

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# READER'S GUIDE TO THE PENNSYLVANIA BULLETIN AND THE PENNSYLVANIA CODE

## *Pennsylvania Bulletin*

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the official gazette of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. It is published weekly. A cumulative subject matter index is published quarterly.

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* serves several purposes. It is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, which is the official codification of agency rules and regulations, Statewide court rules, and other statutorily authorized documents. Changes in the codified text, whether by adoption, amendment, rescission, repeal or emergency action, must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

The following documents are published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*: Governor's Executive Orders; Summaries of Enacted Statutes; Statewide and Local Court Rules; Attorney General Opinions; Motor Carrier Applications before the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission; Applications and Actions before the Department of Environmental Protection; Orders of the Independent Regulatory Review Commission; and other documents authorized by law.

The text of certain documents published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the only valid and enforceable text. Courts are required to take judicial notice of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

### **Adoption, Amendment or Repeal of Regulations**

Generally an agency wishing to adopt, amend or rescind regulations must first publish in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* a Proposed Rulemaking. There are limited instances when the agency may omit the proposal step; it still must publish the adopted version.

The Proposed Rulemaking contains the full text of the change, the agency contact person, a fiscal note required by law and background for the action.

The agency then allows sufficient time for public comment before taking final action. A Final Rulemaking must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* before the changes can take effect. If the agency wishes to adopt changes to the Proposed Rulemaking to enlarge the scope, it must repropose.

## *Citation to the Pennsylvania Bulletin*

Cite material in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* by volume number, a page number and date. Example: Volume 1, *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, page 801, January 9, 1971 (short form: 1 Pa.B. 801 (January 9, 1971)).

## *Pennsylvania Code*

The *Pennsylvania Code* is the official codification of rules and regulations issued by Commonwealth agencies, Statewide court rules and other statutorily authorized documents. The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, printing changes when they are adopted. These changes are then permanently codified by the *Pennsylvania Code Reporter*, a monthly, loose-leaf supplement.

The *Pennsylvania Code* is cited by title number and section number. Example: Title 10 *Pennsylvania Code* § 1.1 (short form: 10 Pa. Code § 1.1).

Under the *Pennsylvania Code* codification system, each regulation is assigned a unique number by title and section. Titles roughly parallel the organization of Commonwealth government.

### **How to Find Rules and Regulations**

Search for your area of interest in the *Pennsylvania Code*. The *Pennsylvania Code* is available at [www.pacodeandbulletin.gov](http://www.pacodeandbulletin.gov).

Source Notes give the history of regulations. To see if there have been recent changes not yet codified, check the List of *Pennsylvania Code* Chapters Affected in the most recent issue of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

In Proposed Rulemakings and proposed Statements of Policy, existing text corresponds to the official codified text in the *Pennsylvania Code*.

*Court Rules in Titles 201—246 of the Pennsylvania Code*

Added text in proposed and adopted court rules is printed in **underscored bold face**. Deleted text in proposed and adopted court rules is enclosed in brackets [ ] and printed in **bold face**.

Proposed new chapters and rules are printed in regular type to enhance readability.

Ellipses, a series of five asterisks, indicate text that is not amended.

### Fiscal Notes

Section 612 of The Administrative Code of 1929 (71 P. S. § 232) requires the Governor's Budget Office to prepare a fiscal note for regulatory actions and administrative procedures of the administrative departments, boards, commissions and authorities receiving money from the State Treasury. The fiscal note states whether the action or procedure causes a loss of revenue or an increase in the cost of programs for the Commonwealth or its political subdivisions. The fiscal note is required to be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* at the same time as the change is advertised.

A fiscal note provides the following information: (1) the designation of the fund out of which the appropriation providing for expenditures under the action or procedure shall be made; (2) the probable cost for the fiscal year the program is implemented; (3) projected cost estimate of the program for each of the 5 succeeding fiscal years; (4) fiscal history of the program for which expenditures are to be made; (5) probable loss of revenue for the fiscal year of its implementation; (6) projected loss of revenue from the program for each of the 5 succeeding fiscal years; (7) line item, if any, of the General Appropriation Act or other appropriation act out of which expenditures or losses of Commonwealth funds shall occur as a result of the action or procedures; and (8) recommendation, if any, of the Secretary of the Budget and the reasons therefor.

The omission of an item indicates that the agency text of the fiscal note states that there is no information available with respect thereto. In items (3) and (6) information is set forth for the first through fifth fiscal years, following the year the program is implemented, which is stated. In item (4) information is set forth for the current and two immediately preceding years. In item (8) the recommendation, if any, made by the Secretary of the Budget is published with the fiscal note. "No fiscal impact" means no additional cost or revenue loss to the Commonwealth or its local political subdivision is intended. See 4 Pa. Code Chapter 7, Subchapter R (relating to fiscal notes).

## Title 234—RULES OF CRIMINAL PROCEDURE

[ 234 PA. CODE CHS. 4 AND 5 ]

**Order Adopting Rule 463 and Revising the Comments to Rules 458, 460, 462 and 546 of the Pennsylvania Rules of Criminal Procedure; No. 528 Criminal Procedural Rules Doc.**

### Order

#### *Per Curiam*

*And Now*, this 27th day of January, 2021, upon the recommendation of the Criminal Procedural Rules Committee; the proposal having been published before adoption at 49 Pa.B. 833 (February 23, 2019), and a Final Report to be published with this *Order*:

*It Is Ordered* pursuant to Article V, Section 10 of the Constitution of Pennsylvania that Pennsylvania Rule of Criminal Procedure 463 is adopted and the Comments to Pennsylvania Rules of Criminal Procedure 458, 460, 462, and 546 are revised, in the following form.

This *Order* shall be processed in accordance with Pa.R.J.A. No. 103(b), and shall be effective June 1, 2021.

### Annex A

#### TITLE 234. RULES OF CRIMINAL PROCEDURE

#### CHAPTER 4. PROCEDURES IN SUMMARY CASES

#### PART E. General Procedures in Summary Cases

#### **Rule 458. Dismissal in Summary Cases Upon Satisfaction or Agreement.**

(A) When a defendant is charged with a summary offense, the issuing authority may dismiss the case upon a showing that:

- (1) the public interest will not be adversely affected;
- (2) the attorney for the Commonwealth, or in cases in which no attorney for the Commonwealth is present at the summary proceeding, the affiant, consents to the dismissal;
- (3) satisfaction has been made to the aggrieved person or there is an agreement that satisfaction will be made to the aggrieved person; and
- (4) there is an agreement as to who shall pay the costs.

(B) When an issuing authority dismisses a case pursuant to paragraph (A), the issuing authority shall record the dismissal on the transcript.

### Comment

This rule permits an issuing authority to dismiss a summary case when the provisions of paragraph (A) are satisfied.

Paragraphs (A)(1) through (4) set forth those criteria that a defendant must satisfy before the issuing authority has the discretion to dismiss the case under this rule.

The requirement in paragraph (A)(2) that, when the attorney for the Commonwealth is present at the summary proceeding, he or she must consent to the dismissal, is one of the criteria, along with the other enumerated

criteria, which gives the issuing authority discretion to dismiss a case under this rule, even when the affiant refuses to consent.

The requirement in paragraph (B) that the issuing authority include in the transcript of the case the fact that he or she dismissed the case is intended to ensure that an adequate record is made of any dismissals under this rule.

For dismissal upon satisfaction or agreement in a court case charging a misdemeanor that is pending before an issuing authority, see Rule 546.

