height of the air cells through which air is being circulated is 5 inches or greater.
- (c) Height of the air chambers, proximity of the air chambers to one another, frequency of air cycling (for alternating pressure mattresses) and air pressure provide adequate patient lift, reducing pressure and prevent bottoming out.
  - (d) A surface designed to reduce friction and shear.
  - (e) May be placed directly on a hospital bed frame.
- (f) Automatically readjusts inflation pressures with change in position of bed (for example, head elevation).
- (3) Augmentative communication devices. Used by residents who are unable to use natural oral speech as a primary means of communication. The specific device requested must be appropriate for use by the resident and the resident must demonstrate the abilities or potential abilities to use the device selected. Portable devices need to supplement, aid or serve as an alternative to natural speech for residents with severe expressive communication disorders. Nonportable devices may be covered only if required for visual enhancement or physical access needs that cannot be accommodated by a portable device.
  - (4) Ventilators (and related supplies).
- (a) Used by residents 21 years of age and older who require full ventilator support for a minimum of 8 hours per day to sustain life.
- (b) Used by residents 20 years of age and younger who require ventilator support to sustain life (no minimum time requirement).

# Statewide Quality Care Assessment Program for Fiscal Years 2021-2022 and 2022-2023

This notice relates to the assessment percentage rates under the Statewide Quality Care Assessment Program (Program) for fiscal years (FY) 2021-2022 and FY 2022-

### Background

Article VIII-G of the Human Services Code (code)<sup>1</sup> (62 P.S. §§ 801-G-816-G) authorizes the Department of Human Services (Department) to implement the Program beginning July 1, 2010, and ending June 30, 2023. Under Article VIII-G, the Department will impose a monetary assessment on all licensed hospitals in this Commonwealth other than certain exempt hospitals.2 See 62 P.S. §§ 801-G—816-G. Assessment revenue is deposited in a restricted account. See 62 P.S. § 805-G(a).

#### Discussion

As announced in the public notice issued at 50 Pa.B. 5335 (September 26, 2020), the assessment percentage rate for FY 2021-2022 and FY 2022-2023 will return to 3.32% of net inpatient revenue and 1.73% of net outpatient revenue for covered hospitals as established under the code. See 62 P.S. § 803-G(b)(5).3 Subject to conditions specified in 62 P.S. § 813-G, the Department intends to use the revenue derived from this assessment to make medical assistance payment to hospitals in accordance with 62 P.S.  $\S$  805-G.

# Fiscal Impact

The Department estimates the annual aggregate assessment fees for the nonexempt hospitals for FY 2021-2022 and FY 2022-2023 to total \$1,000,336 million.

1. Name: The name of the lottery game is Pennsylvania Cash in Hand (hereinafter "Cash in Hand"). The game number is PA-5125.

#### 2. Definitions:

- (a) Authorized retailer or retailer: A person who is properly licensed by the Lottery pursuant to 61 Pa. Code §§ 805.1—805.17.
- (b) Bar code: The symbology on the ticket containing certain encrypted validation and accounting data used for identifying winning and losing tickets.
- (c) CASH IN HAND WINALL BONUS: The area on a Cash in Hand ticket containing one play symbol that, when matched according to the instructions, determines whether the player wins all 12 prizes shown in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area.
- (d) Game Ticket: A bearer instrument produced through a Lottery Terminal that is the player's record of a play for a Fast Play lottery game and sold by an authorized retailer containing the play and validation data as published in this game notice.
- (e) Lottery Central Computer System: The computer gaming system on which all Fast Play plays are recorded.
- (f) Lottery Terminal: A device authorized by the Lottery to function in an interactive mode with the Lottery Central Computer System for the purpose of issuing plays, executing Quick Pick selections, and entering, receiving, and processing lottery transactions, including making purchases, validating plays, transmitting reports, and performing inventory functions.
- (g) Play: A chance to participate in a particular Fast Play lottery game.
- (h) *Play Area*: The area on a ticket which contains one or more play symbols.
- (i) *Play Symbol*: A number, letter, symbol, image or other character found in the play area which is used to determine whether a player wins a prize.
- (j) *Prize*: A non-monetary item, money, or experience that can be won as specified in section 6 (relating to prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners) of this game notice.
- (k) WINNING NUMBERS: The numbers, letters, symbols or other characters found in the play area that, when matched against the play symbols in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area, determine whether a player wins a prize.
- (l) Winning ticket: A game ticket which has been validated and qualifies for a prize.
- (m) YOUR NUMBERS: The numbers, letters, symbols or other characters found in the play area that, when matched against the play symbols in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area, determine whether a player wins a prize.
  - 3. *Price*: The price of a Cash in Hand ticket is \$5.
  - 4. Description of Cash in Hand Fast Play lottery game:
- (a) Cash in Hand lottery game is an instant win game printed from a Lottery Terminal. All prizes are predetermined, and the player does not have the ability to select

their own play symbols. Cash in Hand tickets may be purchased from an authorized retailer or at a Lottery self-service terminal that sells terminal-based Lottery game tickets. Tickets purchased from an authorized retailer shall be printed on-demand at the time of purchase and may not be preprinted by the retailer.

