Weatherization Assistance Program; Proposed State Plan; Virtual Public Hearing

The Department of Community and Economic Development (Department) publishes notice of a public hearing to be held electronically, by means of web/conference call on Thursday, April 22, 2021. In accordance with Governor Tom Wolf's emergency disaster declaration and based on advice from the Department of Health regarding the mitigation of the spread of the novel coronavirus (COVID-19), this public hearing will only be held virtually by means of the method listed. There will be no in-person opportunity to attend the hearing.

The virtual public hearing by means of the web/conference call will be held at 1 p.m. and will last as long as there are comments to be received. This more widely available computer access/conference call will replace the onsite public hearing. The format will be more accessible than an in-person meeting because those who wish to make comment may participate directly from their electronic device, telephone or computer. Access information can be found at the end of this notice.

The purpose of this virtual public hearing is to receive comments on the proposed Pennsylvania 2021-2022 annually appropriated United States Department of Energy (DOE) Weatherization Assistance Program (WAP) State Plan (Plan).

The proposed 2021-2022 Plan will authorize the formula-based distribution for each county. Specific performance goals emphasize production, quality of the work product, prompt, accurate and complete reporting, and compliance with program standards and regulations.

The Plan includes the following changes:

- Provisions for the 2020-2021 unspent funds and extension to spend the funds due to production shutdown during the current COVID-19 pandemic.
- \bullet An overall administrative allowance increase from 10 to 15% due to a change in the WAP reauthorization legislation.
- Reweatherization date change from September 30, 1994, to a rolling 15 years from receiving previous Federally identified weatherization activities.

- A plan of work to receive DOE approval of the home energy audit processes, policies and procedures to include the use of the National Energy Audit Tool and the Manufactured Home Energy Audit Tool for single family and manufactured housing, respectively and an extension for the use of the Home Energy Audit Toolkit audit.
- A plan of work to receive DOE approval of multifamily weatherization processes to include a multifamily audit tool and finalized policy and procedures.
- Training and technical assistance activity changes such as: dramatically streamlining the Home Energy Professional's structure and registration process, introduction of a new training plan template, and moving the training and technical assistance pieces from the Health and Safety Plan to the Master File, Training and Technical Assistance Plan.
- The name change of the National Sustainable Structures Center to the Clean Energy Center.
- The 2021 Pennsylvania WAP SWS Field Manual, reflecting the most recent updates to the SWSs, will be released in Fall 2021, pending DOE approval.

There is a continued National focus on coordination of efforts where other health and safety, lead-abatement, utility weatherization and housing rehab services are coordinated locally with weatherization services.

Code Chapters 91 and 92a and 40 CFR Part 122, implementing The Clean Streams Law (35 P.S. §§ 691.1—691.1001) and the Federal Clean Water Act (33 U.S.C.A. §§ 1251—1376). Where indicated, DEP has made tentative determinations, based on preliminary review, to issue permits subject to proposed effluent limitations consisting of best management practices identified in the erosion and sediment control (E&S) plans and post-construction stormwater management (PCSM) plans submitted with the applications, as well as other terms and conditions based on the permit applications. A 30-day public comment period applies to these applications.

Written comments or objections, or requests for an informal conference, or a public hearing, as applicable, on a mining permit application may be submitted by any person or any officer or head of any Federal, State or local government agency or authority to the Department at the address of the District Mining Office indicated above each application within 30-days of this publication, or within 30-days after the last publication of the applicant's newspaper advertisement, as provided by 25 Pa. Code §§ 77.121—77.123 and 86.31—86.34 (relating to public notices of filing of permit applications, opportunity for comment, and informal conferences).

Written comments or objections related to a mining permit application should contain the name, address and telephone number of persons submitting comments or objections; application number; and a statement of sufficient detail to inform the Department on the basis of comment or objection and relevant facts upon which it is based.

Requests for an informal conference, or a public hearing, as applicable, on a mining permit application, as provided by 25 Pa. Code § 77.123 (relating to public hearing-informal conferences) or § 86.34 (relating to informal conferences), must contain the name, address and telephone number of the requestor; the application number; a brief summary of the issues to be raised by the requestor at the conference; and a statement whether the requestor desires to have the conference conducted in the locality of the proposed mining activities.

Where a National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) number is listed, the mining activity permit application was accompanied by an application for an individual NPDES permit. A separate notice will be provided after the draft NPDES permit is prepared.

