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# READER'S GUIDE TO THE PENNSYLVANIA BULLETIN AND THE PENNSYLVANIA CODE

#### Pennsylvania Bulletin

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the official gazette of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. It is published weekly. A cumulative subject matter index is published quarterly.

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* serves several purposes. It is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, which is the official codification of agency rules and regulations, Statewide court rules, and other statutorily authorized documents. Changes in the codified text, whether by adoption, amendment, rescission, repeal or emergency action, must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

The following documents are published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*: Governor's Executive Orders; Summaries of Enacted Statutes; Statewide and Local Court Rules; Attorney General Opinions; Motor Carrier Applications before the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission; Applications and Actions before the Department of Environmental Protection; Orders of the Independent Regulatory Review Commission; and other documents authorized by law.

The text of certain documents published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the only valid and enforceable text. Courts are required to take judicial notice of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

#### Adoption, Amendment or Repeal of Regulations

Generally an agency wishing to adopt, amend or rescind regulations must first publish in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* a Proposed Rulemaking. There are limited instances when the agency may omit the proposal step; it still must publish the adopted version.

The Proposed Rulemaking contains the full text of the change, the agency contact person, a fiscal note required by law and background for the action.

The agency then allows sufficient time for public comment before taking final action. A Final Rulemaking must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* before the changes can take effect. If the agency wishes to adopt changes to the Proposed Rulemaking to enlarge the scope, it must repropose.

#### Citation to the Pennsylvania Bulletin

Cite material in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* by volume number, a page number and date. Example: Volume 1, *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, page 801, January 9, 1971 (short form: 1 Pa.B. 801 (January 9, 1971)).

#### Pennsylvania Code

The *Pennsylvania Code* is the official codification of rules and regulations issued by Commonwealth agencies, Statewide court rules and other statutorily authorized documents. The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, printing changes when they are adopted. These changes are then permanently codified by the *Pennsylvania Code Reporter*, a monthly, loose-leaf supplement.

The *Pennsylvania Code* is cited by title number and section number. Example: Title 10 *Pennsylvania Code* § 1.1 (short form: 10 Pa. Code § 1.1).

Under the *Pennsylvania Code* codification system, each regulation is assigned a unique number by title and section. Titles roughly parallel the organization of Commonwealth government.

#### How to Find Rules and Regulations

Search for your area of interest in the *Pennsylvania Code*. The *Pennsylvania Code* is available at www.pacodeandbulletin.gov.

Source Notes give the history of regulations. To see if there have been recent changes not yet codified, check the List of *Pennsylvania Code* Chapters Affected in the most recent issue of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

A chronological table of the history of *Pennsylvania Code* sections may be found at www.legis.state. pa.us/cfdocs/legis/CH/Public/pcde\_index.cfm.

A quarterly List of *Pennsylvania Code* Sections Affected lists the regulations in numerical order, followed by the citation to the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* in which the change occurred.

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#### Rules, Regulations and Statements of Policy in Titles 1-107 of the Pennsylvania Code

Text proposed to be added is printed in **underscored bold face**. Text proposed to be deleted is enclosed in brackets [ ] and printed in **bold face**.

Proposed new chapters and sections are printed in regular type to enhance readability. Final rulemakings and statements of policy are printed in regular type.

Ellipses, a series of five asterisks, indicate text that is not amended.

In Proposed Rulemakings and proposed Statements of Policy, existing text corresponds to the official codified text in the *Pennsylvania Code*.

Court Rules in Titles 201–246 of the Pennsylvania Code

Added text in proposed and adopted court rules is printed in <u>underscored bold face</u>. Deleted text in proposed and adopted court rules is enclosed in brackets [ ] and printed in **bold face**.

Proposed new chapters and rules are printed in regular type to enhance readability.

Ellipses, a series of five asterisks, indicate text that is not amended.

#### **Fiscal Notes**

Section 612 of The Administrative Code of 1929 (71 P. S. § 232) requires the Governor's Budget Office to prepare a fiscal note for regulatory actions and administrative procedures of the administrative departments, boards, commissions and authorities receiving money from the State Treasury. The fiscal note states whether the action or procedure causes a loss of revenue or an increase in the cost of programs for the Commonwealth or its political subdivisions. The fiscal note is required to be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* at the same time as the change is advertised.

A fiscal note provides the following information: (1) the designation of the fund out of which the appropriation providing for expenditures under the action or procedure shall be made; (2) the probable cost for the fiscal year the program is implemented; (3) projected cost estimate of the program for each of the 5 succeeding fiscal years; (4) fiscal history of the program for which expenditures are to be made; (5) probable loss of revenue for the fiscal year of its implementation; (6) projected loss of revenue from the program for each of the 5 succeeding fiscal years; (7) line item, if any, of the General Appropriation Act or other appropriation act out of which expenditures or losses of Commonwealth funds shall occur as a result of the action or procedures; and (8) recommendation, if any, of the Secretary of the Budget and the reasons therefor.

The omission of an item indicates that the agency text of the fiscal note states that there is no information available with respect thereto. In items (3) and (6) information is set forth for the first through fifth fiscal years, following the year the program is implemented, which is stated. In item (4) information is set forth for the current and two immediately preceding years. In item (8) the recommendation, if any, made by the Secretary of the Budget is published with the fiscal note. "No fiscal impact" means no additional cost or revenue loss to the Commonwealth or its local political subdivision is intended. See 4 Pa. Code Chapter 7, Subchapter R (relating to fiscal notes).

And Now, this 6th day of October, 2023, It Is Ordered pursuant to Article V, Section 10(c) of the Constitution of Pennsylvania and Sections 1721 and 3502(a) of the Judicial Code, 42 Pa.C.S. §§ 1721, 3502(a), that the Court Administrator of Pennsylvania is authorized to obtain and publish in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* the percentage increase in the Consumer Price Index for calendar year 2022 as required by Act 96 of 2010, 42 Pa.C.S. §§ 1725.1(f) and 3571(c)(4) (as amended) and to revise the Financial Regulations, 204 Pa. Code §§ 29.401-403, as provided in those statutory escalation provisions.

To the extent notice of proposed rulemaking may be required by Rule of Judicial Administration 103, the immediate promulgation of the regulations is hereby found to be in the interests of efficient administration.

#### **CHAPTER 29. MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS**

#### Subchapter K. COSTS, FINES AND FEES

#### § 29.401. Scope.

The Pennsylvania Supreme Court, pursuant to Art. V, § 10 of the Pennsylvania Constitution, and 42 Pa.C.S. § 1721, has authorized by Administrative Order, the Court Administrator of Pennsylvania to promulgate regulations relating to the accounting methods to be utilized in connection with the collection of fees and costs charged and collected by prothonotaries, and clerks of courts of all courts of common pleas, or by any officials designated to perform the functions thereof, as well as by the minor judiciary, including magisterial district judges, and judges and staff of all divisions of the Philadelphia Municipal Court.

Under authority of said Administrative Order and pursuant to the authority vested in the governing authority under 42 Pa.C.S. § 3502(a) of the Judicial Code, the following regulations are adopted to implement Act 96 of 2010, 42 Pa.C.S. §§ 1725.1(f) and 3571(c)(4) (as amended).

#### § 29.401a. Consumer Price Index—costs and fines.

Pursuant to Article V, Section 10 of the Pennsylvania Constitution, and 42 Pa.C.S. § 1721, the Supreme Court has authorized the Court Administrator of Pennsylvania to obtain and publish in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* on or before November 30 the percentage increase in the Consumer Price Index for calendar year 2022 as required by Act 96 of 2010, 42 Pa.C.S. 1725.1(f) and 3571(c)(4) (as amended). See, No. 598 Judicial Administration Docket.

The Court Administrator of Pennsylvania reports that the percentage increase in the Consumer Price Index, All Urban Consumers, U.S. City Average, for calendar year 2022 was 6.5% percent. (*See*, U.S. Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics, Series CUUROOOOSAO, January 20, 2023.)

#### Pennsylvania Peach and Nectarine Research Board; Grant Solicitation and Application Procedures

The Pennsylvania Peach and Nectarine Research Program Board (Board) annually, or more frequently as the availability of fund permits, solicits applications for grants to conduct research projects to increase the quality, profitability, production and sale of peaches and nectarines, enhance the peach and nectarine industry and benefit peach or nectarine producers of this Commonwealth.

The Board was established by the Department of Agriculture (Department) under 3 Pa.C.S. Chapter 45 (relating to Agricultural Commodities Marketing Act) (ACMA). Its composition, funding and duties were subsequently described by a program notice published at 44 Pa.B. 6559 (October 11, 2014).

The Board makes awards of grants from its own funds generated by the methods set forth in the ACMA.

This notice establishes the procedures by which grant applications will be solicited, reviewed and grants awarded.

1. Grant solicitation. The Board will be accepting grant applications for the purposes, in the form and according to the schedule set forth herein, for a period of not less than 30 days beginning on the date of publication of this notice in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. Additional publication and dissemination of this notice shall be made to applicants who have previously submitted grant applications to, or received grants from, the Board, State universities and State-supported universities located in this Commonwealth, universities with colleges of agricultural science located in this Commonwealth and individuals or entities who have requested notification from the Department or the Board of grant availability.

2. *Process overview.* The Board will employ the review process described as follows to select projects to fund by making a grant from its ACMA funds. In the event of an ACMA-funded grant, the terms and conditions of the grant will be governed by a grant agreement between the Board and the applicant which shall be tendered to the applicant for signature, returnable in no more than 30 days.

3. Application deadlines. Applicants should submit a project proposal and grant application, in the form set forth in paragraph 4 of this notice, to the Board by 4 p.m. on Friday, January 5, 2024. Proposals should be sent electronically to RA-AGCOMMODITIES@pa.gov and 14 hard copies must be hand-delivered or sent by United States Mail and postmarked on or before the same date. Applications should be addressed and delivered to the Department of Agriculture, Bureau of Market Development, Attn: Agricultural Commodity Board Grant Program, 2301 North Cameron Street, Harrisburg, PA 17110-9408.

4. Format of the project proposal and grant application. The project proposal and grant application shall be formatted as follows:

a. A cover page, titled Pennsylvania Peach and Nectarine Research Program—Project Proposal and Grant Application, providing: the title of the proposed project; the name and address of the applicant; the name, address, telephone number and e-mail address of the applicant's principal contact person for matters relating to the application; and the total maximum grant amount sought for the proposed project or program.

b. Section 1, titled Statement of Purpose, explaining or presenting: the purpose for which the grant funds would be utilized; details of the proposed project, including a statement of expected impact of outcomes, staffing for the project, and objectives and methodologies; and whether, how and to what anticipated extent the proposed research project increases the quality, profitability or production and sale of peaches and nectarines, enhances the peach and nectarine industry and benefits peach or nectarine producers of this Commonwealth.

c. Section 2, titled Statement of Need, explaining the need for the grant funds sought and identifying the presence of any additional funding partners and the extent of that funding.

d. Section 3, titled Budget, presenting a detailed budget for the proposed project or program, including an itemized breakdown of: all personnel by name devoted to the project, their professional qualifications, the amount of time calculated by hours and the tasks to be performed by each of the named personnel; each and every item of direct expense to be incurred in the project separately set forth, including all purchases of consumable or nonconsumable goods or equipment, listing the disposition of all nonconsumable goods or equipment upon completion of the project; all travel by dates, purpose, destination, mode of transportation and rate; a full breakdown of other costs, if any, and the method used to calculate those costs. See also paragraph 8.

e. Section 4, titled Criteria for Measuring Outcomes, shall identify expected measurable outcomes and the outcome measures. Include a narrative describing data collection to inform the outcome measures. This section must be clear and unambiguous as it will inform expectations of progress reports and final reports.

f. Section 5, titled Industry Involvement, describing the extent of any support, participation and funding from this Commonwealth's peach and nectarine industry, including any written confirmation of that support, participation or funding.

