Maximum Lawful Rate of Interest for Residential Mortgages for the Month of September 2019

The Department of Banking and Securities (Department), under the authority contained in section 301 of the act of January 30, 1974 (P.L. 13, No. 6) (41 P.S. § 301), determines that the maximum lawful rate of interest for residential mortgages for the month of September 2019, is 4 3/4%.

The interest rate limitations under the Commonwealth's usury statute were pre-empted to a great extent by Federal law, the Depository Institutions Deregulation and Monetary Control Act of 1980 (Pub.L. No. 96-221). Further pre-emption was instituted with the signing of Pub.L. No. 96-399, which overrode State interest rate limitations on any individual who finances the sale or exchange of residential real property which the individual owns and which the individual occupies or has occupied as his principal residence.

Each month the Department is required by State law to compute and announce the ceiling rate on residential mortgages in this Commonwealth. This maximum rate is determined by adding 2.50 percentage points to the yield rate on long-term government bonds as published by the Federal Reserve Board or the United States Treasury, or both. The latest yield rate on long-term government securities is 2.33 to which was added 2.50 percentage points for a total of 4.83 that by law is rounded off to the nearest quarter at 4 3/4%.

For NPDES renewal applications in Section I, the Department of Environmental Protection (Department) has made a tentative determination to reissue these permits for 5 years subject to effluent limitations and monitoring and reporting requirements in their current permits, with appropriate and necessary updated requirements to reflect new and changed regulations and other requirements.

For applications for new NPDES permits and renewal applications with major changes in Section II, as well as applications for MS4 Individual Permits and Individual Stormwater Construction Permits in Sections IV and VI, the Department, based upon preliminary reviews, has made tentative determinations of proposed effluent limitations and other terms and conditions for the permit applications. In accordance with 25 Pa. Code § 92a.32(d), the proposed discharge of stormwater associated with construction activities will be managed in accordance with the requirements of 25 Pa. Code Chapter 102. These determinations are published as proposed actions for comments prior to taking final actions.

Unless indicated otherwise, the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Region III Administrator has waived the right to review or object to proposed NPDES permit actions under the waiver provision in 40 CFR 123.24(d).

Persons wishing to comment on NPDES applications are invited to submit statements to the contact office noted before the application within 30 days from the date of this public notice. Persons wishing to comment on WQM permit applications are invited to submit statements to the office noted before the application within 15 days from the date of this public notice. Comments received within the respective comment periods will be considered in the final determinations regarding the applications. A comment submittal should include the name, address and telephone number of the writer and a concise statement to inform the Department of the exact basis of a comment and the relevant facts upon which it is based.

The Department will also accept requests for public hearings on applications. A public hearing may be held if the responsible office considers the public response significant. If a hearing is scheduled, a notice of the hearing will be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* and a newspaper of general circulation within the relevant geographical area. The Department will postpone its final determination until after a public hearing is held.

LAND RECYCLING AND ENVIRONMENTAL REMEDIATION

UNDER ACT 2, 1995 PREAMBLE 1

Acknowledgment of Notices of Intent to Remediate Submitted under the Land Recycling and Environmental Remediation Standards Act (35 P.S. §§ 6026.101—6026.907).

Sections 302-305 of the Land Recycling and Environmental Remediation Standards Act (act) (35 P.S. §§ 6026.302—6026.305) require the Department to publish in the Pennsylvania Bulletin an acknowledgment noting receipt of Notices of Intent to Remediate. An acknowledgment of the receipt of a Notice of Intent to Remediate is used to identify a site where a person proposes to, or has been required to, respond to a release of a regulated substance at a site. A person intending to use the background standard, Statewide health standard, the site-specific standard or intend to remediate a site as a special industrial area shall file a Notice of Intent to Remediate with the Department. A Notice of Intent to Remediate filed with the Department provides a brief description of the location of the site, a list of known or suspected contaminants at the site, the proposed remediation measures for the site and a description of the intended future use of the site. A person who demonstrates attainment of one or a combination of cleanup standards or receives approval of a special industrial area remediation identified under the act will be relieved of further liability for the remediation of the site for contamination identified in reports submitted to and approved by the Department. Furthermore, the person shall not be subject to citizen suits or other contribution actions brought by responsible persons not participating in the remediation.