- (b) Cash in Hand is played by matching any of the play symbols located in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area to any of the play symbols located in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area. A player matching play symbols in this manner will win the prize shown under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol. A bet slip is not used to play this game.
- (c) Cash in Hand tickets contain a "CASH IN HAND WINALL BONUS" area. Whenever a player matches the play symbol in the "CASH IN HAND WINALL BONUS" area to any of the play symbols in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area, the player wins all 12 prizes shown.
- (d) Players can win the prizes identified in section 6 (relating to prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners).
- (e) Cash in Hand tickets cannot be canceled or voided once printed by the Lottery Terminal, even if printed in error.
- (f) To purchase a ticket at an authorized retailer, a player must remit the purchase price to the retailer and verbally request a Cash in Hand ticket. The ticket shall be the only valid proof of the bet placed and the only valid receipt for claiming a prize.
- (g) To purchase a ticket at a Pennsylvania Lottery self-service terminal, the player must insert into the self-service terminal a dollar amount equal to the total purchase price of a Cash in Hand ticket and select the Cash in Hand option on the Lottery self-service terminal. The ticket shall be the only valid proof of the bet placed and the only valid receipt for claiming a prize.
  - 5. Cash in Hand ticket characteristics:
- (a) Cash in Hand tickets shall contain a play area, the cost of the play, the date of sale, and a bar code.
- (b) Play Symbols: Cash in Hand tickets will contain a "WINNING NUMBERS" area, a "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a "CASH IN HAND WINALL BONUS" area. The play symbols and their captions, located in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area, the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and the "CASH IN HAND WINALL BONUS" area, are: 1 (ONE), 2 (TWO), 3 (THREE), 4 (FOUR), 5 (FIVE), 6 (SIX), 7 (SEVEN), 8 (EIGHT), 9 (NINE), 10 (TEN), 11 (ELEVN), 12 (TWLV), 13 (THRTN), 14 (FORTN), 15 (FIFTN), 16 (SIXTN), 17 (SVNTN), 18 (EGHTN), 19 (NINTN), 20 (TWENT), 21 (TWYONE), 22 (TWYTWO), 23 (TWYTHR), 24 (TWYFOR), 25 (TWYFIV), 26 (TWYSIX), 27 (TWYSVN), 28 (TWYEGT), 29 (TWYNIN) and 30 (THIRT).
- (c) Prize Symbols: The prize symbols and their captions, located in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area, are:  $\$5^{.00}$  (FIV DOL),  $\$10^{.00}$  (TEN DOL),  $\$15^{.00}$  (FIFTEEN),  $\$20^{.00}$  (TWENTY),  $\$50^{.00}$  (FIFTY), \$100 (ONE HUN), \$200 (TWO HUN), \$1,000 (ONE THO) and \$50,000 (FTY THO).

## 8. Ticket responsibility:

(a) A Fast Play lottery game ticket is a bearer document deemed to be owned by the person holding the game

ticket, except that if a name is contained on the back of the game ticket, the person named will, for all purposes, be considered the owner of the game ticket.

(b) The holder of a Fast Play lottery game ticket has the sole responsibility for checking the accuracy and condition of the data printed on the game ticket.

- (c) The Commonwealth shall not be responsible for a lost or stolen Fast Play lottery game ticket, or for a Fast Play ticket redeemed by a player in error.
  - 9. Ticket validation and requirements:
- (a) Valid Fast Play lottery game tickets. To be a valid Fast Play lottery game ticket, the presented game ticket must meet the following requirements:
- (1) The game ticket's bar code shall be present in its entirety.
  - (2) The game ticket must be intact.
- (3) The game ticket may not be mutilated, altered, reconstituted or tampered with.
- (4) The game ticket may not be counterfeit or a duplicate of a winning ticket.
  - (5) The game ticket must have been validly issued.
- (6) The game ticket data shall have been recorded on the Lottery Central Computer System and the game ticket data shall match the computer record in every respect.
- (7) The game ticket must not be defectively printed or printed or produced in error such that it cannot be processed or validated by the Lottery.
- (8) The game ticket must pass other confidential security checks of the Lottery.
- (b) Invalid or defective game tickets: A game ticket not passing the validation requirements in subsection (a) will be considered invalid and no payment will be made on account of any play recorded thereon. The determination of the Secretary in this regard is final.
  - 10. Procedures for claiming and payment of prizes:
- (a) A prize may be claimed through an authorized retailer or the Lottery, as provided in this section. A prize must be claimed within 1 year of the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket.
- (b) An authorized retailer is authorized to pay prizes of \$2,500 or less. The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play representing a prize of \$2,500 or less may be paid by a participating authorized retailer if a proper validation pay ticket was issued by the retailer's Lottery Terminal.
- (c) The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play representing a prize in excess of \$2,500 may present the game ticket to an authorized retailer, Lottery District Office, or Lottery Headquarters.
- (d) The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play shall present the ticket, in person, to an authorized retailer, Lottery Headquarters or a Lottery District Office. The retailer or the Lottery will issue payment if:
- (1) The game ticket is scanned, and the play is validated through the Lottery Terminal or the Lottery Central Computer System;
  - (2) A claim form is properly and fully completed;
  - (3) The identification of the claimant is confirmed; and
- (4) The winning ticket has not expired, pursuant to this section or section 12 (relating to unclaimed prizes).
- (e) The Commonwealth shall not be responsible for a winning play paid in error by an authorized retailer.
- (f) In the event a prize described in these rules is not available, the Lottery may either provide a substitute prize, determined by the Secretary to have an equivalent value to the prize won, or make a cash payment to the

