

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READER'S GUIDE TO THE PENNSYLVANIA BULLETIN AND THE PENNSYLVANIA CODE

Pennsylvania Bulletin

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the official gazette of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. It is published weekly. A cumulative subject matter index is published quarterly.

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* serves several purposes. It is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, which is the official codification of agency rules and regulations, Statewide court rules, and other statutorily authorized documents. Changes in the codified text, whether by adoption, amendment, rescission, repeal or emergency action, must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

The following documents are published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*: Governor's Executive Orders; Summaries of Enacted Statutes; Statewide and Local Court Rules; Attorney General Opinions; Motor Carrier Applications before the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission; Applications and Actions before the Department of Environmental Protection; Orders of the Independent Regulatory Review Commission; and other documents authorized by law.

The text of certain documents published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the only valid and enforceable text. Courts are required to take judicial notice of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Adoption, Amendment or Repeal of Regulations

Generally an agency wishing to adopt, amend or rescind regulations must first publish in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* a Proposed Rulemaking. There are limited instances when the agency may omit the proposal step; it still must publish the adopted version.

The Proposed Rulemaking contains the full text of the change, the agency contact person, a fiscal note required by law and background for the action.

The agency then allows sufficient time for public comment before taking final action. A Final Rule-making must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* before the changes can take effect. If the agency wishes to adopt changes to the Proposed Rulemaking to enlarge the scope, it must repropose.

Citation to the Pennsylvania Bulletin

Cite material in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* by volume number, a page number and date. Example: Volume 1, *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, page 801, January 9, 1971 (short form: 1 Pa.B. 801 (January 9, 1971)).

Pennsylvania Code

The *Pennsylvania Code* is the official codification of rules and regulations issued by Commonwealth agencies, Statewide court rules and other statutorily authorized documents. The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, printing changes when they are adopted. These changes are then permanently codified by the *Pennsylvania Code Reporter*, a monthly, loose-leaf supplement.

The *Pennsylvania Code* is cited by title number and section number. Example: Title 10 *Pennsylvania Code* § 1.1 (short form: 10 Pa. Code § 1.1).

Under the *Pennsylvania Code* codification system, each regulation is assigned a unique number by title and section. Titles roughly parallel the organization of Commonwealth government.

How to Find Rules and Regulations

Search for your area of interest in the *Pennsylva*nia Code. The *Pennsylvania Code* is available at www.pacodeandbulletin.gov.

Source Notes give the history of regulations. To see if there have been recent changes not yet codified, check the List of *Pennsylvania Code* Chapters Affected in the most recent issue of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Fiscal Notes

Section 612 of The Administrative Code of 1929 (71 P.S. § 232) requires the Governor's Budget Office to prepare a fiscal note for regulatory actions and administrative procedures of the administrative departments, boards, commissions and authorities receiving money from the State Treasury. The fiscal note states whether the action or procedure causes a loss of revenue or an increase in the cost of programs for the Commonwealth or its political subdivisions. The fiscal note is required to be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* at the same time as the change is advertised.

A fiscal note provides the following information: (1) the designation of the fund out of which the appropriation providing for expenditures under the action or procedure shall be made; (2) the probable cost for the fiscal year the program is implemented; (3) projected cost estimate of the program for each of the 5 succeeding fiscal years; (4) fiscal history of the program for which expenditures are to be made; (5) probable loss of revenue for the fiscal year of its implementation; (6) projected loss of revenue from the program for each of the 5 succeeding fiscal years; (7) line item, if any, of the General Appropriation Act or other appropriation act out of which expenditures or losses of Commonwealth funds shall occur as a result of the action or procedures; and (8) recommendation, if any, of the Secretary of the Budget and the reasons therefor.

The omission of an item indicates that the agency text of the fiscal note states that there is no information available with respect thereto. In items (3) and (6) information is set forth for the first through fifth fiscal years, following the year the program is implemented, which is stated. In item (4) information is set forth for the current and two immediately preceding years. In item (8) the recommendation, if any, made by the Secretary of the Budget is published with the fiscal note. "No fiscal impact" means no additional cost or revenue loss to the Commonwealth or its local political subdivision is intended. See 4 Pa. Code Chapter 7, Subchapter R (relating to fiscal notes).

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Information published under this part, which information includes, but is not limited to, cross references, tables of cases, notes of decisions, tables of contents, indexes, source notes, authority notes, numerical lists and codification guides, other than the actual text of rules or regulations may be reproduced only with the written consent of the [Legislative Reference] Bureau. The information which appears on the same leaf with the text of a rule or regulation, however, may be incidentally reproduced in connection with the reproduction of the rule or regulation, if the reproduction is for the private use of a subscriber and not for resale. There are no other restrictions on the reproduction of information published under this part, and the Commonwealth hereby consents to a reproduction.

A Concurrent Resolution

Extending in whole the disaster emergency declared on August 31, 2021, in response to the aftereffects of Hurricane Ida.

Whereas, On August 31, 2021, the Governor issued a proclamation declaring a disaster emergency in response to the aftereffects of Hurricane Ida; and

Whereas, In the proclamation declaring a disaster emergency, the Governor declared that Hurricane Ida had the potential to cause widespread and heavy rain throughout this Commonwealth, which in turn posed a serious threat of severe flash flooding and other adverse impacts throughout this Commonwealth; and

Whereas, The remnants of Hurricane Ida brought historic rainfall to Pennsylvania, causing record flooding in many places around this Commonwealth; and

Whereas, Flooding was particularly present in the southeastern region of this Commonwealth, some of which surpassed record flood levels, including reports ranging from five to eight inches of rain, which caused significant damage to homes, businesses and public infrastructure, while significantly threatening and disrupting lives and displacing families; and

Whereas, Scranton saw its second wettest day on record and Harrisburg and Altoona recorded their third wettest day on record; and

Whereas, As a result of flooding and damaging winds, a total of 389 roads were closed across this Commonwealth, while downed trees and limbs disrupted utilities, leaving more than 15 major interstates, roadways and expressways closed; and

Whereas, Recovery efforts in response to the damage caused by Hurricane Ida remain ongoing and will continue for the foreseeable future; therefore be it

Resolved, (The Senate concurring), That the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in accordance with section 20(c) of Article IV of the Constitution of Pennsylvania, extend in whole until October 27, 2021, the disaster emergency declared on August 31, 2021, in response to the aftereffects of Hurricane Ida, except as terminated or extended, in whole or in part, by the General Assembly; and be it further

Resolved, That upon adoption of this concurrent resolution by both chambers of the General Assembly, the Secretary of the Senate and the Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives notify the Governor of the General Assembly's action; and be it further

Resolved, That the Secretary of the Senate and the Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives transmit this concurrent resolution to the Legislative Reference Bureau for publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* under 45 Pa.C.S. § 725(a)(4); and be it further

Resolved, That this concurrent resolution take effect immediately.

Local Rules of Civil Procedure—Arbitration; 290 MD 2021

Order of Court

And Now, this 21st day of September, 2021, it is hereby Ordered and Directed as follows:

- 1. Local Rule of Civil Procedure 1301 is rescinded and replaced with the following Local Rule of Civil Procedure 1301. Local Rules of Civil Procedure 1302 and 1303 are hereby adopted by this Court. The rules shall be effective January 3, 2022.
- 2. The Indiana County District Court Administrator shall:

- b. Amend the Indiana County website to include the following Local Rules within thirty (30) days after the publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*; and
- c. File one (1) copy of the Local Rules with the Administrative Office of Pennsylvania Courts (AOPC).

Local Rule of Civil Procedure 1301. Compulsory Arbitration.

All civil actions, except those involving title to real property or actions in equity, shall be submitted to and be heard by a board of arbitrators when the amount in controversy, exclusive of interest and costs, is \$50,000 or loss

Local Rule of Civil Procedure 1302. List of Arbitrators. Appointment to Board.

- (a) The Prothonotary of Indiana County shall prepare and maintain a list of available arbitrators in accordance with Pa.R.Civ.P. 1302.
- (b) When a request for an appointment of a board of arbitrators is submitted, the Prothonotary shall provide counsel with a list of five (5) qualified arbitrators. Each party shall be permitted to strike an arbitrator from the list. The remaining three (3) arbitrators shall serve as the Board of Arbitrators. The first arbitrator on the list shall serve as the chairperson.

Local Rule of Civil Procedure 1303. Hearing. Notice.

The chairperson of the Board of Arbitrators shall be responsible for fixing the date, time and place of the arbitration hearing. The chairperson shall comply with the provisions of Pa.R.Civ.P. 1303.

WASHINGTON COUNTY

Temporary Residential Landlord Tenant Rental Assistance Program; No. 2021-1

Administrative Order

And Now, this 17th day of September, 2021, it is hereby Ordered, Adjudged, and Decreed that the following procedures shall be established for landlord tenant cases until further Order of Court:

- 1. At any time subsequent to the commencement of a residential landlord tenant action for possession of residential real property on the basis of recovery or nonpayment of rent before a magisterial district court, any party to the action, or the Blueprints organization with the consent of any party to the action, may submit a request to the magisterial district court for a continuance. This request shall be signed by the party making the request or by a representative of Blueprints, or another appropriate rental assistance agency, and shall certify that the defendant has submitted an application for emergency rental assistance. Such a request may be considered as good cause shown pursuant to Pa.R.C.P.M.D.J. 209 and, upon receipt of such a request, the magisterial district judge may continue any proceedings, including pending execution of an Order of Possession, for up to thirty (30) days. No continuance pursuant to this Order shall exceed a total of thirty (30) aggregate days.
- 2. If a request for continuance pursuant to this Order is not submitted by a party or a representative of Blueprints or another appropriate rental assistance agency, the magisterial district court may continue the matter for up to thirty (30) days if the magisterial district judge is satisfied that a good faith application for emergency rental assistance has been or will be submitted to Blueprints or another appropriate rental assistance agency. No continuance pursuant to this Order shall exceed a total of thirty (30) aggregate days.
- 3. All appeals to the Court of Common Pleas from judgments of the magisterial district courts concerning residential landlord tenant actions for the recovery or nonpayment of rent, and all other Civil Complaints relating to residential evictions and the recovery or nonpayment of rent, shall be transferred to the docket of one judge of the Court of Common Pleas, as designated by the District Court Administrator and the President Judge. Each case shall be scheduled for an initial case management conference before the assigned judge within thirty (30) days of the filing of the Complaint. Initial case management conferences shall be held in person before the Court unless prior leave of court is granted to hold the conference through advanced communications technology.

