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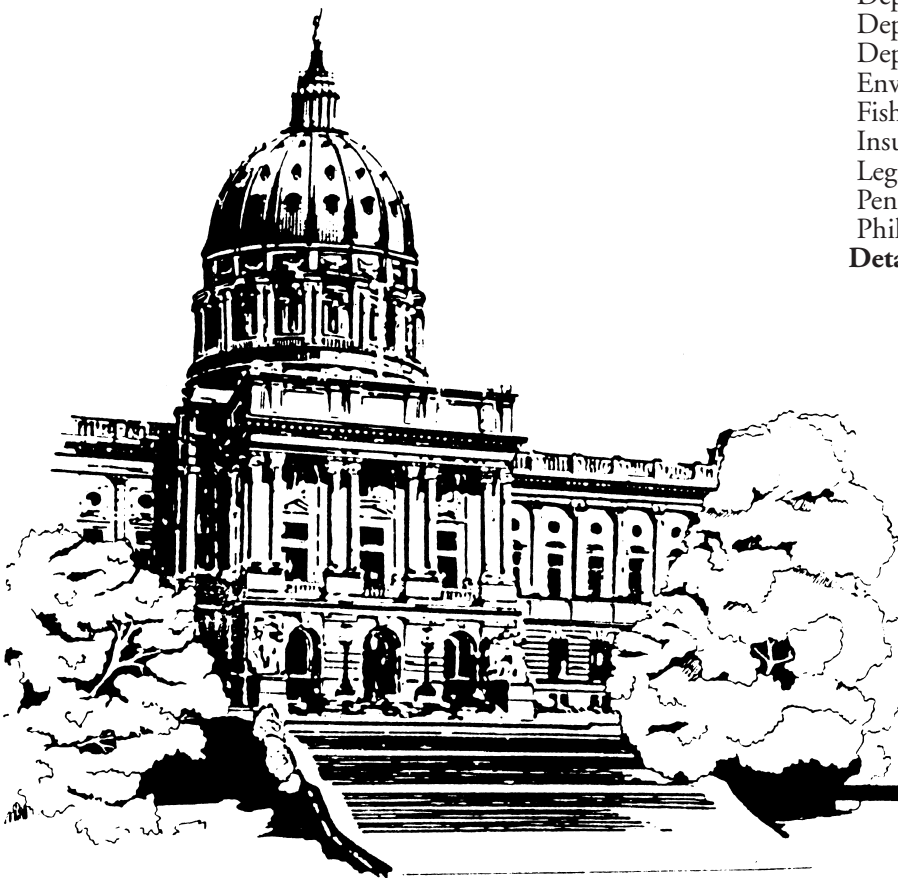

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Pennsylvania Bulletin

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the official gazette of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. It is published weekly. A cumulative subject matter index is published quarterly.

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* serves several purposes. It is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, which is the official codification of agency rules and regulations, Statewide court rules, and other statutorily authorized documents. Changes in the codified text, whether by adoption, amendment, rescission, repeal or emergency action, must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

The following documents are published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*: Governor's Executive Orders; Summaries of Enacted Statutes; Statewide and Local Court Rules; Attorney General Opinions; Motor Carrier Applications before the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission; Applications and Actions before the Department of Environmental Protection; Orders of the Independent Regulatory Review Commission; and other documents authorized by law.

The text of certain documents published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the only valid and enforceable text. Courts are required to take judicial notice of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Adoption, Amendment or Repeal of Regulations

Generally an agency wishing to adopt, amend or rescind regulations must first publish in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* a Proposed Rulemaking. There are limited instances when the agency may omit the proposal step; it still must publish the adopted version.

The Proposed Rulemaking contains the full text of the change, the agency contact person, a fiscal note required by law and background for the action.

The agency then allows sufficient time for public comment before taking final action. A Final Rulemaking must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* before the changes can take effect. If the agency wishes to adopt changes to the Proposed Rulemaking to enlarge the scope, it must repropose.

Citation to the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*

Cite material in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* by volume number, a page number and date. Example: Volume 1, *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, page 801, January 9, 1971 (short form: 1 Pa.B. 801 (January 9, 1971)).

Pennsylvania Code

The *Pennsylvania Code* is the official codification of rules and regulations issued by Commonwealth agencies, Statewide court rules and other statutorily authorized documents. The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, printing changes when they are adopted. These changes are then permanently codified by the *Pennsylvania Code Reporter*, a monthly, loose-leaf supplement.

The *Pennsylvania Code* is cited by title number and section number. Example: Title 10 *Pennsylvania Code* § 1.1 (short form: 10 Pa. Code § 1.1).

Under the *Pennsylvania Code* codification system, each regulation is assigned a unique number by title and section. Titles roughly parallel the organization of Commonwealth government.

How to Find Rules and Regulations

Search for your area of interest in the *Pennsylvania Code*. The *Pennsylvania Code* is available at www.pacodeandbulletin.gov.

Source Notes give the history of regulations. To see if there have been recent changes not yet codified, check the List of *Pennsylvania Code* Chapters Affected in the most recent issue of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

A chronological table of the history of *Pennsylvania Code* sections may be found at www.legis.state.pa.us/cfdocs/legis/CH/Public/pcde_index.cfm.

A quarterly List of *Pennsylvania Code* Sections Affected lists the regulations in numerical order, followed by the citation to the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* in which the change occurred.

Proposed new chapters and sections are printed in regular type to enhance readability. Final rulemakings and statements of policy are printed in regular type.

Ellipses, a series of five asterisks, indicate text that is not amended.

In Proposed Rulemakings and proposed Statements of Policy, existing text corresponds to the official codified text in the *Pennsylvania Code*.

Court Rules in Titles 201—246 of the Pennsylvania Code

Added text in proposed and adopted court rules is printed in **underscored bold face**. Deleted text in proposed and adopted court rules is enclosed in brackets [] and printed in **bold face**.

Proposed new chapters and rules are printed in regular type to enhance readability.

Ellipses, a series of five asterisks, indicate text that is not amended.

Fiscal Notes

Section 612 of The Administrative Code of 1929 (71 P. S. § 232) requires the Governor's Budget Office to prepare a fiscal note for regulatory actions and administrative procedures of the administrative departments, boards, commissions and authorities receiving money from the State Treasury. The fiscal note states whether the action or procedure causes a loss of revenue or an increase in the cost of programs for the Commonwealth or its political subdivisions. The fiscal note is required to be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* at the same time as the change is advertised.

A fiscal note provides the following information: (1) the designation of the fund out of which the appropriation providing for expenditures under the action or procedure shall be made; (2) the probable cost for the fiscal year the program is implemented; (3) projected cost estimate of the program for each of the 5 succeeding fiscal years; (4) fiscal history of the program for which expenditures are to be made; (5) probable loss of revenue for the fiscal year of its implementation; (6) projected loss of revenue from the program for each of the 5 succeeding fiscal years; (7) line item, if any, of the General Appropriation Act or other appropriation act out of which expenditures or losses of Commonwealth funds shall occur as a result of the action or procedures; and (8) recommendation, if any, of the Secretary of the Budget and the reasons therefor.

The omission of an item indicates that the agency text of the fiscal note states that there is no information available with respect thereto. In items (3) and (6) information is set forth for the first through fifth fiscal years, following the year the program is implemented, which is stated. In item (4) information is set forth for the current and two immediately preceding years. In item (8) the recommendation, if any, made by the Secretary of the Budget is published with the fiscal note. "No fiscal impact" means no additional cost or revenue loss to the Commonwealth or its local political subdivision is intended. See 4 Pa. Code Chapter 7, Subchapter R (relating to fiscal notes).

This list shall be published on the Unified Judicial System’s website and in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.” In accordance with this directive, the AOPC has updated the attached *Limits on Public Access to Unified Judicial System Case Records*.

And Now, this 31st day of March, 2023, pursuant to Article V, Section 10 of the Constitution of Pennsylvania, It Is Ordered that:

Rule 104 of the Pennsylvania Rules of the Judicial Ethics Advisory Board is amended in the attached form.

This Order shall be processed in accordance with Pa.R.J.A. 103(b) and shall be effective immediately.

Deletions from the rules are shown in bold and in brackets.

Annex A

TITLE 207. JUDICIAL CONDUCT

PART V. JUDICIAL ETHICS ADVISORY BOARD CHAPTER 1. RULES OF THE JUDICIAL ETHICS ADVISORY BOARD

Subchapter A. PRELIMINARY PROVISIONS

Rule 104. Pennsylvania Judicial Ethics Advisory Board.

(a) *General Rule.* The Supreme Court shall appoint a board to be known as the “Pennsylvania Judicial Ethics Advisory Board” (“the Board”), which shall consist of [**nine**] **thirteen** members: one judge of the Superior Court; one judge of the Commonwealth Court; [**three**] **four** judges of the courts of common pleas; one judge of the Philadelphia Municipal Court; [**two**] **four** magisterial district judges who must be members of the Pennsylvania bar; [**and**] one member of the Pennsylvania bar who is not a judicial officer; **and one retired judge from any level of the judiciary.** A majority of the Board shall constitute a quorum; action of the Board shall be by majority vote of members attending. No member of the Board may be a member of the Judicial Conduct Board or the Court of Judicial Discipline. The Supreme

Court shall designate one member to serve as Chair and another to serve as Vice-Chair.

(b) *Submissions from Representative Courts and Judicial Organizations.* The President Judges of the Superior and Commonwealth Courts shall submit to the Chief Justice the names of three candidates for each Board position to be filled by a judge of their respective courts. The PCSTJ shall submit to the Chief Justice the names of three candidates for each Board position to be filled by a judge of the Philadelphia Municipal Court. The SCJAP shall submit to the Chief Justice the names of three candidates for each Board position to be filled by a magisterial district judge. The Supreme Court shall select appointees for those positions from the names submitted. In the absence of submissions, the Supreme Court shall proceed to fill the Board positions.

(c) *Terms and Vacancies.* The first nine appointments to the Board shall be for staggered terms as follows: three members appointed for six years, three members for four years, and three members for two years. **The four members appointed to expand the Board to thirteen members will be appointed to staggered terms as follows: one member for six years, two members for four years, and one member for two years.** Thereafter, a new appointment to the Board shall be for a single six-year term. A vacancy shall be filled from the same membership category using the same process from which the vacating member was appointed. Appointments to fill a vacancy shall be for the balance of the term vacated.

