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# READER'S GUIDE TO THE PENNSYLVANIA BULLETIN AND THE PENNSYLVANIA CODE

#### Pennsylvania Bulletin

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the official gazette of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. It is published weekly. A cumulative subject matter index is published quarterly.

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* serves several purposes. It is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, which is the official codification of agency rules and regulations, Statewide court rules, and other statutorily authorized documents. Changes in the codified text, whether by adoption, amendment, rescission, repeal or emergency action, must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

The following documents are published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*: Governor's Executive Orders; Summaries of Enacted Statutes; Statewide and Local Court Rules; Attorney General Opinions; Motor Carrier Applications before the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission; Applications and Actions before the Department of Environmental Protection; Orders of the Independent Regulatory Review Commission; and other documents authorized by law.

The text of certain documents published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the only valid and enforceable text. Courts are required to take judicial notice of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

## Adoption, Amendment or Repeal of Regulations

Generally an agency wishing to adopt, amend or rescind regulations must first publish in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* a Proposed Rulemaking. There are limited instances when the agency may omit the proposal step; it still must publish the adopted version.

The Proposed Rulemaking contains the full text of the change, the agency contact person, a fiscal note required by law and background for the action.

The agency then allows sufficient time for public comment before taking final action. A Final Rule-making must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* before the changes can take effect. If the agency wishes to adopt changes to the Proposed Rulemaking to enlarge the scope, it must repropose.

#### Citation to the Pennsylvania Bulletin

Cite material in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* by volume number, a page number and date. Example: Volume 1, *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, page 801, January 9, 1971 (short form: 1 Pa.B. 801 (January 9, 1971)).

#### Pennsylvania Code

The *Pennsylvania Code* is the official codification of rules and regulations issued by Commonwealth agencies, Statewide court rules and other statutorily authorized documents. The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, printing changes when they are adopted. These changes are then permanently codified by the *Pennsylvania Code Reporter*, a monthly, loose-leaf supplement.

The *Pennsylvania Code* is cited by title number and section number. Example: Title 10 *Pennsylvania Code* § 1.1 (short form: 10 Pa. Code § 1.1).

Under the *Pennsylvania Code* codification system, each regulation is assigned a unique number by title and section. Titles roughly parallel the organization of Commonwealth government.

#### **How to Find Rules and Regulations**

Search for your area of interest in the *Pennsylva*nia Code. The *Pennsylvania Code* is available at www.pacodeandbulletin.gov.

Source Notes give the history of regulations. To see if there have been recent changes not yet codified, check the List of *Pennsylvania Code* Chapters Affected in the most recent issue of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

A chronological table of the history of *Pennsylva-nia Code* sections may be found at www.legis.state.pa.us/cfdocs/legis/CH/Public/pcde\_index.cfm.

A quarterly List of *Pennsylvania Code* Sections Affected lists the regulations in numerical order, followed by the citation to the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* in which the change occurred.

In Proposed Rulemakings and proposed Statements of Policy, existing text corresponds to the official codified text in the *Pennsylvania Code*.

Court Rules in Titles 201—246 of the Pennsylvania Code

Added text in proposed and adopted court rules is printed in <u>underscored bold face</u>. Deleted text in proposed and adopted court rules is enclosed in brackets [ ] and printed in **bold face**.

Proposed new chapters and rules are printed in regular type to enhance readability.

Ellipses, a series of five asterisks, indicate text that is not amended.

#### **Fiscal Notes**

Section 612 of The Administrative Code of 1929 (71 P.S. § 232) requires the Governor's Budget Office to prepare a fiscal note for regulatory actions and administrative procedures of the administrative departments, boards, commissions and authorities receiving money from the State Treasury. The fiscal note states whether the action or procedure causes a loss of revenue or an increase in the cost of programs for the Commonwealth or its political subdivisions. The fiscal note is required to be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* at the same time as the change is advertised.

A fiscal note provides the following information: (1) the designation of the fund out of which the appropriation providing for expenditures under the action or procedure shall be made; (2) the probable cost for the fiscal year the program is implemented; (3) projected cost estimate of the program for each of the 5 succeeding fiscal years; (4) fiscal history of the program for which expenditures are to be made; (5) probable loss of revenue for the fiscal year of its implementation; (6) projected loss of revenue from the program for each of the 5 succeeding fiscal years; (7) line item, if any, of the General Appropriation Act or other appropriation act out of which expenditures or losses of Commonwealth funds shall occur as a result of the action or procedures; and (8) recommendation, if any, of the Secretary of the Budget and the reasons therefor.

The omission of an item indicates that the agency text of the fiscal note states that there is no information available with respect thereto. In items (3) and (6) information is set forth for the first through fifth fiscal years, following the year the program is implemented, which is stated. In item (4) information is set forth for the current and two immediately preceding years. In item (8) the recommendation, if any, made by the Secretary of the Budget is published with the fiscal note. "No fiscal impact" means no additional cost or revenue loss to the Commonwealth or its local political subdivision is intended. See 4 Pa. Code Chapter 7, Subchapter R (relating to fiscal notes).

#### Amendment to Proclamation of Disaster Emergency

November 12, 2020

Whereas, on January 10, 2018, I declared a disaster emergency due to the opioid crisis that is ravaging the country, including the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and its citizens;

Whereas, my Proclamation of Disaster Emergency dated January 10, 2018, was renewed by Amendment to Proclamation of Disaster Emergency (1st Amendment) on April 4, 2018, for an additional ninety days. The April 4, 2018, 1st Amendment would have automatically expired by operation of law on July 3, 2018, unless further extended by my official renewal;

Whereas, I renewed the Proclamation of Disaster Emergency for an additional ninety days by official action on June 28, 2018. The June 28, 2018, Amendment to Proclamation of Disaster Emergency (2nd Amendment) was set to expire by operation of law on September 26, 2018, unless further extended by my official renewal;

Whereas, I renewed the Proclamation of Disaster Emergency for an additional ninety days by official action on September 24, 2018. The September 24, 2018, Amendment to Proclamation of Disaster Emergency (3rd Amendment) was set to expire by operation of law on December 23, 2018, unless further extended by my official renewal;

Whereas, I renewed the Proclamation of Disaster Emergency for an additional ninety days by official action on December 21, 2018. The December 21, 2018, Amendment to Proclamation of Disaster Emergency (4th Amendment) was set to expire by operation of law on March 21, 2019, unless further extended by my official renewal;

Whereas, I renewed the Proclamation of Disaster Emergency for an additional ninety days by official action on March 20, 2019. The March 20, 2019, Amendment to Proclamation of Disaster Emergency (5th Amendment) was set to expire by operation of law on June 18, 2019, unless further extended by my official renewal;

