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READER'S GUIDE TO THE PENNSYLVANIA BULLETIN AND PENNSYLVANIA CODE

Pennsylvania Bulletin

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the official gazette of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. It is published every week and includes a table of contents. A cumulative subject matter index is published quarterly.

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* serves several purposes. First, it is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, which is the official codification of agency rules and regulations and other statutorily authorized documents. Changes in the codified text, whether by adoption, amendment, repeal or emergency action must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. Further, agencies proposing changes to the codified text do so in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Second, the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* also publishes: Governor's Executive Orders; State Contract Notices; Summaries of Enacted Statutes; Statewide and Local Court Rules; Attorney General Opinions; Motor Carrier Applications before the Public Utility Commission; Applications and Actions before the Department of Environmental Protection; Orders of the Independent Regulatory Review Commission; and other documents authorized by law.

The text of certain documents published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the only valid and enforceable text. Courts are required to take judicial notice of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Adoption, Amendment or Repeal of Regulations

Generally an agency wishing to adopt, amend or repeal regulations must first publish in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking. There are limited instances where the agency may omit the proposal step; they still must publish the adopted version.

The Notice of Proposed Rulemaking contains the full text of the change, the agency contact person, a fiscal note required by law and background for the action.

The agency then allows sufficient time for public comment before taking final action. An adopted proposal must be published in the *Pennsylvania*

Bulletin before it can take effect. If the agency wishes to adopt changes to the Notice of Proposed Rulemaking to enlarge the scope, they must repropose.

Citation to the Pennsylvania Bulletin

Cite material in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* by volume number and page number. Example: Volume 1, *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, page 801 (short form: 1 Pa.B. 801).

Pennsylvania Code

The *Pennsylvania Code* is the official codification of rules and regulations issued by Commonwealth agencies and other statutorily authorized documents. The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, printing changes as soon as they occur. These changes are then permanently codified by the *Pennsylvania Code Reporter*, a monthly, loose-leaf supplement.

The *Pennsylvania Code* is cited by title number and section number. Example: Title 10 *Pennsylvania Code*, § 1.1 (short form: 10 Pa.Code § 1.1).

Under the *Pennsylvania Code* codification system, each regulation is assigned a unique number by title and section. Titles roughly parallel the organization of Commonwealth government. Title 1 *Pennsylvania Code* lists every agency and its corresponding *Code* title location.

How to Find Documents

Search for your area of interest in the *Pennsylva*nia Code.

The *Pennsylvania Code* contains, as Finding Aids, subject indexes for the complete *Code* and for each individual title, a list of Statutes Used As Authority for Adopting Rules and a list of annotated cases. Source Notes give you the history of the documents. To see if there have been recent changes, not yet codified, check the List of *Pennsylvania Code* Chapters Affected in the most recent issue of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* also publishes a quarterly List of Pennsylvania Code Sections Affected which lists the regulations in numerical order, followed by the citation to the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* in which the change occurred.

Printing Format

Material proposed to be added to an existing rule or regulation is printed in **bold face** and material proposed to be deleted from such a rule or regulation is enclosed in brackets [] and printed in **bold face**. Asterisks indicate ellipsis of *Pennsylvania Code* text retained without change. Proposed new or additional regulations are printed in ordinary style face.

Fiscal Notes

Section 612 of The Administrative Code of 1929 (71 P. S. § 232) requires that the Office of Budget prepare a fiscal note for regulatory actions and administrative procedures of the administrative departments, boards, commissions or authorities receiving money from the State Treasury stating whether the proposed action or procedure causes a loss of revenue or an increase in the cost of programs for the Commonwealth or its political subdivisions; that the fiscal note be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* at the same time as the proposed change is advertised; and that the fiscal note shall provide the following information: (1) the designation of the fund out of which the appropriation providing for expenditures under the action or procedure shall be made; (2) the probable cost for the fiscal year the program is implemented; (3) projected cost estimate of the program for each of the five succeeding fiscal years; (4) fiscal history of the program for which expenditures are to be made; (5) probable loss of revenue for the fiscal year of its implementation; (6) projected loss of revenue from the program for each of the five succeeding fiscal years; (7) line item, if any, of the General Appropriation Act or other appropriation act out of which expenditures or losses of Commonwealth funds shall occur as a result of the action or procedures; (8) recommendation, if any, of the Secretary of the Budget and the reasons therefor.

