Eisenhower Postsecondary Grant Application Guidelines for Professional Development Programs

Applications from Pennsylvania nonprofit organizations, which have previously conducted successful reading professional development activities, and Pennsylvania institutions of higher education will be accepted for professional development programs specially designed to improve reading in this Commonwealth. Grant awards will be funded with higher education money authorized by Subchapter II—Dwight D. Eisenhower Professional Development Program—The Improving America's Schools Act of 1994 (P. L. 103-382).

The Commonwealth has approximately \$534,267 available for this competition. Awards issued under these guidelines will be for a maximum of three full funding cycles; funding in subsequent years is estimated to be about \$373,987 each cycle. Awards for this competition and the subsequent two funding cycles are specifically contingent upon the appropriation of funds by the Federal government, a valid and comprehensive assessment of the success of the project, including, but not limited to, demonstration of significant increase in participants' knowledge of how children learn to read by pre/postcontent based tests and a fully executed contract/memorandum of understanding.

It is anticipated that \$250,000 or more will be awarded to one to three grant recipients for the first funding cycle. Only applications including commitments from regional sites and those seeking funding for all three cycles will be funded. Funding will be awarded only to the applicant;

funds to support each regional site will be included in the applicant's final grant award.

Comments should include the name, address and telephone number of the writer and a brief statement to inform the Field Office of the basis of the comment and the relevant facts upon which it is based. A public hearing may be held if the Field Office considers the public response significant.

Following the 30-day comment period, the Water Management Program Manager will make a final determination regarding the proposed permit action. Notice of this determination will be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* at which time this determination may be appealed to the Environmental Hearing Board.

#### Nitrogen Oxides (NOx) Allowance Program

Proposed revisions to Title V/State Only Operating Permits to include conditions relating to NOx Allowance Requirements in 25 Pa. Code §§ 123.101—123.120.

The Department of Environmental Protection (Department) intends to issue new or revise existing Title V/State Only Operating Permits to include provisions of 25 Pa. Code §§ 123.101—123.120 (relating to NOx allowance requirements). These regulations establish an NOx budget and an NOx allowance trading program for NOx affected sources for the purpose of achieving the health-based ozone ambient air quality standard. An NOx affected source is defined as a fossil fuel fired indirect heat exchange combustion unit with a maximum rated heat input capacity of 250 MMBtu/hour or more and all fossil fuel fired electric generating facilities rated at 15 megawatts or greater or any other source that voluntarily opts to become an NOx affected source.

The new or revised Title V/State only operating permits will require the owner or operator of each NOx affected source to hold a quantity of NOx allowances meeting the requirements of 25 Pa. Code §§ 123.110(a) by December 31, of each calendar year. One NOx Allowance is the limited authorization to emit one ton of NOx during the NOx Allowance Control Period, which begins May 1 of each year and ends September 30 of the same year. The NOx allowances held in the source's current year NOx Allowance Tracking System (NATS) account must be equal to or greater than the total NOx emitted from the source during the year's NOx allowance control period. The initial NOx allowance control period begins on May 1, 1999.

The new or revised Title V/State only operating permits will also include emission monitoring, reporting and recordkeeping requirements for each NOx affected source. NOx emissions from each NOx affected source shall be monitored in accordance with 25 Pa. Code §§ 123.108 and the procedures contained in the document titled "Guidance for Implementation of Emission Monitoring Requirements for the NOx Budget Program."

The Department of Environmental Protection (Department) has reviewed the Rush—Ryan Joint Act 537 Plan Amendment of 1998 (Plan), dated June 1998, adopted August 1998, as compiled by the Northeastern Schuylkill Joint Municipal Authority, on behalf of Rush Township and Ryan Township. The Department has found the Plan is acceptable and planning approval is hereby granted.