Whereas, I renewed the Proclamation of Disaster Emergency for an additional ninety days by official action on June 14, 2019. The June 14, 2019, Amendment to Proclamation of Disaster Emergency (6th Amendment) was set to expire by operation of law on September 12, 2019, unless further extended by my official renewal;

Whereas, I renewed the Proclamation of Disaster Emergency for an additional ninety days by official action on September 5, 2019. The September 5, 2019, Amendment to Proclamation of Disaster Emergency (7th Amendment) was set to expire by operation of law on December 4, 2019, unless further extended by my official renewal;

Whereas, I renewed the Proclamation of Disaster Emergency for an additional ninety days by official action on December 3, 2019. The December 3, 2019, Amendment to Proclamation of Disaster Emergency (8th Amendment) was set to expire by operation of law on March 2, 2020, unless further extended by my official renewal;

Whereas, I renewed the Proclamation of Disaster Emergency for an additional ninety days by official action on February 25, 2020. The February 25, 2020, Amendment to Proclamation of Disaster Emergency (9th Amendment) was set to expire by operation of law on May 25, 2020, unless further extended by my official renewal;

Whereas, I renewed the Proclamation of Disaster Emergency for an additional ninety days by official action on May 22, 2020. The May 22, 2020,

Amendment to Proclamation of Disaster Emergency (10th Amendment) was set to expire by operation of law on August 20, 2020, unless further extended by my official renewal;

Whereas, I renewed the Proclamation of Disaster Emergency for an additional ninety days by official action on August 18, 2020. The August 18, 2020, Amendment to Proclamation of Disaster Emergency (11th Amendment) is set to expire by operation of law on November 16, 2020, unless further extended by my official renewal;

Whereas, the opioid crisis continues to be of such magnitude or severity that emergency action is necessary to protect the health, safety and welfare of affected citizens in Pennsylvania;

Whereas, the opioid crisis continues to be a public health emergency in Pennsylvania contributing to addiction, overdose emergencies and deaths; and

Whereas, investigations by the Opioid Unified Coordination Group indicate that additional resources of the Commonwealth may be needed to mitigate and contend with the magnitude and severity of this continuing and expanding disaster emergency.

Now Therefore, pursuant to the provisions of section 7301(c) of the Emergency Management Services Code, 35 Pa.C.S. § 7301(c), I do hereby order and direct as follows:

- 1. The Proclamation of Disaster Emergency of January 10, 2018, renewed by Amendments to Proclamation of Disaster Emergency dated April 4, 2018, June 28, 2018, September 24, 2018, December 21, 2018, March 20, 2019, June 14, 2019, September 5, 2019, December 3, 2019, February 25, 2020, May 22, 2020, and August 18, 2020, is renewed for an additional period of ninety days, and shall continue to apply to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.
- 2. All directives, authorized actions and provisions of the January 10, 2018, Proclamation of Disaster Emergency, and the April 4, 2018, June 28, 2018, September 24, 2018, December 21, 2018, March 20, 2019, June 14, 2019, September 5, 2019, December 3, 2019, February 25, 2020, May 22, 2020, and August 18, 2020, Amendments to Proclamation of Disaster Emergency shall remain in full force and effect until either rescinded by me or terminated by operation of law ninety days following the effective date of this Proclamation Amendment.
- 3. This Proclamation Amendment (12th Amendment) shall take effect immediately.

## Cost-of-Living Factor under the Public Official Compensation Law

Under section 4(d)(2) and (d.1)(2) of the Public Official Compensation Law (act) (65 P.S. § 366.4(d)(2) and (d.1)(2)), the salaries of members and the officers and leaders of the General Assembly for the year December 1, 2020, through November 30, 2021, may not be increased by an annual cost-of-living adjustment, as provided for under section 4(d)(1) and (d.1)(1) of the act.

Therefore, the salary for members of the General Assembly for the period beginning December 1, 2020, through November 30, 2021, will continue to be \$90,335.42 and for officers and leaders the following total compensation will continue to apply.

## **RULES AND REGULATIONS**

#### **Title 58—RECREATION**

## PENNSYLVANIA GAMING CONTROL BOARD [58 PA. CODE CH. 689]

## Dreamcatcher; Table Game Rules of Play; Temporary Regulations

The Pennsylvania Gaming Control Board (Board), under the general authority in 4 Pa.C.S. § 1202(b)(30) (relating to general and specific powers) and the specific authority in 4 Pa.C.S. §§ 13A02(1) and (2) and 13A03 (relating to regulatory authority; and temporary table game regulations), adopts the temporary regulations in Chapter 689 (relating to Dreamcatcher—Temporary Regulations) to read as set forth in Annex A. The Board's temporary regulations will be added to Part VII (relating to Gaming Control Board) as part of Subpart K (relating to table games).

#### Purpose of this Temporary Rulemaking

This temporary rulemaking will add a new table game to the compliment of games available for play in this Commonwealth.

#### Explanation

Chapter 689 contains the rules governing the play of Dreamcatcher, a wheel-based game where players place a wager on what number the wheel will stop on upon completion of the spin by the dealer. The provisions in this chapter address the physical characteristics of the wheel and the layout of the game, the procedures for the spin and any bonus rounds triggered, and the payout tables for the wagers.

In Dreamcatcher, the optimal theoretical return-to-player percentage is 96.58%.

#### Fiscal Impact

Commonwealth. The Board does not expect that this temporary rulemaking will have a fiscal impact on the Board or other Commonwealth agencies. Updates to Rules Submission forms and internal control procedures will be reviewed by existing Board staff.

Political subdivisions. This temporary rulemaking will not have fiscal impact on political subdivisions of this Commonwealth.

Private sector. This temporary rulemaking will provide certificate holders with an additional table game option. If a certificate holder decides to offer Dreamcatcher within the licensed facility, the certificate holder will be required to train their dealers on the rules of play and purchase new equipment—specifically table layouts corresponding to the game and wagers offered. Costs incurred to train employees or purchase/lease equipment should be offset by the proceeds of gaming.

General public. This temporary rulemaking will not have fiscal impact on the general public.

#### Paperwork Requirements

If a certificate holder seeks to offer Dreamcatcher, the certificate holder will be required to submit a Rules Submission form reflecting the choices in how the game will be offered. These forms are available on the Board's public web site and submitted to Board staff electronically.

Effective Date

This temporary rulemaking will become effective upon publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* and will expire 2 years from the date of publication.

#### Public Comments

While this temporary rulemaking will be effective upon publication, the Board is seeking comments from the public and affected parties as to how this temporary regulation might be improved. Interested persons are invited to submit written comments, suggestions or objections regarding this temporary rulemaking within 30 days after the date of publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* to Chad W. Zimmermann, Assistant Chief Counsel, Pennsylvania Gaming Control Board, P.O. Box 69060, Harrisburg, PA 17106-9060, Attention: Public Comment on Regulation # 125-236.

