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READER'S GUIDE TO THE PENNSYLVANIA BULLETIN AND PENNSYLVANIA CODE

Pennsylvania Bulletin

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the official gazette of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. It is published every week and includes a table of contents. A cumulative subject matter index is published quarterly.

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* serves several purposes. First, it is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, which is the official codification of agency rules and regulations and other statutorily authorized documents. Changes in the codified text, whether by adoption, amendment, repeal or emergency action must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. Further, agencies proposing changes to the codified text do so in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Second, the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* also publishes: Governor's Executive Orders; State Contract Notices; Summaries of Enacted Statutes; Statewide and Local Court Rules; Attorney General Opinions; Motor Carrier Applications before the Public Utility Commission; Applications and Actions before the Department of Environmental Protection; Orders of the Independent Regulatory Review Commission; and other documents authorized by law.

The text of certain documents published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the only valid and enforceable text. Courts are required to take judicial notice of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Adoption, Amendment or Repeal of Regulations

Generally an agency wishing to adopt, amend or repeal regulations must first publish in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking. There are limited instances where the agency may omit the proposal step; they still must publish the adopted version.

The Notice of Proposed Rulemaking contains the full text of the change, the agency contact person, a fiscal note required by law and background for the action.

The agency then allows sufficient time for public comment before taking final action. An adopted proposal must be published in the *Pennsylvania*

Bulletin before it can take effect. If the agency wishes to adopt changes to the Notice of Proposed Rulemaking to enlarge the scope, they must repropose.

Citation to the Pennsylvania Bulletin

Cite material in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* by volume number and page number. Example: Volume 1, *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, page 801 (short form: 1 Pa.B. 801).

Pennsylvania Code

The *Pennsylvania Code* is the official codification of rules and regulations issued by Commonwealth agencies and other statutorily authorized documents. The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, printing changes as soon as they occur. These changes are then permanently codified by the *Pennsylvania Code Reporter*, a monthly, loose-leaf supplement.

The *Pennsylvania Code* is cited by title number and section number. Example: Title 10 *Pennsylvania Code*, § 1.1 (short form: 10 Pa.Code § 1.1).

Under the *Pennsylvania Code* codification system, each regulation is assigned a unique number by title and section. Titles roughly parallel the organization of Commonwealth government. Title 1 *Pennsylvania Code* lists every agency and its corresponding *Code* title location.

How to Find Documents

Search for your area of interest in the *Pennsylva-nia Code*.

The *Pennsylvania Code* contains, as Finding Aids, subject indexes for the complete *Code* and for each individual title, a list of Statutes Used As Authority for Adopting Rules and a list of annotated cases. Source Notes give you the history of the documents. To see if there have been recent changes, not yet codified, check the List of *Pennsylvania Code* Chapters Affected in the most recent issue of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* also publishes a quarterly List of Pennsylvania Code Sections Affected which lists the regulations in numerical order, followed by the citation to the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* in which the change occurred.

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Printing Format

Material proposed to be added to an existing rule or regulation is printed in **bold face** and material proposed to be deleted from such a rule or regulation is enclosed in brackets [] and printed in **bold face**. Asterisks indicate ellipsis of *Pennsylvania Code* text retained without change. Proposed new or additional regulations are printed in ordinary style face.

Fiscal Notes

Section 612 of The Administrative Code of 1929 (71 P. S. § 232) requires that the Office of Budget prepare a fiscal note for regulatory actions and administrative procedures of the administrative departments, boards, commissions or authorities receiving money from the State Treasury stating whether the proposed action or procedure causes a loss of revenue or an increase in the cost of programs for the Commonwealth or its political subdivisions; that the fiscal note be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* at the same time as the proposed change is advertised; and that the fiscal note shall provide the following information: (1) the designation of the fund out of which the appropriation providing for expenditures under the action or procedure shall be made; (2) the probable cost for the fiscal year the program is implemented; (3) projected cost estimate of the program for each of the five succeeding fiscal years; (4) fiscal history of the program for which expenditures are to be made; (5) probable loss of revenue for the fiscal year of its implementation; (6) projected loss of revenue from the program for each of the five succeeding fiscal years; (7) line item, if any, of the General Appropriation Act or other appropriation act out of which expenditures or losses of Commonwealth funds shall occur as a result of the action or procedures; (8) recommendation, if any, of the Secretary of the Budget and the reasons therefor.

The required information is published in the foregoing order immediately following the proposed change to which it relates; the omission of an item indicates that the agency text of the fiscal note states that there is no information available with respect thereto. In items (3) and (6) information is set forth for the first through fifth fiscal years; in that order, following the year the program is implemented, which is stated. In item (4) information is set forth for the current and two immediately preceding years, in that order. In item (8) the recommendation, if any, made by the Secretary of Budget is published with the fiscal note. See 4 Pa. Code § 7.231 et seq. Where "no fiscal impact" is published, the statement means no additional cost or revenue loss to the Commonwealth or its local political subdivision is intended.

PART I. GENERAL

[231 PA. CODE CHS. 1910, 1915, 1920 AND 1930]
Amendments to the Rules of Civil Procedure Relating to Domestic Relations Matters; Recommendation 73

The Domestic Relations Procedural Rules Committee is planning to recommend that the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania amend the Rules of Civil Procedure relating to domestic relations matters as set forth herein. This proposal has not been submitted for review by the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania.

Notes and explanatory comments which appear with proposed amendments have been inserted by the committee for the convenience of those using the rules. Reports, notes and comments will not constitute part of the rules and will not be officially adopted or promulgated by the Supreme Court.

