

READER'S GUIDE TO THE PENNSYLVANIA BULLETIN AND THE PENNSYLVANIA CODE

Pennsylvania Bulletin

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the official gazette of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. It is published weekly. A cumulative subject matter index is published quarterly.

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* serves several purposes. It is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, which is the official codification of agency rules and regulations, Statewide court rules, and other statutorily authorized documents. Changes in the codified text, whether by adoption, amendment, rescission, repeal or emergency action, must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

The following documents are published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*: Governor's Executive Orders; Summaries of Enacted Statutes; Statewide and Local Court Rules; Attorney General Opinions; Motor Carrier Applications before the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission; Applications and Actions before the Department of Environmental Protection; Orders of the Independent Regulatory Review Commission; and other documents authorized by law.

The text of certain documents published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the only valid and enforceable text. Courts are required to take judicial notice of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Adoption, Amendment or Repeal of Regulations

Generally an agency wishing to adopt, amend or rescind regulations must first publish in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* a Proposed Rulemaking. There are limited instances when the agency may omit the proposal step; it still must publish the adopted version.

The Proposed Rulemaking contains the full text of the change, the agency contact person, a fiscal note required by law and background for the action.

The agency then allows sufficient time for public comment before taking final action. A Final Rule-making must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* before the changes can take effect. If the agency wishes to adopt changes to the Proposed Rulemaking to enlarge the scope, it must repropose.

Citation to the Pennsylvania Bulletin

Cite material in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* by volume number, a page number and date. Example: Volume 1, *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, page 801, January 9, 1971 (short form: 1 Pa.B. 801 (January 9, 1971)).

Pennsylvania Code

The *Pennsylvania Code* is the official codification of rules and regulations issued by Commonwealth agencies, Statewide court rules and other statutorily authorized documents. The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, printing changes when they are adopted. These changes are then permanently codified by the *Pennsylvania Code Reporter*, a monthly, loose-leaf supplement.

The *Pennsylvania Code* is cited by title number and section number. Example: Title 10 *Pennsylvania Code* § 1.1 (short form: 10 Pa. Code § 1.1).

Under the *Pennsylvania Code* codification system, each regulation is assigned a unique number by title and section. Titles roughly parallel the organization of Commonwealth government.

How to Find Rules and Regulations

Search for your area of interest in the *Pennsylva*nia Code. The *Pennsylvania Code* is available at www.pacodeandbulletin.gov.

Source Notes give the history of regulations. To see if there have been recent changes not yet codified, check the List of *Pennsylvania Code* Chapters Affected in the most recent issue of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

A chronological table of the history of *Pennsylva-nia Code* sections may be found at www.legis.state.pa.us/cfdocs/legis/CH/Public/pcde_index.cfm.

A quarterly List of *Pennsylvania Code* Sections Affected lists the regulations in numerical order, followed by the citation to the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* in which the change occurred.

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Printing Format

Rules, Regulations and Statements of Policy in Titles 1—107 of the Pennsylvania Code

Text proposed to be added is printed in <u>underscored bold face</u>. Text proposed to be deleted is enclosed in brackets [] and printed in **bold face**.

Proposed new chapters and sections are printed in regular type to enhance readability. Final rulemakings and statements of policy are printed in regular type.

Ellipses, a series of five asterisks, indicate text that is not amended.

In Proposed Rulemakings and proposed Statements of Policy, existing text corresponds to the official codified text in the *Pennsylvania Code*.

Court Rules in Titles 201—246 of the Pennsylvania Code

Added text in proposed and adopted court rules is printed in <u>underscored bold face</u>. Deleted text in proposed and adopted court rules is enclosed in brackets [] and printed in **bold face**.

Proposed new chapters and rules are printed in regular type to enhance readability.

Ellipses, a series of five asterisks, indicate text that is not amended.

Fiscal Notes

Section 612 of The Administrative Code of 1929 (71 P.S. § 232) requires the Governor's Budget Office to prepare a fiscal note for regulatory actions and administrative procedures of the administrative departments, boards, commissions and authorities receiving money from the State Treasury. The fiscal note states whether the action or procedure causes a loss of revenue or an increase in the cost of programs for the Commonwealth or its political subdivisions. The fiscal note is required to be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* at the same time as the change is advertised.

A fiscal note provides the following information: (1) the designation of the fund out of which the appropriation providing for expenditures under the action or procedure shall be made; (2) the probable cost for the fiscal year the program is implemented; (3) projected cost estimate of the program for each of the 5 succeeding fiscal years; (4) fiscal history of the program for which expenditures are to be made; (5) probable loss of revenue for the fiscal year of its implementation; (6) projected loss of revenue from the program for each of the 5 succeeding fiscal years; (7) line item, if any, of the General Appropriation Act or other appropriation act out of which expenditures or losses of Commonwealth funds shall occur as a result of the action or procedures; and (8) recommendation, if any, of the Secretary of the Budget and the reasons therefor.

The omission of an item indicates that the agency text of the fiscal note states that there is no information available with respect thereto. In items (3) and (6) information is set forth for the first through fifth fiscal years, following the year the program is implemented, which is stated. In item (4) information is set forth for the current and two immediately preceding years. In item (8) the recommendation, if any, made by the Secretary of the Budget is published with the fiscal note. "No fiscal impact" means no additional cost or revenue loss to the Commonwealth or its local political subdivision is intended. See 4 Pa. Code Chapter 7, Subchapter R (relating to fiscal notes).

Title 58—RECREATION

GAME COMMISSION

[58 PA. CODE CH. 141]

Hunting and Trapping; General

To effectively manage the wildlife resources of this Commonwealth, the Game Commission (Commission) at its July 9, 2022, meeting amends § 141.4 and Appendix G (relating to hunting hours) to replace the current hunting hours and migratory bird hunting hours tables to accurately reflect the dates and hours of legal hunting for the 2022-2023 hunting/trapping license year and also to delete the closure of open hunting hours for all other wild birds and wild mammals during the overlap with the regular firearms deer seasons.

This final-form rulemaking will not have an adverse impact on the wildlife resources of this Commonwealth.

The authority for this final-form rulemaking is 34 Pa.C.S. (relating to Game and Wildlife Code) (code).

Notice of proposed rulemaking was published at 52 Pa.B. 3103 (May 28, 2022).

1. Purpose and Authority

The Commission amends § 141.4 and Appendix G to replace the current hunting hours and migratory bird hunting hours tables to accurately reflect the dates and hours of legal hunting for the 2022-2023 hunting/trapping license year. As an additional matter for consideration, members of the falconry hunting community have recently approached the Commission to request an expansion of various falconry hunting seasons to include the 2-week period comprising the regular firearms deer season. As a general rule, § 141.4 establishes legal hunting hours within this Commonwealth from 1/2 hour before sunrise to 1/2 hour after sunset. However, this section also provides four exceptions to this general rule, including a closure under paragraph (1) of open hunting hours for all other wild birds and wild mammals during the overlap with the regular firearms deer seasons. Six exceptions to this hour closure for this overlap period are listed for hunting game birds on regulated hunting grounds, migratory waterfowl, coyotes, feral swine, wild boar and bear. The Commission has reviewed the expansion request submitted by the falconry hunting community and determined that it will not significantly impact other hunting activities occurring during the regular firearms deer seasons. The Commission therefore also amends § 141.4 to delete the closure of open hunting hours for all other wild birds and wild mammals during the overlap with the regular firearms deer seasons.

It is important to highlight that the deletion of this text will not only remove the impediment to falconry hunting during the overlap with the regular firearms deer seasons but will also simplify and streamline this section as a whole. Furthermore, removing the text associated with the closure to open hunting hours for all other wild birds and wild mammals during the overlap with the regular firearms deer seasons also eliminates the need to redundantly identify and list the six exceptions (seven if falconry were added) to the hour closure for the overlap

period. The Commission has determined current season and bag limit regulations found in § 139.4 (relating to seasons and bag limits for the license year) sufficiently control the allowance of the hunting of these species during the period of overlap with the regular firearms deer seasons thus eliminating the need for further reauthorization in § 141.4. It is also important to highlight that the hours expansion for falconers during the overlap with the regular firearms deer seasons will not substantively have its intended effect until the Commission expands the falconry hunting seasons during this overlap period in § 139.4. The remainder of the changes to § 141.4 are nonsubstantive housekeeping edits to improve the organization and clarity of the text.

Section 2102(a) of the code (relating to regulations) provides that "The commission shall promulgate such regulations as it deems necessary and appropriate concerning game or wildlife and hunting or furtaking in this Commonwealth, including regulations relating to the protection, preservation and management of game or wildlife and game or wildlife habitat, permitting or prohibiting hunting or furtaking, the ways, manner, methods and means of hunting or furtaking, and the health and safety of persons who hunt or take wildlife or may be in the vicinity of persons who hunt or take game or wildlife in this Commonwealth." The amendments to § 141.4 and Appendix G are adopted under this authority.

2. Regulatory Requirements

This final-form rulemaking amends § 141.4 and Appendix G to replace the current hunting hours and migratory bird hunting hours tables to accurately reflect the dates and hours of legal hunting for the 2022-2023 hunting/trapping license year and also to delete the closure of open hunting hours for all other wild birds and wild mammals during the overlap with the regular firearms deer seasons.

3. Persons Affected

Persons wishing to hunt or trap game or wildlife within this Commonwealth during the 2022-2023 hunting/ furtaking license year will be affected by this final-form rulemaking.

Annex A

TITLE 58. RECREATION PART III. GAME COMMISSION CHAPTER 141. HUNTING AND TRAPPING Subchapter A. GENERAL

§ 141.4. Hunting hours.

Except as otherwise provided in this section, wild birds and mammals may be hunted 1/2 hour before sunrise to 1/2 hour after sunset.

- (1) [Reserved].
- (2) Furbearer seasons. Raccoon, fox, skunk, opossum, coyote, bobcat and weasel may be hunted any hour, day or night.
- (3) Spring turkey season. Turkey may be hunted 1/2 hour before sunrise to 12 noon from the opening day of the spring gobbler season through the third Saturday and for the remainder of the season from 1/2 hour before sunrise to 1/2 hour after sunset.
- (4) Migratory bird seasons. Migratory birds may only be hunted 1/2 hour before sunrise until sunset, except during the snow goose conservation season and the September resident goose season, when geese may be hunted 1/2 hour before sunrise until 1/2 hour after sunset.

To effectively manage the wildlife resources of this Commonwealth, the Game Commission (Commission) at its July 9, 2022, meeting adds § 141.30 (relating to wild bobwhite quail recovery area) to create a wild bobwhite quail recovery area surrounding the Letterkenny Army Depot in Greene Township, Franklin County.

This final-form rulemaking will not have an adverse impact on the wildlife resources of this Commonwealth.

The authority for this final-form rulemaking is 34 Pa.C.S. (relating to Game and Wildlife Code) (code).

Notice of proposed rulemaking was published at 52 Pa.B. 3105 (May 28, 2022).

1. Purpose and Authority

The Commission adds § 141.30 to create a wild bobwhite quail recovery area surrounding the Letterkenny Army Depot in Greene Township, Franklin County. To maximize the likelihood of successful reintroduction, it is important to avoid any harvest mortality on the reintroduced population, as well as potential negative genetic effects from interbreeding with captive-reared bobwhites. Implementation of a wild bobwhite quail recovery area will provide important protections and facilitate dispersal and expansion of the reintroduced bobwhite quail population. The boundary of the recovery area was developed using major roads surrounding the Letterkenny Army Depot that are easily identified with a minimum distance of 7.4 kilometers (km) beyond the Letterkenny Army Depot boundary. Based on average spring dispersal of quail, the 7.4 km distance should provide an adequate buffer to protect almost all dispersing quail from harvest and minimize the possibility of interbreeding with captive-raised quail originating from beyond the restoration area boundary. The wild bobwhite quail recovery area surrounding the Letterkenny Army Depot will cover 177.65 square miles.

Section 2102(a) of the code (relating to regulations) provides that "The commission shall promulgate such regulations as it deems necessary and appropriate concerning game or wildlife and hunting or furtaking in this Commonwealth, including regulations relating to the protection, preservation and management of game or wildlife and game or wildlife habitat, permitting or prohibiting hunting or furtaking, the ways, manner, methods and means of hunting or furtaking, and the health and safety of persons who hunt or take wildlife or may be in the vicinity of persons who hunt or take game or wildlife in this Commonwealth." The addition of § 141.30 is adopted under this authority.

This final-form rulemaking adds § 141.30 to create a wild bobwhite quail recovery area surrounding the Letterkenny Army Depot in Greene Township, Franklin County.

