READER'S GUIDE TO THE PENNSYLVANIA BULLETIN AND THE PENNSYLVANIA CODE

Pennsylvania Bulletin

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the official gazette of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. It is published weekly. A cumulative subject matter index is published quarterly.

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* serves several purposes. It is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, which is the official codification of agency rules and regulations, Statewide court rules, and other statutorily authorized documents. Changes in the codified text, whether by adoption, amendment, rescission, repeal or emergency action, must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

The following documents are published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*: Governor's Executive Orders; Summaries of Enacted Statutes; Statewide and Local Court Rules; Attorney General Opinions; Motor Carrier Applications before the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission; Applications and Actions before the Department of Environmental Protection; Orders of the Independent Regulatory Review Commission; and other documents authorized by law.

The text of certain documents published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the only valid and enforceable text. Courts are required to take judicial notice of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Adoption, Amendment or Repeal of Regulations

Generally an agency wishing to adopt, amend or rescind regulations must first publish in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* a Proposed Rulemaking. There are limited instances when the agency may omit the proposal step; it still must publish the adopted version.

The Proposed Rulemaking contains the full text of the change, the agency contact person, a fiscal note required by law and background for the action.

The agency then allows sufficient time for public comment before taking final action. A Final Rulemaking must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* before the changes can take effect. If the agency wishes to adopt changes to the Proposed Rulemaking to enlarge the scope, it must repropose.

Citation to the Pennsylvania Bulletin

Cite material in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* by volume number, a page number and date. Example: Volume 1, *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, page 801, January 9, 1971 (short form: 1 Pa.B. 801 (January 9, 1971)).

Pennsylvania Code

The *Pennsylvania Code* is the official codification of rules and regulations issued by Commonwealth agencies, Statewide court rules and other statutorily authorized documents. The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, printing changes when they are adopted. These changes are then permanently codified by the *Pennsylvania Code Reporter*, a monthly, loose-leaf supplement.

The *Pennsylvania Code* is cited by title number and section number. Example: Title 10 *Pennsylvania Code* § 1.1 (short form: 10 Pa. Code § 1.1).

Under the *Pennsylvania Code* codification system, each regulation is assigned a unique number by title and section. Titles roughly parallel the organization of Commonwealth government.

How to Find Rules and Regulations

Search for your area of interest in the *Pennsylvania Code*. The *Pennsylvania Code* is available at www.pacodeandbulletin.gov.

Source Notes give the history of regulations. To see if there have been recent changes not yet codified, check the List of *Pennsylvania Code* Chapters Affected in the most recent issue of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

A chronological table of the history of *Pennsylvania Code* sections may be found at www.legis.state.pa.us/cfdocs/legis/CH/Public/pcde_index.cfm.

A quarterly List of *Pennsylvania Code* Sections Affected lists the regulations in numerical order, followed by the citation to the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* in which the change occurred.

In Proposed Rulemakings and proposed Statements of Policy, existing text corresponds to the official codified text in the *Pennsylvania Code*.

Court Rules in Titles 201—246 of the Pennsylvania Code

Added text in proposed and adopted court rules is printed in **underscored bold face**. Deleted text in proposed and adopted court rules is enclosed in brackets [] and printed in **bold face**.

Proposed new chapters and rules are printed in regular type to enhance readability.

Ellipses, a series of five asterisks, indicate text that is not amended.

Fiscal Notes

Section 612 of The Administrative Code of 1929 (71 P. S. § 232) requires the Governor's Budget Office to prepare a fiscal note for regulatory actions and administrative procedures of the administrative departments, boards, commissions and authorities receiving money from the State Treasury. The fiscal note states whether the action or procedure causes a loss of revenue or an increase in the cost of programs for the Commonwealth or its political subdivisions. The fiscal note is required to be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* at the same time as the change is advertised.

A fiscal note provides the following information: (1) the designation of the fund out of which the appropriation providing for expenditures under the action or procedure shall be made; (2) the probable cost for the fiscal year the program is implemented; (3) projected cost estimate of the program for each of the 5 succeeding fiscal years; (4) fiscal history of the program for which expenditures are to be made; (5) probable loss of revenue for the fiscal year of its implementation; (6) projected loss of revenue from the program for each of the 5 succeeding fiscal years; (7) line item, if any, of the General Appropriation Act or other appropriation act out of which expenditures or losses of Commonwealth funds shall occur as a result of the action or procedures; and (8) recommendation, if any, of the Secretary of the Budget and the reasons therefor.

The omission of an item indicates that the agency text of the fiscal note states that there is no information available with respect thereto. In items (3) and (6) information is set forth for the first through fifth fiscal years, following the year the program is implemented, which is stated. In item (4) information is set forth for the current and two immediately preceding years. In item (8) the recommendation, if any, made by the Secretary of the Budget is published with the fiscal note. "No fiscal impact" means no additional cost or revenue loss to the Commonwealth or its local political subdivision is intended. See 4 Pa. Code Chapter 7, Subchapter R (relating to fiscal notes).

RULES AND REGULATIONS

Title 58—RECREATION

FISH AND BOAT COMMISSION

[58 PA. CODE CH. 93]

Boating; Boat Registration and Numbering

The Fish and Boat Commission (Commission) amends Chapter 93 (relating to boat registration and numbering). The Commission is publishing this final-form rulemaking under the authority of 30 Pa.C.S. (relating to Fish and Boat Code) (code). The amendments update the Commission's regulations pertaining to registration and titling of boats.

A. Effective Date

This final-form rulemaking will go into effect upon publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

B. Contact Person

C. Statutory Authority

The amendment to § 93.1 (relating to registration) is published under the statutory authority of section 5308 of the code (relating to period of registration). The amendment to § 93.5 (relating to display of registration number and validation decal) is published under the statutory authority of section 5122 of the code (relating to registrations, licenses, permits, plates and statistics).

D. Purpose and Background

The specific purpose and background of the amendments are described in more detail under the summary of changes.

E. Summary of Changes

The act of June 27, 2022 (P.L. 386, No. 28) (Act 28), amended section 5308 of the code regarding registration and titling of boats. Act 28 established a calendar-year boat registration cycle that is valid from January 1 through December 31.

Act 28 requires the Commission to promulgate final regulations to implement the amendments and publish them in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* within 18 months of the effective date of section 2 of Act 28. The Commission has identified two relevant sections of 58 Pa. Code (relating to recreation) that require amendments to be consistent with Act 28.

Additionally, the Commission has identified language in § 93.1(a) relating to "State Owned" boat registrations which is inconsistent with the statutory registration period and Commission practices. "State Owned" boats are issued 2-year registration certificates.

The Commission amends §§ 93.1 and 93.5 to read as set forth at 53 Pa.B. 1679 (March 25, 2023).