- winner, in an amount determined by the Secretary to have an equivalent value to the prize won.
- 11. Funding for prizes: Moneys will be drawn from the State Lottery Fund, to the extent necessary, to fund the payment of prizes under this section. If this lottery game is terminated for any cause, prize moneys remaining undistributed will remain in the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes otherwise provided for by law.
- 12. Unclaimed prizes: Unclaimed prize money on winning Fast Play lottery game tickets will be retained by the Secretary for payment to the persons entitled thereto for 1 year from the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket. If no claim is made within 1 year from the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket, the right of a ticket holder to claim the prize represented by that ticket, if any, shall expire.
- 13. Purchase and prize restrictions: A Fast Play lottery game ticket may not be purchased by, and a prize may not be paid, to an officer or employee of the Lottery, Lottery professional services contractors or subcontractors, or to a spouse, child, brother, sister or parent residing in the same household of an officer, employee, contractor or subcontractor who is involved in the production, distribution or operation of systems for the validation or accounting of Fast Play games.
  - 14. Governing law:
- (a) By purchasing a ticket, the purchaser agrees to comply with and abide by the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314), this notice, instructions, conditions and final decisions of the Secretary, and procedures established by the Secretary for the conduct of the Fast Play Cash in Hand lottery game.
- (b) Decisions made by the Secretary, including the declaration of prizes and the payment thereof, in interpretation of this notice are final and binding on players and persons making a claim in respect thereof.
  - 15. Retailer compensation:
- (a) Authorized retailers may be entitled to compensation as determined by the Lottery.
- (b) No authorized retailer or employee of an authorized retailer shall request, demand, or accept gratuities or any compensation other than as provided in subsection (a) in exchange for the performance of duties authorized pursuant to the Lottery retailer's license without the Lottery's prior written authorization.
- 16. Retailer Incentive Programs: The Lottery may conduct a separate Retailer Incentive Program for retailers who sell Pennsylvania Fast Play Cash in Hand lottery game tickets.
- 17. Retailer bonus: The Lottery may offer a retailer bonus in connection with the sale of Pennsylvania Fast Play lottery game tickets. If a retailer bonus is offered, a Lottery retailer shall be eligible for a bonus as described in this section. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$100,000 and not exceeding \$500,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$500. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$500,001 and not exceeding \$1,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$5,000. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of

at least \$1,000,001 and not exceeding \$10,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$10,000. A Lottery retailer is entitled only to the largest bonus for which they qualify on a winning ticket. A bonus will be initiated for payment after the Fast Play game ticket is claimed and validated. A bonus will not be awarded to a Lottery retailer that sells a non-winning Pennsylvania Lottery Fast Play game ticket used to enter a Pennsylvania Lottery second-chance drawing or promotion that is subsequently selected to win a prize.

- 18. Termination of the game: The Secretary may announce a termination date, after which no further tickets from this game may be sold. The announcement will be disseminated through media used to advertise or promote Cash in Hand or through normal communications methods.
- 19. Applicability: This notice applies only to the Cash in Hand lottery game announced in this notice.

# Pennsylvania Pirate's Booty Fast Play Game 5124

Under the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314) and 61 Pa. Code § 803.11 (relating to powers and duties of the Secretary of Revenue), the Secretary of Revenue hereby provides public notice of the rules for the following lottery game:

- 1. Name: The name of the lottery game is Pennsylvania Pirate's Booty (hereinafter "Pirate's Booty"). The game number is PA-5124.
  - 2. Definitions:
- (a) Authorized retailer or retailer: A person who is properly licensed by the Lottery pursuant to 61 Pa. Code §§ 805.1—805.17.
- (b) Bar code: The symbology on the ticket containing certain encrypted validation and accounting data used for identifying winning and losing tickets.
- (c) Game Ticket: A bearer instrument produced through a Lottery Terminal that is the player's record of a play for a Fast Play lottery game and sold by an authorized retailer containing the play and validation data as published in this game notice.
- (d) Lottery Central Computer System: The computer gaming system on which all Fast Play plays are recorded.
- (e) Lottery Terminal: A device authorized by the Lottery to function in an interactive mode with the Lottery Central Computer System for the purpose of issuing plays, executing Quick Pick selections, and entering, receiving, and processing lottery transactions, including making purchases, validating plays, transmitting reports, and performing inventory functions.
- (f) PIRATE'S BOOTY BONUS PLAY SYMBOLS: The symbols found within the "YOUR SYMBOLS" area that, when matched according to the instructions, determine whether the player wins a prize of \$50.
- (g) Play: A chance to participate in a particular Fast Play lottery game.

(h) *Play Area*: The area on a ticket which contains one or more play symbols.

- (i) *Play Symbol*: A number, letter, symbol, image or other character found in the play area which is used to determine whether a player wins a prize.
- (j) *Prize*: A non-monetary item, money, or experience that can be won as specified in section 6 (relating to prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners) of this game notice.
- (k) WINNING SYMBOLS: The numbers, letters, symbols or other characters found in the play area that, when matched against the play symbols in the "YOUR SYMBOLS" area, determine whether a player wins a prize.
- (l) Winning ticket: A game ticket which has been validated and qualifies for a prize.
- (m) YOUR SYMBOLS: The numbers, letters, symbols or other characters found in the play area that, when matched against the play symbols in the "WINNING SYMBOLS" area, determine whether a player wins a prize.
  - 3. Price: The price of a Pirate's Booty ticket is \$10.
  - 4. Description of Pirate's Booty Fast Play lottery game:
- (a) Pirate's Booty lottery game is an instant win game printed from a Lottery Terminal. All prizes are predetermined, and the player does not have the ability to select their own play symbols. Pirate's Booty tickets may be purchased from an authorized retailer or at a Lottery self-service terminal that sells terminal-based Lottery game tickets. Tickets purchased from an authorized retailer shall be printed on-demand at the time of purchase and may not be preprinted by the retailer.
- (b) Pirate's Booty is played by matching the play symbols located in the "YOUR SYMBOLS" area to the play symbols located in the "WINNING SYMBOLS" area. A player correctly matching a "YOUR SYMBOLS" play symbol to a "WINNING SYMBOLS" play symbol wins the prize shown under the matching "YOUR SYMBOLS" play symbol. A bet slip is not used to play this game.
- (c) Pirate's Booty tickets contain a "PIRATE'S BOOTY BONUS" area. When the player finds five "PIRATE'S BOOTY BONUS" play symbols in the "YOUR SYMBOLS" area, the player wins \$50 instantly. The "PIRATE'S BOOTY BONUS" is played separately.
- (d) Players can win the prizes identified in section 6 (relating to prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners).
- (e) Pirate's Booty tickets cannot be canceled or voided once printed by the Lottery Terminal, even if printed in error.
- (f) To purchase a ticket at an authorized retailer, a player must remit the purchase price to the retailer and verbally request a Pirate's Booty ticket. The ticket shall be the only valid proof of the bet placed and the only valid receipt for claiming a prize.
- (g) To purchase a ticket at a Pennsylvania Lottery self-service terminal, the player must insert into the self-service terminal a dollar amount equal to the total purchase price of a Pirate's Booty ticket and select the Pirate's Booty option on the Lottery self-service terminal. The ticket shall be the only valid proof of the bet placed and the only valid receipt for claiming a prize.

