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

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Pennsylvania Bulletin

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the official gazette of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. It is published weekly. A cumulative subject matter index is published quarterly.

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* serves several purposes. It is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, which is the official codification of agency rules and regulations, Statewide court rules, and other statutorily authorized documents. Changes in the codified text, whether by adoption, amendment, rescission, repeal or emergency action, must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

The following documents are published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*: Governor's Executive Orders; Summaries of Enacted Statutes; Statewide and Local Court Rules; Attorney General Opinions; Motor Carrier Applications before the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission; Applications and Actions before the Department of Environmental Protection; Orders of the Independent Regulatory Review Commission; and other documents authorized by law.

The text of certain documents published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the only valid and enforceable text. Courts are required to take judicial notice of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Adoption, Amendment or Repeal of Regulations

Generally an agency wishing to adopt, amend or rescind regulations must first publish in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* a Proposed Rulemaking. There are limited instances when the agency may omit the proposal step; it still must publish the adopted version.

The Proposed Rulemaking contains the full text of the change, the agency contact person, a fiscal note required by law and background for the action.

The agency then allows sufficient time for public comment before taking final action. A Final Rulemaking must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* before the changes can take effect. If the agency wishes to adopt changes to the Proposed Rulemaking to enlarge the scope, it must repropose.

Citation to the Pennsylvania Bulletin

Cite material in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* by volume number, a page number and date. Example: Volume 1, *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, page 801, January 9, 1971 (short form: 1 Pa.B. 801 (January 9, 1971)).

Pennsylvania Code

The *Pennsylvania Code* is the official codification of rules and regulations issued by Commonwealth agencies, Statewide court rules and other statutorily authorized documents. The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, printing changes when they are adopted. These changes are then permanently codified by the *Pennsylvania Code Reporter*, a monthly, loose-leaf supplement.

The *Pennsylvania Code* is cited by title number and section number. Example: Title 10 *Pennsylvania Code* § 1.1 (short form: 10 Pa. Code § 1.1).

Under the *Pennsylvania Code* codification system, each regulation is assigned a unique number by title and section. Titles roughly parallel the organization of Commonwealth government.

How to Find Rules and Regulations

Search for your area of interest in the *Pennsylva*nia Code. The *Pennsylvania Code* is available at www.pacodeandbulletin.gov.

Source Notes give the history of regulations. To see if there have been recent changes not yet codified, check the List of *Pennsylvania Code* Chapters Affected in the most recent issue of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Court Rules in Titles 201—246 of the Pennsylvania Code

Added text in proposed and adopted court rules is printed in <u>underscored bold face</u>. Deleted text in proposed and adopted court rules is enclosed in brackets [] and printed in **bold face**.

Proposed new chapters and rules are printed in regular type to enhance readability.

Ellipses, a series of five asterisks, indicate text that is not amended.

Fiscal Notes

Section 612 of The Administrative Code of 1929 (71 P.S. § 232) requires the Governor's Budget Office to prepare a fiscal note for regulatory actions and administrative procedures of the administrative departments, boards, commissions and authorities receiving money from the State Treasury. The fiscal note states whether the action or procedure causes a loss of revenue or an increase in the cost of programs for the Commonwealth or its political subdivisions. The fiscal note is required to be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* at the same time as the change is advertised.

A fiscal note provides the following information: (1) the designation of the fund out of which the appropriation providing for expenditures under the action or procedure shall be made; (2) the probable cost for the fiscal year the program is implemented; (3) projected cost estimate of the program for each of the 5 succeeding fiscal years; (4) fiscal history of the program for which expenditures are to be made; (5) probable loss of revenue for the fiscal year of its implementation; (6) projected loss of revenue from the program for each of the 5 succeeding fiscal years; (7) line item, if any, of the General Appropriation Act or other appropriation act out of which expenditures or losses of Commonwealth funds shall occur as a result of the action or procedures; and (8) recommendation, if any, of the Secretary of the Budget and the reasons therefor.

The omission of an item indicates that the agency text of the fiscal note states that there is no information available with respect thereto. In items (3) and (6) information is set forth for the first through fifth fiscal years, following the year the program is implemented, which is stated. In item (4) information is set forth for the current and two immediately preceding years. In item (8) the recommendation, if any, made by the Secretary of the Budget is published with the fiscal note. "No fiscal impact" means no additional cost or revenue loss to the Commonwealth or its local political subdivision is intended. See 4 Pa. Code Chapter 7, Subchapter R (relating to fiscal notes).

And Now, this 19th day of October, 2021, upon the recommendation of the Domestic Relations Procedural Rules Committee, the proposal having been published for public comment in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, 51 Pa.B. 1006 (February 27, 2021):

It is Ordered pursuant to Article V, Section 10 of the Constitution of Pennsylvania that Rules 1901, 1901.3, 1910.11, 1910.12, 1915.4-2, 1915.4-3, 1920.1, 1920.31, 1920.33, 1920.42, 1920.45, 1920.46, 1920.51, 1920.53, 1920.54, 1920.55-1, 1920.55-2, 1920.55-3, 1920.61, 1920.74, 1920.91, 1930.7, and 1931 of the Pennsylvania Rules of Civil Procedure are amended in the following form.

This Order shall be processed in accordance with Pa.R.J.A. No. 103(b), and shall be effective on January 1, 2022.

Annex A

TITLE 231. RULES OF CIVIL PROCEDURE PART I. GENERAL

CHAPTER 1900. ACTIONS PURSUANT TO THE PROTECTION FROM ABUSE ACT

Rule 1901. Definitions.

As used in this chapter:

* * * *

Fees—means any costs associated with the filing, issuance, registration, service or appeal of a Protection From Abuse matter, including any foreign protection order.

[Master for Emergency Relief—means an attorney, admitted to the practice of law by the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania and appointed pursuant to 23 Pa.C.S.A. § 6110(e), to hear petitions for emergency protection from abuse.]

Temporary Order—An ex parte order entered by the court pursuant to 23 Pa.C.S.A. § 6107.

[Explanatory Comment—2006

The 2005 amendments to the Protection From Abuse Act, Act 66 of 2005, authorize two methods to secure emergency protection from abuse orders. The first is through a magisterial district judge and the other is through a master for emergency relief. In order for a county to exercise the master for emergency relief option, the county must assume the costs of the master and the Administrative Office of Pennsylvania Courts must approve the master's selection and appointment. 23 Pa.C.S.A. § 6110(e).

The 2005 amendments to the Protection From Abuse Act also prohibit the assessment of fees or costs against the plaintiff or petitioner. This prohibition includes fees related to filing, serving, registering or appealing a protection from abuse petition or order. 23 Pa.C.S.A. §§ 6104(d)(1), 6106(b) and (g.1) and 6113.1(b).]

Rule 1901.3. Commencement of Action.

- (a) Except as provided in subdivision (b), [an action shall be commenced] a plaintiff shall commence an action by presenting to the court or filing with the prothonotary a petition setting forth the alleged abuse by the defendant. The petition shall be substantially in the form set forth in [Rule] Pa.R.C.P. No. 1905(b) and shall have as its first page the Notice of Hearing and Order set forth in [Rule] Pa.R.C.P. No. 1905(a).
- (b) An action may be commenced by filing with the prothonotary a certified copy of an emergency order entered pursuant to 23 [Pa.C.S.A.] Pa.C.S. § 6110, including orders issued by [masters for emergency relief] a hearing officer.
- (c) Any fees associated with this action shall not be charged to the plaintiff.
- (d) The [master for emergency relief] hearing officer shall follow the procedures set forth in the Pennsylvania Rules of Civil Procedure Governing Actions and Proceedings Before Magisterial District Judges for emergency relief under the Protection From Abuse Act.

Official Note: See Pa.R.C.P. No. 1930.1(b). This rule may require attorneys or unrepresented parties to file confidential documents and documents containing confidential information that are subject to the Case Records Public Access Policy of the Unified Judicial System of Pennsylvania.

CHAPTER 1910. ACTIONS FOR SUPPORT

Rule 1910.11. Office Conference. Subsequent Proceedings. Order.

- (a) Office Conference.
- (1) A conference officer shall conduct the office conference.
- (2) A lawyer serving as a conference officer employed by, or under contract with, a judicial district or appointed by the court shall not practice family law before a conference officer, hearing officer[, permanent or standing master], or judge of the same judicial district.

Official Note: Conference officers preside at office conferences under Pa.R.C.P. No. 1910.11. Hearing officers preside at hearings under Pa.R.C.P. No. 1910.12. The appointment of **[masters]** a hearing officer to hear actions in divorce or for annulment of marriage is authorized by Pa.R.C.P. No. 1920.51.

* * * * *

Rule 1910.12. Office Conference. Hearing. Record. Exceptions. Order.

(a) Office Conference. There shall be an office conference as provided by [Rule] Pa.R.C.P. No. 1910.11(a) through (d). The provisions of [Rule] Pa.R.C.P. No. 1910.11(d)(3) and (4) regarding income information apply in cases proceeding pursuant to [Rule] Pa.R.C.P. No. 1910.12.

(b) Conference Conclusion.

- (1) At the conclusion of a conference attended by both parties, if an agreement for support has not been reached, and the conference and hearing are not scheduled on the same day, the court, without hearing the parties, shall enter an interim order calculated in accordance with the guidelines and substantially in the form set forth in [Rule] Pa.R.C.P. No. 1910.27(e), and the parties shall be given notice of the date, time and place of a hearing. A record hearing shall be conducted by a hearing officer who must be a lawyer.
- (2) If either party, having been properly served, fails to attend the conference, the court may enter an interim order calculated in accordance with the guidelines and substantially in the form set forth in [Rule] Pa.R.C.P. No. 1910.27(e). Within [twenty] 20 days after the date of receipt or the date of mailing of the interim order, whichever occurs first, either party may demand a hearing before a hearing officer. If no hearing is requested, the order shall become final.
- (3) Any lawyer serving as a hearing officer employed by, or under contract with, a judicial district or appointed by the court shall not practice family law before a conference officer, hearing officer[, permanent or standing master], or judge of the same judicial district.

Official Note: Conference officers preside at office conferences under [Rule] Pa.R.C.P. No. 1910.11. Hearing officers preside at hearings under [Rule] Pa.R.C.P. No. 1910.12. The appointment of [masters] a hearing officer to hear actions in divorce or for annulment of marriage is authorized by [Rule] Pa.R.C.P. No. 1920.51.

(c) Separate Listing.

- (1) Except as provided in subdivision (c)(2), promptly after the conference's conclusion [of the conference], a party may move the court for a separate listing of the hearing [where] if:
- (i) there are complex questions of law, fact or both; ${\boldsymbol{\lceil}}\ {\boldsymbol{or}}\ {\boldsymbol{\rceil}}$
 - (ii) the hearing will be protracted; or
- (iii) the orderly administration of justice requires that the hearing be listed separately.
- (2) [Where] When the conference and hearing are scheduled on the same day, all requests for separate listing [must] shall be presented to the court at least seven days prior to the scheduled court date.
- (3) If the motion for separate listing is granted, discovery shall be available in accordance with [Rule] Pa.R.C.P. No. 4001 *et seq*.

Official Note: The rule relating to discovery in domestic relations matters generally is [Rule] Pa.R.C.P. No. 1930.5.

CHAPTER 1915. ACTIONS FOR CUSTODY OF MINOR CHILDREN

Rule 1915.4-2. Partial Custody. Office Conference. Hearing. Record. Exceptions. Order.

* * * * *

(b) Hearing.

(1) The hearing shall be conducted by a hearing officer who must be a lawyer, and a record shall be made of the testimony. A hearing officer who is a lawyer employed by, or under contract with, a judicial district or appointed by the court shall not practice family law before a conference officer, hearing officer[, permanent or standing master], or judge of the same judicial district.

* * * * *

Rule 1915.4-3. Non-Record Proceedings. Trials.

(a) Non-Record Proceedings. In judicial districts utilizing an initial non-record proceeding, i.e., office conference, if an agreement is not finalized by the conclusion of the proceeding, the conference officer shall promptly notify the court that the matter should be listed for trial. A lawyer employed by, or under contract with, a judicial district or appointed by the court to serve as a conference officer to preside over a non-record proceeding shall not practice family law before a conference officer, hearing officer[, permanent or standing master], or judge of the same judicial district.

CHAPTER 1920. ACTIONS OF DIVORCE OR FOR ANNULMENT OF MARRIAGE

Rule 1920.1. Definitions. Conformity to Civil Action.

(a) As used in this chapter [,]:

* * * * *

"divorce," divorce from the bonds of matrimony or dissolution of a civil union;

"hearing officer," shall have the same meaning as "master" as that term is used in the Divorce Code, 23 Pa.C.S. §§ 3101 et seq.

"marital property rights" means those rights created solely by Section 3501 of the Divorce Code; and

* * * * *

Rule 1920.31. Joinder of Related Claims. Ancillary Claims. Alimony. Counsel Fees. Costs and Expenses.

(a) Ancillary Claims.

- (1) If a party has raised a claim for alimony, counsel fees, or costs and expenses, the parties shall file a true copy of the most recent federal income tax return, pay stubs for the preceding six months, a completed Income Statement in the form required by Pa.R.C.P. No. 1910.27(c)(1), and a completed Expense Statement in the form required by Pa.R.C.P. No. 1910.27(c)(2)(B).
- (i) A party may not file a motion for the appointment of a [master] hearing officer or a request for court action regarding alimony, counsel fees, or costs and expenses until at least 30 days following the filing of that party's tax returns, Income Statement, and Expense Statement.

(ii) The other party shall file the tax returns, Income Statement, and Expense Statement within 20 days of service of the moving party's documents.

(b) **Alimony.**

(1) Orders for alimony may be enforced as provided by the rules governing actions for support and divorce, and in the Divorce Code.

Rule 1920.33. Joinder of Related Claims. Equitable Division. Enforcement.

- (a) If a pleading or petition raises a claim for equitable division of marital property under Section 3502 of the Divorce Code, the parties shall file and serve on the other party an inventory, which shall include the information in subdivisions [(1) through (3)] (a)(3)(i)—(iii), and shall be substantially in the form set forth in Pa.R.C.P. No.
- (1) Within 20 days of service of the moving party's inventory, the non-moving party shall file an inventory.
- (2) A party may not file a motion for the appointment of a [master] hearing officer or a request for court action regarding equitable division until at least 30 days following the filing of that party's inventory.
- Official Note: See Pa.R.C.P. No. 1930.1(b). This rule may require attorneys or unrepresented parties to file confidential documents and documents containing confidential information that are subject to the Case Records Public Access Policy of the Unified Judicial System of Pennsylvania.
- (3) The inventory shall set forth as of the date of separation:
- [(1)] (i) a specific description of the marital assets, which either or both parties have a legal or equitable interest, individually or jointly with another person, the name of the co-owners, if applicable, and the marital liabilities, which either party incurred individually or jointly with another person, and the name of any codebtors, if applicable;
- [(2)] (ii) a specific description of the assets or liabilities claimed to be non-marital and the basis for such claim; and
- [(3)] (iii) the estimated value of the marital and non-marital assets and the amount due for each marital and non-marital liability.
- Official Note: Subdivision (c) provides for sanctions for failure to file an inventory as required by subdivision (a). An inventory may be incomplete if a party lacks comprehensive knowledge of the assets and liabilities involved in the claim for equitable division. Consequently, the rule does not contemplate that a party will be precluded from presenting testimony or offering evidence as to assets or liabilities omitted from the inventory. The omission may be remedied by inclusion of the omitted information in the pre-trial statement required by subdi-
- (b) Within the time required by order of court or written directive of the [master] hearing officer or, if none, at least 60 days before the scheduled hearing on the claim for equitable division, the parties shall file and serve upon the other party a pre-trial statement. The pre-trial statement shall include the following matters, together with any additional information required by special order of the court:

Rule 1920.42. Obtaining Divorce Decrees under Section 3301(c) or Section 3301(d) of the Divorce Code. Affidavits and Counter-Affidavits. Requirements of the Affidavit of Consent. Ancillary Claims. Orders Approving Grounds for Divorce. Notice of Intention to File the Praecipe to Transmit Record. Praecipe to Transmit Record.

(a) Obtaining a divorce decree under Section 3301(c)(1) of the Divorce Code.

(3) After the court enters an order approving grounds for divorce, a party may request, consistent with the judicial district's local rules and procedures, that the court either hears the ancillary claims or appoints a [master] hearing officer to hear the ancillary claims as outlined in Pa.R.C.P. No. 1920.51.

