

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Pennsylvania Bulletin

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the official gazette of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. It is published every week and includes a table of contents. A cumulative subject matter index is published quarterly.

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* serves several purposes. First, it is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, which is the official codification of agency rules and regulations and other statutorily authorized documents. Changes in the codified text, whether by adoption, amendment, repeal or emergency action must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. Further, agencies proposing changes to the codified text do so in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Second, the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* also publishes: Governor's Executive Orders; State Contract Notices; Summaries of Enacted Statutes; Statewide and Local Court Rules; Attorney General Opinions; Motor Carrier Applications before the Public Utility Commission; Applications and Actions before the Department of Environmental Protection; Orders of the Independent Regulatory Review Commission; and other documents authorized by law.

The text of certain documents published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the only valid and enforceable text. Courts are required to take judicial notice of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Adoption, Amendment or Repeal of Regulations

Generally an agency wishing to adopt, amend or repeal regulations must first publish in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking. There are limited instances where the agency may omit the proposal step; they still must publish the adopted version.

The Notice of Proposed Rulemaking contains the full text of the change, the agency contact person, a fiscal note required by law and background for the action.

The agency then allows sufficient time for public comment before taking final action. An adopted proposal must be published in the *Pennsylvania*

Bulletin before it can take effect. If the agency wishes to adopt changes to the Notice of Proposed Rulemaking to enlarge the scope, they must repropose.

Citation to the Pennsylvania Bulletin

Cite material in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* by volume number and page number. Example: Volume 1, *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, page 801 (short form: 1 Pa.B. 801).

Pennsylvania Code

The *Pennsylvania Code* is the official codification of rules and regulations issued by Commonwealth agencies and other statutorily authorized documents. The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, printing changes as soon as they occur. These changes are then permanently codified by the *Pennsylvania Code Reporter*, a monthly, loose-leaf supplement.

The *Pennsylvania Code* is cited by title number and section number. Example: Title 10 *Pennsylvania Code*, § 1.1 (short form: 10 Pa.Code § 1.1).

Under the *Pennsylvania Code* codification system, each regulation is assigned a unique number by title and section. Titles roughly parallel the organization of Commonwealth government. Title 1 *Pennsylvania Code* lists every agency and its corresponding *Code* title location.

How to Find Documents

Search for your area of interest in the *Pennsylva*nia Code.

The *Pennsylvania Code* contains, as Finding Aids, subject indexes for the complete *Code* and for each individual title, a list of Statutes Used As Authority for Adopting Rules and a list of annotated cases. Source Notes give you the history of the documents. To see if there have been recent changes, not yet codified, check the List of *Pennsylvania Code* Chapters Affected in the most recent issue of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* also publishes a quarterly List of Pennsylvania Code Sections Affected which lists the regulations in numerical order, followed by the citation to the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* in which the change occurred.

Printing Format

Material proposed to be added to an existing rule or regulation is printed in **bold face** and material proposed to be deleted from such a rule or regulation is enclosed in brackets [] and printed in **bold face**. Asterisks indicate ellipsis of *Pennsylvania Code* text retained without change. Proposed new or additional regulations are printed in ordinary style face.

Fiscal Notes

Section 612 of The Administrative Code of 1929 (71 P. S. § 232) requires that the Office of Budget prepare a fiscal note for regulatory actions and administrative procedures of the administrative departments, boards, commissions or authorities receiving money from the State Treasury stating whether the proposed action or procedure causes a loss of revenue or an increase in the cost of programs for the Commonwealth or its political subdivisions; that the fiscal note be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* at the same time as the proposed change is advertised; and that the fiscal note shall provide the following information: (1) the designation of the fund out of which the appropriation providing for expenditures under the action or procedure shall be made; (2) the probable cost for the fiscal year the program is implemented; (3) projected cost estimate of the program for each of the five succeeding fiscal years; (4) fiscal history of the program for which expenditures are to be made; (5) probable loss of revenue for the fiscal year of its implementation; (6) projected loss of revenue from the program for each of the five succeeding fiscal years; (7) line item, if any, of the General Appropriation Act or other appropriation act out of which expenditures or losses of Commonwealth funds shall occur as a result of the action or procedures; (8) recommendation, if any, of the Secretary of the Budget and the reasons therefor.

The required information is published in the foregoing order immediately following the proposed change to which it relates; the omission of an item indicates that the agency text of the fiscal note states that there is no information available with respect thereto. In items (3) and (6) information is set forth for the first through fifth fiscal years; in that order, following the year the program is implemented, which is stated. In item (4) information is set forth for the current and two immediately preceding years, in that order. In item (8) the recommendation, if any, made by the Secretary of Budget is published with the fiscal note. See 4 Pa. Code § 7.231 et seq. Where "no fiscal impact" is published, the statement means no additional cost or revenue loss to the Commonwealth or its local political subdivision is intended.

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Information published under this part, which information includes, but is not limited to, cross references, tables of cases, notes of decisions, tables of contents, indexes, source notes, authority notes, numerical lists and codification guides, other than the actual text of rules or regulations may be reproduced only with the written consent of the Bureau. The information which appears on the same leaf with the text of a rule or regulation, however, may be incidentally reproduced in connection with the reproduction of the rule or regulation, if the reproduction is for the private use of a subscriber and not for resale. There are no other restrictions on the reproduction of information published under this part, and the Commonwealth hereby consents to a reproduction.

Recommendation 55; Proposed Amendments to the Rules Relating to Domestic Relations Matters

The Domestic Relations Procedural Rules Committee proposes the following new rules governing family law matters. The Committee solicits comments and suggestions from all interested persons prior to submission of these proposed rules to the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania.

The introductory comments which precede the proposed rules will not constitute part of the rules and will not officially be adopted or promulgated by the Supreme Court

Recommendation 55 Family Court Rules

Introduction

In late 2000, the Domestic Relations Procedural Rules Committee of the Pennsylvania Supreme Court first published, as Recommendation 55, a proposed new set of rules governing family law matters. Extensive comments were submitted and all were reviewed and considered by the committee. In addition, committee members met with members of the judiciary, family law practitioners, domestic relations personnel and others to hear their concerns about the proposed rules as published. As a result of the comments and suggestions received, Recommendation 55 has been revised substantially. Because of the revisions and because of the widespread interest in these family court rules, the committee is publishing the revised recommendation for further comment.

