

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Pennsylvania Bulletin

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the official gazette of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. It is published weekly. A cumulative subject matter index is published quarterly.

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* serves several purposes. It is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, which is the official codification of agency rules and regulations, Statewide court rules, and other statutorily authorized documents. Changes in the codified text, whether by adoption, amendment, rescission, repeal or emergency action, must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

The following documents are published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*: Governor's Executive Orders; Summaries of Enacted Statutes; Statewide and Local Court Rules; Attorney General Opinions; Motor Carrier Applications before the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission; Applications and Actions before the Department of Environmental Protection; Orders of the Independent Regulatory Review Commission; and other documents authorized by law.

The text of certain documents published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the only valid and enforceable text. Courts are required to take judicial notice of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Adoption, Amendment or Repeal of Regulations

Generally an agency wishing to adopt, amend or rescind regulations must first publish in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* a Proposed Rulemaking. There are limited instances when the agency may omit the proposal step; it still must publish the adopted version.

The Proposed Rulemaking contains the full text of the change, the agency contact person, a fiscal note required by law and background for the action.

The agency then allows sufficient time for public comment before taking final action. A Final Rule-making must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* before the changes can take effect. If the agency wishes to adopt changes to the Proposed Rulemaking to enlarge the scope, it must repropose.

Citation to the Pennsylvania Bulletin

Cite material in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* by volume number, a page number and date. Example: Volume 1, *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, page 801, January 9, 1971 (short form: 1 Pa.B. 801 (January 9, 1971)).

Pennsylvania Code

The *Pennsylvania Code* is the official codification of rules and regulations issued by Commonwealth agencies, Statewide court rules and other statutorily authorized documents. The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, printing changes when they are adopted. These changes are then permanently codified by the *Pennsylvania Code Reporter*, a monthly, loose-leaf supplement.

The *Pennsylvania Code* is cited by title number and section number. Example: Title 10 *Pennsylvania Code* § 1.1 (short form: 10 Pa. Code § 1.1).

Under the *Pennsylvania Code* codification system, each regulation is assigned a unique number by title and section. Titles roughly parallel the organization of Commonwealth government.

How to Find Rules and Regulations

Search for your area of interest in the *Pennsylva*nia Code. The *Pennsylvania Code* is available at www.pacodeandbulletin.gov.

Source Notes give the history of regulations. To see if there have been recent changes not yet codified, check the List of *Pennsylvania Code* Chapters Affected in the most recent issue of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

A chronological table of the history of *Pennsylva-nia Code* sections may be found at www.legis.state.pa.us/cfdocs/legis/CH/Public/pcde_index.cfm.

A quarterly List of *Pennsylvania Code* Sections Affected lists the regulations in numerical order, followed by the citation to the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* in which the change occurred.

Court Rules in Titles 201—246 of the Pennsylvania Code

Added text in proposed and adopted court rules is printed in <u>underscored bold face</u>. Deleted text in proposed and adopted court rules is enclosed in brackets [] and printed in **bold face**.

Proposed new chapters and rules are printed in regular type to enhance readability.

Ellipses, a series of five asterisks, indicate text that is not amended.

Fiscal Notes

Section 612 of The Administrative Code of 1929 (71 P.S. § 232) requires the Governor's Budget Office to prepare a fiscal note for regulatory actions and administrative procedures of the administrative departments, boards, commissions and authorities receiving money from the State Treasury. The fiscal note states whether the action or procedure causes a loss of revenue or an increase in the cost of programs for the Commonwealth or its political subdivisions. The fiscal note is required to be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* at the same time as the change is advertised.

A fiscal note provides the following information: (1) the designation of the fund out of which the appropriation providing for expenditures under the action or procedure shall be made; (2) the probable cost for the fiscal year the program is implemented; (3) projected cost estimate of the program for each of the 5 succeeding fiscal years; (4) fiscal history of the program for which expenditures are to be made; (5) probable loss of revenue for the fiscal year of its implementation; (6) projected loss of revenue from the program for each of the 5 succeeding fiscal years; (7) line item, if any, of the General Appropriation Act or other appropriation act out of which expenditures or losses of Commonwealth funds shall occur as a result of the action or procedures; and (8) recommendation, if any, of the Secretary of the Budget and the reasons therefor.

The omission of an item indicates that the agency text of the fiscal note states that there is no information available with respect thereto. In items (3) and (6) information is set forth for the first through fifth fiscal years, following the year the program is implemented, which is stated. In item (4) information is set forth for the current and two immediately preceding years. In item (8) the recommendation, if any, made by the Secretary of the Budget is published with the fiscal note. "No fiscal impact" means no additional cost or revenue loss to the Commonwealth or its local political subdivision is intended. See 4 Pa. Code Chapter 7, Subchapter R (relating to fiscal notes).

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Information published under this part, which information includes, but is not limited to, cross references, tables of cases, notes of decisions, tables of contents, indexes, source notes, authority notes, numerical lists and codification guides, other than the actual text of rules or regulations may be reproduced only with the written consent of the [Legislative Reference] Bureau. The information which appears on the same leaf with the text of a rule or regulation, however, may be incidentally reproduced in connection with the reproduction of the rule or regulation, if the reproduction is for the private use of a subscriber and not for resale. There are no other restrictions on the reproduction of information published under this part, and the Commonwealth hereby consents to a reproduction.

