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READER'S GUIDE TO THE PENNSYLVANIA BULLETIN AND THE PENNSYLVANIA CODE

Pennsylvania Bulletin

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the official gazette of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. It is published weekly. A cumulative subject matter index is published quarterly.

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* serves several purposes. It is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, which is the official codification of agency rules and regulations, Statewide court rules, and other statutorily authorized documents. Changes in the codified text, whether by adoption, amendment, rescission, repeal or emergency action, must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

The following documents are published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*: Governor's Executive Orders; Summaries of Enacted Statutes; Statewide and Local Court Rules; Attorney General Opinions; Motor Carrier Applications before the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission; Applications and Actions before the Department of Environmental Protection; Orders of the Independent Regulatory Review Commission; and other documents authorized by law.

The text of certain documents published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the only valid and enforceable text. Courts are required to take judicial notice of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Adoption, Amendment or Repeal of Regulations

Generally an agency wishing to adopt, amend or rescind regulations must first publish in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* a Proposed Rulemaking. There are limited instances when the agency may omit the proposal step; it still must publish the adopted version.

The Proposed Rulemaking contains the full text of the change, the agency contact person, a fiscal note required by law and background for the action.

The agency then allows sufficient time for public comment before taking final action. A Final Rulemaking must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* before the changes can take effect. If the agency wishes to adopt changes to the Proposed Rulemaking to enlarge the scope, it must repropose.

Citation to the Pennsylvania Bulletin

Cite material in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* by volume number, a page number and date. Example: Volume 1, *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, page 801, January 9, 1971 (short form: 1 Pa.B. 801 (January 9, 1971)).

Pennsylvania Code

The *Pennsylvania Code* is the official codification of rules and regulations issued by Commonwealth agencies, Statewide court rules and other statutorily authorized documents. The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, printing changes when they are adopted. These changes are then permanently codified by the *Pennsylvania Code Reporter*, a monthly, loose-leaf supplement.

The *Pennsylvania Code* is cited by title number and section number. Example: Title 10 *Pennsylvania Code* § 1.1 (short form: 10 Pa. Code § 1.1).

Under the *Pennsylvania Code* codification system, each regulation is assigned a unique number by title and section. Titles roughly parallel the organization of Commonwealth government.

How to Find Rules and Regulations

Search for your area of interest in the *Pennsylvania Code*. The *Pennsylvania Code* is available at www.pacodeandbulletin.gov.

Source Notes give the history of regulations. To see if there have been recent changes not yet codified, check the List of *Pennsylvania Code* Chapters Affected in the most recent issue of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

A chronological table of the history of *Pennsylvania Code* sections may be found at www.legis.state. pa.us/cfdocs/legis/CH/Public/pcde_index.cfm.

A quarterly List of *Pennsylvania Code* Sections Affected lists the regulations in numerical order, followed by the citation to the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* in which the change occurred.

In Proposed Rulemakings and proposed Statements of Policy, existing text corresponds to the official codified text in the *Pennsylvania Code*.

Court Rules in Titles 201–246 of the Pennsylvania Code

Added text in proposed and adopted court rules is printed in <u>underscored bold face</u>. Deleted text in proposed and adopted court rules is enclosed in brackets [] and printed in **bold face**.

Proposed new chapters and rules are printed in regular type to enhance readability.

Ellipses, a series of five asterisks, indicate text that is not amended.

Fiscal Notes

Section 612 of The Administrative Code of 1929 (71 P. S. § 232) requires the Governor's Budget Office to prepare a fiscal note for regulatory actions and administrative procedures of the administrative departments, boards, commissions and authorities receiving money from the State Treasury. The fiscal note states whether the action or procedure causes a loss of revenue or an increase in the cost of programs for the Commonwealth or its political subdivisions. The fiscal note is required to be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* at the same time as the change is advertised.