F. Paperwork

This final-form rulemaking will not increase paperwork and will not create new paperwork requirements.

G. Fiscal Impact

This final-form rulemaking will have no adverse fiscal impact on the Commonwealth or its political subdivisions.

H. Public Comments

A notice of proposed rulemaking was published at 53 Pa.B. 1679. The Commission did not receive any public comments regarding the proposal.

Findings

The Commission finds that:

(1) Public notice of intention to adopt the amendment adopted by this order has been given under sections 201 and 202 of the act of July 31, 1968 (P.L. 769, No. 240) (45 P.S. §§ 1201 and 1202), referred to as the Commonwealth Documents Law, and the regulations promulgated thereunder, 1 Pa. Code §§ 7.1 and 7.2 (relating to notice of proposed rulemaking required; and adoption of regulations).

(2) A public comment period was provided and no public comments were received.

(3) The adoption of the amendment of the Commission in the manner provided in this order is necessary and appropriate for administration and enforcement of the authorizing statutes.

Order

The Commission, acting under the authorizing statutes, orders that:

(A) The regulations of the Commission, 58 Pa. Code Chapter 93, are amended by amending §§ 93.1 and 93.5 to read as set forth at 53 Pa.B. 1679.

(B) The Executive Director will submit this order and 53 Pa.B. 1679 to the Office of Attorney General for approval as to legality and form as required by law.

(C) The Executive Director shall certify this order and 53 Pa.B. 1679 and deposit them with the Legislative Reference Bureau as required by law.

(D) This order shall take effect upon publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Title 58—RECREATION

FISH AND BOAT COMMISSION

[58 PA. CODE CH. 93]

Boating; Boat Registration and Numbering

The Fish and Boat Commission (Commission) amends Chapter 93 (relating to boat registration and numbering). The Commission is publishing this final-form rulemaking under the authority of 30 Pa.C.S. (relating to Fish and Boat Code) (code). The amendment updates the Commis-

sion's regulations pertaining to the boat registration process and simplifies it to provide better customer service.

A. *Effective Date*

This final-form rulemaking will go into effect upon publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

B. *Contact Person*

C. *Statutory Authority*

This amendment to § 93.3 (relating to application for boat registration) is published under the statutory authority of section 5122 of the code (relating to registrations, licenses, permits, plates and statistics).

D. *Purpose and Background*

The specific purpose and background of the amendment is described in more detail under the summary of changes.

E. *Summary of Changes*

The Commission's regulations indicate the required documentation to support an application for boat registration. For boats previously registered, the Commission requires the last registered owner to sign the REV-336 Application for Pennsylvania Boat Registration and/or Boat Title. A bill of sale, signed by the last registered owner, may be substituted for the required signature on the REV-336. The Commission finds that a certificate of registration, also known as a boat registration card, signed by the last registered owner, is also sufficient documentation of ownership and consent to transfer registration to the purchaser of the boat. The addition of this documentation to Commission regulations is intended to simplify the boat registration process and provide better customer service.

The Commission amends § 93.3 to read as set forth at 53 Pa.B. 1176 (March 4, 2023).

F. *Paperwork*

This final-form rulemaking will not increase paperwork and will not create new paperwork requirements.

G. *Fiscal Impact*

This final-form rulemaking will have no adverse fiscal impact on the Commonwealth or its political subdivisions.

H. *Public Comments*

A notice of proposed rulemaking was published at 53 Pa.B. 1176. The Commission did not receive any public comments regarding the proposal.

Findings

The Commission finds that:

(1) Public notice of intention to adopt the amendment adopted by this order has been given under sections 201 and 202 of the act of July 31, 1968 (P.L. 769, No. 240) (45 P.S. §§ 1201 and 1202), referred to as the Commonwealth Documents Law, and the regulations promulgated thereunder, 1 Pa. The DEP may approve or disapprove plans and reports submitted. This notice provides DEP's decision and, if relevant, the basis for disapproval.

Updates to Pediatric Shift Care Services for Beneficiaries under 21 Years of Age

In accordance with 55 Pa. Code § 1150.61(a) (relating to guidelines for fee schedule changes), the Department of

Human Services (Department) announces the following changes to the Medical Assistance (MA) Program Fee Schedule for the provision of pediatric home health aide services provided through home health agencies rendered to MA beneficiaries under 21 years of age.

Background

On February 3, 2023, the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) provided guidance that personal care services provided by a qualified parent or other legally responsible relative (LRR) under the home health benefit, as described in 42 CFR 440.70 (relating to home health services), is allowable if the parent or LRR meets the Federal and State requirements for the provision of those services. In response to CMS' guidance, the Department will cover personal care services provided to MA beneficiaries under 21 years of age under the home health services benefit effective with dates of service on and after October 1, 2023.

To facilitate this change, the Department is adding modifiers to procedure code G0156 to the MA Program Fee Schedule, effective October 1, 2023. Procedure code G0156 with modifier U7 is for pediatric home health aide services by a non-LRR and procedure code G0156 with modifiers U7 and SC is for pediatric home health aide services by a LRR.

Additionally, the Department is end-dating personal care services procedure codes S9122 and T1019, effective September 30, 2023.

New Procedure Code Modifiers

The Department is adding the following modifiers to procedure code G0156 to the MA Program Fee Schedule for the coverage of pediatric home health aide services, effective October 1, 2023.

Procedure code G0156 will require prior authorization, as authorized under section 443.6(b)(7) of the Human Services Code (62 P.S. § 443.6(b)(7)), regarding reimbursement of certain medical assistance items and services.

Providers that received authorizations for procedure codes S9122 or T1019 before October 1, 2023, will con-

tinue to use those procedure codes for dates of service through September 30, 2023. The Department will manually adjust those prior authorization requests with new coding and modifiers for dates of service on and after October 1, 2023.

Providers requesting pediatric home health aide services for dates of service beginning on or after October 1, 2023, must use procedure code G0156 and the appropriate modifiers in their submitted requests.

(v) Holders of tickets upon which a Witch Hat (WINALL) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of \$15⁰⁰ (FIFTEEN) appears in four of the "Prize" areas and a prize symbol of \$5⁰⁰ (FIV DOL) appears in eight of the "Prize" areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.

(w) Holders of tickets upon which a Witch Hat (WINALL) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of \$10⁰⁰ (TEN DOL) appears in eight of the "Prize" areas and a prize symbol of \$5⁰⁰ (FIV DOL) appears in four of the "Prize" areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.

(x) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$15⁰⁰ (FIFTEEN) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, and upon which a 5X (5TIMES) symbol appears in the "MOON MULTIPLIER" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$75.

