READER'S GUIDE TO THE PENNSYLVANIA BULLETIN AND THE PENNSYLVANIA CODE

Pennsylvania Bulletin

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the official gazette of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. It is published weekly. A cumulative subject matter index is published quarterly.

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* serves several purposes. It is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, which is the official codification of agency rules and regulations, Statewide court rules, and other statutorily authorized documents. Changes in the codified text, whether by adoption, amendment, rescission, repeal or emergency action, must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

The following documents are published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*: Governor's Executive Orders; Summaries of Enacted Statutes; Statewide and Local Court Rules; Attorney General Opinions; Motor Carrier Applications before the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission; Applications and Actions before the Department of Environmental Protection; Orders of the Independent Regulatory Review Commission; and other documents authorized by law.

The text of certain documents published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the only valid and enforceable text. Courts are required to take judicial notice of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Adoption, Amendment or Repeal of Regulations

Generally an agency wishing to adopt, amend or rescind regulations must first publish in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* a Proposed Rulemaking. There are limited instances when the agency may omit the proposal step; it still must publish the adopted version.

The Proposed Rulemaking contains the full text of the change, the agency contact person, a fiscal note required by law and background for the action.

The agency then allows sufficient time for public comment before taking final action. A Final Rulemaking must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* before the changes can take effect. If the agency wishes to adopt changes to the Proposed Rulemaking to enlarge the scope, it must repropose.

Citation to the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*

Cite material in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* by volume number, a page number and date. Example: Volume 1, *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, page 801, January 9, 1971 (short form: 1 Pa.B. 801 (January 9, 1971)).

Pennsylvania Code

The *Pennsylvania Code* is the official codification of rules and regulations issued by Commonwealth agencies, Statewide court rules and other statutorily authorized documents. The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, printing changes when they are adopted. These changes are then permanently codified by the *Pennsylvania Code Reporter*, a monthly, loose-leaf supplement.

The *Pennsylvania Code* is cited by title number and section number. Example: Title 10 *Pennsylvania Code* § 1.1 (short form: 10 Pa. Code § 1.1).

Under the *Pennsylvania Code* codification system, each regulation is assigned a unique number by title and section. Titles roughly parallel the organization of Commonwealth government.

How to Find Rules and Regulations

Search for your area of interest in the *Pennsylvania Code*. The *Pennsylvania Code* is available at www.pacode.com.

Source Notes give the history of regulations. To see if there have been recent changes not yet codified, check the List of *Pennsylvania Code* Chapters Affected in the most recent issue of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

A chronological table of the history of *Pennsylvania Code* sections may be found at www.legis.state.pa.us/cfdocs/legis/CH/Public/pcde_index.cfm.

A quarterly List of *Pennsylvania Code* Sections Affected lists the regulations in numerical order, followed by the citation to the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* in which the change occurred.

Text proposed to be added is printed in **underscored bold face**. Text proposed to be deleted is enclosed in brackets [] and printed in **bold face**.

Proposed new chapters and sections are printed in regular type to enhance readability. Final rulemakings and statements of policy are printed in regular type.

Ellipses, a series of five asterisks, indicate text that is not amended.

In Proposed Rulemakings and proposed Statements of Policy, existing text corresponds to the official codified text in the *Pennsylvania Code*.

Court Rules in Titles 201—246 of the Pennsylvania Code

Added text in proposed and adopted court rules is printed in **underscored bold face**. Deleted text in proposed and adopted court rules is enclosed in brackets [] and printed in **bold face**.

Proposed new chapters and rules are printed in regular type to enhance readability.

Ellipses, a series of five asterisks, indicate text that is not amended.

Fiscal Notes

Section 612 of The Administrative Code of 1929 (71 P. S. § 232) requires the Governor's Budget Office to prepare a fiscal note for regulatory actions and administrative procedures of the administrative departments, boards, commissions and authorities receiving money from the State Treasury. The fiscal note states whether the action or procedure causes a loss of revenue or an increase in the cost of programs for the Commonwealth or its political subdivisions. The fiscal note is required to be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* at the same time as the change is advertised.

A fiscal note provides the following information: (1) the designation of the fund out of which the appropriation providing for expenditures under the action or procedure shall be made; (2) the probable cost for the fiscal year the program is implemented; (3) projected cost estimate of the program for each of the 5 succeeding fiscal years; (4) fiscal history of the program for which expenditures are to be made; (5) probable loss of revenue for the fiscal year of its implementation; (6) projected loss of revenue from the program for each of the 5 succeeding fiscal years; (7) line item, if any, of the General Appropriation Act or other appropriation act out of which expenditures or losses of Commonwealth funds shall occur as a result of the action or procedures; and (8) recommendation, if any, of the Secretary of the Budget and the reasons therefor.

The omission of an item indicates that the agency text of the fiscal note states that there is no information available with respect thereto. In items (3) and (6) information is set forth for the first through fifth fiscal years, following the year the program is implemented, which is stated. In item (4) information is set forth for the current and two immediately preceding years. In item (8) the recommendation, if any, made by the Secretary of the Budget is published with the fiscal note. "No fiscal impact" means no additional cost or revenue loss to the Commonwealth or its local political subdivision is intended. See 4 Pa. Code Chapter 7, Subchapter R (relating to fiscal notes).

Reproduction, Dissemination or Publication of Information

Third parties may not take information from the *Pennsylvania Code* and *Pennsylvania Bulletin* and reproduce, disseminate or publish information except as provided by 1 Pa. Code § 3.44:

§ 3.44. General permission to reproduce content of Code and Bulletin.

Information published under this part, which information includes, but is not limited to, cross references, tables of cases, notes of decisions, tables of contents, indexes, source notes, authority notes, numerical lists and codification guides, other than the actual text of rules or regulations may be reproduced only with the written consent of the [Legislative Reference] Bureau. The information which appears on the same leaf with the text of a rule or regulation, however, may be incidentally reproduced in connection with the reproduction of the rule or regulation, if the reproduction is for the private use of a subscriber and not for resale. There are no other restrictions on the reproduction of information published under this part, and the Commonwealth hereby consents to a reproduction.

[EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 2019-07]

Commonwealth Leadership in Addressing Climate Change through Electric Sector Emissions Reductions

October 3, 2019

Whereas, the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania mandate that we protect the Commonwealth's air resources for the protection of public health, safety and well-being of our citizens; prevent injury to plant and animal life and to property; protect the comfort and convenience of the public and Commonwealth recreational resources; and develop, attract and expand industry, commerce and agriculture; and,

Whereas, globally, there is a scientific consensus that climate change is occurring and there is wide agreement amongst scientific organizations that the cause is increased concentrations of greenhouse gasses (GHG) from anthropogenic activities; and

Whereas, in 2015, the Pennsylvania Climate Impacts Assessment Update found that Pennsylvania has undergone a long-term warming of more than 1.8 degrees Fahrenheit over the prior 110 years, and that current warming trends are expected to increase at an accelerated rate with average temperatures projected to increase an additional 5.4 degrees by 2050; and

Whereas, average annual precipitation has increased by approximately 10 percent over the past 100 years and, by 2050, is expected to increase by an additional 8 percent; and

Whereas, Pennsylvania is experiencing the numerous negative effects of these trends. 2018 was the wettest year on record in the Commonwealth. The increased rainfall resulted in extreme weather events and flooding throughout the state costing residents an estimated \$144 million in reported damages, and costing the Commonwealth at least \$125 million in damages to state-maintained infrastructure; and

Whereas, heat-related illness and death are significant public health problems in the Northeastern United States. Projected temperature increases are expected to increase air pollution and diminish water quality, leading to more premature deaths, hospital admissions, and emergency department visits from heat stress such as exacerbated asthma and increased water-borne illnesses; and

Whereas, Executive Order 2019-01, Commonwealth Leadership in Addressing Climate Change and Promoting Energy Conservation and Sustainable Governance, committed the Commonwealth to strive to reduce net GHG emissions by 26 percent from 2005 levels, and to further reduce net GHG emissions by 80 percent by 2050; and

Whereas, on April 29, 2019, the Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) issued a Pennsylvania Climate Action Plan that identifies GHG emission trends and baselines in the Commonwealth, recommends cost-effective strategies for reducing or offsetting GHG emissions, quantifies costs and benefits of these strategies, and recommends limiting carbon emissions through an electricity sector cap and trade program; and


Whereas, based upon data contained in Pennsylvania's GHG Inventory, 30 percent of Pennsylvania's total GHG emissions are produced by Pennsylvania's electricity generation sector; and

Whereas, cap and trade programs have an established track record as economically efficient, market-driven mechanisms for reducing pollution in a variety of contexts; and

Whereas, the Regional Greenhouse Gas Initiative (RGGI) is a cooperative effort of Nine East Coast states to reduce GHG emissions from the power sector. The RGGI participating states have collectively reduced power sector carbon dioxide pollution by over 45 percent since 2005, while experiencing per capita Gross Domestic Product growth and reducing energy costs for businesses; and

Whereas, given the urgency of the climate crisis facing Pennsylvania, the Commonwealth must take concrete, economically sound and immediate steps to reduce GHG emissions.

Now, Therefore, I, Tom Wolf, Governor of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and other laws, do order and direct the DEP as follows:

§ 7a.181. Rulemaking.

By no later than July 31, 2020, the Department of Environmental Protection shall develop and present to the Environmental Quality Board a proposed rulemaking package to abate, control or limit carbon dioxide emissions from fossil-fuel-fired electric power generators. This proposed rulemaking package will be authorized by the act of January 8, 1960 ((1959) P.L. 2119, No. 787), known as the Air Pollution Control Act (35 P.S. §§ 4001—4015). This proposed rulemaking must:

(a) Include a robust public outreach effort working with the business community, energy producers, energy suppliers, organized labor, environmental groups and others to ensure that the development and implementation of this electricity sector cap and trade program results in reduced emissions, economic gains and consumer savings;

(b) Establish a carbon dioxide budget consistent in stringency to that established in the Regional Greenhouse Gas Initiative (RGGI) participating states;

(c) Provide for the annual or more frequent auction of carbon dioxide emissions allowances through a market-based mechanism; and

(d) Be sufficiently consistent with the RGGI Model Rule so that allowances may be traded with holders of allowances from other states.

§ 7a.182. Interaction with regional transmission organization.

The Department of Environmental Protection in conjunction with the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission shall engage with PJM Interconnection to promote the integration of this electricity sector cap and trade program in a manner that preserves orderly and competitive economic dispatch within PJM Interconnection and minimizes emissions leakage.

§ 7a.183. Effective date.

This subchapter shall take effect immediately and shall remain in effect until amended or rescinded by the Governor.

TITLE 201. RULES OF JUDICIAL ADMINISTRATION

CHAPTER 19. MISCELLANEOUS ADMINISTRATIVE PROVISIONS

BROADCASTING IN THE COURTROOM

Rule 1910. Broadcasting, Recording and Photography in the Courtroom.

A. General statutory prohibition. It is unlawful and a criminal offense to use or operate a device to capture, record, transmit or broadcast a photograph, video, motion picture or audio of a proceeding or person within a judicial facility or in an area adjacent to or immediately surrounding a judicial facility without the approval of the court or presiding judicial officer or except as provided by rules of court. See 18 Pa.C.S. § 5103.1 (relating to unlawful use of an audio or video device in court).

