

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# READER'S GUIDE TO THE PENNSYLVANIA BULLETIN AND THE PENNSYLVANIA CODE

## Pennsylvania Bulletin

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the official gazette of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. It is published weekly. A cumulative subject matter index is published quarterly.

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* serves several purposes. It is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, which is the official codification of agency rules and regulations, Statewide court rules, and other statutorily authorized documents. Changes in the codified text, whether by adoption, amendment, rescission, repeal or emergency action, must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

The following documents are published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*: Governor's Executive Orders; Summaries of Enacted Statutes; Statewide and Local Court Rules; Attorney General Opinions; Motor Carrier Applications before the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission; Applications and Actions before the Department of Environmental Protection; Orders of the Independent Regulatory Review Commission; and other documents authorized by law.

The text of certain documents published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the only valid and enforceable text. Courts are required to take judicial notice of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

#### Adoption, Amendment or Repeal of Regulations

Generally an agency wishing to adopt, amend or rescind regulations must first publish in the *Penn-sylvania Bulletin* a Proposed Rulemaking. There are limited instances when the agency may omit the proposal step; it still must publish the adopted version.

The Proposed Rulemaking contains the full text of the change, the agency contact person, a fiscal note required by law and background for the action.

The agency then allows sufficient time for public comment before taking final action. A Final Rulemaking must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* before the changes can take effect. If the agency wishes to adopt changes to the Proposed Rulemaking to enlarge the scope, it must repropose.

# Citation to the Pennsylvania Bulletin

Cite material in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* by volume number, a page number and date. Example: Volume 1, *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, page 801, January 9, 1971 (short form: 1 Pa.B. 801 (January 9, 1971)).

## Pennsylvania Code

The *Pennsylvania Code* is the official codification of rules and regulations issued by Commonwealth agencies, Statewide court rules and other statutorily authorized documents. The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, printing changes when they are adopted. These changes are then permanently codified by the *Pennsylvania Code Reporter*, a monthly, loose-leaf supplement.

The *Pennsylvania Code* is cited by title number and section number. Example: Title 10 *Pennsylvania Code* § 1.1 (short form: 10 Pa. Code § 1.1).

Under the *Pennsylvania Code* codification system, each regulation is assigned a unique number by title and section. Titles roughly parallel the organization of Commonwealth government.

Search for your area of interest in the *Pennsylvania Code*. The *Pennsylvania Code* is available at www.pacodeandbulletin.gov.

Source Notes give the history of regulations. To see if there have been recent changes not yet codified, check the List of *Pennsylvania Code* Chapters Affected in the most recent issue of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

A chronological table of the history of *Pennsylvania Code* sections may be found at www.legis.state. pa.us/cfdocs/legis/CH/Public/pcde\_index.cfm.

A quarterly List of *Pennsylvania Code* Sections Affected lists the regulations in numerical order, followed by the citation to the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* in which the change occurred.

In Proposed Rulemakings and proposed Statements of Policy, existing text corresponds to the official codified text in the *Pennsylvania Code*.

Court Rules in Titles 201–246 of the Pennsylvania Code

Added text in proposed and adopted court rules is printed in <u>underscored bold face</u>. Deleted text in proposed and adopted court rules is enclosed in brackets [ ] and printed in **bold face**.

Proposed new chapters and rules are printed in regular type to enhance readability.

Ellipses, a series of five asterisks, indicate text that is not amended.

#### **Fiscal Notes**

Section 612 of The Administrative Code of 1929 (71 P. S. § 232) requires the Governor's Budget Office to prepare a fiscal note for regulatory actions and administrative procedures of the administrative departments, boards, commissions and authorities receiving money from the State Treasury. The fiscal note states whether the action or procedure causes a loss of revenue or an increase in the cost of programs for the Commonwealth or its political subdivisions. The fiscal note is required to be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* at the same time as the change is advertised.

A fiscal note provides the following information: (1) the designation of the fund out of which the appropriation providing for expenditures under the action or procedure shall be made; (2) the probable cost for the fiscal year the program is implemented; (3) projected cost estimate of the program for each of the 5 succeeding fiscal years; (4) fiscal history of the program for which expenditures are to be made; (5) probable loss of revenue for the fiscal year of its implementation; (6) projected loss of revenue from the program for each of the 5 succeeding fiscal years; (7) line item, if any, of the General Appropriation Act or other appropriation act out of which expenditures or losses of Commonwealth funds shall occur as a result of the action or procedures; and (8) recommendation, if any, of the Secretary of the Budget and the reasons therefor.

The omission of an item indicates that the agency text of the fiscal note states that there is no information available with respect thereto. In items (3) and (6) information is set forth for the first through fifth fiscal years, following the year the program is implemented, which is stated. In item (4) information is set forth for the current and two immediately preceding years. In item (8) the recommendation, if any, made by the Secretary of the Budget is published with the fiscal note. "No fiscal impact" means no additional cost or revenue loss to the Commonwealth or its local political subdivision is intended. See 4 Pa. Code Chapter 7, Subchapter R (relating to fiscal notes).

#### PHILADELPHIA COUNTY

#### Adoption of Philadelphia Court of Common Pleas Civil Rules \*4002.1 and \*4003.8; President Judge General Court Regulation; No. 4 of 2024

#### Order

And Now, this 23rd day of February, 2024, the Board of Judges of Philadelphia County having voted at the Board of Judges' meeting held on February 15, 2024, to adopt Philadelphia Court of Common Pleas Civil Rules \*4002.1, and \*4003.8 as follows to this Order, and, as required by Pa.R.J.A. 103, the Supreme Court Civil Procedural Rules Committee has reviewed the following local rules, has determined that Rules \*4002.1, and \*4003.8 are not inconsistent with applicable statewide rules, and has authorized their promulgation.

*Now*, therefore, it is hereby *Ordered* and *Decreed* that Philadelphia Court of Common Pleas Civil Rules \*4002.1, and \*4003.8 are adopted, as follows, effective thirty days after publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

As required by Pa.R.J.A. 103(d), the local rule which follows this Order was submitted to the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania Civil Procedural Rules Committee for review, and written notification has been received from the Rules Committee certifying that the local rule is not inconsistent with any general rule of the Supreme Court. This Order and the following local rule shall be filed with the Office of Judicial Records (formerly the Prothonotary, Clerk of Courts and Clerk of Quarter Sessions) in a docket maintained for Administrative Orders issued by the First Judicial District of Pennsylvania. As required by Pa.R.J.A. 103(d)(5)(ii), two certified copies of this Administrative Order and the following local rule, as well as one copy of the Administrative Order and local rule shall be distributed to the Legislative Reference Bureau on a computer diskette for publication in the Pennsylvania Bulletin. As required by Pa.R.J.A. 103(d)(6) one certified copy of this Administrative Order and local rule shall be filed with the Administrative Office of Pennsylvania Courts, shall be published on the website of the First Judicial District at http://www.courts.phila.gov, and shall be incorporated in the compiled set of local rules no later than 30 days following publication in the Pennsylvania Bulletin. Copies of the Administrative Order and local rules shall also be published in The Legal Intelligencer and will be submitted to American Lawyer Media, Jenkins Memorial Law Library, and the Law Library for the First Judicial District.

# Rule \*4002.1. Deposition Procedure in Mass Tort Cases.

All plaintiffs in cases assigned to the Mass Tort Program shall be made available for deposition in Philadelphia unless otherwise agreed by all parties or upon motion and for good cause shown.

#### PROPOSED PHILADELPHIA CIVIL RULE \*4003.8. PRE-COMPLAINT DISCOVERY.

#### Rule \*4003.8. Pre-Complaint Discovery.

As authorized by Pa.R.C.P. Nos. 4003.8, a request for pre-complaint discovery, or an objection thereto, whether in the nature of discovery for preparation of pleadings (see Pa.R.C.P. No. 4001(c)), or in the nature of written interrogatories and depositions for the purpose of preparing a complaint (see Pa.R.C.P. Nos. 4005(a) and 4007.1(c)) must comply with all requirements of Discovery Motions as set forth in Phila.Civ.R. \*208.3(a)(4).

*Explanatory Note*: Pa.R.C.P. No. 4003.8 authorizes precomplaint discovery. In order to create a full record, requests for pre-complaint discovery as well as objections to pre-complaint discovery commenced without court approval shall be drafted and assigned for disposition pursuant Phila.Civ.R. \*208.3(a)(4), the local rule which governs discovery motions. This ensures uniformity in that requests for pre-complaint discovery, motions for protective orders and other pre-judgment discovery motions are assigned to discovery court.