Official Note: See Pa.R.C.P. No. 1920.74 for the Motion for Appointment of [Master] Hearing Officer.

- (4) If the parties resolve the ancillary claims by agreement after the court approves the grounds for the divorce but before the court enters an order disposing of the ancillary claims, the parties shall file a Praecipe to Transmit Record requesting the court enter the appropriate divorce decree. To the extent the agreement does not address all of the parties' claims raised in the pleadings, the party raising the outstanding claims shall withdraw the claims before the court enters a divorce decree.
- (b) Obtaining a divorce decree under Section 3301(c)(2) of the Divorce Code.
- (1) If a party has filed a complaint requesting a divorce on the ground of irretrievable breakdown and a party has been convicted of a personal injury crime against his or her spouse, the court shall enter a decree in divorce after:

(iii) the filed affidavits and a blank Counter-Affidavit under Section 3301(c)(2) of the Divorce Code have been served on the other party consistent with Pa.R.C.P. No. 1930.4, and the other party has admitted or failed to deny the averments in the Affidavit to Establish Presumption of Consent under Section 3301(c)(2) of the Divorce Code;

- (A) If a party files a Counter-Affidavit under Section 3301(c)(2) of the Divorce Code denying an averment in the Affidavit to Establish Presumption of Consent under Section 3301(c)(2) of the Divorce Code, either party may present a motion requesting the court resolve the issue.
- (B) After presentation of the motion in subdivision (A), the court may hear the testimony or, consistent with Pa.R.C.P. No. 1920.51(a)(1)(ii)(D), appoint a [master] hearing officer to hear the testimony and to issue a report and recommendation.

(3) After the court enters an order approving grounds for divorce, a party may request, consistent with the judicial district's local rules and procedures, that the court either hears the ancillary claims or appoints a [master] hearing officer to hear the ancillary claims as outlined in Pa.R.C.P. No. 1920.51.

Official Note: See Pa.R.C.P. No. 1920.74 for the Motion for Appointment of [Master] Hearing Officer.

(4) If the parties resolve the ancillary claims by agreement after the court approves the grounds for the divorce but before the court enters an order disposing of the ancillary claims, the parties shall file a Praecipe to Transmit Record requesting the court enter the appropriate divorce decree. To the extent the agreement does not address all of the parties' claims raised in the pleadings, the party raising the outstanding claims shall withdraw the claims before the court enters a divorce decree.

- (c) Obtaining a divorce decree under Section 3301(d) of the Divorce Code.
- (1) If a party has filed a complaint requesting a divorce on the ground of irretrievable breakdown and the requisite separation period has elapsed, the court shall enter a decree in divorce after:

* * * * *

- (iii) the filed affidavit and a blank Counter-Affidavit under Section 3301(d) of the Divorce Code have been served on the other party consistent with Pa.R.C.P. No. 1930.4, and the other party has admitted or failed to deny the averments in the Affidavit under Section 3301(d) of the Divorce Code;
- (A) If a party files a Counter-Affidavit under Section 3301(d) of the Divorce Code denying an averment in the Affidavit under Section 3301(d) of the Divorce Code, including the date of separation, either party may present a motion requesting the court resolve the issue.
- (B) After presentation of the motion in subdivision (A), the court may hear the testimony or, consistent with Pa.R.C.P. No. 1920.51(a)(1)(ii)(D), appoint a **[master]** hearing officer to hear the testimony and to issue a report and recommendation.

* * * * *

(3) After the court enters an order approving grounds for divorce, a party may request, consistent with the judicial district's local rules and procedures, that the court either hears the ancillary claims or appoints a **[master] hearing officer** to hear the ancillary claims as outlined in Pa.R.C.P. No. 1920.51.

Official Note: See Pa.R.C.P. No. 1920.74 for the Motion for Appointment of [Master] Hearing Officer.

Rule 1920.45. Counseling.

* * * * *

(d) If the court has referred a divorce action to a **[master]** hearing officer and a party requests counseling pursuant to the Divorce Code, without leave of court, the **[master]** hearing officer may require counseling and continue the hearing pending the counselor's report.

Rule 1920.46. Affidavit of Non-Military Service.

If the defendant fails to appear in the action, the plaintiff shall file an affidavit regarding military service with the motion for appointment of a [master] hearing officer, prior to a trial by the court, or with the plaintiff's affidavit required by Pa.R.C.P. No. 1920.42(b)(1)(ii) and (c)(1)(ii).

* * * * *

Rule 1920.51. Hearing by the Court. Appointment of [Master] Hearing Officer. Notice of Hearing.

- (a) In an action of divorce or annulment:
- (1) the court may:
- (i) hear the testimony; or

(ii) upon motion of a party or of the court, appoint a **[master] hearing officer**:

* * * * *

(2) the court shall not appoint a [master] hearing officer:

* * * * *

Official Note: Section 3321 of the Divorce Code prohibits the appointment of a [master] hearing officer as to the claims of custody and paternity. However, as set forth in Pa.R.C.P. No. 1920.91(3), the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania suspended Section 3321 insofar as that section prohibits the appointment of [masters] a hearing officer in partial physical custody cases.

- (3) The Motion for the Appointment of a **[Master]** Hearing Officer and the order shall be substantially in the form prescribed by Pa.R.C.P. No. 1920.74. The order appointing the **[master] hearing officer** shall specify the issues or ancillary claims that are referred to the **[master] hearing officer**.
- (4) A permanent or standing [master] hearing officer employed by or under contract with a judicial district or appointed by the court shall not practice family law before a conference officer, hearing officer, permanent or standing [master] hearing officer, or judge of the same judicial district.

Official Note: Conference officers preside at office conferences under Pa.R.C.P. No. 1910.11. Hearing officers preside at hearings under Pa.R.C.P. No. 1910.12. The appointment of [master] hearing officer to hear actions in divorce or annulment is authorized by Section 3321 of the Divorce Code.

- (b) Written notice of the hearing shall be given to each attorney of record by the [master] hearing officer. If a [master] hearing officer has not been appointed, the prothonotary, clerk, or other officer designated by the court shall give the notice.

The support conference officer[,] or hearing officer [or master] shall not participate in custody negotiations, preparation of the forms, or provide legal advice.

- (i) Except as provided in subdivision [(ii) below] (c)(3)(ii), in any matter brought under these Family Court Rules, a decision by a conference officer, [master] hearing officer, or judge shall be entered, filed, and served upon counsel for the parties, or any party not represented by counsel, not later than [thirty (30)] 30 days after the conference, hearing, or trial concludes, unless a shorter time frame is required by statute or another procedural rule.

- (ii) The time for entering and filing a decision may be extended if, within [thirty (30)] 30 days of the conclusion of the conference, hearing, or trial, the court extends the date for such decision by order entered of record showing good cause for the extension. In no event shall an extension delay entry of the decision more than [sixty (60)] 60 days after the conclusion of the conference, hearing, or trial.

- (2) Initial Training. This Order shall be processed in accordance with Pa.R.J.A. No. 103(b), and shall be effective on January 1, 2022.

Annex A

TITLE 246. MINOR COURT CIVIL RULES PART I. GENERAL

CHAPTER 500. ACTIONS FOR THE RECOVERY OF POSSESSION OF REAL PROPERTY

Rule 514. Judgment; Notice of Judgment or Dismissal and the Right to Appeal.

- A. If it appears at the hearing that the complaint has been proven, the magisterial district judge shall enter judgment against the tenant that the real property be delivered up to the landlord and shall enter judgment by separate entries:
- (1) for [the] any amount of rent[, if any, which] that remains due [,];
- (2) for [the] <u>any</u> amount of damages[, if any,] for unjust detention[,];
- (3) for [the] <u>any</u> physical damages[, if any,] to the leasehold premises[, and];
 - (4) for the costs of the proceeding; and
- (5) for the amount of any security deposit applied as an offset to the judgment, if applicable;

less any amount found due the tenant on any cross-complaint filed by the tenant.

- [In addition, the] B. The magisterial district judge shall make an entry on the judgment identifying the sum of money found by the magisterial district judge to constitute the monthly rental for the leasehold premises.
- [B.] C. A money judgment may be rendered for the tenant on a cross-complaint filed by the tenant if the amount found due thereon exceeds any amount found due the landlord on the landlord's complaint.

[C.] D. Entry of judgment.

- (1) Judgment shall be given at the conclusion of the hearing or within three days thereafter.
- (2) Upon the entry of the judgment, the magisterial district court shall promptly give or mail to the parties written notice of judgment or dismissal.
- [D.] E. The written notice of judgment or dismissal shall contain:
- (1) notice of the right of the parties to appeal, the time within which the appeal must be taken, and that the appeal is to the court of common pleas;
- (2) notice that a tenant in a residential lease action who is a victim of domestic violence may appeal the judgment within 30 days of the date of entry of judgment, as well as filing instructions for asserting such an appeal;
- (3) notice that, except as otherwise provided in the rules, if the judgment holder elects to enter the judgment in the court of common pleas, all further process must come from the court of common pleas and no further process may be issued by the magisterial district judge; and
- (4) notice that unless the judgment is entered in the court of common pleas anyone interested in the judgment may file a request for entry of satisfaction with the magisterial district judge if the debtor pays in full, settles, or otherwise complies with the judgment.

Official Note: Subdivision A of this rule requires that the landlord appear and give testimony to prove the complaint before the magisterial district judge can enter judgment against the tenant, even when the tenant fails to appear for the hearing. The magisterial district judge shall not enter a default judgment in a possessory action, including a judgment for money only. See Rule 512A and Note. The various issues that the magisterial district judge must determine at the hearing include: whether notice to quit was given to the tenant in accordance with law or that no notice was required under the terms of the lease; the amount or rent due, if any; damages to the leasehold premises, if any; the amount found to constitute the monthly rental; and, the amount of the security deposit held by the landlord, if any.

As to the notice to quit requirement, see Section 501 of the Landlord and Tenant Act of 1951, 68 P.S. § 250.501. See also Patrycia Bros., Inc. v. McKeefrey, 38 Pa. D. & C.2d 149 (Delaware County C.P. 1966).

The separate entries provided in subdivision A are made necessary as a result of the rental deposit provisions for appeal or *certiorari* contained in Rules 1008B and 1013B, as well as the wage attachment provisions contained in Section 8127 of the Judicial Code, 42 Pa.C.S. § 8127.

If the magisterial district judge permits a security deposit held by the landlord to be used as an offset against a monetary judgment, the amount of the security deposit so applied must be identified as such on the judgment form. There are limited circumstances when application of the security deposit to offset a monetary judgment is appropriate, such as when the tenant has already left the property, the landlord has had the opportunity to inspect the property, both parties have appeared before the magisterial district judge, and the parties agree that the security deposit should be used to offset the judgment. For additional requirements regarding the return of a security deposit, including the provision of a list of damages and remission of the deposit less the cost of damages within 30 days of termination of the lease or upon surrender and acceptance of the leasehold premises, see Section 512 of the Landlord and Tenant Act of 1951, 68 P.S. § 250.512.

Subdivision $[B]\underline{C}$ of this rule $[makes\ provision]$ provides for a money judgment for the tenant if the tenant prevails in a greater amount on the tenant's cross-complaint.

Subdivision [D] \underline{E} of this rule provides for certain notices the magisterial district court shall include in the written notice of judgment or dismissal.

Subdivision [D(2)] E(2) reflects that the appeal period for a victim of domestic violence in a case arising out of a residential lease is 30 days. See Rule 1002B(2); see also 68 P.S. § 250.513. A tenant who is a victim of domestic violence may file a domestic violence affidavit with the magisterial district court to stay the execution of an order for possession until 30 days after the date of entry of the judgment, the filing of an appeal with the court of common pleas pursuant to Rule 1002, or by order of the court of common pleas, whichever is earlier. See Rule 514.1.

As to subdivision [D(2)] E(3), see Rule 402D and Note. As to subdivision [D(3)] E(4), see Rule 341.

Recommendation 2-2021, Minor Court Rules Committee

Amendment of Pa.R.Civ.P.M.D.J. 514

Application of Security Deposit to Offset Judgment

The Minor Court Rules Committee ("Committee") recommended amendments to Rule 514 of the Pennsylvania Rules of Civil Procedure Governing Actions and Proceedings Before Magisterial District Judges ("Rules"). These amendments relate to the use of a security deposit as an offset against a judgment in a landlord-tenant action. The Committee published the proposal for public comment at 50 Pa.B. 4646 (September 12, 2020) and it was posted on the Committee website on August 31, 2020.

The Committee was asked to consider clarifying how the application of a security deposit to a judgment in a landlord-tenant action is reported on the judgment form. Although Rule 514 does not address directly whether the security deposit or an offset is reported on the judgment form, the Note provides that "the amount of the security deposit held by the landlord, if any" is one of a number of issues that the magisterial district judge must determine at the hearing.

There are statutory requirements for return of a security deposit by the landlord at the termination of the lease. See 68 P.S. § 250.512. A landlord is required to provide a tenant with a list of damages to the premises within 30 days of the termination of the lease; the list of damages must be accompanied by payment of the difference between the security deposit (plus accrued interest) and the amount of damages to the premises. Id. § 250.512(a). If the landlord fails to provide a damages list within 30 days of the termination of the lease, the landlord waives the right to withhold any of the security deposit or interest, while failure to remit timely the security deposit to the tenant within 30 days makes the landlord liable to the tenant for double the amount of the security deposit. Id. § 250.512(b)-(c). The statute provides that "[a]ny attempted waiver of this section by contract or otherwise shall be void and unenforceable." Id. § 250.512(d).

The Committee believed that there are limited circumstances when application of the security deposit to offset a monetary judgment would be appropriate. Typically, this would occur when the tenant has already left the property, the landlord has had the opportunity to inspect the property, both parties are before the magisterial district judge, and the parties agree that the security deposit should be used to offset the judgment.

Rule 514 is amended to require that the judgment form reflect the amount of any security deposit applied to the judgment as an offset, if applicable. The Note to Rule 514 was also amended to identify the limited circumstances in which applying the security deposit as an offset to the judgment is appropriate. Listing the security deposit offset as an entry on the judgment form will create more transparency and provide greater clarity as to the elements of the judgment.

Title 255—LOCAL COURT RULES

ADAMS COUNTY

Rule of Judicial Administration 140; Administrative Order Number 5 of 2021

Order of Court

And Now, this 18th day of October, 2021, pursuant to the authority granted by Pennsylvania Rules of Judicial Administration 1910 and 1952, and Pennsylvania Rule of Criminal Procedure 112, it is hereby Ordered that Adams County Rule of Judicial Administration 140 is vacated in its entirety and replaced by the enactment of the following rule:

- 140. Photography, Recording, Broadcasting, and Electronic Equipment in Judicial Facilities.
- A. The activation, operation, or use of any device capable of capturing, recording, transmitting, or broadcasting a photograph, video, motion picture, or audio is prohibited within a judicial facility and the environs of a judicial facility unless otherwise permitted by this rule.

B. Definitions.

Activate, Operate, or Use—The terms activate, operate, or use include but are not limited to any electronic device which is being powered or is in the "on" position regardless of whether the device is in silent mode or otherwise disabled unless the device is completely turned off.

Environs—The environs of a judicial facility include the entire floor on which is located a courtroom, hearing room, jury room, prisoner holding room, Security Department station, or any court filing office including the Prothonotary's Office, the Clerk of Courts Office, the Domestic Relations Office, and the Department of Probation Services Office. The term also includes any elevator and/or stairwell accessing a judicial facility.

Judicial Facilities—The term includes any courtroom, hearing room, or judicial chambers used by the Court, including Magisterial District Courts, to conduct trials, hearings, or any other court related business including rooms made available to interview witnesses including the environs of such a room.

Recording, Broadcasting, or Electronic Equipment—The terms recording, broadcasting, or electronic equipment include but are not limited to cell phones, laptops, electronic tablets, cameras, tape recorders, video recorders, and electronic devices of any type capable of photographing, recording, broadcasting, or digitally preserving information.

- C. Exceptions. The prohibitions set forth in this rule shall not apply to the following:
- 1. Attorney Exception—Licensed attorneys conducting business related to the representation of a client provided the device is in the "silent" or "vibrate only" mode when the attorney is in a courtroom or hearing room unless the device is being actively utilized in a proceeding which the attorney is appearing. The exceptions set forth in this section do not authorize the use or operation of an electronic device to capture, record, transmit,

or broadcast a photograph, video, motion picture, or audio of a proceeding or person within a judicial facility or its environs.