TITLE 58. RECREATION PART III. GAME COMMISSION CHAPTER 141. HUNTING AND TRAPPING Subchapter B. SMALL GAME

§ 141.30. Bobwhite quail recovery area.

(a) *Definition*. For the purpose of this section, the phrase "bobwhite quail recovery area" includes and is limited to portions of Wildlife Management Units 4B and 5A in Franklin County, bounded and described as follows. Beginning in the southwestern extent of the bobwhite quail recovery area at the intersection of Route 30 (Lincoln Highway) and PA-75 (Path Valley Road), proceed east on Route 30 for approximately 15.3 miles to the intersection of Interstate 81. The boundary follows Interstate 81 north for 8.5 miles to exit 24 and continues left

on PA-696 (Old Scotland Road). Follow Old Scotland Road north for 2 miles then continue along PA-696 which becomes South Fayette Street. Follow South Fayette Street for 0.5 miles to West King Street. Follow left on West King Street, then right onto Spring Street, bear right onto Roxbury Road. Follow Roxbury Road for 9 miles to PA-641 (meets at Newburg Road, which becomes Forge Hill Road, Timmons Road, then Spring Run Road). The boundary follows PA-641 northwest for 7.5 miles then taking a left turn on Stone Bridge Road. At the end of Stone Bridge Road take a left onto PA-75 (Path Valley Road) and follow PA-75 for 17 miles to the intersection of Route 30 and the point of origin.

- (b) Prohibitions. It is unlawful to:
- (1) Release artificially propagated quail any time within any area designated as a bobwhite quail recovery
- (2) Hunt quail within any area designated as a bobwhite quail recovery area.

To effectively manage the wildlife resources of this Commonwealth, the Game Commission (Commission) at its July 9, 2022, meeting amends § 141.45 (relating to turkey seasons) to eliminate the use of shotguns and muzzleloaders that propel single-projectile ammunition during the fall turkey seasons.

This final-form rulemaking will not have an adverse impact on the wildlife resources of this Commonwealth.

The authority for this final-form rulemaking is 34 Pa.C.S. (relating to Game and Wildlife Code) (code).

Notice of proposed rulemaking was published at 52 Pa.B. 3101 (May 28, 2022).

1. Purpose and Authority

The Commission's final-form rulemaking, published at 51 Pa.B. 2940 (May 22, 2021), to remove rifles as lawful implements during fall turkey seasons became effective. Despite this change shotguns and muzzleloaders that propel single-projectile ammunition currently remain listed as permitted devices for use by hunters during fall turkey seasons in all Wildlife Management Units (WMU) with an open fall turkey season excluding those portions found within areas designated as special regulations areas (WMUs 2B, 5B, 5C and 5D). The Commission has observed that very few hunters hunt during the fall turkey seasons with a shotgun or muzzleloader using single projectile ammunition. After the changes were made to this section in 2021, the Commission remains focused on identifying alternative methods of stabilizing fall turkey harvest numbers without focusing solely on further reductions in hunting opportunity as measured by season length. The Commission has determined that the elimination of shotguns and muzzleloaders that propel single-projectile ammunition during fall turkey seasons may aid in this goal. The Commission amends § 141.45 to eliminate the use of shotguns and muzzleloaders that propel single-projectile ammunition during the fall turkey seasons.

Section 2102(d) of the code (relating to regulations) authorizes the Commission to "promulgate regulations stipulating the size and type of traps, the type of firearms and ammunition and other devices which may be used, the manner in which and the location where the devices may be used, the species the devices may be used for and the season when the devices may be used." The amendments to § 141.45 are adopted under this authority.

2. Regulatory Requirements

This final-form rulemaking amends § 141.45 to eliminate the use of shotguns and muzzleloaders that propel single-projectile ammunition during the fall turkey seasons.

3. Persons Affected

Persons interested in hunting turkey within this Commonwealth during the fall turkey seasons will be affected by this final-form rulemaking.

Subchapter C. BIG GAME

§ 141.45. Turkey seasons.

- (a) Fall turkey season.
- (1) Permitted devices. It is lawful to hunt turkey during the fall turkey season with any of the following devices:
 - (i) [Reserved].
- (ii) A manually operated or semiautomatic, centerfire shotgun or muzzleloading shotgun that propels multiple projectile shotgun ammunition no larger than # 4 lead, # 2 steel, or # 4 of any other composition or alloy of nontoxic shot approved by the Director of the United States Fish and Wildlife Service or an authorized representative under 50 CFR 20.134 (relating to approval of nontoxic shot types and shot coatings). A centerfire shotgun's magazine capacity may not exceed two rounds. The shotgun's total aggregate ammunition capacity may not exceed three rounds.
 - (iii) [Reserved].
- (iv) A bow and arrow. A bow must have a peak draw weight of at least 35 pounds. An arrow must be equipped with a broadhead that has an outside diameter or width of at least 7/8 inch and may not exceed 3.25 inches in length.
- (v) A crossbow and bolt. A crossbow must have a peak draw weight of at least 125 pounds. A bolt must be equipped with a broadhead that has an outside diameter or width of at least 7/8 inch and may not exceed 3.25 inches in length.
- (2) Prohibitions. While hunting turkey during the fall turkey season, it is unlawful to:
 - (i) [Reserved].
- (ii) Use drives or any method other than hand or mouth calling.
- (iii) Use or possess an electronic caller or a live turkey as a decoy.
- (iv) Use or possess a device or ammunition not provided for in the act or in this subsection, except as authorized under section 2525 of the act (relating to possession of firearm for protection of self or others).
 - (b) Spring turkey season.
- (1) Permitted devices. It is lawful to hunt turkey during the spring turkey season with any of the following devices:
- (i) A manually operated or semiautomatic, centerfire shotgun or muzzleloading shotgun using shot ammunition no larger than # 4 lead, # 2 steel, or # 4 of any other composition or alloy of nontoxic shot approved by the Director of the Unites States Fish and Wildlife Service or an authorized representative under 50 CFR 20.134. A

centerfire shotgun's magazine capacity may not exceed two rounds. The shotgun's total aggregate ammunition capacity may not exceed three rounds.

- (ii) A bow and arrow as permitted under subsection (a)(1)(iv).
- (iii) A crossbow and bolt as permitted under subsection (a)(1)(v).

Special Permits; Wildlife Rehabilitation

To effectively manage the wildlife resources of this Commonwealth, the Game Commission (Commission) at its July 9, 2022, meeting amends § 147.305 (relating to wildlife capture and transportation permits) to require a permit holder to submit a monthly report to the Commission documenting the species and quantity of all wildlife captured or transported, the location where the wildlife is captured, the location where the wildlife is transported to and the disposition of deceased wildlife.

This final-form rulemaking will not have an adverse impact on the wildlife resources of this Commonwealth.

The authority for this final-form rulemaking is 34 Pa.C.S. (relating to Game and Wildlife Code) (code).

Notice of proposed rulemaking was published at 52 Pa.B. 3108 (May 28, 2022).

1. Purpose and Authority

A wildlife capture and transportation permit holder is required to have a wildlife rehabilitator as a sponsor when submitting his or her initial application. However, after the permit application is submitted and approved, the permit holder no longer needs to maintain an affiliation or sponsorship with any particular wildlife rehabilitator. In fact, a wildlife capture and transportation permit holder can pick up wildlife any place at any time and transport the wildlife to the closest properly permitted wildlife rehabilitator. The Commission has observed instances where some of these wildlife capture and transportation permit holders are using this permit to pick up injured wildlife and then holding it and acting as an actual rehabilitator without the required permit.

The Commission has historically provided little oversight to wildlife capture and transportation permit holders after a permit was issued. The Commission received no data on how active permit holders were, the volume of wildlife handled, the locations wildlife is transported to, the species of wildlife captured and transported, the location rehabilitated wildlife is transported to or any other disposition of wildlife. Section 2907 of the code (relating to reports) generally authorizes the Commission to require reports as may be needed for its operations. The Commission amends § 147.305 to require that a permit holder submit a monthly report to the Commission documenting the species and quantity of all wildlife captured or transported, the location where the wildlife is captured, the location where the wildlife is transported to

and the disposition of deceased wildlife. The Wildlife Rehabilitation and Education Council supports this amendment.

Section 2901(b) of the code (relating to authority to issue permits) provides "the commission may, as deemed necessary to properly manage the game or wildlife resources, promulgate regulations for the issuance of any permit and promulgate regulations to control the activities which may be performed under authority of any permit issued." The amendments to § 147.305 are adopted under this authority.

2. Regulatory Requirements

This final-form rulemaking amends § 147.305 to require that a permit holder submit a monthly report to the Commission documenting the species and quantity of all wildlife captured or transported, the location where the wildlife is captured, the location where the wildlife is transported to and the disposition of deceased wildlife.

3. Persons Affected

Persons holding a wildlife capture and transportation permit within the Commonwealth will be affected by this final-form rulemaking.

4. Comment and Response Summary

There were no official comments received regarding this final-form rulemaking.

Subchapter P. WILDLIFE REHABILITATION

- § 147.305. Wildlife capture and transportation permits.
- (a) Issuance of wildlife capture and transportation permits will be limited to the number authorized by the permit class of the sponsoring wildlife rehabilitator.
 - (b) Qualifications are as follows:
- (1) The applicant shall be sponsored by a wildlife rehabilitation permittee.
- (2) The applicant shall successfully pass a Council-approved wildlife capture and transport written examination with a minimum score of 80%.
- (3) The applicant, upon completion of testing, shall obtain a certificate from the Council-approved written examination. This certificate, along with a permit application shall be mailed to the district wildlife conservation officer to receive a permit.
 - (c) Permit conditions are as follows:
- (1) A permittee may capture and transport injured or displaced wildlife when necessary.
- (2) Wildlife shall be immediately transported to the sponsoring permittee or to the nearest properly permitted wildlife rehabilitator.
- (3) Wildlife may not be captured or transported by a permittee outside of the area serviced by a sponsoring permittee except when advance permission from the wildlife rehabilitator has been obtained.
- (d) *Monthly reports*. A permittee shall submit a monthly report to the district wildlife conservation officer documenting the species and quantity of all wildlife captured or transported, the location where the wildlife is captured, the location where the wildlife is transported to and the disposition of deceased wildlife.

Special Permits; Deer Control; Deer Management Assistance Program Permits

To effectively manage the wildlife resources of this Commonwealth, the Game Commission (Commission) at

its July 9, 2022, meeting amends § 147.672 (relating to definitions) to expand the application of the term "private land" to lands where the hunting rights have been leased and where a fee has been charged for hunting.

This final-form rulemaking will not have an adverse impact on the wildlife resources of this Commonwealth.

The authority for this final-form rulemaking is 34 Pa.C.S. (relating to Game and Wildlife Code) (code).

Notice of proposed rule making was published at 52 Pa.B. 3106 (May $28,\ 2022$).

1. Purpose and Authority

The Commission amends § 147.672 to expand the application of the term "private land" to lands where the hunting rights have been leased and where a fee has been charged for hunting. This amendment will effectively expand the meaning of the term, "private land" to include lands otherwise previously ineligible for participation in the Deer Management Assistance Program (DMAP). The Commission has determined that the quantity of land where the hunting rights have been leased and where a fee has been charged for hunting is approximately 5% as reported by hunters. By excluding DMAP on leased land, the only tool the Commission is giving these landowners or lessees to address deer population concerns and their land use goals are Wild Management Unit (WMU)-based, allocations which may not be enough. DMAP provides an additional means for landowners to manage deer to meet their land-use goals outside of the WMU-based antlerless allocations. Fundamentally, there is no difference between DMAP on leased land and DMAP on private land with no public access. Both can restrict hunting access and both need the proper tools to meet their goals. Historic restrictions of DMAP permits for certain lands to encourage public access did not lead to significantly more public access or prevention of leased lands. Leased lands still exist and are part of the landscape of this Commonwealth.

Section 2901(b) of the code (relating to authority to issue permits) provides "the commission may, as deemed necessary to properly manage the game or wildlife resources, promulgate regulations for the issuance of any permit and promulgate regulations to control the activities which may be performed under authority of any permit issued." The amendments to § 147.672 are adopted under this authority.

Special Permits; Nuisance Wildlife Control Operator

To effectively manage the wildlife resources of this Commonwealth, the Game Commission (Commission) at its July 9, 2022, meeting amends §§ 147.726 and 147.728 (relating to operation; and unlawful acts) to authorize nuisance wildlife control operators to collect and properly dispose of deer carcasses from roadways and private property with or without a fee.