The Plan proposes to consolidate the Quakake and Tamanend sewage planning area (Area 1) as proposed in Rush Township's October 1993 Sewage Plan Revision, which was approved by the Department on December 14, 1993, with the Park Crest, Hosensock, Grier City and Barnesville planning area (Area 2) as proposed in the April 1995 Joint Sewage Plan Update, which was approved by the Department on July 12, 1995. Specifically, this Plan proposes the following changes to the previously approved Plans:

- 1. Elimination of the construction of a 0.090 million gallons per day (mgd) treatment plant in Rush Township for Area 1.
- 2. Elimination of the construction of a 0.175 mgd treatment plant at the Lakewood Site for Area 2.
- 3. Construction of a sewage conveyance system along State Route (S. R.) 53090 and S. R. 53040, to connect Area 1 to Area 2.
- 4. Construction of a 0.245 mgd treatment plant near the junction of S. R. 54 and Holly Road, to serve Area 1

and Area 2, with an outfall discharging into Pine Creek downstream of Sobolewski's pond.

In accordance with the provisions of the Pennsylvania Sewage Facilities Act (35 P. S. §§ 750.1—750.20(a)) (Act 537), and 25 Pa. Code Chapter 71, the Department will hold Rush Township and Ryan Township responsible for complete and timely implementation of this Plan according to the schedule contained therein.

This approval covers only the wastewater planning aspects of this project. Before construction of the proposed project may commence, one must obtain a National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System Permit (NPDES Permit) and a Part II Water Quality Management Permit from the Department.

Code § 250.8 Administration of Land Recycling Program requires the Department of Environmental Protection (Department) to publish in the Pennsylvania Bulletin a notice of its final actions on plans and reports. A final report is submitted to document cleanup of a release of a regulated substance at a site to one of the Act 2 (Land Recycling and Environmental Remediation Standards Act) remediation standards. Plans and reports required by provisions of Act 2 for compliance with selection of remediation to a site-specific standard, in addition to a final report, include a remedial investigation report, risk assessment report and cleanup plan. A remedial investigation report includes conclusions from the site investigation, concentration of regulated substances in environmental media, benefits of reuse of the property, and in some circumstances, a fate and transport analysis. If required, a risk assessment report describes potential adverse effects caused by the presence of regulated substances. A cleanup plan evaluates the abilities of potential remedies to achieve remedy requirements. **Cigarette Tax Notice** 

Under section 227-A of the Fiscal Code (72 P. S. § 227-A) (relating to administration powers and duties), the Department hereby announces the lowest cost of the stamping agent, wholesaler, and retailer, respectively, effective upon publication of this notice, as follows:

	Premium Brands	Generic Brands
(a.k.a. Kings	& Regulars)	
Cost of the Stamping Agent (for sales to wholesalers)	\$22.54	\$19.84
Cost of the Wholesaler (for sales to retailers)	\$23.45	\$20.64
Cost of the Retailer (for sales to retail customers)	\$24.85	\$21.88

The Department considers these costs as presumptive minimum costs. Cigarette stamping agents, wholesalers and retailers are prohibited from selling cigarettes at a price lower then their respective presumptive minimum

costs. These costs are listed on a per carton basis, ten packs of cigarettes per carton, twenty cigarettes per pack. To determine the presumptive minimum price per pack of cigarettes, one should divide the costs listed above by ten and round to the nearest hundredth of a percent. For example, the presumptive minimum price of a pack of cigarettes sold by a retailer to a consumer is \$2.49 for premium brands (\$24.85/10), \$2.19 for generic brands (\$21.88/10).

Cigarette dealers who either sell cigarettes under a different packaging setup (that is, eight packs per carton) or sell cigarettes that do not qualify as premium or generic brands (that is, sub-generic, foreign or specialty cigarettes) as described above are prohibited from selling cigarettes at a price lower then the cost of the stamping agent, cost of the wholesaler, or cost of the retailer, respectively, as further defined and explained in the Department's cigarette tax regulations, 61 Pa. Code, Article III.

Cigarette dealers wishing to prove a cost different from the Department's presumptive costs stated above must follow the procedures listed under 61 Pa. Code, Chapter 76 (relating to Unfair Sales of Cigarettes).

