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Pennsylvania Bulletin

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the official gazette of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. It is published weekly. A cumulative subject matter index is published quarterly.

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* serves several purposes. It is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, which is the official codification of agency rules and regulations, Statewide court rules, and other statutorily authorized documents. Changes in the codified text, whether by adoption, amendment, rescission, repeal or emergency action, must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

The following documents are published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*: Governor's Executive Orders; Summaries of Enacted Statutes; Statewide and Local Court Rules; Attorney General Opinions; Motor Carrier Applications before the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission; Applications and Actions before the Department of Environmental Protection; Orders of the Independent Regulatory Review Commission; and other documents authorized by law.

The text of certain documents published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the only valid and enforceable text. Courts are required to take judicial notice of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Adoption, Amendment or Repeal of Regulations

Generally an agency wishing to adopt, amend or rescind regulations must first publish in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* a Proposed Rulemaking. There are limited instances when the agency may omit the proposal step; it still must publish the adopted version.

The Proposed Rulemaking contains the full text of the change, the agency contact person, a fiscal note required by law and background for the action.

The agency then allows sufficient time for public comment before taking final action. A Final Rulemaking must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* before the changes can take effect. If the agency wishes to adopt changes to the Proposed Rulemaking to enlarge the scope, it must repropose.

Citation to the Pennsylvania Bulletin

Cite material in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* by volume number, a page number and date. Example: Volume 1, *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, page 801, January 9, 1971 (short form: 1 Pa.B. 801 (January 9, 1971)).

Pennsylvania Code

The *Pennsylvania Code* is the official codification of rules and regulations issued by Commonwealth agencies, Statewide court rules and other statutorily authorized documents. The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, printing changes when they are adopted. These changes are then permanently codified by the *Pennsylvania Code Reporter*, a monthly, loose-leaf supplement.

The *Pennsylvania Code* is cited by title number and section number. Example: Title 10 *Pennsylvania Code* § 1.1 (short form: 10 Pa. Code § 1.1).

Under the *Pennsylvania Code* codification system, each regulation is assigned a unique number by title and section. Titles roughly parallel the organization of Commonwealth government.

Search for your area of interest in the *Pennsylvania Code*. The *Pennsylvania Code* is available at www.pacodeandbulletin.gov.

Source Notes give the history of regulations. To see if there have been recent changes not yet codified, check the List of *Pennsylvania Code* Chapters Affected in the most recent issue of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Proposed new chapters and rules are printed in regular type to enhance readability.

Fiscal Notes

Section 612 of The Administrative Code of 1929 (71 P. S. § 232) requires the Governor's Budget Office to prepare a fiscal note for regulatory actions and administrative procedures of the administrative departments, boards, commissions and authorities receiving money from the State Treasury. The fiscal note states whether the action or procedure causes a loss of revenue or an increase in the cost of programs for the Commonwealth or its political subdivisions. The fiscal note is required to be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* at the same time as the change is advertised.

A fiscal note provides the following information: (1) the designation of the fund out of which the appropriation providing for expenditures under the action or procedure shall be made; (2) the probable cost for the fiscal year the program is implemented; (3) projected cost estimate of the program for each of the 5 succeeding fiscal years; (4) fiscal history of the program for which expenditures are to be made; (5) probable loss of revenue for the fiscal year of its implementation; (6) projected loss of revenue from the program for each of the 5 succeeding fiscal years; (7) line item, if any, of the General Appropriation Act or other appropriation act out of which expenditures or losses of Commonwealth funds shall occur as a result of the action or procedures; and (8) recommendation, if any, of the Secretary of the Budget and the reasons therefor.

The omission of an item indicates that the agency text of the fiscal note states that there is no information available with respect thereto. In items (3) and (6) information is set forth for the first through fifth fiscal years, following the year the program is implemented, which is stated. In item (4) information is set forth for the current and two immediately preceding years. In item (8) the recommendation, if any, made by the Secretary of the Budget is published with the fiscal note. "No fiscal impact" means no additional cost or revenue loss to the Commonwealth or its local political subdivision is intended. See 4 Pa. Code Chapter 7, Subchapter R (relating to fiscal notes).

Reproduction, Dissemination or Publication of Information

Third parties may not take information from the *Pennsylvania Code* and *Pennsylvania Bulletin* and reproduce, disseminate or publish information except as provided by 1 Pa. Code § 3.44:

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Information published under this part, which information includes, but is not limited to, cross references, tables of cases, notes of decisions, tables of contents, indexes, source notes, authority notes, numerical lists and codification guides, other than the actual text of rules or regulations may be reproduced only with the written consent of the [Legislative Reference] Bureau. The information which appears on the same leaf with the text of a rule or regulation, however, may be incidentally reproduced in connection with the reproduction of the rule or regulation, if the reproduction is for the private use of a subscriber and not for resale. There are no other restrictions on the reproduction of information published under this part, and the Common-wealth hereby consents to a reproduction.

PROPOSED RULEMAKING

STATE BOARD OF VEHICLE MANUFACTURERS, DEALERS AND SALESPERSONS

[49 PA. CODE CH. 19]

Fee Increase

The State Board of Vehicle Manufacturers, Dealers and Salespersons (Board) proposes to amend § 19.4 (relating to fees) to read as set forth in Annex A. This proposed rulemaking provides for increased application fees and biennial renewal fees for vehicle salespersons, factory representatives or distributor representatives, manufacturers, manufacturer branches, distributors, dealers, auction and dealer branches.

Effective Date

The amendments will be effective upon final-form publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. It is anticipated that application fees will be implemented on a graduated basis on July 1, 2023, and on July 1, 2025.

The increased biennial renewal fees will be implemented beginning with the June 1, 2023—May 31, 2025 biennial renewal period. Thereafter, the subsequent graduated increase will be implemented with the biennial renewal for June 1, 2025—May 31, 2027.

Statutory Authority

Under section 302(a)(9) of the Board of Vehicles Act (act) (63 P.S. § 818.302(a)(9)), the Board is authorized to adopt, promulgate and enforce such rules and regulations consistent with the act as are deemed necessary and proper to effectuate the provisions of the act. Section 304 of act (63 P.S. § 818.304) requires license holders to pay a biennial renewal fee. Section 321(c) of act (63 P.S. § 818.321(c)) requires applications for licensure to be accompanied by the required fee. Under section 330(a) of the act (63 P.S. § 818.330(a)), all fees shall be fixed by the Board by regulation and shall be subject to review in accordance with the Regulatory Review Act (71 P.S. § 745.1—745.14). Section 330(a) further requires the Board to increase fees when revenues generated by fees, fines and civil penalties are insufficient to match expenditures over a 2-year period.

