## Community Conservation Partnerships Program Grants Available

The Department of Conservation and Natural Resources (Department) announces that applications are now being accepted for the 2023 round of Community Conservation Partnerships Program Grants. These grants are administered by the Bureau of Recreation and Conservation (Bureau).

The open application period will begin Tuesday, January 17, 2023, and will end at 4 p.m. on Wednesday, April 5, 2023. Depending on the funding source, eligible applicants include municipalities and appropriate nonprofit organizations in this Commonwealth.

Applications must be submitted electronically through the Department's Grants portal at https://apps.dcnr.pa. gov/grants. Papers, faxed or e-mailed applications will not be accepted. Grant information, project guidance documents, program policies, applications and instructions are available at the Department's Grants portal.

Grant assistance from the Department helps communities and organizations in this Commonwealth plan, acquire and develop recreation, park, and trail facilities, and conserve open space.

The Bureau administers the Community Conservation Partnerships Program, which combines several Federal and State funding sources including the Keystone Recreation, Park and Conservation Fund, Environmental Stewardship Fund, Snowmobile Restricted Account, All-Terrain Vehicle Restricted Account, Heritage and Other Parks Fund, Pennsylvania Recreation Trails Program and the Land and Water Conservation Fund.

The Statewide Comprehensive Outdoor Recreation Plan 2020—2024 at https://www.dcnr.pa.gov/Recreation/ PAOutdoorRecPlan identifies the Commonwealth's outdoor recreation priorities. Projects will be selected, in part, on how they align to these priorities. These priorities include:

*Community parks and recreation*: Priority projects in this category include projects that help rehabilitate existing parks and those that improve access for all.

Land conservation: Priority projects in this category include land conservation projects that protect critical habitat, climate resilient lands, forested watersheds, wetlands and riparian corridors or create critical connections between public or conservation lands.

Watershed restoration/rivers implementation: Priority projects in this category include projects that enhance public access to this Commonwealth's waterways, improve this Commonwealth's watersheds and increase planting community trees and riparian forest buffers.

*Trails*: Priority projects in this category include projects that close priority trail gaps and implement the 2020—2024 Pennsylvania Land and Water Trail Network Strategic Plan, available online at http://elibrary.dcnr.pa.gov/GetDocument?docId=3176020&DocName=dcnr\_20030875.pdf.

The applications and NOIs concern, but are not limited to, effluent discharges from sewage treatment facilities and industrial facilities to surface waters or groundwater; stormwater discharges associated with industrial activity (industrial stormwater), construction activity (construction stormwater), and municipal separate storm sewer systems (MS4s); the application of pesticides; the operation of Concentrated Animal Feeding Operations (CAFOs); and the construction of sewage, industrial waste, and manure storage, collection and treatment facilities. This notice is provided in accordance with 25 Pa. Code Chapters 91 and 92a and 40 CFR Part 122, implementing The Clean Streams Law (35 P.S. §§ 691.1—691.1001) and the Federal Clean Water Act (33 U.S.C.A. §§ 1251—1376). The period for comment may be extended at the discretion of DEP for one additional 15-day period. Additional information, including links to draft permits and fact sheets that explain the basis for DEP's tentative determinations may be reviewed by generating the "Applications Received with Comment Periods Report" on DEP's website at www.dep.pa.gov/CWPublicNotice. Notification of 15-day extensions for comment will be provided in the "Applications Received with Comment Periods Report" (Comments column).

Section III provides notice of applications and draft individual permits for stormwater discharges associated with construction activities. Where indicated, DEP has made tentative determinations, based on preliminary review, to issue permits subject to proposed effluent limitations consisting of best management practices identified in the erosion and sediment control (E&S) plans and post-construction stormwater management (PCSM) plans submitted with the applications, as well as other terms and conditions based on the permit applications. A 30-day public comment period applies to these applications.

Applications, NOIs and draft permits, where applicable, may be reviewed at the DEP office that received the application or NOI. Members of the public are encouraged to use DEP's website to obtain additional information as discussed previously.

Comments received within the appropriate comment periods for WQM and NPDES permit applications will be retained by DEP and considered in the final determinations regarding the applications. ## Acknowledgment of Notice(s) of Intent to Remediate Submitted Under the Land Recycling and Environmental Remediation Standards Act (35 P.S. §§ 6026.101-6026.908).

Sections 302-305 of the Land Recycling and Environmental Remediation Standards Act (Act) require the Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) to publish in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* an acknowledgment noting receipt of any Notices of Intent (NOI) to Remediate. Furthermore, an individual shall not be subject to citizen suits or other contribution actions brought by responsible individuals not participating in the remediation.

Under Sections 304(n)(1)(ii) and 305(c)(2) of the Act, there is a 30-day public and municipal comment period for sites proposed for remediation using a site-specific standard, in whole or in part, and for sites remediated as a special industrial area. This period begins when a summary of the NOI to Remediate is published in a newspaper of general circulation in the area of the site. For the following identified site(s), proposed for remediation to a site-specific standard or as a special industrial area, the municipality, within which the site is located, may request to be involved in the development of the remediation and reuse plans for the site if the request is made within 30-days of the following specified date. During this comment period the municipality may request that the following identified individual, as the remediator of the site, develop and implement a public involvement plan. ## PLAN APPROVAL AND OPERATING PERMIT APPLICATIONS

The Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) has developed an integrated plan approval, State Operat-

## MINING ACTIVITY NPDES DRAFT PERMITS

## Payments to Nonpublic and County Nursing Facilities; Final Rates for State Fiscal Year 2022-2023

This notice announces the Department of Human Services (Department) final annual case-mix per diem pay-

ment rates for State Fiscal Year (FY) 2022-2023 for nonpublic and county nursing facilities that participate in the Medical Assistance (MA) Program.

## Nonpublic Nursing Facility Per Diem Rates

As required by the case-mix payment methodology in 55 Pa. Code Chapter 1187, Subchapter G (relating to rate setting), the Department sets an annual MA per diem rate for each nonpublic nursing facility provider. Each facility's annual per diem rate is comprised of four components: resident care; other resident related; administrative; and capital. For each quarter of FY 2022-2023, the Department will adjust the resident care component of each facility's rate by multiplying the resident care component by the facility's MA case-mix index for the appropriate picture date.

The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) approved State Plan Amendment (SPA) 22-0023 on November 23, 2022, which includes the budget adjustment factor (BAF) formula the Department will use for nonpublic nursing facilities in FY 2022-2023. SPA 22-0023 provides that the BAF will limit the estimated Statewide day-weighted average payment rate for MA nursing facility services for county and nonpublic nursing facilities so that the average payment rate in effect for the fiscal year is limited to the amount permitted by the funds appropriated by the General Appropriations Act for the fiscal year. The act of July 11, 2022 (P.L. 540, No. 54) (Act 54), among other things, provided a 17.5% rate increase beginning January 1, 2023. For FY 2022-2023, the Department will calculate a BAF for nonpublic nursing facilities for each rate quarter. The formula the Department uses to determine the quarterly BAF equals the annual target rate divided by the weighted average quarterly rate at 100%. If the quarterly BAF as calculated is greater than 1.0, the quarterly BAF will equal 1.0. The quarterly BAF for each calendar quarter will be in the rate file that will be posted on the Department's web site.

### County Nursing Facility Per Diem Rates

As required by the rate methodology in 55 Pa. Code Chapter 1189, Subchapter D (relating to rate setting), the Department sets an annual MA per diem rate for each county nursing facility provider. As specified in 55 Pa. Code § 1189.91(b) (relating to per diem rates for county nursing facilities), for each rate year beginning on or after July 1, 2007, the per diem rate paid to a county nursing facility for a rate year will be the facility's prior rate year per diem multiplied by a BAF.

In addition, as required by 55 Pa. Code § 1189.91(d), the Department used the formula set forth in the Commonwealth's approved State Plan to determine the BAF for county nursing facilities. CMS approved SPA 22-0024 on November 23, 2022, which includes the BAF formula the Department used for county nursing facilities in FY 2022-2023.

SPA 22-0024 provides that for rate setting year 2022-2023, the BAF shall limit the estimated Statewide dayweighted average payment rate for MA nursing facility services for county and nonpublic nursing facilities so that the average payment rate is limited to the amount permitted by the funds appropriated by the General Appropriations Act. Act 54, among other things, provided a 17.5% rate increase beginning January 1, 2023. The BAF as it applies to county nursing facilities is 1.0.

The final annual per diem rates for FY 2022-2023 rate year are available on the Department's web site at

https://www.dhs.pa.gov/providers/Providers/Pages/Rates-Nursing%20Facilites.aspx and at local county assistance offices throughout this Commonwealth.