Under sections 304(n)(1)(ii) and 305(c)(2) of the act, there is a 30-day public and municipal comment period for sites proposed for remediation using a site-specific standard, in whole or in part, and for sites remediated as a special industrial area. This period begins when a summary of the Notice of Intent to Remediate is published in a newspaper of general circulation in the area of the site. For the following site, proposed for remediation to a site-specific standard or as a special industrial area, the municipality, within which the site is located, may request to be involved in the development of the remediation and reuse plans for the site if the request is made within 30 days of the date specified as follows. During this comment period, the municipality may request that the person identified as the remediator of the site develop and implement a public involvement plan. Requests to be involved and comments should be directed to the remediator of the site.

MINING ACTIVITY NPDES DRAFT PERMITS

This notice provides information about applications for a new, amended or renewed NPDES permits associated with mining activity (coal or noncoal) permits. The applications concern industrial waste (mining) discharges to surface water and discharges of stormwater associated with mining activities. This notice is provided in accordance with 25 Pa. Code Chapters 91 and 92a and 40 CFR Part 122, implementing provisions of The Clean Streams Law (35 P.S. §§ 691.1—691.1001) and the Federal Clean Water Act (33 U.S.C.A. §§ 1251—1376).

The Department of Environmental Protection (Department) has prepared a draft NPDES permit and made a tentative determination to issue the NPDES permit in conjunction with the associated mining activity permit.

Effluent Limits for Coal Mining Activities

For coal mining activities, NPDES permits, when issued, will contain effluent limits that are the more stringent of technology-based (BAT) effluent limitations or Water Quality Based Effluent Limits (WQBEL).

A settleable solids instantaneous maximum limit of 0.5 ml/l applies to: surface runoff (resulting from a precipitation event of less than or equal to a 10-year 24-hour event) from active mining areas; active areas disturbed by coal refuse disposal activities; mined areas backfilled and revegetated; and all other discharges and drainage (resulting from a precipitation event of greater than 1-year 24-hour to less than or equal to a 10-year 24-hour event) from coal refuse disposal piles. Similarly, modified BAT limits apply to iron, manganese and suspended solids in surface runoff, discharges and drainage resulting from these precipitation events and those of greater magnitude in accordance with 25 Pa. Code §§ 87.102, 88.92, 88.187, 88.292, 89.52 and 90.102.

Exceptions to BAT effluent limits may be applicable in accordance with 25 Pa. Code §§ 87.102, 88.92, 88.187, 88.292, 89.52 and 90.102.

Effluent Limits for Noncoal Mining Activities

The limits for noncoal mining activities as provided in 25 Pa. Code Chapter 77 are pH 6 to 9 and other parameters the Department may require.

Discharges from noncoal mines located in some geologic settings (for example, in the coal fields) may require additional water quality based effluent limits. If additional effluent limits are needed for an NPDES permit associated with a noncoal mining permit, then the permit description specifies the parameters.

In addition to BAT or WQBEL limits, coal and noncoal NPDES permits establish effluent limitations in the form of implemented Best Management Practices (BMPs) identified in the associated Erosion and Sedimentation Plan, the Reclamation Plan and the NPDES permit application. These BMPs restrict the rates and quantities of associated pollutants from being discharged into surface waters in this Commonwealth.

More restrictive effluent limitations, restrictions on discharge volume or restrictions on the extent of mining that may occur are incorporated into an NPDES permit when necessary for compliance with water quality standards and antidegradation requirements (in accordance with 25 Pa. Code Chapters 91—96).

The procedures for determining the final effluent limits, using a mass-balance equation or model, are found in Technical Guidance Document 563-2112-115, Developing National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Permits for Mining Activities. Other specific factors to be considered include public comments and Total Maximum Daily Load(s). Additional discharge limitations may apply in the event that unexpected discharges occur.

Discharge rates for surface mining activities are precipitation driven. Discharge rates for proposed discharges associated with underground mining are noted in the permit description.