MINING ACTIVITY NPDES DRAFT PERMITS

This notice provides information about applications for a new, amended or renewed NPDES permits associated with mining activity (coal or noncoal) permits. The applications concern industrial waste (mining) discharges to surface water and discharges of stormwater associated with mining activities. This notice is provided in accordance with 25 Pa. Code Chapters 91 and 92a and 40 CFR Part 122, implementing provisions of The Clean Streams Law (35 P.S. §§ 691.1—691.1001) and the Federal Clean Water Act (33 U.S.C.A. §§ 1251—1376).

The Department of Environmental Protection (Department) has prepared a draft NPDES permit and made a tentative determination to issue the NPDES permit in conjunction with the associated mining activity permit.

Similarly, modified BAT limits apply to iron, manganese and suspended solids in surface runoff, discharges and drainage resulting from these precipitation events and those of greater magnitude in accordance with 25 Pa. Code §§ 87.102, 88.92, 88.187, 88.292, 89.52 and 90.102.

Exceptions to BAT effluent limits may be applicable in accordance with 25 Pa. Code §§ 87.102, 88.92, 88.187, 88.292, 89.52 and 90.102.

Effluent Limits for Noncoal Mining Activities

The limits for noncoal mining activities as provided in 25 Pa. Code Chapter 77 are pH 6 to 9 and other parameters the Department may require.

Discharges from noncoal mines located in some geologic settings (for example, in the coal fields) may require additional water quality based effluent limits. If additional effluent limits are needed for an NPDES permit associated with a noncoal mining permit, then the permit description specifies the parameters.

In addition to BAT or WQBEL limits, coal and noncoal NPDES permits establish effluent limitations in the form of implemented Best Management Practices (BMPs) identified in the associated Erosion and Sedimentation Plan, the Reclamation Plan and the NPDES permit application. These BMPs restrict the rates and quantities of associated pollutants from being discharged into surface waters in this Commonwealth.

More restrictive effluent limitations, restrictions on discharge volume or restrictions on the extent of mining that may occur are incorporated into an NPDES permit when necessary for compliance with water quality standards and antidegradation requirements (in accordance with 25 Pa. Code Chapters 91—96).

The procedures for determining the final effluent limits, using a mass-balance equation or model, are found in Technical Guidance Document 563-2112-115, Developing National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Permits for Mining Activities. Other specific factors to be considered include public comments and Total Maximum Daily Load(s). Additional discharge limitations may apply in the event that unexpected discharges occur.

Discharge rates for surface mining activities are precipitation driven. Discharge rates for proposed discharges associated with underground mining are noted in the permit description.

Persons wishing to comment on an NPDES draft permit should submit a written statement to the Department at the address of the district mining office indicated before each draft permit within 30-days of this public notice. Comments received within the comment period will be considered in the final determinations regarding the NPDES permit applications. Comments must include the name, address and telephone number of the writer and a concise statement to inform the Department of the exact basis of a comment and the relevant facts upon which it is based.

The Department will also accept requests or petitions for a public hearing on NPDES permit applications, as provided in 25 Pa. Code § 92a.82(d). The request or petition for a public hearing shall be filed within 30-days of this public notice and contain the name, address, telephone number and the interest of the party filing the request and state the reasons why a hearing is warranted. A public hearing may be held if the Department considers the public interest significant. If a hearing is scheduled, a notice of the hearing on the NPDES permit application will be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* and a newspaper of general circulation within the relevant geographical area. When a public hearing is held, the Department will consider comments from the public hearing in the final determination on the NPDES permit application.

Appeals must be filed with the Board within 30 days of publication of this notice in the Pennsylvania Bulletin unless the appropriate statute provides a different time period. Copies of the appeal form and the Board's rules of practice and procedure may be obtained from the Board. The appeal form and the Board's rules of practice and procedure are also available in Braille or on audiotape from the Secretary to the Board at (717) 787-3483. This paragraph does not, in and of itself, create a right of appeal beyond that permitted by applicable statutes and decisional law.

For individuals who wish to challenge an action, the appeal must reach the Board within 30-days. A lawyer is not needed to file an appeal with the Board.