### Public Process

The Department published the notice Payment for Nursing Facility Services Provided by County and Nonpublic Nursing Facilities; Notice of Change in Methods and Standards of Setting Payment Rates; Budget Adjustment Factor at 52 Pa.B. 3637 (June 25, 2022) announcing the use of the BAF formula for county and nonpublic nursing facilities. The Department also published a second notice, Payments to Nonpublic and County Nursing Facilities; Proposed Rates for State Fiscal Year 2022-2023, at 52 Pa.B. 3639 (June 25, 2022) announcing the proposed annual per diem rates for nonpublic and county nursing facilities for FY 2022-2023. Both notices invited public comments. No public comments were received.

## Appeals

Following publication of this notice, the Department will send rate letters to each MA nursing facility to notify the facilities of their final rates for FY 2022-2023. The rate letter will also advise each facility that it may file an administrative appeal if the facility believes that the Department made any errors or otherwise disagrees with its final rates for FY 2022-2023. A provider's appeal must be in writing and filed with the Department's Bureau of Hearings and Appeals, 2330 Vartan Way, Second Floor, Harrisburg, PA 17110-9721, within 33 days of the date of the Department's letter notifying the facility of its final rates. Facilities should refer to 67 Pa.C.S. Chapter 11 (relating to Medical Assistance hearings and appeals), and to the Department's regulations in 55 Pa. Code Chapter 41 (relating to Medical Assistance provider appeal procedures), for more detail regarding their appeal rights and the requirements related to written appeals.

### Fiscal Impact

For FY 2022-2023, the change in payment rates will result in an estimated increased cost of \$25.335 million (\$10.590 million in State funds) for per diem rate payments to nonpublic nursing facilities and an estimated increased cost of \$2.084 million (\$0.871 million in State funds) for per diem rate payments for county nursing facilities.

## Peer Groups, Peer Group Medians and Peer Group Prices for Nonpublic Nursing Facilities Including Hospital-Based Nursing Facilities and Special Rehabilitation Facilities for Fiscal Year 2022-2023

The purpose of this notice is to announce the Department of Human Services' (Department) peer groups, peer group medians and peer group prices for nonpublic nursing facilities including hospital-based nursing facilities and special rehabilitation facilities (SRF) codified in 55 Pa. Code Chapter 1187, Appendix B (relating to medians and prices for 2021-2022) under 55 Pa. Code § 1187.95(a)(4) (relating to general principles for rate and price setting). The Department used the peer groups, peer group medians and peer group prices to determine casemix rates for nonpublic nursing facilities for State Fiscal Year (FY) July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2023. The Department calculated the peer groups, peer group medians and peer group prices announced in this notice in accordance with 55 Pa. Code Chapter 1187 (relating to nursing facility services). The data that the Department used to determine the peer group medians and prices is available on the Department's web site at http:// www.dhs.pa.gov/providers/Providers/Pages/Long-Term-Nursing-Facilities.aspx.

To establish the database for the calculation of peer group medians and prices, the Department used each nursing facility's three most recent audited cost reports that were issued by the Department on or before March 31, 2022, and indexed the costs for each report forward to the common date of December 31, 2022, using the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services' Nursing Home Without Capital Market Basket Index. The following is a listing, by group, of the number of nursing facilities with a particular year-end and the inflation factor used to roll the costs of each facility forward to the common date of December 31, 2022.

After the database was inflated using the inflation values, the Department grouped the facilities in the correct geographic and bed size groupings. In accordance with 55 Pa. Code § 1187.94 (relating to peer grouping for price setting), to establish peer groups, the Department used the Metropolitan Statistical Areas (MSA) group classification published in the Federal Office of Management and Budget Bulletin No. 99-04, regarding revised statistical definitions of Metropolitan Areas and guidance on uses of Metropolitan Area definitions, to classify each nursing facility into one of three MSA groups or one non-MSA group. The Department then used the bed complement of the nursing facility on the final day of the reporting period of the most recent audited MA-11 used in the Nursing Information System database to classify nursing facilities into one of three bed complement groups. These groups are 3-119 beds, 120-269 beds, and 270 beds and over. Peer groups 7 and 10 have been collapsed in accordance with 55 Pa. Code § 1187.94(1)(iv). Peer group 13 is designated for SRFs only and peer group 14 is designated for hospital-based nursing facilities only, regardless of geographic location or bed-size.

After the database was established and the peer groups determined, the Department calculated the medians and prices for each peer group. For peer group 13, the Department arrayed the SRFs classified on or before July 1, 2000, to set the peer group median and prices for those facilities. The Department arrayed any SRFs classified after July 1, 2000, with all other SRFs to set their peer group medians and prices.

To calculate the resident care cost medians, the Department divided the inflated audited allowable resident care costs for each cost report by the total facility case-mix index from the available February 1 picture date closest to the midpoint of the cost report period to obtain case-mix neutral total resident care cost for the cost report year. The Department then divided the case-mix neutral total resident care cost for each cost report by the total audited actual resident days for the cost report year to obtain the case-mix neutral resident care cost per diem for the cost report year. The Department calculated the 3-year arithmetic mean of the case-mix neutral resident care cost per diem for each nursing facility to obtain the average case-mix neutral resident care cost per diem of each facility. The Department arrayed the average casemix neutral resident care cost per diem for each nursing facility within the respective peer groups and determined a median for each peer group.

To calculate the other resident related cost medians, the Department first divided the inflated audited allowable other resident related costs for each cost report by the total audited actual resident days for the cost report year to obtain the other resident related cost per diem for the cost report year. The Department calculated the 3-year arithmetic mean of the other resident related cost for each nursing facility to obtain the average other resident related cost per diem of each facility. The Department arrayed the average other resident related cost per diem for each nursing facility within the respective peer groups and determined a median for each peer group.

To calculate the administrative cost medians, the Department adjusted, as appropriate, the total audited actual resident days for each cost report to a minimum 90% occupancy in accordance with 55 Pa. Code § 1187.23 (relating to nursing facility incentives and adjustments). The Department then divided the inflated audited allowable administrative cost for each cost report by the total audited actual resident days, adjusted to 90% occupancy, if applicable, to obtain the administrative cost per diem for the cost report year. The Department calculated the 3-year arithmetic mean of the administrative cost for each nursing facility to obtain the average administrative cost per diem of each facility. The Department arrayed the average administrative cost per diem for each nursing facility within the respective peer groups to determine a median for each peer group.

After the medians were determined for each peer group, the Department set prices using the medians. To set peer group prices, the Department multiplied the resident care cost median of each peer group by 1.17 to obtain the resident care cost peer group price; multiplied the other resident related cost median of each peer group by 1.12 to obtain the other resident related peer group price; and multiplied the administrative cost median of each peer group by 1.04 to obtain the administrative cost peer group price.

The peer groups, peer group medians and peer group prices for nonpublic nursing facilities including hospitalbased and SRFs are in the list of Medians and Prices for 2022-2023.

A Medical Assistance nursing facility provider may file an administrative appeal if the facility believes that the Department made any errors, or the provider otherwise disagrees with the peer group prices that the Department established for its peer group. A provider's appeal must be in writing and filed with the Department's Bureau of Hearings and Appeals, 2330 Vartan Way, Second Floor, Harrisburg, PA 17110-9721, within 30 days of the date of this notice. If a provider chooses to appeal, the provider will be afforded the opportunity for a de novo hearing before the Bureau of Hearings and Appeals. The peer group prices applied in setting the facility's rates may be changed as a result of the final adjudication of the facility's peer group price appeal. Facilities should refer to 67 Pa.C.S. Chapter 11 (relating to Medical Assistance hearings and appeals), and to the Department's regulations in 55 Pa. Code Chapter 41 (relating to Medical Assistance provider appeal procedures), for more detail regarding their appeal rights and the requirements related to their written appeals.

(b) Holders of tickets upon which a Clover (CLOVER) symbol appears in any "PATCH" and a prize symbol of \$300 (THR HUN) appears in the "prize" area for that "PATCH," on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$300.

(c) Holders of tickets upon which a Clover (CLOVER) symbol appears in any "PATCH" and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in the "prize" area for that "PATCH," on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.

(d) Holders of tickets upon which two matching play symbols appear in the same "PATCH" and a prize symbol of  $40^{.00}$  (FORTY) appears in the "prize" area for that "PATCH," on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$45.

(e) Holders of tickets upon which a Clover (CLOVER) symbol appears in any "PATCH" and a prize symbol of  $40^{00}$  (FORTY) appears in the "prize" area for that "PATCH," on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of 40.

(f) Holders of tickets upon which two matching play symbols appear in the same "PATCH" and a prize symbol of  $30^{.00}$  (THIRTY) appears in the "prize" area for that "PATCH," on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of 35.

(g) Holders of tickets upon which a Clover (CLOVER) symbol appears in any "PATCH" and a prize symbol of  $330^{.00}$  (THIRTY) appears in the "prize" area for that "PATCH," on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of 330.

(h) Holders of tickets upon which two matching play symbols appear in the same "PATCH" and a prize symbol of \$20<sup>.00</sup> (TWENTY) appears in the "prize" area for that "PATCH," on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$25.

(i) Holders of tickets upon which a Clover (CLOVER) symbol appears in any "PATCH" and a prize symbol of \$20<sup>.00</sup> (TWENTY) appears in the "prize" area for that "PATCH," on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$20.