B. General rule. Unless otherwise provided by **this rule or by** the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania, judges **[should] shall** prohibit broadcasting, televising, recording or taking photographs in the courtroom and areas immediately adjacent thereto during sessions of court or recesses between sessions, except that a judge may authorize:

[A.] (1) the use of electronic or photographic means for the presentation of evidence, for the perpetuation of a record or for other purposes of judicial administration;

[B.] (2) the broadcasting, televising, recording, or photographing of investitive, ceremonial, or naturalization proceedings;

[C.] (3) the photographic or electronic recording and reproduction of appropriate court proceedings under the following conditions:

[(1)] (a) the means of recording will not distract participants or impair the dignity of the proceedings; **[and]**

[(2)] (b) the parties have consented; and the consent to being depicted or recorded has been obtained from each witness appearing in the recording and reproductions; **[and]**

[(3)] (c) the reproduction will not be exhibited until after the proceeding has been concluded and all direct appeals have been exhausted; and

[(4)] (d) the reproduction will be exhibited only for instructional purposes in educational institutions.

[D.] (4) the use of electronic broadcasting, televising, recording and taking photographs in the courtroom and areas immediately adjacent thereto during sessions of court or recesses between sessions of any trial court nonjury civil proceeding[,]; however, for the purposes of this subsection, “civil proceedings” shall not be construed to mean a support, custody or divorce proceeding. **Paragraphs (c) and (d) of Subsection [(3) and (4)] (3)** shall not apply to nonjury civil proceedings as heretofore defined. No witness or party who expresses any prior objection to the judge shall be photographed, nor shall the testimony of such witness or party be broadcast or telecast. Permission for the broadcasting, televising, recording and photographing of any civil nonjury proceeding shall have first been expressly granted by the judge, and under such conditions as the judge may prescribe in accordance with the guidelines contained in this rule.

Note: Temperate conduct of judicial proceedings is essential to the fair administration of justice. The recording and reproduction of a proceeding should not distort or dramatize the proceeding.

* * * * *

d. *Decorum.* Broadcast representatives’ dress should not set them apart unduly from other trial spectators. Camera operators should not move tripod-mounted cameras except during court recesses. All broadcast equipment should be in place and ready to function no less than five minutes before the beginning of each session of court.

C. Law Enforcement Officers, Sheriff’s Department Officers, and Judicial Security Officers.

(1) Unless expressly prohibited by local rule or order of court as authorized by Subsection (5), and except as otherwise provided in this Subdivision C, officers of law enforcement agencies, sheriffs and deputy sheriffs, and judicial security officers (referred to collectively as “Officers”) may wear body cameras as part of their standard equipment and operate them as permitted by law or by state or local court rule, and as may be further authorized under the policies of the agency with which the Officer is associated.

(2) No body camera may be activated in a courtroom during judicial proceedings except when an Officer, in his or her professional opinion, determines that there is an actual or imminent emergency situation warranting activation in the ordinary course of his or her duties. In such an emergency situation, an Officer may activate his or her body camera until such time as, in his or her professional judgment, the emergency situation has concluded.

(3) When an Officer activates a body camera in a courtroom as permitted by paragraph (2), he or she shall verbally notify the presiding judge at the first reasonable opportunity after the body camera has been activated. Also, within one business day of the emergency incident, the Officer or his or her supervisor shall provide to the presiding judge a written report of the circumstances surrounding the activation of the body camera, including the times of activation and deactivation and an explanation of the Officer's actions. The presiding judge shall promptly share the activation report with judicial district court administration. The activation report also shall be provided to the law enforcement agency with which the Officer is associated.

(4) Any recording made in a courtroom during a judicial proceeding may not be released to anyone outside the court and the law enforcement agency with which the Officer is associated without the express written approval of the president judge of the court. Use and dissemination of a recording made under this Subdivision C in connection with law enforcement activity shall require the express written approval of the president judge.

(5) A judicial district may adopt local rules or protocols regulating the use, operation and activation of body cameras in any location and space that is controlled by the judicial district and used in the ordinary course of its business, including a courtroom.

(6) A court and any law enforcement agency providing security services in the courtroom shall enter into a written agreement conforming to this rule and any local rule or protocol promulgated by the judicial district. At minimum, the agreement shall require the agency to (i) inform its officers of their responsibilities under the rule; (ii) provide training to its officers regarding the requirements of the rule, including training of new officers before they are permitted to activate a body camera in the courtroom; (iii) require annual written certification by a responsible representative of the law enforcement agency that the agency's officers have been informed of their responsibilities under the rule and have received proper training; and (iv) monitor their officers' compliance.

(7) Each law enforcement agency that provides security services to a court or judicial district shall provide to the district court administrator a copy of its current policies regarding use of body cameras, as well as a list of those Officers assigned to a court or judicial district who are qualified to wear and use body cameras.

CHAPTER 29. MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

Subchapter I. BUDGET AND FINANCE

§ 29.351. Definitions.

(a) *Pennsylvania Supreme, Superior and Commonwealth Courts. Initial Filing.*

[1.] Except for the provisions of subsection (g)(1) below, for purposes of 42 Pa.C.S. §§ 3733(a.1) and 3733.1 and section 2802-E of The Administrative Code of 1929 (71 P.S. § 720.102), a statutory fee of [**seventeen dollars (\$17.00)**] **nineteen dollars (\$19.00)** shall be imposed on all items enumerated in the fee schedules of the Appellate Courts for which a filing and service fee is collected, excluding the following:

i. Second and Subsequent Filings for Extension of Time[;],

ii. Reargument/Reconsideration[;],

iii. Services in Connection with Appeals to or Writs of Certiorari from the United States Supreme Court[;],

iv. Miscellaneous Fees[; and],

v. Subpoenas.

(b) *Court of Common Pleas. Prothonotary. Civil Actions and Legal Proceedings.*

1. Except for the provisions of subsection (g)(1) below, for purposes of 42 Pa.C.S. §§ 3733(a.1) and 3733.1 and section 2802-E of The Administrative Code of 1929 (71 P.S. § 720.102), a statutory fee of [**seventeen dollars (\$17.00)**] **nineteen dollars (\$19.00)** shall be imposed on a civil action or legal proceeding in a Court of Common Pleas whenever it is initiated upon the filing of the first legal paper therein of record with the prothonotary [, **which legal paper may be**]. **The first legal paper may be any of the following:**

- i. Praecept for a Writ of Summons [;] .
- ii. Complaint [;] .
- iii. Deleted [;] .
- iv. Petition [;] .
- v. Notice of Appeal from a court of limited jurisdiction [; or,] .
- vi. Petition or grant of any other legal paper commencing an action or proceeding authorized by Act of Assembly or rule of court.

2. For purposes of these regulations, the initiation of a civil action or legal proceeding shall include, but is not limited to:

- i. Actions governed by or authorized under the Pennsylvania Rules of Civil Procedure, such as Civil Action Ejectment, Equity, Ground Rent, Mandamus, Mortgage Foreclosure, Partition of Real Property, Quiet Title, Quo Warranto, Replevin, and the Prevention of Waste [;] .
- ii. Actions pertaining to Dependency, Annulments, Divorce, Custody, Partial Custody, [**Visitation of Minor Children**] **Alimony Pendente Lite**, Support, and Paternity. With respect to Divorce actions, a separate statutory fee shall be imposed for each count in the complaint in addition to the count requesting divorce [;] .
- iii. Statutory actions such as Confirmation of Arbitration Awards, Conformation of Confessed Judgment, Declaratory Judgment, Opening or Striking Off a Judgment, Eminent Domain, Habeas Corpus, Proceedings on Liens (other than revival), Name Changes, Partition of Property Held by Husband and Wife as Tenants By the Entireties, Tax Sales of Real Property [; or,] .

iv. Other actions not included in subsections (i), (ii) or (iii), such as: Appeals from Board of Elections, Appeals from Board of Viewers, Appeals from Zoning Boards, and Certiorari to Magisterial District Judges.

(c) *Court of Common Pleas. Orphans' Court Clerk, Register of Wills.*

[**1.**] Except for the provisions of subsection (g)(1) below, for purposes of 42 Pa.C.S. §§ 3733(a.1) and 3733.1 and section 2802-E of The Administrative Code of 1929 (71 P.S. § 720.102), a statutory fee of [**seventeen dollars (\$17.00)**] **nineteen dollars (\$19.00)** shall be imposed on all petitions for grant of letters, and first filings in petitions concerning adoptions, incapacitated persons' estates, minors' estates, and inter vivos trusts.

(d) *Court of Common Pleas. Clerk of Court.*

1. Except for the provisions of subsection (g)(1) below, for purposes of 42 Pa.C.S. §§ 3733(a.1) and 3733.1 and section 2802-E of The Administrative Code of 1929 (71 P.S. § 720.102), a statutory fee of [**seventeen dollars (\$17.00)**] **nineteen dollars (\$19.00)** shall be imposed upon conviction, guilty plea, or when a defendant is granted entry into an Accelerated Rehabilitative Disposition (ARD) or other pretrial diversionary program based upon the initiation of any criminal proceeding. The initiation of a criminal proceeding shall include **the following:**

i. Cases commenced at the magisterial district judge level resulting in the issuance of a numbered docket transcript form (OTN), and subsequently waived or held to court [;] .

ii. [**the**] **The** appeal of a summary conviction to the Court of Common Pleas [;] .

iii. [**cases**] **Cases** involving juvenile defendants where a petition alleging delinquency has been filed in the Court of Common Pleas [;] .

iv. [**cases**] **Cases** involving juvenile defendants certified to the Court of Common Pleas, resulting in the issuance of a numbered docket transcript form (OTN) [; and] .

v. [**cases**] **Cases** involving the severance of charges into separate cases resulting in the issuance of one or more additional numbered docket transcripts (OTNs).

2. Except for the provisions of subsection (g)(1) below, for purposes of 42 Pa.C.S. §§ 3733(a.1) and 3733.1 and section 2802-E of The Administrative Code of 1929 (71 P.S. § 720.102), a statutory fee of [**seventeen dollars (\$17.00)**] **nineteen dollars (\$19.00)** shall be imposed for each filing of a deed, mortgage or property transfer for which a fee, charge or cost is now authorized. The documents identified as meeting the above conditions are listed below. The list is not exclusive; other filings for which a fee is imposed and that can be considered a property transfer are included, and the fee shall be imposed. Subject to later amendment, the following documents have been identified as meeting the statutory provisions:

- i. Deeds in any form [;] .
- ii. Mortgages [;] .
- iii. Mortgage assignments [;] .
- iv. Mortgage releases [;] .
- v. Mortgage satisfaction pieces [;] .
- vi. Installment sales agreements [;] .
- vii. Leases for a term of thirty (30) years or longer [;] .
- viii. Easements [; and] .
- ix. Rights of Way.