Order

This Order establishes a variance from the requirement that an owner or lessee of "hayride attractions" comply with specific provisions of the Amusement Ride Inspection Act (4 P.S. §§ 401—418) ("Act") and its attendant regulations (7 Pa. Code Chapter 139).

Background

The Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture ("Department") has lawful authority to issue a variance with respect to any rule, regulation or standard prescribed by the Act and its attendant regulations. This authority is imparted at Sections 4(4) and 9 of the Act (4 P.S. §§ 404(4) and 409) and referenced in the regulation at 7 Pa. Code § 39.12 (relating to variances).

A variance may be issued: 1) to prevent undue hardship; or 2) where existing conditions prevent practical compliance and the safety of the public can be reasonably assured.

ASTM International, the organization formerly known as the American Society for Testing and Materials, develops and publishes technical standards for a wide variety of industries with the goal of enhancing performance and safety. The Department adopts the standards developed by ASTM International's committee on amusement rides and devices ("F24 Committee") as its regulatory standards with respect to amusement rides and attractions that operate in this Commonwealth. On November 1, 2019, the F24 Committee published a new standard for hayrides, designated as F3168-19, Standard Practice for Hayride Attractions ("Practice F3168-19").

The Department regulates amusement rides and attractions under strict safety standards for design, construction, maintenance, operation and inspection. Prior to the adoption of Practice F3168-19, there were no industry standards that recognized or addressed the safe operation of hayrides as an amusement ride or attraction. The F24 Committee developed the guidelines in Practice F3168-19 to provide a level of conformity to reduce potential hazards to patrons, attendants, actors and spectators. In addition, the standard was specifically designed to be inclusive of hayride attractions used primarily for entertainment, recreation and/or agritourism purposes.

Historically, hayride attractions have been difficult to vet through the Department's existing registration and approval process because the wagon/trailer and the tow vehicle of a hayride are not designed or built with the specific intent to be used as an amusement ride. The nature of this type of ride—farm equipment being used as a hayride-creates an undue hardship on owners and operators with certain requirements of the Act and its attendant regulations. For example, the regulation at 7 Pa. Code § 139.4 (relating to registration) requires the owner of an amusement ride to provide the Department written verification under seal of a professional engineer that the ride conforms with the applicable design, load and safety requirements of the Act, its attendant regulations, and the ASTM International F24 Committee Standards. The Department recognizes that many of these regulatory requirements are not appropriate or applicable

to owners and operators that use farm equipment, e.g., a wagon/trailer and tow vehicle, for both agriculture purposes and as a hayride attraction.

The Chairman of the ASTM International Hayride Standard Committee has requested this variance on behalf of Pennsylvania hayride owners in accordance with the Act. It is the belief of this office that a limited variance is appropriate with respect to the approval, registration and inspection of hayride attractions, and that the variance will not adversely affect the health or safety of the public.

In summary, the variance will allow an owner to register a hayride attraction without providing written verification from a registered professional engineer that the hayride complies with the requirements of the Act and its attendant regulations. Hayride owners shall comply with all other requirements under 7 Pa. Code § 139.4 and the terms of this variance for registration and approval of the wagon/trailer and tow vehicle.

Variance

For purposes of this Order, the definitions set forth in the Act and its attendant regulations apply. In addition, the following defined terms apply:

Agritourism—the act of conducting an activity for the enjoyment of the public that is related in some way to agriculture.

Hayride Attraction—an experience in which passengers board a wagon or trailer, typically a wagon filled with straw or hay, and are taken on a journey. The term does not include hayride attractions designed specifically for home use, devices or attractions commonly referred to as barrel trains, or animal or human drawn wagons or trailers.

Tow Vehicle—a vehicle used to pull a wagon or trailer that is conveying patrons to, through or from an attraction or over a pathway or trail.

Hayride Attraction Owner/Operator—A person that:

- 1) Owns or operates a hayride attraction that uses a tow vehicle to pull a wagon or trailer as an element or in combination with another amusement ride or attraction, corn maze, zombie walk, paintball game, tree harvesting farm, seasonal attraction, haunted house, haunted attraction, fair, exposition or agritourism event;
- 2) Has submitted the hayride attraction for approval and registration in accordance with the regulation at 7 Pa. Code § 139.4 (relating to registration), except as otherwise provided in this variance;
- 3) Has inspected the hayride attraction prior to it being open to the public and again within 30 days of each period of continued use and has submitted an inspection affidavit to the Department in accordance with the requirements of the regulation at 7 Pa. Code § 139.8 (relating to inspection affidavits);
- 4) Has complied with the design, operation, maintenance, inspection and testing standards for hayride attractions in accordance with Practice F3168-19 or any successor standard and the Department's hayride approval checklist form;
- 5) Has complied with all other requirements in the Act and the regulations at 7 Pa. Code Chapter 139 for owners, lessees and operators of amusement rides and attractions in this Commonwealth; and

6) Has otherwise complied with the terms of this variance.