(j) Holders of tickets upon which two matching play symbols appear in the same "PATCH" and a prize symbol of  $10^{-00}$  (TEN DOL) appears in the "prize" area for that "PATCH," on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$15.

(k) Holders of tickets upon which a Clover (CLOVER) symbol appears in any "PATCH" and a prize symbol of  $10^{00}$  (TEN DOL) appears in the "prize" area for that "PATCH," on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$10.

(l) Holders of tickets upon which two matching play symbols appear in the same "PATCH" and a prize symbol of  $5^{.00}$  (FIV DOL) appears in the "prize" area for that "PATCH," on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$10.

(m) Holders of tickets upon which two matching play symbols appear in the same "PATCH" and a prize symbol of  $2^{00}$  (TWO DOL) appears in the "prize" area for that "PATCH," on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of 7.

(n) Holders of tickets upon which two matching play symbols appear in the same "PATCH" and a prize symbol of 1.00 (ONE DOL) appears in the "prize" area for that "PATCH," on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$6.

(o) Holders of tickets upon which a Clover (CLOVER) symbol appears in any "PATCH" and a prize symbol of  $$5^{.00}$  (FIV DOL) appears in the "prize" area for that "PATCH," on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$5.

(p) Holders of tickets upon which a Clover (CLOVER) symbol appears in any "PATCH" and a prize symbol of  $$2^{.00}$  (TWO DOL) appears in the "prize" area for that "PATCH," on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$2.

(q) Holders of tickets upon which a Clover (CLOVER) symbol appears in any "PATCH" and a prize symbol of  $$1^{.00}$  (ONE DOL) appears in the "prize" area for that "PATCH," on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1.

(r) Holders of tickets upon which a Clover (CLOVER) symbol appears in any "PATCH" and a prize symbol of FREE (TICKET) appears in the "prize" area for that "PATCH," on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of one Clover Patch Match instant game ticket or one Pennsylvania Lottery instant game ticket of equivalent sale price which is currently on sale.

9. Number and description of prizes and approximate odds: The following table sets forth the approximate number of winners, amounts of prizes and approximate odds of winning:

(a) *Qualifying Tickets*: Non-winning PA-1623 Under the Rainbow (\$5), PA-1624 Leprechaun's Gold (\$2) and PA-1625 Clover Patch Match (\$1) lottery game tickets are eligible for entry into the Drawing.

(b) *Participation and entry*:

(1) Entrants must have registered lottery account in order to participate in the Drawing. To create a lottery account, visit https://www.pailottery.com. Creating a lottery account is free.

(2) A registered lottery account holder is subject to the iLottery regulations and specifically agrees to be bound by the iLottery terms and conditions located at https://www.pailottery.com/signup/terms-and-conditions/, as well as any related policies.

(3) To establish a lottery account, players must provide the following information:

(iii) The entire or last four digits of the player's Social Security Number, or comparable equivalent;

(iv) The player's address;

(v) The player's telephone number;

(vi) The player's email address;

(vii) Any other information established by the Lottery to be necessary to verify the age and identity of the player.

(4) An individual may be required to provide additional information or documentation, as set forth in the iLottery terms and conditions, to establish a lottery account or register for iLottery. The information may be used for iLottery registration or to confirm information provided by that individual during the registration process.

(5) To enter the Drawing, entrants must submit the identifying information from at least one Qualifying Ticket via the Drawing's promotional web site, available at https://www.palottery.com, or the Pennsylvania Lottery's official mobile application, during the entry period. The identifying information from a Qualifying Ticket may be submitted only once in the Drawing. Entries will automatically be awarded at the time of successful submission of a Qualifying Ticket. No other method of

submission will be accepted. Entries submitted using any other method, including entries mailed or hand-delivered to the Pennsylvania Lottery, are not valid and will be disqualified.

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(6) Each entry must be complete and the information supplied by the entrant must be accurate. Incomplete entries cannot be submitted.

(7) Only one claimant per entry allowed.

(8) Entrants must be 18 years of age or older.

(9) Players may submit the identifying information from an unlimited number of Qualifying Tickets in the Drawing.

(10) Once an entry has been submitted it cannot be withdrawn or changed.

(c) Drawing description:

(1) The Lottery will conduct one In the Clover Second-Chance Drawing for qualifying instant lottery game tickets. All time references are Eastern Prevailing Time.

(2) All entries received after 11:59:59 p.m. January 22, 2023, through 11:59:59 p.m. March 23, 2023, will be entered into the Drawing tentatively scheduled to be held between March 27, 2023 and April 7, 2023.

(3) The entry period for the Drawing will be posted to the Pennsylvania Lottery's publicly accessible web site.

(4) The number of entries an entrant will receive for the Drawing is determined by the purchase price of the Qualifying Ticket entered. The respective purchase price and corresponding number of entries for the Qualifying Ticket is as follows: PA-1623 Under the Rainbow (\$5) = five entries, PA-1624 Leprechaun's Gold (\$2) = two entries and PA-1625 Clover Patch Match (\$1) = one entry.

(5) Players may review prizes won and their entries for the Drawing via the Drawing's promotional web site.

(d) Prizes available to be won, determination of winners and odds of winning:

(1) The prize entitlements described below are subject to all restrictions and limitations described in section 10(e), or those mentioned anywhere else in these rules.

(2) Lottery will conduct one Drawing from among all the entries received during the entry period as described in section 10(c)(2).

(i) The first through the fourth entries selected in the Drawing will be winning entries and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$17,000, less required income tax withholding.

(ii) The fifth through the eleventh entries selected in the Drawing will be winning entries and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$3,000.

(iii) The twelfth through the twenty-fourth entries selected in the Drawing will be winning entries and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$1,700.

(iv) The twenty-fifth through the seventy-fourth entries selected in the Drawing will be winning entries and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$100 iLottery Bonus Money.

(3) All prizes will be paid as a lump-sum cash payment or uploaded to a winning player's lottery account.

(4) Winners of iLottery Bonus Money are not required to claim a prize. Winners of iLottery Bonus Money will have the iLottery Bonus Money credited to their lottery account and will receive an email notifying them that they won a prize.

(2) The Lottery is not responsible for late, lost or misdirected entries not entered into the Drawing. The Lottery is not responsible for entries that are not entered into the Drawing because of incompatible internet browsers, mobile Lottery application failure or other technical issues. The Lottery is not responsible for entries not entered due to delays in creating a lottery account or the inability to create a lottery account. If a Drawing entry is selected as a winner and rejected or otherwise disqualified during or following the Drawing, the Lottery will select another entry to replace the rejected or otherwise disqualified entry in accordance with these rules and Lottery procedure.

(3) If any discrepancy exists between these rules and any material describing the Drawing, these rules shall govern.

(4) Employees of the Pennsylvania Lottery, 9Rooftops Marketing, LLC (formerly known as MARC USA, LLC), MUSL, Scientific Games International, Inc., MDI Entertainment, LLC, and their subcontractors, or a spouse, child, brother, sister or parent residing as a member of the same household in the principal place of residence of any such person are not eligible to participate in the Drawing. Offer void where prohibited or restricted.

(5) The Pennsylvania Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to cancel or suspend the Drawing and change these rules if the Drawing cannot be conducted as planned due to errors in these rules or advertising, unauthorized intervention, tampering, fraud, technical errors, viruses, worms, bugs or any other cause that, in the Pennsylvania Lottery's sole judgment, could corrupt or impair the administration, security, fairness, integrity or proper conduct of the Drawing. (6) All entries shall be subject to verification by the Pennsylvania Lottery.

(7) The Pennsylvania Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to disqualify an entrant found to be tampering with the operation of the Drawing or to be acting in violation of these rules or applicable law.

(8) The Drawing is governed by the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Applicable laws and regulations apply.

(9) Prizes must be claimed within 1 year of the drawing date of the Drawing in which the prize was won. If no claim is made within 1 year of the drawing date of the Drawing in which the prize was won, the right of an entrant to claim the prize won, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided by statute.

(10) Final determination of winners will be made by the Secretary, whose judgment will be final and binding.

(11) A prize awarded in the Drawing to a person who dies before receiving the prize shall be paid according to 61 Pa. Code § 811.16 (relating to prizes payable after death of a prize winner).

(12) A winner is responsible for all taxes arising from or in connection with any prize won.

(13) A player may only win the prize for which the player is first selected in the Drawing. Subsequent entries, from the same individual, selected in the same Drawing will be disqualified and a replacement entry will be selected.

(14) Winners of iLottery Bonus Money must abide by the iLottery Terms & Conditions, the iLottery Bonus Policy and these rules. iLottery Bonus Money will expire 90 days from the date on which the winner was notified, via email, of the prize win, as further detailed in section 10(d)(4). iLottery Bonus Money has a five times play through requirement in order to convert the iLottery Bonus Money into cash. For example, for a player winning \$100 of iLottery Bonus Money, the player is required to place \$500 in wagers before the iLottery Bonus Money awarded is converted into cash which may be withdrawn from the player's account.