A fiscal note provides the following information: (1) the designation of the fund out of which the appropriation providing for expenditures under the action or procedure shall be made; (2) the probable cost for the fiscal year the program is implemented; (3) projected cost estimate of the program for each of the 5 succeeding fiscal years; (4) fiscal history of the program for which expenditures are to be made; (5) probable loss of revenue for the fiscal year of its implementation; (6) projected loss of revenue from the program for each of the 5 succeeding fiscal years; (7) line item, if any, of the General Appropriation Act or other appropriation act out of which expenditures or losses of Commonwealth funds shall occur as a result of the action or procedures; and (8) recommendation, if any, of the Secretary of the Budget and the reasons therefor.

The omission of an item indicates that the agency text of the fiscal note states that there is no information available with respect thereto. In items (3) and (6) information is set forth for the first through fifth fiscal years, following the year the program is implemented, which is stated. In item (4) information is set forth for the current and two immediately preceding years. In item (8) the recommendation, if any, made by the Secretary of the Budget is published with the fiscal note. "No fiscal impact" means no additional cost or revenue loss to the Commonwealth or its local political subdivision is intended. See 4 Pa. Code Chapter 7, Subchapter R (relating to fiscal notes).

(This is an entirely new rule. Effective 01/01/2024)

Rule 7040. Digital Media as Evidence.

(A) "Electronic evidence" refers to media created, transmitted, or stored in digital format including, but not limited to, all documents, photographs, audio files, video files, text messages, and/or social media excerpts proposed to be submitted as evidence or exchanged in discovery which is transmitted in any form other than paper.

(B) All electronic evidence to be presented in a court proceeding or submitted into the record for the York County Court of Common Pleas shall comply with the requirements of this Rule. Any electronic evidence that does not comply with this rule will not become a part of the record of the case.

(C) When electronic evidence is used during a court proceeding, the party submitting electronic evidence shall:

(1) provide a device by which the electronic evidence may be viewed or played which shall have an output which is compatible with the technology in the courtroom; (2) be familiar with how to operate the device so that the electronic evidence can be viewed;

(3) make the electronic evidence available for use by the opposing parties during cross-examination of the same witness for which it was originally used;

(4) provide the clerk with the electronic evidence, as amended through trial, on its submitted storage device with data preserved in its native format that shall:

(a) have files formatted to a file type, whenever possible, consistent with the acceptable file types periodically published by the court. When a file type is unique or proprietary, the party must provide the appropriate codex or other software to be able to open and view the file on any computer;

(b) have individual files with each file name consistent with how the file will be referenced on the record (e.g., "Commonwealth's Exhibit 1");

(c) be provided on a secure and protected media storage device (see (D), below); and

(d) be identified with a label that shall be affixed to each storage device legibly identifying the case caption (which may be abbreviated), docket number(s), and disk number (1 of 2, etc.) if there is more than one media storage device per case. If it is impractical to affix such label directly on the media storage device, the media storage device shall be submitted in an 8 1/2" by 11"envelope which shall be labeled with all the above information.

(D) The court only accepts the media storage device and file types as periodically published by the court on its public website. The court shall periodically seek input from the York County Bar Association regarding device and file types commonly in use by practitioners. Such storage devices shall be for the exclusive use of the courts and authorized court personnel, unless otherwise ordered.

(E) The clerk shall retain electronic evidence for the same time frame as it would retain any other form of evidence.

PROPOSED RULEMAKING

STATE BOARD OF EXAMINERS IN SPEECH-LANGUAGE PATHOLOGY AND AUDIOLOGY

[49 PA. CODE CH. 45]

Licensure by Endorsement

The State Board of Examiners in Speech-Language Pathology and Audiology (Board) proposes to amend § 45.2 (relating to definitions) and add §§ 45.25 and 45.26 (relating to licensure by endorsement; and provisional endorsement license) to read as set forth in Annex A.