A variance is hereby issued under authority of the Act. The limited terms of this variance are as follows:

- 1. Although a hayride attraction is an amusement attraction for the purposes of the Act and its attendant regulations, the owner of a hayride shall be exempt from the requirements specified in 7 Pa. Code \S 139.4(d)(7)(ii). The effect of this provision is to remove the requirement to submit written verification from a professional engineer with respect to the registration of a hayride attraction
- 2. Prior to operation, the owner of a hayride attraction shall obtain Department approval of the wagon/trailer and tow vehicle by verifying compliance with the design, operation, maintenance, inspection and testing standards in accordance with Practice F3168-19 or any successor standard and the Department's hayride approval checklist form (collectively the "hayride attraction submission"). Each approval will be granted on an annual basis and site specific.
- 3. The hayride attraction submission shall include the following:
- i. a copy of the operator's manual for the submitted attraction that identifies the mechanical, hydraulic, electronic and electrical systems of the attraction, including how the attraction is powered;
- ii. a copy of the owner's manual for the submitted attraction (if different than the operator's manual);
- iii. a detailed inspection checklist outlining areas and frequency on how the attraction is to be inspected;
- iv. photographs fully depicting the attraction, including an overall photo and a clear photo of the manufacturer's ID plate;

- v. an owner's registration form;
- vi. an amusement ride or attraction registration application form; and
 - vii. a hayride attraction approval checklist form.
- 4. The Department will provide the forms referenced in this variance upon request, and make the forms available through the Department's website at www.agriculture.pa. gov.
- 5. A person or business registering a hayride attraction may e-mail the submission to RA-amusementrides@pa.gov or send by mail to:

- 6. Except as otherwise provided in this variance, a person or business that owns, operates or leases a hayride attraction is required to comply with all registration, insurance and inspection requirements in the Act and its attendant regulations.
- 7. Inquiries regarding the registration and approval of hayride attractions may be directed to the Department's Bureau of Ride and Measurement Standards by email or phone at (717) 787-2291.
- 8. The Department will continuously monitor the efficacy of this variance and may revise or rescind this variance as it deems necessary.
 - 9. This Order shall be effective immediately.

Proposed Grant Application by the Department of Education under Part B of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act for Federal Fiscal Year 2022

Public comment is invited regarding the Department of Education's (Department) proposed grant application under Part B of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA-B) for Federal Fiscal Year 2022. The annual grant application provides, in part, assurances that the Commonwealth's policies and procedures in effect are consistent with the Federal requirements to ensure that a free appropriate public education is made available to all children with a disability from 3 years of age to 21 years of age, including children who have been suspended or expelled from school.

The public participation requirements relevant to Part B are in 34 CFR 300.165 (relating to public participation) and in section 441(b)(7) of the General Education Provisions Act (20 U.S.C.A. § 1232d(b)(7)). In accordance with these requirements, and prior to submitting a State plan, adopting any policies and procedures needed to comply with Part B, the Commonwealth must ensure reasonable opportunities for participation by local agencies, representatives of the class of individuals affected by this program and other interested institutions, organizations and individuals in the planning for and operation of the IDEA-B program. Section 76.102 of 34 CFR (relating to stateadministered programs) indicates that the IDEA-B grant application is considered a State plan.

Copies of the proposed 2022 IDEA-B grant application are available by viewing the documents at https://www. education.pa.gov/K-12/Special%20Education/IDEA/Pages/ default.aspx. The current IDEA-B policies and procedures are available for viewing at the previously listed web site. Alternative formats of the documents (for example, Braille, large print, CD) can be made available to members of the public upon request.

The Department will accept written public comment beginning March 10, 2022, until May 10, 2022. Additionally, the Department will provide individuals wishing to present verbal testimony on the proposed 2022 IDEA-B grant application an opportunity to do so. This notice provides information about persons who have applied to the Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) for a new, renewed, or amended NPDES or WQM permit, or a permit waiver for certain stormwater discharges, or have submitted a Notice of Intent (NOI) for coverage under a General Permit. The applications and NOIs concern, but are not limited to, effluent discharges from sewage treatment facilities and industrial facilities to surface waters or groundwater; stormwater discharges associated with industrial activity (industrial stormwater), construction activity (construction stormwater), and municipal separate storm sewer systems (MS4s); the application of pesticides; the operation of Concentrated Animal Feeding Operations (CAFOs); and the construction of sewage, industrial waste, and manure storage, collection and treatment facilities. This notice is provided in accordance with 25 Pa. Code Chapters 91 and 92a and 40 CFR Part 122, implementing The Clean Streams Law (35 P.S. §§ 691.1—691.1001) and the Federal Clean Water Act (33 U.S.C.A. §§ 1251—1376). More information on the types of NPDES and WQM permits that are available can be found on DEP's website (visit www.dep.pa.gov and select Businesses, Water, Bureau of Clean Water, Wastewater Management, and NPDES and WQM Permitting Programs).

Section II identifies individual NPDES permit applications received and draft permits issued by DEP relating to sewage, industrial waste, industrial stormwater, MS4s, pesticides and CAFOs. A 30-day public comment period applies to these applications, except when a site-specific water quality criterion is used to establish effluent limitations, in which case a 45-day public comment period applies. The period for comment may be extended at the discretion of the Department for one additional 15-day period. Additional information, including links to draft permits and fact sheets that explain the basis for DEP's tentative determinations may be reviewed by generating the "Applications Received with Comment Periods Report" on DEP's website at www.dep.pa.gov/CWPublicNotice. Notification of 15-day extensions for comment will be provided in the "Applications Received with Comment Periods Report" (Comments column).