- 2. Court Administration Exception—The use of advanced communication technology by Court Administration, an official court reporter, or designee for purposes of recording/transcribing the official court record or conducting proceedings with offsite counsel, parties, or witnesses in furtherance of directives from the presiding Judge.
- 3. Emergency Responder Exception—Emergency medical, fire, law enforcement, or other personnel responding to an emergency call within a judicial facility.
- 4. Employee/Independent Contractor Exception—Employees or independent contractors of the Adams County Court of Common Pleas or Adams County who clearly display an identification badge issued by the County of Adams or is otherwise pre-approved by the Security Director while the employee is acting as an employee/contractor on court/county business provided the device shall have the power switch "off" when the employee enters a courtroom or hearing room unless the courtroom is closed for repairs.
- 5. Evidence/Equipment Exception—Devices used for the purpose of presenting evidence, or a device which is actual evidence, in any court proceeding actually being conducted at the time of use of the device with the permission of the presiding Judge.
- 6. Law Enforcement Exception—Law enforcement officers providing proper identification and are on business related to a matter pending before the court and/or meeting with the Office of District Attorney provided the device shall have the power switch "off" while the law enforcement officer is in a courtroom or hearing room. This rule is also inapplicable to County Security Officers acting within the scope of their authority.
- 7. Magisterial District Court Exception—In a criminal judicial proceeding before a Magisterial District Judge, the Magisterial District Judge, upon request, shall permit the attorney for the Commonwealth, the affiant, or the defendant to record oral communications made during a judicial proceeding as an aid to the preparation of the written record for subsequent use in a case. Such recording shall not be publicly played or disseminated in any manner unless in a subsequent court proceeding for the litigation in which the recording was made. This exception is limited to the recordation of oral testimony and does not accept or permit the use or operation of an electronic device to capture, record, transmit, or broadcast a photograph, video, motion picture, or audio of a proceeding.
- 8. Office Exception—The provisions of this rule may be waived by an elected official or department director within the confines of their office space provided the device shall have the power switch "off" when leaving the office and reentering other environs of the judicial facility.
- 9. Special Permission Exception—The President Judge may, upon request, make exception to the prohibitions contained in this rule under such circumstances and subject to such conditions as the President Judge may prescribe. The presiding Judge in an active court proceeding is authorized

to grant exception to this rule to any party as the interests of justice require. The permission shall be limited to the proceeding being conducted and for the sole purpose of allowing the party access to information from an electronic device. The permission shall not authorize the capturing, recording, or broadcasting of a photograph, video, or audio of the proceeding nor shall extend beyond the confines of the courtroom in which the proceeding is being conducted unless the proceeding is a ceremonial proceeding in which the presiding Judge has expressly authorized such actions.

- 10. Special Proceedings Exception—At the discretion of the presiding Judge, photographing, video or audio recordings, televising, or broadcasting any special proceeding such as a marriage, naturalization, or adoption in a courtroom and subject to directives from the presiding Judge.
- 11. Statutory Exception—The prohibitions in this rule shall not apply in instances where Pennsylvania statutory law permits the recording of executive or legislative branch proceedings conducted in offices or conference rooms other than courtrooms. Where such exception applies, the electronic device shall only be activated upon entry into the room in which the proceeding is occurring and shall be deactivated and have the power switch "off" before reentry into the other environs of a judicial facility.

D. Penalties.

- 1. Any violation of this rule may result in a finding of contempt and imposition of any other sanction authorized by law. Additionally, a violation of 18 Pa.C.S.A. § 5103.1 will result in criminal prosecution. The prohibitions set forth in this rule are in addition to all federal, state, and county laws and policies and any rule adopted by the Supreme Court including procedural rules.
- 2. Any person who violates this rule shall immediately surrender the electronic device to the Adams County Security Department, the Adams County Sheriff's Department, or Court designee for the remainder of their visit. Additionally, the Security Department and/or the Sheriff's Department is authorized to seize from any person any electronic equipment or device used in violation of this rule as necessary for the preservation of evidence in a subsequent contempt/criminal proceeding.
- E. The exceptions set forth in this section do not authorize the use or operation of an electronic device to capture, record, transmit, or broadcast a photograph, video, motion picture, or audio of a proceeding or person within a judicial facility or its environs. The exceptions set forth in this section do not shield a person from prosecution under 18 Pa.C.S.A. § 5103.1 for actions in violation of the statutory provision unless authorized by the presiding Judge.

This rule shall become effective after all the provisions of the Pennsylvania Rules of Judicial Administration 103 are met, to include the following:

a. Two (2) certified copies of this Order together with a computer diskette that complies with the requirement of 1 Pa. Code § 13.11(b), or other compliant format, containing the text of the local rule(s) adopted hereby shall be distributed to the Legislative Reference Bureau for publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*;

- b. One copy of this Order shall be forwarded to the Administrative Office of the Pennsylvania Courts via e-mail to adminrules@pacourts.us;
- c. A copy of the proposed local rule(s) shall be published on the 51st Judicial District website;
- d. This Order shall be filed in the Office of the Prothonotary of Adams County and a copy thereof shall be filed with the Adams County Clerk of Courts and the Adams County Law Library for inspection and copying;
- e. The effective date of the local rule(s) shall be 30 days after publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION

[25 PA. CODE CHAPTER 250]

Calculation of Soil Lead Medium-Specific Concentrations; Advance Notice of Proposed Rulemaking

The Department of Environmental Protection (Department) is soliciting information for the development of proposed amendments to Chapter 250 (relating to administration of Land Recyling Program) regarding the calculation of medium-specific concentrations (MSCs) in response to public comments on the previous Chapter 250 proposed rulemaking which proposed changes to the models used to calculate the soil lead MSCs. See 50 Pa.B. 1011 (February 15, 2020). After further consideration, the Department, in the final-form rulemaking, rescinded the proposed lead modeling amendments and decided to address this issue in a subsequent rulemaking. The Department, through this Advance Notice of Proposed Rulemaking (ANPR), is soliciting information necessary to prepare the proposed rulemaking.

The information received in response to this ANPR will be used to evaluate the updates to the model, potential changes to model input parameters and potential changes to the statistical tests used to demonstrate attainment of the Statewide health standard for lead in soil at Act 2 remediation sites.

A. Background and Purpose

During the public comment period for the previous proposed rulemaking, the Environmental Quality Board received numerous comments expressing concern with the proposed amendments to § 250.306(e) (relating to ingestion numeric values) which updated the models used to calculate the soil direct contact numeric values for lead. For the nonresidential numeric value calculation, the Society for Environmental Geochemistry and Health (SEGH) Task Force Approach to the Assessment of Lead in Soil was proposed to be replaced with United States Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) Adult Lead Model (ALM). For the residential numeric value calculation, Uptake Biokinetic (UBK) Model for Lead (version 4.0) was proposed to be replaced with the EPA's Integrated Exposure Uptake Biokinetic (IEUBK) Model for Lead in Children from 2010 which has subsequently been updated in May 2021. Updates to the model input parameters Table 7 were also proposed.

Additionally, on September 17, 2020, the Cleanup Standards Scientific Advisory Board (CSSAB) provided a memo to the Department titled "Consideration for the Application of the IEUBK Model and ALM for the Development of Soil Direct Contact Values for Lead within the Act 2 Program." In this memo, the CSSAB discussed the models' use of average concentrations as input values and compared attainment outcomes for each of various datasets using three tests: 75% /10x, 95% UCL, and the average of the attainment sampling soil concentration. Based on this analysis, the CSSAB recommended the Department consider the use of the average lead concentration as an additional option for the attainment demonstration for sites with soil lead contamination. Persons wishing to use the two existing attainment

tests could still do so, consistent with what is currently provided for in the regulations implementing the Land Recycling and Environmental Remediation Standards Act (35 P.S. §§ 6026.101—6026.908) (Act 2).

B. Specific Information Requested by the Department

- 1. The Department is seeking scientific information regarding using the proposed updated models in calculating the residential and non-residential direct contact numeric soil values for lead. Scientifically supported reasoning in support or opposition to the use of these models should be provided including information relating to the financial and economic impacts of these updates.
- 2. The Department is seeking scientific information regarding the use of the most scientifically appropriate target blood lead level and other model input parameters for calculating the residential and nonresidential direct contact numeric soil values for lead. Information on the use of the models' default input parameters versus the use of other specific input parameters should be included.
- 3. The Department is seeking scientific information regarding the use of the average lead concentration as an additional option for the attainment demonstration of the Statewide health standard for sites with soil lead contamination. These models discuss the use of average concentrations as input values for site-specific evaluations. Information on the application of averages in the models as well as the use of averages to demonstrate attainment should be included.

Documents must be received by January 28, 2022. Written or electronic documents will be accepted. A subject heading must be included noting that the document is being submitted in response to the Advance Notice of Proposed Rulemaking for Proposed Changes to the Chapter 250 Soil Lead Models. Referendum on Continuation of the Pennsylvania Wine Marketing and Research Program

I. The Pennsylvania Wine Marketing and Research Program was established under the provisions of the Agricultural Commodities Marketing Act. The Act requires that the Secretary of Agriculture call a referendum of affected producers every five years to determine whether or not a majority of those voting still desire the program. The program was last subjected to a review referendum conducted in 2016. It is now time for another review referendum to determine whether a majority of the wine producers desire the program to continue.

- II. Referendum Period: The referendum period shall be from November 15, 2021 until 4 p.m. on November 29, 2021. Completed ballots shall be mailed or hand-delivered to the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture, Bureau of Market Development, Room 310, 2301 North Cameron Street, Harrisburg, Pennsylvania 17110-9408. Hand-delivered ballots must be received by 4 p.m. on November 29, 2021. Ballots that are mailed must be postmarked no later than November 29, 2021 and received no later than December 3, 2021.
- III. Notice of Referendum: This referendum order and an official ballot shall be mailed no later than November 8, 2021, to all affected producers whose names appear on the list of Pennsylvania wine producers maintained in the Office of the Secretary of Agriculture. Additional copies of the same materials shall be made available at the Office of the Secretary of Agriculture.
- IV. Eligible Voters: The rules governing the eligibility of a producer for voting are as follows: The record date for determination of whether a producer is eligible to vote is November 8, 2021. Names of affected eligible producers shall be taken from the commodity wine list of producers/ sellers maintained in the Office of the Secretary of Agriculture. These names are supplied to the Secretary from the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board. Voting producers must have a Limited Winery License. Producers who hold a Limited Winery License but do not produce wine in Pennsylvania are not eligible to vote.
- V. Counting of Ballots: The ballots will be canvassed and counted by a Teller Committee appointed by the Secretary of Agriculture. The counting of the ballots will begin at 10 a.m., Wednesday, December 8, 2021 at the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture, 2301 North Cameron Street, Harrisburg, Pennsylvania 17110. The Secretary will announce the results of the referendum within 30 days following the completion of the referendum period. The results will be published in the Pennsylvania Bulletin and the Harrisburg Patriot-News, and disseminated to the news media.
- VI. Reporting Irregularities: Any irregularities or disputes concerning the referendum procedures must be reported in written form to the Secretary of Agriculture no later than seven (7) calendar days from the end of the referendum period.
- VII. *Publication*: This referendum order shall be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* and the Harrisburg *Patriot-News*.

VIII. *Effective Date*: The foregoing order shall be effective immediately.

Where indicated, DEP has made tentative determinations, based on preliminary review, to issue permits subject to proposed effluent limitations consisting of best management practices identified in the erosion and sediment control (E&S) plans and post-construction stormwater management (PCSM) plans submitted with the applications, as well as other terms and conditions based on the permit applications. A 30-day public comment period applies to these applications.

A person who demonstrates attainment of one, or a combination of the cleanup standards, or who receives approval of a special industrial area remediation identified under the Act, will be relieved of further liability for the remediation of the site for any contamination identified in reports submitted to and approved by the Department. Furthermore, the person shall not be subject to citizen suits or other contribution actions brought by responsible persons not participating in the remediation.

Under Sections 304(n)(1)(ii) and 305(c)(2) of the Act, there is a 30-day public and municipal comment period for sites proposed for remediation using a site-specific standard, in whole or in part, and for sites remediated as a special industrial area. This period begins when a summary of the NOI to Remediate is published in a newspaper of general circulation in the area of the site. For the following identified site(s), proposed for remediation to a site-specific standard or as a special industrial area, the municipality, within which the site is located, may request to be involved in the development of the remediation and reuse plans for the site if the request is made within 30-days of the following specified date. Code §§ 127.44(a) and 127.45(a), that the Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) has received and intends to issue a Plan Approval to Blythe Township Landfill (1061 Burma Road, P.O. Box 335, Saint Clair, PA 17970) for their facility located in Blythe Township, Schuylkill County. This Plan Approval No. 54-00096A will be converted into a natural Minor Permit through an administrative amendment at a later date.

Plan Approval No. 54-00096A is for the installation and operation of a landfill gas (LFG) Treatment System at the

Blythe Recycling and Demolition Site (BRADS). The facility is a construction and demolition (C&D) landfill which began accepting waste in 2019. BRADS identified the presence of landfill gas (LFG) and odors in a temporary leachate sump. In response, a passive solar flare was installed at the leachate. However, because the LFG methane content is currently insufficient to support combustion, the passive flare has not been effective in controlling odors. As requested by the Department, BRADS submitted an odor control plan and implementation schedule to reduce odors from the sump. BRADS has proposed to install and operate a solid scavenger media treatment system to control H2S odor emissions. The system will reduce H2S emissions from the facility to less than 0.03 TPY. The company shall be subject to and comply with 25 Pa. Code § 123.31 for malodorous emissions. The Plan Approval and Operating permit will contain additional recordkeeping and operating restrictions designed to keep the facility operating within all applicable air quality requirements.

Copies of the application, DEP's analysis and other documents used in the evaluation of the application are available for public review during normal business hours at Air Quality Program, 2 Public Square, Wilkes-Barre, PA 18701.

MINING ACTIVITY NPDES DRAFT PERMITS

If additional effluent limits are needed for an NPDES permit associated with a noncoal mining permit, then the permit description specifies the parameters.

In addition to BAT or WQBEL limits, coal and noncoal NPDES permits establish effluent limitations in the form of implemented Best Management Practices (BMPs) identified in the associated Erosion and Sedimentation Plan, the Reclamation Plan and the NPDES permit application. These BMPs restrict the rates and quantities of associated pollutants from being discharged into surface waters in this Commonwealth.

More restrictive effluent limitations, restrictions on discharge volume or restrictions on the extent of mining that may occur are incorporated into an NPDES permit when necessary for compliance with water quality standards and antidegradation requirements (in accordance with 25 Pa. Code Chapters 91—96).

The procedures for determining the final effluent limits, using a mass-balance equation or model, are found in Technical Guidance Document 563-2112-115, Developing National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Permits for Mining Activities. Other specific factors to be considered include public comments and Total Maximum Daily Load(s). Additional discharge limitations may apply in the event that unexpected discharges occur.

Comments received within the comment period will be considered in the final determinations regarding the NPDES permit applications. TDD users may contact the Board through the Pennsylvania Hamilton Relay Service, (800) 654-5984. Appeals must be filed with the Board within 30-days of publication of this notice in the Pennsylvania Bulletin unless the appropriate statute provides a different time period. Copies of the appeal form and the Board's rules of practice and procedure may be obtained from the Board. The appeal form and the Board's rules of practice and procedure are also available in Braille or on audiotape from the Secretary to the Board at (717) 787-3483. This paragraph does not, in and of itself, create a right of appeal beyond that permitted by applicable statutes and decisional law.

For individuals who wish to challenge an action, the appeal must reach the Board within 30-days. A lawyer is not needed to file an appeal with the Board.

The APM will continue to provide additional funds to qualified FQHCs that provide a high volume of services to Medical Assistance (MA) beneficiaries to allow the FQHCs to develop and offer additional services.

Background

Section 1902(bb)(1) of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C.A. § 1396a(bb)(1)) provides for payment to FQHCs using a Prospective Payment System (PPS) meth-

odology. For services provided to beneficiaries receiving services in a managed care delivery system, states must make supplemental payments equal to the amount the FQHC would have been paid under the PPS. See section 1902(bb)(5) of the Social Security Act. States can also pay providers using an APM. See section 1902(bb)(6) of the Social Security Act.