(e) *Minor Judiciary. Civil and Criminal Proceedings.*

[1.] For purposes of 42 Pa.C.S. §§ 3733(a.1) and 3733.1, and section 2802-E of The Administrative Code of 1929 (71 P.S. § 720.102), a statutory fee of [**seventeen dollars (\$17.00)**] **nineteen dollars (\$19.00)** shall be imposed on the initiation of a legal proceeding except as provided in subsection (iii). The initiation of a legal proceeding, in the following courts of the Minor Judiciary, shall include, but is not limited to, the following:

i. *Magisterial District Judge. Civil Actions.* Except for the provisions of subsection (g)(1) below, a statutory fee of [**seventeen dollars (\$17.00)**] **nineteen dollars (\$19.00)** shall be imposed in connection with the filing of a complaint in Trespass and Assumpsit or for the Recovery of Possession of Real Property (Landlord and Tenant Proceeding) or for any other Civil Action as provided in the Rules of Civil Procedure Governing Actions and Proceedings before Magisterial District Judges.

ii. *Magisterial District Judge. Criminal Actions.* Except for the provisions of subsection (g)(1) below, a statutory fee of [**seventeen dollars (\$17.00)**] **nineteen dollars (\$19.00)** shall be imposed upon a conviction, guilty plea or when a defendant is granted entry into an Accelerated Rehabilitative Disposition (ARD) or any other pretrial diversionary program based upon the filing of a criminal complaint or non-traffic citation charging an offense classified as misdemeanor or summary under a state statute or local ordinance as provided in the Pennsylvania Rules of Criminal Procedure.

iii. *Magisterial District Judge, Pittsburgh Municipal Court, and Philadelphia Municipal Court. Title 75 Summary Offenses Initiated by Traffic Citation.* Except for the provisions of subsection (g)(2) below, a statutory fee of [**ten dollars (\$10.00)**] **twelve dollars (\$12.00)** shall be imposed upon a conviction or guilty plea based upon the filing of a traffic citation charging a violation of Title 75 (relating to vehicles) offense classified as summary under a state statute or local ordinance as provided in the Pennsylvania Rules of Criminal Procedure.

iv. *Pittsburgh Municipal Court. Civil Actions.* Except for the provisions of subsection (g)(1) below, a statutory fee of [**seventeen dollars (\$17.00)**] **nineteen dollars (\$19.00)** shall be imposed in connection with the filing of a civil complaint seeking recovery of fines and penalties imposed by an ordinance of the City of Pittsburgh or by any ordinance or regulation relating to housing and health administered and enforced by the county health department where the violation occurs within the City of Pittsburgh.

v. *Pittsburgh Municipal Court. Criminal Actions.* Except for the provisions of subsection (g)(1) below, a statutory fee of [**seventeen dollars (\$17.00)**] **nineteen dollars (\$19.00)** shall be imposed upon a conviction, guilty plea or when a defendant is granted entry into an Accelerated Rehabilitative Disposition (ARD) or any other pretrial diversionary program based upon the filing of a criminal complaint or non-traffic citation charging an offense classified as misdemeanor or summary under state statute or local ordinance as provided for in the Pennsylvania Rules of Criminal Procedure.

vi. *Philadelphia Municipal Court. Civil Actions.* Except for the provisions of subsection (g)(1) below, a statutory fee of [**seventeen dollars (\$17.00)**] **nineteen dollars (\$19.00)** shall be imposed in connection with the filing of a complaint for a Civil Action, as defined in the Philadelphia Municipal Court Rules of Civil Procedure.

vii. *Philadelphia Municipal Court. Criminal Actions.* Except for the provisions of subsection (g)(1) below, a statutory fee of [**seventeen dollars (\$17.00)**] **nineteen dollars (\$19.00)** shall be imposed upon conviction, guilty plea or when a defendant is granted entry into an Accelerated Rehabilitative Disposition (ARD) or any other pretrial diversionary program based upon the filing of a criminal complaint or non-traffic citation charging an offense classified as misdemeanor or summary under state statute or local ordinance as provided for in the Pennsylvania Rules of Criminal Procedure.

(f) *Recorders of Deeds.*

Except for the provisions of subsection (g)(1) below, for purposes of 42 Pa.C.S. §§ 3733(a.1) and 3733.1[,] and section 2802-E of The Administrative Code of 1929 (71 P.S. § 720.102), a statutory fee of [**seventeen dollars (\$17.00)**] **nineteen dollars (\$19.00)** shall be imposed for each filing of a deed, mortgage or property transfer for which a fee, charge or cost is now authorized. The documents identified as meeting the above conditions are listed below. The list is not exclusive; other filings for which a fee is imposed and that can be considered a property transfer are included, and the fee shall be imposed. Subject to later amendment, the following documents have been identified as meeting the statutory provisions:

- i. Deeds in any form [;],
- ii. Mortgages [;],
- iii. Mortgage assignments [;],
- iv. Mortgage releases [;],
- v. Mortgage satisfaction pieces [;],
- vi. Installment sales agreements [;],
- vii. Leases for a term of thirty (30) years or longer [;],

(g) *Temporary Surcharge.*

1. Beginning [**October 30, 2017**] **July 1, 2019**, and until December 31, 2020, for purposes of section 2802-E of The Administrative Code of 1929 (71 P.S. § 720.102) and section 1795.1-E of The Fiscal Code (72 P.S. § 1795.1-E), a temporary surcharge of [**twenty-three**] **twenty-one** dollars and twenty-five cents [**(\$23.25)**] **(\$21.25)** shall be collected by all collectors of the JCS/ATJ/CJEA fee to supplement the [**seventeen (\$17.00)**] **nineteen dollars (\$19.00)** statutory fee described above. This temporary surcharge may not be imposed upon a conviction or guilty plea based upon the filing of a traffic citation charging a Title 75 (relating to vehicles) offense classified as summary under a state statute or local ordinance as provided in the Pennsylvania Rules of Criminal Procedure.

2. *Magisterial District Judge, Pittsburgh Municipal Court, and Philadelphia Municipal Court. Title 75 Summary Offenses Initiated by Traffic Citation.* Beginning [**October 30, 2017**] **July 1, 2019**, and until December 31, 2020, for purposes of Section 1795.1-E of [**the**] **The** Fiscal Code (72 P.S. § 1795.1-E), a temporary surcharge of [**twelve dollars (\$12.00)**] **ten dollars (\$10.00)** shall be collected to supplement the [**ten dollars (\$10.00)**] **twelve dollars (\$12.00)** statutory fee imposed upon a

conviction or guilty plea based upon the filing of a traffic citation charging a violation of Title 75 (relating to vehicles) offense classified as summary under a state statute or local ordinance as provided in the Pennsylvania Rules of Criminal Procedure.

Rule 1915.3. Commencement of Action. Complaint. Order.

(a) *Commencement of an Action. Filing.*

(5) The moving party shall pay the requisite filing fee and conciliator's fee upon the filing of a custody complaint or petition for modification of a custody order. A conciliator's fee shall not be paid with the filing of a petition to intervene or a petition for contempt for disobedience of a custody order, unless said petition is filed contemporaneously with a custody complaint or a petition for modification of custody. **A conciliator's fee shall not be paid if a stipulated agreement is filed contemporaneously with a custody complaint or petition for modification of custody.**

- Moving of the current existing rolling flag racks including covers and accessory items.
- All proposers shall attend the preproposal meeting.

All work associated with this purchase order shall be completed no later than April 10, 2020.

Program Requirements for the Agriculture and Youth Organization Grant Program

The Department of Agriculture (Department) hereby provides notice of the standards and requirements for the Agriculture and Youth Organization Grant Program (Program).

The Program is established under the authority of the act of July 1, 2019 (3 Pa.C.S. §§ 10301—10307), referred to as the Agriculture and Youth Development Grant Program Act (act). The Program allows the Department to award direct grants and matching grants to help fund eligible projects, programs and equipment purchases conducted or made by organizations that are composed mainly of youth and are organized to promote development in the areas of agriculture, community leadership, vocational training and peer fellowship.

This notice establishes the policy guidelines for the Program. It establishes the process by which grant applications will be solicited and reviewed, and by which grants will be awarded, drawing on \$500,000 in funding available in Fiscal Year (FY) 2019-2020.

For this initial year of the Program, the Department will consider a prospective applicant organization to be composed mainly of "youth" if most of its membership is 24 years of age or younger, and will accept applications from schools or school districts to help fund eligible projects conducted by or for the benefit of agriculture and youth organizations operated under the applicant school or school district. The Department may revise these policy guidelines in subsequent years, as the Department gains experience in administering the Program.

This document has been developed in consultation with the State Agriculture and Youth Development Board (Board).

1. *Program objectives.* The Program's objective is to provide grants to eligible agriculture and youth organizations to help fund projects such as educational programs, work force development programs, eligible seminars and

field trips, agricultural safety training programs, capital projects, equipment purchases and special projects, as approved by the Board.

2. *Definitions.* The following words and phrases apply to the Program:

Agriculture and youth organization. An organization composed mainly of youth and organized to promote development in the areas of agriculture, community leadership, vocational training and peer fellowship. The term includes, but is not limited to, Pennsylvania FFA, 4-H, Ag in the Classroom, the Family, Career and Community Leaders of America and vocational education programs.

Board. The State Agriculture and Youth Development Board.

Department. The Department of Agriculture of the Commonwealth.

Eligible project. One or more of the following, approved by the Board:

a. A special project conducted by an agriculture and youth organization.

b. An educational or work force development program conducted by an agriculture and youth organization.

c. Educational or work force development seminars and field trips conducted by an agriculture and youth organization.

d. An agricultural safety training program conducted by an agriculture and youth organization.

e. A capital project or an equipment purchase for an agriculture and youth organization.

Program. The Agriculture and Youth Organization Grant Program.

3. *Eligibility.* An agriculture and youth organization may apply to the Department for a grant under the Program. For an organization to be eligible to apply, most of its membership must be 24 years of age or younger. A school or school district may apply to receive grant funds for an eligible project conducted by or for the benefit of an agriculture and youth organization that is operated under that school or school district.

4. *Annual allocation limit for FY 2019-2020.* The annual allocation limits for grant funds under the Program shall be as presented in section 5, on a funds-available basis.

5. *Grant types.* There are two different types of grants that can be awarded under the Program:

a. Direct, non-matching reimbursement grants of up to \$7,500 to defray the costs of an eligible project, other than a capital project; and

b. Matching reimbursement grants of up to \$25,000 to defray the costs of an eligible capital project or equipment purchase, where the grant comprises no more than 50% of the project costs.

6. *Limitations on grants.* The following shall apply:

a. The amount of reimbursement is based on actual eligible costs submitted by an approved applicant for an approved project during any fiscal year in which grants are offered.

b. Grant reimbursement money is limited as described in section 5.

c. Grant reimbursement money shall not be used to reimburse any portion of an in-kind contribution to an eligible project.

d. Grant money may not be used to pay or reimburse wages or salaries of grant recipient staff.

e. Grant money may not be used to reimburse any portion of the project costs which are being paid or reimbursed under another Federal or State grant program.

7. *Application procedure.*

a. *Online Applications Only.* An applicant for a grant under the Program shall be submitted through the Commonwealth's Single Application for Assistance online application system at www.esa.dced.state.pa.us.

b. *Application Window.* Applications must be submitted through the Single Application for Assistance online application system between 8 a.m. on October 26, 2019, and 4:59 p.m. on November 29, 2019. Applications received outside of that application window will not be considered or reviewed.

c. *Application Requirements.* An application for a grant under the Program shall contain the following information:

i. The applicant's name, business address and contact information.

ii. A brief narrative explaining how the applicant is an agriculture and youth organization.

iii. A statement as to whether the applicant seeks a direct, non-matching reimbursement grant or a matching reimbursement grant, as these are previously described in section 5.

iv. The details of the project or equipment purchase for which reimbursement grant money is sought, including the following:

A. A project budget.

B. A statement of the maximum amount of grant money sought for the project.

C. A project implementation schedule, a construction schedule or an equipment purchase plan, as appropriate for the project or purchase with respect to which the grant is sought.