5. Term of grants. Applications should be submitted for projects to begin on or after April 1, 2024. Anticipated completion dates will be dictated by the project scope and parameters and may exceed 12 months from commencement if the project so warrants. The Board may award grant funding for multiyear projects or extensions of an ongoing project, if the Board identifies that a multiyear term or an extension advances the grant's objectives. Requests for extensions of ongoing projects shall be made, evaluated and processed in accordance with all the requirements of this notice. Progress reports are to be delivered by e-mail to RA-AGCOMMODITIES@pa.gov no later than October 1, and April 1, every year for the duration of the project, or as requested by the Board. Final reports and invoices should be submitted within 90 days of contract end date. Failure to meet these deadlines constitutes a breach of the grant agreement, may result in nonpayment of invoices and could jeopardize future grant awards.

6. *Notice of award.* Applicants shall be notified by e-mail of the decision on their grant applications by the Board. Best efforts will be made to do so within 60 days of the application deadline.

7. Grant agreement. With the e-mailed grant award notice, the Board will provide applicants with a grant agreement for execution and return within 30 days. The Board will obtain the required signatures on the grant agreement and return a copy to the applicant. Work may be reimbursed for services performed before the date the final signature is applied to the grant agreement as long as the activity is documented in the original proposal set forth in the contract as an attachment. However, the Board is under no obligation to reimburse for services unless a proposed grant has been approved. Among the terms of the grant agreement shall be a requirement that the grant recipient provide the Board full and complete access to all records relating to the performance of the project and submit information as the Board may require.

8. Grant agreement available. The Board grant agreement is available by contacting the Department instead of attachment to this notice. This grant agreement is the contract that will govern all grants awarded under this grant solicitation. The essential terms are non-negotiable; therefore, applicants may wish to carefully review the grant agreement to ensure that proposed projects are compliant with agreement requirements. Applicants who are unable to agree to the terms and conditions should not submit an application. For questions regarding the grant agreement, contact Patrick Andrews at (717) 772-1429.

9. Nonmatching cost-reimbursement grant and indirect costs cap. Grants made hereunder do not require the applicant to secure or devote a matching sum to the project. Payment of grant funds will occur on a reimbursement basis only. Grant awards will not include an allowance for indirect costs, if any, in excess of 10%.

10. Evaluation and awards. The Board reserves the right to request modifications or clarifications, or both, of grant applications, including, but not limited to, additional detail of purpose, reduced or modified budgets and the like. Following the deadline for submission of grant applications, the Board will evaluate each complete and timely filed grant application received and the Board will determine in its sole discretion which projects to fund. The Board will vote on these recommendations at a public meeting and the Department grant administration staff will directly contact those applicants whose applications are approved. The Department will notify applicants whose projects were not funded as well and may provide additional information regarding how to improve future proposals.

The Pennsylvania Potato Research Program Board (Board) annually, or more frequently as the availability of fund permits, solicits applications for grants to conduct research projects to increase the quality, profitability, production and sale of potatoes, enhance the potato industry and benefit potato producers of this Commonwealth.

The Board was established by the Department of Agriculture (Department) under 3 Pa.C.S. Chapter 45

(relating to Agricultural Commodities Marketing Act) (ACMA). Its composition, funding and duties were subsequently described by a program notice at 47 Pa.B. 3497 (June 24, 2017).

The Board makes awards of grants from its own funds generated by the methods set forth in the ACMA.

This notice establishes the procedures by which grant applications will be solicited, reviewed and grants awarded.

1. Grant solicitation. The Board will be accepting grant applications for the purposes, in the form and according to the schedule set forth herein, for a period of not less than 30 days beginning on the date of publication of this notice in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. Additional publication and dissemination of this notice shall be made to applicants who have previously submitted grant applications to, or received grants from, the Board, State universities and State-supported universities located in this Commonwealth, universities with colleges of agricultural science located in this Commonwealth and individuals or entities who have requested notification from the Department or the Board of grant availability.

c. Section 2, titled Statement of Need, explaining the need for the grant funds sought and identifying the presence of any additional funding partners and the extent of that funding.

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d. Code §§ 127.44-127.46, the Department intends to issue Air Quality plan approval to authorize construction and temporary operation of three (3) additional vinyl extrusion lamination lines (Lines 4, 5, and 6) at the VEKA, Inc. (VEKA) Fombell Plant in Marion Township, Beaver County.

The three (3) proposed vinyl extrusion lamination lines will incorporate felt pad wipe application of primer and slot die application of hot melt adhesive with transfer efficiencies of nearly 100% which constitutes best available technology (BAT) for the proposed surface coating operations. Emissions of methylene chloride (MeCl) (HAP), ethanol (VOC), and methylene diphenyl diisocyanate (MDI) (VOC and HAP) are collected by local exhaust ventilation (LEV) (hoods) at the application sites and are routed via common duct to atmosphere. Due to space constraints, in conjunction with the project, VEKA will relocate the lamination operations to the adjoining building, reconfigure the LEV system, relocate and install a larger exhaust duct, and install a higher capacity roof-mounted exhaust fan.

Total potential to emit (PTE) for lamination operations will not increase as a result of the project and will remain limited to 0.20 ton per year (tpy) VOC, 9.90 tpy of a single HAP (methylene chloride), and 9.90 tpy of total HAPs combined. The proposed plan approval has been conditioned to ensure compliance with all applicable requirements specified in 25 Pa. Code, and includes emissions limitations and work practice, monitoring, recordkeeping, and reporting requirements.

At the request of the Department given the revised exhaust parameters and increased maximum short-term emissions rates for the compounds of potential concern (COPC), VEKA conducted an inhalation risk assessment for the proposed project to evaluate potential cancer and noncancer inhalation risks associated with potential air emissions from the lamination lines. Emissions rates of COPC from the two (2) proposed stack locations were modeled to derive exposure concentrations. The highest modeled exposure concentrations were then multiplied or divided by compound-specific unit risk factors or reference concentrations, respectively. Chronic risks for each COPC were then summed and compared against the Department's benchmark excess lifetime cancer risk and health index (HI) values. Acute risks for each COPC were compared against the Department's benchmark hazard quotient (HQ) value.

If required, a cleanup plan evaluates the abilities of potential remedies to achieve remedy requirements. A work plan for conducting a baseline remedial investigation is required by the act for compliance with selection of a special industrial area remediation. The baseline remedial investigation, based on the work plan, is compiled into the baseline environmental report to establish a reference point to show existing contamination, describe proposed remediation to be done and include a description of existing or potential public benefits of the use or reuse of the property. The DEP may approve or disapprove plans and reports submitted. This notice provides DEP's decision and, if relevant, the basis for disapproval.

(12) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$150 (ONE FTY) appears in the "prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$150.

(13) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in the "prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.

(14) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$50<sup>.00</sup> (FIFTY) appears in the "prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$50.

(15) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$40<sup>.00</sup> (FORTY) appears in the "prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$40.

(16) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$30<sup>.00</sup> (THIRTY) appears in the "prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$30.

(17) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$25<sup>.00</sup> (TWY FIV) appears in the "prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$25.

(18) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$20<sup>.00</sup> (TWENTY) appears in the "prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$20.

(19) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING

NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$15<sup>.00</sup> (FIFTEEN) appears in the "prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$15.

(20) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$10<sup>.00</sup> (TEN DOL) appears in the "prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$10.

(b) Determination of prize winners for holders of tickets upon which three matching prize symbols appear in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area, are:

(1) Holders of tickets upon which three matching prize symbols of \$1,000 (ONE THO) appear in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1,000.

(b) Participation and entry:

(1) Entrants must have a registered lottery account in order to participate in the Drawing. To create a lottery account, visit https://www.PAiLottery.com. Creating a lottery account is free.

(2) A registered lottery account holder is subject to the iLottery regulations and specifically agrees to be bound by the iLottery terms and conditions located at https://www.pailottery.com/signup/terms-and-conditions/, as well as any related policies.

(3) To establish a lottery account, players must provide the following information:

(i) The player's name as it appears on a valid government-issued identification or tax documents;

(ii) The player's date of birth;

(iii) The entire or last four digits of the player's Social Security Number, or comparable equivalent;

- (iv) The player's address;
- (v) The player's telephone number;
- (vi) The player's email address;

(vii) Any other information established by the Lottery to be necessary to verify the age and identity of the player.

(4) An individual may be required to provide additional information or documentation, as set forth in the iLottery terms and conditions, to establish a lottery account or register for iLottery. The information may be used for iLottery registration or to confirm information provided by that individual during the registration process.

(5) To enter the Drawing, entrants must submit the identifying information from at least one Qualifying Ticket via the Drawing's promotional web site, available at https://www.palottery.com, or the Lottery's official mobile application during the entry period. The identifying information from a Qualifying Ticket may be submitted only once in the Drawing. Entries will automatically be awarded at the time of successful submission of a Qualifying Ticket. No other method of submission will be accepted, and entries submitted using any other method, including entries mailed or hand-delivered to the Pennsylvania Lottery, are not valid and will be disgualified.

(6) Each entry must be complete and the information supplied by the entrant must be accurate. Incomplete entries cannot be accepted.

(7) Only one claimant per entry is allowed.

(8) Entrants must be 18 years of age or older.

(c) *Drawing description*:

(2) All entries received after 11:59:59 p.m. October 22, 2023, through 11:59:59 p.m. January 4, 2024, will be entered into the Drawing tentatively scheduled to be held between January 5, 2024 and January 22, 2024.

(3) The entry period for the Drawing will be posted to the Pennsylvania Lottery's publicly accessible web site.

(4) The number of entries an entrant will receive for the Drawing is determined by the purchase price of the Qualifying Ticket entered. The purchase price and corresponding number of entries for the Qualifying Ticket is as follows: PA-1658 Ho Ho Holiday 100X (\$30) = 30 entries, PA-1659 \$1 Million Money Tree (\$20) = 20 entries, PA-1660 \$500,000 Merry-mint (\$10) = ten entries, PA-1661 Santa's Cash Drop Doubler (\$5) = five entries, PA-1662 Bah, Humbuck\$ (\$3) = three entries, PA-1663 Twinkles and Tangled (\$2) = two entries and PA-1664 Jingle Buck (\$1) = one entry.

(5) Players may review prizes won and their entries for the Drawing via the Drawing's promotional web site.

(d) *Prizes available to be won, determination of winners and odds of winning:*

The Lottery is not responsible for entries not entered due to delays in creating a lottery account or the inability to create a lottery account. If a Drawing entry is selected as a winner and rejected or otherwise disqualified during or following the Drawing, the Lottery will select one entry to replace the rejected or otherwise disqualified entry in accordance with these rules and Lottery procedure.