#### **PART F. Procedures in Summary Cases for Appealing to Court of Common Pleas for Trial *De Novo***

#### **Rule 460. Notice of Appeal.**

(A) When an appeal is authorized by law in a summary proceeding, including an appeal following a prosecution for violation of a municipal ordinance that provides for imprisonment upon conviction or upon failure to pay a fine, an appeal shall be perfected by filing a notice of appeal within 30 days after the entry of the guilty plea, the conviction, or other final order from which the appeal is taken. The notice of appeal shall be filed with the clerk of courts.

(B) The notice of appeal shall contain the following information:

- (1) the name and address of the appellant;
- (2) the name and address of the issuing authority who accepted the guilty plea or heard the case;
- (3) the magisterial district number in which the case was heard;
- (4) the name and mailing address of the affiant as shown on the complaint or citation;
- (5) the date of the entry of the guilty plea, the conviction, or other final order from which the appeal is taken;
- (6) the offense(s) of which convicted or to which a guilty plea was entered, if any;

(7) the sentence imposed, and if the sentence includes a fine, costs, or restitution, whether the amount due has been paid;

(8) the type or amount of bail or collateral, if any, furnished to the issuing authority;

(9) the name and address of the attorney, if any, filing the notice of appeal; and

(10) except when the appeal is from a guilty plea or a conviction, the grounds relied upon for appeal.

(C) Within 5 days after filing the notice of appeal, a copy shall be served either personally or by mail by the clerk of courts upon the issuing authority, the affiant, and the appellee or appellee's attorney, if any.

(D) The issuing authority shall, within 20 days after receipt of the notice of appeal, file with the clerk of courts:

- (1) the transcript of the proceedings;
- (2) the original complaint or citation, if any;
- (3) the summons or warrant of arrest, if any; and
- (4) the bail bond, if any.

(E) This rule shall provide the exclusive means of appealing from a summary guilty plea or conviction. Courts of common pleas shall not issue writs of *certiorari* in such cases.

(F) This rule shall not apply to appeals from contempt adjudications.

#### Comment

This rule is derived from former Rule 86(A), (D), (E), (F), (H), and (I).

This rule applies to appeals in all summary proceedings, including appeals from prosecutions for violations of municipal ordinances that provide for the possibility of imprisonment, and default hearings.

This rule was amended in 2000 to make it clear in a summary criminal case that the defendant may file an appeal for a trial *de novo* following the entry of a guilty plea.

Appeals from contempt adjudications are governed by Rule 141.

The narrow holding in *City of Easton v. Marra*, 326 A.2d 637 (Pa. Super. 1974), is not in conflict, since the record before the court did not indicate that imprisonment was possible under the ordinance there in question.

See Rule 461 for the procedures for executing a sentence of imprisonment when there is a stay.

"Entry," as used in this rule, means the date on which the issuing authority enters or records the guilty plea, the conviction, or other order in the magisterial district judge computer system.

When the only issues on appeal arise solely from an issuing authority's determination after a default hearing pursuant to Rule 456, the matter must be heard *de novo* by the appropriate judge of the court of common pleas and only those issues arising from the default hearing are to be considered. It is not intended to reopen other issues not properly preserved for appeal. A determination after a default hearing would be a final order for purposes of these rules.

Paragraph (D) was amended in 2003 to align this rule with Rule 401(A), which permits the electronic transmission of parking violation information in lieu of filing a

citation. Therefore, in electronically transmitted parking violation cases only, because there is no original citation, the issuing authority would file the summons with the clerk of courts pursuant to paragraph (D)(3).

Rule 462(D) provides for the dismissal of an appeal when the defendant fails to appear for the trial *de novo*.

See Rule 462(F) regarding the retention of a case at the court of common pleas when a petition to file an appeal *nunc pro tunc* has been denied.

*Certiorari* was abolished by the Criminal Rules in 1973 pursuant to Article V Schedule Section 26 of the Constitution of Pennsylvania, which specifically empowers the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania to do so by rule. This Schedule section is still viable, and the substance of this Schedule section has also been included in the Judicial Code, 42 Pa.C.S. § 934. The abolition of *certiorari* continues with this rule.

**Rule 462. Trial De Novo.**

(A) When a defendant appeals after the entry of a guilty plea or a conviction by an issuing authority in any summary proceeding, upon the filing of the transcript and other papers by the issuing authority, the case shall be heard *de novo* by the judge of the court of common pleas sitting without a jury.

(B) The attorney for the Commonwealth may appear and assume charge of the prosecution. When the violation of an ordinance of a municipality is charged, an attorney representing that municipality, with the consent of the attorney for the Commonwealth, may appear and assume charge of the prosecution. When no attorney appears on

behalf of the Commonwealth, the affiant may be permitted to ask questions of any witness who testifies.

(C) In appeals from summary proceedings arising under the Vehicle Code or local traffic ordinances, other than parking offenses, the law enforcement officer who observed the alleged offense must appear and testify. The failure of a law enforcement officer to appear and testify shall result in the dismissal of the charges unless:

(1) the defendant waives the presence of the law enforcement officer in open court on the record;

(2) the defendant waives the presence of the law enforcement officer by filing a written waiver signed by the defendant and defense counsel, or the defendant if proceeding *pro se*, with the clerk of courts; or

(3) the trial judge determines that good cause exists for the law enforcement officer's unavailability and grants a continuance.

(D) If the defendant fails to appear, the trial judge may dismiss the appeal and enter judgment in the court of common pleas on the judgment of the issuing authority.

(E) If the defendant withdraws the appeal, the trial judge shall enter judgment in the court of common pleas on the judgment of the issuing authority.

(F) If the defendant has petitioned the trial judge to permit the taking of an appeal *nunc pro tunc* and this petition is denied, the trial judge shall enter judgment in the court of common pleas on the judgment of the issuing authority.

(G) The verdict and sentence, if any, shall be announced in open court immediately upon the conclusion of the trial, or, in cases in which the defendant may be sentenced to intermediate punishment, the trial judge may delay the proceedings pending confirmation of the defendant's eligibility for intermediate punishment.

(H) At the time of sentencing, the trial judge shall:

(1) if the defendant's sentence includes restitution, a fine, or costs, state:

(a) the amount of the fine and the obligation to pay costs;

(b) the amount of restitution ordered, including

(i) the identity of the payee(s),

(ii) to whom the restitution payment shall be made, and

(iii) whether any restitution has been paid and in what amount; and

(c) the date on which payment is due.

If the defendant is without the financial means to pay the amount in a single remittance, the trial judge may provide for installment payments and shall state the date on which each installment is due;

(2) advise the defendant of the right to appeal to the Superior Court within 30 days of the imposition of sentence, and that, if an appeal is filed, the execution of sentence will be stayed and the trial judge may set bail;

(3) if a sentence of imprisonment has been imposed, direct the defendant to appear for the execution of sentence on a date certain unless the defendant files a notice of appeal within the 30-day period; and

(4) issue a written order imposing sentence, signed by the trial judge. The order shall include the information specified in paragraphs (H)(1) through (H)(3), and a copy of the order shall be given to the defendant.

(I) After sentence is imposed by the trial judge, the case shall remain in the court of common pleas for the execution of sentence, including the collection of any fine and restitution, and for the collection of any costs.

#### Comment

This rule is derived from former Rule 86(G) and former Rule 1117(c).

This rule was amended in 2000 to make it clear in a summary criminal case that the defendant may file an appeal for a trial *de novo* following the entry of a guilty plea.

"Entry," as used in paragraph (A) of this rule, means the date on which the issuing authority enters or records the guilty plea, the conviction, or other order in the magisterial district judge computer system.