The committee's goals remain unchanged—to make it easier for the public to gain access to the family court system and to assure that family matters are concluded fairly and expeditiously. However, in order to address the major concerns expressed in the comments to the first draft, in particular the issues of cost, personnel and space, the case management requirement has been removed from the current proposal. In addition, because the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania has not mandated continuing legal education for the judiciary, the proposal to require judges presiding over family court matters to obtain certain related instruction also has been withdrawn. Nevertheless, the committee encourages judges who preside over family court matters to voluntarily avail themselves of programs in the substantive and procedural aspects of the law, as well as family and child dynamics, domestic violence and other related topics.

There also are two new provisions in this revised version of Recommendation 55. First, there is the requirement of unified docketing. Several judicial districts already assign the same primary case number to different aspects of a family law case, such as support and equitable distribution, to facilitate consistency and efficiency of operation. Second, the proposed rules allow the domestic relations sections, which often are the parties first point of contact with the judicial system in a family matter, to facilitate the entry of agreed-upon custody orders.

Finally, it remains the committee's plan to recommend that the Supreme Court establish a set of Family Court Rules separate from the Pennsylvania Rules of Civil Procedure. The Pa.R.C.P. 1900 series originally set aside for domestic relations matters is insufficient to contain all of the rules for protection from abuse, custody, support, divorce and paternity. If a separate set of rules is established, eventually all of the rules now in the 1900 series of the Pa. Rules of Civil Procedure will be rearranged, renumbered and relocated to the Pennsylvania Family Court Rules.

Rule 101. Actions Governed by Family Court Rules.

- (a) Divorce, Annulment, Dissolution of Marriage.
- (1) Equitable Distribution.

- (b) Child Custody.

Rule 102. Commencement of Action.

- (a) Centralized Filing. Each judicial district shall establish a Family Court Filing Unit either as a separate and distinct office of the district's family court division, or as a separate and distinct unit of the prothonotary's or court administrator's office. Actions for divorce, annulment, child custody (except as set forth in subdivision (b) below), paternity and protection from abuse shall be commenced by filing a pleading in the Family Court Filing Unit. Child support, spousal support and alimony pendente lite actions shall be initiated at the Domestic Relations Section.
- (b) Custody Agreements. If, at a support proceeding, the parties have agreed upon a schedule of custody, partial custody or visitation regarding their child(ren) and it appears that the entry of a custody order incorporating

the parties' agreement will facilitate the payment and collection of child support, the conference officer, hearing officer or master may provide the parties with a form custody complaint and form custody stipulation, along with information as to where to file the completed documents and the filing fee.

(c) *Unified Docketing*. All actions under these Family Court Rules which involve identical parties shall be entered on the court's docket under the same primary case number. Additional letters or numbers may be added parenthetically to specify the type of action, judge assigned or other identifying information.

Rule 103. Consolidation of Family Court Matters.

- (a) General Rule. To the extent it is practical and appropriate, two or more actions under these Family Court Rules involving the same parties and common questions of law and/or fact should be consolidated for hearing or trial.
- (b) *Trial Continuity*. Whenever possible, trials before a judge or hearings before a master shall be scheduled to be heard on consecutive days. If not held on consecutive days, then the trial or hearing shall be concluded within ninety (90) days of the date of the commencement of the trial or hearing, unless a shorter time frame is required by statute or another procedural rule.
 - (c) Prompt Decisions.
- (1) Except as provided in subdivision (2) below, in any matter brought under these Family Court Rules, a decision by a conference officer, master or judge shall be entered, filed and served upon counsel for the parties, or any party not represented by counsel, not later than fifteen (15) days after the conference, hearing or trial concludes, unless a shorter time frame is required by statute or another procedural rule.
- (2) The time for entering and filing a decision may be extended if, within fifteen (15) days of the conclusion of the conference, hearing or trial, the court extends the date for such decision by order entered of record showing good cause for the extension. In no event shall an extension delay entry of the decision more than forty-five (45) days after the conclusion of the conference, hearing or trial.

Rule 104. Continuing Education for Family Court Personnel.

- (a) *Program Development.* Courses of instruction that include, at a minimum, the following topics shall be developed or approved by the Administrative Office of Pennsylvania Courts (AOPC):
- (1) The substantive law and procedural aspects of the areas of law governed by these Family Court Rules;
 - (2) Domestic violence;
 - (3) Child development;
 - (4) Family dynamics;
 - (5) Addictions and treatments;
 - (6) Asset valuation
 - (7) Community resources.
- (b) *Initial Training*. Within one (1) year of being assigned to cases governed by these Family Court Rules, each master, hearing officer, conciliator, mediator and other court personnel designated by the president or administrative judge of the judicial district shall successfully complete the coursework developed or approved by the AOPC.

- (c) Continuing Education. Each master, hearing officer, conciliator, mediator and other court personnel designated by the president or administrative judge who is assigned to cases governed by these Family Court Rules shall successfully complete six (6) hours of continuing education developed or approved by the AOPC each calendar year after the calendar year in which the initial training was completed.
- (d) Compliance. The AOPC shall monitor compliance with the educational requirements of this rule.

Promulgation of Local Rule 215; No. 1793 S 1989

Order

And Now, this 6th day of December, 2001, Dauphin County Local Rule of Civil Procedure 215 is promulgated as follows:

Rule 215. Preferences.

A trial list preference may be requested in all cases in which a jury previously has been impaneled and sworn, or which were listed and available for trial in the preceding civil trial session but were not reached. Such preference shall be presented in the form of an application for preference. The application must be filed with the Prothonotary at least three weeks prior to the first day of the trial session. Copies must be served upon all other counsel and the Court Administrator's Office. The Calendar Judge will determine the order of preference.

This rule shall be effective 30 days after publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

And Now, this 6th day of December, 2001, Dauphin County Local Rule of Civil Procedure 215.1 is amended as follows:

Rule 215.1. Jury Trials.

(2) Attachment—Listing a case for trial shall have the effect of attaching all counsel of record for the trial term specified. The attachment shall be effective as of the date of the filing of the certificate of readiness unless a prior scheduling order has been issued.