(3) If any discrepancy exists between these rules and any material describing the Drawing, these rules shall govern.

(4) Employees of the Pennsylvania Lottery, 9Rooftops Marketing, LLC (formerly known as MARC USA, LLC), MUSL, Scientific Games International, Inc., MDI Entertainment, LLC, and their subcontractors, or a spouse, child, brother, sister or parent residing as a member of the same household in the principal place of residence of any such person are not eligible to participate in the Drawing. Offer void where prohibited or restricted.

(5) The Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to cancel or suspend the Drawing and change these rules if the Drawing cannot be conducted as planned due to errors in these rules or advertising, unauthorized intervention, tampering, fraud, technical errors, viruses, worms, bugs or any other cause that, in the Lottery's sole judgment, could corrupt or impair the administration, security, fairness, integrity or proper conduct of the Drawing.

(6) All entries shall be subject to verification by the Pennsylvania Lottery.

(7) The Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to disqualify an entrant found to be tampering with the operation of the Drawing or to be acting in violation of these rules or applicable law.

(8) The Drawing is governed by the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Applicable laws and regulations apply.

(9) Prizes must be claimed within 1 year of the drawing date of the Drawing in which the prize was won. If no claim is made within 1 year of the drawing date of the Drawing in which the prize was won, the right of an entrant to claim the prize won, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided by statute.

(10) Final determination of winners will be made by the Secretary, whose judgment will be final and binding.

(11) A prize awarded in the Drawing to a person who dies before receiving the prize shall be paid according to 61 Pa. Code § 811.16 (relating to prizes payable after death of a prize winner).

(12) A winner is responsible for all taxes arising from or in connection with any prize won.

(13) A player may only win the prize for which the player is first selected in the Drawing. Subsequent entries, from the same individual, selected in the same Drawing will be disqualified and one replacement entry will be selected.

(14) Winners of iLottery Bonus Money must abide by the iLottery terms and conditions, the iLottery Bonus Policy and these rules. iLottery Bonus Money will expire 90 days from the date on which the winner was notified, via email, of the prize win, as further detailed in section 10(d)(4). iLottery Bonus Money has a five times play through requirement in order to convert the iLottery Bonus Money into cash. For example, for a player winning \$100 of iLottery Bonus Money, the player is required to place \$500 in wagers before the iLottery Bonus Money awarded is converted into cash which may be withdrawn from the player's account.

(15) Prizes are not transferrable.

(16) Other restrictions may apply.

11. *Retailer incentive awards*: The Lottery may conduct a separate Retailer Incentive Program for retailers who sell \$500,000 Merry-mint instant lottery game tickets.

12. Retailer bonus: The Lottery may offer a retailer bonus in connection with the sale of Pennsylvania instant lottery game tickets. If a retailer bonus is offered, a Lottery retailer shall be eligible for a bonus as described in this section. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$100,000 and not exceeding \$500,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$500. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$500,001 and not exceeding \$1,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$5,000. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$1,000,001 and not exceeding \$10,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$10,000. A Lottery retailer is entitled only to the largest bonus for which they qualify on a winning ticket. A bonus will be initiated for payment after the instant ticket is claimed and validated. A bonus will not be awarded to a Lottery retailer that sells a nonwinning Pennsylvania Lottery instant ticket used to enter a Pennsylvania Lottery second-chance drawing or promotion that is subsequently selected to win a prize.

13. Unclaimed prize money: For a period of 1 year from the announced close of \$500,000 Merry-mint, prize money from winning \$500,000 Merry-mint instant lottery game tickets will be retained by the Secretary for payment to the persons entitled thereto. If no claim is made within 1 year of the announced close of the \$500,000 Merry-mint instant lottery game, the right of a ticket holder to claim the prize represented by the ticket, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided for by statute.

14. Governing law: In purchasing a ticket, the customer agrees to comply with and abide by the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314), 61 Pa. Code Part V (relating to State Lotteries) and the provisions contained in this notice.

15. Termination of the game: The Secretary may announce a termination date, after which no further tickets from this game may be sold. The announcement will be disseminated through media used to advertise or promote \$500,000 Merry-mint or through normal communications methods.

2. *Price*: The price of a \$1 Million Money Tree instant lottery game ticket is \$20.

5. *Prizes*: The prizes that can be won in this game are: \$20, \$40, \$50, \$100, \$200, \$400, \$500, \$1,000, \$10,000, \$100,000 and \$1,000,000. For a complete description of how these prizes can be won, see section 9 (relating to number and description of prizes and approximate odds). A player can win up to 23 times on a ticket.

6. Approximate number of tickets printed for the game: Approximately 5,400,000 tickets will be printed for the \$1 Million Money Tree instant lottery game.

7. Second-Chance Drawing: The Pennsylvania Lottery will conduct one Ugly Sweater Second-Chance Drawing for which non-winning \$1 Million Money Tree instant lottery game tickets may be eligible as provided for in section 10.

#### 8. Determination of prize winners:

The prize shall be paid as a one-time, lump-sum cash payment.

(b) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$100,000 (ONEHUNTHO) appears in the "prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100,000.

(c) Holders of tickets upon which a Gift of Cash (WINALL) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of \$400 (FOR HUN) appears in ten of the "prize" areas and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in ten of the "prize" areas, and upon which three Tree (TREE) symbols appear in the "TREE-MENDOUS MULTIPLIER" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100,000.

(TWENTY) appears in the "prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, and upon which one Tree (TREE) symbol appears in the "TREE-MENDOUS MULTIPLIER" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.

(rr) Holders of tickets upon which a Star (STAR) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of  $40^{00}$  (FORTY) appears in the "prize" area under that Star (STAR) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$40.

(ss) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$20<sup>.00</sup> (TWENTY) appears in the "prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$20.

(tt) Holders of tickets upon which a Star (STAR) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of  $$20^{.00}$  (TWENTY) appears in the "prize" area under that Star (STAR) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$20.

(a) *Qualifying Tickets*: Non-winning PA-1658 Ho Ho Holiday 100X (\$30), PA-1659 \$1 Million Money Tree (\$20), PA-1660 \$500,000 Merry-mint (\$10), PA-1661 Santa's Cash Drop Doubler (\$5), PA-1662 Bah, Humbuck\$ (\$3), PA-1663 Twinkles and Tangled (\$2) and PA-1664 Jingle Buck (\$1) lottery game tickets are eligible for entry into the Drawing.

#### (b) *Participation and entry*:

(1) Entrants must have a registered lottery account in order to participate in the Drawing. To create a lottery account, visit https://www.PAiLottery.com. Creating a lottery account is free.

(2) A registered lottery account holder is subject to the iLottery regulations and specifically agrees to be bound by the iLottery terms and conditions located at https://www.pailottery.com/signup/terms-and-conditions/, as well as any related policies.

(3) To establish a lottery account, players must provide the following information:

(i) The player's name as it appears on a valid government-issued identification or tax documents;

- (v) The player's telephone number;

(vii) Any other information established by the Lottery to be necessary to verify the age and identity of the player.

(4) An individual may be required to provide additional information or documentation, as set forth in the iLottery terms and conditions, to establish a lottery account or register for iLottery. The information may be used for iLottery registration or to confirm information provided by that individual during the registration process.

(5) To enter the Drawing, entrants must submit the identifying information from at least one Qualifying Ticket via the Drawing's promotional web site, available at https://www.palottery.com, or the Lottery's official mobile application during the entry period. The identifying information from a Qualifying Ticket may be submitted

only once in the Drawing. Entries will automatically be awarded at the time of successful submission of a Qualifying Ticket. No other method of submission will be accepted, and entries submitted using any other method, including entries mailed or hand-delivered to the Pennsylvania Lottery, are not valid and will be disqualified.

The purchase price and corresponding number of entries for the Qualifying Ticket is as follows: PA-1658 Ho Ho Holiday 100X (\$30) = 30 entries, PA-1659 \$1 Million Money Tree (\$20) = 20 entries, PA-1660 \$500,000 Merry-mint (\$10) = ten entries, PA-1661 Santa's Cash Drop Doubler (\$5) = five entries, PA-1662 Bah, Humbuck\$ (\$3) = three entries, PA-1663 Twinkles and Tangled (\$2) = two entries and PA-1664 Jingle Buck (\$1) = one entry.

(5) Players may review prizes won and their entries for the Drawing via the Drawing's promotional web site.

(d) *Prizes available to be won, determination of winners and odds of winning:* 

(1) The prize entitlements described below are subject to all restrictions and limitations described in section 10(e), or those mentioned anywhere else in these rules.

The Lottery is not responsible for entries not entered due to delays in creating a lottery account or the inability to create a lottery account. If a Drawing entry is selected as a winner and rejected or otherwise disqualified during or following the Drawing, the Lottery will select one entry to replace the rejected or otherwise disqualified entry in accordance with these rules and Lottery procedure.

(3) If any discrepancy exists between these rules and any material describing the Drawing, these rules shall govern.

(4) Employees of the Pennsylvania Lottery, 9Rooftops Marketing, LLC (formerly known as MARC USA, LLC), MUSL, Scientific Games International, Inc., MDI Entertainment, LLC, and their subcontractors, or a spouse, child, brother, sister or parent residing as a member of the same household in the principal place of residence of any such person are not eligible to participate in the Drawing. Offer void where prohibited or restricted.

(5) The Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to cancel or suspend the Drawing and change these rules if the Drawing cannot be conducted as planned due to errors in these rules or advertising, unauthorized intervention, tampering, fraud, technical errors, viruses, worms, bugs or any other cause that, in the Lottery's sole judgment, could corrupt or impair the administration, security, fairness, integrity or proper conduct of the Drawing.

(6) All entries shall be subject to verification by the Pennsylvania Lottery.

(7) The Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to disqualify an entrant found to be tampering with the operation of the Drawing or to be acting in violation of these rules or applicable law.

(8) The Drawing is governed by the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Applicable laws and regulations apply.

(9) Prizes must be claimed within 1 year of the drawing date of the Drawing in which the prize was won. If no claim is made within 1 year of the drawing date of the Drawing in which the prize was won, the right of an entrant to claim the prize won, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided by statute.

(10) Final determination of winners will be made by the Secretary, whose judgment will be final and binding.

(11) A prize awarded in the Drawing to a person who dies before receiving the prize shall be paid according to 61 Pa. Code § 811.16 (relating to prizes payable after death of a prize winner).

(12) A winner is responsible for all taxes arising from or in connection with any prize won.

(13) A player may only win the prize for which the player is first selected in the Drawing. Subsequent entries, from the same individual, selected in the same Drawing will be disqualified and one replacement entry will be selected.

12. Retailer bonus: The Lottery may offer a retailer bonus in connection with the sale of Pennsylvania instant lottery game tickets. If a retailer bonus is offered, a Lottery retailer shall be eligible for a bonus as described in this section. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$100,000 and not exceeding \$500,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$500. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$500,001 and not exceeding \$1,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$5,000. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$1,000,001 and not exceeding \$10,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$10,000. A Lottery retailer is entitled only to the largest bonus for which they qualify on a winning ticket. A bonus will be initiated for payment after the instant ticket is claimed and validated. A bonus will not be awarded to a Lottery retailer that sells a nonwinning Pennsylvania Lottery instant ticket used to enter a Pennsylvania Lottery second-chance drawing or promotion that is subsequently selected to win a prize.