D. A narrative identifying each entity that will assist in, participate in and benefit from the project.

v. An attestation signed by the applicant, verifying the accuracy of the information presented on the application.

8. *Disposition and review of grant applications.*

a. The Department will review each application, and supporting documentation submitted therewith, for completeness and accuracy, and shall determine whether the application is eligible for consideration by the Board.

b. If an application is found to be incomplete or inaccurate, the Department may request additional documentation and may discontinue further processing of the application until the requested information is received.

c. If the Department determines an application is complete, accurate and eligible for consideration by the Board, it shall submit that application for consideration by the Board at its next scheduled meeting, which shall occur no later than December 31, 2019. The Board shall consider the project, capital project or equipment purchase that is the subject of the application and shall vote to recommend approval or disapproval of the application by the Department.

d. The Department will consider the Board's recommendation and make the decision as to approval or disapproval of an application upon the recommendation of the Board.

9. *Notice of disposition of application.* The Department will provide the applicant written notice of the disposition (approval or disapproval) of the application.

10. *Agreement required.* If the Department approves a grant application, and as a precondition to the Department's release of grant moneys to a successful applicant, the Department and the applicant shall execute a Grant Agreement which describes the terms and conditions subject to which the grant is made. This Grant Agreement may be done electronically, through the Single Application for Assistance.

11. *Distribution of grant money.* As Program grants are reimbursement grants, the Department will not issue grant money until the successful applicant submits the following to the Department:

a. A verified statement that the eligible project has been completed or implemented, or that the subject equipment has been purchased.

b. A verified statement of the project completion date or the equipment purchase date.

c. Photos of the completed or implemented project or the equipment purchased, with a narrative explanation of each photo.

d. Bills and invoices demonstrating that expenses were incurred for which reimbursement grant funds are sought.

Persons wishing to comment on WQM permit applications are invited to submit statements to the office noted before the application within 15 days from the date of this public notice. A person who demonstrates attainment of one or a combination of cleanup standards or receives approval of a special industrial area remediation identified under the act will be relieved of further liability for the remediation of the site for contamination identified in reports submitted to and approved by the Department. Furthermore, the person shall not be subject to citizen suits or other contribution actions brought by responsible persons not participating in the remediation.

Under sections 304(n)(1)(ii) and 305(c)(2) of the act, there is a 30-day public and municipal comment period for sites proposed for remediation using a site-specific standard, in whole or in part, and for sites remediated as a special industrial area. This period begins when a summary of the Notice of Intent to Remediate is published in a newspaper of general circulation in the area of the site. For the following site, proposed for remediation to a site-specific standard or as a special industrial area, the municipality, within which the site is located, may request to be involved in the development of the remediation and reuse plans for the site if the request is made within 30 days of the date specified as follows. During this comment period, the municipality may request that the person identified as the remediator of the site develop and implement a public involvement plan. Requests to be involved and comments should be directed to the remediator of the site.

MINING ACTIVITY NPDES DRAFT PERMITS

This notice provides information about applications for a new, amended or renewed NPDES permits associated with mining activity (coal or noncoal) permits. The applications concern industrial waste (mining) discharges to surface water and discharges of stormwater associated with mining activities. This notice is provided in accordance with 25 Pa. Similarly, modified BAT limits apply to iron, manganese and suspended solids in surface runoff, discharges and drainage resulting from these precipitation events and those of greater magnitude in accordance with 25 Pa. Code §§ 87.102, 88.92, 88.187, 88.292, 89.52 and 90.102.

Exceptions to BAT effluent limits may be applicable in accordance with 25 Pa. Code §§ 87.102, 88.92, 88.187, 88.292, 89.52 and 90.102.

Effluent Limits for Noncoal Mining Activities

The limits for noncoal mining activities as provided in 25 Pa. Code Chapter 77 are pH 6 to 9 and other parameters the Department may require.

Discharges from noncoal mines located in some geologic settings (for example, in the coal fields) may require additional water quality based effluent limits. If additional effluent limits are needed for an NPDES permit associated with a noncoal mining permit, then the permit description specifies the parameters.

In addition to BAT or WQBEL limits, coal and noncoal NPDES permits establish effluent limitations in the form of implemented Best Management Practices (BMPs) identified in the associated Erosion and Sedimentation Plan, the Reclamation Plan and the NPDES permit application. These BMPs restrict the rates and quantities of associated pollutants from being discharged into surface waters in this Commonwealth.

More restrictive effluent limitations, restrictions on discharge volume or restrictions on the extent of mining that may occur are incorporated into an NPDES permit when necessary for compliance with water quality standards and antidegradation requirements (in accordance with 25 Pa. Code Chapters 91—96).

The procedures for determining the final effluent limits, using a mass-balance equation or model, are found in Technical Guidance Document 563-2112-115, Developing National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Permits for Mining Activities. Other specific factors to be considered include public comments and Total Maximum Daily Load(s). Additional discharge limitations may apply in the event that unexpected discharges occur.

Persons wishing to comment on an NPDES draft permit should submit a written statement to the Department at the address of the district mining office indicated before each draft permit within 30 days of this public notice. Comments received within the comment period will be considered in the final determinations regarding the NPDES permit applications. If required, a cleanup plan evaluates the abilities of potential remedies to achieve remedy requirements. A work plan for conducting a baseline remedial investigation is required by the act for compliance with selection of a special industrial area remediation. The baseline remedial investigation, based on the work plan, is compiled into the baseline environmental report to establish a reference point to show existing contamination, describe proposed remediation to be done and include a description of existing or potential public benefits of the use or reuse of the property. The Department may approve or disapprove plans and reports submitted. This notice provides the Department's decision and, if relevant, the basis for disapproval.

Code Chapter 105 (relating to dam safety and waterway management), 25 Pa. Code Chapter 106 (relating to floodplain management) and all other applicable regulations.

4. *Other Water Quality Requirements*—Applicant shall obtain any other permits, authorizations or approvals required to construct, operate, and maintain the Project from any interstate or international agency as required by an interstate compact or international agreement that has established water quality standards applicable to surface waters of this Commonwealth, including wetlands.

6. *Operation*—Applicant shall properly operate and maintain at all times all Project facilities and systems of treatment and control (and related appurtenances) installed to achieve compliance with the terms and conditions of this SWQC and all required permits, authorizations and approvals. Proper operation and maintenance includes adequate laboratory controls, appropriate quality assurance procedures, and the operation of backup or auxiliary facilities or similar systems installed by Applicant.

7. *Inspection*—The Project, including all relevant records, are subject to inspection at reasonable hours and intervals by an authorized representative of PADEP or the delegated County Conservation District to determine compliance with this SWQC, including all permits, authorizations or approvals which ensure the project shall

maintain and protect State water quality standards as required by this SWQC. The Applicant shall provide a copy of this SWQC to an authorized representative conducting an inspection of the Project.

8. *Transfer of Projects*—If Applicant intends to transfer any legal or equitable interest in the Project or any portion(s) thereof, the Applicant shall provide a copy of this SWQC and copies of any permits, authorizations or approvals obtained to comply with the SWQC upon the prospective transferee of the legal and equitable interest at least thirty (30) days prior to the contemplated transfer and shall simultaneously inform the appropriate PADEP Office of such intent. Notice to PADEP shall include a transfer agreement signed by the existing and new owners containing a specific date for transfer of responsibility, coverage, and liability under the SWQC and any permits, authorizations and approvals obtained to comply with the SWQC. The new owner shall submit to PADEP a new application form for the SWQC and any permits, authorizations and approvals required to comply with the SWQC signed by the new owner.

10. *Reservation of Rights*—PADEP may modify, suspend, or revoke this SWQC if (i) PADEP becomes aware of new facts about the Project that warrant such action; or (ii) PADEP determines that the Applicant has not complied with the terms and conditions of the SWQC. PADEP may require additional measures to achieve compliance with any applicable law or regulation.

11. *Other Laws*—Nothing in this SWQC shall be construed to preclude the institution of any legal action or to relieve Applicant from any responsibilities, liabilities, or penalties established pursuant to any applicable law or regulation.

12. *Severability*—The provisions of this SWQC are severable and should any provision of this SWQC be declared invalid or unenforceable, the remainder of this SWQC shall not be affected thereby.

Prior to issuance of the final SWQC, PADEP will consider all relevant and timely comments, suggestions or objections submitted to PADEP within 30 days of this notice. Pennsylvania \$1 Million Merry & Bright Instant Lottery Game 1426

Under the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314) and 61 Pa. Code § 819.203 (relating to notice of instant game rules), the Secretary of Revenue hereby provides public notice of the rules for the following instant lottery game:

1. *Name:* The name of the game is Pennsylvania \$1 Million Merry & Bright (hereinafter “\$1 Million Merry & Bright”). The game number is PA-1426.

2. *Price:* The price of a \$1 Million Merry & Bright instant lottery game ticket is \$20.

3. *Play symbols:* Each \$1 Million Merry & Bright instant lottery game ticket will contain one play area featuring a “WINNING NUMBERS” area, a “YOUR NUMBERS” area, and three “BONUS” spots. The “BONUS” spots are played separately. The play symbols and their captions located in the “WINNING NUMBERS” area are: 1 (ONE), 2 (TWO), 3 (THREE), 4 (FOUR), 5 (FIVE), 6 (SIX), 7 (SEVEN), 8 (EIGHT), 9 (NINE), 10 (TEN), 11 (ELEVN), 12 (TWLV), 13 (THRTN), 14 (FORTN), 15 (FIFTN), 16 (SIXTN), 17 (SVNTN), 18 (EGHTN), 19 (NINTN), 21 (TWYONE), 22 (TWYTWO), 23 (TWYTHR), 24 (TWYFOR), 25 (TWYFIV), 26 (TWYSIX), 27 (TWYSVN), 28 (TWYEGT), 29 (TWYNIN), 30 (THIRT), 31 (THYONE), 32 (THYTWO), 33 (THYTHR), 34 (THYFOR), 35 (THYFIV), 36 (THYSIX), 37 (THYSVN), 38 (THYEGT), 39 (THYNIN), and 40 (FORT). The play symbols and their captions located in the three “BONUS” spots are: NO BONUS (TRY AGAIN) symbol, TRY AGAIN (NO BONUS) symbol, NO BONUS (TRY AGAIN) symbol, TRY AGAIN (NO BONUS) symbol, \$100 Bill (WIN100) symbol, \$200 Bill (WIN200) symbol, and a \$500 Bill (WIN500) symbol.

4. *Prize symbols:* The prize symbols and their captions located in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area are: \$20⁰⁰ (TWENTY), \$40⁰⁰ (FORTY), \$50⁰⁰ (FIFTY), \$100 (ONE HUN), \$200 (TWO HUN), \$400 (FOR HUN), \$500 (FIV HUN), \$1,000 (ONE THO), \$10,000 (TEN THO), \$100,000 (ONEHUNTHO) and \$1MILL (ONE MIL).

5. *Prizes:* The prizes that can be won in this game are: \$20, \$40, \$50, \$100, \$200, \$400, \$500, \$1,000, \$10,000, \$100,000, and \$1,000,000. The prizes that can be won in the “BONUS” spots are: \$100, \$200, and \$500. A player can win up to 21 times on a ticket.