- 4. No trial or hearing on possession pursuant to a residential landlord tenant eviction may be held until after the initial case management conference has been held before the Court.
- 5. The fact that a good faith application for emergency rental assistance has been or will be submitted to Blueprints or another appropriate rental assistance agency may be considered grounds for a continuance pursuant to Pa.R.C.P. 216.
- 6. If a case has been scheduled for an initial case management conference, all motions concerning a supersedeas affidavit pursuant to Pa.R.C.P.M.D.J. 1008 or in forma pauperis status shall be heard by the judge assigned to the case.
- 7. This Order shall be processed in conformity with Pa.R.J.A. 103. The District Court Administrator is directed to do the following:
- a. File one (1) copy of this Administrative Order with the Administrative Office of Pennsylvania Courts;
- b. Distribute two (2) copies to the Legislative Reference Bureau for publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*; and
- c. Serve a copy of this Administrative Order on the judges of the Court of Common Pleas, the judges of the

magisterial district courts of Washington County, and all other necessary officials.

Waterfront Development Organizations

Under the act of July 13, 2016 (P.L. 526, No. 84) (72 P.S. §§ 8701-K—8710-K) referred to as the Waterfront Development Tax Credit Program Act (act) was established in this Commonwealth. This act authorizes the Department of Community and Economic Development (Department) to approve qualified waterfront development organizations who are eligible to submit waterfront development projects. Proposed Exchange of Property

The Department of Conservation and Natural Resources (Department), acting through the Bureau of Forestry (Bureau), and Tracey A. Peters are proposing to negotiate an exchange of property interests in Greene Township, Clinton County and Spring Township, Centre County.

The proposed exchange involves approximately 2-acres of State forest land, which surrounds the site of a State forest camp lease, located in Spring Township, Centre County in exchange to the Commonwealth of a 4-acre tract located in Greene Township, Clinton County (the Bull Run Tract). There is no infrastructure on the 4-acre Bull Run Tract. It is bound on the west by State Route 477 and the east by mostly existing State forest land. The property shares a joint boundary with State forest land for approximately 3/10-mile and provides improved protection of water quality in the Fishing Creek watershed and protection of habitat for species of concern. The

acreage balance is strongly in favor of the Commonwealth and therefore makes this proposed transaction justified as equal or greater value for the Commonwealth. The proposed exchange will further consolidate public ownership of this forested landscape and is consistent with the Bureau's land acquisition goals.

As is the policy of the Department, the public is hereby notified of this proposed exchange. A 30-day period for public inquiry or comment will be in effect beginning October 2, 2021, and ending October 31, 2021. Oral or written comments or questions concerning this proposed exchange may be addressed to Tom Stahl, Planning Section, Bureau of Forestry, P.O. Box 8552, Harrisburg, PA 17105-8552, thstahl@pa.gov, (717) 772-0268. Oral or written comments will become part of the official document used in the final decision process. Written documents are also available regarding the proposed land exchange by request.

If, in the duration of the 30-day comment period, a significant amount of public concern develops, the Secretary of the Department may schedule a public informational meeting.

Cyber Charter School Application; Public Hearings

The Department of Education (Department) has scheduled four dates for public hearings regarding cyber charter school applications that it received on or before October 1, 2021.

The hearings will be held on November 3, 2021, November 4, 2021, November 9, 2021, and November 18, 2021.

Each hearing will take place at 9 a.m. in Heritage Room A, Lobby Level, 333 Market Street, Harrisburg, PA 17126. Login information to access the hearings virtually will be posted to the Department's Division of Charter School's Applications webpage at https://www.education.pa.gov/K-12/Charter%20Schools/Pages/Charter-Applications.aspx.

The hearings pertain to applicants seeking to operate a cyber charter school beginning in the 2022-2023 school year. The purpose of the hearings is to gather information from the applicants about the proposed cyber charter schools as well as receive comments from interested individuals regarding the applications. The names of the applicants, copies of the applications and a listing of the dates and times scheduled for the hearing on each application can be viewed on the Department's web site after October 1, 2021, at www.education.pa.gov.

Individuals who wish to provide comments on an application during the hearings must provide a copy of their written comments to the Department and the applicant on or before October 25, 2021. Comments provided by this deadline and presented at the hearings

will become part of the certified record. Failure to comply with this deadline will preclude the individual from providing comments at the hearings. Verbal comments may be limited based on the number of individuals requesting time to provide comments and may be limited if the comments are duplicative or repetitive of another individual's comments. Persons who are unable to attend the hearings may provide the Department and the applicant with written comments on or before October 25, 2021. Written comments provided to the Department by this deadline will also become part of the certified record.

During the public hearing on an application, the cyber charter applicant will have 30 minutes to present information about the proposed cyber charter school. Each hearing will be conducted by the panel of individuals who have completed an initial review of the application. The panel members may question the applicant on issues identified during their review, as well as issues raised in the written comments filed by the deadline. Designation of School Districts to Receive Duquesne City School District's Junior and Senior High School Students

The Duquesne City School District (Duquesne) eliminated its senior high school program in 2007. Section 14 of the act of July 20, 2007 (P.L. 278, No. 45) (Act 45) governed the reassignment of Duquesne's senior high school students until Act 45 was declared unconstitutional by the Commonwealth Court in 2010. In part, Act 45 authorized the Secretary of Education to designate two or more school districts to accept Duquesne's high school students. Under Act 45, then-Secretary of Education Gerald Zahorchak designated the East Allegheny School District (East Allegheny) and the West Mifflin Area School District (West Mifflin) to accept Duquesne's senior high school students on a tuition basis.

Shortly after Act 45 was struck down, the act of November 23, 2010 (P.L. 1350, No. 123) (Act 123) was enacted. The enactment of Act 123 resulted in significant amendments to section 1607 of the Public School Code of 1949 (School Code) (24 P.S. § 16-1607). Section 1607 of

the School Code authorizes the Secretary of Education to designate two or more school districts to accept Duquesne's high school students. When Act 123 was enacted, East Allegheny and West Mifflin were designated to continue to accept Duquesne's senior high school students.

In 2012, Duquesne sought and received the approval of the Department of Education (Department) to alter/curtail its junior high school program (grades 7 and 8). Accordingly, on July 9, 2012, East Allegheny and West Mifflin were designated to also accept Duquesne's junior high school students under section 1607 of the School Code. Beginning with the 2021-2022 school year, Duquesne has reconfigured and will again operate a 7th grade program.

For the 2021-2022 school year, the designation of East Allegheny and West Mifflin to accept Duquesne's 8—12 grade students remained unchanged.

As required under section 1607(d) of the School Code, the Department provides the following information regarding the assignment of Duquesne's 8—12 grade students to East Allegheny and West Mifflin.

Assignment of Students

- Students entering grades 8, 9, 10, 11 or 12 shall be assigned to the same district to which they were assigned during the previous school year.
- Private, religious or charter school students who are residents of Duquesne and who wish to enroll in Duquesne and attend East Allegheny or West Mifflin must register as Duquesne students at the Duquesne Education Center to be assigned to either East Allegheny or West Mifflin.
- Students transferring into Duquesne will be given a choice between East Allegheny and West Mifflin and will be assigned to the district they choose.

Per Pupil Tuition Rate

The per pupil tuition rate that the designated districts shall receive for the 2021-2022 school year is \$14,978.36.

And in accordance with 25 Pa. Code § 127.521,

the Department of Environmental Protection intends to modify the facility's Title V Operating Permit. The facility is located at 1442 Power Plant Road, New Florence, PA 15944. The facility's major emission sources include two tangential pulverized coal-fired (PC) boilers, Boiler 1 and 2, each with nominal maximum heat inputs of 8,280 MMBtu/hr, two natural gas-fired Auxiliary Boilers, A and B, rated at 211.5 and 212.5 MMBtu/hr, four 3,600 bhp peaking diesel electrical generators, two emergency diesel generators, two nonemergency fire pumps, coal storage piles and processing, and plant roads.

The proposed SIP revision does not adopt any new regulations. It incorporates the provisions and requirements contained in the amended RACT II approval for the facility, which are intended to satisfy the requirements for the 1997, 2008 and 2015 National Ambient Air Quality Standard (NAAQS) for ozone.

The proposed amendments to the RACT II determination, if finally approved, will be incorporated into a revised operating permit (32-00059) for the facility. The relevant RACT II requirements will be submitted to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) as a revision to Pennsylvania's State Implementation Plan and will remain in effect until replaced pursuant to 40 CFR 51 and approval by the EPA. Requirements that are not part of the RACT II determination will be excluded from the SIP submittal; this includes the provisions of the Department's presumptive RACT II requirements in accordance with 25 Pa. Code § 129.97, as they apply to existing sources at this facility.

The following is a summary of the proposed amendments to the RACT II determination for this operation that will be submitted to the EPA as a SIP revision:

- \bullet Emissions of NO_x expressed as NO₂ for Boiler 1 and 2 are individually limited to a maximum of 0.070 lb NO_x/MMBtu on a daily average basis. This limit excludes, emissions during start-up, shut-down, and malfunction; operation pursuant to emergency generation required by PJM, including any necessary testing for such emergency operations; and during periods in which compliance with this emission limit would require operation of any equipment in a manner inconsistent with technological limitations, good engineering and maintenance practices, and/or good air pollution control practices for minimizing emissions.
- \bullet Emissions of NO_x expressed as NO₂ from Boiler 1 and 2 are individually limited to a maximum of 0.27 lb. NO_x/MMBtu on a daily average basis under all operating conditions.
- \bullet Emissions of $\mathrm{NO_x}$ expressed as $\mathrm{NO_2}$ from Boiler 1 and 2 are individually limited to a maximum 700 lbs. $\mathrm{NO_x/hr}$ on a 30-operating day rolling average basis under all operating conditions.
- The owner or operator shall calibrate, operate, and maintain all elements of the SCR system and units in accordance with the manufacturer's specifications, in a manner consistent with good engineering and air pollution control practices when the SCR system is in use.
- \bullet The owner or operator shall maintain NO_{x} controls as effective as reasonably possible during startups and shutdowns.