13. Unclaimed prize money: For a period of 1 year from the announced close of \$1 Million Money Tree, prize money from winning \$1 Million Money Tree instant lottery game tickets will be retained by the Secretary for payment to the persons entitled thereto. If no claim is made within 1 year of the announced close of the \$1 Million Money Tree instant lottery game, the right of a ticket holder to claim the prize represented by the ticket, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided for by statute.

14. Governing law: In purchasing a ticket, the customer agrees to comply with and abide by the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314), 61 Pa. Code Part V (relating to State Lotteries) and the provisions contained in this notice.

15. Termination of the game: The Secretary may announce a termination date, after which no further tickets from this game may be sold. The announcement will be disseminated through media used to advertise or promote \$1 Million Money Tree or through normal communications methods.

5. *Prizes*: The prizes that can be won in this game are: \$3, \$5, \$10, \$15, \$30, \$50, \$100, \$300, \$1,000, \$3,000 and \$50,000. For a complete description of how these prizes can be won, see section 9 (relating to number and description of prizes and approximate odds). A player can win up to 14 times on a ticket.

6. Approximate number of tickets printed for the game: Approximately 5,400,000 tickets will be printed for the Bah, Humbuck\$ instant lottery game.

7. Second-Chance Drawing: The Pennsylvania Lottery will conduct an Ugly Sweater Second-Chance Drawing for which non-winning Bah, Humbuck\$ instant lottery game tickets may be eligible as provided for in section 10.

8. Determination of prize winners: Each Bah Humbuck\$ instant lottery game ticket consists of three distinct "GAME" areas, and a Humbuck\$ area, as described below. Reveal a Scrooge (WIN100) symbol in any "GAME" and win \$100 instantly.

(a) *PAST PAYOUT GAME*: Reveal two like symbols in the "PAST PAYOUT GAME" area and win the total sum of all of the prize symbols displayed on the ticket.

(3) If any discrepancy exists between these rules and any material describing the Drawing, these rules shall govern.

(4) Employees of the Pennsylvania Lottery, 9Rooftops Marketing, LLC (formerly known as MARC USA, LLC), MUSL, Scientific Games International, Inc., MDI Entertainment, LLC, and their subcontractors, or a spouse, child, brother, sister or parent residing as a member of the same household in the principal place of residence of any such person are not eligible to participate in the Drawing. Offer void where prohibited or restricted.

(5) The Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to cancel or suspend the Drawing and change these rules if the Drawing cannot be conducted as planned due to errors in these rules or advertising, unauthorized intervention, tampering, fraud, technical errors, viruses, worms, bugs or any other cause that, in the Lottery's sole judgment, could corrupt or impair the administration, security, fairness, integrity or proper conduct of the Drawing.

(6) All entries shall be subject to verification by the Pennsylvania Lottery.

(7) The Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to disqualify an entrant found to be tampering with the operation of the Drawing or to be acting in violation of these rules or applicable law.

(8) The Drawing is governed by the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Applicable laws and regulations apply.

(9) Prizes must be claimed within 1 year of the drawing date of the Drawing in which the prize was won. If no claim is made within 1 year of the drawing date of the Drawing in which the prize was won, the right of an entrant to claim the prize won, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided by statute.

Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$1,000,001 and not exceeding \$10,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$10,000. A Lottery retailer is entitled only to the largest bonus for which they qualify on a winning ticket. A bonus will be initiated for payment after the instant ticket is claimed and validated. A bonus will not be awarded to a Lottery retailer that sells a nonwinning Pennsylvania Lottery instant ticket used to enter a Pennsylvania Lottery second-chance drawing or promotion that is subsequently selected to win a prize.

13. Unclaimed prize money: For a period of 1 year from the announced close of Bah, Humbuck\$, prize money from winning Bah, Humbuck\$ instant lottery game tickets will be retained by the Secretary for payment to the persons entitled thereto. 3. Play symbols: Each Ho Ho Holiday 100X instant lottery game ticket will contain one play area featuring a "WINNING NUMBERS" area, a "YOUR NUMBERS" area and an "ORNAMENT BONUS" area, and one "HOLIDAY BONUS" area. The "HOLIDAY BONUS" area is played separately. The play symbols and their captions located in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area are: 1 (ONE), 2 (TWO), 3 (THREE), 4 (FOUR), 5 (FIVE), 6 (SIX), 7 (SEVEN), 8 (EIGHT), 9 (NINE), 10 (TEN), 11 (ELEVN), 12 (TWLV), 13 (THRTN), 14 (FORTN), 15 (FIFTN), 16 (SIXTN), 17 (SVNTN), 18 (EGHTN), 19 (NINTN), 20 (TWENT), 21 (TWYONE), 22 (TWYTWO), 23 (TWYTHR), 24(TWYFOR), 25 (TWYFIV), 26 (TWYSIX), 27 (TWYSVN), 28 (TWYEGT), 29 (TWYNIN), 30 (THIRT), 31 (THYONE), 32 (THYTWO), 33 (THYTHR), 34 (THYFOR), 35 (THYFIV), 36 (THYSIX), 37 (THYSVN), 38 (THYEGT), 39 (THYNIN) and 40 (FORT). 4. *Prize symbols*: The prize symbols and their captions located in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area are: \$30<sup>.00</sup> (THIRTY), \$40<sup>.00</sup> (FORTY), \$50<sup>.00</sup> (FIFTY), \$100 (ONE HUN), \$200 (TWO HUN), \$300 (THR HUN), \$500 (FIV HUN), \$1,000 (ONE THO), \$3,000 (THR THO), \$30,000 (THRTYTHO), \$300,000 (THRHUNTHO) and \$3MILL (THR MIL). The prize symbols and their captions, located in the "HOLIDAY BONUS" area, are: \$30<sup>.00</sup> (THIRTY),

 $40^{.00}$  (FORTY),  $50^{.00}$  (FIFTY), 100 (ONE HUN), 200 (TWO HUN), 300 (THR HUN), 500 (FIV HUN) and 1,000 (ONE THO).

5. *Prizes*: The prizes that can be won in this game are: \$30, \$40, \$50, \$100, \$200, \$300, \$500, \$1,000, \$3,000, \$30,000 and \$3,000,000. The prize that can be won in the "ORNAMENT BONUS" area is \$100. The prizes that can be won in the "HOLIDAY BONUS" area, are: \$30, \$40, \$50, \$100, \$200, \$300, \$500 and \$1,000. For a complete description of how these prizes can be won, see section 9 (relating to number and description of prizes and approximate odds). A player can win up to 32 times on a ticket.

6. Approximate number of tickets printed for the game: Approximately 4,800,000 tickets will be printed for the Ho Ho Holiday 100X instant lottery game.

7. Second-Chance Drawing: The Pennsylvania Lottery will conduct one Ugly Sweater Second-Chance Drawing for which non-winning Ho Ho Holiday 100X instant lottery game tickets may be eligible as provided for in section 10.

#### 8. Determination of prize winners:

(a) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$3MILL (THR MIL) appears in the "prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$3,000,000. The prize shall be paid as a one-time, lump-sum cash payment.

(b) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$300,000 (THRHUNTHO) appears in the "prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$300,000.

(c) Holders of tickets upon which a Sleigh (WINALL) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of \$500 (FIV HUN) appears in three of the "prize" areas, a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in five of the "prize" areas, a prize symbol of \$50<sup>.00</sup> (FIFTY) appears in 16 of the "prize" areas and a prize symbol of \$200 (TWO HUN) appears in one of the "prize" areas, and upon which a 100X (100TIMES) symbol appears in the "ORNAMENT BONUS" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$300,000.

(d) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$30,000 (THRTYTHO) appears in the "prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$30,000.

(e) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$300 (THR HUN) appears in the "prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, and upon which a 100X (100TIMES) symbol appears in the "ORNA-MENT BONUS" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$30,000.

(f) Holders of tickets upon which a Sleigh (WINALL) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area, and a prize symbol of \$3,000 (THR THO) appears in two of the "prize" areas, a prize symbol of \$1,000 (ONE THO) appears in 20 of the "prize" areas, a prize symbol of \$500 (FIV HUN) appears in two of the "prize" areas and a

prize symbol of \$300 (THR HUN) appears in one of the "prize" areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$27,300.

(g) Holders of tickets upon which a 100X Tag (100X) symbol appears in the "HOLIDAY BONUS" area and a prize symbol of  $$50^{.00}$  (FIFTY) appears in the "prize" area under that 100X Tag (100X) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$5,000.

(l) Holders of tickets upon which a Sleigh (WINALL) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area, and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in 23 of the "prize" areas, a prize symbol of \$300 (THR HUN) appears in one of the "prize" areas and a prize symbol of \$50<sup>.00</sup> (FIFTY) appears in one of the "prize" areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$2,650.

(m) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$1,000 (ONE THO) appears in the "prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1,000.

(n) Holders of tickets upon which a Santa Hat (HAT) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of \$1,000 (ONE THO) appears in the "prize" area under that Santa Hat (HAT) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1,000.

(o) Holders of tickets upon which a WIN Tag (WIN) symbol appears in the "HOLIDAY BONUS" area and a prize symbol of \$1,000 (ONE THO) appears in the "prize" area under that WIN Tag (WIN) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1,000.

(p) Holders of tickets upon which a Sleigh (WINALL) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in three of the "prize" areas, a prize symbol of  $50^{00}$  (FIFTY) appears in two of the "prize" areas and a prize symbol of  $330^{00}$  (THIRTY) appears in 20 of the "prize" areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1,000.

(q) Holders of tickets upon which a Sleigh (WINALL) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area, and a prize symbol of  $$40^{.00}$  (FORTY) appears in all 25 of the "prize" areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1,000.

(r) Holders of tickets upon which a Sleigh (WINALL) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area, and a prize symbol of  $30^{.00}$  (THIRTY) appears in all 25 of the "prize" areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$750.

(u) Holders of tickets upon which a WIN Tag (WIN) symbol appears in the "HOLIDAY BONUS" area and a prize symbol of \$500 (FIV HUN) appears in the "prize" area under that WIN Tag (WIN) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$500.

(v) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$300 (THR HUN) appears in the "prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$300.

(w) Holders of tickets upon which a Santa Hat (HAT) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of \$300 (THR HUN) appears in the "prize" area under that Santa Hat (HAT) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$300.

(y) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$200 (TWO HUN) appears in the "prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$200.

(z) Holders of tickets upon which a Santa Hat (HAT) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of \$200 (TWO HUN) appears in the "prize" area under that Santa Hat (HAT) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$200.

(aa) Holders of tickets upon which a WIN Tag (WIN) symbol appears in the "HOLIDAY BONUS" area and a prize symbol of \$200 (TWO HUN) appears in the "prize" area under that WIN Tag (WIN) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$200.

(bb) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in the "prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.

(dd) Holders of tickets upon which a HO HO (WIN100) symbol appears in the "ORNAMENT BONUS" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.

(ee) Holders of tickets upon which a WIN Tag (WIN) symbol appears in the "HOLIDAY BONUS" area and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in the "prize" area under that WIN Tag (WIN) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.

(ff) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$50<sup>.00</sup> (FIFTY) appears in the "prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$50.