6. *Second-Chance Drawing:* The Pennsylvania Lottery will conduct a Holly Jolly Second-Chance Drawing for which non-winning \$1 Million Merry & Bright instant lottery game tickets may be eligible as provided for in section 10.

7. *Approximate number of tickets printed for the game:* Approximately 5,400,000 tickets will be printed for the \$1 Million Merry & Bright instant lottery game.

8. *Determination of prize winners:*

(a) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols matches any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$1MILL (ONE MIL) appears in the “prize” area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1,000,000.

(b) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols matches any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$100,000 (ONEHUNTHO) appears in the “prize” area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100,000.

(c) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols matches any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$10,000 (TEN THO) appears in the “prize” area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$10,000.

(d) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols is a 20X (20TIMES) symbol and a prize symbol of \$500 (FIV HUN) appears in the “prize” area under that 20X (20TIMES) play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$10,000.

(e) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols is a Star (WINALL) symbol and a prize symbol of \$500 (FIV HUN) appears in all twenty of the “prize” areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$10,000.

(f) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols matches any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$1,000 (ONE THO) appears in the “prize” area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1,000.

(g) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols is a Tree (TREE) symbol and a prize symbol of \$1,000 (ONE THO) appears in the “prize” area under that Tree (TREE) play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1,000.

(y) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$50⁰⁰ (FIFTY) appears in the "prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$50.

(z) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols is a Tree (TREE) symbol and a prize symbol of \$50⁰⁰ (FIFTY) appears in the "prize" area under that Tree (TREE) play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$50.

(aa) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$40⁰⁰ (FORTY) appears in the "prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$40.

(bb) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols is a Tree (TREE) symbol and a prize symbol of \$40⁰⁰ (FORTY) appears in the "prize" area under that Tree (TREE) play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$40.

(cc) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$20⁰⁰ (TWENTY) appears in the "prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$20.

(dd) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols is a Tree (TREE) symbol and a prize symbol of \$20⁰⁰ (TWENTY) appears in the "prize" area under that Tree (TREE) play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$20.

(2) To enter the Drawing, entrants must submit the identifying information from at least one Qualifying Ticket via the Drawing's promotional web site, available at <http://www.palottery.com>, or the Pennsylvania Lottery's official mobile application, during the entry period. The identifying information from a Qualifying Ticket may be submitted only once for the Drawing. Entries will automatically be awarded at the time of successful submission of a Qualifying Ticket. No other method of submission will be accepted. Entries submitted using any other method, including entries mailed or hand-delivered to the Pennsylvania Lottery, are not valid and will be disqualified.

(3) Each entry must be complete and the information supplied by the entrant must be accurate. Incomplete entries cannot be submitted.

(4) Only one claimant per entry allowed.

(5) Entrants must be 18 years of age or older.

(6) Players may submit the identifying information from an unlimited number of Qualifying Tickets.

(7) Once an entry has been submitted it cannot be withdrawn or changed.

(1) The Lottery will conduct one Holly Jolly Second-Chance Drawing for qualifying instant Lottery game tickets. All time references are Eastern Prevailing Time.

(2) All entries received after 11:59:59 p.m. October 27, 2019, through 11:59:59 p.m. January 2, 2020, will be entered into the Drawing to be held between January 3, 2020 and January 14, 2020.

(3) The entry period for the Drawing will be posted to the Pennsylvania Lottery's publicly accessible web site.

(4) When a Qualifying Ticket is entered into the Drawing, the entry has a chance to be multiplied by five or ten (hereafter the "Entry Multiplier Prize"). Each Qualifying Ticket will have a predetermined ticket file assigned at the time the ticket is printed that will determine whether an entry will be multiplied. If an entry is multiplied, the entrant will be notified during the entry process.

(5) The number of entries an entrant will receive for the Drawing is determined by the purchase price of the Qualifying Ticket entered. The respective purchase price and corresponding number of entries for the Qualifying Ticket is as follows: PA-1426 \$1 Million Merry & Bright (\$20) = 20 entries, PA-1427 Secret Santa (\$10) = ten entries, PA-1428 Holiday Cash Blowout (\$5) = five en-

(6) Players may review prizes won and their entries for the Drawing via the Drawing's promotional web site.

(3) The Lottery will conduct one Drawing from among all the entries received during the entry period as described in section 10(c)(2).

(i) The first entry selected from the total number of instant Lottery game ticket entries awarded in the Drawing will be a winning entry, and the entrant who submitted the winning entry shall be entitled to a prize of \$100,000, less required income tax withholding.

(ii) The second through the fifth entries selected from the total number of instant Lottery game ticket entries awarded in the Drawing will be winning entries, and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$50,000, less required income tax withholding.

(iii) The sixth through the tenth entries selected from the total number of instant Lottery game ticket entries awarded in the Drawing will be winning entries, and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$10,000, less required income tax withholding.

(iv) The eleventh through the twentieth entries selected from the total number of instant Lottery game entries awarded in the Drawing will be winning entries, and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$5,000.

(v) The twenty-first through the seventieth entries selected from the total number of instant Lottery game entries awarded in the Drawing will be winning entries, and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$100 iLottery Bonus Money.

(4) All prizes will be paid as a lump-sum cash payment or uploaded to a winning player's Lottery account.

(5) Winners of iLottery Bonus Money are not required to claim a prize. Winners of iLottery Bonus Money will have the iLottery Bonus Money credited to their Lottery account and will receive an email notifying them that they won a prize.

(6) The number of winning entries to be selected for the Drawing will be posted to the Pennsylvania Lottery's publicly accessible web site.

(1) The prize entitlements described below are subject to all restrictions and limitations described in section 10(e), or those mentioned anywhere else in these rules.

(2) The following table sets forth the approximate number of Entry Multiplier Prizes and the approximate odds of winning an Entry Multiplier Prize:

(7) The odds of an entry being selected in the Drawing depend upon the total number of entries awarded for the Drawing.

(8) A computer generated randomizer will be used to select the winning entries.

(e) *Drawing restrictions:*

(1) To be eligible to participate in the Drawing, entrants must have complied with the requirements of these rules.

(2) The Lottery is not responsible for late, lost or misdirected entries not entered into the Drawing. The Lottery is not responsible for entries that are not entered into the Drawing because of incompatible internet browsers, mobile Lottery application failure or other technical issues. If a Drawing entry is selected as a winner and rejected during or following the Drawing, the Lottery will select another entry to replace the rejected entry in accordance with these rules and Lottery procedure.

(3) If any discrepancy exists between these rules and any material describing the Drawing, these rules shall govern.

(4) Employees of the Pennsylvania Lottery, MARC USA, Scientific Games International, Inc., MDI Entertainment, LLC, and their subcontractors, or a spouse, child, brother, sister or parent residing as a member of the same household in the principle place of residence of any such person are not eligible to participate in the Drawing. Offer void where prohibited or restricted.

(5) The Pennsylvania Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to cancel or suspend the Drawing and change these rules if the Drawing cannot be conducted as planned due to errors in these rules or advertising, unauthorized intervention, tampering, fraud, technical errors, viruses, worms, bugs, or any other cause beyond the control of the Pennsylvania Lottery that, in the Pennsylvania Lottery's sole judgment, could corrupt or impair the administration, security, fairness, integrity, or proper conduct of the Drawing.

(6) All entries shall be subject to verification by the Pennsylvania Lottery.

(7) The Pennsylvania Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to disqualify an entrant found to be

tampering with the operation of the Drawing or to be acting in violation of these rules or applicable law.

(8) The Drawing is governed by the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Applicable laws and regulations apply.

(9) Prizes must be claimed within 1 year of the drawing date of the Drawing in which the prize was won. If no claim is made within 1 year of the drawing date of the Drawing in which the prize was won, the right of an entrant to claim the prize won, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided by statute.

(10) Final determination of winners will be made by the Secretary, whose judgment will be final and binding.

(11) A prize awarded in the Drawing to a person who dies before receiving the prize shall be paid according to 61 Pa. Code § 811.16 (relating to prizes payable after death of a prize winner).

(12) A winner is responsible for all taxes arising from or in connection with any prize won.

(13) A player may only win the prize for which the player is first selected in the Drawing. Subsequent entries, from the same individual, selected in the same Drawing will be disqualified and a replacement entry will be selected.

(15) Prizes are not transferrable.

(16) Other restrictions may apply.

11. *Retailer incentive awards:* The Lottery may conduct a separate Retailer Incentive Program for retailers who sell \$1 Million Merry & Bright instant lottery game tickets.

12. *Retailer bonus:* The Lottery may offer a retailer bonus in connection with the sale of Pennsylvania instant lottery game tickets. If a retailer bonus is offered, a Lottery retailer shall be eligible for a bonus as described in this section. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$100,000 and not exceeding \$500,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$500. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$1,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$5,000. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$1,000,001 and not exceeding \$10,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$10,000. A Lottery retailer is entitled only to the largest bonus for which he qualifies on a winning ticket. A bonus will be initiated for payment after the instant ticket is claimed and validated. A bonus will not be awarded to a Lottery retailer that sells a non-

winning Pennsylvania Lottery instant ticket used to enter a Pennsylvania Lottery second-chance drawing or promotion that is subsequently selected to win a prize.

13. *Unclaimed prize money:* For a period of 1 year from the announced close of \$1 Million Merry & Bright, prize money from winning \$1 Million Merry & Bright instant lottery game tickets will be retained by the Secretary for payment to the persons entitled thereto. If no claim is made within 1 year of the announced close of the \$1 Million Merry & Bright instant lottery game, the right of a ticket holder to claim the prize represented by the ticket, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided for by statute.

14. *Governing law:* In purchasing a ticket, the customer agrees to comply with and abide by the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314), 61 Pa. Code Part V (relating to State Lotteries) and the provisions contained in this notice.

15. *Termination of the game:* The Secretary may announce a termination date, after which no further tickets from this game may be sold. The announcement will be disseminated through media used to advertise or promote \$1 Million Merry & Bright or through normal communications methods.

1. *Name:* The name of the game is Pennsylvania Holiday Cash Blowout (hereinafter "Holiday Cash Blowout"). The game number is PA-1428.

2. *Price:* The price of a Holiday Cash Blowout instant lottery game ticket is \$5.