The procedures for conducting the trial *de novo* in the court of common pleas set forth in paragraphs (B), (G), and (H) are comparable to the summary case trial procedures in Rule 454 (Trial in Summary Cases).

Pursuant to paragraph (B), the decision whether to appear and assume control of the prosecution of the trial *de novo* is solely within the discretion of the attorney for the Commonwealth. When no attorney appears at the trial *de novo* on behalf of the Commonwealth or a municipality, the trial judge may ask questions of any witness who testifies, and the affiant may request the trial judge to ask specific questions. In the appropriate circumstances, the trial judge also may permit the affiant to question Commonwealth witnesses, cross-examine defense witnesses, and make recommendations about the case to the trial judge.

The provisions of paragraph (C) that permit the court to continue the case if there is good cause for the officer's unavailability were added in response to *Commonwealth v. Hightower*, 652 A.2d 873 (Pa. Super. 1995).

Paragraph (D) makes it clear that the trial judge may dismiss a summary case appeal when the judge determines that the defendant is absent without cause from the trial *de novo*. If the appeal is dismissed, the trial judge should enter judgment and order execution of any sentence imposed by the issuing authority.

New paragraph (F) was added in 2017 to clarify that in a case in which a defendant seeks to file an appeal *nunc pro tunc*, and the common pleas judge denies that petition, the case will remain at the court of common pleas. This is consistent with the long-standing policy under the rules that once a case has moved from the minor judiciary to the court of common pleas, the case remains at common pleas.

Paragraph (G) was amended in 2008 to permit a trial judge to delay imposition of sentence in order to investigate a defendant's eligibility for intermediate punishment for certain offenses, including summary violations of 75 Pa.C.S. § 1543(b) (driving while license is under a DUI-related suspension), but only if he or she meets certain eligibility requirements, such as undergoing a drug and alcohol assessment. Potentially this information may not be available to the trial judge following a trial *de novo* at the time of sentencing.

Pursuant to paragraph (H), if the defendant is convicted, the trial judge must impose sentence, and advise the defendant of the payment schedule, if any, and the defendant's appeal rights. See Rule 704(A)(3) and Rule 720(D). No defendant may be sentenced to imprisonment or probation if the right to counsel was not afforded at

trial. *See Alabama v. Shelton*, 535 U.S. 654 (2002), *Scott v. Illinois*, 440 U.S. 367 (1979), and *Argersinger v. Hamlin*, 407 U.S. 25 (1972).

Certain costs are mandatory and must be imposed. *See, e.g.*, Section 1101 of the Crime Victims Act, 18 P.S. § 11.1101.

Once sentence is imposed, paragraph (I) makes it clear that the case is to remain in the court of common pleas for execution of the sentence and collection of any costs, and the case may not be returned to the magisterial district judge. The execution of sentence includes the collection of any fines and restitution.

**Rule 463. Dismissal of Summary Cases Upon Satisfaction or by Agreement in the Court of Common Pleas.**

When a defendant is charged in a summary case, as defined in Rule 103, that is before the court of common pleas, the judge of the court of common pleas may dismiss the case upon a showing that:

- (A) the public interest will not be adversely affected;
- (B) the attorney for the Commonwealth, or in cases in which no attorney for the Commonwealth is present at the summary proceeding, the affiant, consents to the dismissal;
- (C) satisfaction has been made to the aggrieved person or there is an agreement that satisfaction will be made to the aggrieved person; and
- (D) there is an agreement as to who shall pay the costs.

#### Comment

This rule permits a judge of the court of common pleas to dismiss a summary case when the provisions of paragraph (A) through (D) are satisfied. This includes the situation when the summary case is before the court of common pleas pursuant to a summary appeal filed pursuant to Rule 462.

The requirement in paragraph (B) that, when the attorney for the Commonwealth is present at the summary proceeding, he or she must consent to the dismissal, is one of the criteria, along with the other enumerated criteria, which gives the judge discretion to dismiss a case under this rule, even when the affiant refuses to consent.

For dismissal upon satisfaction or agreement in a court case charging a misdemeanor that is pending before an issuing authority, see Rule 546.

For dismissal upon satisfaction or agreement by a judge of the court of common pleas in court cases, see Rule 586.

## CHAPTER 5. PRETRIAL PROCEDURES IN COURT CASES

### PART D. Proceedings in Court Cases Before Issuing Authorities

**Rule 546. Dismissal Upon Satisfaction or Agreement.**

When a defendant is charged in a case in which the most serious offense charged is a misdemeanor[ (s) ], the issuing authority may dismiss the case upon a showing that:

- (1) the public interest will not be adversely affected;
- (2) the attorney for the Commonwealth, or in cases in which there is no attorney for the Commonwealth present, the affiant, consents to the dismissal;
- (3) satisfaction has been made to the aggrieved person or there is an agreement that satisfaction will be made to the aggrieved person; and
- (4) there is an agreement as to who shall pay the costs.

#### Comment

Paragraphs (1) through (4) set forth those criteria that a defendant must satisfy before the issuing authority has the discretion to dismiss the case under this rule.

The requirement in paragraph (2) that, when the attorney for the Commonwealth is present, he or she must consent to the dismissal, is one of the criteria that,

along with the other enumerated criteria, gives the issuing authority discretion to dismiss, even when the affiant refuses to consent.

A dismissal of the case pursuant to this rule is a dismissal of all the charges, including any summary offenses that have been joined with the misdemeanor(s) and are part of the case. See the Comment to Rule 502 (Instituting Proceedings In Court Cases) (when a misdemeanor, felony, or murder is charged with a summary offense in the same complaint, the case should proceed as a court case under Chapter 5 Part B). See also Rule 551 (Withdrawal of Charges Pending Before Issuing Authority) that permits the attorney for the Commonwealth to withdraw one or more of the charges.

For dismissal upon satisfaction or agreement in summary cases **in the magisterial district courts** see Rule 458.

**For the dismissal upon satisfaction or by agreement in summary cases, as defined in Rule 103, that have been appealed to the court of common pleas, see Rule 463.**

For court dismissal upon satisfaction or agreement **in court cases**, see Rule 586.

#### **Dismissal of Summary Cases Upon Satisfaction or by Agreement in the Court of Common Pleas**

On January 27, 2021, effective June 1, 2021, upon the recommendation of the Criminal Procedural Rules Committee, the Court adopted new Rule 463 (Dismissal of Summary Cases upon Satisfaction or by Agreement in the Court of Common Pleas) and revised the Comments to Rules 458 (Dismissal in Summary Cases upon Satisfaction or Agreement), 460 (Notice of Appeal), 462 (Trial *De Novo*), and 546 (Dismissal upon Satisfaction or Agreement) to clarify the proper rule authority to dismiss a summary case upon satisfaction or by agreement when the case is on appeal to the court of common pleas.

<sup>1</sup> The Committee's Final Reports should not be confused with the official Committee Comments to the rules. Also, note that the Supreme Court does not adopt the Committee's Comments or the contents of the Committee's explanatory Final Reports.

The Committee was presented this question due to an ambiguity in the various rules relating to dismissal by agreement. Rule 458 and Rule 586 both provide procedures for the dismissal of cases upon satisfaction or by agreement of the parties. While the language in Rule 586 does not limit itself to non-summary offenses, the Comment following the Rule suggests that only summary offenses joined to a court case can be dismissed pursuant to the Rule, "[i]f a summary offense is joined with a misdemeanor, felony, or murder charge, and therefore is part of the court case, a dismissal of the case pursuant to this rule may include a dismissal of the summary offense." Rule 458 is applicable to summary offenses, but the Comment provides, "[f]or dismissal upon satisfaction or agreement by a judge of the court of common pleas, see Rule 586."