- \bullet The owner or operator shall take steps to bring NO_{x} controls back into full service as quickly as practicable whenever the control equipment experiences a malfunction.
- The owner or operator shall document and report to the DEP, information regarding the cause of the malfunction and the steps for bringing the controls back.
- \bullet The owner or operator shall develop, maintain, and implement an operation and maintenance plan (O&M Plan) for Boiler 1, Boiler 2, Low NO $_{\rm x}$ Burner (LNB) and the SCR.
- During the first 60 days of each calendar year, the facility shall perform a catalyst activity test.
- Within 60 days of receiving the results of the catalyst activity test, the facility shall consult with the SCR catalyst vendor to monitor SCR performance in accordance with the catalyst management plans (CMPs) developed for the SCR systems. Corrective action, if required, shall be completed by April 30.
- Inclusion and Revisions of 40 CFR Part 97 CSAPR Related Subparts (Subpart EEEEE is replaced with Subpart GGGGG).
- \bullet Emissions of $NO_x,$ expressed as $NO_2,$ for the Auxiliary Boiler A (Source 039) are limited to a maximum of 0.135 lb/MMBtu on a daily average basis and 12.5 tpy based on a 12-month rolling total.
- \bullet Emissions of $NO_x,$ expressed as $NO_2,$ for the Auxiliary Boiler B (Source 041) are limited to a maximum of 0.179 lb/MMBtu on a daily average basis and 16.7 tpy based on a 12-month rolling total.
- Heat input from natural gas to Auxiliary Boiler A (Source 039) is limited to 185,200 MMBtu during any consecutive 12-month period.
- Heat input from natural gas to Auxiliary Boiler B (Source 041) is limited to 186,150 MMBtu during any consecutive 12-month period.
- Auxiliary Boilers A and B (Source ID 039 and 041) shall each not exceed a 10% annual heat input capacity factor. The permittee shall maintain an operating log, including records of hours of operation, fuel consumption, fuel type, and typical fuel analyses to verify compliance with the annual capacity factor limitation of 10%.

MINING ACTIVITY NPDES DRAFT PERMITS

This notice provides information about applications for a new, amended or renewed NPDES permits associated with mining activity (coal or noncoal) permits. The applications concern industrial waste (mining) discharges to surface water and discharges of stormwater associated with mining activities. This notice is provided in accordance with 25 Pa. Code Chapters 91 and 92a and 40 CFR Part 122, implementing provisions of The Clean Streams Law (35 P.S. §§ 691.1—691.1001) and the Federal Clean Water Act (33 U.S.C.A. §§ 1251—1376).

The Department of Environmental Protection (Department) has prepared a draft NPDES permit and made a tentative determination to issue the NPDES permit in conjunction with the associated mining activity permit.

Effluent Limits for Coal Mining Activities

For coal mining activities, NPDES permits, when issued, will contain effluent limits that are the more stringent of technology-based (BAT) effluent limitations or Water Quality Based Effluent Limits (WQBEL).

A settleable solids instantaneous maximum limit of 0.5 ml/l applies to: surface runoff (resulting from a precipitation event of less than or equal to a 10-year 24-hour event) from active mining areas; active areas disturbed by coal refuse disposal activities; mined areas backfilled and revegetated; and all other discharges and drainage (resulting from a precipitation event of greater than 1-year 24-hour to less than or equal to a 10-year 24-hour event) from coal refuse disposal piles. Similarly, modified BAT limits apply to iron, manganese and suspended solids in surface runoff, discharges and drainage resulting from these precipitation events and those of greater magnitude in accordance with 25 Pa. Code §§ 87.102, 88.92, 88.187, 88.292, 89.52 and 90.102.

Exceptions to BAT effluent limits may be applicable in accordance with 25 Pa. Code §§ 87.102, 88.92, 88.187, 88.292, 89.52 and 90.102.

Effluent Limits for Noncoal Mining Activities

The limits for noncoal mining activities as provided in 25 Pa. Code Chapter 77 are pH 6 to 9 and other parameters the Department may require.

Discharges from noncoal mines located in some geologic settings (for example, in the coal fields) may require additional water quality based effluent limits. If additional effluent limits are needed for an NPDES permit associated with a noncoal mining permit, then the permit description specifies the parameters.

In addition to BAT or WQBEL limits, coal and noncoal NPDES permits establish effluent limitations in the form of implemented Best Management Practices (BMPs) identified in the associated Erosion and Sedimentation Plan, the Reclamation Plan and the NPDES permit application. These BMPs restrict the rates and quantities of associated pollutants from being discharged into surface waters in this Commonwealth.

More restrictive effluent limitations, restrictions on discharge volume or restrictions on the extent of mining that may occur are incorporated into an NPDES permit when necessary for compliance with water quality standards and antidegradation requirements (in accordance with 25 Pa. Code Chapters 91—96).

The procedures for determining the final effluent limits, using a mass-balance equation or model, are found in Technical Guidance Document 563-2112-115, Developing National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES)

Comments received within the comment period will be considered in the final determinations regarding the NPDES permit applications. The baseline remedial investigation, based on the work plan, is compiled into the baseline environmental report to establish a reference point to show existing contamination, describe proposed remediation to be done and include a description of existing or potential public benefits of the use or reuse of the property. The Department may approve or disapprove plans and reports submitted. This notice provides the Department's decision and, if relevant, the basis for disapproval.

Proposed Alternative Restoration Plan for the Baken Creek Watershed in Perry County.

Central Office: Bureau of Clean Water, P.O. Box 8774, Harrisburg, PA 17105-8774.

The Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) will accept comments on the proposed Alternative Restoration Plan (ARP) developed for the **Baken Creek Watershed** in **Perry County**. The Pennsylvania Integrated Water Quality Monitoring and Assessment Report included stream segments listed as impaired for aquatic life in the watershed. The impairments addressed by this document were listed as being caused by excessive siltation due to removal of riparian vegetation. By restoring this watershed, it is hoped to not only improve water quality locally, but also to improve conditions within the downstream areas of Shermans Creek. Shermans Creek is noted for its "exceptional value" and "high quality" existing uses as well hosting a historic, and perhaps extant, hellbender (Cryptobranchus alleganiensis alleganiensis) population.

The ARP approach was chosen as a temporary alternative to the development of a Total Maximum Daily Load (TMDL). An ARP is currently a better option for this watershed because it not only sets a pollution reduction goal, but it also lays out a comprehensive plan for restoration. DEP plans on partnering with the Perry County Conservation District as primary stakeholders to implement the plan. Funding is proposed to be sought under Section 319 of the Clean Water Act among other sources. If the restoration plan fails to result in delisting of the siltation impairments, a TMDL per section 303(d) of the Clean Water Act would be needed in the future.

Currently, there are no State or Federal in-stream numerical water quality criteria for sediment. Therefore, the Department utilized a reference watershed approach to propose an allowable load per the narrative criteria. The allowable load included allocations for natural sources, nonpoint pollution sources, as well as an uncertainty factor. Nonpoint source load allocations were made for cropland, hay/pasture land, and streambank source sectors present in the watershed. Data used in establishing the allowable load were primarily generated using a water quality analysis model (Model My Watershed) made available through the Stroud Water Research Center.

The following table shows the estimated current sediment loading within the watershed, the prescribed allowable load value and % reductions needed under annual average conditions.

| Summary of Prescribed Load Reductions (expressed as annual averages) in the Baken Creek Watershed | | | | |

An analysis of Best Management Practice (BMP) opportunities indicated that sediment loading in the watershed could be reduced beyond the reduction goal. Key BMPs included agricultural erosion and sedimentation plan implementation, use of precision grass filter strips along drainageways, streambank stabilization/restoration, the use of conservation tillage and the use of riparian buffers.

Stream Redesignation Evaluation of Chester Creek and Reynolds Run; Water Quality Standards Review

Under 25 Pa. Code § 93.4d (relating to processing of petitions, evaluations and assessments to change a designated use) the Department of Environmental Protection (Department) gives notice that evaluations will be conducted on the stream sections listed to determine the proper protected use designation in this Commonwealth's Water Quality Standards (WQS).

On July 11, 2020, the Commonwealth adopted revisions to its WQS regulations at 25 Pa. Code Chapter 93 (relating to water quality standards), and its toxics management strategy—statement of policy at 25 Pa. Code Chapter 16 (relating to water quality toxics management strategy—statement of policy), published at 50 Pa.B. 3426 (July 11, 2020). Under section 303 of the Federal Clean Water Act (act) (33 U.S.C.A. § 1313) and Federal regulations at 40 CFR Part 131 (relating to water quality standards), these revisions were submitted to the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), Region 3, for review. The EPA approved the WQS revisions with exceptions that include:

- The revision to the designated use for Chester Creek (locally known as Goose Creek) in 25 Pa. Code § 93.9g (relating to Drainage List G).
- The revision to the designated use for Reynolds Run in 25 Pa. Code § 93.90 (relating to Drainage List O).

The adopted revisions to these waterbodies changed the designated use of Chester Creek in Chester County from

Trout Stocking (TS), Migratory Fish to Warm Water Fishes and the designated use for Reynolds Run in Lancaster County from High Quality Waters (HQ), Cold Water Fishes to HQ, TS.

In accordance with 40 CFR 131.10(j)(2) (relating to designation of uses), a state must conduct a use attainability analysis (UAA) whenever the state "wishes to remove a designated use that is specified in section 101(a)(2) of the act, to remove a sub-category of such a use, or to designate a sub-category of such a use that requires criteria less stringent than previously applicable." The revisions to Chester Creek and Reynolds Run would require some criteria that are less stringent than those previously applicable.

To initiate the UAA, the Department is requesting that persons who have technical data concerning the water quality, instream habitat or biological condition of these stream sections make the data available to the Department for consideration in these evaluations. Following the review of data and the application of the UAA, notice of draft reports which present the results of these evaluations will be provided with an opportunity for public review and comment. Public comments on the draft report will be addressed in a final report. The final report will be submitted to the EPA for review.

- (e) Lottery Terminal: A device authorized by the Lottery to function in an interactive mode with the Lottery Central Computer System for the purpose of issuing plays, executing Quick Pick selections, and entering, receiving, and processing lottery transactions, including making purchases, validating plays, transmitting reports and performing inventory functions.
- (f) *Play*: A chance to participate in a particular Fast Play lottery game.
- (g) *Play Area*: The area on a ticket, which contains one or more play symbols.
- (h) *Play Symbol*: A number, letter, symbol, image or other character found in the play area, which is used to determine whether a player wins a prize.
- (i) *PROGRESSIVE TOP PRIZE*: The top prize available for this game that begins with a minimum prize amount that grows at a pre-determined rate every time a ticket is purchased, and then resets to the minimum prize amount whenever a top prizewinning ticket is sold.
- (j) *Prize*: A non-monetary item, money or experience that can be won as specified in section 6 (relating to prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners) of this game notice.
- (k) *SPOT*: The visual representation of a "SPOT" printed around certain play symbols in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area. When any prize won in the main game area appears on a "SPOT," the player increases the prize won by \$10.
- (1) WINNING NUMBERS: The numbers, letters, symbols or other characters found in the play area that, when matched against the play symbols in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area, determine whether a player wins a prize.
- (m) Winning ticket: A game ticket which has been validated and qualifies for a prize.
- (n) YOUR NUMBERS: The numbers, letters, symbols or other characters found in the play area that, when matched against the play symbols in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area, determine whether a player wins a prize.
 - 3. *Price*: The price of a Cash Spot ticket is \$2.
 - 4. Description of the Cash Spot Fast Play lottery game:
- (a) The Cash Spot lottery game is an instant win game printed from a Lottery Terminal. All prizes are predetermined, and the player does not have the ability to select their own play symbols. Cash Spot tickets may be purchased from an authorized retailer or at a Lottery self-service terminal that sells terminal-based Lottery game tickets. Tickets purchased from an authorized retailer shall be printed on-demand at the time of purchase and may not be preprinted by the retailer.
- (b) Cash Spot is played by matching the play symbols located in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area to the play symbols located in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area. A player matching play symbols in this manner will win the prize shown under the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol.