(15) Prizes are not transferrable.

(16) Other restrictions may apply.

11. *Retailer incentive awards*: The Lottery may conduct a separate Retailer Incentive Program for retailers who sell Clover Patch Match instant lottery game tickets.

12. Retailer bonus: The Lottery may offer a retailer bonus in connection with the sale of Pennsylvania instant lottery game tickets. If a retailer bonus is offered, a Lottery retailer shall be eligible for a bonus as described in this section. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$100,000 and not exceeding \$500,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$500. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$500,001 and not exceeding \$1,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$5,000. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$1,000,001 and not exceeding \$10,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$10,000. A Lottery retailer is entitled only to the largest bonus for which they qualify on a

winning ticket. A bonus will be initiated for payment after the instant ticket is claimed and validated. A bonus will not be awarded to a Lottery retailer that sells a nonwinning Pennsylvania Lottery instant ticket used to enter a Pennsylvania Lottery second-chance drawing or promotion that is subsequently selected to win a prize.

13. Unclaimed prize money: For a period of 1 year from the announced close of Clover Patch Match, prize money from winning Clover Patch Match instant lottery game tickets will be retained by the Secretary for payment to the persons entitled thereto. If no claim is made within 1 year of the announced close of the Clover Patch Match instant lottery game, the right of a ticket holder to claim the prize represented by the ticket, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided for by statute.

14. Governing law: In purchasing a ticket, the customer agrees to comply with and abide by the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314), 61 Pa. Code Part V (relating to State Lotteries) and the provisions contained in this notice.

15. Termination of the game: The Secretary may announce a termination date, after which no further tickets from this game may be sold. The announcement will be disseminated through media used to advertise or promote Clover Patch Match or through normal communications methods.

The play symbols and their captions, located in the "GO FOR THE GOLD BONUS" area, are: Pot of Gold (NOBONUS) symbol, Hat (TRYAGAIN) symbol, Horseshoe (NOBONUS) symbol, Clover (TRYAGAIN) symbol, Shooting Star (NOBONUS)

symbol, Wishbone (TRYAGAIN) symbol, Moneybag (NOBONUS) symbol, Crown (TRYAGAIN) symbol, Balloon (NOBONUS) symbol and a Gold Bar (WINALL) symbol.

4. Prize Symbols: The prize symbols and their captions, located in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area, are:  $$2^{.00}$  (TWO DOL),  $$4^{.00}$  (FOR DOL),  $$5^{.00}$  (FIV DOL),  $$10^{.00}$  (TEN DOL),  $$20^{.00}$  (TWENTY),  $$30^{.00}$  (THIRTY),  $$50^{.00}$  (FIFTY), \$100 (ONE HUN), \$200 (TWO HUN), \$1,000 (ONE THO) and \$17,000 (SVNTNTHO).

5. *Prizes*: The prizes that can be won in this game, are: \$2, \$4, \$5, \$10, \$20, \$30, \$50, \$100, \$200, \$1,000 and \$17,000. A player can win up to eight times on a ticket.

6. Approximate number of tickets printed for the game: Approximately 5,400,000 tickets will be printed for the Leprechaun's Gold instant lottery game.

7. Second-Chance Drawing: The Pennsylvania Lottery will conduct an In the Clover Second-Chance Drawing for which non-winning Leprechaun's Gold instant lottery game tickets may be eligible as provided for in section 10.

8. Determination of prize winners:

(a) Holders of tickets upon which a Coin (COIN) symbol appears in the play area and a prize symbol of \$17,000 (SVNTNTHO) appears in the "prize" area under that Coin (COIN) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$17,000.

(b) Holders of tickets upon which a Coin (COIN) symbol appears in the play area and a prize symbol of \$1,000 (ONE THO) appears in the "prize" area under that Coin (COIN) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1,000.

(c) Holders of tickets upon which a Gold Bar (WINALL) symbol appears in the "GO FOR THE GOLD BONUS" area and a prize symbol of \$200 (TWO HUN) appears in four of the "prize" areas and a prize symbol of \$50<sup>.00</sup> (FIFTY) appears in four of the "prize" areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1,000.

(d) Holders of tickets upon which a Coin (COIN) symbol appears in the play area and a prize symbol of \$200 (TWO HUN) appears in the "prize" area under that Coin (COIN) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$200.

(e) Holders of tickets upon which a Gold Bar (WINALL) symbol appears in the "GO FOR THE GOLD BONUS" area and a prize symbol of \$50<sup>.00</sup> (FIFTY) appears in two of the "prize" areas, a prize symbol of \$20<sup>.00</sup> (TWENTY) appears in three of the "prize" areas, a prize symbol of \$5<sup>.00</sup> (FIV DOL) appears in two of the "prize" areas and a prize symbol of \$30<sup>.00</sup> (THIRTY) appears in one of the "prize" areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$200.

(f) Holders of tickets upon which a Gold Bar (WINALL) symbol appears in the "GO FOR THE GOLD BONUS" area and a prize symbol of  $330^{.00}$  (THIRTY) appears in five of the "prize" areas, a prize symbol of  $20^{.00}$  (TWENTY) appears in two of the "prize" areas and a prize symbol of  $10^{.00}$  (TEN DOL) appears in one of the "prize" areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$200.

(g) Holders of tickets upon which a Coin (COIN) symbol appears in the play area and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in the "prize" area under that Coin (COIN) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.

(h) Holders of tickets upon which a Gold Bar (WINALL) symbol appears in the "GO FOR THE GOLD BONUS" area and a prize symbol of  $$30^{.00}$  (THIRTY) appears in two of the "prize" areas, a prize symbol of  $$10^{.00}$  (TEN DOL) appears in three of the "prize" areas, a prize symbol of  $$4^{.00}$  (FOR DOL) appears in two of the "prize" areas and a prize symbol of  $$2^{.00}$  (TWO DOL) appears in one of the "prize" areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.

(i) Holders of tickets upon which a Gold Bar (WINALL) symbol appears in the "GO FOR THE GOLD BONUS" area and a prize symbol of \$10<sup>.00</sup> (TEN DOL) appears in four of the "prize" areas, a prizes symbol of \$4<sup>.00</sup> (FOR DOL) appears in two of the "prize" areas, a prize symbol of \$50<sup>.00</sup> (FIFTY) appears in one of the "prize" areas and a prize symbol of \$2<sup>.00</sup> (TWO DOL) appears in one of the "prize" areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.

(j) Holders of tickets upon which a Coin (COIN) symbol appears in the play area and a prize symbol of  $50^{00}$  (FIFTY) appears in the "prize" area under that Coin (COIN) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$50.

(k) Holders of tickets upon which a Gold Bar (WINALL) symbol appears in the "GO FOR THE GOLD BONUS" area and a prize symbol of  $$10^{.00}$  (TEN DOL) appears in three of the "prize" areas, a prize symbol of  $$5^{.00}$  (FIV DOL) appears in two of the "prize" areas, a prize symbol of  $$4^{.00}$  (FOR DOL) appears in two of the "prize" areas and a prize symbol of  $$2^{.00}$  (TWO DOL) appears in one of the "prize" areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$50.

(1) Holders of tickets upon which a Gold Bar (WINALL) symbol appears in the "GO FOR THE GOLD BONUS" area and a prize symbol of  $10^{.00}$  (TEN DOL) appears in two of the "prize" areas, a prize symbol of  $2^{.00}$  (TWO DOL) appears in five of the "prize" areas and a prize symbol of  $20^{.00}$  (TWENTY) appears in one of the "prize" areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of 50.

(m) Holders of tickets upon which a Coin (COIN) symbol appears in the play area and a prize symbol of  $330^{00}$  (THIRTY) appears in the "prize" area under that Coin (COIN) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$30.

(n) Holders of tickets upon which a Gold Bar (WINALL) symbol appears in the "GO FOR THE GOLD BONUS" area and a prize symbol of \$5<sup>.00</sup> (FIV DOL) appears in four of the "prize" areas, a prize symbol of \$2<sup>.00</sup> (TWO DOL) appears in three of the "prize" areas

and a prize symbol of  $4^{00}$  (FOR DOL) appears in one of the "prize" areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$30.

(o) Holders of tickets upon which a Gold Bar (WINALL) symbol appears in the "GO FOR THE GOLD BONUS" area and a prize symbol of  $$5^{.00}$  (FIV DOL) appears in two of the "prize" areas, a prize symbol of  $$2^{.00}$  (TWO DOL) appears in five of the "prize" areas and a prize symbol of  $$10^{.00}$  (TEN DOL) appears in one of the "prize" areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$30.

(p) Holders of tickets upon which a Coin (COIN) symbol appears in the play area and a prize symbol of  $20^{00}$  (TWENTY) appears in the "prize" area under that Coin (COIN) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$20.