Background and Purpose

Section 330(a) of the act requires the Board to increase fees if the revenues generated by fees, fines and civil penalties imposed is not sufficient to meet the expenditures over a 2-year period. The Board raises approximately 85% of its revenue through initial application and renewal fees. The remaining 15% of its revenue comes from other fees, fines and civil penalties. The Board last increased its fees in 2007.

The Board receives an annual report from the Department of State's Bureau of Finance and Operations (BFO) regarding the Board's income and expenses. In Fiscal Year (FY) 2017-2018, the Board incurred \$2,963,270.71 in expenditures and generated only \$947,667.84 in revenue, with a remaining balance of \$1,130,724.10. In FY 2018-2019, the Board incurred \$3,153,485.29 in expenditures and generated \$4,584,031.19 in revenue, with a remaining balance of \$2,635,652.66. Finally, in FY 2019-2020, as of October 20, 2020, it was estimated that the Board would incur \$2,880,000.00 in expenditures and generate only \$594,639.35 in revenue, with a remaining balance of \$350,292.01. In FYs 2020-2021 and 2021-2022, the Board is projected to incur \$6.293 million in expenditures and generate \$4.939 million in revenue, with a deficit balance of (\$817,347.34) at the end of FY 2021-2022. In FY 2022-2023, the Board is projected to incur \$3.266 million in expenditures and generate \$3.19 million in revenue, resulting in a deficit balance of (\$76,347.34).

On November 27, 2019, the BFO advised the Board that it would be necessary to raise its application and biennial renewal fees for vehicle salespersons, factory representatives or distributor representatives, manufacturers, manufacturer branches, distributors, dealers, auction and dealer branches. As part of its annual report, the Board analyzed the cost of the Board's operations to determine if the current application fees reflected the actual cost of the services provided. While application fees only make up less than 15% of the Board's revenue, the Board, with the encouragement and support of the Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs (Bureau), determined that a re-evaluation of all application fees was appropriate. Actual cost calculations are based upon the following formula:

number of minutes to perform the function

pay rate for the classification of the personnel performing the function

a proportionate share of administrative overhead

Application fees are based on time study reports created within the Bureau giving each step in the process and the amount of time it takes to process one application. That amount is multiplied by the anticipated application requests for 1 year (times two since the increases are biennial). Application fee increases, which will be effective July 1, 2023, are calculated at a 9.5% increase as pay increases for staff that process applications are 2.5%in July and 2.25% in January or 4.75% annually (9.5% biennially) and the fees are primarily dependent upon personnel-related costs. The analysis determined that the current application fees do not accurately reflect the actual cost of processing the following applications: vehicle salespersons, factory representatives or distributor representatives, manufacturers, manufacturer branches, distributors, dealers, auction and dealer branches.

During the BFO's presentation to the Board on November 27, 2019, the BFO reported that the new application and biennial renewal fee structure is projected to produce biennial revenues of: \$6.500 million in FYs 2022-2023 and 2023-2024, which will allow the Board to meet or exceed its projected expenditures of \$6.482 million; biennial revenues of \$7.895 million in FYs 2024-2025 and 2025-2026, which will allow the Board to meet or exceed its projected expenditures of \$6.829 million, and will result in a positive remaining balance of \$266,652.66 in FY 2025-2026.

Accordingly, the BFO recommended, and the Board agreed, to amend a total of 16 fees, consisting of 8 application fees and 8 biennial renewal fees on a graduated basis.

On August 6, 2020, the Board released an exposure draft of a proposed annex reflecting proposed increases for application and biennial renewal fees and invited stakeholders to submit comments. As a result of the Board's exposure draft, one comment was received from a stakeholder. Specifically, on August 17, 2020, the Pennsylvania Automotive Association (PAA) submitted a comment to proposed fee increases, expressing their concern as to the amount of the increase to the fees that the Board was proposing. The Board discussed PAA's concerns and noted that the fee increase amount is based upon recommendations made by the BFO and is necessary to support the Board's expenditures. While the Board appreciates the concerns relating to increasing fees, especially during the novel coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic, the Board has provided sufficient time for licensees to plan for and adjust to the increased fees, as the increases would not go into effect until 2023.

As a part of the BFO's fee increase recommendations, the BFO recommended graduated application and biennial renewal fee increases so that the application fee increases are reflective of actual costs to process applications and biennial renewal fees coincide more closely with the projected expenses for each biennium. The Board adopted the graduated fee schedule in an effort to minimize the impact of fee increases to licensees and to ensure that fee increases only occur when it is fiscally necessary to do so.

The Board proposes to amend the term "factory" to manufacturer in § 19.4 of the regulation. The Board would note that "factory" is an outdated term that was used interchangeably in the past with the term "manufacturer." The term "factory" is no longer used within the industry and deleting it would allow the Board to update its terminology and provide consistency between the initial application fee section and the renewal fee section of § 19.4 of the regulations. Finally, the Board proposes adding the word "lot" to the term "dealer branch license" in the license renewal fees and the word "distributor" to the term "manufacturer branch license" in the initial license application fees to ensure consistency of terms throughout § 19.4.

Proposed Initial Application Fees

As set forth as follows and in § 19.4, the proposed graduated increases will impact applicants as follows:

Manufacturer or Distributor Representatives and Salespeople

The Board receives approximately 600 manufacturer or distributor representative applications and 11,000 vehicle salespeople applications per biennial period. The graduated application fee increases will generate additional revenue as follows:

FY 2022-2023 through FY 2023-2024: The fee increase from \$25 to \$65 will generate an additional \$464,000 in application fees.

FY 2024-2025 through FY 2025-2026: The fee increase from 65 to 70 will generate an additional 58,000 in application fees.

Vehicle Dealers, Dealer Branch Lot and Vehicle Auctions

The Board receives approximately 900 vehicle dealer applications, 100 dealer branch lot applications and 10 vehicle auction applications per biennial period. The graduated application fee increases will generate additional revenue as follows:

FY 2022-2023 through FY 2023-2024: The fee increase from 65 to 175 will generate an additional 111,100 in application fees.