If required, a cleanup plan evaluates the abilities of potential remedies to achieve remedy requirements. A work plan for conducting a baseline remedial investigation is required by the act for compliance with selection of a special industrial area remediation. The baseline remedial investigation, based on the work plan, is compiled into the baseline environmental report to establish a reference point to show existing contamination, describe proposed remediation to be done and include a description of existing or potential public benefits of the use or reuse of the property. Lake Erie Creel Limits for Walleye and Yellow Perch—2021

The Executive Director of the Fish and Boat Commission, acting under the authority of 58 Pa. State Board of Medicine # 16A-4941 (IRRC # 3287) Child Abuse Reporting Requirements March 31, 2021

We submit for your consideration the following comments on the proposed rulemaking published in the January 30, 2021 *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. Our comments are based on criteria in Section 5.2 of the Regulatory Review Act (71 P.S. § 745.5b). Section 5.1(a) of the Regulatory Review Act (71 P.S. § 745.5a(a)) directs the State Board of Medicine (Board) to respond to all comments received from us or any other source.

Possible conflict with statute and regulations; Protection of the public health, safety and welfare; and Implementation.

Board regulated practitioners and Mandated reporters

The Preamble explains that Chapter 18 (relating to the State Board of Medicine—Practitioners other than Medical Doctors) is being amended to provide appropriate cross-references to the mandatory training and continuing education requirements for nurse midwives, acupuncturists, practitioners of Oriental medicine, physician assistants, respiratory therapists, athletic trainers, behavior specialists, perfusionists, genetic counselors, prosthetists, orthotists, pedorthists, and orthotic fitters.

The list of practitioners and their corresponding subchapters identified in the Preamble summary are derived from the Board's proposed definition of "Boardregulated practitioner." The Board does not include in the Preamble's description of the amendments or the actual updates "auxiliary personnel performing radiologic procedures on the premises of a medical doctor." (auxiliary personnel)

On April 12, 2018, the State Board of Medicine issued a special notice that the State Boards of Chiropractic, Dentistry, Medicine, Osteopathic Medicine and Podiatry are no longer registering auxiliary personnel or otherwise issuing documents authorizing auxiliary personnel to apply ionizing radiation in the offices of licensees. Auxiliary personnel that wish to perform radiologic procedures are required to pass an exam approved by the relevant Board, or obtain certification through an accrediting or credentialing organization.

Chapter 18 (relating to State Board of Medicine—Practitioners other than Medical Doctors) Subchapter E (relating to Performance of Radiologic Procedures by Auxiliary Personnel), which provides for the examination and certification in Radiography, Radiation Therapy Technology and Nuclear Medicine Technology is not part of the proposed regulation.

Section 6311(a)(12) of the Child Protective Services Law (CPSL) (23 Pa.C.S. §§ 6301—6387) requires an individual

supervised or managed by a person licensed or certified to practice in any health-related field under the jurisdiction of the Department of State, who has direct contact with children in the course of employment, to make a report of suspected child abuse, if the person has reasonable cause to suspect that a child is a victim of child abuse. 23 Pa.C.S. § 6311(a)(12) Auxiliary personnel work under the direct supervision of a medical doctor. 49 Pa. Code § 18.202 (relating to Auxiliary personnel performing radiologic procedures).

The proposed regulation adds and defines the term "Mandated reporter" to mean a person who is required under 23 Pa.C.S. § 6311 (relating to persons required to report suspected child abuse) to make a report of suspected child abuse. The term includes all Board-regulated practitioners. Section 6383(b)(3) of the CPSL requires each licensing board with jurisdiction over professional licensees identified as mandated reporters to require all persons applying for a license or certification or applying for renewal of a license or certification to provide documentation that they have complied with the training and continuing education requirements mandated by Act 31 of 2014. 23 Pa.C.S. § 6383(b)(3).

The Board does not explain in the Preamble or RAF why this subchapter has been omitted from the updates that are necessary to make the Board's regulations consistent with Act 31 of 2014. How does the Board verify that auxiliary personnel are completing the required training in the recognition of the signs of child abuse and reporting?

We ask the Board to amend Chapter 18 (relating to State Board of Medicine—Practitioners other than Medical Doctors) Subchapter E (relating to Performance of Radiologic Procedures by Auxiliary Personnel) in a future rulemaking to include the appropriate cross-references to the required CPSL training in child abuse recognition and reporting for auxiliary personnel or explain why it is unnecessary to do so.

2. Implementation.

Section 6383(b)(3)(ii) of the CPSL requires all persons applying for renewal of a license or certificate to submit documentation acceptable to the Board of the completion of at least 2 hours of approved continuing education "per licensure cycle." We have three questions regarding the Board's interpretation of "per licensure cycle" as it pertains to exemptions. The first question relates to Board-regulated practitioners that are exempt from completing the continuing education requirements during the initial biennial renewal period in which the license is issued. Does this exemption for first-time licensees include the continuing education mandated in Act 31 of 2014?