Section III provides notice of applications and draft individual permits for stormwater discharges associated with construction activities. Where indicated, DEP has made tentative determinations, based on preliminary review, to issue

permits subject to proposed effluent limitations consisting of best management practices identified in the erosion and sediment control (E&S) plans and post-construction stormwater management (PCSM) plans submitted with the applications, as well as other terms and conditions based on the permit applications. A 30-day public comment period applies to these applications.

Applications and NOIs may be reviewed at the DEP office that received the application or NOI. Contact information for each DEP office for Sections I & II is listed as follows. Contact information for Section III is available within the table. Members of the public are encouraged to use DEP's website to obtain additional information as discussed previously.

Comments received within the appropriate comment periods for WQM and NPDES permit applications will be retained by DEP and considered in the final determinations regarding the applications. A comment submittal should include the name, address and telephone number of the writer and a concise statement to inform DEP of the exact basis of a comment and the relevant facts upon which it is based.

Furthermore, the person shall not be subject to citizen suits or other contribution actions brought by responsible persons not participating in the remediation.

Under Sections 304(n)(1)(ii) and 305(c)(2) of the Act, there is a 30-day public and municipal comment period for sites proposed for remediation using a site-specific standard, in whole or in part, and for sites remediated as a special industrial area. This period begins when a summary of the NOI to Remediate is published in a newspaper of general circulation in the area of the site. For the following identified site(s), proposed for remediation to a site-specific standard or as a special industrial area, the municipality, within which the site is located, may request to be involved in the development of the remediation and reuse plans for the site if the request is made within 30-days of the following specified date. During this comment period the municipality may request that the following identified person, as the remediator of the site, develop and implement a public involvement plan. MINING ACTIVITY NPDES DRAFT PERMITS

This notice provides information about applications for a new, amended or renewed NPDES permits associated with mining activity (coal or noncoal) permits. The applications concern industrial waste (mining) discharges to surface water and discharges of stormwater associated with mining activities. This notice is provided in accordance with 25 Pa. A settleable solids instantaneous maximum limit of 0.5 ml/l applies to: surface runoff (resulting from a precipitation event of less than or equal to a 10-year 24-hour event) from active mining areas; active areas disturbed by coal refuse disposal activities; mined areas backfilled and revegetated; and all other discharges and drainage (resulting from a precipitation event of greater than 1-year 24-hour to less than or equal to a 10-year 24-hour event) from coal refuse disposal piles. Similarly, modified BAT limits apply to iron, manganese and suspended solids in surface runoff, discharges and drainage resulting from these precipitation events and those of greater magnitude in accordance with 25 Pa. Code §§ 87.102, 88.92, 88.187, 88.292, 89.52 and 90.102.

Exceptions to BAT effluent limits may be applicable in accordance with 25 Pa. Code §§ 87.102, 88.92, 88.187, 88.292, 89.52 and 90.102.

Effluent Limits for Noncoal Mining Activities

The limits for noncoal mining activities as provided in 25 Pa. Code § 77.522 are pH 6 to 9 and other parameters the Department may require.

Discharges from noncoal mines located in some geologic settings (for example, in the coal fields) may require additional water quality based effluent limits. If additional effluent limits are needed for an NPDES permit associated with a noncoal mining permit, then the permit description specifies the parameters.

Additional criteria

In addition to BAT or WQBEL limits, coal and noncoal NPDES permits establish effluent limitations in the form of implemented Best Management Practices (BMPs) identified in the associated Erosion and Sedimentation Plan, the Reclamation Plan, and the NPDES permit application. These BMPs restrict the rates and quantities of associated pollutants from being discharged into surface waters of this Commonwealth.

More restrictive effluent limitations, restrictions on discharge volume, or restrictions on the extent of mining that may occur are incorporated into an NPDES permit when necessary for compliance with water quality standards and antidegradation requirements (in accordance with 25 Pa. Code Chapters 91—96).

Federal Consistency under the Coastal Zone Management Act; Philadelphia International Airport West Cargo Redevelopment

This notice is published under section 306(d)(14) of the Federal Coastal Zone Management Act of 1972 (CZMA)

(16 U.S.C.A. § 1455(d)(14)), regarding public participation in consistency determinations. The Department of Environmental Protection (Department) Coastal Resources Management Program has received notice that the Philadelphia International Airport (applicant) is proposing the West Cargo Redevelopment Project (Project) for the airport's cargo operations area.