This Comment terminology resulted in the confusion that gave rise to this question. There is an unpublished Superior Court case, *Commonwealth v. Gonder*, 2015 WL 7721790 (Pa. Super. 2015) that held that a common pleas judge could not dismiss under Rule 458 because it only applied to magisterial district judges. However, the facts of *Gonder* involve a situation more akin to a *nolle pros* rather than a true dismissal upon agreement. Additionally, the Committee believes that the interpretation of the rule in *Gonder* may read the rule too narrowly since the definition of "issuing authority" is broader in meaning than "magisterial district judges." The language in the Rule 458 Comment has been in place since 1983 and may reflect older terminology that was intended to convey a meaning of "court cases."

The Committee examined the history of the two rules as well as that of Rule 546 (Dismissal upon Satisfaction or Agreement). Rule 546 provides for dismissal upon agreement in court cases by an issuing authority, presumably occurring before or at the time of the preliminary hearing. Rule 586 represents a similar dismissal when the court case is at the court of common pleas. The Comment to Rule 546 states, "For dismissal upon satisfaction or agreement in summary cases, see Rule 458" without distinction to the type of judge approving the dismissal. Looking at the three rules in conjunction, the Committee concluded that Rules 546 and 586 were intended to cover dismissals of court cases while Rule 458 was intended cover dismissals in summary cases. The omission of a mention of summary appeals may have been an oversight or a belief that dismissals by agreement after a summary case had been appealed to the court of common pleas were rare occurrences. Additionally, Chapter 5 is the portion of the rules that deal with court cases. Placing the procedure for the resolution of summary cases in that chapter would be an anomaly, especially considering that appeals to the common pleas court are contained in Chapter 4, e.g. Rule 462 (Trial *De Novo*).

Initially, the Committee believed that a revision to the Comments to Rules 458 and 546 that summary cases appealed to the common pleas court that are dismissed by agreement are governed by Rule 458 would be sufficient to resolve this question and a proposal to that effect was published for comment. See 49 Pa.B. 833 (February 23, 2019). Following publication, the Committee reconsidered the issue and determined that proceeding via an explanatory Comment in a tangential rule might be insufficient and easily overlooked. The Committee concluded the dismissal procedure for summary cases on appeal is sufficiently consequential that it should be specified in a separate rule, akin to the other distinct rules addressing analogous dismissals (Rules 458, 546, and 586). Each of

those rules contains certain preconditions before the case may be dismissed. The Committee agreed that this procedure for allowing for the dismissal of a summary case that has been appealed to the court of common pleas should be added to Part F (Rules 460—462). That Part expressly governs “Procedures in Summary Cases for Appealing to Court of Common Pleas for a Trial *de Novo*.”

Therefore, new Rule 463 (Dismissal of Summary Cases upon Satisfaction or by Agreement in the Courts of Common Pleas) has been adopted, providing the authority for the dismissal of summary cases upon satisfaction or by agreement when the case is before a court of common pleas. The Committee examined the criteria contained in the other rules providing for dismissal upon satisfaction or by agreements, *i.e.*, the public interest will not be adversely affected; the attorney for the Commonwealth, or in cases in which there is no attorney for the Common-

wealth present, the affiant, consents to the dismissal; satisfaction has been made to the aggrieved person or there is an agreement that satisfaction will be made to the aggrieved person; and there is an agreement as to who shall pay the costs. The Committee concluded that these same criteria would be appropriate considerations in the dismissal of such cases at the court of common pleas. Therefore, these criteria have been incorporated into new Rule 463. Additionally, cross-references to this new rule have been added to the Comments to Rules 458 (Dismissal in Summary Cases upon Satisfaction or Agreement), 460 (Notice of Appeal), 462 (Trial *De Novo*), and 546 (Dismissal upon Satisfaction or Agreement).

## LAND RECYCLING AND ENVIRONMENTAL REMEDIATION

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#### Acknowledgment of Notices of Intent to Remediate Submitted Under the Land Recycling and Environmental Remediation Standards Act (35 P.S. §§ 6026.101—6026.908).

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Sections 302—305 of the Land Recycling and Environmental Remediation Standards Act (Act) require the Department of Environmental Protection (Department) to publish in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* an acknowledgment noting receipt of any Notices of Intent to Remediate. An acknowledgment of the receipt of a Notice of Intent (NOI) to Remediate is used to identify a site where a person proposes to, or has been required to, respond to a release of a regulated substance at a site. Persons intending to use the background standard, Statewide health standard, the site-specific standard, or who intend to remediate a site as a special industrial area, must file a (NOI) to Remediate with the Department. A NOI to Remediate filed with the Department provides a brief description of the location of the site, a list of known or suspected contaminants at the site, the proposed remediation measures for the site, and a description of the intended future use of the site. A person who demonstrates attainment of one, or a combination of the cleanup standards, or who receives approval of a special industrial area remediation identified under the Act, will be relieved of further liability for the remediation of the site for any contamination identified in reports submitted to and approved by the Department. Furthermore, the person shall not be subject to citizen suits or other contribution actions brought by responsible persons not participating in the remediation.

Under Sections 304(n)(1)(ii) and 305(c)(2) of the Act, there is a 30-day public and municipal comment period for sites proposed for remediation using a site-specific standard, in whole or in part, and for sites remediated as a special industrial area. This period begins when a summary of the NOI to Remediate is published in a newspaper of general circulation in the area of the site. For the following identified site(s), proposed for remediation to a site-specific standard or as a special industrial area, the municipality, within which the site is located, may request to be involved in the development of the remediation and reuse plans for the site if the request is made within 30-days of the following specified date. During this comment period the municipality may request that the following identified person, as the remediator of the site, develop and implement a public involvement plan. Requests to be involved, and comments, should be directed to the remediator of the site.

Similarly, modified BAT limits apply to iron, manganese and suspended solids in surface runoff, discharges and drainage resulting from these precipitation events and those of greater magnitude in accordance with 25 Pa. Exceptions to BAT effluent limits may be applicable in accordance with 25 Pa. Code §§ 87.102, 88.92, 88.187, 88.292, 89.52 and 90.102.

#### *Effluent Limits for Noncoal Mining Activities*

The limits for noncoal mining activities as provided in 25 Pa. Code Chapter 77 are pH 6 to 9 and other parameters the Department may require.

Discharges from noncoal mines located in some geologic settings (for example, in the coal fields) may require additional water quality-based effluent limits. If additional effluent limits are needed for an NPDES permit associated with a noncoal mining permit, then the permit description specifies the parameters.

In addition to BAT or WQBEL limits, coal and noncoal NPDES permits establish effluent limitations in the form of implemented Best Management Practices (BMPs) identified in the associated Erosion and Sedimentation Plan, the Reclamation Plan and the NPDES permit application. These BMPs restrict the rates and quantities of associated pollutants from being discharged into surface waters in this Commonwealth.

More restrictive effluent limitations, restrictions on discharge volume or restrictions on the extent of mining that may occur are incorporated into an NPDES permit when necessary for compliance with water quality standards and antidegradation requirements (in accordance with 25 Pa. ### Internet Instant Games iLottery Game

Under the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314) Title 4 Amusements (4 Pa.C.S.A. §§ 501—505) and 61 Pa. Code § 876.2d (relating to iLottery game rules by category of game offered), the Secretary of Revenue hereby provides public notice of the rules for internet instant games of the iLottery category of games, as required by the iLottery permanent regulations published at 50 Pa.B. 1528 (March 14, 2020).

