Agricultural Research Grant Applications

The Department of Agriculture (Department) is soliciting applications to conduct agricultural research on one or more of the following research topic areas, with the research to be conducted from July 1, 2022, to June 30, 2023, with the possibility, but not the assurance, of extending that research into subsequent years. Funding is contingent upon 2022-2023 budget appropriations. This notice establishes the procedures by which grant applications will be solicited and reviewed, and by which grants will be awarded. Notice of grants under the program was previously published at 52 Pa.B. 2130 (April 9, 2022). This notice is being republished to reflect: an extension of the application window through Friday, June 3, 2022.

1. *Grant Solicitation.* The Department will accept grant applications for the purposes, in the form and according to the schedule set forth as follows. Following publication, additional publication and dissemination of this notice shall be made to applicants who have previously submitted grant applications to or received grants from the Department, as well as any individuals or entities who have requested notification from the Department of grant availability. 2. *Research Topic Areas.* Though not exclusive of original research topics, the Department is particularly interested in funding project in the following areas:

a. Ongoing multiyear research projects. The Department has, in previous years, provided funding for various multiyear research projects that might be continued or extended to complete research the Department identifies as addressing continued priorities of the agricultural industry, such as:

• Examining the economic impact of pest infestations like Phorid Flies and Spotted Lanternflies and identifying mitigating measures.

• Measuring the impacts on the Chesapeake Bay of farm management practices that have not received Federal or State government cost-sharing assistance.

• Implementing Chapter 5 of the Pennsylvania Pollinator Protection Plan (see https://ento.psu.edu/ pollinators/pollin-spotlight-items/the-pennsylvaniapollinator-protection-plan-p4).

b. Natural resource conservation, climate and the quality of our soil, water and air. The Department is seeking new proposals that address agriculture's role in stewarding natural resources and innovations in combatting and adapting to climate change. Specifically, the Department requests applications for projects that:

• Provide ongoing water quality monitoring in highpriority streams identified in version 3 of the Chesapeake Bay Watershed Implementation Plan.

• Provide ongoing air quality monitoring around highpriority production areas, particularly mushroom facilities in Chester and Berks Counties.

• Quantify the benefits to soil health and climate change resiliency from best management practices in conservation.

• Quantify reductions in carbon emissions through on-farm energy efficiency measures.

• Identify opportunities in agricultural production practices that could be conducted concurrently with solar energy production.

• Integrate silvopasture and other agro-forestry revenue streams into dairy, livestock or poultry farms.

• Identify soil testing and remediation strategies for urban agriculture.

• Assess the adoption and implementation of best management practices by farmers that are part of conservation plans to ensure compliance and appropriate credit is received.

• Identify and determine the applicability and effectiveness of nutrient management technologies to assist the Commonwealth in assessing the utility of various approaches.

• Assess relationships among reclaimed land, biosolid applications and water quality.

• Identify strategies for invasive species management.

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c. *Human resources in agriculture.* The Department is interested in further scientific study in areas such as:

• The impact of stress and mental health challenges on farmers' long-term success.

• Strategies for recruiting and retaining agriculture's future workforce.

• Assessing the quantity and quality of available onfarm and off-farm housing for agricultural workers, including farm owners.

d. *Economics in agriculture*. The Department would like to evaluate the economic impact and long-term effectiveness of:

• Federal Milk Marketing Orders operating in this Commonwealth compared to alternative arrangements, such as a single state Federal milk marketing order in use in California.

- The Dairy Investment Program
- The Farmers Market Nutrition Program
- The Resource Enhancement and Protection Program
- The Conservation Excellence Grant Program
- The Farm Vitality Grant Program
- The Urban Agriculture Grant Program
- The Farm to School Grant Program
- The Agriculture and Youth Grant Program
- The Small Meat Processors Grant Program
- The Commonwealth Specialty Crop Grant Program

e. *Information and data science in agriculture*. The Department seeks applications that propose methods of integrating data in ways that provide farmers in this Commonwealth with actionable information on enhancing their farm operations and seizing market opportunities.

f. Consumer-focused research. The Department seeks applications that study consumer interest in:

• Biodegradable packaging and other environmental factors in selecting food and beverage products.

• Pharmaceutical or industrial uses for milk proteins or other milk components.

g. Animals and agriculture. The Department seeks applications that address animal health concerns, such as:

• One Health—Proposals that promote humans, the environment, animals, living together harmoniously.

• Animal Health—Proposals that improve or seek to understand aspects of animal health important to agriculture in this Commonwealth.

• *Diagnosis of Animal Diseases*—Proposals that promote the diagnosis of animal diseases that are important to Commonwealth animal agriculture.

• Animal Productivity—Proposals that seek to improve the productivity of agricultural animals in this Commonwealth.

• Animal Welfare—Proposals that seek to improve the welfare of agricultural animals in this Commonwealth.

3. *Grant Agreement*. The terms and conditions of the grant will be governed by a grant agreement between the

Department and the applicant which shall be tendered to the applicant for execution, returnable in no more than 30 days. The Department may require that the grant agreement be submitted and executed electronically.