The required information is published in the foregoing order immediately following the proposed change to which it relates; the omission of an item indicates that the agency text of the fiscal note states that there is no information available with respect thereto. In items (3) and (6) information is set forth for the first through fifth fiscal years; in that order, following the year the program is implemented, which is stated. In item (4) information is set forth for the current and two immediately preceding years, in that order. In item (8) the recommendation, if any, made by the Secretary of Budget is published with the fiscal note. See 4 Pa. Code § 7.231 et seq. Where "no fiscal impact" is published, the statement means no additional cost or revenue loss to the Commonwealth or its local political subdivision is intended.

Reproduction, Dissemination or Publication of Information

Third parties may not take information from the *Pennsylvania Code* and *Pennsylvania Bulletin* and reproduce, disseminate or publish such information except as provided by 1 Pa. Code § 3.44. 1 Pa. Code § 3.44 reads as follows:

§ 3.44. General permission to reproduce content of Code and Bulletin.

Information published under this part, which information includes, but is not limited to, cross references, tables of cases, notes of decisions, tables of contents, indexes, source notes, authority notes, numerical lists and codification guides, other than the actual text of rules or regulations may be reproduced only with the written consent of the Bureau. The information which appears on the same leaf with the text of a rule or regulation, however, may be incidentally reproduced in connection with the reproduction of the rule or regulation, if the reproduction is for the private use of a subscriber and not for resale. There are no other restrictions on the reproduction of information published under this part, and the Commonwealth hereby consents to a reproduction.

Order

And Now, this 3rd day of January, 2011, it is hereby Ordered and Directed as follows:

- 1. Lycoming County Rules of Civil Procedure L205.2(a) and L1915.8 shall be amended as set forth as follows. (Bold text is new language; bold and bracketed text is removed language.)
- 2. The following Lycoming County Rules of Civil Procedure are rescinded: L1910.1, L1910.4, L1910.5, L1910.8, L1910.13, L1914, L1915.3-4, L1920.2, L1920.3, L1920.15, L1920.73, L1920.74, L1920.75, L1920.76 and L1920.77.
 - 3. The Prothonotary is directed to:
- a. File seven (7) certified copies of this order with the Administrative Office of the Pennsylvania Courts.
- b. Forward two (2) certified copies of this order and a computer disk containing the text of the local rule to the Legislative Reference Bureau for publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.
- c. Forward one (1) certified copy of this order to the Pennsylvania Civil Procedural Rules Committee.
- d. Forward one (1) copy of this order to the chairman of the Lycoming County Customs and Rules Committee.
- 4. The revision to Rule L205.2(a) shall become effective immediately after its posting on the Pennsylvania Judiciary's Web Application Portal.
- 5. The remainder of the revisions shall become effective 30 days after the publication of this order in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

L205.2. Filing Legal Papers with the Prothonotary.

(a) Size of paper. Number of copies. All pleadings, motions, petitions, briefs and other legal documents filed

with the prothonotary shall be on paper size 8 1/2 inches by 11 inches, unless otherwise required by rule or order of court. [Any document more than three pages in length may be printed on both sides of the paper.] The original and one copy of all documents to which rule L205.2(b)B applies shall be filed. Unless otherwise required by another applicable rule or order of court, only the original of a brief or any other document is required to be filed.

(b) Reguired cover sheets....

L1915.8. Physical/Mental/Psychological Examinations and Home Studies.

- A. Upon agreement of the parties at the initial conference, the hearing officer may include in the recommended interim order a direction that the parties obtain physical, mental or psychological examinations and/or home studies, prior to the date of the pre-trial conference and may establish a date by which the parties must make the initial arrangements. [Where mediation is utilized, the order may provide that the evaluation be undertaken during the mediation process, deferred until mediation is complete or be left for consideration at the pre-trial conference.]
- B. Any request by the parties for evaluations made after the initial conference and not made at the pre-trial conference or entered into by stipulation must be made by motion in accordance with Pa.R.C.P. No. 1915.8, alleging specific facts and reasons for the request, with a hearing to be held after reasonable notice to the other party.
- C. Unless otherwise directed by the court or hearing officer or agreed upon by the parties, the expense of any evaluation shall be borne initially by the party requesting the evaluation and shall be paid in accordance with Pa.R.C.P. No. 1915.8. A final allocation of the expense may be made by the court upon entry of an order or decision rendered on any issues raised in the proceeding.
- D. Any evaluation filed with the court shall not be available for public inspection and shall be impounded by the prothonotary.


Reorganization of the Department of Banking

The Executive Board approved a reorganization of the Department of Banking effective January 4, 2011.

This document meets the criteria of 45 Pa.C.S. § 702(7) (relating to contents of *Pennsylvania Code*) as a document general and permanent in nature which shall be codified in the *Pennsylvania Code*.)