The applicant's proposed Project is part of a multiyear, multiphased redevelopment and improvement program for the Philadelphia International Airport's (Airport) cargo operations area. The purpose of the Project is to accommodate current and forecasted cargo operation demands at the Airport and has been driven by the need for more capacity to reduce delays and enhance performance. The proposed Project includes the reconfiguration and redevelopment of the existing Cargo City area and the expansion of cargo operations into recently acquired properties at the western end of the Airport. Implementation of the Project is planned as a long-term process with five phases to occur in multiple construction periods over a 9-year to 10-year period. The proposed implementation of the full build-out of the Project plan will permanently impact a total of 15.6 acres of regulated wetlands and 11.8 acres of regulated waterways. The first major activity being proposed is the relocation of Tinicum Island Road (TIR) from its current location to enclose the newly expanded West Cargo site. The proposed shifted roadway location will provide access to the future cargo development as it progresses in its anticipated phased buildout. The proposed road will be 5,800 feet long and would consist of two 12-foot-wide travel lanes with 8-foot-wide shoulders, guiderails, associated new storm water drainage facilities, intersection improvements to 4th Avenue and Hog Island Road and the provision of a 10-foot-wide public trail along the western side of the new roadway corridor. Construction of the proposed roadway alignment would result in unavoidable permanent impacts to 2.09 acres of emergent wetlands and 0.19 acre of waters. To mitigate for the impacts, the TIR project plans include an onsite mitigation plan located within the same subwatershed and within the immediate project area to compensate for the impacts to wetlands and waters. A total of 3.61 acres of new forested wetlands would be created and a total of 0.74 acre of existing wetlands would be enhanced. To mitigate for the balance of the anticipated impacts of full, long-term development of the Project, the applicant proposes the construction of a 45-acre tidal and nontidal mitigation complex within Franklin Delano Roosevelt Park in Philadelphia, a location preferred for its similar coastal zone ecological landscape and city ownership. The mitigation project will yield a total of 28.6 acres of restored/reconstructed tidal wetlands, which will include over 6,200 linear feet of new tidal channels within a diverse intertidal zone of submergent, emergent and upper marsh with tidally influenced coastal plain forest. Approximately 15 acres would comprise wetland and upland buffer enhancements, including provisions for new public trails around the wetland complex. The applicant has applied to the United States Army Corps of Engineers for a Federal permit under section 404 of the Clean Water Act (33 U.S.C.A. § 1344).

This Project is subject to Department review for Federal consistency because it is an activity requiring a Federal license or permit and will have reasonably fore-seeable effects on this Commonwealth's coastal resources or uses.

In accordance with section 307 of the CZMA (16 U.S.C.A. § 1456) and the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) regulations at 15 CFR Part 930, Subpart D (relating to consistency for activities requiring a Federal license or permit), the applicant has certified that the proposed activity will be conducted in a manner consistent with the applicable enforceable policies of the Commonwealth's NOAA-approved Coastal Resources Management Program. Pennsylvania's Agriculture Energy Efficiency Rebate Program Extended

The Department of Environmental Protection (Department) announces the extension of the deadline for applications to Pennsylvania's Agriculture Energy Efficiency Rebate Program (Program) to June 30, 2022, and the inclusion of additional technologies eligible for a rebate under this Program to assist agricultural producers with the purchase of energy efficient equipment for farming operations.

To qualify for the rebate, the applicant must meet the definition of a normal farming operation under the act of June 10, 1982 (P.L. 454, No. 133), known as the Pennsylvania Right to Farm Law, and the application must be submitted to the Department prior to the installation of the project. Equipment purchase costs are eligible and no installation costs will be funded. The rebate will be offered on a first-come, first-served basis in the order in which they are received.

The Program will provide rebates for up to 50% of the equipment purchase cost or \$2,000 for each equipment category, whichever is less, for the technologies listed as follows. Product specifications are required to be submitted with the application. Rebates include equipment costs only and will not fund installation costs.

Eligible equipment costs under the Program include:

- Energy Efficient Lighting Systems, including LED lighting fixtures, LED bulbs and lighting controls (for example, occupancy and motion sensors).
- Energy Efficient Ventilation Systems, including ventilation fans, motors and controls (for example, variable frequency drives (VFD)).
- Energy Efficient Milk Pumping Systems, including pumps, motors and controls (for example, VFD).

Approved applicants will be issued a voucher, then install eligible equipment and submit a payment request form with required documentation to the Department to receive rebate moneys. Applicants may apply under each equipment category, all on a single application or as separate applications, one per equipment category. Only one rebate will be awarded for each technology category, per applicant. The Department will not issue more than

\$5,000 in rebate vouchers total to any one applicant. The maximum total rebate award under this Program, if an applicant applies under all three technology categories, is \$5,000.

the Commission's guidelines, a notice concerning the proposed designation or redesignation of a stream, stream section or lake under special regulations ordinarily will be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* before the matter is reviewed by the Board of Commissioners.

At the next Commission meeting on April 25 and 26, 2022, the Commission will consider taking the following actions with respect to waters subject to special fishing regulations under 58 Pa. Code Chapter 65, effective upon publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

58 Pa. Code § 65.6. Delayed harvest artificial lure only areas

The Commission will consider removing the limits to one stream section managed under the delayed harvest artificial lures only area:

State Board of Medicine Regulation # 16A-4953 (IRRC # 3324)

Registration of Naturopathic Doctors February 17, 2022

We submit for your consideration the following comments on the proposed rulemaking published in the December 18, 2021 *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. Our comments are based on criteria in Section 5.2 of the Regulatory Review Act (71 P.S. § 745.5b). Section 5.1(a) of the Regulatory Review Act (71 P.S. § 745.5a(a)) directs the State Board of Medicine (Board) to respond to all comments received from us or any other source.

1. Compliance with the provisions of the RRA or the regulations of the Commission in promulgating the regulation; Determining whether the regulation is in the public interest; and Clarity and lack of ambiguity.

This proposed rulemaking implements the Naturopathic Doctor Registration Act (NDRA) (63 P.S. §§ 272.101—272.301) by amending the Board's existing Chapter 16 and 18 (relating to State Board of Medicine—general provisions; and State Board of Medicine—practitioners other than medical doctors) by adding a new Subchapter M (relating to the registration of naturopathic doctors) to Chapter 18, including setting the fees for the initial and biennial renewal of registration.

