This notice is provided in accordance with 25 Pa. Code Chapters 91 and 92a and 40 CFR Part 122, implementing The Clean Streams Law (35 P.S. §§ 691.1—691.1001) and the Federal Clean Water Act (33 U.S.C.A. §§ 1251—1376). - (2) During any Non-Operating Days, the NO_x emissions for each glass furnace averaged over consecutive non-operating days may not exceed the amount calculated using the following equation: Pounds per day emission limit of NO_x = 7.0 pounds per ton of glass produced × Furnace permitted production capacity in tons of glass produced per day.
- (d) The permittee shall keep the following records, which shall be retained by the permittee for a period of five (5) years and be made available to DEP upon request:
- (1) CEMS data and calculations necessary to demonstrate compliance with the emission limitations previously listed.
- (2) Documentation of all maintenance performed on control devices.
- (3) All periods each control device was not operating while the associated furnace was operating, including:
 - (i) Start and end times of each period.
 - (ii) Explanation for the occurrence of each period.
- (iii) Calculations or data of emissions which occurred during each period.
- (e) Data or information required to determine compliance shall be recorded and maintained in a time frame consistent with the averaging period of the emissions limitation.
- (f) Records, data, and calculations necessary to demonstrate compliance with the emission limitations above, shall be provided with the facility's annual emissions report required by Section B.
- (g) As of 1/1/23 for Furnace 2, and as of 8/3/24 for Furnace 1, the permittee shall operate the glass furnace $NO_{\rm x}$ control systems whenever technologically feasible during non-operating days (as defined previously) to minimize emissions.
- (h) The permittee shall install, maintain and operate the NO_{x} control devices in accordance with the manufacturer's specifications and with good operating practices.

Similarly, modified BAT limits apply to iron, manganese and suspended solids in surface runoff, discharges and drainage resulting from these precipitation events and those of greater magnitude in accordance with 25 Pa. Code §§ 87.102, 88.92, 88.187, 88.292, 89.52 and 90.102.

Exceptions to BAT effluent limits may be applicable in accordance with 25 Pa. Code §§ 87.102, 88.92, 88.187, 88.292, 89.52 and 90.102.

Effluent Limits for Noncoal Mining Activities

The limits for noncoal mining activities as provided in 25 Pa. Code § 77.522 are pH 6 to 9 and other parameters DEP may require.

Loyalsock Creek flows south along SR 87 through Montoursville to its confluence with the West Branch of the Susquehanna River. The creek makes a button-hook bend to the west across from the Loyalsock Valley Elementary School. This meander is immediately upstream of the Lycoming College Biology Field Station (LBFS), established in 2017 with the purchase of a 116-acre farm property along PA Route 87 in Upper Fairfield Township between Horn Road and Keebler Farm Road. The farm consists of two houses, a barn, several outbuildings, agricultural fields, and riparian/upland forests. A temporary canvas field monitoring station has also been added to the property. The LBFS is used by Lycoming College's biology department for courses in aquatic biology, ecology, plant science, vertebrate and invertebrate zoology, and environmental biology. However, since acquiring this property, flooding, nutrient/sediment loading, and streambank degradation has intensified. The meander of Loyalsock Creek just upstream of the LBFS is unstable, with several different alignments visible in the historic aerial photographs (see enclosure). Most of the alterations were in the channel path before it reaches the bend at the Lycoming College facility. The recent development of a channel avulsion bisecting the LBFS has escalated the erosion and sediment and nutrient input to the river system that includes the West Branch of the Susquehanna River and ultimately the Chesapeake Bay Watershed. Currently the flow in Loyalsock Creek is split between the original channel alignment and the newly formed channel avulsion. Left unaddressed, Loyalsock Creek could, in another major flood, make the channel avulsion the primary channel, abandoning roughly 4,250 ft of original channel. LBFS is proposing to be proactive in delivering solutions that restore and stabilize the degraded streambanks, treat runoff, and reduce nutrient and sediment loading. Specifically, the CAST model shows the Loyalsock Creek Restoration Project will reduce sediment input to the stream system by 276 tons/yr, accompanied by a nutrient reduction of 167 lbs/yr of nitrogen and 151 lbs/yr of phosphorus. In addition to the reduction of sediment and nutrients input into the stream