Licensure of Retail Food Facilities Order

Recitals

- A. The Retail Food Facility Safety Act (Act) (3 Pa.C.S. §§ 5701—5714) is effective as of January 22, 2011.
- B. The Act prescribes standards, responsibilities and requirements relating to the licensure, inspection and safe operation of retail food facilities within the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.
- C. The Act (at 3 Pa.C.S. § 5702) designates the Department of Agriculture (Department) as a "licensor" of certain retail food facilities that are not licensed by designated county health departments or other local health departments or health authorities.
- D. The Act (at 3 Pa.C.S. § 5703(b)) affords licensors of retail food facilities discretion to exempt certain specified types of retail food facilities from having to obtain a license. Where the licensor is the Department, the exemption must be accomplished by Order of the Secretary, published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.
- E. It is the intention of the Department to exempt certain types of retail food facilities from the licensure requirements of the Act.

Order

Under authority of the Act (3 Pa.C.S. § 5703(b)), and with the foregoing recitals incorporated into this Order, the Department hereby orders the following:

- 1. A retail food facility is exempt from having to obtain the retail food facility license required under the Act (3 Pa.C.S. § 5703(a)) if both of the following are accurate:
- a. The Department would otherwise be the licensor under the act with respect to that food facility.
- b. The food facility is one of the following, as described in the Act at 3 Pa.C.S. § 5703(b)(1)(i)—(vi):
- i. A food bank owned by a charitable nonprofit entity and operated for charitable or religious purposes.
- ii. A soup kitchen owned by a charitable nonprofit entity and operated for charitable or religious purposes.
- iii. A retail food facility that operates on no more than 3 days each calendar year.
 - iv. A school cafeteria.
- v. A retail food facility that is owned by a charitable nonprofit entity and that is one or more of the following:
- A. Managed by an organization which is established to promote and encourage participation or support for extracurricular recreational activities for youth of primary and secondary public, private and parochial school systems on a not-for-profit basis. This subparagraph does not apply to organized camps.

- B. Offers only foods that are nonpotentially hazardous foods or beverages.
- vi. A retail food facility in which food or beverages are sold only through a vending machine.
- 2. A retail food facility that seeks to be exempt from licensure under this Order shall provide the Department whatever reasonable documentation or verification the Department requests in order to confirm that it is an entity that is qualified for the licensure exemption described above. The burden of proof that a retail food facility is exempt under this Order shall rest on the retail food facility seeking the exemption.
- 3. The Department provides general notice that two additional types of retail food facilities are exempt from having to obtain the retail food facility license required under the Act (at 3 Pa.C.S. § 5703(a)). These food establishments are specifically exempted from licensure under the Act (at 3 Pa.C.S. § 5703(b)(2)), rather than under this Order. They include the following:
- a. A retail food facility in which only prepackaged, nonpotentially hazardous food or beverages are sold.
- b. A retail food facility that sells only raw agricultural commodities.
- 4. A retail food facility that is exempted from the license requirements under the act is exempt from the licensure requirement only, and remains subject to inspection and all other provisions of the Act and its attendant regulations.
- 5. This Order shall take effect as of January 22, 2011, and shall remain in effect until terminated by subsequent order.

Proposed Exchange of Land

The Department of Conservation and Natural Resources (Department), acting through the Bureau of Forestry, and ISP Minerals, Inc. are proposing to negotiate an exchange of property interests Hamiltonban Township, Adams County.

The Commonwealth will convey approximately 110 acres in Hamiltonban Township to ISP Minerals, Inc. In return, ISP Minerals, Inc. will convey three separate tracts to the Commonwealth. The first tract being approximately 60 acres, the second tract containing 21.4 acres and the third tract containing 29 acres and 156 perches. All three tracts are situated in Hamiltonban Township, Adams County and will be added to the Michaux State Forest.

As is the policy of the Department, the public is notified of this exchange. A 30-day period for public inquiry and/or comment will be in effect commencing January 22, 2011, and ending February 21, 2011. Oral or written comments or questions concerning this proposed exchange may be addressed to Dan Devlin, State Forester, Bureau of Forestry, P. O. Box 8552, Harrisburg, PA 17105-8552, (717) 787-4837. These oral and/or written comments will become part of the official document used in the final decision process.

If, in the duration of the 30-day comment period, a significant amount of public concern develops, the Secretary of the Department may schedule a public informational meeting.