Persons wishing to comment on an NPDES draft permit should submit a written statement to the Department at the address of the district mining office indicated before each draft permit within 30 days of this public notice. Comments

Code § 96.8 (relating to use of offsets and tradable credits from pollution reduction activities in the Chesapeake Bay Watershed) that were set to expire on September 30, 2019. Proposed pollutant reduction activities include the following agriculture best management practices (BMP): continuous no-till planting methods (CNT), planting cover crops, conservation tillage, grass buffers, riparian forest buffers, off-stream watering with and without fencing, precision grazing and horse pasture management. These certification administrative extension approvals authorize the generation of N or P credits, or both, for use by facilities with National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System permits in the compliance year in which the credits are generated. Public Notice of Draft NPDES General Permit for Stormwater Discharges Associated with Construction Activities (PAG-02)

The Department of Environmental Protection (Department) is announcing the availability of a draft National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) General Permit for Stormwater Discharges Associated with Construction Activities (PAG-02) for reissuance. To access the draft PAG-02 and related documents, visit the Department's eLibrary at www.depgreenport.state.pa.us/elibrary/ (select "Permit and Authorization Packages," then "Clean Water," then "PAG-02 NPDES General Permit (Draft)").

The PAG-02 General Permit is intended to provide NPDES permit coverage to persons discharging stormwater associated with construction activities to surface waters of this Commonwealth in satisfaction of State NPDES permit requirements (25 Pa. Code §§ 92a.1(b) and 102.5(a) (relating to purpose and scope; and permit requirements)) and Federal NPDES permit requirements (40 CFR 122.26(b)(14)(x) and (b)(15) (relating to storm water discharges (applicable to State NPDES programs, see § 123.25)). This draft PAG-02 General Permit would apply to eligible projects proposing an earth disturbance activity that involves 1 acre or more of earth disturbance, or an earth disturbance on any portion, part, or during any stage of a larger common plan of development or sale that involves 1 acre or more of earth disturbance. If a project requires NPDES permit coverage but is ineligible for PAG-02 coverage, an applicant may apply for an individual NPDES permit.

Notices of Intent (NOI) to use this draft PAG-02 General Permit for NPDES permit coverage would be submitted to county conservation districts (CCD) that are delegated by the Department to complete reviews of NPDES permit applications under 25 Pa. Code Chapter 102 (relating to erosion and sediment control), or in the absence of a delegated CCD, a regional office of the Department. An eligible applicant may not commence a discharge under the General Permit until the following conditions have been met:

- 1. The applicant has submitted a complete NOI package (3800-PM-BCW0405b and required attachments) in accordance with the requirements of the General Permit and the NOI instructions.
- 2. The applicant has received written approval of coverage under PAG-02, signed by the appropriate Department/CCD manager or supervisor.
- 3. All other permits and approvals relating to the earth disturbance activities reported in the NOI, including but not limited to sewage planning approval required by the Pennsylvania Sewage Facilities Act (35 P.S. §§ 750.1—750.20a), if applicable, have been obtained.
- 4. A pre-construction meeting has been held unless waived in writing by the Department/CCD.

The following bullet points summarize the proposed changes for the reissuance of this draft PAG-02 General Permit in comparison to the PAG-02 General Permit currently in effect, which expires on December 7, 2019:

- Expiration date of coverage—Coverage under this draft PAG-02 would expire on the date the master General Permit expires, which is currently planned for December 7, 2024.
- New requirements are proposed to ensure onsite personnel are properly trained and are aware of responsibilities under the General Permit.
- The proposed draft General Permit would include changes to non-compliance reporting to align with the reporting requirements of 25 Pa. Code §§ 91.33 and 92a.41(b) (relating to incidents causing or threatening pollution; and conditions applicable to all permits).
- This draft General Permit would clarify the appropriate form that must be used for documenting visual site inspections (or equivalent) and the measurable rainfall that triggers a post-storm inspection (that is, 0.25 inches).
- New forms would be available for notifying municipalities and counties of construction projects to satisfy Acts 14, 67, 68 and 127.
- Prohibitions concerning discharge to impaired waters, with and without a Total Maximum Daily Load, would be revised to clarify the causes of impairment triggering additional measures, and to specify that the additional measures include non-discharge alternatives or

antidegradation best available combination of technologies best management practices.