1. *Purpose.* This notice shall provide the rules governing internet instant games offered through the Bureau's iLottery system available on the iLottery web site ([www.PAiLottery.com](http://www.PAiLottery.com)) and the Bureau's mobile application. Internet instant lottery games are operated under 4 Pa.C.S.A. §§ 501—505 and 61 Pa. Code §§ 876.1—876.20, as applicable. This notice shall also rescind the notice published at 48 Pa.B. 2027 (April 7, 2018).

2. *Game Type.* The type of iLottery games governed by this notice are internet instant games, as provided for under 61 Pa. Code § 876.2c(a)(4). Internet instant games

are a category of games where the result of the game is a reveal of numbers, letters or symbols, indicating whether a prize has been won according to this notice, the game's prize structure and the game description.

3. *Definitions.* The words and terms, when used in this notice, have the meanings ascribed to them under 61 Pa. Code § 876.2 (relating to definitions), unless the context clearly indicates otherwise.

4. *Time and place of outcome determination.* Each internet instant game is available on demand and the outcome will be revealed on the computer, tablet computer or other mobile device on which the game is played immediately upon completion of the game.

5. *Method of outcome determination.*

(a) Internet instant game outcomes are determined through the use of a random number generator. At the time the registered iLottery player starts a game, a random number generator selects outcomes from a preset range of potential outcomes and how that outcome will be displayed to the player, based on the specific design of each individual game.

(b) The outcome of an internet instant game is determined at the time the registered iLottery player purchases a play, chance or share (hereinafter referred to as "play" in the singular, or "plays" in the plural). Registered iLottery player selections, actions or choices within iLottery games do not affect the outcome of the game or the prize won.

6. *Prize Structure.*

(a) Prize structures for internet instant games may include one or more of the following: prize tiers; progressive prizes; fixed payout; and prize pool or pools.

(1) Prize tiers are the specific prize amounts that can be won in an internet instant game. Prize amounts may be won and displayed differently in each game and each game may have its own, different prize tiers.

(2) Progressive prizes are a prize tier or tiers that may be present in some games. Any specific progressive prize starts at a predetermined value and a portion of each amount played contributes a preset amount to the progressive prize or prizes each time a play is purchased for that game. When any specific progressive prize is won, the progressive prize for the next play is reset to a predetermined value based on the rules of the game. The operation of the progressive prize or prizes can vary from game to game, and the method of operation will be communicated in the game description.

(3) Fixed payout games feature static prize amounts, and the number and amount of the prizes are not affected by the amount of times a game is played or by the number of people who play the game.

(4) A prize pool or pools are a predetermined set of play outcomes.

(i) A depleting prize pool includes a pre-defined number of plays, including both winning and non-winning outcomes that are random throughout an entire prize pool. As plays are purchased, the total number of outcomes deplete until all plays are gone. A depleting prize pool can be replaced, in its entirety, once all plays are depleted.

(ii) A non-depleting prize pool includes a pre-defined number of plays, including both winning and non-winning outcomes that are random throughout an entire prize pool. As plays are purchased, the winning and losing outcomes are automatically replenished and available for each subsequent purchase.

(b) Internet instant games give a registered iLottery player the opportunity to win one prize per play.

(c) The prize structure of each internet instant game is communicated to players in the game description provided for each individual game, as further described in section 9 (relating to location of individual game descriptions).

7. *Purchase Price.* The purchase price for a single play in any individual internet instant game is determined by the game selected and can range from \$0.01 to \$30. The price, or range of prices, of any individual play in any internet instant game can be found in the game description as further described in section 9 (relating to location of game descriptions).

8. *Availability.*

(a) *Eligibility:* To be eligible to participate in iLottery and purchase plays for internet instant games, a person must agree to the iLottery terms and conditions as provided for at 61 Pa. Code § 876.9, and must meet all of the requirements of 61 Pa. Code §§ 876.10, 876.10a and 876.11.

(1) A person must become a registered iLottery player by establishing a lottery account through the Bureau's iLottery web site or the Bureau's mobile application.

(2) A registered iLottery player must be 18 years of age, or older.

(3) A registered iLottery player must be located within the physical boundaries of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to purchase a play.

(4) During any period of self-exclusion as provided for under 61 Pa. Code § 876.16 (relating to self-exclusion from iLottery and responsible gambling tools), no self-excluded registered iLottery player shall purchase plays, deposit or withdraw funds from the registered iLottery player's lottery account or otherwise participate in iLottery and iLottery promotions prior to the conclusion of the self-exclusion period.

(5) A registered iLottery player shall abide by all other requirements of 4 Pa.C.S.A. §§ 501—505 (relating to lottery), as well as any regulations promulgated thereunder.

(b) Internet instant games are available to registered iLottery players from the on-sale date, as determined by the Bureau, until the game is terminated or suspended in accordance with this section.

(c) The termination of specific internet instant games, of the internet instant game category, or of the iLottery category of games, will be communicated through the Bureau's web site (<http://www.palottery.com>) at the discretion of the Secretary.

(d) Individual internet instant games may be suspended and removed from the game lobby at the discretion of the Bureau for any reason. A game may be suspended or removed by the Bureau for any reason and is not considered terminated unless communicated as described in this section.

9. *Location of Individual Game Descriptions.* The description of each individual internet instant game, containing all of the information as required by 61 Pa. Code § 876.4 (relating to iLottery game description), as well as the instructions for playing each individual internet instant game, will be posted to the Bureau's iLottery web site and the iLottery section of the Bureau's mobile application.

10. *Procedures for Purchasing a Play.*

(a) To purchase a play, a registered iLottery player must have a valid lottery account, as referenced in section 8 (relating to availability).

(b) A registered iLottery player must fund the player's lottery account with money from an approved payment provider, as further detailed on the Bureau's iLottery web site, or the iLottery section of the Bureau's mobile application.

(c) A registered iLottery player may purchase a play using the player's own money, or by using bonus money provided to the registered iLottery player by the Bureau at its discretion, which is deposited into the player's lottery account.

11. *Procedures for Claiming and Payment of Prizes.*

(a) After purchasing a play for an internet instant game, a registered iLottery player must follow the instructions provided for that internet instant game to reveal whether a prize is awarded.

(b) Prizes won by playing internet instant games will be deposited into the registered iLottery player's lottery account and may be withdrawn from the player's lottery account at the player's discretion, as further detailed in the iLottery terms and conditions.

(c) The Bureau will report taxable events to the relevant taxing authorities based on established statutory thresholds and a registered iLottery player will have the ability to view and print tax statements within the registered iLottery player's lottery account.

(d) State and Federal withholding taxes will be automatically deducted from prizes meeting established statutory thresholds and shall be remitted to the appropriate taxing authorities as required by law.

(e) Statutorily required offsets under 23 Pa.C.S. § 4308 (relating to lottery winnings intercept) and 72 P.S. § 215 regarding lottery winnings intercept, shall be automatically deducted from prizes meeting statutory thresholds, and shall be paid to the relevant agencies as required by law.

12. *Governing Law.* By registering to participate in iLottery, the registered iLottery player agrees to comply with and abide by Federal and State law, the iLottery regulations, iLottery Bonus Policy, applicable game rules, the terms and conditions for registration and participation in iLottery and final decisions of the Secretary.

13. *Applicability.*

(a) This notice applies only to the internet instant games category of iLottery games as offered by the Bureau.

(b) Internet instant games are only offered through the Bureau's iLottery web site and the Bureau's mobile application.

(c) Internet instant games are not available through Lottery retailers.

