Under Sections 304(n)(1)(ii) and 305(c)(2) of the Act, there is a 30-day public and municipal comment period for sites proposed for remediation using a site-specific standard, in whole or in part, and for sites remediated as a special industrial area. This period begins when a summary of the NOI to Remediate is published in a newspaper of general circulation in the area of the site. For the following identified site(s), proposed for remediation to a site-specific standard or as a special industrial area, the municipality, within which the site is located, may request to be involved in the development of the remediation and reuse plans for the site if the request is made within 30-days of the following specified date. During this comment period the municipality may request that the following identified person, as the remediator of the site, develop and implement a public involvement plan. Requests to be involved, and comments, should be directed to the remediator of the site.

## HAZARDOUS SITES CLEAN-UP UNDER THE ACT OF OCTOBER 18, 1988

#### NOTICE OF PROMPT INTERIM RESPONSE

#### Mazzaro—McKees Rocks Landfill, Kennedy Township, Allegheny County

Under Section 506(b) of the Hazardous Sites Cleanup Act (HSCA) (35 P.S. § 6020.506(b)), notice is hereby given that the Department of Environmental Protection (Department) has undertaken a HSCA prompt interim response at the Mazzaro—McKees Rocks Landfill site in Kennedy Township, Allegheny County (Site).

Work by DEP and its contractors has demonstrated that landfill gas (LFG), including methane, exists within the Site and potentially beyond the boundaries of the Site, at levels that exceed standards established in 25 Pa. Code Chapter 273 regulations for combustible gas monitoring, off-site migration and mitigation at permitted municipal waste landfill sites. The Department has begun a prompt interim response at the Site to help prevent the potential for offsite LFG migration.

The Department has considered the following six alternatives to address the potential for LFG migration from the Site: 1) take no action; 2) installation of an enhanced gas venting system; 3) installation of a passive trench venting system; 4) installation of a semi-active trench venting system; 5) installation of an active trench system; and 6) installation of impermeable barriers.

The Department chose alternative number 3, the installation of a passive trench venting system, because it complies with the applicable or relevant and appropriate requirements and is the most cost-effective.

The Administrative Record which contains the information that supports the Department's selection of this response action is available for public review and comment. The Administrative Record is available for review on the Department's website at https://www.dep.pa.gov/ Southwest.

The Administrative Record will be open for review and comment from February 20, 2021, until May 21, 2021. Persons may submit written comments into the record during this time only by emailing the Department at RA-EPSW-HSCA@pa.gov.

In addition, persons may participate in a public hearing where oral comments which will be transcribed for inclusion in the Administrative Record. Proposed Alternative Restoration Plan for the Hammer Creek Headwaters Subwatershed in Lebanon County.

Central Office: Bureau of Clean Water, P.O. Box 8774, Harrisburg, PA 17105-8774. The Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) will accept comments on the proposed Alternative Restoration Plan (ARP) developed for the **Hammer Creek Headwaters Watershed** in **Lebanon County**. The Pennsylvania Integrated Water Quality Monitoring and Assessment Report included stream segments impaired for aquatic life in the watershed. The impairments addressed by this document were caused by excessive siltation due to agriculture. There is a large amount of public interest in restoring this watershed due to its potential as a wild trout fishery, as well as to prevent excessive sedimentation within a downstream lake (Speedwell Forge).

The ARP approach was chosen as a temporary alternative to the development of a Total Maximum Daily Load (TMDL). An ARP is currently a better option for this watershed because it not only sets a pollution reduction goal, but it also lays out a comprehensive plan for restoration. DEP plans on partnering with the Doc Fritchey of Trout Unlimited as primary stakeholders to implement the plan. Funding will be sought under Section 319 of the Clean Water Act among other sources. If the restoration plan fails to result in delisting of the siltation impairments, a TMDL per section 303(d) of the Clean Water Act would be needed in the future.

Currently, there are no State or Federal in-stream numerical water quality criteria for sediment. Therefore, the Department utilized a reference watershed approach to propose an allowable load per the narrative criteria. The allowable load included allocations for natural sources, nonpoint pollution sources, as well as an uncertainty factor. Nonpoint source load allocations were made for cropland, hay/pasture land, and streambank source sectors present in the watershed. Data used in establishing the allowable load were primarily generated using a water quality analysis model (Model My Watershed) made available through the Stroud Water Research Center.