THE COURTS 313

The Dauphin County Court will defer to a scheduling/attachment order from another court of equal or higher jurisdiction so long as

- (a) The foreign order is earlier in time; and
- (b) The party with the scheduling conflict timely moves for a continuance and attaches a copy of the foreign order.

Promulgation of Local Rule 1901; No. 1793 S 1989

Order

And Now, this 6th day of December 2001, Dauphin County Local Rule of Judicial Administration 1901 is amended as follows:

Rule 1901. Termination of Inactive Civil Matters.

[A list shall be prepared for general call in January of each year of such civil matters as may be designated from time to time by the Court in which no steps or procedures have been taken for two years or more prior thereto. Notice of impending dismissal shall be given to counsel of record and to parties for whom no appearance has been entered at least thirty days prior to the call of said list as provided by the Pennsylvania Rules of Judicial Administration.

Unless written objection to dismissal is filed in such matter and a copy thereof served upon the Court Administrator at least five days prior to the call of the list, the case shall be stricken from the list and the Prothonotary shall enter an order as of course dismissing the matter with prejudice for failure to prosecute. In cases where objections to dismissal are filed and served, the Court may dismiss the matter if cause for continuance is not shown at the call of the list.

- 1. On or about October 1st of each year, the Prothonotary shall prepare a list of all civil matters in which there has been no docket activity for the preceding two years. The list shall include the names and addresses of counsel of record and/or pro se litigants.
- 2. Upon receipt of the list, the Court Administrator shall prepare a Rule to Show Cause for signature by the Civil Calendar Judge. The rule shall contain substantially the following language:

RULE TO SHOW CAUSE

The Prothonotary of Dauphin County, having determined that no docket activity appears in the record of the above captioned matter for a period in excess of two years,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that a Rule is granted on all parties to show cause, if any they have, why the captioned action shall not be dismissed with prejudice.

This Rule is returnable within 45 days of the posting date. Any response or objection shall be in proper petition form and include:

- a. A brief procedural history of the action setting forth with particularity the party who initiated each procedural step.
- b. Specific reason(s) for failure to advance the case since the last docket entry, including any non-docket activity.
- c. A statement indicating whether opposing counsel or pro se litigant concurs in the objection to the termination.
- d. A specific and comprehensive proposal for moving the case to final resolution.
- e. Whether hearing or argument is requested on the objection.

NOTICE

Failure to file a timely response to this Rule in the manner prescribed will be cause for dismissal of this case with prejudice to any party asserting a claim for relief.

- 3. The Court Administrator shall make service of the Rule by regular mail to the last address of record of the parties or their counsel of record.
- 4. In any case where notice by mail cannot be given or where the Rule has been returned undelivered, the Court Administrator shall provide notice as set forth above, by publication in the manner provided by rule of court for publication of legal notices.
- 5. All objections to termination in which no hearing/argument is requested shall be considered on the pleadings and an appropriate order entered by the Civil Calendar Judge.

- 6. Any objection to termination in which hearing and/or argument is requested shall be heard at a time fixed by the Calendar Judge. An appropriate order disposing of the motion, which may include scheduling provisions and/or specific judicial assignment, shall follow.
- 7. In cases where no response or objection is filed, the Calendar Judge shall enter an order as of course dismissing the matter with prejudice for failure to prosecute.

COMMENT

Amended Rule 1901 is intended to provide a more comprehensive method for the termination of inactive civil matters. The amended rule more closely tracts the requirements of Pa.R.J.A. 1901 and eliminates the prior practice of a "call of the list."

This rule shall be effective 30 days after publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Promulgation of Local Rule 4019; No. 1793 S 1989

Order

And Now, this 10th day of December 2001, Dauphin County Local Rule of Civil Procedure 4019 is amended as follows:

Rule 4019. Discovery Disputes.

* * * * *

- (4) Procedure for failure to provide discovery; Motion for Sanctions.
- (a) If a party fails to respond timely to interrogatories or a request for production of documents or fails to appear in response to a notice of deposition, and no extension of time has been granted, the party issuing the discovery request may file a motion for sanctions.
- (b) A written notice of intention to seek sanctions, specifically listing the sanctions sought, shall be sent to the defaulting party(ies) by certified mail, return receipt requested, at least thirty days before filing a motion for sanctions.
- (c) If the requested discovery is received within said thirty-day notice period, no motion for sanctions shall be filed.
- (d) A motion for sanctions shall state (1) the discovery requested and (2) proposed sanctions appropriate pursuant to Pa.R.Civ.P. 4019. A written certificate of service of the written notice of intention to seek sanctions under subparagraph (b) and a copy of the notice shall be attached. If attorneys' fees and expenses are sought, reasonable documentation of time devoted and expenses incurred shall be attached to the motion.
- (e) The Calendar Judge shall conduct a hearing on the motion, even if the default that prompted the motion has been corrected before the hearing date.

This rule shall be effective 30 days after publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

DELAWARE COUNTY

Adoption of Amendment to Delaware County Local Rule 1915.3(h); Misc. Doc. No. 00-3708

Order

And Now, to wit, this 27th day of December, 2001, it is hereby *Ordered* and *Decreed* that Local Rule 1915.3(h) is hereby *Adopted* and shall read as follows:

Local Rule 1915.3(h).

- (h) A party may offer into evidence without further proof the following items:
- (1) Reports and correspondence and records from physical health providers, educators, law enforcement departments and related officials if said documents are provided to opposing counsel or pro se party at least twenty (20) days before the scheduled hearing. If the moving party receives no written objection thereto not less than ten (10) days prior to the trial date, this evidence shall be admitted without the necessity of testimony from the scrivener. If objection is made, the party requesting the admission of said evidence may submit a specific written request for an evidentiary ruling to the Court Administrator for referral to the appropriate Judge. In no event shall the scheduled hearing be delayed as a result of the application of this rule.
- (2) Reports and correspondence from mental health providers and custody evaluaters if said documents are provided to opposing counsel or pro se party at least twenty (20) days before the scheduled hearing. If the moving party receives no written objections thereto, not less than ten (10) days prior to the trial date, this evidence shall be admitted without the necessity of testimony from the scrivener. Rule WJ507. Retention of Court Reporter Notes and Transcripts.