- If the winning prize amount is printed within a "SPOT," the player increases the prize won by \$10. A bet slip is not used to play this game.
- (c) Players can win the prizes identified in section 6 (relating to prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners).
- (d) A Cash Spot game ticket cannot be canceled or voided once printed by the Lottery Terminal, even if printed in error.
- (e) To purchase a ticket at an authorized retailer, a player must remit the purchase price to the retailer and verbally request a Cash Spot game ticket. The ticket shall be the only valid proof of the bet placed and the only valid receipt for claiming a prize.
- (f) To purchase a ticket at a Pennsylvania Lottery self-service terminal, the player must insert into the self-service terminal a dollar amount equal to the total purchase price of a Cash Spot game ticket and select the Cash Spot option on the Lottery self-service terminal. The ticket shall be the only valid proof of the bet placed and the only valid receipt for claiming a prize.
 - 5. Cash Spot ticket characteristics:
- (a) A Cash Spot ticket shall contain a play area, the cost of the play, the date of sale and a bar code.
- (b) Play Symbols: Each Cash Spot ticket play area will contain a "WINNING NUMBERS" area and a "YOUR NUMBERS" area. The play symbols and their captions, located in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area and the "YOUR NUMBERS" area, are: 1 (ONE), 2 (TWO), 3 (THREE), 4 (FOUR), 5 (FIVE), 6 (SIX), 7 (SEVEN), 8 (EIGHT), 9 (NINE), 10 (TEN), 11 (ELEVN), 12 (TWLV), 13 (THRTN), 14 (FORTN), 15 (FIFTN), 16 (SIXTN), 17 (SVNTN), 18 (EGHTN), 19 (NINTN), 20 (TWENT), 21 (TWYONE), 22 (TWYTWO), 23 (TWYTHR), 24 (TWYFOR) and 25 (TWYFIV). The play symbols and their captions, located in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and printed on a "SPOT," are: 1 (ONE), 2 (TWO), 3 (THREE), 4 (FOUR), 5 (FIVE), 6 (SIX), 7 (SEVEN), 8 (EIGHT), 9 (NINE), 10 (TEN), 11 (ELEVN), 12 (TWLV), 13 (THRTN), 14 (FORTN), 15 (FIFTN), 16 (SIXTN), 17 (SVNTN), 18 (EGHTN), 19 (NINTN), 20 (TWENT), 21 (TWYONE), 22 (TWYTWO), 23 (TWYTHR), 24 (TWYFOR) and 25 (TWYFIV).
- (c) *Prize Symbols*: The prize symbols and their captions, located in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area, are: $\$2^{.00}$ (TWO DOL), $\$4^{.00}$ (FOR DOL), $\$5^{.00}$ (FIV DOL), $\$10^{.00}$ (TEN DOL), $\$20^{.00}$ (TWENTY), $\$50^{.00}$ (FIFTY), \$100 (ONE HUN), \$200 (TWO HUN) and PROG (TOP PRIZE).
- (d) Prizes: The prizes that can be won in this game, are: \$2, \$4, \$5, \$10, \$20, \$50, \$100, \$200 and the "PROGRESSIVE TOP PRIZE." The "PROGRESSIVE TOP PRIZE" amount starts at \$10,000 and increases by \$0.20 every time a Cash Spot ticket is purchased. When a "PROGRESSIVE TOP PRIZE" winning ticket is sold, the "PROGRESSIVE TOP PRIZE" resets to \$10,000. Cash Spot also contains a feature that can increase certain prizes. For a complete list of prizes, and how those prizes can be won, see section 7 (relating to Number and description of prizes and approximate chances of winning). A player can win up to nine times on a ticket.
- (e) Approximate number of tickets available for the game: Approximately 600,000 tickets will be available for sale for the Cash Spot lottery game.

- 6. Prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners:
- (a) All Cash Spot prize payments will be made as one-time, lump-sum cash payments.
- (b) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of PROG (TOP PRIZE) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of a "PROGRESSIVE TOP PRIZE." The amount won under this paragraph is the amount of the "PROGRESSIVE TOP PRIZE," determined by the Lottery Central Computer System, as of the time the winning ticket was purchased. The amount won will be a minimum of \$10,000.
- (c) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$200 (TWO HUN) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$200.
- (d) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols, with the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol appearing within a "SPOT," and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$110.
- (e) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.
- (f) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols, with the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" symbol appearing within a "SPOT," and a prize symbol of \$50.00 (FIFTY) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$60.
- (g) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols, and a prize symbol of \$50^{.00} (FIFTY) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$50.
- (h) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols, with the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" symbol appearing within a "SPOT," and a prize symbol of \$20^{.00} (TWENTY) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$30.
- (i) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of 20^{00} (TWENTY) appears in the "Prize" area under the match-

ing "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$20.

- (j) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols, with the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" symbol appearing within a "SPOT," and a prize symbol of \$10.00 (TEN DOL) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$20.
- (k) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols, with the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" symbol appearing within a "SPOT," and a prize symbol of \$5.00 (FIV DOL) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$15.
- (l) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols, with the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" symbol appearing within a "SPOT," and a prize symbol of \$4.00 (FOR DOL) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$14.
- (m) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols, with the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" symbol appearing within a "SPOT," and a prize symbol of \$2.00 (TWO DOL) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$12.
- (n) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$10.00 (TEN DOL) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$10.
- (o) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$5.00 (FIV DOL) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$5.
- (p) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$4.00 (FOR DOL) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$4.
- (q) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of $\$2^{.00}$ (TWO DOL) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$2.
- 7. Number and description of prizes and approximate chances of winning: The following table sets forth the approximate number of winners, amounts of prizes and approximate chances of winning:

*PROGRESSIVE TOP PRIZE: The minimum value of the PROGRESSIVE TOP PRIZE is \$10,000. The PROGRESSIVE TOP PRIZE increases by \$0.20 every time a ticket is purchased and resets to \$10,000 whenever a top prize-winning ticket is sold.

Prizes, including top prizes, are subject to availability at the time of purchase.

- $8. \ \textit{Ticket responsibility}:$
- (a) A Fast Play lottery game ticket is a bearer document deemed to be owned by the person holding the game ticket, except that if a name is contained on the back of the game ticket, the person named will, for all purposes, be considered the owner of the game ticket.
- (b) The holder of a Fast Play lottery game ticket has the sole responsibility for checking the accuracy and condition of the data printed on the game ticket.
- (c) The Commonwealth shall not be responsible for a lost or stolen Fast Play lottery game ticket, or for a Fast Play ticket redeemed by a player in error.

- 9. Ticket validation and requirements:
- (a) Valid Fast Play lottery game tickets. To be a valid Fast Play lottery game ticket, the presented game ticket must meet the following requirements:
- (1) The game ticket's bar code shall be present in its entirety.
 - (2) The game ticket must be intact.
- (3) The game ticket may not be mutilated, altered, reconstituted or tampered with.
- (4) The game ticket may not be counterfeit or a duplicate of a winning ticket.
 - (5) The game ticket must have been validly issued.

- (6) The game ticket data shall have been recorded on the Lottery Central Computer System and the game ticket data shall match the computer record in every respect.
- (7) The game ticket must not be defectively printed or printed or produced in error such that it cannot be processed or validated by the Lottery.
- (8) The game ticket must pass other confidential security checks of the Lottery.
- (b) Invalid or defective game tickets. A game ticket not passing the validation requirements in subsection (a) will be considered invalid and no payment will be made on account of any play recorded thereon. The determination of the Secretary in this regard is final.
 - 10. Procedures for claiming and payment of prizes:
- (a) A prize may be claimed through an authorized retailer or the Lottery, as provided in this section. A prize must be claimed within 1 year of the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket.
- (b) An authorized retailer is authorized to pay prizes of \$2,500 or less. The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play representing a prize of \$2,500 or less may be paid by a participating authorized retailer if a proper validation pay ticket was issued by the retailer's Lottery Terminal
- (c) The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play representing a prize in excess of \$2,500 may present the game ticket to an authorized retailer, Lottery District Office, or Lottery Headquarters.
- (d) The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play shall present the ticket, in person, to an authorized retailer, Lottery Headquarters or a Lottery District Office. The retailer or the Lottery will issue payment if:
- (1) The game ticket is scanned and the play is validated through the Lottery Terminal or the Lottery Central Computer System;
 - (2) A claim form is properly and fully completed;
 - (3) The identification of the claimant is confirmed; and
- (4) The winning ticket has not expired, pursuant to this section or section 12 (relating to unclaimed prizes).
- (e) The Commonwealth shall not be responsible for a winning play paid in error by an authorized retailer.
- (f) In the event a prize described in these rules is not available, the Lottery may either provide a substitute prize, determined by the Secretary to have an equivalent value to the prize won, or make a cash payment to the winner, in an amount determined by the Secretary to have an equivalent value to the prize won.
- 11. Funding for prizes: Moneys will be drawn from the State Lottery Fund, to the extent necessary, to fund the payment of prizes under this section. If this lottery game is terminated for any cause, prize moneys remaining undistributed will remain in the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes otherwise provided for by law.
- 12. Unclaimed prizes: Unclaimed prize money on winning Fast Play lottery game tickets will be retained by the Secretary for payment to the persons entitled thereto for 1 year from the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket. If no claim is made within 1 year from the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket, the right of a ticket holder to claim the prize represented by that ticket, if any, shall expire.

13. Purchase and prize restrictions: A Fast Play lottery game ticket may not be purchased by, and a prize may not be paid, to an officer or employee of the Lottery, Lottery professional services contractors or subcontractors, or to a spouse, child, brother, sister or parent residing in the same household of an officer, employee, contractor or subcontractor who is involved in the production, distribution or operation of systems for the validation or accounting of Fast Play games.