#### Regulatory Review

Under 4 Pa.C.S. § 13A03, the Board is authorized to adopt temporary regulations which are not subject to the provisions of sections 201—205 of the act of July 31, 1968 (P.L. 769, No. 240), known as the Commonwealth Documents Law (CDL), the Regulatory Review Act (71 P.S. §§ 745.1—745.12) and sections 204(b) and 301(10) of the Commonwealth Attorneys Act (71 P.S. §§ 732-204(b) and 732-301(10)). These temporary regulations expire 2 years after publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

#### Findings

#### The Board finds that:

- (1) Under 4 Pa.C.S. § 13A03, the temporary regulations are exempt from the requirements of the Regulatory Review Act, sections 201—205 of the CDL and sections 204(b) and 301(10) of the Commonwealth Attorney Act.
- (2) The adoption of the temporary regulations is necessary and appropriate for the administration and enforcement of 4 Pa.C.S. Part II (relating to gaming).

#### Order

The Board, acting under 4 Pa.C.S. Part II, orders that:

- (1) The regulations of the Board, 58 Pa. Code Chapter 689, are amended by adding  $\S\S$  689.1—689.3 to read as set forth in Annex A.
- (2) The temporary regulations are effective November 28, 2020.
- (3) The temporary regulations will be posted on the Board's web site and published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.
- (4) The temporary regulations shall be subject to amendment as deemed necessary by the Board.
- (5) The Chairperson of the Board shall certify this order and Annex A and deposit them with the Legislative Reference Bureau as required by law.

## TITLE 58. RECREATION PART VII. GAMING CONTROL BOARD

#### Subpart K. TABLE GAMES

#### CHAPTER 689. DREAMCATCHER— TEMPORARY REGULATIONS

Sec. 689.1.

Dreamcatcher layout; physical characteristics.

689.2. Wagers and rotation of the wheel.

689.3. Payout odds.

### § 689.1. Dreamcatcher layout; physical characteristics.

- (a) Dreamcatcher shall be conducted at a circular wheel at least 5 feet in diameter. The rim of the wheel must be divided into 54 equally spaced sections with 23 containing the number 1, 15 sections containing the number 2, 7 sections containing the number 5, 4 sections containing the number 10, 2 sections containing the number 20, 1 section containing the number 40, 1 section containing a 2× symbol and 1 section containing a 7× symbol.
- (b) The sections required under subsection (a) must be arranged clockwise around the rim of the wheel in the following order: 7×, 2, 1, 5, 1, 2, 5, 1, 2, 10, 1, 2, 1, 20, 1, 2, 1, 2, 1, 5, 1, 2, 10, 1, 5, 1, 2, 2×, 1, 5, 1, 40, 2, 1, 2, 1, 10, 2, 1, 5, 1, 2, 1, 5, 2, 1, 20, 1, 2, 1, 10, 1, 2, 1.
- (c) Each section of the wheel displays the payout odds in § 689.3 (relating to payout odds) for the wager placed. For example, the payout odds for sections with the number 2 are 2 to 1.
- (d) The sections containing the 2× symbol and 7× symbol act as multipliers and trigger a subsequent bonus spin.
- (e) The wheel must contain a clapper capable of selecting a particular section of the wheel upon the conclusion of the spin.
- (f) Each Dreamcatcher table must have a drop box and a tip box attached on the same side of the gaming table as, but on opposite sides of, the dealer, as approved by the Bureau of Casino Compliance in accordance with § 601a.10(g) (relating to approval of table game layouts, signage and equipment).
- (g) The layout for a Dreamcatcher table shall be submitted to the Bureau of Gaming Operations and approved in accordance with § 601a.10(a) and contain, at a minimum:
  - (1) The name or logo of the certificate holder.
- (2) Specific betting areas for the placement of wagers including spaces for 1, 2, 5, 10, 20 and 40.
  - (3) The payout odds for each of the permissible wagers.
- (4) The minimum or maximum wagers, or both, that may be placed and the maximum payout limit per round, if applicable.

#### § 689.2. Wagers and rotation of the wheel.

- (a) Prior to the spin of the wheel, the dealer shall announce "no more bets."
- (b) The wheel shall be spun by the dealer in either direction and must complete at least three revolutions to constitute a valid spin.
- (c) A wager shall be settled in accordance with the wager's position on the layout when the clapper comes to rest in a section of the wheel.
- (d) If the clapper comes to rest between two numbers or symbols upon completion of the spin of the wheel, the spin shall be void and the dealer shall respin the wheel.
- (e) Upon completion of the spin, if the wheel comes to rest on a section of the wheel with 1, 2, 5, 10, 20 or 40, the dealer shall first collect all losing wagers and then pay off all winning wagers in accordance with § 689.3 (relating to payout odds).
- (f) If upon competition of the spin the wheel comes to rest on the  $2\times$  or  $7\times$  section of the wheel, a bonus spin round is triggered the dealer shall spin the wheel again and pay winning wagers in accordance with § 689.3(b) and (c).

#### § 689.3. Payout odds.

(a) A certificate holder shall pay out winning Dreamcatcher wagers at no less than the odds in the following paytable:

Result	Payout Odds
1	1 to 1
2	2 to 1
5	5 to 1
10	10 to 1
20	20 to 1
40	40 to 1

- (b) If upon completion of the bonus spin the wheel comes to rest on a section of the wheel with 1, 2, 5, 10, 20 or 40, the multiplier shall be applied to the result of the bonus spin, and the original wagers shall be settled accordingly. For example, a  $2\times$  bonus spin results in the wheel coming to rest in a section of the wheel with a 10 (10 to 1 odds). The original wager shall be paid at 20 to 1 odds.
- (c) If upon completion of the bonus spin the wheel comes to rest on the  $2\times$  or  $7\times$  section of the wheel, the bonus spin round continues and the multipliers shall stack until the a spin occurs with the wheel comes to rest in a section of the wheel with 1, 2, 5, 10, 20 or 40. For example, a  $2\times$  bonus spin results in the wheel coming to rest in the  $7\times$  section. The subsequent bonus spin results in the wheel coming to rest in a section of the wheel with a 10 (10 to 1 odds). The original wager shall be paid at 140 to 1 odds.

