Referendum on Continuation of the Pennsylvania Vegetable Marketing and Research Program

- 1. The Pennsylvania Vegetable Marketing and Research Program (Program) was initially established in 1989 under the provisions of the Pennsylvania Agricultural Commodities Marketing Act (act) (3 P. S. §§ 1001—1012). The Act requires that the Secretary of Agriculture call a referendum of affected producers every 5 years to determine whether or not a majority of those voting still desire the Program. The Program was continued through a review referendum conducted in 2003. It is now time for another review referendum to determine whether a majority of the vegetable producers still desire the Program to continue.
- 2. Referendum Period: The referendum shall be March 10, 2008, until 4 p.m. on March 24, 2008. Completed ballots shall be mailed or hand delivered to the Department of Agriculture, Commodity Promotion Division, Room 311, 2301 North Cameron Street, Harrisburg, PA 17110-9408. Hand-delivered ballots must be received by 4 p.m. on March 24, 2008. Ballots that are mailed must be postmarked no later than March 24, 2008 and received no later than March 27, 2008.
- 3. Notice of Referendum: This referendum order, the program order and official ballot shall be mailed no later than March 3, 2008, to all affected producers whose names appear on the list of the Pennsylvania vegetable producers maintained in the Office of the Bureau of Market Development. Additional copies of the same materials shall be made available at the Office of the Secretary of Agriculture.

- 4. Eligible Voters: The rules governing the eligibility of a producer for voting are as follows: The record date for determination of whether a producer is eligible to vote is February 29, 2008. All vegetable producers within the Commonwealth who grow 1 or more acres of vegetables for sale are eligible to vote, as are all producers who, for the purpose of selling, grow vegetables in 1,000 square feet or more of greenhouse area. Greenhouse area used to produce vegetable transplants for outdoor use shall not be included. All producers with one or more acres of vegetable production or 1,000 or more square feet of greenhouse vegetable production, as of February 29, 2008, are entitled to vote.
- 5. Counting of Ballots: The ballots will be conveyed and counted by a Teller Committee appointed by the Secretary of Agriculture. The counting of the ballots will begin at 10 a.m. Thursday, April 3, 2008, in the State Agriculture Building, Harrisburg, PA. The Secretary will announce the results of the referendum within 30 days following the completion of the referendum period. The results will be published in the Pennsylvania Bulletin and disseminated to the news media.
- 6. Reporting Irregularities: Any irregularities or disputes concerning the referendum procedures must be reported in written form to the Secretary of Agriculture no later than 7 calendar days from the end of the referendum period.
- 7. Publication: This referendum order shall be published in the Pennsylvania Bulletin and the Harrisburg Patriot-News.
- 8. *Effective Date:* The foregoing order shall be effective from and after the 10th day of February, 2008.

For NPDES renewal applications in Section I, the Department of Environmental Protection (Department) has made a tentative determination to reissue these permits for 5 years subject to effluent limitations and monitoring and reporting requirements in their current permits, with appropriate and necessary updated requirements to reflect new and changed regulations and other requirements.

For applications for new NPDES permits and renewal applications with major changes in Section II, as well as applications for MS4 individual permits and individual stormwater construction permits in Sections IV and VI, the Department, based upon preliminary reviews, has made a tentative determination of proposed effluent limitations and other terms and conditions for the permit applications. These determinations are published as proposed actions for comments prior to taking final actions.

Unless indicated otherwise, the EPA Region III Administrator has waived the right to review or object to proposed NPDES permit actions under the waiver provision in 40 CFR 123.24(d).

Persons wishing to comment on an NPDES application are invited to submit a statement to the regional office noted before an application within 30 days from the date of this public notice. Persons wishing to comment on a WQM permit application are invited to submit a statement to the regional office noted before the application within 15 days from the date of this public notice. Comments received within the respective comment periods will be considered in the final determinations regarding the applications. Comments should include the name, address and telephone number of the writer and a concise statement to inform the Department of the exact basis of a comment and the relevant facts upon which it is based.

The Department will also accept requests for a public hearing on applications. A public hearing may be held if the responsible office considers the public response significant. If a hearing is scheduled, a notice of the hearing will be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* and a newspaper of general circulation within the relevant geographical area. The Department will postpone its final determination until after a public hearing is held.

LAND RECYCLING AND ENVIRONMENTAL REMEDIATION

UNDER ACT 2, 1995

PREAMBLE 1

Acknowledgment of Notices of Intent to Remediate Submitted under the Land Recycling and Environmental Remediation Standards Act (35 P. S. §§ 6026.101—6026.908).