Second, how will the Board implement the requirements of Section 6383(b)(3)(ii) of the CPSL for Board-regulated practitioners that hold more than one license or certification (i.e. nurse-midwife, acupuncturist and practitioner of Oriental medicine)? If an individual is required to have licensure as a prerequisite for another level of certification or licensure would the CPSL training credits earned for the initial license or certification satisfy the requirements for the second, if the training was completed within the same biennial renewal period? It is unclear in Section 16.108(c) whether a Board-regulated practitioner with more than one level of certification or license would need to apply for an exemption or will the credit for the training be applied automatically to both.

Third, the Board explains in the Preamble that "if a licensee happened to be a foster parent and was required to complete the training under Section 6383(c) there would be no need to repeat the training as a condition of licensure or license renewal." Under Section 6383(c)(3) of the CPSL, foster parents must receive three hours of training within 90 days of hire or approval as a foster parent and three hours of training every five years thereafter. In order for an applicant or licensee to be granted an exemption under Section 16.108(c), must the training have been completed within a certain time period to satisfy the CPSL requirements? The Board should describe in the final-form regulation's Preamble and Annex how it will implement the exemptions discussed in the above paragraphs.

Chapter 16. State Board of Medicine—General Provisions

Subchapter B. General License, Certification and Registration Provisions

3. Section 16.18. Volunteer license.—Clarity.

Section 16.18(c)(3) requires an applicant for a volunteer license to "provide verification" of having completed 3 hours of the mandated reporter training. Section 16.108(b) (relating to Child abuse recognition and reporting—mandatory training requirement) states that the Board will not renew a license unless the Bureau has received an electronic report from an approved course provider documenting attendance/participation by the licensee in an approved course or the licensee has obtained an exemption.

Does the verification process work differently for volunteer license applicants? If it is not to work differently, the Board should place the requirement in Section 16.18(b) along the following manner:

- "(b) License. A volunteer license may be issued to a Board-regulated practitioner of the Board for whom the Board has received verification that the applicant has received 3 hours of approved training in child abuse recognition and reporting in accordance with Section 16.108(a) (relating to child abuse recognition and reporting—mandatory training requirement and who documents to the satisfaction of the Board that the applicant will practice without personal remuneration in approved clinics and meets one of the following:
- (1) Holds a currently renewed, active, unrestricted license, registration or certificate in this Commonwealth and retires from active practice at the time the applicant applies for a volunteer license.
- (2) Retires from active practice in this Commonwealth in possession of an unrestricted license which was allowed to lapse by not renewing it" 49 Pa. Code § 16.18(b)

4. Section 16.19. Continuing medical education.—Clarity.

This section is amended to incorporate the required mandatory training in child abuse recognition and reporting as part of the continuing education requirements for medical doctors. This proposal, however, does not address the "at least 3 hours of approved child abuse recognition and reporting training" for medical doctor licensees required under Section 6383(b)(3)(i) of the CPSL.

We ask the Board to amend Chapter 17 (relating to the State Board of Medicine—Medical Doctors) in a future rulemaking to include the appropriate cross-references to the mandatory training requirements for medical doctor licensees or explain why it is unnecessary to do so.

Subchapter G. Minimum Standards of Practice—Child Abuse Reporting

5. Section 16.101. Definitions.—Clarity; Compliance with the RRA and IRRC regulations; and Possible conflict with statute and regulations.

"Board-regulated practitioner"

The term Board-regulated practitioner is defined in Section 16.1 (relating to definitions) as "A medical doctor, midwife, physician assistant, drugless therapist, athletic trainer, acupuncturist, practitioner of Oriental medicine, perfusionist or an applicant for a license or certificate that the Board may issue." This definition applies to Chapters 16 (relating to State Board of Medicine—General provisions), 17 (relating to State Board of Medicine—Medical doctors) and 18 (relating to State Board of Medicine—Practitioners other than medical doctors) unless the context clearly indicates otherwise.

The Board should make the definition of "Board-regulated practitioner" consistent throughout Chapter 16 (relating to State Board of Medicine—General provisions) in the final-form regulation or explain why it is not feasible. It should also submit a revised Description of the proposed amendments that includes the term "Board-regulated practitioner."

"Person responsible for the child's welfare"

A variation of the term appears in the definition of "Perpetrator." The Board should revise the language in the definition of "Perpetrator" to be consistent with the term "Person responsible for the child's welfare."