4. Application Delivery and Deadline. Interested applicants must submit a complete electronic research project proposal and grant application using the Department of Community and Economic Development's Electronic Single Application web site at https://www.esa.dced.state. pa.us/Login.aspx by Friday, June 3, 2022, at 4 p.m. Questions regarding this online application process may be directed to Morgan Sheffield, Grants Coordinator for the Department of Agriculture, at (717) 787-3568.

5. Scoring of Applications. The Department will evaluate each complete and timely-filed project proposal and grant application it receives, using a 100-point scale assessing:

• Up to 15 points for the research project needs statement.

• Up to 15 points for the impact of research outcomes, including enhancement of diversity, equity and inclusion.

• Up to 30 points for the research methodology.

• Up to 10 points for project evaluation and replicability.

• Up to 20 points for support and participation from industry.

• Up to 10 points for diversity of the research team.

6. *Scores.* Upon completion of evaluations, the Department will prepare a record identifying each complete and timely-filed project proposal and grant application received and the numerical score assigned to each. The Department shall award grants based upon its evaluation and scoring.

7. Multiyear Projects or Extensions. The Department may award grant funding for multiyear projects or provide an extension of time to complete an ongoing project, if the Department identifies that a multiyear term or an extension advances the Department's objectives and the grant's likelihood of achieving its stated goals. Requests for extensions of ongoing projects shall be made, evaluated and processed in accordance with all the requirements of this notice.

8. *Notice of Award.* Applicants shall be notified by mail of the decision on their grant applications by the Department. Best efforts will be made to do so within 15 days of the application deadline.

9. Grant Agreement. With the mailed grant award notice, the Department will provide applicants with a grant agreement for execution and return within 30 days or instructions as to finalizing the grant agreement electronically. The Department will obtain the required Commonwealth signatures on the grant agreements and return a copy of the fully-executed grant agreement to the applicant. The grant agreement is not effective, and work should not begin until all required signatures have been applied to the grant agreement. Among the terms of the grant agreement shall be a requirement that the grant recipient provide the Department full and complete access to all records relating to the performance of the project and submit such information as the Department may require.

10. Nonmatching Cost-Reimbursable Grant. Grants made hereunder do not require the applicant secure or devote a matching sum to the project. Payment of grant funds will occur on a reimbursement basis, with the possibility upon the written submission of justification and subsequent approval of the Department of an advance payment option.

11. Allowable Indirect Cost Reimbursement. Grants made hereunder are subject to an indirect cost cap of 15% of total direct project costs. For the purpose of this research grant funding solicitation, indirect costs shall include administrative salaries and benefits, office supplies and equipment, facility related cost including maintenance and repairs, telephones, memberships/dues, freight/postage cost and any consultant related costs associated with the administration of this research grant. 12. *Reporting Requirements.* Upon completion of research projects funded through this program, grant recipients will submit to the Department within 60 days a final report detailing the nature of the questions under study, an explanation of the research design and methods, findings of the research and recommendations for future study.

Maximum Lawful Rate of Interest for Residential Mortgages for the Month of June 2022

The Department of Banking and Securities (Department), under the authority contained in section 301 of the act of January 30, 1974 (P.L. 13, No. 6) (41 P.S. § 301), determines that the maximum lawful rate of interest for residential mortgages for the month of June 2022, is 5 1/4%.

The interest rate limitations under the Commonwealth's usury statute were pre-empted to a great extent by Federal law, the Depository Institutions Deregulation and Monetary Control Act of 1980 (Pub.L. No. 96-221). Further pre-emption was instituted with the signing of Pub.L. No. 96-399, which overrode State interest rate limitations on any individual who finances the sale or exchange of residential real property which the individual owns and which the individual occupies or has occupied as his principal residence.

Each month the Department is required by State law to compute and announce the ceiling rate on residential mortgages in this Commonwealth. This maximum rate is determined by adding 2.50 percentage points to the yield rate on long-term government bonds as published by the Federal Reserve Board or the United States Treasury, or both. The latest yield rate on long-term government securities is 2.85 to which was added 2.50 percentage points for a total of 5.35 that by law is rounded off to the nearest quarter at 5 1/4%.

Availability of Applications for the Emergency Solutions Grant Program

The Department of Community and Economic Development (Department), Center for Community Development Operations, is anticipating receiving funding through the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development for the Emergency Solutions Grant. The Homeless Emergency Assistance and Rapid Transition to Housing Act of 2009 (Pub.L. No. 111-22) provides funding for Emergency Solutions for the Commonwealth to address the needs of homeless people through services in rapid rehousing, street outreach, homelessness prevention and emergency shelters. The focus is to help individuals and families to quickly regain stability in permanent housing after experiencing a housing crisis or homelessness, or both.

The Department will accept applications from any general purpose units of local government, including cities, boroughs, townships, towns, counties, home rule municipalities and communities that wish to apply on behalf of other municipalities. Priority will be given to nonentitled jurisdictions; however, the Department will consider funding applications received from all eligible government jurisdictions previously listed. Nonprofits are eligible applicants or grantees to the extent the project will address a demonstrated regional need.

