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Pennsylvania Bulletin

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the official gazette of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. It is published weekly. A cumulative subject matter index is published quarterly.

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* serves several purposes. It is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, which is the official codification of agency rules and regulations, Statewide court rules, and other statutorily authorized documents. Changes in the codified text, whether by adoption, amendment, rescission, repeal or emergency action, must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

The following documents are published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*: Governor's Executive Orders; Summaries of Enacted Statutes; Statewide and Local Court Rules; Attorney General Opinions; Motor Carrier Applications before the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission; Applications and Actions before the Department of Environmental Protection; Orders of the Independent Regulatory Review Commission; and other documents authorized by law.

The text of certain documents published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the only valid and enforceable text. Courts are required to take judicial notice of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Adoption, Amendment or Repeal of Regulations

Generally an agency wishing to adopt, amend or rescind regulations must first publish in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* a Proposed Rulemaking. There are limited instances when the agency may omit the proposal step; it still must publish the adopted version.

The Proposed Rulemaking contains the full text of the change, the agency contact person, a fiscal note required by law and background for the action.

The agency then allows sufficient time for public comment before taking final action. A Final Rule-making must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* before the changes can take effect. If the agency wishes to adopt changes to the Proposed Rulemaking to enlarge the scope, it must repropose.

Citation to the Pennsylvania Bulletin

Cite material in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* by volume number, a page number and date. Example: Volume 1, *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, page 801, January 9, 1971 (short form: 1 Pa.B. 801 (January 9, 1971)).

Pennsylvania Code

The *Pennsylvania Code* is the official codification of rules and regulations issued by Commonwealth agencies, Statewide court rules and other statutorily authorized documents. The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, printing changes when they are adopted. These changes are then permanently codified by the *Pennsylvania Code Reporter*, a monthly, loose-leaf supplement.

The *Pennsylvania Code* is cited by title number and section number. Example: Title 10 *Pennsylvania Code* § 1.1 (short form: 10 Pa. Code § 1.1).

Under the *Pennsylvania Code* codification system, each regulation is assigned a unique number by title and section. Titles roughly parallel the organization of Commonwealth government.

Search for your area of interest in the *Pennsylva*nia Code. The *Pennsylvania Code* is available at www.pacodeandbulletin.gov.

Source Notes give the history of regulations. To see if there have been recent changes not yet codified, check the List of *Pennsylvania Code* Chapters Affected in the most recent issue of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Fiscal Notes

Section 612 of The Administrative Code of 1929 (71 P.S. § 232) requires the Governor's Budget Office to prepare a fiscal note for regulatory actions and administrative procedures of the administrative departments, boards, commissions and authorities receiving money from the State Treasury. The fiscal note states whether the action or procedure causes a loss of revenue or an increase in the cost of programs for the Commonwealth or its political subdivisions. The fiscal note is required to be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* at the same time as the change is advertised.

A fiscal note provides the following information: (1) the designation of the fund out of which the appropriation providing for expenditures under the action or procedure shall be made; (2) the probable cost for the fiscal year the program is implemented; (3) projected cost estimate of the program for each of the 5 succeeding fiscal years; (4) fiscal history of the program for which expenditures are to be made; (5) probable loss of revenue for the fiscal year of its implementation; (6) projected loss of revenue from the program for each of the 5 succeeding fiscal years; (7) line item, if any, of the General Appropriation Act or other appropriation act out of which expenditures or losses of Commonwealth funds shall occur as a result of the action or procedures; and (8) recommendation, if any, of the Secretary of the Budget and the reasons therefor.

The omission of an item indicates that the agency text of the fiscal note states that there is no information available with respect thereto. In items (3) and (6) information is set forth for the first through fifth fiscal years, following the year the program is implemented, which is stated. In item (4) information is set forth for the current and two immediately preceding years. In item (8) the recommendation, if any, made by the Secretary of the Budget is published with the fiscal note. "No fiscal impact" means no additional cost or revenue loss to the Commonwealth or its local political subdivision is intended. See 4 Pa. Code Chapter 7, Subchapter R (relating to fiscal notes).

WASHINGTON COUNTY

Adoption of Local Rules of Civil Procedure L-200.1; No. 2023-1

Administrative Order

And Now, this 26th day of May, 2023, having received approval from the appropriate Rules Committee pursuant to Pa.R.J.A. 103(d)(4), it is hereby Ordered, Adjudged, and Decreed that Washington County Local Rule of Civil Procedure L-200.1 is rescinded and the following Local Rule L-200.1 is hereby adopted, effective thirty (30) days after publication of this Order in the Pennsylvania Bulletin.

This *Order* shall be processed in accordance with Pa.R.J.A. 103(d)(5) and (6). The District Court Administrator is directed to:

- 1. Distribute copies of the adopted local rules to the Legislative Reference Bureau for publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*;
- 2. File one (1) copy with the Administrative Office of Pennsylvania Courts;
- 3. Publish the local rules on the Court's website within thirty (30) days of the effective date; and
- 4. Cause a copy hereof to be published in the *Washington County Reports* once a week for two (2) successive weeks at the expense of the County of Washington. *By the Court*

Rule L-200.1. Assignment of Cases.

- (1) The President Judge annually shall assign civil case types to the judges of the Court by Administrative Regulation. The Administrative Regulations shall be available by hard copy in the Office of the Court Administrator and at www.washingtoncourts.us.
- (a) The Court Administrator shall assign cases to judges according to the method that the President Judge orders from time to time.
- (i) All proceedings in a case after its assignment, including trial, will be scheduled and conducted by the assigned judge unless otherwise ordered by the Court.
- (b) The President Judge or the Court Administrator shall have the authority to assign or reassign a case to a judge in the interest of the efficient administration of justice.
- (c) The assignment process is to facilitate administrative control and to manage the flow of cases. All judges may hear any matter that properly comes before the Court.

- (2) No one in the office of the Court Administrator may reveal to any person, other than a judge, the sequence in which cases are assigned, if such cases are assigned randomly, unless necessary to administer the case management system or as authorized by the Court.
- (3) The Court may punish a person for contempt if the person causes or attempts to cause an employee of the Court to reveal the sequence in which cases are randomly assigned or to assign a case inconsistent with the direction of the Court.
 - (4) Recusal.
- (a) A judge who intends to recuse on a matter must submit a recusal form to the President Judge.
- (b) Upon approval of the recusal, the President Judge shall reassign the case to another judge in consultation with the Court Administrator.
- (c) If the President Judge is the recusing judge, the commissioned judge with the greatest seniority as determined by Pa.R.J.A. 705 shall reassign the case in consultation with the Court Administrator.
- (d) In the instance of a full bench recusal, the President Judge will request assignment of a judge in accordance with Pa.R.J.A. 701(C).
 - (5) Related Cases. Consolidation.
- (a) When a determination is made that two cases are related, the case filed later will be assigned to the judge handling the lowest numbered (earlier filed) case, unless a determination is made that the efficient administration of justice requires otherwise.
- (b) When cases involving common questions of law or fact are pending before different judges, a party may file a motion to consolidate the cases. The motion shall be filed in each case which the movant seeks to consolidate. The motion must be presented to and ruled upon by the judge assigned to the lowest numbered case. If cases assigned to different judges are consolidated, all cases will be assigned to the judge having the lowest numbered cases. Nothing shall prohibit the Court from consolidating a case on its own motion.
- (6) *Remand*. A remanded case shall be assigned to the judge who previously presided over the case unless:
 - (a) the remand order directs otherwise; or
 - (b) the President Judge reassigns the case.

PROPOSED RULEMAKING

FISH AND BOAT COMMISSION

[58 PA. CODE CH. 65]

Fishing; Special Fishing Regulations

The Fish and Boat Commission (Commission) proposes to amend Chapter 65 (relating to special fishing regulations). The Commission is publishing this proposed rule-making under the authority of 30 Pa.C.S. (relating to Fish and Boat Code) (code). The proposed amendment would implement miscellaneous special regulations in § 65.24 (relating to miscellaneous special regulations) on the 12 stream sections that would manage brown trout with catch and release regulations and maintain Commonwealth inland water regulations for all other species with all tackle types permitted, while continuing to stock these stream sections with rainbow trout at current rates and frequency.

A. Effective Date

This proposed rulemaking, if approved on final-form rulemaking, will go into effect January 1, 2024.

C. Statutory Authority

The proposed amendment to § 65.24 is published under the statutory authority of section 2307(a) of the code (relating to waters limited to specific purposes).

D. Purpose and Background

The specific purpose and background of the proposed amendments are described in more detail under the summary of proposal.

E. Summary of Proposal

In the mid-2000's, productive stream sections were identified that supported high densities of wild brown trout and were being stocked by the Commission. Angler counts documented very high angler use of these stream sections in the early part of trout season, particularly on the opening day of the regular season for trout. As part of the Commission's Strategic Plan for Management of Trout Fisheries in Pennsylvania 2010—2014, Commission staff identified the need to resurvey the stream sections to determine if they supported Class A wild trout populations and designate appropriately. Inaccurate designation leads to inadequate water quality protection and inconsistent application of fisheries management strategies.

Between 2011 and 2015, biologists resurveyed 13 stream sections, and all were determined to support robust wild brown trout populations that qualified for Class A wild trout streams designation. In 2014, the Commission updated its Class A wild trout streams policy in § 57.8a (relating to Class A wild trout streams) to allow for rare circumstances in which Commission stocking could be considered and the new policy became effective January 1, 2015. Following that policy change, the ten stream sections were designated by the Commission as Class A wild trout streams in 2015 and stocking of trout continued. Three additional stocked trout water (STW) stream sections were designated Class A wild trout

streams by the Commission through January 2017, bringing the total number of Class A wild trout streams stocked by the Commission to 13.

Twelve of the 13 stream sections are managed under Commonwealth inland waters regulations in § 61.1 (relating to Commonwealth inland waters) which allow for the harvest of five trout per day, greater than or equal to 7 inches in length (combined species) from 8 a.m. on the opening day of the regular season for trout through Labor Day, catch and release from the day after Labor Day through the third Sunday in February (extended trout season) the following year, and closed to all fishing from the third Monday in February until 8 a.m. on the opening day of the regular season for trout. Yellow Creek, Section 05, is the remaining stream section and is managed with catch and release fly-fishing only regulations in § 65.14 (relating to catch and release fly-fishing only). All 13 of the stream sections are stocked with adult rainbow trout only by the Commission during both preseason and in-season stocking periods, and 4 of the stream sections are also stocked in-season with fingerling rainbow trout only.

As part of the Commission's Strategic Plan for the Management of Trout Fisheries in Pennsylvania 2020—2024, Commission staff identified the need to collect updated biological and social data on these fisheries to inform future management of these stream sections. Deliverable tasks included: 1) by 2022, resurvey the wild brown trout populations and conduct angler use, harvest and opinion surveys to inform fisheries management of the 13 Class A stream sections stocked with trout; and 2) between 2022 and 2024, consider options and make recommendations to the Board of Commissioners to adjust current management if the data support alternate management to optimize these fisheries.