(q) Holders of tickets upon which a Gold Bar (WINALL) symbol appears in the "GO FOR THE GOLD BONUS" area and a prize symbol of  $4^{00}$  (FOR DOL) appears in two of the "prize" areas and a prize symbol of  $2^{00}$  (TWO DOL) appears in six of the "prize" areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of 20.

(r) Holders of tickets upon which a Coin (COIN) symbol appears in the play area and a prize symbol of  $10^{00}$  (TEN DOL) appears in the "prize" area under that Coin (COIN) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$10.

(s) Holders of tickets upon which a Stack of Coins (WIN10) symbol appears in the play area and a prize symbol of  $10^{00}$  (TEN DOL) appears in the "prize" area under that Stack of Coins (WIN10) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of 10.

(t) Holders of tickets upon which a Coin (COIN) symbol appears in the play area and a prize symbol of  $$5^{.00}$  (FIV DOL) appears in the "prize" area under that Coin (COIN) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$5.

(u) Holders of tickets upon which a Coin (COIN) symbol appears in the play area and a prize symbol of  $$4^{.00}$  (FOR DOL) appears in the "prize" area under that Coin (COIN) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$4.

(v) Holders of tickets upon which a Coin (COIN) symbol appears in the play area and a prize symbol of  $$2^{.00}$  (TWO DOL) appears in the "prize" area under that Coin (COIN) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$2.

(3) To establish a lottery account, players must provide the following information:

(i) The player's name as it appears on a valid government-issued identification or tax documents;

(ii) The player's date of birth;

(iii) The entire or last four digits of the player's Social Security Number, or comparable equivalent;

(iv) The player's address;

(v) The player's telephone number;

(vi) The player's email address;

(vii) Any other information established by the Lottery to be necessary to verify the age and identity of the player.

(4) An individual may be required to provide additional information or documentation, as set forth in the iLottery terms and conditions, to establish a lottery account or register for iLottery. The information may be used for iLottery registration or to confirm information provided by that individual during the registration process.

(5) To enter the Drawing, entrants must submit the identifying information from at least one Qualifying Ticket via the Drawing's promotional web site, available at https://www.palottery.com, or the Pennsylvania Lottery's official mobile application, during the entry period. The identifying information from a Qualifying Ticket may be submitted only once in the Drawing. Entries will automatically be awarded at the time of successful submission of a Qualifying Ticket. No other method of submission will be accepted. Entries submitted using any other method, including entries mailed or hand-delivered to the Pennsylvania Lottery, are not valid and will be disqualified.

(6) Each entry must be complete and the information supplied by the entrant must be accurate. Incomplete entries cannot be submitted.

(7) Only one claimant per entry allowed.

(8) Entrants must be 18 years of age or older.

(9) Players may submit the identifying information from an unlimited number of Qualifying Tickets in the Drawing.

(10) Once an entry has been submitted it cannot be withdrawn or changed.

(c) Drawing description:

(1) The Lottery will conduct one In the Clover Second-Chance Drawing for qualifying instant lottery game tickets. All time references are Eastern Prevailing Time.

(2) All entries received after 11:59:59 p.m. January 22, 2023, through 11:59:59 p.m. March 23, 2023, will be entered into the Drawing tentatively scheduled to be held between March 27, 2023 and April 7, 2023.

(3) The entry period for the Drawing will be posted to the Pennsylvania Lottery's publicly accessible web site.

(4) The number of entries an entrant will receive for the Drawing is determined by the purchase price of the Qualifying Ticket entered. The respective purchase price and corresponding number of entries for the Qualifying Ticket is as follows: PA-1623 Under the Rainbow (\$5) = five entries, PA-1624 Leprechaun's Gold (\$2) = two entries and PA-1625 Clover Patch Match (\$1) = one entry.

(5) Players may review prizes won and their entries for the Drawing via the Drawing's promotional web site.

(d) Prizes available to be won, determination of winners and odds of winning:

(1) The prize entitlements described below are subject to all restrictions and limitations described in section 10(e), or those mentioned anywhere else in these rules.

(2) Lottery will conduct one Drawing from among all the entries received during the entry period as described in section 10(c)(2).

(i) The first through the fourth entries selected in the Drawing will be winning entries and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$17,000, less required income tax withholding.

(ii) The fifth through the eleventh entries selected in the Drawing will be winning entries and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$3,000.

(iii) The twelfth through the twenty-fourth entries selected in the Drawing will be winning entries and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$1,700.

(iv) The twenty-fifth through the seventy-fourth entries selected in the Drawing will be winning entries and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$100 iLottery Bonus Money.

(3) All prizes will be paid as a lump-sum cash payment or uploaded to a winning player's lottery account.

(4) Winners of iLottery Bonus Money are not required to claim a prize. Winners of iLottery Bonus Money will have the iLottery Bonus Money credited to their lottery account and will receive an email notifying them that they won a prize.

(5) The number of winning entries to be selected for the Drawing will be posted to the Pennsylvania Lottery's publicly accessible web site.

(6) The odds of winning in the Drawing depend upon the number of entries received for the Drawing.

(7) A computer-generated randomizer will be used to select the Drawing winners.

(e) *Drawing restrictions*:

(1) To be eligible to participate in the Drawing, entrants must have complied with the requirements of these rules. (2) The Lottery is not responsible for late, lost or misdirected entries not entered into the Drawing. The Lottery is not responsible for entries that are not entered into the Drawing because of incompatible internet browsers, mobile Lottery application failure or other technical issues. The Lottery is not responsible for entries not entered due to delays in creating a lottery account or the inability to create a lottery account. If a Drawing entry is selected as a winner and rejected or otherwise disqualified during or following the Drawing, the Lottery will select another entry to replace the rejected or otherwise disqualified entry in accordance with these rules and Lottery procedure.

(3) If any discrepancy exists between these rules and any material describing the Drawing, these rules shall govern.

(4) Employees of the Pennsylvania Lottery, 9Rooftops Marketing, LLC (formerly known as MARC USA, LLC), MUSL, Scientific Games International, Inc., MDI Entertainment, LLC, and their subcontractors, or a spouse, child, brother, sister or parent residing as a member of the same household in the principal place of residence of any such person are not eligible to participate in the Drawing. Offer void where prohibited or restricted.

(5) The Pennsylvania Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to cancel or suspend the Drawing and change these rules if the Drawing cannot be conducted as planned due to errors in these rules or advertising, unauthorized intervention, tampering, fraud, technical errors, viruses, worms, bugs or any other cause that, in the Pennsylvania Lottery's sole judgment, could corrupt or impair the administration, security, fairness, integrity or proper conduct of the Drawing.

(6) All entries shall be subject to verification by the Pennsylvania Lottery.

(7) The Pennsylvania Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to disqualify an entrant found to be tampering with the operation of the Drawing or to be acting in violation of these rules or applicable law.

(8) The Drawing is governed by the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Applicable laws and regulations apply.

(9) Prizes must be claimed within 1 year of the drawing date of the Drawing in which the prize was won. If no claim is made within 1 year of the drawing date of the Drawing in which the prize was won, the right of an entrant to claim the prize won, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided by statute.

(10) Final determination of winners will be made by the Secretary, whose judgment will be final and binding.

(11) A prize awarded in the Drawing to a person who dies before receiving the prize shall be paid according to 61 Pa. Code § 811.16 (relating to prizes payable after death of a prize winner).

(12) A winner is responsible for all taxes arising from or in connection with any prize won.

(13) A player may only win the prize for which the player is first selected in the Drawing. Subsequent entries, from the same individual, selected in the same Drawing will be disqualified and a replacement entry will be selected.

(14) Winners of iLottery Bonus Money must abide by the iLottery Terms & Conditions, the iLottery Bonus Policy and these rules. iLottery Bonus Money will expire 90 days from the date on which the winner was notified, via email, of the prize win, as further detailed in section 10(d)(4). iLottery Bonus Money has a five times play through requirement in order to convert the iLottery Bonus Money into cash. For example, for a player winning \$100 of iLottery Bonus Money, the player is required to place \$500 in wagers before the iLottery Bonus Money awarded is converted into cash which may be withdrawn from the player's account.

(15) Prizes are not transferrable.

(16) Other restrictions may apply.

11. *Retailer incentive awards*: The Lottery may conduct a separate Retailer Incentive Program for retailers who sell Leprechaun's Gold instant lottery game tickets.

12. Retailer bonus: The Lottery may offer a retailer bonus in connection with the sale of Pennsylvania instant lottery game tickets. If a retailer bonus is offered, a Lottery retailer shall be eligible for a bonus as described in this section. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$100,000 and not exceeding \$500,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$500. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$500,001 and not exceeding \$1,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$5,000. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$1,000,001 and not exceeding \$10,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$10,000. A Lottery retailer is entitled only to the largest bonus for which they qualify on a winning ticket. A bonus will be initiated for payment after the instant ticket is claimed and validated. A bonus will not be awarded to a Lottery retailer that sells a nonwinning Pennsylvania Lottery instant ticket used to enter a Pennsylvania Lottery second-chance drawing or promotion that is subsequently selected to win a prize.