FY 2024-2025 through FY 2025-2026: The fee increase from 175 to 190 will generate an additional 15,150 in application fees.

Vehicle Manufacturer, Manufacturer Branch, Distributor and Distributor Branch

The Board receives approximately 50 vehicle manufacturer applications, 2 manufacturer or distributor branch applications and 40 vehicle distributor applications per biennial period. The graduated application fee increases will generate additional revenue as follows:

FY 2022-2023 through FY 2023-2024: The fee increase from 330 to 90 will generate an additional 5,520 in application fees.

FY 2024-2025 through FY 2025-2026: The fee increase from 90 to 100 will generate an additional 920 in application fees.

Proposed Biennial Renewal Fees

As set forth as follows and in § 19.4, the proposed graduated increases will impact licensees, registrants and certificate holders as follows:

Vehicle Dealer

There are approximately 6,576 vehicle dealers who will be impacted by the proposed biennial renewal fee increases. The graduated biennial renewal fee increases will generate additional revenue as follows:

FY 2022-2023: The fee increase from \$175 to \$219 will generate an additional \$289,344 in revenue.

FY 2024-2025: The fee increase from \$219 to \$274 will generate an additional \$361,680 in revenue.

Vehicle Salesperson

There are approximately 31,300 vehicle salespeople who will be impacted by the proposed biennial renewal fee increases. The graduated biennial renewal fee increases will generate additional revenue as follows:

FY 2022-2023: The fee increase from \$90 to \$113 will generate an additional \$719,900 in revenue.

FY 2024-2025: The fee increase from \$113 to \$141 will generate an additional \$876,400 in revenue.

Dealer Branch Lot

There are approximately 389 vehicle dealer branches that will be impacted by the proposed biennial renewal fee increases. The graduated biennial renewal fee increases will generate additional revenue as follows:

FY 2022-2023: The fee increase from \$175 to \$219 will generate an additional \$17,116 in revenue.

FY 2024-2025: The fee increase from \$219 to \$274 will generate an additional \$21,395 in revenue.

Vehicle Auction

There are approximately 57 vehicle auctions that will be impacted by the proposed biennial renewal fee increases. The graduated biennial renewal fee increases will generate additional revenue as follows:

FY 2022-2023: The fee increase from \$175 to \$219 will generate an additional \$2,508 in revenue.

FY 2024-2025: The fee increase from \$219 to \$274 will generate an additional \$3,135 in revenue.

Vehicle Manufacturer

There are approximately 284 vehicle manufacturers that will be impacted by the proposed biennial renewal fee increases. The graduated biennial renewal fee increases will generate additional revenue as follows:

FY 2022-2023: The fee increase from \$250 to \$313 will generate an additional \$17,892 in revenue.

FY 2024-2025: The fee increase from \$313 to \$391 will generate an additional \$22,152 in revenue.

Vehicle Manufacturer or Distributor Branch

There are approximately 14 vehicle manufacturer or distributor branches that will be impacted by the proposed biennial renewal fee increases. The graduated biennial renewal fee increases will generate additional revenue as follows:

FY 2022-2023: The fee increase from \$175 to \$219 will generate an additional \$616 in revenue.

FY 2024-2025: The fee increase from \$219 to \$274 will generate an additional \$770 in revenue.

Vehicle Manufacturer or Distributor Representative

There are approximately 11,684 vehicle manufacturer or distributor representatives who will be impacted by the proposed biennial renewal fee increases. The graduated biennial renewal fee increases will generate additional revenue as follows:

FY 2022-2023: The fee increase from \$90 to \$113 will generate an additional \$268,732 in revenue.

FY 2024-2025: The fee increase from \$113 to \$141 will generate an additional \$327,152 in revenue.

Vehicle Distributor

There are approximately 56 vehicle distributors that will be impacted by the proposed biennial renewal fee increases. The graduated biennial renewal fee increases will generate additional revenue as follows:

FY 2022-2023: The fee increase from \$175 to \$219 will generate an additional \$2,464 in revenue.

FY 2024-2025: The fee increase from \$219 to \$274 will generate an additional \$3,080 in revenue.

Fiscal Impact and Paperwork Requirements.

The proposed amendments will increase the application and biennial renewal fees for all licensees of the Board. There are approximately 14 manufacturer or distributor branches; 57 vehicle auctions; 389 vehicle dealer branches; 6,576 vehicle dealers; 56 vehicle distributors; 284 vehicle manufacturers; 1,164 vehicle manufacturer or distributor representatives and 31,300 vehicle salespersons for a total of approximately 39,840 licensees who will be required to pay more to renew their licenses. Based upon the previously listed fee increases, the total economic impact per fiscal year is as follows:

FY 2022-2023:	\$1,608,882
FY 2023-2024:	\$290,310
FY 2024-2025:	\$1,652,799
FY 2025-2026:	\$37,035
TOTAL:	\$3,589,026

These fees may be paid by applicants and licensees or an employer may elect to pay the application fee of an employee. This proposed rulemaking should have no other fiscal impact on the private sector, the general public or political subdivisions of the Commonwealth.

This proposed rulemaking will require the Board to alter initial licensure applications and biennial renewal forms to reflect the new fees; however, the amendments will not create additional paperwork for the regulated community or for the private sector.

Sunset Date

The Board continuously monitors the effectiveness of its regulations. Therefore, no sunset date has been assigned. Additionally, the BFO provides the Board with an annual report detailing the Board's financial condition. In this way, the Board continuously monitors the adequacy of its fee schedule.

Regulatory Review

Under section 5(a) of the Regulatory Review Act (71 P.S. § 745.5(a)), on May 26, 2021, the Board submitted a copy of this proposed rulemaking and a copy of a Regulatory Analysis Form to the Independent Regulatory Review Commission (IRRC) and to the Chairpersons of the House Professional Licensure Committee and the Senate Consumer Protection and Professional Licensure Committee. A copy of this material is available to the public upon request.

Under section 5(g) of the Regulatory Review Act, IRRC may convey any comments, recommendations or objections to the proposed rulemaking within 30 days from the close of the public comment period. The comments, recommendations or objections must specify the regulatory review criteria in section 5.2 of the Regulatory Review Act (71 P.S. § 745.5b) which have not been met. The Regulatory Review Act specifies detailed procedures for review, prior to final publication of the rulemaking, by the Board, the General Assembly and the Governor.