• For the proposed General Permit, the Department is seeking to improve the efficiency and consistency of Department/CCD completeness and technical reviews by requiring the use of templates for the narrative components of Erosion and Sediment (E&S) and Post-Construction Stormwater Management (PCSM) Plans (that is, E&S Module 1 and PCSM Module 2).

Additional information on the proposed terms and conditions of this draft PAG-02 General Permit can be found in the draft PAG-02 General Permit Fact Sheet and other supporting documents available in the Department's eLibrary.

Applicants must submit a \$500 administrative filing fee and the NOI package to the delegated CCD, along with any additional fees the CCD requires. Applicants must also submit a fee in the amount of \$100 for each disturbed acre to the Department. If a project is located in a county without a delegated CCD, both the disturbed acre fee and the administrative filing fee must be submitted to the Department.

The Department is also announcing the availability of a draft Department PCSM Spreadsheet that may be used to facilitate calculations for PCSM Plans. The PCSM Spreadsheet may be accessed by visiting the Department's Construction Stormwater web site at www.dep. pa.gov/constructionstormwater (select "E&S Resources"). Renewal of the Office of Long-Term Living's Home and Community-Based Community Health-Choices Waiver

The Department of Human Services (Department) is making available for public review and comment the Office of Long-Term Living's (OLTL) proposed Community HealthChoices (CHC) waiver renewal. The Department proposes to renew the CHC waiver with an effective date of January 1, 2020, to align the waiver with the calendar year. In addition, the Department proposes the following substantive and technical changes to the CHC waiver:

- Revise the Residential Habilitation service definition by modifying the number of hours that are defined as a day unit from a minimum of 12 hours to a minimum of 8 hours.
- To the service definitions of Job Finding, Job Coaching, Employment Skills Development, Career Assessment and Benefits Counseling, add language that Office of Vocational Rehabilitation (OVR) services are considered to not be available if OVR has not made an eligibility determination within 120 days; and add language to address when employment services through the CHC waiver can be provided should OVR close the order of selection, thereby creating a waiting list for OVR services.
- Modify the qualifications for Service Coordinators and Service Coordinator supervisors.
- Clarify that, if a CHC Managed Care Organization (MCO) identifies that a participant has not been receiving services for 5 or more days, and if the suspension of services was not pre-planned, then the CHC-MCO must communicate with the participant to determine the reason for the service suspension within 24 hours. If the participant's health status or needs have changed, then the CHC-MCO must conduct a comprehensive needs reassessment of the participant's needs within 14 days of identifying the issue.
- Add that an emergency back-up plan must be included in the Person-Centered Service Plan.
- Remove and modify language to reflect that the CHC waiver will be fully operational Statewide as of January 1, 2020.
- Update language to reflect that the Department utilizes IDEMIA as the data system to process fingerprint-based Federal Bureau of Investigation criminal record checks.

- Update the OLTL bureau names and responsibilities.
- Other minor editorial language changes.

Background

To continue receiving Federal matching funds for Home and Community-Based Services (HCBS) waiver services, the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) requires that existing HCBS waivers be renewed every 5 years. See 42 CFR 430.25(h)(2)(i) (relating to waivers of State plan requirements). The proposed CHC waiver renewal is to be submitted to CMS by no later than October 2, 2019.