This final-form rulemaking will not have an adverse impact on the wildlife resources of this Commonwealth.

The authority for this final-form rulemaking is 34 Pa.C.S. (relating to Game and Wildlife Code) (code).

Notice of proposed rule making was published at 52 Pa.B. 3107 (May 28, 2022).

1. Purpose and Authority

Each year, the Commission receives thousands of calls from the public concerning the presence of white-tailed deer carcasses along roadways and on private property. The Commission will often assign and task its wardens to collect and properly dispose of these carcasses as their schedules and work duties may permit. Suffice it to say, the task is often not accomplished in accordance with the expectations of the public from time to time. This is true despite the efforts of the Commission and the Department of Transportation to contract collection and disposal efforts out to qualified vendors across this Commonwealth.

Former regulations prohibited a person, licensed or otherwise, from picking up white-tailed deer carcasses from roadways and private property, except as may be authorized by a consumption permit. These restrictions limit the public and Commission's ability to utilize existing resources to collect and properly dispose of these white-tailed deer carcasses. The Commission amends §§ 147.726 and 147.728 to authorize nuisance wildlife control operators to collect and properly dispose of deer carcasses from roadways and private property with or without a fee.

These changes will provide residents of this Commonwealth an additional resource to address their concerns with the removal of white-tailed deer found dead along roadways and on private property. Furthermore, nuisance wildlife control operators are already currently regulated through the Commission, therefore these changes are simply an expansion of the existing authority of nuisance wildlife control operators, not the creation of a new permitted class. Lastly, nuisance wildlife control operators are not obligated to engage in white-tailed deer collection and disposal, but rather can elect to expand their business services to include these activities at their discretion.

Section 2901(b) of the code (relating to authority to issue permits) provides "the commission may, as deemed necessary to properly manage the game or wildlife resources, promulgate regulations for the issuance of any permit and promulgate regulations to control the activities which may be performed under authority of any permit issued." The amendments to §§ 147.726 and 147.728 are adopted under this authority.

This final-form rulemaking amends §§ 147.726 and 147.728 to authorize nuisance wildlife control operators to collect and properly dispose of deer carcasses from roadways and private property with or without a fee.

§ 147.726. Operation.

* * * * *

(h) Carcasses shall be disposed of by incineration or in an approved landfill in a manner consistent with the solid waste laws of the Commonwealth. The taking of any white-tailed deer shall be reported within 24 hours and turned over to the district wildlife conservation officer, unless alternative arrangements are accepted by the district wildlife conservation officer.

(i) Nuisance wildlife control operators are authorized to collect and properly dispose of deer carcasses from roadways and private property with or without a fee.

§ 147.728. Unlawful acts.

It is unlawful to:

(1) Except as otherwise provided in § 147.726 (relating to operation), control any white-tailed deer, black bear, elk, wild turkey, beaver, fisher, otter or bobcat without prior approval of the District Wildlife Conservation Officer.

PROPOSED RULEMAKING

DEPARTMENT OF CONSERVATION AND NATURAL RESOURCES

[17 PA. CODE CH. 45]

Conservation of Pennsylvania Native Wild Plants

The Department of Conservation and Natural Resources (Department), under the authority of section 5307(c) of the Wild Resource Conservation Act (WRCA) (32 P.S. § 5307(c)) and sections 305(a)(9) and 313(g) of the Conservation and Natural Resources Act (CNRA) (71 P.S. §§ 1340.305(a)(9) and 1340.313(g)), proposes to amend Chapter 45 (relating to conservation of Pennsylvania native wild plants) as set forth in Annex A.

Purpose

The purpose of this proposed rulemaking is to amend Chapter 45 by updating Pennsylvania native wild plant species classification lists, including certain scientific names, common names and reference sources. (32 P.S. § 5307(c) and 71 P.S. §§ 1340.305(a)(9) and 1340.313(g)).

Discussion

The WRCA (32 P.S. §§ 5301—5314), inter alia, established a procedure for protection of wild flora/plants in this Commonwealth, including imposing powers and duties on the Department of Environmental Resources to investigate, classify and provide for the conservation of Pennsylvania wild plant populations.

The CNRA (71 P.S. §§ 1340.101—1340.1103), which, inter alia, created the Department (71 P.S. § 1340.301) and renamed the Department of Environmental Resources as the Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) (71 P.S. § 1340.501), provided that the Department shall exercise the powers and duties conferred upon the Department of Environmental Resources by the WRCA (71 P.S. § 1340.305(a)(9)), including issuing and modifying regulations (71 P.S. § 1340.313(g)).

The Department proposes to amend the conservation of Pennsylvania native wild plants regulations to update the following Pennsylvania native wild plant species classification lists, including updating certain scientific names, common names and reference sources: Pennsylvania Extirpated (§ 45.11), Pennsylvania Endangered (§ 45.12), Pennsylvania Threatened (§ 45.13), Pennsylvania Rare (§ 45.14) and Tentatively Undetermined (§ 45.21). The updates to the Pennsylvania native wild plant species classification lists include the following: (1) adding plant species to a classification list that are currently unclassified, (2) reclassifying plant species already on a classification list to a new classification and (3) removing plant species from the classification lists altogether (declassifying them).

This proposed rulemaking includes a total of 82 substantive changes to the conservation of Pennsylvania native wild plant regulation species classification lists as follows: (1) 24 currently unclassified native wild plant species will be newly classified, (2) 28 currently classified native wild plant species will be reclassified, including 3

species whose scientific names are changing/being updated (technically these are shown as the "old" name being unclassified and the "new" name being classified) and (3) 30 currently classified native wild plant species will be unclassified.

The proposed amendments to the Pennsylvania native wild plant species classification lists include updates to the scientific names for three native wild plant species and the common name for one native wild plant species. As botanical taxonomists make new discoveries about species, the Department's standard reference, Ann Fowler Rhoads and Timothy A. Block, *The Plants of Pennsylvania: An Illustrated Manual Second Edition* (2007), Philadelphia, Pennsylvania: University of Pennsylvania Press (*The Plants of Pennsylvania*), may not include the most up-to-date nomenclature. In this proposed rulemaking, when the proposed new name is not found in the standard reference, the alternate source is provided in parentheses.

Process of classifying native wild plants in this Commonwealth

Native wild plant species are those plant species that existed in this Commonwealth prior to European settlement. There are approximately 2,800 native wild plant species that currently exist or formerly existed in this Commonwealth. The Department classifies approximately 1/5 of these species because they are a conservation concern. The other 4/5 of these species are considered secure and thus not classified.

The Department begins the process of classifying native wild plants by collecting and analyzing data on native wild plant species in this Commonwealth. The Department uses the following data to make its classification decisions: numbers of populations known in this Commonwealth; number of individuals within populations; the plant's range (within the United States and within this Commonwealth); threats such as pests, invasive species and habitat loss; decrease or increase in population numbers; and taxonomic information. (Note, this list is not exhaustive.) The Department analyzes this data to determine the population, distribution, habitat needs, limiting factors and other biological and ecological information about each plant species.

To make classification decisions, the Department uses data referred to as "State ranks." In this Commonwealth, each plant species receives a State rank from the Pennsylvania Natural Heritage Program (Program). The Program assigns these ranks based on a methodology created by NatureServe, an international network of natural heritage programs. The purpose of NatureServe's methodology is to bring consistency to the biodiversity conservation efforts of individuals and organizations throughout the Western Hemisphere. This methodology is used across North America, Central America and South America. By using this standard tool, the Department ensures its evaluation methods are, at a minimum, equivalent to those of other states and countries in the western hemisphere and that its classification decisions are based on sound science.

Throughout this process, the Department also receives data, information and recommendations from the Pennsylvania Biological Survey's Vascular Plant Technical

Committee (Committee). The Committee is composed of professional botanists working throughout this Commonwealth in academic, consulting, governmental and conservation organizations. Each year, the Committee makes classification recommendations for native wild plants based on the research and expertise of its professional botanists.

The Department assimilates and reviews all data and recommendations it collects and receives and determines the appropriate classifications for each native wild plant species under the definitions in Chapter 45. This review process occurs continuously, as botanists are continually learning more about native wild plant species populations and threats. The Department will continue to update its classification lists as needed to reflect changes to native wild plant conservation needs.

Native wild plant classifications

How plants are classified determines the "management measures necessary for their continued ability to sustain themselves successfully." (32 P.S. § 5307(a)). Native wild plant species that are at risk of extinction in this Commonwealth need greater protection than those less susceptible to that risk. Chapter 45 designates the level of risk facing Pennsylvania's native wild plant species by classifying them as follows:

Pennsylvania Extirpated (§ 45.11)—A classification of plant species believed to be extinct in this Commonwealth. If a plant species classified as Pennsylvania Extirpated is later found to exist in this Commonwealth, it will automatically be considered classified as Pennsylvania Endangered.

Pennsylvania Endangered (§ 45.12)—A classification of plant species that are in danger of extinction throughout most or all of their natural range in this Commonwealth, if critical habitat is not maintained or if the species is greatly exploited by man. This classification also includes populations of plant species that have been classified as Pennsylvania Extirpated, but are subsequently found to exist in this Commonwealth.

Pennsylvania Threatened (§ 45.13)—A classification of plant species that may become endangered throughout most or all of their natural range in this Commonwealth, if critical habitat is not maintained to prevent their further decline, or if the species is greatly exploited by man.

Pennsylvania Rare (§ 45.14)—A classification of plant species that are uncommon in this Commonwealth because they have low population numbers, or are only found in restricted geographic areas.

Pennsylvania Vulnerable (§ 45.15)—A classification of plant species that are in danger of population decline in this Commonwealth because of their beauty, economic value, use as a cultivar or other factors which indicate that persons may seek to remove these species from their native habitats.

Special Concern Population (§ 45.20)—A classification of plant species that the Department has determined to be a unique occurrence deserving protection. Among the factors used to classify a plant species as a Special Concern Population are the existence of unusual geographic locations, unisexual populations or extraordinarily diverse plant populations.

Tentatively Undetermined (§ 45.21)—A classification of plant species that are in danger of population decline, but do not meet the criteria for any other classification due to taxonomic uncertainties, limited historical records or insufficient data.

Updating species nomenclature

This proposed rulemaking updates the scientific and common names of certain native wild plant species to conform to the Department's taxonomic source material. The Department's reference source for the nomenclature used to identify species taxonomy in Chapter 45 is *The Plants of Pennsylvania*. When the species name is not found there, the reference source will be provided in parentheses. Additionally, this proposed rulemaking will correct minor grammatical errors and misspellings of species names.

Pennsylvania Natural Diversity Inventory

The proposed amendments will be incorporated into the Pennsylvania Natural Diversity Inventory (PNDI). PNDI is a database that maintains the Department's list of native wild plant classifications, as well as native rare wildlife classifications from the Game Commission, the Fish and Boat Commission and the United States Fish and Wildlife Service. PNDI provides the most current, reliable and objective scientific information about ecological resources in this Commonwealth and it is used to help inform environmental decisions in this Commonwealth. Most notably, DEP uses PNDI to inform its environmental permitting decisions.

The overwhelming majority of PNDI users use PNDI as part of the process of obtaining a DEP permit. DEP requires permit applicants to screen their land use projects through PNDI for potential impacts to threatened or endangered species to receive a DEP permit. Threatened and endangered plant species are thereby protected by DEP's permitting process.

Although this proposed rulemaking will result in updates to the plant data in PNDI, it will not affect DEP's permitting process. The process of obtaining a DEP permit is beyond the scope of this proposed rulemaking; instead, PNDI's connection to this proposed rulemaking is limited to its use of the plant data that will result from the amendments made by this proposed rulemaking. Person, businesses, small businesses or organizations will not be required to invest in any additional administrative procedures as a direct result of this proposed rulemaking.

Finally, because this proposed rulemaking will remove more species from classifications than it adds, there may be fewer classified plant species for prospective DEP permit applicants to account for when applying for a DEP permit. Depending on the project type, location and classified plant species in question, prospective DEP permit applicants may see no change in the amount of mitigation required to address impacts to threatened and endangered species in fulfilling permit requirements.

The names of the following native wild plant species are proposed to be changed/updated:

Spiraea betulifolia Pallas var. corymbosa (Raf.) Maxim. is proposed to be deleted from Pennsylvania Threatened (§ 45.13) classification and Spiraea corymbosa Rafinesque (Source: Flora of Southeastern United States, Weakley 2020) is proposed to be added to Pennsylvania Endangered (§ 45.12) classification. Spiraea corymbosa is the accepted taxonomy for this species and the appropriate classification is Pennsylvania Endangered.