14. "PROGRESSIVE TOP PRIZE" restrictions:

- (a) An amount of \$0.20 from the sale of each Cash Spot ticket will be accumulated in the "PROGRESSIVE TOP PRIZE" pool.
- (b) Prize Amount: The amount of the "PROGRESSIVE TOP PRIZE" at the time a ticket is purchased can only be verified through the Lottery's Central Computer System. Any advertisement or any materials describing the amount of the "PROGRESSIVE TOP PRIZE" are only valid as of the time they are posted. If any discrepancy exists between this notice and any material describing or advertising the Cash Spot game, this notice and the data contained in the Lottery's Central Computer System shall govern.
- (c) The "PROGRESSIVE TOP PRIZE" and all other prizes are subject to availability at the time of purchase. The Lottery is not responsible for prizes that are not awarded due to technical issues. In the event of a "PROGRESSIVE TOP PRIZE" being reset without the actual sale of a "PROGRESSIVE TOP PRIZE" winning ticket, all prize money that had accumulated into the "PROGRESSIVE TOP PRIZE" pool (i.e. \$0.20 from the sale of each ticket) shall be awarded as part of the next "PROGRESSIVE TOP PRIZE" won.
- (d) Prizes payable to "PROGRESSIVE TOP PRIZE" winners will be paid as a one-time cash payment. For the purposes of calculation of the prize to be paid to "PROGRESSIVE TOP PRIZE" winners, the "PROGRESSIVE TOP PRIZE" amount will be rounded up to the nearest \$0.50.
 - 15. Governing law:
- (a) By purchasing a ticket, the purchaser agrees to comply with and abide by the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314), this notice, instructions, conditions and final decisions of the Secretary, and procedures established by the Secretary for the conduct of the Fast Play Cash Spot lottery game.
- (b) Decisions made by the Secretary, including the declaration of prizes and the payment thereof, in interpretation of this notice are final and binding on players and persons making a claim in respect thereof.
 - 16. Retailer compensation:
- (a) Authorized retailers may be entitled to compensation as determined by the Lottery.
- (b) No authorized retailer or employee of an authorized retailer shall request, demand, or accept gratuities or any compensation other than as provided in subsection (a) in exchange for the performance of duties authorized pursuant to the Lottery retailer's license without the Lottery's prior written authorization.
- 17. Retailer Incentive Programs: The Lottery may conduct a separate Retailer Incentive Program for retailers who sell Pennsylvania Fast Play Cash Spot lottery game tickets.
- 18. Retailer bonus: The Lottery may offer a retailer bonus in connection with the sale of Pennsylvania Fast

Play lottery game tickets. If a retailer bonus is offered, a Lottery retailer shall be eligible for a bonus as described in this section. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$100,000 and not exceeding \$500,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$500. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$500,001 and not exceeding \$1,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$5,000. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$1,000,001 and not exceeding \$10,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$10,000. A Lottery retailer is entitled only to the largest bonus for which they qualify on a winning ticket. A bonus will be initiated for payment after the Fast Play game ticket is claimed and validated. A bonus will not be awarded to a Lottery retailer that sells a non-winning Pennsylvania Lottery Fast Play game ticket used to enter a Pennsylvania Lottery second-chance drawing or promotion that is subsequently selected to win

- 19. Termination of the game: The Secretary may announce a termination date, after which no further tickets from this game may be sold. The announcement will be disseminated through media used to advertise or promote Cash Spot or through normal communications methods.
- 20. Applicability: This notice applies only to the Cash Spot lottery game announced in this notice.

Pennsylvania Nest Egg® Fast Play Game 5135

Under the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314) and 61 Pa. Code § 803.11 (relating to powers and duties of the Secretary of Revenue), the Secretary of Revenue hereby provides public notice of the rules for the following lottery game:

- 1. Name: The name of the lottery game is Pennsylvania Nest Egg® (hereinafter "Nest Egg®"). The game number is PA-5135.
 - 2. Definitions:
- (a) Authorized retailer or retailer: A person who is properly licensed by the Lottery pursuant to 61 Pa. Code §§ 805.1—805.17.
- (b) Bar code: The symbology on the ticket containing certain encrypted validation and accounting data used for identifying winning and losing tickets.
- (c) BONUS EGGS: The area at the bottom of a Nest Egg® ticket containing five play symbols that, when played according to the instructions, determines whether the player increases the total prize won by any prize amount that appears. A BONUS EGGS prize symbol will not appear on a non-winning ticket. Any prizes won in the BONUS EGGS area are not added to a "PROGRES-SIVE TOP PRIZE" win. Any prizes won in the BONUS EGGS area, are not multiplied. BONUS EGGS prizes cannot be won alone.

- (d) Game Ticket: A bearer instrument produced through a Lottery Terminal that is the player's record of a play for a Fast Play lottery game and sold by an authorized retailer containing the play and validation data as published in this game notice.
- (e) Lottery Central Computer System: The computer gaming system on which all Fast Play plays are recorded.
- (f) Lottery Terminal: A device authorized by the Lottery to function in an interactive mode with the Lottery Central Computer System for the purpose of issuing plays, executing Quick Pick selections, and entering, receiving, and processing lottery transactions, including making purchases, validating plays, transmitting reports and performing inventory functions.
- (g) *Play*: A chance to participate in a particular Fast Play lottery game.
- (h) *Play Area*: The area on a ticket which contains one or more play symbols.
- (i) *Play Symbol*: A number, letter, symbol, image or other character found in the play area which is used to determine whether a player wins a prize.
- (j) *Prize*: A non-monetary item, money or experience that can be won as specified in section 6 (relating to prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners) of this game notice.
- (k) PROGRESSIVE TOP PRIZE: The top prize available for this game that begins with a minimum prize amount that grows at a pre-determined rate every time a ticket is purchased, and then resets to the minimum prize amount whenever a top prize-winning ticket is sold.
- (1) NEST EGG® NUMBER BONUS: The area on a Nest Egg® ticket containing one play symbol that, when matched according to the instructions, determines whether the player wins the current "PROGRESSIVE TOP PRIZE" amount instantly.
- (m) WINNING NUMBERS: The numbers, letters, symbols or other characters found in the play area that, when matched against the play symbols in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area, determine whether a player wins a prize.
- (n) Winning ticket: A game ticket which has been validated and qualifies for a prize.
- (o) YOUR NUMBERS: The numbers, letters, symbols or other characters found in the play area that, when matched against the play symbols in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area, determine whether a player wins a prize.
 - 3. Price: The price of a Nest Egg® ticket is \$20.
 - 4. Description of Nest Egg® Fast Play lottery game:
- (a) Nest Egg® lottery game is an instant win game printed from a Lottery Terminal. All prizes are predetermined, and the player does not have the ability to select their own play symbols. Nest Egg® tickets may be purchased from an authorized retailer or at a Lottery self-service terminal that sells terminal-based Lottery game tickets. Tickets purchased from an authorized retailer shall be printed on-demand at the time of purchase and may not be preprinted by the retailer.
- (b) Nest Egg® is played by matching any of the play symbols located in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area to any of the play symbols located in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area. A player matching play symbols in this manner will win the prize shown under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol. Whenever a 10X (10TIMES) symbol

appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area, the player wins ten times the prize shown below that 10X (10TIMES) symbol. A bet slip is not used to play this game.

- (c) Nest Egg® tickets contain a "NEST EGG® NUMBER BONUS" area. Whenever a player matches the play symbol in the "NEST EGG® NUMBER BONUS" area to any of the play symbols in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area, the player wins the current "PROGRESSIVE TOP PRIZE". Nest Egg® tickets also contain a "BONUS EGGS" area. Players finding any prize amount in the "BONUS EGGS" area increase the total prize won, through matching the play symbols located in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area to the play symbols located in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area, by the prize amount shown. "BONUS EGGS" prizes cannot be added to a "PROGRESSIVE TOP PRIZE" win. "BONUS EGGS" prizes are not multiplied. "BONUS EGGS" prizes cannot be won alone.
- (d) Players can win the prizes identified in section 6 (relating to prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners).
- (e) Nest Egg® tickets cannot be canceled or voided once printed by the Lottery Terminal, even if printed in error.
- (f) To purchase a ticket at an authorized retailer, a player must remit the purchase price to the retailer and verbally request a Nest Egg® ticket. The ticket shall be the only valid proof of the bet placed and the only valid receipt for claiming a prize.
- (g) To purchase a ticket at a Pennsylvania Lottery self-service terminal, the player must insert into the self-service terminal a dollar amount equal to the total purchase price of a Nest Egg® ticket and select the Nest Egg® option on the Lottery self-service terminal. The ticket shall be the only valid proof of the bet placed and the only valid receipt for claiming a prize.
 - 5. Nest Egg® ticket characteristics:
- (a) Nest Egg® tickets shall contain a play area, the cost of the play, the date of sale and a bar code.

- (c) *Prize Symbols*: The prize symbols and their captions, located in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area, are: \$20.00 (TWENTY), \$30.00 (THIRTY), \$40.00 (FORTY), \$50.00 (FIFTY), \$100 (ONE HUN), \$200 (TWO HUN), \$500 (FIV HUN), \$1,000 (ONE THO) and \$10,000 (TEN THO).
- (d) Prizes: The prizes that can be won in this game, are: \$20, \$30, \$40, \$50, \$100, \$200, \$500, \$1,000, and \$10,000. The prize that can be won in the "NEST EGG® NUMBER BONUS" area is the "PROGRESSIVE TOP PRIZE." The "PROGRESSIVE TOP PRIZE" amount starts at \$300,000 and increases by \$2.25 every time a Nest Egg® ticket is purchased. When a "PROGRESSIVE TOP PRIZE" winning ticket is sold, the "PROGRESSIVE TOP PRIZE" resets to \$300,000. Nest Egg® contains a feature that can multiply the prize won, through matching the play symbols located in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area to the play symbols located in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area, by ten. Nest Egg® also contains a feature that can increase certain prizes. For a complete list of prizes, and how those prizes can be won, see section 7 (relating to number and description of prizes and approximate chances of winning). A player can win up to 24 times on a ticket.
- (e) Approximate number of tickets available for the game: Approximately 1,200,000 tickets will be available for sale for the Nest Egg® lottery game.
- 6. Prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners:
- (a) All Nest Egg® prize payments will be made as one-time, lump-sum cash payments.
- (b) Holders of tickets upon which the "NEST EGG® NUMBER BONUS" play symbol matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of a "PROGRESSIVE TOP PRIZE." The amount won under this paragraph is the amount of the "PROGRESSIVE TOP PRIZE," determined by the Lottery Central Computer System, as of the time the winning ticket was purchased. The amount won will be a minimum of \$300,000.
- (c) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$10,000 (TEN THO) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$10,000.
- (d) Holders of tickets upon which a 10X (10TIMES) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area, and a prize symbol of \$500 (FIV HUN) appears in the "Prize" area under that 10X (10TIMES) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$5,000.
- (e) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$1,000 (ONE THO) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1,000.
- (f) Holders of tickets upon which a 10X (10TIMES) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area, and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in the "Prize" area under that 10X (10TIMES) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1,000.
- (g) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING

NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$500 (FIV HUN) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$500.