## PROPOSED RULEMAKING

#### **GAME COMMISSION**

[ 58 PA. CODE CH. 137 ]
Wildlife; Chronic Wasting Disease

To effectively manage the wildlife resources of this Commonwealth, the Game Commission (Commission) proposed at its September 26, 2020, meeting to amend §§ 137.34 and 137.35 (relating to Chronic Wasting Disease and emergency authority of Director; and Chronic Wasting Disease restrictions) to expand the authority of the Executive Director to issue executive orders to address additional diseases and species beyond only Chronic Wasting Disease (CWD) and cervids. The Commission is proposing to amend § 137.35 to enhance its CWD response capabilities within this Commonwealth by defining the term "Established Area," restricting the movement of high-risk parts outside from Established Areas and further expanding the ban on importation of high-risk parts to all areas outside this Commonwealth.

This proposed rulemaking will not have an adverse impact on the wildlife resources of this Commonwealth.

The authority for this proposed rulemaking is 34 Pa.C.S. (relating to Game and Wildlife Code) (code).

This proposed rulemaking was made public at the September 26, 2020, meeting of the Commission. Comments can be sent to the Director, Information and Education, Game Commission, 2001 Elmerton Avenue, Harrisburg, PA 17110-9797, until January 18, 2021.

#### 1. Purpose and Authority

The Commission is proposing two changes to address wildlife disease within this Commonwealth. With the first change, the Commission is proposing to amend §§ 137.34 and 137.35 to expand the authority of the Executive Director to issue executive orders to address additional diseases and species of wildlife beyond only CWD and cervids. Section 137.34 currently addresses only the emergency authority of the Game Commission's Executive Director as it pertains to CWD and cervids. This section does not address any other diseases or the impacts of these diseases on other species of wildlife. The Commission has determined that a more comprehensive regulation capable of application to any number of wildlife diseases would provide the Executive Director with the necessary authority and flexibility to respond to additional wildlife diseases other than CWD that threaten human, domestic and wild animal, or environmental health and safety within this Commonwealth. The need for expanding existing regulatory language was recently recognized as a result of the ongoing rabbit hemorrhagic disease outbreak in the southwestern United States.

The changes to § 137.34 primarily consist of replacing the terms "CWD" with the term "wildlife disease" and "cervid" with "wildlife" to give the section an expanded application to additional diseases and additional species of wildlife, but also includes a number of other house-keeping changes, including the addition of a provision limiting the Commission's ability to take action under this section involving wildlife species concurrently regulated with the Federal government (such as migratory

birds) without the concurrence of the Federal government. The related amendments to § 137.35 in this first change are limited to an update to the reference to the new title of § 137.34.

In a related, but distinct second change, the Commission is also proposing to amend § 137.35 to enhance its CWD response capabilities within the Commonwealth by adding and defining the term "Established Area," restricting the movement of high-risk parts outside from Established Areas and further expanding the ban on importation of high-risk parts to all areas outside this Commonwealth. Established Areas will be defined as any geographic area of this Commonwealth that is within a Disease Management Area and has a higher concentration of disease prevalence that is targeted by the Commission for enhanced CWD management activities. Implementation of these new Established Area controls are intended to reduce CWD transmission risk factors. This change also replaces the prohibition of importation of high-risk cervid parts from only CWD endemic states and Canadian provinces with a general prohibition against the importation of high-risk parts from cervids harvested, taken or killed anywhere outside of this Commonwealth. These changes reflect the strategies described in the CWD Response Plan recently adopted by the Commission.

Section 2102(a) of the code (relating to regulations) provides that "The commission shall promulgate such regulations as it deems necessary and appropriate concerning game or wildlife and hunting or furtaking in this Commonwealth, including regulations relating to the protection, preservation and management of game or wildlife and game or wildlife habitat, permitting or prohibiting hunting or furtaking, the ways, manner, methods and means of hunting or furtaking, and the health and safety of persons who hunt or take wildlife or may be in the vicinity of persons who hunt or take game or wildlife in this Commonwealth." The amendments to §§ 137.34 and 137.35 are proposed under this authority.

#### 2. Regulatory Requirements

This proposed rulemaking will amend §§ 137.34 and 137.35 to expand the authority of the Executive Director to issue executive orders to address additional diseases and species of wildlife beyond only CWD and cervids. This proposed rulemaking will also amend § 137.35 to define the term "Established Area," restricting the movement of high-risk parts outside from Established Areas and further expand the ban on importation of high-risk parts to all areas outside this Commonwealth.

#### 3. Persons Affected

Persons wishing to import high-risk wildlife parts into the Commonwealth or export high-risk wildlife parts of any area designated as a Disease Management Area or Established Area will be affected by this proposed rulemaking.

#### 4. Cost and Paperwork Requirements

This proposed rulemaking should not result in any additional cost or paperwork.

#### 5. Effective Date

This proposed rulemaking will be effective upon finalform publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* and will remain in effect until changed by the Commission.

## Annex A TITLE 58. RECREATION PART III. GAME COMMISSION CHAPTER 137. WILDLIFE

- § 137.34. [Chronic Wasting Disease] Wildlife disease and emergency authority of Director.
- (a) The Director has emergency authority to take actions to mitigate risk factors and to determine the prevalence and geographic distribution of [Chronic Wasting Disease (CWD)] wildlife diseases, if the Director concludes that the introduction or spread of [CWD] wildlife diseases poses a threat to human, [farm animals, pets or other cervids] domestic and wild animal, and environmental health and safety within or adjacent to this Commonwealth.
  - (1) The Director has emergency authority to:
- (i) [Prohibit the importation of high risk cervid parts from areas that are known to harbor CWD] Institute importation and exportation restrictions to mitigate disease transmission risk factors.
- (ii) Define and designate Disease Management Areas (DMAs) in this Commonwealth.
- (2) The Director has emergency authority within designated DMAs to:
- (i) Allow the taking of **[ cervids ]** wildlife without regard to established seasons and bag limits and methods of take.
- (ii) Require mandatory [checking of hunter-killed cervids] disease testing or disposal of wildlife or wildlife parts.
- (iii) Prohibit the [removal] movement of [high risk cervid] high-risk wildlife parts.
  - (iv) Prohibit the rehabilitation of [cervids] wildlife.
- (v) Prohibit the use and possession of [ cervid urine-based attractants ] wildlife products.
  - (vi) Prohibit the feeding of [cervids] wildlife.
- (vii) Prohibit [any] the issuance of new permits and allow the suspension or modification of existing permits to possess or transport live [cervids] wildlife.
- (3) Notwithstanding paragraphs (1) and (2), the emergency authority of the Director will not be construed to extend to:
- [ the ] (i) The regulation of captive [ cervids ] wild-life held under 3 Pa.C.S. Chapter [ 27 ] 23 (relating to Domestic Animal Law) or the requirements of a lawful quarantine order issued by the Department of Agriculture

- (ii) The unilateral regulation of wildlife concurrently managed by the Commonwealth and the Federal government.
- (b) It is unlawful for a person to violate a provision of an Executive Order issued by the Director under the authority of this section. A person violating this section will, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay the fine prescribed in the act.