APM for FQHCs Operated by a City of the First Class

On July 24, 2019, CMS approved the Department of Human Services' (Department) request to implement an APM to pay qualifying FQHCs, located in and operated by a city of the first class and that agreed to the APM in writing, a Medical Assistance Encounter Rate (MAER) for medical services provided to MA beneficiaries for dates of service April 1, 2019, through March 31, 2022.

Subject to the approval of CMS, the Department will continue to pay qualifying FQHCs, located in and operated by a city of the first class and that agree to the APM in writing, the FQHC's MAER as supplemental payments, effective on March 31, 2022, as applied to the number of medical services provided to MA beneficiaries for dates of service April 1, 2022, through March 31, 2024.

Fiscal Impact

The estimated annual fiscal impact, as a result of the continued funding allocation for these payments, is \$42.089 million.

Pennsylvania Baking Spirits Bright Fast Play Game 5141

Under the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314) and 61 Pa. Code § 803.11 (relating to powers and duties of the Secretary of Revenue), the Secretary of Revenue hereby provides public notice of the rules for the following lottery game:

1. Name: The name of the lottery game is Pennsylvania Baking Spirits Bright (hereinafter "Baking Spirits Bright"). The game number is PA-5141.

2. Definitions:

- (a) Authorized retailer or retailer: A person who is properly licensed by the Lottery pursuant to 61 Pa. Code §§ 805.1—805.17.
- (b) Bar code: The symbology on the ticket containing certain encrypted validation and accounting data used for identifying winning and losing tickets.
- (c) COOKIE RECIPE: The area at the top of a Baking Spirits Bright lottery game ticket containing one play symbol that, when played according to the instructions, determines whether a player doubles any prize won in the play area below.
- (d) Game Ticket: A bearer instrument produced through a Lottery Terminal that is the player's record of a play for a Fast Play lottery game and sold by an authorized retailer containing the play and validation data as published in this game notice.
- (e) Lottery Central Computer System: The computer gaming system on which all Fast Play plays are recorded.
- (f) Lottery Terminal: A device authorized by the Lottery to function in an interactive mode with the Lottery Central Computer System for the purpose of issuing plays, executing Quick Pick selections, and entering, receiving, and processing lottery transactions, including making purchases, validating plays, transmitting reports and performing inventory functions.
- (g) Play: A chance to participate in a particular Fast Play lottery game.
- (h) Play Area: The area on a ticket, which contains one or more play symbols.
- (i) *Play Symbol*: A number, letter, symbol, image or other character found in the play area, which is used to determine whether a player wins a prize.
- (j) *Prize*: A non-monetary item, money or experience that can be won as specified in section 7 (relating to prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners) of this game notice.
- (k) WINNING NUMBERS: The numbers, letters, symbols or other characters found in the play area that, when matched against the play symbols in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area, determine whether a player wins a prize.
- (l) Winning ticket: A game ticket which has been validated and qualifies for a prize.
- (m) YOUR NUMBERS: The numbers, letters, symbols or other characters found in the play area that, when matched against the play symbols in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area, determine whether a player wins a prize.
- 3. *Price*: The price of a Baking Spirits Bright ticket is \$1.

4. Description of the Baking Spirits Bright Fast Play lottery game:

- (a) The Baking Spirits Bright lottery game is an instant win game printed from a Lottery Terminal. All prizes are predetermined, and the player does not have the ability to select their own play symbols. Baking Spirits Bright tickets may be purchased from an authorized retailer or at a Lottery self-service terminal that sells terminal-based Lottery game tickets. Tickets purchased from an authorized retailer shall be printed on-demand at the time of purchase and may not be preprinted by the retailer.
- (b) Baking Spirits Bright is played by matching the play symbols located in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area to the play symbols located in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area. A player matching play symbols in this manner will win the prize shown under the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol. If a 2X (2TIMES) symbol appears in the "COOKIE RECIPE" area, the player doubles any prize won in the play area below. A bet slip is not used to play this game.
- (c) Players can win the prizes identified in section 7 (relating to prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners).
- (d) A Baking Spirits Bright game ticket cannot be canceled or voided once printed by the Lottery Terminal, even if printed in error.
- (e) To purchase a ticket at an authorized retailer, a player must remit the purchase price to the retailer and verbally request a Baking Spirits Bright game ticket. The ticket shall be the only valid proof of the bet placed and the only valid receipt for claiming a prize.
- (f) To purchase a ticket at a Pennsylvania Lottery self-service terminal, the player must insert into the self-service terminal a dollar amount equal to the total purchase price of a Baking Spirits Bright game ticket and select the Baking Spirits Bright option on the Lottery self-service terminal. The ticket shall be the only valid proof of the bet placed and the only valid receipt for claiming a prize.
 - 5. Baking Spirits Bright ticket characteristics:
- (a) A Baking Spirits Bright ticket shall contain a play area, the cost of the play, the date of sale and a bar code.
- (b) Play Symbols: Each Baking Spirits Bright ticket play area will contain a "WINNING NUMBERS" area, a "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a "COOKIE RECIPE" area. The play symbols and their captions, located in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area and the "YOUR NUMBERS" area, are: 1 (ONE), 3 (THREE), 4 (FOUR), 5 (FIVE), 6 (SIX), 7 (SEVEN), 8 (EIGHT), 9 (NINE), 10 (TEN), 11 (ELEVN), 12 (TWLV), 13 (THRTN), 14 (FORTN), 15 (FIFTN), 16 (SIXTN), 17 (SVNTN), 18 (EGHTN), 19 (NINTN) and 20 (TWENT). The play symbols and their captions, located in the "COOKIE RECIPE" area, are: 1X (NOMULT) and a 2X (2TIMES) symbol.
- (c) Prize Symbols: The prize symbols and their captions, located in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area, are: FREE (TICKET), $\$1^{.00}$ (ONE DOL), $\$2^{.00}$ (TWO DOL), $\$4^{.00}$ (FOR DOL), $\$5^{.00}$ (FIV DOL), $\$10^{.00}$ (TEN DOL), $\$20^{.00}$ (TWENTY), $\$50^{.00}$ (FIFTY), \$100 (ONE HUN), \$500 (FIV HUN) and \$2,500 (TWYFIVHUN).
- (d) *Prizes*: The prizes that can be won in this game, are: Free \$1 Ticket, \$1, \$2, \$4, \$5, \$10, \$20, \$50, \$100, \$500 and \$2,500. Baking Spirits Bright contains a feature that can multiply the prize won. For a complete list of

prizes, and how those prizes can be won, see section 8 (relating to Number and description of prizes and approximate chances of winning). A player can win up to six times on a ticket.

- (e) Approximate number of tickets available for the game: Approximately 1,200,000 tickets will be available for sale for the Baking Spirits Bright lottery game.
- 6. Second-Chance Drawing: The Pennsylvania Lottery will conduct a North Pole Payout Second-Chance Drawing for which non-winning Baking Spirits Bright lottery game tickets may be eligible as provided for in section 9.
- 7. Prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners:
- (a) All Baking Spirits Bright prize payments will be made as one-time, lump-sum cash payments.
- (b) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$2,500 (TWYFIVHUN) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, and upon which a 1X (NOMULT) symbol appears in the "COOKIE RECIPE" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$2,500.
- (c) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$500 (FIV HUN) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, and upon which a 1X (NOMULT) symbol appears in the "COOKIE RECIPE" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$500.
- (d) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, and upon which a 1X (NOMULT) symbol appears in the "COOKIE RECIPE" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.
- (e) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$50⁻⁰⁰ (FIFTY) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, and upon which a 2X (2TIMES) symbol appears in the "COOKIE RECIPE" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.
- (f) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$50^{.00} (FIFTY) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, and upon which a 1X (NOMULT) symbol appears in the "COOKIE RECIPE" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$50.
- (g) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$20⁻⁰⁰ (TWENTY) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, and upon which a 2X (2TIMES) symbol appears in the "COOKIE RECIPE" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$40.
- (h) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$20.00 (TWENTY) appears in the "Prize" area under the match-

- ing "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, and upon which a 1X (NOMULT) symbol appears in the "COOKIE RECIPE" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$20.
- (i) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$10^{.00} (TEN DOL) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, and upon which a 2X (2TIMES) symbol appears in the "COOKIE RECIPE" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$20.
- (j) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$10^{.00} (TEN DOL) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, and upon which a 1X (NOMULT) symbol appears in the "COOKIE RECIPE" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$10.
- (k) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$5.00 (FIV DOL) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, and upon which a 2X (2TIMES) symbol appears in the "COOKIE RECIPE" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$10.
- (l) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$4.00 (FOR DOL) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, and upon which a 2X (2TIMES) symbol appears in the "COOKIE RECIPE" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$8.
- (m) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$5.00 (FIV DOL) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, and upon which a 1X (NOMULT) symbol appears in the "COOKIE RECIPE" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$5.
- (n) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$4.00 (FOR DOL) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, and upon which a 1X (NOMULT) symbol appears in the "COOKIE RECIPE" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$4.
- (o) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$2.00 (TWO DOL) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, and upon which a 2X (2TIMES) symbol appears in the "COOKIE RECIPE" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$4.
- (p) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$2^{.00} (TWO DOL) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, and upon which a 1X (NOMULT) symbol appears in the "COOKIE RECIPE" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$2.
- (q) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of $\$1^{.00}$ (ONE DOL) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, and upon

which a 2X (2TIMES) symbol appears in the "COOKIE RECIPE" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$2.

(r) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of $\$1^{.00}$ (ONE DOL) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, and upon which a 1X (NOMULT) symbol appears in the "COOKIE RECIPE" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1.

(s) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of FREE (TICKET) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, and upon which a 1X (NOMULT) symbol appears in the "COOKIE RECIPE" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of one Baking Spirits Bright Fast Play Game Ticket.

- (ii) The second and the third entries selected in the Drawing will be winning entries and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$50,000, less required income tax withholding.
- (iii) The fourth through the eighth entries selected in the Drawing will be winning entries and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$10,000, less required income tax withholding.
- (iv) The ninth through the thirteenth entries selected in the Drawing will be winning entries and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$5,000.
- (v) The fourteenth through the sixty-third entries selected in the Drawing will be winning entries and the entrants who submitted the winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$100 iLottery Bonus Money.
- (3) All prizes will be paid as lump-sum cash payments or uploaded to a winning player's lottery account.
- (4) Winners of iLottery Bonus Money are not required to claim a prize. Winners of iLottery Bonus Money will have the iLottery Bonus Money credited to their Lottery account and will receive an email notifying them that they won a prize.
- (5) The number of winning entries to be selected for the Drawing will be posted to the Lottery's publicly accessible web site.
- (6) The odds of winning in the Drawing depend upon the number of entries received for the Drawing.
- (7) A computer-generated randomizer will be used to select the Drawing winners.
 - (e) Drawing restrictions:
- (1) To be eligible to participate in the Drawing, entrants must have complied with the requirements of these rules.
- (2) The Lottery is not responsible for late, lost or misdirected entries not entered into the Drawing. The Lottery is not responsible for entries that are not entered into the Drawing because of incompatible internet browsers, mobile Lottery application failure or other technical issues. If an entry is selected as a winner and rejected or otherwise disqualified during or following the Drawing, the Lottery will select another entry to replace the rejected or otherwise disqualified entry in accordance with these rules and Lottery procedure.
- (3) If any discrepancy exists between these rules and any material describing the Drawing, these rules shall govern.
- (4) Employees of the Lottery, 9Rooftops Marketing, LLC (formerly known as MARC USA, LLC), Scientific Games International, Inc., MDI Entertainment, LLC, and

- their subcontractors, or a spouse, child, brother, sister or parent residing as a member of the same household in the principal place of residence of any such person are not eligible to participate in the Drawing. Offer void where prohibited or restricted.
- (5) The Pennsylvania Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to cancel or suspend the Drawing and change these rules if the Drawing cannot be conducted as planned due to errors in these rules or advertising, unauthorized intervention, tampering, fraud, technical errors, viruses, worms, bugs or any other cause beyond the control of the Lottery that, in the Lottery's sole judgment, could corrupt or impair the administration, security, fairness, integrity or proper conduct of the Drawing.
- (6) All entries shall be subject to verification by the Lottery.
- (7) The Pennsylvania Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to disqualify an entrant found to be tampering with the operation of the Drawing or to be acting in violation of these rules or applicable law.
- (8) The Drawing is governed by the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Applicable laws and regulations apply.
- (9) Prizes must be claimed within 1 year of the drawing date of the Drawing in which the prize was won. If no claim is made within 1 year of the drawing date of the Drawing in which the prize was won, the right of an entrant to claim the prize won, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided by statute.
- (10) Final determination of winners will be made by the Secretary, whose judgment will be final and binding.
- (11) A prize awarded in the Drawing to a person who dies before receiving the prize shall be paid according to 61 Pa. Code § 811.16 (relating to prizes payable after death of a prize winner).
- (12) A winner is responsible for all taxes arising from or in connection with any prize won.
- (13) A player may only win the prize for which the player is first selected in the Drawing. Subsequent entries, from the same individual, selected in the Drawing will be disqualified and a replacement entry will be selected.
- (14) Winners of iLottery Bonus Money must abide by the iLottery Terms & Conditions, the iLottery Bonus Policy and these rules. iLottery Bonus Money will expire 90 days from the date on which the winner was notified, via email, of the prize win, as further detailed in section 9(d)(4). iLottery Bonus Money has a five times play through requirement in order to convert the iLottery Bonus Money into cash. For example, for a player winning \$100 of iLottery Bonus Money, the player is required to place \$500 in wagers before the iLottery Bonus Money awarded is converted into cash which may be withdrawn from the player's Lottery account.
 - (15) Prizes are not transferrable.
 - (16) Other restrictions may apply.
 - 10. Ticket responsibility:
- (a) A Fast Play lottery game ticket is a bearer document deemed to be owned by the person holding the game ticket, except that if a name is contained on the back of the game ticket, the person named will, for all purposes, be considered the owner of the game ticket.

(b) The holder of a Fast Play lottery game ticket has the sole responsibility for checking the accuracy and condition of the data printed on the game ticket.

- (c) The Commonwealth shall not be responsible for a lost or stolen Fast Play lottery game ticket, or for a Fast Play ticket redeemed by a player in error.
 - 11. Ticket validation and requirements:
- (a) Valid Fast Play lottery game tickets. To be a valid Fast Play lottery game ticket, the presented game ticket must meet the following requirements:
- (1) The game ticket's bar code shall be present in its entirety.
 - (2) The game ticket must be intact.
- (3) The game ticket may not be mutilated, altered, reconstituted or tampered with.
- (4) The game ticket may not be counterfeit or a duplicate of a winning ticket.
 - (5) The game ticket must have been validly issued.
- (6) The game ticket data shall have been recorded on the Lottery Central Computer System and the game ticket data shall match the computer record in every respect.
- (7) The game ticket must not be defectively printed or printed or produced in error such that it cannot be processed or validated by the Lottery.
- (8) The game ticket must pass other confidential security checks of the Lottery.
- (b) Invalid or defective game tickets. A game ticket not passing the validation requirements in subsection (a) will be considered invalid and no payment will be made on account of any play recorded thereon. The determination of the Secretary in this regard is final.
 - 12. Procedures for claiming and payment of prizes:
- (a) A prize may be claimed through an authorized retailer or the Lottery, as provided in this section. A prize must be claimed within 1 year of the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket.
- (b) An authorized retailer is authorized to pay prizes of \$2,500 or less. The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play representing a prize of \$2,500 or less may be paid by a participating authorized retailer if a proper validation pay ticket was issued by the retailer's Lottery Terminal.
- (c) The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play representing a prize in excess of \$2,500 may present the game ticket to an authorized retailer, Lottery District Office, or Lottery Headquarters.
- (d) The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play shall present the ticket, in person, to an authorized retailer, Lottery Headquarters or a Lottery District Office. The retailer or the Lottery will issue payment if:
- (1) The game ticket is scanned and the play is validated through the Lottery Terminal or the Lottery Central Computer System;
 - (2) A claim form is properly and fully completed;
 - (3) The identification of the claimant is confirmed; and
- (4) The winning ticket has not expired, pursuant to this section or section 14 (relating to unclaimed prizes).
- (e) The Commonwealth shall not be responsible for a winning play paid in error by an authorized retailer.