Effective Date

This proposed rulemaking will be effective upon publication of the final-form rulemaking in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Statutory Authority

The provisions of 63 Pa.C.S. § 3111 (relating to licensure by endorsement) require licensing boards and commissions to issue a license, certificate, registration or permit to an applicant to allow practice in this Commonwealth provided the applicant meets the following criteria: holds a current license, certificate, registration or permit from another state, territory or country whose licensing requirements are substantially equivalent to or exceed the requirements in this Commonwealth; demonstrates competency; has not committed any act that constitutes grounds for refusal, suspension or revocation of a license, certificate, registration or permit to practice that profession or occupation in this Commonwealth, unless the board or commission determines such conduct is not an impediment to granting the license, certificate, registration or permit; is in good standing and has not been disciplined by the jurisdiction that issued the license, certificate, registration or permit, unless the board or commission determines such conduct is not an impediment to granting the license, certificate, registration or permit; and the applicant pays fees, as established by regulation. Additionally, 63 Pa.C.S. § 3111 authorizes boards and commissions to issue a provisional license, certificate, registration or permit while an applicant is satisfying remaining requirements for licensure by en-dorsement, for which the Board must set by regulation the terms of expiration. Additionally, section 5 of the Speech-Language Pathologists and Audiologists Licensure Act (act) (63 P.S. § 1705) provides that the Board may adopt or revise rules and regulations consistent with the law as necessary.

The act of July 1, 2020 (P.L. 575, No. 53) added 63 Pa.C.S. § 3111 as part of the consolidation of the act of July 2, 1993 (P.L. 345, No. 48) (Act 48) (repealed) into 63 Pa.C.S. Chapter 31 (relating to powers and duties). The text of 63 Pa.C.S. § 3111 was originally added to Act 48 by the act of July 1, 2019 (P.L. 292, No. 41).

Background and Need for the Amendments

This proposed rulemaking is needed to effectuate 63 Pa.C.S. § 3111, which requires the Board to issue a license to applicants who meet the requirements for licensure by endorsement as set forth in 63 Pa.C.S. § 3111. Under 63 Pa.C.S. § 3111, the Board must determine whether standards for licensure are substantially

equivalent to or exceed those established by the Board. Additionally, 63 Pa.C.S. § 3111 requires the Board to determine the methods of competency, including completion of continuing education or experience in the profession or occupation for at least 2 of the 5 years immediately preceding the filing of the application, and must establish, by regulation, the expiration of provisional endorsement license. This proposed rulemaking sets forth the criteria for eligibility for licensure by endorsement, including the specific methods required for an applicant to demonstrate competency as well as requirements for granting a provisional endorsement license.

Section 3111 of 63 Pa.C.S. provides that the Board may establish appropriate fees for this licensure. Accordingly, the Board has determined that applicants for licensure by endorsement shall pay the fee for initial licensure in § 45.1(1) (relating to fees).

In accordance with the requirements of Executive Order 1996-1 (4 Pa. Code §§ 1.371—1.382 (relating to regulatory review and promulgation)), the Board sent an exposure draft of this proposed rulemaking to interested parties. The Pennsylvania Speech-Language Hearing Association (PSHA)—which is the State-wide professional association representing the interests of more than 8,000 audiologists, speech-language pathologists, speech, language and hearing scientists, audiology and speechlanguage pathology support personnel, and students throughout the Commonwealth—commented in support of this regulation stating that "PSHA advocates for the planned modifications," and further expressed appreciation for "crafting these regulations" and for the "efforts to improve [the] practice." No other written comments were received.

Description of the Proposed Amendments

The Board proposes to amend § 45.2 to add a definition of the term "jurisdiction" consistent with 63 Pa.C.S. § 3111. Next, the Board proposes to amend Subchapter B (relating to licensure and certification) by adding § 45.25. Proposed § 45.25 requires an applicant to satisfy seven criteria required for licensure by endorsement. The first criterion, as set forth in proposed § 45.25(a)(1), requires an applicant to provide proof of a current license, certificate, registration or permit in good standing to practice in another jurisdiction whose standards are substantially equivalent to or exceed the standards established under section 7(a) of the act (63 P.S. § 1707(a)) and §§ 45.17 and 45.20 (relating to education requirements; and supervised professional experience required for licensure as a speech-language pathologist). Proposed § 45.25(a)(1)(i)further requires an applicant to submit a copy of the current applicable law, regulation or other rule governing licensure, certification, registration or permit requirements and scope of practice in the jurisdiction that issued the license, certificate, registration or permit. Proposed § 45.25(a)(1)(iii) also requires that the copy of the applicable law, regulation or other rule include the enactment date. Additionally, because 63 Pa.C.S. § 3111 is applicable to territories and other countries that use languages other than English, where the applicable law, regulation or other rule is in a language other than English, proposed § 45.25(a)(1)(ii) requires translation of the applicable law, regulation or other rule by a professional translation service at the applicant's expense.