Marshallia grandiflora Beadle & F. E. Boynton is proposed to be deleted from Pennsylvania Endangered (§ 45.12) classification and Marshallia pulchra W. M. Knapp, D. B. Poind. & Weakley (Source: Flora of Southeastern United States, Weakley 2020) is proposed to be added to Pennsylvania Endangered (§ 45.12) classification. The correct name for this species is Marshallia pulchra and the correct classification is Pennsylvania Endangered.

Viola tripartita Elliot is proposed to be deleted from Tentatively Undetermined (§ 45.21) classification and Viola glaberrima (Ging.) House (Source: Flora of Southeastern United States, Weakley 2020) is proposed to be added to Pennsylvania Endangered (§ 45.12) classification. The correct name for these plants is Viola glaberrima and the correct classification is Pennsylvania Endangered.

The common name of *Carex sterilis* Willd. is proposed to be changed from Atlantic Sedge to Sterile Sedge. Both

names are accepted common names. However, the Department prefers Sterile Sedge, as it is a more descriptive name.

Fiscal Impact

Commonwealth. This proposed rulemaking will not have a fiscal impact on this Commonwealth.

Political subdivisions. This proposed rulemaking will not have a fiscal impact on political subdivisions.

Public. This proposed rulemaking will not have a fiscal impact on the public.

Benefits, Costs and Compliance

Benefits. This proposed rulemaking will benefit State, county and municipal conservation planning officials, environmental regulatory agencies, landowners, conservation districts, conservation groups and other organizations concerned with the welfare of the environment, because it more accurately represents the native wild plants in this Commonwealth in need of the most protection. This proposed rulemaking also benefits the citizens of this Commonwealth by protecting this Commonwealth's natural resources, which is a constitutional right. See Pa.Const. Art. I, § 27.

Keeping up-to-date classifications of native wild plants ensures that the Department and other public and private conservation organizations are targeting the appropriate species in their conservation efforts. This will help maintain a healthy biodiversity of ecological systems in this Commonwealth.

Costs and compliance. This proposed rulemaking will not impose additional compliance costs.

Paperwork requirements. There are no additional paperwork requirements associated with this proposed rule-making.

Regulatory Review

Under section 5(a) of the Regulatory Review Act (71 P.S. § 745.5(a)), on August 17, 2022, the Department submitted a copy of this proposed rulemaking and a copy of a Regulatory Analysis Form to the Independent Regulatory Review Commission (IRRC) and to the Chairpersons of the House and Senate Environmental Resources and Energy Committees. The Regulatory Review Act specifies detailed procedures for review prior to final publication of the rulemaking by the Department, the General Assembly and the Governor. Effective Date

ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY BOARD

[25 PA. CODE CH. 218] Radiological Health Fees

The Environmental Quality Board (Board) proposes to amend Chapter 218 (relating to fees) to update the regulations to read as set forth in Annex A. The proposed amendments to Chapter 218 increase the annual fees for radiation-producing machine and service provider (vendor) registrations, accelerator licenses, and radioactive material licenses, and increases the hourly rate professional fee associated with certain full cost recovery licenses.

This proposed rulemaking was adopted by the Board at its meeting on June 14, 2022.

A. Effective Date

This proposed rulemaking will be effective 30 days after publication of the final-form rulemaking in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

C. Statutory Authority

The proposed amendments to Chapter 218 are authorized under sections 301, 302 and 401 of the Radiation Protection Act (RPA) (35 P.S. §§ 7110.301, 7110.302 and 7110.401) and section 1920-A of The Administrative Code of 1929 (71 P.S. § 510-20).

D. Background and Purpose

The Department's Radiation Protection Program (RPP) was established to carry out the comprehensive program of radiation protection in this Commonwealth as required by the RPA (35 P.S. §§ 7110.101—7110.703). Section 401 of the RPA and section 8 of the Radon Certification Act (63 P.S. § 2008) require that fees be established to cover the Department's RPP costs. Section 302(b) of the RPA

(35 P.S. § 7110.302(b)) requires the Board to review the radiation protection fee structure every 3 years.

On February 15, 2022, the Department presented its Three-Year Regulatory Fee and Program Cost Analysis Report (Report) in accordance with § 218.11(l) (relating to registration, renewal of registration and license fees) and Chapter 240, Appendix A (relating to radon certification fee schedule) to the Board. The Report covered the period of 2018—2021 and analyzed costs for three RPP areas, including Accelerator, Radiation-Producing Machines, and Vendors/Service Providers; Radioactive Materials and Decommissioning; and Radon.

Accelerator, radiation-producing machines, and vendors/ service providers analysis

Through a staff of 71 located in the Department's central and regional offices, the RPP's Radiation Control Division administers the radiation-producing machine registration and inspection program, the Mammography Quality Standards Act program, the particle accelerator licensing and inspection program and the vendor/service provider registration program.

The Radiation Control Division is responsible for the registration and inspection of over 11,000 facilities possessing about 33,000 X-ray units. These facilities include hospitals, clinics, and medical and dental offices. Users of radiation-producing machines are required to register with the Radiation Control Division, indicate the number and type of units possessed and designate an individual responsible for radiation safety. Users pay registration fees based on the type of facility and the number of X-ray units they have. The fee amounts are listed in § 218.11(a).

The Federal Mammography Quality Standards Act (MQSA) (42 U.S.C.A. § 263b) was signed into law on October 27, 1992. The MQSA ensures that women and men receive high-quality mammography services for early breast cancer detection through the establishment of a Federal certification and inspection program. The Statute authorizes the United States Food and Drug Administration (USFDA) to obtain state and local assistance in enforcing the MQSA requirements, including annual inspections of all certified mammography facilities. The Department, under a \$588,000 reimbursement contract with the USFDA, conducts inspections of each of this Commonwealth's more than 300 facilities which perform mammographic X-ray procedures. This contract is modified most years due to the changing number of facilities. The average amount is \$575,000.

The Department requires licensing of all particle accelerators within this Commonwealth for industrial use, research or medical purposes. A person who intends to purchase, construct or acquire an accelerator shall notify the Department of this intent by filing the appropriate application for a specific license within 30 days after the initial order is issued to obtain any or all parts of the accelerator. Annual fees for licensed particle accelerators are listed in § 218.11(d). About 150 facilities have approximately 250 licensed accelerators within this Commonwealth.

The Department also administers a registration program for vendors/service providers who sell, lease, install or service, or both, radiation-producing machines. Department regulations require that each vendor/service provider doing business within this Commonwealth must be registered prior to providing these services. To register, each vendor/service provider must complete a registration

application and return that application with the associated fee to Bureau of Radiation Protection. The registration is renewable for 12-month periods following submission of the applicable fee as listed in § 218.11(k).

In analyzing the annual costs and revenue associated with the Accelerator, Radiation-Producing Machines, and Vendors/Service Providers RPP fee category, the Department found that despite substantial increases in personnel and program costs, the Chapter 218 fees, which support the registration of radiation-producing machines and vendors/service providers and the licensing of accelerators, have not been revised since 2009. As a result, the Radiation Protection Fund is decreasing annually in operating reserves, and the fund balance will be negative in Fiscal Year (FY) 2023-2024. Without a fee increase, the Department will be required to curtail spending for needed equipment, infrastructure upgrades, and training and hiring of qualified personnel.

Radioactive materials and decommissioning analysis

The RPP's Radiation Control Division is also responsible for the regulation, licensing and inspection of radioactive material user operations and, along with the Decommissioning Section of the Decommissioning and Surveillance Division, is responsible for termination of radioactive material licenses (such as for by-product, source and special nuclear material).

Users of all by-product, source and special nuclear material are required to obtain a license from the Department prior to obtaining those radioactive materials. This material is used in hospitals, colleges and industries for medical, research and industrial purposes. The Department issues specific, general and reciprocity licenses for the use of radioactive material in this Commonwealth. The objective of the licensing program is to ensure radioactive material is used safely, disposed of properly and facilities are free from contamination when licensed operations are terminated. Annual license fees for radioactive material are listed in Chapter 218, Appendix A (relating to fees for radioactive material licenses).

The Decommissioning Section performs technical reviews of decontamination and decommissioning (D&D) activities for radioactive materials licensees and nonlicensed radiologically contaminated sites in accordance with appropriate Commonwealth regulations. Typical reviews include site characterization plans, health and safety plans, decommissioning plans, survey reports, and the evaluation of decommissioning funding plans and financial assurance mechanisms. The Decommissioning Section also performs onsite reviews and inspections of D&D activities for occupational, public and environmental radiation protection concerns. These activities include performing confirmatory surveys and sampling to ensure the cleanup levels established for the site have been met. The Decommissioning Section would also perform independent oversight and sampling at decommissioning nuclear power plant sites (for example, Three Mile Island Unit 2). This work is performed at full cost recovery.

Fee collections for radioactive material licensing have been trending down since the National economic recession of 2008. Universities and industries that use radioactive material have been consolidating or finding other operational methods that do not require a license. Many licensees have opted to be licensed under a small business fee category at a lower cost, which is specified in Chapter 218, Appendix A. During this same time, actual RPP personnel costs (salaries and benefits) have increased approximately 14% since the last fee increase for this fee area took effect in 2018.

The Department's fiscal analysis showed that with existing reserve funds and current fees, the fund balance will be negative in FY 2024-2025 for the Radioactive Materials and Decommissioning area.

Radon analysis

This Commonwealth has some of the highest indoor air radon levels in the country, and perhaps the world. According to the National Academy of Sciences and the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), radon is the second leading cause of lung cancer. The Department's Radon Program is one of the most robust in the Nation and provides a variety of regulatory and public service activities. These activities include, but are not limited to, implementing the EPA State Indoor Radon Grant (SIRG); certifying radon laboratories/mitigators/and testers; performing inspections of mitigation installations, mitigation offices, testing and laboratory facilities; assisting homeowners and mitigators with difficult to remediate buildings; providing free confirmatory testing to homeowners who have installed active mitigation systems and to homes with radon levels greater than 100 pCi/L; and providing a wide variety of public information services to increase awareness of the radon issue and encouraging testing and mitigation.

The Department receives funding for its Radon Program through a certification fee on radon laboratories, mitigators and testers. Additionally, grant funding from the EPA SIRG provides a small percentage of revenue to offset administrative costs. SIRG funds have been about \$429,000 annually in recent years, which is utilized mainly for staff training, public services announcements, equipment and supplies, home shows and some support of salaries and benefits.

The Department's fiscal analysis indicated that there is currently sufficient revenue to maintain the Radon Program until FY 2027-2028.

Summary of RPP funding needs

Based on the findings of the Report, the Board proposes this rulemaking to address the discrepancy between anticipated fees and needed revenue for the Accelerator, Radiation-Producing Machines, and Vendors/Service Providers program area and the Radioactive Materials and Decommissioning program area.

In March 2008, then-Governor Edward Rendell signed an agreement with the Chairperson of the United States Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) for the Commonwealth to become an Agreement State. This allows the Department to oversee and regulate licensure of radioactive materials for entities in this Commonwealth. These duties are funded through the Chapter 218 fees. As part of the agreement, the Commonwealth committed to implementing a radiation protection program comparable to the NRC's program and ensured that Department regulations would be compatible with NRC regulations.

The proposed amendments to the Chapter 218 fees for radiation-producing machines, vendors and accelerators are necessary to ensure adequate funding is available for the Commonwealth to carry out its duties under the RPA. The proposed amendments to the Chapter 218 fees for radioactive material licenses are necessary to assure adequate funding is available for the Commonwealth to carry out its duties under the Agreement State program. If the Commonwealth were forced to cede its authority to regulate radioactive materials back to the NRC, the regulated community would experience higher costs per NRC's fee regulations.

To ensure there is adequate funding for these program areas and for the Commonwealth to maintain its status as an NRC Agreement State, the Board proposes to increase the fees associated with the Accelerator, Radiation-Producing Machines, and Vendors/Service Providers program area by 30% to provide sufficient revenue through FY 2027-2028 and to increase fees associated with the Radioactive Materials and Decommissioning program area by 10% to ensure sufficient funding through FY 2027-2028.

Outreach

The proposed amendments to the Chapter 218 fees for radiation-producing machines, vendors, and accelerators and for radioactive materials and decommissioning were reviewed with the Department's Radiation Protection Advisory Committee (RPAC). RPAC represents various stakeholders, including radiation-producing machine registrants, radioactive materials licensees and radon service providers, as well as the general public. The Department discussed the need for fee revisions and presented the draft proposed amendments to Chapter 218 with RPAC on March 3, 2022. At the March 3, 2022, meeting, RPAC endorsed moving forward with this proposed rulemaking.