A. Raw Notes of Testimony

- 1. "Raw notes" are those on paper tapes and/or other media in the original state in which they existed when taken at the time of testimony.
- 2. Court reporters will transcribe notes of all Termination of Parental Rights and Adoption proceedings. The transcript and printed raw notes of testimony will be filed in the record, and retained.
- 3. The court reporter may destroy the raw notes 60 days after the date of filing of the transcript. The court reporter shall retain the notes until the court rules on any objections of the transcript.
- 4. In any case in which no transcript has been prepared, the raw notes shall be retained for seven years from the date of testimony.
- 5. Notwithstanding the provisions of this subsection, any party may petition the court for an order directing the retention of particular court reporter notes for a period of time beyond that required herein.

B. Transcripts

- 1. The original of all transcripts will be filed with the appropriate record keeper. With the exception of subsections 2 and 3, Transcripts filed with the Prothonotary, Clerk of the Orphans' Court, and Clerk of Courts are subject to the retention periods set forth in the *County Records Manual*.
- 2. Transcripts filed in juvenile matters may be destroyed when the subject reaches the age of 25, or 10 years after the last action in the case, whichever is later.
- 3. Transcripts for Divorce or Annulment cases may be destroyed 5 years after the Final Decree in Divorce or Annulment is entered.

C. Record Retention Disposal Log

Disposal of raw notes shall be accomplished as provided in Section 2.3 of the *Supreme Court's Record Retention* and *Disposition Schedule*. When completing Disposal Log Forms, the raw notes need not be listed on the Records Disposal Log by caption and case number, but may be listed merely by date of hearing.

Temporary Order Designating Chronic Wasting Disease a Dangerous Transmissible Disease

The Department of Agriculture (Department) hereby designates Chronic Wasting Disease (CWD) a "dangerous transmissible disease," under authority of section 2322(d) of the Agriculture Code (code) (3 Pa.C.S. § 2322(d)). This designation will facilitate the Department's efforts to detect and contain CWD and will assist this Commonwealth's deer and elk industry in developing control programs for the disease.

CWD is a disease of deer, elk and other cerividae and is a member of the group of diseases known as transmissible spongiform encephalopathies (TSEs). Other more well known TSEs are scrapie and bovine spongiform encephalopathy (BSE) or "mad cow" disease. All are thought to be caused by a prion protein that has converted to an abnormal infectious prion protein. There is some evidence, in the case of BSE, that humans may become infected through consumption of meat products containing central nervous system tissues, thus there is a significant public health interest concerning all TSEs.

Recently, several western states instituted import regulations that require deer or elk entering those states be from herds that are participating in a surveillance program and that the state of origin have authority to take action in the event that CWD is diagnosed. To support our deer and elk industry and to keep these markets open, it will be necessary for the Department to assist in the development and oversight of a surveillance program

and to take action in the event that a case of CWD is diagnosed. The authority to do so will depend on the designation of CWD as a "dangerous transmissible" disease.

The Department has authority under the Domestic Animal Law provisions of the code (3 Pa.C.S. §§ 2301—2389) to regularly monitor the domestic animal population of this Commonwealth to determine the prevalence, incidence and location of transmissible diseases. The Department has authority under this act to declare a particular disease not contained in the original act to be a "dangerous transmissible" disease through issuance of a temporary order.

This order is a temporary order, as required under section 2322(d) of the code. This order shall take effect as of January 5, 2002, and shall remain in effect until no later than January 4, 2003. This Department may: (1) reissue this temporary order to extend the designation beyond January 4, 2003; (2) allow this temporary order to expire on January 4, 2003; (3) supplant this temporary order with a formal regulation designating CWD a "dangerous transmissible disease"; or (4) modify this temporary order.

The proposed effluent limits for the operation/activity include: except for the chronic or catastrophic rainfall events defined as over the 25 year/24 hour rain storms, the CAFO general permit is a nondischarge NPDES permit. Where applicable, compliance with 40 CFR Federal effluent limitations guidelines is required. The general permit requires no other numeric effluent limitations and compliance with Pennsylvania Nutrient Management Act and The Clean Streams Law constitutes compliance the State narrative water quality standards.

The Department has conducted administrative and technical reviews of the application. Based on the preliminary reviews of the application of lawful standards and regulations, including the Final CAFO Strategy, the Department has made a tentative determination to issue a General NPDES permit for the operation subject to the terms and conditions and monitoring and reporting requirements specified in the draft permit.

LAND RECYCLING AND ENVIRONMENTAL REMEDIATION

UNDER ACT 2, 1995 PREAMBLE 1

Acknowledgment of Notices of Intent to Remediate Submitted under the Land Recycling and Environmental Remediation Standards Act (35 P. S. §§ 6026.101—6026.908).

Sections 302-305 of the Land Recycling and Environmental Remediation Standards Act (Act) require the Department of Environmental Protection (Department) to publish in the Pennsylvania Bulletin an acknowledgment noting receipt of any Notices of Intent to Remediate. An acknowledgment of the receipt of a Notice of Intent to Remediate is used to identify a site where a person proposes to or has been required to, respond to a release of a regulated substance at a site. Persons intending to use the background standard, Statewide health standard, the site-specific standard or who intend to remediate a site as a special industrial area, must file a Notice of Intent to Remediate with the Department. A Notice of Intent to Remediate filed with the Department provides a brief description of the location of the site, a list of known or suspected contaminants at the site, the proposed remediation measures for the site and a description of the intended future use of the site. A person who demonstrates attainment of one or a combination of the cleanup standards or who receives approval of a special industrial area remediation identified under the Act, will be relieved of further liability for the remediation of the site for any contamination identified in reports submitted to and approved by the Department. Furthermore, the person shall not be subject to citizen suits or other contribution actions brought by responsible persons not participating in the remediation.

Under sections 304(n)(1)(ii) and 305(c)(2) of the Act, there is a 30-day public and municipal comment period for sites proposed for remediation using a site-specific standard, in whole or in part and for sites remediated as a special industrial area. This period begins when a summary of the Notice of Intent to Remediate is published in a newspaper of general circulation in the area of the site. For the sites identified, proposed for remediation to a site-specific standard or as a special industrial area, the municipality, within which the site is located, may request to be involved in the development of the remediation and reuse plans for the site if the request is made

within 30 days of the date specified. During this comment period the municipality may request that the person identified, as the remediator of the site, develop and implement a public involvement plan. Requests to be involved and comments, should be directed to the remediator of the site.