Public Comment

Interested persons are invited to submit written comments, recommendations or objections regarding this proposed rulemaking to the Board Counsel, State Board of Vehicle Manufacturers, Dealers and Salespersons, P.O. Maximum Lawful Rate of Interest for Residential Mortgages for the Month of July 2021

The Department of Banking and Securities (Department), under the authority contained in section 301 of the act of January 30, 1974 (P.L. 13, No. 6) (41 P.S. § 301), determines that the maximum lawful rate of interest for residential mortgages for the month of July 2021, is 4 1/2%.

The interest rate limitations under the Commonwealth's usury statute were pre-empted to a great extent by Federal law, the Depository Institutions Deregulation and Monetary Control Act of 1980 (Pub.L. No. 96-221). Further pre-emption was instituted with the signing of Pub.L. No. 96-399, which overrode State interest rate limitations on any individual who finances the sale or exchange of residential real property which the individual owns and which the individual occupies or has occupied as his principal residence.

Each month the Department is required by State law to compute and announce the ceiling rate on residential mortgages in this Commonwealth. This maximum rate is determined by adding 2.50 percentage points to the yield rate on long-term government bonds as published by the Federal Reserve Board or the United States Treasury, or both. The latest yield rate on long-term government securities is 2.05 to which was added 2.50 percentage points for a total of 4.55 that by law is rounded off to the nearest quarter at 4 1/2%.

Substantial Amendments for the Community Development Block Grant-Disaster Recovery 2012 (P.L. 112-55) and 2013 (P.L. 113-2) Allocations/ Modification to the Citizen Participation Plan/ Public Hearing

Notice is hereby given for a public comment period to review the proposed substantial amendments to the Commonwealth's Fiscal year (FY) 2012 Community Development Block Grant-Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) (P.L. 112-55) funds and FY 2013 Community Development Block Grant-Disaster Recovery (P.L. 113-2) funds. The public comment period is from June 12, 2021, through July 12, 2021.

P.L. 112-55

The United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) issued a notice at 77 FR 22583 (April 16, 2012), which awarded \$27,142,501 of CDBG-DR funds to the Commonwealth to be administered by the Department of Community and Economic Development (Department). This was the first allocation of CDBG-DR funding to assist the Commonwealth with recovery from 2011 storm events (Hurricane Irene—FEMA-4025-DR and Tropical Storm Lee—FEMA-4030-DR). An Action Plan for these funds was submitted and subsequently approved. Since then the Department has published and received approval for six Substantial Amendments to the Action Plan for the CDBG-DR funding received under P.L. 112-55. Priorities for funding were identified in the last Substantial Amendment which was approved by HUD on June 12, 2018.

The Commonwealth is hereby notifying the public of the award of specific projects in the affected municipalities identified and prioritized and soliciting comments on the announcements.

The changes proposed by the 7th Substantial Amendment to be dated July 27, 2021, are as follows:

Acquisition and Clearance (Buyout Program)

• *Montour County*—\$352,000 for the county to acquire and demolish three repetitively flooded properties which are located outside of the protection of the levee system in Danville Borough.

• *Columbia County*—\$2,957,348.90 for the county to acquire and demolish 22 properties which have been identified as being located in a floodway, flood-prone area or have experienced severe repetitive loss or repetitive loss as a result of past flooding events.

• Lycoming County—\$912,000 for the county to acquire and demolish six properties in Muncy Borough, which have been identified as repetitive loss or severe repetitive loss properties.

New Housing Construction

• Columbia County—\$3,125,438 to construct nine condominiums available to low-income and moderate-income persons located on the existing Mills housing campus in Bloomsburg.

Multifamily Rental Program

• Wyoming County—\$2,458,747 to construct 16 rental units in Nicholson Borough designed for elderly persons, which are presumed to be low-income and moderateincome persons. Additional funds are being provided from P.L. 113-2 allocation. Total projected project costs are \$3,309,074.

Infrastructure

• Town of Bloomsburg—\$445,000 for the improvement of the Honeysuckle Lane Stormwater Mitigation System, which provide benefit to the entire low-income and moderate-income town.

Planning

• Pennsylvania Emergency Management Agency (PEMA)—\$100,000 to update the State Recovery Plan. The staff at PEMA have determined the original plan needs to be updated to include the Pennsylvania Business Emergency Operations Center and the splitting Recovery Support Function-6 into two distinct RSFs: RSF-6— Natural and Environmental Recovery and RSF-&— Cultural and Historical Recovery. In addition, the county recovery template would be updated to reflect the current revision to emphasize the new FEMA Community Lifeline resilience needs of communities.

P.L. 113-2

The Commonwealth received \$29,986,000 from HUD under the Disaster Relief Appropriations Act, 2013 (P.L. 113-2, approved January 29, 2013). This was the second allocation of CDBG-DR funding to assist the Commonwealth with recovery from storm events in 2011 (Hurricane Irene—FEMA-4025-DR and Tropical Storm Lee— FEMA-4030-DR). The Action Plan guiding the distribution of the \$29,986,000 appropriation was published on August 30, 2013. Since then, the Department has published and received approval for four Substantial Amendments to the Action Plan. Priorities for funding of specific project types were identified in the previous Substantial Amendment which was approved by HUD on June 12, 2018.

The Commonwealth is hereby notifying the public of the award of specific projects in the affected municipalities identified and prioritized and soliciting comment on the announcements. The following information details the awards under P.L. 113-2 appropriation to reflect updated strategic priorities of the Commonwealth.

The changes proposed by the 5th Substantial Amendment to be dated July 27, 2021, are as follows:

Multifamily Rental Program

• Wyoming County—\$850,327 to construct 16 rental units in Nicholson Borough designed for elderly persons, which are presumed to be low-income and moderateincome persons. Additional funds are being provided from the P.L. 112-55 allocation. Total project costs are \$3,309,074.

Infrastructure

• *Schuylkill County*—\$2,798,969.84 to continue wetlands restoration to mitigate the future impacts of flooding in Pine Grove Borough along the Swatara Creek. The project will qualify under the Urgent Need National objective.

