## DELAWARE RIVER BASIN COMMISSION

### Public Hearing and Business Meeting

The Delaware River Basin Commission (Commission) will hold a public hearing on Wednesday, August 9, 2023. A business meeting will be held the following month on Thursday, September 7, 2023. Both the hearing and the business meeting are open to the public and both will be conducted remotely. Details about the remote platforms for the public hearing and the business meeting will be posted on the Commission's web site at [www.drbc.gov](http://www.drbc.gov), at least 10 days prior to the respective hearing and meeting dates. Both the public hearing and the business meeting will be streamed live on the Commission's YouTube channel.

*Public hearing.* The Commission will conduct the public hearing virtually on August 9, 2023, beginning at 1:30 p.m. Hearing items will include draft dockets for withdrawals, discharges and other projects that could have a substantial effect on the basin's water resources. A list of the projects scheduled for hearing, including project descriptions, along with links to draft dockets, will be posted on the Commission's web site at [www.drbc.gov](http://www.drbc.gov), in a long form of this notice at least 10 days before the hearing date.

Written comments on matters scheduled for hearing on August 9, 2023, will be accepted through 5 p.m. on Monday, August 14, 2023.

The public is advised to check the Commission's web site periodically during the 10 days prior to the hearing date, as items scheduled for hearing may be postponed if additional time is needed to complete the Commission's review. Items also may be added up to 10 days prior to the hearing date. In reviewing docket descriptions, the public is asked to be aware that the details of projects may change during the Commission's review, which is ongoing.

*Business meeting.* The business meeting on September 7, 2023, will begin at 10:30 a.m. and will include: adoption of the minutes of the Commission's June 7, 2023, business meeting; announcements of upcoming meetings and events; a report on hydrologic conditions; reports by the Executive Director and the Commission's General Counsel; and consideration of any items for which a hearing has been completed or is not required. The agenda is expected to include consideration of the draft dockets for withdrawals, discharges and other projects that are subjects of the public hearing on August 9, 2023.

After all scheduled business has been completed and as time allows, the business meeting will be followed by up to 1 hour of open public comment, an opportunity to address the Commission off the record on any topic concerning management of the Delaware River Basin's water resources outside the context of a duly noticed, on-the-record public hearing.

There will be no opportunity for additional public comment for the record at the September 7, 2023, business meeting on items for which a hearing was completed on August 9, 2023, or a previous date. Commission

consideration on September 7, 2023, of items for which the public hearing is closed may result in approval of the item (by docket or resolution) as proposed, approval with changes, denial or deferral. When the Commissioners defer an action, they may announce an additional period for written comment on the item, with or without an additional hearing date, or they may take additional time to consider the input they have already received without requesting further public input. Deferred items will be considered for action at a public meeting of the Commission on a future date.

*Advance registration and sign-up for oral comment.* Links for registration to attend the public hearing and the business meeting will be posted at [www.drbc.gov](http://www.drbc.gov) at least 10 days before each meeting date. Registrants who wish to comment on the record during the public hearing on August 9, 2023, or to address the Commissioners informally during the open public comment session following the meeting on September 7, 2023, as time allows, will be asked to so indicate when registering. ### Amendment Referendum of the Pennsylvania Potato Research Program

Under the applicable provisions of 3 Pa.C.S. §§ 4501—4513 (relating to Agricultural Commodities Marketing Act), an amendment referendum was held from May 30, 2023, to June 29, 2023, to determine if the producers affected by the Pennsylvania Potato Research Program (Program) assented to amend the Program as described in the Referendum Order published at 53 Pa.B. 1811 (April 1, 2023), more particularly by raising the assessment fee from \$8 per acre to \$10 per acre. A teller committee met on July 14, 2023, to count the ballots. The results were as follows: a total of 16 eligible votes were cast with 12 producers voting in favor of and 4 producers voting against the amendment. Eligible producers voting in favor of the Program amendment represented 75% of the votes. Producers voting against the proposed amendment represented 25% of the votes. There were no spoiled or ineligible ballots. In accordance with the foregoing, the Program Order is amended as proposed in the Referendum Order published at 53 Pa.B. 1811 and shall become effective January 1, 2024.

## DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE

### Pennsylvania Potato Research Program; 2023 Order, As Amended

#### Article I: Declaration.

In accordance with the requirements of the Agricultural Commodities Marketing Act, as amended, the Secretary of Agriculture finds that this program effectuates the purposes of said Act.

#### Article II: Definitions.

As used in this research program, the following words and terms shall have the following meanings unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

1. “Act” means the Act of March 24, 1998 (P.L. 217, No. 39) (3 Pa.C.S.A. §§ 4501—4513), as amended, known as the Agricultural Commodities Marketing Act.
2. “Affected Producer” means a person who produces, grows, or causes to be produced or grown five or more acres of potatoes for sale or marketing.
3. “Commodity Research Board” or “Board” consists of the Secretary plus those persons who are appointed by Secretary from among producers whose commodities are subject to this program.
4. “Department” means the Department of Agriculture of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.
5. “Marketing Contract” means any contract or agreement between the Board and a person for the performance of services relating to research, or other objectives in furtherance of this research program.
6. “Person” means an individual, partnership, firm, corporation, association, or any other business unit.

7. “Potatoes” means any potatoes produced in Pennsylvania.

8. “Producer” means a person who produces or grows or causes to be produced or grown potatoes as herein defined.

9. “Secretary” means the Secretary of Agriculture, of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, or his designee.

#### Article III: Scope of Program.

The area affected by this program shall be the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. The program shall apply to all producers who grow (5) or more acres of potatoes for sale.

#### Article IV: Commodity Research Board.

##### Section A. Establishment and Members

The Commodity Research Board shall consist of eleven (11), members, one of whom shall be the Secretary or his designee. The Board shall have the primary decision-making authority in the administration of this research program as provided in the Act.

##### Section B. Term of Office

1. The term of office of each appointed member shall be for three (3) years, beginning July 1 and ending June 30.
2. The Secretary, or his designee, will be a member of the Board, and the other ten (10) members shall be appointed by the Secretary from among the affected producers. In making these appointments, the Secretary shall consider nominations submitted by the affected producers. Any person appointed as a member of the Board.

3. Successor members of the Board shall be appointed in the same manner as the initial members of the Board. Members shall serve in such capacities for the portion of the term of office for which they are appointed and until their respective successors are appointed and qualified.

4. Any person appointed as a member of the Board shall be and remain an affected producer while a member of the Board and shall qualify by filing a written acceptance with the Secretary within fifteen (15) days of being notified of appointment.

5. To fill any vacancy occasioned by the failure or inability of any appointee to perform the duties of a member on the Board, a successor for the unexpired term of such member shall be appointed by the Secretary from among the affected producers.

6. The regular meetings of the Board will be held at least three (3) times per year.

##### Section C. Powers and Duties of the Board

The Commodity Research Board shall have the primary decision-making authority relative to research contracts and other projects in furtherance of this research program and shall have the following powers and duties:

1. To determine all matters pertaining to this research program.
2. To hire and employ personnel which the Board deems necessary for the proper administration of this research program and to fix the compensation and terms of employment of such personnel.
3. To adopt written procedures for acquiring and disposing of property, and subject to these procedures, to acquire, own, use, hire, lease, operate, and dispose of personal property, real property, and interests in real property.

4. To make and enter into all contracts and agreements, in accordance with the provisions of the law, which the Board deems necessary or incidental to the furtherance of the research program or performance of duties and powers pursuant to the Act. The Board shall adopt written procurement procedures for all research contracts.

5. To receive, account for and disburse all monies collected pursuant to this research program.

6. To prepare a budget for the administration, operating costs and expenses of this research program.

7. To receive and report to the Secretary complaints or violations of this research program and to assist and cooperate with the Secretary in the enforcement thereof.

8. To establish committees or sub-committees to carry out assigned duties and functions, and to designate Board members and non-Board members to serve on such committees and subcommittees.

9. To collect and gather information and data relevant to the proper administration of this research program.

10. To charge fees and to assist the Secretary in the imposition of fees and the collection of fees and revenues pursuant to the Act.

11. To issue an annual report on the operation of the research program.

12. To recommend amendments to this research program and amendments to the Act and regulations issued pursuant thereto.

#### *Section D. Expenses and Compensation*

No member of the Board shall receive a salary, but each shall be entitled to his actual expenses incurred while engaged in performing duties authorized herein. In addition, a per diem payment may be made to each Board member or subcommittee member for each day in which a Board member or subcommittee member is performing a duty necessary to the functions of the Board. The per diem payment shall not exceed the maximum sum allowable under the Act.

#### **Article V: Powers and Duties of the Secretary.**

Subject to the provisions contained in the Act, the Secretary shall administer and enforce the provisions of the Act, and shall have and shall exercise all administrative powers necessary to effectuate the purposes of the Act, including the issuance of research programs, the appointment of members to commodity research boards and the providing of personnel, staff, legal counsel, and office facilities required for the administration and enforcement of this research program.

#### **Article VI: Purpose.**

This research program is to provide funds to be used for potato marketing contracts of benefit to the Pennsylvania potato producer. The Secretary and the board may cooperate with any other state or federal agency or other organization to prepare, issue, administer and enforce plans deemed beneficial to the purpose of this program.

#### **Article VII: Budget, Rate of Assessment, Collection of Assessment, and Disbursement of Funds.**

##### *Section A. Budget and Assessment*

A budget shall be prepared and established no later than July 31, for the administration and enforcement of this program and for carrying out duly authorized pro-

grams and research, as herein provided. The rate of assessment shall be \$10.00 per acre on all acres planted.

##### *Section B. Collection of Assessment*

1. Each affected producer shall be responsible for payment of the proper assessment on all potatoes planted.

2. All affected producers (and/or sales agents, should regulations subsequently prescribe) shall make remittance and accounting of the proper assessment to the Secretary or his designated fiscal agent no later than July 31 of the calendar year in which the potatoes were planted.

3. Any delinquent producer may be assessed a penalty for late payments as established by regulation.

##### *Section C. Disbursement of Funds*

Disbursement of funds shall be made in the manner described in the Act and in any regulations promulgated by the Secretary to effectuate the provisions and intent thereof, and in accordance with the provisions of this program.

#### **Article VIII: Effecting Research Program.**

This research program, or amendment thereto, shall not become effective unless and until the Secretary determines by a referendum whether the affected producers assent to the proposed action. The Secretary shall conduct the referendum among affected producers and the affected producers shall be deemed to have assented to the proposed program if, of those voting, not less than a majority by number and a majority by volume (acreage) assent to the proposed program.

#### **Article IX: Amending Research Program.**

The Secretary shall call for a referendum on amendments to the research program within a reasonable period of time, upon the request of the Board or with written request of fifteen percent of the producers in a commodity group of less than two thousand affected producers. In voting on an amendment to the research program, the vote shall be only on the amendment, and shall not terminate the program.

#### **Article X: Terminating Research Program.**

Subject to approval of the Board, the Secretary shall suspend or terminate this research program or any provisions thereof whenever he finds that such provisions or program does not tend to effectuate the purpose of the Act within the standards and subject to the limitations and restrictions imposed in the Act: provided that such termination or suspension shall not be effective until the expiration of the current marketing season.

If the Secretary finds that the termination of the research program is requested in writing, by more than thirty-three and one-third percent of the affected producers who produce for market more than fifty percent of the acreage of potatoes produced within the designated production area for market, he shall terminate or suspend for a specified period, the program or provisions thereof; provided that such termination shall be effective only if announced on or before the first day of July in any calendar year. If fifteen percent of the producers in a commodity group of less than two thousand affected producers request, in writing, that a referendum be held on the question of terminating the program, the Secretary must announce and conduct a referendum within a reasonable period of time. The program shall be terminated if so voted by a majority of those voting.

**Article XI: Research Program Reviewed.**

Every five (5) years the Secretary shall call a referendum of the affected producers of potatoes to determine whether or not a majority of those voting still desire the program.

**Article XII: Interpretation.**

Applicable provisions of this research program shall be interpreted consistent with the Act and the Act shall take precedence in the event of any conflict with this research program.

**Article XIII: Effective Date.**

This research program shall be effective on the first day of January 2024.

### APPLICATIONS FOR NATIONAL POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM (NPDES) PERMITS AND WATER QUALITY MANAGEMENT (WQM) PERMITS UNDER THE CLEAN STREAMS LAW AND FEDERAL CLEAN WATER ACT

This notice provides information about persons who have applied to the Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) for a new, renewed, or amended NPDES or WQM permit, or a permit waiver for certain stormwater discharges, or have submitted a Notice of Intent (NOI) for coverage under a General Permit. The applications and NOIs concern, but are not limited to, effluent discharges from sewage treatment facilities and industrial facilities to surface waters or groundwater; stormwater discharges associated with industrial activity (industrial stormwater), construction activity (construction stormwater), and municipal separate storm sewer systems (MS4s); the application of pesticides; the operation of Concentrated Animal Feeding Operations (CAFOs); and the construction of sewage, industrial waste, and manure storage, collection and treatment facilities. This notice is provided in accordance with 25 Pa. Code Chapters 91 and 92a and 40 CFR Part 122, implementing The Clean Streams Law (35 P.S. §§ 691.1—691.1001) and the Federal Clean Water Act (33 U.S.C.A. §§ 1251—1376). - All Transfer and Minor Amendment Applications/NOIs Received—Transfer and Minor Amendment Applications/NOIs received for Individual and General WQM Permits and Individual and General NPDES Permits, excluding PAG-01 and PAG-02, are identified but do not have public comment periods. DEP provides a 15-day public comment period for Individual WQM Permit Applications for amendments.