Sections 302-305 of the Land Recycling and Environmental Remediation Standards Act (act) require the Department of Environmental Protection (Department) to publish in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* an acknowledgment noting receipt of Notices of Intent to Remediate. An acknowledgment of the receipt of a Notice of Intent to Remediate is used to identify a site where a person proposes to, or has been required to, respond to a release of a regulated substance at a site. Persons intending to use the Background Standard, Statewide Health Standard, the Site-Specific Standard or who intend to remediate a site as a special industrial area must file a Notice of Intent to Remediate with the Department. A Notice of Intent to Remediate filed with the Department provides a brief description of the location of the site, a list of known or suspected contaminants at the site, the proposed remediation measures for the site and a description of the intended future use of the site. A person who demonstrates attainment of one, a combination of the cleanup standards or who receives approval of a special industrial area remediation identified under the act will be relieved of further liability for the remediation of the site for any contamination identified in reports submitted to and approved by the Department. Furthermore, the person

shall not be subject to citizen suits or other contribution actions brought by responsible persons not participating in the remediation.

Under sections 304(n)(1)(ii) and 305(c)(2) of the act, there is a 30-day public and municipal comment period for sites proposed for remediation using a Site-Specific Standard, in whole or in part, and for sites remediated as a special industrial area. This period begins when a summary of the Notice of Intent to Remediate is published in a newspaper of general circulation in the area of the site. For the sites identified, proposed for remediation to a Site-Specific Standard or as a special industrial area, the municipality within which the site is located may request to be involved in the development of the remediation and reuse plans for the site if the request is made within 30 days of the date specified. During this comment period, the municipality may request that the person identified as the remediator of the site develop and implement a public involvement plan. Requests to be involved and comments should be directed to the remediator of the site.

For further information concerning the content of a Notice of Intent to Remediate, contact the environmental cleanup program manager in the Department regional office before which the notice appears. If information concerning this acknowledgment is required in an alternative form, contact the community relations coordinator at the appropriate regional office. Plans and reports required by provisions of the act for compliance with selection of remediation to a Site-Specific Standard, in addition to a final report, include a remedial investigation report, risk assessment report and cleanup plan. A remedial investigation report includes conclusions from the site investigation, concentration of regulated substances in environmental media, benefits of refuse of the property and, in some circumstances, a fate and transport analysis. If required, a risk assessment report describes potential adverse effects caused by the presence of regulated substances. If required, a cleanup plan evaluates the abilities of potential remedies to achieve remedy requirements. A work plan for conducting a baseline remedial investigation is required by provisions of the act for compliance with selection of a special industrial area remediation. The baseline remedial investigation, based on the work plan, is compiled into the baseline environmental report to establish a reference point to show existing contamination, describe proposed remediation to be done and include a description of existing or potential public benefits of the use or reuse of the property. The Department may approve or disapprove plans and reports submitted. This notice provides the Department's decision and, if relevant, the basis for disapproval.

Laboratories Approved to Determine Analyses of Blood and/or Serum for Controlled Substances

The following laboratories are licensed by the Department of Health (Department) under Clinical Laboratory Act (35 P. S. §§ 2151-2165) and/or the Federal Clinical Laboratory Improvement Act of 1967 (42 U.S.C.A. § 263a) and are currently approved by the Department under 28 Pa. Code § 5.50 (relating to approval to provide special analytical services) to perform analyses of blood and/or serum for the determination of controlled substances. This approval is based on demonstrated proficiency in tests conducted by the Bureau of Laboratories of the Department. These laboratories are also approved and designated for purposes of the Vehicle Code, 75 Pa.C.S. §§ 1547 and 3755 (relating to chemical testing to determine amount of alcohol or controlled substance; and reports by emergency room personnel), the Fish and Boat Code, 30 Pa.C.S. § 5125 (relating to chemical testing to determine amount of alcohol or controlled substance) and the Game and Wildlife Code, 34 Pa.C.S. § 2501 (relating to hunting or furtaking under the influence of alcohol or controlled substance), as qualified to perform the types of services which will reflect the presence of controlled substances or their biotransformation products in blood and/or serum.