#### § 137.35. Chronic Wasting Disease restrictions.

- (a) Importation.
- (1) It is unlawful to import any high-risk parts or materials from cervids harvested, taken or killed [within any CWD-endemic state or Canadian province] outside of this Commonwealth.
- (2) This subsection may not be construed to limit the importation of non-high-risk parts or materials from cervids harvested, taken or killed [ within any CWD-endemic state or Canadian province ] outside of this Commonwealth.
  - (b) Exportation.
- (1) It is unlawful to remove or export any high-risk parts or materials from cervids harvested, taken or killed, including by vehicular accident, within any Disease Management or Established Area established within this Commonwealth.
- (2) This subsection may not be construed to limit the removal or exportation of non-high-risk parts or materials from cervids harvested, taken or killed within any Disease Management <u>or Established</u> Area established within this Commonwealth.
- (3) This subsection may not be construed to limit the removal or exportation of high-risk parts or materials from cervids harvested, taken or killed in any Disease Management or Established Area established within this Commonwealth if the parts or materials are transported directly to any location or facility designated and approved in advance by the Commission to receive highrisk cervid parts for waste disposal, taxidermy or butchering purposes. Locations or facilities designated and approved to receive high-risk cervid parts for waste disposal, taxidermy or butchering purposes will be made known through public announcement, web site and other means reasonably intended to reach the widest audience.
- (4) All cervids harvested, taken or killed within any Disease Management or Established Area established within this Commonwealth are subject to disease testing. This testing may require hunters to present cervids, or cervid parts, for checking and sampling at prescribed locations under conditions in a forthcoming notice. The submission process, if any, will be made known through public announcement, web site and other means reasonably intended to reach the widest audience. The cost of testing, sampling and analysis will be borne by the Commission.
- (5) It is unlawful to rehabilitate wild, free-ranging cervids within any Disease Management **or Established** Area established within this Commonwealth.
- (6) It is unlawful to use or possess cervid urine-based attractants in any outdoor setting within any Disease Management **or Established** Area established within this Commonwealth.
- (7) It is unlawful to directly or indirectly feed wild, free-ranging cervids within any Disease Management <u>or</u> **Established** Area established within this Common-

wealth. This prohibition may not be construed to apply to normal or accepted agricultural, habitat management, oil and gas drilling, mining, forest management, or other legitimate commercial or industrial practices. If otherwise lawful feeding is attracting cervids, the Commission may provide written notice prohibiting this activity. Failure to discontinue this activity is a violation of this section.

- (8) The Commission will not issue any new permit to possess or transport live cervids within any Disease Management <u>or Established</u> Area established within this Commonwealth.
  - (c) Nonapplicability.
- (1) Nothing in this section shall be construed to extend to the regulation of captive cervids held under 3 Pa.C.S. Chapter 23 (relating to Domestic Animal Law) or the requirements of a lawful quarantine order issued by the Department of Agriculture.
- (2) Nothing in this section shall be construed to limit the Commission's authority to establish or enforce additional importation, exportation, possession, transportation, or testing requirements or restrictions on cervid parts or materials under the authority of § 137.34 (relating to [Chronic Wasting Disease] wildlife disease and emergency authority of Director).
- (d) Authority to designate. The Executive Director has the authority to designate and publish [a list of current CWD-endemic states and Canadian provinces and] Disease Management and Established Areas established within this Commonwealth. The Executive Director will publish this list and any updates in the Pennsylvania Bulletin.
- (e) *Definitions*. The following words and terms, when used in this section, have the following meanings, unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:
- CWD—Chronic Wasting Disease—The transmissible spongiform encephalopathy of cervids.

[ CWD-endemic state or Canadian province— States or Canadian provinces where CWD has been detected in wild or captive cervid populations. ]

Cervid—Any member of the family Cervidae (deer), specifically including, but not limited to, the following

species: black-tailed deer; caribou; elk; fallow deer; moose; mule deer; red deer; sika deer; white-tailed deer; and any hybrids thereof.

Disease Management Area—Any geographic area of this Commonwealth influenced by a positive case of CWD and targeted by the Commission for CWD management activities

Established Area—Any geographic area of this Commonwealth that is within a Disease Management Area and has a higher concentration of disease prevalence that is targeted by the Commission for enhanced CWD management activities.

Feeding—The act of placing any artificial or natural substance for the use or consumption of wild, free-ranging cervids on an annual, seasonal or emergency basis.

High-risk parts or materials—Any parts or materials, derived from cervids, which are known to accumulate abnormal prions. This includes any of the following: head (including brain, tonsils, eyes and lymph nodes); spinal cord/backbone (vertebra); spleen; skull plate with attached antlers, if visible brain or spinal cord material is present; cape, if visible brain or spinal cord material is present; upper canine teeth, if root structure or other soft material is present; any object or article containing visible brain or spinal cord material; and brain-tanned hide.

Non-high-risk parts or materials—Any parts or materials, derived from cervids, which are not known to accumulate abnormal prions. This includes any of the following: meat, without the backbone; skull plate with attached antlers, if no visible brain or spinal cord material is present; tanned hide or rawhide with no visible brain or spinal cord material present; cape, if no visible brain or spinal cord material is present; upper canine teeth, if no root structure or other soft material is present; and taxidermy mounts, if no visible brain or spinal cord material is present.

(f) Violations. A person violating a requirement or restriction in this section may be prosecuted under section 2102 or 2307 of the act (relating to regulations; and unlawful taking or possession of game or wildlife) and, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay the fine prescribed in the act.

## MUNICIPAL POLICE OFFICERS' EDUCATION AND TRAINING COMMISSION

[ 37 PA. CODE CH. 203 ]

## Consideration for Reinstatement of Expelled Act 120 Cadets

Purpose

Act 165 of 2012 required the Municipal Police Officers' Education and Training Commission to develop standards and guidelines to govern the reinstatement of municipal police officers and certified school instructors who had their certification(s) suspended or revoked under 37 Pa. Code Chapter 203. Act 165 was signed into law on October 24, 2012, and took effect immediately. On September 5, 2015 the Commission published a policy to provide guidance and allow the consideration of applications for reinstatement of certification of police officers and instructors.

The Commission's cheating policy, codified in 37 Pa. Code § 203.54, also applies to uncertified cadets participating in basic police officer training at certified municipal police academies. Cheating in the academy is grounds for expulsion from the academy and any cadet who is expelled for cheating is, based on the cheating policy, "barred from further participation in any Commission-required training and ineligible for certification." While the Commission's policy regarding consideration of applications for reinstatement of certification provided guidance for police officers and instructors seeking reinstatement, no such guidance was provided for uncertified cadets who find themselves permanently barred from training for a violation of the cheating policy.