The following are the conditions that will appear in the Plan Approval pending final review:

- 1. The destruction efficiency of the control device shall be at least 90% for captured VOCs as demonstrated through the Department-approved testing procedure in accordance with 25 Pa. Code Chapter 139.
- 2. The temperature of the combustion chambers of each control device shall be maintained at 1,375°F or at least the temperature at which compliance with the destruction efficiency of Condition No. 3 was demonstrated during the most recent compliance test when controlling emissions from the presses that are operating. The temperature of the combustion chamber shall not fluctuate more than 25°F below the demonstrated compliance temperature. Data shall be collected at least once per shift while presses are operating to determine compliance with this temperature restriction.
- 3. No person shall permit the emission into the outdoor atmosphere of particulate matter from any process previously listed, at any time, in a manner that the concentration of particulate matter in the effluent gas exceeds 0.04 grain per dry standard cubic foot.
- 4. No person shall permit the emission into the outdoor atmosphere of sulfur oxides from a source in a manner that the concentration of the sulfur oxides, expressed as SO_2 , in the effluent gas exceeds 500 parts per million, by volume, dry basis.
- 5. a. The weighted average VOC content of all heatset inks shall not exceed 45% by weight.
- b. The fountain solution VOC content shall not exceed 3% by weight as applied.
- c. The cleaning solutions used for automatic and manual cleaning shall have a VOC composite partial vapor pressure of less than or equal to 10 mm Hg of 20° C

or contain less than 30% by weight of VOCs. Use of higher vapor pressure cleaners shall be limited to less than 5% by weight of the total manual cleaning solution used.

- 6. The permittee shall obtain 74.4 tons of VOC Emission Reduction Credits prior to commencing operation of press LCM-688.
- 7. The installation of LCM-688 accounts for a 30-ton VOC increase at the facility. This increase, when aggregated with Source ID 110 of the Title V Operating Permit, will be limited to 88.6 tons of VOCs per year based on a 12-month rolling total.
 - 8. Monitoring Requirements

The following factors shall be used to calculate VOC emissions:

- a. Ink VOC—20% retained in the substrate, 100% capture of VOC not retained in the substrate.
 - b. Automatic Blanket Wash VOC-40% capture.
 - c. Fountain Solution VOC-70% capture.
- d. Manual Cleaning Solvent VOC—50% retained in shop towels (if management practices listed are followed.)
- (1) The manual cleaning solvent retention factor of 50% may be used to calculate emissions from the use of shop towels if the following practices are followed:
- (a) Used, solvent-contaminated towels are to be stored in containers that are closed whenever practicable when not in use.
- (b) Used, solvent-contaminated towels are to be disposed of or cleaned by an acceptable means.
- (c) The cleaning solvent shall have a composite VOC vapor pressure of no more than 10 mm Hg at 20°C.
- e. Dryers—100% of captured VOC ducted to thermal oxidizer. Negative pressure must be maintained.

These factors may be modified upon a written request by the permittee and approved by the Department.

- 9. For calculation purposes, the total quantities of each pollutant shall be determined form the actual VOCs in each material. At the permittee's discretion, the highest VOC content for a group of materials may be substituted for the actual VOC content of each material in the group. The records shall be kept in a manner, which allows verification of compliance without additional calculations.
- 10. For all materials containing VOCs, data necessary to document compliance with the limitations of this section and the emissions limitations for the individual press shall be collected and recorded at least monthly, usage, density (if needed for calculation purposes), VOC content (including documentation of as-applied content for fountain solution and low-VOC cleaning solvents) and vapor pressure of cleaning solvents. Monthly records shall be maintained onsite for the most recent 5-year period.
- 11. The company shall keep all containers containing VOCs and hazardous air pollutants (HAP) closed whenever practical when not in use. This includes containers containing cleanup solvents and used liquids containing VOCs and HAPs. Solvent laden wipes shall be kept in closed containers whenever practical when not in use.
- 12. The company shall comply with the applicable recordkeeping and reporting requirements addressed in 25 Pa. Code §§ 135.5 and 135.3, respectively.

- 13. Emission statements addressed in 25 Pa. Code § 135.21 shall be calculated on a month-by-month basis if applicable.
- 14. Within 180 days after the initial startup, the company shall conduct a performance test as per the Pennsylvania Source Testing Manual and 25 Pa. Code Chapter 139. The stack test shall be performed to measure actual VOC emissions including the following:
- a. Inlet and outlet concentration of VOC for the thermal oxidizer to determine destruction efficiency.
- b. Gas flow to the inlet and outlet of the thermal oxidizer.
- c. Temperature and moisture content at the inlet and outlet of the thermal oxidizer.
- d. Gas flow and temperature from the heatset dryers used with the Heidelberg Harris M-3000 (LCM-688) heatset press.
- 15. Within 45 days after the initial start-up, a test procedure and a sketch with dimensions, including the location of sampling ports and other data to ensure the collection of representative samples, shall be submitted to the Regional Air Quality Program Manager.
- 16. The stack test shall be performed over a period or periods as necessary to accurately determine the maximum emissions during that time.
- 17. At least 15 days prior to the test, the Regional Air Quality Program manager shall be informed of the date and time of the test.

Code §§ 129.91—129.95 as well as with the carbon monoxide emission limitation to which the engines are currently subject. This installation will not result in any change in the amount of any air contaminant allowed to be emitted from the engines but may result in a reduction in the emission rate of one or more air contaminants from the levels now actually occurring.

The following is a summary of the conditions the Department of Environmental Protection proposes to place in the plan approval to ensure compliance with all applicable air quality regulatory requirements:

- 1. Following the installation of the electronic fuel gas injection systems on Engines 1 and 2, the nitrogen oxides emissions from each engine shall not exceed a rate of 14.55 pounds per hour, the carbon monoxide emissions shall not exceed a rate of 8.38 pounds per hour and the volatile organic compound emissions shall not exceed a rate of 4.0 pounds per hour.
- 2. Within 120 days of completion of installation of an electronic fuel gas injection system on an engine, stack testing shall be performed on the respective engine for nitrogen oxides, carbon monoxide and volatile organic compounds.

- 4. Records shall be maintained of the number of hours per month that each engine is operated as well as the amount of fuel used each month in each engine.