- (h) Holders of tickets upon which a 10X (10TIMES) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area, and a prize symbol of $50^{.00}$ (FIFTY) appears in the "Prize" area under that 10X (10TIMES) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of 500.
- (i) Holders of tickets upon which a 10X (10TIMES) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area, and a prize symbol of $$40^{.00}$ (FORTY) appears in the "Prize" area under that 10X (10TIMES) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$400.
- (j) Holders of tickets upon which a 10X (10TIMES) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area, and a prize symbol of $\$30^{.00}$ (THIRTY) appears in the "Prize" area under that 10X (10TIMES) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$300.
- (k) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$200 (TWO HUN) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$200.
- (l) Holders of tickets upon which a prize is won in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area, and a play/prize symbol of \$200 (TWO HUN) appears in the "BONUS EGGS" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$200.
- (m) Holders of tickets upon which a 10X (10TIMES) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area, and a prize symbol of $\$20^{.00}$ (TWENTY) appears in the "Prize" area under that 10X (10TIMES) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$200.
- (n) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.
- (o) Holders of tickets upon which a prize is won in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area, and a play/prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in the "BONUS EGGS" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.

- (p) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$50.00 (FIFTY) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$50.
- (q) Holders of tickets upon which a prize is won in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area, and a play/prize symbol of \$50^{.00} (FIFTY) appears in the "BONUS EGGS" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$50.
- (r) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of $$40^{.00}$ (FORTY) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$40.
- (s) Holders of tickets upon which a prize is won in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area, and a play/prize symbol of \$40^{.00} (FORTY) appears in the "BONUS EGGS" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$40.
- (t) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$30.00 (THIRTY) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$30.
- (u) Holders of tickets upon which a prize is won in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area, and a play/prize symbol of \$30.00 (THIRTY) appears in the "BONUS EGGS" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$30.
- (v) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$20.00 (TWENTY) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$20.
- (w) Holders of tickets upon which a prize is won in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area, and a play/prize symbol of \$20.00 (TWENTY) appears in the "BONUS EGGS" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$20.
- 7. Number and description of prizes and approximate chances of winning: The following table sets forth the approximate number of winners, amounts of prizes and approximate chances of winning:

- (a) A Fast Play lottery game ticket is a bearer document deemed to be owned by the person holding the game ticket, except that if a name is contained on the back of the game ticket, the person named will, for all purposes, be considered the owner of the game ticket.
- (b) The holder of a Fast Play lottery game ticket has the sole responsibility for checking the accuracy and condition of the data printed on the game ticket.
- (c) The Commonwealth shall not be responsible for a lost or stolen Fast Play lottery game ticket, or for a Fast Play ticket redeemed by a player in error.
 - 9. Ticket validation and requirements:
- (a) Valid Fast Play lottery game tickets. To be a valid Fast Play lottery game ticket, the presented game ticket must meet the following requirements:
- (1) The game ticket's bar code shall be present in its entirety.
 - (2) The game ticket must be intact.
- (3) The game ticket may not be mutilated, altered, reconstituted or tampered with.
- (4) The game ticket may not be counterfeit or a duplicate of a winning ticket.
 - (5) The game ticket must have been validly issued.
- (6) The game ticket data shall have been recorded on the Lottery Central Computer System and the game ticket data shall match the computer record in every respect.
- (7) The game ticket must not be defectively printed or printed or produced in error such that it cannot be processed or validated by the Lottery.
- (8) The game ticket must pass other confidential security checks of the Lottery.
- (b) Invalid or defective game tickets. A game ticket not passing the validation requirements in subsection (a) will be considered invalid and no payment will be made on account of any play recorded thereon. The determination of the Secretary in this regard is final.
 - 10. Procedures for claiming and payment of prizes:
- (a) A prize may be claimed through an authorized retailer or the Lottery, as provided in this section. A prize must be claimed within 1 year of the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket.
- (b) An authorized retailer is authorized to pay prizes of \$2,500 or less. The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play representing a prize of \$2,500 or less may be paid by a participating authorized retailer if a proper validation pay ticket was issued by the retailer's Lottery Terminal.
- (c) The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play representing a prize in excess of \$2,500 may present the game ticket to an authorized retailer, Lottery District Office, or Lottery Headquarters.
- (d) The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play shall present the ticket, in person, to an authorized retailer, Lottery Headquarters or a Lottery District Office. The retailer or the Lottery will issue payment if:

- (1) The game ticket is scanned, and the play is validated through the Lottery Terminal or the Lottery Central Computer System;
 - (2) A claim form is properly and fully completed;
 - (3) The identification of the claimant is confirmed; and
- (4) The winning ticket has not expired, pursuant to this section or section 12 (relating to unclaimed prizes).
- (e) The Commonwealth shall not be responsible for a winning play paid in error by an authorized retailer.
- (f) In the event a prize described in these rules is not available, the Lottery may either provide a substitute prize, determined by the Secretary to have an equivalent value to the prize won, or make a cash payment to the winner, in an amount determined by the Secretary to have an equivalent value to the prize won.
- 11. Funding for prizes: Moneys will be drawn from the State Lottery Fund, to the extent necessary, to fund the payment of prizes under this section. If this lottery game is terminated for any cause, prize moneys remaining undistributed will remain in the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes otherwise provided for by law.
- 12. Unclaimed prizes: Unclaimed prize money on winning Fast Play lottery game tickets will be retained by the Secretary for payment to the persons entitled thereto for 1 year from the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket. If no claim is made within 1 year from the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket, the right of a ticket holder to claim the prize represented by that ticket, if any, shall expire.
- 13. Purchase and prize restrictions: A Fast Play lottery game ticket may not be purchased by, and a prize may not be paid, to an officer or employee of the Lottery, Lottery professional services contractors or subcontractors, or to a spouse, child, brother, sister or parent residing in the same household of an officer, employee, contractor or subcontractor who is involved in the production, distribution or operation of systems for the validation or accounting of Fast Play games.
 - 14. Governing law:
- (a) By purchasing a ticket, the purchaser agrees to comply with and abide by the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314), this notice, instructions, conditions and final decisions of the Secretary and procedures established by the Secretary for the conduct of the Fast Play Nest Egg® lottery game.
- (b) Decisions made by the Secretary, including the declaration of prizes and the payment thereof, in interpretation of this notice are final and binding on players and persons making a claim in respect thereof.
 - 15. Retailer compensation:
- (a) Authorized retailers may be entitled to compensation as determined by the Lottery.
- (b) No authorized retailer or employee of an authorized retailer shall request, demand, or accept gratuities or any compensation other than as provided in subsection (a) in exchange for the performance of duties authorized pursuant to the Lottery retailer's license without the Lottery's prior written authorization.
- 16. Retailer Incentive Programs: The Lottery may conduct a separate Retailer Incentive Program for retailers who sell Pennsylvania Fast Play Nest Egg® lottery game tickets.

- 17. Retailer bonus: The Lottery may offer a retailer bonus in connection with the sale of Pennsylvania Fast Play lottery game tickets. If a retailer bonus is offered, a Lottery retailer shall be eligible for a bonus as described in this section. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$100,000 and not exceeding \$500,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$500. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$500,001 and not exceeding \$1,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$5,000. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$1,000,001 and not exceeding \$10,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$10,000. A Lottery retailer is entitled only to the largest bonus for which they qualify on a winning ticket. A bonus will be initiated for payment after the Fast Play game ticket is claimed and validated. A bonus will not be awarded to a Lottery retailer that sells a non-winning Pennsylvania Lottery Fast Play game ticket used to enter a Pennsylvania Lottery second-chance drawing or promotion that is subsequently selected to win
- 18. Termination of the game: The Secretary may announce a termination date, after which no further tickets from this game may be sold. The announcement will be disseminated through media used to advertise or promote Nest Egg® or through normal communications methods.
- 19. Applicability: This notice applies only to the Nest Egg® lottery game announced in this notice.

Pennsylvania Winfall Fast Play Game 5136

Under the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314) and 61 Pa. Code § 803.11 (relating to powers and duties of the Secretary of Revenue), the Secretary of Revenue hereby provides public notice of the rules for the following lottery game:

- 1. Name: The name of the lottery game is Pennsylvania Winfall (hereinafter "Winfall"). The game number is PA-5136.
 - 2. Definitions:
- (a) Authorized retailer or retailer: A person who is properly licensed by the Lottery pursuant to 61 Pa. Code §§ 805.1—805.17.
- (b) Bar code: The symbology on the ticket containing certain encrypted validation and accounting data used for identifying winning and losing tickets.
- (c) Game Ticket: A bearer instrument produced through a Lottery Terminal that is the player's record of a play for a Fast Play lottery game and sold by an authorized retailer containing the play and validation data as published in this game notice.
- (d) Lottery Central Computer System: The computer gaming system on which all Fast Play plays are recorded.

(e) Lottery Terminal: A device authorized by the Lottery to function in an interactive mode with the Lottery Central Computer System for the purpose of issuing plays, executing Quick Pick selections, and entering, receiving, and processing lottery transactions, including making purchases, validating plays, transmitting reports and performing inventory functions.

- (f) Play: A chance to participate in a particular Fast Play lottery game.
- (g) Play Area: The area on a ticket which contains one or more play symbols.
- (h) *Play Symbol*: A number, letter, symbol, image or other character found in the play area which is used to determine whether a player wins a prize.
- (i) *Prize*: A non-monetary item, money or experience that can be won as specified in section 6 (relating to prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners) of this game notice.
- (j) RAKE IT IN BONUS: The area on a Winfall ticket containing 12 play symbols that, when matched according to the instructions, determines whether the player wins the prize shown to the left of the "RAKE IT IN BONUS" area
- (k) WINFALL NUMBER: The area on a Winfall ticket containing one play symbol that, when matched according to the instructions, determines whether the player wins all 12 prizes shown in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area.
- (l) WINNING NUMBERS: The numbers, letters, symbols or other characters found in the play area that, when matched against the play symbols in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area, determine whether a player wins a prize.
- (m) Winning ticket: A game ticket which has been validated and qualifies for a prize.
- (n) YOUR NUMBERS: The numbers, letters, symbols or other characters found in the play area that, when matched against the play symbols in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area, determine whether a player wins a prize.
 - 3. *Price*: The price of a Winfall ticket is \$5.
 - 4. Description of the Winfall Fast Play lottery game:
- (a) The Winfall lottery game is an instant win game printed from a Lottery Terminal. All prizes are predetermined, and the player does not have the ability to select their own play symbols. Winfall tickets may be purchased from an authorized retailer or at a Lottery self-service terminal that sells terminal-based Lottery game tickets. Tickets purchased from an authorized retailer shall be printed on-demand at the time of purchase and may not be preprinted by the retailer.
- (b) Winfall is played by matching any of the play symbols located in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area to any of the play symbols located in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area. A player matching play symbols in this manner will win the prize shown under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol. A bet slip is not used to play this game.
- (c) Winfall tickets contain a "WINFALL NUMBER" area. Whenever a player matches the play symbol in the "WINFALL NUMBER" area to any of the play symbols in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area, the player wins all 12 prizes shown. Winfall tickets also contain a "RAKE IT IN BONUS" area. When five Dollar Bill symbols appear in the "RAKE IT IN BONUS" area, the player wins the prize

shown to the left of the "RAKE IT IN BONUS" area. The "RAKE IT IN BONUS" is played separately.