Section II identifies individual NPDES permit applications received and draft permits indicating DEP's tentative determination relating to sewage, industrial waste, industrial stormwater, MS4s, pesticides and CAFOs. A 30-day public comment period applies to these applications and draft permits, except when a site-specific water quality criterion is used to establish effluent limitations, in which case a 45-day public comment period applies. The period for comment may be extended at the discretion of DEP for one additional 15-day period. Additional information, including links to draft permits and fact sheets that explain the basis for DEP's tentative determinations may be reviewed by generating the “Applications Received with Comment Periods Report” on DEP's website at [www.dep.pa.gov/CWPublicNotice](http://www.dep.pa.gov/CWPublicNotice). Notification of 15-day extensions for comment will be provided in the “Applications Received with Comment Periods Report” (Comments column).

### **MINING ACTIVITY NPDES DRAFT PERMITS**

This notice provides information about applications for a new, amended or renewed National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permits associated with mining activity (coal or noncoal) permits. The applications concern industrial waste (mining) discharges to surface water and discharges of stormwater associated with mining activities.

This notice is provided in accordance with 25 Pa. Code Chapters 91 and 92a and 40 CFR Part 122, implementing provisions of The Clean Streams Law (35 P.S. §§ 691.1—691.1001) and the Federal Clean Water Act (33 U.S.C.A. §§ 1251—1376).

The Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) has prepared a draft NPDES permit and made a tentative determination to issue the NPDES permit in conjunction with the associated mining activity permit.

*Effluent Limits for Coal Mining Activities*

For coal mining activities, NPDES permits, when issued, will contain effluent limits that are the more stringent of technology-based (BAT) effluent limitations or Water Quality Based Effluent Limits (WQBEL).

The BAT limits for coal mining activities, as provided in 40 CFR Part 434 and 25 Pa. Code Chapters 87—90 are as follows:

A settleable solids instantaneous maximum limit of 0.5 ml/l applies to: surface runoff (resulting from a precipitation event of less than or equal to a 10-year 24-hour event) from active mining areas; active areas disturbed by coal refuse disposal activities; mined areas backfilled and revegetated; and all other discharges and drainage (resulting from a precipitation event of greater than 1-year 24-hour to less than or equal to a 10-year 24-hour event) from coal refuse disposal piles. Similarly, modified BAT limits apply to iron, manganese and suspended solids in surface runoff, discharges and drainage resulting from these precipitation events and those of greater magnitude in accordance with 25 Pa. Code §§ 87.102, 88.92, 88.187, 88.292, 89.52 and 90.102.

Exceptions to BAT effluent limits may be applicable in accordance with 25 Pa. Code §§ 87.102, 88.92, 88.187, 88.292, 89.52 and 90.102.

*Effluent Limits for Noncoal Mining Activities*

The limits for noncoal mining activities as provided in 25 Pa. Code § 77.522 are pH 6 to 9 and other parameters DEP may require.

Discharges from noncoal mines located in some geologic settings (for example, in the coal fields) may require additional water quality based effluent limits. Any person aggrieved by this action may challenge it in an appropriate legal forum. The State and Federal courts are currently split on whether the proper forum to challenge a Department permit, authorization or approval for a facility or activity subject to the Federal Natural Gas Act, 15 U.S.C.A. §§ 717 et seq., is the United States Court of Appeals for the Third Circuit or the Pennsylvania Environmental Hearing Board. See *Delaware Riverkeeper Network v. Sec’y, Dep’t of Env’tl Prot.*, 833 F.3d 360 (3d Cir. 2016); *Delaware Riverkeeper Network v. Sec’y, Dep’t of Env’tl Prot.*, 903 F.3d 65 (3d Cir. 2018), cert. denied, 139 S. Ct. 1648, 203 L. Ed. 899 (2019) and *Cole v. Dep’t. of Env’tl Prot.*, 1577 C.D. 2019 WL 2420667 (Pa. Cmwlth Ct. June 15, 2021) (Pet. for Allowance of Appeal pending); *West Rockhill Twp. v. Dep’t of Env’tl. Prot.*, No. 1595 C.D. 2019 WL 2426014 (Pa. Cmwlth. June 15, 2021) (Pet. for Allowance of Appeal pending).

General grants ranging from \$30,001—\$65,000 (Level II) may be awarded for nonformal education projects that engage youth and teachers from at least 60 Commonwealth counties at three levels: National, State and local. Additionally, Level II projects must demonstrate at least 30% of program participants live, work or attend school within an environmental justice area. For more information on environmental justice areas, visit [www.dep.pa.gov/PublicParticipation/OfficeofEnvironmentalJustice/Pages/PA-Environmental-Justice-Areas.aspx](http://www.dep.pa.gov/PublicParticipation/OfficeofEnvironmentalJustice/Pages/PA-Environmental-Justice-Areas.aspx).

The Program was established by the Environmental Education Act of 1993 (P.L. 105, No. 24), which mandates setting aside 5% of the pollution fines and penalties the Department collects annually for environmental education in this Commonwealth. In its 30-year history, the Program has funded more than \$13.3 million in environmental education projects. Awardees have included schools, nonprofit organizations, colleges and universities, municipalities, county conservation districts and businesses.

#### *Final TGD: Minor Revision*

*DEP ID:* 385-2208-003. *Title:* Alternate Onlot Sewage Pretreatment Technology Verification Policy. *Description:* The purpose of this TGD is to provide scientific methods and minimum levels of pretreatment for demonstrating the performance of onlot alternate technology systems or components. The scientific methods and minimum levels of pretreatment in this TGD can provide the basis for the Department’s evaluation of newly proposed onlot sewage system or component technologies for which approval as an alternate system or component in this Commonwealth is being sought. The TGD provides a consistent approach for the submission, review and approval or disapproval of proposed alternate onlot pretreatment technologies. Compared with the version published as final at 50 Pa.B. 2473 (May 9, 2020), the TGD has been updated to reflect amendments to the Pennsylvania Sewage Facilities Act (35 P.S. §§ 750.1—750.20a) made by the act of June 5, 2020 (P.L. 257, No. 34) (Act 34). The revised TGD also includes minor revisions to clarify certain parts of the TGD based on the experience of the Department’s Sewage Facilities Planning Program staff reviewing several applications for technology approval using the process described in the TGD. Minor revisions to the TGD include the following:

- Throughout the TGD, all references to the act of July 20, 2017 (P.L. 321, No. 26) have been removed since the Pennsylvania Sewage Facilities Act was subsequently amended by Act 34.
- Throughout the TGD, all use of the term “performance standard” has been removed and replaced with “minimum level of pretreatment.”
- Throughout the TGD, all use of the term “experimental systems” has been removed. The TGD does not provide the process for testing and approving experimental systems.
- Throughout the TGD, language has been updated for clarity.
- The format of the “Introduction” section has been changed to provide clarity.
- Changed the timing for the manufacturer to choose the type of performance monitoring before technology classification instead of after technology classification. This was done to facilitate the public comment review process and the development of a technology-specific guidance document.
- Removed language that allows technologies that are not certified by an accredited NSF/American National Standards Institute (ANSI) organization to participate in the alternate approval process. Based on experience, the Department’s Sewage Facilities Planning Program staff determined that without a certification from an accredited NSF/ANSI organization, the Department will not be able to verify that the technology being marketed after approval is the same technology that went through the approval process. The NSF/ANSI certification organizations provide an insignia or “mark” on all products certified under the organization’s process and they complete annual audits of the manufacturing process to confirm the NSF/ANSI certified product uses the same technology that was certified.

- Added language to reflect current practice allowing technologies that are certified by an accredited NSF/ANSI organization based on testing that was performed at a test center with a climate warmer than the Commonwealth. Many of the technologies that have received NSF/ANSI certifications were tested at test centers in southern states such as Texas, Louisiana or Hawaii. This was done to allow these technologies to enter the technology verification process with the stipulation that the Department may ask for additional field-testing sites to compensate for their certification being completed under less harsh weather conditions than is typical of the Commonwealth.

- Added language to reflect current practice which does not require a certification from an accredited NSF/ANSI organization for fecal coliform (FC) removal. The NSF/ANSI 40 certification is the most common certification attained by manufacturers for onlot sewage treatment technologies. However, NSF does not evaluate FC removal. Due to this fact, most manufacturers do not have information about FC removal. Previously, if a manufacturer wished to receive approval for FC removal, they would not be able to since NSF/ANSI 40 standard does not measure FC removal performance. Without the change, the Department was limited to accepting technologies for TVP testing that have completed the NSF/ANSI 350 certification. The list of products that are NSF 350 approved is significantly smaller than the NSF/ANSI 40 list.

- Updated language to address non-proprietary alternate onlot systems.

- Included language that reflects the Department's current expectation that the manufacturer develop a Sewage Enforcement Officer (SEO) training course for each technology. SEOs are required to successfully complete training for alternate technologies before the Department delegates the ability to independently review permits using the alternate technology. The manufacturer's development of this training before classification provides assurance to the Department that SEOs will be able to receive the training necessary to review and permit the technology at the same time the technology is approved.

- Moved ongoing performance monitoring language from the introduction to a section renamed "Performance monitoring." Expanded on the existing language for ongoing performance to provide clarity on what would be expected of the manufacturer if they choose the performance monitoring option.

- Removed language that referenced the possibility of the manufacturer, if they complete the performance audit, to become a conventional technology. The ability for an alternate technology to become conventional was removed from the Sewage Facilities Act when Act 34 of 2020 was enacted.

- Updated the performance audit language to clarify the Department's expectation of the manufacturer with regard to the list of all installed onlot alternate technologies in this Commonwealth. Based on experience, the Department needs more detail in this section to make an informed decision on which installations should or should not be a part of the audit.

- Removed reference to the Chesapeake Data Sharing Agreement. The agreement has expired, with no discussion of renewal.

### Pennsylvania's 2023 Annual Ambient Air Monitoring Network Plan

The Department of Environmental Protection (Department) is seeking public comment on Pennsylvania's 2023 Annual Ambient Air Monitoring Network Plan (Plan). The Plan has been updated to address changes that have been made in the Commonwealth's ambient air monitoring network and to identify changes that are anticipated to occur in the remainder of 2023 and in 2024.

On October 17, 2006, the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) promulgated final amendments to the National ambient air monitoring requirements for criteria pollutants at 40 CFR Parts 53 and 58 (relating to ambient air monitoring reference and equivalent methods; and ambient air quality surveillance). See 71 FR 61235 (October 17, 2006). The EPA's final rule requires state and local agencies to enhance air monitoring to "improve public health protection and better inform the public about air quality in their communities." Under 40 CFR 58.10 (relating to annual monitoring network plan and periodic network assessment), air quality state and local monitoring agencies must adopt an annual air monitoring network plan and make the plan available for public inspection for at least 30 days prior to final submission to the EPA Regional Administrator. The Plan, which was due July 1, 2023, must have included a statement of purpose for each monitor and evidence that siting and operation of each monitor meets Federal requirements. The EPA may also provide an opportunity for review and comment prior to approving or disapproving a state's monitoring network plan.

### Pennsylvania Happy Camper Fast Play Game 5206

Under the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314) and 61 Pa. Code § 803.11 (relating to powers and duties of the Secretary of Revenue), the Secretary of Revenue hereby provides public notice of the rules for the following lottery game:

1. *Name:* The name of the lottery game is Pennsylvania Happy Camper (“Happy Camper”). The game number is PA-5206.

2. *Definitions:*

(a) *Authorized retailer or retailer:* A person who is properly licensed by the Lottery pursuant to 61 Pa. Code §§ 805.1—805.17.

(b) *Bar code:* The symbology on the ticket containing certain encrypted validation and accounting data used for identifying winning and losing tickets.

(c) *CAMPER CASH:* The area at the bottom of a Happy Camper Fast Play lottery game ticket containing four play symbols and a prize symbol that, when played according to the instructions, determines whether the player wins the prize amount shown. CAMPER CASH is played separately.

(d) *Game Ticket:* A bearer instrument produced through a Lottery Terminal that is the player's record of a play for a Fast Play lottery game and sold by an authorized retailer containing the play and validation data as published in this game notice.

(e) *Lottery Central Computer System:* The computer gaming system on which all Fast Play plays are recorded.

(f) *Lottery Terminal:* A device authorized by the Lottery to function in an interactive mode with the Lottery Central Computer System for the purpose of issuing plays, executing Quick Pick selections, and entering, receiving, and processing lottery transactions, including making purchases, validating plays, transmitting reports and performing inventory functions.