Commission staff resurveyed the wild brown trout populations in all 13 of the stream sections during summer 2021. Wild brown trout biomass ranged from 10 kg/ha at Little Lehigh Creek, Section 07, to 175 kg/ha at Yellow Creek, Section 05. Except for the four stream sections in the Lehigh Valley, all others supported a similar biomass in 2021 compared to the Class A qualifying surveys that were conducted between 2011 to 2015.

In addition to the brown trout population assessments, angler surveys (that is, counts and interviews with effort focused on opening day) were conducted at 11 of the 13 stream sections during 2021. A more in-depth assessment from the opening day of the regular season for trout (April 17, 2021) through Labor Day (September 6, 2021) was conducted on Bald Eagle Creek, Section 06, to evaluate angler use, catch, harvest and opinions. Yellow Creek, Section 05, was not included in the angler survey given that it is managed as a catch and release fishery open to year-round angling.

The angler assessments provided valuable insight regarding opinions needed to inform future management of these waters. The only management option in which most (57%) anglers were opposed was a stocking cessation. This result was not unexpected given that most anglers caught stocked rainbow trout, particularly on opening day, and this perceived sentiment was a driving factor in the continuance of stocking following Class A designation in 2015 through 2017.

On opening day of the 2021 trout season, 1,442 anglers were counted on the 12 stream sections during the 8 a.m.

angler use assessments. Angler use ranged from 10 anglers per mile (25th percentile) to 91 anglers per mile (95th percentile) with 8 waters at or above the 75th percentile, 3 in the 50th percentile, and 1 in the 25th percentile compared to Statewide opening day angler use data at STWs. Additionally, 866 anglers were interviewed over the course of the surveys. About one quarter (25%) of anglers indicated they harvest trout at least half the time. Approximately 49% of anglers indicated they harvest both wild brown trout and stocked rainbow trout, 4% of anglers usually only harvest wild brown trout and 47% of anglers usually only harvest stocked rainbow trout.

Anglers caught and harvested more stocked rainbow trout than wild brown trout. The catch and harvest of rainbow trout on Bald Eagle Creek, Section 06, was high over the course of the survey with nearly three times more the amount of adult rainbow trout caught than were stocked and an estimated 57% of the rainbow trout stocked into this stream section harvested by anglers. The catch and harvest of wild brown trout on Bald Eagle Creek, Section 06, was also high during the survey. Anglers caught just over 1.5 times more wild brown trout greater than or equal to 7 inches than were estimated to be present. Additionally, anglers harvested an estimated 23% of the wild brown trout population greater than or equal to 7 inches, of which over 35% of the trout were large (≥ 14 inches). Anglers were estimated to harvest 212 wild brown trout per mile, of which 74 per mile were greater than or equal to 14 inches. This represents a relatively high harvest of the wild brown trout population, particularly the large trout (≥ 14 inches) and suggests that harvest may be limiting the abundance and the size structure of the wild brown trout population in Bald Eagle Creek, Section 06.

When trout stocking occurs, it attracts substantially more harvest-oriented anglers. In Statewide surveys of the Commonwealth's stocked and wild trout streams in 2004 and 2005, Commission staff documented that stocked trout streams had greater than five times higher harvest rates than streams managed for wild trout without stocking. Given the similarities of Bald Eagle Creek, Section 06, to the 11 other Class A stream sections stocked with trout and managed with Commonwealth inland waters regulations, it is likely that similar harvest rates are occurring, and harvest is also precluding those wild brown trout fisheries from reaching their full potential and negatively impacting population size structure.

Most (66%) anglers interviewed indicated support for an alternate management approach that would require catch and release of brown trout while allowing for the continued harvest of rainbow trout under Commonwealth inland waters regulations. This would eliminate harvest mortality and could provide an opportunity for the wild brown trout population to expand, including large (≥ 14 inches) wild brown trout that are most desirable to anglers, while continuing to provide an opportunity for anglers to harvest stocked rainbow trout.

Given the wild brown trout population characteristics and estimated angler use, harvest and opinions determined during the recent assessment of the 12 stream sections managed as both Class A wild trout stream sections and STWs, staff propose implementing a miscellaneous special regulation (See § 65.24) on the 12 stream sections that would manage brown trout with catch and release regulations and maintain Commonwealth inland waters regulations for all other species with all tackle types permitted, while continuing to stock these stream sections with rainbow trout at current rates and frequency.

The Commission proposes that § 65.24 be amended to read as set forth in Annex A.

F. Paperwork

This proposed rulemaking will not increase paperwork and will not create new paperwork requirements.

G. Fiscal Impact

This proposed rulemaking will have no adverse fiscal impact on the Commonwealth or its political subdivisions.

As the section is currently written, permits are valid into the extended season closure period, which is inconsistent with current seasons, sizes and creel limits applied to waters included in the Commission's Stocked Trout Waters Program.

The Commission proposes that § 65.26 be amended to read as set forth in Annex A.

Over the past decade, paddleboarding has been gaining popularity. Paddleboards are now widely available, affordable and relatively easy to transport. Paddleboards resemble oversized surfboards and models are designed for use on various waterways and conditions. They are primarily operated by a person standing on the board using a paddle in a manner similar to a canoe. Paddleboards are frequently used on lakes and rivers throughout this Commonwealth.

On October 3, 2008, the United States Coast Guard (USCG) issued a determination that, when beyond the narrow limits of a swimming, surfing or bathing area, the

device known as a "paddleboard" is a vessel under 46 U.S.C. § 2101 (relating to general definitions). This classification means that no person may use a paddleboard unless in compliance with the Navigation Rules and applicable carriage requirements for this type of vessel. The Commission adopted the USCG's definition of paddleboard and associated life jacket carriage requirements in § 109.2 (relating to paddleboards and sailboards), effective January 1, 2015. This section states that a wearable life jacket must be carried on board for each person, "unless otherwise required to be worn in accordance with § 97.1 (relating to personal life jackets)." Commission staff recommend amendments to § 97.1 to provide clarification regarding life jacket wear requirements, since paddleboards are generally included with canoes and kayaks for recreational boating purposes. Commission staff also recommend amendments to incorporate paddleboards into Chapter 111 regulations for United States Army Corps of Engineers Pittsburgh District lakes where life jacket wear is required on boats less than 16 feet in length or any canoe, kayak or paddle-

The Commission proposes that §§ 97.1, 111.3, 111.20, 111.24, 111.26, 111.27, 111.32, 111.42, 111.43, 111.56, 111.62 and 111.65 be amended to read as set forth in Annex A.

Boats must still comply with § 103.3(a) (relating to restrictions for special areas), which states that "[b]oats are limited to slow, no wake speed when within 100 feet of the shoreline; docks; launching ramps; swimmers or downed skiers or other boat-towed watersports participants; persons wading in the water; anchored, moored, or drifting boats; floats, except for ski jumps and ski landing floats: or other areas so marked. This subsection does not apply in a zoned ski area or authorized ski return areas when those areas are found within the areas described in this subsection."





This statement of policy adopts the Model Code of Ethics for Educators (MCEE) published by the National Association of State Directors of Teacher Education and Certification (NASDTEC) as the Pennsylvania Model Code of Ethics for Educators. This amendment is intended to ensure that this statement of policy reflects recent changes to the MCEE.

The PSPC is committed to providing leadership for improving the quality of education in this Commonwealth by establishing high standards for preparation, certification, practice and ethical conduct in the teaching profession.

Educators are often faced with "gray areas" where there is no clear "right" or "wrong" path. The MCEE, which was developed as a collaborative effort of NASDTEC and the National Council for the Advancement of Educator Ethics, is a guiding document to prepare educators to select the best course of action in ethical dilemmas in their practice and provides a basis for educator preparation, self-reflection and self-accountability.

Section 5(a)(12.2) of the act empowers the PSPC "[t]o develop outreach programs, professional development and courses designed to improve the quality of practice and ethical conduct in the teaching profession." By formally adopting the MCEE as the Pennsylvania Model Code of Ethics for Educators and incorporating it into its outreach programs, the Commission intends to provide educators in this Commonwealth with a tool to help guide their decision-making and to promote an intentional emphasis on professional ethics in the teaching profession.

The MCEE was first released in 2015. In June 2023, NASDTEC published the MCEE 2nd Edition. While most of the content of the MCEE 2nd Edition is contained in the 2015 version, the MCEE 2nd Edition also contains several organizational and editorial changes. The fundamental principles underlying ethical practice in the teaching profession have not changed. This amendment updates the PSPC's statement of policy so that it reflects the revised MCEE. The PSPC adopts the MCEE 2nd Edition because it reflects the PSPC's own view of ethical practice and will keep the Commonwealth's ethical standards consistent with the National standard.

Fiscal Impact and Paperwork Requirements

This statement of policy has no fiscal impact and imposes no additional reporting or paperwork requirements.

Effective Date

This statement of policy shall be effective immediately upon publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Regulatory Review

This statement of policy is not subject to the Regulatory Review Act (71 P.S. §§ 745.1—745.14). However, the PSPC adopted this statement of policy after consultation with interested representatives of the affected parties.

Fiscal Year 2023-2024 Annual Plan for Awarding Grants under the Pennsylvania Agricultural Fair Act

This notice presents the Fiscal Year (FY) 2023-2024 Annual Plan (Annual Plan) of the Department of Agriculture (Department) for the administration of the grant program authorized under the Pennsylvania Agricultural Fair Act (act) (3 P.S. §§ 1501—1510). The act prescribes how the available funds appropriated by the General Assembly shall be distributed. This Annual Plan, authorized by section 8(a) the act (3 P.S. § 1508(a)), has been prepared with the assistance and advice of the Agricultural Fair Advisory Committee (Committee), and was approved by that Committee at its July 17, 2023, meeting.

The act authorizes the Department to make grants to organizations conducting eligible agricultural fairs, Statewide agricultural organizations which contribute to the development of agriculture and agribusiness and to eligible agricultural youth groups for support of their programs.