This policy provides general criteria that the Commission may consider for the reinstatement of eligibility for training and certification of uncertified cadets who were expelled by an academy for cheating. This policy is not binding on the Commission, and the Commission may consider any and all relevant factors and circumstances with regard to a cadet's application for consideration for reinstatement of eligibility. A vote by the Commission to approve an individual's application for consideration for reinstatement of eligibility is not a waiver of any of the training or conditions for certification nor a Commission vote to certify an individual under 37 Pa. Code Chapter 203.

#### Definitions

For the purpose of this policy, unless otherwise defined herein, all terms shall be defined as stated in 37 Pa. Code § 203.1 Definitions.

School Director—The Commission-approved head of a certified municipal police school authorized by the Commission to conduct basic municipal police training.

#### Expelled Cadets

After one year from the date of expulsion for cheating in the basic police training school, the cadet may seek consideration for reinstatement of eligibility. The application for consideration for reinstatement of eligibility shall be submitted by a school director who intends to enroll the cadet in a basic police training class. The application will include the following:

- $1.\ A$  copy of the grade sheet documenting the previous expulsion.
- 2. A written conditional offer of enrollment from a training school (as defined by § 2162 of the Act).
- 3. A Pennsylvania criminal history check completed within the 60 days prior to submission of the application.
- 4. A Federal Bureau of Investigation criminal history check completed within the 60 days prior to submission of the application. (Refer to the following hyperlink for additional information about this criminal history check: http://www.fbi.gov/aboutus/cjis/background-checks).

Applicants may, and are encouraged to, submit the following as well:

- 1. Notarized affidavits testifying to the applicant's character and fitness for employment as a municipal police officer.
- 2. A personal statement from the applicant addressing the reason(s) for the applicant's revocation and reason(s) for which the applicant should be reinstated.

Application for consideration for reinstatement of certification shall be sent via certified mail to the Executive Director at 8002 Bretz Drive, Harrisburg, PA 17112-9748 who, within five (5) business days of receipt, shall present a copy of the application and all related materials, including records maintained by Commission staff, to the members of the Professional Standards Committee (hereafter "the Committee"). The Committee shall convene at a quarterly Committee meeting or such other time and place as they may designate and, with a quorum being present, review the application, and make a recommendation to the full Commission. The Committee may evaluate the applicant's suitability for reinstatement using the following criteria:

- The severity of the violation which caused the expulsion and any negative impact on the public trust, school, or political subdivision
- Notarized character statements submitted with the application by individuals not in the applicant's immediate family or household
- Previous disciplinary actions taken by the training school
- ullet Previous suspensions or revocations by the Commission
- The applicant's acceptance or denial of responsibility for the violation which caused the revocation
- Any criminal convictions, accelerated rehabilitative dispositions (ARD), or arrests on, prior to, or after the date of expulsion
- Community or volunteer service conducted during the period of expulsion
  - Endorsements by the school director or instructors
- Official statements made during the inquiry into the violation which caused the expulsion
- Statements made in letters or other correspondence sent to the Commission during the time of expulsion

A recommendation shall be made no later than the second full Commission meeting following the submission of the application. The Commission shall consider the recommendation of the Committee. The Commission may

request any information, review any document or require clarification from the Committee prior to any vote. These criteria shall not be deemed as exhaustive and the Commission may consider any other relevant factors and circumstances that may speak to the applicant's suitability to serve as a municipal police officer.

Upon hearing the recommendation of the Committee and considering all relevant factors, the Commission will generally approve or deny the individual's application for consideration for reinstatement of eligibility. This approval shall require an affirmative majority vote of a seated quorum.

Any approval of an individual's application for consideration of reinstatement of eligibility shall not be considered a waiver of any of the requirements for training or certification as stated in 37 Pa. Code Chapter 203, Subchapter B. The applicant must meet all physical, psychological, and criminal history requirements of that

subchapter and shall be required to complete the application process and all training then required by the Act with no credit granted for any training completed prior to the expulsion.

It is the policy of the Commission not to entertain repetitive applications for reinstatement. Upon the Commission's rejection of an application for consideration for reinstatement of eligibility, the applicant shall not be permitted to apply for reinstatement for one year from the date of the Commission's vote to reject. Individuals may only apply for reinstatement three times.

## APPLICATIONS FOR NATIONAL POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM (NPDES) PERMITS AND WATER QUALITY MANAGEMENT (WQM) PERMITS

This notice provides information about persons who have applied for a new, amended or renewed NPDES or WQM permit, a permit waiver for certain stormwater discharges or submitted a Notice of Intent (NOI) for coverage under a General Permit. The applications concern, but are not limited to, discharges regarding industrial, animal or sewage waste, discharges to groundwater, discharges associated with municipal separate storm sewer systems (MS4), stormwater associated with construction activities or concentrated animal feeding operations (CAFO). This notice is provided in accordance with 25 Pa. Code Chapters 91 and 92a and 40 CFR Part 122, implementing The Clean Streams Law (35 P.S. §§ 691.1—691.1001) and the Federal Clean Water Act (33 U.S.C.A. §§ 1251—1376).

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For NPDES renewal applications in Section I, the Department of Environmental Protection (Department) has made a tentative determination to reissue these permits for 5 years subject to effluent limitations and monitoring and reporting requirements in their current permits, with appropriate and necessary updated requirements to reflect new and changed regulations and other requirements.

For applications for new NPDES permits and renewal applications with major changes in Section II, as well as applications for MS4 Individual Permits and Individual Stormwater Construction Permits in Sections IV and VI, the Department, based upon preliminary reviews, has made tentative determinations of proposed effluent limitations and other terms and conditions for the permit applications. In accordance with 25 Pa. Code § 92a.32(d), the proposed discharge of stormwater associated with construction activities will be managed in accordance with the requirements of 25 Pa. Code Chapter 102. These determinations are published as proposed actions for comments prior to taking final actions.

Unless indicated otherwise, the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Region III Administrator has waived the right to review or object to proposed NPDES permit actions under the waiver provision in 40 CFR 123.24(d).

Persons wishing to comment on NPDES applications are invited to submit statements to the contact office noted before the application within 30-days from the date of this public notice. Persons wishing to comment on WQM permit applications are invited to submit statements to the office noted before the application within 15-days from the date of this public notice. Comments received within the respective comment periods will be considered in the final determinations regarding the applications. A comment submittal should include the name, address and telephone number of the writer and a concise statement to inform the Department of the exact basis of a comment and the relevant facts upon which it is based.