(g) *Play:* A chance to participate in a particular Fast Play lottery game.

(h) *Play Area:* The area on a ticket which contains one or more play symbols.

(i) *Play Symbol:* A number, letter, symbol, image or other character found in the play area which is used to determine whether a player wins a prize.

(j) *Prize:* A non-monetary item, money or experience that can be won as specified in section 6 (relating to prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners) of this game notice.

(k) *WINNING NUMBERS:* The numbers, letters, symbols or other characters found in the play area that, when matched against the play symbols in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area, determine whether a player wins a prize.

(l) *Winning ticket*: A game ticket which has been validated and qualifies for a prize.

(m) *YOUR NUMBERS*: The numbers, letters, symbols or other characters found in the play area that, when matched against the play symbols in the “WINNING NUMBERS” area, determine whether a player wins a prize.

3. *Price*: The price of a Happy Camper ticket is \$1.

4. *Description of the Happy Camper Fast Play lottery game*:

(a) The Happy Camper lottery game is an instant win game printed from a Lottery Terminal. All prizes are predetermined, and the player does not have the ability to select their own play symbols. Happy Camper tickets may be purchased from an authorized retailer or at a Lottery self-service terminal that sells terminal-based Lottery game tickets. Tickets purchased from an authorized retailer shall be printed on-demand at the time of purchase and may not be preprinted by the retailer.

(b) Happy Camper is played by matching any of the play symbols located in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area to any of the play symbols located in the “WINNING NUMBERS” area. A player matching play symbols in this manner will win the prize shown under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol. A bet slip is not used to play this game.

(c) Happy Camper tickets contain a “CAMPER CASH” area. Whenever two matching symbols appear in the “CAMPER CASH” area, the player wins the prize amount shown. “CAMPER CASH” is played separately.

(d) Players can win the prizes identified in section 6 (relating to prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners).

(e) Happy Camper tickets cannot be canceled or voided once printed by the Lottery Terminal, even if printed in error.

(f) To purchase a ticket at an authorized retailer, a player must remit the purchase price to the retailer and verbally request a Happy Camper ticket. The ticket shall be the only valid proof of the bet placed and the only valid receipt for claiming a prize.

(g) To purchase a ticket at a Pennsylvania Lottery self-service terminal, the player must insert into the self-service terminal a dollar amount equal to the total purchase price of a Happy Camper ticket and select the Happy Camper option on the Lottery self-service terminal. The ticket shall be the only valid proof of the bet placed and the only valid receipt for claiming a prize.

#### 5. *Happy Camper ticket characteristics*:

(a) Happy Camper tickets shall contain a play area, the cost of the play, the date of sale and a bar code.

(b) *Play Symbols*: Happy Camper tickets will contain a “WINNING NUMBERS” area, a “YOUR NUMBERS” area and a “CAMPER CASH” area. “CAMPER CASH” is played separately. The play symbols and their captions, located in the “WINNING NUMBERS” area and the “YOUR NUMBERS” area, are: 1 (ONE), 2 (TWO), 3 (THREE), 4 (FOUR), 5 (FIVE), 6 (SIX), 7 (SEVEN), 8 (EIGHT), 9 (NINE), 10 (TEN), 11 (ELEVN), 12 (TWLV), 13 (THRTN), 14 (FORTN), 15 (FIFTN), 16 (SIXTN), 17 (SVNTN), 18 (EGHTN), 19 (NINTN), 20 (TWENT), 21 (TWYONE), 22 (TWYTWO), 23 (TWYTHR), 24 (TWYFOR), 25 (TWYFIV), 26 (TWYSIX), 27 (TWYSVN), 28 (TWYEGT), 29 (TWYNIN) and 30 (THIRT). The play symbols and their captions, located in the “CAMPER

CASH” area, are: Bear (BEAR) symbol, Campfire (CMPFIRE) symbol, Butterfly (BTTRFLY) symbol, Map (MAP) symbol, Tent (TENT) symbol, Lantern (LANTRN) symbol, Forest (FOREST) symbol, Compass (COMPASS) symbol, Binoculars (BNCULRS) symbol, Boots (BOOTS) symbol, Cabin (CABIN) symbol and a Flashlight (FLSHLGT) symbol.

(c) *Prize Symbols*: The prize symbols and their captions, located in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area, are: FREE (TICKET), \$1<sup>00</sup> (ONE DOL), \$2<sup>00</sup> (TWO DOL), \$3<sup>00</sup> (THR DOL), \$5<sup>00</sup> (FIV DOL), \$10<sup>00</sup> (TEN DOL), \$15<sup>00</sup> (FIFTEEN), \$20<sup>00</sup> (TWENTY), \$25<sup>00</sup> (TWY FIV), \$50<sup>00</sup> (FIFTY), \$100 (ONE HUN), \$500 (FIV HUN) and \$1,500 (FIFTNHUN). The prize symbols and their captions, located in the “CAMPER CASH” area, are: \$1<sup>00</sup> (ONE DOL), \$2<sup>00</sup> (TWO DOL), \$3<sup>00</sup> (THR DOL), \$5<sup>00</sup> (FIV DOL), \$10<sup>00</sup> (TEN DOL), \$15<sup>00</sup> (FIFTEEN), \$20<sup>00</sup> (TWENTY), \$25<sup>00</sup> (TWY FIV), \$50<sup>00</sup> (FIFTY) and \$100 (ONE HUN).

(e) *Approximate number of tickets available for the game*: Approximately 600,000 tickets will be available for sale for the Happy Camper lottery game.

6. *Prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners*:

(a) All Happy Camper prize payments will be made as one-time, lump-sum cash payments.

(b) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$1,500 (FIFTNHUN) appears in the Prize area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1,500.

(c) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$500 (FIV HUN) appears in the Prize area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$500.

(s) Holders of tickets upon which two matching play symbols appear in the “CAMPER CASH” area and a prize symbol of \$3.<sup>00</sup> (THR DOL) appears in the Prize area within the “CAMPER CASH” area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$3.

(t) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$2.<sup>00</sup> (TWO DOL) appears in the Prize area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$2.

(u) Holders of tickets upon which two matching play symbols appear in the “CAMPER CASH” area and a prize symbol of \$2.<sup>00</sup> (TWO DOL) appears in the Prize area within the “CAMPER CASH” area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$2.

(v) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$1.<sup>00</sup> (ONE DOL) appears in the Prize area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1.

(w) Holders of tickets upon which two matching play symbols appear in the “CAMPER CASH” area and a prize symbol of \$1.<sup>00</sup> (ONE DOL) appears in the Prize area within the “CAMPER CASH” area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1.

(x) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of FREE (TICKET) appears in the Prize area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of one Happy Camper Fast Play Game Ticket.

8. *Ticket responsibility:*

(a) A Fast Play lottery game ticket is a bearer document deemed to be owned by the person holding the game ticket, except that if a name is contained on the back of the game ticket, the person named will, for all purposes, be considered the owner of the game ticket.

(b) The holder of a Fast Play lottery game ticket has the sole responsibility for checking the accuracy and condition of the data printed on the game ticket.

(c) The Commonwealth shall not be responsible for a lost or stolen Fast Play lottery game ticket, or for a Fast Play ticket redeemed by a player in error.

9. *Ticket validation and requirements:*

(a) *Valid Fast Play lottery game tickets.* To be a valid Fast Play lottery game ticket, the presented game ticket must meet the following requirements:

(1) The game ticket's bar code shall be present in its entirety.

(2) The game ticket must be intact.

(3) The game ticket may not be mutilated, altered, reconstituted or tampered with.

(4) The game ticket may not be counterfeit or a duplicate of a winning ticket.

(5) The game ticket must have been validly issued.

(6) The game ticket data shall have been recorded on the Lottery Central Computer System and the game ticket data shall match the computer record in every respect.

(7) The game ticket must not be defectively printed or printed or produced in error such that it cannot be processed or validated by the Lottery.

(8) The game ticket must pass other confidential security checks of the Lottery.

(b) *Invalid or defective game tickets.* A game ticket not passing the validation requirements in subsection (a) will be considered invalid and no payment will be made on account of any play recorded thereon. The determination of the Secretary in this regard is final.

10. *Procedures for claiming and payment of prizes:*

(a) A prize may be claimed through an authorized retailer or the Lottery, as provided in this section. A prize must be claimed within 1 year of the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket.

(b) An authorized retailer is authorized to pay prizes of \$2,500 or less. The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play representing a prize of \$2,500 or less may be paid by a participating authorized retailer if a proper validation pay ticket was issued by the retailer's Lottery Terminal.

(c) The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play representing a prize in excess of \$2,500 may present the game ticket to an authorized retailer, Lottery District Office, or Lottery Headquarters.

(d) The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play shall present the ticket, in person, to an authorized retailer, Lottery Headquarters or a Lottery District Office. The retailer or the Lottery will issue payment if:

(1) The game ticket is scanned, and the play is validated through the Lottery Terminal or the Lottery Central Computer System;

(2) A claim form is properly and fully completed;

(3) The identification of the claimant is confirmed; and

(4) The winning ticket has not expired, pursuant to this section or section 12 (relating to unclaimed prizes).

(e) The Commonwealth shall not be responsible for a winning play paid in error by an authorized retailer.

(f) In the event a prize described in these rules is not available, the Lottery may either provide a substitute prize, determined by the Secretary to have an equivalent value to the prize won, or make a cash payment to the winner, in an amount determined by the Secretary to have an equivalent value to the prize won.

11. *Funding for prizes:* Moneys will be drawn from the State Lottery Fund, to the extent necessary, to fund the payment of prizes under this section. If this lottery game is terminated for any cause, prize moneys remaining undistributed will remain in the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes otherwise provided for by law.

12. *Unclaimed prizes:* Unclaimed prize money on winning Fast Play lottery game tickets will be retained by the Secretary for payment to the persons entitled thereto for 1 year from the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket. If no claim is made within 1 year from the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket, the right of a ticket holder to claim the prize represented by that ticket, if any, shall expire.

13. *Purchase and prize restrictions:* A Fast Play lottery game ticket may not be purchased by, and a prize may not be paid, to an officer or employee of the Lottery, Lottery professional services contractors or subcontractors.

tors, or to a spouse, child, brother, sister or parent residing in the same household of an officer, employee, contractor or subcontractor who is involved in the production, distribution or operation of systems for the validation or accounting of Fast Play games.

14. *Governing law:*

(a) By purchasing a ticket, the purchaser agrees to comply with and abide by the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314), this notice, instructions, conditions and final decisions of the Secretary, and procedures established by the Secretary for the conduct of the Fast Play Happy Camper lottery game.

(b) Decisions made by the Secretary, including the declaration of prizes and the payment thereof, in interpretation of this notice are final and binding on players and persons making a claim in respect thereof.

15. *Retailer compensation:*

(a) Authorized retailers may be entitled to compensation as determined by the Lottery.

(b) No authorized retailer or employee of an authorized retailer shall request, demand, or accept gratuities or any compensation other than as provided in subsection (a) in exchange for the performance of duties authorized pursuant to the Lottery retailer's license without the Lottery's prior written authorization.

16. *Retailer Incentive Programs:* The Lottery may conduct a separate Retailer Incentive Program for retailers who sell Pennsylvania Fast Play Happy Camper lottery game tickets.

17. *Retailer bonus:* The Lottery may offer a retailer bonus in connection with the sale of Pennsylvania Fast Play lottery game tickets. If a retailer bonus is offered, a Lottery retailer shall be eligible for a bonus as described in this section. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$100,000 and not exceeding \$500,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$500. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$500,001 and not exceeding \$1,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$5,000. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$1,000,001 and not exceeding \$10,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$10,000. A Lottery retailer is entitled only to the largest bonus for which they qualify on a winning ticket. A bonus will be initiated for payment after the Fast Play game ticket is claimed and validated. A bonus will not be awarded to a Lottery retailer that sells a non-winning Pennsylvania Lottery Fast Play game ticket used to enter a Pennsylvania Lottery second-chance drawing or promotion that is subsequently selected to win a prize.

18. *Termination of the game:* The Secretary may announce a termination date, after which no further tickets from this game may be sold. The announcement will be disseminated through media used to advertise or promote Happy Camper or through normal communications methods.

19. *Applicability:* This notice applies only to the Happy Camper lottery game announced in this notice.

### Pennsylvania PRESS YOUR LUCK® Fast Play Game 5205

Under the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314) and 61 Pa. Code § 803.11 (relating to powers and duties of the Secretary of Revenue), the Secretary of Revenue hereby provides public notice of the rules for the following lottery game:

1. *Name:* The name of the lottery game is Pennsylvania PRESS YOUR LUCK® (“PRESS YOUR LUCK®”). The game number is PA-5205.

2. *Definitions:*

(a) *Authorized retailer or retailer:* A person who is properly licensed by the Lottery pursuant to 61 Pa. Code §§ 805.1—805.17.

(b) *Bar code:* The symbology on the ticket containing certain encrypted validation and accounting data used for identifying winning and losing tickets.