(mm) Holders of tickets upon which a Santa Hat (HAT) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of  $330^{.00}$  (THIRTY) appears in the "prize" area under that Santa Hat (HAT) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$30.

(nn) Holders of tickets upon which a WIN Tag (WIN) symbol appears in the "HOLIDAY BONUS" area and a prize symbol of  $330^{.00}$  (THIRTY) appears in the "prize" area under that WIN Tag (WIN) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$30.

(b) *Participation and entry*:

(1) Entrants must have a registered lottery account in order to participate in the Drawing. To create a lottery account, visit https://www.PAiLottery.com. Creating a lottery account is free.

(2) A registered lottery account holder is subject to the iLottery regulations and specifically agrees to be bound by the iLottery terms and conditions located at https://www.pailottery.com/signup/terms-and-conditions/, as well as any related policies.

(3) To establish a lottery account, players must provide the following information:

(i) The player's name as it appears on a valid government-issued identification or tax documents;

(ii) The player's date of birth;

(iii) The entire or last four digits of the player's Social Security Number, or comparable equivalent;

(iv) The player's address;

(v) The player's telephone number;

(vi) The player's email address;

(vii) Any other information established by the Lottery to be necessary to verify the age and identity of the player.

(4) An individual may be required to provide additional information or documentation, as set forth in the iLottery terms and conditions, to establish a lottery account or register for iLottery. The information may be used for iLottery registration or to confirm information provided by that individual during the registration process.

(5) To enter the Drawing, entrants must submit the identifying information from at least one Qualifying Ticket via the Drawing's promotional web site, available at https://www.palottery.com, or the Lottery's official mo-

bile application during the entry period. The identifying information from a Qualifying Ticket may be submitted only once in the Drawing. Entries will automatically be awarded at the time of successful submission of a Qualifying Ticket. No other method of submission will be accepted, and entries submitted using any other method, including entries mailed or hand-delivered to the Pennsylvania Lottery, are not valid and will be disqualified.

(6) Each entry must be complete and the information supplied by the entrant must be accurate. Incomplete entries cannot be accepted.

(7) Only one claimant per entry is allowed.

(8) Entrants must be 18 years of age or older.

(9) Players may submit the identifying information from an unlimited number of Qualifying Tickets in the Drawing.

(10) Once an entry has been submitted it cannot be withdrawn or changed.

(c) *Drawing description*:

(1) The Lottery will conduct one Ugly Sweater Second-Chance Drawing for qualifying instant lottery game tickets. All time references are Eastern Prevailing Time.

(2) All entries received after 11:59:59 p.m. October 22, 2023, through 11:59:59 p.m. January 4, 2024, will be entered into the Drawing tentatively scheduled to be held between January 5, 2024 and January 22, 2024.

(3) The entry period for the Drawing will be posted to the Pennsylvania Lottery's publicly accessible web site.

(4) The number of entries an entrant will receive for the Drawing is determined by the purchase price of the Qualifying Ticket entered. The purchase price and corresponding number of entries for the Qualifying Ticket is as follows: PA-1658 Ho Ho Holiday 100X (\$30) = 30 entries, PA-1659 \$1 Million Money Tree (\$20) = 20 entries, PA-1660 \$500,000 Merry-mint (\$10) = ten entries, PA-1661 Santa's Cash Drop Doubler (\$5) = five entries, PA-1662 Bah, Humbuck\$ (\$3) = three entries, PA-1663 Twinkles and Tangled (\$2) = two entries and PA-1664 Jingle Buck (\$1) = one entry.

(5) Players may review prizes won and their entries for the Drawing via the Drawing's promotional web site.

(d) *Prizes available to be won, determination of winners and odds of winning:* 

(1) The prize entitlements described below are subject to all restrictions and limitations described in section 10(e), or those mentioned anywhere else in these rules.

(2) Lottery will conduct one Drawing from among all the entries received during the entry period as described in section 10(c)(2).

(i) The first and the second entries selected in the Drawing will be winning entries and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$150,000, less required income tax withholding.

(ii) The third through the fifth entries selected in the Drawing will be winning entries and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$50,000, less required income tax withholding.

(iii) The sixth through the tenth entries selected in the Drawing will be winning entries and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$25,000, less required income tax withholding.

(iv) The eleventh through the fifteenth entries selected in the Drawing will be winning entries and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$5,000.

(v) The sixteenth through the sixty-fifth entries selected in the Drawing will be winning entries and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$100 iLottery Bonus Money.

(3) All prizes will be paid as a lump-sum cash payment or uploaded to a winning player's lottery account.

(4) Winners of iLottery Bonus Money are not required to claim a prize. Winners of iLottery Bonus Money will have the iLottery Bonus Money credited to their lottery account and will receive an email notifying them that they won a prize.

(5) The number of winning entries to be selected for the Drawing will be posted to the Pennsylvania Lottery's publicly accessible web site.

(6) The odds of winning in the Drawing depend upon the number of entries received for the Drawing.

(7) A computer-generated randomizer will be used to select the Drawing winners.

(e) *Drawing restrictions*:

(1) To be eligible to participate in the Drawing, entrants must have complied with the requirements of these rules.

(2) The Lottery is not responsible for late, lost or misdirected entries not entered into the Drawing. The Lottery is not responsible for entries that are not entered into the Drawing because of incompatible internet browsers, mobile Lottery application failure or other technical issues. The Lottery is not responsible for entries not entered due to delays in creating a lottery account or the inability to create a lottery account. If a Drawing entry is selected as a winner and rejected or otherwise disqualified during or following the Drawing, the Lottery will select one entry to replace the rejected or otherwise disqualified entry in accordance with these rules and Lottery procedure.

(3) If any discrepancy exists between these rules and any material describing the Drawing, these rules shall govern.

(4) Employees of the Pennsylvania Lottery, 9Rooftops Marketing, LLC (formerly known as MARC USA, LLC), MUSL, Scientific Games International, Inc., MDI Entertainment, LLC, and their subcontractors, or a spouse, child, brother, sister or parent residing as a member of the same household in the principal place of residence of any such person are not eligible to participate in the Drawing. Offer void where prohibited or restricted.

(5) The Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to cancel or suspend the Drawing and change these rules if the Drawing cannot be conducted as planned due to errors in these rules or advertising, unauthorized intervention, tampering, fraud, technical errors, viruses, worms, bugs or any other cause that, in the Lottery's sole judgment, could corrupt or impair the administration, security, fairness, integrity or proper conduct of the Drawing.

(6) All entries shall be subject to verification by the Pennsylvania Lottery.

(7) The Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to disqualify an entrant found to be tampering with the operation of the Drawing or to be acting in violation of these rules or applicable law.

(8) The Drawing is governed by the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Applicable laws and regulations apply.

(9) Prizes must be claimed within 1 year of the drawing date of the Drawing in which the prize was won. If no claim is made within 1 year of the drawing date of the Drawing in which the prize was won, the right of an entrant to claim the prize won, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided by statute.

(10) Final determination of winners will be made by the Secretary, whose judgment will be final and binding.

(11) A prize awarded in the Drawing to a person who dies before receiving the prize shall be paid according to 61 Pa. Code § 811.16 (relating to prizes payable after death of a prize winner).

(12) A winner is responsible for all taxes arising from or in connection with any prize won.

(13) A player may only win the prize for which the player is first selected in the Drawing. Subsequent entries, from the same individual, selected in the same Drawing will be disqualified and one replacement entry will be selected.

(14) Winners of iLottery Bonus Money must abide by the iLottery terms and conditions, the iLottery Bonus Policy and these rules. iLottery Bonus Money will expire 90 days from the date on which the winner was notified, via email, of the prize win, as further detailed in section 10(d)(4). iLottery Bonus Money has a five times play through requirement in order to convert the iLottery Bonus Money into cash. For example, for a player winning \$100 of iLottery Bonus Money, the player is required to place \$500 in wagers before the iLottery Bonus Money awarded is converted into cash which may be withdrawn from the player's account.

(15) Prizes are not transferrable.

(16) Other restrictions may apply.

11. *Retailer incentive awards*: The Lottery may conduct a separate Retailer Incentive Program for retailers who sell Ho Ho Holiday 100X instant lottery game tickets.

12. *Retailer bonus*: The Lottery may offer a retailer bonus in connection with the sale of Pennsylvania instant lottery game tickets. If a retailer bonus is offered, a Lottery retailer shall be eligible for a bonus as described in this section. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$100,000 and not exceeding \$500,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$500. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$500,001 and not exceeding \$1,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$5,000. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$1,000,001 and not exceeding \$10,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$10,000. A Lottery retailer is entitled only to the largest bonus for which they qualify on a winning ticket. A bonus will be initiated for payment after the instant ticket is claimed and validated. A bonus will not be awarded to a Lottery retailer that sells a nonwinning Pennsylvania Lottery instant ticket used to enter a Pennsylvania Lottery second-chance drawing or promotion that is subsequently selected to win a prize.

13. Unclaimed prize money: For a period of 1 year from the announced close of Ho Ho Holiday 100X, prize money from winning Ho Ho Holiday 100X instant lottery game tickets will be retained by the Secretary for payment to the persons entitled thereto. If no claim is made within 1 year of the announced close of the Ho Ho Holiday 100X instant lottery game, the right of a ticket holder to claim the prize represented by the ticket, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided for by statute.

14. Governing law: In purchasing a ticket, the customer agrees to comply with and abide by the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314), 61 Pa. Code Part V (relating to State Lotteries) and the provisions contained in this notice.

15. Termination of the game: The Secretary may announce a termination date, after which no further tickets from this game may be sold. The announcement will be disseminated through media used to advertise or promote Ho Ho Holiday 100X or through normal communications methods.

Under the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101— 3761-314) and 61 Pa. Code § 819.203 (relating to notice of instant game rules), the Secretary of Revenue hereby provides public notice of the rules for the following instant lottery game:

1. *Name*: The name of the game is Pennsylvania Jingle Buck ("Jingle Buck"). The game number is PA-1664.

2. *Price*: The price of a Jingle Buck instant lottery game ticket is \$1.

3. *Play symbols*: Each Jingle Buck instant lottery game ticket will contain one play area featuring a "WINNING NUMBERS" area and a "YOUR NUMBERS" area. The play symbols and their captions located in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area are: 1 (ONE), 2 (TWO), 3 (THREE), 4 (FOUR), 5 (FIVE), 6 (SIX), 7 (SEVEN), 8

(EIGHT), 9 (NINE), 10 (TEN), 11 (ELEVN), 12 (TWLV), 13 (THRTN), 14 (FORTN), 15 (FIFTN), 16 (SIXTN), 17 (SVNTN), 18 (EGHTN), 19 (NINTN) and 20 (TWENT). The play symbols and their captions located in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area are: 1 (ONE), 2 (TWO), 3 (THREE), 4 (FOUR), 5 (FIVE), 6 (SIX), 7 (SEVEN), 8 (EIGHT), 9 (NINE), 10 (TEN), 11 (ELEVN), 12 (TWLV), 13 (THRTN), 14 (FORTN), 15 (FIFTN), 16 (SIXTN), 17 (SVNTN), 18 (EGHTN), 19 (NINTN), 20 (TWENT) and a Buck (WINALL) symbol.

