MINING ACTIVITY NPDES DRAFT PERMITS

This notice provides information about applications for a new, amended or renewed National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permits associated with mining activity (coal or noncoal) permits. The applications concern

industrial waste (mining) discharges to surface water and discharges of stormwater associated with mining activities. This notice is provided in accordance with 25 Pa. Code Chapters 91 and 92a and 40 CFR Part 122, implementing provisions of The Clean Streams Law (35 P.S. §§ 691.1—691.1001) and the Federal Clean Water Act (33 U.S.C.A. §§ 1251—1376).

The Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) has prepared a draft NPDES permit and made a tentative determination to issue the NPDES permit in conjunction with the associated mining activity permit.

Effluent Limits for Coal Mining Activities

For coal mining activities, NPDES permits, when issued, will contain effluent limits that are the more stringent of technology-based (BAT) effluent limitations or Water Quality Based Effluent Limits (WQBEL).

The BAT limits for coal mining activities, as provided in 40 CFR Part 434 and 25 Pa. Code Chapters 87—90 are as follows:

A settleable solids instantaneous maximum limit of 0.5 ml/l applies to: surface runoff (resulting from a precipitation event of less than or equal to a 10-year 24-hour event) from active mining areas; active areas disturbed by coal refuse disposal activities; mined areas backfilled and revegetated; and all other discharges and drainage (resulting from a precipitation event of greater than 1-year 24-hour to less than or equal to a 10-year 24-hour event) from coal refuse disposal piles. Similarly, modified BAT limits apply to iron, manganese and suspended solids in surface runoff, discharges and drainage resulting from these precipitation events and those of greater magnitude in accordance with 25 Pa. Code §§ 87.102, 88.92, 88.187, 88.292, 89.52 and 90.102.

Exceptions to BAT effluent limits may be applicable in accordance with 25 Pa. Code §§ 87.102, 88.92, 88.187, 88.292, 89.52 and 90.102.

Effluent Limits for Noncoal Mining Activities

The limits for noncoal mining activities as provided in 25 Pa. Code § 77.522 are pH 6 to 9 and other parameters DEP may require.

Discharges from noncoal mines located in some geologic settings (for example, in the coal fields) may require additional water quality-based effluent limits. If additional effluent limits are needed for an NPDES permit associated with a noncoal mining permit, then the permit description specifies the parameters.

The proposed mine site is referred to as the Minard Mine and is located in Athens Township, **Bradford County**, PA. The mining permit application number is 08230301 and the NPDES permit application number is PA0270041. All interested parties are encouraged to attend the hearing. Topographic Map contains the area described. Mining of sandstone and sand and gravel is proposed within the permit area.

The site is located within the Chemung River and Tutelow Creek watersheds. The associated NPDES application proposes discharges of stormwater from the support/processing area and discharges of treated water from the mining pit to Tutelow Creek, which is designated as Warm Water Fishes, Migratory Fishes. The draft NPDES permit document and fact sheet are available on the DEP webpage (see the following details). A draft NPDES permit notice was published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* on August 5, 2023.

The application includes proposals for three (3) variances to conduct mining activities within 100 feet of the Chemung River and Tutelow Creek; to conduct blasting; and to change the postmining land use from cropland to unmanaged water impoundment and forest to unmanaged natural habitat. The stream encroachment activities consist of: installation of a bridge to cross Tutelow Creek, installation of a culvert to cross unnamed tributary 1 to Tutelow Creek, and three (3) encroachments of Tutelow Creek for mining support activities and mineral extraction as described in the application documents.

Availability of Grants through the Small Business Advantage Grant Program

The Department of Environmental Protection (Department) announces the availability of at least \$1 million in grant funding for the 20th year of the Commonwealth's Small Business Advantage Grant Program (Program). The Program assists small businesses undertaking energy efficiency, pollution prevention or natural resource conservation projects. With nearly 1 million small businesses in this Commonwealth, well-designed projects can help small businesses cut operating costs and grow the Commonwealth's economy, while simultaneously protecting the environment.

The Program is a first-come, first-served grant program that provides matching grants, ranging from a maximum of 50% or \$5,000, up to 80% or \$8,000, whichever is less. Maximum funding will vary based on project location and environmental impact. Eligible projects must save the small business a minimum of \$500 per year and at least 20% in annual energy consumption or pollution-related expenses.

Natural resource protection projects are exempt from the minimum cost savings requirements but may need to meet minimum pollution reduction goals; projects must provide enough information to allow quantification of the sediment and nutrient diversion from the directly related receiving waterway to be eligible.

To be eligible, the applicant's business must be Commonwealth-based, be registered to do business in the Commonwealth, and be a for-profit small business with 100 or fewer full-time equivalent employees. The project to which the grant will apply must be undertaken in or on a facility located in this Commonwealth. Applicants may not have current environmental violations or obligations due to the Commonwealth. Applications will be accepted beginning when the application period opening is announced on the Small Business Advantage Grant web site through March 22, 2024, or when funds are exhausted, whichever occurs first.

The criteria established in this TGD are required to be followed by all operations applying manure or agricultural process wastewater, farms that pasture animals and farms managing an Animal Concentration Area (ACA) unless the operators obtain a permit or approval from the Department to implement alternative practices. The substantive revisions in this draft TGD include the following:

• Manure Management Plan Short Form—The Manure Management Plan Short Form (Short Form) is a new form. If the guidelines on the Short Form are followed, then the water quality risks associated with the agricultural operation are deemed to be minimal and the short form will satisfy the planning requirements for the operation set forth in 25 Pa. Code § 91.36(b) (relating to pollution control and prevention at agricultural operations).