Proposed 45.25(a)(2) requires a demonstration of competency. Under this provision, an applicant must

provide proof of competency by demonstrating either experience in the practice of speech-language pathology or audiology, or by completion of continuing education. To demonstrate competency by experience, an applicant must show active engagement in the practice of the profession for at least 2 of the 5 years immediately preceding the filing of the application for licensure by endorsement. The experience must have been engaged in under a license, certificate, registration or permit in a substantially equivalent jurisdiction or jurisdictions. To demonstrate competency through completion of continuing education, an applicant must submit proof of completion of 20 hours of continuing education from an approved provider listed in § 45.505(d) (relating to approval of continuing education programs). The continuing educa-tion must be completed during the 24 months immediately preceding the date of the application for licensure by endorsement. The Board proposes completion of the continuing education within 24 months immediately preceding the date of the application because a 24-month limitation correlates with the Board's biennial renewal continuing education requirement.

Proposed § 45.25(a)(3) and (4) incorporate the statutory prohibitions of 63 Pa.C.S. § 3111 pertaining to conduct that would constitute grounds for refusal, suspension or revocation of a license, certificate, registration or permit to practice the profession or occupation and prior discipline by the jurisdiction that issued the license.

Proposed § 45.25(a)(5) provides for payment of an application fee, as required by 63 Pa.C.S. § 3111(a)(5). The applicable fee for licensure by endorsement under 63 Pa.C.S. § 3111 is the initial licensure fee in § 45.1.

Next, proposed § 45.25(a)(6) requires applicants to apply for licensure in accordance with Chapter 45 (relating to State Board of Examiners in Speech-Language Pathology and Audiology) in the manner and format prescribed by the Board.

Finally, proposed § 45.25(a)(7) requires completion of 3 hours of training in child abuse recognition and reporting, which is mandated continuing education under the Child Protective Services Law at 23 Pa.C.S. § 6383(b)(3)(i) (relating to education and training).

In proposed § 45.25(b), the Board may require a personal interview or additional information to assist the Board in determining eligibility and competency. When a personal interview is necessary, the applicant may request the interview to be conducted by video teleconference for good cause shown.

Consistent with 63 Pa.C.S. § 3111(a)(3) and (4), proposed § 45.25(c) authorizes the Board, in its discretion, to determine that an act prohibited under subsection (a)(3) or (4) is not an impediment to licensure by endorsement.

The Board is also proposing the addition of § 45.26. Consistent with 63 Pa.C.S. § 3111(b), proposed § 45.26 provides that the Board, in its discretion, may issue a provisional endorsement license while an applicant is satisfying remaining requirements under 63 Pa.C.S. § 3111 and proposed § 45.25. Proposed § 45.26(b) sets the expiration of a provisional endorsement license at 1 year. Additionally, upon a written request, the Board may extend the term of the license upon a showing of good cause. Proposed § 45.26(c) sets forth reasons for which a provisional endorsement license will be terminated by the Board, including when the Board denies or grants a license, the provisional endorsement licensee fails to comply with the terms of a provisional endorsement license, or upon expiration of a provisional endorsement license. Finally, proposed § 45.26(d) clarifies that while an individual may reapply for a license by endorsement under proposed § 45.25, the Board will not issue a subsequent provisional endorsement license to an applicant who previously held a provisional endorsement license that expired or was terminated.

Fiscal Impact and Paperwork Requirements

This proposed rulemaking will have no adverse fiscal impact on the Commonwealth or its political subdivisions. The costs to the Board related to processing applications for licensure by endorsement will be recouped through fees paid by applicants. Applicants who apply for licensure by endorsement will be impacted by the \$50 application fee in § 45.1(1) and may incur continuing education expenses if they choose to demonstrate competency by completing 20 hours of continuing education. Applicants must complete child abuse recognition and reporting training, as required by 23 Pa.C.S. § 6383(b)(3)(i). There are free in-person and online child abuse recognition and reporting training options available; therefore, the Board does not anticipate a negative fiscal impact for this statutorily mandated training.