Planning

• *PEMA*—\$100,000 for planning activities to ensure effective recovery from future disasters. Funds are being allocated for a study of users and nonusers of flood insurance to determine how best to communicate with consumers the importance of and the benefits of flood insurance coverage for protection of properties in flood prone areas. PEMA will engage with the Pennsylvania State University to collaborate on this study and make recommendations for future communication strategies.

Modification to the Citizen Participation Process for the Consolidated Plan and Action Plan

Other Special Project Grants or Emergency Declaration

In the event that other Federal special programs are awarded to the Commonwealth or if an emergency declaration is made that affects the administration of the existing Federal programs, that are authorized under the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended (42 U.S.C.A. §§ 5301-5322), Cranston-Gonzales National Affordable Housing Act of 1990, as amended (42 U.S.C.A. §§ 12701-12713) or McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act 1987, as amended (42 U.S.C.A. §§ 11301-11435), and administered by the Department, the citizen participation requirements will be followed in accordance with either the statute or regulations set forth in the program. If HUD may allow for or provides opportunities to request waivers to specific elements of the citizen participation process the Department will determine whether a waiver is necessary and seek use of the waiver authority in accordance with information provided by HUD. Once the waiver is granted by HUD to the Commonwealth, the special conditions will be passed to its grantees, if necessary, to streamline the citizen participation process in accordance with the regulations in place.

To take advantage of the granted waiver authority, the grantee must amend their Citizen Participation Plan to meet the minimum standards included in the waiver if the required action is not already covered in their Citizen Participation Plan.

MINING ACTIVITY NPDES DRAFT PERMITS

This notice provides information about applications for a new, amended or renewed NPDES permits associated with mining activity (coal or noncoal) permits. The applications concern industrial waste (mining) discharges to surface water and discharges of stormwater associated with mining activities. This notice is provided in accordance with 25 Pa. Code Chapters 91 and 92a and 40 CFR Part 122, implementing provisions of The Clean Streams Law (35 P.S. §§ 691.1—691.1001) and the Federal Clean Water Act (33 U.S.C.A. §§ 1251—1376).

The Department of Environmental Protection (Department) has prepared a draft NPDES permit and made a tentative determination to issue the NPDES permit in conjunction with the associated mining activity permit.

Effluent Limits for Coal Mining Activities

For coal mining activities, NPDES permits, when issued, will contain effluent limits that are the more stringent of technology-based (BAT) effluent limitations or Water Quality Based Effluent Limits (WQBEL).

The BAT limits for coal mining activities, as provided in 40 CFR Part 434 and 25 Pa. Code Chapters 87–90 are as follows:

A settleable solids instantaneous maximum limit of 0.5 ml/l applies to: surface runoff (resulting from a precipitation event of less than or equal to a 10-year 24-hour event) from active mining areas; active areas disturbed by coal refuse disposal activities; mined areas backfilled and revegetated; and all other discharges and drainage (resulting from a precipitation event of greater than 1-year 24-hour to less than or equal to a 10-year 24-hour event) from coal refuse disposal piles. Similarly, modified BAT limits apply to iron, manganese and suspended solids in surface runoff, discharges and drainage resulting from these precipitation events and those of greater magnitude in accordance with 25 Pa. Code §§ 87.102, 88.92, 88.187, 88.292, 89.52 and 90.102.

Exceptions to BAT effluent limits may be applicable in accordance with 25 Pa. Code §§ 87.102, 88.92, 88.187, 88.292, 89.52 and 90.102.

Effluent Limits for Noncoal Mining Activities

The limits for noncoal mining activities as provided in 25 Pa. Code Chapter 77 are pH 6 to 9 and other parameters the Department may require.

Discharges from noncoal mines located in some geologic settings (for example, in the coal fields) may require additional water quality based effluent limits. If additional effluent limits are needed for an NPDES permit associated with a noncoal mining permit, then the permit description specifies the parameters.

In addition to BAT or WQBEL limits, coal and noncoal NPDES permits establish effluent limitations in the form of implemented Best Management Practices (BMPs) identified in the associated Erosion and Sedimentation Plan, the Reclamation Plan and the NPDES permit application. These BMPs restrict the rates and quantities of associated pollutants from being discharged into surface waters in this Commonwealth.

More restrictive effluent limitations, restrictions on discharge volume or restrictions on the extent of mining that may occur are incorporated into an NPDES permit when necessary for compliance with water quality standards and antidegradation requirements (in accordance with 25 Pa. Code Chapters 91—96).

The procedures for determining the final effluent limits, using a mass-balance equation or model, are found in Technical Guidance Document 563-2112-115, Developing National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Permits for Mining Activities. Other specific factors to be considered include public comments and Total Maximum Daily Load(s). Additional discharge limitations may apply in the event that unexpected discharges occur.

Discharge rates for surface mining activities are precipitation driven. Discharge rates for proposed discharges associated with underground mining are noted in the permit description.

Persons wishing to comment on an NPDES draft permit should submit a written statement to the Department at the address of the district mining office indicated before each draft permit within 30-days of this public notice. Comments received within the comment period will be considered in the final determinations regarding the NPDES permit applications. Comments must include the name, address and telephone number of the writer and a concise statement to inform the Department of the exact basis of a comment and the relevant facts upon which it is based.

The Department will also accept requests or petitions for a public hearing on NPDES permit applications, as provided in 25 Pa. Code § 92a.82(d). The request or petition for a public hearing shall be filed within 30-days of this public notice and contain the name, address, telephone number and the interest of the party filing the request and state the reasons why a hearing is warranted. A public hearing may be held if the Department considers the public interest significant. If a hearing is scheduled, a notice of the hearing on the NPDES permit application will be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* and a newspaper of general circulation within the relevant geographical area. When a public hearing is held, the Department will consider comments from the public hearing in the final determination on the NPDES permit application.

Appeals must be filed with the Board within 30 days of publication of this notice in the Pennsylvania Bulletin unless the appropriate statute provides a different time period. The Department of Environmental Protection (Department), under the authority of the Hazardous Sites Cleanup Act (HSCA) (35 P.S. §§ 6020.101-6020.1305) has initiated a prompt interim response at the Porter Elementary School Asbestos Site (Site), located at 1195 Rockville Road, New Bethlehem, PA 16242, approximately four miles northwest of New Bethlehem Borough. This response has been initiated pursuant to Sections 501(a) and 505(b) of the HSCA (35 P.S. §§ 6020.501(a) and 6020-505(b)).