- 5. Pirate's Booty ticket characteristics:
- (a) Pirate's Booty tickets shall contain a play area, the cost of the play, the date of sale and a bar code.
- (b) Play Symbols: Pirate's Booty tickets will contain a "WINNING SYMBOLS" area and a "YOUR SYMBOLS" area. The play symbols and their captions, located in the "WINNING SYMBOLS" area and the "YOUR SYMBOLS" area, are: Mermaid (MERMAID) symbol, Barrel (BARREL) symbol, Ship (SHIP) symbol, Anchor (ANCHOR) symbol, Palm Trees (PLMTRE) symbol, Fish (FISH) symbol, Octopus (OCTOPUS) symbol, Compass (COMPASS) symbol, Fishing Lure (LURE) symbol, Crab (CRAB) symbol, Message in a Bottle (BOTLMSG) symbol, Whale (WHALE) symbol, Ship's Wheel (WHEEL) symbol, Parrot (PARROT) symbol, Starfish (STARFSH) symbol, Binoculars (BINOCULARS) symbol, Hook (HOOK) symbol, Ruby (RUBY) symbol, Telescope (TLESCPE) symbol, Doubloons (DBLOONS) symbol, Pirate (PIRATE) symbol and a Chest (CHEST) symbol. The "PIRATE'S BOOTY BONUS" play symbol, located in the play area, is an "X" symbol.
- (c) Prize Symbols: The prizes symbols and their captions, located in the play area, are:  $\$10^{.00}$  (TEN DOL),  $\$15^{.00}$  (FIFTEEN),  $\$20^{.00}$  (TWENTY),  $\$30^{.00}$  (THIRTY),  $\$40^{.00}$  (FORTY),  $\$50^{.00}$  (FIFTY), \$100 (ONE HUN), \$500 (FIV HUN), \$1,000 (ONE THO) and \$100,000 (ONEHUNTHO).
- (d) *Prizes*: The prizes that can be won in this game are: \$10, \$15, \$20, \$30, \$40, \$50, \$100, \$500, \$1,000 and \$100,000. The prize that can be won in the "PIRATE'S BOOTY BONUS" is \$50. A player can win up to 16 times on a ticket.
- (e) Approximate number of tickets available for the game: Approximately 600,000 tickets will be available for sale for the Pirate's Booty lottery game.
- 6. Prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners:
- (a) All Pirate's Booty prize payments will be made as one-time, lump-sum cash payments.
- (b) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "YOUR SYMBOLS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING SYMBOLS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$100,000 (ONEHUNTHO) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR SYMBOLS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100,000.
- (c) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "YOUR SYMBOLS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING SYMBOLS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$1,000 (ONE THO) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR SYMBOLS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1,000.
- (d) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "YOUR SYMBOLS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING SYMBOLS" play symbols, and the matching symbol is a Chest (CHEST) symbol, and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in six of the "Prize" areas, a prize symbol of \$50.00 (FIFTY) appears in six of the "Prize" areas, a prize symbol of \$20.00 (TWENTY) appears in two of the "Prize" areas and a prize symbol of \$10.00 (TEN DOL) appears in one of the "Prize" areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$950.
- (e) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "YOUR SYMBOLS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING SYMBOLS" play symbols, and the matching symbol is a Chest (CHEST) symbol, and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in five of the "Prize" areas, a

- prize symbol of  $\$50^{.00}$  (FIFTY) appears in five of the "Prize" areas and a prize symbol of  $\$40^{.00}$  (FORTY) appears in five of the "Prize" areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$950.
- (f) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "YOUR SYMBOLS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING SYMBOLS" play symbols, and the matching symbol is a Chest (CHEST) symbol, and a prize symbol of \$40<sup>-00</sup> (FORTY) appears in six of the "Prize" areas, a prize symbol of \$30<sup>-00</sup> (THIRTY) appears in six of the "Prize" areas, a prize symbol of \$15<sup>-00</sup> (FIFTEEN) appears in two of the "Prize" areas and a prize symbol of \$500 (FIV HUN) appears in one of the "Prize" areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$950.
- (g) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "YOUR SYMBOLS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING SYMBOLS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$500 (FIV HUN) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR SYMBOLS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$500.
- (h) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "YOUR SYMBOLS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING SYMBOLS" play symbols, and the matching symbol is a Chest (CHEST) symbol, and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in two of the "Prize" areas, a prize symbol of \$50<sup>.00</sup> (FIFTY) appears in two of the "Prize" areas, a prize symbol of \$30<sup>.00</sup> (THIRTY) appears in two of the "Prize" areas, a prize symbol of \$15<sup>.00</sup> (FIFTEEN) appears in four of the "Prize" areas and a prize symbol of \$10<sup>.00</sup> (TEN DOL) appears in two of the "Prize" areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$500.

"Prize" areas and a prize symbol of  $20^{.00}$  (TWENTY) appears in five of the "Prize" areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$450.