APPLICATIONS FOR NATIONAL POLLUTION DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM (NPDES) PERMITS AND WATER QUALITY MANAGEMENT (WQM) PERMITS

This notice provides information about persons who have applied for a new, amended or renewed NPDES or WQM permit, a permit waiver for certain stormwater discharges or submitted a Notice of Intent (NOI) for coverage under a General Permit. The applications concern, but are not limited to, discharges regarding industrial, animal or sewage waste, discharges to groundwater, discharges associated with municipal separate storm sewer systems (MS4), stormwater associated with construction activities or concentrated animal feeding operations (CAFO). This notice is provided in accordance with 25 Pa. Code Chapters 91 and 92a and 40 CFR Part 122, implementing The Clean Streams Law (35 P. S. §§ 691.1—691.1001) and the Federal Clean Water Act (33 U.S.C.A. §§ 1251—1376).

For NPDES renewal applications in Section I, the Department of Environmental Protection (Department) has made a tentative determination to reissue these permits for 5 years subject to effluent limitations and monitoring and reporting requirements in their current permits, with appropriate and necessary updated requirements to reflect new and changed regulations and other requirements.

For applications for new NPDES permits and renewal applications with major changes in Section II, as well as applications for MS4 Individual Permits and Individual Stormwater Construction Permits in Sections IV and VI, the Department, based upon preliminary reviews, has made tentative determinations of proposed effluent limitations and other terms and conditions for the permit applications. These determinations are published as proposed actions for comments prior to taking final actions.

Unless indicated otherwise, the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Region III Administrator has waived the right to review or object to proposed NPDES permit actions under the waiver provision in 40 CFR 123.24(d).

Persons wishing to comment on NPDES applications are invited to submit statements to the contact office noted before the application within 30 days from the date of this public notice. Persons wishing to comment on WQM permit applications are invited to submit statements to the office noted before the application within 15 days from the date of this public notice. Comments received within the respective comment periods will be considered in the final determinations regarding the applications. A comment submittal should include the name, address and telephone number of the writer and a concise statement to inform the Department of the exact basis of a comment and the relevant facts upon which it is based.

The Department will also accept requests for public hearings on applications. A public hearing may be held if the responsible office considers the public response significant. If a hearing is scheduled, a notice of the hearing will be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* and a newspaper of general circulation within the relevant geographical area. The Department will postpone its final determination until after a public hearing is held.

PA0248002, Concentrated Animal Feeding Operation (CAFO), Jobo Holstein Farm, LLC (Jobo Holstein Farm), 200 Tall Oaks Road, Gettysburg, Pennsylvania 17325.

Jobo Holstein Farm, LLC has submitted an application for an Individual NPDES permit for an existing CAFO known as Jobo Holstein Farm, located at 200 Tall Oaks Road in Mount Pleasant Township, **Adams County**.

The CAFO is situated near an UNT Swift Run in Watershed 7-F, which is classified for warm water fishery. The CAFO is designed to maintain an animal population of approximately 1,637.4 animal equivalent units (AEU) consisting of 1,120 cows and 426 calves/heifers. Manure is collected and stored in three inground storage facilities with a total storage capacity of 8.71 million gallons. A release or discharge to waters of the Commonwealth under normal operating conditions is not expected. Normal operating conditions are defined as conditions below a 25-year, 24-hour storm event.

The Department has conducted administrative and technical reviews of the application. Based on the preliminary review and application of lawful standards and regulations, the Department has made a tentative determination to issue an NPDES permit for the operation subject to the terms and conditions and monitoring and reporting requirements specified in the permit.

The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) permit waiver provision under 40 CFR 123.24(e) does not apply to this NPDES permit.

The Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) hereby announces the following grants to counties pursuant to the Pennsylvania Municipal Waste Planning, Recycling and Waste Reduction Act of 1988, Act 101, P. L. 556, Section 901 and Section 208 of the Waste Tire Recycling Act/Small Business and Household Pollution Prevention Act (Act 190 of 1996).

Planning grants are awarded to counties for 80% of approved costs for preparing municipal waste management plans as required by Act 101, for carrying out related studies, surveys, investigations, inquiries, research and analysis, including those related to siting, environmental mediation, education programs on pollution prevention and household hazardous waste and providing technical assistance to small businesses for pollution prevention. Grants may be awarded for feasibility studies and project development for municipal waste processing or disposal facilities, except for facilities for the combustion of municipal waste that are not proposed to be operated for the recovery of energy. Coastal and Estuarine Land Acquisition Conservation Program; Federal Fiscal Year 2012 Grant Solicitation and Publication of the Final Pennsylvania Coastal and Estuarine Land Acquisition Plan

The Coastal Resources Management Program of the Department of Environmental Protection (Department) is soliciting land acquisition grant proposals to submit to the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) through the Coastal and Estuarine Land Conservation Program (CELCP).