13. Unclaimed prize money: For a period of 1 year from the announced close of Leprechaun's Gold, prize money from winning Leprechaun's Gold instant lottery game tickets will be retained by the Secretary for payment to the persons entitled thereto. If no claim is made within 1 year of the announced close of the Leprechaun's Gold instant lottery game, the right of a ticket holder to claim the prize represented by the ticket, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided for by statute.

14. Governing law: In purchasing a ticket, the customer agrees to comply with and abide by the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314), 61 Pa. Code Part V (relating to State Lotteries) and the provisions contained in this notice.

15. Termination of the game: The Secretary may announce a termination date, after which no further tickets from this game may be sold. The announcement will be disseminated through media used to advertise or promote Leprechaun's Gold or through normal communications methods.

Under the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101— 3761-314) and 61 Pa. Code § 819.203 (relating to notice of instant game rules), the Secretary of Revenue hereby provides public notice of the rules for the following instant lottery game:

1. *Name*: The name of the game is Pennsylvania Lucky 7 (hereinafter "Lucky 7"). The game number is PA-1622.

2. *Price*: The price of a Lucky 7 instant lottery game ticket is \$10.

3. *Play symbols*: Each Lucky 7 instant lottery game ticket will contain one play area featuring a "WINNING NUMBERS" area and a "YOUR NUMBERS" area. The play symbols and their captions, located in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area, are: 1 (ONE), 2 (TWO), 3 (THREE), 4 (FOUR), 5 (FIVE), 6 (SIX), 8 (EIGHT), 9 (NINE), 10 (TEN), 11 (ELEVN), 12 (TWLV), 13 (THRTN), 14 (FORTN), 15 (FIFTN), 16 (SIXTN), 18 (EGHTN), 19 (NINTN), 20 (TWENT), 21 (TWYONE), 22 (TWYTWO), 23 (TWYTHR), 24 (TWYFOR), 25 (TWYFIV), 26 (TWYSIX), 28 (TWYEGT), 29 (TWYNIN) and 30 (THIRT). The play symbols and their captions, located in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area, are: 1 (ONE), 2 (TWO), 3 (THREE), 4 (FOUR), 5 (FIVE), 6 (SIX), 8 (EIGHT), 9 (NINE), 10 (TEN), 11 (ELEVN), 12 (TWLV), 13 (THRTN), 14 (FORTN), 15 (FIFTN), 16 (SIXTN), 18 (EGHTN), 19 (NINTN), 20 (TWENT), 21 (TWYONE), 22 (TWYTWO), 23 (TWYTHR), 24 (TWYFOR), 25 (TWYFIV), 26 (TWYSIX), 28 (TWYEGT), 29 (TWYNIN), 30 (THIRT), 7 (SEVEN) symbol, 7X (7TIMES) symbol, Gold Coin (WIN70) symbol and a LUCKY (WINALL) symbol.

4. *Prize symbols*: The prize symbols and their captions, located in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area, are:  $$10^{.00}$  (TEN DOL),  $$20^{.00}$  (TWENTY),  $$30^{.00}$  (THIRTY),  $$40^{.00}$  (FORTY),  $$50^{.00}$  (FIFTY),  $$70^{.00}$  (SEVENTY), \$100 (ONE HUN), \$200 (TWO HUN), \$700 (SVN HUN), \$1,000 (ONE THO), \$7,000 (SVN THO) and \$500,000 (FIVHUNTHO).

5. *Prizes*: The prizes that can be won in this game, are: \$10, \$20, \$30, \$40, \$50, \$70, \$100, \$200, \$700, \$1,000, \$7,000 and \$500,000. Lucky 7 contains a feature that can multiply certain prizes. For a complete list of prizes, and how those prizes can be won, see section 8 (relating to number and description of prizes and approximate odds). A player can win up to 15 times on a ticket.

6. Approximate number of tickets printed for the game: Approximately 12,000,000 tickets will be printed for the Lucky 7 instant lottery game.

### 7. Determination of prize winners:

(a) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$500,000 (FIVHUNTHO) appears in the "prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$500,000.

(b) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$7,000 (SVN THO) appears in the "prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$7,000.

(c) Holders of tickets upon which a 7X (7TIMES) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a

prize symbol of \$1,000 (ONE THO) appears in the "prize" area under that 7X (7TIMES) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$7,000.

(d) Holders of tickets upon which a LUCKY (WINALL) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of \$700 (SVN HUN) appears in eight of the "prize" areas and a prize symbol of \$200 (TWO HUN) appears in seven of the "prize" areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$7,000.

(x) Holders of tickets upon which a Gold Coin (WIN70) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of \$70<sup>.00</sup> (SEVENTY) appears in the "prize" area under that Gold Coin (WIN70) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$70.

(y) Holders of tickets upon which a 7X (7TIMES) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a

prize symbol of  $$10^{.00}$  (TEN DOL) appears in the "prize" area under that 7X (7TIMES) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$70.

(z) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$50<sup>.00</sup> (FIFTY) appears in the "prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$50.

(aa) Holders of tickets upon which a 7 (SEVEN) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of  $$50^{.00}$  (FIFTY) appears in the "prize" area under that 7 (SEVEN) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$50.

(bb) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$40<sup>.00</sup> (FORTY) appears in the "prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$40.

(cc) Holders of tickets upon which a 7 (SEVEN) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of  $$40^{.00}$  (FORTY) appears in the "prize" area under that 7 (SEVEN) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$40.

If a retailer bonus is offered, a Lottery retailer shall be eligible for a bonus as described in this section. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$100,000 and not exceeding \$500,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$500. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$500,001 and not exceeding \$1,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$5,000. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$1,000,001 and not exceeding \$10,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$10,000. A Lottery retailer is entitled only to the largest bonus for which they qualify on a winning ticket. A bonus will be initiated for payment after

the instant ticket is claimed and validated. A bonus will not be awarded to a Lottery retailer that sells a nonwinning Pennsylvania Lottery instant ticket used to enter a Pennsylvania Lottery second-chance drawing or promotion that is subsequently selected to win a prize.

11. Unclaimed prize money: For a period of 1 year from the announced close of Lucky 7, prize money from winning Lucky 7 instant lottery game tickets will be retained by the Secretary for payment to the persons entitled thereto. If no claim is made within 1 year of the announced close of the Lucky 7 instant lottery game, the right of a ticket holder to claim the prize represented by the ticket, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided for by statute.

12. Governing law: In purchasing a ticket, the customer agrees to comply with and abide by the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101-3761-314), 61 Pa. Code Part V (relating to State Lotteries) and the provisions contained in this notice.

13. *Termination of the game*: The Secretary may announce a termination date, after which no further tickets

from this game may be sold. The announcement will be disseminated through media used to advertise or promote Lucky 7 or through normal communications methods.

Under the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101— 3761-314) and 61 Pa. Code § 819.203 (relating to notice of instant game rules), the Secretary of Revenue hereby provides public notice of the rules for the following instant lottery game:

1. *Name*: The name of the game is Pennsylvania Under the Rainbow (hereafter "Under the Rainbow"). The game number is PA-1623.

2. *Price*: The price of an Under the Rainbow instant lottery game ticket is \$5.

3. Play symbols: Each Under the Rainbow instant lottery game ticket will contain one play area featuring a "WINNING NUMBERS" area, a "YOUR NUMBERS" area, a "CLOUD BONUS" area and a "POT O'GOLD BONUS" area. The "POT O'GOLD BONUS" area is played separately. The play symbols and their captions, located separately. The play symbols and then captons, rotated in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area, are: 1 (ONE), 2 (TWO), 3 (THREE), 4 (FOUR), 6 (SIX), 7 (SEVEN), 8 (EIGHT), 9 (NINE), 10 (TEN), 11 (ELEVN), 12 (TWLV), 13 (THRTN), 14 (FORTN), 15 (FIFTN), 16 (SIXTN), 17 (SVNTN), 18 (EGHTN), 19 (NINTN), 20 (TWENT), 21 (TWYONE), 22 (TWYTWO), 23 (TWYTHR), 24 (TWYFOR), 25 (TWYFIV), 26 (TWYSIX), 27 (TWYSVN), 28 (TWYEGT), 29 (TWYNIN) and 30 (THIRT). The play symbols and their captions, located in the "YOUR NUM-BERS" area, are: 1 (ONE), 2 (TWO), 3 (THREE), 4 (FOUR), 6 (SIX), 7 (SEVEN), 8 (EIGHT), 9 (NINE), 10 (TEN), 11 (ELEVN), 12 (TWLV), 13 (THRTN), 14 (FORTN), 15 (FIFTN), 16 (SIXTN), 17 (SVNTN), 18 (EGHTN), 19 (NINTN), 20 (TWENT), 21 (TWYONE), 22 (TWYTWO), 23 (TWYTHR), 24 (TWYFOR), 25 (TWYFIV), 26 (TWYSIX), 27 (TWYSVN), 28 (TWYEGT), 29 (TWYNIN), 30 (THIRT) and a Rainbow (RAINBOW) symbol. The play symbols and their captions, located in the "CLOUD BONUS" area, are: Bird (NOMULT) symbol, Moon (TRYAGAIN) symbol, Clouds (NOMULT) symbol, Lightning (TRYAGAIN) symbol, Wind (NOMULT) symbol and a 5X (5TIMES) symbol. The play symbols and their captions, located in the "POT O'GOLD BONUS" area, are: Clover (NOBONUS) symbol, Hat (TRYAGAIN) symbol, Moon (NOBONUS) symbol, Flower (TRYAGAIN) symbol, Cane (NOBONUS) symbol, Moneybag (TRYAGAIN) symbol and a Leprechaun (LPCHN) symbol.