Funds appropriated by the General Assembly to fund the act in FY 2023-2024 shall be dispersed by the Department as follows, on a funds-available basis, in the following order of priority:

- 1. First priority shall be given to grants to finance a portion of a fair's operating costs. These costs include, but are not limited to, the cost of exhibiting agribusiness products, materials and equipment, conducting agricultural or agribusiness educational activities and demonstrations, and awarding premiums to contest and exhibit winners at the agricultural fair. For these grants, the maximum payment shall be as allowed for each Class Fair under section 5(1)(i)(A) of the act (3 P.S. § 1505(1)(i)(A)). These maximum payments range from \$2,500 to \$14,000, depending on the Class Fair involved.
- 2. Second priority shall be given to grants to finance a portion of the agricultural premiums identified in section 5(1)(i)(B) of the act. For these grants, the maximum payment shall not exceed \$15,000.
- 3. Third priority shall be given to grants to reimburse a county agricultural society, or an independent agricultural society, that conducts harness horse racing at its annual agricultural fair, other than races for colts and fillies 2 years of age and 3 years of age, in an amount equal to that used during the annual agricultural fair as purse money for harness horse racing, track and stable maintenance, starting gate rental and the cost of harness horse racing officials during the annual fair. For these grants, the maximum amount of reimbursement shall be as allowed under section 5(1)(iii) of the act. This maximum amount is \$13,000, at least \$4,000 of which must be used to reimburse purse money.
- 4. Fourth priority shall be given to grants to reimburse a county agricultural society, or an independent agricultural society, that conducts harness horse racing for 2-year-old and 3-year-old colts and fillies at its annual agricultural fair. For these grants, the maximum amount of reimbursement shall be as allowed under section 5(1)(iv) of the act. This maximum amount is \$7,600.

- 5. Fifth priority shall be given to grants to reimburse a Statewide agricultural organization that conducts an agricultural fair and is otherwise eligible for grants under section 5(2) of the act, for up to \$2,000 of its fair's operating expenses (including premium payments) on a dollar-for-dollar basis, and for 50% of all additional premium costs that are not included in that initial dollar-for-dollar reimbursement, up to a maximum amount of \$10,000. The total maximum payment shall not exceed \$12,000.
- 6. Sixth priority shall be given to grants to countywide or Statewide 4-H and Future Farmers of America (FFA) or combined FFA and Future Homemakers of America units of boys and girls under 21 years of age that are eligible for grants under section 5(3) of the act. Grants shall be awarded in accordance with the requirements of that provision of the act.
- a. The purpose of the act is to make funds available to encourage the further development and improvement of this Commonwealth's agricultural fairs, and to continue the contribution of agricultural fairs to agriculture and agribusiness by encouraging related careers, fostering agricultural production and agricultural product improvements, and promoting increased investments in agriculture. This Commonwealth's agricultural fairs also enrich the life of the community by showcasing agricultural and agribusiness achievements, offering recreational opportunities and promoting tourism. For these reasons, the Department encourages those agricultural youth groups that are eligible for grants under section 5(3) of the act to engage in projects and activities that are conducted at agricultural fairs or that are of direct benefit to agricultural fairs.
- b. The Department will award grants to the agricultural youth groups previously described as follows:
- i. For actual expenses incurred for activities which contribute to the advancement of agriculture or agribusiness by a 4-H youth group, a payment which will be calculated according to the following formula, under authority of section 5(3) of the act:

- *Tier 1*: \$2,000 for total enrollment of up to 1,000 members plus \$1.50 for each traditional member and \$1 for each school enrichment/special interest member.
- *Tier 2*: \$2,500 for total enrollment of 1,001 to 2,000 members plus \$1.50 for each traditional member and \$1 for each school enrichment/special interest member.
- *Tier 3*: \$3,000 for total enrollment of 2,001 to 3,000 members plus \$1.50 for each traditional member and \$1 for each school enrichment/special interest member.
- Tier 4: \$3,500 for total enrollment of 3,001+ members plus \$1.50 for each traditional member and \$1 for each school enrichment/special interest member, a maximum reimbursement of \$9,000.
- ii. For actual expenses incurred for activities which contribute to the advancement of agriculture or agribusiness by FFA Youth groups, a payment which will be calculated using the following formula, under authority of section 5(3) of the act:
- *Tier I*: County FFA Organizations with 100 members or less will receive base funding of \$1,000 with an additional \$4 per member.
- *Tier II*: County FFA Organizations with 101 to 210 members inclusive will receive a \$2,000 base funding with an additional \$2 per member.
- *Tier III*: County FFA Organizations with 211 members or more will receive funding of \$2,000 with an additional \$4 per member for every member over 210.
- 7. Funds remaining after the previous grants have been awarded shall be utilized for capital improvement as provided in section 5(1)(ii) of the act.

The Department will endeavor to disburse the previous payments at the earliest date practicable.

Appeals must be filed with the Board within 30-days of publication of this notice in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* unless the appropriate statute provides a different time period. This paragraph does not, in and of itself, create a right of appeal beyond that permitted by applicable statutes and decisional law. Unemployment Compensation; Relief from Charges

The purpose of this notice is to announce the following amendments to the act of December 5, 1936 (2nd Sp. Sess., 1937 P.L. 2897, No. 1), known as the Unemployment Compensation Law (UC Law) (43 P.S. §§ 751—919.10), as provided for under the act of March 27, 2020 (P.L. 25, No. 9).

Article III. Contributions by Employers and Employes

Section 302.1. Relief from Charges.

Subsection (b)(2)(i) of section 302.1 of the UC Law (43 P.S. \S 782.1(b)(2)(i)) is amended to extend the time period for an employer to request relief from charges on the basis of a separation that occurs on or before the date the claimant files an application for benefits or on the basis of continuing part-time work from 15 days to 21 days after the date of the earliest notice issued by the Department under section 501(a) of the lUC Law (43 P.S. \S 821(a)) indicating that the claimant is eligible for benefits under section 401(a) of the UC Law (43 P.S. \S 801(a)).

Subsection (b)(3)(i) of section 302.1 of the UC Law (43 P.S. § 782.1(b)(3)(i)) is amended to extend the time period for an employer to request relief from charges on the basis of a separation that occurs after the claimant files an application for benefits from 15 days to 21 days after the date of the earliest notice issued by the Department indicating that the claimant is claiming benefits subsequent to the separation.

Under section 6(2) of the act of March 27, 2020 (P.L. 25, No. 9), the previously referenced amendments to the UC Law are effective upon publication of this notice in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Under the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314) and 61 Pa. Code § 803.11 (relating to powers and duties of the Secretary of Revenue), the Secretary of Revenue hereby provides public notice of the rules for the following lottery game:

- 1. *Name*: The name of the lottery game is Pennsylvania Monster Money ("Monster Money"). The game number is PA-5209.
 - 2. Definitions:
- (a) Authorized retailer or retailer: A person who is properly licensed by the Lottery pursuant to 61 Pa. Code §§ 805.1—805.17.
- (b) Bar code: The symbology on the ticket containing certain encrypted validation and accounting data used for identifying winning and losing tickets.

(c) Game Ticket: A bearer instrument produced through a Lottery Terminal that is the player's record of a play for a Fast Play lottery game and sold by an authorized retailer containing the play and validation data as published in this game notice.

- (d) Lottery Central Computer System: The computer gaming system on which all Fast Play plays are recorded.
- (e) Lottery Terminal: A device authorized by the Lottery to function in an interactive mode with the Lottery Central Computer System for the purpose of issuing plays, executing Quick Pick selections, and entering, receiving, and processing lottery transactions, including making purchases, validating plays, transmitting reports and performing inventory functions.
- (f) Play: A chance to participate in a particular Fast Play lottery game.
- (g) Play Area: The area on a ticket which contains one or more play symbols.
- (h) *Play Symbol*: A number, letter, symbol, image or other character found in the play area which is used to determine whether a player wins a prize.
- (i) *Prize*: A non-monetary item, money or experience that can be won as specified in section 7 (relating to prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners) of this game notice.
- (j) WINNING NUMBERS: The numbers, letters, symbols or other characters found in the play area that, when matched against the play symbols in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area, determine whether a player wins a prize.
- (k) Winning ticket: A game ticket which has been validated and qualifies for a prize.
- (l) YOUR NUMBERS: The numbers, letters, symbols or other characters found in the play area that, when matched against the play symbols in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area, determine whether a player wins a prize.
 - 3. Price: The price of a Monster Money ticket is \$1.
- 4. Description of the Monster Money Fast Play lottery game:
- (a) The Monster Money lottery game is an instant win game printed from a Lottery Terminal. All prizes are predetermined, and the player does not have the ability to select their own play symbols. Monster Money tickets may be purchased from an authorized retailer or at a Lottery self-service terminal that sells terminal-based Lottery game tickets. Tickets purchased from an authorized retailer shall be printed on-demand at the time of purchase and may not be preprinted by the retailer.
- (b) Monster Money is played by matching any of the play symbols located in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area to any of the play symbols located in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area. A player matching play symbols in this manner will win the prize shown under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol. Whenever an Eyeball (EYEBALL) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area, the player wins double the prize shown below that Eyeball (EYEBALL) symbol. A bet slip is not used to play this game.
- (c) Players can win the prizes identified in section 7 (relating to prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners).
- (d) Monster Money tickets cannot be canceled or voided once printed by the Lottery Terminal, even if printed in error.

- (e) To purchase a ticket at an authorized retailer, a player must remit the purchase price to the retailer and verbally request a Monster Money ticket. The ticket shall be the only valid proof of the bet placed and the only valid receipt for claiming a prize.
- (f) To purchase a ticket at a Pennsylvania Lottery self-service terminal, the player must insert into the self-service terminal a dollar amount equal to the total purchase price of a Monster Money ticket and select the Monster Money option on the Lottery self-service terminal. The ticket shall be the only valid proof of the bet placed and the only valid receipt for claiming a prize.
 - 5. Monster Money ticket characteristics:
- (a) Monster Money tickets shall contain a play area, the cost of the play, the date of sale and a bar code.
- (b) Play Symbols: Monster Money tickets will contain a "WINNING NUMBERS" area and a "YOUR NUMBERS" area. The play symbols and their captions, located in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area, are: 1 (ONE), 2 (TWO), 3 (THREE), 4 (FOUR), 5 (FIVE), 6 (SIX), 7 (SEVEN), 8 (EIGHT), 9 (NINE), 10 (TEN), 11 (ELEVN), 12 (TWLV), 13 (THRTN), 14 (FORTN), 15 (FIFTN), 16 (SIXTN), 17 (SVNTN), 18 (EGHTN), 19 (NINTN), 20 (TWENT), 21 (TWYONE), 22 (TWYTWO), 23 (TWYTHR), 24 (TWYFOR), 25 (TWYFIV), 26 (TWYSIX), 27 (TWYSVN), 28 (TWYEGT), 29 (TWYNIN) and 30 (THIRT). - (q) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$5.00 (FIV DOL) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$5.
- (r) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$4.00 (FOR DOL) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$4.
- (s) Holders of tickets upon which an Eyeball (EYEBALL) play symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of $\$2^{.00}$ (TWO DOL) appears in

- the Prize area under that Eyeball (EYEBALL) play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$4

- (w) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$1.00 (ONE DOL) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1.
- (x) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of FREE (TICKET) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of one Monster Money Fast Play Game Ticket.