### Pennsylvania Cash 5 with Quick Cash Terminal-Based Lottery Game

Under 61 Pa. Code § 816.101 (relating to creation), the Secretary of Revenue hereby provides public notice of the termination of the Cash 5 lottery game rules at 61 Pa. Code §§ 816.101—816.117, effective for tickets purchased on or before February 8, 2021. Under the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314) and 61 Pa. Code § 875.4 (relating to notice of terminal-based lottery game rules), the Secretary of Revenue hereby provides public notice of the following new rules for the terminal-based lottery game, Pennsylvania Cash 5 with Quick Cash, effective for tickets purchased on or after February 9, 2021:

1. *Name:* The name of the terminal-based lottery game is Pennsylvania Cash 5 with Quick Cash (hereinafter, "Cash 5 with Quick Cash"). The game will commence at the discretion of the Secretary, and will continue until the Secretary publicly announces a suspension or termination date.

2. *Price:* The price of one Cash 5 with Quick Cash play is \$2. Each Cash 5 with Quick Cash \$2 play includes one Cash 5 Drawing play and one Quick Cash instant win play, printed on separate tickets. Additional Cash 5 with Quick Cash plays may be purchased at the discretion of the player, up to a maximum of ten plays for seven consecutive Cash 5 Drawings.

3. *Description of the Cash 5 with Quick Cash lottery game:*

(a) Cash 5 with Quick Cash is designed to give players the opportunity to win one Cash 5 Drawing prize and one Quick Cash instant win prize for each play purchased. Cash 5 Drawing plays or Quick Cash plays cannot be purchased separately.

(b) For a single \$2 purchase, the player receives one ticket containing five different Cash 5 Drawing numbers ranging from 1 to 43, which may either be quick pick or at the player's selection, and a ticket containing one Quick Cash play.

(c) Players meeting all validation criteria can win a Cash 5 Drawing prize, identified in section 6(b) (relating to Determinations of Cash 5 Drawing prize winners for tickets correctly matching the winning numbers selected by the Lottery), by matching, in the same play, five, four, three or two of the winning numbers randomly selected by the Lottery as determined and publicly announced by the Secretary.

(d) Players can win one Quick Cash instant win prize by matching any of the play symbols located in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area to any of the play symbols located in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area in a Quick Cash GAME. Correctly matching play symbols in this manner entitles the ticket holder to the prize shown to the right of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols for that GAME, as further identified in Section 6(c) (relating to Quick Cash prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners). If more than one Quick Cash GAME appears on a ticket, (for example, where a purchase of two Cash 5 with Quick Cash plays includes a ticket containing two Quick Cash GAMES) each Quick Cash GAME is played separately.

4. *Cash 5 with Quick Cash bet slip and ticket characteristics:*

(a) To purchase a Cash 5 with Quick Cash play, the player shall remit to an authorized retailer the purchase price, submit the completed Cash 5 with Quick Cash bet slip or request the number selection through quick pick or manual terminal entry to have a ticket issued.

(b) The Cash 5 Drawing ticket portion of the Cash 5 with Quick Cash play shall consist of one to ten plays, each containing one five-number selection for each \$2 wagered, the drawing date or range of dates for which the ticket is entered, amount bet, and validation number data. On Cash 5 Drawing tickets containing multiple plays, each five-number Cash 5 Drawing selection will be identified by a letter prefix: A for the first play printed on the ticket; B for the second play printed on the ticket; C for the third play printed on the ticket; D for the fourth play printed on the ticket; E for the fifth play printed on the ticket; F for the sixth play printed on the ticket; G for the seventh play printed on the ticket; H for the eighth play printed on the ticket; I for the ninth play printed on the ticket; and J for the tenth play printed on the ticket. Each Cash 5 Drawing ticket shall be the only valid proof of the bet placed, and the only valid receipt for claiming a prize. The ticket shall only be valid for the drawing date or range of dates printed on the ticket. In addition, within the same purchase, a player may repeat the selected Cash 5 Drawing numbers for up to seven consecutive Cash 5 Drawings, for a maximum of 70 total Cash 5 Drawing plays, and 70 Quick Cash GAMES, per purchase.

(c) The Quick Cash ticket portion of the Cash 5 with Quick Cash play shall consist of one to five GAMES, each containing five Quick Cash "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols, five Quick Cash "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols and one Quick Cash Prize area containing one Quick Cash prize symbol. On Quick Cash tickets containing multiple plays, each Quick Cash GAME will be identified by a GAME number: GAME 1 for the first play printed on the ticket; GAME 2 for the second play printed on the ticket; GAME 3 for the third play printed on the ticket; GAME 4 for the fourth play printed on the ticket; and GAME 5 for the fifth play printed on the ticket. A player who purchases more than five total Cash 5 with Quick Cash plays will receive multiple Quick Cash instant win tickets, each containing one to five Quick Cash GAMES, until the total number of Quick Cash GAMES has been printed. Each Quick Cash ticket shall be the only valid proof of the bet placed, and the only valid receipt for claiming a prize.

(d) Cash 5 with Quick Cash bet slips shall be available at no cost to the player. The minimum wager is \$2. For \$2, purchase Cash 5 Drawing play A and one Quick Cash instant win GAME; for \$4, purchase Cash 5 Drawing plays A and B and two Quick Cash instant win GAMES; for \$6, purchase Cash 5 Drawing plays A, B and C and three Quick Cash instant win GAMES; for \$8, purchase Cash 5 Drawing plays A, B, C and D and four Quick Cash instant win GAMES; for \$10, purchase Cash 5 Drawing plays A, B, C, D and E and five Quick Cash instant win GAMES; for \$12, purchase Cash 5 Drawing plays A, B, C, D, E and F and six Quick Cash instant win GAMES, printed on two tickets; for \$14, purchase Cash 5 Drawing plays A, B, C, D, E, F and G and seven Quick Cash instant win GAMES, printed on two tickets; for \$16, purchase Cash 5 Drawing plays A, B, C, D, E, F, G and H and eight Quick Cash instant win GAMES, printed on two tickets; for \$18, purchase Cash 5 Drawing plays A, B,

C, D, E, F, G, H and I and nine Quick Cash instant win plays, printed on two tickets; and for \$20, purchase Cash 5 Drawing plays A, B, C, D, E, F, G, H, I and J and ten Quick Cash instant win GAMES, printed on two tickets. Plays shall be selected in accordance with the instructions printed on the Cash 5 with Quick Cash bet slip. A Cash 5 with Quick Cash bet slip has no pecuniary or prize value and does not constitute evidence of the purchase of a ticket or the numbers selected.

(e) If Cash 5 with Quick Cash bet slips are unavailable, number selections may be given to an authorized retailer in groups of five-number selections, for each play and for each \$2 wagered. The retailer shall manually enter the selections into the Lottery terminal. A player may also request number selection using the quick pick option by indication on the bet slip or making the request to an authorized retailer.

(f) A player may also purchase Cash 5 with Quick Cash plays using a Pennsylvania Lottery self-service terminal. To purchase a ticket at a Pennsylvania Lottery self-service terminal, the player must insert into the self-service terminal a dollar amount equal to the total purchase price of the Cash 5 with Quick Cash game ticket and select the Cash 5 with Quick Cash option on the Lottery self-service terminal.

(g) No portion of a Cash 5 with Quick Cash game ticket can be canceled or voided once printed by the Lottery Terminal, even if printed in error.

5. *Time, place and manner of conducting Cash 5 Drawings:*

(a) *Time of drawing.* A Cash 5 Drawing will be held on a daily basis or as determined and publicly announced by the Secretary.

(b) *Place of drawing.* A Cash 5 Drawing will be conducted in the Harrisburg, Pennsylvania area unless the Secretary directs that a drawing or part of the drawing procedure be conducted at some other location.