Sunset Date

The Board continuously monitors the cost effectiveness of its regulations. Therefore, no sunset date has been assigned.

Regulatory Review

Under section 5(a) of the Regulatory Review Act (71 P.S. § 745.5(a)), on May 11, 2023, the Board submitted a copy of this proposed rulemaking and a copy of a Regulatory Analysis Form to the Independent Regulatory Review Commission (IRRC) and the Chairpersons of the Senate Consumer Protection and Professional Licensure Committee and the House Professional Licensure Committee. A copy of this material is available to the public upon request.

Under section 5(g) of the Regulatory Review Act, IRRC may convey comments, recommendations or objections to the proposed rulemaking within 30 days of the close of the public comment period. The comments, recommendations or objections must specify the regulatory review criteria in section 5.2 of the Regulatory Review Act (71 P.S. § 745.5b) which have not been met. The Regulatory Review Act specifies detailed procedures for review, prior to final publication of the rulemaking, by the Board, the General Assembly and the Governor.

Annex A

TITLE 49. PROFESSIONAL AND VOCATIONAL STANDARDS

PART I. DEPARTMENT OF STATE

Subpart A. PROFESSIONAL AND OCCUPATIONAL AFFAIRS

CHAPTER 45. STATE BOARD OF EXAMINERS IN SPEECH-LANGUAGE PATHOLOGY AND AUDIOLOGY

Subchapter A. GENERAL PROVISIONS

§ 45.2. Definitions.

The following words and terms, when used in this chapter, have the following meanings, unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

* * * * *

Inactive license—A license status in which the licensee notifies the Board that the licensee no longer requires an active license to practice.

Jurisdiction—A state, territory or country.

Lapsed license—A license status in which the license has not been currently renewed.

* * *

Subchapter B. LICENSURE AND CERTIFICATION

(*Editor's Note*: Sections 45.25 and 45.26 are proposed to be added and are printed in regular type to enhance readability.)

§ 45.25. Licensure by endorsement.

(a) *Requirements for issuance*. To be issued a license by endorsement under 63 Pa.C.S. § 3111 (relating to licensure by endorsement), an applicant must satisfy all of the following conditions:

(1) Have a license, certificate, registration or permit in good standing to practice speech-language pathology or audiology in another jurisdiction whose standards are substantially equivalent to or exceed those established under section 7(a) of the act (63 P.S. § 1707(a)) and §§ 45.17 and 45.20 (relating to education requirements; and supervised professional experience required for licensure as a speech-language pathologist). The following apply:

(i) An applicant must submit a copy of the current applicable law, regulation or other rule governing licensure, certification, registration or permit requirements and scope of practice in the jurisdiction that issued the license, certificate, registration or permit.

(ii) If the applicable law, regulation or other rule is in a language other than English, at the applicant's expense, the applicable law, regulation or other rule shall be translated by a professional translation service and verified to be complete and accurate.

(iii) The copy of the applicable law, regulation or other rule must include the enactment date.

(2) Demonstrate competency by one of the following:

(i) Experience in the practice of speech-language pathology or audiology by demonstrating, at a minimum, that the applicant has actively engaged in the practice of speech-language pathology or audiology under a license, certificate, registration or permit in a substantially equivalent jurisdiction, or jurisdictions, for at least 2 of the 5 years immediately preceding the date the application is filed with the Board. (ii) Completion of 20 hours of continuing education in speech-language pathology or audiology from continuing education providers listed in § 45.505(d) (relating to approval of continuing education programs) or other equivalent providers, as determined by the Board, during the 24 months immediately preceding the date the application is filed with the Board. Completion of child abuse recognition and reporting training under paragraph (7) may be attributed to the 20 hours of required continuing education.

(3) Have not committed any act that constitutes grounds for refusal, suspension or revocation of a license, certificate, registration or permit to practice speechlanguage pathology or audiology under section 10 of the act (63 P.S. § 1710) or §§ 45.102—45.104 (relating to Code of Ethics; unprofessional conduct; and fraud or deceit).