3. *Play symbols:* Each Holiday Cash Blowout instant lottery game ticket will contain a play area featuring a "WINNING NUMBERS" area, a "YOUR NUMBERS" area, and a "CASH BONUS" area. The "CASH BONUS" area is played separately. The play symbols and their captions located in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area are: 1 (ONE), 2 (TWO), 3 (THREE), 4 (FOUR), 5 (FIVE), 6 (SIX), 7 (SEVEN), 8 (EIGHT), 9 (NINE), 10 (TEN), 11 (ELEVN), 12 (TWLV), 13 (THRTN), 14 (FORTN), 15 (FIFTN), 16 (SIXTN), 17 (SVNTN), 18 (EGHTN), 19 (NINTN), 20 (TWENT), 21 (TWYONE), 22 (TWY TWO), 23 (TWYTHR), 24 (TWYFOR), 25 (TWYFIV), 26 (TWYSIX), 27 (TWYSVN), 28 (TWYEGT), 29 (TWYNIN), and 30 (THIRT). The play symbols and their captions located in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area are: 1 (ONE), 2 (TWO), 3 (THREE), 4 (FOUR), 5 (FIVE), 6 (SIX), 7 (SEVEN), 8 (EIGHT), 9 (NINE), 10 (TEN), 11 (ELEVN), 12 (TWLV), 13 (THRTN), 14 (FORTN), 15 (FIFTN), 16 (SIXTN), 17 (SVNTN), 18 (EGHTN), 19 (NINTN), 20

(TWENTY), 21 (TWYONE), 22 (TWY TWO), 23 (TWY THR), 24 (TWY FOR), 25 (TWY FIV), 26 (TWY SIX), 27 (TWY SVN), 28 (TWY EGT), 29 (TWY NIN), 30 (THIRT), a Gift Tag (GIFT TAG) symbol and a BLOWOUT (WINALL) symbol. The play symbols and their captions located in the "CASH BONUS" area are: Reindeer (NO BONUS) symbol, Gift (TRY AGAIN) symbol, Bells (NO BONUS) symbol, Candy Cane (TRY AGAIN) symbol, Holly (NO BONUS) symbol, Cookie (TRY AGAIN) symbol, Mitten (NO BONUS) symbol, Sleigh (TRY AGAIN) symbol and a \$50 Burst (WIN\$50) symbol.

4. *Prize symbols:* The prize symbols and their captions located in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area are: \$5⁰⁰ (FIV DOL), \$10⁰⁰ (TEN DOL), \$20⁰⁰ (TWENTY), \$25⁰⁰ (TWY FIV), \$50⁰⁰ (FIFTY), \$100 (ONE HUN), \$200 (TWO HUN), \$500 (FIV HUN), \$1,000 (ONE THO), \$10,000 (TEN THO), and \$100,000 (ONEHUNTHO).

7. *Approximate number of tickets printed for the game:* Approximately 12,600,000 tickets will be printed for the Holiday Cash Blowout instant lottery game.

8. *Determination of prize winners:*

(a) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$100,000 (ONEHUNTHO) appears in the "prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100,000.

(b) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$10,000 (TEN THO) appears in the "prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$10,000.

(c) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$1,000 (ONE THO) appears in the "prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1,000.

(d) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols is a Gift Tag (GIFT TAG) symbol and a prize symbol of \$1,000 (ONE THO) appears in the "prize" area under that Gift Tag (GIFT TAG) play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1,000.

(e) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols is a BLOWOUT (WINALL) symbol, and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in eight of the "prize" areas and a prize symbol of \$50⁰⁰ (FIFTY) appears in four of the "prize" areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1,000.

(f) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols is a BLOWOUT (WINALL) symbol, and a prize symbol of \$200 (TWO HUN) appears

in four of the "prize" areas, a prize symbol of \$25⁰⁰ (TWY FIV) appears in two of the "prize" areas, a prize symbol of \$20⁰⁰ (TWENTY) appears in four of the "prize" areas and a prize symbol of \$10⁰⁰ (TEN DOL) appears in two of the "prize" areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$950.

(a) *Qualifying Tickets:* Non-winning PA-1426 \$1 Million Merry & Bright (\$20), PA-1427 Secret Santa (\$10), PA-1428 Holiday Cash Blowout (\$5), PA-1429 Jingle All the Way (\$3), PA-1430 Snowball Buck\$ (\$2), and PA-1431 Oh, What Fun (\$1) instant game tickets are eligible for entry into the Drawing.

(b) *Participation and entry:*

(1) Entrants must be members of the Pennsylvania Lottery VIP Players Club to participate in the Drawing. To join the VIP Players Club, visit <http://www.palottery.state.pa.us/vipplayersclub/login.aspx>. Becoming a VIP Players Club member is free.

(2) To enter the Drawing, entrants must submit the identifying information from at least one Qualifying Ticket via the Drawing's promotional web site, available at <http://www.palottery.com>, or the Pennsylvania Lottery's official mobile application, during the entry period. The identifying information from a Qualifying Ticket may be submitted only once for the Drawing. Entries will automatically be awarded at the time of successful submission of a Qualifying Ticket. No other method of submission will be accepted. Entries submitted using any other method, including entries mailed or hand-delivered to the Pennsylvania Lottery, are not valid and will be disqualified.

(3) Each entry must be complete and the information supplied by the entrant must be accurate. Incomplete entries cannot be submitted.

(4) Only one claimant per entry allowed.

(5) Entrants must be 18 years of age or older.

(6) Players may submit the identifying information from an unlimited number of Qualifying Tickets.

(7) Once an entry has been submitted it cannot be withdrawn or changed.

(c) *Drawing description:*

(1) The Lottery will conduct one Holly Jolly Second-Chance Drawing for qualifying instant Lottery game tickets. All time references are Eastern Prevailing Time.

(3) The Lottery will conduct one Drawing from among all the entries received during the entry period as described in section 10(c)(2).

(i) The first entry selected from the total number of instant Lottery game ticket entries awarded in the Drawing will be a winning entry, and the entrant who submitted the winning entry shall be entitled to a prize of \$100,000, less required income tax withholding.

(ii) The second through the fifth entries selected from the total number of instant Lottery game ticket entries awarded in the Drawing will be winning entries, and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$50,000, less required income tax withholding.

(iii) The sixth through the tenth entries selected from the total number of instant Lottery game ticket entries awarded in the Drawing will be winning entries, and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$10,000, less required income tax withholding.

(iv) The eleventh through the twentieth entries selected from the total number of instant Lottery game entries awarded in the Drawing will be winning entries, and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$5,000.

(2) The Lottery is not responsible for late, lost or misdirected entries not entered into the Drawing. The Lottery is not responsible for entries that are not entered into the Drawing because of incompatible internet browsers, mobile Lottery application failure or other technical issues. If a Drawing entry is selected as a winner and rejected during or following the Drawing, the Lottery will select another entry to replace the rejected entry in accordance with these rules and Lottery procedure.

(3) If any discrepancy exists between these rules and any material describing the Drawing, these rules shall govern.

(4) Employees of the Pennsylvania Lottery, MARC USA, Scientific Games International, Inc., MDI Entertainment, LLC, and their subcontractors, or a spouse, child, brother, sister or parent residing as a member of the same household in the principle place of residence of any such person are not eligible to participate in the Drawing. Offer void where prohibited or restricted.

(5) The Pennsylvania Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to cancel or suspend the Drawing and change these rules if the Drawing cannot be conducted as planned due to errors in these rules or advertising, unauthorized intervention, tampering, fraud, technical errors, viruses, worms, bugs, or any other cause beyond the control of the Pennsylvania Lottery that, in the Pennsylvania Lottery's sole judgment, could corrupt or impair the administration, security, fairness, integrity, or proper conduct of the Drawing.

(6) All entries shall be subject to verification by the Pennsylvania Lottery.

(7) The Pennsylvania Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to disqualify an entrant found to be tampering with the operation of the Drawing or to be acting in violation of these rules or applicable law.

(8) The Drawing is governed by the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Applicable laws and regulations apply.

(9) Prizes must be claimed within 1 year of the drawing date of the Drawing in which the prize was won. If no claim is made within 1 year of the drawing date of the Drawing in which the prize was won, the right of an entrant to claim the prize won, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided by statute.

(10) Final determination of winners will be made by the Secretary, whose judgment will be final and binding.

(11) A prize awarded in the Drawing to a person who dies before receiving the prize shall be paid according to 61 Pa. Code § 811.16 (relating to prizes payable after death of a prize winner).

(12) A winner is responsible for all taxes arising from or in connection with any prize won.

(13) A player may only win the prize for which the player is first selected in the Drawing. Subsequent entries, from the same individual, selected in the same Drawing will be disqualified and a replacement entry will be selected.

(15) Prizes are not transferrable.

(16) Other restrictions may apply.

11. *Retailer incentive awards:* The Lottery may conduct a separate Retailer Incentive Program for retailers who sell Holiday Cash Blowout instant lottery game tickets.

12. *Retailer bonus:* The Lottery may offer a retailer bonus in connection with the sale of Pennsylvania instant lottery game tickets. If a retailer bonus is offered, a Lottery retailer shall be eligible for a bonus as described in this section. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$100,000 and not exceeding \$500,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$500. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$500,001 and not exceeding \$1,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$5,000. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$1,000,001 and not exceeding \$10,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$10,000. A Lottery retailer is entitled only to the largest bonus for which he qualifies on a winning ticket. A bonus will be initiated for payment after the instant ticket is claimed and validated. A bonus will not be awarded to a Lottery retailer that sells a non-winning Pennsylvania Lottery instant ticket used to enter a Pennsylvania Lottery second-chance drawing or promotion that is subsequently selected to win a prize.

13. *Unclaimed prize money:* For a period of 1 year from the announced close of Holiday Cash Blowout, prize money from winning Holiday Cash Blowout instant lottery game tickets will be retained by the Secretary for payment to the persons entitled thereto. If no claim is made within 1 year of the announced close of the Holiday Cash Blowout instant lottery game, the right of a ticket holder to claim the prize represented by the ticket, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided for by statute.

14. *Governing law:* In purchasing a ticket, the customer agrees to comply with and abide by the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314), 61 Pa. Code Part V (relating to State Lotteries) and the provisions contained in this notice.

15. *Termination of the game:* The Secretary may announce a termination date, after which no further tickets

from this game may be sold. The announcement will be disseminated through media used to advertise or promote Holiday Cash Blowout or through normal communications methods.

Under the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314) and 61 Pa. Code § 819.203 (relating to notice of instant game rules), the Secretary of Revenue hereby provides public notice of the rules for the following instant lottery game:

1. *Name:* The name of the game is Pennsylvania Jingle All the Way (hereinafter "Jingle All the Way"). The game number is PA-1429.

2. *Price:* The price of a Jingle All the Way instant lottery game ticket is \$3.

3. *Play symbols:* Each Jingle All the Way instant lottery game ticket will contain one play area featuring ten "ROW" areas. Each "ROW" is played separately. The play symbols and their captions located in the play area are: Bell (BELL) symbol, Tree (TREE) symbol, Deer (DEER) symbol, Snowman (SNOWMAN) symbol, Present (PRESENT) symbol, Light (LIGHT) symbol, Skate (SKATE) symbol, Mitten (MITTEN) symbol, Bow (BOW) symbol, Cookie (COOKIE) symbol, Candy Cane (CANDY CANE) symbol, and a Jingle (WIN\$30) symbol.

4. *Prize Symbols:* The prize symbols and their captions located in the "PRIZE LEGEND" area are: \$3, \$5, \$10, \$15, \$20, \$50, \$100, \$300, \$1,000, \$3,000, and \$50,000.

5. *Prizes:* The prizes that can be won in this game are: \$3, \$5, \$10, \$15, \$20, \$30, \$50, \$100, \$300, \$1,000, \$3,000, and \$50,000. A player can win up to 10 times on a ticket.

6. *Second-Chance Drawing:* The Pennsylvania Lottery will conduct a Holly Jolly Second-Chance Drawing for which non-winning Jingle All the Way instant lottery game tickets may be eligible as provided for in section 10 (relating to Second-Chance Drawings).

7. *Approximate number of tickets printed for the game:* Approximately 8,400,000 tickets will be printed for the Jingle All the Way instant lottery game.