- (l) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "YOUR SYMBOLS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING SYMBOLS" play symbols, and the matching symbol is a Chest (CHEST) symbol, and a prize symbol of \$30<sup>.00</sup> (THIRTY) appears in six of the "Prize" areas, a prize symbol of \$20<sup>.00</sup> (TWENTY) appears in six of the "Prize" areas, a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in one of the "Prize" areas, a prize symbol of \$40<sup>.00</sup> (FORTY) appears in one of the "prize" areas and a prize symbol of \$10<sup>.00</sup> (TEN DOL) appears in one of the "prize" areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$450.
- (m) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "YOUR SYMBOLS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING SYMBOLS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR SYMBOLS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.
- (n) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "YOUR SYMBOLS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING SYMBOLS" play symbols and a prize symbol of  $50^{00}$  (FIFTY) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR SYMBOLS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of 50.
- (o) Holders of tickets upon which five "X" symbols appear in the "YOUR SYMBOLS" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$50.
- (p) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "YOUR SYMBOLS" play symbols matches any of the

- "WINNING SYMBOLS" play symbols and a prize symbol of  $40^{00}$  (FORTY) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR SYMBOLS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of 40.
- (q) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "YOUR SYMBOLS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING SYMBOLS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$30.00 (THIRTY) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR SYMBOLS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$30.
- (r) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "YOUR SYMBOLS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING SYMBOLS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$20.00 (TWENTY) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR SYMBOLS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$20.
- (s) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "YOUR SYMBOLS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING SYMBOLS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$15.00 (FIFTEEN) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR SYMBOLS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$15.
- (t) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "YOUR SYMBOLS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING SYMBOLS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$10.00 (TEN DOL) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR SYMBOLS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$10.
- 7. Number and description of prizes and approximate chances of winning: The following table sets forth the approximate number of winners, amounts of prizes and approximate chances of winning:

  - (5) The game ticket must have been validly issued.
- (6) The game ticket data shall have been recorded on the Lottery Central Computer System and the game ticket data shall match the computer record in every respect.
- (7) The game ticket must not be defectively printed or printed or produced in error such that it cannot be processed or validated by the Lottery.
- (8) The game ticket must pass other confidential security checks of the Lottery.
- (b) Invalid or defective game tickets: A game ticket not passing the validation requirements in subsection (a) will be considered invalid and no payment will be made on account of any play recorded thereon. The determination of the Secretary in this regard is final.
  - 10. Procedures for claiming and payment of prizes:
- (a) A prize may be claimed through an authorized retailer or the Lottery, as provided in this section. A prize must be claimed within 1 year of the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket.
- (b) An authorized retailer is authorized to pay prizes of \$2,500 or less. The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play representing a prize of \$2,500 or less may be paid by a participating authorized retailer if a proper validation pay ticket was issued by the retailer's Lottery Terminal.
- (c) The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play representing a prize in excess of \$2,500 may present the game ticket to an authorized retailer, Lottery District Office, or Lottery Headquarters.
- (d) The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play shall present the ticket, in person, to an authorized retailer, Lottery Headquarters or a Lottery District Office. The retailer or the Lottery will issue payment if:
- (1) The game ticket is scanned and the play is validated through the Lottery Terminal or the Lottery Central Computer System;
  - (2) A claim form is properly and fully completed;
  - (3) The identification of the claimant is confirmed; and
- (4) The winning ticket has not expired, pursuant to this section or section 12 (relating to unclaimed prizes).
- (e) The Commonwealth shall not be responsible for a winning play paid in error by an authorized retailer.

(f) In the event a prize described in these rules is not available, the Lottery may either provide a substitute prize, determined by the Secretary to have an equivalent value to the prize won, or make a cash payment to the winner, in an amount determined by the Secretary to have an equivalent value to the prize won.

- 11. Funding for prizes: Moneys will be drawn from the State Lottery Fund, to the extent necessary, to fund the payment of prizes under this section. If this lottery game is terminated for any cause, prize moneys remaining undistributed will remain in the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes otherwise provided for by law.
- 12. Unclaimed prizes: Unclaimed prize money on winning Fast Play lottery game tickets will be retained by the Secretary for payment to the persons entitled thereto for 1 year from the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket. If no claim is made within 1 year from the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket, the right of a ticket holder to claim the prize represented by that ticket, if any, shall expire.
- 13. Purchase and prize restrictions: A Fast Play lottery game ticket may not be purchased by, and a prize may not be paid, to an officer or employee of the Lottery, Lottery professional services contractors or subcontractors, or to a spouse, child, brother, sister or parent residing in the same household of an officer, employee, contractor or subcontractor who is involved in the production, distribution or operation of systems for the validation or accounting of Fast Play games.

### 14. Governing law:

- (a) By purchasing a ticket, the purchaser agrees to comply with and abide by the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314), this notice, instructions, conditions and final decisions of the Secretary, and procedures established by the Secretary for the conduct of the Fast Play Pirate's Booty lottery game.
- (b) Decisions made by the Secretary, including the declaration of prizes and the payment thereof, in interpretation of this notice are final and binding on players and persons making a claim in respect thereof.

## 15. Retailer compensation:

- (a) Authorized retailers may be entitled to compensation as determined by the Lottery.
- (b) No authorized retailer or employee of an authorized retailer shall request, demand, or accept gratuities or any compensation other than as provided in subsection (a) in exchange for the performance of duties authorized pursuant to the Lottery retailer's license without the Lottery's prior written authorization.
- 16. Retailer Incentive Programs: The Lottery may conduct a separate Retailer Incentive Program for retailers who sell Pennsylvania Fast Play Pirate's Booty lottery game tickets.
- 17. Retailer bonus: The Lottery may offer a retailer bonus in connection with the sale of Pennsylvania Fast Play lottery game tickets. If a retailer bonus is offered, a Lottery retailer shall be eligible for a bonus as described in this section. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in

a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$100,000 and not exceeding \$500,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$500. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$500,001 and not exceeding \$1,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$5,000. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$1,000,001 and not exceeding \$10,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$10,000. A Lottery retailer is entitled only to the largest bonus for which they qualify on a winning ticket. A bonus will be initiated for payment after the Fast Play game ticket is claimed and validated. A bonus will not be awarded to a Lottery retailer that sells a non-winning Pennsylvania Lottery Fast Play game ticket used to enter a Pennsylvania Lottery second-chance drawing or promotion that is subsequently selected to win a prize.