(4) Have not been disciplined by the jurisdiction that issued the license, certificate, registration or permit.

(5) Have paid the initial licensure fee as required by § 45.1(1) (relating to fees).

(6) Have applied for licensure in accordance with this chapter in the manner and format prescribed by the Board.

(7) Have completed 3 hours of training in child abuse recognition and reporting from a provider approved by the Department of Human Services as required under 23 Pa.C.S. § 6383(b)(3)(i) (relating to education and training).

(b) *Interview and additional information*. An applicant may be required to appear before the Board for a personal interview and may be required to submit additional information, including supporting documentation relating to competency and experience. The applicant may request the interview to be conducted by video teleconference for good cause shown.

(c) Prohibited acts. Notwithstanding subsection (a)(3) and (4), the Board may, in its discretion, determine that an act prohibited under section 10 of the act (63 P.S. § 1710) or §§ 45.102—45.104 or disciplinary action by a jurisdiction is not an impediment to the granting of a license by endorsement under 63 Pa.C.S. § 3111.

§ 45.26. Provisional endorsement license.

(a) Provisional endorsement license. The Board may, in its discretion, issue a provisional endorsement license to an applicant while the applicant is satisfying remaining requirements for licensure by endorsement under 63 Pa.C.S. § 3111 (relating to licensure by endorsement) and § 45.25 (relating to licensure by endorsement).

(b) Expiration of a provisional endorsement license.

(1) An individual holding a provisional endorsement license may practice for up to 1 year after issuance of the provisional endorsement license. The Board, in its discretion, may determine that an expiration date of less than 1 year is appropriate.

(2) Upon a written request and a showing of good cause, the Board may grant an extension of no longer than 1 year from the expiration date of the provisional endorsement license.

(c) *Termination of a provisional endorsement license*. A provisional endorsement license terminates if any of the following occurs:

(2) When the holder of the provisional license fails to comply with the terms of the provisional endorsement license.

(3) When the provisional endorsement license expires.

(d) *Reapplication*. An individual may reapply for licensure by endorsement under § 45.25 after expiration or termination of a provisional endorsement license. The individual may not be issued a subsequent provisional endorsement license.

Sec'y, Dep't of Envtl Prot.*, 903 F.3d 65 (3d Cir. 2018), cert. denied, 139 S. Ct. 1648, 203 L. Ed. 899 (2019) and *Cole v. Dep't. of Envtl Prot.*, 1577 C.D. 2019 WL 2420667 (Pa. Cmwlth Ct. June 15, 2021) (Pet. for Allowance of Appeal pending); *West Rockhill Twp. v. Dep't of Envtl. Prot.*, No. 1595 C.D. 2019 WL 2426014 (Pa. Cmwlth. June 15, 2021) (Pet. for Allowance of Appeal pending).

Availability of Amendments to the Office of Developmental Programs' Consolidated, Community Living, Person/Family Directed Support and Adult Autism Waivers as well as Rate Setting Methodology and Proposed Fee Schedule Rates for Select Services Funded Through the Office of Developmental Programs' Waivers

The Department of Human Services (Department) is making available for public review and comment, the Office of Developmental Programs' proposed amendments to the Consolidated, Person/Family Directed Support (P/FDS), Community Living and Adult Autism waivers, which will be effective November 1, 2023. The Department is also making available for public review and comment the rate setting methodology and proposed Fee Schedule Rates for services in the waivers that are impacted by the proposed amendments and additional Fee Schedule Rates for Needs Group 5 Residential Habilitation services and for Life Sharing Without Day services. In addition, the Department is making available for public review and comment, the Fee Schedule Rates for Community Participation Support services and for Transportation Trip services which will be in effect 6 months after the expiration of the Federal novel coronavirus (COVID-19) public health emergency.

Background

Whenever substantive changes are made to an approved waiver, the Department must submit an amendment to the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) for approval.

The Department proposes the following substantive amendments to all four waivers effective November 1, 2023:

• Increase community participation and create administrative efficiencies by removing the requirement for a variance to be requested for each individual who spends less than 25% of their time during the provision of Community Participation Support or Day Habilitation services participating in integrated community activities. Providers of Community Participation Support or Day Habilitation services will instead be required to include in their quality management plans required by 55 Pa. Code § 6100.45 (relating to quality management) provider performance improvement targets and strategies that ensure opportunities for access to the community for service locations where individuals' participation in integrated community activities is low as defined in the waivers.