8. *Determination of prize winners:*

(a) Holders of tickets upon which three Bell (BELL) play symbols appear in the same "ROW," on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$50,000.

(b) Holders of tickets upon which three Tree (TREE) play symbols appear in the same "ROW," on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$3,000.

(c) Holders of tickets upon which three Deer (DEER) play symbols appear in the same "ROW," on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1,000.

(d) Holders of tickets upon which three Snowman (SNOWMAN) play symbols appear in the same "ROW," on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$300.

(e) Holders of tickets upon which three Present (PRESENT) play symbols appear in the same "ROW," on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.

(f) Holders of tickets upon which three Light (LIGHT) play symbols appear in the same "ROW," on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$50.

(g) Holders of tickets upon which a Jingle (WIN\$30) symbol appears in any "ROW," on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$30.

(h) Holders of tickets upon which three Skate (SKATE) play symbols appear in the same "ROW," on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$20.

(i) Holders of tickets upon which three Mitten (MITTEN) play symbols appear in the same "ROW," on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$15.

(j) Holders of tickets upon which three Bow (BOW) play symbols appear in the same "ROW," on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$10.

(k) Holders of tickets upon which three Cookie (COOKIE) play symbols appear in the same "ROW," on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$5.

(l) Holders of tickets upon which three Candy Cane (CANDY CANE) play symbols appear in the same "ROW," on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$3.

Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$1,000,001 and not exceeding \$10,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$10,000. A Lottery retailer is entitled only to the largest bonus for which he qualifies on a winning ticket. A bonus will be initiated for payment after the instant ticket is claimed and validated. A bonus will not be awarded to a Lottery retailer that sells a non-winning Pennsylvania Lottery instant ticket used to enter a Pennsylvania Lottery second-chance drawing or promotion that is subsequently selected to win a prize.

13. *Unclaimed prize money:* For a period of 1 year from the announced close of Jingle All the Way, prize money from winning Jingle All the Way instant lottery game tickets will be retained by the Secretary for payment to the persons entitled thereto. (i) The first entry selected from the total number of instant Lottery game ticket entries awarded in the Drawing will be a winning entry, and the entrant who submitted the winning entry shall be entitled to a prize of \$100,000, less required income tax withholding.

(ii) The second through the fifth entries selected from the total number of instant Lottery game ticket entries awarded in the Drawing will be winning entries, and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$50,000, less required income tax withholding.

(iii) The sixth through the tenth entries selected from the total number of instant Lottery game ticket entries awarded in the Drawing will be winning entries, and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$10,000, less required income tax withholding.

(iv) The eleventh through the twentieth entries selected from the total number of instant Lottery game

entries awarded in the Drawing will be winning entries, and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$5,000.

(v) The twenty-first through the seventieth entries selected from the total number of instant Lottery game entries awarded in the Drawing will be winning entries, and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$100 iLottery Bonus Money.

(4) All prizes will be paid as a lump-sum cash payment or uploaded to a winning player’s Lottery account.

(5) Winners of iLottery Bonus Money are not required to claim a prize. Winners of iLottery Bonus Money will have the iLottery Bonus Money credited to their Lottery account and will receive an email notifying them that they won a prize.

(6) The number of winning entries to be selected for the Drawing will be posted to the Pennsylvania Lottery’s publicly accessible web site.

(7) The odds of an entry being selected in the Drawing depend upon the total number of entries awarded for the Drawing.

(8) A computer generated randomizer will be used to select the winning entries.

(e) *Drawing restrictions:*

(1) To be eligible to participate in the Drawing, entrants must have complied with the requirements of these rules.

(2) The Lottery is not responsible for late, lost or misdirected entries not entered into the Drawing. The Lottery is not responsible for entries that are not entered into the Drawing because of incompatible internet browsers, mobile Lottery application failure or other technical issues. If a Drawing entry is selected as a winner and rejected during or following the Drawing, the Lottery will select another entry to replace the rejected entry in accordance with these rules and Lottery procedure.

(3) If any discrepancy exists between these rules and any material describing the Drawing, these rules shall govern.

(4) Employees of the Pennsylvania Lottery, MARC USA, Scientific Games International, Inc., MDI Entertainment, LLC, and their subcontractors, or a spouse, child, brother, sister or parent residing as a member of the same household in the principle place of residence of any such person are not eligible to participate in the Drawing. Offer void where prohibited or restricted.

(5) The Pennsylvania Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to cancel or suspend the Drawing and change these rules if the Drawing cannot be conducted as planned due to errors in these rules or advertising, unauthorized intervention, tampering, fraud, technical errors, viruses, worms, bugs, or any other cause beyond the control of the Pennsylvania Lottery that, in the Pennsylvania Lottery's sole judgment, could corrupt or impair the administration, security, fairness, integrity, or proper conduct of the Drawing.

(6) All entries shall be subject to verification by the Pennsylvania Lottery.

(7) The Pennsylvania Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to disqualify an entrant found to be tampering with the operation of the Drawing or to be acting in violation of these rules or applicable law.

(8) The Drawing is governed by the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Applicable laws and regulations apply.

(9) Prizes must be claimed within 1 year of the drawing date of the Drawing in which the prize was won. If no claim is made within 1 year of the drawing date of the Drawing in which the prize was won, the right of an entrant to claim the prize won, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided by statute.

(10) Final determination of winners will be made by the Secretary, whose judgment will be final and binding.

(11) A prize awarded in the Drawing to a person who dies before receiving the prize shall be paid according to 61 Pa. Code § 811.16 (relating to prizes payable after death of a prize winner).

(12) A winner is responsible for all taxes arising from or in connection with any prize won.

(13) A player may only win the prize for which the player is first selected in the Drawing. Subsequent entries, from the same individual, selected in the same Drawing will be disqualified and a replacement entry will be selected.

(14) Winners of iLottery Bonus Money must abide by the iLottery terms and conditions, the iLottery Bonus Policy and these rules. iLottery Bonus Money will expire 90 days from the date on which the winner was notified, via email, of the prize win, as further detailed in section 10(d)(5). iLottery Bonus Money has a five times play through requirement in order to convert the iLottery Bonus Money into cash. For example, if a player wins \$100 of iLottery Bonus Money, the player is required to place \$500 in wagers before the iLottery Bonus Money awarded is converted into cash, which may be withdrawn from the player's Lottery account.

(15) Prizes are not transferrable.

(16) Other restrictions may apply.

11. *Retailer incentive awards:* The Lottery may conduct a separate Retailer Incentive Program for retailers who sell Oh, What Fun instant lottery game tickets.

12. *Retailer bonus:* The Lottery may offer a retailer bonus in connection with the sale of Pennsylvania instant lottery game tickets. If a retailer bonus is offered, a Lottery retailer shall be eligible for a bonus as described in this section. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$100,000 and not exceeding \$500,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$500. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$500,001 and not exceeding \$1,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$5,000. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$1,000,001 and not exceeding \$10,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$10,000. A Lottery retailer is entitled only to the largest bonus for which he qualifies on a winning ticket. A bonus will be initiated for payment after the instant ticket is claimed and validated. A bonus will not be awarded to a Lottery retailer that sells a non-winning Pennsylvania Lottery instant ticket used to enter a Pennsylvania Lottery second-chance drawing or promotion that is subsequently selected to win a prize.

13. *Unclaimed prize money:* For a period of 1 year from the announced close of Oh, What Fun, prize money from winning Oh, What Fun instant lottery game tickets will be retained by the Secretary for payment to the persons entitled thereto. If no claim is made within 1 year of the announced close of the Oh, What Fun instant lottery game, the right of a ticket holder to claim the prize represented by the ticket, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided for by statute.

14. *Governing law:* In purchasing a ticket, the customer agrees to comply with and abide by the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314), 61 Pa. Code Part V (relating to State Lotteries) and the provisions contained in this notice.

15. *Termination of the game:* The Secretary may announce a termination date, after which no further tickets from this game may be sold. The announcement will be disseminated through media used to advertise or promote Oh, What Fun or through normal communications methods.

Under the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314) and 61 Pa. Code § 819.203 (relating to notice of instant game rules), the Secretary of Revenue hereby provides public notice of the rules for the following instant lottery game:

1. *Name:* The name of the game is Pennsylvania Secret Santa (hereinafter “Secret Santa”). The game number is PA-1427.

2. *Price:* The price of a Secret Santa instant lottery game ticket is \$10.

3. *Play symbols:* Each Secret Santa instant lottery game ticket will contain one play area featuring a “WINNING NUMBERS” area, a “YOUR NUMBERS” area, and a “BEARD BONUS” area. The “BEARD BONUS” area is played separately. The play symbols and their captions located in the “WINNING NUMBERS” area are: 1 (ONE), 2 (TWO), 3 (THREE), 4 (FOUR), 5 (FIVE), 6 (SIX), 7 (SEVEN), 8 (EIGHT), 9 (NINE), 10 (TEN), 11 (ELEVN), 12 (TWLV), 13 (THRTN), 14 (FORTN), 15 (FIFTN), 16 (SIXTN), 17 (SVNTN), 18 (EGHTN), 19 (NINTN), 20 (TWENT), 21 (TWYONE), 22 (TWYTWO), 23 (TWYTHR), 24 (TWYFOR), 25 (TWYFIV), 26 (TWYSIX), 27 (TWYSVN), 28 (TWYEGT), 29 (TWYNIN), 30 (THIRT), 31 (THYONE), 32 (THYTWO), 33 (THYTHR), 34 (THYFOR), 35 (THYFIV), 36 (THYSIX), 37 (THYSVN), 38 (THYEGT), 39 (THYNIN), and 40 (FORT). 4. *Prize symbols:* The prize symbols and their captions located in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area are: \$10⁰⁰ (TEN DOL), \$15⁰⁰ (FIFTEEN), \$20⁰⁰ (TWENTY), \$30⁰⁰ (THIRTY), \$50⁰⁰ (FIFTY), \$100 (ONE HUN), \$150 (ONEHUNFTY), \$200 (TWO HUN), \$400 (FOR HUN), \$500 (FIV HUN), \$1,000 (ONE THO), \$10,000 (TEN THO), and \$300,000 (THRHUNTHO). The prize symbols and their captions located in the “BEARD BONUS” area are: \$10⁰⁰ (TEN DOL), \$15⁰⁰ (FIFTEEN), \$20⁰⁰ (TWENTY), \$30⁰⁰ (THIRTY), \$50⁰⁰ (FIFTY), \$100 (ONE HUN), \$150 (ONEHUNFTY), and \$200 (TWO HUN).

5. *Prizes:* The prizes that can be won in this game are: \$10, \$15, \$20, \$30, \$50, \$100, \$150, \$200, \$400, \$500, \$1,000, \$10,000, and \$300,000. A player can win up to 16 times on a ticket.

6. *Second-Chance Drawing:* The Pennsylvania Lottery will conduct a Holly Jolly Second-Chance Drawing for

which non-winning Secret Santa instant lottery game tickets may be eligible as provided for in section 10 (relating to Second-Chance Drawings).

7. *Approximate number of tickets printed for the game:* Approximately 6,600,000 tickets will be printed for the Secret Santa instant lottery game.

8. *Determination of prize winners:*

(a) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols matches any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$300,000 (THRHUNTHO) appears in the “prize” area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$300,000.

(b) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols matches any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$10,000 (TEN THO) appears in the “prize” area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$10,000.