Proposed Amendment of Pa.R.J.C.P. 1187

The Juvenile Court Procedural Rules Committee is considering proposing to the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania the amendment of Pennsylvania Rule of Juvenile Court Procedure 1187 governing the authority of juvenile court hearing officers for the reasons set forth in the accompanying publication report. Pursuant to Pa.R.J.A.

103(a)(1), the proposal is being published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* for comments, suggestions, or objections prior to submission to the Supreme Court.

Any report accompanying this proposal was prepared by the Committee to indicate the rationale for the proposed rulemaking. It will neither constitute a part of the rules nor be adopted by the Supreme Court.

TITLE 237. JUVENILE RULES

PART I. RULES

Subpart B. DEPENDENCY MATTERS

CHAPTER 11. GENERAL PROVISIONS

PART D. JUVENILE COURT HEARING OFFICERS

Rule 1187. Authority of Juvenile Court Hearing Officer.

[A.] (a) *No [authority] Authority.* A juvenile court hearing officer shall not have the authority to:

1) preside over:

[a] (i) termination of parental rights hearings;

[b] (ii) adoptions;

[c] (iii) any hearing in which any party seeks to establish a permanency goal of adoption or change the permanency goal to adoption;

2) enter orders for [emergency or] protective custody pursuant to [Rules 1200 and 1210] Rule 1202(A)(2) or Rule 1210;

3) issue warrants; and

4) issue contempt orders.

[B.] (b) *Right to [hearing before judge] Hearing Before Judge.*

1) Prior to the commencement of any proceeding, the juvenile court hearing officer shall inform all parties of the right to have the matter heard by a judge. If a party objects to having the matter heard by the juvenile court hearing officer, the case shall proceed before the judge.

2) If a party objects to having the matter heard by the juvenile court hearing officer pursuant to [paragraph (B)(1)] subdivision (b)(1), the juvenile court hearing

officer or the court's designee for scheduling cases shall immediately schedule a hearing before the judge. The time requirements of these rules shall apply.

Comment

A juvenile court hearing officer's authority is limited under this rule. To implement this rule, Rule 1800 suspends 42 Pa.C.S. § 6305(b) only to the extent that juvenile court hearing officers may not hear all classes of cases.

[Under paragraph (A)(1)(c)] Pursuant to subdivision (a)(1)(iii), once the permanency goal has been approved for adoption by a judge, all subsequent reviews or hearings may be heard by the juvenile court hearing officer unless a party objects pursuant to [paragraph (B)] subdivision (b).

Subdivision (a)(2) is not intended to limit the juvenile court hearing officer's ability to recommend to the court that an order for protective custody be issued during any proceeding, including a permanency review hearing, if witnesses are available to provide sufficient evidence to a judge at the time of the recommendation.

[Under paragraph (A)(3), nothing] Subdivision (a)(3) is not intended to limit the juvenile court hearing officer's ability, in a proper case before the juvenile court hearing officer, to recommend to the court that a warrant be issued. This includes arrest, bench, and search warrants.

Concerning the provisions of [paragraph (B)] subdivision (b), see 42 Pa.C.S. § 6305(b).

[Under paragraph (B)(2)] Pursuant to subdivision (b)(2), it should be determined whenever possible before the date of the hearing whether there will be an objection to having the matter heard before a juvenile court hearing officer. If it is anticipated [that] there will be an objection, the case [is to] should be scheduled in front of [the] a judge, rather than the juvenile court hearing officer, to prevent continuances and delays in the case.

PUBLICATION REPORT

Proposed Amendment of Pa.R.J.C.P. 1187

The Juvenile Court Procedural Rules Committee ("Committee") proposes to amend Rule 1187 of the Pennsylvania Rules of Juvenile Court Procedure to clarify that a juvenile court hearing officer (JCHO) is not prohibited from recommending an order for protective custody.

The Committee has discussed the merits of rulemaking that would permit a JCHO to seek a protective custody order during a permanency hearing. The genesis of these discussions is the occasion when a JCHO hears evidence during a permanency review hearing that would indicate the necessity for an order for protective custody. *Cf.* 1606. When those circumstances arise, the Committee believes the JCHO should be able to immediately contact a judge and recommend such an order provided witnesses are available to the judge at the time of the recommendation. While such an ability may be implicit under Pa.R.J.C.P. 1187, a majority of the Committee favored amending the commentary to clarify the authority of the JCHO.

The Committee invites all comments, concerns, and suggestions regarding this rulemaking proposal.

Rules Governing Abandoned and Blighted Properties Conservatorship Act under Title 68 P.S. § 1101 et seq.

Rule 701. Initiation of Conservatorship Action.

(1) A conservatorship action is commenced and assigned a CS docket number by the filing of a Petition for the Appointment of a Conservator (“Petition”) with the Department of Court Records and payment of the applicable filing fee.

(2) The petitioner must file a notice of filing of the petition with the Department of Court Records after filing the petition for appointment of a conservator. (See Form 703, Notice of Filing of a Petition for the Appointment of a Conservator.)

(3) The petitioner must file a praecipe for *lis pendens* with the Department of Court Records for indexing against the property, and a *lis pendens* with the Department of Real Estate. *Note:* The Judge has the discretion to remove the *lis pendens*.

(4) A copy of the petition filed with the Department of Court Records must be submitted to conservatorship calendar@alleghenycourts.us to receive a hearing date.

(5) The petition must be filed by an eligible “party in interest” as defined in 68 P.S. § 1103 of the Abandoned and Blighted Properties Conservatorship Act, 68 P.S. § 1101 et seq. (“the Act”).

Note: The Abandoned and Blighted Property Conservatorship Act provides a mechanism to transform abandoned and blighted properties into productive reuse by authorizing the filing of a petition with the Court of Common Pleas by certain named interested parties seeking the appointment of a Conservator who will be authorized to take possession of the property, undertake its rehabilitation, and as appropriate, ultimately sell the premises unless reclaimed by the owner(s).

Rule 702. Contents of Petition for Appointment of Conservator.

(1) The petition must name as respondent(s) the owner(s) of the property at issue.

Note: The petitioner must undertake a substantial examination of the public record to determine all parties who may be deemed an owner and not merely rely on the last recorded deed.

(2) The petition must contain the following:

(a) The identity and addresses of all lienholders and other secured creditors of the owners, including judgment creditors of owners;

(b) Street address of the property, including ZIP Code, extended ZIP Code, and tax parcel ID (block and lot number);

(c) Proof that the proposed conservator is entitled to appointment pursuant to sections 1103, 1105(e), and 1111 of the Act;

Note: The Court may request but is not limited to the following: a copy of the title report; a copy of any citations for municipal code violations; a copy of any citations declaring the structure a public nuisance; an affidavit supporting the petitioner’s qualifications as a “party in interest”; an affidavit of one or more neighbors on their firsthand knowledge of the vacancy and physical condition of the property; an affidavit outlining the petitioner’s intent with the property, including whether the property will be designated for affordable housing; and/or an affidavit of one or more neighbors on whether appointment of a conservator would benefit the property.

(d) A sworn statement that, to the best of the petitioner’s knowledge, the property meets the conditions for conservatorship set forth within Section 1105(d) of the Act;

(e) A proposed Order of Court; and

(f) A notice of filing of a petition for the appointment of a conservator. (See Form 703, Notice of Filing of a Petition for the Appointment of a Conservator.)

(3) In addition to the items identified in subparagraph (2) of this Rule, a non-profit acting as petitioner shall attach the following:

(a) Proof that the nonprofit is operated within Allegheny County;

(b) Proof that the nonprofit is eligible to receive a Certificate of Good Standing from the Pennsylvania Department of State; and

(c) Proof that the nonprofit has passed a resolution authorizing the filing of the petition, and if seeking to serve as conservator, proof that it is authorized to perform all of the duties required of a conservator

(4) A petitioner (other than a nonprofit corporation acting as a petitioner) shall attach proof that the petitioner is located within the 2,000 feet of the subject property.

Rule 703. Notification and Service of the Petition.

(1) The petitioner shall conspicuously post the Notice of the Filing of the Petition, including the Allegheny County

docket number, the Order and the hearing date, on the subject property pursuant to Section 1104(d)(1) of the Act. The Notice of the Filing of the Petition shall be substantially in the form set forth below (See FORM 703).

(2) A copy of the Notice and Petition, including all exhibits, shall be served pursuant to the Act on the following individuals and entities:

- (a) The owner(s) of the subject property;
- (b) The solicitor of the municipality (political subdivision) in which the subject property is located;
- (c) The Allegheny County Law Department (445 Fort Pitt Blvd # 300, Pittsburgh PA 15219);
- (d) All municipal authorities known to have provided service to the subject property; and
- (e) All lienholders.

(3) Except as set forth in subsection (a) below, service shall be made by registered or certified mail to each of the above individuals and entities at their last known address. If service cannot be completed by registered or certified mail, service must be completed in accordance with Section 1104(d)(2—5) of the Act.

(a) Service may be effectuated by email upon any entity or individual that has agreed to accept service by email.

(4) Proof of service of the Notice and Petition shall be filed with the Department of Court Records. Proof of service shall include an executed affidavit of service by posting and one of the following:

- (a) a signed return receipt of the certified or registered mail attached to an Affidavit of Service, or
- (b) an executed affidavit of personal service if service is completed by personal service, or
- (c) an affidavit filed by the serving party evidencing service by email pursuant to 3(a), or
- (d) by a filed acceptance of service by the party served, or
- (e) If service is made by alternative means pursuant to Order of Court, then proof of service shall be made pursuant to Pa.R.C.P. 430.

Note: The above Notice of Filing should be conspicuously posted on the property, prominently displayed on the property using a sign affixed to a stake that is no less than four (4) feet in height and displayed prominently on the front of the physical dwelling if such a building exists.

Rule 704. Answer to Petition and Petition to Intervene.

- (1) A respondent may file an answer to the petition.
- (2) A “party in interest” as defined by Section 1103 of the Act, seeking to intervene pursuant to Section 1105 of the Act, shall either file and serve a petition to intervene prior to the hearing date or attend the hearing.
- (3) A party in interest may file a motion to schedule an expedited pretrial conference to address the facts at issue with the parties and the Court. The assigned Judge may schedule a pretrial conference prior to the scheduled hearing if the conference will not disrupt the scheduled conservatorship hearing date.
- (4) A praecipe of appearance shall be filed and served on all parties for any attorney who intends to appear for or on behalf of a respondent or party in interest prior to the hearing for the appointment of the conservator.

Rule 705. Process for Scheduling a Hearing.