The guideline review is open from May 9, 2022, through June 10, 2022. A fully executed application with all applicable attachments must be submitted to the Department through the Electronic Single Application (ESA) only and during the designated time the ESA is open. Applications received during this window of time will be considered for funding. Hard copies will not be accepted.

This notice provides information about persons who have applied to the Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) for a new, renewed, or amended NPDES or WQM permit, or a permit waiver for certain stormwater discharges, or have submitted a Notice of Intent (NOI) for coverage under a General Permit. The applications and NOIs concern, but are not limited to, effluent discharges from sewage treatment facilities and industrial facilities to surface waters or groundwater; stormwater discharges associated with industrial activity (industrial stormwater), construction activity (construction stormwater), and municipal separate storm sewer systems (MS4s); the application of pesticides; the operation of Concentrated Animal Feeding Operations (CAFOs); and the construction of sewage, industrial waste, and manure storage, collection and treatment facilities. This notice is provided in accordance with 25 Pa. Code Chapters 91 and 92a and 40 CFR Part 122, implementing The Clean Streams Law (35 P.S. §§ 691.1—691.1001) and the Federal Clean Water Act (33 U.S.C.A. §§ 1251—1376). More information on the types of NPDES and WQM permits that are available can be found on DEP's website (visit www.dep.pa.gov and select Businesses, Water, Bureau of Clean Water, Wastewater Management, and NPDES and WQM Permitting Programs).

DEP provides a 15-day public comment period for Individual WQM Permit Applications for amendments.

A 30-day public comment period applies to these applications and draft permits, except when a site-specific water quality criterion is used

to establish effluent limitations, in which case a 45-day public comment period applies. The period for comment may be extended at the discretion of the Department for one additional 15-day period. Additional information, including links to draft permits and fact sheets that explain the basis for DEP's tentative determinations may be reviewed by generating the "Applications Received with Comment Periods Report" on DEP's website at www.dep.pa.gov/CWPublicNotice. Notification of 15-day extensions for comment will be provided in the "Applications Received with Comment Periods Report" (Comments column).

Section III provides notice of applications and draft individual permits for stormwater discharges associated with construction activities. Where indicated, DEP has made tentative determinations, based on preliminary review, to issue permits subject to proposed effluent limitations consisting of best management practices identified in the erosion and sediment control (E&S) plans and post-construction stormwater management (PCSM) plans submitted with the applications, as well as other terms and conditions based on the permit applications. A 30-day public comment period applies to these applications.

Applications, NOIs and draft permits, where applicable, may be reviewed at the DEP office that received the application or NOI. Members of the public are encouraged to use DEP's website to obtain additional information as discussed previously.

Comments received within the appropriate comment periods for WQM and NPDES permit applications will be retained by DEP and considered in the final determinations regarding the applications. DEP will also accept requests or petitions for public hearings on applications. The request or petition must indicate the interest of the party filing and the reasons why a hearing is warranted. A hearing will be held if the Department determines that there is a significant public interest. If a hearing is scheduled, a notice of the hearing will be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* and a newspaper of general circulation within the relevant geographical area. DEP will postpone its final determination until after a public hearing is held.

MINING ACTIVITY NPDES DRAFT PERMITS

This notice provides information about applications for a new, amended or renewed NPDES permits associated with mining activity (coal or noncoal) permits. The applications concern industrial waste (mining) discharges to surface water and discharges of stormwater associated with mining activities. This notice is provided in accordance with 25 Pa. Code Chapters 91 and 92a and 40 CFR Part 122, implementing provisions of The Clean Streams Law (35 P.S. §§ 691.1—691.1001) and the Federal Clean Water Act (33 U.S.C.A. §§ 1251—1376).

The Department of Environmental Protection (Department) has prepared a draft NPDES permit and made a tentative determination to issue the NPDES permit in conjunction with the associated mining activity permit.

Effluent Limits for Coal Mining Activities

For coal mining activities, NPDES permits, when issued, will contain effluent limits that are the more stringent of technology-based (BAT) effluent limitations or Water Quality Based Effluent Limits (WQBEL).

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The BAT limits for coal mining activities, as provided in 40 CFR Part 434 and 25 Pa. Code Chapters 87—90 are as follows:

A settleable solids instantaneous maximum limit of 0.5 ml/l applies to: surface runoff (resulting from a precipitation event of less than or equal to a 10-year 24-hour event) from active mining areas; active areas disturbed by coal refuse disposal activities; mined areas backfilled and revegetated; and all other discharges and drainage (resulting from a precipitation event of greater than 1-year 24-hour to less than or equal to a 10-year 24-hour event) from coal refuse disposal piles. Similarly, modified BAT limits apply to iron, manganese and suspended solids in surface runoff, discharges and drainage resulting from these precipitation events and those of greater magnitude in accordance with 25 Pa. Code §§ 87.102, 88.92, 88.187, 88.292, 89.52 and 90.102.

Exceptions to BAT effluent limits may be applicable in accordance with 25 Pa. Code §§ 87.102, 88.92, 88.187, 88.292, 89.52 and 90.102.