4. *Prize Symbols*: The prize symbols and their captions located in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area are: FREE (TICKET),  $$1^{.00}$  (ONE DOL),  $$2^{.00}$  (TWO DOL),  $$4^{.00}$  (FOR DOL),  $$5^{.00}$  (FIV DOL),  $$10^{.00}$  (TEN DOL),  $$15^{.00}$  (FIFTEEN),  $$20^{.00}$  (TWENTY),  $$40^{.00}$  (FORTY), \$100 (ONE HUN), \$400 (FOR HUN) and \$5,000 (FIV THO).

5. *Prizes*: The prizes that can be won in this game are: Free \$1 Ticket, \$1, \$2, \$4, \$5, \$10, \$15, \$20, \$40, \$100, \$400 and \$5,000. For a complete description of how these prizes can be won, see section 9 (relating to number and description of prizes and approximate odds). A player can win up to four times on a ticket.

6. Approximate number of tickets printed for the game: Approximately 10,800,000 tickets will be printed for the Jingle Buck instant lottery game.

7. Second-Chance Drawing: The Pennsylvania Lottery will conduct an Ugly Sweater Second-Chance Drawing from the Pennsylvania Lottery for which non-winning Jingle Buck instant lottery game tickets may be eligible as provided in section 10.

8. Determination of prize winners:

(a) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match either of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$5,000 (FIV THO) appears in the "prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$5,000.

(b) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match either of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$400 (FOR HUN) appears in the "prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$400.

(c) Holders of tickets upon which a Buck (WINALL) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in all four of the "prize" areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$400.

(d) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match either of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in the "prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.

(e) Holders of tickets upon which a Buck (WINALL) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of \$40<sup>.00</sup> (FORTY) appears in two of the "prize" areas and a prize symbol of \$10<sup>.00</sup> (TEN DOL) appears in two of the "prize" areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.

(f) Holders of tickets upon which a Buck (WINALL) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of  $20^{00}$  (TWENTY) appears in three of the "prize" areas and a prize symbol of  $40^{00}$  (FORTY)

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appears in one of the "prize" areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.

(g) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match either of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$40<sup>.00</sup> (FORTY) appears in the "prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$40.

(h) Holders of tickets upon which a Buck (WINALL) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of  $$15^{.00}$  (FIFTEEN) appears in two of the "prize" areas and a prize symbol of  $$5^{.00}$  (FIV DOL) appears in two of the "prize" areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$40.

(i) Holders of tickets upon which a Buck (WINALL) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of  $$10^{.00}$  (TEN DOL) appears in all four of the "prize" areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$40.

(j) Holders of tickets upon which a Buck (WINALL) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of  $5^{.00}$  (FIV DOL) appears in two of the "prize" areas, a prize symbol of  $20^{.00}$  (TWENTY) appears in one of the "prize" areas and a prize symbol of  $10^{.00}$  (TEN DOL) appears in one of the "prize" areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of 40.

(k) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match either of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$20<sup>.00</sup> (TWENTY) appears in the "prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$20.

(m) Holders of tickets upon which a Buck (WINALL) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of  $$5^{.00}$  (FIV DOL) appears in all four of the "prize" areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$20.

(n) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match either of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$15<sup>.00</sup> (FIFTEEN) appears in the "prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$15.

(o) Holders of tickets upon which a Buck (WINALL) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of  $$5^{.00}$  (FIV DOL) appears in two of the "prize" areas, a prize symbol of  $$4^{.00}$  (FOR DOL) appears in one of the "prize" areas and a prize symbol of  $$1^{.00}$  (ONE DOL) appears in one of the "prize" areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$15.

(p) Holders of tickets upon which a Buck (WINALL) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of  $$4^{.00}$  (FOR DOL) appears in two of the "prize" areas, a prize symbol of  $$5^{.00}$  (FIV DOL) appears in one of the "prize" areas and a prize symbol of  $$2^{.00}$  (TWO DOL) appears in one of the "prize" areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$15.

(q) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match either of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$10<sup>.00</sup> (TEN DOL) appears in the "prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$10.

(r) Holders of tickets upon which a Buck (WINALL) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of \$4<sup>.00</sup> (FOR DOL) appears in two of the "prize" areas and a prize symbol of \$1<sup>.00</sup> (ONE DOL) appears in two of the "prize" areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$10.

(s) Holders of tickets upon which a Buck (WINALL) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of  $$2^{.00}$  (TWO DOL) appears in two of the "prize" areas, a prize symbol of  $$5^{.00}$  (FIV DOL) appears in one of the "prize" areas and a prize symbol of  $$1^{.00}$  (ONE DOL) appears in one of the "prize" areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$10.

(u) Holders of tickets upon which a Buck (WINALL) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of  $\$1^{.00}$  (ONE DOL) appears in three of the "prize" areas and a prize symbol of  $\$2^{.00}$  (TWO DOL) appears in one of the "prize" areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$5.

(v) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match either of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$4<sup>.00</sup> (FOR DOL) appears in the "prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$4.

(w) Holders of tickets upon which a Buck (WINALL) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of  $$1^{.00}$  (ONE DOL) appears in all four of the "prize" areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$4.

(x) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match either of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of  $$2^{.00}$  (TWO DOL) appears in the "prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$2.

(y) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match either of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of  $1^{.00}$  (ONE DOL) appears in the "prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of 1.

(z) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match either of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of FREE (TICKET) appears in the "prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of one Jingle Buck instant game ticket or one Pennsylvania Lottery instant game ticket of equivalent sale price which is currently on sale.

#### (b) Participation and entry:

(1) Entrants must have a registered lottery account in order to participate in the Drawing. To create a lottery account, visit https://www.PAiLottery.com. Creating a lottery account is free. (2) A registered lottery account holder is subject to the iLottery regulations and specifically agrees to be bound by the iLottery terms and conditions located at https://www.pailottery.com/signup/terms-and-conditions/, as well as any related policies.

(3) To establish a lottery account, players must provide the following information:

(vii) Any other information established by the Lottery to be necessary to verify the age and identity of the player.

(4) An individual may be required to provide additional information or documentation, as set forth in the iLottery terms and conditions, to establish a lottery account or register for iLottery. The information may be used for iLottery registration or to confirm information provided by that individual during the registration process.

(5) To enter the Drawing, entrants must submit the identifying information from at least one Qualifying Ticket via the Drawing's promotional web site, available at https://www.palottery.com, or the Lottery's official mobile application during the entry period. The identifying information from a Qualifying Ticket may be submitted only once in the Drawing. Entries will automatically be awarded at the time of successful submission of a Qualifying Ticket. (4) The number of entries an entrant will receive for the Drawing is determined by the purchase price of the Qualifying Ticket entered. The purchase price and corresponding number of entries for the Qualifying Ticket is as follows: PA-1658 Ho Ho Holiday 100X (\$30) = 30 entries, PA-1659 \$1 Million Money Tree (\$20) = 20 entries, PA-1660 \$500,000 Merry-mint (\$10) = ten entries, PA-1661 Santa's Cash Drop Doubler (\$5) = five entries, PA-1662 Bah, Humbuck\$ (\$3) = three entries, PA-1663 Twinkles and Tangled (\$2) = two entries and PA-1664 Jingle Buck (\$1) = one entry.

(5) Players may review prizes won and their entries for the Drawing via the Drawing's promotional web site.

(d) *Prizes available to be won, determination of winners and odds of winning:* 

(1) The prize entitlements described below are subject to all restrictions and limitations described in section 10(e), or those mentioned anywhere else in these rules.

(2) Lottery will conduct one Drawing from among all the entries received during the entry period as described in section 10(c)(2).

(i) The first and the second entries selected in the Drawing will be winning entries and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$150,000, less required income tax withholding.

(iii) The sixth through the tenth entries selected in the Drawing will be winning entries and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$25,000, less required income tax withholding.

(2) The Lottery is not responsible for late, lost or misdirected entries not entered into the Drawing. The Lottery is not responsible for entries that are not entered into the Drawing because of incompatible internet browsers, mobile Lottery application failure or other technical issues. The Lottery is not responsible for entries not entered due to delays in creating a lottery account or the inability to create a lottery account. If a Drawing entry is selected as a winner and rejected or otherwise disqualified during or following the Drawing, the Lottery will select one entry to replace the rejected or otherwise disqualified entry in accordance with these rules and Lottery procedure.

(3) If any discrepancy exists between these rules and any material describing the Drawing, these rules shall govern.

(4) Employees of the Pennsylvania Lottery, 9Rooftops Marketing, LLC (formerly known as MARC USA, LLC), MUSL, Scientific Games International, Inc., MDI Entertainment, LLC, and their subcontractors, or a spouse, child, brother, sister or parent residing as a member of the same household in the principal place of residence of any such person are not eligible to participate in the Drawing. Offer void where prohibited or restricted.

(5) The Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to cancel or suspend the Drawing and change these rules if the Drawing cannot be conducted as planned due to errors in these rules or advertising, unauthorized intervention, tampering, fraud, technical errors, viruses, worms, bugs or any other cause that, in the Lottery's sole judgment, could corrupt or impair the administration, security, fairness, integrity or proper conduct of the Drawing.

(6) All entries shall be subject to verification by the Pennsylvania Lottery.

(7) The Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to disqualify an entrant found to be tampering with the operation of the Drawing or to be acting in violation of these rules or applicable law.

(8) The Drawing is governed by the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Applicable laws and regulations apply.

(9) Prizes must be claimed within 1 year of the drawing date of the Drawing in which the prize was won. If no claim is made within 1 year of the drawing date of the Drawing in which the prize was won, the right of an entrant to claim the prize won, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided by statute.

(10) Final determination of winners will be made by the Secretary, whose judgment will be final and binding.

(11) A prize awarded in the Drawing to a person who dies before receiving the prize shall be paid according to 61 Pa. Code § 811.16 (relating to prizes payable after death of a prize winner).

(12) A winner is responsible for all taxes arising from or in connection with any prize won.

(13) A player may only win the prize for which the player is first selected in the Drawing. Subsequent entries, from the same individual, selected in the same Drawing will be disqualified and one replacement entry will be selected.

11. *Retailer incentive awards*: The Lottery may conduct a separate Retailer Incentive Program for retailers who sell Jingle Buck instant lottery game tickets.

12. Retailer bonus: The Lottery may offer a retailer bonus in connection with the sale of Pennsylvania instant lottery game tickets. If a retailer bonus is offered, a Lottery retailer shall be eligible for a bonus as described in this section. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$100,000 and not exceeding \$500,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$500. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$500,001 and not exceeding \$1,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$5,000. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$1,000,001 and not exceeding \$10,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$10,000. A Lottery retailer is entitled only to the largest bonus for which they qualify on a winning ticket. A bonus will be initiated for payment after the instant ticket is claimed and validated. A bonus will not be awarded to a Lottery retailer that sells a nonwinning Pennsylvania Lottery instant ticket used to enter a Pennsylvania Lottery second-chance drawing or promotion that is subsequently selected to win a prize.

13. Unclaimed prize money: For a period of 1 year from the announced close of Jingle Buck, prize money from winning Jingle Buck instant lottery game tickets will be retained by the Secretary for payment to the persons entitled thereto. If no claim is made within 1 year of the announced close of the Jingle Buck instant lottery game, the right of a ticket holder to claim the prize represented by the ticket, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided for by statute.