• Improve quality of services provided by adding additional provider qualification standards that address financial preparedness and experience rendering services.

• Prevent individuals from losing services due to changes in Community Participation Support or Transportation Trip rates by allowing exceptions to annual service limits in the P/FDS and Adult Autism waivers.

• Increase employment of individuals by allowing Community Participation Support, Day Habilitation, Career Planning and Supported Employment services to assist individuals with contacting relevant agencies and obtaining documents needed to access employment supports and services that educate participants on the impact of employment on current benefits and adding a timeframe for when providers must complete a plan for decreasing an individual's need for Job Coaching and Support.

• Improve quality and support provider innovation through inclusion of supplemental payments for activities that promote recovery and expansion of services impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic and technology that enhance services and for staff training, credentialing and business associates programs for employment.

The Department proposes the following substantive amendments to the Consolidated, Community Living and P/FDS waivers effective November 1, 2023:

• Promote the health, wellness and safety of individuals receiving services by allowing for group Music Therapy, Art Therapy and Equine Assisted Therapy and adding a Specialty Health Assessment and Coordination service.

• Support individuals with complex needs by clarifying what must be in the risk mitigation policy for Life Sharing providers when serving individuals with a medically complex condition.

Rates

Additional Fee Schedule Rates are being added for:

• Group Music Therapy, Art Therapy and Equine Assisted Therapy services provided through the Consolidated, Community Living and P/FDS waivers.

• Needs Group 5 Residential Habilitation services provided through the Consolidated Waiver and Life Sharing Without Day services provided through the Consolidated and Community Living waivers.

The new Specialty Health Assessment and Coordination service in the Consolidated, Community Living and P/FDS waivers will be reimbursed monthly as a vendor service based on the cost that the provider charges to the general public.

In addition, on April 3, 2021, the Department provided notification at 51 Pa. B. 1907 (April 3, 2021) that it had implemented temporary increases to the Fee Schedule Rates for Community Participation Support services provided through the Consolidated, Community Living and P/FDS Waivers and Transportation Trip services provided through the Consolidated, Community Living, P/FDS and Adult Autism Waivers retroactive to January 1, 2021. The Department intended to end the temporary increases to the Fee Schedule Rates and Department-Established Fees on June 30, 2021.

On March 11, 2021, President Joe Biden signed the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) of 2021 (Pub.L. No. 117-2). Section 9817 of the ARPA provides the Commonwealth with a temporary 10 percentage point increase to the Federal medical assistance percentage for certain Medicaid expenditures for home and community-based services provided the Department maintains provider payments at a rate no less than those in place on April 1, 2021, through the end of the spending period required by section 9817. On February 26, 2022, the Department provided notification at 52 Pa.B. 1328 (February 26, 2022) that new Fee Schedule Rates for Community Participation Support services provided through the Consolidated, Community Living and P/FDS waivers will be effective 6 months after the expiration of the Federal COVID-19 public health emergency. The Department no longer intends to implement the rates for Community Participation Support services announced in the February 26, 2022, notice and will instead continue to use the rates announced in the April 3, 2021, notice.

The proposed Fee Schedule Rates discussed in this notice will also apply to the Department-Established Fees under 55 Pa. Code § 4300.115(a) (relating to Department established fees) for base-funded services managed through County programs for individuals with an intellectual disability under the Mental Health and Intellectual Disability Act of 1966 (50 P.S. §§ 4101—4704); 55 Pa. Code Chapter 4300 (relating to county mental health and intellectual disability fiscal manual); and 55 Pa. Code Chapter 6100 (relating to services for individuals with an intellectual disability or autism).