(c) *Game Ticket:* A bearer instrument produced through a Lottery Terminal that is the player's record of a play for a Fast Play lottery game and sold by an authorized retailer containing the play and validation data as published in this game notice.

(d) *Lottery Central Computer System:* The computer gaming system on which all Fast Play plays are recorded.

(e) *Lottery Terminal:* A device authorized by the Lottery to function in an interactive mode with the Lottery Central Computer System for the purpose of issuing plays, executing Quick Pick selections, and entering, receiving, and processing lottery transactions, including making purchases, validating plays, transmitting reports and performing inventory functions.

(f) *STOP! NUMBER:* The area at the top of a PRESS YOUR LUCK® Fast Play lottery game ticket containing one play symbol that, when matched according to the instructions, determines whether the player wins all 12 prizes shown in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area.

(g) *NO WHAMMIES WINALL:* The area on a PRESS YOUR LUCK® Fast Play lottery game ticket that, when matched according to the instructions, determines whether the player wins all 12 prizes shown in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area. The Whammy (WHAMMY) symbol included within the “NO WHAMMIES WINALL” instructions does not determine whether a “NO WHAMMIES WINALL” prize is awarded.

(h) *Play:* A chance to participate in a particular Fast Play lottery game.

(i) *Play Area:* The area on a ticket which contains one or more play symbols.

(j) *Play Symbol:* A number, letter, symbol, image or other character found in the play area which is used to determine whether a player wins a prize.

(k) *Prize*: A non-monetary item, money, or experience that can be won as specified in section 7 (relating to prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners) of this game notice.

(l) *WINNING NUMBERS*: The numbers, letters, symbols or other characters found in the play area that, when matched against the play symbols in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area, determine whether a player wins a prize.

(m) *Winning ticket*: A game ticket which has been validated and qualifies for a prize.

(n) *YOUR NUMBERS*: The numbers, letters, symbols or other characters found in the play area that, when matched against the play symbols in the “WINNING NUMBERS” area, determine whether a player wins a prize.

3. *Price*: The price of a PRESS YOUR LUCK® ticket is \$5.

4. *Description of the PRESS YOUR LUCK® Fast Play lottery game*:

(a) The PRESS YOUR LUCK® lottery game is an instant win game printed from a Lottery Terminal. All prizes are predetermined, and the player does not have the ability to select their own play symbols. PRESS YOUR LUCK® tickets may be purchased from an authorized retailer or at a Lottery self-service terminal that sells terminal-based Lottery game tickets. Tickets purchased from an authorized retailer shall be printed on-demand at the time of purchase and may not be preprinted by the retailer.

(b) PRESS YOUR LUCK® is played by matching any of the play symbols located in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area to any of the play symbols located in the “WINNING NUMBERS” area. A player matching play symbols in this manner will win the prize shown under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol. A bet slip is not used to play this game.

(c) PRESS YOUR LUCK® tickets contain a “NO WHAMMIES WINALL” area. Whenever the “STOP! NUMBER” play symbol at the top of a PRESS YOUR LUCK® ticket matches any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols on that ticket and no Whammy (WHAMMY) symbol appears in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area, the player wins all 12 prizes shown. The Whammy (WHAMMY) symbol included within the “NO WHAMMIES WINALL” instructions does not determine whether a “NO WHAMMIES WINALL” prize is awarded.

(d) Players can win the prizes identified in section 7 (relating to prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners).

(e) PRESS YOUR LUCK® tickets cannot be canceled or voided once printed by the Lottery Terminal, even if printed in error.

(f) To purchase a ticket at an authorized retailer, a player must remit the purchase price to the retailer and verbally request a PRESS YOUR LUCK® ticket. The ticket shall be the only valid proof of the bet placed and the only valid receipt for claiming a prize.

(g) To purchase a ticket at a Pennsylvania Lottery self-service terminal, the player must insert into the self-service terminal a dollar amount equal to the total purchase price of a PRESS YOUR LUCK® ticket and select the PRESS YOUR LUCK® option on the Lottery self-service terminal. The ticket shall be the only valid proof of the bet placed and the only valid receipt for claiming a prize.

5. *PRESS YOUR LUCK® ticket characteristics*:

(a) PRESS YOUR LUCK® tickets shall contain a play area, the cost of the play, the date of sale and a bar code.

(b) *Play Symbols*: PRESS YOUR LUCK® tickets will contain a “WINNING NUMBERS” area, a “YOUR NUMBERS” area, a “STOP! NUMBER” area and a “NO WHAMMIES WINALL” area. The play symbols and their captions, located in the “WINNING NUMBERS” area and the “STOP! NUMBER” area, are: 1 (ONE), 2 (TWO), 3 (THREE), 4 (FOUR), 5 (FIVE), 6 (SIX), 7 (SEVEN), 8 (EIGHT), 9 (NINE), 10 (TEN), 11 (ELEVN), 12 (TWLV), 13 (THRTN), 14 (FORTN), 15 (FIFTN), 16 (SIXTN), 17 (SVNTN), 18 (EGHTN), 19 (NINTN), 20 (TWENT), 21 (TWYONE), 22 (TWYTWO), 23 (TWYTHR), 24 (TWYFOR), 25 (TWYFIV), 26 (TWYSIX), 27 (TWYSVN), 28 (TWYEGT), 29 (TWYNIN) and 30 (THIRT). The play symbols and their captions, located in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area, are: 1 (ONE), 2 (TWO), 3 (THREE), 4 (FOUR), 5 (FIVE), 6 (SIX), 7 (SEVEN), 8 (EIGHT), 9 (NINE), 10 (TEN), 11 (ELEVN), 12 (TWLV), 13 (THRTN), 14 (FORTN), 15 (FIFTN), 16 (SIXTN), 17 (SVNTN), 18 (EGHTN), 19 (NINTN), 20 (TWENT), 21 (TWYONE), 22 (TWYTWO), 23 (TWYTHR), 24 (TWYFOR), 25 (TWYFIV), 26 (TWYSIX), 27 (TWYSVN), 28 (TWYEGT), 29 (TWYNIN), 30 (THIRT), a BIG BUCKS (BIGBUCKS) symbol and a Whammy (WHAMMY) symbol.

(c) *Prize Symbols*: The prize symbols and their captions, located in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area, are: \$5<sup>00</sup> (FIV DOL), \$10<sup>00</sup> (TEN DOL), \$15<sup>00</sup> (FIFTEEN), \$25<sup>00</sup> (TWY FIV), \$50<sup>00</sup> (FIFTY), \$100 (ONE HUN), \$200 (TWO HUN), \$500 (FIV HUN), \$1,000 (ONE THO), \$5,000 (FIV THO) and \$75,000 (SVYFIVTHO).

(d) *Prizes*: The prizes that can be won in this game are: \$5, \$10, \$15, \$25, \$50, \$100, \$200, \$500, \$1,000, \$5,000 and \$75,000. A player can win up to 12 times on a ticket.

(e) *Approximate number of tickets available for the game*: Approximately 960,000 tickets will be available for sale for the PRESS YOUR LUCK® lottery game.

6. The Pennsylvania Lottery will conduct a PRESS YOUR LUCK® Second-Chance Drawing for which non-winning PRESS YOUR LUCK® lottery game tickets may be eligible as provided for in section 9.

7. *Prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners*:

(a) All PRESS YOUR LUCK® prize payments will be made as one-time, lump-sum cash payments.

(b) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$75,000 (SVYFIVTHO) appears in the Prize area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$75,000.

(c) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$5,000 (FIV THO) appears in the Prize area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$5,000.

(d) Holders of tickets upon which the “STOP! NUMBER” play symbol matches any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and upon which no Whammy (WHAMMY) symbol appears in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area and a prize symbol of \$1,000 (ONE THO) appears in two of the Prize areas, a prize symbol of \$500 (FIV HUN)



appears in four of the Prize areas, a prize symbol of \$200 (TWO HUN) appears in four of the Prize areas and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in two of the Prize areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$5,000.

(e) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$1,000 (ONE THO) appears in the Prize area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1,000.

(f) Holders of tickets upon which a BIG BUCKS (BIG BUCKS) play symbol appears in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area and a prize symbol of \$1,000 (ONE THO) appears in the Prize area under that BIG BUCKS (BIG BUCKS) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1,000.

(g) Holders of tickets upon which the “STOP! NUMBER” play symbol matches any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and upon which no Whammy (WHAMMY) symbol appears in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area and a prize symbol of \$200 (TWO HUN) appears in two of the Prize areas, a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in three of the Prize areas, a prize symbol of \$50<sup>.00</sup> (FIFTY) appears in five of the Prize areas and a prize symbol of \$25<sup>.00</sup> (TWY FIV) appears in two of the Prize areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1,000.

(j) Holders of tickets upon which a BIG BUCKS (BIG BUCKS) play symbol appears in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area and a prize symbol of \$500 (FIV HUN) appears in the Prize area under that BIG BUCKS (BIG BUCKS) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$500.

(k) Holders of tickets upon which the “STOP! NUMBER” play symbol matches any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and upon which no Whammy (WHAMMY) symbol appears in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area and a prize symbol of \$200 (TWO HUN) appears in two of the Prize areas, a prize symbol of \$15<sup>.00</sup> (FIFTEEN) appears in three of the Prize areas, a prize symbol of \$10<sup>.00</sup> (TEN DOL) appears in four of the Prize areas and a prize symbol of \$5<sup>.00</sup> (FIV DOL) appears in three of the Prize areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$500.

(l) Holders of tickets upon which the “STOP! NUMBER” play symbol matches any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and upon which no Whammy

(o) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$200 (TWO HUN) appears in the Prize area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$200.

(p) Holders of tickets upon which a BIG BUCKS (BIG BUCKS) play symbol appears in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area and a prize symbol of \$200 (TWO HUN) appears in the Prize area under that BIG BUCKS (BIG BUCKS) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$200.

(q) Holders of tickets upon which the “STOP! NUMBER” play symbol matches any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and upon which no Whammy (WHAMMY) symbol appears in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area and a prize symbol of \$50<sup>.00</sup> (FIFTY) appears in two of the Prize areas, a prize symbol of \$15<sup>.00</sup> (FIFTEEN) appears in four of the Prize areas, a prize symbol of \$10<sup>.00</sup> (TEN DOL) appears in two of the Prize areas and a prize symbol of \$5<sup>.00</sup> (FIV DOL) appears in four of the Prize areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$200.

(r) Holders of tickets upon which the “STOP! (s) Holders of tickets upon which the “STOP! NUMBER” play symbol matches any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and upon which no Whammy (WHAMMY) symbol appears in the “YOUR NUMBERS”

area and a prize symbol of \$25<sup>00</sup> (TWY FIV) appears in two of the Prize areas, a prize symbol of \$15<sup>00</sup> (FIFTEEN) appears in four of the Prize areas, a prize symbol of \$10<sup>00</sup> (TEN DOL) appears in three of the Prize areas, a prize symbol of \$5<sup>00</sup> (FIV DOL) appears in two of the Prize areas and a prize symbol of \$50<sup>00</sup> (FIFTY) appears in one of the Prize areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$200.

(t) Holders of tickets upon which the “STOP! NUMBER” play symbol matches any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and upon which no Whammy (WHAMMY) symbol appears in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area and a prize symbol of \$10<sup>00</sup> (TEN DOL) appears in five of the Prize areas, a prize symbol of \$5<sup>00</sup> (FIV DOL) appears in five of the Prize areas, a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in one of the Prize areas and a prize symbol of \$25<sup>00</sup> (TWY FIV) appears in one of the Prize areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$200.

(u) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in the Prize area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.

(v) Holders of tickets upon which a BIG BUCKS (BIG BUCKS) play symbol appears in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in the Prize area under that BIG BUCKS (BIG BUCKS) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.

(w) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$50<sup>00</sup> (FIFTY) appears in the Prize area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$50.

(x) Holders of tickets upon which a BIG BUCKS (BIG BUCKS) play symbol appears in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area and a prize symbol of \$50<sup>00</sup> (FIFTY) appears in the Prize area under that BIG BUCKS (BIG BUCKS) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$50.

(y) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$25<sup>00</sup> (TWY FIV) appears in the Prize area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$25.

(z) Holders of tickets upon which a BIG BUCKS (BIG BUCKS) play symbol appears in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area and a prize symbol of \$25<sup>00</sup> (TWY FIV) appears in the Prize area under that BIG BUCKS (BIG BUCKS) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$25.

(aa) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$15<sup>00</sup> (FIFTEEN) appears in the Prize area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$15.

(bb) Holders of tickets upon which a BIG BUCKS (BIG BUCKS) play symbol appears in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area and a prize symbol of \$15<sup>00</sup> (FIFTEEN) appears in the Prize area under that BIG BUCKS (BIG BUCKS) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$15.

(cc) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$10<sup>00</sup> (TEN DOL) appears in the Prize area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$10.

(dd) Holders of tickets upon which a BIG BUCKS (BIG BUCKS) play symbol appears in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area and a prize symbol of \$10<sup>00</sup> (TEN DOL) appears in the Prize area under that BIG BUCKS (BIG BUCKS) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$10.