(c) *Manner of conducting drawings.* The Lottery will select, at random, five numbers from 1 through 43, with the aid of mechanical devices or any other selection methodology as authorized by the Secretary. The five numbers selected will be used in determining winners for each individual Cash 5 Drawing. The validity of a Drawing will be determined solely by the Lottery.

(d) Winning Cash 5 Drawing selections are determined separately from winning Quick Cash GAMES. Tickets containing a Quick Cash GAME win may be presented for payment at any time while the ticket remains valid, as described in section 9(b) (relating to Unclaimed prize money).

6. *Cash 5 with Quick Cash prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners:*

(a) An amount equal to 44.39% of Cash 5 with Quick Cash gross sales for a Cash 5 Drawing will be reserved for prizes and allocated to the prize pool for payment of prizes as enumerated in Section 6(b) (relating to Determinations of Cash 5 Drawing prize winners for tickets correctly matching the winning numbers selected by the Lottery). The prize pool does not include money carried forward from a previous Pennsylvania Cash 5 Drawing.

(b) Determinations of Cash 5 Drawing prize winners for tickets correctly matching the winning numbers selected by the Lottery, are:

(1) Holders of tickets upon which the player's five numbers, in a single play, match the five winning numbers selected by the Lottery, shall be the winner of the jackpot category prize. The jackpot category prize shall consist of 44.0% of the Cash 5 Drawing prize pool, plus any prize money carried forward from a prior Cash 5 Drawing pursuant to §§ 6(b)(1)(iii), 6(b)(2)(ii) and 6(b)(3)(ii).

(i) The Lottery will estimate and announce the projected amount of the upcoming jackpot category prize prior to the drawing. Payment will be made in the amount estimated and announced as the projected jackpot category prize or in the actual amount of the jackpot category prize, whichever is greater, divided equally by the number of plays on tickets determined by the Lottery to be entitled to claim a jackpot category prize.

(ii) Prize money allocated to the jackpot category prize will be paid on a pari-mutuel basis. If more than one winning jackpot prize play is determined, each, upon meeting the requirements of 61 Pa. Code §§ 875.10 and 875.11 (relating to terminal-based lottery game ticket validation and requirements; and procedures for claiming and payment of prizes), is entitled to a prorated payment share of the total jackpot category prize.

(iii) If, in a Cash 5 Drawing, there are no winning jackpot category prize plays, prize money allocated from the prize pool to that prize category will be carried forward and added to the amount allocated for the jackpot category prize money in the next Cash 5 Drawing.

(2) Holders of tickets upon which four of the player's numbers, in a single play, match four of the winning numbers selected by the Lottery, shall be entitled to a second category prize of \$200.

(3) Holders of tickets upon which three of the player's numbers, in a single play, match three of the winning numbers selected by the Lottery, shall be entitled to a third category prize of \$10.

(4) Holders of tickets upon which two of the player's numbers, in a single play, match two of the winning numbers selected by the Lottery, shall be entitled to a fourth category prize of \$2.

(c) *Quick Cash prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners:*

(1) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols, and a prize symbol of \$6<sup>00</sup> appears in the Prize area to the right of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols, in the same GAME, shall be entitled to a prize of \$6.

(2) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols, and a prize symbol of \$2<sup>00</sup> appears in the Prize area to the right of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols, in the same GAME, shall be entitled to a prize of \$2.

(d) All Cash 5 with Quick Cash prize payments, including the jackpot category prize, will be made as a one-time, lump-sum cash payment. For the purposes of jackpot prize calculation, the calculation will be rounded down so that prizes will be paid in multiples of \$0.50.

(e) A winning Cash 5 Drawing ticket is entitled only to the highest prize won by those numbers in each play appearing on the ticket.

(f) A winning Quick Cash ticket is entitled to the prize for any winning GAME printed on that Quick Cash ticket. A winning Quick Cash ticket may contain up to five winning GAMES.

(g) The number of prize categories, the allocation of prize money among the prize categories, and the minimum jackpot category prize amount for the Cash 5 Drawing portion of the Cash 5 with Quick Cash play may be changed at the discretion of the Secretary and the change will be announced by public notice. The changes will only apply prospectively to Cash 5 Drawings as of the date specified in the public notice.

7. *Probability of winning:* The following tables set forth all possible ways that a prize can be won for the Cash 5 Drawing portion of a single Cash 5 with Quick Cash play; all the possible ways that a prize can be won for each GAME on the Quick Cash portion of a single Cash 5 with Quick Cash play; corresponding prize or prizes won; and probability of winning each prize or combination of prizes:

(a) *Cash 5 Drawing prizes:*

(b) *Quick Cash GAME prizes:*

8. *Retailer Incentive and Marketing Promotion Programs:*

(a) The Lottery may conduct a separate Retailer Incentive Program for retailers who sell Cash 5 with Quick Cash lottery tickets. The conduct of the Program will be governed by 61 Pa. Code § 811.41 (relating to promotional prizes).

(b) Retailer Incentive and Marketing Promotion Programs, including the use of unfunded free tickets, may be implemented at the discretion of the Secretary. If needed, funds for the programs, including the payment of prizes resulting from the programs, will be drawn from the Lottery Fund.

9. *Unclaimed Prize Money:*

(a) For a period of 1 year from the announced Drawing date, prize money from winning Cash 5 Drawing game tickets will be retained by the Secretary for payment to the persons entitled thereto. If no claim is made within 1 year of the anniversary date of the Drawing in which the ticket or chance was entered, the right of a ticket holder to claim the prize represented by the ticket, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided for by statute.

(b) A Quick Cash prize must be claimed within 1 year of the sale date of the Quick Cash ticket. If no claim is made within 1 year of the sale date of a Quick Cash ticket, the right of a ticket holder to claim the prize represented by the ticket, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided for by statute.

**FISH AND BOAT COMMISSION**

**Classification of Wild Trout Streams; Proposed Additions and Revisions; April 2021**

Under 58 Pa. Code § 57.11 (relating to listing of wild trout streams), it is the policy of the Fish and Boat Commission (Commission) to accurately identify and classify stream sections supporting naturally reproducing populations of trout as wild trout streams. The Commission’s Fisheries Management Division maintains the list of wild trout streams. The Executive Director, with the approval of the Commission, will from time-to-time publish the list of wild trout streams in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. The listing of a stream section as a wild trout stream is a biological designation that does not determine how it is managed. The Commission relies upon many factors in determining the appropriate management of streams.

At the next Commission meeting on April 12 and 13, 2021, the Commission will consider changes to its list of wild trout streams. Specifically, the Commission will consider the addition of the following streams or portions of streams to the list:

## FISH AND BOAT COMMISSION

### Proposed Changes to List of Class A Wild Trout Waters; April 2021

The Fish and Boat Commission (Commission) is considering changes to its list of Class A Wild Trout Streams. Under 58 Pa. Code § 57.8a (relating to Class A wild trout streams), it is the Commission's policy to manage self-sustaining Class A wild trout populations as a renewable natural resource to conserve that resource and the angling it provides. Class A wild trout populations represent the best of this Commonwealth's naturally reproducing trout fisheries. With rare exceptions, the Commission manages these stream sections solely for the perpetuation of the wild trout fishery with no stocking.

Criteria developed for Class A Wild Trout fisheries are species specific. Wild Trout Biomass Class Criteria include provisions for:

(i) *Wild Brook Trout Fisheries*

(A) Total brook trout biomass of at least 30 kg/ha (26.7 lbs/acre).