- (1) To obtain a hearing date on a Conservatorship case, the requesting party must do the following:
 - (a) File a Motion to Obtain a Hearing with the Department of Court Records, and
 - (b) Submit the Motion to Obtain a Hearing to conservatorshipcalendar@alleghenycourts.us.

Note: The Motion to Obtain a Hearing will not need to be presented and argued unless oral argument is requested by any party in interest; it will be at the Court’s discretion whether or not the hearing requested will be scheduled. If the Court has not acted on the Motion to Obtain a Hearing within twenty one (21) days, the Moving party is encouraged to email the conservatorshipcalendar@alleghenycourts.us email inbox requesting that the Motion be ruled upon.

- (2) This rule applies to any hearings related to the Act requested by any party in interest.
- (3) Any Motion to Obtain a Hearing shall state clearly whether it is contested to the best of the filing party’s knowledge at the time of the filing.

Note: Identifying whether the Motion to Obtain a Hearing is contested may assist in determining whether a status conference or Rule to Show Cause hearing is necessary.

- (4) An Order scheduling a Status Conference or Rule to Show Cause hearing following the filing and submission of the Motion to Obtain a Hearing will be filed with the Department of Court Records, and the Department of Court Records shall serve the Order upon the parties pursuant to Pa.R.C.P. 236.
- (5) Any Motion to Obtain a Hearing filed pursuant to this Rule shall be served pursuant to Local Rule 703.
- (6) Any Motion for Alternative Service shall be presented to the General Motions Judge pursuant to the procedures set forth in Local Rule 208.3(a). The Motion shall substantially include the following, consistent with Pa.R.C.P. 430:
 - (a) An affidavit stating the nature and extent of the investigation made to determine the whereabouts of the defendant and the reasons why service cannot be made. The affidavit shall set forth the movant’s good faith effort to locate the respondent(s); good faith efforts include
 - i. Inquiries of postal authorities including inquiries pursuant to the Freedom of Information Act, 39 C.F.R. Part 265;
 - ii. Inquiries of relatives, neighbors, friends, and employers of the respondent(s);
 - iii. Examinations of local telephone directories, courthouse records, voter registration records, local tax records, local assessment records, and motor vehicle records,
 - iv. A reasonable internet search;
 - v. Lexis Public Records search;
 - vi. Examination of the Allegheny County Orphan’s Court/Registry of Wills for any estates filed on behalf of Respondent; and
 - vii. Search for any obituaries of respondent.
 - (b) A proposed order with the relief requested which includes posting and publication.

Rule 706. Hearing on Petition.

- (1) The petitioner must produce the following evidence at the hearing:
 - (a) That the property meets the conditions for conservatorship set forth in Section 1105(d) of the Act;

- (b) Evidence of standing;
 - (b) Proof of service that complies with these Local Rules, and
 - (c) Schedule of encumbrances for certification under Section 11105(e)(1) of the Act.
- (2) Any party in interest who appears at the hearing may be permitted to present evidence to support or contest the petition.

(3) The Court has discretion to permit a party in interest who has not filed an answer or other responsive pleading, including a petition to intervene, to do so or to postpone the hearing or permit said party in interest to participate in the hearing.

Rule 707. Conditional Relief. Respondent's Request for Period to Abate Conditions.

If conditional relief is granted to permit the owner(s) a specified amount of time to remedy or remedy the conditions, the owner(s) must post a straight bond with the Allegheny County Department of Court Records per Section 1105(f)(3) of the Act in the amount of the estimated costs of repair outlined within the petition for appointment of conservator, unless the Court orders otherwise.

Rule 708. Appointment of a Conservator.

If a conservator is appointed, the Order may set forth the powers, duties and obligations of the conservator, including requirements which must be met before the conservator may exercise any authorized powers and duties, such as securing any necessary bond and/or insurance and may also require the conservator, and any other individual(s) who must enter the premises to assist with the preparation of the final plan, to execute right of entry authorizations and provide certificates of additional insurance.

Rule 709. Declining Appointment as Conservator. Removal of Conservator.

(1) At any time, the conservator may decline the appointment as conservator, and the petitioner may propose another competent entity to be appointed as the new conservator by submitting a Motion to Remove and Replace Conservator to the assigned Judge. The Court will schedule a hearing on the motion to determine whether the proposed conservator meets the definition of a "competent entity" pursuant to Section 1103 of the Act.

(2) A conservator may be removed by the Court at any time upon the request of the conservator, or upon a motion by a party in interest alleging that the conservator is not carrying out its responsibilities.

(3) After a hearing, the Court may find the conservator to be incompetent and appoint a competent entity as conservator or the Court may terminate the conservatorship.

Rule 710. Filing of Final Plan.

(1) The petitioner may attach a proposed Final Plan for Abatement to the petition in lieu of a preliminary plan and the conservator may present the same at the initial conservatorship hearing.

(2) The Final Plan for Abatement must fully comply with Section 1106(b) of the Act and shall specifically set forth the scope of work to be performed, financing details, and other relevant terms.

(3) The Final Plan for Abatement may include a request to grant a lien or security interest with priority per

Section 1108(b) of the Act and may also include a request to borrow funds to implement the Final Plan for Abatement.

Note: Although petitioners may attach a proposed Final Plan for Abatement to the petition in lieu of a preliminary plan, and may present that Final Plan for Abatement at the initial conservatorship hearing, such methods may not allow adequate time for interested parties, heirs and others to object, interplead, and/or participate in the litigation. Rarely will it be appropriate for a petitioner to request the entry of the Final Plan of Abatement at the initial conservatorship hearing due to the extreme relief the petitioner is seeking, which may be to terminate the property rights of another who may not yet have notice of the petition.

Rule 711. Hearing on Final Plan and Court Approval.

(1) If a Final Plan for Abatement is not presented at the initial conservatorship hearing, the conservator shall file with the Department of Court Records and serve on the parties a Final Plan for Abatement no less than thirty (30) days prior to the Final Plan for Abatement hearing date.

(2) The conservator shall file a motion for a hearing on the Final Plan for Abatement with the Department of Court Records and serve said documents on all parties.

(3) To obtain a hearing date on the Final Plan for Abatement, the conservator shall follow the procedures set forth in Local Rule 705.

(4) If the proposed Final Plan for Abatement is denied, the conservator shall file an Amended Final Plan for Abatement, and comply with subsections (2) and (3) of this Local Rule to obtain a new hearing date. Once the Final Plan for Abatement is approved, no changes may be made unless authorized by the Court.

Rule 712. Status Reports.

The Court may require status reports at least annually from the date of the appointment of a conservator.

Rule 713. Filing of an Account.

Upon completion of the rehabilitation or demolition of the subject property, the conservator shall file a full account of all funds expended by the conservator. The account shall include a summary of actions taken by the conservator, and a detailed report verifying each of the items in the scope of work approved by the court was in fact completed and if it was not completed, the conservator shall provide sufficient justification for non-completion.

Rule 714. Conservator's Lien.

(1) The conservator shall file a motion to obtain a hearing on the conservator's lien with the Department of Court Records and serve said motion on all parties.

(2) To obtain a hearing date on the conservator's lien, the conservator shall follow the procedure set forth in Local Rule 705.

Rule 715. Sale of Subject Property. Distribution of Proceeds.

(1) The conservator shall seek an Order to sell the property by submitting for an application for sale to the assigned Judge.

(a) The conservator is required to obtain at least one (1) fair market value appraisal of the subject property.

(b) The conservator must provide notice of the hearing in accordance with Local Rule 705.

(2) The conservator shall follow the procedures set forth in Local Rule 705 to obtain a hearing date on the application for sale.

Rule 716. Request for Special Relief.

(1) Any party in interest may request special relief during the pendency of a conservatorship action by filing a motion setting forth the special relief requested and following the procedures set forth in Local Rule 705.

Rule 717. Termination of Conservatorship.

(1) To terminate a conservatorship, a conservator or any party in interest may petition the Court pursuant to Local Rule 705.

PROPOSED RULEMAKING

INSURANCE DEPARTMENT

[31 PA. CODE CH. 89]

Preparation of Forms

The Insurance Department (Department) proposes to amend Chapter 89 (relating to approval of life, accident and health insurance) to read as set forth in Annex A. This rulemaking is proposed under the Department's general rulemaking authority as set forth in sections 206, 506, 1501 and 1502 of The Administrative Code of 1929 (71 P.S. §§ 66, 186, 411 and 412), section 314 of the Accident and Health Filing Reform Act (40 P.S. § 3801.314) and the Department's rulemaking authority under the Unfair Insurance Practices Act (40 P.S. §§ 1171.1—1171.15). See *PALU v. Insurance Department*, 371 A.2d 564 (Pa. Cmwlth. 1977) (further explaining the Insurance Commissioner's authority to promulgate regulations under the Unfair Insurance Practices Act).

Background and Purpose

This proposed rulemaking, as set forth in Annex A, will allow for the voluntary collection of demographic data, including questions related to race and ethnicity when certain criteria are met. Specifically, the proposed amendment to § 89.12 (relating to application forms) will allow insurers to collect data that will help them develop better tools to address inequities in life, accident and health insurance coverage. Moreover, this proposed amendment will be consistent with Federal and State efforts to address equity issues across society generally. For example, at the Federal level, the 2023 Notice of Benefit and Payment Parameters takes significant steps toward requiring health insurers to collect race and ethnicity data; beginning with the 2025 benefit year, health insurers will be required to collect it. Amending § 89.12(e) will allow the Commonwealth's health insurers to comply with this upcoming Federal requirement and remove an inconsistency between Federal and State provisions.

The provision, as currently written in § 89.12(e), addresses the inequities that were the focus of the landmark Civil Rights Act of 1964 (42 U.S.C. §§ 2000a—2000h-6), which prohibited “discrimination or segregation on the ground of race, color, religion or national origin.” Following that National precedent, on July 1, 1969, the Department issued § 89.12 for application forms, including: “Questions as to race or color are not permitted on the application.” See § 89.12(e).

In the 54 years since the 1969 issuance, society has continued to grapple with racial and ethnic equity issues. More recently, society has recognized that inequities can only be addressed if they are adequately identified. To identify those issues and measure improvement in addressing them, data is necessary. This proposed amendment will allow insurers to collect that data, if they choose, while continuing to prohibit insurers from using that data in an unfairly discriminatory manner. This is consistent with ongoing Federal initiatives outlined the 2023 Notice of Benefit and Payment Parameters and will allow the Commonwealth's regulations to remain consistent with Federal law.