"Recent act or failure to act"

In the text of the definition, the "of" in the phrase "An act of failure to act" should be changed to an "or" to read "An act or failure to act."

Section 16.102. Suspected child abuse—mandated reporting requirements.—Clarity; and Protection of the public, health and welfare.

Subsection (a)

This subsection tracks, for the most part, the statutory requirements of Section 6311(b)(1)(i)—(iv) (relating to Basis to report) of the CPSL. Sections 6311(b)(2) and (3) of the CPSL, which are not carried over in the Board's proposal, state that:

- "...(2) Nothing in this section shall require a child to come before the mandated reporter in order for the mandated reporter to make a report of suspected child abuse.
- (3) Nothing in this section shall require the mandated reporter to identify the person responsible for the child

abuse to make a report of suspected child abuse." 23 Pa.C.S. § 6311(b)(2) and (3).

Sections 6311(b)(2) and (3) make clear the mandated reporter's responsibility to act and to make a report of suspected child abuse even if certain information is unknown. The statutory provisions, if added, would also make this section consistent with the requirements for written or electronic reports in Section 16.102(d). The Board should incorporate these provisions in the final-form rulemaking or explain why it is unnecessary to do so and how not including them in the final version of the rulemaking protects the public health, safety and welfare.

7. Section 16.103. Photographs, medical tests and X-rays of child subject to report.—Possible conflict with statutes and regulations.

The Preamble explains that this section is in accordance with Section 6314 of the CPSL. Section 6314 of the CPSL also provides that medical summaries or reports of the photographs, X-rays and medical tests "shall be made available to law enforcement officials in the course of investigating cases pursuant to section 6340(a)(9) or (10) (relating to release of information in confidential reports)."

Section 16.103 is referenced in Section 16.105 (relating to Immunity from liability) which provides a Board-regulated practitioner who acts in good faith in making a report of suspected child abuse, a referral to general protective services, cooperates in or consults with an investigation, testifies in a proceeding or engages in any action authorized under 23 Pa.C.S. §§ 6314—6317 immunity from civil and criminal liability that might otherwise result by reason of the practitioner's actions. To be consistent with the CPSL and Section 16.105 (relating to immunity from liability), the Board should amend this Section to include the statutory provision relating to the availability of reports, summaries and medical tests to law enforcement officials or explain why it is not needed.

8. Section 16.108. Child abuse recognition and reporting—mandatory training requirement.— Implementation procedures.

Subsection (a)

Subsection (a) requires an individual applying for an initial license to the Board to complete at least three hours of training in child abuse recognition and reporting requirements. This subsection does not address documentation and reporting of completion of training as required under 23 Pa.C.S. § 6383(b)(3)(i) (relating to Education and training). We ask the Board to revise this subsection to include the implementation procedures for submitting proof of training.

Subsection(c)

Under subsection (c)(3), an applicant or licensee may apply for an exemption from subsection (a) or (b) by submitting documentation demonstrating that the individual "should not be subject to the training or continuing education requirement." A request for exemption is "considered on a case-by-case basis." The standards for documentation and evaluation are vague. We ask the Board to explain the standards for sufficient documentation and the evaluation process for reviewing a request for exemption

The Board should clarify that exemptions granted under this subsection are applicable only for the biennial renewal period for which the exemption is requested. A description of how the applicant or licensee will be notified if their request for exemption is granted or denied should be included in the Preamble and Annex to the final-form regulation.

9. Section 16.109. Child abuse recognition and reporting—course approval process.—Clarity and lack of ambiguity.

Subsection(c)

This subsection states that the Bureau will notify the applicant in writing upon approval of the course and will post a list of approved courses on the Bureau's website. "Applicant" as used in this subsection would appear to mean an individual, entity or organization applying for approval to provide mandated reporter training. In Section 16.108 the term "applicant" refers to a person applying for initial certification or licensure. The Board should clarify this subsection with regards to the use of "applicant."

Chapter 18. State Board of Medicine—Practitioners other than Medical Doctors

Subchapter J. Perfusionists

10. Section 18.603. Application for perfusionist license.—Clarity.

Subsection (a)

The Board should amend this subsection to include the phrase "or cause to be submitted" similar to proposed Section 18.523(a)(1) since the verification of taking the mandated child abuse recognition and reporter training will be submitted electronically by the course provider.

11. Miscellaneous Clarity.

In RAF # 7, the Board should update the statutory citation for the CPSL to read "Child Protective Services Law (CPSL) (23 Pa.C.S. §§ 6301—6387)."