(y) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING

NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$50^{.00} (FIFTY) appears in the “Prize” area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$50.

(z) Holders of tickets upon which a Broom (WIN50) symbol appears in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area and a prize symbol of \$50^{.00} (FIFTY) appears in the “Prize” area under that Broom (WIN50) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$50.

(aa) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$10^{.00} (TEN DOL) appears in the “Prize” area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, and upon which a 5X (5TIMES) symbol appears in the “MOON MULTIPLIER” area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$50.

(bb) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$25^{.00} (TWY FIV) appears in the “Prize” area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$25.

(cc) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$5^{.00}

(FIV DOL) appears in the “Prize” area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, and upon which a 5X (5TIMES) symbol appears in the “MOON MULTIPLIER” area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$25.

(dd) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$15^{.00} (FIFTEEN) appears in the “Prize” area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$15.

(ee) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$10^{.00} (TEN DOL) appears in the “Prize” area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$10.

(ff) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$5^{.00} (FIV DOL) appears in the “Prize” area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$5.

(iii) The entire or last four digits of the player's Social Security Number, or comparable equivalent;

(iv) The player's address;

(v) The player's telephone number;

(vi) The player's email address;

(vii) Any other information established by the Lottery to be necessary to verify the age and identity of the player.

(4) An individual may be required to provide additional information or documentation, as set forth in the iLottery terms and conditions, to establish a lottery account or register for iLottery. The information may be used for iLottery registration or to confirm information provided by that individual during the registration process.

(5) To enter the Drawing, entrants must submit the identifying information from at least one Qualifying Ticket via the Drawing's promotional web site, available at <https://www.palottery.com>, or the Lottery's official mobile application during the entry period. The identifying information from a Qualifying Ticket may be submitted only once in the Drawing. Entries will automatically be awarded at the time of successful submission of a Qualifying Ticket. No other method of submission will be accepted, and entries submitted using any other method, including entries mailed or hand-delivered to the Pennsylvania Lottery, are not valid and will be disqualified.

(c) *Drawing description:*

(3) The entry period for the Drawing will be posted to the Pennsylvania Lottery's publicly accessible web site.

(4) The number of entries an entrant will receive for the Drawing is determined by the purchase price of the Qualifying Ticket entered. The purchase price and corresponding number of entries for the Qualifying Ticket is as follows: PA-1655 Make Me Witch (\$5) = five entries, PA-1656 Spooky Season (\$2) = two entries and PA-1657 Monster Multiplier (\$1) = one entry.

(5) Players may review prizes won and their entries for the Drawing via the Drawing's promotional web site.

(d) *Prizes available to be won, determination of winners and odds of winning:*

(1) The prize entitlements described below are subject to all restrictions and limitations described in section 10(e), or those mentioned anywhere else in these rules.

(2) Lottery will conduct one Drawing from among all the entries received during the entry period as described in section 10(c)(2).

(i) The first through the third entries selected in the Drawing will be winning entries and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$30,000, less required income tax withholding.

(iii) The twelfth through the twenty-eighth entries selected in the Drawing will be winning entries and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$1,300.

(iv) The twenty-ninth through the seventy-eighth entries selected in the Drawing will be winning entries and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$100 iLottery Bonus Money.

The Lottery is not responsible for entries that are not entered into the Drawing because of incompatible internet browsers, mobile Lottery application failure or other technical issues. The Lottery is not responsible for entries not entered due to delays in creating a lottery account or the inability to create a lottery account. If a Drawing entry is selected as a winner and rejected or otherwise disqualified during or following the Drawing, the Lottery will select one entry to replace the rejected or otherwise disqualified entry in accordance with these rules and Lottery procedure.

(3) If any discrepancy exists between these rules and any material describing the Drawing, these rules shall govern.

(4) Employees of the Pennsylvania Lottery, 9Rooftops Marketing, LLC (formerly known as MARC USA, LLC), MUSL, Scientific Games International, Inc., MDI Entertainment, LLC, and their subcontractors, or a spouse,

child, brother, sister or parent residing as a member of the same household in the principal place of residence of any such person are not eligible to participate in the Drawing. Offer void where prohibited or restricted.

(5) The Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to cancel or suspend the Drawing and change these rules if the Drawing cannot be conducted as planned due to errors in these rules or advertising, unauthorized intervention, tampering, fraud, technical errors, viruses, worms, bugs or any other cause that, in the Lottery's sole judgment, could corrupt or impair the administration, security, fairness, integrity or proper conduct of the Drawing.

(6) All entries shall be subject to verification by the Pennsylvania Lottery.

(7) The Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to disqualify an entrant found to be tampering with the operation of the Drawing or to be acting in violation of these rules or applicable law.

(8) The Drawing is governed by the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Applicable laws and regulations apply.

(9) Prizes must be claimed within 1 year of the drawing date of the Drawing in which the prize was won. If no claim is made within 1 year of the drawing date of the Drawing in which the prize was won, the right of an entrant to claim the prize won, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided by statute.

(10) Final determination of winners will be made by the Secretary, whose judgment will be final and binding.

(11) A prize awarded in the Drawing to a person who dies before receiving the prize shall be paid according to 61 Pa. Code § 811.16 (relating to prizes payable after death of a prize winner).

(12) A winner is responsible for all taxes arising from or in connection with any prize won.

(13) A player may only win the prize for which the player is first selected in the Drawing. Subsequent entries, from the same individual, selected in the same Drawing will be disqualified and one replacement entry will be selected.

(14) Winners of iLottery Bonus Money must abide by the iLottery terms and conditions, the iLottery Bonus Policy and these rules. iLottery Bonus Money will expire 90 days from the date on which the winner was notified, via email, of the prize win, as further detailed in section 10(d)(4). iLottery Bonus Money has a five times play through requirement in order to convert the iLottery Bonus Money into cash. 11. *Retailer incentive awards:* The Lottery may conduct a separate Retailer Incentive Program for retailers who sell Make Me Witch instant lottery game tickets.

12. *Retailer bonus:* The Lottery may offer a retailer bonus in connection with the sale of Pennsylvania instant lottery game tickets. If a retailer bonus is offered, a Lottery retailer shall be eligible for a bonus as described in this section. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket

that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$100,000 and not exceeding \$500,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$500. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$500,001 and not exceeding \$1,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$5,000. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$1,000,001 and not exceeding \$10,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$10,000. A Lottery retailer is entitled only to the largest bonus for which they qualify on a winning ticket. A bonus will be initiated for payment after the instant ticket is claimed and validated. A bonus will not be awarded to a Lottery retailer that sells a non-winning Pennsylvania Lottery instant ticket used to enter a Pennsylvania Lottery second-chance drawing or promotion that is subsequently selected to win a prize.