CERTIFIED EMISSION REDUCTION CREDITS IN PENNSYLVANIA'S ERC REGISTRY

Emission reduction credits (ERCs) are surplus, permanent, quantified and Federally enforceable emission reductions used to offset emission increases of oxides of nitrogen (NOx), volatile organic compounds (VOCs) and the following criteria pollutants: carbon monoxide (CO), lead (Pb), oxides of sulfur (SOx), particulate matter (PM), PM-10 and PM-10 precursors.

The Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) maintains an ERC registry in accordance with the requirements of 25 Pa. Code § 127.209. The ERC registry system provides for the tracking of the creation, transfer and use of ERCs. Prior to registration of the credits, ERC Registry Applications are reviewed and approved by the Department to confirm that the ERCs meet the requirements of 25 Pa. Code §§ 127.206—127.208. Registration of the credits in the ERC registry system constitutes certification that the ERCs satisfy applicable requirements and that the credits are available for use. The following registered and certified ERCs in the ERC Registry are currently available for use as follows:

- (1) To satisfy new source review (NSR) emission offset ratio requirements;
 - (2) To "net-out" of NSR at ERC-generating facilities;
- (3) To sell or trade the ERCs for use as emission offsets at new or modified facilities.

The certified ERCs shown are expressed in tons per year (tpy), satisfy the applicable ERC requirements contained in 25 Pa. Code §§ 127.206—127.208. ERCs created from the curtailment or shutdown of a source or facility expires for use as offsets 10 years after the emission reduction occurs. ERCs generated by the overcontrol of emissions by an existing facility do not expire for use as offsets. However, credits in the registry which are not used in a plan approval will be discounted if new air quality requirements are adopted by the Department or the United States Environmental Protection Agency.

Bond Rate Guidelines for the Calculation of Land Reclamation Bonds on Coal Mining Operations

The Department of Environmental Protection (Department) announces the bond rate guidelines for 2002 for anthracite and bituminous coal mining operations. The authority for bonding coal mining operations is found under The Clean Streams Law (35 P. S. §§ 691.1—691.1001), the Surface Mining Conservation and Reclamation Act (52 P. S. §§ 1396.1—1396.19a), the Coal Refuse Disposal Control Act (52 P. S. §§ 30.51—30.66) and the regulations promulgated thereunder at 25 Pa. Code Chapter 86, Subchapter F (relating to bonding and insurance requirements). The unit costs listed in these guidelines will be used in calculating the land reclamation bonds for surface coal mining operations including surface mines,

coal refuse disposal sites, coal refuse reprocessing sites, preparation facilities and the surface facilities of underground mining operations. The procedures for calculating land reclamation bonds are described in technical guidance number 563-2504-001, "Conventional Bonding for Land Reclamation—Coal," which is available on the Department's website (www.dep.state.pa.), at the Public Participation Center.

The bond rate guidelines will be applied as prescribed in the effective date section of this notice. The Department may review the adequacy of bonds on existing permits based on the bond rate guidelines at any time. The Department will conduct these reviews before issuing permit renewals. The Department may conduct similar reviews at the mid-term of a permit and before approving a permit revision.

The bond rate guidelines do not apply to bonds assuring replacement of water supplies under subsection 3.1(c) of the Surface Mining Conservation and Reclamation Act or to bonds ensuring compliance with the requirements of the Bituminous Mine Subsidence and Land Conservation Act.

General Methodology

The Department developed the bond rate guidelines using a database of unit costs provided by the Bureau of Abandoned Mine Reclamation (BAMR). The BAMR database lists costs for the various unit operations needed to complete reclamation of a mine site. These costs were obtained from bids on recent reclamation contracts.

The bond rate guidelines for Year 2002 are listed in Table 1. Not all unit operations included in the BAMR database are included in Table 1. Certain unit operations, such as "clearing and grubbing" are not normally needed when reclaiming bond forfeiture sites. Some unit operations listed in the database were combined to streamline the guidelines. In the event that a unit operation necessary to calculate a reclamation bond is not listed in Table 1, then any additional cost information available from the BAMR will be used. If enough data is still not available, the rate will be set from a standard reference like "Means Building Construction Cost Data."

Laboratories Approved to Determine Analyses of Blood and/or Serum for Controlled Substances

The following laboratories are licensed by the Department of Health (Department) under the Clinical Laboratory Act (35 P.S. §§ 2151-2165) and/or the Federal Clinical Laboratory Improvement Act of 1967 (42 U.S.C.A. § 263a) and are currently approved by the Department under 28 Pa. Code § 5.50 (relating to approval to provide special analytical services) to perform analyses of blood and/or serum for the determination of controlled substances. This approval is based on demonstrated proficiency in tests conducted by the Bureau of Laboratories of the Department. These laboratories are also approved and designated for purposes of the Vehicle Code, 75 Pa.C.S. §§ 1547 and 3755 (relating to chemical testing to determine amount of alcohol or controlled substance; and reports by emergency room personnel), the Fish and Boat Code, 30 Pa.C.S. § 5125 (relating to chemical testing to determine amount of alcohol or controlled substance) and the Game and Wildlife Code, 34 Pa.C.S. § 2502 (relating to hunting or furtaking under the influence of alcohol or controlled substance), as qualified to perform the types of services which will reflect the presence of controlled substances or their biotransformation products in blood and/or serum.

Depending upon their capability and performance in proficiency surveys, laboratories are approved to perform screening and/or confirmatory analyses on blood and/or

serum. Laboratories approved to perform screening analyses are designated on the approval list by an "S" followed by the letters "B" for blood and/or "Se" for serum. Laboratories approved to screen both blood and serum would therefore have "SBSe" listed after their laboratory name. Laboratories approved to offer confirmatory analyses will be designated on the approval list by a "C" followed by the letters "B" for blood and/or "Se" for serum. Laboratories approved to perform confirmatory analyses on both serum and blood would therefore have "CBSe" listed after the name of their laboratory.

Screening analyses provide a presumptive indication that a controlled substance is present. Confirmatory testing is used to substantiate screening results.

Persons seeking forensic blood and/or serum analysis services from any of the listed laboratories should determine that the laboratory employs techniques and procedures acceptable for the medicolegal purposes. They should also determine that the director of the facility is agreeable to performing analyses for forensic purposes. Persons seeking the analyses are responsible for specifying the extent to which the presence of a controlled substance is to be verified. That specification should be predicated upon the purpose for which the analysis is being sought.