- (d) Holders of tickets where the player completely matches eight entire words in "GRID 1," in which the winning combination contains a Rocket symbol, using only the letters found in the "YOUR LETTERS" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$2,000.
- (e) Holders of tickets where the player completely matches eight entire words in "GRID 1," using only the letters found in the "YOUR LETTERS" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1,000.
- (f) Holders of tickets where the player completely matches seven entire words in "GRID 1," in which the winning combination contains a Rocket symbol, using only the letters found in the "YOUR LETTERS" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$600.
- (g) Holders of tickets where the player completely matches seven entire words in "GRID 1," using only the letters found in the "YOUR LETTERS" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$300.
- (h) Holders of tickets where the player completely matches six entire words in "GRID 1," in which the winning combination contains a Rocket symbol, using only the letters found in the "YOUR LETTERS" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$200.
- (i) Holders of tickets where the player completely matches five entire words in "GRID 2," using only the letters found in the "YOUR LETTERS" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$150.
- (j) Holders of tickets where the player completely matches six entire words in "GRID 1," using only the letters found in the "YOUR LETTERS" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.
- (k) Holders of tickets where the player completely matches five entire words in "GRID 1," in which the winning combination contains a Rocket symbol, using only the letters found in the "YOUR LETTERS" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.
- (l) Holders of tickets where the player completely matches four entire words in "GRID 1," in which the winning combination contains a Rocket symbol, using only the letters found in the "YOUR LETTERS" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$60.
- (m) Holders of tickets where the player completely matches five entire words in "GRID 1," using only the letters found in the "YOUR LETTERS" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$50.
- (n) Holders of tickets where the player completely matches four entire words in "GRID 2," using only the

- letters found in the "YOUR LETTERS" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$50.
- (o) Holders of tickets where the player completely matches four entire words in "GRID 1," using only the letters found in the "YOUR LETTERS" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$30.
- (p) Holders of tickets where the player completely matches three entire words in "GRID 1," in which the winning combination contains a Rocket symbol, using only the letters found in the "YOUR LETTERS" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$20.
- (q) Holders of tickets where the player completely matches three entire words in "GRID 2," using only the letters found in the "YOUR LETTERS" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$15.
- (r) Holders of tickets where the player completely matches three entire words in "GRID 1," using only the letters found in the "YOUR LETTERS" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$10.
- (s) Holders of tickets where a \$10 Bill (WIN10) symbol appears in the "QUICK \$10" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$10.
- (t) Holders of tickets where the player completely matches two entire words in "GRID 1," in which the winning combination contains a Rocket symbol, using only the letters found in the "YOUR LETTERS" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$6.
- (u) Holders of tickets where the player completely matches two entire words in "GRID 2," using only the letters found in the "YOUR LETTERS" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$5.
- (v) Holders of tickets where the player completely matches two entire words in "GRID 1," using only the letters found in the "YOUR LETTERS" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$3.
- 7. Game play instructions for the Rocket Crossword game are:

A bonus will not be awarded to a Lottery retailer that sells a nonwinning Pennsylvania Lottery instant ticket used to enter a Pennsylvania Lottery second-chance drawing or promotion that is subsequently selected to win a prize.
- 11. Unclaimed prize money: For a period of 1 year from the announced close of Rocket Crossword, prize money from winning Rocket Crossword instant lottery game tickets will be retained by the Secretary for payment to the persons entitled thereto. If no claim is made within 1 year of the announced close of the Rocket Crossword instant lottery game, the right of a ticket holder to claim the prize represented by the ticket, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided for by statute.
- 12. Governing law: In purchasing a ticket, the customer agrees to comply with and abide by the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314), 61 Pa. Code Part V (relating to State Lotteries) and the provisions contained in this notice.
- 13. Termination of the game: The Secretary may announce a termination date, after which no further tickets from this game may be sold. The announcement will be

Classification of Wild Trout Streams; Proposed Additions; October 2019

Under 58 Pa. Code § 57.11 (relating to listing of wild trout streams), it is the policy of the Fish and Boat Commission (Commission) to accurately identify and classify stream sections supporting naturally reproducing populations of trout as wild trout streams. The Commission's Fisheries Management Division maintains the list of wild trout streams. The Executive Director, with the approval of the Commission, will from time-to-time publish the list of wild trout streams in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. The listing of a stream section as a wild trout stream is a biological designation that does not determine how it is managed. The Commission relies upon many factors in determining the appropriate management of streams.