• Manure Management Plan Workbook

 \circ Operation Information—In addition to clarifying existing language, the following points have been added or modified on the Operation Information Page:

■ Animals on the Operation—Modified to a check item. If answered yes, the Animals Worksheet must be completed.

■ *Environmentally Sensitive Areas*—Included springs for clarification.

■ *Agricultural Process Wastewater*—New check item. If answered yes, the Agricultural Process Wastewater Worksheet must be completed.

■ *Manure Spreader Calibration*—New check item. The operator must identify that the manure spreader will be calibrated according the recommendations in Agronomy Facts 68 (Appendix 3) prior to manure application.

 \circ Animals Worksheet—New worksheet to be completed by any operator with animals housed onsite. Includes an Animal Equivalent Unit Calculation. If after completion of the worksheet, it is determined that the operation is regulated under the Nutrient Management Act (P.L. 112, No. 38), the operation should contact a certified nutrient management specialist before proceeding with the remainder of the Manure Management Plan.

 \circ Environmentally Sensitive Areas Worksheet—Included springs for clarification.

• Winter Spreading Worksheet—Included language related to "vegetative cover." No changes to winter manure spreading requirements.

• Manure Management Plan Summary

■ New check box identifying that soils tests taken in the last 3 years indicated phosphorous levels are less than 200 ppm.

■ Clarification language indicating that no single manure application can exceed 9,000 gallons per acre unless it is applied in accordance with 25 Pa. Code § 83.294(e) (relating to nutrient application procedures).

 \circ *Operation Map*—New blank page inserted to facilitate hand drawing or remind the planner to include a map, or both.

• Agricultural Process Wastewater Worksheet—New worksheet to facilitate planning for agricultural process wastewater management. Though, there are no changes to the requirement to address the agricultural process wastewater in the Manure Management Plan.

Pennsylvania Agriculture Energy Efficiency Rebate Program

The Department of Environmental Protection (Department) announces the availability of a rebate program for agriculture energy efficiency projects to Commonwealth agriculture producers under the Pennsylvania Agriculture Energy Efficiency Rebate Program (Program). The Program provides rebates to assist agricultural producers with the purchase of LED lighting systems, efficient ventilation equipment, and efficient milk pumping and cooling equipment for their farming operations.

To qualify for the rebate, the applicant must meet the definition of a normal agricultural operation under the act of June 10, 1982 (P.L. 454, No. 133), known as the Pennsylvania Right to Farm Law and the application must be submitted to the Department prior to the installation of the project. Equipment purchase costs after July 1, 2023, are eligible. The rebate will be offered on a first-come, first-served basis in the order in which they are received, until no later than December 31, 2023. Approved applicants will be issued a voucher, then install eligible equipment and submit a payment request form with required documentation to the Department to receive rebate moneys.

The following rebates are offered:

• \$7,500 rebate for LED lighting systems (up to 50% of equipment purchase costs).

• \$7,500 rebate for efficient ventilation (up to 50% of equipment purchase costs).

• \$7,500 rebate for dairy and refrigeration or cooling equipment (up to 50% of equipment purchase costs).

 \bullet \$7,500 for variable frequency drives (up to 50% of equipment purchase costs).

• Installation costs of up to \$2,000 may be included for each technology category.

Applicants may apply under each category, but no more than a total of \$7,500 in rebates will be issued to any one applicant.

We submit for your consideration the following comments on the proposed rulemaking published in the June 17, 2023 *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. Our comments are based on criteria in Section 5.2 of the Regulatory Review Act (Act) (71 P.S. § 745.5b). Section 5.1(a) of the Act (71 P.S. § 745.5a(a)) directs the Environmental Hearing Board (Board) to respond to all comments received from us or any other source.

Section 1021.51. Commencement, form and content.— Implementation procedures; Clarity.

Subsection (f)

Subsection (f)(1)(iv) and (2)(vi)(C), regarding electronic and conventional filing, respectively, provide for an appellant to serve a copy of a notice of appeal on any potentially adversely affected person in accordance with the Pennsylvania Rules of Civil Procedure or a document evidencing the action by the Department of Environmental Protection. The general citation to the Pennsylvania Rules of Civil Procedure is vague and does not provide clear guidance to an appellant. We ask the Board to clarify these provisions by citing specific Pennsylvania Rules of Civil Procedure regarding service.

Subsection (j)

Subsection (j) outlines the procedures to intervene in an appeal. Interested persons identified under subsection (h)(4) who wish to intervene are required to file under Section 1021.81 "unless otherwise specified in the order of the Board." The comment to Section 1021.81 states that subsection (j) allows persons to intervene "by simply filing an entry of appearance." However, this subsection only provides this method of filing for persons identified under subsection (h)(2) and (3). We have two questions regarding implementation. First, is an interested person identified by the Board under subsection (h)(4) required to file a petition to intervene or an entry of appearance? Second, what intervention procedure is typically included in the previously-referenced order? We ask the Board to respond to these questions in the Preamble to the final-form regulation. Further, we ask the Board to consider clarify-

ing this subsection so that it is consistent with the comment to Section 1021.81.