E. Summary of Regulatory Requirements

§ 218.11. Registration, renewal of registration and license fees

In subsection (a), the annual administrative fees and annual fees per X-ray tube or radiation generating device for radiation-producing machines are proposed to be increased by approximately 30% to provide adequate funding to support the oversight of X-ray machines in hospitals, dental offices, veterinary clinics and other facilities. Additionally, the Board proposes to move "Chiropractors" out of the "Other" fee category and have them instead pay the same annual administrative fees and annual fees per X-ray tube or radiation generating device as "Dentists, podiatrists, veterinarians." This change is proposed as chiropractors' equipment is more in-line with the equipment used by dentists, podiatrists and veterinarians.

In subsection (d)(1), the fee amounts for accelerators, below 50 MeV, other than for ion implantation are proposed to be increased by 30% from \$2,100 to \$2,730 for the first accelerator at a facility and from \$700 to \$910 for each additional unit at the facility.

In subsection (d)(2), the fee amounts for accelerators used for ion implantation are proposed to be increased by 30% from \$700 to \$910 and from \$70 to \$90 for each additional unit at the same facility.

In subsection (d)(3), the fee amounts associated with accelerators 50 MeV and above are proposed to be increased by 30%. This includes the hourly rate considered for staff time to review license applications and to conduct inspections being increased from \$150 per hour to \$195 per hour; the minimum annual fee being increased from \$2,100 to \$2,730 for the first accelerator at a facility; and the fee for each additional unit being increased from \$700 to \$910.

In subsection (i), the annual fee amounts for electronic brachytheraphy devices are proposed to be increased by 30% from \$1,000 to \$1,300 for the first unit at a facility and from \$100 to \$130 for each additional unit at the facility.

In subsection (k), the annual registration fee for radiation-producing machine service providers is proposed to be increased by 30% from \$140 to \$180.

Chapter 218, Appendix A. Fees for radioactive material licenses

The Board is proposing to increase the 39 different fee categories for radioactive material licenses by 10% based on the findings of the Report to ensure adequate funding is available for the Commonwealth to carry out its duties under the Agreement State program.

Additionally, the professional hourly rate fee, identified by the asterisk in this proposed rulemaking, is proposed to be increased from \$225 per hour to \$275 per hour, which is below the NRC's current FY 2021 hourly rate of \$288 per hour. This hourly rate is applicable to fee categories 4A (Waste Storage, Processing or Disposal), 5B (Well Logging Field Flood Tracer Studies) and 14 (Decontamination, Decommissioning, Reclamation or Site Restoration).

F. Benefits, Costs and Compliance

Benefits

The proposed Chapter 218 fee increases for radioactive material licenses are necessary to ensure that adequate funding is available for the Commonwealth to carry out its duties under the Agreement State program and the RPA. If the Commonwealth were forced to cede its authority to regulate radioactive materials back to the NRC, the regulated community would be subject to higher NRC fees. Radioactive material controls under the Agreement State program guard against the potential for unnecessary public radiation exposure from the use of radioactive material benefitting the health of all residents in this Commonwealth.

The proposed Chapter 218 fees for registration of X-ray facilities, licensing of accelerators and registration of vendors have not been increased since 2009, although costs have steadily increased. If fees for radiation-producing machines are not increased, oversight of radiation safety-related activities may be diminished, and the replacement of obsolete survey equipment may be delayed reducing the assurance that regulated activities are being conducted safely.

For these reasons, the Department will benefit from this proposed rulemaking by having the needed additional revenue to cover the costs of the programs mandated by the RPA, and the general public will benefit from this proposed rulemaking by the continued safety with the use of radioactive materials, the safety of radiation-producing machines and additional quality assurance that will be provided.

Compliance costs

The cost of compliance with the proposed fee amendments for the Accelerator, Radiation-Producing Machines, and Vendors/Service Providers program area are proposed to increase by 30% to provide sufficient revenue through FY 2027-2028. The cost of compliance with the proposed fee amendments for the Radioactive Materials and Decommissioning program area are proposed to increase by 10% to ensure sufficient funding through FY 2027-2028. Considering increases in inflation since the last time these fee categories were increased (2009 for the Accelerator, Radiation-Producing Machines, and Vendors/Service Providers program area and 2018 for the Radioactive Materials and Decommissioning program area), the cost of compliance is being increased in line with inflation rates.

Compliance assistance plan

The Department will notify the regulated community to expect higher fees by informing RPAC, issuing an Information Notice to relevant licensees and publishing notification in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Paperwork requirements

This proposed rulemaking does not require additional recordkeeping or reporting requirements as a result of the fee increases in Chapter 218.

G. Pollution Prevention

The Pollution Prevention Act of 1990 (42 U.S.C.A. §§ 13101—13109) established a National policy that promotes pollution prevention as the preferred means for achieving state environmental protection goals. The Department encourages pollution prevention, which is the reduction or elimination of pollution at its source, through the substitution of environmentally friendly materials, more efficient use of raw materials and the incorporation of energy efficiency strategies. Pollution prevention practices can provide greater environmental protection with greater efficiency because they can result in significant cost savings to facilities that permanently achieve or move beyond compliance.

This proposed rulemaking is designed to support the safe and effective use of licensed radioactive materials and radiation-producing machines to protect the health and safety of residents in this Commonwealth. Failure to increase fees may have a direct effect on the Department's ability to implement radiological pollution prevention.

H. Sunset Review

These regulations will be reviewed in accordance with the sunset review schedule published by the Department to determine whether the regulations effectively fulfill the goals for which they were intended.

I. Regulatory Review

Under section 5(a) of the Regulatory Review Act (71 P.S. § 745.5(a)), on August 10, 2022, the Department submitted a copy of this proposed rulemaking and a copy of the Regulatory Analysis Form to the Independent Regulatory Review Commission (IRRC) and the Chairpersons of the House and Senate Environmental Resources and Energy Committees. A copy of this material is available to the public upon request.

Under section 5(g) of the Regulatory Review Act, IRRC may convey comments, recommendations or objections to this proposed rulemaking within 30 days of the close of the public comment period. The comments, recommendations or objections must specify the regulatory review criteria in section 5.2 of the Regulatory Review Act (71 P.S. § 745.5(b)) which have not been met. The Regulatory Review Act specifies detailed procedures for review, prior to final publication of the rulemaking, by the Department, the General Assembly and the Governor of comments, recommendations or objections raised.

J. Public Comments

Interested persons are invited to submit written comments, suggestions, support or objections regarding this proposed rulemaking to the Board. Comments, suggestions, support or objections must be received by the Board by September 26, 2022.

ARTICLE V. RADIOLOGICAL HEALTH CHAPTER 218. FEES PAYMENT OF FEES

§ 218.11. Registration, renewal of registration and license fees.

(a) Annual registration fees for radiation-producing machines are the sum of an annual administrative fee and an annual fee for each X-ray tube or radiation generating device and shall be paid as follows:

- (d) Particle accelerators are licensed under Chapter 228 (relating to radiation safety requirements for particle accelerators). Annual fees are as follows:
- (1) Accelerators, below 50 MeV, other than for ion implantation—[\$2,100] \$2,730 for the first accelerator at the facility plus [\$700] \$910 for each additional unit at that facility.
- (2) Accelerators used for ion implantation—[\$700] \$910 plus [\$70] \$90 for each additional unit at the same facility.

- (3) Accelerators 50 MeV and above—full cost of staff time to review license applications and conduct inspections as needed. (Hourly rate is [\$150] \$195 per hour). For the purpose of anticipating costs and compliance with subsections (e) and (f), a minimum annual fee of [\$2,100] \$2,730 for the first accelerator at the facility plus [\$700] \$910 for each additional unit is established. Additional invoices will be issued by the Department at regular intervals at least quarterly when net costs are incurred above the minimum annual fee.
- (i) Electronic brachytherapy devices are licensed under Chapter 221 (relating to X-rays in the healing arts). The annual fee is [\$1,000] \$1,300 for the first unit (controller) at the facility plus [\$100] \$130 for each additional unit at that facility.
- (j) Emerging technology devices require Department safety review and approval prior to use. The registrant shall pay a fee equal to the full cost of Department staff time, as specified in Appendix A, for the review and approval process.
- (k) A radiation-producing machine service provider shall pay an annual registration fee of [\$140]\$180.
- (l) The Department will review the adequacy of the fees established in this section at least once every 3 years and provide a written report to the EQB. The report must identify any disparity between the amount of program income generated by the fees and the costs to administer these programs, and must contain recommendations to increase fees to eliminate the disparity, including recommendations for regulatory amendments to increase program fees.

The following pesticide active ingredients can be used legally in the growing and processing of seeds, immature medical marijuana plants, medical marijuana plants or medical marijuana and in accordance with the Pennsylvania Pesticide Control Act of 1973 (3 P.S. §§ 111.21—112). To qualify, products containing the following active ingredients must also be registered in the Commonwealth, and labeled for use in greenhouses on unspecified food crops or unspecified herbs, or both. Commonwealth pesticide registration can be checked at https://www.paplants.pa.gov/ProductRegFSA/BrandSearch.aspx.

The Department of Agriculture (Department) evaluates potential pesticide active ingredients for inclusion on this list on an annual basis. Candidates for addition to this list should be submitted to the Department by June 1st of each year. This list will be reviewed and updated September of each calendar year. Deletions of active ingredients will occur on an as-needed basis. Submissions can be sent to the Department of Agriculture, Attn: Pesticide Registration, 2301 North Cameron Street, Harrisburg, PA 17110.

The Department will utilize the following criteria when evaluating active ingredients for inclusion on the list:

- 1) The active ingredient is in at least one United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) registered pesticide or is exempt under section 25(b) of the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act (7 U.S.C.A. § 136w(b)).
 - 2) Pesticides containing this ingredient are labeled for unspecified food or herb crops.
 - 3) The active ingredient is exempt from the requirements of a tolerance on all food crops.

The Department may also consider other factors, such as pyrolysis data or whether addition of an active ingredient may likely lead to widespread misuse.

Substantial Amendment to the 2019—2023 Consolidated Plan and 2019 Action Plan; Public Hearing

On March 27, 2020, the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES Act) (Pub.L. No. 116-136) was signed into law to respond to the growing effects of the novel coronavirus (COVID-19) public health crisis. The CARES Act provides special allocations to the Commonwealth under the Community Development Block Grant—Cares (CDBG-CV), Emergency Solutions Grant and Housing Opportunities for People with AIDS Grant programs to be used to prevent, prepare for and respond to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Annually, the Department of Community and Economic Development (Department) prepares the Action Plan which outlines the methods of distribution for Federal funding received by the Commonwealth through the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). Notice is hereby given that the 2019—2023 Consolidated Plan and the 2019 Action Plan will be amended to account for two additional allocations of CDBG-CV funding. For the 2019 Action Plan, the Methods of Distribution to the Commonwealth's resources will be updated, which according to the Pennsylvania Citizen Participation Plan for the Consolidated Plan, constitutes a significant change in the distribution of funds under the plan and requires a substantial amendment to the original Consolidated Plan and Action Plan.

The Department conducted an unmet needs survey from December 20, 2021, until January 25, 2022. In addition, two listening sessions with grantees were held on March 8, 2022, and March 10, 2022. Additionally, the Department staff met with representatives of grantees at the PAHRA Capitol Conference held in February and consulted with the CD&H Advisory Committee to provide additional detail on the continued unmet needs in their communities.

The information provided to the Department necessitated changing the method of distribution to broaden the scope of public infrastructure projects to be funded and

reducing other project categories, which did not receive much consideration by units of local government during the last competitive application period. Proposed activities must support and document that they prepare for, prevent or respond to the COVID-19 pandemic.

After receiving applications for funding based on the changes previously as determined by the previously listed methods, the Department is again changing its method of distribution to better align the amounts of funding to reflect those areas which received applications for funding.

These changes trigger a substantial amendment. In accordance with a waiver of regulatory authority, approved by HUD on April 7, 2020, to the normal citizen comment period, the Commonwealth will hold a 5-day citizen comment period starting August 28, 2022, until September 1, 2022.

The proposed substantial amendment for the 2019 Annual Action Plan is as follows:

Increase the amount of funding for Public Improvements and Facilities to \$54,248,518.

Reduce the amount of funding for Housing-related activities to \$75,000.

Reduce the amount of funding for Public Service activities to \$0.

Reduce the amount of funding for Economic Development activities to \$0.