- (d) Players can win the prizes identified in section 6 (relating to prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners).
- (e) Winfall tickets cannot be canceled or voided once printed by the Lottery Terminal, even if printed in error.
- (f) To purchase a ticket at an authorized retailer, a player must remit the purchase price to the retailer and verbally request a Winfall ticket. The ticket shall be the only valid proof of the bet placed and the only valid receipt for claiming a prize.
- (g) To purchase a ticket at a Pennsylvania Lottery self-service terminal, the player must insert into the self-service terminal a dollar amount equal to the total purchase price of a Winfall ticket and select the Winfall option on the Lottery self-service terminal. The ticket shall be the only valid proof of the bet placed and the only valid receipt for claiming a prize.
 - 5. Winfall ticket characteristics:
- (a) Winfall tickets shall contain a play area, the cost of the play, the date of sale and a bar code.
- (b) Play Symbols: Winfall tickets will contain a "WINNING NUMBERS" area, a "YOUR NUMBERS" area, a "RAKE IT IN BONUS" area and a "WINFALL NUMBER" area. The play symbols and their captions, located in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area, the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and the "WINFALL NUMBER" area, are: 1 (ONE), 2 (TWO), 3 (THREE), 4 (FOUR), 5 (FIVE), 6 (SIX), 7 (SEVEN), 8 (EIGHT), 9 (NINE), 10 (TEN), 11 (ELEVN), 12 (TWLV), 13 (THRTN), 14 (FORTN), 15 (FIFTN), 16 (SIXTN), 17 (SVNTN), 18 (EGHTN), 19 (NINTN), 20 (TWENT), 21 (TWYONE), 22 (TWYTWO), 23 (TWYTHR), 24 (TWYFOR), 25 (TWYFIV), 26 (TWYSIX), 27 (TWYSVN), 28 (TWYEGT), 29 (TWYNIN) and 30 (THIRT). The play symbols, located in the "RAKE IT IN BONUS" area, are: Sideways Leaf symbol, Leaf symbol, Upside Down Leaf symbol and a Dollar Bill symbol.
- (c) Prize Symbols: The prize symbols and their captions, located in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area, are: \$5 00 (FIV DOL), \$10 00 (TEN DOL), \$20 00 (TWENTY), \$30 00 (THIRTY), \$50 00 (FIFTY), \$100 (ONE HUN), \$200 (TWO HUN), \$500 (FIV HUN), \$1,000 (ONE THO), \$5,000 (FIV THO) and \$25,000 (TWFIVTHO). The prize symbols and their captions, located in the "RAKE IT IN BONUS" area, are: \$5 00 (FIV DOL), \$10 00 (TEN DOL), \$20 00 (TWENTY), \$30 00 (THIRTY), \$50 00 (FIFTY), \$100 (ONE HUN), \$200 (TWO HUN) and \$500 (FIV HUN).
- (d) *Prizes*: The prizes that can be won in this game, are: \$5, \$10, \$20, \$30, \$50, \$100, \$200, \$500, \$1,000, \$5,000 and \$25,000. A player can win up to 13 times on a ticket.
- (e) Approximate number of tickets available for the game: Approximately 600,000 tickets will be available for sale for the Winfall lottery game.
- 6. Prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners:
- (a) All Winfall prize payments will be made as onetime, lump-sum cash payments.
- (b) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$25,000 (TWFIVTHO) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$25,000.

- (c) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$5,000 (FIV THO) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$5,000.
- (d) Holders of tickets upon which the "WINFALL NUMBER" play symbol matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$1,000 (ONE THO) appears in two of the "Prize" areas, a prize symbol of \$500 (FIV HUN) appears in four of the "Prize" areas, a prize symbol of \$200 (TWO HUN) appears in four of the "Prize" areas and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in two of the "Prize" areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$5,000.
- (e) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$1,000 (ONE THO) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1,000.
- (f) Holders of tickets upon which the "WINFALL NUMBER" play symbol matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$200 (TWO HUN) appears in two of the "Prize" areas, a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in four of the "Prize" areas, a prize symbol of \$50.00 (FIFTY) appears in three of the "Prize" areas, a prize symbol of \$20.00 (TWENTY) appears in two of the "Prize" areas and a prize symbol of \$10.00 (TEN DOL) appears in one of the "Prize" areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1,000.
- (g) Holders of tickets upon which the "WINFALL NUMBER" play symbol matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in six of the "Prize" areas and a prize symbol of \$50 00 (FIFTY) appears in six of the "Prize" areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$900
- (h) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$500 (FIV HUN) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$500.
- (i) Holders of tickets upon which five Dollar Bill symbols appear in the "RAKE IT IN BONUS" area, and a prize symbol of \$500 (FIV HUN) appears to the left of the "RAKE IT IN BONUS" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$500.
- (j) Holders of tickets upon which the "WINFALL NUMBER" play symbol matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in three of the "Prize" areas, a prize symbol of $\$50^{.00}$ (FIFTY) appears in two of the "Prize" areas, a prize symbol of $\$20^{.00}$ (TWENTY) appears in three of the "Prize" areas and a prize symbol of $\$10^{.00}$ (TEN DOL) appears in four of the "Prize" areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$500.
- (k) Holders of tickets upon which the "WINFALL NUMBER" play symbol matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of 50^{00} (FIFTY) appears in six of the "Prize" areas and a prize symbol of 30^{00} (THIRTY) appears in six of the "Prize" areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of 480.
- (l) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING

- NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$200 (TWO HUN) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$200.
- (m) Holders of tickets upon which five Dollar Bill symbols appear in the "RAKE IT IN BONUS" area, and a prize symbol of \$200 (TWO HUN) appears to the left of the "RAKE IT IN BONUS" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$200.
- (n) Holders of tickets upon which the "WINFALL NUMBER" play symbol matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of $\$50^{.00}$ (FIFTY) appears in two of the "Prize" areas, a prize symbol of $\$20^{.00}$ (TWENTY) appears in two of the "Prize" areas, a prize symbol of $\$10^{.00}$ (TEN DOL) appears in four of the "Prize" areas and a prize symbol of $\$5^{.00}$ (FIV DOL) appears in four of the "Prize" areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$200.
- (o) Holders of tickets upon which the "WINFALL NUMBER" play symbol matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of $\$30^{.00}$ (THIRTY) appears in five of the "Prize" areas, a prize symbol of $\$10^{.00}$ (TEN DOL) appears in three of the "Prize" areas and a prize symbol of $\$5^{.00}$ (FIV DOL) appears in four of the "Prize" areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$200.
- (p) Holders of tickets upon which the "WINFALL NUMBER" play symbol matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$20.00 (TWENTY) appears in six of the "Prize" areas and a prize symbol of \$10.00 (TEN DOL) appears in six of the "Prize" areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$180.
- (q) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.
- (r) Holders of tickets upon which five Dollar Bill symbols appear in the "RAKE IT IN BONUS" area, and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears to the left of the "RAKE IT IN BONUS" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.
- (s) Holders of tickets upon which the "WINFALL NUMBER" play symbol matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of $\$20^{.00}$ (TWENTY) appears in two of the "Prize" areas, a prize symbol of $\$10^{.00}$ (TEN DOL) appears in two of the "Prize" areas and a prize symbol of $\$5^{.00}$ (FIV DOL) appears in eight of the "Prize" areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.
- (t) Holders of tickets upon which the "WINFALL NUMBER" play symbol matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of $\$10^{.00}$ (TEN DOL) appears in six of the "Prize" areas and a prize symbol of $\$5^{.00}$ (FIV DOL) appears in six of the "Prize" areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$90.

- (u) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$50.00 (FIFTY) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$50.
- (v) Holders of tickets upon which five Dollar Bill symbols appear in the "RAKE IT IN BONUS" area, and a prize symbol of $\$50^{.00}$ (FIFTY) appears to the left of the "RAKE IT IN BONUS" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$50.
- (w) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$30.00 (THIRTY) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$30.
- (x) Holders of tickets upon which five Dollar Bill symbols appear in the "RAKE IT IN BONUS" area, and a prize symbol of $\$30^{.00}$ (THIRTY) appears to the left of the "RAKE IT IN BONUS" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$30.
- (y) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$20.00 (TWENTY) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$20.
- (z) Holders of tickets upon which five Dollar Bill symbols appear in the "RAKE IT IN BONUS" area, and a prize symbol of \$20.00 (TWENTY) appears to the left of the "RAKE IT IN BONUS" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$20.
- (aa) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of 10^{00} (TEN DOL) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$10.
- (bb) Holders of tickets upon which five Dollar Bill symbols appear in the "RAKE IT IN BONUS" area, and a prize symbol of \$10^{.00} (TEN DOL) appears to the left of the "RAKE IT IN BONUS" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$10.
- (cc) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$5.00 (FIV DOL) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$5.
- (dd) Holders of tickets upon which five Dollar Bill symbols appear in the "RAKE IT IN BONUS" area, and a prize symbol of $\$5^{.00}$ (FIV DOL) appears to the left of the "RAKE IT IN BONUS" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$5.

- 8. Ticket responsibility:
- (a) A Fast Play lottery game ticket is a bearer document deemed to be owned by the person holding the game ticket, except that if a name is contained on the back of the game ticket, the person named will, for all purposes, be considered the owner of the game ticket.
- (b) The holder of a Fast Play lottery game ticket has the sole responsibility for checking the accuracy and condition of the data printed on the game ticket.
- (c) The Commonwealth shall not be responsible for a lost or stolen Fast Play lottery game ticket, or for a Fast Play ticket redeemed by a player in error.
 - 9. Ticket validation and requirements:
- (a) Valid Fast Play lottery game tickets. To be a valid Fast Play lottery game ticket, the presented game ticket must meet the following requirements:
- (1) The game ticket's bar code shall be present in its entirety.
 - (2) The game ticket must be intact.
- (3) The game ticket may not be mutilated, altered, reconstituted or tampered with.
- (4) The game ticket may not be counterfeit or a duplicate of a winning ticket.
 - (5) The game ticket must have been validly issued.
- (6) The game ticket data shall have been recorded on the Lottery Central Computer System and the game ticket data shall match the computer record in every respect.
- (7) The game ticket must not be defectively printed or printed or produced in error such that it cannot be processed or validated by the Lottery.