(ee) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$5<sup>00</sup> (FIV DOL) appears in the Prize area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$5.

(ff) Holders of tickets upon which a BIG BUCKS (BIG BUCKS) play symbol appears in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area and a prize symbol of \$5<sup>00</sup> (FIV DOL) appears in the Prize area under that BIG BUCKS (BIG BUCKS) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$5.

9. *Second-Chance Drawing:* The PRESS YOUR LUCK® Second-Chance Drawing from the Pennsylvania Lottery ("Lottery") for qualifying Fast Play lottery game tickets ("Drawing").

(a) *Qualifying Tickets:* Non-winning PA-5205 PRESS YOUR LUCK® (\$5) Fast Play lottery game tickets ("Qualifying Tickets") are eligible for entry in the Drawing.

(b) *Participation and entry:*

(1) Entrants must have a registered lottery account in order to participate in the Drawing. To create a lottery

account, visit <https://www.pailottery.com>. Creating a lottery account is free.

(2) A registered lottery account holder is subject to the iLottery regulations and specifically agrees to be bound by the iLottery terms and conditions located at <https://www.pailottery.com/signup/terms-and-conditions/>, as well as any related policies.

(3) To establish a lottery account, players must provide the following information:

(i) The player's name as it appears on a valid government-issued identification or tax documents;

(ii) The player's date of birth;

(iii) The entire or last four digits of the player's Social Security Number, or comparable equivalent;

- (iv) The player's address;
- (v) The player's telephone number;
- (vi) The player's email address;
- (vii) Any other information established by the Lottery to be necessary to verify the age and identity of the player.

(4) An individual may be required to provide additional information or documentation, as set forth in the iLottery terms and conditions, to establish a lottery account or register for iLottery. The information may be used for iLottery registration or to confirm information provided by that individual during the registration process.

(5) To enter the Drawing, entrants must submit the identifying information from at least one Qualifying Ticket via the Drawing's promotional web site, available at <https://www.palottery.com>, or the Pennsylvania Lottery's official mobile application, during the entry period. The identifying information from a Qualifying Ticket may be submitted only once in the Drawing. Entries will automatically be awarded at the time of successful submission of a Qualifying Ticket. No other method of submission will be accepted. Entries submitted using any other method, including entries mailed or hand-delivered to the Pennsylvania Lottery, are not valid and will be disqualified.

(6) Each entry must be complete and the information supplied by the entrant must be accurate. Incomplete entries cannot be submitted.

(7) Only one claimant per entry allowed.

(8) Entrants must be 18 years of age or older.

(9) Players may submit the identifying information from an unlimited number of Qualifying Tickets in the Drawing.

(10) Once an entry has been submitted it cannot be withdrawn or changed.

(c) *Drawing description:*

(1) The Lottery will conduct one PRESS YOUR LUCK® Second-Chance Drawing for qualifying Fast Play Lottery game tickets. All time references are Eastern Prevailing Time.

(2) All entries received after 4:59:59 a.m. August 1, 2023, through 11:59:59 p.m. October 19, 2023, will be entered into the Drawing tentatively scheduled to be held between October 20, 2023 and November 3, 2023.

(3) The entry period for the Drawing will be posted to the Lottery's publicly accessible web site at <https://www.palottery.com>.

(4) The number of entries an entrant will receive for the Drawing is determined by the purchase price of the Qualifying Ticket entered. The purchase price and corresponding number of entries for the Qualifying Ticket is as follows: PA-5205 PRESS YOUR LUCK® (\$5) = five entries.

(5) Players may review prizes won and their entries for the Drawing via the Drawing's promotional web site.

(d) *Prizes available to be won, determination of winners and odds of winning:*

(1) The prize entitlements described below are subject to all restrictions and limitations described in section 9(e) or mentioned anywhere else in these rules.

(2) The Lottery will conduct one Drawing from among all the entries received during the entry period as described in section 9(c)(2).

(i) The first entry selected in the Drawing will be a winning entry and the entrant who submitted that winning entry shall be entitled to a prize of \$75,000, less required income tax withholding.

(ii) The second through the fifty-first entries selected in the Drawing will be winning entries and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$100 iLottery Bonus Money.

(3) All prizes will be paid as lump-sum cash payments or uploaded to a winning player's lottery account.

(4) Winners of iLottery Bonus Money are not required to claim a prize. Winners of iLottery Bonus Money will have the iLottery Bonus Money credited to their lottery account and will receive an email notifying them that they won a prize.

(5) The number of winning entries to be selected for the Drawing will be posted to the Lottery's publicly accessible web site.

(6) The odds of winning in the Drawing depend upon the number of entries received for the Drawing.

(7) A computer-generated randomizer will be used to select the Drawing winners.

(e) *Drawing restrictions:*

(1) To be eligible to participate in the Drawing, entrants must have complied with the requirements of these rules.

(2) The Lottery is not responsible for late, lost or misdirected entries not entered into the Drawing. The Lottery is not responsible for entries that are not entered into the Drawing because of incompatible internet browsers, mobile Lottery application failure or other technical issues. The Lottery is not responsible for entries not entered due to delays in creating a lottery account or the inability to create a lottery account. If an entry is selected as a winner and rejected or otherwise disqualified during or following the Drawing, the Lottery will select one entry to replace the rejected or otherwise disqualified entry in accordance with these rules and Lottery procedure.

(3) If any discrepancy exists between these rules and any material describing the Drawing, these rules shall govern.

(4) Employees of the Lottery, 9Rooftops Marketing, LLC (formerly known as MARC USA, LLC), MUSL, Scientific Games International, Inc., MDI Entertainment, LLC, and their subcontractors, or a spouse, child, brother, sister or parent residing as a member of the same household in the principal place of residence of any such person are not eligible to participate in the Drawing. Offer void where prohibited or restricted.

(5) The Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to cancel or suspend the Drawing and change these rules if the Drawing cannot be conducted as planned due to errors in these rules or advertising, unauthorized intervention, tampering, fraud, technical errors, viruses, worms, bugs or any other cause that, in the Lottery's sole judgment, could corrupt or impair the administration, security, fairness, integrity or proper conduct of the Drawing.

(6) All entries shall be subject to verification by the Lottery.

(7) The Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to disqualify an entrant found to be tampering with the operation of the Drawing or to be acting in violation of these rules or applicable law.

(8) The Drawing is governed by the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Applicable laws and regulations apply.

(9) Prizes must be claimed within 1 year of the drawing date of the Drawing in which the prize was won. If no claim is made within 1 year of the drawing date of the Drawing in which the prize was won, the right of an entrant to claim the prize won, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided by statute.

(10) Final determination of winners will be made by the Secretary, whose judgment will be final and binding.

(11) A prize awarded in the Drawing to a person who dies before receiving the prize shall be paid according to 61 Pa. Code § 811.16 (relating to prizes payable after death of a prize winner).

(12) A winner is responsible for all taxes arising from or in connection with any prize won.

(13) A player may only win the prize for which the player is first selected in the Drawing. Subsequent entries, from the same individual, selected in the same Drawing will be disqualified and one replacement entry will be selected.

(14) Winners of iLottery Bonus Money must abide by the iLottery Terms & Conditions, the iLottery Bonus Policy and these rules. iLottery Bonus Money will expire 90 days from the date on which the winner was notified, via email, of the prize win, as further detailed in section 9(d)(4). iLottery Bonus Money has a five times play through requirement in order to convert the iLottery Bonus Money into cash. For example, for a player winning \$100 of iLottery Bonus Money, the player is required to place \$500 in wagers before the iLottery Bonus Money awarded is converted into cash which may be withdrawn from the player's lottery account.

(15) Prizes are not transferrable.

(16) Other restrictions may apply.

#### 10. *Ticket responsibility:*

(a) A Fast Play lottery game ticket is a bearer document deemed to be owned by the person holding the game ticket, except that if a name is contained on the back of the game ticket, the person named will, for all purposes, be considered the owner of the game ticket.

(b) The holder of a Fast Play lottery game ticket has the sole responsibility for checking the accuracy and condition of the data printed on the game ticket.

(c) The Commonwealth shall not be responsible for a lost or stolen Fast Play lottery game ticket, or for a Fast Play ticket redeemed by a player in error.

#### 11. *Ticket validation and requirements:*

(a) *Valid Fast Play lottery game tickets.* To be a valid Fast Play lottery game ticket, the presented game ticket must meet the following requirements:

(1) The game ticket's bar code shall be present in its entirety.

(2) The game ticket must be intact.

(3) The game ticket may not be mutilated, altered, reconstituted or tampered with. (4) The game ticket may not be counterfeit or a duplicate of a winning ticket.

(5) The game ticket must have been validly issued.

(6) The game ticket data shall have been recorded on the Lottery Central Computer System and the game ticket data shall match the computer record in every respect.

(7) The game ticket must not be defectively printed or printed or produced in error such that it cannot be processed or validated by the Lottery.

(8) The game ticket must pass other confidential security checks of the Lottery.

(b) *Invalid or defective game tickets.* A game ticket not passing the validation requirements in subsection (a) will be considered invalid and no payment will be made on account of any play recorded thereon. The determination of the Secretary in this regard is final.

#### 12. *Procedures for claiming and payment of prizes:*

(a) A prize may be claimed through an authorized retailer or the Lottery, as provided in this section. A prize must be claimed within 1 year of the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket.

(b) An authorized retailer is authorized to pay prizes of \$2,500 or less. The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play representing a prize of \$2,500 or less may be paid by a participating authorized retailer if a proper validation pay ticket was issued by the retailer's Lottery Terminal.

(c) The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play representing a prize in excess of \$2,500 may present the game ticket to an authorized retailer, Lottery District Office, or Lottery Headquarters.

(d) The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play shall present the ticket, in person, to an authorized retailer, Lottery Headquarters or a Lottery District Office. The retailer or the Lottery will issue payment if:

(1) The game ticket is scanned, and the play is validated through the Lottery Terminal or the Lottery Central Computer System;

(2) A claim form is properly and fully completed;

(3) The identification of the claimant is confirmed; and

(4) The winning ticket has not expired, pursuant to this section or section 14 (relating to unclaimed prizes).

(e) The Commonwealth shall not be responsible for a winning play paid in error by an authorized retailer.

(f) In the event a prize described in these rules is not available, the Lottery may either provide a substitute prize, determined by the Secretary to have an equivalent value to the prize won, or make a cash payment to the winner, in an amount determined by the Secretary to have an equivalent value to the prize won.

13. *Funding for prizes:* Moneys will be drawn from the State Lottery Fund, to the extent necessary, to fund the payment of prizes under this section. If this lottery game is terminated for any cause, prize moneys remaining undistributed will remain in the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes otherwise provided for by law.

14. *Unclaimed prizes:* Unclaimed prize money on winning Fast Play lottery game tickets will be retained by the Secretary for payment to the persons entitled thereto for 1 year from the sale date of the Fast Play lottery

game ticket. If no claim is made within 1 year from the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket, the right of a ticket holder to claim the prize represented by that ticket, if any, shall expire.

15. *Purchase and prize restrictions:* A Fast Play lottery game ticket may not be purchased by, and a prize may not be paid, to an officer or employee of the Lottery, Lottery professional services contractors or subcontractors, or to a spouse, child, brother, sister or parent residing in the same household of an officer, employee, contractor or subcontractor who is involved in the production, distribution or operation of systems for the validation or accounting of Fast Play games.

16. *Governing law:*

(a) By purchasing a ticket, the purchaser agrees to comply with and abide by the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314), this notice, instructions, conditions and final decisions of the Secretary and procedures established by the Secretary for the conduct of the Fast Play PRESS YOUR LUCK® lottery game.

(b) Decisions made by the Secretary, including the declaration of prizes and the payment thereof, in interpretation of this notice are final and binding on players and persons making a claim in respect thereof.

17. *Retailer compensation:*

(a) Authorized retailers may be entitled to compensation as determined by the Lottery.

(b) No authorized retailer or employee of an authorized retailer shall request, demand or accept gratuities or any compensation other than as provided in subsection (a) in exchange for the performance of duties authorized pursuant to the Lottery retailer's license without the Lottery's prior written authorization.

18. *Retailer Incentive Programs:* The Lottery may conduct a separate Retailer Incentive Program for retailers who sell Pennsylvania Fast Play PRESS YOUR LUCK® lottery game tickets.

19. *Retailer bonus:* The Lottery may offer a retailer bonus in connection with the sale of Pennsylvania Fast Play lottery game tickets. If a retailer bonus is offered, a Lottery retailer shall be eligible for a bonus as described in this section. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$100,000 and not exceeding \$500,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$500. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$500,001 and not exceeding \$1,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$5,000. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$1,000,001 and not exceeding \$10,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$10,000. A Lottery retailer is entitled only to the largest bonus for which they qualify on a winning ticket. A bonus will be initiated for payment after the Fast Play game ticket is claimed and validated. A bonus will not be awarded to a Lottery retailer that sells a non-winning Pennsylvania Lottery Fast Play game ticket used to enter a Pennsylvania Lottery second-chance drawing or promotion that is subsequently selected to win a prize.