4. Prize Symbols: The prize symbols and their captions, located in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area, are:  $\$5^{.00}$  (FIV DOL),  $\$10^{.00}$  (TEN DOL),  $\$25^{.00}$  (TWY FIV),  $\$50^{.00}$  (FIFTY), \$100 (ONE HUN), \$250 (TWOHUNFTY), \$500 (FIV HUN), \$1,000 (ONE THO), \$5,000 (FIV THO) and \$100,000 (ONEHUNTHO). The prize symbols and their captions, located in the "POT O'GOLD BONUS" area, are:  $\$5^{.00}$  (FIV DOL),  $\$10^{.00}$  (TEN DOL),  $\$25^{.00}$  (TWY FIV),  $\$50^{.00}$  (FIFTY), \$100 (ONE HUN), \$250 (TWOHUNFTY), \$500 (FIV HUN) and \$1,000 (ONE THO).

5. *Prizes*: The prizes that can be won in this game, are: \$5, \$10, \$25, \$50, \$100, \$250, \$500, \$1,000, \$5,000 and \$100,000. The prizes that can be won in the "POT O'GOLD BONUS" area, are: \$5, \$10, \$25, \$50, \$100, \$250, \$500 and \$1,000. Under the Rainbow contains a feature that can multiply the prize won. For a complete list of prizes, and how those prizes can be won, see section 9 (relating to number and description of prizes and approximate odds). A player can win up to 12 times on a ticket.

6. Approximate number of tickets printed for the game: Approximately 5,400,000 tickets will be printed for the Under the Rainbow instant lottery game.

7. Second-Chance Drawing: The Pennsylvania Lottery will conduct an In the Clover Second-Chance Drawing for which non-winning Under the Rainbow instant lottery game tickets may be eligible as provided for in section 10.

8. Determination of prize winners:

(a) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$100,000 (ONEHUNTHO) appears in the "prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100,000.

(b) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$5,000 (FIV THO) appears in the "prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$5,000.

(c) Holders of tickets upon which a Rainbow (RAIN-BOW) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of \$5,000 (FIV THO) appears in the "prize" area under that Rainbow (RAINBOW) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$5,000.

(d) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$1,000 (ONE THO) appears in the "prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, and upon which a 5X (5TIMES) symbol appears in the "CLOUD BONUS" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$5,000.

(e) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$1,000 (ONE THO) appears in the "prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1,000.

(f) Holders of tickets upon which a Rainbow (RAIN-BOW) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of \$1,000 (ONE THO) appears in the "prize" area under that Rainbow (RAINBOW) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1,000.

(g) Holders of tickets upon which a Leprechaun (LPCHN) symbol appears in the "POT O'GOLD BONUS" area and a prize symbol of \$1,000 (ONE THO) appears in the "prize" area under that Leprechaun (LPCHN) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1,000.

(h) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$500 (FIV HUN) appears in the "prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$500.

(i) Holders of tickets upon which a Rainbow (RAIN-BOW) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of \$500 (FIV HUN) appears in the "prize" area under that Rainbow (RAINBOW) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$500.

(j) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in the "prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, and upon which a 5X (5TIMES) symbol appears in the "CLOUD BONUS" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$500.

(k) Holders of tickets upon which a Rainbow (RAIN-BOW) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in the "prize" area under that Rainbow (RAINBOW) symbol, and upon which a 5X (5TIMES) symbol appears in the "CLOUD BONUS" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$500.

(1) Holders of tickets upon which a Leprechaun (LPCHN) symbol appears in the "POT O'GOLD BONUS" area and a prize symbol of \$500 (FIV HUN) appears in the "prize" area under that Leprechaun (LPCHN) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$500.

(m) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$250 (TWOHUNFTY) appears in the "prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$250.

(n) Holders of tickets upon which a Rainbow (RAIN-BOW) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of \$250 (TWOHUNFTY) appears in the "prize" area under that Rainbow (RAINBOW) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$250.

(o) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$50<sup>.00</sup> (FIFTY) appears in the "prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, and upon which a 5X (5TIMES) symbol appears in the "CLOUD BONUS" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$250.

(p) Holders of tickets upon which a Leprechaun (LPCHN) symbol appears in the "POT O'GOLD BONUS" area and a prize symbol of \$250 (TWOHUNFTY) appears in the "prize" area under that Leprechaun (LPCHN) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$250.

(q) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in the "prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.

(r) Holders of tickets upon which a Rainbow (RAIN-BOW) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in the "prize" area under that Rainbow (RAINBOW) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.

(s) Holders of tickets upon which a Leprechaun (LPCHN) symbol appears in the "POT O'GOLD BONUS" area and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in the "prize" area under that Leprechaun (LPCHN) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.

(t) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$50<sup>.00</sup> (FIFTY) appears in the "prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$50.

(u) Holders of tickets upon which a Rainbow (RAIN-BOW) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of  $50^{00}$  (FIFTY) appears in the "prize" area under that Rainbow (RAINBOW) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$50.

(v) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$10<sup>.00</sup> (TEN DOL) appears in the "prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, and upon which a 5X (5TIMES) symbol appears in the "CLOUD BONUS" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$50.

(w) Holders of tickets upon which a Rainbow (RAIN-BOW) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of  $10^{00}$  (TEN DOL) appears in the "prize" area under that Rainbow (RAINBOW) symbol, and upon which a 5X (5TIMES) symbol appears in the "CLOUD BONUS" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$50.

(x) Holders of tickets upon which a Leprechaun (LPCHN) symbol appears in the "POT O'GOLD BONUS" area and a prize symbol of  $50^{00}$  (FIFTY) appears in the "prize" area under that Leprechaun (LPCHN) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$50.

(y) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$25<sup>.00</sup> (TWY FIV) appears in the "prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$25.

(z) Holders of tickets upon which a Rainbow (RAIN-BOW) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of  $$25^{.00}$  (TWY FIV) appears in the "prize" area under that Rainbow (RAINBOW) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$25.

(aa) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$5<sup>.00</sup> (FIV DOL) appears in the "prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, and upon which a 5X (5TIMES) symbol appears in the "CLOUD BONUS" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$25.

(ii) Holders of tickets upon which a Leprechaun (LPCHN) symbol appears in the "POT O'GOLD BONUS" area and a prize symbol of \$5.00 (FIV DOL) appears in the "prize" area under that Leprechaun (LPCHN) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$5.

10. Second-Chance Drawing: The Pennsylvania Lottery's (hereafter, the "Lottery") In the Clover Second-Chance Drawing for qualifying instant lottery game tickets (hereafter, the "Drawing"):

(a) *Qualifying Tickets*: Non-winning PA-1623 Under the Rainbow (\$5), PA-1624 Leprechaun's Gold (\$2) and PA-1625 Clover Patch Match (\$1) lottery game tickets are eligible for entry into the Drawing.

(b) *Participation and entry*:

(1) Entrants must have registered lottery account in order to participate in the Drawing. To create a lottery account, visit https://www.pailottery.com. Creating a lottery account is free.

(2) A registered lottery account holder is subject to the iLottery regulations and specifically agrees to be bound by the iLottery terms and conditions located at https://www.pailottery.com/signup/terms-and-conditions/, as well as any related policies.

(3) To establish a lottery account, players must provide the following information:

(i) The player's name as it appears on a valid government-issued identification or tax documents;

(ii) The player's date of birth;

(iii) The entire or last four digits of the player's Social Security Number, or comparable equivalent;

(iv) The player's address;

(v) The player's telephone number;

(vi) The player's email address;

(vii) Any other information established by the Lottery to be necessary to verify the age and identity of the player.

(4) An individual may be required to provide additional information or documentation, as set forth in the iLottery terms and conditions, to establish a lottery account or register for iLottery. The information may be used for iLottery registration or to confirm information provided by that individual during the registration process.

(5) To enter the Drawing, entrants must submit the identifying information from at least one Qualifying Ticket via the Drawing's promotional web site, available at https://www.palottery.com, or the Pennsylvania Lottery's official mobile application, during the entry period. The identifying information from a Qualifying Ticket may be submitted only once in the Drawing. Entries will automatically be awarded at the time of successful submission of a Qualifying Ticket. No other method of submission will be accepted. Entries submitted using any other method, including entries mailed or hand-delivered to the Pennsylvania Lottery, are not valid and will be disqualified.