- (8) The game ticket must pass other confidential security checks of the Lottery.
- (b) Invalid or defective game tickets. A game ticket not passing the validation requirements in subsection (a) will be considered invalid and no payment will be made on account of any play recorded thereon. The determination of the Secretary in this regard is final.
 - 10. Procedures for claiming and payment of prizes:
- (a) A prize may be claimed through an authorized retailer or the Lottery, as provided in this section. A prize must be claimed within 1 year of the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket.
- (b) An authorized retailer is authorized to pay prizes of \$2,500 or less. The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play representing a prize of \$2,500 or less may be paid by a participating authorized retailer if a proper validation pay ticket was issued by the retailer's Lottery Terminal.
- (c) The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play representing a prize in excess of \$2,500 may present the game ticket to an authorized retailer, Lottery District Office, or Lottery Headquarters.
- (d) The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play shall present the ticket, in person, to an authorized retailer, Lottery Headquarters or a Lottery District Office. The retailer or the Lottery will issue payment if:
- (1) The game ticket is scanned, and the play is validated through the Lottery Terminal or the Lottery Central Computer System;
 - (2) A claim form is properly and fully completed;
 - (3) The identification of the claimant is confirmed; and
- (4) The winning ticket has not expired, pursuant to this section or section 12 (relating to unclaimed prizes).

- (e) The Commonwealth shall not be responsible for a winning play paid in error by an authorized retailer.
- (f) In the event a prize described in these rules is not available, the Lottery may either provide a substitute prize, determined by the Secretary to have an equivalent value to the prize won, or make a cash payment to the winner, in an amount determined by the Secretary to have an equivalent value to the prize won.
- 11. Funding for prizes: Moneys will be drawn from the State Lottery Fund, to the extent necessary, to fund the payment of prizes under this section. If this lottery game is terminated for any cause, prize moneys remaining undistributed will remain in the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes otherwise provided for by law.
- 12. Unclaimed prizes: Unclaimed prize money on winning Fast Play lottery game tickets will be retained by the Secretary for payment to the persons entitled thereto for 1 year from the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket. If no claim is made within 1 year from the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket, the right of a ticket holder to claim the prize represented by that ticket, if any, shall expire.
- 13. Purchase and prize restrictions: A Fast Play lottery game ticket may not be purchased by, and a prize may not be paid, to an officer or employee of the Lottery, Lottery professional services contractors or subcontractors, or to a spouse, child, brother, sister or parent residing in the same household of an officer, employee, contractor or subcontractor who is involved in the production, distribution or operation of systems for the validation or accounting of Fast Play games.

14. Governing law:

- (a) By purchasing a ticket, the purchaser agrees to comply with and abide by the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314), this notice, instructions, conditions and final decisions of the Secretary, and procedures established by the Secretary for the conduct of the Fast Play Winfall lottery game.
- (b) Decisions made by the Secretary, including the declaration of prizes and the payment thereof, in interpretation of this notice are final and binding on players and persons making a claim in respect thereof.

15. Retailer compensation:

- (a) Authorized retailers may be entitled to compensation as determined by the Lottery.
- (b) No authorized retailer or employee of an authorized retailer shall request, demand, or accept gratuities or any compensation other than as provided in subsection (a) in exchange for the performance of duties authorized pursuant to the Lottery retailer's license without the Lottery's prior written authorization.
- 16. Retailer Incentive Programs: The Lottery may conduct a separate Retailer Incentive Program for retailers who sell Pennsylvania Fast Play Winfall lottery game tickets.
- 17. Retailer bonus: The Lottery may offer a retailer bonus in connection with the sale of Pennsylvania Fast Play lottery game tickets. If a retailer bonus is offered, a Lottery retailer shall be eligible for a bonus as described in this section. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket

- that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$100,000 and not exceeding \$500,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$500. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$500,001 and not exceeding \$1,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$5,000. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$1,000,001 and not exceeding \$10,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$10,000. A Lottery retailer is entitled only to the largest bonus for which they qualify on a winning ticket. A bonus will be initiated for payment after the Fast Play game ticket is claimed and validated. A bonus will not be awarded to a Lottery retailer that sells a non-winning Pennsylvania Lottery Fast Play game ticket used to enter a Pennsylvania Lottery second-chance drawing or promotion that is subsequently selected to win a prize.
- 18. Termination of the game: The Secretary may announce a termination date, after which no further tickets from this game may be sold. The announcement will be disseminated through media used to advertise or promote Winfall or through normal communications methods.
- 19. Applicability: This notice applies only to the Winfall lottery game announced in this notice.

1332 Waiver Reinsurance Program—Program Parameters; Notice 2021-11

On July 24, 2020, the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services, a division of the United States Department of Health and Human Services, and the United States Department of the Treasury, approved the Insurance Department's 1332 Waiver Application. The approval is effective for a waiver period from January 1, 2021, through December 31, 2025, with a provision for a possible extension at the end of the initial term.

The reinsurance program is a claims-based, attachment point reinsurance program that will reimburse health insurers for claims costs of qualifying Affordable Care Act-compliant individual enrollees, where a percentage of the claims costs exceeding a specified threshold (attachment point) and up to a specified ceiling (reinsurance cap) will be reimbursed. Beginning January 1, 2022, and slightly adjusted from the preliminary parameters in Notice 2021-06 published at 51 Pa.B. 3073 (May 29, 2021) and the revised parameters in Notice 2021-09 published at 51 Pa.B. 4175 (July 31, 2021), the program-adopted parameters have been updated to an attachment point of \$60,000, a cap of \$100,000 and a coinsurance rate of 64%.

Cancellation of Certificates of Public Convenience for Motor Carriers; Failure to Maintain Evidence of Insurance; M-2021-3028299

Tentative Order

By the Commission:

Pursuant to Section 512 of the Public Utility Code, 66 Pa.C.S. § 512, the Commission is authorized to prescribe appropriate insurance requirements for motor carriers. Section 512 provides, in relevant part:

The commission may, as to motor carriers, prescribe, by regulation or order, such requirements as it may deem necessary for the protection of persons or property of their patrons and the public, including the filing of surety bonds, the carrying of insurance, or the qualifications and conditions under which such carriers may act as self-insurers with respect to such matters. All motor carriers of passengers. . .shall cover each and every vehicle, transporting such passengers, with a public liability insurance policy or a surety bond issued by an insurance carrier, or a bonding company authorized to do business in this Commonwealth, in such amounts as the commission may prescribe. . . .

Consistent with this broad statutory charge, the Commission promulgated regulations governing motor carrier insurance requirements. 52 Pa. Code Chapter 32. Those regulations provide, inter alia, that a motor carrier may not operate, and a certificate of public convenience will not be issued or remain in force, until there has been filed with and approved by the Commission a certificate of insurance by an insurer authorized to do business in Pennsylvania for the payment of claims resulting from the operation, maintenance, or use of a motor vehicle in the carrier's authorized service. 52 Pa. Code §§ 32.11,

- 32.12. The certificate of insurance, commonly known as a Form E, is in a form prescribed and approved by the Commission and provides protection for bodily injury, death, or property damage. 52 Pa. Code § 32.2(a). Additionally, the Commission regulations require that certain carriers maintain evidence of cargo insurance via a certificate of insurance commonly known as a Form H. The Commission's regulations require that evidence of insurance be maintained at all times with the Commission to ensure the protection of the public:
 - (h) Compliance. Failure to maintain evidence of insurance on file with the Commission in accordance with this chapter shall cause the immediate suspension of the rights and privileges conferred by a certificate of public convenience or permit held by the motor carrier. The Commission may establish rules under which suspended rights and privileges may be temporarily reinstated pending compliance with this chapter.

52 Pa. Code § 32.2(h).

The Commission has been notified that the motor carriers listed in Appendix A, attached hereto, no longer have acceptable evidence of insurance on file with the Commission. The Commission sent all carriers a letter notifying them that their operating authority was suspended. Since the date of the suspensions, these motor carriers have failed to provide acceptable evidence of insurance, notwithstanding notification by the Commission of the suspension and the necessity to provide acceptable evidence of insurance.

Under these circumstances, we tentatively conclude that the motor carriers listed in Appendix A are not in compliance with the insurance requirements of 66 Pa.C.S. § 512 and our regulations at 52 Pa. Code Chapter 32. As such, it is appropriate to initiate the process to cancel their certificates of public convenience as being in the public interest; *Therefore*,

It Is Ordered That:

- 1. Cancellation of the Certificates of Public Convenience of each motor carrier listed in Appendix A is hereby tentatively approved as being in the public interest.
- 2. That the Law Bureau shall publish a copy of this Tentative Order in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.
- 3. To the extent they challenge cancellation of the Certificates of Public Convenience, all parties listed in Appendix A, must file comments within thirty (30) days after publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. To file comments, you must either efile them by opening and using an efiling account through the Commission's website at www.puc.pa.gov. In the alternative, you may file comments by sending them by overnight delivery to the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission, Attn: Secretary Rosemary Chiavetta, Commonwealth Keystone Building, 400 North Street, 2nd Floor, Harrisburg, PA 17120. Retain the tracking information as proof of submission. Filings made by fax or email are not acceptable and will be rejected.
- 4. Alternatively, acceptable evidence of insurance may be filed with the Commission on behalf of the motor carriers listed in Appendix A, within thirty (30) days after publication of this order in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Motor carriers listed in Appendix A who desire to continue operations should immediately contact their insurance agents to secure compliance with Commission insurance requirements. It is the motor carrier's responsi-

bility to ensure compliance. Motor carriers can verify their insurance status at our web site at https://www.puc.pa.gov/search/utility-authority-search/.

Additionally, motor carriers may call our insurance hotline at (717) 787-1227 for more information.

5. Absent the timely filing of comments challenging the cancellation of the Certificate of Public Convenience or the timely filing of acceptable evidence of insurance, the Bureau of Technical Utility Services shall prepare a Secretarial Letter for issuance by the Secretary's Bureau canceling the carrier's applicable Certificate of Public Convenience. The Secretarial Letter shall direct the Department of Transportation to suspend the carrier's vehicle registration(s) consistent with 75 Pa.C.S. § 1375.

- 6. Upon issuance of the Secretarial Letter described in Ordering Paragraph No. 5 above, the applicable Certificate of Public Convenience of each non-compliant carrier shall be cancelled.
- 7. The Secretary serve a copy of the Secretarial Letter upon the Commission's Bureau of Investigation and Enforcement, Bureau of Technical Utility Services, Bureau of Administration, the Department of Revenue—Bureau of Corporation Taxes and the Department of Transportation.