The Committee solicits comments and suggestions from all interested persons prior to submission of this proposal to the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania. Please submit written comments no later than Friday, November 4, 2005 directed to:

TITLE 231. RULES OF CIVIL PROCEDURE PART I. GENERAL

CHAPTER 1910. ACTIONS FOR SUPPORT

Rule 1910.11. Office Conference. Subsequent Proceedings. Order.

- (a)(1) The office conference shall be conducted by a conference officer.
- (2) A conference officer who is a lawyer employed by a judicial district shall not practice family law before a conference officer, permanent hearing officer or permanent or standing master employed by the same judicial district.

Official Note: Conference officers preside at office conferences under **[Support]** Rule 1910.11. Hearing officers preside at hearings under **[Support]** Rule 1910.12. The appointment of masters to hear actions in divorce or for annulment of marriage is authorized by **[Divorce]** Rule 1920.51.

(c) At the conference, the parties shall furnish to the officer true copies of their most recent federal income tax returns, their pay stubs for the preceding six months,

verification of child care expenses and proof of medical coverage which they may have or have available to them. In addition, they shall provide copies of their income and expense statements in the form required by Rule 1910.27(c), completed as set forth below.

* * * * *

(2) For cases which are decided according to *Melzer v. Witsberger*, **505 Pa. 462**, 480 A.2d 991 (1984), the entire income and expense statement must be completed.

* * * * *

- (e) At the conclusion of the conference or promptly thereafter, the conference officer shall prepare a conference summary and furnish copies to the court and to both parties. The conference summary shall state:
 - (1) the facts upon which the parties agree [,];
- (2) the contentions of the parties with respect to facts upon which they disagree [,]; and
- (3) the conference officer's recommendation [], if any, of
- (i) the amount of support and by and for whom the support shall be paid[,]; and
 - (ii) the effective date of any order.
- (f) If an agreement for support is not reached at the conference, the court, without hearing the parties, shall enter an interim order calculated in accordance with the guidelines and substantially in the form set forth in Rule 1910.27(e). [The order shall state] Each party shall be provided with a copy of the order and written notice that any party may, within ten days after the date of receipt or the date of the mailing of [a copy of] the order, whichever occurs first, file a written demand with the domestic relations section for a hearing before the court.

* * * * *

- (j)(1) Promptly after receipt of the notice of the scheduled hearing, a party may move the court for a separate listing where:
- (i) there are complex questions of law, fact or both $\mbox{\footnote{l}}$, $\mbox{\footnote{l}}$; or
 - (ii) the hearing will be protracted $[\ , \];$ or

* * * * *

- (b)(1) At the conclusion of a conference attended by both parties, if an agreement for support has not been reached, and the conference and hearing are not scheduled on the same day, the court, without hearing the parties, shall enter an interim order calculated in accordance with the guidelines and substantially in the form set forth in Rule 1910.27(e), and the parties shall be given notice of the date, time and place of a hearing. A record hearing shall be conducted by a hearing officer who must be a lawyer.
- (2) If **the** defendant, having been properly served, fails to attend the conference, the court shall enter an interim order calculated in accordance with the guidelines and

substantially in the form set forth in Rule 1910.27(e). Within ten days after the date of **receipt or the date of mailing of** the order, **whichever occurs first**, either party may demand a hearing before a hearing officer. If no hearing is requested, the order shall become final.

(3) A hearing officer employed by a judicial district shall not practice family law before a conference officer, hearing officer or permanent or standing master employed by the same judicial district.

Official Note: Conference officers preside at office conferences under **[Support]** Rule 1910.11. Hearing officers preside at hearings under **[Support]** Rule 1910.12. The appointment of masters to hear actions in divorce or for annulment of marriage is authorized by **[Divorce]** Rule 1920.51.

- (c)(1) Except as provided in subdivision (c)(2), promptly after conclusion of the conference, a party may move the court for a separate listing of the hearing where:
- (i) there are complex questions of law, fact or both $\boldsymbol{[}$, $\boldsymbol{]};$ or
 - (ii) the hearing will be protracted [,]; or

* * * * *

- (d) The hearing officer shall receive evidence, hear argument and file with the court a report containing a recommendation with respect to the entry of an order of support. The report may be in narrative form stating the reasons for the recommendation and shall include a proposed order substantially in the form set forth in Rule 1910.27(e) stating:
- (1) the amount of support calculated in accordance with the guidelines [,];
 - (2) by and for whom it shall be paid[,]; and

* * * * *

- (e) The court, without hearing the parties, shall enter an interim order consistent with the proposed order of the hearing officer except upon good cause shown. [The order shall state] Each party shall be provided with a copy of the interim order and written notice that any party may, within ten days after the date of receipt or the date of mailing of the order, whichever occurs first, file with the domestic relations section written exceptions to [that] the report [with the domestic relations section] of the hearing officer and interim order.
- (f) Within ten days after the date of **receipt or the date of mailing of** the report by the hearing officer, **whichever occurs first**, any party may file exceptions to the report or any part thereof, to rulings on objections to evidence, to statements or findings of facts, to conclusions of law, or to any other matters occurring during the hearing. Each exception shall set forth a separate objection precisely and without discussion. Matters not covered by exceptions are **[demand] deemed** waived unless, prior to entry of the final order, leave is granted to file exceptions raising those matters. If exceptions are filed, any other party may file exceptions within ten days of the date of service of the original exceptions.
- (g) If no exceptions are filed within the ten-day period, the **interim** order shall constitute a final order.

CHAPTER 1915. ACTIONS FOR CUSTODY, PARTIAL CUSTODY AND VISITATION OF MINOR CHILDREN

Rule 1915.4-2. Office Conference. Hearing. Record. Exceptions. Order.