Section 5.2 of the RRA (71 P.S. § 745.5b) directs this Commission to determine whether a regulation is in the public interest. When making this determination, the Commission considers criteria such as economic or fiscal impacts, reasonableness, and need. To make that determination, the Commission must analyze the text of the proposed rulemaking and the reasons for the new or amended language. The Commission also considers the information a promulgating agency is required to provide under Section 745.5(a) in the Regulatory Analysis Form (RAF).

The Board explains in its response to RAF # 26 that it elected to not enact any regulations which address the authorized scope of practice because the legislature did not provide a basic statutory framework to determine what does, and what does not constitute the practice of the profession. Furthermore, a review of the legislative history indicates the intent of the legislature was to enact a "title protection act, and not a true practice act." Given the Board's explanation, we would note that there are provisions of the proposal that conflict with its approach regarding the scope of practice. For instance:

- Section 18.15a(d) (relating to scope of practice of acupuncturists and practitioners of Oriental medicine) is being added to clarify that "[t]his section does not limit the scope of practice of a naturopathic doctor when recommending herbs, minerals and other supplements, or combinations, according to traditions other than Oriental medicine traditions." (Emphasis added.)
- Section 18.911(c)(8) (relating to Code of ethics), a naturopathic doctor shall "[a]ccurately inform the patient, other health care professionals and the public of the limitations of the practice of naturopathic medicine." (Emphasis added.)
- Section 18.911(d)(3) (relating to Code of ethics) states that a naturopathic doctor may not "engage in a commercial activity which conflicts with the *duties of a naturopathic doctor*." (Emphasis added.)
- Section 18.911(e) (relating to Code of ethics) reads, "[a] naturopathic doctor may not perform a service or provide a service that the naturopathic doctor is not qualified to perform, or which is beyond the scope of the naturopathic doctor's education, training, capabilities or experience." (Emphasis added.)

The Board should either eliminate any references to the scope of practice, limitations of naturopathic medicine, or duties of a naturopathic doctor in the final version of this rulemaking or explain how these provisions are consistent with the legislature's intent. Should the Board retain these provisions in the final-form regulation, it should describe how it will determine alleged violations of these particular sections. See 63 P.S. § 272.204(6)

2. Clarity and lack of ambiguity.

"Naturopathic medicine" appears in several sections of the statute and regulatory proposal. The Board notes that the NDRA omits any definition for "naturopathic medicine," but it does not explain why it did not include an interpretation of the term in the proposed regulation. Notwithstanding the Board's discussion and position regarding the scope of practice, we question how the act will be administered and enforced and whether compliance by the regulated community can be attained if there is not a common understanding of what naturopathic medicine is.

Additionally, there are several other "key terms" used throughout the rulemaking for which there are no definitions. They include: "commercial activity," "naturopathic evaluation," "naturopathic service," "naturopath or traditional naturopath," "naturopathy" "natural substances," "naturopathic plan of service," "service regimen," and "purveyors of merchandise or services." In order for this Commission to determine whether the regulation is in the public interest, it must have a complete understanding of key terms used in the rulemaking. The Board should define these essential terms in the final version of this regulation, or explain why it is unnecessary to do so and how it is in the public interest.

3. Non-regulatory language.—Clarity and lack of ambiguity; Implementation procedures.

A regulation has the full force and effect of law. We have concerns related to the use of non-regulatory language, which does not establish standards that could be predicted by the regulated community, found throughout the proposed regulation. For example:

- Section 18.911(c)(3) reads, "Adequately safeguard confidential patient information, including storage and disposal of records." (Emphasis added.)
- Section 18.911(c)(8) reads, "Accurately inform the patient, other health care professionals and the public of the limitations of the practice of naturopathic medicine." (Emphasis added.)
- Section 18.911(c)(9) reads, "Adequately assess the patient to determine if contraindications against naturopathic service exist and refer the patient to an appropriate health care practitioner." (Emphasis added.)
- Section 18.911(c)(11)(iv) reads, "Cooperate with any lawful investigation conducted by the Board, including all of the following:...Providing meaningful and timely access to relevant patient records." (Emphasis added.)
- Section 18.911(d)(1) states, "A naturopathic doctor may not: Misrepresent credentials, qualifications or affiliations, and *shall attempt to correct others* who misrepresent the naturopathic doctor's credentials, qualifications or affiliations." (Emphasis added.)

These emphasized phrases do not set binding norms and lack clarity. For that reason, consistent implementation of these provisions by the Board and compliance by the regulated community could be difficult. We ask the Board to review the final-form regulation to ensure the use of regulatory language, setting clear compliance standards for the regulated community to meet.

4. Implementation procedures and timetables for compliance by the public and private sectors.

RAF # 29 asks the promulgating agency to include a schedule for review of the regulation including the expected date of delivery of the final-form regulation, the expected effective date of the final-form regulation, and

the expected date by which compliance with the rule-making will be required. In each of these instances, the Board identified "Winter 2021-2022." The Board should amend its response to RAF # 29 to reflect an updated estimate of the timeline for the final-form regulation.