At the next Commission meeting on October 21 and 22, 2019, the Commission will consider changes to its list of wild trout streams. Specifically, the Commission will consider the addition of the following streams or portions of streams to the list:

Proposed Changes to List of Class A Wild Trout Waters; October 2019

The Fish and Boat Commission (Commission) is considering changes to its list of Class A Wild Trout Streams. Under 58 Pa. Code § 57.8a (relating to Class A wild trout streams), it is the Commission's policy to manage self-sustaining Class A wild trout populations as a renewable natural resource to conserve that resource and the angling it provides. Class A wild trout populations represent the best of this Commonwealth's naturally reproducing trout fisheries. With rare exceptions, the Commission manages these stream sections solely for the perpetuation of the wild trout fishery with no stocking.

Criteria developed for Class A Wild Trout fisheries are species specific. Wild Trout Biomass Class Criteria include provisions for:

- (i) Wild Brook Trout Fisheries
- (A) Total brook trout biomass of at least 30 kg/ha (26.7 lbs/acre).
- (B) Total biomass of brook trout less than 15 cm (5.9 inches) in total length of at least 0.1~kg/ha (0.089 lbs/acre).
- (C) Brook trout biomass must comprise at least 75% of the total trout biomass.
 - (ii) Wild Brown Trout Fisheries
- (A) Total brown trout biomass of at least 40 kg/ha (35.6 lbs/acre).
- (B) Total biomass of brown trout less than 15 cm (5.9 inches) in total length of at least 0.1 kg/ha (0.089 lbs/acre).
- (C) Brown trout biomass must comprise at least 75% of the total trout biomass.
 - (iii) Mixed Wild Brook and Brown Trout Fisheries
- (A) Combined brook and brown trout biomass of at least 40 kg/ha (35.6 lbs/acre).
- (B) Total biomass of brook trout less than 15 cm (5.9 inches) in total length of at least 0.1 kg/ha (0.089 lbs/acre).

- (C) Total biomass of brown trout less than 15 cm (5.9 inches) in total length of at least 0.1 kg/ha (0.089 lbs/acre).
- (D) Brook trout biomass must comprise less than 75% of the total trout biomass.
- (E) Brown trout biomass must comprise less than 75% of the total trout biomass.
 - (iv) Wild Rainbow Trout Fisheries

Total biomass of rainbow trout less than 15 cm (5.9 inches) in total length of at least 2.0 kg/ha (1.78 lbs/acre).

- (v) Mixed Wild Brook and Rainbow Trout Fisheries
- (A) Combined brook and rainbow trout biomass of at least 40 kg/ha (35.6 lbs/acre).
- (B) Total biomass of brook trout less than 15 cm (5.9 inches) in total length of at least 0.1 kg/ha (0.089 lbs/acre).
- (C) Total biomass of rainbow trout less than 15 cm (5.9 inches) in total length of at least 0.1 kg/ha (0.089 lbs/acre)
- (D) Brook trout biomass shall comprise less than 75% of the total trout biomass.
- (E) Rainbow trout biomass shall comprise less than 75% of the total trout biomass.
- (vi) Mixed Wild Brown and Rainbow Trout Fisheries
- (A) Combined brown and rainbow trout biomass of at least 40 kg/ha (35.6 lbs/acre).
- (B) Total biomass of brown trout less than 15 cm (5.9 inches) in total length of at least 0.1 kg/ha (0.089 lbs/acre).
- (C) Total biomass of rainbow trout less than 15 cm (5.9 inches) in total length of at least 0.1 kg/ha (0.089 lbs/acre).
- $\left(D\right)$ Brown trout biomass shall comprise less than 75% of the total trout biomass.
- (E) Rainbow trout biomass shall comprise less than 75% of the total trout biomass.

Universal Service Reporting Requirements; Doc. No. M-2019-3011814

This Secretarial Letter establishes a docket to review universal service reporting (USR) requirements. A working group of stakeholders and Commission staff has been established as part of this process. In particular, this Secretarial Letter releases the existing USR data dictionary and a new document posing possible changes to the data dictionary, along with the PowerPoint presentation regarding the proposed changes to the data dictionary that were shared at the July 30, 2019 Stakeholder Working Group meeting. Additionally, this Secretarial Letter establishes a timeline for submission of comments and reply comments.