Depending upon their capability and performance in proficiency surveys, laboratories are approved to perform screening and/or confirmatory analyses on blood and/or serum. Laboratories approved to perform screening analyses are designated on the approval list by an "S" followed by the letters "B" for blood and/or "Se" for serum. Laboratories approved to screen both blood and serum would therefore have "SBSe" listed after their laboratory name. Laboratories approved to offer confirmatory analyses will be designated on the approval list by a "C" followed by the letters "B" for blood and/or "Se" for serum. Laboratories approved to perform confirmatory analyses on both serum and blood would therefore have "CBSe" listed after the name of their laboratory.

Screening analyses provide a presumptive indication that a controlled substance is present. Confirmatory testing is used to substantiate screening results.

Persons seeking forensic blood and/or serum analysis services from any of the listed laboratories should determine that the laboratory employs techniques and procedures acceptable for the medicolegal purposes. They should also determine that the director of the facility is agreeable to performing analyses for forensic purposes. Persons seeking the analyses are responsible for specifying the extent to which the presence of a controlled substance is to be verified. That specification should be predicated upon the purpose for which the analysis is being sought.

The name of a laboratory is sometimes changed but the location, personnel and testing procedures of the facility remain unchanged. When changes of this type occur, the Clinical Laboratory Permit number does not change. If questions arise about the identity of a laboratory due to a name change, the Clinical Laboratory Permit number should be used as the primary identifier. To assist in identifying a laboratory that performed a test if the name of the facility changed, the Clinical Laboratory Permit numbers of the facilities are included in the lists of approved laboratories above the name of the laboratory at the time the list was prepared.

The list of approved laboratories will be revised approximately semiannually and published in the Pennsylvania Bulletin. Questions regarding this list should be directed to M. Laboratories Approved to Determine Blood Alcohol Content

The following laboratories are licensed by the Department of Health (Department) under the Clinical Laboratory Act (act) (35 P. S. §§ 2151—2165) and are currently approved by the Department under 28 Pa. Code §§ 5.50 and 5.103 (relating to approval to provide special analytical services; and blood tests for blood alcohol content) to perform alcohol analyses of blood and/or serum and plasma. This approval is based on demonstrated proficiency in periodic tests conducted by the Department's Bureau of Laboratories.

Since procedures for determining the alcohol content of serum and plasma are identical and results obtained from serum or plasma derived from a blood sample are the same, laboratories that demonstrate reliability in the analysis of serum proficiency testing specimens are approved to analyze both serum and plasma. These laboratories are also approved and designated under the provisions of the Vehicle Code, 75 Pa.C.S. §§ 1547 and 3755 (relating to chemical testing to determine amount of alcohol or controlled substance; and reports by emergency room personnel), the Fish and Boat Code, 30 Pa.C.S. § 5125 (relating to chemical testing to determine the amount of alcohol or controlled substance) and the Game and Wildlife Code, 34 Pa.C.S. § 2501 (relating to hunting or fur taking under the influence of alcohol or controlled substance) as qualified to perform the types of specialized services which will reflect the presence of alcohol in blood and/or serum and plasma. Laboratories located outside this Commonwealth may not provide blood and/or serum and plasma alcohol testing services in this Commonwealth unless they are specifically licensed by the Department under the act.

Persons seeking forensic blood and/or serum and plasma analysis services from the following designated laboratories should determine that the laboratory employs techniques and procedures acceptable for forensic purposes, and that the director of the facility is agreeable to performing determinations for this purpose. The list of approved laboratories will be revised approximately semi-annually and published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

The name of a laboratory is sometimes changed but the location, personnel and testing procedures of the facility remain unchanged. When changes of this type occur, the Clinical Laboratory Permit number does not change. If questions arise about the identity of a laboratory due to a name change, the Clinical Laboratory Permit number should be used as the primary identifier. To assist in identifying a laboratory that performed a test if the name of the facility changed, the Clinical Laboratory Permit numbers of the facilities are included in the lists of approved laboratories above the name of the laboratory at the time the list was prepared.

The Department's blood alcohol and serum/plasma alcohol proficiency testing programs are approved by the United States Department of Health and Human Services in accordance with the requirements contained in the Clinical Laboratory Improvement Amendments of 1988 (42 CFR 493.901 and 493.937) which are administered by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services. Participation in these programs may therefore be used to demonstrate acceptable performance for approval purposes under both Federal and Commonwealth statutes.