* * * * *

(b) Within ten days of the **date of receipt or the date of** mailing of the master's report and recommendation, **whichever occurs first**, any party may file exceptions to the report or any part thereof, to rulings on objections to evidence, to statements or findings of fact, to conclusions of law, or to any other matters occurring during the hearing. Each exception shall set forth a separate objection precisely and without discussion. Matters not covered by exceptions are deemed waived unless, prior to entry of the final decree, leave is granted to file exceptions raising those matters.

* * * * *

Rule 1920.55-3. Master's Report. Notice. Hearing De Novo. Final Decree.

* * * * *

- (c) Within ten days **[after] of** the date the master's report is mailed **or received, whichever occurs first**, any party may file a written demand for a hearing de novo. If a demand is filed, the court shall hold a hearing de novo and enter a final decree.
- (d) If no demand for de novo hearing is filed within **the** ten **[days of the date the report is mailed] -day period**, the court shall review the report and recommendation and, if approved, shall enter a final decree.

CHAPTER 1930. RULES RELATING TO DOMESTIC RELATIONS MATTERS GENERALLY

Rule 1930.4. Service of Original Process in Domestic Relations Matters.

(a) *Persons Who May Serve.* Original process in all domestic relations matters may be served by the sheriff or a competent adult:

* * * * *

(3) or pursuant to special order of court.

Official Note: See Rule 76 for the definition of "competent adult." Service upon an incarcerated person in a domestic relations action must also include notice of any hearing in such action, and specific notice of the incarcerated individual's right to apply to the court for a writ of habeas corpus ad testificandum to enable him or her to attend the hearing. The writ is available where an incarcerated individual wishes to testify in person, as well as where the individual's testimony is sought by another. Vanaman v. Cowgill, 363 Pa. Super. Ct. 602, 526 A.2d 1226 (1987). In determining whether a writ of habeas corpus ad testificandum should be issued, a court must weigh the factors set forth in Salemo v. Salemo, 381 Pa. Super. Ct. 632, 554 A.2d 563 (1989).

Rule 1920.51 Appointment of Master.

Practice of Law by Attorneys Displaced by Hurricane Katrina; No. 377 Supreme Court Rules; Doc. No. 1

Order

Per Curiam

And Now, this 19th day of September, 2005, it is hereby ordered that:

Based upon the extreme devastation caused to the states of Louisiana, Mississippi and Alabama by Hurricane Katrina, making it impossible to practice law in the areas affected by this storm, this Court hereby orders that the rules governing the practice of law in this Commonwealth be temporarily modified for attorneys displaced by Hurricane Katrina set forth as follows.

Attorneys holding a valid law license issued by the highest court of law in Louisiana, Mississippi or Alabama, who are: (i) in good standing in their respective states, (ii) persons of good character and fitness to practice law and (iii) who have been displaced from their home jurisdiction by Hurricane Katrina, are permitted to practice law in facilities located in Pennsylvania for a period of nine months from the date of this order, provided such practice is limited to furnishing legal services to their clients with respect to actions or matters arising out of the jurisdictions where they are licensed. Attorneys practicing pursuant to this Order shall not hold themselves out as licensed Pennsylvania attorneys or as authorized to practice Pennsylvania law.

THE COURTS 5379

Attorneys, who are not subject to the disciplinary system of the jurisdiction where they are licensed with respect to the legal services performed in Pennsylvania under this Order, shall be subject to the Pennsylvania Rules of Professional Conduct and Rules of Disciplinary Enforcement. All attorneys practicing pursuant to this Order shall submit an affidavit to the Pennsylvania Board of Law Examiners within five (5) days of commencing the practice of law in Pennsylvania alleging that the lawyer: (i) is licensed to practice law in Louisiana, Mississippi or Alabama, (ii) is in good standing in their respective state, (iii) is a person of good character and fitness to practice law and (iv) has been displaced from the practice of law by Hurricane Katrina.

This Order is not intended, in any way, to restrict or limit any attorney from practicing law in compliance with Rule of Professional Conduct 5.5.

Interstate/International Quarantine Order

Recitals.

- A. Chronic Wasting Disease (CWD) is an infectious, progressive and always fatal disease of cervids (elk, whitetail deer, mule deer, blacktail deer, red deer and hybrids thereof, etc.).
- B. There is no known treatment for CWD infection, no vaccine against this disease and no feasible live animal test that can detect the presence of CWD.
- C. CWD is known to be transmissible from infected to uninfected cervids by ingestion of infected or contaminated materials.
- D. CWD has been designated a "dangerous transmissible disease" of animals under 3 Pa.C.S. § 2321(d) (relating to dangerous transmissible diseases) by order of the Secretary of Agriculture under 3 Pa.C.S. §§ 2301—2389 (relating to the Domestic Animal Law).
- E. The Department of Agriculture (Department) has broad authority under the Domestic Animal Law to regulate the keeping and handling of domestic animals in order to exclude, contain or eliminate dangerous transmissible diseases, such as CWD.
- F. The Department also has broad authority under the Domestic Animal Law to prohibit the importation of domestic animals, conveyances, containers, goods, products or materials in an effort to keep dangerous transmissible diseases, such as CWD, from entering this Commonwealth.
- G. CWD is of particular concern to the captive/farmed cervid industry, in that presence of CWD infection in a herd may result in the destruction of the entire herd and may severely limit the market for Pennsylvania product.
- H. CWD also has the potential to severely impact upon Pennsylvania's native cervid population, should it enter this Commonwealth.
- I. CWD has been detected in cervids in New York and West Virginia and is known to be present in a number of other States and several Canadian Provinces.
- J. PDA has concern that certain high-risk materials from hunter-harvested cervids taken in areas where CWD is known to be present pose an unacceptable risk of introducing CWD into this Commonwealth and seeks to prohibit the importation of these high-risk materials through this Order.