system, the Loyalsock Creek Restoration Project will implement bank stabilization measures to reduce runoff volumes, increase infiltration, and improve water quality. The project will contribute to the implementation of the Countywide Action Plan as part of Pennsylvania's Phase 3 WIP. The project will also restore the natural floodplain to further improve water quality and wildlife habitat. The project proposes to install a bench that matches the existing banks on either side of the entrance of the channel avulsion, essentially shutting off stream flow to the avulsion channel under normal conditions. The bench will be constructed along the river left bank up to the existing bank elevation on either side of the channel avulsion. The bench will be constructed of material aggraded on the inside of the button-hook meander and fronted with an R-5 rock toe. This bench will be stabilized with the installation of hybrid log vanes along the bench and along the river left banks upstream of the bench. In anticipation of high flows that may overtop the banks and installed bench, several watershed protection BMPs will be installed along the avulsion channel to manage flood flows and minimize the erosion and sediment input during high flow events. The BMPs include the installation of hybrid log vanes on the outside of bends, log wall sills to prevent down-cutting of the banks and the formation of secondary flow paths. Channel blocks will be installed in potential avulsion channels to promote more flow over the flood plain, thus reducing the erosive energy of the flood waters. Log cribbing will be installed upstream of existing structures to route flow around the structures and minimize damage to the structures. A minimum of a 30 to 50-foot buffer will be established at the end of the project to reduce nutrient and sediment loading. The total linear feet of the channel avulsion that will be converted to flood plain is approximately 2,225 feet. The original channel length that will be preserved as the primary channel is 4,250 ft. Latitude: 41.3119°, Longitude: 76.9131°.

This response has been initiated pursuant to Sections 501(a) and 505(b) of HSCA (35 P.S. §§ 6020.501(a) and (b)). The Site is located in Douglass Township, Montgomery County, PA.

The Site consists of a landfill located at 300 Merkel Road and the surrounding area. The area primarily consists of residential properties, an apartment complex, a few commercial properties, and agricultural land. To date, six residential potable wells have been affected by per- and polyfluorinated Substances (PFAS), and one PFAS, perfluorooctanoic acid (PFOA) was detected above its Maximum Contaminant Level (MCL) in all six wells. These residents with contaminated wells are receiving or have been offered bottled water service.

To address the release and threat of release of PFAS at the Site and corresponding threats to human health, DEP installed, and will maintain for the duration of its drinking water investigation at the Site, point-of-entry treatment systems. This response complies with Applicable, Relevant and Appropriate Requirements (ARARs), is feasible, and cost-effective. Other alternatives considered were no action, and the continued delivery of bottled water.

This notice is being provided pursuant to Section 506(b) of HSCA. The Administrative Record which contains the information that forms the basis and documents the selection of this response action is available for public review and comment. The Administrative Record is lo-

the site investigation; concentration of regulated substances in environmental media; benefits of reuse of the property; and, in some circumstances, a fate and transport analysis. If required, a risk assessment report describes potential adverse effects caused by the presence of regulated substances. If required, a cleanup plan evaluates the abilities of potential remedies to achieve remedy requirements.

- (a) Key Number Match: Players can win a prize by matching any "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbol to any "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, including the play symbols within the "YOUR NUMBERS PAYDAY" spots, and can win a prize automatically by revealing a Car (CAR) symbol or a LIFE (LIFE) symbol. - (4) Holders of tickets upon which a Car (CAR) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of \$1,000 (ONE THO) appears in the "prize" area under that Car (CAR) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1,000.
- (5) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$500 (FIV HUN) appears in the "prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$500.
- (6) Holders of tickets upon which a Car (CAR) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of \$500 (FIV HUN) appears in the "prize" area under that Car (CAR) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$500.
- (7) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$200 (TWO HUN) appears in the "prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$200.
- (8) Holders of tickets upon which a Car (CAR) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of \$200 (TWO HUN) appears in the "prize" area under that Car (CAR) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$200.
- (9) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in the "prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.
- (10) Holders of tickets upon which a Car (CAR) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in the "prize" area under that Car (CAR) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.
- (11) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$50.00 (FIFTY) appears in the "prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$50.
- (12) Holders of tickets upon which a Car (CAR) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of \$50.00 (FIFTY) appears in the "prize" area under that Car (CAR) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$50.
- (13) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$40.00 (FORTY) appears in the "prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$40.