#### Allegheny County Rules of Judicial Administration. Civil Division: Custody of Exhibits in Court Proceedings.

# Rule 5101.1. Civil Division Custody of Exhibits. Definitions.

(a) The following words and phrases when used in these rules shall have the following meanings, unless the context clearly indicates otherwise, or the particular word or phrase is expressly defined in the chapter in which the particular rule is included:

1. "Court proceeding." Any trial, hearing, argument or similar event before a judge, panel, or hearing officer where evidence, if entered, is on the record. It does not include a proceeding before a Magisterial District Court, a non-record proceeding before a judicial arbitration matter pursuant to Pa.R.Civ.P. 1301 et sec., or any other proceeding excluded by Local Rule of Judicial Administration 5103.1(e);

2. "Custodian." The person or persons designated by local rule of judicial administration to safeguard and maintain exhibits offered into evidence in a court proceeding. The custodian shall be the proponent of the exhibit. Custodian shall also include the custodian's designee. However, where circumstances occur that that the proponent is unable to serve as custodian, a member of court staff, court reporter, clerk of court, and/or hearing officer may serve as custodian;

3. "*Exhibit.*" A document, record, object, photograph, model, or similar item offered into evidence whether or not admitted, in a court proceeding;

4. "*Proponent.*" A party seeking the admission of an exhibit into the record in a court proceeding; and

5. "Records office." the Allegheny County, Department of Court Records, Civil/Family Division ("Department of Court Records") will serve as the records office for the Allegheny County Court of Common Pleas Civil Division.

(b) For any words and phrases not defined by these rules, meaning may be discerned through examination of its dictionary definition and its legal meaning may be gleaned from its use in an application body of law.

#### Rule 5102.1. Civil Division Custody of Exhibits. General Provisions.

(a) In all Civil Division court proceedings, as defined by Local Rule 5101.1, all parties must designate an individual who shall serve as that party's custodian of exhibits throughout the court proceedings and until which time as the court proceedings concludes.

1. The custodian of exhibits shall be identified at the outset of the court proceedings, and all parties' custodian's names shall be placed on the record.

2. The Court shall identify a court custodian whose role during the court proceedings shall be limited to locking the Courtroom at the conclusion of each day of the court proceedings and opening the Courtroom at the beginning of each day of the court proceedings.

3. If the Court determines that a pro se party is unable to perform the duties of a custodian, the court custodian shall assume the duties of the custodian during and after the trial, including all duties identified in this local rule.

(b) During and throughout the court proceedings, the custodian(s) shall secure and maintain all exhibits, including breaks and recesses, unless otherwise provided in Pa.R.J.A. 5103(c)-(d).

(c) After court proceedings the custodian(s) shall:

1. Retain or take custody of all documentary exhibits, photographs, and photographs of non-documentary exhibits accepted or rejected during the court proceedings;

2. File all documentary exhibits, photographs, and photographs of non-documentary exhibits with the Department of Court Records office within five (5) business days of the conclusion of the court proceedings unless otherwise directed by the court.

a. The custodians filing exhibits shall include an index of exhibits.

b. The index shall identify the exhibit using the number or letter used by the proponent during the court proceedings to refer to that exhibit, whether the exhibit was admitted or rejected from evidence, and a description or identification of the exhibit.

3. Secure and maintain all other non-documentary exhibits as directed by the Court, or as agreed by the parties.

4. After the court proceedings the court custodian shall confirm that the proponent-custodian(s) filed all exhibits with the Department of Court Records.

a. If a proponent-custodian determines that another party's proponent-custodian has not filed the exhibits pursuant to this rule within five (5) business days, the complying party or parties may seek appropriate relief with the court regarding the non-compliant proponentcustodian's failure to file their exhibits.

*Note*: The Parties may benefit from working collaboratively to stipulate to those unobjectionable trial exhibits, prior to trial, and file said stipulation(s) with accompanying index of exhibits, and exhibits, with the Department of Court Records.

#### Rule 5103.1. Civil Division Custody of Exhibits. Special Provisions.

(a) Oversized exhibits and large photographs exceeding 8  $1/2 \times 11$  inches shall be reduced in size and/or photographed so that the copy or photograph of the physical exhibit can be photocopied/scanned on to 8  $1/2'' \times 11''$  inch paper for filing.

1. In addition to photocopying the oversized physical exhibit (e.g. medical device, tire, axel, blueprint, map, large photograph etc.), the party seeking to admit said physical exhibit shall be responsible for maintaining said physical exhibit until the conclusion/completion of the trial, all post-trial events, appeals and appellate procedures.

2. A proponent who provides a reduced copy of an oversized exhibit shall ensure that the reproduced document is clear and capable of further reproduction to transfer to digital media.

(b) *Use of Digital Media*. A proponent shall ensure that an exhibit in digital format entered into the record is in a format acceptable to the court.

(c) *Duplicates*. The court may direct that the original item, and not a duplicate, be entered into the record.

(d) *Exhibits Under Seal.* If an exhibit offered into evidence contains confidential information or confidential documents as defined by the Case Records Public Access Policy of the Unified Judicial System of Pennsylvania ("Policy"), the proponent shall file a copy of the exhibit and a certification prepared in compliance with the Policy,

and the Department of Court Records requirement, with the Department of Court Records.

1. Any exhibit sealed by the court during the court proceedings shall not be accessible to the public.

(e) *Exclusion*. This rule does not apply to record hearings that may be appealed de novo to the court of common pleas or upon which exceptions or objections can be filed to a court of common pleas, such as hearings before the Board of Viewers and/or arbitration hearings where a party elects to have the arbitration hearing recorded.

(f) Parties shall provide copies of exhibits to the trial Judge, at the time of the trial;

(g) The Court of Common Pleas, Civil Division will not store or maintain exhibits following the conclusion of the trial or court proceedings for which the exhibits were used.

#### Allegheny County Rules of Judicial Administration. Orphans' Court Division: Custody of Exhibits in Court Proceedings.

# Rule 5101.2. Orphans' Court Division Custody of Exhibits. Definitions.

(a) The following words and phrases when used in these rules shall have the following meanings, unless the context clearly indicates otherwise, or the particular word or phrase is expressly defined in the chapter in which the particular rule is included:

1. "Court proceeding." Any trial, hearing, argument or similar event before a Judge or Master where evidence, if entered, is on the record;

2. "Custodian." The person or persons designated by local rule of judicial administration to safeguard and maintain exhibits offered into evidence in a court proceeding. The custodian shall be the proponent of the exhibit. Custodian shall also include the custodian's designee. However, in circumstances where the proponent is unable to serve as custodian, a member of the court staff may serve as custodian;

3. "*Exhibit.*" A document, record, object, photograph, model, or similar item offered into evidence whether or not admitted, in a court proceeding;

4. "*Proponent*." A party seeking the admission of an exhibit into the record in a court proceeding; and

5. "Records office." The Allegheny County, Department of Court Records, Wills/Orphans' Court Division ("Department of Court Records") shall serve as the Records Office for the Allegheny County Court of Common Pleas Orphans' Court Division.

(b) For any words and phrases not defined by these rules, meaning may be discerned through examination of its dictionary definition and its legal meaning may be gleaned from its use in an applicable body of law.

# Rule 5102.2. Orphans' Court Division Custody of Exhibits. General Provisions.

(a) In all Orphans' Court Division proceedings, all parties must designate an individual who shall serve as that party's custodian of exhibits throughout the court proceedings and until such time as the court proceedings concludes.

1. The custodian of exhibits shall be identified at the outset of the court proceedings, and all parties' custodian's names shall be placed on the record.

2. The Court shall identify a Court custodian, whose role during the court proceedings shall be limited as set forth in (3) below.

3. If the Court determines that a pro se party is unable to perform the duties of a custodian, the Court custodian shall assume the duties of that party only during and after the trial, including all duties identified in this local rule.

(b) During and throughout the court proceedings, the custodian(s) shall be responsible for securing and maintaining all documentary exhibits, photographs, and photographs of non-documentary exhibits, including breaks and recesses, unless otherwise provided in Pa.R.J.A. 5103(c)-(d).

(c) After court proceedings the custodian(s) shall:

1. Take custody of and retain all documentary exhibits, photographs, and photographs of non-documentary exhibits offered into evidence, whether admitted or not admitted, during the court proceedings;

2. File all documentary exhibits, photographs, and photographs of non-documentary exhibits with the Department of Court Records within five (5) business days of the conclusion of the court proceedings, unless otherwise directed by the court, including an index of exhibits stating the following:

a. The exhibit number or letter used by the proponent to refer to the exhibit;

b. A description of the exhibit; and

c. Whether the exhibit was admitted into evidence.

3. Secure and maintain all non-documentary exhibits as directed by the Court, or as agreed by the parties.

4. After the court proceedings, the Court custodian shall confirm that the custodian designated by each party has complied with subsections (c)(1), (2), (3). If the custodian designated by each party has failed to comply, the Court custodian shall promptly notify the Court, who may impose sanctions.