State Board of Nursing Regulation # 16A-5140 (IRRC # 3288)

Child Abuse Reporting Requirements March 31, 2021

We submit for your consideration the following comments on the proposed rulemaking published in the January 30, 2021 *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. Our comments are based on criteria in Section 5.2 of the Regulatory Review Act (71 P.S. § 745.5b). Section 5.1(a) of the Regulatory Review Act (71 P.S. § 745.5a(a)) directs the State Board of Nursing (Board) to respond to all comments received from us or any other source.

1. Implementation procedures; Clarity and lack of ambiguity.

The definition of "Board-regulated practitioner" in Section 21.501 (relating to definitions) includes certified registered nurse practitioners and clinical nurse specialists. We acknowledge that these certifications are held by registered nurses. However, the proposed rulemaking does not amend the application and continuing education requirements for these certifications in Chapter 21, Subchapters C and H (relating to certified registered nurse practitioners; and clinical nurse specialists). We ask the Board to explain how child abuse recognition and reporting training and continuing education requirements in 23 Pa.C.S. § 6383(b)(3)(i) and (ii) (relating to education and training) are implemented for these certifications. Further, we ask the Board to consider clarifying these subchapters in a future rulemaking by either adding child abuse recognition and reporting requirements or crossreferences to the applicable registered nurse regulations.

Section 21.20. Licensure by examination.—Implementation procedures; Clarity and lack of ambiguity.

This section requires an applicant for licensure as a registered nurse to "submit proof of completion" of at least 3 hours of approved training in child abuse recognition and reporting." (Emphasis added.) As explained in the Preamble and required by Section 21.509(b)(13) (relating to child abuse recognition and reporting course approval process), an approved course provider reports participation/ attendance electronically to the Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs (Bureau). We ask the Board to revise this section to clarify that the approved course provider electronically reports proof of attendance/ completion.

This comment also applies to Sections 21.28(f), 21.131(d) and (e), 21.150, 21.155(f) and 21.723(b)(3).

3. Section 21.501. Definitions.—Clarity and lack of ambiguity.

Perpetrator

Subparagraphs (i)(D) and (ii)(D) of the definition of "perpetrator" limit this term to individuals of certain ages who are responsible for a child's welfare. However, the specifically-defined term "person responsible for the child's welfare" is not used. To improve clarity, we ask the Board to revise the definition of "perpetrator" to use the term defined in this section.

Serious physical neglect

The definition of "serious physical neglect" does not include the phrase "when committed by a perpetrator" as specified in the definition of this term in 23 Pa.C.S. § 6303 (relating to definitions). We ask the Board to revise this definition to include the omitted language.

4. Section 21.502. Suspected child abuse—mandated reporting requirements.—Protection of the public health, safety and welfare; Clarity and lack of ambiguity.

Subsection (a) requires a Board-regulated practitioner to report suspected child abuse when there is "reasonable cause to suspect that a child is a victim of child abuse" under a set of circumstances derived from 23 Pa.C.S. § 6311(b)(1) (relating to persons required to report suspected child abuse). This subsection does not include the responsibilities under 23 Pa.C.S. § 6311(b)(2) and (3) to report suspected child abuse when certain information is not known. To protect the public health, safety and welfare, the Board should add the omitted statutory provisions or explain why it is unnecessary to do so.

5. Section 21.503. Photographs, medical tests and X-rays of child subject to report.—Clarity and lack of ambiguity.

Under this section, a Board-regulated practitioner is required to send "[m]edical summaries or reports of the photographs, X-rays and relevant medical tests taken" to the county children and youth social service agency after the written or electronic report is submitted. Under 23 Pa.C.S. § 6314 (relating to photographs, medical tests and X-rays of child subject to report), these materials "shall be made available to law enforcement officials in the course of investigating cases." For consistency, the Board should add the statutory requirement to make these materials available to law enforcement officials or explain why it is not necessary to do so.

 Section 21.508. Child abuse recognition and reporting—mandatory training requirement.— Implementation procedures; Clarity and lack of ambiguity.

Subsection (a)

Subsection (a) requires an individual applying for initial licensure to complete at least three hours of training in child abuse recognition and reporting requirements. This subsection does not address documentation and reporting of completion of training as required under 23 Pa.C.S. § 6383(b)(3)(i). We ask the Board to revise this subsection to include the implementation procedures for submission of proof of training by an approved course provider.