The Department will also accept requests for public hearings on applications. A public hearing may be held if the responsible office considers the public response significant. If a hearing is scheduled, a notice of the hearing will be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* and a newspaper of general circulation within the relevant geographical area. The Department will postpone its final determination until after a public hearing is held.

A person who demonstrates attainment of one, or a combination of the cleanup standards, or who receives approval of a special industrial area remediation identified under the Act, will be relieved of further liability for the remediation of the site for any contamination identified in reports submitted to and approved by the Department. Furthermore, the person shall not be subject to citizen suits or other contribution actions brought by responsible persons not participating in the remediation.

Under Sections 304(n)(1)(ii) and 305(c)(2) of the Act, there is a 30-day public and municipal comment period for sites proposed for remediation using a site-specific standard, in whole or in part, and for sites remediated as a special industrial area. This period begins when a summary of the NOI to Remediate is published in a newspaper of general circulation in the area of the site. For the following identified site(s), proposed for remediation to a site-specific standard or as a special industrial area, the municipality, within which the site is located, may request to be involved in the development of the remediation and reuse plans for the site if the request is made within 30-days of the following specified date. During this comment period the municipality may request that the following identified person, as the remediator of the site, develop and implement a public involvement plan. Requests to be involved, and comments, should be directed to the remediator of the site.

#### MINING ACTIVITY NPDES DRAFT PERMITS

If additional effluent limits are needed for an NPDES permit associated with a noncoal mining permit, then the permit description specifies the parameters.

In addition to BAT or WQBEL limits, coal and noncoal NPDES permits establish effluent limitations in the form of implemented Best Management Practices (BMPs) identified in the associated Erosion and Sedimentation Plan, the Reclamation Plan and the NPDES permit application. These BMPs restrict the rates and quantities of associated pollutants from being discharged into surface waters in this Commonwealth.

More restrictive effluent limitations, restrictions on discharge volume or restrictions on the extent of mining that may occur are incorporated into an NPDES permit when necessary for compliance with water quality standards and antidegradation requirements (in accordance with 25 Pa. Responses should include the name, address, and telephone number of the writer and a concise statement to inform the Department of the exact basis of a comment and relevant facts upon which it is based. A public hearing may be held after consideration of comments received by the appropriate Department Regional Office during the 30-day public comment period.

Following the 30-day comment period, the appropriate Regional Office Water Management Program Manager will make a final determination regarding the proposed permit. Notice of this determination will be published in

the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* at which time this determination may be appealed to the Environmental Hearing Board.

The application and related documents, including the erosion and sediment control plan for the earth disturbance activity are on file and may be inspected at the office identified in this notice.

- (d) Game Ticket: A bearer instrument produced through a Lottery Terminal that is the player's record of a play for a Fast Play lottery game and sold by an authorized retailer containing the play and validation data as published in this game notice.
- (e) Lottery Central Computer System: The computer gaming system on which all Fast Play plays are recorded.
- (f) Lottery Terminal: A device authorized by the Lottery to function in an interactive mode with the Lottery Central Computer System for the purpose of issuing plays, executing Quick Pick selections, and entering, receiving, and processing lottery transactions, including making purchases, validating plays, transmitting reports, and performing inventory functions.

- (l) Winning ticket: A game ticket which has been validated and qualifies for a prize.
- (m) YOUR NUMBERS: The numbers, letters, symbols or other characters found in the play area that, when matched against the play symbols in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area, determine whether a player wins a prize.

- 3. *Price*: The price of a \$20, \$50 & \$100 Blowout ticket is \$10.
- 4. Description of \$20, \$50 & \$100 Blowout Fast Play lottery game:
- (a) \$20, \$50 & \$100 Blowout lottery game is an instant win game printed from a Lottery Terminal. All prizes are predetermined, and the player does not have the ability to select their own play symbols. \$20, \$50 & \$100 Blowout tickets may be purchased from an authorized retailer or at a Lottery self-service terminal that sells terminal-based Lottery game tickets. Tickets purchased from an authorized retailer shall be printed on-demand at the time of purchase and may not be preprinted by the retailer.
- (b) \$20, \$50 & \$100 Blowout is played by matching the play symbols in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area to the play symbols located in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area. A player matching play symbols in this manner will win the prize shown under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol. - (c) *Prize Symbols*: The prize symbols and their captions located in the play area are:  $$10^{.00}$  (TEN DOL),  $$20^{.00}$  (TWENTY),  $$50^{.00}$  (FIFTY) and \$100 (ONE HUN).

- (h) Lottery Terminal: A device authorized by the Lottery to function in an interactive mode with the Lottery Central Computer System for the purpose of issuing plays, executing Quick Pick selections, and entering, receiving, and processing lottery transactions, including making purchases, validating plays, transmitting reports, and performing inventory functions.
- (i) *Play*: A chance to participate in a particular Fast Play lottery game.
- (j) Play Area: The area on a ticket which contains one or more play symbols.
- (k) *Play Symbol*: A number, letter, symbol, image or other character found in the play area which is used to determine whether a player wins a prize.

- (l) *Prize*: A non-monetary item, money, or experience that can be won as specified in section 6 (relating to prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners) of this game notice.
- (m) WINNING NUMBERS: The numbers, letters, symbols or other characters found in the play area that, when matched against the play symbols in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area, determine whether a player wins a prize.
- (n) Winning ticket: A game ticket which has been validated and qualifies for a prize.
- (o) YOUR NUMBERS: The numbers, letters, symbols or other characters found in the play area that, when matched against the play symbols in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area, determine whether a player wins a prize.
  - 3. Price: The price of a High Voltage Cash ticket is \$5.
- 4. Description of High Voltage Cash Fast Play lottery game:
- (a) High Voltage Cash lottery game is an instant win game printed from a Lottery Terminal. All prizes are predetermined, and the player does not have the ability to select their own play symbols. High Voltage Cash tickets may be purchased from an authorized retailer or at a Lottery self-service terminal that sells terminal-based Lottery game tickets. Tickets purchased from an authorized retailer shall be printed on-demand at the time of purchase and may not be preprinted by the retailer.
- (b) High Voltage Cash is played by matching any of the play symbols located in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area to any of the play symbols located in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area. A player matching play symbols in this manner will win the prize shown under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol. A bet slip is not used to play this game.
- (c) High Voltage Cash tickets contain a "LIGHTNING BOLT BONUS" area. Whenever a player matches the "HIGH VOLTAGE NUMBER" to any "WINNING NUMBER" and a 2X (2TIMES) symbol appears in the "BOLT BONUS MULTIPLIER" area, double any prize won in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area. Whenever a player matches the "HIGH VOLTAGE NUMBER" to any "WINNING NUMBER" and a 5X (5TIMES) symbol appears in the "BOLT BONUS MULTIPLIER" area, multiply any prize won in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area by five. Whenever a player matches the "HIGH VOLTAGE NUMBER" to any "WINNING NUMBER" and a 10X (10TIMES) symbol appears in the "BOLT BONUS MULTIPLIER" area, multiply any prize won in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area by ten. Whenever a player matches the "HIGH VOLTAGE NUMBER" to any "WINNING NUMBER" and a 1X (PRIZE) symbol appears in the "BOLT BONUS MULTIPLIER" area, any prize won in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area is not multiplied.
- (d) Players can win the prize identified in section 6 (relating to prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners).
- (e) High Voltage Cash tickets cannot be canceled or voided once printed by the Lottery Terminal, even if printed in error.
- (f) To purchase a ticket at an authorized retailer, a player must remit the purchase price to the retailer and verbally request a High Voltage Cash ticket. The ticket shall be the only valid proof of the bet placed and the only valid receipt for claiming a prize.