 - (iv) The player's address;
 - (v) The player's telephone number;
 - (vi) The player's email address;
- (vii) Any other information established by the Lottery to be necessary to verify the age and identity of the player.
- (4) An individual may be required to provide additional information or documentation, as set forth in the iLottery terms and conditions, to establish a lottery account or register for iLottery. The information may be used for iLottery registration or to confirm information provided by that individual during the registration process.
- (5) To enter the Drawing, entrants must submit the identifying information from at least one Qualifying Ticket via the Drawing's promotional web site, available at https://www.palottery.com, or the Pennsylvania Lottery's official mobile application, during the entry period. - (4) The number of entries an entrant will receive for the Drawing is determined by the purchase price of the Qualifying Ticket entered. The purchase price and corresponding number of entries for the Qualifying Ticket is as follows: PA-5207 Witch Way (\$5) = five entries, PA-5208 Spooky Skeleton (\$2) = two entries and PA-5209 Monster Money (\$1) = one entry.

(5) Players may review prizes won and their entries for the Drawing via the Drawing's promotional web site.

- (d) Prizes available to be won, determination of winners and odds of winning:
- (1) The prize entitlements described below are subject to all restrictions and limitations described in section 9(e) or mentioned anywhere else in these rules.
- (2) The Lottery will conduct one Drawing from among all the entries received during the entry period as described in section 9(c)(2).
- (i) The first entry selected in the Drawing will be a winning entry and the entrant who submitted that winning entry shall be entitled to a prize of \$30,000, less required income tax withholding.
- (ii) The second through the sixth entries selected in the Drawing will be winning entries and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$7,000, less required income tax withholding.

- (4) Employees of the Lottery, 9Rooftops Marketing, LLC (formerly known as MARC USA, LLC), MUSL, Scientific Games International, Inc., MDI Entertainment, LLC, and their subcontractors, or a spouse, child, brother,

sister or parent residing as a member of the same household in the principal place of residence of any such person are not eligible to participate in the Drawing. Offer void where prohibited or restricted.

- (5) The Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to cancel or suspend the Drawing and change these rules if the Drawing cannot be conducted as planned due to errors in these rules or advertising, unauthorized intervention, tampering, fraud, technical errors, viruses, worms, bugs or any other cause that, in the Lottery's sole judgment, could corrupt or impair the administration, security, fairness, integrity or proper conduct of the Drawing.
- (6) All entries shall be subject to verification by the Lottery.
- (7) The Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to disqualify an entrant found to be tampering with the operation of the Drawing or to be acting in violation of these rules or applicable law.
- (8) The Drawing is governed by the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Applicable laws and regulations apply.
- (9) Prizes must be claimed within 1 year of the drawing date of the Drawing in which the prize was won. - (b) The holder of a Fast Play lottery game ticket has the sole responsibility for checking the accuracy and condition of the data printed on the game ticket.
- (c) The Commonwealth shall not be responsible for a lost or stolen Fast Play lottery game ticket, or for a Fast Play ticket redeemed by a player in error.
 - 11. Ticket validation and requirements:
- (a) Valid Fast Play lottery game tickets. To be a valid Fast Play lottery game ticket, the presented game ticket must meet the following requirements:
- (1) The game ticket's bar code shall be present in its entirety.
 - (2) The game ticket must be intact.
- (3) The game ticket may not be mutilated, altered, reconstituted or tampered with.
- (4) The game ticket may not be counterfeit or a duplicate of a winning ticket.
 - (5) The game ticket must have been validly issued.
- (6) The game ticket data shall have been recorded on the Lottery Central Computer System and the game ticket data shall match the computer record in every respect.
- (7) The game ticket must not be defectively printed or printed or produced in error such that it cannot be processed or validated by the Lottery.
- (8) The game ticket must pass other confidential security checks of the Lottery.
- (b) Invalid or defective game tickets. A game ticket not passing the validation requirements in subsection (a) will be considered invalid and no payment will be made on account of any play recorded thereon. The determination of the Secretary in this regard is final.
 - 12. Procedures for claiming and payment of prizes:
- (a) A prize may be claimed through an authorized retailer or the Lottery, as provided in this section. A prize must be claimed within 1 year of the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket.
- (b) An authorized retailer is authorized to pay prizes of \$2,500 or less. The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play representing a prize of \$2,500 or less may be paid by a participating authorized retailer if a proper validation pay ticket was issued by the retailer's Lottery Terminal.
- (c) The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play representing a prize in excess of \$2,500 may present the game ticket to an authorized retailer, Lottery District Office, or Lottery Headquarters.
- (d) The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play shall present the ticket, in person, to an authorized retailer, Lottery Headquarters or a Lottery District Office. The retailer or the Lottery will issue payment if:
- (1) The game ticket is scanned, and the play is validated through the Lottery Terminal or the Lottery Central Computer System;
 - (2) A claim form is properly and fully completed;
 - (3) The identification of the claimant is confirmed; and
- (4) The winning ticket has not expired, pursuant to this section or section 14 (relating to unclaimed prizes).
- (e) The Commonwealth shall not be responsible for a winning play paid in error by an authorized retailer.

- (f) In the event a prize described in these rules is not available, the Lottery may either provide a substitute prize, determined by the Secretary to have an equivalent value to the prize won, or make a cash payment to the winner, in an amount determined by the Secretary to have an equivalent value to the prize won.
- 13. Funding for prizes: Moneys will be drawn from the State Lottery Fund, to the extent necessary, to fund the payment of prizes under this section. If this lottery game is terminated for any cause, prize moneys remaining undistributed will remain in the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes otherwise provided for by law.
- 14. *Unclaimed prizes*: Unclaimed prize money on winning Fast Play lottery game tickets will be retained by the Secretary for payment to the persons entitled thereto for 1 year from the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket. If no claim is made within 1 year from the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket, the right of a ticket holder to claim the prize represented by that ticket, if any, shall expire.
- 15. Purchase and prize restrictions: A Fast Play lottery game ticket may not be purchased by, and a prize may not be paid, to an officer or employee of the Lottery, Lottery professional services contractors or subcontractors, or to a spouse, child, brother, sister or parent residing in the same household of an officer, employee, contractor or subcontractor who is involved in the production, distribution or operation of systems for the validation or accounting of Fast Play games.

16. Governing law:

- (a) By purchasing a ticket, the purchaser agrees to comply with and abide by the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314), this notice, instructions, conditions and final decisions of the Secretary, and procedures established by the Secretary for the conduct of the Fast Play Monster Money lottery game.
- (b) Decisions made by the Secretary, including the declaration of prizes and the payment thereof, in interpretation of this notice are final and binding on players and persons making a claim in respect thereof.
 - 17. Retailer compensation:
- (a) Authorized retailers may be entitled to compensation as determined by the Lottery.
- (b) No authorized retailer or employee of an authorized retailer shall request, demand, or accept gratuities or any compensation other than as provided in subsection (a) in exchange for the performance of duties authorized pursuant to the Lottery retailer's license without the Lottery's prior written authorization.
- 18. Retailer Incentive Programs: The Lottery may conduct a separate Retailer Incentive Program for retailers who sell Pennsylvania Fast Play Monster Money lottery game tickets.
- 19. Retailer bonus: The Lottery may offer a retailer bonus in connection with the sale of Pennsylvania Fast Play lottery game tickets. If a retailer bonus is offered, a Lottery retailer shall be eligible for a bonus as described in this section. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$100,000 and not exceeding \$500,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$500. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$500,001 and not

exceeding \$1,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$5,000. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$1,000,001 and not exceeding \$10,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$10,000. A Lottery retailer is entitled only to the largest bonus for which they qualify on a winning ticket. A bonus will be initiated for payment after the Fast Play game ticket is claimed and validated. A bonus will not be awarded to a Lottery retailer that sells a non-winning Pennsylvania Lottery Fast Play game ticket used to enter a Pennsylvania Lottery second-chance drawing or promotion that is subsequently selected to win a prize.

- 20. Termination of the game: The Secretary may announce a termination date, after which no further tickets from this game may be sold. The announcement will be disseminated through media used to advertise or promote Monster Money or through normal communications methods.
- 21. Applicability: This notice applies only to the Monster Money lottery game announced in this notice.

Pennsylvania Spooky Skeleton Fast Play Game 5208

Under the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314) and 61 Pa. Code § 803.11 (relating to powers and duties of the Secretary of Revenue), the Secretary of Revenue hereby provides public notice of the rules for the following lottery game:

- 1. Name: The name of the lottery game is Pennsylvania Spooky Skeleton ("Spooky Skeleton"). The game number is PA-5208.
 - 2. Definitions:
- (a) Authorized retailer or retailer: A person who is properly licensed by the Lottery pursuant to 61 Pa. Code §§ 805.1—805.17.
- (b) *Bar code*: The symbology on the ticket containing certain encrypted validation and accounting data used for identifying winning and losing tickets.
- (c) CANDLE CASH: The area at the top of a Spooky Skeleton ticket containing a "YOUR CANDLE" play symbol that, when played according to the instructions, determines whether the player wins a prize of \$13. "CANDLE CASH" is played separately.
- (d) Game Ticket: A bearer instrument produced through a Lottery Terminal that is the player's record of a play for a Fast Play lottery game and sold by an authorized retailer containing the play and validation data as published in this game notice.
- (e) Lottery Central Computer System: The computer gaming system on which all Fast Play plays are recorded.
- (f) Lottery Terminal: A device authorized by the Lottery to function in an interactive mode with the Lottery Central Computer System for the purpose of issuing plays, executing Quick Pick selections, and entering,

receiving, and processing lottery transactions, including making purchases, validating plays, transmitting reports and performing inventory functions.