The following table shows the estimated current sediment loading within the watershed, the prescribed allowable load value, and % reductions needed under annual average conditions.

An analysis of Best Management Practice (BMP) opportunities indicated that sediment loading in the watershed could be reduced far beyond the reduction goals. Key BMPs included agricultural erosion and sedimentation plan implementation, use of precision grass filter strips along drainageways, streambank stabilization/restoration, the use of conservation tillage and the use of riparian buffers. A bonus will not be awarded to a Lottery retailer that sells a nonwinning Pennsylvania Lottery instant ticket used to enter a Pennsylvania Lottery second-chance drawing or promotion that is subsequently selected to win a prize.

11. Unclaimed prize money: For a period of 1 year from the announced close of Terrific 10s, prize money from winning Terrific 10s instant lottery game tickets will be retained by the Secretary for payment to the persons entitled thereto. If no claim is made within 1 year of the announced close of the Terrific 10s instant lottery game, the right of a ticket holder to claim the prize represented by the ticket, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided for by statute.

The Insurance Department (Department) has determined that no contributions will be required during 2021 to maintain the balance of the Workers' Compensation Security Fund (Fund).

Section 9(1) of the Workers' Compensation Security Fund Act (act) (77 P.S. § 1059(1)) states "[i]f, due to the payment of liabilities or claims, the balance of the fund is reduced below \$500,000,000, the department shall require contributions to maintain the actuarial soundness of the fund and to restore, in a timely manner, the balance of the fund to a level at or above \$500,000,000."

As of the evaluation of December 31, 2020, the balance of the Fund exceeded \$500,000,000. Therefore, insurers writing workers' compensation insurance in this Commonwealth will not be required to submit contributions to the Fund in 2021.

Jelin was issued and entered on February 9, 2021, with the Philadelphia Parking Authority's (Authority) Taxicab and Limousine Division's (TLD) Office of the Clerk.

On August 30, 2019, the Enforcement Department of the TLD of the Authority issued the following citations to Oussama Moutki (Respondent): Citation T-28737 for a violation of 52 Pa. Code § 1017.24, failure to properly activate and display meter; Citation T-28738 for a violation of 52 Pa. Code § 1021.11, rates charged other than tariff; and Citation T-28739 for a violation of 52 Pa. Code § 1021.11, discourage, prevent, refuse use of a credit card.

The complaints were served by proof-of-mail on August 30, 2019, but were returned to the TLD marked as "return to sender, attempted, moved, unable to forward."

Service of the complaints was effectuated on October 12, 2019, via publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* pursuant to 52 Pa. Code § 1001.51(e) (relating to service by the Authority). See 49 Pa.B. 6048.

Respondent did not pay the penalty amount identified on each citation or file a request for a hearing with the TLD Clerk within 15 days after the date of service as provided in 52 Pa. Code § 1005.13(b) (relating to answer to citations).

On November 9, 2019, a notice was published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* to remind Respondent of the outstanding citations; to either pay the penalties, request a hearing, or suffer a default. See 49 Pa.B. 6792.

To date, more than 15 days have expired and Respondent has failed to pay the penalties or file a request for a hearing with the TLD Clerk. Therefore, pursuant to 52 Pa. Code 1005.13(c) the complaint is sustained and a Default Order is entered against Respondent.

A penalty of \$100 is imposed on Citation T-28737, a penalty of \$500 is imposed on Citation T-28738, and a penalty of \$1,000 is imposed on Citation T-28739 along with an administration fee of \$75 for a total of \$1675.

Respondent is Ordered to pay \$1,675 by February 24, 2021.

Pursuant to 52 Pa. Code § 1001.13(b) this Order will become effective on February 24, 2021 as an adjudication of the Authority if not selected for review by the Authority.

Respondent is hereby notified to cease and desist from further violations of the Taxicab and Limousine regulations, 52 Pa. Code, §§ 1001.1 et seq.