(g) To purchase a ticket at a Pennsylvania Lottery self-service terminal, the player must insert into the self-service terminal a dollar amount equal to the total purchase price of a High Voltage Cash ticket and select High Voltage Cash option on the Lottery self-service terminal. The ticket shall be the only valid proof of the bet placed and the only valid receipt for claiming a prize.

- 5. High Voltage Cash ticket characteristics:
- (a) High Voltage Cash tickets shall contain a play area, the cost of the play, the date of sale, and a bar code.
- (b) Play Symbols: High Voltage Cash tickets will contain a "WINNING NUMBERS" area, a "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a "LIGHTNING BOLT BONUS" area. The play symbols and their captions, located in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area and the "YOUR NUM-BERS" area, are: 1 (ONE), 2 (TWO), 3 (THREE), 4 (FOUR), 5 (FIVE), 6 (SIX), 7 (SEVEN), 8 (EIGHT), 9 (NINE), 10 (TEN), 11 (ELEVN), 12 (TWLV), 13 (THRTN), 14 (FORTN), 15 (FIFTN), 16 (SIXTN), 17 (SVNTN), 18 (EGHTN), 19 (NINTN), 20 (TWENT), 21 (TWYONE), 22 (TWYTWO), 23 (TWYTHR), 24 (TWYFOR), 25 (TWYFIV), 26 (TWYSIX), 27 (TWYSVN), 28 (TWYEGT), 29 (TWYNIN) and 30 (THIRT). The "HIGH VOLTAGE NUMBER" play symbols located in the "LIGHTNING BOLT BONUS" area are: 1 (ONE), 2 (TWO), 3 (THREE), 4 (FOUR), 5 (FIVE), 6 (SIX), 7 (SEVEN), 8 (EIGHT), 9 (NÎNE), 10 (TEN), 11 (ELEVN), 12 (TWLV), 13 (THRTN), 14 (FORTN), 15 (FIFTN), 16 (SIXTN), 17 (SVNTN), 18 (EGHTN), 19 (NINTN), 20 (TWENT), 21 (TWYONE), 22 (TWYTWO), 23 (TWYTHR), 24 (TWYFOR), 25 (TWYFIV), 26 (TWYSIX), 27 (TWYSVN), 28 (TWYEGT), 29 (TWYNIN) and 30 (THIRT). The "BOLT BONUS MULTI-PLIER" symbols, located in the "LIGHTNING BOLT BONUS" area, are: 1X (PRIZE), 2X (2TIMES), 5X (5TIMES) and 10X (10TIMES).
- (c) Prize Symbols: The prize symbols and their captions, located in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area, are:  $\$5^{.00}$  (FIV DOL),  $\$10^{.00}$  (TEN DOL),  $\$20^{.00}$  (TWENTY),  $\$25^{.00}$  (TWYFIV),  $\$50^{.00}$  (FIFTY), \$100 (ONE HUN), \$200 (TWO HUN), \$500 (FIV HUN), \$1,000 (ONE THO), \$5,000 (FIV THO) and \$50.000 (FTY THO).
- (d) *Prizes*: The prizes that can be won in this game are: \$5, \$10, \$20, \$25, \$50, \$100, \$200, \$500, \$1,000, \$5,000 and \$50,000. High Voltage Cash contains a feature that can multiply the prize won as detailed in section 4 (relating to description of High Voltage Cash Fast Play lottery game). For a complete list of all prizes that can be won in this game, see section 7 (relating to number and description of prizes and approximate chances of winning). A player can win up to 12 times on a ticket.
- (e) Approximate number of tickets available for the game: Approximately 1,200,000 tickets will be available for sale for High Voltage Cash lottery game.
- 6. Prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners:
- (a) All High Voltage Cash prize payments will be made as one-time, lump-sum cash payments.
- (b) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$50,000 (FTY THO) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$50,000.
- (c) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$5,000

(FIV THO) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$5,000.

- (d) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$1,000 (ONE THO) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, and the "HIGH VOLTAGE NUMBER" matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a 5X (5TIMES) symbol appears in the "BOLT BONUS MULTIPLIER" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$5,000.
- (e) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$500 (FIV HUN) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, and the "HIGH VOLTAGE NUMBER" matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a 10X (10TIMES) symbol appears in the "BOLT BONUS MULTIPLIER" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$5,000.

  - 10. Procedures for claiming and payment of prizes:

- (e) The Commonwealth shall not be responsible for a winning play paid in error by an authorized retailer.
- (f) In the event a prize described in these rules is not available, the Lottery may either provide a substitute prize, determined by the Secretary to have an equivalent value to the prize won, or make a cash payment to the

winner, in an amount determined by the Secretary to have an equivalent value to the prize won.

- 11. Funding for prizes: Moneys will be drawn from the State Lottery Fund, to the extent necessary, to fund the payment of prizes under this section. If this lottery game is terminated for any cause, prize moneys remaining undistributed will remain in the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes otherwise provided for by law.
- 12. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$500,001 and not exceeding \$1,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$5,000. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of

at least \$1,000,001 and not exceeding \$10,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$10,000. A Lottery retailer is entitled only to the largest bonus for which they qualify on a winning ticket. A bonus will be initiated for payment after the Fast Play game ticket is claimed and validated. A bonus will not be awarded to a Lottery retailer that sells a non-winning Pennsylvania Lottery Fast Play game ticket used to enter a Pennsylvania Lottery second-chance drawing or promotion that is subsequently selected to win a prize.

- 18. Termination of the game: The Secretary may announce a termination date, after which no further tickets from this game may be sold. The announcement will be disseminated through media used to advertise or promote High Voltage Cash or through normal communications methods.
- 19. Applicability: This notice applies only to High Voltage Cash lottery game announced in this notice.