Rate Setting Methodology:

The proposed Fee Schedule Rates for Life Sharing Without Day services, Residential Habilitation Needs Group 5 and group Music Therapy, Art Therapy and Equine Assisted Therapy were developed using a marketbased approach. The process for the development of the Fee Schedule included a review of the waiver service definitions and a determination of allowable cost components which reflected costs that are reasonable, necessary and related to the service, as defined in the Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards (OMB Circular Uniform Guidance, December 26, 2014). The Department established the Fee Schedule Rates to fund services at a level sufficient to ensure access, encourage provider participation and promote provider choice, while at the same time ensuring cost effectiveness and fiscal accountability. The Fee Schedule Rates represent the maximum rates that the Department will pay for each service.

In developing the proposed Fee Schedule Rates for Life Sharing Without Day Services, Residential Habilitation Needs Group 5 and group Music Therapy, Art Therapy and Equine Assisted Therapy, the Department evaluated and used various independent data sources, such as a Commonwealth-specific compensation study, to ensure the rates reflect the expected expenses for the delivery services.

As required by 55 Pa. Code § 6100.571(b) (relating to fee schedule rates), to establish the Fee Schedule Rates the Department examined and used data relating to the following factors:

- The service needs of the individuals.
- Staff wages.
- Staff-related expenses.
- Productivity.
- Occupancy.
- Program and administration-related expenses.

• Geographic costs based on the location where the service is provided.

• Service definitions in the Consolidated, Community Living and P/FDS waivers and determinations made about allowable cost components that reflect reasonable and necessary costs related to the delivery of each service.

• Cost of implementing applicable Federal and State statutes and regulations and local ordinances.

The Department also used the previously-described methodology to determine that the rates for Community Participation Support and Transportation Trip services implemented January 1, 2021, continue to reflect the expected expenses for the delivery of Community Participation Support and Transportation Trip services. Therefore, the Department intends to continue to use the Fee Schedule Rates for Community Participation Support and Transportation Trip services implemented on January 1, 2021.

The proposed Fee Schedule Rates, which are also the proposed Department-Established Fees under 55 Pa. Code § 4300.115(a), for each service are included in the following tables. In accordance with 55 Pa. Code § 1150.61(a) (relating to guidelines for fee schedule changes), the Department of Human Services (Department) announces the addition of procedure codes G0312 and G0315 to the Medical Assistance (MA) Program Fee Schedule for Early and Periodic Screening, Diagnostic and Treatment (EPSDT) and novel coronavirus (COVID-19) vaccine counseling only visits, respectively, when provided to MA beneficiaries under 21 years of age or their parent or caregiver, or both, and no EPSDT pediatric vaccine or SARS-CoV-2 vaccine, respectively, is administered.

Background

The Department added procedure code 99401 with the U1 modifier to the MA Program Fee Schedule on September 20, 2022, to bill for EPSDT vaccine counseling only visits provided to MA beneficiaries under 21 years of age or their parent or caregiver, or both, that receive counseling about any pediatric vaccine covered under the EPSDT benefit, but no pediatric vaccine is administered.

The Department added procedure code 99401 with the U2 modifier to the MA Program Fee Schedule on September 23, 2022, to bill for COVID-19 vaccine counseling only visits provided to MA beneficiaries under 21 years of age or their parent or caregiver, or both, when a SARS-CoV-2 vaccine is not administered.

The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services developed new procedures, G0312 and G0315, to bill for EPSDT and COVID-19 vaccine counseling only visits, respectively, for MA beneficiaries under 21 years of age. Although states are not required to utilize these procedure codes, the Department is adding them to the MA Program Fee Schedule.

The Department is adding the following procedure codes, procedure code descriptions and MA fees to the MA Program Fee Schedule, effective with dates of service on and after June 12, 2023:

Effective with dates of service on and after June 11, 2023, the MA Program is end-dating procedure code 99401 with the U1 modifier for the provision of vaccine counseling only visits to MA beneficiaries under 21 years of age for pediatric vaccine provided through the EPSDT benefit when no pediatric vaccines are administered.

Additionally, effective with dates of service on and after June 11, 2023, the MA Program is end-dating procedure code 99401 with the U2 modifier for the provision of COVID-19 vaccine counseling only visits for beneficiaries under 21 years of age when a SARS-CoV-2 vaccine is administered.

The MA Program Fee Schedule has been updated to reflect these changes.