- (g) *Play*: A chance to participate in a particular Fast Play lottery game.
- (h) *Play Area*: The area on a ticket, which contains one or more play symbols.
- (i) *Play Symbol*: A number, letter, symbol, image or other character found in the play area, which is used to determine whether a player wins a prize.
- (j) *Prize*: A non-monetary item, money or experience that can be won as specified in section 7 (relating to prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners) of this game notice.
- (k) WINNING NUMBERS: The numbers, letters, symbols or other characters found in the play area that, when matched against the play symbols in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area, determine whether a player wins a prize.
- (l) Winning ticket: A game ticket which has been validated and qualifies for a prize.
- (m) YOUR CANDLE: The symbol found in the "CANDLE CASH" area that, when appearing with a Flame symbol, determines whether the player wins a prize of \$13.
- (m) YOUR NUMBERS: The numbers, letters, symbols or other characters found in the play area that, when matched against the play symbols in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area, determine whether a player wins a prize.
 - 3. Price: The price of a Spooky Skeleton ticket is \$2.
- 4. Description of the Spooky Skeleton Fast Play lottery game:
- (a) The Spooky Skeleton lottery game is an instant win game printed from a Lottery Terminal. All prizes are predetermined, and the player does not have the ability to select their own play symbols. Spooky Skeleton tickets may be purchased from an authorized retailer or at a Lottery self-service terminal that sells terminal-based Lottery game tickets. Tickets purchased from an authorized retailer shall be printed on-demand at the time of purchase and may not be preprinted by the retailer.
- (b) Spooky Skeleton is played by matching the play symbols located in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area to the play symbols located in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area. A player matching play symbols in this manner will win the prize shown under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol. Whenever an Apple (APPLE) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area, the player increases the prize shown under that play symbol by \$13 and wins that amount. A bet slip is not used to play this game.
- (c) Spooky Skeleton tickets also contain a "CANDLE CASH" area. Whenever a Flame symbol appears on YOUR CANDLE, the player wins a prize of \$13. "CANDLE CASH" is played separately.
- (d) Players can win the prizes identified in section 7 (relating to prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners).
- (e) A Spooky Skeleton game ticket cannot be canceled or voided once printed by the Lottery Terminal, even if printed in error.
- (f) To purchase a ticket at an authorized retailer, a player must remit the purchase price to the retailer and

- verbally request a Spooky Skeleton game ticket. The ticket shall be the only valid proof of the bet placed and the only valid receipt for claiming a prize.
- (g) To purchase a ticket at a Pennsylvania Lottery self-service terminal, the player must insert into the self-service terminal a dollar amount equal to the total purchase price of a Spooky Skeleton game ticket and select the Spooky Skeleton option on the Lottery self-service terminal. The ticket shall be the only valid proof of the bet placed and the only valid receipt for claiming a prize.
 - 5. Spooky Skeleton ticket characteristics:
- (a) A Spooky Skeleton ticket shall contain a play area, the cost of the play, the date of sale and a bar code.
- (b) Play Symbols: Each Spooky Skeleton ticket play area will contain a "WINNING NUMBERS" area, a "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a "CANDLE CASH" area. The play symbols and their captions, located in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area, are: 1 (ONE), 2 (TWO), 3 (THREE), 4 (FOUR), 5 (FIVE), 6 (SIX), 7 (SEVEN), 8 (EIGHT), 9 (NINE), 10 (TEN), 11 (ELEVN), 12 (TWLV), 13 (THRTN), 14 (FORTN), 15 (FIFTN), 16 (SIXTN), 17 (SVNTN), 18 (EGHTN), 19 (NINTN), 20 (TWENT), 21 (TWYONE), 22 (TWYTWO), 23 (TWYTHR), (TWYFOR), 25 (TWYFIV), 26 (TWYSIX), 27 (TWYSVN), 28 (TWYEGT), 29 (TWYNIN) and 30 (THIRT). The play symbols and their captions, located in the "YOUR NUM-BERS" area, are: 1 (ONE), 2 (TWO), 3 (THREE), 4 (FOUR), 5 (FIVE), 6 (SIX), 7 (SEVEN), 8 (EIGHT), 9 (NINE), 10 (TEN), 11 (ELEVN), 12 (TWLV), 13 (THRTN), 14 (FORTN), 15 (FIFTN), 16 (SIXTN), 17 (SVNTN), 18 (EGHTN), 19 (NINTN), 20 (TWENT), 21 (TWYONE), 22 (TWYTWO), 23 (TWYTHR), 24 (TWYFOR), 25 (TWYFIV), 26 (TWYSIX), 27 (TWYSVN), 28 (TWYEGT), 29 (TWYNIN), 30 (THIRT) and an Apple (APPLE) symbol. The play symbols located in the "CANDLE CASH" area are: Candle Without a Flame symbol and Candle With a Flame symbol.
- (c) Prize Symbols: The prize symbols and their captions, located in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area, are: $\$2^{.00}$ (TWO DOL), $\$4^{.00}$ (FOR DOL), $\$5^{.00}$ (FIV DOL), $\$10^{.00}$ (TEN DOL), $\$25^{.00}$ (TWY FIV), $\$50^{.00}$ (FIFTY), \$100 (ONE HUN), \$200 (TWO HUN), \$500 (FIV HUN) and \$13,000 (THRTNTHO).
- (d) *Prizes*: The prizes that can be won in this game, are: \$2, \$4, \$5, \$10, \$25, \$50, \$100, \$200, \$500 and \$13,000. The prize that can be won in the "CANDLE CASH" area is \$13. Spooky Skeleton contains a feature that can increase certain prizes. For a complete list of prizes, and how those prizes can be won, see section 8 (relating to number and description of prizes and approximate chances of winning). A player can win up to ten times on a ticket.
- (e) Approximate number of tickets available for the game: Approximately 720,000 tickets will be available for sale for the Spooky Skeleton lottery game.
- 6. Second-Chance Drawing: The Pennsylvania Lottery will conduct a SPOOK-TACULAR Second-Chance Drawing for which non-winning Spooky Skeleton lottery game tickets may be eligible as provided for in section 9.
- 7. Prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners:
- (a) All Spooky Skeleton prize payments will be made as one-time, lump-sum cash payments.
- (b) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING

- NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$13,000 (THRTNTHO) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$13,000.
- (c) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$500 (FIV HUN) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$500.
- (d) Holders of tickets upon which an Apple (APPLE) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of \$200 (TWO HUN) appears in the Prize area under that Apple (APPLE) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$213.
- (e) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$200 (TWO HUN) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$200.
- (f) Holders of tickets upon which an Apple (APPLE) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in the Prize area under that Apple (APPLE) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$113.
- (g) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.
- (h) Holders of tickets upon which an Apple (APPLE) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of \$50.00 (FIFTY) appears in the Prize area under that Apple (APPLE) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$63.
- (i) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$50.00 (FIFTY) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$50.
- (j) Holders of tickets upon which an Apple (APPLE) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of \$25.00 (TWY FIV) appears in the Prize area under that Apple (APPLE) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$38.
- (k) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$25.00 (TWY FIV) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$25.

- (l) Holders of tickets upon which an Apple (APPLE) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of \$10^{.00} (TEN DOL) appears in the Prize area under that Apple (APPLE) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$23.
- (m) Holders of tickets upon which an Apple (APPLE) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of $\$5^{.00}$ (FIV DOL) appears in the Prize area under that Apple (APPLE) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$18.
- (n) Holders of tickets upon which an Apple (APPLE) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of \$4.00 (FOR DOL) appears in the Prize area under that Apple (APPLE) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$17.
- (o) Holders of tickets upon which an Apple (APPLE) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of $\$2^{.00}$ (TWO DOL) appears in the Prize area under that Apple (APPLE) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$15.
- (p) Holders of tickets upon which a Flame symbol appears on the "YOUR CANDLE" symbol in the "CANDLE CASH" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$13.
- (q) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$10.00 (TEN DOL) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$10.
- (r) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$5.00 (FIV DOL) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$5.
- (s) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$4.00 (FOR DOL) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$4.
- (t) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$2.00 (TWO DOL) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$2.
- 8. Number and description of prizes and approximate chances of winning: The following table sets forth the approximate number of winners, amounts of prizes and approximate chances of winning:

- 9. Second-Chance Drawing: The Pennsylvania Lottery's SPOOK-TACULAR Second-Chance Drawing for qualifying Fast Play lottery game tickets ("Drawing").
- (a) Qualifying Tickets: Non-winning PA-5207 Witch Way (\$5), PA-5208 Spooky Skeleton (\$2) and PA-5209 Monster Money (\$1) Fast Play lottery game tickets ("Qualifying Tickets") are eligible for entry in the Drawing.
 - (b) Participation and entry:
- (1) Entrants must have a registered lottery account in order to participate in the Drawing. To create a lottery account, visit https://www.pailottery.com. Creating a lottery account is free.
- (2) A registered lottery account holder is subject to the iLottery regulations and specifically agrees to be bound by the iLottery terms and conditions located at https://www.pailottery.com/signup/terms-and-conditions/, as well as any related policies.
- (3) To establish a lottery account, players must provide the following information:
- (i) The player's name as it appears on a valid government-issued identification or tax documents;
 - (ii) The player's date of birth;
- (iii) The entire or last four digits of the player's Social Security Number, or comparable equivalent;
 - (iv) The player's address;
 - (v) The player's telephone number;
 - (vi) The player's email address;
- (vii) Any other information established by the Lottery to be necessary to verify the age and identity of the player.
- (4) An individual may be required to provide additional information or documentation, as set forth in the iLottery terms and conditions, to establish a lottery account or register for iLottery. The information may be used for iLottery registration or to confirm information provided by that individual during the registration process.
- (5) To enter the Drawing, entrants must submit the identifying information from at least one Qualifying Ticket via the Drawing's promotional web site, available at https://www.palottery.com, or the Pennsylvania Lottery's official mobile application, during the entry period.

The identifying information from a Qualifying Ticket may be submitted only once in the Drawing. Entries will automatically be awarded at the time of successful submission of a Qualifying Ticket. No other method of submission will be accepted. Entries submitted using any other method, including entries mailed or hand-delivered to the Pennsylvania Lottery, are not valid and will be disqualified.

- (6) Each entry must be complete and the information supplied by the entrant must be accurate. Incomplete entries cannot be submitted.
 - (7) Only one claimant per entry allowed.
 - (8) Entrants must be 18 years of age or older.
- (9) Players may submit the identifying information from an unlimited number of Qualifying Tickets in the Drawing.
- (10) Once an entry has been submitted it cannot be withdrawn or changed.
 - (c) Drawing description:
- (1) The Lottery will conduct one SPOOK-TACULAR Second-Chance Drawing for qualifying Fast Play Lottery game tickets. All time references are Eastern Prevailing Time
- (2) All entries received after 4:59:59 a.m. September 5, 2023, through 11:59:59 p.m. November 2, 2023, will be entered into the Drawing tentatively scheduled to be held between November 6, 2023 and November 17, 2023.
- (3) The entry period for the Drawing will be posted to the Lottery's publicly accessible web site at https:// www.palottery.com.
- (4) The number of entries an entrant will receive for the Drawing is determined by the purchase price of the Qualifying Ticket entered. The purchase price and corresponding number of entries for the Qualifying Ticket is as follows: PA-5207 Witch Way (\$5) = five entries, PA-5208 Spooky Skeleton (\$2) = two entries and PA-5209 Monster Money (\$1) = one entry.
- (5) Players may review prizes won and their entries for the Drawing via the Drawing's promotional web site.
- (d) Prizes available to be won, determination of winners and odds of winning:
- (1) The prize entitlements described below are subject to all restrictions and limitations described in section 9(e) or mentioned anywhere else in these rules.