*Comment*: The Parties may benefit from working collaboratively to stipulate to those unobjectionable trial exhibits prior to trial, and file said stipulation(s) with accompanying index of exhibits and exhibits, with the Department of Court Records.

#### Rule 5103.2. Orphans' Court Custody of Exhibits. Special Provisions.

(a) Oversized exhibits and large photographs exceeding 8  $1/2 \times 11$  inches shall be reduced in size and/or photographed so that the copy or photograph of the physical exhibit can be photocopied/scanned on to 8  $1/2'' \times 11''$  inch paper for filing.

1. The actual oversized exhibit or large photograph shall be maintained by the party seeking to admit it until the conclusion/completion of the trial, all post-trial events, appeals and appellate procedures.

2. A proponent who provides a reduced copy of an oversized exhibit shall ensure that the reproduced document is clear and capable of further reproduction to transfer to digital media.

(b) *Use of Digital Media*. A proponent shall ensure that an exhibit in digital format entered into the record is in a format acceptable to the court.

(c) *Duplicates*. The court may direct that the original item, and not a duplicate/photocopy, be entered into the record.

(d) *Exhibits Under Seal.* If an exhibit offered into evidence contains confidential information or confidential documents as defined by the Case Records Public Access Policy of the Unified Judicial System of Pennsylvania ("Policy"), the custodian shall file the exhibit and a certification prepared in compliance with the Policy, and the Department of Court Records requirement, with the Department of Court Records. Any exhibit sealed by the court during the court proceedings shall not be accessible to the public.

(e) Parties shall provide copies of exhibits to the Court at the time of the proceeding; however, the Court shall not be responsible for filing the exhibits, except if the Court custodian is acting on behalf of a pro se party.

(f) The Court of Common Pleas, Orphans' Court Division will not store or maintain exhibits following the conclusion of the proceeding for which the exhibits were used.

#### Allegheny County Rules of Judicial Administration. Criminal Division: Custody of Exhibits in Court Proceedings.

# Rule 5101.3. Criminal Division Custody of Exhibits. Definitions.

(a) The following words and phrases when used in these rules shall have the following meanings, unless the context clearly indicates otherwise, or the particular word or phrase is expressly defined in the chapter in which the particular rule is included:

1. "Court proceeding." Any trial, hearing, argument or similar event before a judge, panel, or hearing officer where evidence, if entered, is on the record. It does not include a proceeding before a Magisterial District Court.

2. "Custodian." The custodian shall be the proponent of the exhibit. Custodian shall also include the custodian's designee. However, where circumstances occur that the proponent is unable to serve as custodian, either a member of court staff, court reporter, clerk of court, and/or hearing officer may serve as custodian, as designated by the presiding judge, consistent with Rule of Judicial Administration 5103(d).

3. "*Exhibit.*" A document, record, object, photograph, model or similar item offered into evidence whether or not admitted, in a court proceeding.

4. "*Proponent.*" A party seeking the admission of an exhibit into the record in a court proceeding.

5. "Records office." The Allegheny County Department of Court Records, Criminal Division ("Department of Court Records") will serve as the records office for the Allegheny County Court of Common Pleas Criminal Division.

(b) For any words and phrases not defined by these rules, meaning may be discerned through examination of its dictionary definition and its legal meaning may be gleaned from its use in an application body of law.

#### Rule 5102.3. Criminal Division Custody of Exhibits. General Provisions.

(a) In all Criminal Division court proceedings, the trial judge must designate an individual who shall serve as that party's custodian of exhibits throughout the court proceedings and until such time as the court proceedings conclude.

1. The custodian of exhibits shall be identified at the outset of the court proceedings, and all parties' custodian's names shall be placed on the record. The default custodian shall be the trial for each party who enters an appearance in the particular proceeding.

2. The Court shall identify a Court custodian whose role during the court proceedings shall be limited to locking the Courtroom at the conclusion of each day of the court proceedings and opening the Courtroom at the beginning of each day of the court proceedings. The default court custodian shall be the courtroom tipstaff.

3. If the Court determines that a pro se party is unable to perform the duties of a custodian, stand-by counsel will serve as the custodian. In the event that stand-by counsel has not been appointed, the Public Defender's Office will be appointed as custodian.

(b) During and throughout the court proceedings, including breaks and recesses, the custodians shall secure and maintain all exhibits, unless otherwise provided in Pa.R.J.A.~5103(c)-(d).

(c) The trial court judge shall maintain a paper record of all exhibits along with an index, using the number or letter used by the proponent, noting whether the exhibit was admitted or rejected.

 $(d) \ After \ court \ proceedings \ the \ exhibit \ custodian(s) \ shall:$ 

1. Retain or take custody of all documentary exhibits, photographs, and photographs of non-documentary exhibits accepted or rejected during the court proceedings. All other physical evidence, including but not limited to weapons, drugs and biological material will remain in the custody of the affiant.

2. File all documentary exhibits, photographs, and photographs of non-documentary exhibits with the Department of Court Records office within five (5) business days of the conclusion of the court proceedings unless otherwise directed by the Court;

a. Prior to the filing, the exhibit custodians shall reconcile the exhibit index with the Court.

b. The custodians filing exhibits shall include an index of exhibits.

c. The index shall identify the exhibit using the number or letter used by the proponent during the court proceedings, whether the exhibit was admitted or rejected from evidence, and provide a description of the exhibit.

d. A stamped copy of the filed index of exhibits shall also be provided to the court custodian after filing with the Department of Court Records.

3. Secure and maintain all other non-documentary exhibits as directed by the Court, or as agreed to by the parties.

4. If one or both parties fails to file the exhibit index, the Court, sua sponte or at the behest of either party, may issue an order granting appropriate relief and/or schedule a hearing.

a. If a custodian determines that another party's custodian has not filed the exhibits pursuant to this rule within five (5) business days, the complying party or parties may seek appropriate relief with the Court regarding the non-compliant custodian's failure to file their exhibits.

*Comment*: The Parties may benefit from working collaboratively to stipulate to those unobjectionable trial exhibits, prior to trial, and file said stipulation(s) with accompanying index of exhibits, and exhibits, with the Department of Court Records.

#### Rule 5103.3. Criminal Division Custody of Exhibits. Special Provisions.

# (a) Oversized exhibits and large photographs exceeding 8 $1/2 \times 11$ inches shall be reduced in size and/or photographed so that the copy or photograph of the physical exhibit can be photocopied/scanned on to 8 $1/2" \times 11"$ inch paper for filing. This shall be done by the custodian of such exhibits.

1. In addition to photocopying the oversized physical exhibit the party seeking to admit said physical exhibit shall be responsible for maintaining said physical exhibit until the conclusion/completion of the trial, all post-trial events, appeals and appellate procedures.

2. A proponent who provides a reduced copy of an oversized exhibit shall ensure that the reproduced document is clear and capable of further reproduction or transfer to digital media.

(b) *Use of Digital Media*. A proponent shall ensure that an exhibit in digital format entered into the record is in a format compatible with court equipment.

(c) *Duplicates*. The Court may direct that the original item and not a duplicate, be entered into the record.

(d) *Exhibits Under Seal.* If an exhibit offered into evidence contains confidential information or confidential documents as defined by the Case Records Public Access Policy of the Unified Judicial System of Pennsylvania ("Policy"), the proponent shall file a copy of the exhibit and a certification prepared in compliance with the Policy, and Department of Court Records requirements, with the Department of Court Records.

1. Any exhibit sealed by the Court during the court proceedings shall not be accessible to the public.

(e) *Exclusion*. This Rule does not apply to record hearings that may be appealed de novo to the Court of Common Pleas, Criminal Division.

(f) Parties shall provide copies of exhibits to the trial judge, at the time of the trial, however, neither the Court custodian of the exhibits, nor the trial judge shall be responsible to file exhibits.

(g) The Court of Common Pleas, Criminal Division will not store or maintain exhibits following the conclusion of the trial or court proceedings for which the exhibits were used.

#### Rule 5102. Custody of Exhibits. General Provisions.

(a) During Court Proceedings Before Judge.

(1) The Court Reporter/Court Monitor shall be designated as the custodian of all documentary exhibits and photographs of non-documentary exhibits accepted or rejected during the court proceedings.

(b) After Court Proceedings Before Judge. The Court Reporter/Monitor shall be designated as the custodian of all documentary exhibits and photographs of non-documentary exhibits after court proceedings have concluded.

(1) The Court Reporter/Monitor shall:

(ii) file all documentary exhibits, photographs, photographs of non-documentary exhibits, and corresponding Index of Exhibits with the Clerk of Judicial Records within five (5) business days of the conclusion of the court proceeding unless otherwise directed by the court. In accordance with Lehigh County Rules of Civil Procedure 205.4, the Court Reporter/Court Monitor may also electronically file all exhibits, if practical to do so, via File and Serve. Electronic filing of the exhibits is at the discretion of the Court Reporter/Court Monitor.