Explanation of Regulatory Requirements

Proposed § 89.12(e) allows an insurer to include questions as to demographic factors, including race and ethnicity, on an application.

Proposed § 89.12(e)(1) requires an application to clearly state that the disclosure is voluntary.

Proposed § 89.12(e)(2) requires any questions as to the data to include the following options verbatim: (i) Prefer Not to Answer; (ii) Other.

Proposed § 89.12(e)(3) requires an insurer to provide, at the time of application or when the data is collected, the prospective insured with a written statement including that the data will be maintained as private, that the data may not be used by the insurer for eligibility determinations, underwriting or rating purposes, and that the insurer may not deny an application based on the applicant's refusal to answer the questions related to demographic data on the application.

Proposed § 89.12(e)(4) requires an insurer to provide to the insured a written explanation as to why the data is being requested by the insurer and how the data will be used to support efforts to provide equitable coverage.

Proposed § 89.12(e)(5) requires the insurer to provide written attestation to the Department that the application, collection and use of demographic data meets Federal and State laws regarding unfair discrimination, including that the data is maintained as private, the data may not be used for eligibility determinations, underwriting or rating purposes, and that the insurer may not deny an application based on the applicant's refusal to answer the question related to demographic data on the application.

Proposed § 89.12(e)(6) requires the insurer to submit the written attestation set forth in proposed § 89.12(e)(5) by 180 days after the effective date of the final-form rulemaking, the date the product is filed or the date that there is a material change to the data collection process even if no filing is required.

Proposed § 89.12(f) states that an insurer is not required to collect demographic information, including race and ethnicity at the time of application or otherwise.

External Comments

The Department circulated an exposure draft similar to this proposed rulemaking to several industry participants including the Insurance Federation of Pennsylvania, Inc., the Pennsylvania Association of Mutual Insurance Companies and several health insurers. The exposure draft was circulated on October 11, 2022. The Department has also discussed this topic informally with industry members over approximately the last year. The Department considered all comments, responded to several questions and incorporated revisions to this proposed rulemaking based upon stakeholder feedback.

Affected Parties

This proposed rulemaking will affect foreign and domestic insurers that issue individual and group life, accident and health insurance contracts in this Commonwealth.

Fiscal Impact

State government

There will not be any fiscal impact to the Department as a result of this proposed rulemaking.

General public

This proposed rulemaking will have no fiscal impact upon the general public.

Political subdivisions

This proposed rulemaking will have no fiscal impact upon political subdivisions.

Private sector

This proposed rulemaking will have no fiscal impact upon the private sector, except for a possible minimal impact to the regulated entities who choose to collect the data.

Paperwork

This proposed rulemaking would impose minimal additional paperwork on the Department because it would be reviewing attestations and related information submitted by insurers choosing to collect the demographic data. The Department does not anticipate that this additional review will materially impact its regulatory activities.

Effective Date / Sunset Date

This proposed rulemaking will become effective immediately upon final-form publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. The Department continues to monitor the effectiveness of regulations on a triennial basis; therefore, no sunset date has been assigned.

Regulatory Review

Under Section 5(a) of the Regulatory Review Act (71 P.S. § 745.5(a)), on April 4, 2023, the Department submitted a copy of this proposed rulemaking and a copy of a Regulatory Analysis Form to the Independent Regulatory Review Commission (IRRC) and to the Chairpersons of the House Insurance Committee and the Senate Banking and Insurance Committee. A copy of this material is available to the public upon request.

Under section 5(g) of the Regulatory Review Act, IRRC may convey any comments, recommendations or objections to the proposed rulemaking within 30 days of the close of the public comment period. The comments, recommendations or objections must specify the regulatory review criteria in section 5.2 of the Regulatory Review Act (71 P.S. § 745.5b) which have not been met. The Regulatory Review Act specifies detailed procedures for review, prior to final delivery of the rulemaking by the Department, the General Assembly and the Governor.

TITLE 31. INSURANCE

PART IV. LIFE INSURANCE

CHAPTER 89. APPROVAL OF LIFE, ACCIDENT AND HEALTH INSURANCE

Subchapter A. REQUIREMENTS FOR ALL POLICIES AND FORMS

PREPARATION OF FORMS

§ 89.12. Application forms.

(a) When submitting a policy form to which a copy of the application will be attached when the policy is issued,

a copy of the application shall be attached to the policy form. If the form of the application has already been approved, the form number and date of approval shall be shown either on the form or in the transmittal letter.

(b) If it is the practice of the insurer to attach a reduced size reproduction of the application to a form when issued, the application should be attached to each copy of the form submitted. The application should be legibly reproduced in the size to be used in the contract.

(c) An application which includes a provision for home office endorsements or corrections may not be approved for use unless it is specifically stipulated therein that a change may not be made in the amount of insurance, the age at issue, the plan of insurance or benefits applied for by the endorsements or corrections. This subsection does not apply to group applications.

(d) Applications shall contain clear and direct questions by the insurer permitting answers by the applicant only in the form of direct statements of known facts. Applications may not contain questions or representations based on indefinite or ambiguous terms or which are inconsistent with policy provisions and may not require the making of warranties by the applicant.

(e) [Questions as to race or color are not permitted on the application.] An insurer may include questions as to demographic factors, including race and ethnicity, on an application subject to all of the following:

(1) The application clearly states that the disclosure of the data is voluntary.

(2) Questions as to the data include the following answer options verbatim:

(i) Prefer Not to Answer.

(ii) Other.

(3) At the time of application or when the data is collected, the insurer provides to the insured a written statement that contains the following information:

(i) The data will be maintained as private.

(ii) The data may not be used by the insurer for eligibility determinations, underwriting or rating purposes.

(iii) The insurer may not deny an application based on the applicant's refusal to answer the questions related to demographic data on the application.

(4) At the time of application or when the data is collected, the insurer provides a written explanation to the insured regarding all of the following:

(i) Why the data is being requested by the insurer.

(ii) How the data will support efforts to provide equitable coverage.

(5) The insurer provides a written attestation to the Department that the insurer's application, collection and use of data meets Federal and State law regarding unfair discrimination, including all of the following:

(i) The insured's data is maintained as private.

(ii) The insured's data may not be used by the insurer for eligibility determinations, underwriting or rating purposes.

(iii) The insurer may not deny an application based on the applicant’s refusal to answer the questions related to demographic data on the application.

(6) The insurer shall provide the written attestation in paragraph (5) for each product by the following dates:

(i) (The blank refers to the date 180 days following the effective date of the final-form rule-making), for products in existence as of the effective date of this regulation.

(ii) The date the product is filed.

(iii) The date that there is a material change to the application or data collection process, even if not required to be filed.

(f) Nothing in this subsection may be construed to require an insurer to collect demographic information, including race and ethnicity data, at the time of application or otherwise.

[58 PA. CODE CH. 63]

Fishing; General Fishing Regulations

The Fish and Boat Commission (Commission) proposes to amend Chapter 63 (relating to general fishing regulations). The Commission is publishing this proposed rulemaking under the authority of 30 Pa.C.S. (relating to Fish and Boat Code) (code). The proposed amendment updates the Commission’s regulations pertaining to the fees of fishing licenses and permits.

A. Effective Date

This proposed rulemaking, if approved on final-form rulemaking, will go into effect on December 1, 2023.

B. Contact Person

C. Statutory Authority

The proposed amendment to § 63.57 (relating to license, permit and issuing agent fees) is published under the statutory authority of section 322.1 of the code (relating to power to set fees).

D. Purpose and Background

The specific purpose and background of the proposed amendment is described in more detail under the summary of proposal.

E. Summary of Proposal

The Commonwealth’s fishing and boating programs are paid for by anglers and boaters through the User pays, User Benefits Model, primarily from the sale of fishing licenses, permits and boat registrations.

The Commission has two legislatively authorized special funds: the Fish Fund and Boat Fund. These funds receive money mainly from fishing license and permit fees, boat registration fees, fines and penalties, tax refunds of motorboat fuel and Federal funds.

By far, the largest source of revenue for the Fish Fund is from fishing license and permit fees, and these fees account for more than 67% of Fish Fund revenues.

Commission staff regularly monitor the status and fiscal health of the Fish Fund to ensure that adequate funds are available to maintain and support programs designed to meet the expectations of anglers and other users of this Commonwealth’s aquatic resources.

An adjustment to the fees for fishing licenses and permits is needed to cope with inflationary pressures, maintain and improve existing programs, and to address and meet anglers and boaters’ desires for:

- Strategic and timely fisheries management to protect, conserve and enhance the aquatic resources of this Commonwealth.
- Critical infrastructure improvements and maintenance efforts for State fish hatcheries, hazardous dams, boat launch access areas and ramps, and other Commission-owned facilities to improve and maintain fishing opportunities.
- Upgrades and replacement of equipment, vehicles and watercraft for customer and employee safety and for sustained service delivery.
- Aquatic resource field and classroom education and angler information programs.
- Conservation law enforcement.
- Maintaining operations and offsetting inflationary and supply chain constraint costs.

If new revenues are not in place for the 2024 license year, the Commission will not be able to maintain adequate levels of services to this Commonwealth’s anglers, let alone respond to anglers’ desires for expanded efforts in many program areas.

To maintain adequate funding to sustain these important programs and invest in the future, the Commission is seeking a modest fee increase for all fishing license and permit categories as shown in the following table:

DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE

Agricultural Research Grant Applications

The Department of Agriculture (Department) is soliciting applications to conduct agricultural research on one or more of the following research topic areas, with the research to be conducted from July 1, 2023, to June 30, 2025, with the possibility, but not the assurance, of extending that research into subsequent years. Funding is contingent upon 2023-2024 budget appropriations. This notice establishes the procedures by which grant applications will be solicited and reviewed, and by which grants will be awarded.

1. *Grant Solicitation.* The Department will accept grant applications for the purposes, in the form and according to the schedule set forth as follows. Following publication, additional publication and dissemination of this notice shall be made to applicants who have previously submitted grant applications to or received grants from the Department, as well as any individuals or entities who have requested notification from the Department of grant availability.

2. *Research Topic Areas.* Though not exclusive of original research topics, the Department is particularly interested in funding projects in the following areas:

a. *Ongoing multiyear research projects.* The Department has, in previous years, provided funding for various multiyear research projects that might be continued or extended to complete research the Department identifies as addressing continued priorities of the agricultural industry, such as:

- Examining the economic impact of pest infestations like Phorid Flies and Spotted Lanternflies and identifying mitigating measures.