- (f) In the event a prize described in these rules is not available, the Lottery may either provide a substitute prize, determined by the Secretary to have an equivalent value to the prize won, or make a cash payment to the winner, in an amount determined by the Secretary to have an equivalent value to the prize won.
- 13. Funding for prizes: Moneys will be drawn from the State Lottery Fund, to the extent necessary, to fund the payment of prizes under this section. If this lottery game is terminated for any cause, prize moneys remaining undistributed will remain in the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes otherwise provided for by law.
- 14. Unclaimed prizes: Unclaimed prize money on winning Fast Play lottery game tickets will be retained by the Secretary for payment to the persons entitled thereto for 1 year from the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket. If no claim is made within 1 year from the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket, the right of a ticket holder to claim the prize represented by that ticket, if any, shall expire.
- 15. Purchase and prize restrictions: A Fast Play lottery game ticket may not be purchased by, and a prize may not be paid, to an officer or employee of the Lottery, Lottery professional services contractors or subcontractors, or to a spouse, child, brother, sister or parent residing in the same household of an officer, employee, contractor or subcontractor who is involved in the production, distribution or operation of systems for the validation or accounting of Fast Play games.

16. Governing law:

- (a) By purchasing a ticket, the purchaser agrees to comply with and abide by the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314), this notice, instructions, conditions and final decisions of the Secretary, and procedures established by the Secretary for the conduct of the Fast Play Baking Spirits Bright lottery game.
- (b) Decisions made by the Secretary, including the declaration of prizes and the payment thereof, in interpretation of this notice are final and binding on players and persons making a claim in respect thereof.
 - 17. Retailer compensation:
- (a) Authorized retailers may be entitled to compensation as determined by the Lottery.
- (b) No authorized retailer or employee of an authorized retailer shall request, demand, or accept gratuities or any compensation other than as provided in subsection (a) in exchange for the performance of duties authorized pursuant to the Lottery retailer's license without the Lottery's prior written authorization.
- 18. Retailer Incentive Programs: The Lottery may conduct a separate Retailer Incentive Program for retailers who sell Pennsylvania Fast Play Baking Spirits Bright lottery game tickets.
- 19. Retailer bonus: The Lottery may offer a retailer bonus in connection with the sale of Pennsylvania Fast Play lottery game tickets. If a retailer bonus is offered, a Lottery retailer shall be eligible for a bonus as described in this section. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$100,000 and not exceeding \$500,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$500. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$500,001 and not

- exceeding \$1,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$5,000. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$1,000,001 and not exceeding \$10,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$10,000. A Lottery retailer is entitled only to the largest bonus for which they qualify on a winning ticket. A bonus will be initiated for payment after the Fast Play game ticket is claimed and validated. A bonus will not be awarded to a Lottery retailer that sells a non-winning Pennsylvania Lottery Fast Play game ticket used to enter a Pennsylvania Lottery second-chance drawing or promotion that is subsequently selected to win a prize.
- 20. Termination of the game: The Secretary may announce a termination date, after which no further tickets from this game may be sold. The announcement will be disseminated through media used to advertise or promote Baking Spirits Bright or through normal communications methods.
- 21. Applicability: This notice applies only to the Baking Spirits Bright lottery game announced in this notice.

Pennsylvania Frosty Fun Fast Play Game 5138

Under the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314) and 61 Pa. Code § 803.11 (relating to powers and duties of the Secretary of Revenue), the Secretary of Revenue hereby provides public notice of the rules for the following lottery game:

- 1. Name: The name of the lottery game is Pennsylvania Frosty Fun (hereinafter "Frosty Fun"). The game number is PA-5138.
 - 2. Definitions:
- (a) Authorized retailer or retailer: A person who is properly licensed by the Lottery pursuant to 61 Pa. Code §§ 805.1—805.17.
- (b) Bar code: The symbology on the ticket containing certain encrypted validation and accounting data used for identifying winning and losing tickets.
- (c) FROZEN \$50 NUMBER: The area at the top of a Frosty Fun lottery game ticket containing one play symbol that, when played according to the instructions, determines whether the player wins a prize of \$50.
- (d) Game Ticket: A bearer instrument produced through a Lottery Terminal that is the player's record of a play for a Fast Play lottery game and sold by an authorized retailer containing the play and validation data as published in this game notice.
- (e) Lottery Central Computer System: The computer gaming system on which all Fast Play plays are recorded.
- (f) Lottery Terminal: A device authorized by the Lottery to function in an interactive mode with the Lottery Central Computer System for the purpose of issuing plays, executing Quick Pick selections, and entering, receiving, and processing lottery transactions, including

making purchases, validating plays, transmitting reports and performing inventory functions.

- (g) Play: A chance to participate in a particular Fast Play lottery game.
- (h) *Play Area*: The area on a ticket which contains one or more play symbols.
- (i) *Play Symbol*: A number, letter, symbol, image or other character found in the play area which is used to determine whether a player wins a prize.
- (j) *Prize*: A non-monetary item, money, or experience that can be won as specified in section 7 (relating to prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners) of this game notice.
- (k) WINNING NUMBERS: The numbers, letters, symbols or other characters found in the play area that, when matched against the play symbols in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area, determine whether a player wins a prize.
- (l) Winning ticket: A game ticket which has been validated and qualifies for a prize.
- (m) YOUR NUMBERS: The numbers, letters, symbols or other characters found in the play area that, when matched against the play symbols in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area, determine whether a player wins a prize.
 - 3. *Price*: The price of a Frosty Fun ticket is \$10.
 - 4. Description of Frosty Fun Fast Play lottery game:
- (a) Frosty Fun lottery game is an instant win game printed from a Lottery Terminal. All prizes are predetermined, and the player does not have the ability to select their own play symbols. Frosty Fun tickets may be purchased from an authorized retailer or at a Lottery self-service terminal that sells terminal-based Lottery game tickets. Tickets purchased from an authorized retailer shall be printed on-demand at the time of purchase and may not be preprinted by the retailer.
- (b) Frosty Fun is played by matching any of the play symbols located in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area to any of the play symbols located in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area. A player matching play symbols in this manner will win the prize shown under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol. A bet slip is not used to play this game.
- (c) Frosty Fun tickets contain a "FROZEN \$50 NUMBER" area. Whenever a player matches the play symbol in the "FROZEN \$50 NUMBER" area to any of the play symbols in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area, the player will win a prize of \$50.
- (d) Frosty Fun tickets contain a feature that can multiply certain prizes. When a 2X symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area next to a winning prize amount, double the prize shown and win that amount. When a 3X symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area next to a winning prize amount, triple the prize shown and win that amount.
- (e) Players can win the prizes identified in section 7 (relating to prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners).
- (f) Frosty Fun tickets cannot be canceled or voided once printed by the Lottery Terminal, even if printed in error.
- (g) To purchase a ticket at an authorized retailer, a player must remit the purchase price to the retailer and

verbally request a Frosty Fun ticket. The ticket shall be the only valid proof of the bet placed and the only valid receipt for claiming a prize.

- (h) To purchase a ticket at a Pennsylvania Lottery self-service terminal, the player must insert into the self-service terminal a dollar amount equal to the total purchase price of a Frosty Fun ticket and select the Frosty Fun option on the Lottery self-service terminal. The ticket shall be the only valid proof of the bet placed and the only valid receipt for claiming a prize.
 - 5. Frosty Fun ticket characteristics:
- (a) Frosty Fun tickets shall contain a play area, the cost of the play, the date of sale and a bar code.
- (b) Play Symbols: Frosty Fun tickets will contain a "WINNING NUMBERS" area, a "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a "FROZEN \$50 NUMBER" area. The play symbols and their captions, located in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area, the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and the "FROZEN \$50 NUMBER" area, are: 1 (ONE), 4 (FOUR), 5 (FIVE), 6 (SIX), 7 (SEVEN), 8 (EIGHT), 9 (NINE), 10 (TEN), 11 (ELEVN), 12 (TWLV), 13 (THRTN), 14 (FORTN), 15 (FIFTN), 16 (SIXTN), 17 (SVNTN), 18 (EGHTN), 19 (NINTN), 20 (TWENT), 21 (TWYONE), 22 (TWYTWO), 23 (TWYTHR), 24 (TWYFOR), 25 (TWYFIV), 26 (TWYSIX), 27 (TWYSVN), 28 (TWYEGT), 29 (TWYNIN) and 30 (THIRT). The multiplier symbols are: 2X symbol and a 3X symbol.
- (c) Prize Symbols: The prize symbols and their captions, located in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area, are: $\$10^{.00}$ (TEN DOL), $\$15^{.00}$ (FIFTEEN), $\$20^{.00}$ (TWENTY), $\$30^{.00}$ (THIRTY), $\$50^{.00}$ (FIFTY), \$100 (ONE HUN), \$500 (FIV HUN), \$1,000 (ONE THO), \$5,000 (FIV THO) and \$50,000 (FTY THO).
- (d) *Prizes*: The prizes that can be won in this game, are: \$10, \$15, \$20, \$30, \$50, \$100, \$500, \$1,000, \$5,000 and \$50,000. The prize that can be won in the "FROZEN \$50 NUMBER" area is \$50. A player can win up to 16 times on a ticket.
- (e) Approximate number of tickets available for the game: Approximately 600,000 tickets will be available for sale for the Frosty Fun lottery game.
- 6. Second-Chance Drawing: The Pennsylvania Lottery will conduct a North Pole Payout Second-Chance Drawing for which non-winning Frosty Fun lottery game tickets may be eligible as provided for in section 9.
- 7. Prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners:
- (a) All Frosty Fun prize payments will be made as one-time, lump-sum cash payments.
- (b) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$50,000 (FTY THO) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$50,000.
- (c) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$5,000 (FIV THO) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$5,000.
- (d) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$1,000 (ONE THO) appears in the "Prize" area under the

matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1,000.

- (e) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$500 (FIV HUN) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, and a 2X symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area next to that \$500 (FIV HUN) prize symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1,000.
- (f) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$500 (FIV HUN) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$500.
- (g) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, and a 3X symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area next to that \$100 (ONE HUN) prize symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$300.
- (h) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, and a 2X symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area next to that \$100 (ONE HUN) prize symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$200.
- (i) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of 50^{00} (FIFTY) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, and a 3X symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area next to that 50^{00} (FIFTY) prize symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$150.
- (j) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.
- (k) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$50^{.00} (FIFTY) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, and a 2X symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area next to that \$50^{.00} (FIFTY) prize symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.
- (l) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$30⁻⁰⁰ (THIRTY) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, and a 3X symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area next to that \$30⁻⁰⁰ (THIRTY) prize symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$90.
- (m) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$30.00 (THIRTY) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching

- "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, and a 2X symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area next to that \$30.00 (THIRTY) prize symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$60.
- (n) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of $\$20^{.00}$ (TWENTY) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, and a 3X symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area next to that $\$20^{.00}$ (TWENTY) prize symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$60.
- (o) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$50.00 (FIFTY) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$50.
- (p) Holders of tickets upon which the "FROZEN \$50 NUMBER" play symbol matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$50.
- (q) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$15^{.00} (FIFTEEN) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, and a 3X symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area next to that \$15^{.00} (FIFTEEN) prize symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$45.
- (r) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of $\$20^{.00}$ (TWENTY) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, and a 2X symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area next to that $\$20^{.00}$ (TWENTY) prize symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$40.
- (s) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of $\$30^{.00}$ (THIRTY) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$30.
- (t) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$15.00 (FIFTEEN) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, and a 2X symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area next to that \$15.00 (FIFTEEN) prize symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$30.
- (u) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of $$10^{.00}$ (TEN DOL) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, and a 3X symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area next to that $$10^{.00}$ (TEN DOL) prize symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$30.
- (v) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of $\$20^{.00}$ (TWENTY) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$20.

- (w) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of $$10^{.00}$ (TEN DOL) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, and a 2X symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area next to that $$10^{.00}$ (TEN DOL) prize symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$20.
- (x) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of $$15^{.00}$ (FIFTEEN) appears in the "Prize" area under
- the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$15.
- (y) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$10.00 (TEN DOL) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$10.

 - (b) *Participation and entry*:
- (1) Entrants must be members of the Pennsylvania Lottery VIP Players Club to participate in the Drawing. To join the VIP Players Club, visit https://www.palottery.state.pa.us/vipplayersclub/login.aspx. Becoming a VIP Players Club member is free.
- (2) To enter the Drawing, entrants must submit the identifying information from at least one Qualifying Ticket via the Drawing's promotional web site, available at https://www.palottery.com, or the Lottery's official mobile application during the entry period. The identifying information from a Qualifying Ticket may be submitted only once in the Drawing. Entries will automatically be awarded at the time of successful submission of a Qualifying Ticket. No other method of submission will be accepted, and entries submitted using any other method, including entries mailed or hand-delivered to the Lottery, are not valid and will be disqualified.
- (3) Each entry must be complete and the information supplied by the entrant must be accurate. Incomplete entries cannot be accepted.
 - (4) Only one claimant per entry is allowed.
 - (5) Entrants must be 18 years of age or older.
- (6) Players may submit the identifying information from an unlimited number of Qualifying Tickets in the Drawing.

- (4) The number of entries an entrant will receive for the Drawing is determined by the purchase price of the Qualifying Ticket entered. The respective purchase price and corresponding number of entries for the Qualifying Ticket is as follows: PA-5138 Frosty Fun (\$10) = ten entries, PA-5139 Holiday Cash Drop (\$5) = five entries, PA-5140 To Me, From Santa (\$2) = two entries and PA-5141 Baking Spirits Bright (\$1) = one entry.

- (5) Players may review prizes won and their entries for the Drawing via the Drawing's promotional web site.
- (d) Prizes available to be won, determination of winners and odds of winning:
- (1) The prize entitlements described below are subject to all restrictions and limitations described in section 9(e) or mentioned anywhere else in these rules.
- (2) The Lottery will conduct one Drawing from among all the entries received during the entry period as described in section 9(c)(2).
- (i) The first entry selected in the Drawing will be a winning entry and the entrant who submitted that winning entry shall be entitled to a prize of \$100,000, less required income tax withholding.
- (ii) The second and the third entries selected in the Drawing will be winning entries and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$50,000, less required income tax withholding.
- (iii) The fourth through the eighth entries selected in the Drawing will be winning entries and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$10,000, less required income tax withholding.
- (iv) The ninth through the thirteenth entries selected in the Drawing will be winning entries and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$5,000.
- (v) The fourteenth through the sixty-third entries selected in the Drawing will be winning entries and the entrants who submitted the winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$100 iLottery Bonus Money.

- (3) If any discrepancy exists between these rules and any material describing the Drawing, these rules shall govern.
- (4) Employees of the Lottery, 9Rooftops Marketing, LLC (formerly known as MARC USA, LLC), Scientific Games International, Inc., MDI Entertainment, LLC, and their subcontractors, or a spouse, child, brother, sister or parent residing as a member of the same household in the principal place of residence of any such person are not eligible to participate in the Drawing. Offer void where prohibited or restricted.
- (5) The Pennsylvania Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to cancel or suspend the Drawing and change these rules if the Drawing cannot be conducted as planned due to errors in these rules or advertising, unauthorized intervention, tampering, fraud, technical errors, viruses, worms, bugs or any other cause beyond the control of the Lottery that, in the Lottery's sole judgment, could corrupt or impair the administration, security, fairness, integrity or proper conduct of the Drawing.
- (6) All entries shall be subject to verification by the Lottery.
- (7) The Pennsylvania Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to disqualify an entrant found to be tampering with the operation of the Drawing or to be acting in violation of these rules or applicable law.
- (8) The Drawing is governed by the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Applicable laws and regulations apply.
- (9) Prizes must be claimed within 1 year of the drawing date of the Drawing in which the prize was won. If no claim is made within 1 year of the drawing date of the Drawing in which the prize was won, the right of an entrant to claim the prize won, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided by statute.
- (10) Final determination of winners will be made by the Secretary, whose judgment will be final and binding.
- (11) A prize awarded in the Drawing to a person who dies before receiving the prize shall be paid according to 61 Pa. Code § 811.16 (relating to prizes payable after death of a prize winner).