Subsection (b)

Subsection (b) states that the "Board will not renew a license unless the Bureau has received an electronic report from an approved course provider documenting the attendance/participation by the licensee in an approved course or the licensee has obtained an exemption under subsection (c)." Section 21.131(b) (relating to continuing education) provides that a registered nurse "will not be required to meet the continuing education requirement on the first renewal immediately following licensure." We ask the Board to explain how it will implement the child abuse recognition and reporting continuing education requirements for registered nurses who are exempt from continuing education following initial licensure.

Subsection (c)

Under subsection (c), an applicant or licensee may apply for an exemption from subsection (a) or (b). Paragraph (3) directs an applicant or licensee to submit documentation demonstrating that the individual "should not be subject to the training or continuing education requirement." A request for exemption is "considered on a case-by-case basis." We have three concerns. First, the standards for documentation and evaluation are vague. Second, this subsection does not specify if the exemption is limited to one biennial renewal period. Third, the process for notification of approval or denial is not stated. We ask the Board to explain the standards for sufficient documentation and the evaluation process for reviewing a request for exemption, including if there is a time frame for completion of training prior to applying for an exemption. We also ask the Board to considering clarifying this subsection to state the time period of the exemption and the process for notifying applicants and licensees.

7. Section 21.721. Qualifications for licensure.— Implementation procedures; Clarity and lack of ambiguity.

Subsection (c) requires an applicant for licensure as a dietitian-nutritionist to "submit complete at least 3 hours of training in child abuse recognition and reporting." (Emphasis added.) As addressed in Comment # 1, since the approved course provider electronically reports participation/attendance the Bureau, this subsection should be revised to delete "submit."

8. Miscellaneous clarity.

- We identified the following clarity issues in Section 21.501:
- o In the definition of "mandated reporter," the reference to "chapter" should be corrected to "subchapter."
- o In subparagraph (i)(F) of the definition of "perpetrator," the phrase "by birth or adoption of the child" should be corrected to "by birth or adoption to the child."

- o In the definition of "recent act or failure to act," the phrase "act of failure" should be corrected to "act or failure."
- The reference to "subparagraph" in Section 21.502(c)(1) (relating to suspected child abuse—mandated reporting requirements) should be corrected to "paragraph."
- In Section 21.507(b)(4) (relating to noncompliance), the phrase "convicted of a prior offense under § 6319" should be revised to cross-reference 23 Pa.C.S. § 6319. (Emphasis added.)
- In Section 21.603(b) (relating to applications), "applicant for a volunteer licensee" should be corrected to "applicant for a volunteer license."
- Section 21.605 (relating to biennial renewal) should be revised to cross-reference 35 P.S. \$ 449.46(c). (Emphasis added.)
- We identified the following clarity issues in the Regulatory Analysis Form:
- o The citation to the Child Protective Services Law in Question # 7 should be updated to 23 Pa.C.S. §§ 6301—6387. (Emphasis added.)
- o The citation to The Professional Nursing Law in Question # 8 should be corrected to 63 P.S. § 212.1(k). (Emphasis added.)
- o The number of volunteer applicants and licensees should be included in responses to Questions # 15, 16, 18 and 19.

Tentative Order

By the Commission:

The Commission's regulations at 52 Pa. Code § 54.40(a) state that an Electric Generation Supplier (EGS) license will not be issued or remain in force until the licensee furnishes a bond or other security approved by the Commission. In addition, 52 Pa. Code § 54.40(d) states that the maintenance of an EGS license is contingent on the licensee providing proof to the Commission that a bond or other approved security in the amount directed by the Commission has been obtained.

Each EGS must file an original bond, letter of credit, continuation certificate, amendment, or other approved financial instrument with Rosemary Chiavetta, Secretary, Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission, 400 North Street, Harrisburg, PA, 17120, prior to the EGS's current security expiration date. Each financial instrument must be an original document that displays a "wet" signature or digital signature, preferably in blue ink, and displays a "raised seal" or original notary stamp. The name of the principal on the original financial instrument must match exactly with the name that appears on the EGS's license issued by the Commission.

Failure to file before the financial security's expiration date may cause Commission staff to initiate a formal proceeding that may lead to the following: cancellation of each company's electric supplier license, removal of each company's information from the Commission's website and notification to all electric distribution companies, in which each company is licensed to do business, of the cancellation of the license.