(c) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols matches any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$1,000 (ONE THO) appears in the “prize” area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1,000.

(d) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols is a Stocking (STOCKING) symbol and a prize symbol of \$1,000 (ONE THO) appears in the “prize” area under that Stocking (STOCKING) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1,000.

(e) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols is a Santa (WINALL) symbol, and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in five of the “prize” areas and a prize symbol of \$50⁰⁰ (FIFTY) appears in ten of the “prize” areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1,000.

(mm) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols is a Stocking (STOCKING) symbol and a prize symbol of \$15.⁰⁰ (FIFTEEN) appears in the “prize” area under that Stocking (STOCKING) play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$15.

(nn) Holders of tickets upon which a Cookie Crumb (CRUMB) symbol appears in the “BEARD BONUS” area, and a prize symbol of \$15.⁰⁰ (FIFTEEN) appears in the “prize” area under that Cookie Crumb (CRUMB) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$15.

(oo) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols matches any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$10.⁰⁰ (TEN DOL) appears in the “prize” area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$10.

(pp) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols is a Stocking (STOCKING) symbol and a prize symbol of \$10.⁰⁰ (TEN DOL) appears in the “prize” area under that Stocking (STOCKING) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$10.

(qq) Holders of tickets upon which a Cookie Crumb (CRUMB) symbol appears in the “BEARD BONUS” area, and a prize symbol of \$10.⁰⁰ (TEN DOL) appears in the “prize” area under that Cookie Crumb (CRUMB) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$10.

(1) Entrants must be members of the Pennsylvania Lottery VIP Players Club to participate in the Drawing. To join the VIP Players Club, visit <http://www.palottery.state.pa.us/vipplayersclub/login.aspx>. Becoming a VIP Players Club member is free.

(2) To enter the Drawing, entrants must submit the identifying information from at least one Qualifying Ticket via the Drawing's promotional web site, available at <http://www.palottery.com>, or the Pennsylvania Lottery's official mobile application, during the entry period. (3) The Lottery will conduct one Drawing from among all the entries received during the entry period as described in section 10(c)(2).

(i) The first entry selected from the total number of instant Lottery game ticket entries awarded in the Drawing will be a winning entry, and the entrant who submitted the winning entry shall be entitled to a prize of \$100,000, less required income tax withholding.

(ii) The second through the fifth entries selected from the total number of instant Lottery game ticket entries

awarded in the Drawing will be winning entries, and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$50,000, less required income tax withholding.

If a Drawing entry is selected as a winner and rejected during or following the Drawing, the Lottery will select another entry to replace the rejected entry in accordance with these rules and Lottery procedure.

(3) If any discrepancy exists between these rules and any material describing the Drawing, these rules shall govern.

(4) Employees of the Pennsylvania Lottery, MARC USA, Scientific Games International, Inc., MDI Entertainment, LLC, and their subcontractors, or a spouse, child, brother, sister or parent residing as a member of the same household in the principle place of residence of any such person are not eligible to participate in the Drawing. Offer void where prohibited or restricted.

(5) The Pennsylvania Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to cancel or suspend the Drawing and change these rules if the Drawing cannot be conducted as planned due to errors in these rules or advertising, unauthorized intervention, tampering, fraud, technical errors, viruses, worms, bugs, or any other cause beyond the control of the Pennsylvania Lottery that, in the Pennsylvania Lottery's sole judgment, could corrupt or impair the administration, security, fairness, integrity, or proper conduct of the Drawing.

(6) All entries shall be subject to verification by the Pennsylvania Lottery.

(7) The Pennsylvania Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to disqualify an entrant found to be

tampering with the operation of the Drawing or to be acting in violation of these rules or applicable law.

(8) The Drawing is governed by the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Applicable laws and regulations apply.

(9) Prizes must be claimed within 1 year of the drawing date of the Drawing in which the prize was won. If no claim is made within 1 year of the drawing date of the Drawing in which the prize was won, the right of an entrant to claim the prize won, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided by statute.

(10) Final determination of winners will be made by the Secretary, whose judgment will be final and binding.

(11) A prize awarded in the Drawing to a person who dies before receiving the prize shall be paid according to 61 Pa. Code § 811.16 (relating to prizes payable after death of a prize winner).

12. *Retailer bonus:* The Lottery may offer a retailer bonus in connection with the sale of Pennsylvania instant lottery game tickets. If a retailer bonus is offered, a Lottery retailer shall be eligible for a bonus as described in this section. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$100,000 and not exceeding \$500,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$500. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$500,001 and not exceeding \$1,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$5,000. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$1,000,001 and not exceeding \$10,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$10,000. A Lottery retailer is entitled only to the largest bonus for which he qualifies on a winning ticket. A bonus will be initiated for payment after the instant ticket is claimed and validated. A bonus will not be awarded to a Lottery retailer that sells a non-winning Pennsylvania Lottery instant ticket used to enter

a Pennsylvania Lottery second-chance drawing or promotion that is subsequently selected to win a prize.

13. *Unclaimed prize money:* For a period of 1 year from the announced close of Secret Santa, prize money from winning Secret Santa instant lottery game tickets will be retained by the Secretary for payment to the persons entitled thereto. If no claim is made within 1 year of the announced close of the Secret Santa instant lottery game, the right of a ticket holder to claim the prize represented by the ticket, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided for by statute.

14. *Governing law:* In purchasing a ticket, the customer agrees to comply with and abide by the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314), 61 Pa. Code Part V (relating to State Lotteries) and the provisions contained in this notice.

15. *Termination of the game:* The Secretary may announce a termination date, after which no further tickets from this game may be sold. The announcement will be disseminated through media used to advertise or promote Secret Santa or through normal communications methods.

Under the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314) and 61 Pa. Code § 819.203 (relating to notice of instant game rules), the Secretary of Revenue hereby provides public notice of the rules for the following instant lottery game:

1. *Name:* The name of the game is Pennsylvania Snowball Buck\$ (hereinafter “Snowball Buck\$”). The game number is PA-1430.

2. *Price:* The price of a Snowball Buck\$ instant lottery game ticket is \$2.

3. *Play symbols:* Each Snowball Buck\$ instant lottery game ticket will contain one play area. The play symbols and their captions located in the play area are: Candy Cane (CANDY CANE) symbol, Reindeer (DEER) symbol, Ornament (ORNAMENT) symbol, Mitten (MITTEN) symbol, Stocking (STOCKING) symbol, Bells (BELLS) symbol, Holly (HOLLY) symbol, Scarf (SCARF) symbol, Tree (TREE) symbol, Lights (LIGHTS) symbol, Santa Hat (SANTA HAT) symbol, Present (PRESENT) symbol, Candle (CANDLE) symbol, Cookie (COOKIE) symbol, Sleigh (SLEIGH) symbol, Wreath (WREATH) symbol, Nutcracker (NUTCRACKER) symbol, Snowballs (SNOWBALLS) symbol, and a Bucks (BUCK\$) symbol.

4. *Prize symbols:* The prize symbols and their captions located in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area are: \$2⁰⁰ (TWO DOL), \$4⁰⁰ (FOR DOL), \$5⁰⁰ (FIV DOL), \$10⁰⁰ (TEN DOL), \$20⁰⁰ (TWENTY), \$40⁰⁰ (FORTY), \$100 (ONE HUN), \$200 (TWO HUN), \$500 (FIV HUN), \$1,000 (ONE THO), and \$20,000 (TWY THO).

5. *Prizes:* The prizes that can be won in this game are: \$2, \$4, \$5, \$10, \$20, \$40, \$100, \$200, \$500, \$1,000, and \$20,000. A player can win up to 10 times on a ticket.

6. *Second-Chance Drawing:* The Pennsylvania Lottery will conduct a Holly Jolly Second-Chance Drawing for which non-winning Snowball Buck\$ instant lottery game tickets may be eligible as provided for in section 10 (relating to Second-Chance Drawings).

7. *Approximate number of tickets printed for the game:* Approximately 10,800,000 tickets will be printed for the Snowball Buck\$ instant lottery game.

8. *Determination of prize winners:*

(a) Holders of tickets upon which a Snowballs (SNOWBALLS) play symbol appears in the play area and a prize symbol of \$20,000 (TWY THO) appears in the “PRIZE” area under that Snowballs (SNOWBALLS) play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$20,000.

(b) Holders of tickets upon which a Snowballs (SNOWBALLS) symbol appears in the play area and a prize symbol of \$1,000 (ONE THO) appears in the “PRIZE” area under that Snowballs (SNOWBALLS) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1,000.

(c) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the play symbols in the play area is a Bucks (BUCK\$) symbol and a prize symbol of \$200 (TWO HUN) appears in two of the “PRIZE” areas, a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in five of the “PRIZE” areas, a prize symbol of \$40⁰⁰ (FORTY) appears in two of the “PRIZE” areas and a prize symbol of \$20⁰⁰ (TWENTY) appears in one of the “PRIZE” areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1,000.

(d) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the play symbols in the play area is a Bucks (BUCK\$) symbol and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in all ten of the “PRIZE” areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1,000.

Revision of the Maximum Allowable Sulfur Content Limit for No. 2 and Light Commercial Fuel Oil

We submit for your consideration the following comments on the proposed rulemaking published in the July 6, 2019 *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. Our comments are based on criteria in Section 5.2 of the Regulatory Review Act (71 P.S. § 745.5b). Section 5.1(a) of the Regulatory Review Act (71 P.S. § 745.5a(a)) directs the Environmental Quality Board (Board) to respond to all comments received from us or any other source.

1. Implementation procedures.

This proposed regulation lowers the maximum allowable sulfur content limit for No. 2 and lighter commercial fuel oil from the current limit of 500 parts per million (ppm) to 15 ppm. The Board stated in Section 29 of the Regulatory Analysis Form (RAF) that the expected effective date of the final-form regulation is the first quarter of 2020, with an implementation date 60 days following final-form publication of the regulation in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Two commentators submitted comments supporting the proposed reduction of sulfur content while expressing concern with the effective and implementation dates. These commentators explained that the fuel oil supply chain will need to cycle through the existing inventory of No. 2 and lighter commercial fuel oil at the current sulfur content limit of 500 ppm within 60 days of an unknown date. They state that the transition from 500 ppm to 15 ppm will require sufficient notice to account for seasonal demands.

Did the Board consider a fixed implementation date to allow the regulated community to plan for the transition to the lower sulfur content limit? We ask the Board to explain in the preamble to the final-form regulation the reasonableness of a 60-day implementation period based on the effective date of the final-form regulation. Further, we ask the Board to work with the regulated community to ensure that the implementation procedures for the final-form regulation will allow the fuel oil transportation system to efficiently meet the lower sulfur limit for No. 2 and lighter commercial fuel oil with minimal fiscal impact.

2. Whether a less costly or less intrusive alternative method of achieving the goal of the regulation has been considered for regulations impacting small businesses.

Senator Scott Hutchinson submitted a comment opposing the proposed regulation, noting that the immediate reduction in sulfur content is "drastic and overly burdensome, especially on a small refinery that lacks the resources to invest in plant upgrades to meet the new standards." We ask the Board to explain in the preamble to the final-form regulation whether a less costly or less intrusive alternative method of achieving the goal of the regulation was considered for small businesses in the fuel oil supply chain impacted by this regulation.