Order of Quarantine

With the foregoing recitals incorporated into this Order by reference, the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture hereby establishes an Interstate and International Quarantine under authority of the Domestic Animal Law, at 3 Pa.C.S.A. § 2329(c). The terms of this Order are as follows:

1. The Quarantined Area affected by this Interstate and International Quarantine Order is as follows:

All States and Canadian provinces with a history of having free-ranging cervids infected with CWD. This quarantine includes:

- a. *The following States:* Colorado, Illinois, Nebraska, New Mexico, South Dakota, Utah, West Virginia (only Hampshire County), Wisconsin, and Wyoming
- b. The following Canadian Provinces: Alberta, Saskatchewan
- 2. This Order prohibits the importation into the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania the following animal parts originating from any hunter-harvested cervid in the Quarantined Area:
- a. Head (including brain, tonsils, eyes and retropharyngeal lymph nodes);
 - b. Spinal Cord/Backbone;
 - c. Spleen;
- d. The following, if uncleaned: Hide, cape, skull plate with attached antlers, upper canine teeth, tanned hide; and
 - e. Unfinished taxidermy mounts.
- 3. This Order shall not be construed to limit the importation into this Commonwealth of the following animal parts originating from any hunter-harvested cervid in the Quarantined Area:
 - a. Meat, without the backbone;
- b. The following, if cleaned: Hide, cape, skull plate with attached antlers, upper canine teeth, tanned hide; and
 - c. Finished taxidermy mounts.
- 4. This Order is immediately effective, and shall remain in effect unless rescinded or modified by subsequent order.
- 5. Any person violating the requirements of this Order shall be subject to criminal prosecution and/or civil penalties of up to \$10,000 per violation.
- 6. This Order shall not be construed as limiting the Department's authority to establish additional quarantine or testing requirements on imported cervids.
 - 7. This Order is effective October 1, 2005.

Comments received within the respective comment periods will be considered in the final determinations regarding the applications. Comments should include the name, address and telephone number of the writer and a concise statement to inform the Department of the exact basis of a comment and the relevant facts upon which it is based.

The Department will also accept requests for a public hearing on applications. A public hearing may be held if the responsible office considers the public response significant. If a hearing is scheduled, a notice of the hearing will be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* and a newspaper of general circulation within the relevant geographical area. LAND RECYCLING AND **ENVIRONMENTAL REMEDIATION**

UNDER ACT 2, 1995 PREAMBLE 1

Acknowledgment of Notices of Intent to Remediate Submitted under the Land Recycling and Environmental Remediation Standards Act (35 P.S. §§ 6026.101-6026.908).

Sections 302-305 of the Land Recycling and Environmental Remediation Standards Act (act) require the Department of Environmental Protection (Department) to publish in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* an acknowledgment noting receipt of Notices of Intent to Remediate. An acknowledgment of the receipt of a Notice of Intent to Remediate is used to identify a site where a person proposes to, or has been required to, respond to a release of a regulated substance at a site. Persons intending to use the Background Standard, Statewide Health Standard, the Site-Specific Standard or who intend to remediate a site as a special industrial area must file a Notice of Intent to Remediate with the Department. A Notice of Intent to Remediate filed with the Department provides a brief description of the location of the site, a list of known or suspected contaminants at the site, the proposed remediation measures for the site and a description of the intended future use of the site. A person who demonstrates attainment of one, a combination of the cleanup standards or who receives approval of a special industrial area remediation identified under the act will be relieved of further liability for the remediation of the site for any contamination identified in reports submitted to and approved by the Department. Furthermore, the person shall not be subject to citizen suits or other contribution actions brought by responsible persons not participating in the remediation.

Under sections 304(n)(1)(ii) and 305(c)(2) of the act, there is a 30-day public and municipal comment period for sites proposed for remediation using a Site-Specific Standard, in whole or in part, and for sites remediated as a special industrial area. This period begins when a summary of the Notice of Intent to Remediate is pub-

lished in a newspaper of general circulation in the area of the site. For the sites identified, proposed for remediation to a Site-Specific Standard or as a special industrial area, the municipality within which the site is located may request to be involved in the development of the remediation and reuse plans for the site if the request is made within 30 days of the date specified. During this comment period, the municipality may request that the person identified as the remediator of the site develop and implement a public involvement plan. Requests to be involved and comments should be directed to the remediator of the site.

Environmental Remediation & Recovery, Inc., 5719 Route 6N, Edinboro, PA 16412 on behalf of Dauphin Oil Company, 815 Newville Road, Carlisle, PA 17013, submitted a revised Notice of Intent to Remediate site soils contaminated with petroleum hydrocarbons during closure of storage tanks and a floor drain. The applicant proposes to remediate the site to meet the combined Site Specific and Statewide Health Standard requirements. The site will be redeveloped as a retail drug store.

NEW SOURCES AND MODIFICATIONS

The Department of Environmental Protection's (Department) review of the information contained in the application indicates that the draw furnace, induction hardener and ESP will comply with all applicable requirements pertaining to air contamination sources, air cleaning devices and the emission of air contaminants including the best available technology requirements of 25 Pa. Code §§ 127.1 and 127.12. Based on this finding, the Department intends to approve the application and issue plan approval for the proposed construction and installation.

