#### § 29.401a. Consumer Price Index—costs and fines.

Pursuant to Article V, Section 10 of the Pennsylvania Constitution, and 42 Pa.C.S. § 1721, the Supreme Court has authorized the Court Administrator of Pennsylvania to obtain and publish in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* on or before November 30 the percentage increase in the Consumer Price Index for calendar year 2016 as required by Act 96 of 2010, 42 Pa.C.S. §§ 1725.1(f) and 3571(c)(4) (as amended). See No. 488 Judicial Administration Docket.

The Court Administrator of Pennsylvania reports that the percentage increase in the Consumer Price Index, All Urban Consumers, U.S. City Average, for calendar year 2016 was 2.1% percent. (See, U.S. Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics, Series CUUROOOOSAO, January 20, 2017.)

#### § 29.401. Scope.

The Pennsylvania Supreme Court, pursuant to Art. V, § 10 of the Pennsylvania Constitution, and 42 Pa.C.S. § 1721, has authorized by Administrative Order, the Court Administrator of Pennsylvania to promulgate regulations relating to the accounting methods to be utilized in connection with the collection of fees and costs charged and collected by prothonotaries, and clerks of courts of all courts of common pleas, or by any officials designated to perform the functions thereof, as well as by the minor judiciary, including magisterial district judges, and judges and staff of all divisions of the Philadelphia Municipal Court.

Under authority of said Administrative Order and pursuant to the authority vested in the governing authority under 42 Pa.C.S. § 3502(a) of the Judicial Code, the following regulations are adopted to implement Act 96 of 2010, 42 Pa.C.S. §§ 1725.1(f) and 3571(c)(4) (as amended).

#### § 29.402. 42 Pa.C.S. § 1725.1. Costs.

(a) Civil cases.—In calendar year 2018, the costs to be charged by magisterial district judges in every civil case, except as otherwise provided in this section, shall be as follows:

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(1) Actions involving \$500 or less \$53.00	C
(2) Actions involving more than \$500 but not more than \$2,000 \$70.50	0
(3) Actions involving more than \$2,000 but not more than \$4,000 \$88.00	0

Said costs shall not include, however, the cost of postage and registered mail which shall be borne by the plaintiff.
(a.1) <i>Custody cases.</i> —In calendar year 2018, the cost (in addition to the cost provided by general rule) to be charged by the court of common pleas shall be as follows
(1) Custody cases, except as provided in section 1725(c)(2)(v)\$8.00
(b) Criminal cases.—In calendar year 2018, the costs to be charged by the minor judiciary or by the court of common pleas where appropriate in every criminal case except as otherwise provided in this section, shall be as follows:
(1) Summary conviction, except motor vehicle cases\$50.00
(2) Summary conviction, motor vehicle cases, other than paragraph (3) \$39.50
(3) Summary conviction, motor vehicle cases, hearing demanded
(4) Misdemeanor
(5) Felony
Such costs shall not include, however, the cost of postage and registered mail which shall be paid by the defendant upon conviction.
(c) <i>Unclassified costs or charges</i> .—In calendar year 2018, the costs to be charged by the minor judiciary in the following instances not readily classifiable shall be as follows:
(1) Entering transcript of judgment from another member of the minor judiciary\$9.00
(2) Marrying each couple, making record thereof, and certificate to the parties\$44.00
(3) Granting emergency relief pursuant to 23 Pa.C.S. Ch. 61 (relating to protection from abuse). \$18.00
(4) Issuing a search warrant (except as provided in subsection (d))
(5) Any other issuance not otherwise provided in this subsection

#### LAWRENCE COUNTY

Transfer of Existing Cases from Magisterial District Court 53-3-03 to Magisterial District Court 53-3-04 and 53-3-01; No. 90171 of 2017, A.D.

#### **Administrative Order**

And Now, this 6th day of October, 2017, in accordance with Pennsylvania Rule of Judicial Administration No. 65(B)(6), it is hereby Ordered and Decreed that all filings originating in Hickory Township, Plain Grove Township, Scott Township, Shenango Township, Washington Township and South New Castle Boro, the venue of Magisterial District Court (MDC) 53-3-03, shall be transferred to and heard in Magisterial District Court (MDC) 53-3-04. Filings in Slippery Rock Township, also MDC 53-3-03, shall be transferred to and heard in Magisterial District Court (MDC) 53-3-01. Payments may continue to be made at the MDC 53-3-03 office until 10:00 a.m. on November 29, 2017, after which time all payments must be made at the MDC 53-3-04 office, with the exception of cases originating in Slippery Rock Township payments for which must be made at the MDC 53-3-01 office. The MDC 53-3-03 office shall close as of the close of business on November 29, 2017.

The effective date for the previously listed change of venue shall be November 1, 2017.

The Prothonotary shall exit this Order to all Lawrence County Judges; all Lawrence County Magisterial District Court Judges, all Lawrence County Commissioners; James Gagliano; Court Administration; David Gettings, County Controller; the District Attorney of Lawrence County; the Public Defender of Lawrence County; and the Police Departments of each of the previously named municipalities in MDC 53-3-03.

The Lawrence County District Court Administrator is *Ordered* and *Directed* to do the following:

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- 1. File one (1) copy with the Administrative Office of Pennsylvania Courts.
- 2. File two (2) paper copies and one (1) electronic copy in a Microsoft Word format only to bulletin@palrb.us with the Legislative Reference Bureau for publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.
- 3. Publish the Order on the Lawrence County Court website at www.co.lawrence.pa.us, and in the *Lawrence County Law Journal* and the *New Castle News*.
- 4. File one (1) copy of the local rule with the Lawrence County Law Library and the Office of the County Commissioners for public inspection and copying.
