Furthermore, the person shall not be subject to citizen suits or other contribution actions brought by responsible persons not participating in the remediation.

Under sections 304(n)(l)(ii) and 305(c)(2) of the act, there is a 30-day public and municipal comment period for sites proposed for remediation using a site-specific standard, in whole or in part, and for sites remediated as a special industrial area. This period begins when a summary of the Notice of Intent to Remediate is published in a newspaper of general circulation in the area of the site. For the following sites proposed for remediation to a site-specific standard or as a special industrial area, the municipality, within which the site is located, may request to be involved in the development of the remediation and reuse plans for the site if the request is made within 30 days of the date specified. During this comment period the municipality may request that the person identified, as the remediator of the site, develop and implement a public involvement plan. Requests to be involved, and comments, should be directed to the remediator of the site.

Under section 1113 of the Hazardous Sites Cleanup Act (35 P. S. §§ 6020.101–6020.1305) (HSCA), the Department of Environmental Protection (Department) has agreed to a de minimis Consent Order and Agreement (Agreement) with the Lakeside Park Company, Robert R. Gillette, Bessie G. Gillette, the Estate of Homer B. Widel (Julie M. Widel, Executrix) (collectively, referred to as Lakeside) and the Sandy Creek Conservancy (Conservancy), concerning the resolution of Lakeside's liability for the Sandy Lake Asbestos Site (Site). The Site is located on a 31.75-acre parcel between the former Penn Central Railroad Line and Route 845 in Stoneboro Borough, Mercer County, PA.

The specific terms of this settlement are set forth in the Agreement with Lakeside and the Conservancy. Economic Development under the Municipalities Financial Recovery Act (53 P. S. §§ 11701.101—11701.501) are eligible for an additional 10% of approved cost. No application requesting more than \$2 million in grant funding will be accepted.

The following recyclable materials diverted from the municipal solid waste will be considered as eligible for grant funding: clear glass, colored glass, aluminum, steel and bimetallic cans, high-grade office paper, newsprint, corrugated paper, other marketable grades of paper, plastics, source separated food scraps, and leaf and yard wastes.

Eligible recycling program development costs include: recycling program design costs; recycling market investigations; development of recycling market commitments; development of recycling program ordinances; developing of recycling public education programs; and the costs of developing contracts for procuring equipment or services necessary for the operation of the recycling program.

Eligible recycling program implementation costs include: purchasing or leasing vehicles used to collect recyclables, transport recyclables to processing facilities or markets, and vehicles used in the operation of a materials recovery facility; reusable containers for the collection or storage of recyclable materials; acquiring and/or renovating buildings for the processing or storage of recovered materials; equipment used to process or manufacture recyclable materials into usable products; improvements to land needed to operate a recycling facility or yard waste composting facility; and, the costs associated with educating the public on recycling program requirements, including the development and publication of printed and audio-visual educational materials, advertisements, the development of Internet "Recycling Home Pages," and school or special event programs. Composting projects and programs will be considered to be recycling projects or programs accordingly. A municipality must retain sole ownership of equipment or facilities funded by the grant.

Funding for equipment or facilities purchased for the recycling program used for recycling and other purposes will be prorated according to its recycling use. Funding for certain leaf and yard waste collection equipment may be limited according to its seasonal use. Funding for wood processing equipment will be approved only when the equipment is part of an approved yard waste composting facility operating under the Department's guidelines or in cases where the equipment is used cooperatively among two or more municipalities. Funding of street sweepers for the purpose of leaf collection will not be considered.

Funding may be restricted in situations where equipment or services requested through a grant application may be available from the public or private sector within the county of the applicant. Public notices may be required before the grant application may be submitted depending upon the nature of the funding request. When the municipality submits the recycling grant application to the Department, it must include proof of compliance with the notification requirements, a description of any responses received to the notice, and an explanation of why the municipality has concluded the mechanical processing equipment is not available to the program from the private sector.

It is required that potential applicants contact the following appropriate DEP Regional Planning and Recycling Coordinator listed to schedule a pre-application conference to discuss application requirements and program particulars. Applications will be returned to municipalities who fail to schedule pre-application conferences. Grant application forms are available from DEP Regional and Central offices.

Grant applications must be received or postmarked by 3 p.m., October 6, 2000. Applications received by the Department after that date will not be considered during the current round of solicitation. Applications must be on forms provided by the Department, with two copies submitted to the appropriate DEP Regional Office. Certified Emission Reduction Credits in Pennsylvania's ERC Registry

Emission reduction credits (ERC) are surplus, permanent, quantified and Federally enforceable emission reductions used to offset emission increases of oxides of nitrogen (NO_x), volatile organic compounds (VOC) and the following criteria pollutants: carbon monoxide (CO), lead (Pb), oxides of sulfur (SO_x), particulate matter (PM), PM-10 and PM-10 precursors.