Effluent Limits for Noncoal Mining Activities

The limits for noncoal mining activities as provided in 25 Pa. Code § 77.522 are pH 6 to 9 and other parameters the Department may require.

Discharges from noncoal mines located in some geologic settings (for example, in the coal fields) may require additional water quality based effluent limits. If additional effluent limits are needed for an NPDES permit associated with a noncoal mining permit, then the permit description specifies the parameters.

Additional criteria

In addition to BAT or WQBEL limits, coal and noncoal NPDES permits establish effluent limitations in the form of implemented Best Management Practices (BMPs) identified in the associated Erosion and Sedimentation Plan, the Reclamation Plan, and the NPDES permit application. These BMPs restrict the rates and quantities of associated pollutants from being discharged into surface waters of this Commonwealth.

More restrictive effluent limitations, restrictions on discharge volume, or restrictions on the extent of mining that may occur are incorporated into an NPDES permit when necessary for compliance with water quality standards and antidegradation requirements (in accordance with 25 Pa. Code Chapters 91—96).

The procedures for determining the final effluent limits, using a mass-balance equation or model, are found in Technical Guidance Document 563-2112-115, Developing National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Permits for Mining Activities. Other specific factors to be considered include public comments and Total Maximum Daily Load(s). Additional discharge limitations may apply in the event that unexpected discharges occur.

Discharge rates for surface mining activities are precipitation driven. Discharge rates for proposed discharges associated with underground mining are noted in the permit description.

Submittal of comments

Persons wishing to comment on an NPDES draft permit should submit a written statement to the Department at the address of the district mining office indicated before each draft permit notice within 30-days of this notice. Comments received within the comment period will be considered in the final determinations regarding the NPDES permit applications. Comments must include the name, address and phone number of the writer and a concise statement to inform the Department of the basis of a comment and the relevant facts upon which it is based.

Requests or petitions for a public hearing on any NPDES permit applications will be accepted as provided in 25 Pa. Code § 92a.82(d). The request or petition for a public hearing shall be filed within 30-days of this public notice and contain the name, address, phone number and the interest of the party filing the request and state the reasons why a hearing is warranted. The Department may hold a public hearing if the public interest is significant. If a hearing is scheduled, a notice of the hearing will be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* and a newspaper of general circulation within the relevant geographical area. The Department will consider comments from the public hearing in the final determination on the NPDES permit application.

Benner Township PFAS Investigation; Benner Township, Centre County.

The Department of Environmental Protection (DEP), under the authority of the Hazardous Sites Cleanup Act (HSCA) (35 P.S. §§ 6020.101—6020.1305) has initiated a Prompt-Interim Response for the Benner Township PFAS Investigation. This response has been initiated pursuant to Section 501(a) and 505(b) of HSCA (35 P.S. §§ 6020.501(a) and 6020.505(b)). The site is located in Benner Township, Centre County, PA.

The Benner Township PFAS Investigation is located in the area surrounding the University Park Airport. The investigation includes a commercial/industrial area to the north of the airport, and mixed residential/agricultural areas primarily to the east and south of the airport.

The Benner Township PFAS Investigation was initiated after PFAS compounds were detected in the public water supply at the State-of-the-Art company located on High Tech Road in Benner Township. Following confirmation of the groundwater contamination in this water supply well, Northcentral Regional Office personnel conducted testing at two additional active water supply wells at companies along High Tech Road.

The HSCA-funded investigation is focused on defining the extent of the plume, identifying any receptors, and determining the source(s) of the contamination. PFAS consists of a number of man-made compounds manufactured for industrial as well as household uses. These compounds are present in a wide variety of products and ubiquitous in the environment. Several PFAS compounds are known to cause potential damage to human health.

When DEP became aware that residential water supply wells were impacted with PFAS compounds above the EPA lifetime Health Advisory Level (HAL) of 70 part per trillion, the focus of the investigation became concentrated on sampling private water supply wells in the areas of known contamination to identify any residents who were being exposed to PFAS at levels above the EPA HAL. As sample results were received, any property owner whose well contained PFAS above the EPA HAL, and who did not have an existing home treatment system that effectively filtered out PFAS, was provided with bottled water for consumptive use as a temporary Prompt Interim Response. This Prompt Interim Response was initiated due to the exposure of residents ingesting a harmful chemical.

Because the provision of bottled water is a temporary alternate drinking water source, and it does not provide protection from other potential routes of exposure such as inhalation, DEP is including plans to install home water treatment systems to those residents with drinking water containing PFAS above the EPA HAL as part of this Prompt Interim Response in order more completely address exposure pathways. Further alternatives will be evaluated for a permanent alternate water supply, such as installation of and hook-up to a public water line extension, and the permanent operation of the home treatment systems. An analysis of the alternatives will be conducted prior to determining the final remedy. This notice is being provided pursuant to Section 506(b) of HSCA. Application Period for Municipal Recycling Program Performance Grant Applications under Act 101, Section 904 of the Municipal Waste Planning, Recycling and Waste Reduction Act of 1988; Calendar Year 2021

The Department of Environmental Protection (Department) announces a request for applications from municipalities for recycling performance grant assistance for recycling programs under section 904 of the Municipal Waste Planning, Recycling and Waste Reduction Act of 1988 (Act 101) (53 P.S. § 4000.904). Municipalities include counties, cities, boroughs, incorporated towns, townships, home rule municipalities, their authorities, councils of governments, consortiums or similar entities established by two or more municipalities under 53 Pa.C.S. Chapter 23, Subchapter A (relating to intergovernmental cooperation). This application period is for eligible materials recycled and marketed in calendar year 2021.