The Department proposes to place in the plan approval the following conditions to ensure compliance with all applicable regulatory requirements:

- 1. Under the best available technology provisions in 25 Pa. Code §§ 127.1 and 127.12, the air contaminant emissions from the induction hardener and draw furnace shall be controlled by a United Air Specialists, Inc. model PSG-32-3 two-stage wet ESP.
- 2. Under the best available technology provisions in 25 Pa. Code §§ 127.1 and 127.12, the concentration of particulate matter to the outdoor atmosphere of the combined exhaust from the induction hardener and draw furnace shall not exceed 0.00002 grain per dry standard cubic foot.
- 3. Under the best available technology provisions in 25 Pa. Code §§ 127.1 and 127.12, the opacity of the combined exhaust to the outdoor atmosphere from the induction hardener and draw furnace shall not exceed 0%, by U.S. EPA Test Method 9, at all times.
- 4. The permittee shall measure, at least once each month, during induction hardener and draw furnace operation, the opacity of the combined exhaust from the induction hardener and draw furnace, by U.S. EPA Test Method 9.
- 5. The permittee shall install, maintain and operate instrumentation to continuously measure and record the temperature of the exhaust entering the ESP. The temperature of the exhaust entering the ESP shall not exceed 100°F. The temperature monitoring system shall be electronically interlocked with the induction hardener and draw furnace to immediately shut down the induction hardener and draw furnace should the exhaust temperature to the ESP exceed 100°F. The temperature records shall be retained for a minimum of 5 years and shall be made available to the Department upon request.
- 6. At least 60 days before operation of the induction hardener and draw furnace, the permittee shall submit the following information to the Department regarding the temperature monitoring and recording system: equipment manufacturer and model number, manufacturer's literature, the expected normal and maximum measurement device readings, the location of the monitoring system measurement points in relation to the ESP and the exhaust duct wall, including a flow diagram that clearly shows the location of the measurement points. The

Department reserves the right to condition the proposed monitoring system or deny it, if inadequate.

- 7. The permittee shall monitor and record at least once each day the status of the indicator light on each power pack access door of each module of the ESP. If an indicator lamp is flashing or is not lit, the permittee shall within the same day perform the troubleshooting procedures and repairs/corrective actions contained on pages 17—20 of the manufacturer's manual. The permittee shall record the troubleshooting procedures performed and the repairs/corrective actions made. In addition, the permittee shall record the output voltages to the ionizer section and collection section of each affected module before and after the repairs/corrective actions made. The output voltage to the ionizer section shall be $10.0\ to\ 11.5\ KVDC$ and the output voltage to the collection section shall be 4.5 to 7.3 KVDC. Repairs/corrective actions that can be made during troubleshooting shall be performed the same day; repairs that require replacement parts shall be completed within 15 days of diagnosis. If either the ionizer section output voltage or the collection section output voltage is outside of the above ranges, the induction hardener and draw furnace shall not be operated until the voltages are restored to within the above required ranges. Records shall be retained for a minimum of 5 years and shall be made available to the Department upon request.
- 8. The permittee shall manually clean the internal components of the ESP at least once every 3 months in accordance with the manual cleaning and inspection procedures specified on pages 14—16 of the manufacturer's manual. The induction hardener and the draw furnace shall not be operated during ESP cleaning.
- 9. The permittee shall perform the weekly inspection and maintenance operations specified on pages 13 and 14 of the manufacturer's manual.
- 10. The permittee shall keep records of the U.S. EPA Test Method 9 opacity measurements and resulting averages and any corrective actions taken if the average opacity exceeds 0%. The records shall be retained for a minimum of 5 years and shall be made available to the Department upon request.
- 11. The permittee shall keep the following records of each manual cleaning of the ESP: date of cleaning, type of detergent used (including MSDS), detergent strength, water temperature, type of agitation/impingement used, duration of soaking, rinse procedure and dry-out time. The records shall be retained for a minimum of 5 years and shall be made available to the Department upon request.
- 12. The permittee shall keep records of the results of each weekly inspection and the repairs/corrective actions made. The records shall be retained for a minimum of 5 years and shall be made available to the Department upon request.
- 13. The permittee shall keep records of the amount of Polyquench 15 used each month in the induction hardener. The records shall be retained for a minimum of 5 years and shall be made available to the Department upon request.

60-318-011A: Pik Rite, Inc. (60 Pik Rite Lane, Lewisburg, PA 17837) for construction of a fabricated steel parts surface coating operation in Buffalo Township, **Union County**.

The surface coating operation will incorporate two spray booths in which farm equipment and other items are spray painted. The air contaminant emissions from this surface coating operation are not expected to exceed 3.54 tons of VOCs, .57 ton of volatile hazardous air pollutants and .89 ton of acetone per year.

The Department of Environmental Protection's (Department) review of the information submitted by Pik Rite, Inc. indicates that the surface coating operation will comply with all applicable regulatory requirements pertaining to air contamination sources and the emission of air contaminants, including the applicable limitation of 25 Pa. Code § 129.52 and the best available technology requirement of 25 Pa. Code §§ 127.1 and 127.12. Based on this finding, the Department of Environmental Protection proposes to issue plan approval for the construction of the surface coating operation.