- Measuring the impacts on the Chesapeake Bay of farm management practices that have not received Federal or State government cost-sharing assistance.

- Implementing Chapter 5 of the Pennsylvania Pollinator Protection Plan (see <https://ento.psu.edu/pollinators/pollin-spotlight-items/the-pennsylvania-pollinator-protection-plan-p4>).

b. *Natural resource conservation, climate and the quality of our soil, water and air.* The Department is seeking new proposals that address agriculture's role in stewarding natural resources and innovations in combatting and adapting to climate change. Specifically, the Department requests applications for projects that:

- Provide ongoing water quality monitoring in high-priority streams identified in version 3 of the Chesapeake Bay Watershed Implementation Plan.

- Provide ongoing air quality monitoring around high-priority production areas, particularly mushroom facilities in Chester and Berks Counties.

- Quantify the benefits to soil health, carbon sequestration and climate change resiliency from best management practices in conservation. (For example, functional buffers, cover crops, no-till and the like.)

- Quantify economic benefits and reductions in carbon emissions through on-farm energy efficiency measures.

- Identify opportunities with Agrivoltaics such as gaps, barriers, implementation of panels modified to support agriculture in this Commonwealth.

- Integrate silvopasture and other agro-forestry revenue streams into dairy, livestock or poultry farms.

- Identify soil testing and remediation strategies for urban agriculture, particularly how these strategies can be operationalized, their benefits measured and the cost of implementation.

- Assess the adoption and implementation of best management practices by farmers that are part of conservation plans to ensure compliance and appropriate credit is received.

- Identify and determine the applicability and effectiveness of nutrient management technologies to assist the Commonwealth in assessing the utility of various approaches.

- Assess relationships among reclaimed land, biosolid applications and water quality.

- Identify strategies for invasive species management.

- Manure Treatment Technology impact and options for increasing manure mitigation or other revenue opportunities.

- Assess alternative methods to preserving prime agricultural lands in this Commonwealth.

- Development of sustainable methods for production of nursery and greenhouse plants.

c. *Human resources in agriculture.* The Department is interested in further scientific study in areas such as:

- Assessing the availability, success and outlook for apprenticeships, preapprenticeships and other on-the-job training opportunities within agriculture.

- Assessing the quantity and quality of available on-farm and off-farm housing for agricultural workers, including farm owners.

d. *Consumer-focused research.* The Department seeks applications that study consumer focused research in:

- Biodegradable packaging and other environmental factors in selecting food and beverage products.
- Pharmaceutical or industrial uses for milk proteins or other milk components.
- The Emergency Food Assistance Program analysis.
- Food product manufacturing and processing industry.
- Economic impact of agriculture trade in this Commonwealth and opportunities for agriculture.
- Economic opportunities for Hard Cider in this Commonwealth.
- Barriers to land access, particularly for Black, Indigenous and people of color farmers and in rural communities.
- Economic impact of county and local fairs in this Commonwealth.
- *PA Preferred*—Marketing strategic analysis to determine best practices, strengths and weaknesses in efforts to promote to consumers and potential members.

e. *Animals and agriculture.* The Department seeks applications that address animal health concerns, such as:

- *One Health*—Proposals that promote humans, the environment, animals, living together harmoniously.
- *Animal Health*—Proposals that improve or seek to understand aspects of animal health important to agriculture in this Commonwealth.
- *Diagnosis of Animal Diseases*—Proposals that promote the diagnosis of animal diseases that are important to Commonwealth animal agriculture.
- *Animal Productivity*—Proposals that seek to improve the productivity of agricultural animals in this Commonwealth.
- *Animal Welfare*—Proposals that seek to improve the welfare of agricultural animals in this Commonwealth.
- Assess the status of High Path Avian Influenza vaccine development and deployment on the poultry industry in this Commonwealth.
- Review and recommend Federal Milk Marketing Order recommendations that would be most beneficial to the dairy industry in this Commonwealth.
- Review and recommend collection and distribution changes to the Milk Marketing Board Over Order Premium that would be most advantageous to the dairy industry in this Commonwealth.
- Chronic Wasting Disease strategy development to reduce incidents or live animal test development, or both.

f. *Technology and innovation.*

- Assess the application and deployment of augmented reality on animal and plant industries in this Commonwealth.

3. *Application Delivery and Deadline.* Interested applicants must submit a complete electronic research project proposal and grant application using the Department of Community and Economic Development's Electronic Single Application web site at [https://www.esa.dced.state](https://www.esa.dced.state.pa.us/Login.aspx)

pa.us/Login.aspx by Monday, May 15, 2023, at 5 p.m. Questions regarding this online application process may be directed to Morgan Sheffield, Grants Coordinator for the Department of Agriculture, at (717) 787-3568.

4. *Scoring of Applications.* The Department will evaluate each complete and timely-filed project proposal and grant application it receives, using a 100-point scale assessing:

- Up to 15 points for the research project needs statement.
- Up to 15 points for the impact of research outcomes, including enhancement of diversity, equity and inclusion.
- Up to 30 points for the research methodology.
- Up to 10 points for project evaluation and replicability.
- Up to 20 points for support and participation from industry.
- Up to 10 points for diversity of the research team.

5. *Scores.* Upon completion of evaluations, the Department will prepare a record identifying each complete and timely-filed project proposal and grant application received and the numerical score assigned to each. The Department shall award grants based upon its evaluation and scoring.

6. *Multiyear Projects or Extensions.* The Department may award grant funding for multiyear projects or provide an extension of time to complete an ongoing project, if the Department identifies that a multiyear term or an extension advances the Department's objectives and the grant's likelihood of achieving its stated goals. Requests for extensions of ongoing projects shall be made, evaluated and processed in accordance with all the requirements of this notice.

7. *Notice of Award.* Applicants shall be notified by mail of the decision on their grant applications by the Department. Best efforts will be made to do so within 60 days of the application deadline.

8. *Grant Agreement.* With the mailed grant award notice, the Department will provide applicants with a grant agreement for execution and return within 30 days or instructions as to finalizing the grant agreement electronically. The Department will obtain the required Commonwealth signatures on the grant agreements and return a copy of the fully-executed grant agreement to the applicant. The grant agreement is not effective, and work should not begin until all required signatures have been applied to the grant agreement. Among the terms of the grant agreement shall be a requirement that the grant recipient provide the Department full and complete access to all records relating to the performance of the project and submit such information as the Department may require.

9. *Nonmatching Cost-Reimbursable Grant.* Grants made hereunder do not require the applicant secure or devote a matching sum to the project, but outside funding may be considered as an evaluation criterion under section 5 of this solicitation. Payment of grant funds will occur on a reimbursement basis, with the possibility upon the written submission of justification and subsequent approval of the Department of an advance payment option.

10. *Allowable Indirect Cost Reimbursement.* Grants made hereunder are subject to an indirect cost cap of 15% of total direct project costs. For the purpose of this research grant funding solicitation, indirect costs shall

include administrative salaries and benefits, office supplies and equipment, facility related cost including maintenance and repairs, telephones, memberships/dues, freight/postage cost and any consultant related costs associated with the administration of this research grant.

11. *Reporting Requirements.* Upon completion of research projects funded through this program, grant recipients will submit to the Department within 60 days a final report detailing the nature of the questions under study, an explanation of the research design and methods, findings of the research and recommendations for future study.

Bureau of Ride and Measurement Standards

Order

Section 1. Purpose; Authority; Duration.

This Order is a temporary order establishing training and certification requirements and procedures for persons seeking to become certified parking meter inspectors. The Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture has lawful authority to issue a temporary order under Section 4415(b) of the Consolidated Weights and Measures Act (3 Pa.C.S. § 4115(b)).

This Order is effective as of April 25, 2023 and shall remain in effect until April 25, 2024.

Section 2. Definitions.

The following word and terms, when used in this order, have the following meanings, unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

Act—The Consolidated Weights and Measures Act, 3 Pa.C.S. §§ 4101—4194.

Certified parking meter inspector or *CPMI*—An individual who is certified by the Department of Agriculture to inspect and certify the accuracy of parking meters.

Department—The Department of Agriculture of the Commonwealth.

Section 3. Certified parking meter inspector.

(a) *General.* A person may apply to the Department to be designated a certified parking meter inspector (“CPMI”) for purposes of the Act and this order.

(b) *Authority.* A CPMI may inspect and certify the accuracy of parking meters as required by the Act.

(c) *Fees.* A CPMI may charge a fee for inspection and testing services.

Section 4. Certification standards.

A person seeking a CPMI certificate from the Department shall do the following:

(1) Successfully complete an approved training course as described in Section 5 (relating to training courses).

(2) Pass a Department-administered or Department-approved written test by a score of at least 70%.

(3) Possess or have access to field standards and test equipment as necessary to inspect, determine and certify the accuracy of parking meters, as required under the Act.

(4) Comply with the application requirements described in Section 7 (relating to applying for CPMI certification) and other requirements of this order.

(5) Be at least 18 years of age.

Section 5. Training courses.

(a) *Department-administered courses and Department-approved courses.* The Department-administered parking meter certification training course meets the requirements of subsection (b) and is an approved training course. The Department will approve additional parking meter certification training courses that meet the application and course-content requirements of this Section.

(b) *Training course; hours and content.* A Department-approved parking meter certification training course shall consist of a minimum of four (4) hours of instruction, with at least two (2) hours of classroom training and at least two (2) hours of hands-on training. The training course shall cover the following topics:

(1) Basic operation of mechanical and digital parking meters.

(2) Determination and use of appropriate field standards.

(3) Familiarization with documentation requirements.

(4) Inspection and testing procedures.

(5) Noting deficiencies and reporting results.

(c) *Application for approval by Department.* A person seeking the Department’s approval of a parking meter certification training course shall apply in writing to the Department and provide the following:

(1) A course outline.

(2) A description of the subject matter to be addressed in each component of the course, addressing the course topic requirements set forth in subsection (a).

(3) The name and background information of each course instructor, a description of the subject matter to be addressed by that instructor and information to demonstrate the familiarity of the instructor with that subject matter.

(4) A list of the dates, times and locations at which the training course is to be presented.

(5) A copy of the proposed written test, together with a copy of the answer key.

(6) Verification that the person conducting the course shall issue a certificate of completion to any person who successfully completes the course, and shall promptly report the results of the testing required under Section 4, Paragraph (2) (relating to certification standards), above, in writing to the Department.

(7) Such other information as the Department may reasonably require.

(d) *Obtaining the list of current approved training courses.* The Department will provide a current list of approved training courses upon request, and will maintain a copy of the current list on its internet website at www.agriculture.pa.gov.