20. *Termination of the game:* The Secretary may announce a termination date, after which no further tickets from this game may be sold. The announcement will be

disseminated through media used to advertise or promote PRESS YOUR LUCK® or through normal communications methods.

21. *Applicability:* This notice applies only to the PRESS YOUR LUCK® lottery game announced in this notice.

## DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE

### Pennsylvania Winner Winner Chicken Dinner Fast Play Game 5204

Under the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314) and 61 Pa. Code § 803.11 (relating to powers and duties of the Secretary of Revenue), the Secretary of Revenue hereby provides public notice of the rules for the following lottery game:

1. *Name:* The name of the lottery game is Pennsylvania Winner Winner Chicken Dinner (“Winner Winner Chicken Dinner”). The game number is PA-5204.

2. *Definitions:*

(a) *Authorized retailer or retailer:* A person who is properly licensed by the Lottery pursuant to 61 Pa. Code §§ 805.1—805.17.

(b) *Bar code:* The symbology on the ticket containing certain encrypted validation and accounting data used for identifying winning and losing tickets.

(c) *EGGS-TRA CASH:* The area at the bottom of a Winner Winner Chicken Dinner Fast Play lottery game ticket containing three play/prize symbols that, when matched according to the instructions, determines whether the player wins a prize. “EGGS-TRA CASH” is played separately.

(d) *Game Ticket:* A bearer instrument produced through a Lottery Terminal that is the player's record of a play for a Fast Play lottery game and sold by an authorized retailer containing the play and validation data as published in this game notice.

(e) *Lottery Central Computer System:* The computer gaming system on which all Fast Play plays are recorded.

(f) *Lottery Terminal:* A device authorized by the Lottery to function in an interactive mode with the Lottery Central Computer System for the purpose of issuing plays, executing Quick Pick selections, and entering, receiving, and processing lottery transactions, including making purchases, validating plays, transmitting reports and performing inventory functions.

(g) *Play:* A chance to participate in a particular Fast Play lottery game.

(h) *Play Area:* The area on a ticket which contains one or more play symbols.

(i) *Play Symbol:* A number, letter, symbol, image or other character found in the play area which is used to determine whether a player wins a prize.

(j) *Prize:* A non-monetary item, money, or experience that can be won as specified in section 6 (relating to prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners) of this game notice.

(k) *PROGRESSIVE TOP PRIZE*: The top prize available for this game that begins with a minimum prize amount that grows at a pre-determined rate every time a ticket is purchased and then resets to the minimum prize amount whenever a top prize-winning ticket is sold.

(l) *WINNER WINNER WINALL NUMBER*: The area at the top of a Winner Winner Chicken Dinner Fast Play lottery game ticket containing one play symbol that, when matched according to the instructions, determines whether the player wins all 15 prizes shown in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area.

(m) *WINNING NUMBERS*: The numbers, letters, symbols or other characters found in the play area that, when matched against the play symbols in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area, determine whether a player wins a prize.

(n) *Winning ticket*: A game ticket which has been validated and qualifies for a prize.

(o) *YOUR NUMBERS*: The numbers, letters, symbols or other characters found in the play area that, when matched against the play symbols in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area, determine whether a player wins a prize.

3. *Price*: The price of a Winner Winner Chicken Dinner ticket is \$10.

4. *Description of the Winner Winner Chicken Dinner Fast Play lottery game*:

(a) The Winner Winner Chicken Dinner lottery game is an instant win game printed from a Lottery Terminal. All prizes are predetermined, and the player does not have the ability to select their own play symbols. Winner Winner Chicken Dinner tickets may be purchased from an authorized retailer or at a Lottery self-service terminal that sells terminal-based Lottery game tickets. Tickets purchased from an authorized retailer shall be printed on-demand at the time of purchase and may not be preprinted by the retailer.

(b) Winner Winner Chicken Dinner is played by matching any of the play symbols located in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area to any of the play symbols located in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area. A player matching play symbols in this manner will win the prize shown under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol. A bet slip is not used to play this game.

(c) Winner Winner Chicken Dinner tickets contain a "WINNER WINNER WINALL NUMBER" area. Whenever the play symbol at the top of a Winner Winner Chicken Dinner ticket matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols, the player wins all 15 prizes shown in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area.

(d) Winner Winner Chicken Dinner tickets also contain an "EGGS-TRA CASH" area. Whenever two matching play/prize symbols appear in the "EGGS-TRA CASH" area, the player wins the prize amount shown. Whenever two Progressive (TPRZE) symbols appear in the "EGGS-TRA CASH" area, the player wins the current "PROGRESSIVE TOP PRIZE." "EGGS-TRA CASH" is played separately.

(e) Players can win the prizes identified in section 6 (relating to prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners).

(f) Winner Winner Chicken Dinner tickets cannot be canceled or voided once printed by the Lottery Terminal, even if printed in error.

(g) To purchase a ticket at an authorized retailer, a player must remit the purchase price to the retailer and

verbally request a Winner Winner Chicken Dinner ticket. The ticket shall be the only valid proof of the bet placed and the only valid receipt for claiming a prize.

(h) To purchase a ticket at a Pennsylvania Lottery self-service terminal, the player must insert into the self-service terminal a dollar amount equal to the total purchase price of a Winner Winner Chicken Dinner ticket and select the Winner Winner Chicken Dinner option on the Lottery self-service terminal. The ticket shall be the only valid proof of the bet placed and the only valid receipt for claiming a prize.

5. *Winner Winner Chicken Dinner ticket characteristics*:

(a) Winner Winner Chicken Dinner tickets shall contain a play area, the cost of the play, the date of sale and a bar code.

(b) *Play Symbols*: Winner Winner Chicken Dinner tickets will contain a "WINNING NUMBERS" area, a "YOUR NUMBERS" area, an "EGGS-TRA CASH" area and a "WINNER WINNER WINALL NUMBER" area. "EGGS-TRA CASH" is played separately. The play symbols and their captions, located in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area, and the "WINNER WINNER WINALL NUMBER" area, are: 1 (ONE), 2 (TWO), 3 (THREE), 4 (FOUR), 5 (FIVE), 6 (SIX), 7 (SEVEN), 8 (EIGHT), 9 (NINE), 10 (TEN), 11 (ELEVN), 12 (TWLV), 13 (THRTN), 14 (FORTN), 15 (FIFTN), 16 (SIXTN), 17 (SVNTN), 18 (EGHTN), 19 (NINTN), 20 (TWENT), 21 (TWYONE), 22 (TWYTWO), 23 (TWYTHR), 24 (TWYFOR), 25 (TWYFIV), 26 (TWYSIX), 27 (TWYSVN), 28 (TWYEGT), 29 (TWYNIN) and 30 (THIRT). The play symbols and their captions, located in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area, are: 1 (ONE), 2 (TWO), 3 (THREE), 4 (FOUR), 5 (FIVE), 6 (SIX), 7 (SEVEN), 8 (EIGHT), 9 (NINE), 10 (TEN), 11 (ELEVN), 12 (TWLV), 13 (THRTN), 14 (FORTN), 15 (FIFTN), 16 (SIXTN), 17 (SVNTN), 18 (EGHTN), 19 (NINTN), 20 (TWENT), 21 (TWYONE), 22 (TWYTWO), 23 (TWYTHR), 24 (TWYFOR), 25 (TWYFIV), 26 (TWYSIX), 27 (TWYSVN), 28 (TWYEGT), 29 (TWYNIN), 30 (THIRT) and a Chicken (CHICKEN) symbol. The play/prize symbols and their captions, located in the "EGGS-TRA CASH" area, are: \$10<sup>00</sup> (TEN DOL), \$15<sup>00</sup> (FIFTEEN), \$20<sup>00</sup> (TWENTY), \$30<sup>00</sup> (THIRTY), \$50<sup>00</sup> (FIFTY), \$100 (ONE HUN), \$300 (THR HUN), \$500 (FIV HUN) and a Progressive (TPRZE) symbol.

(c) *Prize Symbols*: The prize symbols and their captions, located in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area, are: \$10<sup>00</sup> (TEN DOL), \$15<sup>00</sup> (FIFTEEN), \$20<sup>00</sup> (TWENTY), \$30<sup>00</sup> (THIRTY), \$50<sup>00</sup> (FIFTY), \$100 (ONE HUN), \$300 (THR HUN), \$500 (FIV HUN) and \$1,000 (ONE THO).

(d) *Prizes*: The prizes that can be won in this game are: \$10, \$15, \$20, \$30, \$50, \$100, \$300, \$500 and \$1,000. The prizes that can be won in the "EGGS-TRA CASH" area, are: \$10, \$15, \$20, \$30, \$50, \$100, \$300, \$500 and the "PROGRESSIVE TOP PRIZE." The "PROGRESSIVE TOP PRIZE" amount starts at \$150,000 and increases by \$0.70 every time a Winner Winner Chicken Dinner ticket is purchased. When a "PROGRESSIVE TOP PRIZE" winning ticket is sold, the "PROGRESSIVE TOP PRIZE" resets to \$150,000. A player can win up to 16 times on a ticket.

(e) *Approximate number of tickets available for the game*: Approximately 720,000 tickets will be available for sale for the Winner Winner Chicken Dinner lottery game.

6. *Prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners*:

(a) All Winner Winner Chicken Dinner prize payments will be made as one-time, lump-sum cash payments.



(b) Holders of tickets upon which two Progressive (TPRZE) play/prize symbols appear in the "EGGS-TRA CASH" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of a "PROGRESSIVE TOP PRIZE." The amount won under this paragraph is the amount of the "PROGRESSIVE TOP PRIZE," determined by the Lottery Central Computer System, as of the time the winning ticket was purchased. The amount won will be a minimum of \$150,000.

(c) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$1,000 (ONE THO) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1,000.

(d) Holders of tickets upon which a Chicken (CHICKEN) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of \$1,000 (ONE THO) appears in the Prize area under that Chicken (CHICKEN) symbol, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1,000.

(e) Holders of tickets upon which the "WINNER WINNER WINALL NUMBER" play symbol matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$300 (THR HUN) appears in two of the Prize areas, a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in two of the Prize areas, a prize symbol of \$20<sup>00</sup> (TWENTY) appears in five of the Prize areas, a prize symbol of \$10<sup>00</sup> (TEN DOL) appears in five of the Prize areas and a prize symbol of \$50<sup>00</sup> (FIFTY) appears in one of the Prize areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1,000.

(f) Holders of tickets upon which the "WINNER WINNER WINALL NUMBER" play symbol matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in five of the Prize areas, a prize symbol of \$50<sup>00</sup> (FIFTY) appears in five of the Prize areas and a prize symbol of \$30<sup>00</sup> (THIRTY) appears in five of the Prize areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$900.

(g) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$500 (FIV HUN) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$500.

(h) Holders of tickets upon which a Chicken (CHICKEN) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of \$500 (FIV HUN) appears in the Prize area under that Chicken (CHICKEN) symbol, shall be entitled to a prize of \$500.

(i) Holders of tickets upon which two play/prize symbols of \$500 (FIV HUN) appear in the "EGGS-TRA CASH" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$500.

(j) Holders of tickets upon which the "WINNER WINNER WINALL NUMBER" play symbol matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$50<sup>00</sup> (FIFTY) appears in five of the Prize areas, a prize symbol of \$30<sup>00</sup> (THIRTY) appears in five of the Prize areas and a prize symbol of \$20<sup>00</sup> (TWENTY) appears in five of the Prize areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$500.

(k) Holders of tickets upon which the "WINNER WINNER WINALL NUMBER" play symbol matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in two of the Prize

areas, a prize symbol of \$50<sup>00</sup> (FIFTY) appears in two of the Prize areas, a prize symbol of \$30<sup>00</sup> (THIRTY) appears in two of the Prize areas, a prize symbol of \$20<sup>00</sup> (TWENTY) appears in five of the Prize areas and a prize symbol of \$10<sup>00</sup> (TEN DOL) appears in four of the Prize areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$500.

(l) Holders of tickets upon which the "WINNER WINNER WINALL NUMBER" play symbol matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$50<sup>00</sup> (FIFTY) appears in five of the Prize areas, a prize symbol of \$20<sup>00</sup> (TWENTY) appears in five of the Prize areas, a prize symbol of \$30<sup>00</sup> (THIRTY) appears in four of the Prize areas and a prize symbol of \$10<sup>00</sup> (TEN DOL) appears in one of the Prize areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$480.

(m) Holders of tickets upon which the "WINNER WINNER WINALL NUMBER" play symbol matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in two of the Prize areas, a prize symbol of \$15<sup>00</sup> (FIFTEEN) appears in six of the Prize areas, a prize symbol of \$10<sup>00</sup> (TEN DOL) appears in six of the Prize areas and a prize symbol of \$50<sup>00</sup> (FIFTY) appears in one of the Prize areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$400.

(n) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$300 (THR HUN) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$300.