The present ${\rm SO_x}$ limit was established based on a total reduced sulfur (TRS) concentration of 46.9 parts per million (ppm) in a 2009 plan approval application, which was adequate at that time based on available data. The TRS concentration has since increased over time due to changes in the waste composition. Therefore, due to the fluctuations in TRS concentration since the 2009 data, the facility is requesting to change emission limits for SO_x based on newly available data. In accordance with 25 Pa. Code §§ 129.91—129.100, the Department of Environmental Protection has made a preliminary determination to approve the RACT 2 sitewide $\mathrm{NO_x}$ emission averaging plan to be submitted as part of the PA State Implementation Plan (SIP) for the Brunner Island facility.

The proposed SIP revision does not adopt any new regulations. It incorporates the provisions and requirements contained in the RACT 2 approval, which are intended to satisfy the requirements for the 1997 National Ambient Air Quality Standard (NAAQS) and the 2008 NAAQS for ozone.

The proposed RACT 2 plan, if approved by DEP, will be issued as a modification of the facility's Title V operating permit (67-05005). The relevant RACT 2 requirements will also be submitted to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) for approval and incorporation into Pennsylvania's State Implementation Plan. Requirements that are not part of the RACT 2 approval will be excluded from the SIP submittal.

The proposed RACT 2 requirements for this facility that are proposed to be submitted to the EPA as part of the SIP, are found in Group 012 of the draft permit, and require that Sources 031A, 032, and 033A shall comply with the facility-wide averaging plan requirements of 25 Pa. By the end of the Ozone Season of 2022, the permittee shall cease combustion of coal at Brunner Island during the Ozone Season (May 1 through September 30 of any calendar year), except that such combustion shall be allowed during each Ozone Season in the interim period from January 1, 2023 to December 31, 2028 (Interim Period), as long as the following conditions are met:
- a. The 30-Day Rolling Average $\mathrm{NO_x}$ Emission Rate (for Brunner Island Units 1—3) is at or below 0.12 lb./MMBtu, calculated at the end of each operating day during each Interim Period Ozone Season when coal has been burned, with the first compliance demonstration made at the end of the 30th operating day in each Ozone Season during which coal has been burned. The permittee shall notify DEP of each operating day when coal was burned during the Ozone Season, within thirty (30) days after the end of any Ozone Season during which coal was burned.
- b. Brunner Island shall emit less than 6,800,000 tons of carbon dioxide (CO_2) from Brunner Island Units 1—3 per calendar year during which coal has been burned during the Ozone Season during the Interim Period.
- 2. By December 31, 2028, the permittee shall cease combustion of coal at Brunner Island, other than during periods of time (including time required for startup and shutdown) when PJM has declared an Emergency Action as defined in PJM Manual 13 (Emergency Operations) or an equivalent standard, and when gas is not available or the supply of gas to Brunner Island is interrupted.
- 3. The 30-Day Rolling Average $\mathrm{NO_x}$ Emission Rate (for Brunner Island Units 1—3) during the Ozone Season shall be determined using the methodology found in 25 Pa. Code § 129.100 (a)(1)(i)—(iii) (for units measuring emissions with continuous emissions monitors (CEMs)), with total $\mathrm{NO_x}$ emissions and total heat input from Brunner Island Units 1—3 used in the calculation. Furthermore, an operating day shall be defined as one with emissions reported from any one of the three units. This paragraph does not, in and of itself, create a right of appeal beyond that permitted by applicable statutes and decisional law. Adoption of the 2022 Editions of the Guidelines for Design and Construction of Hospitals and Guidelines for Design and Construction of Outpatient Facilities

Under the authority of the Health Care Facilities Act (act) (35 P.S. §§ 448.101—448.904b) and the hospital and ambulatory surgical facility regulations promulgated under the act, the Department of Health (Department) adopts the 2022 edition of the Guidelines for Design and Construction of Hospitals and Guidelines for Design and Construction of Outpatient Facilities (Guidelines), effective February 1, 2023. As of February 1, 2023, the Department will apply the 2022 Guidelines to all plans for new construction, alterations or renovations of hospitals and ambulatory surgical facilities.

The Department currently applies the 2018 edition of the *Guidelines* for all new construction, alterations or renovations of hospitals and ambulatory surgical facilities. The 2018 edition of the *Guidelines* will continue to be applied through February 1, 2023, unless a hospital or ambulatory surgical facility elects to use the 2022 *Guidelines* as set forth as follows.

While the mandatory usage of the new Guidelines will not occur until February 1, 2023, the Department has received inquiries regarding whether hospitals and ambulatory surgical facilities may use the 2022 Guidelines before that date. The Department will permit hospitals and ambulatory surgical facilities to use the 2022 Guidelines starting August 1, 2022. Thus, from August 1, 2022, until January 31, 2023, hospitals and ambulatory surgical facilities may elect to use either the 2018 Guidelines or the 2022 Guidelines, but after February 1, 2023, hospitals and ambulatory surgical facilities must use the 2022 Guidelines.

The Department recommends that smaller renovation projects or new additions be designed and submitted for approval based on compliance with the 2018 edition of the *Guidelines* as soon as possible after August 1, 2022. Although it is still permissible to utilize the 2018 edition until February 1, 2023, it would be prudent to utilize the 2022 edition. Larger or more complicated projects should be designed in conformance with the 2022 *Guidelines*,

however, final plan approvals issued after February 1, 2023, will be based upon conformance with the 2022 edition of the *Guidelines*, regardless of when the preliminary plans were submitted.

The established procedure requires the submission of construction plans and the issuance of a final construction plan approval by the Division of Safety Inspection (DSI) prior to the start of any new construction, renovation, alteration or changes in usage. Blueprints are to be submitted to the DSI and are reviewed for compliance with the NFPA 101, Life Safety Code and the requirements as set forth in the *Guidelines*. The plan approval function is a requirement to ensure that new construction, alterations and renovations comply with applicable regulations to avoid building noncompliant conditions into hospitals or ambulatory surgical buildings, which would necessitate costly remedial work to correct prior to the Department allowing the renovated area to be occupied.

After construction has been completed, a final inspection must be conducted for Life Safety Code requirements by the DSI and for State Licensure or Federal Certification, or both, requirements by the Division of Acute and Ambulatory Care.

Approved Prearrest and Evidential Breath Testing Devices

The Department of Health (Department) has statutory authority to approve both prearrest and evidential breath testing devices for use by law enforcement officials to determine the alcohol content of blood by analysis of a person's breath. This notice contains the combined approved lists of prearrest breath testing devices and evidential breath testing devices.

Prearrest Breath Testing Devices

The Department approves prearrest breath testing devices as required by 28 Pa. Code §§ 5.101—5.104 (relating to equipment to determine blood alcohol content under the Vehicle Code and the Fish and Boat Code). Authority to promulgate these regulations is contained in the Vehicle Code, 75 Pa.C.S. § 1547(k) (relating to chemical testing to determine amount of alcohol or controlled substance), the Fish and Boat Code, 30 Pa.C.S. § 5125(k) (relating to chemical testing to determine amount of alcohol or controlled substance), the Game and Wildlife

Code, 34 Pa.C.S. § 2502(j) (relating to chemical test to determine amount of alcohol) and section 2102(g) of The Administrative Code of 1929 (71 P.S. § 532(g)).

Prearrest breath testing devices approved under this authority may be used by police officers, waterways patrolmen and officers enforcing the Vehicle Code, the Fish and Boat Code and the Game and Wildlife Code in conducting preliminary determinations of the alcohol content of blood of persons suspected of driving, boating, hunting or furtaking while under the influence of alcohol. Officers and patrolmen use these devices to assist them in determining whether or not a person should be placed under arrest for violation of 75 Pa.C.S. § 3802 (relating to driving under influence of alcohol or controlled substance), for violation of 30 Pa.C.S. § 5502 (relating to operating watercraft under influence of alcohol or controlled substance), for violation of 34 Pa.C.S. § 2501 (relating to hunting or furtaking prohibited while under influence of alcohol or controlled substance) or for any other criminal offense under the Vehicle Code, the Fish and Boat Code or the Game and Wildlife Code which involves operating a vehicle or boat, hunting or furtaking while under the influence of alcohol.

The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) of the United States Department of Transportation published model specifications for Screening Devices to Measure Alcohol in Bodily Fluids at 59 FR 39382 (August 2, 1994). These specifications established performance criteria and methods for testing alcohol screening devices to measure alcohol content. The NHTSA established these specifications to support state laws and the United States Department of Transportation's workplace alcohol testing program. The Department has elected to use the NHTSA criteria for approving devices for the prearrest testing of a person's breath to determine the alcohol content of the person's blood.

The NHTSA published its first Conforming Products List (CPL) for screening devices at 59 FR 61923 (December 2, 1994), with corrections at 59 FR 65128 (December 16, 1994), identifying the devices that meet the NHTSA's Model Specifications for Screening Devices to Measure Alcohol in Bodily Fluids. Thereafter, the NHTSA updated the CPL at 60 FR 42214 (August 15, 1995), 66 FR 22639 (May 4, 2001), 70 FR 54972 (September 19, 2005), with corrections at 70 FR 72502 (December 5, 2005) and 72 FR 4559 (January 31, 2007).

The NHTSA published revised Model Specifications for Screening Devices to Measure Alcohol in Bodily Fluids at 73 FR 16956 (March 31, 2008). These specifications removed from use interpretive screening devices (ISD) because ISDs did not provide an unambiguous test result. These specifications also removed from use the Breath Alcohol Sample Simulator as it is not necessary for testing breath alcohol screening devices. All other performance criteria and test methods were maintained. The NHTSA published an additional update to the CPL at 74 FR 66398 (December 15, 2009). The current list was published at 77 FR 35745 (June 14, 2012).

Evidential Breath Testing Devices

The Department approves evidential breath testing devices under the authority of the Vehicle Code (75 Pa.C.S. \S 1547(c)(1)), the Fish and Boat Code (30 Pa.C.S. \S 5125(c)(1)) and the Game and Wildlife Code (34 Pa.C.S. \S 2502(c)).

Evidential breath testing devices approved under this notice may be used by law enforcement officials to obtain test results which will be admissible in evidence in any summary or criminal proceeding in which the defendant is charged with a violation of 75 Pa.C.S. § 3802 or any other violation of the Vehicle Code arising out of the same action or 30 Pa.C.S. § 5502 or any other violation of the Fish and Boat Code arising out of the same action or 34 Pa.C.S. § 2501 or any other violation of the Game and Wildlife Code arising out of the same action.

The NHTSA published the Standards for Devices to Measure Breath Alcohol at 38 FR 30459 (November 5, 1973). A Qualified Products List of Evidential Breath Measurement Devices comprised of instruments that met this standard was first issued at 39 FR 41399 (November 21, 1974).

The NHTSA converted the Standards for Devices to Measure Breath Alcohol to Model Specifications for Evidential Breath Testing Devices (Model Specifications) and published a CPL of instruments that were found to conform to the Model Specifications as Appendix D to that notice at 49 FR 48854 (December 14, 1984).

The NHTSA published a notice to amend the Model Specifications at 58 FR 48705 (September 17, 1993) and to update the CPL. That notice changed the alcohol concentration levels at which instruments are evaluated for precision and accuracy, from 0.000, 0.050, 0.101 and 0.151 BAC, to 0.000, 0.020, 0.040, 0.080 and 0.160 BAC, respectively. It also included a test for the presence of acetone and an expanded definition of alcohol to include other low molecular weight alcohols, for example, methyl or isopropyl. Since that time, the CPL has been annotated to indicate which instruments have been determined to meet the Model Specifications published in 1984 and which have been determined to meet the Model Specifications, as revised and published in 1993.

Thereafter, the NHTSA has periodically updated the CPL with those breath instruments found to conform to the Model Specifications.

The NHTSA published an additional update to the CPL at 77 FR 35747 (June 14, 2012) for instruments that conform to the Model Specifications for Evidential Breath Alcohol Measurement Devices at 58 FR 48705 (September 17, 1993). The Department's list of evidential breath testing devices contains updates to the CPL published at 77 FR 35747 (June 14, 2012) for instruments that conform to the Model Specifications for Evidential Breath Alcohol Measurement Devices at 58 FR 48705 (September 17, 1993). This current list was published at 82 FR 50940 (November 2, 2017).

Instruments marked with an asterisk (*) meet the Model Specifications detailed in 49 FR 48854 (December 14, 1984) (that is, instruments tested at 0.000, 0.050, 0.101 and 0.151 BAC). Instruments not marked with an asterisk meet the Model Specifications detailed in 58 FR 48705 (September 17, 1993) and were tested at BACs = 0.000, 0.020, 0.040, 0.080 and 0.160. All instruments that meet the Model Specifications currently in effect (dated September 17, 1993) also meet the Model Specifications for Screening Devices to Measure Alcohol in Bodily Fluids.