Chapter 16. State Board of Medicine— General Provisions

Subchapter B. General License, Certification and Registration Provisions

5. Section 16.13. Licensure, certification, examination and registration fees.—Clarity and Economic or fiscal impacts.

The Board proposes to add the Application for initial registration fee of \$100 and a biennial registration renewal fee of \$50 to the fee schedule. In RAF # 17, the Board states that registrants that allow their registration to lapse would be required to pay a \$100 reactivation fee. (Emphasis added.) The Board should submit a revised final-form regulation that includes the reactivation fee or explain why it is not needed.

The Board submitted a Fee Report Form for Naturopathic Doctor Initial Registration Application but did not submit Fee Report Forms for the processing of biennial renewal applications or applications for reactivation of naturopathic doctor registration. Fee Report Forms for every fee listed in this section should be included in the final rulemaking package.

Chapter 18. State Board of Medicine— Practitioners Other than Medical Doctors

(New) Subchapter M. Registration of Naturopathic Doctors

6. Section 18.903. Application for naturopathic doctor registration.—Clarity and Implementation procedures.

Section 18.904(b)(2) and (3) and Section 18.905(b)(3) and (4) require a registrant, as a condition of biennial renewal and reactivation of inactive or expired registration, to disclose on the application any authorization to practice as a naturopathic doctor in another, district, territory, possession or country and whether or not there is disciplinary action pending before or taken by the appropriate licensing, registration or certification authority in another jurisdiction since the most recent application for biennial registration, whether or not authorized to practice or advertise in that other jurisdiction. We believe these disclosures are equally relevant to the initial application for naturopathic doctor registration and should be included in Section 18.903 or explain why it is unnecessary to do so.

7. Section 18.905. Inactive status; reactivation of inactive or expired registration.—Clarity and Implementation procedures; and Economic or fiscal impacts.

Subsection (a)

This subsection provides that a naturopathic doctor may request in writing that the Board place the registration on inactive status. It states that confirmation of inactive status will be forwarded to the registrant. We ask the Board to specify when the inactive status request becomes effective. Under this subsection, a naturopathic doctor may not use the title of "naturopathic doctor" or "doctor of naturopathic medicine" or any other term implying that the individual is currently registered as a naturopathic doctor while on inactive status. The Board should revise this provision to include "or has an expired registration."

Subsection (b)

Section 18.905(b)(1) requires a registrant, in order to reactivate an inactive or expired registration, in addition to completing an application for reactivation, to pay the *current biennial registration fee* in Section 16.13 (relating to licensure, certification, examination and registration fees) and any applicable late fees required under section 225 of the Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs Fee Act (63 P.S. § 1401-225). (Emphasis added.)

As previously noted, the Board writes in RAF # 17 that only practitioners that allow their registration to lapse would be required to pay the \$100 reactivation fee. This section, however, does not address the "reactivation fee." The Board should clarify its intent regarding the fees that are to be charged to a registrant under this section and make any necessary revisions to the RAF, Preamble, and Annex to the final-form regulation for consistency with the Board's intent.

8. Section 18.907. Acceptable titles and professional designation by registrants and non-registrants; prohibited titles.—Clarity and lack of ambiguity.

Subsection (b)

Section 201 of the NDRA states: "It shall be unlawful for an individual to use the title of "naturopathic doctor" or "doctor of naturopathic medicine" unless that person is registered as a naturopathic doctor with the Board." 63 P.S. § 272.201

Several commentators, including the statewide organization representing a group of traditional naturopaths, contend that the General Assembly did not intend to "preclude the use of "N.D." by unregistered traditional naturopaths. If the General Assembly intended for the Board to regulate the use of the abbreviation "N.D.," it would have retained the language that expressly prohibits unlicensed individuals from using it. They believe the Board's proposal not only creates uncertainty among traditional naturopaths regarding the continued use of their degree but also causes public confusion. Additionally, they are concerned that it may impose a significant financial burden upon traditional naturopaths who may be required to revise signage and advertisements.

Senator Doug Mastriano requests that consideration be given for naturopathic doctors who have obtained their degrees and certifications in naturopathy from other schools not included in this proposed rulemaking. He believes that the proposal, if unamended, could be detrimental financially and professionally to the "thousands of naturopathic doctors and traditional naturopathic doctors" who have practiced for many generations. Given there is even a question concerning the intentions of the legislature in passing the NDRA and this section, he asserts, is reason enough to "pause and revisit the issue." Furthermore, he writes, "[i]t is unconscionable to restrict current naturopathic doctors of their titles and use of the term "Doctor of Naturopathy" which is their livelihood in such a manner and without cause on their part."

Senator Mastriano and a number of commentators request that the Board amend Section 18.907(b) to provide that "[a]n individual who has not registered with the

Board may claim to be, and hold oneself out as, a naturopath, a traditional naturopath, *DOCTOR OF NATUROPATHY*, *OR N.D.* and use any similar title implying that the individual practices naturopathy so long as the title does not also imply that the individual is a naturopathic doctor registered with the Board." (Emphasis added.) The Commission, in its determination of whether this rulemaking is the public interest, will review the Board's response to commentators' concerns.