- 18. Termination of the game: The Secretary may announce a termination date, after which no further tickets from this game may be sold. The announcement will be disseminated through media used to advertise or promote Pirate's Booty or through normal communications methods.
- 19. Applicability: This notice applies only to the Pirate's Booty lottery game announced in this notice.

# Pennsylvania Pool Party Fast Play Game 5126

Under the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314) and 61 Pa. Code § 803.11 (relating to powers and duties of the Secretary of Revenue), the Secretary of Revenue hereby provides public notice of the rules for the following lottery game:

1. Name: The name of the lottery game is Pennsylvania Pool Party (hereinafter "Pool Party"). The game number is PA-5126.

# 2. Definitions:

- (a) Authorized retailer or retailer: A person who is properly licensed by the Lottery pursuant to 61 Pa. Code §§ 805.1—805.17.
- (b) Bar code: The symbology on the ticket containing certain encrypted validation and accounting data used for identifying winning and losing tickets.
- (c) *FLOAT SYMBOLS*: The two areas on a Pool Party ticket, each containing one play symbol that, when matched against the "WINNING FLOAT" symbol in the play area according to the instructions, determines whether the player wins a prize of \$5.
- (d) Game Ticket: A bearer instrument produced through a Lottery Terminal that is the player's record of a play for a Fast Play lottery game and sold by an authorized retailer containing the play and validation data as published in this game notice.

- (e) Lottery Central Computer System: The computer gaming system on which all Fast Play plays are recorded.
- (f) Lottery Terminal: A device authorized by the Lottery to function in an interactive mode with the Lottery Central Computer System for the purpose of issuing plays, executing Quick Pick selections, and entering, receiving, and processing lottery transactions, including making purchases, validating plays, transmitting reports, and performing inventory functions.
- (g) Play: A chance to participate in a particular Fast Play lottery game.
- (h) *Play Area*: The area on a ticket which contains one or more play symbols.
- (i) *Play Symbol*: A number, letter, symbol, image or other character found in the play area which is used to determine whether a player wins a prize.
- (j) *Prize*: A non-monetary item, money, or experience that can be won as specified in section 6 (relating to prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners) of this game notice.
- (k) WINNING FLOAT SYMBOL: The area at the top of the play area on a Pool Party ticket containing one play symbol that, when matched against either "FLOAT" symbol in the play area according to the instructions, determines whether the player wins a prize of \$5.
- (1) WINNING NUMBERS: The numbers, letters, symbols or other characters found in the play area that, when matched against the play symbols in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area, determine whether a player wins a prize.
- (m) Winning ticket: A game ticket which has been validated and qualifies for a prize.
- (n) YOUR NUMBERS: The numbers, letters, symbols or other characters found in the play area that, when matched against the play symbols in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area, determine whether a player wins a prize.
  - 3. Price: The price of a Pool Party ticket is \$1.
  - 4. Description of Pool Party Fast Play lottery game:
- (a) Pool Party lottery game is an instant win game printed from a Lottery Terminal. All prizes are predetermined, and the player does not have the ability to select their own play symbols. Pool Party tickets may be purchased from an authorized retailer or at a Lottery self-service terminal that sells terminal-based Lottery game tickets. Tickets purchased from an authorized retailer shall be printed on-demand at the time of purchase and may not be preprinted by the retailer.
- (b) Pool Party is played by matching any of the play symbols located in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area to any of the play symbols located in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area. A player matching play symbols in this manner will win the prize shown under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol. A bet slip is not used to play this game.
- (c) Pool Party is also played by matching either of the "FLOAT" play symbols to the "WINNING FLOAT" play symbol. Players matching play symbols in this manner will win \$5 instantly.
- (d) Players can win the prizes identified in section 6 (relating to prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners).

- (e) Pool Party tickets cannot be canceled or voided once printed by the Lottery Terminal, even if printed in error.
- (f) To purchase a ticket at an authorized retailer, a player must remit the purchase price to the retailer and verbally request a Pool Party ticket. The ticket shall be the only valid proof of the bet placed and the only valid receipt for claiming a prize.
- (g) To purchase a ticket at a Pennsylvania Lottery self-service terminal, the player must insert into the self-service terminal a dollar amount equal to the total purchase price of a Pool Party ticket and select the Pool Party option on the Lottery self-service terminal. The ticket shall be the only valid proof of the bet placed and the only valid receipt for claiming a prize.
  - 5. Pool Party ticket characteristics:
- (a) Pool Party tickets shall contain a play area, the cost of the play, the date of sale and a bar code.
- (b) Play Symbols: Pool Party tickets will contain a "WINNING NUMBERS" area, a "YOUR NUMBERS" area, two "FLOAT" areas and a "WINNING FLOAT" area. The play symbols and their captions, located in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area and the "YOUR NUMBERS" area, are: 1 (ONE), 2 (TWO), 3 (THREE), 4 (FOUR), 5 (FIVE), 6 (SIX), 7 (SEVEN), 8 (EIGHT), 9 (NINE), 10 (TEN), 11 (ELEVN), 12 (TWLV), 13 (THRTN), 14 (FORTN), 15 (FIFTN), 16 (SIXTN), 17 (SVNTN), 18 (EGHTN), 19 (NINTN), 20 (TWENT), 21 (TWYONE), 22 (TWYTWO), 23 (TWYTHR), 24 (TWYFOR), 25 (TWYFIV) and 26 (TWYSIX). The play symbols and their captions, located in the two "FLOAT" areas and the "WINNING FLOAT" area, are: Pineapple Float (PNAPLE) symbol, Pizza Float (PIZZA) symbol, Cactus Float (CACTUS) symbol, Donut Float (DONUT) symbol and a Lemon Float (LEMON) symbol.
- (c) Prize Symbols: The prize symbols and their captions, located in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area, are: FREE (TICKET),  $\$1^{.00}$  (ONE DOL),  $\$2^{.00}$  (TWO DOL),  $\$4^{.00}$  (FOR DOL),  $\$5^{.00}$  (FIV DOL),  $\$10^{.00}$  (TEN DOL),  $\$25^{.00}$  (TWY FIV),  $\$50^{.00}$  (FIFTY), \$100 (ONE HUN), \$500 (FIV HUN) and \$2,500 (TWYFIVHUN).
- (d) *Prizes*: The prizes that can be won in this game, are: Free \$1 Ticket, \$1, \$2, \$4, \$5, \$10, \$25, \$50, \$100, \$500 and \$2,500. The prize that can be won in the "WINNING FLOAT" area is \$5. A player can win up to six times on a ticket.
- (e) Approximate number of tickets available for the game: Approximately 600,000 tickets will be available for sale for the Pool Party lottery game.
- 6. Prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners:
- (a) All Pool Party prize payments will be made as one-time, lump-sum cash payments.
- (b) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$2,500 (TWYFIVHUN) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$2,500.
- (c) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$500 (FIV HUN) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$500.