(B) Total biomass of brook trout less than 15 cm (5.9 inches) in total length of at least 0.1 kg/ha (0.089 lbs/acre).

(C) Brook trout biomass must comprise at least 75% of the total trout biomass.

(ii) *Wild Brown Trout Fisheries*

(A) Total brown trout biomass of at least 40 kg/ha (35.6 lbs/acre).

(B) Total biomass of brown trout less than 15 cm (5.9 inches) in total length of at least 0.1 kg/ha (0.089 lbs/acre).

(C) Brown trout biomass must comprise at least 75% of the total trout biomass.

(iii) *Mixed Wild Brook and Brown Trout Fisheries*

(A) Combined brook and brown trout biomass of at least 40 kg/ha (35.6 lbs/acre).

(B) Total biomass of brook trout less than 15 cm (5.9 inches) in total length of at least 0.1 kg/ha (0.089 lbs/acre).

(C) Total biomass of brown trout less than 15 cm (5.9 inches) in total length of at least 0.1 kg/ha (0.089 lbs/acre).

(D) Brook trout biomass must comprise less than 75% of the total trout biomass.

(E) Brown trout biomass must comprise less than 75% of the total trout biomass.

(iv) *Wild Rainbow Trout Fisheries*

Total biomass of rainbow trout less than 15 cm (5.9 inches) in total length of at least 2.0 kg/ha (1.78 lbs/acre).

(v) *Mixed Wild Brook and Rainbow Trout Fisheries*

(A) Combined brook and rainbow trout biomass of at least 40 kg/ha (35.6 lbs/acre).

(B) Total biomass of brook trout less than 15 cm (5.9 inches) in total length of at least 0.1 kg/ha (0.089 lbs/acre).

(C) Total biomass of rainbow trout less than 15 cm (5.9 inches) in total length of at least 0.1 kg/ha (0.089 lbs/acre).

(D) Brook trout biomass shall comprise less than 75% of the total trout biomass.

(E) Rainbow trout biomass shall comprise less than 75% of the total trout biomass.

(vi) *Mixed Wild Brown and Rainbow Trout Fisheries*

(A) Combined brown and rainbow trout biomass of at least 40 kg/ha (35.6 lbs/acre).

(B) Total biomass of brown trout less than 15 cm (5.9 inches) in total length of at least 0.1 kg/ha (0.089 lbs/acre).

(C) Total biomass of rainbow trout less than 15 cm (5.9 inches) in total length of at least 0.1 kg/ha (0.089 lbs/acre).

(D) Brown trout biomass shall comprise less than 75% of the total trout biomass.

(E) Rainbow trout biomass shall comprise less than 75% of the total trout biomass.

During recent surveys, Commission staff documented the following stream sections to have Class A wild trout populations. The Commission intends to consider adding these waters to its list of Class A Wild Trout Streams at its meeting on April 12 and 13, 2021.

## FISH AND BOAT COMMISSION

### Temporary Change to Fishing Regulations; Fishing in Stocked Trout Waters and Regional Opening Day of Trout Season

The Executive Director of the Fish and Boat Commission (Commission), acting under the authority of 58 Pa. Code § 65.25 (relating to temporary changes to fishing regulations), has taken immediate action to amend 58 Pa. Code § 63.3 (relating to fishing in stocked trout waters), and 58 Pa. Code § 65.12 (relating to regional opening day of trout season), 58 Pa. Code § 65.26 (relating to extended trout season) and 58 Pa. Code § 69.12 (relating to seasons, sizes and creel limits—Lake Erie, Lake Erie tributaries and Presque Isle Bay including peninsula waters). This action is necessitated by the continuing novel coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic that continues to pose a risk to the health of anglers and is designed to decrease that risk by reducing the potential for larger concentrations of anglers and adjusting the closed season to allow for modifications to stocking schedules. Specifically, the Executive Director has amended these sections to:

- Close to fishing all stocked trout streams and rivers between February 15, 2021, and 8 a.m. on April 3, 2021.
- Regulate all trout stocked lakes under Stocked Trout Waters Open to Year-Round Fishing regulations to allow for catch-and-release fishing for trout between February 15, 2021, and 8 a.m. on April 3, 2021.
- Eliminate the Regional Mentored Youth Trout Day and move the Statewide Mentored Youth Trout Day to March 27, 2021.
- Eliminate the Regional Opening Day of Trout Season and move the Statewide Opening Day of Trout Season to April 3, 2021.
- Modify Lake Erie trout and salmon season, size and creel limits.

These are temporary changes affecting only the 2021 trout season and will expire on April 11, 2021.

While this temporary amendment is in effect, the following sections will be amended to read as follows:

#### § 63.3. Fishing in stocked trout waters.

It is unlawful to fish in stocked trout waters regulated under § 61.1 (relating to Commonwealth inland waters) from 12:01 a.m. on [ **March 1 to 8 a.m. on the first Saturday after April 11** ] **February 15 to 8 a.m. on Saturday April 3, except for stocked trout water lakes where catch and release fishing only shall be permitted** and in stocked trout waters regulated under § 65.12 (relating to regional opening day of trout season) from 12:01 a.m. on [ **March 1** ] **February 15** to 8 a.m. on [ **the first Saturday after March 28** ] **Saturday April 3, except for stocked trout water lakes where catch and release fishing only shall be permitted.** As used in this subpart, the term “stocked trout waters” means waters that are stocked with adult trout by the Commission. A listing of stocked trout waters is published in the Commission’s “Summary of Fishing Regulations and Laws,” which is available from the Commission at Post Office Box 67000, Harrisburg, Pennsylvania 17106-7000. The Executive Director or a designee may, from time to time, supplement or modify the list of stocked trout waters, and additions or deletions will be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

#### § 65.26. Extended trout season.

(a) *General rule.* The extended trout season is in effect [ **from the day after Labor Day until the last day of February of the following year** ] **until 12:01 a.m. on February 15** on stocked trout waters and all waters downstream of stocked trout waters. A creel limit of three trout per day and a minimum size limit of 7 inches apply during this season, except Class A wild trout streams where the creel limit is 0 and areas with special regulations.

\* \* \* \* \*

#### § 69.12. Seasons, sizes and creel limits—Lake Erie, Lake Erie tributaries and Presque Isle Bay including peninsula waters.

\* \* \* \* \*

(d) It is unlawful to fish in or along any Lake Erie tributary stream from 12:01 a.m. on [ **the Friday before the first Saturday after April 11** ] **April 2, 2021** until 8 a.m. on [ **the first Saturday after April 11** ] **April 3, 2021.**

(e) It is unlawful to possess trout or salmon in or along any Lake Erie tributary stream from 12:01 a.m. on [ **the Friday before the first Saturday after April 11** ] **April 2, 2021** until 8 a.m. on [ **the first Saturday after April 11** ] **April 3, 2021.**

(f) Except as otherwise provided in subsections (d) and (e) and this subpart, the following seasons, sizes and creel limits apply to Lake Erie, Lake Erie tributaries and Presque Isle Bay, including peninsula waters:

In accordance with the Commission's Emergency Order at M-2020-3019262, all parties participating in matters pending before the Commission are required to eFile their submissions by opening an eFiling account and accepting eService. Individuals can sign up for a free eFiling account with the Secretary of the Commission through the Commission's eFiling system at <https://www.puc.pa.gov/efiling/Default.aspx>. A protest shall indicate whether it applies to the temporary authority application, the

permanent authority application, or both. Protests may only be filed if there is evidence that the applicant lacks fitness. Protests based on endangering or impairing operations of an existing carrier will not be honored.