13. *Unclaimed prize money:* For a period of 1 year from the announced close of Make Me Witch, prize money from winning Make Me Witch instant lottery game tickets will be retained by the Secretary for payment to the persons entitled thereto. If no claim is made within 1 year of the announced close of the Make Me Witch instant lottery game, the right of a ticket holder to claim the prize represented by the ticket, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided for by statute.

14. *Governing law:* In purchasing a ticket, the customer agrees to comply with and abide by the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314), 61 Pa. Code Part V (relating to State Lotteries) and the provisions contained in this notice.

15. *Termination of the game:* The Secretary may announce a termination date, after which no further tickets from this game may be sold. The announcement will be disseminated through media used to advertise or promote Make Me Witch or through normal communications methods.

Under the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314) and 61 Pa. Code § 819.203 (relating to notice of instant game rules), the Secretary of Revenue hereby provides public notice of the rules for the following instant lottery game:

1. *Name:* The name of the game is Pennsylvania Monster Multiplier ("Monster Multiplier"). The game number is PA-1657.

2. *Price:* The price of a Monster Multiplier instant lottery game ticket is \$1.

3. *Play symbols:* Each Monster Multiplier instant lottery game ticket will contain one play area and a "MONSTER MULTIPLIER" area. The play symbols and their captions, located in the play area, are: Pumpkin

(PUMKIN) symbol, Ghost (GHOST) symbol, Scary Monster (SCARY) symbol, Blob Monster (BLOB) symbol, Viper Monster (VIPER) symbol, Bug Eyes Monster (BUGEYES) symbol, Groovy Monster (GROOVY) symbol, Bat (BAT) symbol, Smiling Pumpkin (SMILE) symbol, Scared Pumpkin (SCARED) symbol, Winking Pumpkin (WINK) symbol, Toothy Monster (TOOTHY) symbol, Spike Monster (SPIKE) symbol, Bigmouth Monster (BIGMOUTH) symbol, Spotted Monster (SPOTS) symbol, Witch Hat (HAT) symbol, Shy Pumpkin (SHY) symbol and a Monster (MONEY) symbol. The play symbols and their captions, located in the "MONSTER MULTIPLIER" area, are: 1X (NOMULT) symbol, 2X (2TIMES) symbol, 3X (3TIMES) symbol, 5X (5TIMES) symbol, 10X (10TIMES) symbol and a 20X (20TIMES) symbol.

4. *Prize Symbols:* The prize symbols and their captions, located in the play area, are: FREE (TICKET), \$1^{.00} (ONE DOL), \$2^{.00} (TWO DOL), \$3^{.00} (THR DOL), \$5^{.00} (FIV DOL), \$10^{.00} (TEN DOL), \$20^{.00} (TWENTY), \$30^{.00} (THIRTY), \$100 (ONE HUN), \$200 (TWO HUN) and \$1,300 (THRTNHUN).

5. *Prizes:* The prizes that can be won in this game are: Free \$1 Ticket, \$1, \$2, \$3, \$5, \$10, \$20, \$30, \$100, \$200, and \$1,300. Monster Multiplier contains a feature that can multiply the prize won. For a complete list of prizes, and how those prizes can be won, see section 9 (relating to number and description of prizes and approximate odds). A player can win up to five times on a ticket.

6. *Approximate number of tickets printed for the game:* Approximately 5,400,000 tickets will be printed for the Monster Multiplier instant lottery game.

7. *Second-Chance Drawing:* The Pennsylvania Lottery will conduct one SPOOK-TACULAR Second-Chance Drawing for which non-winning Monster Multiplier instant lottery game tickets may be eligible as provided for in section 10.

8. *Determination of prize winners:*

(a) Holders of tickets upon which a Monster (MONEY) symbol appears in the play area and a prize symbol of \$1,300 (THRTNHUN) appears in the "prize" area under that Monster (MONEY) symbol, and upon which a 1X (NOMULT) symbol appears in the "MONSTER MULTIPLIER" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1,300.

(b) Holders of tickets upon which a Monster (MONEY) symbol appears in the play area and a prize symbol of \$200 (TWO HUN) appears in the "prize" area under that Monster (MONEY) symbol, and upon which a 1X (NOMULT) symbol appears in the "MONSTER MULTIPLIER" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$200.

(c) Holders of tickets upon which a Monster (MONEY) symbol appears in the play area and a prize symbol of \$10^{.00} (TEN DOL) appears in the "prize" area under that Monster (MONEY) symbol, and upon which a 20X (20TIMES) symbol appears in the "MONSTER MULTIPLIER" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$200.

(d) Holders of tickets upon which a Monster (MONEY) symbol appears in the play area and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in the "prize" area under that Monster (MONEY) symbol, and upon which a 1X (NOMULT) symbol appears in the "MONSTER MULTIPLIER" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.

(e) Holders of tickets upon which a Monster (MONEY) symbol appears in the play area and a prize symbol of \$10^{.00} (TEN DOL) appears in the "prize" area under that Monster (MONEY) symbol, and upon which a 10X (10TIMES) symbol appears in the "MONSTER MULTIPLIER" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.

(f) Holders of tickets upon which a Monster (MONEY) symbol appears in the play area and a prize symbol of \$5^{.00} (FIV DOL) appears in the "prize" area under that Monster (MONEY) symbol, and upon which a 20X (20TIMES) symbol appears in the "MONSTER MULTIPLIER" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.

(g) Holders of tickets upon which a Monster (MONEY) symbol appears in the play area and a prize symbol of \$30^{.00} (THIRTY) appears in the "prize" area under that Monster (MONEY) symbol, and upon which a 1X (NOMULT) symbol appears in the "MONSTER MULTIPLIER" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$30.

(h) Holders of tickets upon which a Monster (MONEY) symbol appears in the play area and a prize symbol of \$10^{.00} (TEN DOL) appears in the "prize" area under that Monster (MONEY) symbol, and upon which a 3X (3TIMES) symbol appears in the "MONSTER MULTIPLIER" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$30.

(i) Holders of tickets upon which a Monster (MONEY) symbol appears in the play area and a prize symbol of \$20^{.00} (TWENTY) appears in the "prize" area under that Monster (MONEY) symbol, and upon which a 1X (NOMULT) symbol appears in the "MONSTER MULTIPLIER" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$20.

(j) Holders of tickets upon which a Monster (MONEY) symbol appears in the play area and a prize symbol of \$1^{.00} (ONE DOL) appears in the "prize" area under that Monster (MONEY) symbol, and upon which a 20X (20TIMES) symbol appears in the "MONSTER MULTIPLIER" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$20.