14. Governing law: In purchasing a ticket, the customer agrees to comply with and abide by the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314), 61 Pa. Code Part V (relating to State Lotteries) and the provisions contained in this notice.

15. Termination of the game: The Secretary may announce a termination date, after which no further tickets from this game may be sold. The announcement will be disseminated through media used to advertise or promote Jingle Buck or through normal communications methods.

The play symbols and their captions, located in the play area, are: Jingle Bell (BELL) symbol, Cupcake (CUPCAKE) symbol, Cookie (COOKIE) symbol, Bear with Heart (HEART BEAR) symbol, Scarf (SCARF) symbol, Snow Globe (SNOW GLOBE) symbol, Ornament (ORNAMENT) symbol, Musical Note (MUSICAL NOTE) symbol, Tree (TREE) symbol, Wreath (WREATH) symbol, Mitten (MITTEN) symbol, Poinsettia (POINSETTIA) symbol, Mistletoe (MISTLE-TOE) symbol, Lights (LIGHTS) symbol, Reindeer (DEER) symbol, Flurries (FLURRIES) symbol, Present (PRES-ENT) symbol, Santa (SANTA) symbol and a Parachute (WINALL) symbol. The play symbols and prize amounts, and their captions, located in the "CASH DROP AREA," are: Drum (DRUM) symbol, Nutcracker (NUTCRACKER) symbol, Stocking (STOCKING) symbol, Sleigh (SLEIGH) symbol, Candy Cane (CNDYCANE) symbol, Snowballs (SNOWBALLS) symbol,  $5^{.00}$  (FIV DOL),  $10^{.00}$  (TEN DOL),  $20^{.00}$  (TWENTY),  $50^{.00}$  (FIFTY), 100 (ONE HUN) and \$200 (TWO HUN).

4. *Prize Symbols*: The prize symbols and their captions, located in the play area, are:  $$5^{.00}$  (FIV DOL),  $$10^{.00}$  (TEN DOL),  $$20^{.00}$  (TWENTY),  $$50^{.00}$  (FIFTY), \$100 (ONE HUN), \$200 (TWO HUN), \$400 (FOR HUN), \$1,000 (ONE THO), \$5,000 (FIV THO) and \$200,000 (TWOHUNTHO). 5. *Prizes*: The prizes that can be won in this game are: \$5, \$10, \$20, \$50, \$100, \$200, \$400, \$1,000, \$5,000 and \$200,000. For a complete description of how these prizes can be won, see section 9 (relating to number and description of prizes and approximate odds). A player can win up to 13 times on a ticket.

6. Approximate number of tickets printed for the game: Approximately 10,800,000 tickets will be printed for the Santa's Cash Drop Doubler instant lottery game.

7. Second-Chance Drawing: The Pennsylvania Lottery will conduct one Ugly Sweater Second-Chance Drawing for which non-winning Santa's Cash Drop Doubler instant lottery game tickets may be eligible as provided for in section 10.

#### 8. Determination of prize winners:

(c) Holders of tickets upon which a Parachute (WINALL) symbol appears in the play area and a prize symbol of \$1,000 (ONE THO) appears in four of the "prize" areas, a prize symbol of \$50<sup>.00</sup> (FIFTY) appears in six of the "prize" areas, a prize symbol of \$200 (TWO HUN) appears in one of the "prize" areas and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in one of the "prize" areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$4,600.

(d) Holders of tickets upon which a Santa (SANTA) symbol appears in the play area and a prize symbol of \$1,000 (ONE THO) appears in the "prize" area under that Santa (SANTA) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1,000.

(e) Holders of tickets upon which a Parachute (WINALL) symbol appears in the play area and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in seven of the "prize" areas and a prize symbol of  $20^{00}$  (TWENTY) appears in five of the "prize" areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$800.

(f) Holders of tickets upon which a Parachute (WINALL) symbol appears in the play area and a prize symbol of  $50^{00}$  (FIFTY) appears in all 12 of the "prize" areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$600.

(g) Holders of tickets upon which two matching prize amounts of \$200 (TWO HUN) appear in the "CASH DROP AREA," on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$400.

(4) An individual may be required to provide additional information or documentation, as set forth in the iLottery

terms and conditions, to establish a lottery account or register for iLottery. The information may be used for iLottery registration or to confirm information provided by that individual during the registration process.

(5) To enter the Drawing, entrants must submit the identifying information from at least one Qualifying Ticket via the Drawing's promotional web site, available at https://www.palottery.com, or the Lottery's official mobile application during the entry period. The identifying information from a Qualifying Ticket may be submitted only once in the Drawing. Entries will automatically be awarded at the time of successful submission of a Qualifying Ticket. No other method of submission will be accepted, and entries submitted using any other method, including entries mailed or hand-delivered to the Pennsylvania Lottery, are not valid and will be disqualified.

(i) The first and the second entries selected in the Drawing will be winning entries and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$150,000, less required income tax withholding.

(ii) The third through the fifth entries selected in the Drawing will be winning entries and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$50,000, less required income tax withholding.

(iii) The sixth through the tenth entries selected in the Drawing will be winning entries and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$25,000, less required income tax withholding.

(iv) The eleventh through the fifteenth entries selected in the Drawing will be winning entries and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$5,000.

(v) The sixteenth through the sixty-fifth entries selected in the Drawing will be winning entries and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$100 iLottery Bonus Money.

(3) All prizes will be paid as a lump-sum cash payment or uploaded to a winning player's lottery account.

(4) Winners of iLottery Bonus Money are not required to claim a prize. Winners of iLottery Bonus Money will have the iLottery Bonus Money credited to their lottery account and will receive an email notifying them that they won a prize.

(5) The number of winning entries to be selected for the Drawing will be posted to the Pennsylvania Lottery's publicly accessible web site.

(6) The odds of winning in the Drawing depend upon the number of entries received for the Drawing.

(7) A computer-generated randomizer will be used to select the Drawing winners.

(e) Drawing restrictions:

(1) To be eligible to participate in the Drawing, entrants must have complied with the requirements of these rules.

(2) The Lottery is not responsible for late, lost or misdirected entries not entered into the Drawing. The Lottery is not responsible for entries that are not entered into the Drawing because of incompatible internet browsers, mobile Lottery application failure or other technical issues. The Lottery is not responsible for entries not entered due to delays in creating a lottery account or the inability to create a lottery account. If a Drawing entry is selected as a winner and rejected or otherwise disqualified during or following the Drawing, the Lottery will select one entry to replace the rejected or otherwise disqualified entry in accordance with these rules and Lottery procedure.

(3) If any discrepancy exists between these rules and any material describing the Drawing, these rules shall govern.

(4) Employees of the Pennsylvania Lottery, 9Rooftops Marketing, LLC (formerly known as MARC USA, LLC), MUSL, Scientific Games International, Inc., MDI Entertainment, LLC, and their subcontractors, or a spouse, child, brother, sister or parent residing as a member of the same household in the principal place of residence of any such person are not eligible to participate in the Drawing. Offer void where prohibited or restricted.

(5) The Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to cancel or suspend the Drawing and change these rules if the Drawing cannot be conducted as planned due to errors in these rules or advertising, unauthorized intervention, tampering, fraud, technical errors, viruses, worms, bugs or any other cause that, in the Lottery's sole judgment, could corrupt or impair the administration, security, fairness, integrity or proper conduct of the Drawing.

(6) All entries shall be subject to verification by the Pennsylvania Lottery.

(7) The Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to disqualify an entrant found to be tampering with the operation of the Drawing or to be acting in violation of these rules or applicable law.

(8) The Drawing is governed by the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Applicable laws and regulations apply.

(9) Prizes must be claimed within 1 year of the drawing date of the Drawing in which the prize was won. If no claim is made within 1 year of the drawing date of the Drawing in which the prize was won, the right of an entrant to claim the prize won, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided by statute.

(10) Final determination of winners will be made by the Secretary, whose judgment will be final and binding.

(11) A prize awarded in the Drawing to a person who dies before receiving the prize shall be paid according to 61 Pa. Code § 811.16 (relating to prizes payable after death of a prize winner).

(12) A winner is responsible for all taxes arising from or in connection with any prize won.

(13) A player may only win the prize for which the player is first selected in the Drawing. Subsequent entries, from the same individual, selected in the same Drawing will be disqualified and one replacement entry will be selected.

(14) Winners of iLottery Bonus Money must abide by the iLottery terms and conditions, the iLottery Bonus Policy and these rules. iLottery Bonus Money will expire 90 days from the date on which the winner was notified, via email, of the prize win, as further detailed in section 10(d)(4). iLottery Bonus Money has a five times play through requirement in order to convert the iLottery Bonus Money into cash. For example, for a player winning \$100 of iLottery Bonus Money, the player is required to place \$500 in wagers before the iLottery Bonus Money awarded is converted into cash which may be withdrawn from the player's account.

- (15) Prizes are not transferrable.
- (16) Other restrictions may apply.

11. *Retailer incentive awards*: The Lottery may conduct a separate Retailer Incentive Program for retailers who sell Santa's Cash Drop Doubler instant lottery game tickets.

12. Retailer bonus: The Lottery may offer a retailer bonus in connection with the sale of Pennsylvania instant lottery game tickets. If a retailer bonus is offered, a Lottery retailer shall be eligible for a bonus as described in this section. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$100,000 and not exceeding \$500,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$500. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$500,001 and not exceeding \$1,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$5,000. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$1,000,001 and not exceeding \$10,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$10,000. A Lottery retailer is entitled only to the largest bonus for which they qualify on a winning ticket. A bonus will be initiated for payment after the instant ticket is claimed and validated. A bonus will not be awarded to a Lottery retailer that sells a nonwinning Pennsylvania Lottery instant ticket used to enter a Pennsylvania Lottery second-chance drawing or promotion that is subsequently selected to win a prize.

13. Unclaimed prize money: For a period of 1 year from the announced close of Santa's Cash Drop Doubler, prize money from winning Santa's Cash Drop Doubler instant lottery game tickets will be retained by the Secretary for payment to the persons entitled thereto. If no claim is made within 1 year of the announced close of the Santa's Cash Drop Doubler instant lottery game, the right of a ticket holder to claim the prize represented by the ticket, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided for by statute.

14. Governing law: In purchasing a ticket, the customer agrees to comply with and abide by the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314), 61 Pa. Code Part V (relating to State Lotteries) and the provisions contained in this notice.

15. Termination of the game: The Secretary may announce a termination date, after which no further tickets from this game may be sold. The announcement will be disseminated through media used to advertise or promote Santa's Cash Drop Doubler or through normal communications methods.

#### Pennsylvania Twinkles and Tangled Instant Lottery Game 1663

Under the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101— 3761-314) and 61 Pa. Code § 819.203 (relating to notice of instant game rules), the Secretary of Revenue hereby provides public notice of the rules for the following instant lottery game:

1. Name: The name of the game is Pennsylvania Twinkles and Tangled ("Twinkles and Tangled"). The game number is PA-1663. Twinkles and Tangled is separated into two themed scenes: Twinkles ("Scene 1") and Tangled ("Scene 2"). Both scenes are organized under the same game and the same prize structure and no one scene is determinative of the prizes available to be won on any individual game ticket, or the Second-Chance Drawing entries provided for in section 10.