Municipal Recycling Program Performance Grant (Performance Grant) funds will be awarded to municipalities based upon the weight of source-separated recyclable materials identified in section 1501(c)(1)(i) of Act 101 (53 P.S. § 4000.1501(c)(1)(i)) recovered by municipal recycling programs and the population of the municipality as determined by the most recent decennial census. Due to funding available for the Recycling Performance Grant program for calendar year 2021, the funding formula will remain the same as last year.

For residential tonnage, municipalities that market some or all of their own material are not subject to the 20% residue deduction for those materials. Marketed means that the materials were sold to a manufacturer for the purposes of converting the recyclables into new product. Compensation/rebates from a collector or processor do not count as the marketing of materials.

Materials that go to a second-hand processor are subject to the 20% residue deduction—weight receipts from that entity cannot be considered as market receipts for the municipality (the processor cannot prorate marketed materials to one or more municipalities).

For commercial tonnage, materials that go directly from the generator to a market can be exempt from the 20% rate. Documentation must include a statement from the

commercial entity or home office of the commercial entity that the materials are directly marketed without further processing. Commercial materials that are sorted/ processed after leaving the generator are subject to the 20% residue rate.

If an application is claiming an overall residue rate of less than 20%, it must describe why and supply supporting documentation to justify the claim.

Multi-municipal applications under the Act 101, Section 904 Recycling Performance Grant Program will only be accepted by the Department from the following:

A. Council of governments, consortiums or other similar entities established by two or more municipalities under 53 Pa.C.S. Chapter 23, Subchapter A.

B. Two or more municipalities where the collection of recyclables has been accomplished either through a joint bid for services or a joint municipally-operated collection system (curbside or drop-off) accompanied by a joint recycling education program.

An application submitted jointly to the Department by two or more municipalities that does not meet one of the previously listed criteria will be held until the participating municipalities supply individual applications. Submittals from county governments are not considered multimunicipal applications and are therefore not subject to these criteria.

Applicants who have failed to comply with the conditions set forth in previously awarded grants, the recycling program performance requirements contained in the act of November 9, 2006 (P.L. 1347, No. 140), the grant requirements of Act 101 or the regulations of Act 101 may not be awarded funds under this grant program. Applicants must ensure that they are in compliance with 25 Pa. Code § 272.314(b)(2) (relating to limits on Department's authority to award grants).

Eligible materials include post-consumer: clear glass; colored glass; aluminum cans; steel and bimetallic cans; high-grade office paper; newsprint; corrugated paper; other marketable grades of paper; and plastics. Grants will be awarded only for properly documented, eligible materials that were actually marketed on or after January 1, 2021, to and including December 31, 2021. Applicants should only claim those tonnages for which they have documentation at the time they complete their application. Residues, materials not listed as eligible or materials that cannot be documented as being generated within the municipality or marketed or recycled into new products or uses are not eligible for consideration toward the grant. In particular, recovered glass that is being stockpiled or used as daily cover at a landfill will not be considered as recycled. Applicants must be able to document the amount of residue attributable to their recycling program.

Documentation to support all claims that eligible recyclable materials were generated within the municipality and marketed must be made available for auditing by the Department, the Office of the Auditor General, the Office of the Treasurer or agents of those offices for 4 years. The Department will not require applicants to retain hauler customer lists; however, the lists may be required to be examined in the event of an audit. It will be the applicant's responsibility to arrange for hauler customer lists to be provided, or for haulers to be present with their customer lists, during a grant audit.

Supporting documentation is not required to be submitted with the application. Tonnages not properly documented at the time of an audit will not be credited towards the applicant's Performance Grant award. Additional/supplemental documentation will not be accepted after the audit is completed. Failure to submit a complete and accurate application may result in a denial of the application.

Grant applications must be submitted online through the Commonwealth's Electronic Single Application web site, eGrants, at www.esa.dced.state.pa.us. Applications must be received by 3 p.m. on December 30, 2022, to be eligible for funding. Applications will not be accepted after the deadline. California Air Resources Board Executive Officer's Certification of an Enhanced Conventional Nozzle by a Second Manufacturer