(k) Holders of tickets upon which a Monster (MONEY) symbol appears in the play area and a prize symbol of \$2^{.00} (TWO DOL) appears in the "prize" area under that Monster (MONEY) symbol, and upon which a 10X (10TIMES) symbol appears in the "MONSTER MULTIPLIER" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$20.

(l) Holders of tickets upon which a Monster (MONEY) symbol appears in the play area and a prize symbol of \$5^{.00} (FIV DOL) appears in the "prize" area under that Monster (MONEY) symbol, and upon which a 3X (3TIMES) symbol appears in the "MONSTER MULTIPLIER" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$15.

(m) Holders of tickets upon which a Monster (MONEY) symbol appears in the play area and a prize symbol of \$10^{.00} (TEN DOL) appears in the "prize" area under that Monster (MONEY) symbol, and upon which a 1X (NOMULT) symbol appears in the "MONSTER MULTIPLIER" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$10.

(n) Holders of tickets upon which a Monster (MONEY) symbol appears in the play area and a prize symbol of \$5^{.00} (FIV DOL) appears in the "prize" area under that

Monster (MONEY) symbol, and upon which a 2X (2TIMES) symbol appears in the “MONSTER MULTIPLIER” area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$10.

(o) Holders of tickets upon which a Monster (MONEY) symbol appears in the play area and a prize symbol of \$2.00 (TWO DOL) appears in the “prize” area under that Monster (MONEY) symbol, and upon which a 5X (5TIMES) symbol appears in the “MONSTER MULTIPLIER” area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$10.

(p) Holders of tickets upon which a Monster (MONEY) symbol appears in the play area and a prize symbol of \$1.00 (ONE DOL) appears in the “prize” area under that Monster (MONEY) symbol, and upon which a 10X (10TIMES) symbol appears in the “MONSTER MULTIPLIER” area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$10.

(q) Holders of tickets upon which a Monster (MONEY) symbol appears in the play area and a prize symbol of \$3.00 (THR DOL) appears in the “prize” area under that Monster (MONEY) symbol, and upon which a 3X (3TIMES) symbol appears in the “MONSTER MULTIPLIER” area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$9.

(r) Holders of tickets upon which a Monster (MONEY) symbol appears in the play area and a prize symbol of \$3.00 (THR DOL) appears in the “prize” area under that Monster (MONEY) symbol, and upon which a 2X (2TIMES) symbol appears in the “MONSTER MULTIPLIER” area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$6.

(s) Holders of tickets upon which a Monster (MONEY) symbol appears in the play area and a prize symbol of \$2.00 (TWO DOL) appears in the “prize” area under that Monster (MONEY) symbol, and upon which a 3X (3TIMES) symbol appears in the “MONSTER MULTIPLIER” area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$6.

(t) Holders of tickets upon which a Monster (MONEY) symbol appears in the play area and a prize symbol of \$5.00 (FIV DOL) appears in the “prize” area under that Monster (MONEY) symbol, and upon which a 1X (NOMULT) symbol appears in the “MONSTER MULTIPLIER” area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$5.

(w) Holders of tickets upon which a Monster (MONEY) symbol appears in the play area and a prize symbol of \$1.00 (ONE DOL) appears in the “prize” area under that Monster (MONEY) symbol, and upon which a 3X (3TIMES) symbol appears in the “MONSTER MULTIPLIER” area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$3.

(x) Holders of tickets upon which a Monster (MONEY) symbol appears in the play area and a prize symbol of \$2.00 (TWO DOL) appears in the “prize” area under that Monster (MONEY) symbol, and upon which a 1X (NOMULT) symbol appears in the “MONSTER MULTIPLIER” area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$2.

(y) Holders of tickets upon which a Monster (MONEY) symbol appears in the play area and a prize symbol of \$1.00 (ONE DOL) appears in the “prize” area under that Monster (MONEY) symbol, and upon which a 2X (2TIMES) symbol appears in the “MONSTER MULTIPLIER” area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$2.

(z) Holders of tickets upon which a Monster (MONEY) symbol appears in the play area and a prize symbol of \$1.00 (ONE DOL) appears in the “prize” area under that Monster (MONEY) symbol, and upon which a 1X (NOMULT) symbol appears in the “MONSTER MULTIPLIER” area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1.

(aa) Holders of tickets upon which a Monster (MONEY) symbol appears in the play area and a prize symbol of FREE (TICKET) appears in the “Prize” area under that Monster (MONEY) symbol, and upon which a 1X (NOMULT) symbol appears in the “MONSTER MULTIPLIER” area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of one Monster Multiplier instant game ticket or one Pennsylvania Lottery instant game ticket of equivalent sale price which is currently on sale.

9. *Number and description of prizes and approximate odds:* The following table sets forth the approximate number of winners, amounts of prizes and approximate odds of winning:

(2) A registered lottery account holder is subject to the iLottery regulations and specifically agrees to be bound

(3) To establish a lottery account, players must provide the following information:

(i) The player's name as it appears on a valid government-issued identification or tax documents;

(ii) The player's date of birth;

(iii) The entire or last four digits of the player's Social Security Number, or comparable equivalent;

(iv) The player's address;

(v) The player's telephone number;

(vi) The player's email address;

(vii) Any other information established by the Lottery to be necessary to verify the age and identity of the player.

(4) An individual may be required to provide additional information or documentation, as set forth in the iLottery terms and conditions, to establish a lottery account or register for iLottery. The information may be used for iLottery registration or to confirm information provided by that individual during the registration process.

(5) To enter the Drawing, entrants must submit the identifying information from at least one Qualifying Ticket via the Drawing's promotional web site, available at <https://www.palottery.com>, or the Lottery's official mobile application during the entry period. The identifying information from a Qualifying Ticket may be submitted only once in the Drawing. Entries will automatically be awarded at the time of successful submission of a Qualifying Ticket. The purchase price and corresponding number of entries for the Qualifying Ticket is as follows: PA-1655 Make Me Witch (\$5) = five entries, PA-1656 Spooky Season (\$2) = two entries and PA-1657 Monster Multiplier (\$1) = one entry.

(5) Players may review prizes won and their entries for the Drawing via the Drawing's promotional web site.

(d) *Prizes available to be won, determination of winners and odds of winning:*

(1) The prize entitlements described below are subject to all restrictions and limitations described in section 10(e), or those mentioned anywhere else in these rules.

(2) Lottery will conduct one Drawing from among all the entries received during the entry period as described in section 10(c)(2).

The Lottery is not responsible for entries that are not entered into the Drawing because of incompatible internet browsers, mobile Lottery application failure or other technical issues. The Lottery is not responsible for entries not entered due to delays in creating a lottery account or the inability to create a lottery account. If a Drawing entry is selected as a winner and rejected or otherwise disqualified during or following the Drawing, the Lottery will select one entry to replace the rejected or otherwise disqualified entry in accordance with these rules and Lottery procedure.