(d) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.

- 11. Funding for prizes: Moneys will be drawn from the State Lottery Fund, to the extent necessary, to fund the payment of prizes under this section. If this lottery game is terminated for any cause, prize moneys remaining undistributed will remain in the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes otherwise provided for by law.

12. Unclaimed prizes: Unclaimed prize money on winning Fast Play lottery game tickets will be retained by the Secretary for payment to the persons entitled thereto for 1 year from the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket. If no claim is made within 1 year from the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket, the right of a ticket holder to claim the prize represented by that ticket, if any, shall expire.

13. Purchase and prize restrictions: A Fast Play lottery game ticket may not be purchased by, and a prize may not be paid, to an officer or employee of the Lottery, Lottery professional services contractors or subcontractors, or to a spouse, child, brother, sister or parent residing in the same household of an officer, employee, contractor or subcontractor who is involved in the production, distribution or operation of systems for the validation or accounting of Fast Play games.

### 14. Governing law:

- (a) By purchasing a ticket, the purchaser agrees to comply with and abide by the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314), this notice, instructions, conditions and final decisions of the Secretary, and procedures established by the Secretary for the conduct of the Fast Play Pool Party lottery game.
- (b) Decisions made by the Secretary, including the declaration of prizes and the payment thereof, in interpretation of this notice are final and binding on players and persons making a claim in respect thereof.
  - 15. Retailer compensation:
- (a) Authorized retailers may be entitled to compensation as determined by the Lottery.
- (b) No authorized retailer or employee of an authorized retailer shall request, demand, or accept gratuities or any compensation other than as provided in subsection (a) in exchange for the performance of duties authorized pursuant to the Lottery retailer's license without the Lottery's prior written authorization.
- 16. Retailer Incentive Programs: The Lottery may conduct a separate Retailer Incentive Program for retailers who sell Pennsylvania Fast Play Pool Party lottery game tickets.
- 17. Retailer bonus: The Lottery may offer a retailer bonus in connection with the sale of Pennsylvania Fast Play lottery game tickets. If a retailer bonus is offered, a Lottery retailer shall be eligible for a bonus as described in this section. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$100,000 and not exceeding \$500,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$500. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$500,001 and not exceeding \$1,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$5,000. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$1,000,001 and not exceeding \$10,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$10,000. A Lottery retailer is entitled only to the largest bonus for which they qualify on a winning ticket. A bonus will be initiated for payment after the Fast Play game ticket is claimed and validated. A bonus will not be awarded to a Lottery retailer that sells a non-winning Pennsylvania Lottery Fast Play game ticket used to enter a Pennsylvania Lottery second-chance drawing or promotion that is subsequently selected to win

18. Termination of the game: The Secretary may announce a termination date, after which no further tickets from this game may be sold. The announcement will be disseminated through media used to advertise or promote Pool Party or through normal communications methods.

19. Applicability: This notice applies only to the Pool Party lottery game announced in this notice.

Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board— Cleaning of Malt or Brewed Beverage Dispensing Systems Regulation No. 54-101 (# 3255)

On February 28, 2020, the Independent Regulatory Review Commission (Commission) received this proposed regulation from the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board (Board). This rulemaking amends 40 Pa. Code Chapters 5 and 9. The proposed regulation was published in the March 21, 2020 *Pennsylvania Bulletin* with a public comment period ending on April 20, 2020. Milk Marketing Board— Transactions Between Dealers and Producers; Termination of Dealer-Producer Contract Regulation No. 47-18 (# 3240)

On July 1, 2019, the Independent Regulatory Review Commission (Commission) received this proposed regulation from the Milk Marketing Board (Board). This rule-making amends 7 Pa. Code § 143.31. The proposed regulation was published in the July 13, 2019 *Pennsylvania Bulletin* with a public comment period ending on August 12, 2019. The final-form regulation was submitted to the Commission on May 12, 2021.

The rulemaking extends the current notice requirement to terminate a dealer-producer relationship from 28 days to 90 days for dealers and maintains the 28-day notice requirement for producers to terminate a contract. It also provides for waivers to address situations where a 90-day notice would financially imperil a milk dealer.

On December 9, 2020, the Independent Regulatory Review Commission (Commission) received this proposed regulation from the State Board of Physical Therapy (Board). This rulemaking amends 49 Pa. Code Chapter 40. The proposed regulation was published in the December 19, 2020 *Pennsylvania Bulletin* with a public comment period ending on January 18, 2021. The final-form regulation was submitted to the Commission on April 26, 2021.

This final-form regulation updates the Board's child abuse reporting regulations to be consistent with the Child Protective Services Law, including the act of April 15, 2014 (P.L. 411, No. 31). 23 Pa.C.S. §§ 6301—6387. Physical therapists and physical therapist assistants are mandated reporters who are required to immediately report suspected child abuse, and complete training in child abuse recognition and reporting as a condition of licensure or certification.

We suggest the Board consider adding this provision to the final-form regulation or explain why it is unnecessary to do so.