The following is a summary of the conditions the Department proposes to place in the plan approval to be issued to ensure compliance with all applicable regulatory requirements:

- 1. No more than a combined total of 1,770.5 gallons of coating used in the surface coating operation in any 12-consecutive month period shall contain VOCs in excess of 1.69 pounds per gallon of coating, as mixed for application, and no coating shall contain VOCs in excess of 2.74 pounds per gallon of coating, as mixed for application.
- 2. No more than a combined total of 1,072.5 gallons of coating used in the surface coating operation in any 12-consecutive month period, as mixed for application, shall contain any volatile hazardous air pollutants, of which no more than 272.5 gallons in any 12-consecutive month period shall contain volatile hazardous air pollutants in excess of .36 pound per gallon of coating, as mixed for application, and none shall contain volatile hazardous air pollutants in excess of 1.2 pounds per gallon of coating, as mixed for application.
- 3. No more than 5 gallons of adhesives shall be used in any 12-consecutive month period and no adhesive shall contain VOCs or volatile hazardous air pollutants in excess of 5.09 pounds per gallon of adhesive, as mixed for application.
- 4. No more than 250 gallons of cleanup solvent shall be used in any 12-consecutive month period, of which no more than 200 gallons shall contain any VOCs or volatile hazardous air pollutants. No cleanup solvent shall contain volatile hazardous air pollutants in excess of 3.31 pounds per gallon of solvent.
- 5. The total combined VOC emissions from the surface coating operation shall not exceed 3.54 tons in any 12-consecutive month period and the total combined volatile hazardous air pollutant emissions shall not exceed .57 ton in any 12-consecutive month period.
- 6. Coatings applied in the surface coating operation shall be applied by brush or wiping cloth or by high volume low pressure spray technology (or an application technique determined by the Department to have an equivalent transfer efficiency).

- 7. Surface coating performed at this site shall take place in spray booths which are exhausted to the atmosphere through spray booth filters except that coatings can be applied by brush or wiping cloth outside of the spray booths. The particulate matter emission rate from the spray booths shall not exceed .01 grain per dry standard cubic foot of exhaust.
- 8. Coatings used in the surface coating operation shall comply with 25 Pa. Code § 129.52.
- 9. VOC-containing, volatile hazardous air pollutantcontaining and acetone-containing materials used in the surface coating operation shall be stored in closed containers when not in actual use. Spray lines, guns, and the like, shall be cleaned by either flushing a solid liquid stream of solvent into an appropriate container or by soaking equipment in closed containers of liquid solvent. Under no circumstances shall cleaning solvent be sprayed or flushed from a spray gun or line into the air. Under no circumstances shall cleaning solvent be flushed from a spray gun or line into a container in such a manner that it is atomized. Used cleaning solvent and all used cleaning rags or cloths shall be stored in closed containers and shall never be treated in any manner which would unnecessarily promote the evaporative loss of cleaning solvent to the atmosphere.
- 10. Records shall be maintained of the identity, composition and amount of each coating, coating component, coating additive, adhesive, cleaning solvent, and the like used each month. If a coating is mixed onsite from multiple components or if a coating has an additive (other than water) mixed with it on site, records shall also be maintained of the identity and composition of each of the coating components mixed together, as well as the mix ratio, for each different batch of coating mixed.

For individuals who wish to challenge an action, appeals must reach the Board within 30 days. A lawyer is not needed to file an appeal with the Board.

Important legal rights are at stake, however, so individuals should show this notice to a lawyer at once. Persons who cannot afford a lawyer may qualify for free pro bono representation. Call the Secretary to the Board at (717) 787-3483 for more information.

Persons or municipalities that propose to operate under the terms and conditions of this general permit after the date of general permit issuance must apply for a determination of applicability to the Department's Bureau of Waste Management, Division of Municipal and Residual Waste, P. O. Box 8472, Harrisburg, PA 17105-8472. At a minimum, the following information must be provided on forms available from the Department's Bureau of Waste Management:

- a. Name and street address of applicant.
- b. Number and title of general permit.
- c. A description of the waste which fully characterizes its composition and properties; the waste generation process; and a plan for screening, managing and rejecting waste.
 - d. Name and location of the generators of the waste.
- e. A description of the processing operations, including a detailed site drawing showing the permit boundary, processing equipment, placement of storage units and other significant features.
- f. A Preparedness, Prevention, and Contingency (PPC) plan for the facility prepared in accordance with the most

- recent edition of the Department's *Guidelines for the Development and Implementation of Environmental Emergency Response Plans.*
- g. Proof that copies of the notification have been submitted to the municipality, county, county planning agency and county health department in which the processing activities will be conducted.
- h. Proof that the waste and waste management activities will be consistent with the general permit.
- i. Signed and notarized statement by the applicant who seeks to operate under the terms and conditions of this general permit that states that the person accepts all conditions of this general permit.
- j. An application fee in the amount specified in the residual waste regulations, payable to the "Commonwealth of Pennsylvania."
- k. Information that identifies the applicant (that is, individual, corporation, partnership, government agency, association, and the like), including the names and addresses of every officer that has a beneficial interest in or otherwise controls the operation of the company.
- l. A list of all previous permits or licenses issued to the permittee by the Department or Federal government under the environmental protection acts; the date of issuance and current status of those permits; and the permittee's compliance history concerning the environmental protection acts.
- m. Proof that any independent contractors retained by the permittee to perform any activities authorized under this general permit are in compliance with Department regulations as required in Condition 12.
- n. Proof that the applicant has legal right to enter the land and operate the facilities approved under this general permit.
- o. An irrevocable written consent from the landowner giving the Department permission to enter upon the land where the applicant will be conducting waste management activities.
- p. Bonding and insurance in an amount acceptable to the Department with supporting documentation.
- q. Additional information the Department believes is necessary to make a decision.

FISH AND BOAT COMMISSION

Proposal for Use of Herbicide; Conneaut Lake, Crawford County

The Executive Director of the Fish and Boat Commission (Commission), acting under the authority of 30 Pa.C.S. § 2504(a)(1) (relating to pollution of waters), may authorize the use of any method or means to collect, eradicate or control fish (including aquatic plants) for purposes of research and fish management. This authorization generally takes the form of issuance of a joint Commission/Department of Environmental Protection "Permit for Use of an Algicide, Herbicide or Fish Control Chemical in Waters of the Commonwealth."