- (14) Holders of tickets upon which a Car (CAR) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of $$40^{.00}$ (FORTY) appears in the "prize" area under that Car (CAR) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$40.
- (15) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$20.00 (TWENTY) appears in the "prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$20.
- (16) Holders of tickets upon which a Car (CAR) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of $\$20^{.00}$ (TWENTY) appears in the "prize" area under that Car (CAR) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$20.
- (17) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$10.00 (TEN DOL) appears in the "prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$10.
- (18) Holders of tickets upon which a Car (CAR) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of $$10^{.00}$ (TEN DOL) appears in the "prize" area under that Car (CAR) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$10.
- (b) PAYDAY Area: Players can win each of the prizes under each of the three "YOUR NUMBERS PAYDAY" spots by revealing a Money (MONEY) symbol in the "PAYDAY" area. If the play symbol in any "YOUR NUMBERS PAYDAY" spot also matches a "WINNING NUMBER," players can win the same prize by a Key Number Match, as described in section 8(a), above.

- (10) Holders of tickets upon which a Money (MONEY) symbol appears in the "PAYDAY" area and a prize symbol of \$20.00 (TWENTY) appears in two of the "YOUR NUMBERS PAYDAY" spots and a prize symbol of \$10.00 (TEN DOL) appears in one of the "YOUR NUMBERS PAYDAY" spots, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$50.
- (11) Holders of tickets upon which a Money (MONEY) symbol appears in the "PAYDAY" area and a prize symbol of \$10.00 (TEN DOL) appears in two of the "YOUR NUMBERS PAYDAY" spots and a prize symbol of \$20.00 (TWENTY) appears in one of the "YOUR NUMBERS PAYDAY" spots, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$40.
- (12) Holders of tickets upon which a Money (MONEY) symbol appears in the "PAYDAY" area and a prize symbol of \$10^{.00} (TEN DOL) appears in all three of the "YOUR NUMBERS PAYDAY" spots, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$30.

- (iii) The entire or last four digits of the player's Social Security Number, or comparable equivalent;
 - (iv) The player's address;

- (v) The player's telephone number;
- (vi) The player's email address;
- (vii) Any other information established by the Lottery to be necessary to verify the age and identity of the player.
- (4) An individual may be required to provide additional information or documentation, as set forth in the iLottery terms and conditions, to establish a lottery account or register for iLottery. The information may be used for iLottery registration or to confirm information provided by that individual during the registration process.
- (5) To enter the Drawing, entrants must submit the identifying information from at least one Qualifying Ticket via the Drawing's promotional web site, available at https://www.palottery.com, or the Lottery's official mobile application during the entry period. The identifying information from a Qualifying Ticket may be submitted only once in the Drawing. Entries will automatically be awarded at the time of successful submission of a Qualifying Ticket. - random, will be awarded the Entry Multiplier Prize. If an entry is multiplied, the entrant will be notified during the entry process.

- (3) Lottery will conduct one Drawing from among all the entries received during the entry period as described in section 10(c)(2).
- (i) The first entry selected in the Drawing will be a winning entry and the entrant who submitted that winning entry shall be entitled to a prize of \$25,000, less required income tax withholding.
- (ii) The second and the third entries selected in the Drawing will be winning entries and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$15,000, less required income tax withholding.
- (iii) The fourth and the fifth entries selected in the Drawing will be winning entries and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$10,000, less required income tax withholding.

If a Drawing entry is selected as a winner and rejected or otherwise disqualified during or following the Drawing, the Lottery will select one entry to replace the rejected or otherwise disqualified entry in accordance with these rules and Lottery procedure.
- (3) If any discrepancy exists between these rules and any material describing the Drawing, these rules shall govern.
- (4) Employees of the Pennsylvania Lottery, 9Rooftops Marketing, LLC (formerly known as MARC USA, LLC), MUSL, Scientific Games International, Inc., MDI Entertainment, LLC, and their subcontractors, or a spouse, child, brother, sister or parent residing as a member of the same household in the principal place of residence of any such person are not eligible to participate in the Drawing. Offer void where prohibited or restricted.
- (5) The Pennsylvania Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to cancel or suspend the Drawing and change these rules if the Drawing cannot be conducted as planned due to errors in these rules or advertising, unauthorized intervention, tampering, fraud, technical errors, viruses, worms, bugs or any other cause that, in the Pennsylvania Lottery's sole judgment, could corrupt

or impair the administration, security, fairness, integrity or proper conduct of the Drawing.

- (6) All entries shall be subject to verification by the Pennsylvania Lottery.
- (7) The Pennsylvania Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to disqualify an entrant found to be tampering with the operation of the Drawing or to be acting in violation of these rules or applicable law.
- (8) The Drawing is governed by the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Applicable laws and regulations apply.
- (9) Prizes must be claimed within 1 year of the drawing date of the Drawing in which the prize was won. If no claim is made within 1 year of the drawing date of the Drawing in which the prize was won, the right of an entrant to claim the prize won, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided by statute.