(o) Holders of tickets upon which a Chicken (CHICKEN) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of \$300 (THR HUN) appears in the Prize area under that Chicken (CHICKEN) symbol, shall be entitled to a prize of \$300.

(p) Holders of tickets upon which two play/prize symbols of \$300 (THR HUN) appear in the "EGGS-TRA CASH" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$300.

(q) Holders of tickets upon which the "WINNER WINNER WINALL NUMBER" play symbol matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$30<sup>00</sup> (THIRTY) appears in two of the Prize areas, a prize symbol of \$20<sup>00</sup> (TWENTY) appears in five of the Prize areas, a prize symbol of \$15<sup>00</sup> (FIFTEEN) appears in four of the Prize areas, a prize symbol of \$10<sup>00</sup> (TEN DOL) appears in three of the Prize areas and a prize symbol of \$50<sup>00</sup> (FIFTY) appears in one of the Prize areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$300.

(r) Holders of tickets upon which the "WINNER WINNER WINALL NUMBER" play symbol matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$20<sup>00</sup> (TWENTY) appears in six of the Prize areas, a prize symbol of \$15<sup>00</sup> (FIFTEEN) appears in six of the Prize areas, a prize symbol of \$50<sup>00</sup> (FIFTY) appears in one of the Prize areas, a prize symbol of \$30<sup>00</sup> (THIRTY) appears in one of the Prize areas and a prize symbol of \$10<sup>00</sup> (TEN DOL) appears in one of the Prize areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$300.

(z) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$30<sup>00</sup> (THIRTY) appears in the Prize area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$30.

(aa) Holders of tickets upon which a Chicken (CHICKEN) symbol appears in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area and a prize symbol of \$30<sup>00</sup> (THIRTY) appears in the Prize area under that Chicken (CHICKEN) symbol, shall be entitled to a prize of \$30.

(bb) Holders of tickets upon which two play/prize symbols of \$30<sup>00</sup> (THIRTY) appear in the “EGGS-TRA CASH” area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$30.

(cc) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$20<sup>00</sup> (TWENTY) appears in the Prize area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$20.

(dd) Holders of tickets upon which a Chicken (CHICKEN) symbol appears in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area and a prize symbol of \$20<sup>00</sup> (TWENTY) appears in the Prize area under that Chicken (CHICKEN) symbol, shall be entitled to a prize of \$20.

(ee) Holders of tickets upon which two play/prize symbols of \$20<sup>00</sup> (TWENTY) appear in the “EGGS-TRA CASH” area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$20.

(ff) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$15<sup>00</sup> (FIFTEEN) appears in the Prize area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$15.

(gg) Holders of tickets upon which a Chicken (CHICKEN) symbol appears in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area and a prize symbol of \$15<sup>00</sup> (FIFTEEN) appears in the Prize area under that Chicken (CHICKEN) symbol, shall be entitled to a prize of \$15.

(hh) Holders of tickets upon which two play/prize symbols of \$15<sup>00</sup> (FIFTEEN) appear in the “EGGS-TRA CASH” area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$15.

(ii) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$10<sup>00</sup> (TEN DOL) appears in the Prize area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$10.

(jj) Holders of tickets upon which a Chicken (CHICKEN) symbol appears in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area and a prize symbol of \$10<sup>00</sup> (TEN DOL) appears in the Prize area under that Chicken (CHICKEN) symbol, shall be entitled to a prize of \$10.

(kk) Holders of tickets upon which two play/prize symbols of \$10<sup>00</sup> (TEN DOL) appear in the “EGGS-TRA CASH” area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$10.

Prizes, including top prizes, are subject to availability at the time of purchase.

8. *Ticket responsibility:*

(a) A Fast Play lottery game ticket is a bearer document deemed to be owned by the person holding the game ticket, except that if a name is contained on the back of the game ticket, the person named will, for all purposes, be considered the owner of the game ticket.

(b) The holder of a Fast Play lottery game ticket has the sole responsibility for checking the accuracy and condition of the data printed on the game ticket.

(c) The Commonwealth shall not be responsible for a lost or stolen Fast Play lottery game ticket, or for a Fast Play ticket redeemed by a player in error.

9. *Ticket validation and requirements:*

(a) *Valid Fast Play lottery game tickets.* To be a valid Fast Play lottery game ticket, the presented game ticket must meet the following requirements:

(1) The game ticket's bar code shall be present in its entirety.

(2) The game ticket must be intact.

(3) The game ticket may not be mutilated, altered, reconstituted or tampered with.

(4) The game ticket may not be counterfeit or a duplicate of a winning ticket.

(5) The game ticket must have been validly issued.

(6) The game ticket data shall have been recorded on the Lottery Central Computer System and the game ticket data shall match the computer record in every respect.

(7) The game ticket must not be defectively printed or printed or produced in error such that it cannot be processed or validated by the Lottery.

(8) The game ticket must pass other confidential security checks of the Lottery.

(b) *Invalid or defective game tickets.* A game ticket not passing the validation requirements in subsection (a) will be considered invalid and no payment will be made on account of any play recorded thereon. The determination of the Secretary in this regard is final.

10. *Procedures for claiming and payment of prizes:*

(a) A prize may be claimed through an authorized retailer or the Lottery, as provided in this section. A prize must be claimed within 1 year of the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket.

(b) An authorized retailer is authorized to pay prizes of \$2,500 or less. The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play representing a prize of \$2,500 or less may be paid by a participating authorized retailer if a proper validation pay ticket was issued by the retailer's Lottery Terminal.

(c) The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play representing a prize in excess of \$2,500 may present the game ticket to an authorized retailer, Lottery District Office, or Lottery Headquarters.

(d) The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play shall present the ticket, in person, to an authorized retailer, Lottery Headquarters or a Lottery District Office. The retailer or the Lottery will issue payment if:

(1) The game ticket is scanned, and the play is validated through the Lottery Terminal or the Lottery Central Computer System;

(2) A claim form is properly and fully completed;

(3) The identification of the claimant is confirmed; and

(4) The winning ticket has not expired, pursuant to this section or section 12 (relating to unclaimed prizes).

(e) The Commonwealth shall not be responsible for a winning play paid in error by an authorized retailer.

(f) In the event a prize described in these rules is not available, the Lottery may either provide a substitute prize, determined by the Secretary to have an equivalent value to the prize won, or make a cash payment to the winner, in an amount determined by the Secretary to have an equivalent value to the prize won.

11. *Funding for prizes:* Moneys will be drawn from the State Lottery Fund, to the extent necessary, to fund the payment of prizes under this section. If this lottery game is terminated for any cause, prize moneys remaining undistributed will remain in the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes otherwise provided for by law.

12. *Unclaimed prizes:* Unclaimed prize money on winning Fast Play lottery game tickets will be retained by the Secretary for payment to the persons entitled thereto for 1 year from the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket. If no claim is made within 1 year from the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket, the right of a ticket holder to claim the prize represented by that ticket, if any, shall expire.

13. *Purchase and prize restrictions:* A Fast Play lottery game ticket may not be purchased by, and a prize may not be paid, to an officer or employee of the Lottery, Lottery professional services contractors or subcontractors, or to a spouse, child, brother, sister or parent residing in the same household of an officer, employee, contractor or subcontractor who is involved in the production, distribution or operation of systems for the validation or accounting of Fast Play games.

14. *"PROGRESSIVE TOP PRIZE" restrictions:*

(a) An amount of \$0.70 from the sale of each Winner Winner Chicken Dinner ticket will be accumulated in the "PROGRESSIVE TOP PRIZE" pool.

(b) *Prize Amount:* The amount of the "PROGRESSIVE TOP PRIZE" at the time a ticket is purchased can only be verified through the Lottery's Central Computer System. Any advertisement or any materials describing the amount of the "PROGRESSIVE TOP PRIZE" are only valid as of the time they are posted. If any discrepancy exists between this notice and any material describing or advertising the Winner Winner Chicken Dinner game, this notice and the data contained in the Lottery's Central Computer System shall govern.

(c) The "PROGRESSIVE TOP PRIZE" and all other prizes are subject to availability at the time of purchase. The Lottery is not responsible for prizes that are not awarded due to technical issues. In the event of a "PROGRESSIVE TOP PRIZE" being reset without the actual sale of a "PROGRESSIVE TOP PRIZE" winning ticket, all prize money that had accumulated into the "PROGRESSIVE TOP PRIZE" pool (i.e., \$0.70 from the sale of each ticket) shall be awarded as part of the next "PROGRESSIVE TOP PRIZE" won.

(d) Prizes payable to "PROGRESSIVE TOP PRIZE" winners will be paid as a one-time cash payment. For the purposes of calculation of the prize to be paid to "PRO-

GRESSIVE TOP PRIZE” winners, the “PROGRESSIVE TOP PRIZE” amount will be rounded up to the nearest \$0.50.

15. *Governing law:*

(a) By purchasing a ticket, the purchaser agrees to comply with and abide by the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314), this notice, instructions, conditions and final decisions of the Secretary and procedures established by the Secretary for the conduct of the Fast Play Winner Winner Chicken Dinner lottery game.

(b) Decisions made by the Secretary, including the declaration of prizes and the payment thereof, in interpretation of this notice are final and binding on players and persons making a claim in respect thereof.

16. *Retailer compensation:*

(a) Authorized retailers may be entitled to compensation as determined by the Lottery.

(b) No authorized retailer or employee of an authorized retailer shall request, demand or accept gratuities or any compensation other than as provided in subsection (a) in exchange for the performance of duties authorized pursuant to the Lottery retailer’s license without the Lottery’s prior written authorization.

17. *Retailer Incentive Programs:* The Lottery may conduct a separate Retailer Incentive Program for retailers who sell Pennsylvania Fast Play Winner Winner Chicken Dinner lottery game tickets.

18. *Retailer bonus:* The Lottery may offer a retailer bonus in connection with the sale of Pennsylvania Fast Play lottery game tickets. If a retailer bonus is offered, a Lottery retailer shall be eligible for a bonus as described in this section. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$100,000 and not exceeding \$500,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$500. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$1,000,001 and not exceeding \$1,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$5,000. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$1,000,001 and not exceeding \$10,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$10,000. A Lottery retailer is entitled only to the largest bonus for which they qualify on a winning ticket. A bonus will be initiated for payment after the Fast Play game ticket is claimed and validated. A bonus will not be awarded to a Lottery retailer that sells a non-winning Pennsylvania Lottery Fast Play game ticket used to enter a Pennsylvania Lottery second-chance drawing or promotion that is subsequently selected to win a prize.

19. *Termination of the game:* The Secretary may announce a termination date, after which no further tickets from this game may be sold. The announcement will be disseminated through media used to advertise or promote Winner Winner Chicken Dinner or through normal communications methods.

20. *Applicability:* This notice applies only to the Winner Winner Chicken Dinner lottery game announced in this notice.

## DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION

### Adjustment of Minimum Waiver Expenditure for Emission Inspection

Effective September 1, 2023, the minimum waiver expenditure for an emission inspection is established at \$450 in accordance with 67 Pa. Code § 177.282 (relating to annual adjustment of minimum waiver expenditure for emission inspection).

An emissions waiver is available if a vehicle has failed an initial emission inspection, qualifying repairs have been completed and the subject vehicle has failed a retest. To qualify for this waiver, a customer must demonstrate they expended \$450 on qualifying repairs, which include without limitation attempting to diagnose the emissions failure, and have met all other applicable requirements of 67 Pa. Code § 177.281 (relating to issuance of waiver). The minimum waiver expenditure will be adjusted on September 1, 2024, and future adjustments will be made annually under 67 Pa. Code § 177.282.

This regulation sets forth the criteria for eligibility for licensure by endorsement, including the specific methods required for an applicant to demonstrate competency as well as requirements for granting a provisional endorsement license.

The final-form regulation was submitted to the Commission on June 9, 2023.

This regulation implements Act 41 of 2019 (Act 41) (63 Pa.C.S.A. § 3111) which requires licensing boards and commissions to issue a license, certificate, registration, or permit to an applicant who pays fees established by the board or commission by regulation, provided the applicant meets certain criteria for eligibility. Act 41 also requires boards and commissions that issue provisional licenses, certificates, registrations, or permits to set the expiration of the provisional endorsement license by regulation.

We have determined this regulation is consistent with the statutory authority of the Board (63 Pa.C.S. § 3111; 63 P.S. § 1505(b)) and the intention of the General Assembly. Having considered all of the other criteria of the Regulatory Review Act, we find promulgation of this regulation is in the public interest.

The final-form regulation was submitted to the Commission on May 22, 2023.

This final rulemaking incorporates Act 134 of 2014 requirements relating to liability insurance and circumstances when diagnosis of a condition by another practitioner must occur. In addition, the regulation updates terminology, removes outdated provisions, revises practice responsibilities and expands options for demonstrating English language proficiency.

**Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board  
Regulation # 54-104 (IRRC # 3372)**

**Duties and Rights of Licensees**

**July 19, 2023**

We submit for your consideration the following comments on the proposed rulemaking published in the May 20, 2023 *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. Our comments are based on criteria in Section 5.2 of the Regulatory Review Act (RRA) (71 P.S. § 745.5b). Section 5.1(a) of the Regulatory Review Act (71 P.S. § 745.5a(a)) directs the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board (Board) to respond to all comments received from us or any other source.