The Commission has received a proposal from the Conneaut Lake Aquatic Management Association (CLAMA) to conduct a lake-wide aquatic vegetation treatment in Conneaut Lake, Crawford County, in 2006. Conneaut Lake is a 929-acre natural lake that is owned by the Commonwealth. Conneaut Lake has been treated in the last 10 years with Reward (active ingredient diquat dibromide), a contact herbicide, to control the exotic invasive plant Eurasian watermilfoil, Myriophyllum spicatum. Additionally, occurrence of the potentially invasive plant Cabomba caroliniana or fanwort has expanded, and spot treatment of 2 acres was approved in 2004 and 2005 using a systemic herbicide, Sonar (active ingredient fluridone). Cabomba is more resistant to herbicides than Eurasian watermilfoil. Conneaut Lake contains a diverse aquatic plant community. Diversity of submerged plants has increased since 1988.

CLAMA proposes lake-wide treatment of Conneaut Lake with a moderate dose (8 to 12 parts per million fluridone) of Sonar A. S. to eradicate both Eurasian watermilfoil and Cabomba. A reduction in overall plant diversity and impacts to nontarget species such as elodea (*Elodea* sp.) and coontail (*Ceratophyllum demersum*) is expected, and recovery of native species is expected 1 to 3 years after treatment.

Commission staff have identified four possible courses of action and invite public comments regarding them:

- (1) No treatment. Treatment with an aquatic herbicide would not be approved, and Eurasian watermilfoil, Cabomba and native vegetation would grow unimpeded.
- (2) Treatment to be the same as 2004 and 2005. Up to 90 acres of vegetation would be treated with Reward or an alternative product for dense Eurasian watermilfoil beds and spot treatment of Cabomba with Sonar would be approved. Recent results have shown temporary control of Eurasian watermilfoil and effective control of Cabomba in areas of spot treatment. The occurrence and range of Cabomba would be expected to expand under this option.
- (3) Selective treatment of Eurasian watermilfoil with expanded spot treatment of Cabomba. An extensive plant survey would be required to identify and target Cabomba treatment areas. Expected treatment would include up to 90 acres with a product and dose (equivalent to or similar to 0.75 gallon per acre Reward) that targets Eurasian watermilfoil and a product and dose (equivalent or similar to the 12 parts per million Sonar A. S.) that targets identified Cabomba areas. Cabomba control would not be as effective as lake-wide treatment if the active ingredient could not be contained in the target area. Additional pretreatment expense for surveys would be incurred, and a smaller treatment area for Cabomba would be expected with this option than with lake-wide treatment.
- (4) Lake-wide treatment with Fluridone as proposed by CLAMA. As explained previously, a moderate dose of 8 to 12 parts per million fluridone would be administered to the entire lake. CLAMA anticipates that effective control of Cabomba and control of Eurasian watermilfoil for more than 1 year may occur. Diversity and numbers of nontarget plants would be reduced for an estimated 1 to 3 years, and the composition of the resulting plant community may be different.

If you fail to answer this complaint within twenty days of the date of service, the Bureau of Transportation and Safety will request that the Commission issue a secretarial letter imposing a penalty. Pursuant to 66 Pa.C.S. § 3301(a), the penalty could include a fine of up to \$1,000 for each license, or any other remedy as may be appropriate. Each day you continue to violate any regulation, direction, requirement, determination or order of the Commission is a separate and distinct offence, subject to additional penalties.
- C. You may elect not to contest this Complaint by causing your insurer to file proper evidence of current insurance in accordance with the Commission's regulations within twenty days of the date of service of this

Complaint. The proof of insurance must be filed with the Secretary of the Commission at the address set forth in Paragraph A. Upon receipt of the evidence of insurance from your insurer, the complaint proceeding shall be closed. ACORD CERTIFICATES OF INSURANCE ARE UNACCEPTABLE AS EVIDENCE OF INSURANCE.

- D. If you file an Answer which either admits or fails to deny the allegations of the Complaint, the Bureau of Transportation and Safety will request that the Commission enter an order imposing a penalty (see Paragraph B). Should the Commission cancel you Certificate of Public Convenience, it may also impose an additional fine of up to \$1,000.
- E. If you file an answer which contests the complaint, the matter will be assigned to an Administrative Law Judge for hearing and decision. The judge is not bound by the optional penalty set forth in Paragraph B.

Approval of PSSA Performance Level Descriptors and Performance Level Scores

At its regular public meeting held September 15, 2005, the State Board of Education (Board) approved new Performance Level Descriptors and Pennsylvania System

of School Assessment (PSSA) Performance Level Scores recommended to the Board by the Department of Education (Department). The approved performance descriptors and PSSA performance level scores are based upon the recommendations of teachers, administrators and intermediate unit staff who participated in multi-day workshops facilitated by the Department's assessment contractor. The Performance Level Scores for grades 5, 8 and 11 were validated based upon the levels established by the Board in 2001, as published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* at 31 Pa.B. 2763 (May 26, 2001). With the addition of grade level tests in grade three, performance levels had to be established for the first time.

The scores approved by the Board on September 15, 2005, update scores that were previously approved by the Board on June 30, 2005. At that meeting, the Board approved the methodology for deriving the performance levels and, consequently, the expected rigor reflected by each level of performance. Following the June 30, 2005, meeting, it was determined an error was made in calculating the scores. The error resulted from use of incorrect equating data, not from the process used to calculate the new scores. The scores reflected in this notice were calculated using correct equating data and were verified for their accuracy by an independent contractor selected by the Department.