Laboratories Approved to Determine Urine Controlled Substance Content

The following laboratories are licensed by the Department of Health (Department) under the Clinical Laboratory Act (35 P.S. §§ 2151-2165) and/or the Federal Clinical Laboratory Improvement Act of 1967 (42 U.S.C.A. § 263a) and are currently approved by the Department under 28 Pa. Code § 5.50 (relating to approval to provide special analytical services) to perform analyses of urine for the determination of controlled substances or their biotransformation products. This approval is based on demonstrated proficiency in tests conducted by the Bureau of Laboratories of the Pennsylvania Department of Health. These laboratories are also approved and designated for purposes of the Vehicle Code, 75 Pa.C.S. §§ 1547 and 3755 (relating to chemical testing to determine amount of alcohol or controlled substance; and reports by emergency room personnel), the Fish and Boat Code, 30 Pa.C.S. \S 5125 (relating to chemical testing to determine amount of alcohol or controlled substance) and the Game and Wildlife Code, 34 Pa.C.S. § 2501 (relating to hunting or furtaking under the influence of alcohol or controlled substance), as qualified to perform the types of services which will reflect the presence of controlled substances or their biotransformation products in urine.

Depending upon their capability and performance in proficiency surveys, laboratories are approved to perform screening and/or confirmatory urine drug analyses. Laboratories approved to perform screening tests only are designated on the approval list by an "S" after the laboratory's name. Laboratories approved to perform confirmatory testing only are designated by a "C" following the laboratory's name. Those approved to perform both screening and confirmatory analyses are designated by the letters "SC." Screening analyses provide a presumptive indication that a controlled substance is present. Confirmatory testing is used to substantiate screening results.

Persons seeking forensic urine drug analysis services from any of the listed laboratories should determine that the laboratory employs techniques and procedures acceptable for the purpose. They should also determine that the director of the facility is agreeable to performing analyses

for that purpose. Persons seeking the analyses are responsible for specifying the extent to which the presence of a controlled substance is to be verified. That specification should be predicated upon the purpose for which the analysis is being sought.

The list of approved laboratories will be revised approximately semiannually and published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. The name of a laboratory is sometimes changed but the location, personnel and testing procedures of the facility remain unchanged. When changes of this type occur, the Clinical Laboratory Permit number does not change. If questions arise about the identity of a laboratory due to a name change, the Clinical Laboratory Permit number should be used as the primary identifier. To assist in identifying a laboratory that performed a test if the name of the facility changed, the Clinical Laboratory Permit numbers of the facilities are included in the lists of approved laboratories above the name of the laboratory at the time the list was prepared.

Prearrest Breath Testing Devices

The Department of Health (Department) is approving the following prearrest breath testing devices for determining the alcohol content of the blood by analysis of a person's breath as required by 28 Pa. Code §§ 5.101—5.104 (relating to equipment to determine blood alcohol content under the Vehicle Code and the Fish and Boat Code). This list of approved prearrest breath testing devices is adopted under the authority contained in the Motor Vehicle Code, 75 Pa.C.S. § 1547(k) (relating to chemical testing to determine amount of alcohol or controlled substance); the Fish and Boat Code, 30 Pa.C.S. § 5125(k) (relating to chemical testing to determine

amount of alcohol or controlled substance); and the Game and Wildlife Code, 34 Pa.C.S. § 2502(j) (relating to chemical test to determine amount of alcohol)

Devices approved under this notice may be used by police officers, waterways patrolmen and officers enforcing the Game and Wildlife Code in conducting preliminary alcohol content in blood determinations on persons suspected of driving, boating, hunting or furtaking, while under the influence of alcohol. The sole purpose of these testing devices is to assist the officer or patrolman in determining whether or not the person should be placed under arrest for violation of 75 Pa.C.S. § 3802 (relating to driving under influence of alcohol or controlled substance), for violation of 30 Pa.C.S. § 5502 (relating to operating watercraft under influence of alcohol or controlled substance), for violation of 34 Pa.C.S. § 2501 (relating to hunting or furtaking prohibited while under influence of alcohol or controlled substance) or for any other criminal offense under the Vehicle Code, the Game and Wildlife Code or the Fish and Boat Code which involves operating a vehicle, hunting or furtaking while under the influence of alcohol.

This notice contains devices that were included in the previous publication of this list, which appeared at 35 Pa.B. 2694 (April 30, 2005), and adds additional devices to that list.

The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) of the United States Department of Transportation published model specifications for Screening Devices to Measure Alcohol in Bodily Fluids in the 59 FR 393820 (August 2, 1994). These specifications established performance criteria and methods for testing alcohol screening devices using either breath or other bodily fluids to measure blood alcohol content. NHTSA established these specifications to support State laws and the Federal Department of Transportation's workplace alcohol testing program. The Department has elected to use the NHTSA criteria for approving devices for the prearrest testing of a person's breath to determine the alcohol content of the person's blood.