The Department of Environmental Protection (Department) maintains an ERC registry in accordance with the requirements of 25 Pa. Code § 127.209. The ERC registry system provides for the tracking of the creation, transfer and use of ERCs. Prior to registration of the credits, ERC Registry Applications are reviewed and approved by the Department to confirm that the ERCs meet the requirements of 25 Pa. Code §§ 127.206—127.208. Registration of the credits in the ERC registry system constitutes certification that the CRCs satisfy applicable requirements and that the credits are available for use. The following registered, and certified ERCs in the ERC Registry are currently available for use as follows: (1) To satisfy new source review (NSR) emission offset ratio requirements; (2) To "net-out" of NSR at ERC-generating facilities; (3) To sell or trade the ERCs for use as emission offsets at new or modified facilities.

The following certified ERCs shown, expressed in tons per year (tpy), satisfy the applicable ERC requirements contained in 25 Pa. Code §§ 127.206—127.208. ERCs created from the curtailment or shutdown of a source or facility expire for use as offsets 10 years after the emission reduction occurs. ERCs generated by the overcontrol of emissions by an existing facility do not expire for use as offsets. However, credits in the registry which are not used in a plan approval will be discounted if new air quality requirements are adopted by the Department or United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA).

Changes to Quarterly UC Tax Forms Now in Effect

Employers have begun receiving revised Pennsylvania (PA) Unemployment Compensation (UC) tax forms. The changes are a part of the Department of Labor and Industry's (Department) project to revise PA Form UC-2/ 2A/2B to be more customer-friendly and machine-readable to efficiently capture the data.

Specifications to print Department approved facsimile Form UC-2 and UC-2A were mailed out to payroll service providers in early May. Anyone not using the preprinted quarterly reports provided by the Department, or filing by Magnetic Media, will be required to print their reports in accordance with these new specifications.

The specifications for Form UC-2A (wage detail) can be used immediately. Beginning with the third quarter of 2000, employers will be expected to utilize the Department provided form or an approved facsimile for reporting wage detail. Also beginning with the third quarter of 2000, employers with less than 250 employes can have their employe names and social security numbers preprinted on Form UC-2A. For persons interested in this service, please be sure to fill in the circle beside item No. 6 on Form UC-2A. This item must be completed each quarter for the following quarter to be preprinted. As provided in 55 Pa. Code § 1150.61(a), the Department of Public Welfare (Department) announces that effective July 3, 2000, it will increase the fees listed in the Medical Assistance (MA) Program Fee Schedule for services rendered by funeral directors. Specifically, effective July 3, 2000, the Department will increase the maximum payment available for burial and/or cremation to \$750 if there are no resources that reduce the payment. Further, the Department will eliminate the sliding scale payment based on the age of the deceased. The specific changes to the MA Program Fee Schedule are as follows:

Revised Goal—Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE); Participation in Federally-Funded Contracts

Under the authority contained in the Transportation Act for the 21st Century, Act of June 9, 1998, Pub. L. No 105-178, 112 Stat. 113 (23 U.S.C. § 101), and in keeping with the requirements of Part 26 of Title 49 of the Code of Federal Regulations, the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (Department) provides public notice of its revised goal for participation by Disadvantaged Business Enterprises (DBEs) in its federally assisted contracts.

Pending receipt of public comments, the Department's revised goal is a work in progress. However, the Department proposes an overall goal of 8.90 percent for DBE participation in Department contracts funded in whole or in part with federal monies.

As a recipient of federal funds from the United States Department of Transportation (US DOT) through its agencies, including the Federal Highway Administration, the Department must comply with the goal setting provisions of the new US DOT DBE regulation, set forth in 49 C.F.R. Part 26, effective March 4, 1999. The Department is mandated to submit a revised goal and methodology for federally assisted contracts in accordance with the provisions of 49 C.F.R. Sections 26.45 and 26.51. The revised goal and methodology must be submitted to the Federal Highway Administration by August 1, 2000. An important part of this process is providing notice to the public concerning the revised goal and methodology used to arrive at the final goal and affording the public the opportunity to provide comments on the goal proposal.

To comply with the goal setting provisions of the new regulation, the Department employed a two step process, as outlined in 49 C.F.R. Section 26.45. Under step one, the Department created a baseline figure for the relative availability of "ready, willing and able DBEs" in a relevant market, derived from demonstrative evidence of local market conditions. To this end, the Department developed a definition of "ready, willing and able DBEs" relative to any business "ready willing and able DBEs" relative to any business "ready willing and able" to perform on federally assisted Department contracts. The Department considered historical activity within specified market areas including research, engineering, and design consulting, contractors (prime, subcontractors and suppliers), and other consultant activities. Additionally, the Department developed a ratio within market areas of "ready willing and able DBEs" relative to the universe of all other "ready willing and able" enterprises.

Under step two, the Department examined all relevant evidence in its jurisdiction to determine what adjustments, up or down, are needed to arrive at the overall goal, taking into consideration other conditions or variables impacting DBEs in the Commonwealth. As part of this adjustment phase, the Department considered market potential based upon employment security data and other public data. The Department also considered certain changes relative to counting and certification that occurred as the result of the new regulation.

Consistent with the public participation requirement for this process, the Department is making the proposed revised goal and methodology available for inspection and review for forty-five days from the date of this notice.