The Board action was taken under general authority granted to it by the Public School Code of 1949 (24 P. S. §§ 1-101—27-2702) and in accordance with specific provisions of the Board's regulations codified at 22 Pa. Code Chapter 4 (relating to academic standards and assessment). The approved PSSA performance level scores are described infra in the Appendix. The performance level descriptors are available for review on the Department website (www.pde.state.pa.us).

Background

Published at 29 Pa.B. 399 (January 16, 1999), the regulations of the Board now codified at 22 Pa. Code Chapter 4 "establish rigorous academic standards and assessments to facilitate the improvement of student achievement and to provide parents and communities a measure by which school performance can be determined." See 22 Pa. Code § 4.2 (relating to purpose). To help accomplish these goals, the Board established in Chapter 4 a State assessment system. The State assessment system is designed specifically to accomplish the following purposes:

- (1) Provide students, parents, educators and citizens with an understanding of student and school performance.
- (2) Determine the degree to which school programs enable students to attain proficiency of academic standards under § 4.12 (relating to academic standards).
- (3) Provide results to school districts, including charter schools, and AVTSs for consideration in the development of strategic plans under § 4.13 (relating to strategic plans).
- (4) Provide information to State policymakers including the General Assembly and the Board on how effective schools are in promoting and demonstrating student proficiency of academic standards.
- (5) Provide information to the general public on school performance.
- (6) Provide results to school districts, including charter schools, and AVTSs based upon the aggregate performance of all students, for students with an Individualized

Education Program (IEP) and for those without an IEP. See 22 Pa. Code § 4.51(a) (relating to State assessment system).

As prescribed by the regulations, the criteria for judging performance on State assessments are the following:

- (1) Performance on State reading assessments shall be demonstrated by students' responses to comprehension questions about age-appropriate reading passages and by their written responses to in-depth comprehension questions about the passages.
- (2) Performance on State mathematics assessments shall be demonstrated by students' responses to questions about grade-appropriate content and by the quality of their responses to questions which require a written solution to a problem.
- (3) Performance on State writing assessments shall be demonstrated by the quality of students' written compositions on a variety of topics and modes of writing. See 22 Pa. Code § 4.51(b)(1)—(3). Levels of proficiency established by the regulations are "advanced, proficient, basic and below basic." See 22 Pa. Code § 4.51(b)(4).

Under the regulations, it is the responsibility of the Department to develop State assessments "based on academic standards in mathematics, reading and writing under § 4.12 [(relating to academic standards)]." See 22 Pa. Code § 4.51(c). In developing assessments, the Department is required "to consult with educators, students, parents and citizens regarding the specific methods of assessment." Individual test results from the assessment are to be used in planning instruction "only by parents, teachers, administrators and guidance counselors with a need to know based upon local board policy on testing and in reporting academic progress." Id. The Department and other Commonwealth entities are prohibited from collecting individual student test scores, and may only collect aggregate test scores by school and district. Id.

The State assessments must be administered annually and include assessments of the State academic standards in mathematics and reading at grades 3, 5, 8 and 11 and in writing at the elementary, middle and high school levels. See 22 Pa. Code § 4.51(d) and § 403.3(d) (relating to assessments). Students not achieving at the proficient level in the administration of State assessments in grade 11 must be provided one additional opportunity in grade 12 to demonstrate a proficient level on State assessments. See 22 Pa. Code § 4.51(e). The Secretary of Education has the authority to establish guidelines for the administration of the State assessment system. See 22 Pa. Code § 4.51(h).

Development and Approval of Descriptors and Scores

As part of the State assessment system established by the regulations, the Board delegated to the Department the very important task of developing specific criteria for each of the performance levels prescribed by § 4.51 (b)(4)—advanced, proficient, basic and below basic. Specifically, the Department is directed by the regulations to "consult with educators, students, parents and citizens," and then to "develop and recommend to the Board for its approval specific criteria for each performance level." Id.

As reported to the Board at its May 18, 2005, study session, the Department met with educators, parents, community and business leaders from across this Commonwealth to assist the Department in the validation of the performance levels descriptors and scores. Based on these efforts as described in detail for the Board at its June 30, 2005, meeting, the Department recommended

the performance level descriptors and scores that the Board ultimately adopted at its June 30, 2005, meeting. Before adopting the performance level descriptors and scores on June 30, 2005, the Board provided members of the public in attendance with the opportunity to comment on the Department's recommendation. Following that meeting upon identification of an equating error, the Department recalculated the cut scores using correct data. The Department then verified the accuracy of the corrected cut scores by engaging an independent research organization to validate the corrected cut scores. The Department recommended and the Board approved the corrected cut scores at the Board meeting held on September 15, 2005.

The approved performance levels (as they appear infra) will be applied to the 2005 PSSA test scores, which will be released in September 2005. The Performance Level Descriptors, due to their length, are not included here but may be accessed on the Department's website: www. pde.state.pa.us. The Department and the Board will review the descriptors and scores periodically based on actual experience in using them and consider revisions as appropriate, using the same process prescribed by § 4.51(b)(4).

STATE CONTRACTS INFORMATION DEPARTMENT OF GENERAL SERVICES

Act 266 of 1982 provides for the payment of interest penalties on certain invoices of "qualified small business concerns". The penalties apply to invoices for goods or services when payments are not made by the required payment date or within a 15 day grace period thereafter.

A business is eligible for payments when the required payment is the latest of:

The payment date specified in the contract.

30 days after the later of the receipt of a proper invoice or receipt of goods or services.

The net payment date stated on the business' invoice.


A 15-day grace period after the required payment date is provided to the Commonwealth by the Act.