This solicitation is for preliminary candidate proposals and is for funding awards under NOAA's Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) 2012 Funding cycle.

CELCP places an emphasis on "ecologically valuable" lands. The geographic areas covered by CELCP are the designated Delaware Estuary Coastal Zone Watershed,

select Chesapeake Bay Watersheds and the Lake Erie Coastal Zone Watershed. The Department will select the three candidate projects from this Commonwealth for submission to NOAA by employing the guidelines issued by the Federal agency. NOAA will develop a ranked list of projects eligible for funding. Once NOAA receives final appropriations from the United States Congress, the agency will make final determinations as to which projects are selected for funding within amounts available. Federal funding awards, based upon the final CELCP funding appropriated, are expected to be made between June 1, 2012, and October 1, 2012.

The Department intends to consider a hospital eligible for this additional class of disproportionate share payments if the hospital meets all of the following criteria, based on the Fiscal Year (FY) 2002-2003 MA Cost Report, unless otherwise specified:

- a) The hospital is enrolled in the MA Program as an acute care general hospital with an excluded psychiatric unit.
- b) The hospital provides MA inpatient days of care in excess of the 85th percentile of MA inpatient days provided by all enrolled acute care general hospitals with an excluded psychiatric unit.
- c) The hospital's number of MA admissions exceeds the 85th percentile of MA admissions of all enrolled acute care general hospitals with an excluded psychiatric unit.
- d) The hospital provides inpatient psychiatric days of care to MA recipients in this Commonwealth in excess of the 90th percentile of the days provided by all enrolled acute care general hospitals with an excluded psychiatric unit.
- e) The hospital's percentage of uncompensated care to net patient revenue exceeds the 90th percentile of this percentage for all enrolled acute care general hospitals with an excluded psychiatric unit according to the Pennsylvania Health Care Cost Containment Council (PHC4) Financial Analysis 2004.
- f) The hospital's operating margin is less than the 15th percentile of the operating margins of all enrolled acute care general hospitals with an excluded psychiatric unit according to the PHC4 Financial Analysis 2004.

The Department intends to proportionately divide payments between qualified hospitals based on the percentage of each qualifying hospital's MA inpatient days to total MA inpatient days of all qualifying hospitals. Article VIII-G of the Public Welfare Code (code)¹ (62 P. S. §§ 801-G—816-G) authorizes the Department to implement the Program for the 3-year period beginning July 1, 2010, and ending June 30, 2013. Under the code, the Department will impose a monetary assessment on all licensed hospitals in this Commonwealth other than certain exempt hospitals.² See Article VIII-G of the code. For State FY 2010-2011, Section 803-G(b)(1) of the code (62 P. S. § 803-G) specifies that the assessment will equal 2.69% of the net inpatient revenue of the covered hospitals.

On October 22, 2010, the General Assembly enacted Act 2010-84 (P. L. _____, No. 84), which, among other things, amended section 803-G of the code to authorize the Secretary of the Department (Secretary) to adjust the assessment percentage for FY 2010-2011. Before adjusting the assessment percentage, the Secretary must publish a notice in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* that specifies

the proposed assessment percentage and identifies the aggregate impact on covered hospitals subject to the assessment and allows interested parties a 30-day period in which to comment. After consideration of any comments received during the 30-day period, the Secretary must publish a second notice announcing the assessment percentage. An adjustment to the assessment percentage must also be approved by the Governor. See section 803-G(c) of the code.

The Department published notice of its proposed adjustment to the assessment percentage and estimated aggregate impact on hospitals subject to the assessment under the Program for FY 2010-2011 at 40 Pa.B 6987 (December 4, 2010). The Department received no public comments during the 30-day comment period.

Assessment Percentage and Estimated Impact on Hospitals

This notice provides the final adjusted assessment percentage for FY 2010-2011 and the estimated fiscal impact of this adjustment on hospitals. For FY 2010-2011, the Department is adjusting the assessment percentage rate under the Statewide Quality Care Assessment Program to 2.95% of net inpatient revenue of the covered hospitals. The Governor approved this adjustment to the assessment percentage.

The Department estimates the annual aggregate assessment fees for the nonexempt hospitals will total \$547.050 million. Subject to conditions specified in section 813-G of the code, (62 P.S. § 813-G), the Department intends to use revenue derived from this assessment, together with the related Federal matching funds, to make updates to the Department's Fee-for-Service inpatient acute care general hospital prospective payment system and changes to the hospital disproportionate share hospital and supplemental payments as specified in the Commonwealth's approved State Plan.