DEP considered two alternatives for the Site: 1.) No action, and 2.) building demolition and off-site disposal of all ACM's to an appropriate landfill or waste facility.

The "No Action" alternative would not achieve any of the previously-mentioned objectives. Therefore, DEP has selected alternative for the Site, which consists of building demolition and disposal of all building materials at a landfill approved friable and non-friable ACM's. This alternative will achieve all three objectives previously identified for the prompt interim response.

This notice is being provided pursuant to section 506(b) of HSCA. The Department may approve or disapprove plans and reports submitted. This notice provides the Department's decision and, if relevant, the basis for disapproval.

REQUEST FOR COMMENT

Proposed Total Maximum Daily Loads (TMDLs) for a Subwatershed of Carr Run in Crawford County.

Central Office: Bureau of Clean Water, P.O. Box 8774, Harrisburg, PA 17105-8774.

The Department of Environmental Protection will accept comments on the proposed "TMDLs" developed for a subwatershed of Carr Run in Crawford County under Section 303(d) of the Clean Water Act. The Pennsylvania Integrated Water Quality Monitoring and Assessment Report included stream segments impaired for aquatic life in the watershed. The impairments addressed by this document were identified as being caused by excessive siltation due to agriculture.

There currently are no state or Federal in-stream numerical water quality criteria for sediment. Therefore, the Department utilized a reference watershed approach to develop the applicable narrative criteria. The proposed TMDL document sets allowable loading of sediment in the Carr Run Subwatershed. The "TMDLs" included allocations for nonpoint sources, reserves for current and future point sources, as well as margin of safety factors. Nonpoint source load allocations were made for cropland, hay/pasture land, and streambank source sectors present in the watershed. Data used in establishing the "TMDLs" were primarily generated using a water quality analysis model (Model My Watershed) made available through the Stroud Water Research Center.

The following table shows the estimated current sediment loadings within the watershed, the prescribed "TMDL" values, and % reductions needed under annual average conditions.

This notice is published under section 306(d)(14) of the Federal Coastal Zone Management Act of 1972 (CZMA) (16 U.S.C.A. § 1455(d)(14)), regarding public participation in consistency determinations. The Department of Environmental Protection (Department), Coastal Resources Management Program has received notice that the United States Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) is proposing the Fiscal Year 2021 maintenance dredging of the Delaware River Federal navigation channels.

The USACE Philadelphia District's Fiscal Year 2021 maintenance dredging of the Federally authorized navigation channels in the Delaware River is proposed to include the following activities. In the Philadelphia to Sea channel, hydraulic and mechanical dredging of approximately 900,000 cubic yards of predominately silt material between River Mile 78.5 and River Mile 81, utilizing a contractor, is scheduled to be conducted in the fall/winter of 2021/2022 with upland placement of the dredged material into the Pedricktown, Federally owned confined disposal facility (CDF) in Salem County, NJ. In the Philadelphia to Trenton channel, mechanical (bucket) dredging of approximately 75,000 cubic yards of primarily sand material between River Mile 106 and River Mile 112 is scheduled to be conducted by a contractor from October through December 2021 with upland disposal at either the Palmyra Cove CDF in Burlington County, NJ or the Fort Mifflin CDF in Philadelphia.

This project is subject to Department review for Federal consistency because it is a Federal agency activity and will have reasonably foreseeable effects on the Commonwealth's coastal resources or uses.

In accordance with section 307 of the CZMA (16 U.S.C.A. § 1456) and the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) regulations at 15 CFR Part 930, Subpart C (relating to consistency for Federal agency activities), the applicant has determined that the proposed activity will be conducted in a manner consistent with the applicable enforceable policies of the Commonwealth's NOAA-approved Coastal Resources Management Program. FISH AND BOAT COMMISSION

Removal of Waters from the Refuge Areas Program; July 2021

Under 58 Pa. Code § 67.2 (relating to refuge areas), the Executive Director of the Fish and Boat Commission (Commission), with the approval of the Commission, may designate waters as refuge areas to which 30 Pa.C.S. § 2306 (relating to refuge areas), shall apply. Section 2306 of 30 Pa.C.S. provides that the Commission may set aside, at its discretion, areas as it may judge best as refuge areas in which fishing, or entry shall be prohibited

for periods of time as the Commission prescribes. According to the regulation, the designation of waters as refuge areas shall be effective upon posting of the waters after publication of a notice that the waters have been so designated in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. Refuge areas are closed to public fishing except during the period from June 15 until the last day of February of the following year. It is unlawful to disturb fish or other aquatic life in refuge areas by any means, including wading, throwing stones, rocks or other objects, or otherwise agitating the waters. The regulation will not be construed to prohibit fishing in these areas during the extended trout season.

Based on current conditions, there is justification to remove the refuge area designation from 17 streams. Some streams are no longer being maintained as marked refuge areas, some streams are no longer stocked with trout and some streams are simply not being well utilized by anglers. These conditions are inconsistent with the premise for the use of refuge areas. Therefore, the Commission, at its next meeting on July 26 and 27, 2021, will consider taking action to remove the refuge area designations from the sections of the following waters that have been so designated.

Chronic Wasting Disease—Designation of Disease Management Areas and Endemic States and Canadian Provinces Order # 9

Executive Order

Whereas, Chronic Wasting Disease (CWD) is an infectious and progressive neurological disease that is found in, and always proves fatal to, members of the family Cervidae (deer, elk or moose, and other susceptible species, collectively called cervids); and

Whereas, There are no known treatments for CWD infection, no vaccines to protect against CWD infection, and no approved tests that can detect the presence of CWD in live cervids; and

Whereas, CWD is designated as a "dangerous transmissible disease" of animals by order of the Secretary of Agriculture under 3 Pa.C.S. § 2321(d) (relating to dangerous transmissible diseases); and

Whereas, The Game and Wildlife Code (Code) (34 Pa.C.S. §§ 101 et seq.) and regulations promulgated thereunder (58 Pa. Code §§ 131.1 et seq.) collectively provide broad authority to the PGC to regulate activities relating to the protection, preservation, and management of game and wildlife, including cervids; and

Whereas, On March 28, 2017 (effective May 16, 2017), the Commission added 58 Pa. Code § 137.35 (relating to Chronic Wasting Disease Restrictions) to give more permanent status and structure to the CWD requirements and restrictions previously established and maintained over the prior decade by and through executive orders; and

Whereas, Section 137.35(d) provides the Executive Director with the authority to designate CWD Disease Management Areas (DMAs) and Established Areas (EAs) within this Commonwealth; and

Whereas, Previous executive orders concerning designation of CWD DMAs and EAs within this Commonwealth were issued by the Commission on June 1, 2017, July 24, 2017, October 6, 2017, February 16, 2018, May 21, 2018, October 22, 2018, June 17, 2019 and June 2, 2020; and

Whereas, The Commission has determined that further designations of CWD DMAs and EAs are required to implement necessary updates to the Commission's CWD program.