- (2) The Lottery will conduct one Drawing from among all the entries received during the entry period as described in section 9(c)(2).
- (i) The first entry selected in the Drawing will be a winning entry and the entrant who submitted that winning entry shall be entitled to a prize of \$30,000, less required income tax withholding.
- (ii) The second through the sixth entries selected in the Drawing will be winning entries and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$7,000, less required income tax withholding.
- (iii) The seventh through the nineteenth entries selected in the Drawing will be winning entries and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$1,300.
- (iv) The twentieth through the sixty-ninth entries selected in the Drawing will be winning entries and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$100 iLottery Bonus Money.
- (3) All prizes will be paid as lump-sum cash payments or uploaded to a winning player's lottery account.
- (4) Winners of iLottery Bonus Money are not required to claim a prize. Winners of iLottery Bonus Money will have the iLottery Bonus Money credited to their lottery account and will receive an email notifying them that they won a prize.
- (5) The number of winning entries to be selected for the Drawing will be posted to the Lottery's publicly accessible web site.
- (6) The odds of winning in the Drawing depend upon the number of entries received for the Drawing.
- (7) A computer-generated randomizer will be used to select the Drawing winners.
 - (e) Drawing restrictions:
- (1) To be eligible to participate in the Drawing, entrants must have complied with the requirements of these
- (2) The Lottery is not responsible for late, lost or misdirected entries not entered into the Drawing. The Lottery is not responsible for entries that are not entered into the Drawing because of incompatible internet browsers, mobile Lottery application failure or other technical issues. The Lottery is not responsible for entries not entered due to delays in creating a lottery account or the inability to create a lottery account. If an entry is selected as a winner and rejected or otherwise disqualified during or following the Drawing, the Lottery will select one entry to replace the rejected or otherwise disqualified entry in accordance with these rules and Lottery procedure.
- (3) If any discrepancy exists between these rules and any material describing the Drawing, these rules shall govern.
- (4) Employees of the Lottery, 9Rooftops Marketing, LLC (formerly known as MARC USA, LLC), MUSL, Scientific Games International, Inc., MDI Entertainment, LLC, and their subcontractors, or a spouse, child, brother, sister or parent residing as a member of the same household in the principal place of residence of any such person are not eligible to participate in the Drawing. Offer void where prohibited or restricted.
- (5) The Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to cancel or suspend the Drawing and change these rules if the Drawing cannot be conducted as planned due to errors in these rules or advertising, unauthorized inter-

- vention, tampering, fraud, technical errors, viruses, worms, bugs or any other cause that, in the Lottery's sole judgment, could corrupt or impair the administration, security, fairness, integrity or proper conduct of the Drawing.
- (6) All entries shall be subject to verification by the Lottery.
- (7) The Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to disqualify an entrant found to be tampering with the operation of the Drawing or to be acting in violation of these rules or applicable law.
- (8) The Drawing is governed by the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Applicable laws and regulations apply.
- (9) Prizes must be claimed within 1 year of the drawing date of the Drawing in which the prize was won. If no claim is made within 1 year of the drawing date of the Drawing in which the prize was won, the right of an entrant to claim the prize won, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided by statute.
- (10) Final determination of winners will be made by the Secretary, whose judgment will be final and binding.
- (11) A prize awarded in the Drawing to a person who dies before receiving the prize shall be paid according to 61 Pa. Code § 811.16 (relating to prizes payable after death of a prize winner).
- (12) A winner is responsible for all taxes arising from or in connection with any prize won.
- (13) A player may only win the prize for which the player is first selected in the Drawing. Subsequent entries, from the same individual, selected in the same Drawing will be disqualified and one replacement entry will be selected.
- (14) Winners of iLottery Bonus Money must abide by the iLottery terms and conditions, the iLottery Bonus Policy and these rules. iLottery Bonus Money will expire 90 days from the date on which the winner was notified, via email, of the prize win, as further detailed in section 9(d)(4). iLottery Bonus Money has a five times play through requirement in order to convert the iLottery Bonus Money into cash. For example, for a player winning \$100 of iLottery Bonus Money, the player is required to place \$500 in wagers before the iLottery Bonus Money awarded is converted into cash which may be withdrawn from the player's Lottery account.
 - (15) Prizes are not transferrable.
 - (16) Other restrictions may apply.
 - 10. Ticket responsibility:
- (a) A Fast Play lottery game ticket is a bearer document deemed to be owned by the person holding the game ticket, except that if a name is contained on the back of the game ticket, the person named will, for all purposes, be considered the owner of the game ticket.
- (b) The holder of a Fast Play lottery game ticket has the sole responsibility for checking the accuracy and condition of the data printed on the game ticket.
- (c) The Commonwealth shall not be responsible for a lost or stolen Fast Play lottery game ticket, or for a Fast Play ticket redeemed by a player in error.

- 11. Ticket validation and requirements:
- (a) Valid Fast Play lottery game tickets. To be a valid Fast Play lottery game ticket, the presented game ticket must meet the following requirements:
- (1) The game ticket's bar code shall be present in its entirety.
 - (2) The game ticket must be intact.
- (3) The game ticket may not be mutilated, altered, reconstituted or tampered with.
- (4) The game ticket may not be counterfeit or a duplicate of a winning ticket.
 - (5) The game ticket must have been validly issued.
- (6) The game ticket data shall have been recorded on the Lottery Central Computer System and the game ticket data shall match the computer record in every respect.
- (7) The game ticket must not be defectively printed or printed or produced in error such that it cannot be processed or validated by the Lottery.
- (8) The game ticket must pass other confidential security checks of the Lottery.
- (b) Invalid or defective game tickets. A game ticket not passing the validation requirements in subsection (a) will be considered invalid and no payment will be made on account of any play recorded thereon. The determination of the Secretary in this regard is final.
 - 12. Procedures for claiming and payment of prizes:
- (a) A prize may be claimed through an authorized retailer or the Lottery, as provided in this section. A prize must be claimed within 1 year of the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket.
- (b) An authorized retailer is authorized to pay prizes of \$2,500 or less. The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play representing a prize of \$2,500 or less may be paid by a participating authorized retailer if a proper validation pay ticket was issued by the retailer's Lottery Terminal.
- (c) The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play representing a prize in excess of \$2,500 may present the game ticket to an authorized retailer, Lottery District Office, or Lottery Headquarters.
- (d) The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play shall present the ticket, in person, to an authorized retailer, Lottery Headquarters or a Lottery District Office. The retailer or the Lottery will issue payment if:
- (1) The game ticket is scanned and the play is validated through the Lottery Terminal or the Lottery Central Computer System;
 - (2) A claim form is properly and fully completed;
 - (3) The identification of the claimant is confirmed; and
- (4) The winning ticket has not expired, pursuant to this section or section 14 (relating to unclaimed prizes).
- (e) The Commonwealth shall not be responsible for a winning play paid in error by an authorized retailer.
- (f) In the event a prize described in these rules is not available, the Lottery may either provide a substitute prize, determined by the Secretary to have an equivalent value to the prize won, or make a cash payment to the winner, in an amount determined by the Secretary to have an equivalent value to the prize won.

13. Funding for prizes: Moneys will be drawn from the State Lottery Fund, to the extent necessary, to fund the payment of prizes under this section. If this lottery game is terminated for any cause, prize moneys remaining undistributed will remain in the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes otherwise provided for by law.

- 14. Unclaimed prizes: Unclaimed prize money on winning Fast Play lottery game tickets will be retained by the Secretary for payment to the persons entitled thereto for 1 year from the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket. If no claim is made within 1 year from the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket, the right of a ticket holder to claim the prize represented by that ticket, if any, shall expire.
- 15. Purchase and prize restrictions: A Fast Play lottery game ticket may not be purchased by, and a prize may not be paid, to an officer or employee of the Lottery, Lottery professional services contractors or subcontractors, or to a spouse, child, brother, sister or parent residing in the same household of an officer, employee, contractor or subcontractor who is involved in the production, distribution or operation of systems for the validation or accounting of Fast Play games.

16. Governing law:

- (a) By purchasing a ticket, the purchaser agrees to comply with and abide by the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314), this notice, instructions, conditions and final decisions of the Secretary, and procedures established by the Secretary for the conduct of the Fast Play Spooky Skeleton lottery game.
- (b) Decisions made by the Secretary, including the declaration of prizes and the payment thereof, in interpretation of this notice are final and binding on players and persons making a claim in respect thereof.
 - 17. Retailer compensation:
- (a) Authorized retailers may be entitled to compensation as determined by the Lottery.
- (b) No authorized retailer or employee of an authorized retailer shall request, demand, or accept gratuities or any compensation other than as provided in subsection (a) in exchange for the performance of duties authorized pursuant to the Lottery retailer's license without the Lottery's prior written authorization.
- 18. Retailer Incentive Programs: The Lottery may conduct a separate Retailer Incentive Program for retailers who sell Pennsylvania Fast Play Spooky Skeleton lottery game tickets.
- 19. Retailer bonus: The Lottery may offer a retailer bonus in connection with the sale of Pennsylvania Fast Play lottery game tickets. If a retailer bonus is offered, a Lottery retailer shall be eligible for a bonus as described in this section. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$100,000 and not exceeding \$500,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$500. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$500,001 and not exceeding \$1,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$5,000. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$1,000,001 and not exceeding \$10,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$10,000. A Lottery retailer is entitled only to the largest bonus for which they qualify on a

winning ticket. A bonus will be initiated for payment after the Fast Play game ticket is claimed and validated. A bonus will not be awarded to a Lottery retailer that sells a non-winning Pennsylvania Lottery Fast Play game ticket used to enter a Pennsylvania Lottery second-chance drawing or promotion that is subsequently selected to win a prize.

- 20. Termination of the game: The Secretary may announce a termination date, after which no further tickets from this game may be sold. The announcement will be disseminated through media used to advertise or promote Spooky Skeleton or through normal communications methods.
- 21. Applicability: This notice applies only to the Spooky Skeleton lottery game announced in this notice.

Pennsylvania Witch Way Fast Play Game 5207

Under the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101— 3761-314) and 61 Pa. Code § 803.11 (relating to powers and duties of the Secretary of Revenue), the Secretary of Revenue hereby provides public notice of the rules for the following lottery game:

- 1. Name: The name of the lottery game is Pennsylvania Witch Way ("Witch Way"). The game number is PA-5207.
 - 2. Definitions:
- (a) Authorized retailer or retailer: A person who is properly licensed by the Lottery pursuant to 61 Pa. Code §§ 805.1—805.17.
- (b) Bar code: The symbology on the ticket containing certain encrypted validation and accounting data used for identifying winning and losing tickets.
- (c) Game Ticket: A bearer instrument produced through a Lottery Terminal that is the player's record of a play for a Fast Play lottery game and sold by an authorized retailer containing the play and validation data as published in this game notice.
- (d) Lottery Central Computer System: The computer gaming system on which all Fast Play plays are recorded.
- (e) Lottery Terminal: A device authorized by the Lottery to function in an interactive mode with the Lottery Central Computer System for the purpose of issuing plays, executing Quick Pick selections, and entering, receiving, and processing lottery transactions, including making purchases, validating plays, transmitting reports and performing inventory functions.
- (f) Play: A chance to participate in a particular Fast Play lottery game.
- (g) Play Area: The area on a ticket which contains one or more play symbols.
- (h) Play Symbol: A number, letter, symbol, image or other character found in the play area which is used to determine whether a player wins a prize.