- (15) Prizes are not transferrable.
- (16) Other restrictions may apply.
- 10. Ticket responsibility:
- (a) A Fast Play lottery game ticket is a bearer document deemed to be owned by the person holding the game ticket, except that if a name is contained on the back of the game ticket, the person named will, for all purposes, be considered the owner of the game ticket.
- (b) The holder of a Fast Play lottery game ticket has the sole responsibility for checking the accuracy and condition of the data printed on the game ticket.
- (c) The Commonwealth shall not be responsible for a lost or stolen Fast Play lottery game ticket, or for a Fast Play ticket redeemed by a player in error.
 - 11. Ticket validation and requirements:
- (a) Valid Fast Play lottery game tickets. To be a valid Fast Play lottery game ticket, the presented game ticket must meet the following requirements:
- (1) The game ticket's bar code shall be present in its entirety.
 - (2) The game ticket must be intact.
- (3) The game ticket may not be mutilated, altered, reconstituted or tampered with.
- (4) The game ticket may not be counterfeit or a duplicate of a winning ticket.
 - (5) The game ticket must have been validly issued.
- (6) The game ticket data shall have been recorded on the Lottery Central Computer System and the game ticket data shall match the computer record in every respect.
- (7) The game ticket must not be defectively printed or printed or produced in error such that it cannot be processed or validated by the Lottery.
- (8) The game ticket must pass other confidential security checks of the Lottery.
- (b) Invalid or defective game tickets. A game ticket not passing the validation requirements in subsection (a) will be considered invalid and no payment will be made on account of any play recorded thereon. The determination of the Secretary in this regard is final.
 - 12. Procedures for claiming and payment of prizes:
- (a) A prize may be claimed through an authorized retailer or the Lottery, as provided in this section. A prize must be claimed within 1 year of the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket.
- (b) An authorized retailer is authorized to pay prizes of \$2,500 or less. The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play representing a prize of \$2,500 or less may be paid by a participating authorized retailer if a proper validation pay ticket was issued by the retailer's Lottery Terminal.
- (c) The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play representing a prize in excess of \$2,500 may present the game ticket to an authorized retailer, Lottery District Office, or Lottery Headquarters.

- (d) The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play shall present the ticket, in person, to an authorized retailer, Lottery Headquarters or a Lottery District Office. The retailer or the Lottery will issue payment if:
- (1) The game ticket is scanned, and the play is validated through the Lottery Terminal or the Lottery Central Computer System;
 - (2) A claim form is properly and fully completed;
 - (3) The identification of the claimant is confirmed; and
- (4) The winning ticket has not expired, pursuant to this section or section 14 (relating to unclaimed prizes).
- (e) The Commonwealth shall not be responsible for a winning play paid in error by an authorized retailer.
- (f) In the event a prize described in these rules is not available, the Lottery may either provide a substitute prize, determined by the Secretary to have an equivalent value to the prize won, or make a cash payment to the winner, in an amount determined by the Secretary to have an equivalent value to the prize won.
- 13. Funding for prizes: Moneys will be drawn from the State Lottery Fund, to the extent necessary, to fund the payment of prizes under this section. If this lottery game is terminated for any cause, prize moneys remaining undistributed will remain in the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes otherwise provided for by law.
- 14. Unclaimed prizes: Unclaimed prize money on winning Fast Play lottery game tickets will be retained by the Secretary for payment to the persons entitled thereto for 1 year from the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket. If no claim is made within 1 year from the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket, the right of a ticket holder to claim the prize represented by that ticket, if any, shall expire.
- 15. Purchase and prize restrictions: A Fast Play lottery game ticket may not be purchased by, and a prize may not be paid, to an officer or employee of the Lottery, Lottery professional services contractors or subcontractors, or to a spouse, child, brother, sister or parent residing in the same household of an officer, employee, contractor or subcontractor who is involved in the production, distribution or operation of systems for the validation or accounting of Fast Play games.

16. Governing law:

- (a) By purchasing a ticket, the purchaser agrees to comply with and abide by the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314), this notice, instructions, conditions and final decisions of the Secretary, and procedures established by the Secretary for the conduct of the Fast Play Frosty Fun lottery game.
- (b) Decisions made by the Secretary, including the declaration of prizes and the payment thereof, in interpretation of this notice are final and binding on players and persons making a claim in respect thereof.
 - 17. Retailer compensation:
- (a) Authorized retailers may be entitled to compensation as determined by the Lottery.
- (b) No authorized retailer or employee of an authorized retailer shall request, demand, or accept gratuities or any compensation other than as provided in subsection (a) in exchange for the performance of duties authorized pursuant to the Lottery retailer's license without the Lottery's prior written authorization.

18. Retailer Incentive Programs: The Lottery may conduct a separate Retailer Incentive Program for retailers who sell Pennsylvania Fast Play Frosty Fun lottery game tickets.

- 19. Retailer bonus: The Lottery may offer a retailer bonus in connection with the sale of Pennsylvania Fast Play lottery game tickets. If a retailer bonus is offered, a Lottery retailer shall be eligible for a bonus as described in this section. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$100,000 and not exceeding \$500,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$500. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$500,001 and not exceeding \$1,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$5,000. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$1,000,001 and not exceeding \$10,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$10,000. A Lottery retailer is entitled only to the largest bonus for which they qualify on a winning ticket. A bonus will be initiated for payment after the Fast Play game ticket is claimed and validated. A bonus will not be awarded to a Lottery retailer that sells a non-winning Pennsylvania Lottery Fast Play game ticket used to enter a Pennsylvania Lottery second-chance drawing or promotion that is subsequently selected to win
- 20. Termination of the game: The Secretary may announce a termination date, after which no further tickets from this game may be sold. The announcement will be disseminated through media used to advertise or promote Frosty Fun or through normal communications methods.
- 21. Applicability: This notice applies only to the Frosty Fun lottery game announced in this notice.

Pennsylvania Holiday Cash Drop Fast Play Game 5139

Under the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314) and 61 Pa. Code § 803.11 (relating to powers and duties of the Secretary of Revenue), the Secretary of Revenue hereby provides public notice of the rules for the following lottery game:

1. *Name*: The name of the lottery game is Pennsylvania Holiday Cash Drop (hereinafter "Holiday Cash Drop"). The game number is PA-5139.

2. Definitions:

- (a) Authorized retailer or retailer: A person who is properly licensed by the Lottery pursuant to 61 Pa. Code §§ 805.1—805.17.
- (b) *Bar code*: The symbology on the ticket containing certain encrypted validation and accounting data used for identifying winning and losing tickets.

- (c) BONUS DROP: The area at the top of a Holiday Cash Drop lottery game ticket containing two prize symbols that, when played according to the instructions, determines whether the player wins the prize amount shown. BONUS DROP is played separately.
- (d) CASH DROP: The area at the bottom of a Holiday Cash Drop lottery game ticket containing one play/prize symbol that, when played according to the instructions, determines whether the player increases the total prize won by any prize amount that appears. CASH DROP prizes cannot be won alone.
- (e) Game Ticket: A bearer instrument produced through a Lottery Terminal that is the player's record of a play for a Fast Play lottery game and sold by an authorized retailer containing the play and validation data as published in this game notice.
- (f) Lottery Central Computer System: The computer gaming system on which all Fast Play plays are recorded.
- (g) Lottery Terminal: A device authorized by the Lottery to function in an interactive mode with the Lottery Central Computer System for the purpose of issuing plays, executing Quick Pick selections, and entering, receiving, and processing lottery transactions, including making purchases, validating plays, transmitting reports and performing inventory functions.
- (h) *Play*: A chance to participate in a particular Fast Play lottery game.
- (i) *Play Area*: The area on a ticket, which contains one or more play symbols.
- (j) *Play Symbol*: A number, letter, symbol, image or other character found in the play area, which is used to determine whether a player wins a prize.
- (k) *Prize*: A non-monetary item, money, or experience that can be won as specified in section 7 (relating to prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners) of this game notice.
- (l) WINNING NUMBERS: The numbers, letters, symbols or other characters found in the play area that, when matched against the play symbols in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area, determine whether a player wins a prize.
- (m) Winning ticket: A game ticket which has been validated and qualifies for a prize.
- (n) YOUR NUMBERS: The numbers, letters, symbols or other characters found in the play area that, when matched against the play symbols in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area, determine whether a player wins a prize.
 - 3. Price: The price of a Holiday Cash Drop ticket is \$5.
- 4. Description of the Holiday Cash Drop Fast Play lottery game:
- (a) The Holiday Cash Drop lottery game is an instant win game printed from a Lottery Terminal. All prizes are predetermined, and the player does not have the ability to select their own play symbols. Holiday Cash Drop tickets may be purchased from an authorized retailer or at a Lottery self-service terminal that sells terminal-based Lottery game tickets. Tickets purchased from an authorized retailer shall be printed on-demand at the time of purchase and may not be preprinted by the retailer.

- (b) Holiday Cash Drop is played by matching the play symbols located in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area to the play symbols located in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area. A player matching play symbols in this manner will win the prize shown under the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol. Whenever a player wins a prize in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize amount appears in the "CASH DROP" area, the player adds the amount shown to the total won and wins that amount. A bet slip is not used to play this game.
- (c) Holiday Cash Drop is also played by matching the play symbols in the "BONUS DROP" area. Whenever both of the prize amounts in the "BONUS DROP" area match, the player wins that prize amount. "BONUS DROP" is played separately.
- (d) Players can win the prizes identified in section 7 (relating to prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners).
- (e) A Holiday Cash Drop game ticket cannot be canceled or voided once printed by the Lottery Terminal, even if printed in error.
- (f) To purchase a ticket at an authorized retailer, a player must remit the purchase price to the retailer and verbally request a Holiday Cash Drop game ticket. The ticket shall be the only valid proof of the bet placed and the only valid receipt for claiming a prize.
- (g) To purchase a ticket at a Pennsylvania Lottery self-service terminal, the player must insert into the self-service terminal a dollar amount equal to the total purchase price of a Holiday Cash Drop game ticket and select the Holiday Cash Drop option on the Lottery self-service terminal. The ticket shall be the only valid proof of the bet placed and the only valid receipt for claiming a prize.
 - 5. Holiday Cash Drop ticket characteristics:
- (a) A Holiday Cash Drop ticket shall contain a play area, the cost of the play, the date of sale and a bar code.
- (b) Play Symbols: Each Holiday Cash Drop ticket play area will contain a "WINNING NUMBERS" area and a "YOUR NUMBERS" area. The play symbols and their captions, located in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area and the "YOUR NUMBERS" area, are: 1 (ONE), 2 (TWO), 3 (THREE), 4 (FOUR), 5 (FIVE), 6 (SIX), 7 (SEVEN), 8 (EIGHT), 9 (NINE), 10 (TEN), 11 (ELEVN), 12 (TWLV), 13 (THRTN), 14 (FORTN), 15 (FIFTN), 16 (SIXTN), 17 (SVNTN), 18 (EGHTN), 19 (NINTN), 20 (TWENT), 21 (TWYONE), 22 (TWYTWO), 23 (TWYTHR), 24 (TWYFOR), 25 (TWYFIV), 26 (TWYSIX), 27 (TWYSVN), 28 (TWYFGT), 29 (TWYNIN) and 30 (THIRT). The play/prize symbols and their captions, located in the "CASH DROP" area, are: Candy Cane (TRYAGAIN) symbol, Tree (TRYAGAIN) symbol, Snow Globe (TRYAGAIN) symbol, Santa (TRYAGAIN) symbol, Snow Globe (TRYAGAIN) symbol, Santa (TRYAGAIN) symbol, \$0 (FIV DOL), \$10.00 (TEN DOL), \$15.00 (FIFTEEN), \$20.00 (TWENTY), \$50.00 (FIFTY) and \$200 (TWO HUN).
- (c) Prize Symbols: The prize symbols and their captions, located in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area, are: \$5 $^{.00}$ (FIV DOL), \$10 $^{.00}$ (TEN DOL), \$15 $^{.00}$ (FIFTEEN), \$20 $^{.00}$ (TWENTY), \$40 $^{.00}$ (FORTY), \$50 $^{.00}$ (FIFTY), \$100 (ONE HUN), \$200 (TWO HUN), \$1,000 (ONE THO) and \$25,000 (TWYFIVTHO). The prize symbols and their captions, located in the "BONUS DROP" area, are: \$5 $^{.00}$ (FIV DOL), \$10 $^{.00}$ (TEN DOL), \$15 $^{.00}$ (FIFTEEN), \$20 $^{.00}$ (TWENTY), \$40 $^{.00}$ (FORTY) and \$50 $^{.00}$ (FIFTY).

- (d) *Prizes*: The prizes that can be won in this game, are: \$5, \$10, \$15, \$20, \$40, \$50, \$100, \$200, \$1,000 and \$25,000. The prizes that can be won in the "BONUS DROP" area, are: \$5, \$10, \$15, \$20, \$40 and \$50. The prizes that can be won in the "CASH DROP" area, are: \$5, \$10, \$15, \$20, \$50 and \$200. Holiday Cash Drop also contains a feature that can increase certain prizes. For a complete list of prizes, and how those prizes can be won, see section 8 (relating to Number and description of prizes and approximate chances of winning). A player can win up to 14 times on a ticket.
- (e) Approximate number of tickets available for the game: Approximately 600,000 tickets will be available for sale for the Holiday Cash Drop lottery game.
- 6. Second-Chance Drawing: The Pennsylvania Lottery will conduct a North Pole Payout Second-Chance Drawing for which non-winning Holiday Cash Drop lottery game tickets may be eligible as provided for in section 9.
- 7. Prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners:
- (a) All Holiday Cash Drop prize payments will be made as one-time, lump-sum cash payments.
- (b) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$25,000 (TWYFIVTHO) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$25,000.
- (c) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$1,000 (ONE THO) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1,000.
- (d) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$200 (TWO HUN) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$200.
- (e) Holders of tickets upon which a prize is won in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area, and a play/prize symbol of \$200 (TWO HUN) appears in the "CASH DROP" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$200.
- (f) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.
- (g) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$50^{.00} (FIFTY) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$50.
- (h) Holders of tickets upon which a prize is won in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area, and a play/prize symbol of \$50.00 (FIFTY) appears in the "CASH DROP" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$50.
- (i) Holders of tickets upon which two prize symbols of $$50^{.00}$ (FIFTY) appear in the "BONUS DROP" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$50.
- (j) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING

NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$40.00 (FORTY) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$40.

- (k) Holders of tickets upon which two prize symbols of \$40^{.00} (FORTY) appear in the "BONUS DROP" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$40.
- (l) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$20.00 (TWENTY) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$20.
- (m) Holders of tickets upon which a prize is won in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area, and a play/prize symbol of \$20^{.00} (TWENTY) appears in the "CASH DROP" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$20.
- (n) Holders of tickets upon which two prize symbols of \$20^{.00} (TWENTY) appear in the "BONUS DROP" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$20.
- (o) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$15.00 (FIFTEEN) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$15.
- (p) Holders of tickets upon which a prize is won in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area, and a play/prize symbol of \$15.00 (FIFTEEN) appears in the "CASH DROP" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$15.
- (q) Holders of tickets upon which two prize symbols of \$15.00 (FIFTEEN) appear in the "BONUS DROP" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$15.
- (r) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$10.00 (TEN DOL) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$10.
- (s) Holders of tickets upon which a prize is won in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area, and a play/prize symbol of \$10.00 (TEN DOL) appears in the "CASH DROP" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$10.
- (t) Holders of tickets upon which two prize symbols of \$10.00 (TEN DOL) appear in the "BONUS DROP" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$10.
- (u) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$5.00 (FIV DOL) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$5.
- (v) Holders of tickets upon which a prize is won in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area, and a play/prize symbol of \$5.00 (FIV DOL) appears in the "CASH DROP" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$5.
- (w) Holders of tickets upon which two prize symbols of \$5.00 (FIV DOL) appear in the "BONUS DROP" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$5.
- 8. Number and description of prizes and approximate chances of winning: The following table sets forth the approximate number of winners, amounts of prizes and approximate chances of winning:

- (2) To enter the Drawing, entrants must submit the identifying information from at least one Qualifying Ticket via the Drawing's promotional web site, available at https://www.palottery.com, or the Lottery's official mobile application during the entry period. The identifying information from a Qualifying Ticket may be submitted only once in the Drawing. Entries will automatically be awarded at the time of successful submission of a Qualifying Ticket. No other method of submission will be accepted, and entries submitted using any other method, including entries mailed or hand-delivered to the Lottery, are not valid and will be disqualified.
- (3) Each entry must be complete, and the information supplied by the entrant must be accurate. Incomplete entries cannot be accepted.