(2) The Index of Exhibits shall be prepared and maintained by the Court Reporter/Court Monitor and shall include all of the following information in conformity with the form attached as Appendix I:

(i) the case number;

(ii) the title of the court proceeding;

(iii) initial start date of the court proceeding and of each successive session;

(iv) the name of the presiding judge;

(v) the exhibit number;

(vi) a written description of each exhibit;

(vii) the proponent of each exhibit;

(viii) the date on which the exhibit was offered, admitted, or not admitted into evidence; and

(ix) the name of the Court Reporter/Court Monitor.

#### Rule 5103. Custody of Exhibits. Special Provisions.

(a) Documentary Exhibits.

(1) If a proponent offers into evidence an exhibit that is larger than  $8-1/2 \times 11$  inches or a photograph, the proponent shall ensure that a copy of the document reduced to  $8-1/2 \times 11$  inches is entered into the record. Items larger than  $8-1/2 \times 11$  inches may be used for illustration during the court proceedings.

(2) A proponent who provides a reduced copy of an oversized exhibit or a copy of a photograph shall ensure that the reproduced exhibit or photograph is clear and capable of further reproduction or transfer to digital media.

(3) If a proponent offers into evidence a deposition of a witness via digital media, the digital media shall be marked as an exhibit. The submission of same must be accompanied by a transcript of the deposition, which shall also be marked as an exhibit and retained in the record of the proceedings.

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(i) It shall not be necessary for the Court Reporter/ Court Monitor to also transcribe the audio portion of the deposition, so long as the record clearly reflects which part of the audio portion of the deposition was offered into evidence and admitted.

#### (c) Non-documentary Exhibits: Generally.

(3) The proponent shall retain custody of physical evidence (including, but not limited to weapons, cash, other items of value, drugs, or other dangerous materials) and bulky, oversized, or otherwise physically impractical exhibits at all times during and after a court proceeding.

(e) Use of Digital Media. Any digital exhibit that is not also presented via photograph, and any documentary exhibits of extraordinary size or bulk, defined as documents in excess of 100 pages, shall be entered into the record on a Universal Serial Bus (USB) flash drive. Multiple digital exhibits may be submitted by a party on one USB flash drive.

#### (g) Disposition of Exhibits After Trial.

(1) Documentary exhibits, photographs, and photographs of non-documentary exhibits filed with the Clerk of Judicial Records are subject to existing record retention schedules.

#### Rule 5104. Exemption.

(b) *Proceedings Before Hearing Officers*. Record hearings before hearing officers in divorce, custody, support, delinquency, and dependency matters are excluded from Lehigh County Local Rules 5102 and 5103.

#### CHAPTER II. CUSTODY OF EXHIBITS.

#### Rule 5102. General Provisions.

Local Rules 5102 and 5103 are issued to align McKean County Court of Common Pleas practice and procedure with Pa.R.J.A. 5101—5105. Reference to Pa.R.J.A. 5102— 5105 shall be made when interpreting McKean County Local Rules 5102 and 5103 and when determining the procedure and practice for Exhibit Retention in McKean County.

The court recorder/monitor or court reporter for all, or a portion, of a court proceeding shall be designated as the "Custodian," as defined by Pa.R.J.A. 5101(a)(2), for all

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documentary exhibits, photographs, and photographs of non-documentary exhibits accepted during the court proceeding.

(a) If only one custodian is involved with a proceeding, they shall file with the appropriate records office (Prothonotary/Clerk of Courts or Orphan's Court) all submitted exhibits, with the exception of non-documentary exhibits, and index of exhibits within 5 business days of the conclusion of the proceeding.

(b) The proponent shall assure that document evidence is in a formant, including size and material, that is compatible with being filed and easily stored by the records office. If, due to the nature of the proceeding and the requirement that an oversized or undersized document exhibit be entered into evidence that is not easily capable of storage by the records office, then the records office may request that alternate measures be undertaken for storage of this document evidence, including that the proponent retain custody in conformance with Rule 5103 for physical evidence.

(c) If multiple custodians are involved with a proceeding, the first custodian shall provide the subsequent custodian (and so on, if more than two custodians) with the submitted exhibits and index of exhibits. The custodian at the conclusion of the proceeding shall file with the appropriate records office all submitted exhibits and index of exhibits within 5 business days of the conclusion of the proceeding.

#### Rule 5103. Custody of Exhibits. Special Provisions.

(a) The proponent (party that moved Exhibit into evidence) shall retain custody of physical evidence (including, but not limited to weapons, cash, other items of value, drugs, or other dangerous materials) and bulky, oversized, or otherwise physically impractical exhibits at all times during and after a court proceeding. The court may issue an order in exceptional circumstances for the court to retain said exhibits.

(1) These non-documentary exhibits must be photographed by the proponent, converted to a letter sized document, and appropriately marked and produced during the court proceeding for inclusion in the documentary record.

(2) Digital media such as CDs, thumb drives, etc. shall also be retained by the records office.

(3) Unless otherwise provided by the presiding judge, at the conclusion of the court proceeding, non-documentary evidence shall be returned to the proponent for safekeeping.

(4) Document exhibits shall be retained by the records office in accordance with existing authority for record retention.

(5) Non-documentary exhibits such as, but not limited to, knives, firearms, drugs, car parts, etc., shall be held by the proponent until an appropriate order such as: Order for Forfeiture; Order for Destruction; Order for Return, etc. is obtained. When addressing such a request the court will consider the nature of the action, the status of the proceedings including whether there is an active appeal or the potential for future litigation and the position of the opposing party.

(b) Any digital exhibit that cannot be printed (i.e., audio or video recording) shall be entered into the record

on a Universal Serial Bus (USB) flash drive (or other format if expressly approved by the court). If one party has multiple digital exhibits, they may be submitted together on one USB flash drive.

(c) Any exhibit containing confidential information or equivalent to any of the categories enumerated in Pa. Access Policy § 8.0 shall include a Confidential Document Form so that the document can be properly sealed by the record office.

#### iii. Exceptions:

Excluded from the requirements of these Exhibit Retention Local Rules are record hearings that may be appealed de novo to a court of common pleas or upon which exceptions or objections can be filed to a court of common pleas from the provisions of this chapter, such as: proceedings before hearing officers in divorce, custody, support, delinquency, and dependency matters.

# Rule R.J.A.L5102. Custody of Exhibits. General Provisions.

(a) During Court Proceedings before Judge.

(1) The Official Court Reporter shall be designated as the custodian of all documentary exhibits and photographs of non-documentary exhibits accepted or rejected during the court proceedings.

(2) The Official Court Reporter shall maintain the Index of Exhibits and shall use a form which shall be in the following format:

(3) If the Official Court Reporter is not present during court proceedings, the Court or a designated tipstaff shall secure all exhibits accepted or rejected during the court proceedings and file them with the Official Court Reporter.

(4) If the court proceedings are audio-recorded, the Court or a designated tipstaff shall secure all exhibits accepted or rejected during the court proceedings and file them with the Official Court Reporter.

(b) After Court Proceedings before Judge.

(1) The Official Court Reporter shall:

(a) Secure and maintain all documentary exhibits, photographs, and photographs of non-documentary exhibits accepted or rejected during the court proceedings, and;

(b) Secure and maintain all non-documentary exhibits as directed by the Court or agreed to by the parties.

(2) The Official Court Reporter shall file a copy of the Index of Exhibits with copies of the exhibits in the Prothonotary's Office

(c) Proceedings before the Court Hearing Officer:

(1) In proceedings before the Court Hearing Officer, the Hearing Officer shall be the custodian of the documentary exhibits.

(2) The Court Hearing Officer shall retain all documentary exhibits, photographs, and photographs of nondocumentary exhibits accepted or rejected during the court proceedings. (3) The Court Hearing Officer shall prepare the Index of Exhibits and secure and maintain the Index of Exhibits with the exhibits.

# Rule R.J.A.L5103. Custody of Exhibits. Special Provisions.

(a) Documentary Exhibits: Generally.

(1) If a document is larger than 8  $1/2 \times 11$  inches, the Official Court Reporter shall be provided with a copy of the same sized 8  $1/2 \times 11$  inches. Items larger than 8  $1/2 \times 11$  inches may be used for illustration during the court proceedings.

(2) Original depositions presented at trial shall remain in the proponent's possession. The proponent shall simultaneously submit copies of depositions as an exhibit.

(b) Non-documentary Exhibits: Generally.

(1) If the exhibit is oversized or bulky, the proponent shall maintain custody of the exhibit. A photograph shall be taken by the proponent of the oversized or bulky exhibit and submitted to the Official Court Reporter either before or during the court proceedings.