- (i) Prize: A non-monetary item, money, or experience that can be won as specified in section 7 (relating to prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners) of this game notice.
- (j) THIS WAY OR THAT WAY: The area at the bottom of a Witch Way lottery game ticket containing a "THIS WAY NUMBER" play symbol and a "THAT WAY NUM-BER" play symbol and the area at the top of a Witch Way lottery game ticket containing a "THIS WAY PRIZE" symbol and a "THAT WAY PRIZE" symbol, that, when matched according to the instructions, determine whether the player wins a prize. "THIS WAY OR THAT WAY" is played separately.
- (k) WINNING NUMBERS: The numbers, letters, symbols or other characters found in the play area that, when matched against the play symbols in the "YOUR NUM-BERS" area, determine whether a player wins a prize.
- (l) Winning ticket: A game ticket which has been validated and qualifies for a prize.
- (m) YOUR NUMBERS: The numbers, letters, symbols or other characters found in the play area that, when matched against the play symbols in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area, determine whether a player wins a prize.
- 3. Price: The price of a Witch Way lottery game ticket is \$5.
 - 4. Description of the Witch Way Fast Play lottery game:
- (a) Witch Way lottery game is an instant win game printed from a Lottery Terminal. All prizes are predetermined and the player does not have the ability to select their own play symbols. Witch Way lottery game tickets may be purchased from an authorized retailer or at a Lottery self-service terminal that sells terminal-based Lottery game tickets. Tickets purchased from an authorized retailer shall be printed on-demand at the time of purchase and may not be preprinted by the retailer.
- (b) Witch Way lottery game is played by matching any of the play symbols located in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area to any of the play symbols located in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area. A player matching play symbols in this manner will win the prize shown under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol. A bet slip is not used to play this game.
- (c) Witch Way lottery game tickets contain a "THIS WAY OR THAT WAY" area. When any "WINNING NUMBER" matches the "THIS WAY NUMBER," the player wins the "THIS WAY PRIZE." When any "WINNING NUMBER," the "THIAT WAY NUMBER," the NUMBER" matches the "THAT WAY NUMBER," the player wins the "THAT WAY PRIZE." "THIS WAY OR THAT WAY" is played separately.
- (d) Players can win the prizes identified in section 7 (relating to prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners).
- (e) Witch Way lottery game tickets cannot be canceled or voided once printed by the Lottery Terminal, even if printed in error.
- (f) To purchase a ticket at an authorized retailer, a player must remit the purchase price to the retailer and verbally request a Witch Way lottery game ticket. The ticket shall be the only valid proof of the bet placed and the only valid receipt for claiming a prize.
- (g) To purchase a ticket at a Pennsylvania Lottery self-service terminal, the player must insert into the self-service terminal a dollar amount equal to the total purchase price of a Witch Way lottery game ticket and

select the Witch Way option on the Lottery self-service terminal. The ticket shall be the only valid proof of the bet placed and the only valid receipt for claiming a prize.

- 5. Witch Way lottery game ticket characteristics:
- (a) Witch Way lottery game tickets shall contain a play area, the cost of the play, the date of sale and a bar code.
- (b) Play Symbols: Witch Way lottery game tickets will contain a "WINNING NUMBERS" area, a "YOUR NUM-BERS" area and a "THIS WAY OR THAT WAY" area. "THIS WAY OR THAT WAY" is played separately. The play symbols and their captions, located in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area and the "THIS WAY OR THAT WAY" area at the bottom of the ticket, are: 1 (ONE), 2 (TWO), 3 (THREE), 4 (FOUR), 5 (FIVE), 6 (SIX), 7 (SEVEN), 8 (EIGHT), 9 (NINE), 10 (TEN), 11 (ELEVN), 12 (TWLV), 13 (THRTN), 14 (FORTN), 15 (FIFTN), 16 (SIXTN), 17 (SVNTN), 18 (EGHTN), 19 (NINTN), 20 (TWENT), 21 (TWYONE), 22 (TWYTWO), 23 (TWYTHR), 24 (TWYFOR), 25 (TWYFIV), 26 (TWYSIX), 27 (TWYSVN), 28 (TWYEGT), 29 (TWYNIN) and 30 (THIRT). The play symbols and their captions, located in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area, are: 1 (ONE), 2 (TWO), 3 (THREE), 4 (FOUR), 5 (FIVE), 6 (SIX), 7 (SEVEN), 8 (EIGHT), 9 (NINE), 10 (TEN), 11 (ELEVN), 12 (TWLV), 13 (THRTN), 14 (FORTN), 15 (FIFTN), 16 (SIXTN), 17 (SVNTN), 18 (EGHTN), 19 (NINTN), 20 (TWENT), 21 (TWYONE), 22 (TWYTWO), 23 (TWYTHR), 24 (TWYFOR), 25 (TWYFIV), 26 (TWYSIX), 27 (TWYSVN), 28 (TWYEGT), 29 (TWYNIN), 30 (THIRT) and a Cat (9TIMES) symbol.
- (c) Prize Symbols: The prize symbols and their captions, located in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area, are: \$5 $^{.00}$ (FIV DOL), \$10 $^{.00}$ (TEN DOL), \$20 $^{.00}$ (TWENTY), \$30 $^{.00}$ (THIRTY), \$50 $^{.00}$ (FIFTY), \$100 (ONE HUN), \$500 (FIV HUN), \$1,000 (ONE THO) and \$31,000 (TRYONETHO). The prize symbols and their captions, located in the "THIS WAY OR THAT WAY" area, are: \$5 $^{.00}$ (FIV DOL), \$10 $^{.00}$ (TEN DOL), \$20 $^{.00}$ (TWENTY), \$30 $^{.00}$ (THIRTY), \$50 $^{.00}$ (FIFTY) and \$100 (ONE HUN).
- (d) *Prizes*: The prizes that can be won in this game are: \$5, \$10, \$20, \$30, \$50, \$100, \$500, \$1,000 and \$31,000. The prizes that can be won in the "THIS WAY OR THAT WAY" area at the top of the ticket, are: \$5, \$10, \$20, \$30, \$50 and \$100. Witch Way contains a feature that can multiply certain prizes. For a complete list of prizes, and how those prizes can be won, see section 8 (relating to number and description of prizes and approximate odds). A player can win up to 14 times on a ticket.
- (e) Approximate number of tickets available for the game: Approximately 480,000 tickets will be available for sale for the Witch Way lottery game.
- 6. Second Chance Drawing: The Pennsylvania Lottery will conduct a SPOOK-TACULAR Second-Chance Drawing for which non-winning Witch Way lottery game tickets may be eligible as provided for in section 9.
- 7. Prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners:
- (a) All Witch Way prize payments will be made as one-time, lump-sum cash payments.
- (b) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$31,000 (TRYONETHO) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$31,000.

(c) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$1,000 (ONE THO) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1,000.

- (d) Holders of tickets upon which a Cat (9TIMES) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONEHUN) appears in the Prize area under that Cat (9TIMES) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$900.
- (e) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$500 (FIV HUN) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$500.
- (f) Holders of tickets upon which a Cat (9TIMES) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of $\$50^{.00}$ (FIFTY) appears in the Prize area under that Cat (9TIMES) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$450.
- (g) Holders of tickets upon which a Cat (9TIMES) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of \$30^{.00} (THIRTY) appears in the Prize area under that Cat (9TIMES) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$270.
- (h) Holders of tickets upon which a Cat (9TIMES) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of $\$20^{.00}$ (TWENTY) appears in the Prize area under that Cat (9TIMES) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$180.
- (i) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.
- (j) Holders of tickets upon which any "WINNING NUMBER" matches the "THIS WAY NUMBER" or the "THAT WAY NUMBER" and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in the corresponding "THIS WAY PRIZE" area or the "THAT WAY PRIZE" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.
- (k) Holders of tickets upon which a Cat (9TIMES) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of $\$10^{.00}$ (TEN DOL) appears in the Prize area under that Cat (9TIMES) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$90.
- (l) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$50.00 (FIFTY) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$50.
- (m) Holders of tickets upon which any "WINNING NUMBER" matches the "THIS WAY NUMBER" or the "THAT WAY NUMBER" and a prize symbol of 50^{00} (FIFTY) appears in the corresponding "THIS WAY PRIZE" area or the "THAT WAY PRIZE" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of 50.
- (n) Holders of tickets upon which a Cat (9TIMES) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of $\$5^{.00}$ (FIV DOL) appears in the Prize area under that Cat (9TIMES) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$45.

- (o) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$30.00 (THIRTY) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$30.
- (p) Holders of tickets upon which any "WINNING NUMBER" matches the "THIS WAY NUMBER" or the "THAT WAY NUMBER" and a prize symbol of $\$30^{.00}$ (THIRTY) appears in the corresponding "THIS WAY PRIZE" area or the "THAT WAY PRIZE" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$30.
- (q) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$20.00 (TWENTY) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$20.
- (r) Holders of tickets upon which any "WINNING NUMBER" matches the "THIS WAY NUMBER" or the "THAT WAY NUMBER" and a prize symbol of $$20^{.00}$ (TWENTY) appears in the corresponding "THIS WAY PRIZE" area or the "THAT WAY PRIZE" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$20.
- (s) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING

- NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$10.00 (TEN DOL) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$10.
- (t) Holders of tickets upon which any "WINNING NUMBER" matches the "THIS WAY NUMBER" or the "THAT WAY NUMBER" and a prize symbol of $$10^{.00}$ (TEN DOL) appears in the corresponding "THIS WAY PRIZE" area or the "THAT WAY PRIZE" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$10.
- (u) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$5.00 (FIV DOL) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$5.
- (v) Holders of tickets upon which any "WINNING NUMBER" matches the "THIS WAY NUMBER" or the "THAT WAY NUMBER" and a prize symbol of \$5.00 (FIV DOL) appears in the corresponding "THIS WAY PRIZE" area or the "THAT WAY PRIZE" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$5.
- 8. Number and description of prizes and approximate chances of winning: The following table sets forth the approximate number of winners, amounts of prizes and approximate chances of winning:

Prizes, including top prizes, are subject to availability at the time of purchase.