Background

On January 17, 2019, the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (Commission) entered an Order at Docket No. M-2017-2587711, releasing a staff report titled Home Energy Affordability for Low-Income Customers in Pennsylvania (Report). The Report found, inter alia, that inconsistencies and limitations in reported data impacted the analysis and evaluation of Customer Assistance Programs (CAPs) and other universal service programs.

Additionally, the January 2019 Order directed staff in the Bureau of Consumer Services (BCS) and the Law Bureau to convene, no later than July 31, 2019, a universal service reporting working group (USRWG) to standardize USR protocols for data definitions, tracking, and reporting. In accordance with the January 2019 Order, the USRWG is to conclude its work no later than December 31, 2019, and BCS is to provide a consensus/ non-consensus report to the Commission prior to January 31, 2020. January 2019 Order at 23.

The initial USRWG meeting was held on July 30, 2019, in Hearing Room 1 of the Keystone Building, Harrisburg. At the meeting, BCS reviewed potential updates to the

USR requirements and the USR data dictionary. Stakeholders may file comments and reply comments at Docket No. M-2019-3011814 to address the current USR data dictionary and the potential changes. Comments and reply comments are to relate to USR data and the USR data dictionary and to follow the numerical order of the existing USR data numbering convention in the existing USR data dictionary and the potential changes articulated in the new document. Parties may suggest deletions and additions to the USR data to be collected.

This letter will be published in the Pennsylvania Bulletin. Interested parties are directed to this docket on the Commission website to access the USR data dictionary, the document posing possible changes to the USR directory, and the PowerPoint discussed in this Secretarial Letter.

Interested parties may submit written comments by August 30, 2019. Written reply comments may be submitted by September 13, 2019. Comments and reply comments may be e-filed or filed in hard copy.² The staff contacts for this matter are Eric Tuttle, etuttle@pa.gov, and Louise Fink Smith, Law Bureau, finksmith@pa.gov. Word copies of filings are to be provided to these staff contacts.

The Commission intends to schedule a second USRWG meeting, via Secretarial Letter at this docket, following the initial comment and reply comment period.

Jelin was issued and entered on August 1, 2019, with the Philadelphia Parking Authority's (Authority) Taxicab and Limousine Division's (TLD) Office of the Clerk.

On April 16, 2018, the Enforcement Department of the Taxicab and Limousine Division (TLD) of the Philadelphia Parking Authority (PPA) issued Citation T-24195 to G & V Cab Corp., (Respondent) for violation of 52 Pa. Code § 1011.4, failure to pay assessment.

The complaint was served on Respondent on April 16, 2018, by first class mail.

The existing USR data dictionary was established for electric distribution companies (EDCs) pursuant to 52 Pa. Code § 54.71 (1998). It was amended to add provisions for natural gas distribution companies (NGDCs) pursuant to 52 Pa. Code § 62.1 (2000). In addition to the inconsistencies in the ways that utilities within the same industry interpret the reporting requirements, there are inconsistencies between the requirements for EDCs and NGDs. Further, as detailed in the Report, there are voids in the reporting requirements.

Respondent did not pay the penalty amount identified on the citation or file a request for a hearing with the TLD Clerk within 15 days after the date of service as provided in 52 Pa. Code § 1005.13(b).

On June 7, 2018, the TLD Clerks' office sent Respondent a reminder notice of the outstanding citation; to either pay the penalty, request a hearing, or suffer a default.

To date, more than 15 days have expired and Respondent has failed to pay the penalty or file a request for a hearing with the TLD Clerk. Therefore, pursuant to 52 Pa. Code § 1005.31(c), the complaint is sustained and a Default Order is entered against Respondent.

A penalty of \$500 is imposed along with an administration fee of \$75 for a total of \$575.

In addition, Respondent's CPC No. 1000376-01 is hereby CANCELLED with respect to medallion P-0819. Respondent is Ordered to pay \$575 by August 16, 2019.

Pursuant to 52 Pa. Code § 1001.13(b) this Order will become effective on August 16, 2019 as an adjudication of the Authority if not selected for review by the Authority.