(2) Copies of audio and/or video recordings presented during the court proceedings shall be submitted to the Official Court Reporter either before or during the court proceedings.

### MINING ACTIVITY NPDES DRAFT PERMITS

This notice provides information about applications for a new, amended or renewed National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permits associated with mining activity (coal or noncoal) permits. The applications concern industrial waste (mining) discharges to surface water and discharges of stormwater associated with mining activities. This notice is provided in accordance with 25 Pa. Code Chapters 91 and 92a and 40 CFR Part 122, implementing provisions of The Clean Streams Law (35 P.S. §§ 691.1—691.1001) and the Federal Clean Water Act (33 U.S.C.A. §§ 1251—1376).

The Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) has prepared a draft NPDES permit and made a tentative determination to issue the NPDES permit in conjunction with the associated mining activity permit.

#### Effluent Limits for Coal Mining Activities

For coal mining activities, NPDES permits, when issued, will contain effluent limits that are the more stringent of technology-based (BAT) effluent limitations or Water Quality Based Effluent Limits (WQBEL).

The BAT limits for coal mining activities, as provided in 40 CFR Part 434 and 25 Pa. Code Chapters 87—90 are as follows:

A settleable solids instantaneous maximum limit of 0.5 ml/l applies to: surface runoff (resulting from a precipitation event of less than or equal to a 10-year 24-hour event) from active mining areas; active areas disturbed by coal refuse disposal activities; mined areas backfilled and revegetated; and all other discharges and drainage (resulting from a precipitation event of greater than 1-year 24-hour to less than or equal to a 10-year 24-hour event) from coal refuse disposal piles. Similarly, modified BAT limits apply to iron, manganese and suspended solids in surface runoff, discharges and drainage resulting from these precipitation events and those of greater magnitude in accordance with 25 Pa. Code §§ 87.102, 88.92, 88.187, 88.292, 89.52 and 90.102.

Exceptions to BAT effluent limits may be applicable in accordance with 25 Pa. Code §§ 87.102, 88.92, 88.187, 88.292, 89.52 and 90.102.

#### Effluent Limits for Noncoal Mining Activities

The limits for noncoal mining activities as provided in 25 Pa. Code § 77.522 are pH 6 to 9 and other parameters DEP may require.

Discharges from noncoal mines located in some geologic settings (for example, in the coal fields) may require additional water quality based effluent limits. If additional effluent limits are needed for an NPDES permit associated with a noncoal mining permit, then the permit description specifies the parameters.

If required, a risk assessment report describes potential adverse effects caused by the presence of regulated substances. If required, a cleanup plan evaluates the abilities of potential remedies to achieve remedy requirements. A work plan for conducting a baseline remedial investigation is required by the act for compliance with selection of a special industrial area remediation. The baseline remedial investigation, based on the work plan, is compiled into the baseline environmental report to establish a reference point to show existing contamination, describe proposed remediation to be done and include a description of existing or potential public benefits of the use or reuse of the property. The DEP may approve or disapprove plans and reports submitted. This notice provides DEP's decision and, if relevant, the basis for disapproval.

On November 9, 2023, the Department of Environmental Protection (Department), under the authority of the Solid Waste Management Act of July 7, 1980, P.L. 380, as amended, 35 P.S. §§ 6018.101—6018.1003; and the Clean Streams Law, Act of June 22, 1937, P.L. 1987, as amended, 35 P.S. §§ 691.1—691.1001, entered into a Consent Order and Agreement (COA) with Scrubgrass Reclamation Company, LP (Scrubgrass) for the removal of waste coal ash that has accumulated at the Scrubgrass Power Plant in Scrubgrass Township, Venango County, PA.

Since 2007, Scrubgrass has been utilizing their conditioning area, constructed from coal ash, to allow new coal ash to go through an exothermic reaction prior to being loaded onto a truck to be transported offsite. The COA identifies and addresses coal ash that has accumulated for more than one year and exceeded the limits of that pad and requires removal of coal ash in accordance with an approved schedule. It also addresses approximately 3.52 acres of earth disturbance activities associated with constructing a small scale solar power facility that Scrubgrass conducted prior to obtaining all of the necessary permit from the Department. Specifically, the COA requires Scrubgrass to, among other things: (1) remove all of the coal ash under a schedule that provides for complete removal by January 1, 2026; (2) submit an administratively complete NPDES permit application for the solar project within 60 days of the COA; and (3) pay a civil penalty in the amount of \$28,800.

#### Draft National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System General Permit for Discharges of Stormwater Associated with Construction Activities (PAG-02)

The Department of Environmental Protection (Department) is announcing the availability of a draft National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) General Permit for Discharges of Stormwater Associated with Construction Activities (PAG-02). The draft General Permit and related documents are available on the Department's eLibrary at www.depgreenport.state.pa.us/elibrary/ (select "Permit and Authorization Packages," then "Clean Water," and then "PAG-02 NPDES General Permit for Discharges of Stormwater Associated with Construction Activities 3800-PM-BCW0405").

The PAG-02 General Permit is intended to provide NPDES permit coverage to persons discharging stormwater associated with construction activities to surface waters of this Commonwealth in satisfaction of State (25 Pa. Code §§ 102.5(a) and 92a.1(b) (relating to permit requirements; and purpose and scope)) and Federal (40 CFR 122.26(b)(14)(x) and (b)(15) (relating to storm water discharges (applicable to State NPDES programs, see § 123.25))) NPDES permit requirements. The PAG-02 General Permit applies to eligible projects proposing an earth disturbance activity that involves 1 or more acres of earth disturbance, or an earth disturbance on any portion, part or during any stage of, a larger common plan of development or sale that involves 1 or more acres of earth disturbance. If a project is ineligible for PAG-02 and requires NPDES permit coverage, an applicant may submit an application for an individual NPDES permit.

Notices of Intent (NOI) to use the PAG-02 General Permit for NPDES permit coverage must be submitted to county conservation districts (CCD) that are delegated by the Department to complete reviews of NPDES permit applications under 25 Pa. Code Chapter 102 (relating to erosion and sediment control), or in the absence of a delegated CCD, a regional office of the Department.

The Department is proposing the following significant changes in the draft PAG-02 General Permit (2024 General Permit) in comparison to the PAG-02 General Permit that became effective on December 8, 2019, and will expire on December 7, 2024 (2019 General Permit):

• Impairment Causes—The 2019 General Permit requires the use of nondischarge alternatives or antidegradation best available combination of technologies best management practices (BMP) when stormwater discharges are proposed to surface waters (including tributaries to the Chesapeake Bay) that are impaired for causes of siltation, turbidity, suspended solids, water/flow variability, flow modifications/alterations or nutrients. Since 2019, the Department has renamed several of these causes through the Department's Integrated Water Quality Report. The Department is proposing to revise the list of causes as siltation, turbidity, Total Suspended Solids, algae, eutrophication, nutrients, flow regime modifications and habitat alterations to be consistent with the latest Integrated Water Quality Report.

• Authorized Non-Stormwater Discharges—The Department is proposing to identify specific types of non-stormwater discharges that are authorized during earth disturbance activities to be consistent with other Department general permits for stormwater discharges.

• *EPA Technology-Based Standards*—The Department is proposing to incorporate the United States Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) technology-based standards at 40 CFR Part 450 (relating to construction and development point source category) into the effluent limitation requirements, along with two new requirements for construction dewatering water. Discharges would need to be treated by an approved series of at least two BMPs.

• Site Inspections—The Department is proposing to require that site inspections be conducted only by qualified personnel. Three options would be available to demonstrate that a person is qualified. Existing permittees would be provided 1 year from the effective date of the 2024 General Permit to implement this provision.

• *Definitions*—The Department is proposing to add or revise definitions to clarify certain conditions of the General Permit. For example, the Department is proposing a definition for the term "operator co-permittee" to distinguish between an operator, as defined at 25 Pa. Code § 102.1 (relating to definitions), who is a co-permittee, and co-applicants that become co-permittees upon approval of coverage.

• Instrument Recording—The 2019 General Permit requires that proof of the recording of an instrument for post-construction stormwater management (PCSM) stormwater BMPs, which are now referred to as stormwater control measures (SCM), be submitted to the Department or CCD with the Notice of Termination (NOT) or a Transfer Application. The Department is proposing that the full recording and proof of the recording be submitted before the pre-construction meeting is scheduled and then again upon submission of the NOT to ensure compliance with 25 Pa. Code § 102.8(m) (relating to PCSM requirements).

• *Co-Permittees*—The Department is proposing to eliminate the requirement to submit the Co-Permittee Acknowledgement Form for Chapter 102 Permits (3800-FM-BCW0271a) and the Co-Permittee Liability Release Form (3800-FM-BCW0271).