Laboratories Approved to Perform Blood Lead and/or Erythrocyte Protoporphyrin Determinations

The following laboratories are licensed in accordance with the Clinical Laboratory Act (35 P. S. §§ 2151—2165) and/or the Federal Clinical Laboratory Improvement Act of 1967 (42 U.S.C.A. § 263a), and are currently approved under 28 Pa. Code § 5.50 (relating to approval to provide special analytical services) to perform analyses of blood for lead or erythrocyte protoporphyrin content. This approval is based on demonstrated proficiency in periodic evaluations conducted by the Bureau of Laboratories of the Department of Health (Department).

Lead poisoning is a reportable noncommunicable disease. Approved laboratories which offer blood lead or erythrocyte protoporphyrin testing services are required to inform the Department of actual or possible incidents of this condition in accordance with 28 Pa. Code § 27.4 (relating to reportable noncommunicable diseases and conditions). In addition, the Department requests laboratories to submit reports on children under 6 years of age

and pregnant women, on whom laboratory tests confirm venous blood lead concentrations of 15 micrograms per deciliter or higher. The Department's collection and review of these latter reports would be consistent with the most recent revision of the guideline titled, *Preventing Lead Poisoning in Young Children*, which was published in 1991 by the United States Department of Health and Human Services, Public Health Service, Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, and is available from them.

The reports must be sent to the Department of Health, Division of Environmental Health, P. O. Box 90, Harrisburg, PA 17108. Report forms are available on request from the Division of Environmental Health.

Erythrocyte protoporphyrin determinations may be performed as an adjunct determination to substantiate blood lead levels of 25 micrograms per deciliter or higher. Since erythrocyte protoporphyrin concentrations may not increase as a result of low level exposures to lead, direct blood lead analysis is the only reliable method for identifying individuals with blood lead concentrations below 25 micrograms per deciliter.

Persons seeking blood lead or erythrocyte protoporphyrin analyses should determine that the laboratory employs techniques and procedures acceptable for the purpose for which the analyses are sought. Laboratories offering blood lead analysis only are designated with the letter "L" following the name of the laboratory. Those offering erythrocyte protoporphyrin analysis only are designated with the letter "P." Laboratories offering both services are designated with the letters "LP."

Blood lead analyses performed for occupational safety and health purposes must be conducted by a laboratory which also meets the requirements of the Occupational Safety and Health Administration of the United States Department of Labor as specified in 29 CFR 1910.1025(j)(2)(iii) (relating to lead).

The list of approved laboratories will be reviewed semiannually and if there are any changes to the list, a notice to that effect will be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* at that time.

The Department's blood lead proficiency testing program is approved by the United States Department of Health and Human Services in accordance with the requirements contained in the Clinical Laboratory Improvement Amendments of 1988 (42 CFR 493.901 and 493.937 (relating to approval of proficiency testing programs; and toxicology)) which are administered by the Health Care Financing Administration. Participation in these programs may therefore be used to demonstrate acceptable performance for approval purposes under both Federal and Commonwealth statutes.

Food Stamp Heating and Nonheating Standard Utility Allowances and Telephone Allowance

In addition, these regulations provide for revision of these amounts by publication of a notice in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. The allowances have been approved by the Food and Nutrition Service (FNS) of the United States Department of Agriculture and are effective October 1, 2001.

The heating and nonheating SUAs are established in accordance with the requirements of 7 CFR 273.9(d)(6)(iii)(A) and (B). Notice is hereby given that the Department of Public Welfare (Department) is increasing the heating SUA from \$292 to \$333 and the nonheating SUA from \$155 to \$181. These allowances remain as shown until revised by publication of a notice in the $Pennsylvania\ Bulletin$.

The Department recommends that the revisions of these allowances be codified in 55 Pa. Code § 501.7(a)(2).

The telephone allowance is established in accordance with the requirements of 7 CFR 273.9(d)(6)(iii)(A) and (B). Notice is hereby given that the Department is increasing the telephone allowance from \$24 to \$26. This allowance remains as shown until revised by publication of a notice in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

The Department recommends that the revisions of this allowance be codified in 55 Pa. Code § 501.7(a)(3).

The citations in 55 Pa. Code § 501.7(a)(1), (2) and (3) have been revised to reflect increases in the allowance approved by FNS and the references to the redesignated paragraphs in 7 CFR 273.9(d)(6).

Subpart L. FOOD STAMP PROGRAM

CHAPTER 501. FOOD STAMP DISCRETIONARY PROVISIONS

§ 501.7. Treatment of income.

- (a) Income deductions.
- (1) Heating standard utility allowance (SUA) and nonheating SUA—7 CFR 273.9(d)(6)[(i)(C)]. A CAO will offer an eligible household the opportunity to use the heating SUA, nonheating SUA or the household's actual utility costs except for actual telephone costs when computing the combined shelter and utility cost. The SUAs include a nonheating SUA and a heating SUA. The heating SUA is available to households which incur out-of-pocket heating or cooling, or both, costs, even if paid irregularly, separate and apart from their rent or mortgage payments. A household that receives energy assistance payments made under the Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) is entitled to the heating SUA even if it does not incur out-of-pocket costs. The nonheating SUA is available to households which incur utility costs exclusive of heating or cooling costs, or both
- (2) Standard utility allowance amounts—7 CFR 273.9(d)(6) [(iii) and (vi)]. The nonheating SUA amount is [\$155] \$181 and the heating SUA amount is [\$292] \$333 per month effective October 1, [2000] 2001. The heating SUA/nonheating SUA amounts are approved by FNS and reviewed annually by the Department in accordance with provisions of 7 CFR 273.9(d)(6)[(vi)] (relating to income and deductions). Future adjustments will be issued by the Department as a notice in the Pennsylvania Bulletin and codified in this subpart.
- (3) Telephone allowance—7 CFR 273.9(d)(6)[(v)(C)]. The telephone allowance is [\$24] \$26 per month effective October 1, [2000] 2001, regardless of the amount of the telephone charge. This allowance is available to households which incur telephone expenses. The Department has developed a method, that is FNS approved, for calculating the mandatory telephone allowance. Future adjustments will be issued by the Department as a notice in the Pennsylvania Bulletin and codified in this subpart.