(e) *Effect of addition of a course to list of courses.* If a training course is added to the list described in subsection (d), a person who has successfully completed that course

within six (6) months preceding the date the Department approved the course will be deemed to have successfully completed an approved training course as described in Section 4, Paragraph 1 (relating to certification standards). That person must also meet the requirements of Section 4, Paragraphs (2), (3), (4) and (5) in order to be designated a CPMI.

Section 6. Audit by Department.

The Department may attend and audit an approved training course to ascertain whether the course is conducted in accordance with the Act and this order. A person offering or conducting an approved training course shall, at least 7 days in advance of conducting the course, mail or deliver to the Department written notification of the date, time and location of the training course. A person offering or conducting an approved training course shall allow the Department's auditors entry to the program and provide copies of course materials.

Section 7. Applying for CPMI certification.

(a) *Application required.* A person who has successfully completed a Department-administered or Department-approved parking meter certification training course may apply to the Department for a CPMI certificate. Certification is granted through issuance of the certificate described in Section 8 (relating to CPMI certificate).

(b) *Form of application.* A person seeking certification under the Act may obtain an application form from the Department using the contact information provided in Section 14 (relating to contacting the Department). The applicant shall complete the form and return it to that same address. The application form shall require the following information:

- (1) The name, mailing address and birth date of the person seeking a certificate.
- (2) The name, location and date of completion of any approved training course completed by the person seeking a certificate.
- (3) A copy of any certificate of completion with respect to the approved training course.
- (4) A detailed description of the equipment the person seeking the CPMI certificate will use in conducting parking meter inspections, including applicable verifications of accuracy, inspection records and other documentation demonstrating the equipment is accurate and in working order.
- (5) The date of the application.
- (6) Other information the Department might reasonably require.

(c) *Departmental action on application.* The Department will, within 30 days of receiving an application, mail the applicant a certificate, a disapproval notice or a request for additional clarification or documentation. If the Department requests additional clarification or documentation, its review and consideration of the application will cease until the requested material is received, from which time the 30-day review period shall begin again.

Section 8. CPMI certificate.

(a) *CPMI certificate.* The Department will provide a CPMI a CPMI certificate.

(b) *Contents of CPMI certificate.* A CPMI certificate will bear the following information:

- (1) The name of the person to whom it is issued.
- (2) The date of issuance.

(3) A unique identification number.

(4) A statement that the Department has determined the person identified on the certificate to be a "CPMI" with respect to parking meters.

(5) Other information the Department might reasonably include.

(c) *Ownership of CPMI certificate.* A CPMI certificate issued by the Department will remain the property of the Department. A CPMI or other person having physical possession of a certified parking meter certificate shall, upon written notice from the Department, surrender and return the certificate to the Department.

(d) *Obligation to produce CPMI certificate for inspection.* A CPMI shall produce the CPMI certificate for inspection upon demand by the Department or any person on whose behalf the CPMI is performing the inspection or test.

Section 9. Expiration of CPMI certificate.

A CPMI certificate will remain valid unless or until five (5) years or more elapse between consecutive parking meter inspections by the CPMI to whom the CPMI certificate is issued, or unless the CPMI certificate is suspended or revoked in accordance with the procedures in Section 12 (relating to suspension or revocation of certification).

Section 10. Obtaining a new CPMI certificate.

(a) *No renewals: new certificate required.* The Department will not renew a CPMI certificate or extend the expiration date of a certificate. A person shall, instead, apply for and obtain a new CPMI certificate in accordance with Section 7 (relating to applying for CPMI certification) to be issued a successor CPMI certificate.

(b) *Training course.* A person who is applying for a CPMI certificate shall have successfully completed a training course as described in Section 5 (relating to training courses) within six (6) months of the date of the application form.

Section 11. Inspection and testing by the Department.

(a) *Random inspection and testing.* The Department may conduct random inspection and testing of parking meters that have been inspected and tested by a CPMI to determine whether the CPMI conducted the inspection and testing in accordance with the Act and this order.

(b) *Inspections generally.* In addition to the random inspection and testing described in subsection (a), the Department may conduct inspection and testing of any parking meter that has been inspected and tested by a CPMI.

(c) *Time lapse affecting results.* In evaluating the inspection and testing performed by the CPMI, the Department will consider any lapse of time between an inspection performed by the Department and the inspection performed by the CPMI.

(d) *Reporting of results.* Within 30 days following a random inspection, the Department will mail the CPMI written notice of the inspection and the results of that inspection.

(e) *Use of results.* The Department may use the results of its inspection and testing to suspend or revoke the certificate of a CPMI in accordance with Section 12 (relating to suspension or revocation of certification), or as the basis for a warning or instruction directed to the CPMI.

Section 12. Suspension or revocation of certification.

(a) *Basis for action.* The Department may suspend or revoke a CPMI certificate if the CPMI does one or more of the following:

- (1) Violates a provision of this order.
- (2) Violates a provision of the Act.
- (3) Intentionally or fraudulently reports inaccurate information on an inspection report form.
- (4) Is found, following inspection and testing by the Department in accordance with Section 11 (relating to inspection and testing by the Department), to have inaccurately, improperly or incompetently performed testing and inspections of parking meters issued.

(b) *Notice.* The Department will provide a CPMI with written notice of its intention to suspend or revoke certification, which will afford the CPMI notice and opportunity for an administrative hearing before the Department prior to the effective date of the suspension or revocation.

(c) *Delivery of notice.* The Department will deliver the notice described in subsection (b) to the affected CPMI by personal service or by regular mail to the address provided by the CPMI on his application for a certificate under Section 7 (relating to applying for CPMI certification), or to the address most recently provided to the Department in writing by the CPMI as the address to which notices should be sent.

Section 13. CPMI list.

(a) *CPMI list to be maintained.* The Department will maintain a current CPMI list containing the following information with respect to each CPMI:

- (1) Name and address.
- (2) Telephone number.
- (3) Fax number (if available).
- (4) The unique identification number of the CPMI's certificate.

(b) *Distribution of copies.* The Department will provide a copy of the current CPMI list upon request.

Maximum Lawful Rate of Interest for Residential Mortgages for the Month of May 2023

The Department of Banking and Securities (Department), under the authority contained in section 301 of the act of January 30, 1974 (P.L. 13, No. 6) (41 P.S. § 301), determines that the maximum lawful rate of interest for residential mortgages for the month of May 2023, is 6 1/4%.

The interest rate limitations under the Commonwealth's usury statute were pre-empted to a great extent by Federal law, the Depository Institutions Deregulation and Monetary Control Act of 1980 (Pub.L. No. 96-221). Further pre-emption was instituted with the signing of Pub.L. No. 96-399, which overrode State interest rate

limitations on any individual who finances the sale or exchange of residential real property which the individual owns and which the individual occupies or has occupied as his principal residence.

Each month the Department is required by State law to compute and announce the ceiling rate on residential mortgages in this Commonwealth. This maximum rate is determined by adding 2.50 percentage points to the yield rate on long-term government bonds as published by the Federal Reserve Board or the United States Treasury, or both. The latest yield rate on long-term government securities is 3.79 to which was added 2.50 percentage points for a total of 6.29 that by law is rounded off to the nearest quarter at 6 1/4%.

A warm start-up shall not exceed 5 hours per start-up per combustion turbine and shall not exceed 9 hours per start-up of all three combustion turbines combined. If a warm startup is aborted (e.g., the turbine trips prior to the end of the startup event), subsequent restarts will still be defined as a warm startup.

(3) A hot start-up shall be defined as an event that occurs after a combustion turbine has not been operating for less than 8 hours. A hot start-up shall not exceed 4 hours per start-up per combustion turbine and shall not exceed 8 hours per start-up of all three combustion turbines combined.

(4) The emissions from start-up or shutdown shall be included in the emissions calculations.

(5) A combustion turbine shutdown begins with the initiation of the shutdown command. A shutdown ends with the termination of fuel injection into the combustion chamber(s). A shutdown of all three turbines shall not last longer than 2 1/2 hours.

(Compliance with the requirements in this streamlined permit condition also assures compliance with the Alternate RACT III requirements in 25 Pa. Code § 129.114(a).)

The Department of Environmental Protection (Department), Coastal Resources Management Program has received notice that the City of Erie and the Erie Sewer Authority (applicant) are proposing to rehabilitate the Mill Creek channel wall (Project).

The applicant is proposing to stabilize the concrete channel walls of Mill Creek which will help to mitigate future hazardous occurrences from happening directly to the water body. The concrete channel walls have been in existence since the 1900s and need maintenance. The applicant projects that if stabilization measures are not taken, hazardous events such as concrete debris falling in

the waterway due to the cracking channel walls could occur. Possible short-term impacts during construction consist of minor, temporary noise and air pollution from construction equipment. The applicant has stated that there is no public access by means of uplands to the Project site since the area is located on privately owned land; therefore, public access will not be restricted. Access to the navigable waterway is not anticipated to be detrimental due to the existing Mill Creek Tube outfall and existing hardened banks. Effects on historic resources from this Project are not anticipated. Recreational fishing will be temporarily disrupted due to the location of the Project work zone. Wetlands are present within the Project area but will be avoided and applicable erosion control measures will be implemented. The Project involves maintenance activities and is temporary in nature. Substantial changes to the site are not proposed. Minimal disturbances due to maintenance activities may occur, but the long-term effects of the proposed Project are expected to be beneficial. The applicant proposes that the Project will maintain existing infrastructure for the community, ensuring that existing services will continue to function as expected for the foreseeable future. The applicant is seeking authorization of the proposed Project from the United States Army Corps of Engineers under section 10 of the Federal Rivers and Harbors Act of 1899 (33 U.S.C.A. § 403). The applicant is seeking coverage for the proposed Project under the Pennsylvania State Programmatic General Permit.

This Project is subject to Department review for Federal consistency because it is an activity requiring a Federal license or permit and will have reasonably foreseeable effects on this Commonwealth's coastal resources or uses.

Proposed State Implementation Plan Revision; Attainment Demonstration for the Indiana, PA Nonattainment Area for the 2010 Sulfur Dioxide National Ambient Air Quality Standard; Public Hearing

The Department of Environmental Protection (Department) is seeking public comment on a proposed State Implementation Plan (SIP) revision which demonstrates how the Indiana nonattainment area (Indiana Area) will attain the 2010 1-hour National Ambient Air Quality Standard (NAAQS) for Sulfur Dioxide (SO₂). Short-term exposure to SO₂ has been linked to adverse respiratory conditions in humans.