2. *Price*: The price of a Twinkles and Tangled instant lottery game ticket is \$2.

3. Play symbols: Each Twinkles and Tangled instant lottery game ticket will contain one play area featuring an "UNWRAP THIS GIFT" area. The play symbols and their captions, located in the play area of "Scene 1," are: Candy House (CANDY HOUSE) symbol, Holly (HOLLY) symbol, Sleigh (SLEIGH) symbol, Candy Cane (CNDYCANE) symbol, Mistletoe (MISTLETOE) symbol, Candle (CANDLE) symbol, Present (PRESENT) symbol, Poinsettia (POINSETTIA) symbol, Mitten (MITTEN) symbol, Jingle Bell (BELL) symbol, Cookie (COOKIE) symbol, Stocking (STOCKING) symbol, Nutcracker (NUT-CRACKER) symbol, Drum (DRUM) symbol, Wreath (WREATH) symbol, Twinkle (TWINKLE) symbol and a Checklist (WINALL) symbol. The play symbols and their captions, located in the play area of "Scene 2," are: Candy House (CANDY HOUSE) symbol, Holly (HOLLY) symbol, Sleigh (SLEIGH) symbol, Candy Cane (CNDYCANE) symbol, Mistletoe (MISTLETOE) symbol, Candle (CANDLE) symbol, Present (PRESENT) symbol, Poinsettia (POINSETTIA) symbol, Mitten (MITTEN) symbol, Jingle Bell (BELL) symbol, Cookie (COOKIE) symbol, Stocking (STOCKING) symbol, Nutcracker (NUT-CRACKER) symbol, Drum (DRUM) symbol, Wreath (WREATH) symbol, Tangle (TANGLE) symbol and a Checklist (WINALL) symbol. The play symbols and their captions, located in the "UNWRAP THIS GIFT" area in both "Scene 1" and "Scene 2," are: NOBONUS (TRYAGAIN) symbol, TRYAGAIN (NOBONUS) symbol, NOBONUS (TRYAGAIN) symbol, TRYAGAIN (NOBONUS) symbol, \$2.00 (TWO DOL), \$4.00 (FOR DOL), \$5.00 (FIV DOL), \$10.00 (TEN DOL), \$20.00 (TWENTY), \$40.00 (FORTY), \$100 (ONE HUN) and \$500 (FIV HUN).

4. *Prize Symbols*: The prize symbols and their captions, located in the play area of "Scene 1" and "Scene 2," are:  $$2^{.00}$  (TWO DOL),  $$4^{.00}$  (FOR DOL),  $$5^{.00}$  (FIV DOL),  $$10^{.00}$  (TEN DOL),  $$20^{.00}$  (TWENTY),  $$40^{.00}$  (FORTY), \$100 (ONE HUN), \$200 (TWO HUN), \$500 (FIV HUN), \$1,000 (ONE THO) and \$25,000 (TWYFIVTHO).

5. *Prizes*: The prizes that can be won in this game are: \$2, \$4, \$5, \$10, \$20, \$40, \$100, \$200, \$500, \$1,000 and \$25,000. Twinkles and Tangled contains a feature that can increase certain prizes. For a complete description of how these prizes can be won, see section 9 (relating to number and description of prizes and approximate odds). A player can win up to nine times on a ticket.

6. Approximate number of tickets printed for the game: Approximately 6,000,000 tickets will be printed for the Twinkles and Tangled instant lottery game.

7. Second-Chance Drawing: The Pennsylvania Lottery will conduct an Ugly Sweater Second-Chance Drawing from the Pennsylvania Lottery for which non-winning Twinkles and Tangled instant lottery game tickets may be eligible as provided in section 10.

#### 8. Determination of prize winners:

(a) Holders of tickets upon which a Twinkle (TWINKLE) or Tangle (TANGLE) symbol appears in the play area and a prize symbol of \$25,000 (TWYFIVTHO) appears in the "prize" area under that Twinkle (TWINKLE) or Tangle (TANGLE) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$25,000.

(b) Holders of tickets upon which a Twinkle (TWINKLE) or Tangle (TANGLE) symbol appears in the play area and a prize symbol of \$1,000 (ONE THO) appears in the "prize" area under that Twinkle (TWINKLE) or Tangle (TANGLE) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1,000.

(c) Holders of tickets upon which a Twinkle (TWINKLE) or Tangle (TANGLE) symbol appears in the play area and a prize symbol of \$500 (FIV HUN) appears in the "prize" area under that Twinkle (TWINKLE) or Tangle (TANGLE) symbol, and upon which a \$500 (FIV HUN) play symbol appears in the "UNWRAP THIS GIFT" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1,000.

(d) Holders of tickets upon which a Checklist (WINALL) symbol appears in the play area and a prize symbol of \$200 (TWO HUN) appears in two of the "prize" areas and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in six of the "prize" areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1,000.

(e) Holders of tickets upon which a Checklist (WINALL) symbol appears in the play area and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in six of the "prize" areas and a prize symbol of \$40<sup>.00</sup> (FORTY) appears in two of the "prize" areas, and upon which a \$40<sup>.00</sup> (FORTY) play symbol appears in the "UNWRAP THIS GIFT" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1,000.

(f) Holders of tickets upon which a Twinkle (TWINKLE) or Tangle (TANGLE) symbol appears in the play area and a prize symbol of \$500 (FIV HUN) appears in the "prize" area under that Twinkle (TWINKLE) or Tangle (TANGLE) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$500.

(g) Holders of tickets upon which a Checklist (WINALL) symbol appears in the play area and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in three of the "prize" areas and a prize symbol of  $$40^{.00}$  (FORTY) appears in five of the "prize" areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$500.

\$4.00 (FOR DOL) appears in one of the "prize" areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$40.

(aa) Holders of tickets upon which a Checklist (WINALL) symbol appears in the play area and a prize symbol of  $5^{00}$  (FIV DOL) appears in all eight of the "prize" areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$40.

(bb) Holders of tickets upon which a Twinkle (TWINKLE) or Tangle (TANGLE) symbol appears in the play area and a prize symbol of \$20<sup>.00</sup> (TWENTY) appears in the "prize" area under that Twinkle (TWINKLE) or Tangle (TANGLE) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$20.

(5) To enter the Drawing, entrants must submit the identifying information from at least one Qualifying Ticket via the Drawing's promotional web site, available at https://www.palottery.com, or the Lottery's official mobile application during the entry period. The identifying information from a Qualifying Ticket may be submitted only once in the Drawing. Entries will automatically be awarded at the time of successful submission of a Qualifying Ticket. The purchase price and corresponding number of entries for the Qualifying Ticket is as follows: PA-1658 Ho Ho Holiday 100X (\$30) = 30 entries, PA-1659 \$1 Million Money Tree (\$20) = 20 entries, PA-1660 \$500,000 Merry-mint (\$10) = ten entries, PA-1661 Santa's Cash Drop Doubler (\$5) = five entries, PA-1662 Bah, Humbuck\$ (\$3) = three entries, PA-1663 Twinkles and Tangled (\$2) = two entries and PA-1664 Jingle Buck (\$1) = one entry.

(5) Players may review prizes won and their entries for the Drawing via the Drawing's promotional web site.

(d) Prizes available to be won, determination of winners and odds of winning:

(1) The prize entitlements described below are subject to all restrictions and limitations described in section 10(e), or those mentioned anywhere else in these rules.

Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$100,000 and not exceeding \$500,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$500. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$500,001 and not exceeding \$1,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$5,000. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$1,000,001 and not exceeding \$10,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$10,000. A Lottery retailer is entitled only to the largest bonus for which they qualify on a winning ticket. A bonus will be initiated for payment after the instant ticket is claimed and validated. A bonus will not be awarded to a Lottery retailer that sells a nonwinning Pennsylvania Lottery instant ticket used to enter a Pennsylvania Lottery second-chance drawing or promotion that is subsequently selected to win a prize.

13. Unclaimed prize money: For a period of 1 year from the announced close of Twinkles and Tangled, prize money from winning Twinkles and Tangled instant lottery game tickets will be retained by the Secretary for payment to the persons entitled thereto. If no claim is made within 1 year of the announced close of the Twinkles and Tangled instant lottery game, the right of a ticket holder to claim the prize represented by the ticket, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided for by statute.

14. Governing law: In purchasing a ticket, the customer agrees to comply with and abide by the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314), 61 Pa. Code Part V (relating to State Lotteries) and the provisions contained in this notice.

15. Termination of the game: The Secretary may announce a termination date, after which no further tickets from this game may be sold. The announcement will be disseminated through media used to advertise or promote Twinkles and Tangled or through normal communications methods.

We submit for your consideration the following comments on the proposed rulemaking published in the August 5, 2023 *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. Our comments are based on criteria in Section 5.2 of the Regulatory Review Act (RRA) (71 P.S. § 745.5b). Section 5.1(a) of the RRA (71 P.S. § 745.5a(a)) directs the State Board of Chiropractic (Board) to respond to all comments received from us or any other source.

## 1. Compliance with the provisions of the RRA and the regulations of IRRC.

Section 5.2 of the RRA (71 P.S. § 745.5b) directs IRRC to determine whether a regulation is in the public interest. When making this determination, IRRC considers criteria such as economic or fiscal impact and reasonableness. To make that determination, IRRC must analyze the text of the proposed regulation and the reasons for the new or amended language. IRRC also considers the information a promulgating agency is required to provide under Section 5 of the RRA in the Regulatory Analysis Form (RAF) (71 P.S. § 745.5(a)).

RAF question # 21 asks the agency to provide a specific estimate of the costs and/or savings to state government associated with the implementation of the regulation and to explain how the dollar estimates were derived. The Board states in its response that it will incur a minimal cost to revise its online application forms and online biennial registration platform to indicate the increased fees. However, the Board does not provide a dollar estimate for this cost to implement the regulation. We ask the Board to provide with the final regulation an updated RAF that includes a specific cost estimate to state government associated with implementation of the regulation.

#### 2. Section 5.6. Fees.—Reasonableness.

In this section, the Board proposes to increase application fees to reflect the updated costs of processing applications and to increase the Board's biennial registration fees to ensure that its revenue meets or exceeds its current and projected expenses, as required under Section 1101(b) of the Chiropractic Practice Act (63 P.S. § 625.1101(b)). The Pennsylvania Chiropractic Association (PCA) and the American Chiropractic Association (ACA) each commented on the proposed fees relating to continuing education course approval, asking the Board to consider alternative means of addressing the budgetary gap. PCA suggests that "the fee increase be reflected in a tiered manner specific to 'per credit' ranges as opposed to per course," and offers suggested fees that it asserts are "proportional to cost absorption." The ACA asserts that the proposed fee increases make delivery of affordable, quality, and approved continuing education credits "a cost-prohibitive undertaking without enhancing the standards of quality" and asks the Board to consider the successful models delivered by several other state licensing boards.

ACA also notes that several states "take one step further in defining the [continuing education] providers who are pre-approved" and asserts that "this model has the potential to minimize the number of applications that must be processed" by the Board, thereby decreasing both direct and indirect costs.

We ask the Board to address these alternatives to the proposed fee schedules in the Preamble and RAF of the final regulation, and to explain why the fees in the final regulation are reasonable.