The NHTSA also evaluates equipment to determine if it must be operated at fixed locations (that is, nonmobile equipment) or can be transported to nonfixed operational sites in the field (that is, mobile equipment). Most equipment on the following list is approved for mobile and nonmobile operation. The instruments on the list not marked with an asterisk meet the specifications for use as prearrest or evidentiary breath testing devices. The instruments on the list marked with an asterisk may be

used as evidentiary devices for blood alcohol concentrations at or above 0.050%. These instruments may also be used as prearrest breath testing devices if they are approved for mobile operations. However, these instruments may not be used for making arrests under the Vehicle Code, the Fish and Boat Code or the Game and Wildlife Code where blood alcohol concentrations below 0.050% must be determined. Nonmobile devices can only be used as evidentiary testing instruments since they are not portable. Before purchasing breath testing devices, law enforcement officials should consult with the manufacturer of the equipment they intend to purchase to verify that the devices can be used for their intended purposes.

The update to the CPL published at 82 FR 50940 (November 2, 2017) adds 12 new instruments that have been evaluated and found to conform to the Model Specifications, as amended on September 17, 1993 for mobile and nonmobile use. One instrument is distributed by two different companies, so it has been listed twice. One manufacturer changed their legal name. One manufacturer added a new product option for USB and Ethernet connectivity. One manufacturer added a Bluetooth keyboard accessory to two devices and a calibration accessory for seven of its devices. These devices were found to conform with or without the accessories. Another seven instruments are now being listed under a different distributer/manufacturer and those devices will be crossreferenced for legacy purposes. In alphabetical order by company, the new devices are:

- (1) The "AlcoMate TS600" distributed by AK GlobalTech Corporation, Palisades Park, NJ. This device will be known as the Alcoscan ALP—1 outside of the United States. The AlcoMate TS600 is a hand-held device with an electrochemical (EC) fuel cell sensor. This device is powered by internal batteries and is intended for mobile or stationary operations.
- (2) The "Intoxilyzer 500" manufactured by CMI, Inc., Owensboro, KY. This instrument is currently listed on the CPL for Alcohol Screening Devices and will be removed when that CPL is updated. Improvements to the device's sampling system allow it to conform as an Evidential Breath Tester (EBT). It is a hand-held instrument intended for use in mobile or stationary operations. It uses a fuel cell sensor and is powered by an internal battery. The Intoxilyzer 500 is also distributed as the Lion Alcolmeter 500 by Lion Laboratories outside the United States, so it has been listed twice on the CPL, once under each of its distributors/manufacturers.
- (3) The "Intoxilyzer 9000" manufactured by CMI, Inc., Owensboro, KY. This is a bench-top device that is intended for use in mobile or stationary operations. This device uses an infrared (IR) sensor to measure ethanol concentration. The Intoxilyzer 9000 can be powered by either 110 volts alternate current (AC) or 12 volts direct current (DC).
- (4) The "Alcotest 3820" manufactured by Draeger, Inc., Irving, TX. The Alcotest 3820 is a hand-held device that uses an electrochemical (EC) fuel cell sensor to measure ethanol concentration. This instrument is powered by internal batteries and is intended for use in stationary or mobile operations.
- (5) The "Alcotest 5510" manufactured by Draeger, Inc., Irving, Texas. The Alcotest 5510 is a hand-held device that uses an EC fuel cell senor to measure ethanol. This device is powered by internal batteries and is intended for use in mobile or stationary operations.

- (6) The "Alcotest 5820" manufactured by Draeger, Inc., Irving, TX. The Alcotest 5820 is a hand-held device that uses an EC fuel cell sensor to measure ethanol. This device is powered by internal batteries and is intended for use in mobile or stationary operations.
- (7) The "Alcotest 6820" manufactured by Draeger, Inc., Irving, TX. The Alcotest 6820 is a hand-held device that uses an EC fuel cell sensor to measure ethanol. This device is powered by internal batteries and is intended for use in mobile or stationary operations.
- (8) The "AlcoQuant 6020 Plus" manufactured by EnviteC, Wismar, Germany and distributed by Honeywell GmbH, Fond du Lac, WI. The AlcoQuant 6020 Plus is a hand-held device with a fuel cell sensor. This device is powered by internal batteries and is intended for use in mobile and stationary operations.
- (9) The Alco-Sensor FST manufactured by Intoximeters, Inc., Saint Louis, MO. The Alco-Sensor FST is a hand-held EBT that uses an EC fuel cell sensor to measure ethanol concentration. This instrument is powered by internal batteries and is intended for use in stationary or mobile operations.
- (10) The Intox DMT Dual Sensor manufactured by Intoximeters, Inc., Saint Louis, MO. The Intox DMT Dual Sensor is a bench-top EBT that is intended for use in stationary or mobile operations. This device uses both an IR sensor and an EC fuel cell sensor. The Intox DMT Dual Sensor can be powered by either 110 volts AC or 12 volts DC.
- (11) The "Intox EC/IR II.t" manufactured by Intoximeters, Inc., Saint Louis, MO. This is a benchtop device intended for use in mobile or stationary operations. This device uses both an EC fuel cell sensor and an IR sensor to measure ethanol concentrations. The Intox EC/IR II.t can be powered by either 110 volts AC or 12 volts DC.
- (12) The "FC10Plus" manufactured by Lifeloc Technologies, Inc., Wheat Ridge, CO. This is a hand-held device that is intended for use in mobile or stationary operations. This device uses a fuel cell sensor and is powered by internal batteries.

This update indicates that two devices (the Phoenix 6.0 and the FC20, manufactured by Lifeloc Technologies, Inc., Wheat Ridge, CO) come with Bluetooth keyboard support and five additional fields that users can use to enter additional information. With these features, these devices will be listed on the CPL as the "Phoenix 6.0BT" and the "FC20BT." This update indicates also that seven devices manufactured by Lifeloc come with the EASYCAL calibration accessory. Those devices include the FC10, FC10Plus, FC20, FC20BT, EV30, Phoenix 6.0 and the Phoenix 6.0BT. The CPL specifies that each of these devices conforms to the model specifications "w/or without the EASYCAL accessory."

Intoximeters, Inc., Saint Louis, MO acquired the breath alcohol testing business of National Patent Analytical Systems, Inc. (NPAS). Since there have been no changes to the devices other than ownership and a device name change, all six devices previously listed under NPAS (BAC DataMaster (with or without the Delta-1 accessory), BAC Verifier DataMaster (with or without the Delta-1 accessory), DataMaster cdm (with or without the Delta-1 accessory), DataMaster DMT with Fuel Cell option, DataMaster DMT with Rev A Fuel Cell option and DataMaster DMT) will now be listed under both Intoximeters and NPAS. The NPAS DataMaster DMT will

now be known as the Intoximeters Intox DMT. Accordingly, this device will be listed under Intoximeters under both names.

The CPL has been updated to reflect that Draeger Safety Diagnostics, Inc. will begin operating under the name Draeger, Inc. effective July 1, 2017, to align all sales and service operations for Draeger in the United States. Law enforcement agencies should determine that an approved training program in the use of the equipment is available in accordance with the previously referenced statutes before purchasing any of the devices contained on this list. Law enforcement agencies that plan to utilize a device that does not appear on the following list should contact the manufacturer of the equipment to verify that it has been evaluated by the NHTSA and found to meet the NHTSA's performance requirements. If a device is approved by the NHTSA after the date of this publication, the manufacturer of the device will need to forward documentation of the NHTSA acceptability to Jennifer Okraska at the address given as follows so that the Department has information sufficient to enable it to include the device in the next revision of this notice in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Some of the devices included in this notice are listed under the name of more than one manufacturer due to the fact that the name of the manufacturer has changed or the right to produce a device has been transferred to a different company. In these instances, the device is listed under the name of every company that was ever associated with the device to allow law enforcement agencies to continue using devices bearing the name of a previous manufacturer.

To facilitate accessibility of information concerning breath alcohol testing devices which are approved for law enforcement purposes in this Commonwealth, the Department will publish revisions of this list of equipment semiannually as notices in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH

Cytomegalovirus (CMV) Education and Newborn Screening Act

The act of June 27, 2022 (P.L. 388, No. 29), known as the CMV (CMV) Education and Newborn Screening Act (act) was signed into law on June 27, 2022. The act takes effect immediately and provides for the Department of Health (Department) to promulgate regulations within 2 years of the effective date. The act also requires the Department to make certain information and statistics regarding CMV available by means of the Department's web site. This information, including links to relevant resources, a template for capturing CMV screening consent/refusal and the Excel form used for the reporting requirements discussed as follows, can be found on the PA Newborn Hearing web site at https://www.health. pa.gov/topics/programs/Newborn-Screening/Pages/Hearing. aspx. The act additionally requires all newborn care providers (birthing facilities, certified nurse midwives, unlicensed midwives and health care practitioners) to provide CMV information to pregnant persons under their care and to offer a CMV screening to the parent or guardian of any newborn who fails their initial screening before the child turns 21 days of age. The Department created a CMV brochure available on the PA Newborn Hearing web site which can be shared with parents and guardians to meet this informational requirement. If practitioners cannot perform CMV screenings, they must provide referrals for screening.

Consent must be provided by the newborn's parent or guardian and established by means of a signed consent form. Objection to a CMV screening following a failed initial hearing screening must be established by means of a signed form. Consent and objection forms must then be stored in the medical records of the child and reported on monthly to the Department. Providers are required to submit monthly aggregate screening, referral and CMV consent and objection data to the Department by means of an Excel spreadsheet available on the PA Newborn Hearing web site. Reporting will begin in October 2022, for newborns birthed September 1, 2022, and forward. Aggregate data for each month must be submitted within 7 days of the following month to the resource account at ra-tcnbsadmin_fax@pa.gov.

The act establishes that the CMV screening is to be performed using polymerase chain reaction (PCR) on saliva or urine, a follow up urine test to a positive PCR saliva test or additional testing measures approved by the Department.

Laboratories Approved to Determine Analyses of Blood or Serum or Both for Controlled Substances under The Clinical Laboratory Act, the Vehicle Code, the Fish and Boat Code and the Game and Wildlife Code

The following laboratories are licensed by the Department of Health (Department) under The Clinical Laboratory Act (35 P.S. §§ 2151—2165) or section 353 of the Federal Clinical Laboratories Improvement Amendments of 1988 (42 U.S.C.A. § 263a), or both, and are currently approved by the Department under 28 Pa. Code § 5.50 (relating to approval to provide special analytical services) to perform analyses of blood or serum, or both, for the determination of controlled substances. This approval is contingent on demonstrated proficiency in periodic tests conducted by the Department's Bureau of Laboratories. These laboratories are also approved and designated for purposes of the Vehicle Code, 75 Pa.C.S. §§ 1547 and 3755(a) (relating to chemical testing to determine amount of alcohol or controlled substance; and reports by emergency room personnel), the Fish and Boat Code, 30 Pa.C.S. § 5125 (relating to chemical testing to determine amount of alcohol or controlled substance) and the Game and Wildlife Code, 34 Pa.C.S. § 2502 (relating to chemical test to determine amount of alcohol), as qualified to perform the types of services which will reflect the presence of controlled substances in blood or serum, or both.

Depending upon their capability and performance in proficiency surveys, laboratories are approved to perform screening or confirmatory analyses, or both, on blood or serum, or both. Screening analyses provide a presumptive indication that a controlled substance is present. Confirmatory testing is used to substantiate screening results.

Persons seeking forensic blood or serum analysis services, or both, from any of the listed laboratories should determine that the laboratory employs techniques and procedures acceptable for medicolegal purposes. They should also determine that the director of the facility is

agreeable to performing analyses for forensic purposes. Persons seeking blood or serum analyses, or both, are responsible for specifying the controlled substances for which testing is being sought. Persons seeking those analyses should first determine the purpose of the analyses, that is, whether they are for medical, legal or other purposes.

The Vehicle Code contains a provision at 75 Pa.C.S. § 1547(c)(3)(ii) that permits test results on blood or urine for alcohol or controlled substances to be introduced into evidence in legal proceedings in this Commonwealth if the laboratory is located in another state and is not licensed and approved by the Department to provide these services. This section states that the test results may be admissible into evidence at summary or criminal proceedings in which the defendant is charged with a violation of 75 Pa.C.S. § 3802 (relating to driving under influence of alcohol or controlled substance) if the laboratory that performed the test is licensed by the state in which the facility is located and licensed under the Clinical Laboratory Improvement Amendments of 1988, (Pub.L. No. 100-578). A similar provision appears in the Fish and Boat Code at 30 Pa.C.S. § 5125(c)(3)(ii).