• Imported Fill and Soil and Groundwater Contamination—The Department is proposing to clarify requirements concerning the importation of fill to a project site and the discovery of soil and groundwater contamination during construction.

• Erosion Potential (EP) Analysis—The Department is proposing that the 2024 PAG-02 NOI will require the completion of an EP Analysis, using Department Form No. 3800-FM-BCW0271h, for stormwater discharges during and following construction that will not directly enter a surface water to evaluate the stability of the flow path up to the 10-year/24-hour storm event.

• Annual Report—The Department is proposing to require that an annual report be submitted each year by December 7, which would be the anniversary of the General Permit's expiration date, to provide information on the status of the project.

• SCM Construction Certification Form—The Department is proposing the use of a standard form, 3800-FM-BCW0271j, to document the completion of each structural PCSM SCM. The form would need to be signed by a licensed professional and submitted to the Department or CCD within 30 days of completion of each SCM.

• Construction Confirmation Testing for Infiltration Capacity—For infiltration-based SCMs, the Department is proposing to require post-construction testing to determine whether as-built ponding time or drawdown time are within a tolerance range of the design ponding time or drawdown time. The results would be submitted to the Department or CCD with the SCM Construction Certification Form.

• New Property Owner Notification Form—The Department is proposing to require permittees that sell property within the project site that contains or will contain PCSM SCMs to provide a copy of the New Property Owner Notification Form (3800-FM-BCW0271i) to the new property owner, along with record drawings or other documentation of SCMs and the long-term Operation and Maintenance Plan. Permittees would need to submit the form to the Department or CCD within 30 days of the date of property transfer.

 Impervious Surfaces for Residential Subdivisions-The Department is proposing that the 2024 PAG-02 NOI will include questions concerning the area of postconstruction impervious surface that is planned. For residential subdivisions, the Department expects that the area of impervious surface used in the stormwater analysis will be either the maximum area of impervious surface for a lot under a municipal ordinance or the anticipated impervious area with a factor of safety of at least 10%. This approach is expected to streamline the process when impervious surfaces are added to individual lots during construction of a larger common plan of development or after the sale of a lot and in other circumstances where a change to PCSM SCMs may be needed. This approach also is expected to reduce the administrative burden on the permittee and the Department or CCD by decreasing the number of permit amendments during construction.

In addition, the Department will update the Erosion and Sediment Module 1 and PCSM Module 2 to be consistent with the revisions to the 2024 General Permit upon permit reissuance. Additional information on these proposals may be found in the draft PAG-02 General Permit Fact Sheet and other supporting documents.

Applicants must submit a \$500 administrative filing fee to the delegated CCD with the NOI package and any additional fees the CCD requires. Applicants must also submit a fee in the amount of \$100 for each disturbed acre to the Department. If a project is located in a county without a delegated CCD, the disturbed acre fee and the administrative filing fee must be submitted to the Department.

For existing permittees, the Department is proposing that a renewal NOI to remain covered under the reissued PAG-02 General Permit must be submitted by December 7, 2024, using form 3800-PM-BCW0405h. A \$500 administrative filing fee must accompany the renewal NOI.

Written Comments: Interested persons are invited to submit written comments regarding the draft PAG-02 General Permit and associated documents through Monday, April 8, 2024. Commentators are encouraged to submit comments using the Department's online eComment system at www.ahs.dep.pa.gov/eComment. Written comments can also be submitted by e-mail to ecomment@pa.gov or by mail to the Department of Environmental Protection, Policy Office, Rachel Carson State Office Building, P.O. Box 2063, Harrisburg, PA 17105-2063. Comments, including comments submitted by e-mail, must include the originator's name and address. Comments submitted by facsimile will not be accepted.

Written comments submitted during the 30-day comment period will be retained by the Department and considered in finalizing the General Permit. The Department will provide an opportunity for any interested person or group of persons, any affected State, any affected interstate agency, the EPA or any interested agency, to request or petition for a public hearing with respect to the draft General Permit. The request or petition for public hearing, which must be filed within the 30-day period allowed for filing of written comments, must indicate the interest of the party filing the request and the reasons why a hearing is warranted. A hearing will be held if there is significant public interest.

#### Federal Consistency under the Coastal Zone Management Act; United States Army Corps of Engineers Proposed Maintenance Dredging at Conneaut Harbor, Ashtabula County, Ohio

This notice is published under section 306(d)(14) of the Federal Coastal Zone Management Act of 1972 (CZMA) (16 U.S.C. § 1455(d)(14)), regarding public participation in consistency determinations. The Department of Environmental Protection (Department), Coastal Resources Management Program, has received notice that the United States Army Corps of Engineers (applicant) is proposing to conduct maintenance dredging of the Federal navigation channels at Conneaut Harbor in Ashtabula County, Ohio (Project).

The applicant anticipates the need to dredge and manage sediments excavated from the authorized Federal navigation channels of Conneaut Harbor, located on the southern shore of Lake Erie at the mouth of the Conneaut Creek, in order to maintain sufficient water depths for deep-draft commercial and recreational navigation under section 10 of the Rivers and Harbors Act of 1899 (33 U.S.C. § 403) and section 404 of the Federal Clean Water Act (CWA) (33 U.S.C. § 1344). Federal navigation channels within the harbor include the Outer Harbor Channel, Inner Harbor Channel and Municipal Access Channel. The applicant may dredge up to an additional 1 foot of sediment to ensure proper maintenance of the minimum authorized depth and to account for dredging tolerance in Conneaut Harbor. The applicant proposes to dredge an estimated total of approximately 100,000 cubic yards of sediment from the Conneaut Harbor Federal navigation channels annually over a 3-year period from 2024 to 2026. The applicant proposes that predominantly fine-grain sediment dredged from the Inner and Outer

Harbor Channels would be discharged at an existing open-lake placement area in Lake Erie, located 4 miles from the West Breakwater light, at an azimuth of 314°00'. However, if section 401 of the CWA (33 U.S.C. § 1341) regarding Water Quality Certification conditions does not allow for placement of sediment within the existing "deep water" open-lake placement area in excess of 10,000 cubic yards, the applicant may place the sediment (if sufficient Federal funding is available) at the City of Conneaut upland placement facility, located south of the Federal navigation channels and adjacent to Conneaut Creek. (Public Notice Figure 1.) In the past, sediment from the Municipal Access Channel of Conneaut Harbor has been found to be primarily coarse-grain in nature and determined to be suitable for use as littoral nourishment. This was the case in 2004, when 25,000 cubic yards were removed from the Municipal Access Channel and placed in the existing authorized nearshore placement area, located approximately 1,500 feet east of the Conneaut Harbor East Breakwater Extension. Since this time, numerous evaluations of sediment within the Municipal Access Channel have indicated that the sediment is now predominantly fine grain in nature and contains total organic carbon concentrations above the recommended threshold. However, it remains a possibility that deposited material within the Municipal Access Channel in a given year could consist of predominantly coarse-grain sediment with low total organic carbon and would therefore be suitable for placement in the authorized nearshore placement area. Placement of the coarsegrain Municipal Access Channel dredged sediment in the nearshore zone may cost significantly more when compared to "deep water" open-water placement due to shallow water depths. The applicant proposes that nearshore placement, if suitable sediments are recovered, would take place between -11 and -8 feet below Low Water Datum (LWD). The applicant proposes to place the recovered sediment at the shallowest depth possible (-8)feet LWD) if there are no increased costs when compared to the costs for placement at the -11-foot LWD depth. If placement in the nearshore zone at depths of -8 feet LWD cost significantly more than open water placement, the applicant states that a non-Federal partner will need to pay the increased cost of nearshore placement.

This Project is subject to Department review for Federal consistency because it is a Federal agency activity and will have reasonably foreseeable interstate effects on this Commonwealth's coastal resources or uses.

In accordance with section 307 of the CZMA (16 U.S.C. § 1456) and the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) regulations at 15 CFR Part 930, Subpart C (relating to consistency for Federal agency activities) and Subpart I (relating to consistency of Federal activities having interstate coastal effects), the applicant has determined that the proposed activity will be conducted in a manner consistent with the applicable enforceable policies of the Commonwealth's NOAA-approved Coastal Resources Management Program. #### Fentanyl and Xylazine Detected in a Urine Drug Screening Performed under Act 43 of 2023

The act of December 14, 2023 (P.L. 378, No. 43) (Act 43) amended 35 Pa.C.S. (relating to health and safety) to require fentanyl and xylazine testing when a urine drug screening is conducted in an emergency department within an acute care hospital to assist in diagnosing a patient's condition. Xylazine testing is only required if testing is available as part of the urine drug screening panel. If the urine drug screening performed under Act 43 detects fentanyl or xylazine, the de-identified results shall be reported to the Department of Health (Department). Under Act 43, the Department is required, in consultation with stakeholders, to set the screening threshold for the reporting of test results and the manner of submission of test results and to thereafter transmit notice of the same to the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* for publication.