On June 22, 2010, the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) promulgated a revised primary NAAQS for SO₂ of 75 parts per billion, which went into effect on August 23, 2010 (75 FR 35520). On August 5, 2013, the EPA designated four areas in this Commonwealth as nonattainment for the 2010 1-hour SO₂ NAAQS, including the Indiana Area (78 FR 47191). The Indiana Area includes all of Indiana County and the municipalities of Plumcreek Township, South Bend Township and Elderton Borough in Armstrong County.

On October 19, 2020 (85 FR 66240), the EPA published a final rulemaking, effective November 18, 2020, approving the Pennsylvania SO₂ attainment plan for the Indiana Area (2020 Final Rule). As a result of litigation challenging the EPA's 2020 Final Rule in *Sierra Club v. EPA*, 3d Cir., Case No. 20-3568, the United States Court of Appeals for the Third Circuit granted the EPA's motion for remand without vacatur and ordered the EPA to take final action no later than August 17, 2022. On March 17, 2022 (87 FR 15166), the EPA reconsidered the October

2020 Final Rule and proposed converting its approval of Pennsylvania's 2010 SO₂ Indiana Area Attainment Plan into a partial approval and partial disapproval (2022 Proposed Rule). On August 18, 2022 (87 FR 50778), the EPA published a final rulemaking partially approving and partially disapproving the Commonwealth's 2010 SO₂ Indiana Area Attainment Plan (2022 Final Rule). The 2022 Final Rule, effective September 19, 2022, retained the EPA's previous approval of the emission inventory and nonattainment New Source Review program requirements and disapproved the dispersion modeling attainment demonstration, RACM/RACT requirements, RFP requirements and contingency measures (87 FR 50779).

The proposed SIP revision addresses the requirements for an approvable SIP revision as set forth in sections 110, 172, 191 and 192 of the Clean Air Act (42 U.S.C.A. §§ 7410, 7502, 7514 and 7514a) and 40 CFR § 51.102 (relating to public hearings), including reasonable further progress toward attainment, installation of reasonably available control measures/technology, dispersion modeling demonstrating attainment in 2023 and contingency measures. After consideration of comments received from the public, the Department will finalize and submit the Indiana, PA SO₂ SIP revision to the EPA for approval and to revise the SIP.

Pennsylvania 4 X 4 Payout Instant Lottery Game 1636

Under the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314) and 61 Pa. Code § 819.203 (relating to notice of instant game rules), the Secretary of Revenue hereby provides public notice of the rules for the following instant lottery game:

1. *Name:* The name of the game is Pennsylvania 4 X 4 Payout (hereafter "4 X 4 Payout"). The game number is PA-1636.

2. *Price:* The price of a 4 X 4 Payout instant lottery game ticket is \$5.

3. *Play symbols:* Each 4 X 4 Payout instant lottery game ticket will contain one play area featuring a "WINNING NUMBERS" area and a "YOUR NUMBERS" area. The play symbols and their captions, located in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area, are: 1 (ONE), 2 (TWO), 3 (THREE), 4 (FOUR), 5 (FIVE), 6 (SIX), 7 (SEVEN), 8

(EIGHT), 9 (NINE), 10 (TEN), 11 (ELEVN), 12 (TWLV), 13 (THRTN), 14 (FORTN), 15 (FIFTN), 16 (SIXTN), 17 (SVNTN), 18 (EGHTN), 19 (NINTN), 20 (TWENT), 21 (TWYONE), 22 (TWYTWO), 23 (TWYTHR), 24 (TWYFOR), 25 (TWYFIV), 26 (TWYSIX), 27 (TWYSVN), 28 (TWYEGT), 29 (TWYNIN) and 30 (THIRT). The play symbols and their captions, located in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area, are: 1 (ONE), 2 (TWO), 3 (THREE), 4 (FOUR), 5 (FIVE), 6 (SIX), 7 (SEVEN), 8 (EIGHT), 9 (NINE), 10 (TEN), 11 (ELEVN), 12 (TWLV), 13 (THRTN), 14 (FORTN), 15 (FIFTN), 16 (SIXTN), 17 (SVNTN), 18 (EGHTN), 19 (NINTN), 20 (TWENT), 21 (TWYONE), 22 (TWYTWO), 23 (TWYTHR), 24 (TWYFOR), 25 (TWYFIV), 26 (TWYSIX), 27 (TWYSVN), 28 (TWYEGT), 29 (TWYNIN), 30 (THIRT), 4X4 (4TIMES) symbol, Key (WINALL) symbol and a Truck (TRUCK) symbol.

4. *Prize symbols:* The prize symbols and their captions, located in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area, are: \$5⁰⁰ (FIV DOL), \$10⁰⁰ (TEN DOL), \$20⁰⁰ (TWENTY), \$40⁰⁰ (FORTY), \$50⁰⁰ (FIFTY), \$100 (ONE HUN), \$200 (TWO HUN), \$400 (FOR HUN), \$1,000 (ONE THO), \$5,000 (FIV THO) and a TRUCK (YOUPICK) symbol.

5. *Prizes:* The prizes that can be won in this game, are: \$5, \$10, \$20, \$40, \$50, \$100, \$200, \$400, \$1,000 and \$5,000. The prize that can be won when a Truck (TRUCK) play symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area is a Truck Prize as described in section 10. A player can win up to 12 times on a ticket.

6. *Second-Chance Drawings:* The Pennsylvania Lottery will conduct one Brake the Bank Second-Chance Drawing for which non-winning 4 X 4 Payout instant lottery game tickets may be eligible as provided for in section 11.

7. *Approximate number of tickets printed for the game:* Approximately 10,800,000 tickets will be printed for the 4 X 4 Payout instant lottery game.

8. *Determination of prize winners:*

(a) Holders of tickets upon which a Truck (TRUCK) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of a TRUCK (YOUPICK) appears in the "prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a Truck Prize as described in section 10.

(b) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$5,000 (FIV THO) appears in the "prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$5,000.

(c) Holders of tickets upon which a Key (WINALL) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of \$1,000 (ONE THO) appears in two of the "prize" areas, a prize symbol of \$400 (FOR HUN) appears in five of the "prize" areas and a prize symbol of \$200 (TWO HUN) appears in five of the "prize" areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$5,000.

(d) Holders of tickets upon which a Key (WINALL) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of \$400 (FOR HUN) appears in nine of the "prize" areas, a prize symbol of \$200 (TWO HUN) appears in two of the "prize" areas and a prize symbol \$1,000 (ONE THO) appears in one of the "prize" areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$5,000.

(e) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$1,000 (ONE THO) appears in the "prize" area under the match-

(TEN DOL) appears in the “prize” area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$10.

(bb) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$5⁰⁰ (FIV DOL) appears in the “prize” area under the match-

ing “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$5.

9. *Number and description of prizes and approximate odds:* The following table sets forth the approximate number of winners, amounts of prizes and approximate odds of winning:

(b) Each Truck Prize winner shall select one prize from the following four available choices:

(1) 2023 FORD F-150 Raptor®: Base model includes standard 3.5L V6 EcoBoost® high-output engine with Auto Start-Stop Technology;

(2) 2023 FORD F-150 Limited®: Base model includes 3.5L PowerBoost Full Hybrid V6 Engine;

(3) 2023 FORD F-150 Lightning® Platinum: Base model includes Dual eMotor—Extended Range Battery; or

(4) The cash value of the prize (“Cash Option”), as described in section 10(d), below.

(c) The amount allocated to the vehicle itself (hereafter “Allocated Amount”) is \$112,657.83. Each Truck Prize will be a 2023 production year model at the time of the claim or may be replaced with a 2024 model if a 2023 model is no longer available. During 2023 model production, the Lottery may factory order a Truck Prize with winner’s specifications up to the Allocated Amount or locate the Truck Prize based on local dealer stock. Once 2023 model production ceases, a Truck Prize will be ordered based on current local dealer stock up to the Allocated Amount.

(d) A Truck Prize winner opting for the Cash Option will receive the cash value of the Truck Prize (\$150,000)

minus required income tax withholding, subject to the provisions of section 10(e)(1), below.

(e) Truck Prize Restrictions:

(1) If the Department of Human Services, pursuant to 23 Pa.C.S.A. § 4308, determines that a winner of the Truck Prize owes certain debts to the Commonwealth as provided in 23 Pa.C.S.A. § 4308 or 72 P.S. § 215, the winner shall be awarded the Cash Option, and the amount of any arrearages shall be deducted from the cash value of the prize. After the delinquent support obligation is met, the winner will receive the remaining prize value, if any, according to Lottery procedure.

(2) In the event a prize described in section 10(b)(1)—(3) is not available, the Lottery may either provide a substitute prize, determined by the Secretary to have an equivalent value to the prize won, or make a cash payment to the winner in an amount determined by the Secretary to have an equivalent value to the prize won.

(3) Each winner, his or her respective heirs, legal representatives and assigns, agrees to indemnify, defend, release and discharge the Pennsylvania Lottery, its employees, officers, directors and commissioners and Ford Motor Company from and against any loss, claim, damage, suit or injury arising out of or relating to this game, acceptance and possession of the Truck Prize or any action taken pursuant to these rules. By entering, the winner indemnifies, releases, discharges and agrees to hold harmless the Pennsylvania Lottery, its employees, officers, directors and commissioners and Ford Motor Company from unanticipated cancellation, suspension or postponement of the promotion due to natural disaster, national emergency or other unforeseen act of God or man.

11. *Second-Chance Drawing:* The Pennsylvania Lottery’s (hereafter, the “Lottery”) Brake the Bank Second-Chance Drawing for qualifying instant lottery game tickets (hereafter, the “Drawing”):

(a) *Qualifying Tickets:* Non-winning PA-1636 4 X 4 Payout (\$5) lottery game tickets are eligible for entry into the Drawing.

(b) *Participation and entry:*

(1) Entrants must have a registered lottery account in order to participate in the Drawing. To create a lottery account, visit <https://www.pailottery.com>. Creating a lottery account is free.

(2) A registered lottery account holder is subject to the iLottery regulations and specifically agrees to be bound by the iLottery terms and conditions located at <https://www.pailottery.com/signup/terms-and-conditions/>, as well as any related policies.

(3) To establish a lottery account, players must provide the following information:

(i) The player’s name as it appears on a valid government-issued identification or tax documents;

(ii) The player’s date of birth;

(iii) The entire or last four digits of the player’s Social Security Number, or comparable equivalent;

(iv) The player’s address;

(v) The player’s telephone number;

(vi) The player’s email address;

(vii) Any other information established by the Lottery to be necessary to verify the age and identity of the player.