(6) Each entry must be complete and the information supplied by the entrant must be accurate. Incomplete entries cannot be submitted.

(7) Only one claimant per entry allowed.

(8) Entrants must be 18 years of age or older.

(9) Players may submit the identifying information from an unlimited number of Qualifying Tickets in the Drawing.

(10) Once an entry has been submitted it cannot be withdrawn or changed.

(c) Drawing description:

(1) The Lottery will conduct one In the Clover Second-Chance Drawing for qualifying instant lottery game tickets. All time references are Eastern Prevailing Time.

(2) All entries received after 11:59:59 p.m. January 22, 2023, through 11:59:59 p.m. March 23, 2023, will be entered into the Drawing tentatively scheduled to be held between March 27, 2023 and April 7, 2023.

(3) The entry period for the Drawing will be posted to the Pennsylvania Lottery's publicly accessible web site.

(4) The number of entries an entrant will receive for the Drawing is determined by the purchase price of the Qualifying Ticket entered. The respective purchase price and corresponding number of entries for the Qualifying Ticket is as follows: PA-1623 Under the Rainbow (\$5) = five entries, PA-1624 Leprechaun's Gold (\$2) = two entries and PA-1625 Clover Patch Match (\$1) = one entry.

(5) Players may review prizes won and their entries for the Drawing via the Drawing's promotional web site.

(d) Prizes available to be won, determination of winners and odds of winning:

(1) The prize entitlements described below are subject to all restrictions and limitations described in section 10(e), or those mentioned anywhere else in these rules.

(2) Lottery will conduct one Drawing from among all the entries received during the entry period as described in section 10(c)(2).

(i) The first through the fourth entries selected in the Drawing will be winning entries and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$17,000, less required income tax withholding.

(ii) The fifth through the eleventh entries selected in the Drawing will be winning entries and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$3,000.

(iii) The twelfth through the twenty-fourth entries selected in the Drawing will be winning entries and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$1,700.

(iv) The twenty-fifth through the seventy-fourth entries selected in the Drawing will be winning entries and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$100 iLottery Bonus Money.

(3) All prizes will be paid as a lump-sum cash payment or uploaded to a winning player's lottery account.

(4) Winners of iLottery Bonus Money are not required to claim a prize. Winners of iLottery Bonus Money will have the iLottery Bonus Money credited to their lottery account and will receive an email notifying them that they won a prize.

(5) The number of winning entries to be selected for the Drawing will be posted to the Pennsylvania Lottery's publicly accessible web site.

(6) The odds of winning in the Drawing depend upon the number of entries received for the Drawing.

(7) A computer-generated randomizer will be used to select the Drawing winners.

(e) *Drawing restrictions*:

(1) To be eligible to participate in the Drawing, entrants must have complied with the requirements of these rules. (2) The Lottery is not responsible for late, lost or misdirected entries not entered into the Drawing. The Lottery is not responsible for entries that are not entered into the Drawing because of incompatible internet browsers, mobile Lottery application failure or other technical issues. The Lottery is not responsible for entries not entered due to delays in creating a lottery account or the inability to create a lottery account. If a Drawing entry is selected as a winner and rejected or otherwise disqualified during or following the Drawing, the Lottery will select another entry to replace the rejected or otherwise disqualified entry in accordance with these rules and Lottery procedure.

(3) If any discrepancy exists between these rules and any material describing the Drawing, these rules shall govern.

(4) Employees of the Pennsylvania Lottery, 9Rooftops Marketing, LLC (formerly known as MARC USA, LLC), MUSL, Scientific Games International, Inc., MDI Entertainment, LLC, and their subcontractors, or a spouse, child, brother, sister or parent residing as a member of the same household in the principal place of residence of any such person are not eligible to participate in the Drawing. Offer void where prohibited or restricted.

(5) The Pennsylvania Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to cancel or suspend the Drawing and change these rules if the Drawing cannot be conducted as planned due to errors in these rules or advertising, unauthorized intervention, tampering, fraud, technical errors, viruses, worms, bugs or any other cause that, in the Pennsylvania Lottery's sole judgment, could corrupt or impair the administration, security, fairness, integrity or proper conduct of the Drawing.

(6) All entries shall be subject to verification by the Pennsylvania Lottery.

(7) The Pennsylvania Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to disqualify an entrant found to be tampering with the operation of the Drawing or to be acting in violation of these rules or applicable law.

(8) The Drawing is governed by the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Applicable laws and regulations apply.

(9) Prizes must be claimed within 1 year of the drawing date of the Drawing in which the prize was won. If no claim is made within 1 year of the drawing date of the Drawing in which the prize was won, the right of an entrant to claim the prize won, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided by statute.

(10) Final determination of winners will be made by the Secretary, whose judgment will be final and binding.

(11) A prize awarded in the Drawing to a person who dies before receiving the prize shall be paid according to 61 Pa. Code § 811.16 (relating to prizes payable after death of a prize winner).

(12) A winner is responsible for all taxes arising from or in connection with any prize won.

(13) A player may only win the prize for which the player is first selected in the Drawing. Subsequent entries, from the same individual, selected in the same Drawing will be disqualified and a replacement entry will be selected.

(14) Winners of iLottery Bonus Money must abide by the iLottery Terms & Conditions, the iLottery Bonus Policy and these rules. iLottery Bonus Money will expire 90 days from the date on which the winner was notified, via email, of the prize win, as further detailed in section 10(d)(4). iLottery Bonus Money has a five times play through requirement in order to convert the iLottery Bonus Money into cash. For example, for a player winning \$100 of iLottery Bonus Money, the player is required to place \$500 in wagers before the iLottery Bonus Money awarded is converted into cash which may be withdrawn from the player's account.

(15) Prizes are not transferrable.

(16) Other restrictions may apply.

11. *Retailer incentive awards*: The Lottery may conduct a separate Retailer Incentive Program for retailers who sell Under the Rainbow instant lottery game tickets.

12. Retailer bonus: The Lottery may offer a retailer bonus in connection with the sale of Pennsylvania instant lottery game tickets. If a retailer bonus is offered, a Lottery retailer shall be eligible for a bonus as described in this section. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$100,000 and not exceeding \$500,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$500. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$500,001 and not exceeding \$1,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$5,000. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$1,000,001 and not exceeding \$10,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$10,000. A Lottery retailer is entitled only to the largest bonus for which they qualify on a winning ticket. A bonus will be initiated for payment after the instant ticket is claimed and validated. A bonus will not be awarded to a Lottery retailer that sells a nonwinning Pennsylvania Lottery instant ticket used to enter a Pennsylvania Lottery second-chance drawing or promotion that is subsequently selected to win a prize.

13. Unclaimed prize money: For a period of 1 year from the announced close of Under the Rainbow, prize money from winning Under the Rainbow instant lottery game tickets will be retained by the Secretary for payment to the persons entitled thereto. ### Finding

Under section 2002(b) of The Administrative Code of 1929 (71 P.S. § 512(b)) establishing the Department of

Transportation (Department), the Director of the Bureau of Design and Delivery, as delegated by the Secretary of Transportation, makes the following written finding:

Alternative 5C is the preferred alternative for the Eisenhower Drive extension project in Adams and York Counties. The preferred alternative includes approximately 4 miles of new roadway extension consisting of two 12-foot travel lanes with 4-foot to 8-foot shoulders. The corridor passes through two municipalities, Conewago Township and Penn Township. The project includes extending Eisenhower Drive, from its current terminus at High Street by means of a new roadway through Conewago Township, to a terminus at State Route 0116 (Hanover Road) west of McSherrystown.

The Environmental Assessment (EA) and EA Comment Responses have been evaluated by the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and were determined to discuss adequately and accurately the needs, environmental issues and impacts of the proposed project and mitigation measures that will be taken to minimize harm as stipulated in the EA. Based on the EA, the FHWA has issued a Finding of No Significant Impact for the project. Furthermore, the Bureau of Design and Delivery has concluded that all State environmental evaluation requirements, as published in section 2002 of The Administrative Code of 1929, have been satisfied.

Based on studies and the Final Individual Section 4(f) Evaluation, there is no feasible and prudent alternative to the use of the Section 4(f)/Section 2002 resources for the proposed action, and the project is planned to minimize harm to the Section 4(f)/Section 2002 resources. The proposed project is anticipated to impact approximately 6.6 acres total of the southern boundary of the National Register eligible Devine Chapel Farm; approximately 2.3 acres total of the southern boundary of the National Register eligible Poist Chapel Farm and approximately 6.1 acres total of the southern and eastern boundary of the National Register eligible Henry Hostetter Farm.

On the basis of the documentation, it can be concluded that the harm to the resources has been minimized, feasible and prudent alternatives have been explored to avoid impact upon the resources and section 2002 of The Administrative Code of 1929 has been fulfilled as it relates to this project.

Mitigation measures will be taken to minimize harm as stipulated in the EA. No significant environmental impact is likely to result from the proposed action.