#### Screening threshold

Emergency departments should use minimal threshold values as appropriately determined for tests used when reporting to the Department. After consulting with stakeholders, the Department determined that the following screening threshold shall apply. Under 42 CFR 493.1253 (relating to standard: Establishment and verification of performance specifications), laboratories are required to establish and verify test system performance specifications. Laboratories should follow manufacturer's instructions for waived tests. Laboratories should follow 42 CFR 493.1253 for nonwaived tests (Federal Drug Administration (FDA)-cleared, FDA-approved and laboratory developed tests).

#### Submission

After consulting with stakeholders, the Department has determined that, effective June 1, 2024, de-identified test results for fentanyl or xylazine shall be submitted in aggregate form to the Department monthly on the Act 43 of 2023—Urine Drug Screening Reporting—Fentanyl and Xylazine Form, which will be available on the Department's web site. The emergency department conducting the urine drug screening is permitted to identify an appropriate reporter to submit this form to the Department. Reporting of a positive test result for fentanyl is not required if a health care practitioner determines that the positive result is due to a legally prescribed course of treatment for the patient.

#### Sexual Assault Victim Emergency Services Regulation Listing of Hospitals That May Not Provide Emergency Contraception and Hospitals That May Not Provide Any Sexual Assault Emergency Services; Corrected Notice

This corrected notice replaces, in its entirety, the notice that was previously published at 54 Pa.B. 856 (February 17, 2024).

The Department of Health (Department) published final-form sexual assault victim emergency services regulations at 38 Pa.B. 573 (January 26, 2008). The sexual assault victim emergency services regulations became effective on January 26, 2008, and amended 28 Pa. Code Part IV, Subpart B (relating to general and special hospitals) to add specific requirements for hospitals relating to the provision of sexual assault emergency services. See 28 Pa. Code §§ 117.51—117.58 (relating to sexual assault victim emergency services).

Hospitals that decide they may not provide emergency contraception due to a stated religious or moral belief contrary to providing this medication are required to give notice to the Department of the decision. See 28 Pa. Code § 117.57 (relating to religious and moral exemptions). Hospitals that refer all emergency patients to other hospitals after institution of essential life-saving measures and decide not to provide any sexual assault emergency services are required to give notice to the Department of the decision. See 28 Pa. Code § 117.58 (relating to exemption for hospitals providing limited emergency services).

Sections 117.57(1)(ii) and 117.58(1)(ii) of 28 Pa. Code state that the Department will annually publish the lists of hospitals in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* that have chosen not to provide emergency contraception under 28 Pa. Code § 117.57 or any sexual assault emergency services under 28 Pa. Code § 117.58. The following lists are published in accordance with those provisions and do not create any new obligations for hospitals or relieve hospitals of any existing obligations.

### FISH AND BOAT COMMISSION

#### Mentored Youth Fishing Day Program; Trout— 2024

Acting under the authority of 58 Pa. Code § 65.20 (relating to Mentored Youth Fishing Day Program), the Executive Director has designated March 30, 2024, as Mentored Youth Fishing Day for trout, beginning at 8 a.m. and ending at 7:30 p.m., in stocked trout waters designated under 58 Pa. Code § 63.3 (relating to fishing in stocked trout waters) and the waters identified as follows that are normally closed to trout fishing on those dates. This designation under § 65.20 will be effective upon publication of this notice in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.


To participate, anglers 16 years of age or older (adult anglers) must possess a valid Pennsylvania fishing license and current trout permit and be accompanied by a youth (under 16 years of age) who has obtained a mentored youth permit or a voluntary youth license from the Fish and Boat Commission (Commission). Youth anglers must possess a 2024 mentored youth permit or voluntary youth license obtained from the Commission and be accompanied by a licensed adult angler to participate.

Although waters included in the Mentored Youth Fishing Day Program (Program) will be open to accompanying adult anglers, only youth anglers with a 2024 voluntary youth license or mentored youth permit may possess a total of two trout (combined species) with a minimum length of 7 inches. Adult anglers are prohibited from possessing trout. Other Commonwealth inland regulations will apply. It is unlawful to fish in waters designated as part of the Program except in compliance with the requirements of § 65.20 when participating in the Program.

The waters included in the Program on March 30, 2024, are the stocked trout waters Statewide. Special regulation areas are not included in the Program. A listing of stocked trout waters is published in the Commission's "Summary of Fishing Regulations and Laws" available from the Commission at P.O. Box 67000, Harrisburg, PA 17106-7000. The map of stocked trout waters can also be found at https://pfbc.maps.arcgis.com/apps/webappviewer/ index.html?id=3292981a1fcf415e9ce4a4a7a3ce98e2. #### **Tentative Order**

#### By the Commission:

The Commission's regulations at 52 Pa. Code § 54.40(a) state that an Electric Generation Supplier (EGS) license will not be issued or remain in force until the licensee furnishes a bond or other security approved by the Commission. In addition, 52 Pa. Code § 54.40(d) states that the maintenance of an EGS license is contingent on the licensee providing proof to the Commission that a

bond or other approved security in the amount directed by the Commission has been obtained.

Each EGS must file an original bond, letter of credit, continuation certificate, amendment, or other approved financial instrument with Rosemary Chiavetta, Secretary, Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission, 400 North Street, Harrisburg, PA, 17120, prior to the EGS's current security expiration date. Each financial instrument must be an original document that displays a "wet" signature or digital signature, preferably in blue ink, and displays a "raised seal" or original notary stamp. The name of the principal on the original financial instrument must match exactly with the name that appears on the EGS's license issued by the Commission.

Failure to file before the financial security's expiration date may cause Commission staff to initiate a formal proceeding that may lead to the following: cancellation of each company's electric supplier license, removal of each company's information from the Commission's website, and notification to all electric distribution companies, in which each company is licensed to do business, of the cancellation of the license.

As of February 13, 2024, each EGS listed in the Supplier Table below has not provided proof to the Commission that it has a bond or other approved security in the amount or language directed by the Commission, to replace a bond which is expired, or which is non-compliant with Commission regulations.

As part of its EGS license validation procedures, the Commission's Bureau of Technical Utility Services sent a 90-day Security Renewal Notice email to each entity in the Supplier Table above stating that original documentation of a bond, or other approved security in the amount or language directed by the Commission, must be filed within 30-days prior to each entity's security expiration date. None of the companies listed in the Supplier Table provided the required documentation.

Based on the above facts, we tentatively conclude that the EGSs listed in the Supplier Table are not in compliance with 52 Pa. Code § 54.40(a) and (d) and therefore it is appropriate to initiate the cancellation process for the EGS license of each company listed in the Supplier Table, without the necessity of a formal complaint, as being in the public interest;

#### Therefore,

#### It Is Ordered That:

1. Cancellation of the Electric Generation Supplier License of each company listed in the Supplier Table is hereby tentatively approved as being in the public interest.

2. The Secretary (i) serve a copy of this Tentative Order upon the Office of Consumer Advocate, the Office of Small Business Advocate, the Bureau of Investigation & Enforcement, all electric generation distribution companies, and all of the Electric Generation Suppliers listed in the Supplier Table; (ii) publish a copy of this Tentative Order in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* with a 30-day comment period; and (iii) file a copy of this Tentative Order at each Electric Generation Supplier's assigned docket number.

3. To the extent any of the Electric Generation Suppliers listed in the Supplier Table challenge the cancellation of their license, they must file comments within thirty (30) days after publication of this Tentative Order in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. Written comments referencing Docket No. M-2024-3045251 must be eFiled to the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission through the Commision's eFiling System. You may set up a free eFiling account with the Commission at https://efiling.puc.pa.gov/ filing\_resources.aspx. Comments containing confidential information should be emailed to Commission Secretary Rosemary Chiavetta at rchiavetta@pa.gov rather than eFiled.

4. Alternatively, Electric Generation Suppliers listed in the Supplier Table may provide the Commission an approved security up to and within thirty (30) days after publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. The Electric Generation Supplier must file an original bond, letter of credit, continuation certificate, amendment, or other approved financial instrument displaying a "wet" signature or digital signature, preferably in blue ink, and displaying a "raised seal" or original notary stamp with Rosemary Chiavetta, Secretary, Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission, 400 North Street, Harrisburg, PA, 17120.

5. Absent the timely (i) filing of comments challenging the cancellation of the Electric Generation Supplier's license, or (ii) the filing of an approved security within 30-days after publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, the Bureau of Technical Utility Services, shall prepare a Final Order for entry by the Secretary revoking the license of each Electric Generation Supplier that fails to respond.