(4) An individual may be required to provide additional information or documentation, as set forth in the iLottery terms and conditions, to establish a lottery account or register for iLottery. The information may be used for iLottery registration or to confirm information provided by that individual during the registration process.

(5) To enter the Drawing, entrants must submit the identifying information from at least one Qualifying Ticket via the Drawing’s promotional web site, available at <https://www.palottery.com>, or the Lottery’s official mobile application during the entry period. The identifying information from a Qualifying Ticket may be submitted only once in the Drawing. Entries will automatically be awarded at the time of successful submission of a Qualifying Ticket. No other method of submission will be accepted, and entries submitted using any other method, including entries mailed or hand-delivered to the Pennsylvania Lottery, are not valid and will be disqualified.

(6) Each entry must be complete and the information supplied by the entrant must be accurate. Incomplete entries cannot be accepted.

(7) Only one claimant per entry is allowed.

(8) Entrants must be 18 years of age or older.

(9) Players may submit the identifying information from an unlimited number of Qualifying Tickets in the Drawing.

(10) Once an entry has been submitted it cannot be withdrawn or changed.

(c) *Drawing description:*

(1) The Lottery will conduct one Brake the Bank Second-Chance Drawing for qualifying instant lottery game tickets. All time references are Eastern Prevailing Time.

(2) All entries received after 11:59:59 p.m. April 16, 2023, through 11:59:59 p.m. June 1, 2023, will be entered into the Drawing tentatively scheduled to be held between June 5, 2023 and June 16, 2023.

(3) The entry period for the Drawing will be posted to the Pennsylvania Lottery’s publicly accessible web site.

(4) When a Qualifying Ticket is entered into the Drawing, the entry has a chance to be multiplied by four (hereafter the “Entry Multiplier Prize”). Each Qualifying Ticket will have a predetermined ticket file assigned at the time the ticket is printed that will determine whether an entry will be multiplied. If an entry is multiplied, the entrant will be notified during the entry process.

(5) The number of entries an entrant will receive for the Drawing is determined by the purchase price of the Qualifying Ticket entered and the Entry Multiplier Prize, if applicable. The respective purchase price and corresponding number of entries for the Qualifying Ticket is as follows: PA-1636 4 X 4 Payout (\$5) = five entries.

(6) Players may review prizes won and their entries for the Drawing via the Drawing’s promotional web site.

(d) *Prizes available to be won, determination of winners and odds of winning:*

(1) The prize entitlements described below are subject to all restrictions and limitations described in section 11(e), or those mentioned anywhere else in these rules.

(2) The following table sets forth the approximate number of Entry Multiplier Prizes and the approximate odds of winning an Entry Multiplier Prize:

(3) Lottery will conduct one Drawing from among all the entries received during the entry period as described in section 11(c)(2).

(i) The first entry selected in the Drawing will be a winning entry and the entrant who submitted that winning entry shall be entitled to a prize of \$50,000, less required income tax withholding.

(ii) The second through the eleventh entries selected in the Drawing will be winning entries and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$5,000.

(iii) The twelfth through the sixty-first entries selected in the Drawing will be winning entries and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$100 iLottery Bonus Money.

(4) All prizes will be paid as a lump-sum cash payment or uploaded to a winning player’s lottery account.

(5) Winners of iLottery Bonus Money are not required to claim a prize. Winners of iLottery Bonus Money will have the iLottery Bonus Money credited to their lottery account and will receive an email notifying them that they won a prize.

(6) The number of winning entries to be selected for the Drawing will be posted to the Pennsylvania Lottery's publicly accessible web site.

(7) The odds of winning in the Drawing depend upon the number of entries received for the Drawing.

(8) A computer-generated randomizer will be used to select the Drawing winners.

(e) *Drawing restrictions:*

(1) To be eligible to participate in the Drawing, entrants must have complied with the requirements of these rules.

(2) The Lottery is not responsible for late, lost or misdirected entries not entered into the Drawing. The Lottery is not responsible for entries that are not entered into the Drawing because of incompatible internet browsers, mobile Lottery application failure or other technical issues. The Lottery is not responsible for entries not entered due to delays in creating a lottery account or the inability to create a lottery account. If a Drawing entry is selected as a winner and rejected or otherwise disqualified during or following the Drawing, the Lottery will select one entry to replace the rejected or otherwise disqualified entry in accordance with these rules and Lottery procedure.

(3) If any discrepancy exists between these rules and any material describing the Drawing, these rules shall govern.

(4) Employees of the Pennsylvania Lottery, 9Roof tops Marketing, LLC (formerly known as MARC USA, LLC), MUSL, Scientific Games International, Inc., MDI Entertainment, LLC, and their subcontractors, or a spouse, child, brother, sister or parent residing as a member of the same household in the principal place of residence of any such person are not eligible to participate in the Drawing. Offer void where prohibited or restricted.

(5) The Pennsylvania Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to cancel or suspend the Drawing and change these rules if the Drawing cannot be conducted as planned due to errors in these rules or advertising, unauthorized intervention, tampering, fraud, technical errors, viruses, worms, bugs or any other cause that, in the Pennsylvania Lottery's sole judgment, could corrupt or impair the administration, security, fairness, integrity or proper conduct of the Drawing.

(6) All entries shall be subject to verification by the Pennsylvania Lottery.

(7) The Pennsylvania Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to disqualify an entrant found to be tampering with the operation of the Drawing or to be acting in violation of these rules or applicable law.

(8) The Drawing is governed by the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Applicable laws and regulations apply.

(9) Prizes must be claimed within 1 year of the drawing date of the Drawing in which the prize was won. If no claim is made within 1 year of the drawing date of the Drawing in which the prize was won, the right of an entrant to claim the prize won, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided by statute.

(10) Final determination of winners will be made by the Secretary, whose judgment will be final and binding.

(11) A prize awarded in the Drawing to a person who dies before receiving the prize shall be paid according to 61 Pa. Code § 811.16 (relating to prizes payable after death of a prize winner).

(12) A winner is responsible for all taxes arising from or in connection with any prize won.

(13) A player may only win the prize for which the player is first selected in the Drawing. Subsequent entries, from the same individual, selected in the same Drawing will be disqualified and one replacement entry will be selected.

(14) Winners of iLottery Bonus Money must abide by the iLottery Terms & Conditions, the iLottery Bonus Policy and these rules. iLottery Bonus Money will expire 90 days from the date on which the winner was notified, via email, of the prize win, as further detailed in section 11(d)(5). iLottery Bonus Money has a five times play through requirement in order to convert the iLottery Bonus Money into cash. For example, for a player winning \$100 of iLottery Bonus Money, the player is required to place \$500 in wagers before the iLottery Bonus Money awarded is converted into cash which may be withdrawn from the player's account.

(15) Prizes are not transferrable.

(16) Other restrictions may apply.

12. *Retailer incentive awards:* The Lottery may conduct a separate Retailer Incentive Program for retailers who sell 4 X 4 Payout instant lottery game tickets.

13. *Retailer bonus:* The Lottery may offer a retailer bonus in connection with the sale of Pennsylvania instant lottery game tickets. If a retailer bonus is offered, a Lottery retailer shall be eligible for a bonus as described in this section. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$100,000 and not exceeding \$500,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$500. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$1,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$5,000. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$1,000,001 and not exceeding \$10,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$10,000. A Lottery retailer is entitled only to the largest bonus for which they qualify on a winning ticket. A bonus will be initiated for payment after the instant ticket is claimed and validated. A bonus will not be awarded to a Lottery retailer that sells a non-winning Pennsylvania Lottery instant ticket used to enter a Pennsylvania Lottery second-chance drawing or promotion that is subsequently selected to win a prize.

14. *Unclaimed prize money:* For a period of 1 year from the announced close of 4 X 4 Payout, prize money from winning 4 X 4 Payout instant lottery game tickets will be retained by the Secretary for payment to the persons entitled thereto. If no claim is made within 1 year of the announced close of the 4 x 4 Payout instant lottery game, the right of a ticket holder to claim the prize represented by the ticket, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided for by statute.

15. *Governing law:* In purchasing a ticket, the customer agrees to comply with and abide by the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314), 61 Pa. Code Part V (relating to State Lotteries) and the provisions contained in this notice.

16. *Termination of the game:* The Secretary may announce a termination date, after which no further tickets

Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$500,001 and not exceeding \$1,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$5,000. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$1,000,001 and not exceeding \$10,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$10,000. A Lottery retailer is entitled only to the largest bonus for which they qualify on a winning ticket. A bonus will be initiated for payment after the instant ticket is claimed and validated. A bonus will not be awarded to a Lottery retailer that sells a non-winning Pennsylvania Lottery instant ticket used to enter a Pennsylvania Lottery second-chance drawing or promotion that is subsequently selected to win a prize.

A bonus will not be awarded to a Lottery retailer that sells a non-winning Pennsylvania Lottery instant ticket used to enter a Pennsylvania Lottery second-chance drawing or promotion that is subsequently selected to win a prize.

11. *Unclaimed prize money:* For a period of 1 year from the announced close of King of Dads, prize money from winning King of Dads instant lottery game tickets will be retained by the Secretary for payment to the persons entitled thereto. Lake Erie Commercial Fishing—2023

The Executive Director of the Fish and Boat Commission (Commission), acting under the authority of 58 Pa. Code § 69.31(b) (relating to seasons), has determined that the 2023 total allowable commercial catch for walleye from the Commonwealth waters of Lake Erie is 4,000 pounds. The commercial fishing season for walleye on Lake Erie is January 1 to March 14 and 12:01 a.m. the first Saturday in May to December 31. This season shall end when the Executive Director determines that 4,000 pounds of walleye probably have been taken by commercial fishing interests fishing in the Commonwealth waters of Lake Erie.

The Executive Director of the Commission, acting under the authority of 58 Pa. Code § 69.31(c), has established that the 2023 total allowable commercial catch for yellow perch from the Commonwealth waters of Lake Erie is 100,000 pounds. The commercial fishing season for yellow perch on Lake Erie is January 1 until the date the Executive Director determines that 100,000 pounds of yellow perch probably have been taken by commercial fishing interests fishing in the Commonwealth waters of Lake Erie.

Lake Erie Creel Limits for Walleye and Yellow Perch—2023

The Executive Director of the Fish and Boat Commission, acting under the authority of 58 Pa.