(3) If any discrepancy exists between these rules and any material describing the Drawing, these rules shall govern.

(4) Employees of the Pennsylvania Lottery, 9RoofTops Marketing, LLC (formerly known as MARC USA, LLC), MUSL, Scientific Games International, Inc., MDI Entertainment, LLC, and their subcontractors, or a spouse, child, brother, sister or parent residing as a member of the same household in the principal place of residence of any such person are not eligible to participate in the Drawing. Offer void where prohibited or restricted.

(5) The Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to cancel or suspend the Drawing and change these rules if the Drawing cannot be conducted as planned due to errors in these rules or advertising, unauthorized intervention, tampering, fraud, technical errors, viruses, worms, bugs or any other cause that, in the Lottery's sole judgment, could corrupt or impair the administration, security, fairness, integrity or proper conduct of the Drawing.

(6) All entries shall be subject to verification by the Pennsylvania Lottery.

(7) The Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to disqualify an entrant found to be tampering with the operation of the Drawing or to be acting in violation of these rules or applicable law.

(8) The Drawing is governed by the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Applicable laws and regulations apply.

(9) Prizes must be claimed within 1 year of the drawing date of the Drawing in which the prize was won. If no claim is made within 1 year of the drawing date of the Drawing in which the prize was won, the right of an entrant to claim the prize won, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided by statute.

(10) Final determination of winners will be made by the Secretary, whose judgment will be final and binding.

(11) A prize awarded in the Drawing to a person who dies before receiving the prize shall be paid according to 61 Pa. Code § 811.16 (relating to prizes payable after death of a prize winner).

(12) A winner is responsible for all taxes arising from or in connection with any prize won.

(13) A player may only win the prize for which the player is first selected in the Drawing. Subsequent entries, from the same individual, selected in the same Drawing will be disqualified and one replacement entry will be selected.

12. *Retailer bonus:* The Lottery may offer a retailer bonus in connection with the sale of Pennsylvania instant lottery game tickets. If a retailer bonus is offered, a Lottery retailer shall be eligible for a bonus as described in this section. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$100,000 and not exceeding \$500,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$500. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$500,001 and not exceeding \$1,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$5,000. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$1,000,001 and not exceeding \$10,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$10,000. A Lottery retailer is entitled only to the largest bonus for which they qualify on a winning ticket. A bonus will be initiated for payment after the instant ticket is claimed and validated. A bonus will

not be awarded to a Lottery retailer that sells a non-winning Pennsylvania Lottery instant ticket used to enter a Pennsylvania Lottery second-chance drawing or promotion that is subsequently selected to win a prize.

13. *Unclaimed prize money:* For a period of 1 year from the announced close of Monster Multiplier, prize money from winning Monster Multiplier instant lottery game tickets will be retained by the Secretary for payment to the persons entitled thereto. If no claim is made within 1 year of the announced close of the Monster Multiplier instant lottery game, the right of a ticket holder to claim the prize represented by the ticket, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided for by statute.

14. *Governing law:* In purchasing a ticket, the customer agrees to comply with and abide by the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314), 61 Pa. Code Part V (relating to State Lotteries) and the provisions contained in this notice.

15. *Termination of the game:* The Secretary may announce a termination date, after which no further tickets from this game may be sold. The announcement will be disseminated through media used to advertise or promote Monster Multiplier or through normal communications methods.

Under the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314) and 61 Pa. Code § 819.203 (relating to notice of instant game rules), the Secretary of Revenue hereby provides public notice of the rules for the following instant lottery game:

1. *Name:* The name of the game is Pennsylvania Spooky Season (“Spooky Season”). The game number is PA-1656.

2. *Price:* The price of a Spooky Season instant lottery game ticket is \$2.

3. *Play symbols:* Each Spooky Season instant lottery game ticket will contain one play area featuring a “WINNING NUMBERS” area, a “YOUR NUMBERS” area and a “TOMBSTONE \$20” area. The “TOMBSTONE \$20” area is played separately. The play symbols and their captions, located in the “WINNING NUMBERS” area and the “YOUR NUMBERS” area, are: 1 (ONE), 2 (TWO), 3 (THREE), 4 (FOUR), 5 (FIVE), 6 (SIX), 7 (SEVEN), 8 (EIGHT), 9 (NINE), 10 (TEN), 11 (ELEVN), 12 (TWLV), 13 (THRTN), 14 (FORTN), 15 (FIFTN), 16 (SIXTN), 17 (SVNTN), 18 (EGHTN), 19 (NINTN), 20 (TWENT), 21 (TWYONE), 22 (TWYTWO), 23 (TWYTHR), 24 (TWYFOR) and 25 (TWYFIV). The play symbols and their captions, located in the “TOMBSTONE \$20” area, are: Bat (WINGS) symbol, Cauldron (CAULDRON) symbol, Eyes (EYES) symbol, Pumpkin (PUMPKIN) symbol, Ghost (GHOST) symbol, Spider (SPIDER) symbol and a Skull (WIN20) symbol.

4. *Prize symbols:* The prize symbols and their captions, located in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area, are: \$2⁰⁰ (TWO DOL), \$4⁰⁰ (FOR DOL), \$5⁰⁰ (FIV DOL), \$10⁰⁰ (TEN DOL), \$20⁰⁰ (TWENTY), \$40⁰⁰ (FORTY), \$100 (ONE HUN), \$200 (TWO HUN), \$500 (FIV HUN), \$1,000 (ONE THO) and \$13,000 (THRTNTHO).

5. *Prizes:* The prizes that can be won in this game are: \$2, \$4, \$5, \$10, \$20, \$40, \$100, \$200, \$500, \$1,000 and \$13,000. The prize that can be won in the “TOMBSTONE \$20” area is \$20. A player can win up to 11 times on a ticket.

6. *Approximate number of tickets printed for the game:* Approximately 5,400,000 tickets will be printed for the Spooky Season instant lottery game.

7. *Second-Chance Drawing:* The Pennsylvania Lottery will conduct one SPOOK-TACULAR Second-Chance Drawing for which non-winning Spooky Season instant lottery game tickets may be eligible as provided for in section 10.

8. *Determination of prize winners:*

(a) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match either of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$13,000 (THRTNTHO) appears in the “prize” area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$13,000.

(b) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match either of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$1,000 (ONE THO) appears in the “prize” area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1,000.

(c) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match either of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$500 (FIV HUN) appears in the “prize” area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$500.

(d) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match either of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$200 (TWO HUN) appears in the “prize” area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$200.

(e) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match either of the “WINNING

NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in the “prize” area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.

(f) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match either of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$40⁰⁰ (FORTY) appears in the “prize” area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$40.