Now Therefore, I, BRYAN J. BURHANS, Executive Director of the Pennsylvania Game Commission, pursuant to the authority vested in me by the Code and regulations promulgated thereunder, do hereby order and direct the following:

1. DMAs within this Commonwealth are designated as set forth below. These DMAs are more graphically illustrated on the maps titled "DMA2," "DMA3," "DMA4" and "DMA5" attached hereto and incorporated by reference herein. Should any conflict exist between the below-listed written boundaries and maps of DMA 2, DMA3, DMA4 and DMA5, the written descriptions shall prevail.

a. DMA1: Eliminated.

b. *DMA2*: Adams, Bedford, Blair, Cambria, Centre, Clearfield, Cumberland, Dauphin, Franklin, Fulton, Huntingdon, Indiana, Juniata, Mifflin, Northumberland, Perry, Snyder, Somerset, Union, and Westmoreland counties, bounded and described as follows: Beginning in the Southeastern extent of the DMA at the intersection of

Taneytown Road (State Highway 134) and the Maryland State Line, proceed north on Highway 134 for approximately 7.5 miles to the intersection of Steinwehr Avenue in Gettysburg. Follow right on Steinwehr Ave to Baltimore Street. Follow left on Baltimore Street through downtown Gettysburg. Proceed halfway around the traffic circle at the square onto Carlisle Street (State Highway 34). The DMA boundary follows Highway 34 north for approximately 21.2 miles to the intersection of the Baltimore Avenue (State Highway 94). Follow Highway 94 north for approximately 6.1 miles to the intersection of Interstate 81. Follow I-81 north for approximately 18.6 miles to the Susquehanna River. Follow the Susquehanna River north for approximately 11.2 miles to US Highway 22. Turn right onto US Highway 22 east for 0.2 miles, then exit to State Highway 147 towards Halifax. Follow State Highway 147 for 7.5 miles to the intersection with State Highway 225 in Halifax. Follow State Highway 255 for 33.1 miles to State Highway 890 in Treverton. Follow State Highway 890 north for 9.0 miles to State Highway 61 near Sunbury. Follow State Highway 61 west 3.2 miles to the intersection of US Highway 11 in Shamokin Dam. Follow US Highway 11 south for 3.3 miles to the intersection of US Highway 522. Follow US Highway 522 west for 10.4 miles to the intersection of Route 104. Follow route 104 north for approximately 8.9 miles to the intersection of State Highway 45. Turn left and the boundary follows State Highway 45 for approximately 34.2 miles to the intersec-tion of State Highway 144 in Old Fort. The DMA boundary follows State Highway 144 south for approximately 3.8 miles to the intersection of US Highway 322 in Potters Mills. Proceed left on US 322 south for 11.2 miles to the intersection of State Highway 655 near Reedsville. Turn right and the boundary follows Highway 655 south for approximately 8.1 miles to the intersection of State Highway 305. The DMA boundary follows State Highway 305 west for 10.2 miles to State Highway 26, then west along State Highway 26 for 9.4 miles to intersection of State Highway 45. Follow State Highway 45 south for 6.5 miles to Marengo Road in Pennsylvania Furnace. Follow Marengo Road north 6.3 miles to the intersection of State Highway 550. Turn right onto State Highway 550 and follow for 0.3 miles north to the intersection with Port Mountain Road. Turn left onto Beckwith Road and follow 1.7 miles northwest towards Port Matilda. Continue on Beckwith Road through Port Matilda to Alternate Route 220. Follow Alternate Route 220 for 0.5 miles where the road becomes State Route 3042. Continue west on State Route 3042 for 0.7 miles to US Highway 322. Follow US Highway 322 west for 9.9 miles to the intersection with State Highway 504 in Phillipsburg. Turn left on State Highway 504 and follow 0.6 miles west to State Highway 53. Continue west on State Highway 53 for 9.5 miles to the intersection of Route 153 in Houtzdale. The DMA boundary follows Route 153 south for 5.9 miles to the intersection of State Highway 253 (Viola Pike) and then left on Route 253 for 8.6 miles to the intersection of State Highway 53 in Van Ormer. Continue left on State Highway 53 for 1.7 miles to the intersection of Marina Road. Continue west on Marina Road for 5.5 miles where the road becomes Glendale Lake Road. Continue on Glendale Lake Road for 3 miles to the intersection with State Highway 36. Follow State Highway 36 west for .5 miles into the town of Patton. The DMA boundary follows right on State Highway 36 south for 3.5 miles to Bridge Street. Turn left on Bridge Street and follow west for 1.6 miles to the intersection of Spangler Street. Follow Spangler Street south for .9 miles to the intersection of Municipal Road. Turn right on

Municipal Road and follow for 3.6 miles west to the intersection of US Highway 219 (Crawford Avenue) in Northern Cambria. Follow US Highway 219 south for 1.3 miles to the intersection of State Highway 271. Follow State Highway 271 south for 2.8 miles to the intersection of State Highway 553 near Nicktown. Follow State Highway 553 west for 6.9 miles to the intersection of State Highway 403 near Heilwood. Continue south on State Highway 403 for 15.8 miles to the intersection of US Highway 22. The boundary follows US Highway 22 west for 14 miles to the intersection of State Highway 217 South in Blairsville. Follow State Highway 217 South for 12.5 miles to the intersection of US Highway 30. Follow US Highway 30 east for 21.3 miles to intersection of US Highway 219. Finally, south along State Highway 219 for 32.6 miles to the Maryland border at the place of beginning.