NHTSA published a conforming products list of alcohol screening devices at 72 FR 4559 (January 31, 2007). The breath testing devices included in this Federal approval list have been incorporated into the list in this notice. Since this list contains only these devices which test breath, items on the NHTSA list that test saliva or other bodily fluids are, therefore, not included in this notice.

Some of the devices are listed under the name of more than one manufacturer. This is due to the fact that the name of the manufacturer has changed or the right to produce a device has been transferred to a different company. In those instances, the device is listed under the name of each company that was ever associated with the device to allow law enforcement agencies to continue using devices bearing the name of a previous manufact-

Additionally, there are a number of handheld breath testing devices on the Department's list of approved evidentiary breath testing equipment that frequently are used as prearrest screening devices. Any device on this list of evidentiary breath testing equipment that was evaluated using the 1993 Model Specifications for Evidential Breath Testers (see 58 FR 48705) also fully meets the requirements of the Model Specifications for prearrest screening devices. Both procedures evaluate the performance of instruments at the 0.020 alcohol level. The most recent list of approved evidential breath alcohol testing devices was published at 37 Pa.B. 5435 (October 6, 2007).

Pennsylvania Gaming Control Board Regulation #125-72 (IRRC #2646) General Provisions; and Applications December 26, 2007

We submit for your consideration the following comments on the proposed rulemaking published in the October 27, 2007 *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. Our comments are based on criteria in Section 5.2 of the Regulatory Review Act (71 P. S. § 745.5b). Section 5.1(a) of the Regulatory Review Act (71 P. S. § 745.5a(a)) directs the Pennsylvania Gaming Control Board (Board) to respond to all comments received from us or any other source.

Section 421a.6. Advertising.—Implementation procedures; Clarity.

Subsection (a)

This subsection will require certain licensees of the Board to discontinue particular advertisements or promotions "as expeditiously as possible" if the Board determines that the advertisements or promotions are not "within the spirit or intent of the act." Both of the quoted phrases lack clarity and do not provide licensees with a definitive standard to follow. We recommend that the phrase "expeditiously as possible" be replaced with a specific time period. We also recommend that the Board list the criteria that specify what it considers to be outside of the "spirit or intent of the act."

Subsection (b)

The term "advertisement" is defined in this section. We have two questions. First, would an email from a licensee

to a customer or a potential customer be considered advertising? Second, is a "promotion" different than an "advertisement"? If so, we recommend that a definition of "promotion" be added to the final-form rulemaking.

Class of the Dublic

Subsection (d)

This subsection pertains to mandatory language regarding problem gambling that must appear in advertisements. It requires Board approval of the text and type size to be used in the advertisements. We have a suggestion and a question.

First, a commentator has suggested that the regulation be amended to include the specific requirements for the mandatory language. They note that this would eliminate the need for review and approval by the Board which, in turn, would facilitate marketing initiatives and help avoid time delays. We agree with this suggestion and recommend the Board include more specific requirements pertaining to text and type size in the final-form regulation and eliminate the requirement for Board approval of advertisements.

Second, do the requirements of this subsection apply to promotions?

Subsection (e)

Under this subsection, slot machine licensees are prohibited from using an individual or "a virtual facsimile thereof" at a licensed facility to induce a person to gamble. A commentator has questioned what is meant by the term "virtual facsimile." We agree that this term is unclear and ask the Board to define it in the final-form regulation.

Department of Agriculture Regulation #2-155 (IRRC #2647)

Odor Management Certification Program December 26, 2007

We submit for your consideration the following comments on the proposed rulemaking published in the October 27, 2007 *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. Our comments are based on criteria in Section 5.2 of the Regulatory Review Act (71 P. S. § 745.5b). Section 5.1(a) of the Regulatory Review Act (71 P. S. § 745.5a(a)) directs the Department of Agriculture (Department) to respond to all comments received from us or any other source.

1. Section 130f.2. Definitions.—Clarity.

Impacts

This term is defined as:

- (i) Conflicts arising from the offsite migration of the odors from agricultural facilities.
- (ii) The term does not include mental or physical health affects (sic), or changes in property values.