Finding Delaware County

Under the provisions of section 2002(b) of The Administrative Code (71 P. S. \S 2002(b)), the Secretary of Transportation makes the following written finding:

The Department of Transportation (Department) plans to replace the existing Market Street Bridge over Amtrak's Northeast Corridor line and SEPTA's R-2 line in Marcus Hook Borough and Lower Chichester Township, Delaware County. The project will require the acquisition of land from the Marcus Hook Borough park. However, the total proposed Borough Parkland area will be increased by 14 sq. meters (151 sq. feet) due to the conversion of existing highway right-of-way to parkland.

Mandated Benefits

Section 9 of the Health Care Cost Containment Act (35 P. S. §§ 449.1—449.19) requires that the Health Care Cost Containment Council (Council) review proposed mandated health benefits on request of the executive and legislative branches of government. Senate Bill 636 would require health insurance policies to provide coverage for colorectal cancer screening examinations and laboratory tests for cancer for eligible nonsymptomatic individuals in accordance with the most recently published American Cancer Society guidelines for colorectal cancer screenings. Eligible individuals include: (1) individuals 50 years of age or older; and (2) individuals under 50 years of age who are at high risk for colorectal cancer according to the most recently published colorectal cancer screening guidelines of the American Cancer Society. Covered screenings include: 1) fecal-occult blood test, (2) flexible sigmoidoscopy, (3) colonoscopy, (4) barium enema and (5) other procedures as the Department of Health deems appropriate.

In some cases, the Insurance Commissioner (Commissioner) may order that the company reimburse an insured for the higher cost of replacement insurance coverage obtained while the appeal is pending. If an insured wishes to seek reimbursement for the higher cost of replacement insurance, the insured must produce documentation at the hearing which will allow comparison of coverages and costs between the original policy and the replacement policy.

Following the hearing and receipt of the stenographic transcript, the Commissioner will issue a written order

resolving the factual issues presented at the hearing and stating what remedial action, if any, is required. The Commissioner's Order will be sent to those persons participating in the hearing or their designated representatives. Order

By the Commission:

The Medallion Act, 66 Pa.C.S. §§ 2401—2416, provides for Commission oversight of taxicab service in cities of the first class (Philadelphia). The Medallion Act provides that a vehicle may not be operated as a taxicab in cities of the first class unless a certificate of public convenience is issued authorizing the operation of the taxicab and a medallion is attached to the hood of the vehicle. See 66 Pa.C.S. § 2404(a). The medallion is reissued annually, consistent with the fiscal year (July 1—June 30) of the

program. See 66 Pa.C.S. §§ 2406 and 2414(b). Under section 2406 of the Medallion Act, 66 Pa.C.S. § 2406, a medallion may not be reissued unless all outstanding Commission fines, penalties and fees have been paid and unless all insurance, tariff and vehicle inspection requirements are current. The Medallion Act authorizes the Commission to require, by order or regulation, that each medallion holder submit to a periodic inspection of its taxicab by Commission personnel. See 66 Pa.C.S. § 2404. The Medallion Act further requires that a medallion holder is required to have its vehicle inspected by the Commission prior to issuance of a medallion. See 66 Pa.C.S. \S 2404. 1

Currently the Commission performs annual (reissuance) medallion inspections in April, May and June. During this period, Commission personnel inspect approximately 1,600 taxicabs. These inspections are in addition to other duties required of the enforcement staff and significantly impact staff's ability to meet its ongoing responsibilities. While the Commission schedules inspections during the 3 month period in an attempt to evenly distribute the workload, scheduling of the inspections is voluntary and the bulk of the inspections occur in June. Also, medallion holders frequently fail to appear for scheduled inspections, creating lost time and requiring rescheduling. These factors further frustrate efforts of Commission enforcement staff to perform their duties.

There is a need for a more structured annual inspection program. Therefore, we will implement an annual inspection program that evenly divides the inspections over the current 3 month period (April, May, June). The inspections will be performed by appointment on a Commission designated date. The Commission will notify a medallion holder of the inspection date for a particular vehicle. The medallion holder should then contact the Commission's Philadelphia office to schedule an appointment time for that designated date. A medallion holder who presents a vehicle for inspection which fails, will be fined for equipment defects. Reinspection will occur at the earliest convenience of the Commission.² Inspections will be performed only if renewal applications and fees have been filed and paid. All outstanding fines must also be satis-

The inspection schedule will go into effect with the 2002-2003 medallion year. For that year, the inspection schedule will be as follows:

Group A	1—534	April, 2002	
Group B	535—1067	May, 2002	
Group C	1068—1600	June, 2002	

The following year, 2003-2004, the groups will be rotated as follows:

	Medallion #	Inspection Month

Group A	1—534	June, 2003

This rotation will continue in subsequent years, so that in 2004-2005, the first group to be inspected (April, 2004) will be medallion numbers 1068—1600 (Group C). Commission staff will provide an inspection schedule, listing specific dates on which designated medallion holders are

to present vehicles for inspection. This schedule will be included in the annual renewal application currently mailed to all medallion holders. Each medallion holder should contact the Commission to schedule an appointment time for the designated inspection date.

We believe that scheduling inspections evenly over the 3-month period will significantly aid our enforcement personnel in the diligent execution of their duties. While the Commission's workload will continue to be extremely heavy during the reinspection cycle, we believe that it will be more manageable. Medallion owners who choose not to schedule or honor an inspection appointment are cautioned that their vehicles may not be inspected prior to the July 1 deadline due to the Commission's workload. While the Commission will strive to accommodate all medallion owners' inspection needs, we strongly urge medallion owners to schedule inspections and honor appointments.

Therefore It Is Ordered That:

- 1. A Medallion inspection schedule, as set forth in this Order, is hereby implemented, to be effective with the 2002-2003 Medallion year.
- 2. The Secretary shall serve a copy of this Final Order on all current Medallion owners, by first class mail.
- 3. The Secretary shall have this Order published in the Pennsylvania Bulletin.

The payment date specified in the contract.

30 days after the later of the receipt of a proper invoice or receipt of goods or services.

The net payment date stated on the business' invoice.


A 15-day grace period after the required payment date is provided to the Commonwealth by the Act.