The Department of Environmental Protection (Department) announces that effective Saturday, May 14, 2022, it finds that a second manufacturer received certification from the Executive Officer of the California Air Resources Board (CARB) for an enhanced conventional gasoline nozzle. Under 25 Pa. Code § 129.61a(k)(2)(i) (relating to vapor leak monitoring procedures and other requirements for small gasoline storage tank emission control) as established in the regulatory amendments to 25 Pa. Code Chapter 129 published at 52 Pa.B. 1875 (March 26, 2022), the Department is required to establish a date for when enhanced conventional gasoline nozzles must be installed at gasoline dispensing facilities subject to § 129.61a. Section 129.61a(k)(2)(i) provides that, "[t]he owner or operator shall replace each conventional nozzle with an enhanced conventional nozzle within 2 years after the Department publishes notice in the Pennsylvania Bulletin of the CARB Executive Officer having issued an Executive Order of Certification to a second manufacturer for an enhanced conventional nozzle." On October 9, 2019, the Executive Officer of the CARB issued an Executive Order to a second manufacturer for an enhanced conventional gasoline nozzle. See https://ww2.arb.ca.gov/our-work/ programs/vapor-recovery/vapor-recovery-executive-orders. Consistent with § 129.61a(k)(2)(i), the owners and operators of gasoline dispensing facilities subject to § 129.61a will be required to install enhanced conventional gasoline nozzles before May 14, 2024, the date that is no later than 2 years after this publication.

Public Notice of Draft National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System General Permit for Wet Weather Discharges from Combined Sewer Systems (PAG-06)

The Department of Environmental Protection (Department) is announcing the availability of a draft National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) General Permit for Wet Weather Discharges from Combined Sewer Systems (PAG-06). The draft General Permit and related documents are available online at http:// www.depgreenport.state.pa.us/elibrary/ (select "Permit and Authorization Packages," then "Clean Water," then "Draft—PAG-06 for Wet Weather Discharges from Combined Sewer Systems"). The PAG-06 General Permit is intended to provide NPDES permit coverage to combined sewer overflow (CSO) discharges from satellite combined sewer systems (CSS) that serve populations less than 75,000. A CSS is a sewer system that has been designed to collect and convey both sewage and stormwater and may discharge to surface waters through CSOs prior to reaching a publicly owned treatment works (POTW) or wastewater treatment plant. A satellite CSS is a CSS that is owned or operated by a person different from the owner or operator of the POTW or wastewater treatment plant into which the CSS directly flows.

The following significant changes are proposed in the draft PAG-06 General Permit in comparison to the PAG-06 General Permit that is currently in effect, which expires November 30, 2022:

• The Notice of Intent (NOI) fee would increase from \$500, paid in annual NOI installment fees of \$100 per year, to \$2,500, paid in annual NOI installment fees of \$500 per year.

• New procedures are introduced to clarify the requirements for a permittee's submission of a revised Long-Term Control Plan (LTCP). New permit language is proposed to clarify public participation requirements for changes to a facility's LTCP.

• Coverage under PAG-06 would expire on the date of the master General Permit. The Annual CSO Status Report will no longer be utilized as an NOI to renew coverage each year. In addition, an expiration date of general permit coverage will be identified on the approval of coverage page of the general permit.

Written Comments

Interested persons are invited to submit written comments regarding the draft PAG-06 General Permit and associated documents through Monday, June 13, 2022. Commentators are encouraged to submit comments using the Department's online eComment system at www.ahs.dep.pa.gov/eComment. Written comments can be submitted by e-mail to ecomment@pa.gov or by mail to the Department of Environmental Protection, Policy Office, Rachel Carson State Office Building, P.O. Recommended Strategies for the Reduction of Oxides of Nitrogen Emission from Municipal Waste Combustors under Consideration by the Ozone Transport Commission; Public Comment Period

The Department of Environmental Protection (Department) is seeking comments on control measures under consideration by the Ozone Transport Commission (Commission) for regional and National recommendations to reduce oxides of nitrogen (NO_x) emissions from municipal waste combustors (MWC). This public comment period is consistent with section 7.4 of the Air Pollution Control Act (APCA) (35 P.S. § 4007.4), which requires an opportunity for public review and comment on recommendations for additional control measures prior to final action by the Commission.

As a multistate organization created by Congress under sections 176A and 184 of the Clean Air Act (42 U.S.C.A. §§ 7506a and 7511c), the Commission is authorized to develop recommendations for additional control measures to mitigate the transport of ozone and its precursors (NO_x and Volatile Organic Compounds) in the Ozone Transport Region (OTR) established by operation of law. In addition to the Commonwealth, the OTR is comprised of the States of Connecticut, Delaware, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, Rhode Island, Vermont, northern Virginia and the District of Columbia.

The Commission issued a charge to the Stationary and Area Source Committee to identify sectors that are significant sources of NO_x emissions in the OTR. Municipal waste combustors were identified, investigated and found to have cost effective additional control technologies. The Commission has undertaken a stakeholder participation process to obtain input and comment from interested parties in developing recommendations on measures for MWC to reduce NO_x emissions. Upon completion of the stakeholder participation process, the Commission drafted a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) containing the recommendations on MWC NO_x emission reduction measures for consideration by the Commission membership. The Commission is scheduled to consider final action on the draft MOU during its annual meetings on June 1 and June 2, 2022. The adoption of an MOU, resolution or other action commits a signatory state to pursue the adoption and implementation of control measures, which include:

 $\bullet~\mathrm{NO}_{\mathrm{x}}$ emission limits in parts per million by volume, dry basis.