It is not clear what is intended by the exclusion of health effects and property values in Paragraph (ii). In the statutory criteria for eligibility for financial assistance, the State Conservation Commission (SCC) must consider whether a project will "improve the health, safety or environment of the people..." (3 Pa.C.S.A. § 511(b)(1)). Public health is also mentioned in civil penalties and remedies (3 Pa.C.S.A. § 514(d)). Moreover, what "conflicts" remain after the exclusion of health effects or changes in property value? Why would an odor that caused the health effect of loss of appetite be excluded from impacts? The Department needs to explain why Paragraph (ii) is appropriate in the definition of "impacts."

Odor management regulations

This definition is dependent upon the SCC regulation which is not yet final as of the date of these comments. If possible, this final regulation should reference the final regulation by the SCC.

2. 130f.3. Fees.—Reasonableness; Clarity.

Fees for dual certification

We note that the nutrient management specialist regulations (7 Pa. Code § 130b.3(a)(3)(ii)) impose a fee for dual certification. Subsections 130f.11(i), (j) and (k) provide for dual certification as an odor management specialist. Why didn't the Department include a fee for dual certification as an odor management specialist in Section 130f.3?

Fees required

Subsection (a) does not state whether fees are required annually or whether they cover the entire three-year certification periods specified in sections 130f.22(c) and 130f.31(a). The regulation should clearly state how often fees are required to be paid to maintain certification.

3. 130f.11. Determination of competence.—Reasonableness.

Other areas and course work

Paragraph (d)(11) requires training to include "[O]ther areas and course work related to requirements set forth in the odor management regulations, as determined appropriate by the Department." How will the person or organization running the training course have adequate

notice of an area determined to be appropriate by the Department and where could they find this determination by the Department?

4. 130f.21. Determination of competence.—Reasonableness; Clarity

Other applicable laws and regulations

Paragraph (c)(9) is overly broad by requiring knowledge in "[O]ther applicable laws and regulations." The regulation should clearly state what knowledge is required.

5. 130f.31. Recertification.—Reasonableness; Clarity.

Fees

Related to our concern with Section 130f.3 regarding *Fees*, this section does not require payment of a fee. Assuming a fee is required for recertification, Subsection (a) should require payment of the fee along with the written documentation of continuing education and training.

6. Miscellaneous Clarity.

- In Section 130f.2, the definition of "BMP" should include a reference to the Act.
- Subsection 130f.31(c) excludes "coffee breaks" from the calculation of credit hours. We recommend deleting the word "coffee" so that all breaks would be excluded from credit hours.

Increase in the Accident Surcharge Dollar Threshold (Cap) to \$1,350; Notice 2008-01

Insurers writing private passenger automobile insurance in this Commonwealth may not, by law, penalize their policyholders (such as, apply rate surcharges or otherwise increase premiums) whose aggregate claim cost over a 3-year period does not exceed a certain threshold (cap). This threshold (cap) applies to any person injured or property damaged, and is measured in excess of any deductible or self-insured retention. Effective July 1, 2008, the Insurance Department (Department) has increased the threshold (cap) to \$1,350.

Section 19(a) of Act 6 of 1990 (75 Pa.C.S. § 1799.3) (relating to limit on cancellations, refusals to renew, refusals to write, surcharges, rate penalties and point

assignments) does not allow an insurer to, "cancel or refuse to renew a policy or apply any surcharge, rate penalty or driver record point assignment" when the threshold (cap) is not exceeded.

By law, the Department is required to adjust the amount of the threshold (cap) at least once every 3 years. Section 19(e) of Act 6 of 1990 stipulates the adjustment be made relative to changes in the Consumer Price Index for medical care and automobile maintenance and repair costs. The previous adjustment to the threshold (cap) was effective July 1, 2005, when the threshold (cap) increased to \$1,150.

Each individual insurer, ISO, AIPSO and MSO should file the previously mentioned change for prior approval by April 1, 2008, and specify an effective date of no later than July 1, 2008. To assure the availability of funds to pay claims and operating expenses, all assessment payments must be remitted to the MCARE Fund within 30 days of receipt by the billing party.

Any unbilled MCARE assessments associated with primary policies with February or March 2008 effective or renewal dates should be billed so that payment of the assessment is due to the billing party by the later of March 31, 2008, or 60 days after the effective or renewal dates of the primary policies. In order to assure the availability of funds to pay claims and operating expenses, all assessment payments must be remitted to the MCARE Fund within 30 days of receipt by the billing party.

Any MCARE assessments associated with primary policies with April 2008 or later effective or renewal dates should be billed and remitted to the MCARE Fund under standard procedures.

This action is subject to 1 Pa. Code Part II (relating to the General Rules of Administrative Practice and Procedure).