Electric Generation Supplier License Cancellations of Companies with an Expired Financial Security, Insufficient Financial Security Amount or Language

Electric Generation Supplier License Cancellations of Companies with an Expired Financial Security, Insufficient Financial Security Amount or Language; M-2021-3023559

#### **Tentative Order**

By the Commission:

The Commission's regulations at 52 Pa. Code § 54.40(a) state that an Electric Generation Supplier (EGS) license will not be issued or remain in force until the licensee furnishes a bond or other security approved by the Commission. In addition, 52 Pa. Code § 54.40(d) states that the maintenance of an EGS license is contingent on the licensee providing proof to the Commission that a bond or other approved security in the amount directed by the Commission has been obtained.

Each EGS must file an original bond, letter of credit, continuation certificate, amendment, or other approved financial instrument with Rosemary Chiavetta, Secretary, Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission, 400 North Street, Harrisburg, PA, 17120, prior to the EGS's current security expiration date. Each financial instrument must be an original document that displays a "wet" signature or digital signature, preferably in blue ink, and displays a "raised seal" or original notary stamp. The name of the principal on the original financial instrument must match exactly with the name that appears on the EGS's license issued by the Commission.

Failure to file before the financial security's expiration date may cause Commission staff to initiate a formal proceeding that may lead to the following: cancellation of each company's electric supplier license, removal of each company's information from the Commission's website, and notification to all electric distribution companies, in which each company is licensed to do business, of the cancellation of the license.

While we recognize that the COVID-19 pandemic has provided some challenges related to the continuance of normal business operations, it is imperative that the Commission have an approved financial security in place with each EGS to ensure compliance with 52 Pa. Code § 54.40(d). On March 25, 2020, Commission staff issued an EGS Financial Security Filing Guidance Memo (Guidance Memo) that stated the following:

• Where practical, EGSs should file an original bond, letter of credit, continuation certificate, amendment, or other financial instrument. These original financial instruments should display "wet" signatures or digital signatures, preferably in blue ink, and display a "raised seal" or original notary stamp.

- EGSs should email a copy of the original financial instrument directly to Secretary Chiavetta at rchiavetta@ pa.gov. Secretary Chiavetta has waived the restriction on emailed filings that contain confidential and proprietary material. As such, financial security instruments will be permitted to be filed by email for the duration of the Commission's work from home order.
- If an EGS is unable to acquire a "raised seal" or original notary stamp on the financial security during the pendency of the COVID-19 emergency, the Secretary's Bureau will not reject the financial security.
- If an EGS has been granted a reduction in its financial security, and it is time to renew the annual reduction, please file an original annual compliance filing with the Secretary's Bureau and a copy via email at rchiavetta@pa.gov.

Please note that the requirement that EGSs maintain a valid financial security on file with the Commission, remains in effect.

Be advised that emailed financial security instruments—after review and acceptance of the Secretary's Bureau and the Bureau of Technical Utility Services—will be provisionally approved by the Commission until Commission staff resume working in the Keystone Building. EGSs must still mail the original bond with original signatures and notary stamp as per the Commission's normal practice.

On July 27, 2020, the Commission issued a Secretarial Letter which modified certain filing and service requirements. 1 Specifically, this Secretarial Letter amended the Emergency Order issued on March 20, 2020, at Docket No. M-2020-3019262 regarding the filing of certain confidential documents. At the time the Emergency Order was issued, the Commission did not have access to its physical location. However, since that time the Commission has secured limited access to its place of business. Under these circumstances and consistent with the authority provided to the Secretary by the Emergency Order, the Secretarial Letter requires that confidential filings made pursuant to 52 Pa. Code § 54.40(a) (EGS financial securities), must be filed with the Secretary by overnight delivery and are not to be filed electronically with the Secretary.

As of June 8, 2021, each EGS listed in the Supplier Table below has not provided proof to the Commission that it has a bond or other approved security in the amount or language directed by the Commission, to replace a bond which is expired, or which is noncompliant with Commission regulations.

The Secretary (i) serve a copy of this Tentative Order upon the Office of Consumer Advocate, the Office of Small Business Advocate, the Bureau of Investigation & Enforcement, all electric generation distribution companies, and all of the Electric Generation Suppliers listed in the Supplier Table; (ii) publish a copy of this Tentative Order in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* with a 30-day comment period; and (iii) file a copy of this Tentative Order at each Electric Generation Supplier's assigned docket number
- 3. To the extent any of the Electric Generation Suppliers listed in the Supplier Table challenge the cancellation of their license, they must file comments within thirty (30) days after publication of this Tentative Order in the Pennsylvania Bulletin. ### **Final Order**

On February 25, 2021, the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (Commission) adopted a Tentative Order for the Revocation of Natural Gas Supplier (NGS) Licenses of companies that did not file a Natural Gas Supplier Annual Report or pay past due Annual or Supplemental Fees. On March 13, 2021, the Tentative Order was published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, with a response deadline of April 13, 2021.

The Public Utility Code authorizes the Commission to establish, by order or rule, on a reasonable cost basis, fees to be charged for annual activities related to the oversight of natural gas suppliers. 66 Pa.C.S. § 2208(h). NGSs are required to pay these fees. In addition, NGSs are required to file annual reports with the Commission by April 30 of each year identifying their gross Pennsylvania intrastate operating revenues from the prior calendar year. 52 Pa. Code § 62.110(a)(1).

Both the Code 66 Pa.C.S. § 2208(c)(2), and the Commission's regulations, 52 Pa. Code § 62.113(a)(5), state that the failure of an NGS to comply with applicable provisions of the Code or the rules, regulations, orders, or directives of the Commission shall be cause for the Commission to revoke the license of the NGS.

#### Supplier Fees

The Natural Gas Suppliers listed in Table 1 below paid their past due fees within 30 days after publication of the Tentative Order in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. As such, the Commission will not revoke the licenses of these NGSs.