While we recognize that the COVID-19 pandemic has provided some challenges related to the continuance of normal business operations, it is imperative that the Commission have an approved financial security in place with each EGS to ensure compliance with 52 Pa. Code § 54.40(d). On March 25, 2020, Commission staff issued an EGS Financial Security Filing Guidance Memo (Guidance Memo) that stated the following:

- Where practical, EGSs should file an original bond, letter of credit, continuation certificate, amendment, or other financial instrument. These original financial instruments should display "wet" signatures or digital signatures, preferably in blue ink, and display a "raised seal" or original notary stamp.
- EGSs should email a copy of the original financial instrument directly to Secretary Chiavetta at rchiavetta@pa.gov. Secretary Chiavetta has waived the restriction on emailed filings that contain confidential and proprietary material. As such, financial security instruments will be permitted to be filed by email for the duration of the Commission's work from home order.
- If an EGS is unable to acquire a "raised seal" or original notary stamp on the financial security during the pendency of the COVID-19 emergency, the Secretary's Bureau will not reject the financial security.
- If an EGS has been granted a reduction in its financial security, and it is time to renew the annual

reduction, please file an original annual compliance filing with the Secretary's Bureau and a copy via email at rchiavetta@pa.gov.

Please note that the requirement that EGSs maintain a valid financial security on file with the Commission, remains in effect.

Be advised that emailed financial security instruments—after review and acceptance of the Secretary's Bureau and the Bureau of Technical Utility Services—will be provisionally approved by the Commission until Commission staff resume working in the Keystone Building. EGSs must still mail the original bond with original signatures and notary stamp as per the Commission's normal practice.

On July 27, 2020, the Commission issued a Secretarial Letter which modified certain filing and service requirements. 1 Specifically, this Secretarial Letter amended the Emergency Order issued on March 20, 2020, at Docket No. M-2020-3019262 regarding the filing of certain confidential documents. At the time the Emergency Order was issued, the Commission did not have access to its physical location. However, since that time the Commission has secured limited access to its place of business. Under these circumstances and consistent with the authority provided to the Secretary by the Emergency Order, the Secretarial Letter requires that confidential filings made pursuant to 52 Pa. Code § 54.40(a) (EGS financial securities), must be filed with the Secretary by overnight delivery and are not to be filed electronically with the Secretary.

As of March 16, 2021, each EGS listed in the Supplier Table below has not provided proof to the Commission that it has a bond or other approved security in the amount or language directed by the Commission, to replace a bond which is expired or which is non-compliant with Commission regulations.

As part of its EGS license validation procedures, the Commission's Bureau of Technical Utility Services sent a 90-day Security Renewal Notice email to each entity in the Supplier Table above stating that original documentation of a bond, or other approved security in the amount or language directed by the Commission, must be filed within 30-days prior to each entity's security expiration

date. None of the companies listed in the Supplier Table provided the required documentation.

Based on the above facts, we tentatively conclude that the EGSs listed in the Supplier Table are not in compliance with 52 Pa. Code § 54.40(a) and (d) and therefore it is appropriate to initiate the cancellation process for the

EGS license of each company listed in the Supplier Table, without the necessity of a formal complaint, as being in the public interest; *Therefore*,

It Is Ordered That:

- 1. Cancellation of the Electric Generation Supplier License of each company listed in the Supplier Table is hereby tentatively approved as being in the public interest.
- 2. The Secretary serve a copy of this Tentative Order upon the Office of Consumer Advocate, the Office of Small Business Advocate, the Bureau of Investigation & Enforcement, all electric distribution companies, all of the Electric Generation Suppliers in the Supplier Table and publish a copy of this Tentative Order in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* with a 30-day comment period.
- 3. The Secretary serve a copy of this Tentative Order upon the Pennsylvania Department of Revenue—Bureau of Compliance, Business License Clearance Division.
- 4. Absent the filing of adverse public comment or the filing of an approved security within 30-days after publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, the Bureau of Technical Utility Services shall prepare a Final Order for entry by the Secretary.
- 5. Upon entry of the Final Order, EGSs that remain listed as not in compliance with 52 Pa. Code § 54.40(a) and (d) will be stricken from all active utility lists maintained by the Commission's Bureau of Technical Utility Services and the Assessment Section of the Bureau of Administration, removed from the Commission's website, and notifications be sent to all electric distribution companies in which the Electric Generation Suppliers are licensed to do business.
- 6. Upon entry of the Final Order described in Ordering Paragraph No. 4, each electric distribution company in which the Electric Generation Suppliers are licensed to do business, shall return the customers of the Electric Generation Suppliers to default service.