**1. RRA Section 5.2(a)—Legislative comments.**

In determining whether a proposed, final-form, final-omitted or existing regulation is in the public interest, the commission shall, first and foremost, determine whether the agency has the statutory authority to promulgate the regulation and whether the regulation conforms to the intent of the General Assembly in the enactment of the statute upon which the regulation is based. In making its determination, IRRC shall consider written comments submitted by the committees and current members of the General Assembly, pertinent opinions of Pennsylvania’s courts and formal opinions of the Attorney General. 71 P.S. § 745.5b.

Representative John Lawrence submitted comments expressing support for the majority of the proposed changes contained in this rulemaking. The legislative comments note, most of the amendments are either technical in nature or in direct response to actions of the General Assembly. They agree that these proposed changes are appropriate and necessary. However, they

observe that the Board’s proposal to delete Section 5.32(e)(1), regarding lewd, immoral or improper conduct at a licensed premises, does not fit into either previously mentioned category. The proposed repeal of this section, they argue, goes beyond a “housekeeping” measure and instead represents a substantive regulatory change for which the Board fails to provide justification.

In the Preamble and its response to Regulatory Analysis Form (RAF) question # 10, the Board, regarding the deletion of Section 5.32(e)(1), states that:

This proposed rulemaking deletes subsection (e)(1), which prohibits “lewd, immoral or improper conduct by the licensee, its servants, agents, employees, patrons or event, contest or tournament participants.” The case of *Conchatta, Inc. v. Miller*, 458 F.3d 258 (3d Cir. 2006), held that the prohibition on “lewd, immoral or improper conduct” was unconstitutional on the basis that it is substantially overbroad. *Conchatta* was not based on subsection (e)(1) of the Board’s regulation, but a different subsection—subsection (b)—that has since been reserved. See 43 Pa.B. 7082 (December 7, 2013). Since the phrase “lewd, immoral or improper conduct” is legally unenforceable, this proposed rulemaking deletes it from subsection (e)(1).

The legislative comments disagree strongly with the Board’s statement that the phrase “lewd, immoral or improper conduct” is legally unenforceable. The Board, as asserted in the legislative comments, fails to provide any basis for *Conchatta’s* applicability to the proposed repeal of Section 5.32(e)(1). They contend that the Board’s



opinion is unsupported and has no basis in fact or law. They further assert that recent court rulings that suggest courts have taken a more agreeable view toward the types of restrictions envisioned in Section 5.32(b) have been ignored by the Board.

The legislative comments also identify the following Board's responses in the proposed rulemaking's RAF as deficient:

- RAF question # 9 asks if the regulation is mandated by any court order or federal regulation. The Board replies that it is not mandated by a federal or state law, court order or federal regulation. These legislative comments assert that the Board's response to RAF question # 9 is inconsistent with its attempt to justify the deletion of Section 5.32(e)(1) with the court's holding in *Conchatta* (RAF question # 10).

- RAF question # 10 asks the promulgating agency to state why the regulation is needed and to explain the compelling public interest that justifies the regulation, to describe who will benefit from the regulation and to quantify the benefits. The Board, according to the legislative comments, fails to address these key elements.

- RAF question # 17 requires the promulgating agency to identify the financial, economic and social impact of the regulation on individuals, small businesses, businesses and labor communities and other public and private organizations. The Board states that it anticipates that the regulated community will not sustain a financial, economic or social impact because of the regulation. A discussion of the social impact of the proposed regulatory change on individuals or other public and private organizations is not included in the Board's response.

- RAF question # 18 directs the promulgating agency to explain how the benefits of the regulation outweigh any cost and adverse effects. The Board reports that there are no costs or adverse effects anticipated with this proposed rulemaking. The legislative comments disagree with the Board's assertion. They object to what is perceived as the Board's dismissal of this important question and claim that even a cursory review of the subject matter would suggest otherwise. They suggest that there has been significant community interest and debate over potential adverse effects associated with this subject matter for years, including legislation and litigation across the country.

We will review the Board's responses to all of the issues raised in the legislative comments in our determination of whether the final-form regulation is in the public interest.

**2. Section 5.32. Restrictions/exceptions.—Whether the regulation is in the public interest; and Protection of the public health, safety and welfare.**

The Board proposes to delete paragraph (e)(1), which prohibits lewd, immoral or improper conduct by the licensee, its servants, agents, employees, patrons or event, contest or tournament participants for activities conducted under the subchapter, on the basis that is legally unenforceable.

The Independence Law Center (ILC) submitted comments contrary to the Board's position. It declares that "such conduct is most assuredly able to be prohibited" and that paragraph (e)(1) is constitutional and useful. The ILC writes that:

"To be clear, it was not the words "lewd," "immoral," or "improper" that were unenforceable, but the section 5.32(b) as a whole that did not have limiting

text. By contrast to the phrase "lewd, immoral, improper or unlawful *purpose*" in section 5.32(b) (emphasis added), section 5.32(e) states, "There may not be lewd, immoral or improper *conduct* by the licensee, its servants, agents, employees, patrons or event, contest or tournament participants." (Emphasis added.)

The ILC further states that "open lewdness" is prohibited by Pennsylvania law. The offense is defined as follows: "A person commits a misdemeanor of the third degree if he does any lewd act which he knows is likely to be observed by others who would be affronted or alarmed." 18 Pa.C.S.A. § 5901. The ILC argues that liquor licensed establishments should continue to prohibit this kind of conduct on its premises. Removing this provision, it contends, is a change that is not in the interest of either visitors to liquor licensed establishments or communities as a whole. Based on the concerns expressed in the legislative comments and the ILC, we ask the Board to submit a revised Preamble and RAF to final-form regulation that includes a detailed explanation of how the proposed regulatory change protects the public health, safety and welfare. Furthermore, we will review the Board's responses to all of the issues raised by Representative Lawrence and the ILC in our determination of whether the final version of this rulemaking is in the public interest.

### Commonwealth Essential Health Benefits Benchmark Plan—Public Comment Period; Notice 2023-14

The Insurance Department (Department) is exploring the possibility of updating the Commonwealth's Essential Health Benefits benchmark plan (EHB-benchmark plan), including the positive impacts an update may have on Commonwealth residents enrolled in individual and small group health insurance plans. The Department seeks public input about which benefits to potentially include in an updated EHB-benchmark plan as the Commonwealth considers this important update process. The Commonwealth's current EHB-benchmark plan can be found at <https://www.cms.gov/ccio/resources/data-resources/ehb#Pennsylvania>.

Under the Affordable Care Act (P.L. 111-148), the EHB-benchmark plan establishes the minimum essential health benefits that individual and small group health insurance plans must offer. The Commonwealth's EHB-benchmark plan must provide coverage for at least the following benefit categories:

1. Ambulatory patient services.
2. Emergency services.
3. Hospitalization.
4. Maternity and newborn care.
5. Mental health and substance use disorder services, including behavioral health treatment.
6. Prescription drugs.
7. Rehabilitative and habilitative services and devices.
8. Laboratory services.
9. Preventive and wellness services and chronic disease management.
10. Pediatric services, including oral and vision care.

In addition to the required coverage categories, Federal regulations provide parameters that must be considered prior to updating the EHB-benchmark plan:

- The scope of benefits must be equal to, or greater than, the scope of benefits provided under a typical employer plan.
- The EHB-benchmark plan's generosity may not exceed certain comparison plans from 2017, including the EHB-benchmark plan used in 2017. Generosity in this case refers to the actuarial value of the benefits provided—how much financial coverage the EHB-benchmark plan offers for covered services.
- The EHB-benchmark plan's benefits must not be unduly weighted toward any of the benefit categories previously listed.
- The EHB-benchmark plan must provide benefits for diverse segments of the population, including women, children, persons with disabilities and other groups.
- The EHB-benchmark plan must not include discriminatory benefit designs.

To assist the Department in evaluating options for an updated EHB-benchmark plan, the Department seeks public input about what benefits an updated EHB-

benchmark plan should include so that Commonwealth residents continue to have access to comprehensive coverage that is consistent with current medical practices.

#### **Tentative Order**

*By the Commission:*

The Commission's regulations at 52 Pa. Code § 54.40(a) state that an Electric Generation Supplier (EGS) license will not be issued or remain in force until the licensee furnishes a bond or other security approved by the Commission. In addition, 52 Pa. Code § 54.40(d) states that the maintenance of an EGS license is contingent on the licensee providing proof to the Commission that a

bond or other approved security in the amount directed by the Commission has been obtained.

Each EGS must file an original bond, letter of credit, continuation certificate, amendment, or other approved financial instrument with Rosemary Chiavetta, Secretary, Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission, 400 North Street, Harrisburg, PA, 17120, prior to the EGS's current security expiration date. Each financial instrument must be an original document that displays a "wet" signature or digital signature, preferably in blue ink, and displays a "raised seal" or original notary stamp. The name of the principal on the original financial instrument must match exactly with the name that appears on the EGS's license issued by the Commission.

Failure to file before the financial security's expiration date may cause Commission staff to initiate a formal proceeding that may lead to the following: cancellation of each company's electric supplier license, removal of each company's information from the Commission's website, and notification to all electric distribution companies, in which each company is licensed to do business, of the cancellation of the license.

As of June 30, 2023, each EGS listed in the Supplier Table below has not provided proof to the Commission that it has a bond or other approved security in the amount or language directed by the Commission, to replace a bond which is expired, or which is non-compliant with Commission regulations.

As part of its EGS license validation procedures, the Commission's Bureau of Technical Utility Services sent a 90-day Security Renewal Notice email to each entity in the Supplier Table above stating that original documentation of a bond, or other approved security in the amount or language directed by the Commission, must be filed within 30-days prior to each entity's security expiration date. None of the companies listed in the Supplier Table provided the required documentation.

Based on the above facts, we tentatively conclude that the EGSs listed in the Supplier Table are not in compliance with 52 Pa. Code § 54.40(a) and (d) and therefore it is appropriate to initiate the cancellation process for the EGS license of each company listed in the Supplier Table, without the necessity of a formal complaint, as being in the public interest; *Therefore,*

*It Is Ordered That:*

1. Cancellation of the Electric Generation Supplier License of each company listed in the Supplier Table is hereby tentatively approved as being in the public interest.

2. The Secretary (i) serve a copy of this Tentative Order upon the Office of Consumer Advocate, the Office of Small Business Advocate, the Bureau of Investigation & Enforcement, all electric generation distribution companies, and all of the Electric Generation Suppliers listed in the Supplier Table; (ii) publish a copy of this Tentative Order in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* with a 30-day comment period; and (iii) file a copy of this Tentative Order at each Electric Generation Supplier's assigned docket number.

3. To the extent any of the Electric Generation Suppliers listed in the Supplier Table challenge the cancellation of their license, they must file comments within thirty (30) days after publication of this Tentative Order in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. Written comments referencing Docket No. M-2023-3037455 must be eFiled to the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission through the Commission's eFiling System. You may set up a free eFiling account with the Commission at <https://efiling.puc.pa.gov/> if you do not have one. Filing instructions may be found on the Commission's website at [http://www.puc.pa.gov/filing\\_resources.aspx](http://www.puc.pa.gov/filing_resources.aspx). Comments containing confidential information should be emailed to Commission Secretary Rosemary Chiavetta at [rchiavetta@pa.gov](mailto:rchiavetta@pa.gov) rather than eFiled.

4. Alternatively, Electric Generation Suppliers listed in the Supplier Table may provide the Commission an approved security up to and within thirty (30) days after publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. The Electric Generation Supplier must file an original bond, letter of credit, continuation certificate, amendment, or other ap-

proved financial instrument displaying a "wet" signature or digital signature, preferably in blue ink, and displaying a "raised seal" or original notary stamp with Rosemary Chiavetta, Secretary, Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission, 400 North Street, Harrisburg, PA, 17120.

5. Absent the timely (i) filing of comments challenging the cancellation of the Electric Generation Supplier's license, or (ii) the filing of an approved security within 30-days after publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, the Bureau of Technical Utility Services, shall prepare a Final Order for entry by the Secretary revoking the license of each Electric Generation Supplier that fails to respond.

6. Upon entry of the Final Order, Electric Generation Suppliers that remain listed as not in compliance with 52 Pa. Code § 54.40(a) and (d) will be stricken from all active utility lists maintained by the Commission's Bureau of Technical Utility Services and the Assessment Section of the Bureau of Administration, removed from the Commission's website, and notifications be sent to all electric distribution companies in which the Electric Generation Suppliers are licensed to do business.

7. Upon entry of the Final Order, Electric Generation Suppliers that fail to respond will be prohibited from providing electric generation supply services to retail electric customers. That upon entry of the Final Order described in Ordering Paragraph No. 5, each electric distribution company in which the Electric Generation Suppliers are licensed to do business, shall return the customers of the Electric Generation Suppliers to default service.