 - (5) Entrants must be 18 years of age or older.
- (6) Players may submit the identifying information from an unlimited number of Qualifying Tickets in the Drawing.
- (7) Once an entry has been submitted it cannot be withdrawn or changed.

- (c) Drawing description:

- (2) All entries received after 4:59:59 a.m. November 2, 2021, through 11:59:59 p.m. January 6, 2022, will be entered into the Drawing to be held between January 10, 2022 and January 18, 2022.
- (3) The entry period for the Drawing will be posted to the Lottery's publicly accessible web site at https://www.palottery.com.
- (4) The number of entries an entrant will receive for the Drawing is determined by the purchase price of the Qualifying Ticket entered. The respective purchase price and corresponding number of entries for the Qualifying Ticket is as follows: PA-5138 Frosty Fun (\$10) = ten entries, PA-5139 Holiday Cash Drop (\$5) = five entries, PA-5140 To Me, From Santa (\$2) = two entries and PA-5141 Baking Spirits Bright (\$1) = one entry.
- (5) Players may review prizes won and their entries for the Drawing via the Drawing's promotional web site.
- (d) Prizes available to be won, determination of winners and odds of winning:
- (1) The prize entitlements described below are subject to all restrictions and limitations described in section 9(e) or mentioned anywhere else in these rules.
- (2) The Lottery will conduct one Drawing from among all the entries received during the entry period as described in section 9(c)(2).
- (i) The first entry selected in the Drawing will be a winning entry and the entrant who submitted that winning entry shall be entitled to a prize of \$100,000, less required income tax withholding.
- (ii) The second and the third entries selected in the Drawing will be winning entries and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$50,000, less required income tax withholding.
- (iii) The fourth through the eighth entries selected in the Drawing will be winning entries and the entrants

who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$10,000, less required income tax withholding.

- (iv) The ninth through the thirteenth entries selected in the Drawing will be winning entries and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$5,000.
- (v) The fourteenth through the sixty-third entries selected in the Drawing will be winning entries and the entrants who submitted the winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$100 iLottery Bonus Money.
- (3) All prizes will be paid as lump-sum cash payments or uploaded to a winning player's lottery account.

- (2) The Lottery is not responsible for late, lost or misdirected entries not entered into the Drawing. The Lottery is not responsible for entries that are not entered into the Drawing because of incompatible internet browsers, mobile Lottery application failure or other technical issues. If an entry is selected as a winner and rejected or otherwise disqualified during or following the Drawing, the Lottery will select another entry to replace the rejected or otherwise disqualified entry in accordance with these rules and Lottery procedure.
- (3) If any discrepancy exists between these rules and any material describing the Drawing, these rules shall govern.
- (4) Employees of the Lottery, 9Rooftops Marketing, LLC (formerly known as MARC USA, LLC), Scientific Games International, Inc., MDI Entertainment, LLC, and their subcontractors, or a spouse, child, brother, sister or parent residing as a member of the same household in the principal place of residence of any such person are not eligible to participate in the Drawing. Offer void where prohibited or restricted.
- (5) The Pennsylvania Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to cancel or suspend the Drawing and change these rules if the Drawing cannot be conducted as planned due to errors in these rules or advertising, unauthorized intervention, tampering, fraud, technical errors, viruses, worms, bugs or any other cause beyond the control of the Lottery that, in the Lottery's sole judgment, could corrupt or impair the administration, security, fairness, integrity or proper conduct of the Drawing.
- (6) All entries shall be subject to verification by the Lottery.
- (7) The Pennsylvania Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to disqualify an entrant found to be

- tampering with the operation of the Drawing or to be acting in violation of these rules or applicable law.
- (8) The Drawing is governed by the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Applicable laws and regulations apply.
- (9) Prizes must be claimed within 1 year of the drawing date of the Drawing in which the prize was won. If no claim is made within 1 year of the drawing date of the Drawing in which the prize was won, the right of an entrant to claim the prize won, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided by statute.
- (10) Final determination of winners will be made by the Secretary, whose judgment will be final and binding.
- (11) A prize awarded in the Drawing to a person who dies before receiving the prize shall be paid according to 61 Pa. Code § 811.16 (relating to prizes payable after death of a prize winner).
- (12) A winner is responsible for all taxes arising from or in connection with any prize won.

 - (15) Prizes are not transferrable.

 - 10. Ticket responsibility:
- (a) A Fast Play lottery game ticket is a bearer document deemed to be owned by the person holding the game ticket, except that if a name is contained on the back of the game ticket, the person named will, for all purposes, be considered the owner of the game ticket.
- (b) The holder of a Fast Play lottery game ticket has the sole responsibility for checking the accuracy and condition of the data printed on the game ticket.
- (c) The Commonwealth shall not be responsible for a lost or stolen Fast Play lottery game ticket, or for a Fast Play ticket redeemed by a player in error.
 - 11. Ticket validation and requirements:
- (a) Valid Fast Play lottery game tickets. To be a valid Fast Play lottery game ticket, the presented game ticket must meet the following requirements:
- (1) The game ticket's bar code shall be present in its entirety.
 - (2) The game ticket must be intact.
- (3) The game ticket may not be mutilated, altered, reconstituted or tampered with.
- (4) The game ticket may not be counterfeit or a duplicate of a winning ticket.

- (5) The game ticket must have been validly issued.
- (6) The game ticket data shall have been recorded on the Lottery Central Computer System and the game ticket data shall match the computer record in every respect.
- (7) The game ticket must not be defectively printed or printed or produced in error such that it cannot be processed or validated by the Lottery.
- (8) The game ticket must pass other confidential security checks of the Lottery.
- (b) Invalid or defective game tickets. A game ticket not passing the validation requirements in subsection (a) will be considered invalid and no payment will be made on account of any play recorded thereon. The determination of the Secretary in this regard is final.
 - 12. Procedures for claiming and payment of prizes:
- (a) A prize may be claimed through an authorized retailer or the Lottery, as provided in this section. A prize must be claimed within 1 year of the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket.
- (b) An authorized retailer is authorized to pay prizes of \$2,500 or less. The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play representing a prize of \$2,500 or less may be paid by a participating authorized retailer if a proper validation pay ticket was issued by the retailer's Lottery Terminal
- (c) The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play representing a prize in excess of \$2,500 may present the game ticket to an authorized retailer, Lottery District Office, or Lottery Headquarters.
- (d) The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play shall present the ticket, in person, to an authorized retailer, Lottery Headquarters or a Lottery District Office. The retailer or the Lottery will issue payment if:
- (1) The game ticket is scanned and the play is validated through the Lottery Terminal or the Lottery Central Computer System;
 - (2) A claim form is properly and fully completed;
 - (3) The identification of the claimant is confirmed; and
- (4) The winning ticket has not expired, pursuant to this section or section 14 (relating to unclaimed prizes).
- (e) The Commonwealth shall not be responsible for a winning play paid in error by an authorized retailer.
- (f) In the event a prize described in these rules is not available, the Lottery may either provide a substitute prize, determined by the Secretary to have an equivalent value to the prize won, or make a cash payment to the winner, in an amount determined by the Secretary to have an equivalent value to the prize won.
- 13. Funding for prizes: Moneys will be drawn from the State Lottery Fund, to the extent necessary, to fund the payment of prizes under this section. If this lottery game is terminated for any cause, prize moneys remaining undistributed will remain in the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes otherwise provided for by law.
- 14. Unclaimed prizes: Unclaimed prize money on winning Fast Play lottery game tickets will be retained by the Secretary for payment to the persons entitled thereto for 1 year from the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket. If no claim is made within 1 year from the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket, the right of a ticket holder to claim the prize represented by that ticket, if any, shall expire.

15. Purchase and prize restrictions: A Fast Play lottery game ticket may not be purchased by, and a prize may not be paid, to an officer or employee of the Lottery, Lottery professional services contractors or subcontractors, or to a spouse, child, brother, sister or parent residing in the same household of an officer, employee, contractor or subcontractor who is involved in the production, distribution or operation of systems for the validation or accounting of Fast Play games.

16. Governing law:

- (a) By purchasing a ticket, the purchaser agrees to comply with and abide by the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314), this notice, instructions, conditions and final decisions of the Secretary, and procedures established by the Secretary for the conduct of the Fast Play Holiday Cash Drop lottery game.
- (b) Decisions made by the Secretary, including the declaration of prizes and the payment thereof, in interpretation of this notice are final and binding on players and persons making a claim in respect thereof.
 - 17. Retailer compensation:
- (a) Authorized retailers may be entitled to compensation as determined by the Lottery.
- (b) No authorized retailer or employee of an authorized retailer shall request, demand, or accept gratuities or any compensation other than as provided in subsection (a) in exchange for the performance of duties authorized pursuant to the Lottery retailer's license without the Lottery's prior written authorization.
- 18. Retailer Incentive Programs: The Lottery may conduct a separate Retailer Incentive Program for retailers who sell Pennsylvania Fast Play Holiday Cash Drop lottery game tickets.
- 19. Retailer bonus: The Lottery may offer a retailer bonus in connection with the sale of Pennsylvania Fast Play lottery game tickets. If a retailer bonus is offered, a Lottery retailer shall be eligible for a bonus as described in this section. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$100,000 and not exceeding \$500,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$500. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$500,001 and not exceeding \$1,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$5,000. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$1,000,001 and not exceeding \$10,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$10,000. A Lottery retailer is entitled only to the largest bonus for which they qualify on a winning ticket. A bonus will be initiated for payment after the Fast Play game ticket is claimed and validated. A bonus will not be awarded to a Lottery retailer that sells a non-winning Pennsylvania Lottery Fast Play game ticket used to enter a Pennsylvania Lottery second-chance drawing or promotion that is subsequently selected to win
- 20. Termination of the game: The Secretary may announce a termination date, after which no further tickets from this game may be sold. The announcement will be disseminated through media used to advertise or promote Holiday Cash Drop or through normal communications methods.

21. Applicability: This notice applies only to the Holiday Cash Drop lottery game announced in this notice.

Pennsylvania To Me, From Santa Fast Play Game 5140

Under the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314) and 61 Pa. Code § 803.11 (relating to powers and duties of the Secretary of Revenue), the Secretary of Revenue hereby provides public notice of the rules for the following lottery game:

- 1. *Name*: The name of the lottery game is Pennsylvania To Me, From Santa (hereinafter "To Me, From Santa"). The game number is PA-5140.
 - 2. Definitions:
- (a) Authorized retailer or retailer: A person who is properly licensed by the Lottery pursuant to 61 Pa. Code §§ 805.1—805.17.
- (b) Bar code: The symbology on the ticket containing certain encrypted validation and accounting data used for identifying winning and losing tickets.
- (c) Game Ticket: A bearer instrument produced through a Lottery Terminal that is the player's record of a play for a Fast Play lottery game and sold by an authorized retailer containing the play and validation data as published in this game notice.
- (d) Lottery Central Computer System: The computer gaming system on which all Fast Play plays are recorded.
- (e) Lottery Terminal: A device authorized by the Lottery to function in an interactive mode with the Lottery Central Computer System for the purpose of issuing plays, executing Quick Pick selections, and entering, receiving, and processing lottery transactions, including making purchases, validating plays, transmitting reports and performing inventory functions.
- (f) Play: A chance to participate in a particular Fast Play lottery game.
- (g) Play Area: The area on a ticket which contains one or more play symbols.
- (h) *Play Symbol*: A number, letter, symbol, image or other character found in the play area which is used to determine whether a player wins a prize.
- (i) *Prize*: A non-monetary item, money or experience that can be won as specified in section 7 (relating to prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners) of this game notice.
- (j) UNWRAP FOR ALL THE CASH NUMBER: The area on a To Me, From Santa ticket containing one play symbol that, when matched according to the instructions, determines whether the player wins all eight prizes shown in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area.
- (k) WINNING NUMBERS: The numbers, letters, symbols or other characters found in the play area that, when matched against the play symbols in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area, determine whether a player wins a prize.

- (l) Winning ticket: A game ticket which has been validated and qualifies for a prize.
- (m) YOUR NUMBERS: The numbers, letters, symbols or other characters found in the play area that, when matched against the play symbols in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area, determine whether a player wins a prize.
 - 3. Price: The price of a To Me, From Santa ticket is \$2.
- 4. Description of the To Me, From Santa Fast Play lottery game:
- (a) The To Me, From Santa lottery game is an instant win game printed from a Lottery Terminal. All prizes are predetermined, and the player does not have the ability to select their own play symbols. To Me, From Santa tickets may be purchased from an authorized retailer or at a Lottery self-service terminal that sells terminal-based Lottery game tickets. Tickets purchased from an authorized retailer shall be printed on-demand at the time of purchase and may not be preprinted by the retailer.
- (b) To Me, From Santa is played by matching any of the play symbols located in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area to any of the play symbols located in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area. A player matching play symbols in this manner will win the prize shown under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol. A bet slip is not used to play this game.
- (c) To Me, From Santa tickets contain an "UNWRAP FOR ALL THE CASH NUMBER" area. Whenever a player matches the play symbol in the "UNWRAP FOR ALL THE CASH NUMBER" area to any of the play symbols in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area, the player wins all eight prizes shown.
- (d) Players can win the prizes identified in section 7 (relating to prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners).
- (e) To Me, From Santa tickets cannot be canceled or voided once printed by the Lottery Terminal, even if printed in error.
- (f) To purchase a ticket at an authorized retailer, a player must remit the purchase price to the retailer and verbally request a To Me, From Santa ticket. The ticket shall be the only valid proof of the bet placed and the only valid receipt for claiming a prize.
- (g) To purchase a ticket at a Pennsylvania Lottery self-service terminal, the player must insert into the self-service terminal a dollar amount equal to the total purchase price of a To Me, From Santa ticket and select the To Me, From Santa option on the Lottery self-service terminal. The ticket shall be the only valid proof of the bet placed and the only valid receipt for claiming a prize.
 - 5. To Me, From Santa ticket characteristics:
- (a) To Me, From Santa tickets shall contain a play area, the cost of the play, the date of sale and a bar code.
- (b) Play Symbols: To Me, From Santa tickets will contain a "WINNING NUMBERS" area, a "YOUR NUMBERS" area and an "UNWRAP FOR ALL THE CASH NUMBER" area. The play symbols and their captions, located in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area, the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and the "UNWRAP FOR ALL THE CASH NUMBER" area, are: 1 (ONE), 2 (TWO), 3 (THREE), 4 (FOUR), 5 (FIVE), 6 (SIX), 7 (SEVEN), 8 (EIGHT), 9 (NINE), 10 (TEN), 11 (ELEVN), 12 (TWLV), 13 (THRTN), 14 (FORTN), 15 (FIFTN), 16 (SIXTN), 17

- (SVNTN), 18 (EGHTN), 19 (NINTN), 20 (TWENT), 21 (TWYONE), 22 (TWYTWO), 23 (TWYTHR), 24 (TWYFOR) and 25 (TWYFIV).
- (c) Prize Symbols: The prize symbols and their captions, located in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area, are: $\$2^{.00}$ (TWO DOL), $\$4^{.00}$ (FOR DOL), $\$5^{.00}$ (FIV DOL), $\$10^{.00}$ (TEN DOL), $\$15^{.00}$ (FIFTEEN), $\$20^{.00}$ (TWENTY), $\$30^{.00}$ (THIRTY), $\$50^{.00}$ (FIFTY), \$100 (ONE HUN), \$200 (TWO HUN) and \$10,000 (TEN THO).
- (d) *Prizes*: The prizes that can be won in this game, are: \$2, \$4, \$5, \$10, \$15, \$20, \$30, \$50, \$100, \$200 and \$10,000. A player can win up to eight times on a ticket.
- (e) Approximate number of tickets available for the game: Approximately 600,000 tickets will be available for sale for the To Me, From Santa lottery game.
- 6. Second-Chance Drawing: The Pennsylvania Lottery will conduct a North Pole Payout Second-Chance Drawing for which non-winning To Me, From Santa lottery game tickets may be eligible as provided for in section 9.
- 7. Prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners:
- (a) All To Me, From Santa prize payments will be made as one-time, lump-sum cash payments.
- (b) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$10,000 (TEN THO) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$10,000.
- (c) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$200 (TWO HUN) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$200.
- (d) Holders of tickets upon which the "UNWRAP FOR ALL THE CASH NUMBER" play symbol matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$30^{.00} (THIRTY) appears in four of the "Prize" areas and a prize symbol of \$20^{.00} (TWENTY) appears in four of the "Prize" areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$200.
- (e) Holders of tickets upon which the "UNWRAP FOR ALL THE CASH NUMBER" play symbol matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$30.00 (THIRTY) appears in five of the "Prize" areas, a prize symbol of \$20.00 (TWENTY) appears in two of the "Prize" areas and a prize symbol of \$10.00 (TEN DOL) appears in one of the "Prize" areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$200.