### Rates of Tax on Aviation Gasoline and Jet Fuel for 1999; Oil Company Franchise Tax Rate for 1999

### **Aviation Gasoline and Jet Fuels**

Under 74 Pa.C.S. § 6121(b), the Secretary of Revenue announces that for the calendar year 1999 the rate of tax on aviation gasoline and all other liquid fuels used or sold and delivered by distributors within this Commonwealth for use as fuel in propeller-driven piston engine aircraft or aircraft engines will decrease from the current rate of 3 5/10¢ to 3 3/10¢\* per gallon or fractional part thereof.

Under 74 Pa.C.S. § 6131(b), the Secretary of Revenue announces that for the calendar year 1999 the rate of tax on jet fuels used or sold and delivered by distributors within this Commonwealth for use as fuel in turbine-propeller jet, turbojet and jet-driven aircraft and aircraft engines will decrease from the current rate of 1 7/10¢ to 1 5/10¢ per gallon or fractional part thereof.

The rate of tax on aviation gasoline is adjusted annually beginning on January 1, 1985 and each January 1 thereafter. The rate of tax on jet fuels is adjusted annually beginning on January 1, 1986 and each January 1 thereafter. Under 74 Pa.C.S. § 6121(b) and § 6131(b) the rate of each tax increases or decreases 1/10 of a cent per gallon for each 10% increase or decrease in the producer price index for jet fuel as determined by the United States Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics, for the most recent 12-month period available as of November 1, subject to a maximum rate of 6¢ per gallon for aviation gasoline and 2¢ per gallon for jet fuels. On November 1, 1998, the most recently available 12-month period was September 1997 to September 1998, as reported in Bureau of Labor Statistics, United States

Department of Labor, Producer Price Indexes, September 1998, for which the percentage change was -25.7%. Accordingly, the aviation gasoline tax rate and the jet fuel tax rate both decrease by 2/10 of a cent per gallon.

### **Oil Company Franchise Tax**

The Secretary of Revenue announces that for the calendar year 1999 there is no change in the current rate of the oil company franchise tax which is hereby determined to be 13.9¢ per gallon on all liquid fuels and 18.8¢ per gallon on all fuels used or sold and delivered by distributors within this Commonwealth under 75 Pa.C.S. § 9004(b) and § 9002, definition of "Cents per Gallon Equivalent Basis."

The rate of the oil company franchise tax imposed under Chapter 95 (Taxes for Highway Maintenance and Construction) of the Vehicle Code, 75 Pa.C.S. § 9502, and collected under Chapter 90 (Liquid Fuels and Fuels Tax), 75 Pa.C.S. § 9004(b), is determined annually by the Department of Revenue and announced by each December 15 for the following calendar year. The tax rate is determined on a "cents per gallon equivalent basis," which is defined by 75 Pa.C.S. § 9002 as:

The average wholesale price per gallon multiplied by the decimal equivalent of any tax imposed by section 9502 (relating to imposition of tax), the product of which is rounded to the next highest tenth of a cent per gallon. The rate of tax shall be determined by the Department of Revenue on an annual basis beginning every January 1 and shall be published as a notice in the Pennsylvania Bulletin no later than the preceding December 15. In the event of a change in the rate of tax imposed by section 9502, the Department shall redetermine the rate of tax as of the effective date of such change and give notice as soon as possible.

"Average wholesale price" as used above is defined as:

The average wholesale price per gallon of all taxable liquid fuels and fuels, excluding the federal excise tax and all liquid fuels taxes, as determined by the Department of Revenue for the 12-month period ending on the September 30 immediately prior to January 1 of the year for which the rate is to be set. In no case shall the average wholesale price be less than 90¢ nor more than \$1.25 per gallon.

For the 12-month period ending September 30, 1998 the Department has determined that the average wholesale price of liquid fuels and fuels was less than 90¢ per gallon; accordingly, an average wholesale price of 90¢ per gallon is used to determine the rate for 1999.