The name or location of a laboratory, as well as the personnel and testing procedures, can change. When changes of this type occur, the clinical laboratory permit number does not change. If questions arise about the identity of a laboratory due to a name or location change, the clinical laboratory permit number should be used as the primary identifier. To assist in identifying a laboratory that performed a test, the clinical laboratory permit number of the facility at the time the list was prepared is included in the list of approved laboratories before the name of the laboratory.

The list of approved laboratories will be revised approximately semiannually and published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. Laboratories Approved to Determine Blood Alcohol Content under The Clinical Laboratory Act, the Vehicle Code, the Fish and Boat Code and the Game and Wildlife Code

The following laboratories are licensed by the Department of Health (Department) under The Clinical Laboratory Act (35 P.S. §§ 2151-2165) and are currently approved by the Department under 28 Pa. Code §§ 5.50 and 5.103 (relating to approval to provide special analytical services; and blood tests for blood alcohol content) to perform alcohol analyses of blood, serum or plasma. This approval is contingent on demonstrated proficiency in

periodic tests conducted by the Department's Bureau of Laboratories. These laboratories are also approved and designated under the provisions of the Vehicle Code, 75 Pa.C.S. §§ 1547 and 3755(a) (relating to chemical testing to determine amount of alcohol or controlled substance; and reports by emergency room personnel), the Fish and Boat Code, 30 Pa.C.S. § 5125 (relating to chemical testing to determine amount of alcohol or controlled substance) and the Game and Wildlife Code, 34 Pa.C.S. § 2502 (relating to chemical test to determine amount of alcohol) as qualified to perform the types of specialized services which will reflect the presence of alcohol in blood, serum or plasma.

The Vehicle Code at 75 Pa.C.S. § 1547(c)(3)(ii) also permits test results on blood or urine for alcohol or controlled substances to be introduced into evidence in certain legal proceedings in this Commonwealth if the laboratory is located in another state and is not licensed and approved by the Department to provide forensic blood, serum or plasma analysis services. This section states that the test results will be admissible into evidence at summary or criminal proceedings in which the defendant is charged with a violation of 75 Pa.C.S. § 3802 (relating to driving under influence of alcohol or controlled substance) or any other violation of the Vehicle Code arising out of the same action if the laboratory that performed the test is licensed to conduct the test by the state in which the facility is located and licensed under the Clinical Laboratory Improvement Amendments of 1988, (Pub.L. No. 100-578). A similar provision appears in the Fish and Boat Code at 30 Pa.C.S. § 5125(c)(3)(ii).

Since procedures for determining the alcohol content of serum and plasma are identical and results obtained from serum or plasma derived from a blood sample are the same, laboratories that demonstrate reliability in the determination of alcohol in serum are approved to analyze both serum and plasma for alcohol content.

Persons seeking forensic blood, serum or plasma analysis services from the following designated laboratories should determine that the laboratory employs techniques and procedures acceptable for forensic purposes and that the director of the facility is agreeable to performing determinations for this purpose.

The name or location of a laboratory, as well as the personnel and testing procedures, can change. When changes of this type occur, the clinical laboratory permit number does not change. If questions arise about the identity of a laboratory due to a name or location change, the clinical laboratory permit number should be used as the primary identifier. To assist in identifying a laboratory that performed a test, the clinical laboratory permit number of the facility at the time the list was prepared is included in the list of approved laboratories above the name of the laboratory.

The Department's blood alcohol and serum and plasma alcohol proficiency testing programs are approved by the United States Department of Health and Human Services in accordance with the requirements in section 353 of the Clinical Laboratory Improvement Amendments of 1988 (42 U.S.C.A. § 263a), and implementing regulations at 42 CFR 493.901 and 493.937 (relating to approval of proficiency testing programs; and toxicology), which are administered by the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services. Successful participation in the Department's proficiency testing program will satisfy the compliance requirements for both the Department and Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services.

The list of approved laboratories will be revised approximately semiannually and published in the Pennsylvania Bulletin. Laboratories Approved to Determine Controlled Substance Content of Urine under The Clinical Laboratory Act, the Vehicle Code, the Fish and Boat Code and the Game and Wildlife Code

The following laboratories are licensed by the Department of Health (Department) under The Clinical Laboratory Act (35 P.S. §§ 2151—2165) and are currently approved by the Department under 28 Pa. Code § 5.50 (relating to approval to provide special analytical services) to perform analyses of urine for the determination of controlled substances.

This approval is contingent on demonstrated proficiency in periodic tests conducted by the Department's Bureau of Laboratories. These laboratories are also approved and designated for purposes of the Vehicle Code, 75 Pa.C.S. §§ 1547 and 3755 (relating to chemical testing to determine amount of alcohol or controlled substance; and reports by emergency room personnel), the Fish and Boat Code, 30 Pa.C.S. § 5125 (relating to chemical testing to determine amount of alcohol or controlled substance) and the Game and Wildlife Code, 34 Pa.C.S. § 2502 (relating to chemical test to determine amount of alcohol), as qualified to perform the types of services which will reflect the presence of controlled substances in urine.

Depending upon their capability and performance in proficiency surveys, laboratories are approved to perform screening or confirmatory urine drug analyses, or both. Screening analyses provide a presumptive indication that a controlled substance is present. Confirmatory testing is used to substantiate screening results.

Persons seeking forensic urine drug analysis services from any of the listed laboratories should determine that the laboratory employs techniques and procedures acceptable for the purpose. They should also determine that the director of the facility is agreeable to performing analyses for that purpose. Persons seeking the analyses are responsible for specifying the extent to which the presence of a controlled substance is to be verified. That specification should be predicated upon the purpose for which the analysis is being sought.

The Commonwealth's Vehicle Code contains a provision in 75 Pa.C.S. § 1547(c)(3)(ii) that permits test results on blood or urine for alcohol or controlled substances to be introduced into evidence at legal proceedings in this Commonwealth if the laboratory is located in another state and is not licensed and approved by the Department to provide these services. This section states that the test results may be admissible into evidence at summary or criminal proceedings in which the defendant is charged with a violation of 75 Pa.C.S. § 3802 (relating to driving under influence of alcohol or controlled substance) or any other violation of the Vehicle Code arising out of the same action if the laboratory that performed the test is licensed by the state in which the facility is located and licensed under the Clinical Laboratory Improvement Amendments of 1988 (Pub.L. No. 100-578). A similar provision appears in the Fish and Boat Code at 30 Pa.C.S. § 5125(c)(3)(ii).

The name or location of a laboratory, as well as the personnel and testing procedures, can change. When changes of this type occur, the clinical laboratory permit number does not change. If questions arise about the identity of a laboratory due to a name or location change, the clinical laboratory permit number should be used as the primary identifier. To assist in identifying a labora-

tory that performed a test, the clinical laboratory permit number of the facility at the time the list was prepared is included in the list of approved laboratories above the name of the laboratory.

The list of approved laboratories will be revised approximately semiannually and published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. Laboratories Approved to Perform Blood Lead and/or Erythrocyte Protoporphyrin Determinations under The Clinical Laboratory Act

The following laboratories are licensed in accordance with The Clinical Laboratory Act (35 P.S. §§ 2151—2165) and are currently approved under 28 Pa. Code § 5.50 (relating to approval to provide special analytical services) to perform analyses of blood for lead or erythrocyte protoporphyrin content. This approval is based on demonstrated proficiency in periodic evaluations conducted by the Bureau of Laboratories of the Department of Health (Department).

Lead poisoning is reportable. Approved laboratories that offer blood lead testing services are required to inform the Department of actual or possible incidents of this condition in accordance with 28 Pa. Code § 27.34 (relating to reporting cases of lead poisoning). These regulations specify the following requirements for reporting by clinical laboratories:

- (1) A clinical laboratory shall report all blood lead test results on both venous and capillary specimens for persons under 16 years of age to the Department's Childhood Lead Poisoning Prevention Program, Division of Maternal and Child Health, Bureau of Family Health.
- (2) A clinical laboratory shall report an elevated blood lead level in a person 16 years of age or older to the Department's Division of Environmental Health Epidemiology, Bureau of Epidemiology or to other locations as designated by the Department. An elevated blood lead level is defined by the National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health (NIOSH). As of January 26, 2002, NIOSH defines an elevated blood lead level as a venous blood lead level of 25 micrograms per deciliter (ug/dL) or higher. The Department will publish in the Pennsylvania Bulletin any NIOSH update of the definition within 30 days of NIOSH's notification to the Department.
- (3) A clinical laboratory which conducts blood lead tests of 100 or more specimens per month shall submit results electronically in a format specified by the Department.
- (4) A clinical laboratory which conducts blood lead tests of less than 100 blood lead specimens per month shall submit results either electronically or by hard copy in the format specified by the Department.

(5) A laboratory which performs blood lead tests on blood specimens collected in this Commonwealth shall be licensed as a clinical laboratory and shall be specifically approved by the Department to conduct those tests.

- (6) Blood lead analyses requested for occupational health purposes on blood specimens collected in this Commonwealth shall be performed only by laboratories which are licensed and approved as specified in paragraph (5), and which are also approved by the Occupational Safety and Health Administration of the United States Department of Labor under 29 CFR 1910.1025(j)(2)(iii) (relating to lead).
- (7) A clinical laboratory shall complete a blood lead test within 5 work days of the receipt of the blood specimen and shall submit the case report to the Department by the close of business of the next work day after the day on which the test was performed. The clinical laboratory shall submit a report of lead poisoning using either the hard copy form or electronic transmission format specified by the Department.
- (8) When a clinical laboratory receives a blood specimen without all of the information required for reporting purposes, the clinical laboratory shall test the specimen and shall submit the incomplete report to the Department.

Erythrocyte protoporphyrin determinations may be performed as an adjunct determination to substantiate blood lead levels of 25 µg/dL or higher. Since erythrocyte protoporphyrin concentrations may not increase as a result of low-level exposures to lead, direct blood lead analysis is the only reliable method for identifying individuals with blood lead concentrations below 25 µg/dL.

Persons seeking blood lead or erythrocyte protoporphyrin analyses should determine that the laboratory employs techniques and procedures acceptable for the purpose for which the analyses are sought.

The list of approved laboratories will be revised approximately semiannually and published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

The name or location of a laboratory, as well as the personnel and testing procedures, can change. When changes of this type occur, the clinical laboratory permit number does not change. If questions arise about the identity of a laboratory due to a name or location change, the clinical laboratory permit number should be used as the primary identifier. To assist in identifying a laboratory that performed a test, the clinical laboratory permit number of the facility at the time the list was prepared is included in the list of approved laboratories above the name of the laboratory.

The Department's blood lead proficiency testing program is approved by the United States Department of Health and Human Services in accordance with 42 CFR 493.901 and 493.937 (relating to approval of proficiency testing programs; and toxicology) which are administered by the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services. Successful participation in the Department's proficiency testing program will satisfy the compliance requirements for both the Department and Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services.

This announcement provides advance notice that the Department of Human Services (Department) intends to continue to make an additional payment to certain county nursing facilities in Fiscal Year (FY) 2022-2023.

Proposed Payment

The Department intends to make a county nursing facility supplementation payment to each qualified county nursing facility. To qualify, a county nursing facility must be located in a home rule county that was formerly a county of the second class A, have more than 725 beds and a Medicaid acuity of 0.79 as of August 1, 2015. The number of beds will be the number of licensed beds as of August 1, 2015, and the Medicaid acuity will be determined using the Case Mix Index Report for the August 1, 2015, Picture Date in accordance with 55 Pa. Code § 1187.33 (relating to resident data and picture date reporting requirements).

The Department will calculate the qualifying county nursing facility's supplementation payment for FY 2022-2023 by multiplying the supplementation per diem by the number of paid Medical Assistance (MA) facility and therapeutic leave days for the prior fiscal year. The supplementation per diem will be calculated by dividing the total funds available by the total number of paid MA facility and therapeutic leave days for the prior fiscal year for qualifying facilities.

The Department will submit a State Plan Amendment (SPA) to the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS). If CMS approves the SPA, the total funds will consist of both State and Federal funding. The Department will use its best efforts to process this supplementation payment within 30 days of the date it receives notice from CMS.

Fiscal Impact

This change will result in an estimated cost of \$4.785 million (\$2.000 million in State funds) for FY 2022-2023.