• NO_x emission limit averaging times.

• Updated presumptive Reasonably Available Control Technology (RACT) standards for MWC.

• Updating facility-specific RACT standards for MWC.

The Commission held stakeholder meetings on December 14, 2021, January 19, 2022, and March 8, 2022, to accept comments on specific measures which were presented in a report titled Municipal Waste Combustor Workgroup Report available on the Commission web site at https://otcair. org/upload/Documents/Reports/MWC%20Report_revised %2020220425.pdf. The response to comment document can be found on the Commission web site at https://otcair.org/ upload/Documents/Meeting%20Materials/Stakeholder%20 comments%20on%20MWC%20report%20and%20OTC%20 responses%203_7_22.pdf. The Department has reviewed stakeholder comments submitted to the Commission on the proposed measures. Disproportionate Share Payments and Supplemental Hospital Payments to Qualifying Hospitals

The Department of Human Services (Department) is providing final notice of its funding allocation for Fiscal Year (FY) 2021-2022 for several classes of inpatient disproportionate share hospital and supplemental payments to Medical Assistance (MA) enrolled and qualifying inpatient acute care general hospitals. The Department is not otherwise changing the qualifying criteria or payment methodology for these payments.

The Department published notice of its intent to allocate funding for these payments at 51 Pa.B. 7951 (December 18, 2021). The Department increased the funding allocation for one payment that was announced in its notice of intent. Supplemental payments to acute care general hospitals that provide a substantial portion of their inpatient services to MA beneficiaries were increased to an allocation of \$2.665 million in total funds, and this revised funding allocation did appear on the State Plan page submitted to the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services and approved on March 15, 2022.

Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$1,000,001 and not exceeding \$10,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$10,000. A Lottery retailer is entitled only to the largest bonus for which they qualify on a winning ticket. A bonus will be initiated for payment after the instant ticket is claimed and validated. A bonus will not be awarded to a Lottery retailer that sells a nonwinning Pennsylvania Lottery instant ticket used to enter a Pennsylvania Lottery second-chance drawing or promotion that is subsequently selected to win a prize.

11. Unclaimed prize money: For a period of 1 year from the announced close of The Instant Lottery, prize money from winning The Instant Lottery instant lottery game tickets will be retained by the Secretary for payment to the persons entitled thereto. If no claim is made within 1 year of the announced close of the The Instant Lottery instant lottery game, the right of a ticket holder to claim the prize represented by the ticket, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided for by statute.

12. Governing law: In purchasing a ticket, the customer agrees to comply with and abide by the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314), 61 Pa. Code Part V (relating to State Lotteries) and the provisions contained in this notice.

13. Termination of the game: The Secretary may announce a termination date, after which no further tickets from this game may be sold. The announcement will be disseminated through media used to advertise or promote The Instant Lottery or through normal communications methods.

The play symbols and their captions, located in the play area, are: 1 (ONE), 2 (TWO), 3 (THREE), 4 (FOUR), 6 (SIX), 7 (SEVEN), 8 (EIGHT), 9 (NINE), 10 (TEN), 11 (ELEVN), 12 (TWLV), 13 (THRTN), 14 (FORTN), 16 (SIXTN), 17 (SVNTN), 18 (EGHTN), 19 (NINTN), 20 (TWENT), LUCKY (LUCKY) symbol and a X5 (5TIMES) symbol.

A Lottery retailer is entitled only to the largest bonus for which they qualify on a winning ticket. A bonus will be initiated for payment after the instant ticket is claimed and validated. A bonus will not be awarded to a Lottery retailer that sells a nonwinning Pennsylvania Lottery instant ticket used to enter a Pennsylvania Lottery second-chance drawing or promotion that is subsequently selected to win a prize.

11. Unclaimed prize money: For a period of 1 year from the announced close of Lucky x5, prize money from winning Lucky x5 instant lottery game tickets will be retained by the Secretary for payment to the persons entitled thereto. If no claim is made within 1 year of the announced close of the Lucky x5 instant lottery game, the right of a ticket holder to claim the prize represented by the ticket, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided for by statute.

12. Governing law: In purchasing a ticket, the customer agrees to comply with and abide by the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314), 61 Pa. Code Part V (relating to State Lotteries) and the provisions contained in this notice.

Classification of Wild Trout Streams; Proposed Additions; July 2022

Under 58 Pa. Code § 57.11 (relating to listing of wild trout streams), it is the policy of the Fish and Boat Commission (Commission) to accurately identify and classify stream sections supporting naturally reproducing populations of trout as wild trout streams. The Commission's Fisheries Management Division maintains the list of wild trout streams. The Executive Director, with the approval of the Commission, will from time-to-time publish the list of wild trout streams in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. The listing of a stream section as a wild trout stream is a biological designation that does not determine how it is managed. The Commission relies upon many factors in determining the appropriate management of streams.