6. Upon entry of the Final Order, Electric Generation Suppliers that remain listed as not in compliance with 52 Pa. Code § 54.40(a) and (d) will be stricken from all active utility lists maintained by the Commission's Bureau of Technical Utility Services and the Assessment Section of the Bureau of Administration, removed from the Commission's website, and notifications be sent to all electric distribution companies in which the Electric Generation Suppliers are licensed to do business.

7. Upon entry of the Final Order, Electric Generation Suppliers that fail to respond will be prohibited from providing electric generation supply services to retail electric customers. That upon entry of the Final Order described in Ordering Paragraph No. 5, each electric distribution company in which the Electric Generation Suppliers are licensed to do business, shall return the customers of the Electric Generation Suppliers to default service.

Revocation of Natural Gas Supplier Licenses of Companies that did not File a Natural Gas Supplier Annual Report or Pay Past Due Annual or Supplemental Fees; M-2024-3045253

#### **Tentative Order**

#### By the Commission:

The Public Utility Code authorizes the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (Commission) to establish, by order or rule, on a reasonable cost basis, fees to be charged for annual activities related to the oversight of natural gas suppliers (NGS). 66 Pa.C.S. § 2208(h). NGSs are required to pay these fees. In addition, NGSs are required to file annual reports with the Commission by April 30 of each year identifying their gross Pennsylvania intrastate operating revenues from the prior calendar year. 52 Pa. Code § 62.110(a)(1).

Both the Code, 66 Pa.C.S. § 2208(c)(2), and Commission regulations, 52 Pa. Code § 62.113(a)(5), state that the failure of an NGS to comply with applicable provisions of the Code or the rules, regulations, orders, or directives of the Commission shall be cause for the Commission to revoke the license of the NGS. Through this Order, the Commission tentatively finds that the NGSs identified in Table 1 (failure to pay fees) and Table 2 (failure to report revenue) are not in compliance with their obligations under the Code and Commission regulations and initiates this proceeding to revoke their NGS licenses.

#### Annual and Supplemental Fees

Act 155 of 2014 authorized the Commission to establish annual fees to fund the Commission's oversight of NGSs. 66 Pa.C.S. § 2208(h). These fees were established by order of the Commission<sup>1</sup> as (1) a flat annual fee of \$350 to be paid by all licensed suppliers and brokers regardless of reported gross intrastate operating revenues and (2) a supplemental fee—to be paid only by suppliers—based on each NGS's gross intrastate operating revenues.

NGSs are required to pay the \$350 flat annual fee to the Commission's Bureau of Administration by July 1 of each year. Suppliers with reported gross intrastate operating revenues are also required to pay the supplemental fee to the Commission within thirty days of receiving the Commission issued supplemental fee invoice.

Although an NGS is not a "public utility," see 66 Pa.C.S. §§ 102, 2202 and 52 Pa. Code § 62.141 (relating to the definitions of "public utility" and "natural gas supplier"), it is a licensed entity subject to the power and authority of the Commission, and it must comply with applicable

provisions of the Code, Commission regulations, and Commission orders. 66 Pa.C.S. §§ 501 and 2208(e). The Commission has the authority, consistent with due process, to suspend or revoke an NGS's license for the NGS's failure to comply with applicable provisions of the Code, Commission regulations, and Commission orders. 66 Pa.C.S. § 2208(c)(2) and 52 Pa. Code. § 62.113(a)(5). An NGS that fails to pay either or both of its annual or supplemental fee violates both the Code, 66 Pa.C.S. § 2208(h), and the Commission's directives contained in the Final Implementation Order. Therefore, such an NGS is subject to fines and having its license revoked by the Commission.

On May 1, 2023, the Commission sent all NGS brokers and suppliers an Annual Fee Invoice with payment due by July 1, 2023. On July 20, 2023, a past due balance letter was sent to delinquent NGS brokers and suppliers requesting that the past due annual fee be paid within 20 days of the date of the letter.

On September 6, 2023, the Commission sent NGS suppliers a Supplemental Fee invoice and an explanation of the Supplemental Fee with payment due within 30 days of receipt of the invoice. On October 24, 2023, the Commission sent past due balance letters to delinquent NGS suppliers stating that the past due supplemental fee must be paid within 20 days of the date of the letter.

As of February 13, 2024, the NGS brokers and suppliers listed in Table 1 below have not paid either or both of their annual or supplemental fees through 2023.

#### Annual Report

All NGS suppliers must also file an Annual Report with the Commission by April 30 each year. 52 Pa. Code § 62.110(a). The Annual Report must include, among other things, the NGS's total gross receipts from the sale of natural gas supply services in the preceding calendar year. 52 Pa. Code § 62.110(a)(1). This information is used by the Commission to calculate the supplemental fee in accordance with the terms of the Final Implementation Order.

As previously noted, the Commission has the authority, consistent with due process, to suspend or revoke an NGS's license for the NGS's failure to comply with applicable provisions of the Code, Commission regulations, and Commission orders. 66 Pa.C.S. § 2208(c)(2) and 52 Pa. Code. § 62.113(a)(5). An NGS that fails to file an annual report violates the Commission's regulations at 52 Pa. Code § 62.110(a). Therefore, such an NGS is subject to fines and having its license revoked by the Commission.

The Commission sent an NGS Requirements Letter to all NGS suppliers in February 2023 advising them of their annual filing requirements and the due dates. In December 2023, the Commission sent a Failure to Submit Annual Report Notice (Notice) to NGS suppliers that failed to file a 2023 Annual Report with the Commission. The Notice stated that the past due Annual Report must be filed within 30 days of the Notice.

As of February 13, 2024, the NGS suppliers listed in Table 2 below have not filed a 2023 Annual Report, reporting their 2022 gross receipts, with the Commission.

#### Disposition

Based on the above facts, we tentatively find that the NGSs listed in Table 1 are not in compliance with the Public Utility Code, 66 Pa.C.S. § 2208(c)(2), (h) and the Final Implementation Order, and the NGSs listed in Table 2 are not in compliance with the Public Utility Code, 66 Pa.C.S. § 2208(c)(2), and the Commission's regulations at 52 Pa. Code § 62.110(a). Therefore, it is appropriate to initiate the NGS license revocation process

for each company listed in Table 1 and Table 2 as being in the public interest; *Therefore*,

The Secretary (i) serve a copy of this Tentative Order upon the Office of Consumer Advocate, the Office of Small Business Advocate, the Bureau of Investigation & Enforcement, all natural gas distribution companies, and all of the Natural Gas Suppliers listed in Table 1 and Table 2; (ii) publish a copy of this Tentative Order in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* with a 30-day comment period; and (iii) file a copy of this Tentative Order at each Natural Gas Supplier's assigned docket number.

3. To the extent any of the Natural Gas Suppliers listed in Table 1 and Table 2 challenge the revocation of their license, they must file comments within thirty (30) days after publication of this Tentative Order in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. Written comments referencing Docket No. M-2024-3045253 should be eFiled to the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission through the Commission's eFiling System. You may set up a free eFiling account with the Commission at https:// efiling.puc.pa.gov/ if you do not have one. Comments containing confidential information should be sent to the Commission via overnight service rather than eFiled.

4. Alternatively, Natural Gas Suppliers listed in Table 1 may pay their outstanding fee balance up to and within thirty (30) days after publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. Payment shall be sent to the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission, Attn: Fiscal Office, Commonwealth Keystone Building, 400 North Street, 3rd Floor, Harrisburg, PA 17120. Checks shall be made payable to "Commonwealth of Pennsylvania."

5. Alternatively, Natural Gas Suppliers listed in Table 2 may file their outstanding 2023 annual revenue report within thirty (30) days after publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. Any completed 2023 annual revenue reports shall be sent to the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission, Attn: Secretary's Bureau, Commonwealth Keystone Building, 400 North Street, Harrisburg, PA 17120.

6. Absent the timely (i) filing of comments challenging the revocation of the Natural Gas Supplier's license; (ii) payment of the Natural Gas Supplier's outstanding fee balance; or (iii) filing of the Natural Gas Supplier's 2023 annual revenue report within 30-days after publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, the Bureau of Technical Utility Services, in conjunction with the Bureau of Administration, shall prepare a Final Order for entry by the Secretary revoking the license of each Natural Gas Supplier that fails to respond.

7. Upon entry of the Final Order, Natural Gas Suppliers that fail to respond will be prohibited from providing natural gas supply services to retail gas customers. Any customers served by the Natural Gas Supplier will be returned to the appropriate Natural Gas Distribution Company's provider of last resort service as set forth in the Final Order.

8. Upon entry of the Final Order, Natural Gas Suppliers that fail to respond will be stricken from all active utility lists maintained by the Commission's Bureau of Technical Utility Services and the Assessment Section of the Bureau of Administration, removed from the Commission's website, and notifications will be sent to all natural gas distribution companies in which the Natural Gas Suppliers were licensed to do business.