(g) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match either of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$20⁰⁰ (TWENTY) appears in the “prize” area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$20.

(h) Holders of tickets upon which a Skull (WIN20) symbols appear in the “TOMBSTONE \$20” area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$20.

(i) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match either of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$10⁰⁰ (TEN DOL) appears in the “prize” area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$10.

(j) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match either of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$5⁰⁰ (FIV DOL) appears in the “prize” area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$5.

(k) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match either of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$4⁰⁰ (FOR DOL) appears in the “prize” area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$4.

(l) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match either of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$2⁰⁰ (TWO DOL) appears in the “prize” area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$2.

10. *Second-Chance Drawing:* The Pennsylvania Lottery's SPOOK-TACULAR Second-Chance Drawing for qualifying instant lottery game tickets ("Drawing"):

(a) *Qualifying Tickets:* Non-winning PA-1655 Make Me Witch (\$5), PA-1656 Spooky Season (\$2) and PA-1657 Monster Multiplier (\$1) lottery game tickets are eligible for entry into the Drawing.

(b) *Participation and entry:*

(1) Entrants must have a registered lottery account in order to participate in the Drawing. To create a lottery account, visit <https://www.pailottery.com>. Creating a lottery account is free.

(2) A registered lottery account holder is subject to the iLottery regulations and specifically agrees to be bound by the iLottery terms and conditions located at <https://www.pailottery.com/signup/terms-and-conditions/>, as well as any related policies.

(3) To establish a lottery account, players must provide the following information:

(i) The player's name as it appears on a valid government-issued identification or tax documents;

(ii) The player's date of birth;

(iii) The entire or last four digits of the player's Social Security Number, or comparable equivalent;

(iv) The player's address;

(v) The player's telephone number;

(vi) The player's email address;

(vii) Any other information established by the Lottery to be necessary to verify the age and identity of the player.

(4) An individual may be required to provide additional information or documentation, as set forth in the iLottery terms and conditions, to establish a lottery account or register for iLottery. The information may be used for iLottery registration or to confirm information provided by that individual during the registration process.

(5) To enter the Drawing, entrants must submit the identifying information from at least one Qualifying Ticket via the Drawing's promotional web site, available at <https://www.palottery.com>, or the Lottery's official mobile application during the entry period. The identifying information from a Qualifying Ticket may be submitted only once in the Drawing. Entries will automatically be awarded at the time of successful submission of a Qualifying Ticket. No other method of submission will be accepted, and entries submitted using any other method, including entries mailed or hand-delivered to the Pennsylvania Lottery, are not valid and will be disqualified.

(c) *Drawing description:*

(3) The entry period for the Drawing will be posted to the Pennsylvania Lottery's publicly accessible web site.

(4) The number of entries an entrant will receive for the Drawing is determined by the purchase price of the Qualifying Ticket entered. The purchase price and corresponding number of entries for the Qualifying Ticket is as follows: PA-1655 Make Me Witch (\$5) = five entries, PA-1656 Spooky Season (\$2) = two entries and PA-1657 Monster Multiplier (\$1) = one entry.

(5) Players may review prizes won and their entries for the Drawing via the Drawing's promotional web site.

(d) *Prizes available to be won, determination of winners and odds of winning:*

(1) The prize entitlements described below are subject to all restrictions and limitations described in section 10(e), or those mentioned anywhere else in these rules.

(2) Lottery will conduct one Drawing from among all the entries received during the entry period as described in section 10(c)(2).

(i) The first through the third entries selected in the Drawing will be winning entries and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$30,000, less required income tax withholding.

(ii) The fourth through the eleventh entries selected in the Drawing will be winning entries and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$7,000, less required income tax withholding.

(iii) The twelfth through the twenty-eighth entries selected in the Drawing will be winning entries and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$1,300.

(iv) The twenty-ninth through the seventy-eighth entries selected in the Drawing will be winning entries and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$100 iLottery Bonus Money.

(3) All prizes will be paid as a lump-sum cash payment or uploaded to a winning player's lottery account.

(2) The Lottery is not responsible for late, lost or misdirected entries not entered into the Drawing. The Lottery is not responsible for entries that are not entered into the Drawing because of incompatible internet browsers, mobile Lottery application failure or other technical issues. The Lottery is not responsible for entries not entered due to delays in creating a lottery account or the inability to create a lottery account. If a Drawing entry is selected as a winner and rejected or otherwise disqualified during or following the Drawing, the Lottery will select one entry to replace the rejected or otherwise disqualified entry in accordance with these rules and Lottery procedure.

(3) If any discrepancy exists between these rules and any material describing the Drawing, these rules shall govern.

(4) Employees of the Pennsylvania Lottery, 9RoofTops Marketing, LLC (formerly known as MARC USA, LLC), MUSL, Scientific Games International, Inc., MDI Entertainment, LLC, and their subcontractors, or a spouse, child, brother, sister or parent residing as a member of the same household in the principal place of residence of

any such person are not eligible to participate in the Drawing. Offer void where prohibited or restricted.

(5) The Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to cancel or suspend the Drawing and change these rules if the Drawing cannot be conducted as planned due to errors in these rules or advertising, unauthorized intervention, tampering, fraud, technical errors, viruses, worms, bugs or any other cause that, in the Lottery's sole judgment, could corrupt or impair the administration, security, fairness, integrity or proper conduct of the Drawing.

(6) All entries shall be subject to verification by the Pennsylvania Lottery.

(7) The Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to disqualify an entrant found to be tampering with the operation of the Drawing or to be acting in violation of these rules or applicable law.

(8) The Drawing is governed by the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Applicable laws and regulations apply.

(9) Prizes must be claimed within 1 year of the drawing date of the Drawing in which the prize was won. If no claim is made within 1 year of the drawing date of the Drawing in which the prize was won, the right of an entrant to claim the prize won, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided by statute.

(10) Final determination of winners will be made by the Secretary, whose judgment will be final and binding.

(11) A prize awarded in the Drawing to a person who dies before receiving the prize shall be paid according to 61 Pa. Code § 811.16 (relating to prizes payable after death of a prize winner).

(12) A winner is responsible for all taxes arising from or in connection with any prize won.

(13) A player may only win the prize for which the player is first selected in the Drawing. Subsequent entries, from the same individual, selected in the same Drawing will be disqualified and one replacement entry will be selected.