- 9. Second-Chance Drawing: The Pennsylvania Lottery's SPOOK-TACULAR Second-Chance Drawing for qualifying Fast Play lottery game tickets ("Drawing").
- (a) Qualifying Tickets: Non-winning PA-5207 Witch Way (\$5), PA-5208 Spooky Skeleton (\$2) and PA-5209 Monster Money (\$1) Fast Play lottery game tickets ("Qualifying Tickets") are eligible for entry in the Drawing.
 - (b) Participation and entry:
- (1) Entrants must have a registered lottery account in order to participate in the Drawing. To create a lottery account, visit https://www.pailottery.com. Creating a lottery account is free.
- (2) A registered lottery account holder is subject to the iLottery regulations and specifically agrees to be bound by the iLottery terms and conditions located at https://www.pailottery.com/signup/terms-and-conditions/, as well as any related policies.
- (3) To establish a lottery account, players must provide the following information:
- (i) The player's name as it appears on a valid government-issued identification or tax documents;
 - (ii) The player's date of birth;
- (iii) The entire or last four digits of the player's Social Security Number, or comparable equivalent;
 - (iv) The player's address;
 - (v) The player's telephone number;
 - (vi) The player's email address;
- (vii) Any other information established by the Lottery to be necessary to verify the age and identity of the player.
- (4) An individual may be required to provide additional information or documentation, as set forth in the iLottery terms and conditions, to establish a lottery account or register for iLottery. The information may be used for iLottery registration or to confirm information provided by that individual during the registration process.
- (5) To enter the Drawing, entrants must submit the identifying information from at least one Qualifying Ticket via the Drawing's promotional web site, available at https://www.palottery.com, or the Pennsylvania Lottery's official mobile application, during the entry period. - (4) The number of entries an entrant will receive for the Drawing is determined by the purchase price of the Qualifying Ticket entered. The purchase price and corresponding number of entries for the Qualifying Ticket is as follows: PA-5207 Witch Way (\$5) = five entries, PA-5208 Spooky Skeleton (\$2) = two entries and PA-5209 Monster Money (\$1) = one entry.
- (5) Players may review prizes won and their entries for the Drawing via the Drawing's promotional web site.
- (d) Prizes available to be won, determination of winners and odds of winning:
- (1) The prize entitlements described below are subject to all restrictions and limitations described in section 9(e) or mentioned anywhere else in these rules.
- (2) The Lottery will conduct one Drawing from among all the entries received during the entry period as described in section 9(c)(2).
- (i) The first entry selected in the Drawing will be a winning entry and the entrant who submitted that winning entry shall be entitled to a prize of \$30,000, less required income tax withholding.

- (3) If any discrepancy exists between these rules and any material describing the Drawing, these rules shall govern.
- (4) Employees of the Lottery, 9Rooftops Marketing, LLC (formerly known as MARC USA, LLC), MUSL, Scientific Games International, Inc., MDI Entertainment, LLC, and their subcontractors, or a spouse, child, brother, sister or parent residing as a member of the same household in the principal place of residence of any such person are not eligible to participate in the Drawing. Offer void where prohibited or restricted.
- (5) The Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to cancel or suspend the Drawing and change these rules if the Drawing cannot be conducted as planned due to errors in these rules or advertising, unauthorized intervention, tampering, fraud, technical errors, viruses, worms, bugs or any other cause that, in the Lottery's sole judgment, could corrupt or impair the administration, security, fairness, integrity or proper conduct of the Drawing.
- (6) All entries shall be subject to verification by the Lottery.
- (7) The Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to disqualify an entrant found to be tampering with the operation of the Drawing or to be acting in violation of these rules or applicable law.
- (8) The Drawing is governed by the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Applicable laws and regulations apply.
- (9) Prizes must be claimed within 1 year of the drawing date of the Drawing in which the prize was won. If no claim is made within 1 year of the drawing date of the Drawing in which the prize was won, the right of an entrant to claim the prize won, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided by statute.

- (b) The holder of a Fast Play lottery game ticket has the sole responsibility for checking the accuracy and condition of the data printed on the game ticket.
- (c) The Commonwealth shall not be responsible for a lost or stolen Fast Play lottery game ticket, or for a Fast Play ticket redeemed by a player in error.
 - 11. Ticket validation and requirements:
- (a) Valid Fast Play lottery game tickets. To be a valid Fast Play lottery game ticket, the presented game ticket must meet the following requirements:
- (1) The game ticket's bar code shall be present in its entirety.
 - (2) The game ticket must be intact.
- (3) The game ticket may not be mutilated, altered, reconstituted or tampered with.
- (4) The game ticket may not be counterfeit or a duplicate of a winning ticket.
 - (5) The game ticket must have been validly issued.
- (6) The game ticket data shall have been recorded on the Lottery Central Computer System and the game ticket data shall match the computer record in every respect.
- (7) The game ticket must not be defectively printed or printed or produced in error such that it cannot be processed or validated by the Lottery.
- (8) The game ticket must pass other confidential security checks of the Lottery.
- (b) Invalid or defective game tickets. A game ticket not passing the validation requirements in subsection (a) will be considered invalid and no payment will be made on account of any play recorded thereon. The determination of the Secretary in this regard is final.
 - 12. Procedures for claiming and payment of prizes:
- (a) A prize may be claimed through an authorized retailer or the Lottery, as provided in this section. A prize must be claimed within 1 year of the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket.
- (b) An authorized retailer is authorized to pay prizes of \$2,500 or less. The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play representing a prize of \$2,500 or less may

be paid by a participating authorized retailer if a proper validation pay ticket was issued by the retailer's Lottery Terminal.

- (c) The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play representing a prize in excess of \$2,500 may present the game ticket to an authorized retailer, Lottery District Office, or Lottery Headquarters.
- (d) The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play shall present the ticket, in person, to an authorized retailer, Lottery Headquarters or a Lottery District Office. The retailer or the Lottery will issue payment if:
- (1) The game ticket is scanned and the play is validated through the Lottery Terminal or the Lottery Central Computer System;
 - (2) A claim form is properly and fully completed;
 - (3) The identification of the claimant is confirmed; and
- (4) The winning ticket has not expired, pursuant to this section or section 14 (relating to unclaimed prizes).
- (e) The Commonwealth shall not be responsible for a winning play paid in error by an authorized retailer.
- (f) In the event a prize described in these rules is not available, the Lottery may either provide a substitute prize, determined by the Secretary to have an equivalent value to the prize won, or make a cash payment to the winner, in an amount determined by the Secretary to have an equivalent value to the prize won.
- 13. Funding for prizes: Moneys will be drawn from the State Lottery Fund, to the extent necessary, to fund the payment of prizes under this section. If this lottery game is terminated for any cause, prize moneys remaining undistributed will remain in the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes otherwise provided for by law.
- 14. Unclaimed prizes: Unclaimed prize money on winning Fast Play lottery game tickets will be retained by the Secretary for payment to the persons entitled thereto for 1 year from the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket. If no claim is made within 1 year from the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket, the right of a ticket holder to claim the prize represented by that ticket, if any, shall expire.
- 15. Purchase and prize restrictions: A Fast Play lottery game ticket may not be purchased by, and a prize may not be paid, to an officer or employee of the Lottery, Lottery professional services contractors or subcontractors, or to a spouse, child, brother, sister or parent residing in the same household of an officer, employee, contractor or subcontractor who is involved in the production, distribution or operation of systems for the validation or accounting of Fast Play games.
 - 16. Governing law:
- (a) By purchasing a ticket, the purchaser agrees to comply with and abide by the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314), this notice, instructions, conditions and final decisions of the Secretary, and procedures established by the Secretary for the conduct of the Fast Play Witch Way lottery game.
- (b) Decisions made by the Secretary, including the declaration of prizes and the payment thereof, in interpretation of this notice are final and binding on players and persons making a claim in respect thereof.
 - 17. Retailer compensation:
- (a) Authorized retailers may be entitled to compensation as determined by the Lottery.

- (b) No authorized retailer or employee of an authorized retailer shall request, demand, or accept gratuities or any compensation other than as provided in subsection (a) in exchange for the performance of duties authorized pursuant to the Lottery retailer's license without the Lottery's prior written authorization.
- 18. Retailer Incentive Programs: The Lottery may conduct a separate Retailer Incentive Program for retailers who sell Pennsylvania Fast Play Witch Way lottery game tickets.
- 19. Retailer bonus: The Lottery may offer a retailer bonus in connection with the sale of Pennsylvania Fast Play lottery game tickets. If a retailer bonus is offered, a Lottery retailer shall be eligible for a bonus as described in this section. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$100,000 and not exceeding \$500,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$500. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$500,001 and not exceeding \$1,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$5,000. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$1,000,001 and not exceeding \$10,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$10,000. A Lottery retailer is entitled only to the largest bonus for which they qualify on a winning ticket. A bonus will be initiated for payment after the Fast Play game ticket is claimed and validated. A bonus will not be awarded to a Lottery retailer that sells a non-winning Pennsylvania Lottery Fast Play game ticket used to enter a Pennsylvania Lottery second-chance drawing or promotion that is subsequently selected to win a prize.
- 20. Termination of the game: The Secretary may announce a termination date, after which no further tickets from this game may be sold. The announcement will be disseminated through media used to advertise or promote Witch Way or through normal communications methods.

PENNSYLVANIA PUBLIC UTILITY COMMISSION

2023 Review of All Jurisdictional Fixed Utilities' Universal Service Programs: Doc. Number M-2023-3038944

On March 16, 2023, the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (Commission) adopted the joint motion of Vice Chairman Stephen M. DeFrank and Commissioner Kathryn L. Zerfuss requesting comments, review and potential revisions to the Commission's universal service policies for electric distribution companies, natural gas distribution companies, jurisdictional water and wastewater utilities and local exchange telecommunications companies. This was followed by a Secretarial Letter dated March 27, 2023 that specifically requested comments from interested parties regarding how the Commission's regulations, policies and procedures could be revised with a particular focus on 1) increasing program coordination among all utilities, 2) streamlining the eligibility and enrollment process, and 3) reducing the number of otherwise eligible consumers from losing low-income benefits due to the verification or re-enrollment process. The Commission articulated fourteen (14) questions on which comment was sought and noted that a review of these comments may help inform the Commission's consideration of improvements to the existing programs, including improvements that may be considered in the context of a future rulemaking proceeding.

The Secretarial Letter was published in the Pennsylvania Bulletin on April 8, 2023 setting a 60 day period in which to file comments. By June 7, 2023, comments were received by multiple interested stakeholders.

The Commission has reviewed the filed comments and has determined that a working group should be formed involving the Commission's Law Bureau and Bureau of Consumer Services, as well as all interested parties, to address the issues raised in the comments and related matters. The objectives of this working group would be specifically to:

- 1. Develop a common application that could be used by all jurisdictional fixed public utilities statewide to facilitate the enrollment of eligible customers into their utilities' universal service programs.
- 2. Discuss the potential development of a web site dedicated to facilitating the enrollment of customers into utilities' universal service programs using, among other tools, the common application developed previously listed in # 1 above.