9. Section 18.908. Informed consent and disclosure of financial interests.—Clarity and lack of ambiguity.

Subsection (b) reads that "[a] naturopathic doctor shall disclose to patients and prospective patients if the naturopathic doctor receives any commission, rebate, referral fee or similar financial incentive in connection with the referral of a patient to purveyors of merchandise or services, or for recommending any merchandise to a patient." § 18.908(b)

Under Section 18.911 (relating to code of ethics) a naturopathic doctor may not "engage in commercial activity which conflicts with the duties of a naturopathic doctor" or "receive remuneration from, or provide remuneration to, or split a fee, for either making or accepting a referral of the patient to or from another health care provider." §§ 18.911(d)(3) and (8)

We have three concerns. First, Section 18.908(b) requires disclosure to patients and prospective patients for behavior that is clearly prohibited under Section 18.911. Second, as mentioned previously in the discussion related to the Definitions section, the proposal is deficient in defining key terms such as "purveyors of merchandise or services," and "commercial activity." Third, the proposal is void of any specificity regarding the "duties of a naturopathic doctor." Without the benefit of clearly defined terms and professional benchmarks, how will the regulated community comply with these financial disclosure requirements and code of ethics standards? The Board should submit a final rulemaking that makes clear its intent regarding financial disclosure and that is consistent with the code of ethics standards.

10. Section 18.911. Code of Ethics.—Clarity and lack of ambiguity; and Reasonableness of requirement.

Subsection (f)

Under this subsection, "[a] naturopathic doctor may not construe any failure to specify a particular ethical, legal or professional duty in this subchapter as a denial of the existence of other ethical, legal or professional duties or responsibilities that are equally as important and generally recognized in the naturopathic medicine profession." The Board should delete this provision from the final-form regulation or explain the reasonableness of holding to account practitioners for duties and responsibilities that have not been specified. The Board should also explain how it will be enforced if it is carried over to the final version of this rulemaking.

11. Section 18.913. Grounds for discipline.—Clarity.

Subsection (a)

Section 18.913 (a)(8) authorizes the Board to impose disciplinary or corrective measures on a naturopathic doctor or applicant for registration as a naturopathic doctor for "[o]ffering, undertaking or agreeing to cure or treat a disease by a *secret* method, treatment, product or medicine." (Emphasis added.) The Board should clarify its

intent and explain the need for this provision in a revised Preamble to the final-form regulation.

Subsection (b)

The NDRA provides that "...[a] naturopathic doctor affected under this paragraph shall at reasonable intervals be afforded an opportunity to demonstrate that he can resume a competent practice of his profession with reasonable skill and safety to patients. 63 P.S. § 272.204(5)(iv). (Emphasis added.) The Board should provide a detailed description of how it will administer this provision in the final-form regulation.

12. Miscellaneous.—Clarity.

For consistency with the act, should § 18.903(b)(3) read "An applicant who graduated prior to 1986 shall demonstrate a passing score on a state naturopathic *licensure* examination?" (Emphasis added.)

The final-form regulation should be amended to consistently use the terms "initial registration" and "naturopathic service."

- 8. That Respondent by failing to display the number of the certificate of public convenience, violated 52 Pa. Code § 29.71(a). The penalty for this violation is \$50.00.
- 9. That Respondent by failing to display the number of the taxicab, violated 52 Pa. Code § 29.71(c). The penalty for this violation is \$50.00.
- 10. That Respondent, by permitting a vehicle to be operated that was not equipped with a meter violated 52 Pa. Code § 29.314(b)(1). The penalty for this violation is \$1,000.00.
- 11. That Respondent, by permitting a vehicle to be operated that did not have a dome light affixed to roof, violated 52 Pa. Code § 29.314(d). The penalty for this violation is \$250.00.

By the Authority:

The Authority is the sole regulator of all taxicab, limousine and transportation network company services in Philadelphia. The Authority is empowered to conduct rate investigations and determine the uniform rate that shall be charged by all taxicabs authorized to provide call or demand service in Philadelphia.²

On March 30, 2021, the Authority authorized the Taxicab and Limousine Division ("TLD") to reopen a rate investigation to gather information and comment concerning the petition that was filed with the TLD seeking "to allow for up-front pricing or to allow approved PPA smartphone app-based providers and Philadelphia medallion taxicabs to calculate their own fare outside of the taxicab meter but must provide passengers with binding up-front fare quote to offer passengers with the same price certainty as transportation network companies

The TLD sought written comments from the taxicab and limousine industry members and the general public. However, no comments were submitted. Upon review of all information received and investigated, the TLD submitted a recommendation to amend the taxicab tariff as outlined below.

Based upon review of all information received and recommendation of TLD staff, *Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved and Ordered* by the Board of the Authority as

Section 1. Rate Review Investigation.

- (a) The implementation of a pilot program may commence to allow for an upfront flex fare pricing model, outside of the current taxicab tariff and meter system, for medallion taxicab trips in Philadelphia that are initiated through an Authority approved taxicab smartphone application (i.e. the "Curb app") and such fares are calculated based upon an algorithm of both live and historical trip data, including metered fares, traffic and wait times.
- (b) All other rates as outlined in the current taxicab tariff shall remain unchanged.

Section 2. Action by Taxicab and Limousine Divi-

- (a) The TLD staff shall broadcast this Order to all members of the taxicab and limousine industry by email as well as posting it on the Authority's website and within TLD Headquarters along with depositing this Order with the Pennsylvania Bulletin for publishing.
- (b) The TLD shall continue to investigate and gather information concerning the upfront flex fare pricing and report its findings to the Authority no later than six months from the date of this Order to review the status of this pilot program.