- (o) Holders of tickets upon which the "UNWRAP FOR ALL THE CASH NUMBER" play symbol matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$5.00 (FIV DOL) appears in four of the "Prize" areas, a prize symbol of \$4.00 (FOR DOL) appears in two of the "Prize" areas, a prize symbol of \$20.00 (TWENTY) appears in one of the "Prize" areas and a prize symbol of \$2.00 (TWO DOL) appears in one of the "Prize" areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$50.

- (u) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$15.00 (FIFTEEN) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$15.
- (v) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$10.00 (TEN DOL) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$10.
- (w) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$5.00 (FIV DOL) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$5.
- (x) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$4.00 (FOR DOL) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$4.

- (d) Prizes available to be won, determination of winners and odds of winning:
- (1) The prize entitlements described below are subject to all restrictions and limitations described in section 9(e) or mentioned anywhere else in these rules.
- (2) The Lottery will conduct one Drawing from among all the entries received during the entry period as described in section 9(c)(2).
- (i) The first entry selected in the Drawing will be a winning entry and the entrant who submitted that winning entry shall be entitled to a prize of \$100,000, less required income tax withholding.

Offer void where prohibited or restricted.
- (5) The Pennsylvania Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to cancel or suspend the Drawing and change these rules if the Drawing cannot be conducted as planned due to errors in these rules or advertising, unauthorized intervention, tampering, fraud, technical errors, viruses, worms, bugs or any other cause beyond the control of the Lottery that, in the Lottery's sole judgment, could corrupt or impair the administration, security, fairness, integrity or proper conduct of the Drawing.
- (6) All entries shall be subject to verification by the Lottery.
- (7) The Pennsylvania Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to disqualify an entrant found to be tampering with the operation of the Drawing or to be acting in violation of these rules or applicable law.
- (8) The Drawing is governed by the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Applicable laws and regulations apply.
- (9) Prizes must be claimed within 1 year of the drawing date of the Drawing in which the prize was won. If no claim is made within 1 year of the drawing date of the Drawing in which the prize was won, the right of an entrant to claim the prize won, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided by statute.

- (b) The holder of a Fast Play lottery game ticket has the sole responsibility for checking the accuracy and condition of the data printed on the game ticket.
- (c) The Commonwealth shall not be responsible for a lost or stolen Fast Play lottery game ticket, or for a Fast Play ticket redeemed by a player in error.
 - 11. Ticket validation and requirements:
- (a) Valid Fast Play lottery game tickets. To be a valid Fast Play lottery game ticket, the presented game ticket must meet the following requirements:
- (1) The game ticket's bar code shall be present in its entirety.
 - (2) The game ticket must be intact.
- (3) The game ticket may not be mutilated, altered, reconstituted or tampered with.
- (4) The game ticket may not be counterfeit or a duplicate of a winning ticket.
 - (5) The game ticket must have been validly issued.
- (6) The game ticket data shall have been recorded on the Lottery Central Computer System and the game ticket data shall match the computer record in every respect.
- (7) The game ticket must not be defectively printed or printed or produced in error such that it cannot be processed or validated by the Lottery.
- (8) The game ticket must pass other confidential security checks of the Lottery.
- (b) Invalid or defective game tickets. A game ticket not passing the validation requirements in subsection (a) will be considered invalid and no payment will be made on account of any play recorded thereon. The determination of the Secretary in this regard is final.

- 12. Procedures for claiming and payment of prizes:
- (a) A prize may be claimed through an authorized retailer or the Lottery, as provided in this section. A prize must be claimed within 1 year of the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket.
- (b) An authorized retailer is authorized to pay prizes of \$2,500 or less. The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play representing a prize of \$2,500 or less may be paid by a participating authorized retailer if a proper validation pay ticket was issued by the retailer's Lottery Terminal.
- (c) The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play representing a prize in excess of \$2,500 may present the game ticket to an authorized retailer, Lottery District Office, or Lottery Headquarters.
- (d) The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play shall present the ticket, in person, to an authorized retailer, Lottery Headquarters or a Lottery District Office. The retailer or the Lottery will issue payment if:
- (1) The game ticket is scanned, and the play is validated through the Lottery Terminal or the Lottery Central Computer System;
 - (2) A claim form is properly and fully completed;
 - (3) The identification of the claimant is confirmed; and
- (4) The winning ticket has not expired, pursuant to this section or section 14 (relating to unclaimed prizes).
- (e) The Commonwealth shall not be responsible for a winning play paid in error by an authorized retailer.
- (f) In the event a prize described in these rules is not available, the Lottery may either provide a substitute prize, determined by the Secretary to have an equivalent value to the prize won, or make a cash payment to the winner, in an amount determined by the Secretary to have an equivalent value to the prize won.
- 13. Funding for prizes: Moneys will be drawn from the State Lottery Fund, to the extent necessary, to fund the payment of prizes under this section. If this lottery game is terminated for any cause, prize moneys remaining undistributed will remain in the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes otherwise provided for by law.
- 14. Unclaimed prizes: Unclaimed prize money on winning Fast Play lottery game tickets will be retained by the Secretary for payment to the persons entitled thereto for 1 year from the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket. If no claim is made within 1 year from the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket, the right of a ticket holder to claim the prize represented by that ticket, if any, shall expire.
- 15. Purchase and prize restrictions: A Fast Play lottery game ticket may not be purchased by, and a prize may not be paid, to an officer or employee of the Lottery, Lottery professional services contractors or subcontractors, or to a spouse, child, brother, sister or parent residing in the same household of an officer, employee, contractor or subcontractor who is involved in the production, distribution or operation of systems for the validation or accounting of Fast Play games.
 - 16. Governing law:
- (a) By purchasing a ticket, the purchaser agrees to comply with and abide by the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314), this notice, instructions, conditions and final decisions of the Secretary, and procedures established by the Secretary for the conduct of the Fast Play To Me, From Santa lottery game.

- (b) Decisions made by the Secretary, including the declaration of prizes and the payment thereof, in interpretation of this notice are final and binding on players and persons making a claim in respect thereof.
 - 17. Retailer compensation:
- (a) Authorized retailers may be entitled to compensation as determined by the Lottery.
- (b) No authorized retailer or employee of an authorized retailer shall request, demand, or accept gratuities or any compensation other than as provided in subsection (a) in exchange for the performance of duties authorized pursuant to the Lottery retailer's license without the Lottery's prior written authorization.
- 18. Retailer Incentive Programs: The Lottery may conduct a separate Retailer Incentive Program for retailers who sell Pennsylvania Fast Play To Me, From Santa lottery game tickets.
- 19. Retailer bonus: The Lottery may offer a retailer bonus in connection with the sale of Pennsylvania Fast Play lottery game tickets. If a retailer bonus is offered, a Lottery retailer shall be eligible for a bonus as described in this section. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$100,000 and not exceeding \$500,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$500. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$500,001 and not exceeding \$1,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$5,000. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$1,000,001 and not exceeding \$10,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$10,000. A Lottery retailer is entitled only to the largest bonus for which they qualify on a winning ticket. A bonus will be initiated for payment after the Fast Play game ticket is claimed and validated. A bonus will not be awarded to a Lottery retailer that sells a non-winning Pennsylvania Lottery Fast Play game ticket used to enter a Pennsylvania Lottery second-chance drawing or promotion that is subsequently selected to win a prize.
- 20. Termination of the game: The Secretary may announce a termination date, after which no further tickets from this game may be sold. The announcement will be disseminated through media used to advertise or promote To Me, From Santa or through normal communications methods.
- 21. Applicability: This notice applies only to the To Me, From Santa lottery game announced in this notice.

Treasure Hunt Terminal-Based Lottery Game; Change to Game Rules; Amended Notice

Under the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314) and 61 Pa. Code § 875.4 (relating to notice of terminal-based lottery game rules), the Secretary of Rev-

enue hereby provides public notice of changes to the Treasure Hunt Terminal-Based Lottery Game rules that were published at 37 Pa.B. 1938 (April 21, 2007) and as amended at 44 Pa.B. 862 (February 8, 2014).

The Pennsylvania Lottery has decided to provide flexibility in establishing the starting jackpot prize level for the Treasure Hunt Terminal-Based Lottery Game. These changes will be effective upon publication.

The correct version of this document is as follows, with ellipses referring to the existing text as it appeared at 37 Pa.B. 1938-1939:

* * * * *

- 6. Prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners:
- (a) Determination of Pennsylvania Treasure Hunt prize winners for tickets correctly matching the winning numbers selected by the Lottery are:
- (1) Holders of tickets upon which the player's five numbers, in a single game or play, match the five winning numbers selected by the Lottery, shall be the winner of the jackpot category prize.
- (i) The Lottery will estimate and announce the projected amount of the upcoming jackpot prior to the drawing. Payment will be made in the amount estimated and announced as the projected jackpot, or in the actual amount of the jackpot, whichever is greater, divided equally by the number of plays on tickets determined by the Lottery to be entitled to claim a jackpot category prize.

Findings

Under section 2002 of The Administrative Code of 1929 (71 P.S. § 512) establishing the Department of Transportation (Department), the Director of the Bureau of Project Delivery, as delegated by the Secretary of Transportation, makes the following written findings:

The Department is planning the projects listed as follows. Environmental and Section 4(f) Documentation have been developed for the projects identified as follows to evaluate the potential environmental impacts caused by these projects. The Section 4(f) documents also serve as the Section 2002 Evaluation. The approved documents are available in the CE/EA Expert System at http://www.dotdom2.state.pa.us/ceea/ceeamain.nsf. The environmental, economic, social and other effects of the proposed projects have been considered. Based upon studies, there is no feasible and prudent alternative to the use of the Section 2002 resources for the proposed projects identified as follows and all reasonable steps have been taken to minimize such effects.

• SR 3005, Section 019—Shrewsbury Township and Hillsgrove Township, Sullivan County.

Project Description: The project involves the acquisition of right-of-way (ROW) along Ogdonia Road (SR 3005) where work was completed because of a flood recovery project in 2018.

Environmental Documents: CE 1a Reevaluation approved on April 1, 2021, and a Determination of Section 4(f) De Minimis Use Section 2002 No Adverse Use Public Parks, Recreation Areas, Wildlife and/or Waterfowl Refuges, State Forest Land and State Game Land approved on March 31, 2021.

Proposed Use of Section 4(f)/2002 Resource: Approximately 0.082-acre of ROW will be required from the 114,552-acre Loyalsock State Forest, which qualifies as a Section 4(f)/2002 resource.

SR 1017, Section 03B—Albany Township, Berks County.

Project Description: The project is the replacement of Stump's Bridge that carries Creek Road (SR 1017) over Kistler Creek.

Environmental Documents: CE 2 Reevaluation approved on May 5, 2021, a Determination of Section 4(f) De Minimis Use Section 2002 No Adverse Use Historic Properties approved on May 2, 2019, and a Nationwide/Programmatic Section 4(f) Evaluation for Projects that Necessitate the Use of Historic Bridges approved on June 13, 2019.

Proposed Use of Section 4(f)/2002 Resources: Approximately 0.036-acre of ROW will be required from Bachman's Implements, which was determined to be eligible for listing on the National Register of Historic Places (NRHP). The existing structure, known as Stump's Bridge, was determined eligible for listing on the NRHP.

SR 0082, Section SIP—West Brandywine Township, Chester County.

Project Description: The project is the construction of a roundabout at the intersection of Manor Road (SR 0082) and Cedar Knoll Road/East. Receivlle Road (SR 4005).

Environmental Documents: CE 1b Evaluation approved on April 9, 2021, and a Determination of Section 4(f) De Minimis Use Section 2002 No Adverse Use Historic Properties approved on March 29, 2021.

Proposed Use of Section 4(f)/2002 Resources: Approximately 0.428-acre of ROW will be required from the Baldwin Farm, which was determined to be eligible for listing in the NRHP.

SR 0202, Section CNM—Westtown Township and Thornbury Township, Chester County.

Project Description: The project consists of intersection improvements to the intersection of Wilmington Pike (SR 0202) and Street Road (SR 0926) including additional lanes and signal upgrades.

Environmental Documents: CE 2 Evaluation approved on June 7, 2021, and a Determination of Section 4(f) De Minimis Use Section 2002 No Adverse Use Historic Properties approved on April 21, 2021.

Proposed Use of Section 4(f)/2002 Resources: Approximately 0.14-acre of ROW will be required from the 0.77-acre Westtown Inn, which was determined to be eligible for listing on the NRHP.

SR 0422, Section M03—North Coventry Township, Chester County.

Project Description: The project is the reconstruction of one mile of the Benjamin Franklin Highway (SR 0422) and two structure replacements.

Environmental Documents: CE 1b Evaluation approved on May 24, 2021, and a Determination of Section 4(f) De Minimis Use Section 2002 No Adverse Use Historic Properties approved on May 10, 2021.

Proposed Use of Section 4(f)/2002 Resources: Approximately 0.00443-acre of ROW will be required from the Kenilworth Historic District, which was determined to be eligible for listing on the NRHP.

SR 1023, Section CB6—East Pikeland Township, Chester County.

Project Description: The project involves the replacement of the structure that carries Merlin Road (SR 1023) over Pigeon Run.

Environmental Documents: CE BRPA Evaluation approved on April 14, 2021, and a Determination of Section 4(f) De Minimis Use Section 2002 No Adverse Use Historic Properties approved on March 9, 2021.

Proposed Use of Section 4(f)/2002 Resources: Approximately 0.004-acre of ROW will be required from the 1,055-acre Middle Pickering Rural Historic District, which is listed in the NRHP.

SR 3101, Section DRB—Chadds Ford Township, Delaware County and Pennsbury Township, Chester County.

Project Description: The project is the replacement of the South Creek Road bridge that carries SR 3101 over East Penn Railroad.

Environmental Documents: CE 2 Evaluation approved on June 7, 2021, and a Nationwide/Programmatic Section 4(f) Evaluation for Projects that Necessitates the Use of Historic Bridges approved on March 22, 2021.

Proposed Use of Section 4(f)/2002 Resources: The existing South Creek Road Bridge, also known as Pyles Twin Bridge, is listed as a contributing resource to the Twin Bridges Rural Historic District, which is listed on the NRHP. Approximately 0.565-acre of ROW will be required from adjacent properties and 0.116-acre aerial easement will be required from the East Penn Railroad. The adjacent properties and the East Penn Railroad are contributing resources to the Twin Bridges Rural Historic District.

SR 0422, Section M1B—Lower Pottsgrove Township and North Coventry Township, Montgomery County.

Project Description: The project is the reconstruction of 3.24-miles of US 422 from the west of the Pottstown Interchange to the Sanatoga Interchange.

Environmental Documents: CE 2 Reevaluation approved on April 20, 2021, and a Determination of Section 4(f) De Minimis Use Section 2002 No Adverse Use Public Parks, Recreation Areas, Wildlife and/or Waterfowl Refuges, State Forest Land and State Game Land approved February 17, 2021.

Proposed Use of Section 4(f)/2002 Resources: Approximately 0.060-acre of ROW will be required from the 54-acre Sanatoga Park, which qualifies as a Section 4(f)/2002 resource.

SR 0094, Section 026—Reading Township, Adams County.

Project Description: The project involves geometric and safety improvements to the intersection of Carlisle Pike (SR 0094) and East Berlin Road (SR 0234).

Environmental Documents: CE 1b Reevaluation approved on April 21, 2021, and a Determination of Section 4(f) De Minimis Use Section 2002 No Adverse Use Historic Properties approved on February 17, 2015.

Proposed Use of Section 4(f)/2002 Resource: Approximately 0.198-acre of ROW will be required from the 97-acre Jacob Miller Farm, which was determined eligible for listing on the NRHP.

SR 7301, Section 000—City of Pittsburgh, Allegheny County.