c. DMA3: Armstrong, Cambria, Clarion, Clearfield, Indiana and Jefferson counties, bounded and described as follows: Beginning at the southernmost point at the intersection of State Highway 403 and State Highway 286 in the town of Clymer, proceed east on State Highway 286 for 4.9 miles to State Highway 240. Follow in State Highway 240 east for 8.5 miles to the intersection of US Highway 219. Follow US Highway 219 north for 2.4 miles to Sylvis Road. Follow Sylvis Road east for 5.8 miles to the intersection of State Highway 36. Follow State Highway 36 east for 8.8 miles to the intersection of La Jose Road (SR-3016) in Newburg. Follow La Jose Road east for 3.6 miles becoming Cherry Corner Road (SR-3005) for another .3 mile to the intersection of Marron Road (SR-3016). Turn left onto Marron Road and follow northeast for 2.7 miles to the intersection of State Road 729. Follow State Road 729 east for .9 miles to the intersection of Old Station Road. Follow Old Station Road (SR-2012) east for 2.4 miles to the intersection of Douglas Road (SR-3007). Follow US Highway 322 east for .3 miles to the intersection of State Highway 949. Follow State Highway 949 south for 4.2 miles to the intersection of State Highway 28. Turn right on State Route 2027 and proceed for 0.3 miles at which point State Route 2027 becomes State Route 2025, proceed south on State Route 2025 for 0.6 miles to State Route 372 (Bridge Street). Stay on State Route 372, proceeding south for 0.5 miles to State Route 2009 (Noble Road). Turn right on State Route 2009, proceeding northeast for 13.2 miles to the intersection with State Route 2003 (Little Britain Road). Turn right on State Route 2003, proceeding north for 1.6 miles to U.S. Route 222 (Robert Fulton Highway). Turn left on U.S. Route 222, proceeding south for 4.5 miles to State Route 3004 (Furniss Road). Turn right on State Route 3004, proceed-ing 1.6 miles at which point State Route 3004 becomes State Route 10Z (Harmony Ridge Dr.). Proceed along State Route 10Z for 2.0 miles to Fishing Creek. Left following Fishing Creek approximately 0.5 miles to the Susquehanna River. Proceed northwest along the Susquehanna River shoreline for 20.0 miles to a point abeam State Route 999. Turn right on State Route 999 proceeding east for 7.0 miles to State Route 741 (Rohrerstown Road). Turn left on State Route 741, proceeding north for 3.6 miles to U.S. Route 30 (Lincoln Highway) interchange. Turn right on U.S. Route 30, proceeding east for 2.4 miles to State Route 4011

(Fruitville Pike). Turn left on State Route 4011, proceeding north for 6.7 miles to State Route 772 (Orange Street). Turn right on State Route 772, proceeding east for 3.6 miles to State Route 501. Turn left on state Route 501 in Lititz, proceeding northerly for 5 miles to the intersection with U.S. Route 322 (West 28th Division Highway). Turn left on U.S. Route 322, proceeding westerly for 1.3 miles to the Pennsylvania Turnpike (U.S. Route 76). Move right along U.S. Route 76, proceeding east for 0.7 miles to the western boundary of State Game Lands 46. Proceed north, then east for 1.2 miles along the game lands boundary to state Route 501 (Furnace Hills Pike). Turn left on state Route 501, proceeding north for 4.1 miles to the intersection with state Route 419. Turn left, proceeding west for 0.1 miles to state Route 897 (South 5th Street). Turn right on state Route 897, proceeding northwest for 6.2 miles to the starting point at the intersection of state Route 897 and U.S. Route 422 at the place of beginning.

e. DMA5: Warren County, bounded and described as follows: Beginning in the northeastern extent of the DMA at the New York State Line, at the intersection of the Allegheny River, proceed south on the west shore of the river for 27.8 miles to the bridge at Pennsylvania Ave East (Business U.S. Route 6). Turn left on Pennsylvania Ave East and proceed south for 0.1 mile to U.S. Route 6. Turn right, proceeding west on U.S. Route 6 for 11.6 miles to West Main St (State Route 27) at Youngsville. Turn sharp right on West Main St, proceeding northeast for 0.5 mile to State Route 27 (Matthews Run Rd). Turn left on State Route 27, proceeding north for 7.2 mile to the intersection of State Route 69 (Jackson Run Road). Turn left on state Route 69 proceeding north for 3 miles to the intersection of State Route 957 (Main St) in Sugar Grove. Turn right on State Route 957, proceeding east for 0.2 miles to Jamestown Street. Turn slight left on Jamestown Street, proceeding north for 0.7 miles to where Jamestown Street becomes Busti Road. Continue north for 1 mile to the New York border. The boundary follows east along the border for 18.1 miles to the Allegheny River at the place of beginning.

The sole EA is more graphically illustrated on the map titled "Established Area In DMA2" attached hereto and incorporated by reference herein. Should any conflict exist between the below-listed written boundary and map of "Established Area In DMA2", the written descriptions shall prevail.



STATE HORSE RACING COMMISSION

Amended Association Racing Commissioners International Restricted Therapeutic Use— Clenbuterol (Thoroughbred Horses Only); Administrative Policy SHRC 2021-3

The State Horse Racing Commission (Commission), in accordance with 3 Pa.C.S. § 9312(6) (relating to additional powers of commission) of the Race Horse Industry Reform Act and 7 Pa. Code § 401.4(a) (relating to substances of therapeutic value), is authorized to adopt National standards relating to prohibited substances, uniform drug threshold levels and to regulate or restrict substances of therapeutic value, including Clenbuterol in thoroughbred race horses.

In December 2020, the National regulatory organization known as the Association of Racing Commissioners International (ARCI) through the Racing Medication and Testing Consortium amended its ARCI Controlled Therapeutic Medication Schedule by restricting the use of the therapeutic medication Clenbuterol—with certain enumerated restrictions. ARCI also modified the threshold level for Clenbuterol to level of detection. These measures are designed to provide a complete regulation of Clenbuterol and to protect health and safety of the horse.

On May 25, 2021, at its monthly public meeting and in accordance with its statutory authority the Commission approved the previously listed ARCI amendment prohibiting the use of Clenbuterol in thoroughbred race horses except with enumerated conditions. This amendment shall take effect on July 19, 2021.