12. *Retailer bonus:* The Lottery may offer a retailer bonus in connection with the sale of Pennsylvania instant lottery game tickets. If a retailer bonus is offered, a Lottery retailer shall be eligible for a bonus as described in this section. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum

payout, of at least \$100,000 and not exceeding \$500,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$500. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$500,001 and not exceeding \$1,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$5,000. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$1,000,001 and not exceeding \$10,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$10,000. A Lottery retailer is entitled only to the largest bonus for which they qualify on a winning ticket. A bonus will be initiated for payment after the instant ticket is claimed and validated. A bonus will not be awarded to a Lottery retailer that sells a non-winning Pennsylvania Lottery instant ticket used to enter a Pennsylvania Lottery second-chance drawing or promotion that is subsequently selected to win a prize.

13. *Unclaimed prize money:* For a period of 1 year from the announced close of Spooky Season, prize money from winning Spooky Season instant lottery game tickets will be retained by the Secretary for payment to the persons entitled thereto. If no claim is made within 1 year of the announced close of the Spooky Season instant lottery game, the right of a ticket holder to claim the prize represented by the ticket, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided for by statute.

14. *Governing law:* In purchasing a ticket, the customer agrees to comply with and abide by the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314), 61 Pa. Code Part V (relating to State Lotteries) and the provisions contained in this notice.

15. *Termination of the game:* The Secretary may announce a termination date, after which no further tickets from this game may be sold. The announcement will be disseminated through media used to advertise or promote Spooky Season or through normal communications methods.

(EIGHT), 9 (NINE), 10 (TEN), 11 (ELEVN), 12 (TWLV), 13 (THRTN), 14 (FORTN), 15 (FIFTN), 16 (SIXTN), 17 (SVNTN), 18 (EGHTN), 19 (NINTN), 20 (TWENT), 21 (TWYONE), 22 (TWYTWO), 23 (TWYTHR), 24 (TWYFOR), 25 (TWYFIV), 26 (TWYSIX), 27 (TWYSVN), 28 (TWYEGT), 29 (TWYNIN) and 30 (THIRT). (c) Holders of tickets upon which a WIN WIN WIN (WINALL) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of \$1,000 (ONE THO) appears in five of the "prize" areas and a prize symbol of \$500 (FIV HUN) appears in ten of the "prize" areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$10,000.

(d) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$1,000 (ONE THO) appears in the "prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1,000.

(e) Holders of tickets upon which a WIN WIN WIN (WINALL) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of \$200 (TWO HUN) appears in two of the "prize" areas, a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in three of the "prize" areas, a prize symbol of \$50 (FIFTY) appears in five of the "prize" areas

and a prize symbol of \$10 (TEN DOL) appears in five of the "prize" areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1,000.

(f) Holders of tickets upon which a WIN WIN WIN (WINALL) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in five of the "prize" areas and a prize symbol of \$50 (FIFTY) appears in ten of the "prize" areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1,000.

(g) Holders of tickets upon which a WIN+200 (ADD200) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of \$500 (FIV HUN) appears in the "prize" area under that WIN+200 (ADD200) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$700.

(h) Holders of tickets upon which a WIN+200 (ADD200) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of \$400 (FOR HUN) appears in the "prize" area under that WIN+200 (ADD200) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$600.

(o) Holders of tickets upon which a WIN WIN WIN (WINALL) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of \$50 (FIFTY) appears in two of the "prize" areas, a prize symbol of \$30 (THIRTY) appears in four of the "prize" areas and a prize symbol of \$20 (TWENTY) appears in nine of the "prize" areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$400.

(p) Holders of tickets upon which a WIN WIN WIN (WINALL) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS"

area and a prize symbol of \$30 (THIRTY) appears in ten of the “prize” areas and a prize symbol of \$20 (TWENTY) appears in five of the “prize” areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$400.

In addition, 52 Pa. Code § 54.40(d) states that the maintenance of an EGS license is contingent on the licensee providing proof to the Commission that a bond or other approved security in the amount directed by the Commission has been obtained.

Each EGS must file an original bond, letter of credit, continuation certificate, amendment, or other approved financial instrument with Rosemary Chiavetta, Secretary, Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission, 400 North Street, Harrisburg, PA, 17120, prior to the EGS's current security expiration date. Each financial instrument must be an original document that displays a "wet" signature or digital signature, preferably in blue ink, and displays a "raised seal" or original notary stamp. The name of the principal on the original financial instrument must match exactly with the name that appears on the EGS's license issued by the Commission.

Failure to file before the financial security's expiration date may cause Commission staff to initiate a formal proceeding that may lead to the following: cancellation of each company's electric supplier license, removal of each company's information from the Commission's website, and notification to all electric distribution companies, in which each company is licensed to do business, of the cancellation of the license.

As of August 15, 2023, each EGS listed in the Supplier Table below has not provided proof to the Commission that it has a bond or other approved security in the amount or language directed by the Commission, to replace a bond which is expired, or which is non-compliant with Commission regulations.

Alternatively, Electric Generation Suppliers listed in the Supplier Table may provide the Commission an approved security up to and within thirty (30) days after publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. The Electric Generation Supplier must file an original bond, letter of credit, continuation certificate, amendment, or other approved financial instrument displaying a "wet" signature or digital signature, preferably in blue ink, and displaying a "raised seal" or original notary stamp with Rosemary Chiavetta, Secretary, Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission, 400 North Street, Harrisburg, PA, 17120.

5. Absent the timely (i) filing of comments challenging the cancellation of the Electric Generation Supplier's license, or (ii) the filing of an approved security within 30-days after publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, the Bureau of Technical Utility Services, shall prepare a Final Order for entry by the Secretary revoking the license of each Electric Generation Supplier that fails to respond.

6. Upon entry of the Final Order, Electric Generation Suppliers that remain listed as not in compliance with 52 Pa. Code § 54.40(a) and (d) will be stricken from all active utility lists maintained by the Commission's Bureau of Technical Utility Services and the Assessment Section of the Bureau of Administration, removed from the Commission's website, and notifications be sent to all electric distribution companies in which the Electric Generation Suppliers are licensed to do business.

7. Upon entry of the Final Order, Electric Generation Suppliers that fail to respond will be prohibited from providing electric generation supply services to retail electric customers. That upon entry of the Final Order described in Ordering Paragraph No. 5, each electric distribution company in which the Electric Generation Suppliers are licensed to do business, shall return the customers of the Electric Generation Suppliers to default service.

2. On September 27, 2022, by Commission Secretarial letter, Respondent was issued a certificate of public convenience by this Commission authorizing transportation, as a common carrier, by motor vehicle, property, excluding household goods in use, between points in Pennsylvania at PUC utility code no. 8925384. Respondent was further advised that the "Certificate holder is advised to become familiar with the requirements of 52 Pa. Code. Failure to comply with all applicable requirements may subject the carrier to penalties, including fines, suspension of operating rights or cancellation of authority. Title 52 of the *Pennsylvania Code* may be accessed on the World Wide Web at www.pacode.com."

3.