At the next Commission meeting on July 25 and 26, 2022, the Commission will consider changes to its list of wild trout streams. Specifically, the Commission will consider the addition of the following streams or portions of streams to the list:

Proposed Changes to List of Class A Wild Trout Waters; July 2022

The Fish and Boat Commission (Commission) is considering changes to its list of Class A Wild Trout Streams. Under 58 Pa. Code § 57.8a (relating to Class A wild trout streams), it is the Commission's policy to manage selfsustaining Class A wild trout populations as a renewable natural resource to conserve that resource and the angling it provides. Class A wild trout populations represent the best of this Commonwealth's naturally reproducing trout fisheries. With rare exceptions, the Commission manages these stream sections solely for the perpetuation of the wild trout fishery with no stocking.

Criteria developed for Class A Wild Trout fisheries are species specific. Wild Trout Biomass Class Criteria include provisions for:

(i) Wild Brook Trout Fisheries

(A) Total brook trout biomass of at least 30 kg/ha (26.7 lbs/acre).

(B) Total biomass of brook trout less than 15 cm (5.9 inches) in total length of at least 0.1 kg/ha (0.089 lbs/acre).

(C) Brook trout biomass must comprise at least 75% of the total trout biomass.

(ii) Wild Brown Trout Fisheries

(A) Total brown trout biomass of at least 40 kg/ha (35.6 lbs/acre).

(B) Total biomass of brown trout less than 15 cm (5.9 inches) in total length of at least 0.1 kg/ha (0.089 lbs/acre).

(C) Brown trout biomass must comprise at least 75% of the total trout biomass.

(iii) Mixed Wild Brook and Brown Trout Fisheries

(A) Combined brook and brown trout biomass of at least 40 kg/ha (35.6 lbs/acre).

(B) Total biomass of brook trout less than 15 cm (5.9 inches) in total length of at least 0.1 kg/ha (0.089 lbs/acre).

(C) Total biomass of brown trout less than 15 cm (5.9 inches) in total length of at least 0.1 kg/ha (0.089 lbs/acre).

(D) Brook trout biomass must comprise less than 75% of the total trout biomass.

(E) Brown trout biomass must comprise less than 75% of the total trout biomass.

(iv) Wild Rainbow Trout Fisheries

Total biomass of rainbow trout less than 15 cm (5.9) inches) in total length of at least 2.0 kg/ha (1.78 lbs/acre).

(v) Mixed Wild Brook and Rainbow Trout Fisheries

(A) Combined brook and rainbow trout biomass of at least 40 kg/ha (35.6 lbs/acre).

(B) Total biomass of brook trout less than 15 cm (5.9 inches) in total length of at least 0.1 kg/ha (0.089 lbs/acre).

(C) Total biomass of rainbow trout less than 15 cm (5.9 inches) in total length of at least 0.1 kg/ha (0.089 lbs/acre).

(D) Brook trout biomass shall comprise less than 75% of the total trout biomass.

(E) Rainbow trout biomass shall comprise less than 75% of the total trout biomass.

(vi) Mixed Wild Brown and Rainbow Trout Fisheries

(A) Combined brown and rainbow trout biomass of at least 40 kg/ha (35.6 lbs/acre).

(B) Total biomass of brown trout less than 15 cm (5.9 inches) in total length of at least 0.1 kg/ha (0.089 lbs/acre).

(C) Total biomass of rainbow trout less than 15 cm (5.9 inches) in total length of at least 0.1 kg/ha (0.089 lbs/acre).

(D) Brown trout biomass shall comprise less than 75% of the total trout biomass.

(E) Rainbow trout biomass shall comprise less than 75% of the total trout biomass.

We submit for your consideration the following comments on the proposed rulemaking published in the January 29, 2022 *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. Our comments are based on criteria in Section 5.2 of the Regulatory Review Act (71 P.S. § 745.5b). Section 5.1(a) of the Regulatory Review Act (71 P.S. § 745.5a(a)) directs the Environmental Quality Board (Board) to respond to all comments received from us or any other source.

1. Section 121.1. Definitions.—Clarity.

"Nuclear specialty coating"

Subparagraph (B) requires a protective coating used to seal porous surfaces to: "...Be relatively easy to decontaminate." Federal regulations include a reference to "ASTM 4256-89 or 94" for this particular requirement. See 40 CFR § 63.782. For consistency, we ask the Board to include the reference to "ASTM 4256-89 or 94" in the final rulemaking or to explain why it is not needed.

"Thinning ratio"

"Thinning ratio" is defined as "[t]he volumetric ratio of thinner to coating, *as supplied*." (Emphasis added.) Federal regulations provide a definition for the term "[a]s supplied" to mean "the condition of a coating before any thinning, as sold and delivered by the coating manufacturer to the user." See 40 CFR § 63.782. In order to provide greater clarity to the regulated community, we recommend the Board include the definition of "as supplied" in the final-form regulation or explain why it is not necessary.

2. Miscellaneous.—Clarity.

We ask the Board to review the commentator's suggestion regarding a typographical error related to footnote "b" associated with proposed revisions to Table I Emission Limits of VOCs in Surface Coatings by Process Category Weight of VOC per Volume of Coating Solids and to make the necessary correction, if appropriate.
